Hall of Famer Bill O'Donnell was close friends with Brennan, having met him in the 1970s at Saratoga Raceway.

And although O'Donnell has a plethora of Brennan stories, there are two in particular that may not be well known.

"He was [jockey] Ronnie Turcotte's bodyguard when they raced Secretariat," said O'Donnell. "He had a painting on his wall of Secretariat – it was signed by Ronnie Turcotte, [trainer] Lucien Laurin and [owner] Penny Chenery – that they gave him."

Turcotte, now 79, remembered Brennan's name and said how important he would have been to him.

"They got a call when we were going to Arlington Park that if I crossed the wire in front, I wouldn't go any further," said Turcotte.

Perhaps it's appropriate that Brenna is linked to a horse that had the biggest heart on record.

O'Donnell's second story also involves a horse, the 2003 Hambletonian runner-up, Sugar Trader, who went on to win the Yonkers Trot.

Sugar Trader was a handful and although Luc Ouellette piloted him perfectly that year, Ouellette was not available to travel to Yonkers for The Trot.

O'Donnell said Brennan called him about who to get to drive.

"I said, 'Go in the locker room at Yonkers and get the oldest guy in there to drive that horse that's got some patience,' because he needed a little help that horse," said O'Donnell. "Just get somebody that's really quiet." He said, 'Cat Manzi's the oldest guy,' and I said, 'That's the guy.'"

O'Donnell remembers running into Manzi at some point and discussing the whole situation.

"Cat said, 'Did you tell Brennan to get me to drive that horse?' And I said, 'Yeah,'" said O'Donnell. "[Cat] said, [Brennan] came in the locker room and said 'Hey Cat, O'Donnell called me and said get the oldest guy in here to

drive that horse. That's you."

For any that didn't know Brennan, at 6'3" he was a mountain of a man, which came in very handy the night of The Trot, because it took both he and his groom, Eric Marecki,

to walk the horse back to the paddock. Since Sugar Trader had once reared in the paddock and hit Brennan in the head and knocked him out, they weren't taking any chances.

Hall of Famer Linda Toscano also had a horse story about Brennan.

"When [Brennan] first came down from Saratoga, he didn't know me and I didn't know John and bottom line, he was looking for cheap horses and he claimed my horse [Tramp]," said Toscano. "Now, nobody would have claimed my horse because everybody knew he was my pet. It was fine. I understood the business, but I used to say to him all the time, 'You claimed my only horse, I can't even believe you did that.'"

"So, years later I've got a guy who was looking to claim horses and I'm at The Meadowlands at this point and John's got a decent stable at The Meadowlands and every day this guy would call me and say, 'Can we claim this horse or that horse?' And I'd say, 'No, I'm not claiming from Noel Daley, or no, I'm not claiming from Jim Campbell.' So, he hits on one and the horse's name was Top Notch Memory and he said, 'How about this?' and I said, 'John Brennan? Yeah, I owe him one.' So, on the night the horse was in to go I walked over to John after the horse hit the racetrack and said, 'I just want to give you a heads up, I'm claiming this horse tonight.' And he

said, 'I can't believe you're taking my horse.' I said, 'I owe you one.' He said, 'Linda, that was 30 years ago.' I said, 'There's no statute of limitations on murdering and claiming horses.' He told everyone that story."

Driver George Brennan was lucky enough to be friends with Brennan, Carmine and Vinnie.

"At Ray Schnittker's wedding, John Brennan, myself and Mike Kimelman sang Calendar Girl," said George. "John wanted to sing it and he asked Mike and me and we said we'll sing it with you. We were terrible but we made people laugh."

George's life-long friendship with the Fuscos started when they were teenagers in 1981, competing in a North American junior driving tournament.

"Carmine would never get mad," said George. "If people were arguing around him, he was always the equalizer. He was going to make everything better. I never saw him lose his cool. And Vinnie couldn't do enough for you. If you came off the track and you needed a tire changed or you needed a new bike, Vinnie was always there. You couldn't outwork those two guys."

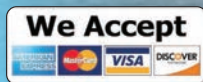

"My biggest moment this year was winning the Vinnie Fusco Memorial at Freehold. And they don't take pictures, but I went around and I did a lap and I stopped in the winner's circle. I made the sign of the cross, pounded my heart, gave them a kiss. I loved them both so much, those guys. I miss them so much."

Trainer Chubby Stallworth remembers Vinnie having a favorite saying around the barn from a movie called "Life" with Eddie Murphy and Martin Lawrence.

"The old saying was Can't Get Right," said Stallworth. "If you knew the movie, you'd understand what it meant. He'd say 'Chubby, he Can't Get Right' and I'd laugh. And [Vinnie] made up wristbands and we were all walking around with wristbands saying Can't Get Right on it."

Jim Morrill Jr. had a, you-had-to-see-it-to-believe-it moment driving against Carmine at Yonkers back in the day.

"Going to the three-eighths, I start to come on the outside and I'm lefthanded," said Morrill. "So, I reach over to snap the disk a little bit and yanked Carmine's whip out of his hand."

"And now we're coming around the third turn and I'm trying to keep up second over and I've got no go and Carmine's on the inside. And now when we straighten up down the backside, he's in front of me and he goes, 'Hey, you don't need your whip, give me yours.' And I took my whip and I threw it like a dart and he reached right up and snagged it out of the air. You couldn't throw it again in a million years and have someone catch it like that."

The final words of this column belong to the families – John Brennan's nephew Michael and Carmine and Vinnie's sisters Adrian and Toni and nephew Ryan.

A year ago, the press hounded these two families and would not allow them to grieve in private. What was worse, perhaps, is that John, Carmine and Vinnie were treated simply as statistics.

On nightly news broadcasts, John was referred to as the first coronavirus death in New Jersey and rarely, if ever, by name, while Carmine had the same dubious distinction in Pennsylvania.

"That's all they became, is this virus," said Adrian, who stopped watching network TV for two months. "I just couldn't watch the news anymore."

"My uncle wasn't a number, he was a person who died from the coronavirus," said Michael. "He really looked out for the horsemen and besides the horsemen, he was such a good family man. He was a gentle giant."

There were also stories about John being at a Fusco family dinner and about Fusco family members visiting from another country.

"John Brennan was not at our family dinner and no relatives were visiting from Italy," said Toni.

Some horsemen have said they know they got the virus from John, which is impossible to prove since other people in the race office and paddock were sick before and at the same time as John, so there's no way to determine who spread what to whom, especially if you add in asymptomatic people, and John wasn't even at the track when some of these alleged virus-spreading incidents took place.

One thing that is undeniable is the loss for both families.

"We miss their presence and their voices but now we do stuff in their honor," said Ryan.

Many in the family have donated convalescent plasma and they are taking part in a study by the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, looking into why the virus hit their family so hard.

"We don't want to see anyone else's family have to go through this," said Ryan.

In addition to Carmine and Vinnie, the Fuscus also lost their eldest sister Rita, mom Grace and Aunt Maria to the virus.

"Eight of us went in and only three came out," said Toni. "There's a hole in our heart that will never mend."

These were three kind-hearted men who each had a great sense of humor and would do anything for anyone. They wouldn't think twice about buying a meal for someone in need or giving a set of winter warm-ups to someone who didn't have any.

"[John] used to say, 'Did you ever try to eat money?' said Michael. 'It doesn't taste good. You can't take it with you. I want to see you enjoy it.'"

The Fuscus are a close-knit Italian family who, prior to COVID-19, enjoyed weekly Sunday night dinners whenever possible. Carmine and Vinnie were two of 11 siblings in this multi-generational harness family that included 26 nieces and nephews.

In the early '80s, when their father was injured in a spill at Freehold and hurt his shoulder, Carmine, as the oldest son, dropped out of high school to take over the family business to put food on the table until his dad recovered. Carmine would work with the horses by day and attend night school to get his diploma on time.

The brothers were known as hard workers but they also appreciated kicking back and having fun, which included wanting a Fudgie the Whale cake for their birthdays. And even though he was living in Pennsylvania, Carmine and his wife Christie always remained close to his family.

Vinnie's wife Michele and children Aidan and Makena were his world and every year on Valentine's Day, he would give his daughter a stuffed teddy bear.

John had three sisters and a brother, three nephews and a

niece, two great nieces and a great nephew, all of which he adored.

Anyone who spent any time around John on race nights would see him FaceTiming with his great nieces and nephew, especially Michael's daughter Madison, who is now 4.

"He FaceTimed with her the day he died," said Michael. "She was in the tub and he was saying, 'How you doing Maddie girl?'"

The John Brennan Trotting series starts at Yonkers Raceway on March 31 with a final on April 21.

John's family will have a funeral mass/memorial on Saturday, June 26, at 11 a.m. at St. Francis de Sales Church in John's hometown of Rockaway Beach, NY with a luncheon to follow at The Bungalow Bar.

In order for the mass and luncheon to run as smoothly as possible, and to give John the proper send off, the family requests that if you plan to attend the mass and/or luncheon, that you contact John's nephew, Michael, at 917-731-6931.

The Fuscus are also considering a memorial, perhaps this summer, but currently have no specific date in mind.

Scott Robinson sentenced to 18 months in federal prison, must forfeit more than \$3.8 million

Robinson is the first to be sentenced of the 27 people indicted a year ago for their alleged involvement in a horse doping scheme.

Bill Finley first reported in *Thoroughbred Daily News* on Tuesday (March 9) ([full story here](#)) that Scott Robinson has been handed an 18-month sentence in a federal prison that included three additional years of supervised release and a forfeiture of more than \$3.8 million.

Robinson, a drug manufacturer and distributor, pled guilty to one count of drug adulteration and misbranding. The maximum sentence for that offense is five years. The money that he must pay to the government represents the value of the drugs he sold illegally.

Tuesday's decision by Judge J. Paul Oetken in U.S. District Court in Lower Manhattan, came exactly one year to the day after 27 people were indicted by federal authorities in an alleged horse doping scheme that involved people from both the standardbred and thoroughbred communities. Robinson is the first to be sentenced.

"I want to apologize to the horse racing industry," Robinson said when given a chance to address the court via Skype. "Horse racing is the only thing in my life that I have ever truly loved. From the first time I went to the racetrack, I fell in deep love with horse racing and this negative attention is not what I am about, and I sincerely apologize for that. For the last 15 years plus, I have promoted horse racing and tried to increase its popularity. I take full responsibility for the actions I have taken."

The attorney representing the government argued for a harsh sentence.

"Unfortunately, his conduct up to this point illustrates that he is not contrite or remorseful and that he viewed his conduct as, really, no big deal and believed that no consequences would follow," said Sarah Mortazavi. "We ask the court to send a different message, both to Mr. Robinson and members of the community, that this type of conduct can lead to ill effects, that this type of conduct will not be tolerated and that it is taken seriously by the government and the court."

Oetken said he took into consideration the fact that Robinson had no prior record and the many letters he received in support of the defendant, but in the end concluded that a prison sentence was warranted.

"The criminal conduct here was serious, the defendant engaged in a scheme to market and sell misbranded and adulterated drugs across the country, including performance-enhancing drugs to racehorse trainers and others," Oetken said.

Natalie Voss reported in *The Paulick Report* ([full story here](#)) that although Robinson had no criminal history, prosecutors did note that he was court martialed in 1998 and dishonorably discharged from the Navy after he admitted to reselling anabolic steroids to other enlisted members of the Navy.

Voss further reported that Robinson, together with pharmacist Scott Mangini, was accused of operating consumer-facing websites such as HorsePreRace, peddling products which purported to be blood builders and pain blockers which were allegedly untestable, as well as discounted versions of prescription drugs despite not being an FDA-approved manufacturer. Robinson is neither a veterinarian nor a pharmacist.

A pre-sentencing report filed by federal prosecutors ahead of Oetken's ruling revealed even more disturbing details about the conditions in which those products were made. A state pharmacy board inspection report dated February 2016 which was published by the Paulick Report had picked up on unsanitary conditions at co-conspirator Scott Mangini's facility in Florida: the Florida Department of Health Records noted that there was no working sink in the pharmacy for hand washing, and employees were instead using a ten-gallon bucket. The department noted so much dust on the counters where prescriptions were made that an investigator was able to trace letters in the dirt with an alcohol swab – a particular problem since some products were injectables.

When federal agents executed search warrants in September, 2019 on premises used by Robinson, prosecutors say he became incensed and "attempted to extort the federal agents involved in the seizure by threatening to release a letter to certain members of the racehorse industry informing them of the existence and scope of the FBI's investigation if the FBI did not immediately return his electronic devices the same day they were seized. After being informed his threat was itself a crime, Robinson retracted his threat hours later."

Robinson is required to surrender himself to authorities on Sept. 7, 2021.

The undersigned are encouraging the standardbred industry to negotiate with the thoroughbred industry about how to best structure the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act to be inclusive of harness racing's unique needs.

We (the undersigned) support the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) recently passed by Congress and signed into law by President Trump.

We know that there are details about funding and other matters that will have to be worked out in good faith between regulators and members of the horse racing community. And we know that the new law is not perfect. But we believe that the new law is a legitimate and important step in the right direction toward universal medication rules for our sport, increased enforcement of drug rules to make the sport more honest and a greater public acceptance of horse racing as a safe, humane sport.

We believe that representatives of the standardbred industry should work with those who support the new law, and who will be enforcing it, to help establish the rules and policies that will likely govern our sport for years to come.

USTA confirms its opposition to HISA

We (the United States Trotting Association) oppose the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) of 2020 (HISA), which Senator Mitch McConnell (R-KY) acting on behalf of the topmost sliver of the thoroughbred elite inserted into the middle of the 5,500-page, last-minute omnibus funding measure that passed at the end of the last Congress and was signed into law on December 27, 2020. In doing this, McConnell broke his own promise, given to Senator Toomey and others, to allow a roll call vote on the measure. This was a fixed race, hardly an auspicious start for an "Integrity" Act.

HISA is unconstitutional. This is what happens when a special interest succeeds in ramming through a bill surreptitiously, with no debate or amendment process. However, HISA also promises severe economic damage to our entire industry, so when Jeff Gural proposed a round table to

study possible amendments to HISA and to define its funding, the USTA put constitutional concerns to one side and joined in, hoping to find out whether harness racing could be adequately protected. As Gural wrote, "the federal legislation needs to be modified for it to work for standardbreds."

The USTA did not come to the round table empty-handed. We have the draft, ready to introduce in Congress, of a federal statute that would not be unconstitutional. It is founded on veterinary science, provides for scientifically correct use of therapeutic medication in standardbreds, and ensures fair representation of the standardbred breed. Importantly, the USTA bill would cost racing participants many millions of dollars per year less to operate, because it uses existing state regulatory resources instead of reinventing the wheel at the federal level. The USTA's bill is presently under consideration by the round table.

Vague HISA language about the "unique characteristics" of each breed is just as much a requirement for regulators as "thou shalt not steal" is a requirement for bank robbers. What would actually work is requiring a separate set of medication regulations for each breed, which the USTA draft includes and HISA does not. Instead, HISA bans Lasix then spells out an obstacle course for the use of Lasix that cannot possibly be navigated. Any suggested change to the standardbred medication rules under HISA would continue to be attacked by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC), a thoroughbred organization of which John Campbell is a director. For years, RMTC has stridently and unfailingly opposed every one of the USTA's science-based medication recommendations to the state commissions, even when RMTC lacked any scientific basis for doing so.

The USTA differs from every other round table member in that we represent the interest of all participants in harness racing. The HISA proponents at the round table represent themselves individually. Even the Hambletonian Society is merely a record-keeping organization whose pronouncements only represent the personal views of its 17 individual directors, two of whom are major thoroughbred owners and officials. The USTA is therefore duty bound to fight to protect our sport from crippling expenses and regulations, and if the round table proves to be nothing more than another invitation to surrender, we shall continue the fight.

HISA's supporters should work with the USTA to establish rules and policies that will protect and nurture the harness racing sport for years to come.

After Alesha Binkley's first win, there was only one choice: "I have to keep doing this."

Alesha Binkley's first standardbred win produced a picture-perfect ending courtesy of a perfectly named pacer and a nearly-flawless performance.

There was a one in three chance the aspiring driver would win her first ever race at Washington Court House Fair in Ohio on July 21, 2018. So, it wasn't exactly a surprise when the Illinois native and Astarisontheway made a trip to the winner's circle after a neck score as the 2-5 choice, stopping

the clock in 2:05.

Perhaps the only mild eye-opener was the professional manner in which Binkley accomplished the feat with the daughter of Dongetinmyway, a horse she had co-owned with Trent Stohler and Benjamin Graber.

For a rookie, she looked every bit a veteran in the milestone race, an Ohio Ladies Pacing Series dash.

"As soon as we won, I thought to myself, 'I have to keep doing this! I loved it. During the race, since there were only three of us, it was almost like you were training. There was one horse in front of me, and the other one was in back of me. I was just sitting in the two-hole and I had such an adrenaline rush the whole time. My heart was racing."

The name of the horse isn't lost on Binkley.

"It's kind of awesome that I won my first race with that horse. I was kind of hoping it was a sign."

As it turns out, it was.

Binkley, who grew up in the southeastern part of Illinois, was groomed for horse racing success.

She relocated from Kentucky to Indiana, looking for employment at Hoosier Park Racetrack when she was 19, eventually landing a job with Judi Lunsford, before working for Stohler.

Alesha Binkley has been hooked on harness racing since her very first win.

The 26-year-old is grateful to have learned from some of the sport's most successful horsepeople.

"I'm very fortunate to have worked for a lot of amazing people. Everyone I've worked for has taught me so much."

These days, Binkley, who won 10 of 20 races in her rookie 2018 driving season, is as busy as she's ever been.

Not that it's a bad thing.

"Being busy, it keeps me out of trouble," she said with a laugh. "I'm busy with racing – I have two horses I train for owners from Illinois, I groom two horses for Ron Burke, I jog some of his horses, and I take care of one horse for Virgil Morgan Jr. – and I'm busy being a mom [to soon-to-be five-year-old daughter, Maevyn]. I'm kind of everywhere."

One place she currently is not is in the race bike. But that will change soon enough for the talented multi-sport athlete who played on high school and travel teams for softball, volleyball and basketball.

A winner of eight of 38 races in 2019, Binkley had her most recent driving start on November 27 of last year, a third at The Meadows with Burke trainee Delcrest Holiday.

Highlights in the sulky include a victory in the \$12,000 Western Final of the C.K.G. Billings Amateur Trot at The

Meadows in August 2019, and a Great Lakes Amateur Drivers Association Series score with Hititoutofthepark at Delaware last September.

No need to ask the woman known as “The Hoosier Hotshot” if she’s looking forward to sitting in the driver’s seat again.

“I’ll start driving again at Miami Valley when they have the amateur races again. I’ll drive some of those races. I was watching some replays the other day and I thought, ‘Man, I really want to drive.’ The weather hasn’t been great, which really doesn’t motivate you that much, but it’s been much nicer the last little while. That makes you want to get out there. I can’t wait to start driving. My heart races every time – when I’m behind the gate, training, watching replays of my races – and it’s a feeling I’ve never had before. I love it.”

For all of the successes, Binkley has also had to contend with certain challenges along the way.

The toughest hurdle, more so early on in her driving career, was dealing with her most vocal critic.

“When I would have a bad drive, I would always take it home with me. I would be so upset if I messed up, or if the horse didn’t race to expectations. One day it finally clicked... I have to stop being so hard on myself. I realize it happens, it’s horse racing, and you have to let it go and move on to the next one. I’m so hard on myself, so it takes some time to be able to wrap your head around that.

“With training, my horses are inconsistent these days. The bad weather we’ve had certainly plays a big part in that. You never know if the horses will be good or bad each week. When you do something one week and it’s a totally different result next week, it can drive you crazy. That’s my biggest problem. It can be tough when you do what you think is right

for the horse, preparation-wise, and it doesn’t pan out as planned. I guess it’s just dealing with the ups and downs of training horses.”

Fortunately for Binkley, she is able to put all in perspective, both in the barn and at home, courtesy of her biggest supporter.

And yes, horses play a major role in their mother-daughter relationship.

“Maevyn, she’s probably my best little friend. She loves to be at the barn, so she’ll come with me all the time. Most days I’m here all day, and whenever asks if we’re ready to go home, and I tell her there’s still more work to be done, she loves it. She has her pony, “Sunshine,” and she’ll ride her all day long.”

The horse times don’t end there.

“She loves to play horses too. We go to the barn and then we go home and she has all the Breyer horses. So that’s what we play. She also likes to dress up. Whatever we do, we have a lot of fun.”

Fun is a word Binkley often uses to describe her horse racing life. She’s hoping to experience more of that feeling in 2021.

“I have goals, but they change all the time because I want to keep pushing myself. I would like to have my own stable by the end of the year. The best horse I’ve owned so far is Queen Ann M. I claimed her for \$5,000 and she made almost \$50,000 in 2019. I’d like to have some more horses like her. So, that would be my goal this year, to work for myself and do my own thing.”

It’s just what any star is on the way type would want.

Chatting with Walter "Butch" Paisley

Walter Paisley turned 80 on Wednesday (March 10).

Born In Berwyn, IL, but now a 22-year resident of Stockton, IL, "Three hours from Balmoral," Butch is now 80.

The Illinois Hall Of Famer with over 5,700 wins and \$35 million lifetime was one of the sport's greatest drivers, reigning supreme from the mid-1960s for a 25-year span, mostly in the Chicago area. Now retired but with a "couple stalls, one broodmare, a barn but no horses," Paisley recently remembered some of the greats of the past and the best moments of his career.

His first win came in 1958 when Paisley was 17: "I didn't make any money until I was 27-28 years old. It took a long time. I was 16-17 and hanging around the fairs – I had a horse and a sulky – and I would think nothing of walking to the next fair when one ended. One time it was 12 miles or so and I was hitchhiking with my bike and horse and I got a ride, but most of the time people were all full up."

Wait, you were hitchhiking with your bike and horse?

"Yes. I didn't even give it a thought. I was where I wanted to be – around the fairs, the stalls, you name it."

In 1959 you were just 18 and racing in the Hambletonian with a 99-1 or longer shot named Algiers Eblis. You are still the youngest ever Hambletonian driver. How did this happen?

"My father. He had a dream to be in it and Harry Burright was set down and he wanted me to drive. I just wanted to stay out of everybody's way. He was more than a 99-1 shot. (finished 12-15-14 in summary). Remember, there was a \$2,000 entrance fee. But nothing was going to stop my dad from putting him in there. Oh, one more thing. That was the first time I ever wore a helmet. Not even once before."

NOTE: From 1958-1965 Paisley only banked \$24,000 or so, combined.

What was the catalyst that got your career going in the mid-1960s?

"I was hanging around the Farrington barn a lot. I was fascinated by the conversation. I wanted to be around the barns that were winning. It paid off. One time Bob Farrington and Lloyd Arnold were going to Australia for a month and I wound up driving one of their horses. I won. Bob called to see how the horse did. He was told it won and he told his second trainer to put me down on all of them. I must have won 20-25 races in a short period of time for him and I was on my way."

You were instrumental in drivers getting a flat fee back then too.

"Yes. There were drivers who were driving a few longshots here and there and weren't getting any money. We thought that there should be a \$25 surcharge for each drive. The owners didn't seem to mind. It really was a good idea. You can turn off a potential talent by not paying them something."

What about Herve Filion?

"I knew him well. One time, I was driving Armbrro Nesbit – in the American-National, I think. First time. Joe O'Brien told me, 'Either sit last or go to the top. And he does not like

getting hit.' So I had him on the lead and Herve and Otaro Hanover pass me at the 7/8ths and I'm thinking, 'Oh my God. I just got this horse beat.' I reached up and decided to hit him once and he fought back and won. Herve past the wire told me he thought he had me."

Billy Haughton?

"One time Billy left a horse with me. Some problem came up and I called him. He told me that I didn't have to call him, just do what I thought best. That kind of confidence from a guy like Billy goes a long way."

Stanley Dancer?

"Quiet. In 1972, I remember being in the drivers room just watching Albatross at Sportsman's Park the night he set the world record of 1:54.3. Wow! I couldn't believe how great this horse was. Back then, the very best horses at the track would go in 1:56-1:57. Braidwood, one of the best horses I ever drove at the time, took a record of 1:57.2 and made a lot of money."

Bob Farrington?

"Like I said, he gave me a big boost. I raced Braidwood against him when he was 4. Braidwood was a one-dimensional type horse who couldn't leave-but you couldn't stop him once he got going."

What about that 1975 season when you and Daryl Busse were battling it out nationally for the dash title.

"I remember it well. I wound up going to Monticello and a couple other tracks to get as many drives in December. Some trainers actually offered to take Busse OFF their horses to give me a chance and I told them absolutely not. It wasn't that important." (Busse wound up winning it by two)

Sanders Russell?

"I remember going to Georgia to see him and his operation. Everything stopped at 10 in the morning for biscuits and gravy."

Glen Garnsey?

"He helped me. I drove Balanced Image and won the American-National for him."

In 1980, you were chosen as the World Driving Championship representative.

"Yes, quite an honor. And the next year I tried it for a couple of months at the Meadowlands. They do things quite different there. I remember a couple times winning and getting taken off that horse the next start. Overall, New Jersey just wasn't for me. I couldn't see living there full-time."

Hollywood Park?

"Oh, great memories. The track was like cotton balls.

Beautiful. Loved it there. Clean."

What about today?

"I don't follow it as much. But I get a chance to talk to the guys here and there. I talked to Dave Magee a few weeks back. I have no complaints. I did what I wanted to do and loved it."

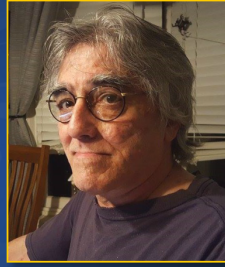

Force pacing and trotting into futurity, Part 3

In the 1960s, James Cagney, famous actor who also owned, trained and drove trotters, said the beauty of harness racing made him cry. Fans and industry participants like Cagney are rare anymore. Most of them have passed on from the “glory days” of harness racing. In the new millennium, the sport has lost many such lovers but the game of pari-mutuel racing is surviving, if not thriving.

In this closing part of the three-part series, we pursue what the pari-mutuel business needs now — visionaries that can devise ideas and plans from a mental effort that attracts bettors, old and new. A visionary sees through things; those things being obstacles — real or unreal — that he or she refuses to believe are invulnerable.

One single visionary can change the course of any environment or walk of life. When he or she appears, no one sees them coming because the cultural and commercial atmosphere is as now exists in pari-mutuel horse racing. They should be easy to spot if we keep our ears open to what may now seem like outrageous ideas, because today's outrageous is tomorrow's normal.

Consider this guy:

Howard Hughes was a visionary of aviation. When the fledgling commercial airplane industry accepted a fixed altitude for modern aircraft flight, aviators across the board agreed that was as high as there was to fly. Hughes disagreed, insisting a much higher altitude was acceptable and safer, which was the key to attracting more commercial-airline passengers.

In the early 1940s, Hughes correctly established that only one percent of the American population had ever set foot on a commercial airliner, mostly because people were scared to death of flying. It was the rocky, rumbling turbulence of

commercial airplanes that scared them the most. “If we build a plane that can fly above the weather,” Hughes said, “we can get every man, woman and child in [America] to feel safe up there.” From that theory, he went on to predict, “An airplane with the ability to fly in the sub-stratosphere across the world is the future.”

Consider this guy:

Hughes' vision — albeit from a man with the kind of money and power needed to change an entire industry — was instituted from the ground up, so to speak, and air travel became the prevalent and fashionable way to travel.

In the 1960s, a visionary in the world of sports may have eclipsed Hughes' influence in his business when standing defiant against a homegrown American institution — baseball.

When American businessman Charles O. Finley purchased the ragged Kansas City Athletics, every team owner in baseball scoffed at his involvement, and as Finley developed unprecedented gimmicks to strengthen the team with fresh talent he worked equally as hard to create new fans to the deteriorating sport.

In the decade when pop culture was exploding, baseball games were being considered sluggish and boring. “Charlie O,” as he became known, knew that baseball was show business — a show and a business — and if he could rock the boat of baseball tradition — bring the sport into the future — it would mean survival and it would thrive to the beat of a growing dollar's worth.

Charlie O broke down traditional aspects of Abner Doubleday's sport in such ways that renewed baseball's core audience and markedly expanded the fan base. Charlie O's influence was most apparent when he moved the Royals from Missouri to California, where he started from scratch with the Oakland Athletics.

In his former business, one of Charlie O's friends said there was something “genie-like” about him. “I always felt like I was in the presence of P.T. Barnum,” his friend said. “He was an awe-inspiring figure, like a magician or the master of ceremonies of a three-ring circus. You always expected him to produce something you'd never seen before.”

As opposed to offering millions of dollars to buy established stars, Charlie O sent scouts across the USA to find complete unknowns with the potential to turn into established stars. The process would eventually bring to baseball Reggie Jackson, Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue, Rickey Henderson and Dennis Eckersley, Mark McGwire and Jose Canseco. Charlie O scrapped the 60-year-old standard baggy

uniforms, replacing them with tight brightly colored ones. The baseball establishment disapproved but popular opinion did not. ESPN's Paul Lukas wrote Charlie O was "dragging baseball into the modern age."

The public embraced his ideas and Charlie O gimmicks always got press. He made the team mascot a picture of an elephant in an Athletics uniform and named it Harry Elephante [sic]. The Oakland stadium was refurbished in favor of the live spectators. Once the A's won their first of three-consecutive World Series, the newborn stars became an abrasive bunch off the field and Charlie O encouraged the press to cover the brawls, since on the field they played perfectly.

Before their reign ended, closure that would spawn the "Moneyball" theory, Charlie O ruptured the baseball establishment as his ideas became trends throughout the leagues and fundamental changes ensued from the rules to the business of baseball.

Harness racing needs some people like Charlie O to upset the establishment and take great chances with every aspect of the sport from the silks to the sulkies to the rules and the greater desires of the bettors. A man or woman visionary, someone who, like Charlie O, as team manager Dick Williams said, is someone who the farther you go away from, the more you realize it.

Scarborough Downs forever

Off-Track wagering rolls on at The Downs Club.

Last November, the Maine State Harness Racing Commission approved the 2021 off-track wagering facility license for Scarborough Downs. After 70 years of operation as a racetrack, the venue would not be reopening to play host to another season of live harness racing. Instead, Crossroads Holdings was transforming the grounds into “The Downs,” a residential development complete with businesses, green space, and on-site recreation. The website for The Downs describes the “live-work-play” vision for the former track, “bringing newfound vitality and life to a well-loved landmark” to “help define the next chapter in Scarborough’s bright future, making this our own community trifecta.” An artist’s depiction of what the transformed property will look like shows Scarborough Downs’ grandstand, clearly positioned as part of the new landscape.

Denise Terry is president of Scarborough Downs. She runs The Downs Club OTB, working seven days a week at the venue that remains a family business.

“I always would call myself ‘vice-president,’ because I always think of my mom as the president,” she said, reflecting on the track’s past, but also confirming the permanent continuation of its OTB.

“It is bittersweet for me. I’ve worked here for 34 years. To see it kind of go, on the last day of racing, I never wanted to see that happen. For personal, private reasons within my family, that’s something we had to do, but to be able to stay here and be the OTB and continue is nice, and to see what they’re doing to the property is rewarding as well. They’ve done some nice things here. The roads coming in, they’ve made them beautiful with nice lights and beautiful greenery and plants. The development with the condos and the apartments is going really well. So it’s developing all around, which would be nice for the OTB, because it’s bringing in people who potentially will be customers.”

The grandstand, beside the clubhouse, has been renovated and repurposed by Maine Health as a COVID-19 vaccination site. Terry said it was expected to remain open for at least six months, possibly longer.

“What they have just recently done is they put a million dollars into the grandstand. They’re getting toward the number of 1,500 people a day through the grandstand, getting their vaccines. It’s kind of exciting, because the grandstand got a little facelift. She got some new heat and some new floors, and they did a nice job inside of it.”



The Downs has not yet indicated a specific future function for the grandstand. “I’m going to keep my fingers crossed that they find some purpose and a use for it,” Terry told HRU. “I would hate to see it taken down. I think they also recognize that it was built back in the day, and the structure is a sound structure. It needed a little bit of a facelift. I know it got a new roof when Maine Health came in, and they worked on some of the windows in the front, the ceilings and such. So I’m keeping my fingers crossed that they don’t tear it down. It would be a shame to see it go. But I don’t know exactly what they have in mind for it, either.”

Scarborough Downs’ president explained that there was never any doubt that the simulcast lounge would remain in business after the final season of pari-mutuel racing. “I plan on being here this year of course for the OTB. I work well with Crossroads Holdings, and they would like to see me stay here. If something were to come up, because things are ever-changing with their project here, and this building that I’m in isn’t available, there would be another place somewhere on this property that I could have an OTB.”

The Downs Club simulcasting is situated inside the clubhouse, which Terry has equipped with extra TV monitors moved from the grandstand. “There’s plenty of seating, and there’s a bar and a concessions stand,” she said, adding that the indoor smoking area was removed to allow for safe physical distancing between OTB tables. “We have some customers who like to come out and place their wagers, but the whole Covid thing is a very scary thing. Some of our customers are older, and they see that we take it seriously, so I think that it makes them a little more comfortable when they come out.” Masks are required for all patrons, and a dedicated cleaner keeps everything sanitized.

She expressed hope that a bill to legalize sports betting would soon be passed in Maine, so that her OTB could include a sportsbook. To explore what that might look like, Terry said she visited The Brook, a Draft Kings sportsbook that opened last August in New Hampshire. Located at the former Seabrook Greyhound Park, which closed when the state eliminated dog racing in 2010, the sportsbook made a positive impression on the racetrack executive, who wanted to ensure that horses stayed front and center.

“When I went in there, I definitely could see the harness

racing and the thoroughbred racing. It was present. It wasn't just over in a corner somewhere," she told HRU. "Sometimes when you're looking at a sport like football, they're betting, but the game's not for three hours or something. There's always a track that's going off, within a couple of minutes. So I think the two go nicely together."

Last year, it was a struggle to handle Scarborough Downs' final season of racing during Maine's first wave of COVID. The OTB could only open on the track's dark days, to keep attendance within mandated limits. "So we raced, and even though we weren't open, we held racing for [horsepeople] to have the opportunity to make money for them to take care of their horses," said Terry. "I would go down and I'd stand at the checkpoint, and check in and try to limit numbers into the paddock, take temperatures, and make sure that everybody was safe."

"The last day of live racing, that was a tough one, because we could only have so many people here," she remembered. "We really didn't advertise. We didn't want to advertise too heavily, because you didn't want too many people, because it was right when the virus was ramping up and there were a lot of cases. So we had lines out the doors, because we were trying to stick with our number, so once someone left, we let somebody come in. But it was crazy. It was a crazy busy day, a sad day, but it went off."

Customers in southern Maine can still depend on Scarborough Downs OTB when it comes to watching and wagering on racing throughout the state (and beyond), although Scarborough itself is no longer a commercial racetrack. "The tax on an OTB is a lot more expensive than when we simulcast as a commercial track," said Terry. She added that the statewide unavailability of Churchill Downs-affiliated simulcast signals was a matter that she hoped to see resolved in the near future. "That's been kind of challenging, because our customers don't understand. The [Kentucky] Derby just draws a whole different crowd. People who never go out to the races will go out on Derby day, so we had them showing up here," but unable to watch the race at simulcast venues anywhere in Maine.

Some Scarborough Downs employees have continued to work at the OTB.

"I have great staff that have supported me and have been here with me for a long time and will do anything to help. I don't have a lot of staff now," said Terry. "When we closed, that was one of the harder things to do. I didn't have jobs for the racing department and saying goodbye to those people, it was not easy. I think that some of them have been hired over at Cumberland [Fairgrounds], which makes me happy

that they were given the opportunity to continue. A lot of the people in this industry love what they do."

The racetrack executive said she tries to employ as many of her tellers as possible in the OTB, with two of them selling tickets alongside the self-serve machines. "We're fortunate. Our tellers, they stayed with us, they're dedicated, and they're knowledgeable when they punch their tickets. [...] When we were live racing, I was able to have the shifts available, so now we're trying to rotate the shifts to get the shifts to the people who still want some hours, but with a limited schedule." Terry has special praise for veteran teller Martina Mitchell: "She's been here probably longer than me. She can bang out tickets like there's no tomorrow. She's fantastic."

First Tracks LLC will be racing at Cumberland Fairgrounds this year and next, as the new commercial racetrack operator prepares to acquire land and build a state of the art harness racing complex in southern Maine. Terry said that she wished them the best of luck, but cautioned that the economics of live racing had ultimately proved overwhelming at Scarborough Downs. "You can cut and you can look at every cost, and it's just the decline in harness racing itself," she explained. Her mother, Sharon Terry, had once been able to turn the track's finances around and see a profit. But over time, competition for gambling dollars was hurting the bottom line, while the cost of hosting races was only escalating: "There's so much that goes into doing a live sport like that, between racing officials and ambulances and tote systems... It's just expensive."

Denise credited her mother with strategic cost-cutting in the best interests of the track. "She would look at ways to make it so it was viable, and at the same time, we had the perfect time when it was doing okay. Penn National had Bangor and Oxford was not yet online for the casino. Once that happened, that pretty much cut into our business here, because even though they're not racing [at Oxford Casino], it's another form of gaming and we couldn't compete with slots. We're running the part of the gaming industry that's just harness racing and horses. Customers will come here, but you know, if you give them other opportunities, they're going to go there as well, splitting up their dollars."

Today, Sharon Terry is living with Alzheimer's disease. "She doesn't like being away from her surroundings, so she has her good days and her bad days," said Denise. "It's a really tough, tough disease. It's not something I would wish on anyone. We needed to take care of her, and that was one of the reasons why we sold [Scarborough Downs] when we sold." In 2019, Denise led a fundraising team called Terry's Trotters in the annual Portland Walk to End Alzheimer's. "My

friend and I—she’s actually the bartender here—we sort of put that together and did that,” she said. “When we were finishing up our walk, people who haven’t seen my mom, that had worked for her for years, or [knew her from] the business here or school were able to see her. It was emotional. It was kind of a cool experience to get her out and be able to be with her like that.” COVID made the 2020 walk into a virtual event, so Terry’s Trotters were sidelined, but don’t count them out for future events: “I think I will do it again, I’m just not sure when,” said Denise.

As rules for businesses continue to shift during the pandemic, Denise anticipates more opportunities for The Downs Club. Restrictions on bar hours and capacity, plus limited travel and tourism, have taken their toll on many independent businesses over the past year, but she has stayed pragmatic and optimistic. “I get a license every year, just as everybody gets the license. It wasn’t a temporary license, and I’ve worked well with the Risbaras,” she noted.

Risbara Brothers are the locally-based general contractors developing The Downs; Crossroads Holdings, which acquired the property for the venture, consists of Rocco Risbara, William Risbara, Marc Risbara, Peter Michaud, and Richard

Michaud. Denise said she appreciated how they are weaving traces of the harness racing backstory into names and other elements at The Downs. “I think they tried, even within their advertising. They want to keep that history kind of alive through their marketing.”

Denise Terry knows the work it takes to keep an OTB going today. “I am very hands-on. I will go and wait on the customers. I will bartend; I’ll work at the concession stand. I’ll do whatever it takes to make [customers] feel comfortable,” she said. “I’m a seven-day-a-week kind of person. Open it in the morning, close it down at night.” Her 13- and 15-year-old kids have been “very understanding” about their mother’s devotion to Scarborough Downs, and the OTB that carries on its legacy. “They grew up here at the track. I had a [baby] carriage in my office when they were born,” she recalled with a smile. “They know this means a lot to me, and for me to be here.”

Yonkers Raceway in the stakes action spotlight

Both the M Life Rewards Gents and Ladies Pacing Series are underway, the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series begins tonight and the former Levy Series (now called the Borgata) starts Monday.

With stalwarts like Kissin In The Sand, Shartin N, and Caviart Ally now retired, the open pacing mares division is search of new faces at the top, and a group of 18 will look to take a step forward tonight (March 12) in the first leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series at Yonkers Raceway. The first Grand Circuit event of 2021, the Blue Chip Matchmaker will start with three \$35,000 splits, slated as races two, three, and five on Friday's 10-race program in Westchester, NY.

New Zealand import My Ruebe Star (Jordan Stratton/Shane Tritton) has won three editions of the local fillies and mares open since coming to the United States, and she has the pole position in tonight's first flight. She will meet up with the likes of fellow Kiwi Bettors Heart (post five, Dexter Dunn/Nifty Norman), who was victorious in an the open that took place at Yonkers on Dec. 10 of last year, and Machnhope (post three, Andrew McCarthy/Noel Daley), a regular at the toplevel at tracks across the Northeast. Machnhope prepped for the Blue Chip Matchmaker with a 1:52 win at the Meadowlands last Friday.

Tonight's opening group also includes Caviart Cherie (post two, Matt Kakaley/Nick Devita), who raced in the Blue Chip Matchmaker in 2019, Dbldelitebrigade N (post four, Jason Bartlett/Tom Fanning), who has picked up checks in her three starts in the Openover the last couple of months, and Alii Nui (post six, Stratton also listed for trainer Erv Miller).

Alexa Skye (post four, Todd McCarthy/Jeff Cullipher), who has a record of 3-2-0 from five starts this year, tops the second section. Alexa Skye scored in the Open at Yonkers on January 14 and has been second in two subsequent tries over the half-mile oval. Seaswift Joy N won three legs and was fifth from post eight in the final in the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series in 2019, and she will take another shot in the event this season, starting from post one for Andrew McCarthy and trainer Tony Alagna. The Stratton/Tritton combo have another entrant in this group with Maczaffair N (post six), and the connections behind Shartin N — owner Rich Poillucci, trainer Jim King Jr., and driver Tim Tetrick — have a new shooter in Keep Rockin A (post three). Keep Rockin A, who will be making her U.S. debut, was Group 1 and Group 2 placed in her native country.

Also competing will be Monica Gallagher (post two, Austin Siegelman/Chris Height), who scored in a non-winners \$20,000 last five race on March 4 at Yonkers, and Parisian



Blue Chip (post five, Daniel Dube), a newcomer from Canada for trainer Peter Tritton. Parisian Blue Chip raced several times in the Preferred at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 2020 and took a mark of 1:50.2.

A trio of mares with multiple wins in the open level at Yonkers during their careers — Snobbytowntown (post two, George Brennan/Ron Burke), Siesta Beach (post three, Matt Kakaley/Nick Devita), and Lady Dela Renta A (post four, Jordan Stratton/Shane Tritton) — meet up with a couple of sharp invaders in Soho Burning Love A (post one, Tim Tetrick/Jim King Jr.) and Blue Ivy (post five, Tyler Buter/Todd Buter) in the final Matchmaker ensemble. The other mare entered in that race, Kaitlyn N (post six, Kakaley also listed for trainer Paul Blumenfeld), has credentials of her own, having won a round of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series in 2019 before coming in sixth from first-up in the final.

The Blue Chip Matchmaker Series has five preliminary rounds, occurring tonight, March 19 and 26, and April 2 and 9. The final will take place on Monday, April 19.

First post for this tonight's program at Yonkers is 7:15 p.m.

Dragon Said & Scootnroll now two-for-two in M Life Rewards Gents Pacing Series

Wednesday night's (March 10) card at Yonkers Raceway featured three \$15,000 divisions of the second round of the M Life Rewards Gents Pacing Series for colts and geldings. **Dragon Said** and **Scootnroll** both repeated their victories from the first leg, while **Diamondbeach** took the night's fastest flight.

Dragon Said (Joe Bongiorno) was the 1-5 favorite in the opening group and didn't disappoint, winning in 1:54.3. Away second from post two, Bongiorno brought Dragon Said to the outside coming off the first turn, and he would go around early pace-setter Cigar Smoking Tony (Jason Bartlett) for the top spot after the :28.1 quarter. Dragon Said continued to show the way to the half in :57.4 and the three-quarters in 1:26.3, but Rolling With Sam (George Brennan) put some first-over pressure on him at that latter marker.

Rolling With Sam stayed game on the rim around the last turn and continued to menace Dragon Said turning for home, but Dragon Said kicked it into another gear in the stretch and went on to win by a length and a half. Rolling With Sam held second, followed by Cigar Smoking Tony.

Trained by Jenn Bongiorno for owner Robert Devine, Dragon Said is a 4-year-old Well Said gelding. This was his sixth career win, and he has now earned \$46,232. Dragon

Said paid \$2.60 to win and headed a \$9.40 exacta and a \$19.40 trifecta.

The outside post was no issue for Diamondbeach (Austin Siegelman) in the second split as he went right down the road to tally in a life's-best clocking of 1:52.3. Siegelman sent Diamondbeach from the seven-hole, and he was able to get in front of Odds On Brexit (Tyler Buter) well before the :28.1 opening quarter. Diamondbeach marched on to the half in 57 seconds and the three-quarters in 1:24.3, then slammed the door with a 28-second final kicker, downing Odds On Brexit by 4 1/4 lengths. Trevor's Ace (Jordan Stratton) collected third.

Ricky Bucci owns and trains Diamondbeach, a 4-year-old gelded son of Somebeachsomewhere. Diamondbeach is now a five-time winner from 18 appearances, and he has banked \$44,116. Diamondbeach, a 3-1 shot, returned \$8.30 to win and topped a \$49.00 exacta and a \$132.00 trifecta.

In the final section, **Sailboat Hanover** (Brennan) and Salt Life (Mark MacDonald) tussled early on, with Sailboat Hanover getting to the front in a 26.4 opening quarter. He was able to back down the pace to 56 seconds at the half, but 4-5 favorite Retour Au Jeu (Stratton) was out and on the move from fourth prior to that marker, giving Got The Mojo (Matt Kakaley) a second-over trip and Scootnroll (Buter) the third-over ride.

Retour Au Jeu, who was a round one winner, forged his way around Sailboat Hanover just after the 1:24.2 three-quarters. Despite losing his cover, Got The Mojo continued on and battled with Retour Au Jeu on the final turn, with Scootnroll going three-wide off the bend. Retour Au Jeu dug in determinedly and managed to hold off Got The Mojo, but he couldn't do the same with Scootnroll, as he powered by late to win by a neck in 1:53.4. Retour Au Jeu had to settle for second, and Got The Mojo ended up third.

A 4-year-old gelding by Roll With Joe, Scootnroll is trained by Todd Buter for owners Rick and Geoff Howles. Scootnroll posted his 12th victory from 22 trips behind the gate, and he has pocketed \$71,764. Scootnroll, sent off at 7-1, paid \$16.40 to win. The exacta returned \$40.00, and the trifecta was good for \$282.50.

The M Life Rewards Gents Pacing Series has one additional preliminary round next Wednesday (March 17), and the final will go on March 24.

Action continues in Yonkers Raceway's M Life Rewards Ladies Pacing Series

Turnthefrownaround improved to two-for-two in this year's M Life Rewards Ladies Pacing Series for fillies and mares at Yonkers Raceway with a 1:56.4 victory in Tuesday night's

(March 9) last of three splits. The other divisional winners were **Paige's Girl** and **Pettycoat Business**.

Driven by George Brennan, Turnthefrownaround worked out a second-over trip behind Break The Deal (Scott Zeron) and was sent three-wide on the last turn. Turnthefrownaround rallied steadily after being fed the clear racetrack, and she would get up in the lane to win by half a length. 27-1 shot Avaya Hanover (Joe Bongiorno) turned a pocket trip from the outside post seven into a runner-up finish, and Pray The Rosary (Jim Marohn Jr.), who led through fractions of :27.3, :57.4, and 1:26.1, wound up third.

The winner is a 4-year-old daughter of Roll With Joe and is trained by Ron Burke for owners Burke Racing Stable LLC., Weaver Brussemi LLC., and Phil Collura. Turnthefrownaround scored her sixth victory in her 31st trip behind the gate, and she has now banked \$137,160. Turnthefrownaround returned \$3.10 to win as the 1-2 favorite and headed an exacta that paid \$108.50, and a trifecta that kicked back \$302.

Brennan also scored with 3-5 choice Pettycoat Business in the second flight. Positioned fourth at the :28.2 opening quarter and the :57.3 half, Brennan sent Pettycoat Business out first-over just beyond the latter marker. She hustled up quickly into second on the outside, but leader Sound Idea (Zeron) proved a stubborn foe, and Pettycoat Business and Sound Idea would duel to the 1:25.4 three-quarters, around the final turn, and into the lane. Pettycoat Business finally got the measure of Sound Idea for good through the drive, and the favorite would score by half a length in 1:54.3. Sound Idea was a game second, and Dragon Roll (Jason Bartlett) took third from the pocket.

A 4-year-old Art Major mare, Pettycoat Business is trained by Scott Di Domenico for co-owner/breeder Michael Robinson and his ownership partners Robert Mondillo, R.B.H. Ventures Inc., and Gilbilly Stable. Pettycoat Business now has a record of 4-5-4 from 18 tries, and she has earned \$138,473. Pettycoat Business, who paid \$3.20 to win, led a \$5.60 exacta and an \$8.70 trifecta.

Paige's Girl, the 5-2 second choice, won Tuesday night's opening section after leading from start to finish. She darted to the point from post four, posted stations of :28.3, :57.4, and 1:25.3, and held sway in a :28.4 final kicker, prevailing by a head in 1:54.2. Rable (Jordan Stratton) rallied three-wide in the lane after sitting third and was second, and Somebeachsomefra (Brennan) checked in third after stalking the winner from the two-hole.

Lance Hudson trains Paige's Girl, a 4-year-old by Captaintreacherous, for owner William Hartt. Paige's Girl is now a seven-time winner from 18 lifetime efforts, and she has pocketed \$56,941. Paige's Girl returned \$7.20 to win and topped a \$14.00 exacta and a \$26.20 trifecta.

The M Life Rewards Ladies Pacing Series has one more preliminary round next Tuesday (March 16) before the final on March 23.

Winning at Big M is ‘really special’ for John Calabrese

When the Meadowlands Racetrack opened on Sept. 1, 1976, a 16-year-old John Calabrese was in attendance. The new facility was less than 10 minutes from his childhood home in North Jersey and gave Calabrese his first-ever look at harness racing.

“It was such a big thing when they built the (football) stadium and the racetrack,” Calabrese said. “There were so many commercials on TV, so much fanfare about it, so we went to the track. It was fabulous. That was it.

“My father and I and my brother used to go there all the time. We’d have dinner, we’d look at each other, and my father would ask if we wanted to go to the races. We’d say, sure.”

Forty-five years later, Calabrese is still going to The Meadowlands. Now, though, he is on the other side of the fence, competing as an amateur driver. He won last week’s GSY Amateur Series event at The Big M with Preppy Art and is the 3-1 morning-line favorite with the same horse in tonight’s (March 12) fifth of six legs in the series.

“To win races there all these years later is incredible,” said Calabrese, who got his first Meadowlands driving victory in 2016 and has totaled 12 of his 76 lifetime triumphs there. “It’s great to win a race anywhere, but The Meadowlands is really special. There is nothing like it.”

Calabrese worked at the racetrack while in college before shifting his attention to the backstretch. What he really wanted to do was work with the horses. So, during the summer between his junior and senior years at Upsala College, he went to the stables and got jobs with several trainers. After graduating, he never considered any other career.

“I never made out a resume, I never looked for a job,” Calabrese said. “I went right back to the barn.”

In the 1990s, Calabrese started his own training stable. He still conditions a handful of horses at his 30-acre farm in central New Jersey.

“I was driving at Freehold when I started out, but I was only driving once a week,” Calabrese said. “I found that driving once a week, I just couldn’t compete with those guys. I still drive some of my young trotters in the beginning until I get them set, but then I turn them over to catch drivers.”

He added, with a laugh, “I stick to the amateurs for myself. I absolutely love driving. It’s an absolute thrill, just that rush

you get when you go behind the gate.”

Calabrese’s biggest thrill so far came in 2016 when he won a GSY Pro-Am race at The Meadowlands. The field included two Hall of Fame drivers, John Campbell and David Miller, as well as Tim Tetrick, who was elected to the Hall of Fame in 2019.

Making the victory even more special was that Hall of Fame trainer Ray Remmen, who won the first race at The Meadowlands in 1976 and captured multiple training titles at the track, presented the trophy in the winner’s circle. Calabrese worked for Ray and his brother Larry after graduating from college and it was the Remmens who got Calabrese started in amateur driving thanks to a trotter named Keenan.

“I owe it all to them,” Calabrese said.

And a trip to a new racetrack, all those decades ago.

Veterinarian Eddy McCarvill dead at 62

Paul Delean, writing for Standardbred Canada ([full story here](#)) reported on Tuesday (March 9) that veterinarian Eddy McCarvill, an important part of numerous harness racing success stories from Quebec over the past 30 years, has died, age 62, after a long battle with stomach cancer.

He'll be missed, not only as a super vet, but as a super guy, a gentleman, a professional. "He was quiet and low-key but always there for us," said Claude Levesque, head of the Quebec Jockey Club, whose board of directors included McCarvill.

A native of the Jonquiere region of Quebec, which used to have to its own track, McCarvill initially wanted to be a racehorse driver and trainer, but at the urging of his father, a racehorse owner, he opted for veterinary studies.

His expertise in lameness and horses' feet made him the go-to vet for many of the top racing stables and trainers from Quebec, including Dustin Jones, Yves Filion and Luc Blais.

When racing ended in Montreal, where he was based, McCarvill made regular trips to Ontario for his clients.

Owner/trainer Guy Corbeil, a close personal friend, recalls McCarvill providing him with training tips as well as veterinary services when he was just starting out in the sport in the mid-1990s.

"He didn't just know horses, he knew racing, so when a trainer would describe something to him, he could figure it out," Corbeil said. "He was also loyal to his clients and they stayed with him."

McCarvill actually went back to school to become a medical doctor but had a change of heart and resumed veterinary work before completing the program.

Corbeil said his friend, who exercised regularly, "looked 10 years younger than he was." But three years ago, he was diagnosed with cancer. It was in remission for a time, but

returned five months ago. "He's a discreet guy. He didn't want to talk about it," Corbeil said.

Eddy McCarvill leaves his wife, Begonia, and son Alex, 12.

Funeral arrangements are still indeterminate.

Big M moving post time to 6:20 p.m. next week

Management at Meadowlands Racing & Entertainment announced Wednesday morning (March 10) that post time will move to 6:20 p.m., effective Friday, March 19.

"This is in response to our fans who want to bet our entire card but appreciate getting home a little bit earlier," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir of the track shifting post time 20 minutes later than what has been the norm since Dec. 26. "We have seen solid wagering on our early races that have been taking place in the before-7 p.m. window. Those races have, in effect, replaced the races in the after-11 p.m. window, where wagering had not been as strong when we had our post time at 7:15 p.m."

Racing will be conducted on the usual Friday and Saturday basis all the way through Hambletonian Day, Saturday, Aug. 7.

Post time for this weekend's races (March 12-13) will be 6 p.m.

Game of Claims Series for trotters at Pocono

The Game Of Claims Series lived on during the Monday afternoon (March 8) card at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono – it just shifted gaits to the trot, where four fields of \$15,000-base-priced horses raced \$15,000 divisions in their first preliminary leg.

While the gait shifted, other recent aspects of the Game Of Claims series remained firmly in place. The Napolitano brothers, Anthony and George Jr., each drove two of the four series winners, and each handled a horse who divided honors for fastest split at 1:55.4. And there were plenty of claims out of the initial trot gathering as well – 15 of the 29 entrants left the Pocono paddock to head back to new barns, including all four winners.

The quickest first prelim winners were the Lucky Chucky gelding **Namje**, who was powerful from a pocket trip, by

George, to win by 5¾ lengths after coming in from Saratoga, and the Explosive Matter gelding Explosive Magic, who made an early pace-controlling move for Anthony en route to a five length decision. The other Game Of Claims winners were **Credit Fraud**, a Jailhouse Jesse mare who grinded to a 1:56.4 victory for Anthony, and the Muscle Mass gelding **Broadway Bruiser**, home in 1:57.4 with George doing the sulky sitting.

For the day, “Anthony Nap” crossed the wire first six times, George four, putting Anthony ahead of his brother 29-26 after ten cards of racing at The Downs in 2021.

The frenzied claiming box activity for the Game Of Claims trotters raised the total of horses haltered during the week to 27, with \$437,500 paid out; for the meet, there have already been 153 claims put through, with \$2,770,875 changing hands. There is likely to be much more claiming activity the next two weeks, especially among the series trotters, as everyone tries to have a sharp horse to enter in the \$30,000 championship on Monday, March 29.

Close finishes in Game of Claims finals Sunday at Pocono

The Bettor’s Delight gelding **Love The Action**, who sat out last week’s Game Of Claims Pacing Series final preliminary for \$10,000-based pacers after posting a second and a first, got into the final as the last of nine qualifying horses, one point ahead of the AE1, and then he made the wait worthwhile by winning the \$20,000 Series Championship in 1:53.4 on Sunday (March 7) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Claimed by trainer Gilbert Garcia-Herrera and owner Gilbert-Garcia Owen from his series triumph, Love The Action was sent off the 6-5 favorite, and driver George Napolitano Jr. was very aggressive with him, hanging Bamski to a :26.4 opening number, then reclaiming command by the :55.4 half. Second choice Sweet Talkin Satin, the only horse at any level of the series to win all three of his prelims, came the rough first-over trip to the 1:24.1 three-quarters and pressured the leader into the stretch.

Love The Action, though, would find his biggest challenge in the lane to his inside in pocketsitter Bamski, driven by George’s brother Anthony – indeed, it looked like Bamski had gotten the slightest of advantages past midstretch. But the gritty winner would not be denied, fighting back to beat his left-hand rival by a neck, with Sweet Talkin Satin hanging on admirably for third.

In the \$15,000 Game Of Claims Championship for \$7,500-tagged horses, driver Marcus Miller “broke up the Napolitanos,” who had won the initial three finals, sending the Art Major gelding **Stick With Cramer** up the Pocono Pike to get a 1:55 triumph. Claimed after the first leg by owner/trainer Shea Lare, the winner now has turned in two wins and a second for his conditioner – whose UTR lifetime is .852, as this is the first horse the 19-year-old has trained and owned.

Miller put Stick With Cramer in perfect pocket position early, as Needless To Say shot to the top and forced foes to either tuck, as did top two choices R Gauwitz Hanover (George Napolitano Jr.) and Don’tcallmefrancis (Anthony Napolitano), or be hung out, as was Onlythetuffsurvive through early fractions of :27.2 and :57.

The two favorites, both double prelim winners, swept around the tiring parked horse down the back, with “Francis” first-over at the 1:26 three-quarters and “R Gauwitz” right behind him. In the stretch, R Gauwitz Hanover tipped right for a path – and Stick With Cramer tipped left, with the latter outpacing the former by a nose, with Dontcallmefrancis very good to hold on for third.

Dismissed at 23-1, Best Derby Native repeats in Meadows Series

She had to overcome 23-1 odds and finesse her way around a breaking horse, but **Best Derby Native** was up to the task, notching her second straight series win – and third consecutive victory overall – in Wednesday’s Donna Dunn Memorial Pace at The Meadows.

Filly Speaks captured the other \$10,000 second-leg split in the event for 3- and 4-year-old filly and mare pacers. The \$15,000-added series final is set for Wednesday, March 17.

Best Derby Native was enjoying a pocket trip behind 3-5 favorite Keep Watching when that one jumped it off near the three-quarters. Aaron Merriman was able to check Best Derby Native, clear the breaker and preserve his rail position. The 4-year-old daughter of Allamerican Native—Best Suntan brushed through the lane and scored in a career-best 1.54.2, a length better than Twin B Chit Chat. Sparklinlikeitis finished third.

Filly Speaks, the 1-5 choice, had far less drama in her division, speeding to the point early and triumphing by 4 lengths in 1:54.4 for Tony Hall, trainer Scott Betts and

owners Tim Betts, Nick Catalano and Keith Pippi. Lady Sophia and Aint Watching completed the ticket.

Hall collected four wins and Dan Rawlings three on the 13-race card.

Mapping out a night of action at The Big M

Why is The Meadowlands the industry's handle leader?

There are many factors that make the mile oval the most prolific in terms of average wagering per card in the game, with large field size and small takeouts on popular bets being the most influential.

But it is not only big bettors that fuel the bustling betting, but small players also have a sizeable say in making the Big M what it is, as they are able to get a lot of action for not a lot of money if they team up with other players to take on the track's most popular puzzles.

Low takeouts are great for the bettor but sometimes overlooked are the Big M's six bets that sport low 10-, 20- and 50-cent minimums. They make wagering on the races a viable entertainment option for new racing fans. The low minimums have made playing the races affordable to those players, and that has helped The Meadowlands average \$3.6 million on Saturday nights during the winter.

For those with a smaller bankroll but want to get in on the action at The Big M and get plenty of chances to make a score, here is one possible roadmap:

Four people who play as a partnership come out to the races or play from home on their favorite ADW platform. The total bankroll is \$100, so all each player has to contribute is \$25. Look at this low-minimum, low-takeout strategy, in which \$100 buys 657 wagers:

RACE 1 – the 20-cent Pick-5: The low minimum means the partnership can play a decent-sized ticket (in this case, \$30) yet still have plenty of money left if they do not hit. If they are sharp enough to cash, they can play the remainder of the card without digging into the original \$100 and keep the leftover money for the next night.

1st ticket: 1,2/1,2/1,2/1,2/1,2,3,4,5 = \$16 (80 combinations)

2nd ticket: 1/1/1,2/1,2/ALL = \$8 (40 combinations)

3rd ticket: 1/1/1,2/1,2,3/1,2,3,4,5 = \$6 (30 combinations)

Total: 150 combinations for \$30, 15 per cent takeout = \$4.50

RACES 2,3,4,5,7,8,9,11,12 – the 10-cent Superfecta: On a

typical 13-race program, The Big M offers nine Superfectas. We will spend \$2.40 per race using two strategies.

1st ticket: Box 1,2,3,4 = \$1.20 (12 combinations)

2nd ticket: Key 1 with 2,3,4,5 = \$1.20 (12 combinations)

Total: 24 combinations at \$2.40 apiece for 9 races = \$21.60 (216 combinations), 20 per cent takeout = \$4.32

RACES 6 and 9 – the 50-cent Pick-4: The track's signature wager, which always offers a guaranteed pool of \$50,000, will take an investment of \$24.

Of the four following possible tickets, one can be played in each Pick-4:

1st ticket: 1,2/1,2/1,2/1,2,3 = \$12 (24 combinations)

2nd ticket: 1/1,2/1,2,3/1,2,3,4 = \$12 (24 combinations)

3rd ticket: 1/1/1,2,3,4/1,2,3,4,5,6 = \$12 (24 combinations)

4th ticket: 1/1,2/1,2/1,2,3,4,5,6 = \$12 (24 combinations)

Total: 243 combinations at 10-cents apiece = \$24.30, 15 per cent takeout = \$3.65

This bet enables one to use three horses in all positions while adding one horse in positions two through 5.

Grand Total: \$99.90 total investment, 657 combinations, total takeout \$16.07 (16 per cent).

"Based on the low 16 per cent takeout on these \$100 in wagers," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemyer, "the average player will lose \$4 an hour for over four hours of action. An above average player can create better odds of winning by wagering into low-takeout wagers. The better players can overcome a low takeout, based on their knowledge and experience, and make their evening profitable.

"The great thing about low takeout is that it creates more winning players, which creates more handle, which creates more purse money, which creates more revenue for our simulcast partners and stakeholders. That is a healthy business model for the future. Low takeout makes winning possible. This has obviously created more interest in The Meadowlands in 2021."
