The King of Australia scores remarkable three-peat

King Of Swing became the first pacer to win Down Under's richest race three times thanks to a memorable performance Saturday near Sydney in the \$1 million Miracle Mile. After which, King Of Swing was retired to stud.

It was one of the great moments in the modern era of Down Under harness racing.

Champion pacer **King Of Swing** created history at Menangle, just outside of Sydney, Saturday night (March 10) when he became the first pacer to win Australasia's richest race and premier speed test, the \$A1 million Miracle Mile, three times.

And connections immediately confirmed it was his final race start, retiring him to stand at stud later in the year.

King Of Swing really had to earn it, too. He was crossed at the start by longshot Mach Dan in a blistering :25.6 opening quarter then driver Luke McCarthy had to fight hard to "re-take." King Of Swing paced a :54.6 first half, but McCarthy still looked to have plenty of horse coming to the final bend on the 1400m track.

"He gave me a good kick when I asked him, but I knew it would be a long way home after that early burn," McCarthy said. "The great thing about this guy is how hard he fights and he did, he just kept giving for me."

King Of Swing held off his brilliant and emerging stablemate Spirit Of St Louis to win by 1.2m in a 1:49.2 mile.

The time was quick, but Sydney's recent flooding caused plenty of damage to the track and repairs during the week meant it wasn't as fast as Menangle can be.

McCarthy confirmed King Of Swing's owners felt it was the right time to retire him.

"I think he could have raced on for another year, I'm sure he could have. In fact, I think he's racing in the best form of his career now," he said. "But I totally get where the owners are coming from. They want him to go out on top.

"The breeding season doesn't start until late in the year, so we could've gone on to the big Queensland races in the middle of year, but the owners didn't want that. They felt there was no need.

"It would've meant a break and getting him back up again. They'd rather give him the extra time to let down into a stallion.

"He's got everything you could ask for to make a stallion, great breeding (Rocknroll Hanover—Twist and Twirl – by Artsplace), he's a fantastic looker and just has the most remarkable temperament you'd ever see for a stallion.

"I'm sure he'll be in huge demand and quickly have a full book for the first season."

King Of Swing's career stats certainly put him up with the alltime Down Under greats.

His prize money of \$A3,390,546 put him fifth on the all-time earners' list for Down Under pacers behind: Blacks A Fake (\$A4,575,438), Im Themightyquinn (\$A4,567,456), Lazarus (\$A4,125,988) and Smoken Up (\$A3,607,985).

King Of Swing also won Group 1 races from the age of 2 when he won the Breeders Crown final to last night as a 7-year-old.

A tradition of excellence

Of his 11 wins at Group 1 level, the biggest were certainly his three Miracle Miles, two Hunter Cups and the 2020 Blacks A Fake in Queensland – as an open-class free-for-all pacer at the highest level.

King Of Swing started his career with astute horseman Ray Green in NZ before being bought by his current owners for an undisclosed but large figure as a 3-year-old. He joined Gary Hall Sr's stable and won the new connections a Group 1 West Australian Derby soon after, but then his form fluctuated wildly.

In a remarkable show of humility and honesty, Hall Sr admitted he would never have got the best out of King Of Swing.

"No, I never really got along with the horse. He and I weren't really suited together," Hall Sr. said, laughing.

"Seriously though, it was my call to suggest the move to Luke and Belinda (McCarthy). I want to set the record straight on all of this.

"Everyone said the move came because the horse didn't handle Gloucester Park (a tight half-mile track), but that's not true. Sure, he loves the big Menangle (1400m) track, but he goes well on all tracks for Luke and Belinda.

"The truth is my training style didn't suit him. He needed a change. I always sensed there was more than what he was showing because he would give you glimpses.

"I had a share in the horse too, so it was in my best interests as well as everyone else to try something different.

"I'm in awe of the job Luke and Belinda have done with him,

but I'm not totally surprised. They're great horse people with a fantastic training facility and he's a horse who had the potential there for them to unlock. Which they did so well.

"I've just really enjoyed seeing the horse fulfill his potential. I've got no hard feelings about giving up training him, none at all."

In the care of Team McCarthy, King Of Swing raced 33 times for a staggering 25 wins, four seconds, three thirds and just one unplaced run – a fifth in last December's Inter Dominion final at Menangle.


As versatile as he was, those three Miracle Miles will have him best remembered as a sprinter. As too will the fact he went unbeaten in 12 starts over a mile at Menangle.

Part-owner Glen Moore, also one of Australia's most astute harness punters, said King Of Swing ranked right up with the other champion he raced, Im Themightyquinn.

"They were very different horses, but King Of Swing's body of work is pretty special," he said. "Im Themightyquinn won three Inter Dominions, but not a Miracle Mile. King Of Swing won three Miracle Miles and not an Inter Dominion.

"After tonight it's pretty hard to split them. I'm just incredibly lucky to have been part of some amazing years with them both."

Jan Johnson on the incredible success and contribution of Continental Farms

There is little doubt that the genesis of the European, primarily Swedish, influence over North American trotting began with the entity known as Continental Farms.

Continental Farms consisted of three Swedes, Hakan Wallner, Berndt Lindstedt and Jan Johnson.

The argument could be made that without Continental and their success on these shores, we may have not had the Nordins, Jimmy Takter, Per Henriksen, Per Eriksson, Ake Svanstedt, Jonas Czernyson, Domenico Cecere and numerous other prominent European horsemen racing here.

Continental Farms officially began as a registered stable in the United States in 1975.

The two elder members of the stable — Berndt Lindstedt and Hakan Wallner — first joined forces in Sweden as partners in 1966 when Lindstedt was 30 and Wallner was 27.

They raced primarily in Sweden with occasional forays into other European venues.

They were joined in the enterprise by Jan Johnson when Continental Farms was formed in 1978. Johnson had been with Wallner since he was 14 in 1965 and looked upon him as being somewhat as a surrogate parent.

Wallner was a born entrepreneur. He began visiting America in the mid-'60s purchasing horses for the Wallner-Lindstedt stable. Among his early purchases on these shores was the 1972 Elitlopp, 1973 Prix d'Amerique winner Dart Hanover and the 1979 Elitlopp winner and very successful Swedish sire Pershing. Bernie Lindstedt drove these two as well as most of the stable's successful horses on both sides of the Atlantic.

The soft spoken Lindstedt is a great all around horseman, but





is likely best known as one of the top drivers harness racing has ever known.

He has driven the winners of over 2,000 races and \$25 million and was the leading driver in Europe on several occasions while also competing at a top level in North America. He has competed in and been victorious in most of the most important trotting classics on each side of the Atlantic.

Among the top horses he has guided to victories in addition to the aforementioned Dart Hanover and Pershing, have been 1986 Trotter of the Year Royal Prestige, the initial Breeders Crown winner and successful French stallion Workaholic, Hambletonian Oaks winner Spring Dash and such classics winners as Supergill, Express Ride, Yankee Glide, Nan's Catch (dam of the remarkable Moni Maker), Conch, Silver Springs, Armbro Goal, Kit Lobell, Southern Newton, Geraldine Broline, Must Be Victory, Harry's Bar, Kick Tail, Smok'n Lantern, Marita's Victory and Yankee Mustang.

The elder statesman of the trio at 86, Lindstedt is now retired and living in Sweden where he still follows racing fervently and speaks on a daily basis to his best friend Jan Johnson.

Lindstedt was enshrined into the sport's Living Hall of Fame in Goshen in 2003.

Wallner was known as one of the world's greatest trotting ambassadors. He was a man of great warmth and personality as well as great entrepreneurial skills. If one were to choose the person who was most responsible for international trotting commerce, the choice would likely be between Hakan Wallner and France's Jean Pierre Dubois.

He more than any other single individual paved the way for European horsemen to move to and compete in North America at the trotting sport's highest level.

In the 1980s, Wallner moved to Italy where he pursued a successful career including a win in the Italian Derby with Offenburg LB in 1992. He passed away in Treviso, Italy in January of 2001.

He was elected to the Swedish Hall of Fame in 2015 and as an Immortal in the Hall of Fame of the Trotter in 2018.

Jan Johnson the youngest of the trio, now 71, is the only member of the stable still active in the sport on a daily basis. Many people regard Jan as having been the backbone of the operation. Bernie was best known as the driver. Hakan was Mr. Outside who everybody knew and often dealt with. Jan was in effect responsible for a great part of everything else.

Although the two junior members of the Continental team do not have Lindstedt's driving numbers, the ones they do have are nonetheless not too shabby. Wallner drove the North American winners of \$8,302,240, while Johnson has driven the winners of \$14,070,578.

It was from his home in Lighthouse Point, FL that we spoke with Jan Johnson recently.

Jan, you are 71 and still active on a daily basis. You are not only occupied at one job in the industry, but in two.

"I'm not that old — yet! I still enjoy what I'm doing. I've been lucky enough to land a job riding behind the 2-year-olds in Tony Alagna's stable, six mornings a week. What a pleasure it has been working with Tony, his mom Donna Lee and the wonderful team that they have put together. They have as well-bred and as good a looking bunch of young horses I've ever seen put together in a single stable. One after another, one set after another! There appears to be a whole lot of quality among them. I'm fairly certain that there are several of these colts and fillies that will be heard from on the Grand Circuit this year.

My second job is in helping to manage Lennart Agren's SRF stable horses here in the United States. Mr. Agren is the largest trotting horse owner in Sweden and maybe in all of Europe. He owns over 200 horses. Of those, about 50 of them are here in the United States. About half of them are broodmares, with the others being horses in training. I manage the business aspects of his horses here in the States. I keep in touch with the farms where the broodmares are stationed and stay in touch with the trainers in whose charge the racehorses are. It's a little busy now, with the breeding season approaching full tilt and stakes payments coming this week."

Together with Hakan Wallner and Berndt Lindstedt, the three of you comprised Continental Farms. Tell us about your partners.

"I worked for and with Hakan from the time I was 14 years old. There was never another person like him. He was the Swedish equivalent of Billy Haughton and Stanley Dancer combined! He was a great horseman, a great friend and a great businessman. He paved the way for many young European horsemen here in the United States. He was a dynamic personality who had a great influence on international harness racing. I looked upon him as being almost a surrogate father.

"Bernie is my oldest and dearest friend. Even though he hasn't left Sweden for five years, we still speak with each other every single day. I have heard him described as being someone who personifies the term 'gentleman.' I could not agree more."

You've been fortunate to have worked with all of the great Continental horses, through the years. Which one was your favorite?

"That's too hard a question. There have been so many. I couldn't come up with just a single one."

Okay, then, which one was the best?

"This might surprise you. It was the filly Nan's Catch. In my heart I know that if she had been in the Hambletonian, she would have won it. As it happens, we won the Hambletonian that year with Armbro Goal, with Nan's Catch winning the Oaks. We also had another good trotter that year in Supergill. I believe that she was better than either of them. We've had more than our share of top horses through the years, but I truly believe she was the best."

Then I'm guessing that it wasn't a surprise that if any mare would produce a trotter as good as Moni Maker it would be her?

"It is hard to imagine any horse producing a Moni Maker, but if any mare had the credentials to produce one as good as Moni Maker, it would be her. (More about Moni Maker later)."

Tell us a little about your early years here.

"My first year here was 1973. I was here with Hakan and another fellow. We had six horses between the three of us. How times have changed. Nowadays it isn't unusual for one groom to have

six horses by himself. Fortunately of the six, we had two real good ones in Express Ride and Buckeye Count. So we got started off on the right foot."

Who is the best horseman you've ever known?

"That would have to be Stig H Johansson. He did it all. He was a great driver, still is a great trainer and is the greatest all around horseman I've ever known. In terms of just being a great trainer, Soren Nordin would certainly have to be in the conversation."

What was your greatest thrill in all your years in the sport?

"My greatest personal thrill would be in winning the 1990 Kentucky Futurity with Star Mystic."

You developed a very good pacer in I Am A fool. How did that come about?

"The plan was that Bob Waxman and I were going to take a flyer and buy a pacing colt together. As sometimes was the case with Waxman, he didn't pay for his share. So I ended up owning him

all by myself. He trained well all winter and I qualified him at The Meadowlands in 1.56. He looked good. Brett Pelling made an offer of \$200,000 for him on behalf of David Brooks. That was an awful lot of money for me, so I sold him. The colt ended up making a million dollars, so it turned out well for everybody."

Tell me something about yourself that not too many people know.

"On separate occasions, I had both Valley Victory and Moni Maker bought. Unfortunately, both deals went south. I had a deal with Arlene Traub to buy Valley Victory for a client. He was going to be sent to Sweden where he would stand in stud. Arlene then broke the agreement and sold him to George Segal and Tony Pedone. I had Moni Maker bought for a client of ours at the conclusion of her 2-year-old season for \$400,000. The check was actually written. Then at the last minute, our client got cold feet and he changed his mind. The breed would be a whole lot different if those deals, especially the one for Valley Victory had gone through."

Anything else?

"I'd be remiss if I didn't give credit to the great team of caretakers



we've had through the years. Some of them sprouted their own wings and flew well beyond from where they came. If you don't have good people taking care of the horses, then chances are you won't have much success.

"We've also had a great number of quality owners backing us through the years, including, but not limited to Ulf Moberg, K G Bertmarks, Jorgen Jahre Sr and Jr, Ebby and Peter Gerry and Castleton Farms."

Do you envision the possibility of ever going back to Sweden to live?

"Not a chance. I am an American. This is still the greatest country on earth. I still hold a great love for Sweden and will occasionally go back to visit, especially around Elitloppet time. The United States is my home."

Interesting people and horses

It was a pleasant surprise to hear from Trey Nosrac, who recently wrote about his breeding philosophies in his HRU column Breaking Stride (full story here).

Nosrac owns a young trotting mare named Imagine Her Reign, who's by Uncle Peter and out of Margie, by Angus Hall. His question was about my thoughts on breeding her to Volstead. Nosrac is a Francophile, and he was drawn to Volstead under the impression that the horse was somehow French-connected. (If that's a possible condition that doesn't involve a large quantity of drugs and Gene Hackman).

Actually, Volstead is strictly an American-bred horse, by Cantab Hall, and out of Madame Volo, by Yankee Glide. He did, however, spend his entire racing career in Sweden, where he won \$729,716 in U.S. dollars, and took a record of 1:51.3. He is now standing at Dublin Valley Farm in Ohio.

Volstead seems not to have done any racing at 2, which is probably not that unusual in Sweden. However, that means that there is no way of applying Federico Tesio's, and my, basic standard of 2-year-old brilliance when appraising a stallion's future sire potential.

In this case, I'm inclined to give the horse the benefit of the doubt, and for the moment, not hold his lack of 2-year-old racing against him. After all, he didn't make the decision to be born in Sweden.

What you have when you cross Volstead on Imagine Her Reign is a 2 by 3 cross to Cantab Hall. Parenthetically, the Cantab name derives from the word Cantabrigian, meaning a resident of Cambridge, hence Cantab. That also happens to be the location of Harvard, so all Harvard men and women, good and true, are also Cantabs.

I told Nosrac to breed his mare to Volstead. With a broodmare band of one, the only way to swing for the stars is through judicious inbreeding. Cantab Hall was a great racehorse, and I know for a fact, as his breeder, that he is big, good looking, and perfectly correct. Not to mention one of the more successful stallions of the present day.

Based on Cantab's success in the stud, I assume his genetic profile, if it were visible, would show a very high card for his speed gene. In case you forgot, I compare the genetic makeup of any horse to a deck of playing cards, with a low of two and a high card of ace.

With a top sire like Cantab, his genetic deck, as far as the speed gene is concerned, probably starts with a 10, and goes up from there. At the moment of conception, the sire and dam each contribute 50 per cent to their foal's genetic inheritance, and they're blended to create the foal's genetic profile.

Although they each contribute 50 per cent, what they contribute can be totally different from each other's. If Cantab should come up with a face card, and Imagine Her Reign contributes a card from the middle of the deck, that foal will be above average in speed inheritance. And if she comes up with, say, an eight, or a nine, Nosrac will have a black type stakes contender.

There can also be something else at work here, which I admit I don't fully understand. Some great sires, and I put Cantab in

that class, have some inexplicable ability to call out the highest possible speed gene from the mares to which they're bred. When you look at the high percentage of fast horses a sire like Cantab gets, it's clear something is causing his mares to also come up with a high card speed gene.

In my own lifetime, I saw this phenomenon time after time with Garland Lobell. He improved the production of every mare he was bred to. My dear friend Lina Alm told me that she had heard that Steady Beau, a pacing sire from the Ming Dynasty, always improved every mare he was bred to. So it happens, but while it's a phenomenon I can note, I can't explain it.

A flashy ad for a pacing horse called Rodeo Romeo also caught my eye, and I compulsively ran his five generation pedigree. R² is by Rocknroll Hanover, and out of Southwind Vanna, by Artsplace. I'm not here to write an ad for any stallion, but R² has an interesting pedigree.

He's 3 by 4 by 4 to Abercrombie, 3 by 4 to Western Hanover, and 3 by 4 to Direct Scooter. What these numbers mean, in case it slipped your mind, is this;

When the sum of the generations in which the same name appears is six or less, that is designated *inbreeding*. When the sum of the generations is seven or eight, that is *linebreeding*. Anything higher than eight is an outcross.

Some of the names in R squared's fifth generation stir memories. Southwind Vanna's fifth dam is Jambo Belle. Jambo was the *nom*

de cours of Bert James, who played a prominent role as a breeder in days of yore. Jambo Belle was one of the prizes in the package the Armstrong Brothers and I bought from Bert. It also included Voodoo Hanover, the dam of Albatross, and Maryellen Hanover, who went on to be one of the great matrons of the modern era.

Golden Miss, the 4th dam of Rocknroll Hanover, was Bill Shehan's first broodmare. Shehan was a very smart breeder, and with limited resources originally, he collected a powerful band of mares. Shehan was frequently involved with Francis McKinzie, as I was, also.

McKinzie told me that he advised Shehan not to pay the asking price of \$10,000 for Golden Miss, telling him that by the next spring he could buy her for \$7,500. Those were significant amounts in our early days. Shehan ignored Francis, and paid the \$10,000 asking price. The mare went on to become a foundation pacing mare.

There were giants in those days, and this Cantab was lucky to have known them. And, on that subject, i.e. Cambridge, don't forget what they say about Cantabs;

"You can tell a Harvard man, but you can't tell him much."

Present company excepted, I hope.



Breaking down Day 1 of the Pomp vs. Outsiders driving challenge

With just under 20 race days presumed remaining in the history of Pompano Park, this week the track will see the best collection of drivers assembled in perhaps decades. That's because Tuesday and Wednesday (March 15 and 16) feature a world driving challenge, dubbed "Team Pomp" versus "The Outsiders."

Defending their home turf, Team Pomp consists of Wally Hennessey, Dave Miller, Peter Wrenn and Keven Wallis. The Pompano team will benefit greatly from having Dave Miller on their team who otherwise would be an 'outsider,' but has driven full-time at the south Florida oval this winter. Maybe he'll get some ribbing from his more frequent competitors for defecting.

Despite Miller making Pompano his home this winter, forever trop driver at the track, Wally Hennessey still leads the way in the local standings. Having 12 fewer starts than Miller, Hennessey has more wins, 59 to 50. Included in that is a UDRS of .375 for Hennessey to Miller's .338. Together, the two Hall of Famers form a strong foundation for Team Pomp. Hennessey captains the team.

The Outsiders includes 2022 bound Hall of Famer in Yannick Gingras, who serves as the team's captain. He's joined by fellow world class drivers Dexter Dunn, Andrew McCarthy and James MacDonald, who comes off a career year in 2021. Amazingly, this will be the first start for all of the Outsider drivers at Pompano Park. What better time though to get it in.

You wouldn't think off-hand the Team Pomp quartet would be able to win against the Team Outsiders group, but thanks to possibly some good old home cooking Team Pomp might actually have the edge. The draw for Wednesday won't take place until Sunday, but here's how things shake out for Tuesday, the first of two cards for the driving challenge.

Races 2, 3, 4 and 8 consist of the races specifically designated towards the driving challenge. Will horses driven by Hennessey offer more value than they would normally with the other drivers around? Dunn, Gingras and others can be found on other drives throughout the card which may completely change the complexion of typical Pompano Park handicapping, though for now we'll focus just on the driving challenge races.

RACE 2

In a N/W \$3,000 L5 trot, it's perhaps no surprise that Hennessey lands on the 1-1 even money programmed favorite to kick things off. His drive, Holton, comes off a solid second from last week when he took his shot through the stretch against a heavily backed 1-5 shot and came up short only a length or so. That 1:55.2 clocking came in just his third start back on the year and he's gotten quicker each time out; would seem likely to start things with a notch in Team Hennessey's corner. Manwilling comes out of that same race as Holton and goes from Campagnuolo in that Florida Amateur Driving Club -Legends race, to Gingras. He was a useful second six races back against similar, though would still need to go faster to threaten the looming big favorite. Thundercrest from the outside could be there to complete some exotics if for no other reason that he gets Dunn; he's gone some relatively tougher trips in recent tries against better. Race pick: Team Pomp.

RACE 3

On the pace, a N/W \$4,000 L5 race, it's Hennessey with another morning line favorite though this one is a little more questionable. Mc Mach broke last week after being looped for the lead and it's hard to tell where he was going to go if not for the break. That said, he was an Open III winner at the end of January and continues to take another drop. America's Fleet gets Wrenn as another as part of Team Pomp and he was a \$15,000 claim

in January. He did good for himself last week to take a shot in behind a couple of essentially dual even-money favorites and hold for second. Rockntouch is another class dropper and picks up Gingras. Only knock is that Hennessey had been driving prior with notable success, came up short a few times at low prices in February. I'm guessing Drunkonaplane will show speed from post 8 despite not showing it recently. He has Dave Miller and Team Pomp seems to have this race cornered. **Race pick:** Team Pomp.


RACE 4

It's the third consecutive morning line favorite for Team Pomp and here's where I'll take a stand. In the lower-level condition for fillies & mares N/W \$2,000 L5, The Outsiders look good with Hallsglensmavis. This one goes from Sanzeri to Dunn and this 5-year-old mare checks a lot of boxes. She won in 1:54.3 a few races back and has had a tougher go of it since then, including a first-over try two back and then was used last out when parked through an opening guarter of :26.3; she can take these all the way. Misty Memory N is the early 5-2 favorite for Team Pomp. She had Miller last week as she does now and had to take the overland route from post 7 as the 4-5 favorite. Not sold that she's simply as fast as #5, we'll see. Indian Creek Kyla endured a horrible shuffle last out when the outside flow cleared and she actually had a lot of late pace to come back on to get third. It's her fourth start at the reduced level and she gets McCarthy. Gypsy Merlot brushed to the lead in that same race but couldn't stave off the onslaught; needs one well-timed move. Race pick: The Outsiders

RACE 8

The final race of the first driving challenge night is a TrackMaster rated 70.3 or lower condition and Hennessey again lands the probable favorite in Lyons Johnny. Amazingly, this one switched to Hennessey last out and almost won at a price of 6-1 which would have been unheard for the driver at Pompano. That was a tough beat and speed will be coming again from the 14-year-old. St Lads Flirt rode the cones in her first start back since December and came down to these parts from Canada last fall. That last race went relatively fast and might serve him well for this one; won in 1:52 last year at Georgian. Born Of Fire makes his third start off the Scott Nance claim. He just missed two back and closed with a :28 final quarter last week, gets James MacDonald. Rope The Moon is always around and is another asset in the race for Team Pomp. **Race pick:** Team Pomp.







The continuing education of Mitch Cushing and Rock Diamonds N

Mitch Cushing admits he didn't have an affinity for veteran pacer Rock Diamonds N before this winter. He had driven the 9-year-old import, trained and co-owned by his father, Ron, twice before the Miami Valley Raceway meet. In the month of March, however, the two have teamed for back-to-back victories, the latest coming in the \$24,000 Open II, wiring the field in a 1:52 performance on March 10.

"Honestly, I really wasn't a huge fan. I always liked how fast he was, but he was stupid hot, he would get ridiculously hot and you couldn't hold him. Getting to drive him this winter, I've been able to learn (from and with) him," Cushing said.

Rock Diamonds N arrived from New Zealand in 2019 when Ron Cushing acquired the gelding with the help of friend and agent

Frank Ranaldi. Owned in partnership with Kevin Sywyk, the Rocknroll Hanover—Dancing Diamonds gelding earned nearly \$190,000 Down Under. Since his arrival in the United States, he has banked more than \$300,000 in three full seasons and eight starts thus far in 2022. His latest victory pushed career earnings over \$500,000.

During that first season stateside, the younger Cushing steered Rock Diamonds N to a triumph in the 60th annual Gold Cup and Saucer at Charlottetown Driving Park. The win still resonates with the 24-year-old catch driver because of its significance to the region.

"He's the only horse that I've been fortunate enough to win a staple race with. He raced a spectacular mile there. It means something to people in Canada. It's a big trophy and a huge event," Cushing explained. "He's the first horse I've had the opportunity to experience that with."

Despite the win, Cushing didn't fully appreciate the pacer. Entering this season, he had limited opportunities to sit behind the veteran in competition. Besides the Gold Cup and Saucer win, his only other time in the bike came at Plainridge Park in a race where he choked Rock Diamonds N down accidently. Paired with him eight times at Miami Valley, the duo have hit the board four times, producing victories in their last two attempts. Through the process, the catch driver has developed an admiration for the 40-time winner.

"As soon as you get him on a helmet, you literally just take your lines and drop them to your knees. And I mean literally, drop them like untied shoelaces. He just puts his head square in the middle of the guy's back and follows him wherever they go. You don't have to steer him, you don't have to hold him, nothing. When you pull him off the helmet, you just grab the bit again and he's ready to take you wherever you need to go," commented Cushing. "He's grown to become one of my favorites just because I've come to learn the horse and now I respect him. Not every horse is like that. It just goes to show the class that he has. It's something that you don't come by every day."

Ron Cushing, a veteran of the Michigan circuit before moving to the northeast, brought six horses to Miami Valley shortly after Christmas. Two were claimed earlier in the meet, but Rock Diamonds N and 10-year-old stallion Starznheaven have each secured a pair of victories. In a few weeks, the elder Cushing will depart once Plainridge opens.

Mitch Cushing is three months into his second season in Ohio. A top driver at Plainridge, he moved to the Midwest in 2021. Before the move, he competed at Saratoga with weekend stints at Freehold and the Meadowlands. A phone call, however, changed his plans.

"I was focused on doing what I could to make it to Grand Circuit level. Usually you want to be as close as you can to that environment," he said. "I was ordering a race bike from Chad Foulk, and he asked me what I was doing. He said, 'I know you just moved to Saratoga. Have you ever thought about coming out to Ohio?' I said, 'Honestly, it has never crossed my mind."

The seed was planted, though, and soon the Michigan native was on the move to the Buckeye State. His first opportunities came via fellow New Englander Mike Hitchcock, a trainer who also made the move to Ohio. The driver is focused on putting

down roots, adding accounts and improving each year. In 2021 he guided 136 winners, more than 100 less than in 2018 when he finished second in the Plainridge standings. While down in wins, he set a new career mark in purse earnings with just shy of \$1.8 million.

"Scotty Zeron is a mentor of mind. He always told me what matters most is the column to the right. That's the figure that pays the bills," said Cushing. "The wins and everything else will come. If the number all the way to the right is always increasing or is always there, that is the number that allows you to do what you do in life."

Currently, Cushing is driving at Miami Valley and MGM Northfield Park. He ranks in the top 15 at Miami Valley with six wins in 2022. He began driving horses for Ohio Hall of Famer Virgil Morgan Jr. last season, piloting 75-1 Odds On Shaggy to a narrow third-place finish in the \$300,000 Ohio Sire Stakes final for sophomore pacing colts. The colt hit the board in a tight photo behind upset winner Borntobeshameless and heavy favorite Charlie May, a highlight for the driver, who has also guided Breeders Crown starter Refined to victory this winter for the trainer.

"The money is great, the schedule is great. The access to race seven days a week is amazing," he said. "I added Northfield to my schedule, and now that my roots are a little more set, I have some connections. Everything is a process. I'm just looking to be better every year. This year I hope my average, my wins, my money, I hope it's all better."

With so many harness tracks closing (the latest being the great Pompano Park which will sadly say 'goodbye' to it's horsemen and patrons after 50 years), there is a grim outlook for our great sport.

There are several reasons why the sport has steadily declined over the past decade(s): the main one being the onset of offtrack betting and the opening of casinos.

So it's no wonder many people hesitate before taking the plunge into making a career of driving, training, grooming and owning standardbreds.

There's not a lot of 'young fresh blood,' which is what harness racing desperately needs; but that didn't stop this issue's superstar, Tabitha Teresczuk.

Although her family was not involved in the business, Teresczuk started riding horses at the fairgrounds when she was 16.

"I've always loved horses and grew up mostly around quarter horses and would go to the rodeos on the weekends," Teresczuk said.

"I was born in Cleveland, Ohio, and would watch the racehorses at the track and I guess you could say it was 'love at first sight' with the sport.

"I started out at Northfield Park doing catch paddocks for Jodi Schillaci, and a few others. I was immediately hooked and before long got my trainer and driver licenses and went out on my own. Jodi taught me so much about hard work and paying attention to the 'little things.'

"I drove a bit at the fairs and started riding under saddle when they had the series. I went to various tracks and it was great experience.

"One day I was involved in a bad accident while competing under saddle, so I had to quit driving and started concentrating on training.

"I've worked for some of the best trainers in the business, such as Virgil Morgan, Dan Altmeyer, and Sam and Jodi Schillaci.

"I have been good friends with the Schillacis for over 20 years and after working for them awhile we purchased a couple of horses together. We did very well and although I am now on my own we remain close. They taught me a lot and they are some of the hardest working people I know."

Who was your best horse?

"The best horse I've trained would be Dennis. His owners sent him to me as a 4-year-old and he held the world record on a half-mile as a 3-year-old in 1:53.3.

"Trainer Roland Mallar originally trained him and did a terrific job because he was a difficult horse on the track. Dennis was a lot of work, but he was worth it. He was a handy horse that could race on any size track, but I kept him mainly at Yonkers and Pocono. After he tore a suspensory in a qualifier at the Meadowlands, we decided to retire him."

Who was your favorite horse?

"There's too many to pick from but it would probably be Magnum Kosmos. I took care of him on and off during his entire racing career. He made the Hambletonian final, but unfortunately, broke behind the gate.

"After that I began riding him and took him to the standardbred show in New Jersey. He ended up being Grand Champion one year in halter, and after he got injured he became my riding horse and has a home for life."

What was the highlight in your career?

"That would be when my trotting filly, Liz, was the 2-year-old Trotting Filly of the Year at The Meadows Racetrack.

"She ended up winning a couple legs of the stallion series and the final that year.

"Liz was a homebred that her owner sent me. That girl had a mind of her own.

"She would run for no reason and it took me a long time and a lot of equipment changes to figure her out, but when I finally did, she ended up being a really nice 2-year-old."

Teresczuk has raced her horses at Dover Downs, Harrington, Tioga, Yonkers, Monticello, Chester, Pocono Downs, The Meadows, The Meadowlands, Freehold, Northfield and spent several winters in Pompano. Today, she trains a small stable of three at Mark Ford Training Center in Middleton, NY.

"I'm really a 'hands-on' person and enjoy doing everything myself. It's rewarding when all your hard work pays off, but can be frustrating at times, but that is when I put my big girl pants on and do my best and try again next week."

Let's take a leap of faith in Florida

After the final race at Pompano Park harness racetrack, many of us will sense an unsettling feeling about the future of our sport. As far as I can tell, nobody did anything wrong at "The Winter Capital of Harness Racing." The racing handle was strong, the track and the people who put on the races gave off a good vibe — all to no avail. The wrecking ball will swing.

Interviews with political representatives supporting our sport in Florida suggest the future of harness racing is more than a longshot. We may never know the legislative arm twisting and turning that brings us to this low point where harness horse racing gets snuffed out in one of our most populous states. Similar stories continue with Michigan, Illinois, and countless other racetracks that rely on shadowy, unknown forces.

Harness racing often feels like we are stuck in loveless arranged marriages, dependent on the other party who has connections, lawyers, and politicians, trying to facilitate an uncoupling.

Troubling times like these might inspire you to believe, as I do, that we need something to aim for, a project to get excited about, an initiative that is all ours, all positive, free from conflict, fiefdoms and restraint. Instead of silently slinking out of Florida, we could build something, something we all could take ownership of financially and emotionally. Wouldn't it be wonderful to create a not-for-profit, multipurpose, year-round facility dedicated to the sport, a hub of harness *racing*, a place of our own we could call home, a shelter against oncoming storms?

Let's leap into the unknown. We may fall, we may fly, but we can try.

Why not...

Create the legal framework for a non-profit entity. After an afternoon on the Internet looking into things like an IRC 501(c)(8) (a fraternal beneficiary society, orders, or associations operating under the lodge system), or 701(3)c, or LCC's, this project seems possible. We have plenty of good lawyers in our midst that could assist in the setup.

Find a Florida location. We could build from scratch or reinvigorate a training center. I would suggest Spring Garden Ranch training center in DeLeon Springs, a spacious rural area with existing zoning and infrastructure. This location would be perfect. Each visit to

Spring Garden calms the troubled heart and raises spirits.

No racing license is required. Of course, we continue to work in the Florida state legislature to restore pari-mutuel racing. But at this point, and maybe for a long time, wagering is not needed. This effort would be like Ray Kinsella in *Field of Dreams*, who hears a strange whisper, "If you build it, they will come."

Get the funding. Operating expenses are always an obstacle for dreamers who leap into the unknown. At Spring Garden, either the purchase of the property or a long-term lease would not be an onerous expense. The fastest path would be an original outlay from an interested benefactor or benefactors. A deep pocket or two from benevolent members of the racing community could give us a start. After securing the property, raising money, and electing a board of directors, the funding becomes the staff's responsibility.

Rebrand our flagship facility. Create a mighty and proud name such as - *The American Society of Trotting and Pacing Institute at Spring Garden Ranch.*

To do exactly what and raise funding how? The beauty of leaps of faith is that there are no rules. The staff (and our team should consist of youthful, enterprising people) will take the ball and run. The staff answers to the board with their plans. Possible funding? The team can prioritize from a broad menu of revenue streams. Here are a dozen easy examples tossed on the table:

- The winter training operation
- Educational grants
- · Agricultural grants
- Tourism grants
- Reopen the onsite restaurant
- Donations from you and me
- RV hookup rentals
- Facility rentals
- USTA convention site
- Tours
- A for-profit horse retirement operation
- Non-wagering horse events and races
- Legacy grants from estates
- Merchandise sales

Smart, enthusiastic people will fill pages with concepts and funding methods for ongoing expansion. The facility will be ever-changing, a launching pad for new initiatives. Right now, you might have your creative juices flowing for funding, additions, and activities.



USTA annual meeting kicks off with Marketing and Communications Committee

The 2022 U.S. Trotting Association's board of directors annual meeting kicked off on Friday (March 11) with the Marketing and Communications Committee presentation.

The agenda included a look at 2021, the Year in Review, by USTA staff members Dan Leary, Wendy Ross and Kyle Creditt who made the presentation. Then Leary gave a brief summary of the USTA's first year of publishing the Breeders Book Stallion Directory and how it will be sold and marketed starting in year two.

The final presentation was made by committee co-chair Ashley Tetrick, a proposal on how to utilize the website HarnessRacing. com to promote harness racing and expand the audience for the sport.

Tetrick described how after college graduation she took a job as an outrider and found it difficult to find information about harness racing.

"I graduated from Purdue University... and I had a lot of bills to pay so I ended up as an outrider at Balmoral Park, which ironically, I feel kind of fed my urge for information within harness racing," said Tetrick, who is on the recently formed Electronic Marketing Committee. "I couldn't figure out where to go for basic, everyday information.

"When (USTA) president Russell Williams informed Jim Miller and me about this acquisition of HarnessRacing.com, it was really interesting to me because this is a really incredible opportunity to create exactly where that information, simple, immediate could lie. Our goal with the Electronic Marketing Committee...was to figure out what is HarnessRacing.com supposed to be."

Citing her experience as a pharmaceutical representative, Tetrick explained how her company focused on consumer marketing and how HarnessRacing.com needs to focus solely on that.

"As a pharmaceutical rep, I was a liaison between the consumer and my firm," said Tetrick. "The number one thing that I think is necessary... is that separation between trade media and consumer media."

In the USTA presentation, Leary discussed the changes in the organization's Communications Department over the past two years as well as providing a recap of the first year publishing the Breeders Book and the plans for the options of Hoof Beats subscribers to include it or not with their subscriptions.

The Year in Review presentation featured several short videos demonstrating how the USTA utilized them and graphics on social media platforms, what the approach is to covering racing and developing feature story ideas, and how the USTA "traveling team" used technology to produce exciting videos and capture unique photos.

The USTA annual meeting continued on Saturday (March 12) with the Board of Directors opening general session, the annual recognition luncheon, and the Racing, Registration, and Finance Committees.

Sixty-one nominated to Pepsi North America Cup

Woodbine Entertainment has released the list of eligible horses for its 2022 major standardbred stakes, including the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup.

The Pepsi North America Cup, harness racing's richest race for 3-year-old pacers, received 61 nominations, down from 72 in 2021.

The list of nominees includes Dan Patch Award and Metro Pace winner Monte Miki, O'Brien Award winner Betterhavemymoney and the Sires Stakes champions from Ontario (Bob Loblaw), Kentucky (Pebble Beach), Pennsylvania (True Blue Lindy), Ohio (Gulf Shores) and Indiana (Dalby Hanover).

The 39th Pepsi North America Cup is scheduled for Saturday, June 18 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The eliminations will take place a week prior on Saturday, June 11.

Woodbine's lucrative stakes program features rich events throughout the summer and into the fall. Nomination numbers held steady from prior years and uncertain times.

The Maple Leaf Trot saw a noticeable increase in nominations, with 51 older trotters nominated to this year's event, up from 38 in 2021.

The list for the prestigious Maple Leaf Trot includes European stars Ecurie D, who won last year's Breeders Crown open trot, and Alrajah One, who will make his North America debut this season. The star-studded group also features past winners Lindy The Great (2021), Atlanta (2020) and recent award-winners Bella Bellini, Forbidden Trade, Jujubee and Perfetto.

The Canadian Pacing Derby also saw a spike in nominations from 46 to 54. Canadian Horse of the Year Desperate Man is part of the who's who list of nominees, along with defending champion Allywag Hanover.

The Maple Leaf Trot and Canadian Pacing Derby are scheduled for Saturday, September 3.

Woodbine's marquee two-year-old stakes saw nominations climb in three of the four, with the Metro Pace up from 174 to 179, the Shes A Great Lady up from 142 to 163 and the Wellwood Memorial up from 200 to 204. The Peaceful Way saw nominations drop from 160 to 133.

The winner of the William Wellwood Memorial will earn the 10th and final slot in the Mohawk Million. Woodbine will release the names of the slot owners for this year's 'Million' on Thursday afternoon (March 10).

Harrah's Hoosier Park makes upgrades for 2022 season

With the return of live harness racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino just a few weeks away, final preparations for the 29th season are well underway throughout the property. Opening day of the 160-day meet is set for Friday, March 25. "Outrage" over Russell Williams' letter

The undersigned feel compelled to express our outrage at Russell Williams' recently published letter to New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania regulators, seeking their investigation into testing integrity at Jeff Gural related tracks (full story here).

All within the industry are well aware of the long standing animosity of the USTA leadership duo of Joe Faraldo and Russell Williams toward Jeff Gural. This Russell Williams letter takes that personal vendetta to a new level, endangering the very industry the USTA is charged to protect. It is maliciously inspired, poorly thought out, intellectually dishonest, and a divisive attempt to add new fractures into an already divided industry.

A few facts....

- There would be no harness racing at The Meadowlands, Tioga, or Vernon without Jeff Gural's financial and political intervention to save them.
- 2. There would have been no progress in attempts in attempts to rid our industry of beards, blood doping trainers, shadowy and unregulated equine drug chemist, and unethical veterinary practices without Jeff Gural's financial and leadership support of recent undercover investigative efforts that led directly to major indictments and lengthy, deserved jail time for significant offenders.
- 3. Any hope that our industry has for follow up indictments and further rooting out of industry bad actors relies on continued undercover work and targeting born out of the fruit of the original indictments.
- 4. Drug testing, whether conducted by Jeff Gural's Hong Kong lab of choice or by labs chosen by state regulators, has consistently failed to produce significant actionable evidence with which to effectively proceed against the many obvious industry bad actors still plying their trades within the racing industry.
- 5. The Racing Commissions that the Williams' letter alludes to have not been responsible for any effective outing of significance. Their lack of effectiveness is one of the major factors underlying the creation of HISA, which, it is hoped, will better facilitate achievement of industry integrity aspirations.

- 6. Russell Williams and Joe Faraldo (USTA management) have aggressively opposed HISA, preferring to rely upon the clearly, historically inadequate state racing commission model of industry integrity management. Their opposition is based on three pillars: claims of HISA unconstitutionality, fears related to enforcement cost uncertainties, and concerns that HISA might lead to banning of Lasix. Note that their opposition on these grounds justifies, in their minds, continued reliance on state enforcement and drug testing that have proven totally ineffective in righting our ship.
- 7. Jeff Gural's private ownership rights give him extraordinary, but not unfettered, powers to run his business as he sees fit.

Williams' letter presents no supporting facts for its implied claim that Jeff Gural has engaged in selective enforcement of drug positives. Just as importantly, it neglects the fact that we, as an industry, really have no transparency with respect to possible selective enforcement on the part of state commissions or the USTA. The idea of enabling full transparency respecting all drug testing results is a good one, but it would require creation of an independent body solely authorized to ensure this transparency, and it would need to apply to state commission results no lee than to Mr. Gural's. Certainly the USTA cannot act in this neutral capacity, as evidenced by the personal and biased nature of current leadership's manner of dealing with industry matters.

The notion that Mr. Gural's handling of the Adrienne Hall matter is somehow proof of Mr. Gural's impropriety of bias is unfounded. If the New Jersey Racing Commission would ban her, then her situation would be sealed. We may not agree with Mr. Gural's belief that allowing her to race will lead others to inform, or in the wisdom of allowing an admitted doper to continue competing at his tracks, but as long as state commissions do not ban her, it is a prerogative of ownership for Mr. Gural to act as he is. Industry response may move him to change his policy, but his position is based on his belief that allowing her to continue competing will lead to more disclosures from others believing their cooperation might induce leniency. The implied favoritism suggested by Williams is out of line.

Williams' letter also exposes its hypocrisy and elitist approach in suggesting it is attempting to protect stakes owners expectations for a level playing field. The doping issue is no less pervasive and harmful in non-stakes races, which constitute the vast bulk of our races. Where is USTA concern for their effective supervision?

In closing, it is unbelievable that the USTA would specifically target Jeff Gural for selective enforcement of integrity issues when nowhere else in our industry is there any enforcement of integrity issues. Sadly, the USTA, Russell Williams, and Joe Faraldo have turned a complete blind eye to issues of integrity! Where it not for Jeff Gural's "self-appointed" regulatory efforts, we, as an industry, honest trainers, and owners would be far worse off!

Gural proudly owns his efforts to clean up racing. Shows up in court to bear witness to a man sentenced to years in prison, when questions mount as to whether others are equally guilty. It must be that when the dirt hits the fan all those muddied need to be held accountable. Gural cannot on the one hand fight for racing integrity and then on the other shield known culprits from punishment. Oakes, Pena and others were dealt the Gural wrath while others have gone unpunished or protected from being publicly implicated. Gural should be front and center with the U.S. attorney's office to go full force in furthering its investigation. Don't stop with the few lives destroyed while others continue to enjoy the fruits of their ill-gotten gains. It is, for example, unfathomable that Gural hasn't grabbed his megaphone to push for an investigation of the driver(s) allegedly paid to not put forth a best effort (as alleged in the Fishman trial). The zeal and publicity for Gural's justice can't punish some and leave others unscathed. Mr. Gural started this pursuit. It's on him to finish it.

Does post-time drag exist?

I having been reading about the drag time for Meadowlands races and find the whole thing amusing and silly. There is no drag and there never was one. Think of the guy who turns his clock ahead a few minutes in order not to be late. He becomes conditioned to do things with his clock being ahead of time. Obviously, it's just a mental thing. Now think of the Meadowlands race time as seven minutes after the time says zero. Once one knows that's the real race time, it is no longer a drag, it's the real post time and the bettor has the conditioned response to bet accordingly. Most wait until near post time and you know post time is seven minutes after it says zero.

The experiment to go when the clock said zero had to fail. Everyone was conditioned to bet seven minutes later. It's been inbred to them. It would take a considerable time for them to become accustomed to race time being the real time and that would cost the Meadowlands a considerable amount of money waiting for the bettor to be acclimated. Once they all know that betting would go back to normal. So in the end it really makes no difference, just be consistent and the bettor will catch on.
