Takter fighting to remove the stain from Manchego's record

The trainer said a troubling and questionable positive in Ohio for gabapentin — that even the racing commission admits was "likely caused by environmental contamination" — could ruin the trotting mare's chances to be enshrined in the Hall of Fame.

Trainer Nancy Takter said she is fighting on to try to overturn a positive test Manchego received in Ohio in 2019 for multiple reasons, but chief among them is trying to remove the tarnish on the champion trotting mare's otherwise sterling record.

"The reason that we're still fighting it and the importance of it is because she loses eligibility to the Hall of Fame because of this positive," Takter said, adding that she has appealed the decision to the courts.



"How are you protecting the sport when you're clouding a horse that's destined to be in the Hall of Fame? She's had an amazing racing career. There aren't very many that rival her racing career. You are putting doubt into the public. There are 10 articles written that 'Nancy Takter gets a positive.' It was in the Swedish newspapers and [Manchego] didn't get invited to the Elitlopp. There were a lot of questions about this stupid positive in Ohio about the Elitlopp, but then COVID happened and we didn't end up going, but that was one of their main concerns, was that she had a positive in Ohio.


On Sept. 7,2019, Manchego raced in a \$50,000 open at Scioto Downs as a tune-up for the Dayton Trotting Derby she won 10 days later by nine lengths. Yet, after the open, the mare — a three-time Dan Patch winner and world champion that earned over \$3.1 million lifetime and had a mark of 1:49 — came up positive for gabapentin. Under the Association of Racing Commissioners International, gabapentin is a Class 3 drug. It is a pain killer normally prescribed to people that have neuropathic pain that does not respond to opiates or NSAIDs (nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs).

At the time of Manchego's positive, the Ohio State Racing Commission (OSRC) did not allow for any amount of gabapentin in a horse.

Around the same time as Manchego's positive, multiple other horses received gabapentin positives after racing at Scioto Downs and the OSRC has admitted those positives were likely caused by contamination. Shortly after Manchego's positive, the OSRC established a threshold limit for gabapentin. However, that threshold did not apply retroactively to those that received positives prior. The OSRC has not budged in the Manchego case.

In a OSRC report on the case dated Dec. 13, 2022, Andrew P. Cooke wrote:

"In conclusion, Manchego raced at Scioto Downs on Sept. 7, 2019 with trace amounts of gabapentin in its blood. The

In 2019, the same year she received a positive for gabapentin believed to have been caused by environmental contamination, Manchego (Dexter Dunn, shown winning that year's Dr. Steele Memorial at The Meadowlands) earned over \$585,000 and set her mark of 1:49 in Lexington.



presence of gabapentin in Manchego's blood was confirmed by the independent analysis requested by the respondent [Takter]. On Sept. 7, 2019, any amount of gabapentin in Manchego was a prohibited foreign substance and a violation of Ohio's laws regulating horse racing. The origin of the gabapentin is unknown but was likely caused by environmental contamination. There is no evidence to suggest the respondent knowingly administered gabapentin to Manchego or that the gabapentin provided a competitive advantage. In October 2019, the Commission adopted a minimum threshold amount in testing for and reporting gabapentin that far exceeded the trace amount of gabapentin found in Manchego. The Commission's decision to adopt a minimum threshold amount in testing for gabapentin in October 2019 did not alter the fact that Manchego raced on Sept. 7, 2019 with a prohibited foreign substance in its blood.

"It is recommended that the Ohio State Racing Commission uphold the decision of the judges... to suspend the respondent for 15 days and fine her \$500 for the violation... It is also recommended that Manchego be disqualified from Race 15 at Scioto Downs on Sept. 15, 2019, and that all prize money be forfeited."

Translation: At the time of Manchego's positive, no gabapentin was allowed, regardless of circumstances. Therefore, due to the trainer responsibility rule, Takter was found guilty. As mentioned earlier, that decision is now headed to the courts.


But, regardless how that turns out, Takter is riled about the damage done already and the inflexibility of the OSRC, which she said, "knew they had a problem... because there was numerous emails going between the racing commission and the lab and, also, the racing commission actually hired an outside scientist to set a threshold for gabapentin, while we were all still racing."

Takter said earlier on the same day Manchego raced, *Standardbred Canada* **published an article** that originated at *Harness Racing Weekend Preview* about a suspicious rash of gabapentin positives in Ohio. Takter said it's further evidence that there was a problem. She wants to know why the OSRC continued to test for gabapentin that night and beyond.

"Now the next stage is that it goes to common court and all the evidence is presented to a real judge that knows nothing about horse racing and, hopefully, their judgment isn't clouded by everything that they read out there because any time that someone wants to write anything about our sport, it's about us drugging horses."

Takter said the fact that there was obvious environmental contamination makes the case particularly vexing for her and all trainers that fall victim to something completely beyond their control.

"I feel like I need to keep fighting and speaking out about this because, as a trainer, it's really unsettling to have your horse go through a test barn — be it a big race or a small race. We're worried about these stupid, little contamination positives that

we have no control over," she said. "I said to the guy, 'What did you want me to do differently?' There was nothing that I could've done differently."

Further, gabapentin is commonly-prescribed to humans. At a hearing with the OSRC, Takter's lawyer Jim Gallagher presented evidence proving the prevalence of the drug in the general population.

"The interesting thing, too, about gabapentin that maybe people don't realize is how stable it is in the environment and I don't know if you read the statistics about how many grams are just in the environment floating around. There's nothing you can do about this," Takter said.

Takter is also rankled by the high sensitivity of drug tests that often pick up extremely miniscule amounts of substances that aren't performance-enhancing in any way at such small levels.

"The testing labs nowadays are so sensitive that they could literally pick up minute, minute trace levels of whatever, which is not having any effect on any races or anything," Takter said. "And they don't have thresholds set for all the drugs... because it's very expensive to set thresholds for drugs. So, there's a lot of testing and research that needs to be done for each drug and at what level is each drug performance enhancing and so forth.

"It's human nature that nobody wants to be wrong. Nobody wants to be told that they are wrong. Nobody wants their rules that they are trying to enforce to be wrong. Unfortunately, a lot of these rules are outdated and just haven't been updated for the times."

Takter further pointed out that it was wiretaps, not drug testing, that led to the recent rash of high-profile horse doping indictments.

"They didn't catch a single one of them in the testing barn. Not a single one of them had a positive that is anything related to anything they got indicted on," Takter said.

"But then you have honest trainers that keep getting these bogus, stupid positives because the lab is so sensitive to stuff that is completely irrelevant. [Ohio's] own expert that they hired to set a threshold is saying that when [Manchego] raced it had no outcome or effect on that race.


"The problem is that it's on all those [trainers'] records now and, God forbid, they do get another positive then they do have a record and you're a repeat offender now. I don't think a lot of

people realize the situation that they get put in when you are a repeat offender when it comes to stuff like this."

Apart from the harm to Manchego's reputation, Takter said the case has damaged hers and the sport's, as well.

"It pisses me off, too, because when this came out everybody wanted to brand you a cheater," she said. "There are people like that and you have your jealous, hater people that want to say that everybody is a cheater, everybody that does well is obviously doing something wrong."

What's at stake?

As the March 15 staking deadline approaches, horsepeople share their staking stories.

What was the toughest staking decision you ever had to make?

SCOTT DIDOMENICO

"Most frustrating? Two-year-old trotting fillies. One day they look great, the next day they lose their minds. The best story for me was Hands Off My Cookie as a 2-year-old. It almost seemed silly to pay into the Breeders Crown then the Sweetheart at The Meadowlands and race some of the [New York] state-bred horses she was in with. But it turned out to be a lot of fun and an experience and feeling second to none."

PETER BLOOD

In the 1980s he was training many good youngsters: a lot for Thomas Gonsalves.

"Not staking Peculiar to the [1989 Woodrow] Wilson. Sam Francisco [Ben] won it. My colt Love Not War took the consolation and my other one, Timmy, was second, so I went 1-2 in the consolation. Peculiar was New Jersey Sires Stakes Freshman of the Year and I feel I left a lot of money on the table that year. There were so many more opportunities then compared to today."

DAWN ALLEN

Dawn's husband Rod and his dad Carl, raced many stakes horses back in the 1980s to 2000s. Carl won the \$1,700,000 Woodrow Wilson with homebred Carls Bird. They had Horse of the Year CR Kay Suzie in 1995. Dawn was the one who did the staking.

"I did all of it. Back in the '80s-'90s, we staked to everything. Carl was going to win the Hambletonian at all costs. It was his competitive positive thinking that won more races than the horses ability to do so. A throw of the dice, we borrowed several

hundred thousand dollars a season and staked 40-plus horses. I did it by hand on ledger sheets until the late '80s when a staking program was developed. I would have a sheet for each horse and a form for each race, but they wouldn't let me finalize anything because they trained on stakes payment day. Then I'd have to eliminate, re-add, write checks, get to the post office which was sometimes at the Orlando Airport postmarking until midnight and pray I could re-check the next day. Selfstake.com made my life heaven. Gradually, they cut back when they realized they were racing for our own money and traveling became so expensive. They chose mostly sire stake races and one or two big races for most horses and the pets got several more big races."

MIKE KEELING

Keeling and Paula Wellwood trained the sport's last Triple Crown winner, Marion Marauder (2016), who was not eligible for the Kentucky Futurity that year.

"Boy that's a tough one. I have definitely over-staked or more correctly overestimated a horse's ability in the past. But, luckily, I've never missed or neglected to stake a good, good horse correctly. I guess not having Marion Marauder eligible for the Kentucky Futurity could be considered an error but we, as a policy, don't pay into the Grand Circuit at Lexington. Luckily we could supplement him and it worked out."

BRUCE RIEGLE

"Worldly Woman and Cami Almahurst. Especially Worldy Woman. Dad [Gene] never sat behind her even once. [My brother] Alan did and she ran into the outside fence at Scioto. It was tough to stake a filly who didn't make her first start until the Red Mile in the fall at 2. She sold at the Tattersalls for \$2,200, and I did get along with her and we did well."

BRIAN BROWN

"I don't remember exactly a horse, but the toughest thing is staking a horse that goes bad right after the 15th of any of the months you're paying."

JOHN KOPAS

"Dad [Jack] was never one to dwell on the past. He was always looking to the future. I don't specifically remember one, but I do remember asking myself later on 'What were you thinking paying this youngster into so many?"

TRAVIS ALEXANDER

"The toughest was Western Gallie with Fashion Farms. Coming back at 3 as a maiden but had \$200,000 made. We had to make a decision on whether to go light or heavy. We went heavy."

PAUL KELLEY

"The toughest staking decisions were probably 20-25 years ago when I felt I had to overstake most horses. I'm a lot more frugal now, especially with 2-year-olds. Staking 2-year-olds is like playing Indian Head Poker for big bucks."

JACK DARLING

"In general, it has always been staking my American-bred 2-year-olds to stakes races in the U.S. Nine times out of 10 you are just throwing your money away. I don't mind paying them into our Mohawk stakes races as the payments are pretty reasonable and the track is close by. That's why I have been buying Ontario Sires Stakes yearlings almost exclusively the past few years. To keep the stakes payments under control."

CARTER PINSKE

"That's a tough question. I hate the staking system, but I don't have a specific instance of a particular horse. I would say paying 2-year-olds into the Breeders Crown is the toughest. STEPHANE BOUCHARD REMEMBERS RECORD 20 YEARS LATER

On March 8, 2003, Stephane Bouchard won the final three at Freehold and headed to Yonkers and captured the first eight. Eleven consecutive pari-mutuel drives, all victories. The record has not been touched since.

Bouchard has never been one to toot his own horn.

"I actually did not know I had done this until *Sports Eye* called me on the ride home. I was focused on the next race and was not thinking that I had won the last three at Freehold. It was probably better that I didn't think about it at the moment. Good memories."

TRAVIS ALEXANDER ON THE DOORSTEP OF HARNESS RACING HISTORY?

Travis Alexander has trained the last two Messenger winners — American Courage (2021) and Pleaseletmeknow (2022) — both driven by Matt Kakaley and owned/bred by Mark and Leslie Wasserman and Travis' wife Alaina's Fiddler's Creek Stables LLC. This year they are going for the three-peat with homebred, Downrightdelicious.

The others also won the Springfield — formerly the Sheppard Stake — and so did Downrightdelicious.

The last driver to win the same Triple Crown race three straight years? John Campbell in the Kentucky Futurity with Armbro Keepsake, Pine Chip and Bullville Victory (1992-94). The last trainer to do it was Jimmy Takter in the Yonkers Trot: Judge Joe (2009), On The Tab (2010) and Leader Of The Gang (2011).

The last time a trainer/driver did it? Billy Haughton in the Messenger with Armbro Omaha, Brets Champ and Windshield Wiper (1974-76). But nobody has ever done it with a homebred.



2023 Breeders Crown Foreign Stallion Nomination Form





Up to 15 North American Foals of 2024 by Foreign Stallions may be made eligible to the Breeders Crown with a payment by March 15, 2023 of a Foreign Stallion Nomination Fee equal to the amount of the North American advertised service fee for a 2023 breeding. (\$500 U.S. funds minimum)





Additionally, any foals that are **foaled & registered in North America which are produced** from mares bred outside of North America may also be made eligible by a payment of the advertised stud fee in the country where the stallion stands. This payment provides Breeders Crown eligibility for a North American crop of up to 15 foals.




If the Foreign Stallion's North American Crop is 15 foals or less, that payment is the total amount due for these North American foals to be eligible to make the 2025 Yearling payment and maintain eligibility by the future payments to the Breeders Crown. Any additional amount ("surcharge") or refund of this nomination fee will be determined by the number of 2024 foals ("North American Crop") by these stallions standing outside North America ("Foreign Stallions") and foaled and registered in North America (either with the U.S. Trotting Assoc. or Standardbred Canada) as of August 15, 2024. All foals which are nominated as yearlings must be registered in North America at the time of nomination.

Big Towner – Simpson's Folly, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

Big Towner's pedigree is likely as unique as that of any prominent stallion in the history of harness racing. He was sired by Gene Abbe, then a 30-year-old stallion, who in turn was sired by Bert Abbe, then 22. He was only six generations removed from Hambletonian himself.

I know I'm probably missing some, however I picked up 17 descendants of Hambletonian in his pedigree, only in the male portion of his lineage.

Just think of that. When presenting his pedigree, you would have 54 years of heritage on the page. Compare that, for argument's sake, to a 2-year-old by Captain Crunch, then a 4-year-old stallion who was by Captaintreacherous, then a 5-year-old stallion.

In comparing Big Towner's male pedigree to that of the son of Captain Crunch, you would have a spread in years of 52 to one of nine.

Yet the sons and daughters of Big Towner were able to compete and often subdue horses whose lineage was far more modern than those with which they were competing.

How could this be? I have no idea. Mother Nature does not always provide answers to her actions. It's just one of the many unanswerable questions that one comes across in this huge puzzle involving the breeding of racehorses.

If you were speaking in terms of generations and were considering each generation as 10 years, Big Towner was at least five generations behind his contemporaries.

I digress. This column is about Big Towner as a great sire of fillies and perhaps, more importantly, as a great sire of broodmares.

Before going further, one needs to mention that Big Towner's sire, Gene Abbe, was known as a very good sire of raceway pacers with very few of the female persuasion involved in his better performers. Yet, arguably his greatest son is known as a great sire of fillies and mares and, more importantly, known for producing exceptional broodmares.

Big Towner sired five millionaires. They were out of mares by five different sires. Two of them were the fillies Town Pro (\$1,229,582) and Sweet Reflection (\$1,004,639), a more than significant impact.

Big Towner mares have produced 17 millionaires by 14 different sires. The three richest money winners sired by him were females: Anndrovette (\$3,544,930), Darlins Delight (\$2,901,926) and Voelz Hanover (\$1,609,543). Only Bettors Delight, Cams Card Shark and Western Ideal are credited with more than one of those 17, with two each. One might be accused of not telling the complete story without mentioning that one would have to go significantly beyond the three leaders until one encountered another filly at number 18.

The fact that his fillies have excelled, does not mean that the male horses as a result of being out of Big Towner mares did not. Included among them were Whosurboy (\$1,690,543), Big Jim (\$1,541,924), Timesareachanging (\$1,516,563), Goliath Bayama (\$1,503,428) and ten other millionaires.

Unlike his sire Gene Abbe who did not do particularly well with fillies, Big Towner certainly did well both as a sire of terrific fillies and as a sire of the dams of excellent racehorses.

One thing Big Towner did have in common with Gene Abbe was his disposition. I was never around Gene Abbe, but from what I've been told he was somewhat cranky, not overtly mean, but certainly not to be trusted and definitely not a kid's horse. Steve Jones, the son of Hall of Famer Hal Jones tells the story his dad would tell. The stud man at Pickwick farms had been told not to trust Gene Abbe, to never turn his back on him. One day he grew too trusting and Gene Abbe picked him up and threw him out the door. The man was lucky. If he hadn't been thrown out of the stall, Lord only knows what might have happened. Big Towner was somewhat similar, if you allowed him to, he could hurt you.

As good, possibly bordering on great a sire as Big Towner was, he was even more noted as a broodmare sire. He sired the winners of \$118,217,494 and sired the dams of the winners of close to double that number.

REMEMBERING THE WIZARD

I'd be very remiss if I did not mention Pacey Mindlin, AKA The Wizard; a friend of over 50 years who we lost last week. He was what we call a "lifer." I have not known that many lifers, but in the last two years I've lost three of them: first Gerry Bloch, then Eddie Schneerer and now Pacey. Each one of those three were closely involved in the sport for over 50 years.

For as long as I knew him, Pacey has always been involved in many facets of the game. He loved just about everything pertaining to harness racing. Most of all he loved the people and the horses. For as long as he and I have been on social media, we have been involved in back-and-forth repartee. I delighted in pulling his chain as he did mine. I'll miss you, my friend.





Trevor Williams wants equal success for himself and Manitoba

For Trevor Williams, success doesn't always show up on the stat sheet.

He's made a name for himself in his native Manitoba and beyond its borders, as a horseman whose top goal is a dead heat between personal achievement and the long-term health of standardbred racing in his province.

"Success, for me, is my personal barn's success," the 35-year-old Williams said. "I would like to see more wins, more money and a higher average than my previous years. Always striving for better is what keeps me wanting to do this. There is no better feeling in the world than winning a horse race, other than winning a bunch of horse races. A successful year for me would also be to secure a long-term deal with the provincial government and see the industry grow here. I really strive to make the Manitoba industry a little bit better."

Williams, who drives, trains and owns, is also the president of the Manitoba Standardbred Racing Industry Inc. (MSRI), the new board that is overseeing harness racing in the province, a position he's held for three years. Prior to that, he was the president of the now-former Manitoba Great Western Harness Racing Circuit Inc. and before that, he held the title of vice-president of the Manitoba Harness Horseman Association.

His love for the sport dates back to the days when his parents, Mike and Heather Williams, would take him to the track. Heather grew up in racing. Mike is a long-time owner.

Williams launched his own horse racing career in 2015, making the jump from the financial world to the racetrack life.

Did he make the switch for love or money?

"Definitely more of the heart," Williams said. "That balance between keeping yourself moving forward and

loving what you do... the banking world was great and I did well, and enjoyed it at times too, but this is my passion. It was getting to the point where I had to decide that if I was going to do it right, I had to put the hours in to run a successful stable. I couldn't do both. It was consuming my life and my family's life, so I made the leap. It went really well right off the bat and things have been good."

In 2015, his first year of training, Williams sent out 23 winners and 50 top-three finishers from 65 starts, producing a gaudy .529 UTRS.

Two years ago, he won a career-best 64 races and posted a career-high \$135,027 in purse earnings.

His numbers in 2022, at first blush, appear to be a huge drop off from the year prior.

But that certainly is not the case.

The 19 wins from 61 starts could easily have an asterisk beside it and for a very good reason.

"In 2022, the highlight was definitely the birth of my son," Williams said. "I stepped away a little bit. I had my first-born, a son. This was the main factor in turning the stable over to a good friend in Travis Ellis for the short term. He worked really closely with me in Manitoba and Alberta and sending him off

on his own to California was hopefully a big highlight for him. He had a career-year for himself, and it was also good for me as an owner. We have had owners that have stuck with me for years and trusted in this adjustment. We did very well in Alberta and hope to continue that in California and beyond. I obviously can't thank them enough for their continued support.

"As far as stats-wise, I don't have any numbers attached to me for the past eight months. So, maybe it isn't the best time to do a story on me. I'm still managing here and there and I have some colts here in Manitoba, but Travis took a stable down to California for us, I own a large number of those horses and we're doing okay."

Better than okay, actually.

The one-two punch of Williams and Ellis has seen great success at Cal-Expo, where the latter is overseeing a stable of 25.

"I am back full-time in 2023," Williams said. "We have a lot on the go and hopefully a brand-new track opening in a couple of months. My plan, in order to stay here with my partner Robyn and our son Kip, is to create a career out of racing in Manitoba as much as I can. The hope is one day to be able to do it 10,11 or 12 months out of the year. Now, it's just not possible. I have Manitoba-bred colts and Alberta-bred colts and we can bring

them back here to compete over the summer and go from there. What things will look like this winter are uncertain, but I think there is a lot to look forward to."

The former bank manager, who ended the 2021 season as Canada's top percentage trainer for any conditioner with at least 150 starts, has no regrets about his move from finance to racing.

Williams praises his partner, Robyn, a health care worker, for helping him get through any tough days at the racetrack.

"Robyn has been amazing in so many ways, including my career," Williams said. "She knows better than anybody that a bad day can hit me pretty hard. I'm a competitive person. I absolutely hate to lose. There is so much to think about when it comes to racing — our feed programs, the soundness of your horses, your drivers — that your mind is constantly juggling what you can do differently. Even if your horse races well, your mind never really completely shuts off. To have that support person when you get home, someone who can help take your mind off that or talk about it, that makes it a lot easier. It's cool to come home to the family."

It's also equally rewarding to share that world with his son, Kip, now six months old.

"As soon as he was able to get out of the house, he saw a horse," Williams said. "He seemed to really love them."

Like father, like son, no doubt.

After time away from the horses and the hustle and bustle of the races, Williams is all-in on making 2023 his best season yet.

"Hopefully, we have a big year in store with our stable in Manitoba and Travis will ship the other half of the crew to Maine, to race at Bangor, Cumberland and Plainridge as well," Williams said. "We don't know how it's going to look yet, but I'll be taking care of business in Canada for sure."

But that's far from everything Williams, who will have around 15 horses to race at home this year, is focused on.

As always, his thoughts are on working towards a sustainable future for standardbred racing in Manitoba.

"We had a really good deal in place with the government last year," Williams said. "Getting a million-dollar grant and hopefully increasing that this year would be huge for Manitoba. If we can grow this to be an industry for people like myself and up-and-coming trainers to stick around for the majority of the year, that would be amazing."

So too, he offered, is the thought of perhaps seeing another Williams make a name for himself in racing one day or simply enjoy the sport his father loves.

"It would be nice to have something long-term, so that when my son is older, he can see the industry is thriving," Williams said. "That's what I would like to see happen."





Hitch up those teams

Creating a harness racing league could draw in bettors.

If the Chicago Cubs are your favorite baseball team, each regular season is a rollercoaster ride of joys and disappointments you share with fellow fans. Each game in the quest for a National League Central Division title is crucial, but being a Cubs fan is much more.

Rooting for your Cubbies means that every draft pick, player acquisition and trade is meaningful. The rosters of opposing teams, preseason games, management decisions and off-season moves are all part of the fun. When the season begins, the constantly shifting standings are riveting. The depth of experiences for a team sports fan is endless. And starting this year, you can wager on your home team.

For many reasons, team experiences were unavailable to horse racing. Communications and research did not offer the chance to view far-away races or to research any race deeply. Horse racing was never a team sport. Perhaps it never will be. However, the world has changed. Racehorse gamblers and fans have new options and creating a team paradigm for our sport could be one of them. Let me paint a simple outline.

When the fall yearling sales end, the "commissioner" of the MLHHR (Major League of Harness Horse Racing), begins to set the season in motion. Setting up the season is a simple, enjoyable task. First, the commissioner (or his delegates) decides how many state teams will be in the league and gives each team a catchy name. For example, one team will be the Indiana Iron Horses.

Step two, choose 10 Indiana-bred yearlings (soon-to-be 2-year-olds) from the recent sales results to compose the team roster. Repeat this process for other states — New York, Ohio, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Indiana, New Jersey and Maine — maybe combining some states like Kentucky, Virginia, Minnesota and Illinois. And, of course, assign a franchise representing Canada. Bingo, we have a league.

The commissioner could assign each team a clever nickname and logo for fun, maybe even do a little merchandising. The training season begins and everything proceeds as usual throughout the 2-year-old racing season. There is no ask of any trainer or owner, no fees; they are merely a virtual stable of young horses.

The competition is straightforward — each team's total dollars earned, in and out of state, at commercial racetracks, on the Grand Circuit, or at Podunk fairs — every penny earned in purses by each team member gets added to the running total through November. The most aggregate money determines the champion team. Your team must stick with the horses they rode in on. No replacements for injury or 2-year-old horses that do not qualify are permitted.

Who would be the commissioner and why would this team concept be of value?

Let me state clearly: I don't know who. But it could be anyone. Nor do I know if this idea has any value. Iterations may have been experimented with previously, but remember, environments change and you never step into the same puddle twice. I don't think being the new commissioner would cost a dime and could be fun for the creator and the participants. The whole plan would appear to be cost-free.



Of course, people could follow their team just for fun and bragging rights. A team concept with wagering could bring revenue. In gambling terms, this would be considered something along the lines of a long-term futures-market sports team wagering proposition.

Your challenge is to choose your team and wager. You can pick your team from a hat or choose because you like the trainer. Maybe you select a team because most horses will race in your home state, or you use meticulous analysis and sales results. We all understand that some of the ten horses from each group will not reach the starting gate. Forecasting 2-year-olds' performances are chancy. Million-dollar yearlings often may not earn a dime, and medium-priced yearlings may evolve into a Bulldog Hanover.

It is beyond my pay grade and mental acuity to opine exactly how team wagering should be structured. The league composition could be state or national. Do payoffs go to the winners only? Pay first, second and third? Will some teams have a higher payout? Will wagering on these harness horse racing teams have a closing date to lock in wagers? Will the market odds fluctuate? If you back a team leading in the standings, can you market your ticket?

Simple factual analogy.

I have gambled on sports teams winning championships for the past few years, usually \$50 or \$100. Last preseason I wagered on a group of young men who assembled to play together as the TCU Horned Frogs football team to win the NCAA Championship. Last preseason, I wagered on the Cleveland Guardians baseball

team, a group featuring 17 rookies, to win the Central Division. And I wagered on the Cleveland Cavaliers, with a core lineup barely out of their teens, to win the NBA Eastern Division.

Why can't teams of 2-year-old harness racehorses form a league and offer me the same wager on the Ohio Obliterators taking the MLHHR crown?

If this offer were on the table, as soon as the teams of yearling are listed, I would have a lot of fun evaluating the various team groupings (horses, trainers, programs) and choosing my favorite. If a team wager of this type is on the table, I will bet a hundred, maybe two hundred, on my team before the deadline. When the horses begin to near qualifying time, I will get very interested in how "my team" is performing and how my opposition's teams are lining up. Qualifying day and early racing will be fascinating and immersive. Every day throughout the season, I will have horses to watch race and root for or against. I may place additional wagers if team wagers are available in shorter intervals, such as which team will win the most money during the first seven days of July.

This team competition format would be a unique way to play for harness racing fans/gamblers like me. For the other 98.4 per cent of the uninformed masses, this team format would offer a nice little entrance ramp into our world.

Teena Freibert – Owner of Bluegrass Staking

If you're a horse owner in the sport of harness racing, when the month of February rolls around you might encounter a bit of angina and sleepless nights when you have to start making stakes payments.

This task is tedious, but essential, and repeats in March, April and sometimes May.

That's where Teena Freibert and Bluegrass Staking Service comes in

Staking can be very cumbersome and confusing, so it's in your best interest to choose a reputable staking service to help simplify the task.

There is no greater nightmare for an owner than when you buy or raise a colt or filly and discover months later you might possibly have a possible champion or top stake horse, but for some reason you either forgot or intentionally avoided staking your horse to a particular race.

A novice owner may not know how or where to stake your horse, so it's best to seek a stake service to help guide you.

Born in Bowling Green, KY, Freibert fell in love with horses as a child, even though her family didn't even know what harness racing was.

"I grew up in Louisville and after my freshman year at the University of Kentucky (UK), I had some free time, so I took a job at a family friend's racing stable at the Red Mile Racetrack in Lexington," Freibert said. "I loved the horses and the idea of racing so much that I offered to work for free in return for learning all about the sport."

As it turned out, in the same barn with her friend was her future husband, Mike.

"We hit it off immediately and married a year later," Freibert said. "I remained in school and changed my major to Animal Science and took a part-time job working at Kentuckiana Farm for Carter Duer.



"Ironically, Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie [Brittany Farms] were also working at Kentuckiana at that time. We have remained the best of friends ever since."

After graduating from UK, Freibert left Kentuckiana and got a job at the Tattersalls Sales Company in the pedigree research department.

"In July 1984 Mike and I had our first of three children," Freibert said. "I wanted to be able to stay at home with my son, Ryan, so I made the decision to start Bluegrass Staking Service."

She met with attorney, Tommy Bell, two weeks after giving birth and got in touch with a computer programmer to write a staking program.

"That year at the yearling sale I set up a card table stacked with staking contracts," Freibert said. "At that time I didn't have a single customer but by the time the season started I had signed 150 horses up and we were off.

"Working for Tattersalls I became familiar with the stake races and also serendipitously learned about a woman named Marie Monahan. Marie was the owner of a legendary staking service. Looking back on my journey, it seems like my steps were predetermined."

Yes, staking can be very cumbersome. Our goal at Bluegrass is to help ease the pain and simplify things for the owner. For each horse we build a list of races based on the sire, the dam [in cases of dual eligibility], the previous payments and available early and late closers. We put it all together in a neat and simple package called a payment calendar. This provides a great overview of the options and allows our customers to make informed decisions.

Also, while working at the Tattersalls Sale, Freibert became friends with Moe Graif from Blue Bonnets in Quebec. Graif also ran a staking service, along with doing bookkeeping for several horsemen.

"Within three years, I purchased Moe Graif's staking service and got started with many Canadian clients," Freibert said. "Three years later, while I was at the North American Harness Racing Secretary's meeting in Florida, I was seated next to Marie who confided in me she wanted to sell her business. The following spring, we struck a deal and my husband left his job with the state to become my full-time business partner. I attribute most of our success to our partnership that we both nurtured and 39 years later, we are still going strong.

"Today, Blue Grass Staking employs seven people. My sister-inlaw, Cynthia, has been with us for over 20 years and my youngest daughter, Erin, joined our team in 2014. Tami is a full-time programmer who has completely rebuilt our program over the past three years and our newest addition is Ashley, who I've known since 2006 when I was her golf coach. My husband still works some — although he claims to be retired — and my good friend, Susan, helps out in the busy season."

As far as customers, Bluegrass Staking is proud to serve most of the larger stables in North America and some overseas as well.

"We also have a huge number of smaller stables, but regardless of the size, we treat and give the same attention to everyone," Freibert said. "Staking has changed in the years since 1984. In the beginning, the work was mostly seasonal, but now it is a full-time year-round job.

"From November to May we work long hours. For me, a 14-hour day is not unusual. We spend our off-season building a database of eligibility and fine tune our program."

As for the future of harness racing, Freibert thinks it is going in the right direction.

"With the addition of dual eligibility and the wonderful programs Kentucky offers, we have seen an increase in the number of horses being staked," Freibert said. "This year we hit a new record with 3,000 racehorses."

Staking your horse properly is very important. It can be confusing and uncertain and that is where Freibert and the Bluegrass Staking team enter.

"Yes, staking can be very cumbersome," Freibert said. "Our goal at Bluegrass is to help ease the pain and simplify things for the owner. For each horse we build a list of races based on the sire, the dam [in cases of dual eligibility], the previous payments and available early and late closers. We put it all together in a neat and simple package called a payment calendar. This provides a great overview of the options and allows our customers to make informed decisions."

The Bluegrass Staking **website** allows customers to use their dashboard to make staking selections each month.

"Over the past few years, we have built some safety nets into the website so, for instance, if a customer tries to save their staking selections without choosing a sire stake event, they will get a pop-up reminder where they need to confirm the omission or change the selection," Freibert said. "We also provide guidance on yearling staking because many of our yearling customers who are not involved in the racing end are not familiar with the stakes.

"On the racehorses we provide tools like the pop-up reminders and if we see something that seems way out of line we will bring it to their attention, but mostly trust that they are doing their job."

What's next for Bluegrass Staking?

"We have a huge clientele and the trust they put in us is quite humbling," Freibert said. "Bluegrass Staking is my fourth child. Hopefully, in the next few years I will be able to enjoy the fruits of my labor and my daughter and awesome hard-working, dedicated staff will take BGS to the next level."

Borgata consolation winner Im Sir Blake A back for more

After a five-month hiatus to freshen up from a busy 2022 campaign, Australian-bred male pacer Im Sir Blake is ready to make his first start of this season ahead of a trip to the MGM Borgata Series later this month.

The 8-year-old gelding, trained by Erv Miller for owner Douglas Overhiser, won last year's \$100,000 Borgata consolation final. He made his seasonal bow Saturday (March 11) in the \$45,000 open pace at The Meadowlands, where he started from post eight with Marcus Miller in the sulky.

Last season, Im Sir Blake won eight of 30 races, hit the board an additional nine times, and earned \$200,770. He visited seven tracks in five states as he averaged three starts a month before seeing his campaign end in late September. He won on every sized oval — half, five-eighths, seven-eighths, and mile — along the way.

"He was busy right from the beginning of last year," Marcus Miller said. "It was time to let him freshen up a little bit and take another crack at it again this year.

"He's a really nice horse. He does well everywhere he goes.

He's just one of those horses that's really handy and can get the job done. He's got a really nice attitude. He always gives you a run from the top of the stretch home. He's always digging at the wire. I think that's the best part about him."

Im Sir Blake is a son of Alta Christiano N—Jupiters Darling. He spent his first three seasons Down Under, where he won 14 of 39 races and earned \$89,371. For his career, he has posted 26 victories in 84 starts and banked \$342,877.

He headed into Saturday's race at The Big M with two Pocono Downs at Mohegan Pennsylvania qualifiers under his belt. He won the first in 1:55 over a surface labeled "good." He finished second by a half-length to Borgataeligible Jack's Legend N in the second, timed in 1:54.1.

"The track was pretty slow both days he qualified," Miller said. "We had snow before the one and I think the other time it had just rained. I was happy with him both times. He did get picked off by a pretty nice horse in the second qualifier, but I didn't really tune him in going to the gate. I just wanted to make sure that he had a decent mile for his second qo."

In last year's Borgata Series at MGM Yonkers Raceway, Im Sir Blake had a fourth-place finish in his opening-round division before four consecutive third-place efforts. He captured the consolation final by a nose over Chase H Hanover.

"He didn't really draw bad last year, but it seemed anytime he did draw closer to inside in the legs there was always a super speed horse inside of him, one we couldn't quite get around," Miller said. "He only had enough points for the consolation, but luckily, he was pretty fresh for it, so it worked out good in that sense. It was pretty cool for him to get that win. It wasn't the [championship] final, but maybe things will shake out a little bit differently this year."

The Borgata Series begins March 20 and continues for five consecutive weeks with \$50,000 preliminary legs before a \$200,000-added final on April 24.

Miller is coming off one of his most lucrative seasons as a driver. His horses earned \$5.22 million in purses in 2022 — the second-highest total of his career — and he topped 300 wins for the sixth time. He finished fourth in the standings at Pocono with 180 victories, just one behind third-place Anthony Napolitano.

"I didn't have any superstars, but I had a lot of really nice horses," Miller said. "Pocono has been going good. I probably had my best year there last year and this year has started off well too. I'm happy."





Pacey Mindlin, "The Wizard," dies at 81

Miami Valley Raceway management is deeply saddened to report the passing of Pacey "The Wizard" Mindlin on March 7, 2023, following a short illness.

Introduced nightly by sidekick Barry Vicroy as "the world's greatest handicapper," Mindlin offered listeners insight, humor and selections in his own inimitable style.

"He was the face of racing at Miami Valley," said director of racing Ken Rambo. "He had a legion of fans throughout the harness racing world and even those that thought his antics were a bit too unconventional tuned in to watch him. He will be missed."

Mindlin, 81, was a lifelong resident of southwest Ohio who began going to the races with his father Sandee at age 8 or 9. He bought his first horse and joined the USTA in 1966. Over the years he has owned 142 horses, often in partnership with friend Kenneth Cohen.

While he was a fixture at the Lexington and Harrisburg yearling sales, many of those he raced were homebreds as he was responsible for bringing 79 foals into the world over the years. Horsemen recognized Mindlin as a bloodlines expert.

Among his best horses were Lightning Wave, who won a heat of the Little Brown Jug, Norma Ruth Hanover, Good Bye Columbus, Pointer Hanover and Joyful Crown.

"The one that got away," Mindlin said with a laugh over the years, was Fan Hanover. I was the under bidder on that great mare."

He hired many top national trainers through the years and at least a half dozen Hall of Fame drivers sat behind his horses, but he believed his local trainers Herb Coven Jr. and Jim Dailey "could have competed with anyone, anywhere."

Horses he owned won three Ohio Sires Stakes championships and a pair in Indiana.

He ran a successful scrap yard in Franklin, which he inherited from his father, for 55 years before selling it several years ago.

In addition to his handicapping host duties at Miami Valley and many Ohio county fairs, Mindlin was an associate judge for parts of 20 years, working at Lebanon and Latonia raceways and



several county fairs. He was a close friend of Corwin Nixon, Lou Carlo and Mel Hagemeyer, general managers at the two meets.

Mindlin is survived by his wife of 33 years, Debbie.

Miami Valley will honor "The Wizard" with a feature race before the end of the 2023 meet.

"We've heard Pacey sign off with 'Pace Baby Pace' for the last time," said race secretary Gregg Keidel. "But I hope to come up with an annual event which honors his legacy."

All Alone wins again at Big M

He doesn't have much experience, but you wouldn't know it after seeing All Alone perform in Friday (March 10) night's featured pace at The Meadowlands.

The 3-year-old colt by Heston Blue Chip—Lonesome Day won a second straight start — his second lifetime win from six outings — keeping main foe Idiosyncratic at bay to the wire by a head in 1:53.2 in a \$14,500 non-winners of two pace over a sloppy track on a second straight Friday card that saw miserable rainy weather in northern New Jersey.

Driver Scott Zeron put All Alone on the point while parked as he got past 3-1 second choice Idiosyncratic in :29. After reaching the half in :57.3, Zeron was able to rate the third fraction to :28.3, leaving a :27.1 final quarter in the tank, which proved to be just enough to prevail over a fast-closing Idiosyncratic. Third Pillar was third.

"I like him more off a helmet," said winning trainer Linda Toscano of All Alone. "But he had to be there [on the lead] tonight. He's still learning. He's got a lot of talent."

As the 1-5 favorite, All Alone returned \$2.60 to his backers.

It was a good night for Hall of Famer Toscano, whose only other starter on the card was also a winner, as C Is For Cookie (\$5.20 as the 8-5 public choice), a 3-year-old filly by Betting Line—Sweet Future, scored in her career debut in a snappy 1:51.3 with Zeron at the lines.

"I loved her when I trained her down, but she injured herself [last year]," said Toscano. "But that's what 2-year-olds do sometimes. She got loose on the lead and Scott let her race."

Gural: Do you believe me or Joe Faraldo?


When I opened the March issue of *Hoof Beats* I saw a letter from the Director's Chair from Mr. [Joe] Faraldo, the Chairman of the Board. The sad part is there is almost nothing in his memo that is truthful. The sole goal of the USTA led by Faraldo is to ensure that the status quo remains so that those members who want to use drugs can continue and those members who don't can just suck it up and race against them.

What is most troubling is that Faraldo, who obviously does not like me much, criticized the position I have taken repeatedly that had the USTA given me the changes they wanted in the [Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority] legislation, I am fairly certain I could have accomplished that goal. Other than one conference call I had with [USTA president] Russell [Williams] and the USTA lobbyists who seemed to agree with my position, the USTA did not reach out to ask for my help. At the last minute, they did ask for my help in making sure that the change in the law that was required to make [HISA] constitutional would not happen and would I use my influence to kill it.

After reading the latest opinion from the Sixth District affirming that, with that change, it is now constitutional, I can understand why they wanted me to kill it, as had I done so the Sixth Circuit would have affirmed the Fifth Circuit in declaring the law unconstitutional.

You have a choice; you can believe Joe who was in charge of the Horsemen's Association at Yonkers when the two leading trainers Rene Allard and [Faraldo's] personal trainer Richard Banca were arrested and now, fortunately, have been convicted, or you can believe me.

When I took over The Meadowlands the first thing I did was hire Brice [Cote] to do out-of-competition testing and used the Hong Kong lab and eventually hired 5 Stones where we worked with the FBI and the US Attorney to put 29 horsemen or veterinarians in prison. I think the comparison is quite dramatic and if you really believe that Joe wants to do away with drugs
