WEG, Big M join forces to launch cross-border Pick 4, reduce drag

The new Can-Am Pick 4, and accompanying reduction in post time drag, is an attempt by the New Jersey and Ontario tracks to derive mutual – and mutuel – benefit.

Jason Settlemoir said the most exciting part of the announcement that the Meadowlands and Woodbine are launching a joint-track, cross-border Pick 4 is the accompanying promise to drastically reduce the drag time after post time to no more than five minutes.

The chief operating officer and general manager of the Meadowlands Racetrack has been on a campaign for a few years to reduce the time after the “minutes to post” clock hits zero before horses actually go to the gate ([full story here](#)).

“I’m very excited about trying to move the drag back,” Settlemoir said Saturday, a day after it was announced the Can-Am Pick 4 will debut on March 22 at the East Rutherford, NJ track and Woodbine Mohawk Park in Milton, ON. “I’m hopeful that you’ll see that our customers realize that we’re trying to do something positive with both of these, especially with the drag initiative.

“Both of our properties tend to be somewhere between six and 10 minutes past zero for every race, so we’re going to put the countdown clocks in at three minutes past zero and when those run out the horses will be called to the gate and then we’ll be off somewhere between 4:45 and five minutes. For us, we’re going to be reducing the drag by almost half. We’re going to try it and I’m excited about it. I’m hoping we can move the needle in the other direction.

“At the same time, I’m a little nervous because I want to make sure the word is out there so people that are accustomed to that six, eight or 10 minutes past zero are not waiting... they are aware that this is going to start happening.”

Mohawk will play host to the Can-Am Pick-4. It will start with the second last race on the Mohawk card, then alternate between the two tracks and end at the Meadowlands.

“If you imagine yourself at a self-bet machine, you’ll have the Meadowlands races one through 13, like you normally do,

and then you’ll have the Woodbine Entertainment Group races, one through 10 or 11, and then there will be a third path there called the ‘Can-Am’ that will include that Pick 4,” Settlemoir said.

Likely more interesting to bettors is the 15 per cent takeout rate on the bet, which will also offer 20-cent minimums.

“I think bettors will like the takeout and it’s fun to have something new and some new products and new wagers available,” said Woodbine Mohawk Park president Jessica Buckley, adding it will be a great opportunity for the two tracks’ stellar broadcast teams to promote each other.

“I think the handicappers at both sites are going to have some fun putting bets together and working together with the Meadowlands makes so much sense for us,” Buckley said. “We’re trying to partner the two top tracks in North America and have a successful Pick 4... We’ve done similar things on the thoroughbred side, but nothing that was going to be an ongoing wager like this.”

Settlemoir said the regulatory bodies in both jurisdictions were very receptive to the idea. “We got approval from them fairly quickly,” he said.

Beginning March 22, the two tracks will both add the Can-Am Pick 4 and try the reduced post-time drag on Friday nights to start. If both go well, they hope to expand both the wager and the reduced drag to their Saturday night cards.

Buckley said with Mohawk and the Meadowlands consistently drawing the highest handle in the standardbred game, a reduced drag time will hopefully force other tracks to send their races off faster in order to stay off the Big M and Mohawk signals.

“I think that if we’re able to make a success of it, and everyone is staying off one another, then (other tracks will) play between (Mohawk and the Meadowlands) and it should



work much better," Buckley said.

Settlemoir has long lamented that post-time drag is a necessary evil to drive handle – because it works – and the only way to reduce it is if most major tracks are working in tandem to do so. He said the initiative has been in the works for more than two years, going back to conference calls he organized with other tracks to try and get everyone to work better together for mutual – and mutual – benefit.

“It really came up when we were having those calls with the other racetrack operators when we were trying to come up with something collaborative when we were trying to improve the drag. We started talking more about the wager together with other racetracks and nothing really ever materialized after those meetings,” Settlemoir said.

Yet, the seed was planted with the Meadowlands’ Canadian friends. Settlemoir said Woodbine chair Clay Horner ran with it from there.

“It’s something we’ve talked about a few times and we met with (Meadowlands owner) Jeff (Gural) and Jason this summer and had a great discussion about how we could do a cross-border wager and work together and try something and that’s how the Can-Am Pick 4 was born,” Buckley said.

“Having two guys like Jeff Gural and Clay Horner that are willing to try just about anything that, to me, is super exciting because they get it, they understand that it’s the customer’s view, too,” said Settlemoir, adding that if customers truly want reduced drag time, hopefully they will support the new initiative and, “continue to wager the same amount, if not more, and we’ll continue to move.”

Settlemoir said he hopes Meadowlands bettors will adjust quickly to the reduced drag and bet as much, or more, than they do now so drag can be reduced even more.

If that happens, Settlemoir said the plan is to decrease post-time drag even more.

“Hopefully, one day, during this initiative, we’ll actually get to zero,” he said. “I’ve said it right from the beginning, I don’t enjoy it. I’ve always said it needed to be an industry-wide initiative.”

Settlemoir said the new Can-Am Pick 4 wasn’t necessary to launch the reduced drag-time strategy, but the two can complement each other.

“I think it just sets the tone and gives us something additional to say, ‘Hey, we’re doing this Can-Am wager and we’re also going to reduce the drag,’” Settlemoir said. “We needed to make people aware of this so they are aware of the wager and they are also aware of reducing the drag, so it doesn’t hurt the handle at either place.”

Recently imported Mach Doro A is poised for Levy engagement

The talented son of Mach Three was one of the top open pacers in Australia.

Kevin Sywyk and Ron Cushing thought they were set with a legitimate contender for the 2019 Levy at Yonkers when they bought Bettors Fire N in September of 2018. After going undefeated last year and only missing the board once since the calendar turned in January, Bettors Fire N had them looking forward to the start of the series next week.

But the result of a casual conversation with their third partner, Frank Ranaldi, seven weeks ago now has them loaded with a solid one-two punch after acquiring one of the best open pacers from Australia: Mach Doro A.

Mach Doro A (Mach Three—Three Eagles—Falcon Seelster) is a travelling Group 1 pacer that has consistently tackled the Australian Grand Circuit over the past two years. His career included competing in the Inter Dominion and Miracle Mile, the two biggest races on their schedule, along with winning many other feature events during his six years of racing.

He has raced against the very best including the great Lazarus N and Spankem N and has beaten the likes of Tiger Tara N, My Field Marshall N and Lennytheshark A along the way.

Ranaldi, a noted Australasian standardbred exporter, was well acquainted with the career of Mach Doro A and appreciated his racing efforts week in and week out. When he heard the horse might be for sale, he moved with stealth speed to procure him and send him to the States.

"The purchase of Mach Doro A was somewhat of an interesting process. He was on my watch list way before he reached free-for-all company and I had an opportunity to buy him for less than half of what he cost recently. I liked him and hated him all at the same time as he showed great talent one start, but followed with subsequent lack-luster performances. He confused me to a point where I just passed on him," said Ranaldi.

"I soon lived to regret that decision as he went on to win race after race. So when there were whispers that he may be available again I did not hesitate to consolidate and buy him myself and worry about selling later."

As it turned out, time was not on Ranaldi's side after this transaction as a flight to New York was already booked and the horse was slated to leave in a few days. During that time, he contacted a couple of his clients in the States who were interested in buying him but could not commit completely with the short notice they had. So Mach Doro A ended up in the air with no final destination.

"It was a chance social conversation with Kevin (Sywyk) who asked me what else I had available. I advised him there was one on an inbound flight with no particular home to go to and we struck up a deal then and there. Kevin and Ron (Cushing) partnered in with me and Bettors Fire had a new stablemate," said Ranaldi.

"Despite his outstanding performances Down Under, Mach Doro A still has to acclimate and adapt to the North American style of racing before we really know how he will

perform or before we compare him to other successful Group 1 imports like Bit Of A Legend N, Christen Me or Bettors Fire.

“Our trainer Heidi Gibbs and Ron had the daunting task of preparing Mach for the Levy and a shot at the title against some great horses. It's a huge challenge but if the horse remains healthy and Lady Luck is on his side, I am quietly confident Mach will make his presence felt.”

The whole series of events caught Cushing off guard because in the length of one phone call he found out he had another top pacer coming to his stable. But after learning what happened, Cushing wasn't really surprised because he knows how Ranaldi works.

“Frank does things a little differently. He doesn't look for horses that are being shopped around; he looks for horses he likes and goes after them. Once the owners see there is an interest, a conversation gets underway and eventually a price does come out and a deal gets done.” Cushing then went on to speak very highly of the horse that came into his barn in late January.

“Mach is more than I expected. He's a very intelligent horse who goes about his business in a very professional manner. He's a big horse and he covers a lot of ground. Gait-wise he's perfect and he has unbelievable speed. When I qualified him two weeks ago I got away third and found myself behind a leader getting to the half in a minute. So I pulled and let him out just a little bit and he paced the third quarter in :27.1 opening up four lengths and I was just hanging onto him. He

was very gently rigged when he got here and I only made a few minor changes to help him cover the half-mile track. If I can get him to do what I want to do, the sky is the limit,” said Cushing.

In his first pari-mutuel start on Monday (March 4) at Yonkers he went a very similar mile. After getting away sixth he pulled before the half, moved three- wide at three-quarters and around the last turn before pacing away under a line drive down the lane in 1:54.3, which was a new lifetime mark for a mile.

“Mach Doro A was a machine over there. However, how he performs here remains to be seen. But one thing is for certain, we're going to get a chance to see one of the top 15 open pacers from the Southern Hemisphere race against some of the top open pacers in North America over the next five weeks,” Cushing said.

“Was buying this horse being in the right place at the right time? That's yet to be seen. I think it was the right place at the right time. We felt like we had a contender in Bettors Fire N and now we have another horse that is a contender in Mach Doro A. If he does what he is capable of doing and has luck on his side, we have a chance to clear \$400,000 in two months.”

The Campbell connection

No surprise here: John Campbell has direct ties to the five trainers who are going into the Hall of Fame this year:

1. He succeeded Ted Wing in 1979 as the Meadowlands driving champion. Wing had won it in 1978 after missing by one in 1977.

2. Linda Toscano worked for John Campbell, and that duo also teamed up to be third with Share The Delight in the most famous of all races held at the Big M – the 2008 Meadowlands Pace won by Art Official over Somebeachsomewhere.

3. Joe Holloway and Campbell go way back to the 1987 Presidential with the winner Banker Blue Chip. Tuff Choice won 13 straight in 1985 for Holloway and Campbell. The latter also had the first option to drive Jennas Beach Boy – and did drive She's A Great Lady for Holloway to a Breeders Crown win on the same card in 1996 that stablemate Jennas Beach Boy as won a Crown.

4. Jerry Silverman trained the first million-dollar winner Campbell drove – Hilarion on Meadowlands Pace Night in 1982. It marked Silverman's first million-dollar winner, as well (Die Laughing would come eight years later) and the first time any catch driver would capture a seven-figure event.

5. Blair Burgess and Campbell go back to Amity Chef (third in the 1986 Meadowlands Pace as the favorite). Campbell also drove Real Desire in 2001-2002 to earnings exceeding \$3 million and including two Breeders Crowns and a Hall Of Fame nod himself. Glidemaster won the Triple Crown in 2006 with Campbell driving the first two legs for Burgess before the driver was injured.

Remember when they were drivers?

A couple of names from the Dan Patch Awards Night in Orlando were trainers of significance who were so honored: Joe Holloway and Jo Ann Looney. But, remember, they drove, too.

In 1979, at the Meadowlands only, Holloway was 29 4-4-6, \$62,240 for the meet. His win total was higher than four Hall of Famers at the Meadowlands that meet: Del Insko

(2-for-26), Delvin Miller (1-for-16), Gene Riegler (1-for-19) and John Chapman (1-for-6).

Looney had the biggest ever single season in Meadowlands history for a female driver. She was 42 7-5-4, \$62,633

Laura Young – Farm manager, CVT, Southwind Farms

Recently, a national poll was taken on the places where people say their dream vacation would be – #1 was Iceland, followed by Bora Bora; Santorini, Greece; Machu Picchu and The Galapagos Islands.

We all have a different opinion on what we fancy. Some like to soak up the sun on a beach in Miami while others prefer to ski the snowy slopes of Aspen, Colorado.

But if I were a horse, my Heaven on Earth would be a farm located in Pennington, NJ called Southwind Farms. It is the crème de la crème.

There, you can get R&R, be pampered at a spa and get your meals served to you in your own stall. This takes teamwork and at Southwind Farms there are reliable, loving, hard-working people that care about the horse. But the one person who deserves the most credit for the success of the farm is a woman named Laura Young.

Unlike many people who grew up in the business, Young did not. Young's mother was a taxidermist and her father was a gunsmith. So how did she get started working with horses?

"I grew up in Trenton, New Jersey, in one of the toughest areas where drugs and crime were rampant. I wanted to work so I could earn enough money to get the hell out of there. I started working for Per Henriksen in 1992 as a groom. I was a 14-year-old going to high school so I could only work on weekends.

"When I was a junior I saw an ad in the Trentonian for weekend help at Southwind Farms. I went for the interview and was hired on the spot. Twenty-five plus years later and I am still here, loving every minute as if I was still that 16-year-old kid!

Laura Young with 2-year-old Well Said–Southwind Solara filly Southwind Spring.

"At Southwind Farms the horses come first. A normal day involves checking the horses a couple times, watering and cleaning the stalls, bathing and general care. During breeding season it gets more intense as we start at 5:30 a.m. The mares are ultra-sounded for we have to see where they are in their cycles. Everything is logged and breeding decisions are made. Semen is shipped, drivers are lined up and everything is logged into the computer program.

"Afternoons are set aside for data entry, client communication, projects, yearling measurement and evaluating. Then there is evening breeding and foaling. Sometimes I never leave the barn for more than an hour in a 24 hour day!"

In her spare time, when she has some, Young is an avid hunter.

"I grew up with my parents involved in hunting/taxidermy so it is second nature to me. I know hunting is a controversial subject and I openly discuss it with the people who are against it. But when I harvest an animal my family consumes

it or the meat is given to feed the hungry. We are overrun with deer in New Jersey and there are so many people starving.

"When you have a hunting, veterinarian tech/medical background it truly helps you be as realistic as possible when making crucial decisions. I also took an oath as a CVT to ease the suffering and do everything in my power to treat the animal ethically."

Southwind Farms is the home to the 2009 Horse of the Year and 2017's leading money-winning sire Muscle Hill. He is the proud papa to seven millionaire offsprings: Resolve, Marion Marauder, Southwind Frank, Ariana G, Mission Brief, Bar Hopping, and What The Hill. He also sired Hambletonian winner Trixton, among many others. And Muscle Hill is not only a good-looking stud, but is smart.

"Muscle Hill is by far the most intelligent horse I have ever been around. We currently stand Muscle Hill, Walner and Tactical Landing. We also manage Resolve and Sportswriter in Canada. And here at Southwind Farms we have a great broodmare band. We own 46 of our own and have a few outside mares, which brings the total available ladies up to about 55."

In the age-old question of which has more influence, the sire or dam, Young said neither.

"I believe the environment the foals are exposed to has the most influence. You can breed the best to the best, but if that foal is not properly managed from day 1, it won't matter who the sire or mare is," she said.

As far as advice to people who wish to breed on their own or raise a foal themselves, Young said to be prepared to change his/her lifestyle.

"You have to be dedicated and take equine breeding or foaling courses. It can mean the difference between a healthy, live foal and a dead one. Educate yourself and have

realistic expectations of what your goals are as a small start-up breeder," Young said.



operated by Anthony and Amy MacDonald. The pair participated in a similar tour hosted by Harness Racing New Zealand in September 2018.

There are currently 137 standardbred horses (including 75 2-year-olds) in TheStable.ca owned by 634 people from 11 countries worldwide.

The Australian tour began Feb. 20 in Melbourne and concluded March 3 in Sydney and was hosted by Australian Pacing Gold (APG), Club Menangle and the New South Wales Standardbred Owners Association (NSWSOA).

MacDonald presented seminars at four racetracks (Bendigo, Menangle, Bathurst and Newcastle) visited numerous training centres and breeding farms and spoke during events hosted by Club Menangle and APG. During the 14-day tour, he also participated in 10 media interviews, including video features, podcasts, print articles and live TV interviews.

"It was a pleasure having Anthony in Australia to talk about TheStable.ca and fractional ownership," said Daniel Cordina, a director of Club Menangle and vice president of the NSWSOA. "As an association, we've learned a lot about fractional ownership in this short amount of time and look forward to the next 12 months to foster this project.

"Anthony's passion has been contagious, and it was something that our industry needed. The message has spread quickly; we need an Anthony to set up in Sydney!"

The tour was intended to inform racing participants, administrators, executives and local politicians about this proven model with the intent of replicating the system to attract new owners and grow Australian harness racing. "We are shrinking, and I believe the owners, trainers and their horses are the key to stopping this trend. But educating our horsepeople about how to market and advertise themselves can be a difficult proposition, and one that will take time. Providing a venue for dialogue is the first step. Australia certainly understood that.

"The trainers Down Under were curious to see what our ownership model looked like once we unpacked it in front of them. They understand that the future of this industry lies in its growth. Our message was simple: The more people that participate in horse racing, the brighter the future will be for all of us. That's the same in all hemispheres."

During the tour, MacDonald also drove three horses at Bathurst Harness Racing Club. Donning the polka dot silks of the horses' owners, he didn't add to his 3,044 career wins, lamenting instead that, "losing feels the same on both sides of the world."

I apologize to the Alagna Barn because I missed many of their sets while training some of the nice Lindy Farm horses. I did see a few nice sets from Tony's barn, however. The aforementioned Force And Fury with **Donna** the Captaintreacherous colt from My Little Dragon, **Chief Mate** with Tony, a Captaintreacherous colt from Heaven Forbid, and **Ideal Perception** (c, American Ideal—Southwind Siren) with Matt looked energetic in 2:35 as did Carma Delight (f Captaintreacherous—Darlins Delight), **Creative Power** (f Artspeak—Shyaway) and **Caviart Heather** (f Somebeachsomewhere—Full Picture) in 2:30 trained by Tony, Donna and Matt in that order.

Nocturnal Bluechip returns to Yonkers for shot at Levy Series

When Nocturnal Bluechip came to Jeff Gillis' stable in Canada late last summer, the trainer admittedly didn't know what to expect. Then a 5-year-old gelding, Nocturnal Bluechip was a stakes winner at 2 and 3 and established himself as a consistent type in the conditioned and non-winners ranks at Yonkers and Pocono Downs in his 4- and 5-year old seasons. Immediately before heading north, the Bettor's Delight son even made a start in the Great Northeast Open Series at Pocono, finish fifth in a 1:49.2 mile.

"The owner called me and asked me to try him up in Canada, and so I did not really knowing what to expect," Gillis said. "He's not a horse that I had followed. I haven't had a ton of success with Bettor's Delight, although many others have. Being that he's an older sire, I expected Nocturnal Bluechip to be a little lazy, which he can be at times. I watched a bunch of replays on him and just kind of played it by ear."

Nocturnal Bluechip made his first start for Gillis at the non-winners of \$30,000 last five level Aug. 25 and won his first race for his new trainer in his fourth start after dropping to the non-winners of \$11,000 last five level Sept. 15. Then, the gelding got on a roll.

Nocturnal Bluechip made it four straight victories over the following month, including two at the preferred level, and took a mark of 1:48.2 in the process. He's raced almost exclusively at the preferred level since, racking up another two victories and six placings. The streak boosted the gelding's earnings to \$398,493 for owner NLG Racing Stable.

"I just went into it with an open mind, clean slate, let him dictate and tell us what he is. Not really many expectations good or bad," Gillis said. "He's certainly has surprised me. Initially, I wasn't quite sure about him, but he found his form toward the late summer-early fall and he's been pretty consistent since."

"I've been pleasantly surprised. He's a horse that's got good tactical speed, he's been pretty consistent, he's got a turn of foot, so there's a lot to like about him."

Nocturnal Bluechip's impressive run over the winter gave Gillis the confidence to nominate to the George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series. It's the first time Gillis will compete in the six-week event, which begins March 16. The trainer will also bring Obvious Bluechip to the Matchmaker Series.

"I'm excited to have a couple that I think can be factors in the series," Gillis said. "It's kind of a quiet time of year for stakes and this gets the ball rolling for the year, so I'm very much looking forward to it."

Nocturnal Bluechip will prepare for the series with a start in Saturday night's (March 9) \$44,000 open handicap pace. Unlike many of his Levy Series rivals, Nocturnal Bluechip raced through the winter. However, with only two starts this year, Gillis thinks the gelding will still be fresh heading into the grueling series.

"I guess it's the old adage, rest versus rust," he said. "Early in the series, it would favor a horse that's been racing and then as the series gets on, maybe it favors a fresher horse being that it is six straight weeks if you make the final. But I'm going to say that Nocturnal Bluechip fits somewhere in between because he's raced through the winter, but he's raced fairly infrequently. It will be four weeks off heading into this week and he'd only raced twice in the previous seven, so he's fresh at the same time I feel."

Although Gillis is unsure how much of a role the seven-eighths mile track at Mohawk has played in Nocturnal Bluechip's recent success, the trainer doesn't think the switch back to the half-mile oval at Yonkers will be an issue. The gelding is 1-for-16 on the half with another five placings.

"I haven't ever raced him on a half, but I don't expect it to be an issue at all," Gillis said. "I guess we'll wait and see. I've reviewed his lines and seen that he's raced there before. We'll wait and see."


Nocturnal Bluechip drew post two for his first local open try and will employ the driving services of Dan Dube; the pair are 15-1 on the morning line. Bit Of A Legend drew post six off his first win of the year in the Open February 23 while the runner up from that race and a winner of the open Feb. 16, Don Domingo, drew post seven.

Preferred runner up last out Killer Martini drew favorably in post four while three-time preferred winner this season Iमारocknrollegend will start from post eight. Australian import Sams A Champ debuted a winner at Freehold last out for Tahnee Camilleri and was assigned post one. Bettor Memories and Shneonucrzydiamnd complete the lineup.

"I don't know the field very well. I just know that this horse is quick off the wings, so I feel like he'll get himself spotted most of the time. I find that those horses tend to get you pieces a lot on a small track, even if they don't win," Gillis said. "This is really a dress rehearsal for the series, so I'm not going in with any expectations. I'm just going to experiment and see how it goes."

The first leg of the Bluechip Matchmaker Series is Friday, March 15 while the George Morton Levy Series kicks off Saturday, March 16.

I thought this was a brilliant idea, something I would try if I had a sire that I believed in and, well, money. Of course, I procrastinated on Prestidigitator. The pay for a foal promotion ship has sailed without my mare, but Prestidigitator stuck in my head. If you say his name fast three times, you sound like a typewriter.

I like this stallion. However, I have never raced in Canada and there might be landmines. One of the freaky things that I like about Prestidigitator is that his first crop of babies will hit the track THIS year. A crop in action gives us a little side serving of entertainment. We can follow his babies at the races; cheering for new family members is weirdly entertaining for me.”

“You’ve had weirder ideas,” he said.

I continued, “Choice number two is another stallion that I am not very familiar with – Enterprise. He came on the Ohio scene late. He is out of the Chapter Seven family, which is excellent. One of the perks in my book of quirks is that Enterprise spent a year racing in France. Delray Dude overpowering in Meadows series opener

Delray Dude overpowered the field in a 1:52.4 victory in Friday's opening leg of the Walter Russell Memorial Pace at The Meadows. Dew A Little Dance survived a late rally by Touch Of The West in the other \$12,500 division of the event for 3- and 4-year-old colts, stallions and geldings.

A 4-year-old American Ideal—Docdor Libby gelding, Delray Dude entered the series off a break at Yonkers. But he was fast and straight Friday, lowering his life mark 2.4 seconds for Dave Palone, trainer Ron Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Brussemi LLC. The pocket-sitting Stonelake was second, 1-1/2 lengths in arrears, while previously unbeaten Champagneonabeach settled for show.

Friday's card also featured a "battle of millionaires" in the \$18,000 preferred handicap pace as Dapper Dude roared from the pocket to down Dancin Yankee by 3/4 lengths in 1:50.3. Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. drove for trainer Tim Twaddle and owner Micki Rae Stables.

Palone and Burke each fashioned a triple on the 13-race card. Tony Hall piloted a pair of winners to give him 14 over the last four programs.

During the week, The Meadows kicked off three other series for 3- and 4-year-olds. Among the highlights:

Galaxy Girl let Revival do all the heavy lifting on the front before out-finishing her in the Lightning Lane to score in 1:59, fastest of Wednesday's three opening-leg divisions. Also taking \$12,500 splits were Lindy Misssunshine and Moshannon Magic.

When menacing challenger Sweet Madam jumped it off, it appeared Revival might be home free. But Galaxy Girl powered through the Lightning Lane for Mike Wilder and

defeated Revival by 1-1/2 lengths, with Ima Yankee third. Rich Gillock trains the 4-year-old daughter of Angus Hall-Sierra Fortune for Hutt Racing Stable.

In the \$20,000 Filly & Mare Preferred Handicap Pace, Maewegonow made it two straight with a 1:58.2 victory for Hall, trainer Richard Perfido and owner Thomas Mattingly. Hall notched four wins and Gillock three on the 13-race program.

Ken Weaver Memorial Trot — colts, stallions and geldings

First Maestro followed the live cover of Explosive Magic, then zipped by him in the lane to capture the fastest of Tuesday's three opening-leg divisions. Ryanlee and Fan The Flames took the other \$12,500 splits.

A sophomore son of Winning Mister-First Sonata, First Maestro failed to take a mark in 13 tries last year but is undefeated in three 2019 outings. He downed Explosive Magic by a neck in 1:58.4 for Hall, trainer Norm Parker and owner/breeder Bob Key. Andovers Asset earned show.

In the \$20,000 filly and mare preferred handicap pace, Circle The Page went from worst to first to pull off a 16-1 upset for Dan Rawlings. John Sullivan conditions the 5-year-old daughter of Real Artist-Queen Marie, who lifted her lifetime bankroll to \$226,334, and owns with Michael Marocco. Wilder and Hall each piloted three winners on the 13-race card.

Donna Dunn Memorial Pace — fillies and mares

Mystical Thread and Miss Daisy Duke registered front-end victories in the \$12,500 divisions, although the performance of the former may have been a bit more impressive, as it occurred after steady snow had turned the track condition to "good." The 4-year-old daughter of Fred And Ginger—Threads Of Life roared to the front for Palone and trainer J.W. Miller and scored in a career-best 1:56.4, three lengths ahead of Better Speed, with Ultra Violet third.

A 4-year-old daughter of Sportswriter—Keystone Jubilee, Miss Daisy Duke prevailed in 1:58.1 for Wilder and trainer Spencer Kahrig. She's The Best rallied for second, falling a head short, while Flipping Fun was fourth-placed third. Kahrig Racing Stable enjoyed a sweep, as it campaigns Miss Daisy Duke with Cache Is King LLC and Paul Czopek and owns Mystical Thread in partnership with Caleb Little.

Hall was the day's driving star again with five wins on the 13-race program.

Sutton derails Trolley in Friday Big M feature

Driver Andy Miller was able to steal a slow middle half, and that's just what Sutton needed to end Trolley's four-race winning streak in the Friday night feature at the Meadowlands, the \$25,000 preferred handicap for trotters.

Sutton was away quickly from post eight and went parked out past the quarter before securing the top at the three-eighths. Sutton hit the half in :57.1 after looping early leader In Secret, who led at the quarter in :28.

Trolley, the 4-5 favorite, started his first-over march toward the leader at the half after sitting in the five-hole and made steady progress as Sutton hit three-quarters in 1:26.2 after rating the middle half in :58.2.

Trolley couldn't get close enough to the pace-setter to threaten given the sluggish pace, and Sutton still led by a little more than a length at the head of the stretch before slightly extending that advantage to 1½ lengths as they hit the wire. Trolley held second, with In Secret finishing third.

"When the draw came out," said winning trainer Julie Miller, "I was hoping Andy was going to do what he did, leave the gate. The fact that he was able to rate the middle half was a big factor in us winning, because Sutton has back class."

"He had a foot injury last year," said Julie of her prized pupil, "so we've been giving him some TLC. He's heavily staked for this year, so we are hoping to keep him sound and have a big 2019."

Sutton, a 6-year-old son of Donato Hanover—I Wanted Wings who trotted the mile in 1:54, returned \$6.20 to his backers as the second choice in the wagering. He's now won 11-of-37 lifetime outings, good for earnings of \$521,038 for owners Andy Miller Stable and Jason and Douglas Allen.

A LITTLE MORE: Wagering was lively in the 50-Cent Pick-4, as \$107,921 was pushed through the windows, and after a sequence that saw winner's odds of 5-1, 4-1, 3-1 and 2-1, the payoff was \$533.20... Longshot players were loving life in the sixth race as Explosive Ridge and driver Vinny Ginsburg lit up the tote board, returning \$170.40 for a \$2 bet, the biggest win payout of the year... Andy Miller and Big M leading driver Yannick Gingras both had three victories on the night... All-source wagering totaled \$2,799,501, the 18th time this year out of 19 cards that wagering has exceeded \$2.5 million.

Then Harness Horse of the Year, Wiggle It Jiggleit, came to 3R for Team Teague in 2018, only to come up second best to the Burke's Stable's Rockin Ron in a classic battle over a sloppy track in 1:52.

In 2017, it was the Jimmy Takter Stable winning the Prix D'Ete for the second time as Western Fame and driver Trevor Henry wired the field in 1:53.2. Then this past year, Ricky and Jamie Macomber stole the show in an upset with their pacer Beckhams Z Tam in 1:52.1.

The 2019 race season gets underway at the Hippodrome 3R on Sunday, April 28 with first race post time at 1:00 pm.

Richard Young on how to attract owners

We often speak of the industry attracting new blood. Let's face it, we need more owners to get in the business for it to survive. The thoroughbred industry seems to thrive with their signature races and an ownership group that appears to be far more affluent as a group. However, I feel quite sure the vast majority of owners have a much higher failure rate than in harness racing. A few years ago, I was introduced to a guy who owned and bred thoroughbreds. He was quite affluent, but he was a minor player. I'm sure this is more the norm than not. I tried to get him into the standardbreds and was virtually laughed at. It took me approximately five years to get him to be a partner on one horse. In so much as that horse went on to be a \$2.5 million earner, he was hooked. He is now a converted harness horse owner.

There are many reasons why harness racing should be attractive to thoroughbred owners especially since they are quite familiar with the pit falls and losing money. The reason I was able to eventually convince a die-hard thoroughbred guy is almost too simple. I think it's best to show in a chart. Understand it's pure guesswork as to the actual percentages, but does illustrate why thoroughbred owners may wish to try harness racing.

For illustration purposes, we are assuming that the purchaser is looking for a stakes horse .

There are many reasons that favor harness racing, the most obvious the fun of watching your horse race regularly. I realize the numbers I put up may be way off. I feel it might favor standardbreds even more. I would really like someone who has access to better numbers to investigate this. I believe that advertising in trade publications for the thoroughbreds with an accurate chart may entice owners to try harness racing. Because the group is generally more affluent, it may also increase the prices horses sell for which is a good thing for everyone.

Surick responds to Perry

I want to address a letter written by David Perry about my performance at Freehold Raceway ([full story here](#)). I take total exception to being referred to as a trainer that gives his horses drugs or cheats. He also states that I don't do well at any track outside of Freehold. I will refute his statements while at the same time try not to get insulting. First of all, last year I ended up third-leading trainer at Harrah's Philadelphia and currently sitting in a tie for third at the Meadowlands and also top 10 at Yonkers Raceway. I currently sit in fifth place in the NATIONAL trainers earnings for this year. Last year, I finished 20th in the nation for earnings which I am proud of considering I have very few stake-quality horses, and fourth in wins. Also Freehold today is not a major league track, but is more akin to the minor leagues. Most of the horses that race there either have seen there better days or just don't have the ability to race at the bigger venues. I enjoy winning races even if I am racing for \$3,000 purses. Isn't that what this game is supposed to be all about? I buy and claim horses specifically to fit the conditions there. There is a reason that most of my horses that win go off at low odds, it's because they should and the bettors know it. Also it is a big advantage having Andy Miller drive for me over everyone else who is there, most of the drivers combined don't have close to 10,000 wins like he almost has. I only wish that David Perry realized this before he tried to hurt my reputation instead of thanking me and my owners for helping to support the races and help fill the box.
