Sylvain Filion awaits decision of stay hearing

In Part 1 of a continuing report, the Canadian Hall of Fame driver has asked the Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel to put a stay on his 10-year suspension and \$40,000 fine while the appeals process plays out.

On Friday (March 7), the Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel (HRAP) held a virtual hearing in which Canadian Hall of Fame driver Sylvain Filion made the case for a stay. He was appealing his 10-year suspension and \$40,000 fine imposed by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) on Oct. 31, 2024. Filion and trainer Richard Moreau were identically penalized when former Woodbine Mohawk Park pacer Funtime Bayama (p, 3, 1:49.1s; \$303,108) tested positive for darbepoetin (DPO) in out-of-competition testing on June 10, 2024.

HRAP chair Stanley Sadinsky stated that, "Mr. Filion was found to have been acting as an actual trainer of the horse, along with its trainer of record, Richard Moreau. Mr. Filion now seeks a stay of this ruling." A stay would allow the 56-year-old driver to temporarily return to competition while he awaits his appeal hearing date, which had not been set as of March 13. Filion had served 127 days of his suspension as of the hearing date.

Filion was represented by Jennifer Friedman. Brendan van Niejenhuis and Alexandra Heine represented the registrar in the unusual hearing.

"I've sat on a lot of contested stay motions, but I've never seen so much material filed upon a motion for a stay," said Sadinsky, reminding participants that Filion's hearing was only to determine whether he met the criteria for a stay.

Four witnesses testified in the hearing: horseman Stephane Larocque; AGCO senior manager of racing Tyler Durand; Sylvain Filion's wife Domenic Pare; and Filion himself. Two other racing officials, Brad Capes and Mike Weber, were sent summonses but did not attend due to mandatory training that made them unavailable.

"If at that [late afternoon] point in the evidence you're not in a position to grant the appellant's [Filion's] request for a stay, then I would suggest we address the potential evidence of those two other individuals," said Friedman, addressing Sadinsky.

Larocque was the first to be interviewed. He stated that he had been friends with Filion for "at least 20 years," and had trained horses for Yves Filion, Sylvain's father. Larocque had written a letter in defense of Sylvain, whom he called "a straight shooter" and a "one-of-a-kind" talent with horses. He testified that 10 to 15 different trainers used to regularly ask the now-suspended driver to take their horses for training miles or to jog.

"It was almost every day, because [Sylvain would] sometimes stop [in] to my barn and a lot of times he was gone to other barns... [because] everybody would like to have his opinion on a horse," said Larocque. "A lot of them were clients who used to use him as a driver, and you know, the trainers wanted his opinion... because he's so good at it."

Friedman asked Larocque about what distinguishes a driver who goes training miles with horses from a de facto trainer.

"Well, they're going to give their advice, but it's the trainer's decision to make the last call," Larocque replied.

Larocque called Sylvain "a Guy Lafleur of harness racing," referring to the Montreal Canadiens hockey legend. He defended the integrity of Sylvain's 37-year driving career, adding, "To me, it's very disrespectful for him, what's happening right now."

When questioned by Heine, the recently-retired trainer denied ever visiting Moreau's farm to train or watch Funtime Bayama with Sylvain, or ever being involved in discussions with Sylvain, Moreau and/or a veterinarian about "racing strategy" for the gelding.

Durand was the next witness. He stated that in his position as AGCO senior manager of racing, he oversees the manager of the Equine Drug Unit, who in turn supervises the inspectors involved in the Funtime Bayama case. Van Niejenhuis asked Durand "whether an investigation was happening between [June and October, 2024] relating to Mr. Filion."

Durand replied, "Not initially. Initially the investigation or inspection was focused around Mr. Moreau, however, during the course of which Mr. Filion became involved... Information

was gathered through the course of the inspection that led us to believe that Mr. Filion was acting as the de facto trainer of the horse Funtime Bayama."

Friedman next questioned Durand about whether he would agree that Sylvain was facing "aggressive... regulatory action, when there's no hearing available or a suspension is levied," which she added was "at the heart of why a stay ought to be granted."

Durand disagreed.

"Mr. Filion had an opportunity to explain to us during the course of the inspection his side of the events, and that is what formed the basis of the Deputy Registrar's decision," he said.

"Are you aware that the appellant [Sylvain] made multiple informal stay requests virtually since the time the ruling was issued?" asked Friedman.

"Yes," said Durand.

Friedman argued that Filion had suffered reputational damage from widespread reports of the allegations against him.

"In terms of the ruling itself, particularly one of this nature where there's a positive test, you'd agree that this kind of news travels fast in industries such as the horse racing industry... and that often participants and the public will jump to the conclusion that a positive test means someone cheated?" she asked. Durand agreed.

"Are you aware that [Sylvain] was recently inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame?" asked Friedman.

"Yes," replied Durand.

"Are you also aware that the AGCO required him to be interviewed for this matter on the very same day of his induction?" continued Friedman. "Is that troubling to you at all?"

Durand said, "I don't know if that was intentional. I don't believe that it was, but that is unfortunate timing."

Multiple racing and mainstream news articles were displayed on screen, showing headlines about Sylvain's suspension. Friedman asked and Durand agreed that "this news traveled around virtually everywhere before Sylvain Filion had an opportunity to defend himself."

She noted that the four-time O'Brien Driver of the Year and 1999 World Driving Champion had a previously "clean record" free of serious conduct or medication violations, suggesting this was "a basis for granting a stay."

When Friedman asked Durand whether he agreed that granting a stay would allow Sylvain "damage control... for his reputation" and a chance to earn an income from driving again, he said he was unsure.

Durand countered that Sylvain's history did not outweigh the current charges against him.

"The AGCO's position is that this is an extremely serious offence,

and it would be viewed upon the industry negatively to consent to a stay and allow him to participate when we believe the offence was so egregious that he should not be participating," he said.

Friedman drew attention to the "novelty" of the accusations against Sylvain.


"How many times has the AGCO held a driver responsible as trainer of record?" she asked Durand, who responded that he was not aware of any in recent years.

She next questioned Durand about Sylvain's "chance to defend himself" before the AGCO ruling against him. The senior manager of racing replied that the driver "did have the opportunity to tell us, but he was not presented with what the violation was against him, prior to the ruling being issued."

Friedman argued that Sylvain did not know which AGCO judge or judges ruled against him, which Durand agreed the driver was "entitled to know."

The integrity of Funtime Bayama's out-of-competition blood sample was raised by Friedman. Durand said the sample was first analyzed in British Columbia by Bureau Veritas, and later by LGC in the United Kingdom, to confirm the analysis.

"The samples were still in their locked container and sealed and arrived just as the lab had shipped them there, but it was not placed in an evidence bag" for shipping to LGC, he said.

Missing documentation and an outstanding residue test on the sample, requested by the counsel representing trainer Moreau, constitute a basis for allowing Sylvain a stay, argued Friedman. She later questioned Durand on whether letters of support for Sylvain's return to racing could help "restore his reputation."

Durand said, "He could attempt to do so."

When questioned by van Niejenhuis about whether Sylvain's 2024 Hall of Fame induction and accomplishments matter

in deciding whether to grant a stay, Durand replied they did not. He also told van Niejenhuis that he was unaware of anything preventing Sylvain from attempting to restore his own reputation.

Sylvain's counsel next called Pare to testify. Pare said the couple had been together since high school, and that Sylvain had always earned a living in harness racing. She supported Larocque's earlier statements that Sylvain was a professional catch driver who frequently trained horses, in the sense of taking them for training miles.

"I live with Sylvain for the last 34 years," said Pare. "Every single morning, he will go and exercise horses at training facilities, farm facilities, whoever calls or texts him, 'Hey Sylvain, I need your input about that horse. Can you come and exercise the horse?"

After Pare's testimony, Sylvain spoke extensively about his ongoing suspension and hopes for the future. This will be covered in the next edition of this column.

At publication deadline (March 13), the HRAP had made no ruling on Sylvain's application for a stay and no appeal hearing dates were set for Sylvain or Moreau.

Disqualification placings bolster need for clear and uniform rules

In December, this column detailed events that came from a **strange disqualification in a race at Batavia Downs**. The purpose of this writing just three months after isn't simply to air more grievances around questionable rulings — I could do that weekly — but to illustrate the desperate need for both clearly defined rules, and for judges that can interpret those rules consistently.

As you'll see why, it's no coincidence that the Batavia race, as well as these next two examples come from tracks in New York State.

Beginning with a race from Monticello Raceway on Feb. 20, an apparent pylon violation resulted in a placing that lacks sense. In race 2 that afternoon, a horse named Itzalldowntoluck N prevailed narrowly in a three-horse finish, where second finisher Beddanburg was a head behind and third finisher Sharp Razor was just a neck behind. Following an inquiry that lasted more than five minutes, it was announced that Itzalldowntoluck N would be placed from first to second for a "pylon violation going into the last turn."

Even on replay, it's difficult to see the precise extent of the violation, but let's concede that a violation in some capacity did in fact occur. How is it possible that the horse would have been disqualified to second place, but not third place? If the violation were material enough that it was ruled the initial winner gained an advantage over the second-place horse who finished a head behind, how would that same logic not have held the same for the third-place horse was only a neck behind?

The problem, in part, is with the surprisingly vague rules governing New York harness racing. I did an electronic search through the 151-page harness racing rules subchapter from the New York State Gaming Commission, and the word "pylon" appears just a single time throughout that entire document. The one time it does appear isn't regarding how to handle violations but rather referring only to the structure of open stretch racing.

The most relevant part to this instance appears to be covered in section 4117.2 (c) where it says in part, "... Any horse or sulky that may partly leave the course shall be disqualified one or more

positions, as appropriate, if, in the opinion of the judges, such occurrence has had a material effect on the finish of the race."

At minimum, provided these were the rules followed, an explanation should have been provided in the decision to place the winner second, but not third.

Then there are times when rules are better documented, but what's the use of them if they either aren't followed or aren't followed consistently? Which brings up another recent example from a New York harness track to complete the column trifecta, this one from Yonkers Raceway.

In race 7, from March 5, the horse Diamondbeach was dueling to the outside of the horse Record Year. Looking as if he might push by and win in the race's final stages, Diamondbeach broke stride. Driver Brent Holland did all he could to lose ground while on the break, so much so that he ended up being passed at the finish by Contact Zone for second, who never would have gotten as close if not for the break.

Within three and a half minutes, Diamondbeach was disqualified, but not in the manner one would think. Rather than remaining in third place, Diamondbeach was placed all the way back to seventh, for the reason provided by the track announcer of "for interference while on a break to trailing horses." A separate question – but shouldn't one of the judges be providing clarity for disqualifications, rather than the announcer?

Like any other sport, bad calls are inevitable – that's just part of racing. But having rules in place that can at least be followed consistently and transparently should be something to strive for.

At any rate, it was a massively large reach to conclude that Diamondbeach breaking had impact all the way to the sixth-place horse. What is clear is that based on the proximity to the finish and the distance between the trailing horses when the break occurred, the initial order of finish was not impacted whatsoever.

The overall point now comes when comparing the Yonkers event to the Monticello event side-by-side. In the same set of rules governing both tracks, how can it be determined in one instance that a pylon violation resulted in a placement of mere inches, but in another instance a break that didn't materially change any order of the finish be placed back many spots.

Part of the problem is the rules, which leave way too much interpretation to the judges. New York isn't alone in that, other jurisdictions give judges discretion on how to determine an "unfair advantage" if the violation occurred with just a single pylon. But then on the other side, take Sweden, for example. As one of their disqualification rules for breaking states that a horse will be disqualified automatically if it breaks in the final 100 meters. That rule may sound harsh, but at least it's crystal clear and leaves no room for subjective interpretation.

Judges, like anyone else, shouldn't be beyond reproach. I received reader feedback from the Batavia disqualification in December, letting me know they hoped that column would bring more awareness to the poorly handled situation, when fair judges were brought in from another state to fill in for the regular judges that night. It leads one to think, what measures can be put in place to ensure that judges are interpreting rules uniformly.

Like any other sport, bad calls are inevitable – that's just part of racing. But having rules in place that can at least be followed consistently and transparently should be something to strive for.



When it comes to Jimmy Bernstein, music's loss is harness racing's gain

In no particular order, Jimmy Bernstein wanted to be a horse trainer of both thoroughbred and standardbred horses; involved in medicine; a musician and an entrepreneur. In some fashion, now at the age of 78, he has achieved all of those goals.

Let's begin with harness racing. How did it start?

"In the late '60s a man by the name of Fred Schwartz was an owner of the great Romeo Hanover. I was friends with his son. We'd go to Roosevelt and Yonkers to watch him train and race. I became smitten with the sport as I had also previously been with the thoroughbreds. My parents spent many a summer attending the races at Saratoga. I, of course, went along with them.

"I maintained my interest throughout college and the start of medical school. I wasn't all that happy in grad school. One day, I got in my car and drove to New Egypt, NJ, to the stable of Stanley Franklin Dancer. I approached Mr. Dancer and told him I wanted to learn about horses and harness racing. He hired me as a groom. I was to earn \$80 a week. 'My goodness' I thought to myself. Not only was I going to learn about harness racing, but I was going to get paid for doing it.

"I not only was going to work for one of the greatest operations in the game, but I was also going to learn from some of the greatest trainers and grooms in the sport. Two that stood out were the inimitable Dick Baker and Jean Guy Lamarre. There's nothing like starting at the top.

"I'll just ramble from there. After some time, I met a young man named David Tovim who offered me a job as his second trainer. I went to work for him and then went out on my own. I started my own small stable at Monticello where I met Ralph Swalsky who is still a dear friend today. I had some, but nowhere near overwhelming success.

"In the interim I met my lovely wife Lisa, a sister of fellow trainer Mike Taub.

"I had a good filly by the name of Joyce Collins who I one day turned my back on. Bad move. She nailed me hard in my back. I was hurt pretty bad. "I suppose it did. My uncle was a successful entrepreneur. He had founded a company called New Hermes. I went to work for him. I started in sales and rose through the ranks. I owned some equity in it. It went public in 1989. I made some money. I was now reasonably well off."

What happened then?

"In 1995, I yearned to start in medicine again. I studied for eight months and then took the MCATs. I did pretty well in them. I was accepted into New York Medical School. My lifelong ambition was about to be fulfilled. I was about to become a doctor — or not!

"Then fate cast a nasty blow. I became very ill. I was diagnosed with a brain tumor. I was fortunate enough to be seen by Dr. Keith Black in Los Angeles.

Paddock interviews gain popularity

Giving customers actionable information by asking the right questions can help the sport's broadcast.

If you flip on The Meadowlands' signal, you'll often find in-depth interviews of drivers and trainers conducted between races from the paddock. Other racetracks achieve this more discreetly, either by relaying tidbits they've heard off-camera from their connections during the on-track broadcast, or in the thoroughbred game, by having on-site reporters provide information pre-race while riding horses.

From what I've gathered from Planet Horseplayer, this information is well-received, but it's most effective when the right people and right questions are asked.

I'd like to share how I think this can be accomplished in the best way to quench the thirst of curious customers.

First and foremost, with upwards of a hundred horses on a card, the paddock interviewer cannot possibly gather information on every horse, nor should they. I firmly believe that it is crucial to meticulously plan this well in advance of the races. One can clearly see that The Meadowlands' John Rallis excels in this regard. He typically identifies the appropriate connections to interview beforehand.

Next, the subset of horses we as players want to know something about tend to exhibit a few key characteristics.

They may include: Horses that were locked in, or appeared to be so, in their last race or horses that were live, but taken down from outside posts. Does the driver want to put these horses in play because he felt the horse was good in their last start?

Well-bet horses that underperformed in their last are a big ask for players. Beaten favorites are a long-time horseplayer angle for a reason; namely something happened the previous week. Asking a trainer or driver what, if anything, they thought might've tripped up their charge can clear up some mystery.

Lastly, and this in my view trumps all of the above, are horses who have missed time.

I had access to a large database back in the day, and horses who were off 15-28 days in harness racing had a \$1 return on

investment of less than 50 cents. They were essentially one of the worst bets you can imagine.

Today that's simply not the case. Horses who have missed a few weeks or more can be excellent wagers and they win more often than in any time in the sport's long history. The freshening could've done the horse good, and the trainer could've schooled the horse the previous Tuesday, or zipped him or her a couple of fast miles.

How would the public know that without input from the trainer?

Notice how most, if not all, of these questions are best addressed to the trainer. While driver intent is commendable, the person in charge of the horse 24/7 often offers the most practical advice.

I know at times some of these questions can rankle some feathers from participants. For example, if a trainer says a horse needs a week and will race from off the pace but the driver sees an opportunity to leave and wins the race from the pocket, it's not ideal. However, contrary to the belief of some, horseplayers are pretty sharp. We know it's a horse race and anything can happen. In fact, I would argue that those who doubt this fundamental truth are unlikely to become long-term, daily customers anyway.

I commend some in this sport — especially The Meadowlands, both management and the participants — for embracing paddock interviews. Perfecting and tweaking the process can do harness racing a great deal of good.





Post position possibilities

We need more players to play our horse racing game. New players with new revenue will not appear magically or organically. One road we could explore to increasing gambling participation may be using our post positions as random number generators.

Many methods come to mind for new people selecting lottery-like numbers before the horses approach the starting gate. True horse gamblers and serious handicappers will not be interested, but they should be. Incorporating wagered money from people who prefer to pick a number is to your advantage. The mantra for any serious handicapper of horses racing in a pari-mutuel situation should be, "Give me large pools of stupid money."

Consider the following:

Eight horses are in a race, numbered 1 through 8. What are the random chances of the total number of the first and second-place finishers totaling 3? The order of finish does not matter; only the total of the first two finishers. For example, (1, 2) or (2, 1), a total of 3.

This race has 28 possible totals. The range of possible totals is from 3 to 15. In a random selection situation, the possible totals and odds are below.

The first column is the winning number, followed by a pair or pairs that create the sum, followed by the probability of occurrence in a percentage:

3 (1, 2) 3.57 per cent

4 (1, 3) 3.57 per cent

5 (1, 4), (2, 3) 7.14 per cent

6 (1, 5), (2, 4) 7.14 per cent

7 (1, 6), (2, 5), (3, 4) 10.71 per cent

8 (1, 7), (2, 6), (3, 5) 10.71.29 per cent

9 (1, 8), (2, 7), (3, 6), (4, 5) 14.29 per cent

10 (2, 8), (3, 7), (4, 6) 10.71 per cent

11 (3, 8), (4, 7), (5, 6) 10.71 per cent

12 (4, 8), (5, 7) 7.14 per cent

13 (5, 8), (6, 7) 7.14 per cent

14 (6, 8) 3.57 per cent

15 (7, 8) 3.57 per cent

Any handicapper worth his pencil, racing program, and calculator can look at a race program and easily skew these odds favorably. If the payoff total is 3 in a race, and you notice the #1 or #2 horse looks hopeless, the wise horse player does not play the number 3. However, if the experienced horse gambler finds both the #1 and #2 are live, 3 becomes a more attractive target.

This proposed concept does not target horseplayers. The proposal is a vehicle for the other 98 per cent of humans for whom reading a racing program is as likely as reading a Latin scroll. Differing sizes of fields and late scratches of horses will require some flexibility, but the first and second-place finishers will always determine a total number.

For now, imagine we keep it simple and say to a newbie:

"Pick a number, any number from 3 to 15, and wager whatever amount you wish on this lucky number. If the total of the first two horses matches the number you chose, you win.

"Some of the numbers are easier to hit than others. For example, 3, 4, 14, and 15 are the most difficult to match. In horseracing, we call these long shots, but should you hit on these numbers, you will win *nine times* your wagered amount.

"Conversely, as you see in the chart, the number 9 is the easiest to match because four combinations total 9. In horse racing, we call this the favorite. You will win only *four times* your wagered amount if you match one of these numbers. The amount you win depends on the difficulty of your number hitting."

This wagering suggestion is merely a proposal. Adjusting the various payoff amounts will be required. Initially, I thought these payoffs should be fixed odds payoffs for the simplicity of new gamblers on horses. However, a case could be made for the odds varying slightly according to the wagering, keeping the pari-mutuel format intact.

Matching the correct number *total* of the first two finishers *seems* simple. New wagerers should not feel intimidated because they are just choosing a number. The payoffs would be high enough to entice players. New gamblers merely choose their number and watch the race intently, constantly calculating the finish needed to make them a winner.

The exact format is for mightier minds than mine, but using our numbers to increase participation could be as easy as one number plus one number equals fun.

The book on Riley Asher-Stalbaum is worth reading

Riley Asher-Stalbaum embodies poetry in motion.

Whether during her childhood, when she would sit trackside to watch races, or in more recent years as a standardbred trainer, Asher-Stalbaum has rarely been without a book by her side and pen and paper within reach.

"I started loving reading and writing, especially reading, at a very young age," Asher-Stalbaum said. "My mom is a big reader. She would read to us at the races, at home, or at the barn – she was always reading to us. When she was busy, I'm the oldest of four siblings, so it was my turn to read to my brothers and sisters.

"It's something of a joke... I always have a book in my bag when I pack for the races. I have all my horse stuff and a book or two."

Asher-Stalbaum's time in the standardbred world — and even outside it — has already had many interesting chapters written, from family ties to individual successes, to personal awards and team triumphs.

The horsewoman from Leslie, MI, a small, friendly community of around 1,900 people located just south of the state capital Lansing, developed her fondness for all things equine through her parents, trainer Kim Asher and driver Larry Stalbaum.

"The barn was always a constant," Asher-Stalbaum said. "We moved nearly 20 times, but no matter where we were, there were always horses and the barn. When we grew up, we developed different interests and moved to different places, but the barn was where we were always together."

Asher-Stalbaum's early contributions to the family's racing stable came in the form of art and fashion.

Win or lose, their horses always looked the part.

"I remember going out to the barn when we were too young to help," Asher-Stalbaum said. "We would draw with chalk on the walls or put pretty ribbons in the horses' hair. We would bring out the pretty bandages when the horses raced. I think our job back then was to bedazzle the horses, to make sure they looked pretty on race night.

"When we got older, we got to train with mom and dad. We would sit in their laps and hold the lines. They would take us two at a time and since there were four of us, two would always be upset when the others were out on the track. It always felt great to be out there."

In 2018, after years of learning the trade from her parents, Asher-Stalbaum struck out on her own and did it in grand fashion, despite some early trepidations.

"We were in Batavia, racing at Buffalo,"

she said. "My dad took part of his stable and went back to the Saratoga area and I stayed in Batavia with my mom and my siblings and had four horses that I trained. It was a lot of fun to be in charge and make decisions, but there was a learning curve that came with it. I would be calling my mom and dad, asking for their insight, and for a little bit, you think, 'Maybe I don't know what I'm doing.' But you reassure yourself you can do it."

If she did require more reassurance, a look at her year-end rookie totals would be the ultimate boost of confidence.

Asher-Stalbaum won 32 races and posted 83 top three finishes in 185 starts.

She earned a pair of seconds in her first two starts that April, both coming at Buffalo Raceway, the half-mile oval in Hamburg, NY.

The third start would prove to be the proverbial charm for the young trainer, fittingly, with Empire Earl N, a seasoned trotter her mother had previously trained, and father had driven.

On the night of April 21, it was the eldest of the four Asher-Stalbaum siblings who would hear her name announced just moments after the first race.

With Ray Fisher, Jr. in the sulky, the bay son of Earl—Santa Nita forged to the front after an opening half in :57.3. A quarter-length



ahead of the even-money choice after three-quarters in 1:27.4, Empire Earl N, second choice in the betting at 5-2, was a half-length on top at the stretch call.

And then, in the final push to the wire, a wide smile emerged from where she was standing.

"It was one of the most thrilling moments of my life," Asher-Stalbaum said. "I was so happy, so excited – I could not stop smiling. We had always won races before, but it was always my mom and dad, so to hear my name called... it was a whole different level of excitement. My siblings were there, and my mother was too.

"It was close almost right until the end. He pulled away and I knew he had it. He made me stressed for most of the mile."

The trotter also brought out a vocal reaction she hadn't expected.

"I can say the whole paddock heard me for sure," Asher-Stalbaum said. "I tried to be calm, cool and collected, but I did get excited. I might have been a little dramatic."

At the conclusion of her rookie campaign, Asher-Stalbaum, powered by multiple wins from Empire Earl N, Quicksilvercandy A, and Kaitlyn Rae, sported a sparkling .300 UTRS (Universal

Training Rating System) mark to go along with purse earnings of \$234,436.

But it wasn't only on the racetrack where she made a strong impression – others had taken notice of her achievements.

The Upstate New York Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association feted Asher-Stalbaum as its 2018 Rising Star at Batavia Downs.

"It meant the world," she said. "It was so incredible, and it was such a big surprise. All the hard work I had put into my own stable, while honoring my parents and their legacy – to be able to stand on my own and be recognized just meant everything to me."

On the cusp of reaching the 100-win mark for her career, Asher-Stalbaum has crafted her own identity and with it, gained confidence in herself and her horses.

She has also incorporated advice from her parents into her training methods.

"Patience was something my mother has always preached," Asher-Stalbaum said. "You can't ever rush things. When you are having a bad week or bad month, take a step back, look at the whole thing, and be patient. Whatever it happens to be, you will see it if you are not scrambling to fix everything all at once.

"My dad always has these helpful sayings. His big advice is always to look at the horse and see each one as an individual, that one solution is not going to work for every horse, to adjust my training schedule to them. You have to be the one to adjust and work with them."

What did Asher-Stalbaum learn about herself in 2024?

"I have learned to be more patient, and I have learned to take more risks," she said. "I am a very conservative person, in terms of my personality. I don't like to put myself out there and I don't like to take chances. I will generally take the safer path because that is what I feel most comfortable in.

"But with racing, you can't always take that safe path. Whether that is simply buying the horse, trying something new with your horses – taking risks is almost never as scary as it sounds. I have learned to step outside the known path and try to improve myself."

Currently stationed in Sacramento at Cal-Expo, the plan, in the short term, is to return to Michigan to race in the spring.

For the person who has been a sojourner of sorts — Asher-Stalbaum was part of youth groups who visited Thailand, Ecuador, The Galápagos Islands, and Namibia, Africa, where she joined a team of scientists in tracking and tagging big cats — she feels right at home in The Wolverine State.

"I am definitely a warm weather person," Asher-Stalbaum said. "We came to Cal-Expo to train our babies down and give them a lighter winter too. I'm looking forward to going back to Michigan. They are getting races set up again, so I am excited to see what they are doing with the track. Hopefully, we will get some more races and more opportunities. That is home, so if I had to pick a place to go, it would be in Michigan.

"We also have a Michigan baby, a 2-year-old, who will start racing soon. From there, it is a little undecided."

Wherever she does find herself, Asher-Stalbaum is certain to add some more fulfilling chapters to her life in and beyond the barn.

"I'm working on publishing a poetry book, which I hope will be out soon," she said. "Naturally, a few of the poems are inspired by horses. I sent it out to people. I write short stories too and I hope to become a published author with novels, but with poetry, it is a way to express feelings I don't have the time to when I'm at the barn or races. It's nice to have that outlet, to have those moments where I don't have to worry about anything else.

"Racing, reading, and writing each offer something unique every day. The horses are my constant inspiration, and the hard work and dedication required in racing are mirrored in everything I write and do."

If someone were to one day pen a book on her horse racing experiences, Asher-Stalbaum knows the perfect author for the project.

She laughed heartily before adding, "I think it would have to be an autobiography."

I was with a woman friend one night at a Los Alamitos harness program in the 1980s. We sat in lower clubhouse seats upside the finish line because I wanted to give her a succinct view during the final moments of every race; to expose all of her senses to each vivacious finish. We were positioned perfectly to clearly hear the pounding hooves and shouting drivers in action. She took in the atmosphere of live harness racing with enthusiasm; winning and losing a few bucks while having a great time through the first few races on the program.

Then a race went into the final turn with a few horses making aggressive moves heading into the stretch. The crowd became boisterous as three trotters challenged for the lead. Behind them two others were rough gaited and the horse driven by Gene Vallandingham began to gallop. Vallandingham put pressure on both lines to work the trotter back on-stride while the rest of the field left him behind and crossed the wire. Vallandingham's horse struggled a few lengths behind the finishers before the trotter's front legs gave in.

The sudden jolt sprung Vallandingham from his seat. The crowd gasped and held its breath as the horse dragged the sulky and

regained its stance. But all eyes remained upon Vallandingham as he approached landing on the limestone. Before contact he positioned his arms for the impact and to allow his palms to hit the track first.

Then Vallandingham performed what is known by circus acrobats as an inadvertent somersault; a single move with "mistaken grace" that propelled him to springboard from a tumble into a stance. Then he raised both arms like a Broadway musical star as he stood perfectly balanced with an ear-to-ear smile as if he never lost control of the sudden flight.

In the grandstand there was an automatic response. My woman friend stood and applauded along with everyone as Vallandingham froze in triumph while his horse strolled away with the help of grooms. Though the mishap provoked an inquiry there was not one eye in the crowd watching the tote board. The applause continued.

Vallandingham's entertaining dismount was the main attraction of that race. Fans saw horses breaking and galloping in other races but no one ever saw anything like Vallandingham's use of mistaken grace.

"Jot down some questions about things you might not understand or want to know more about. Imagine yourself as a horse's driver or caretaker or trainer. Think about it all now that you know how cool it all is."



Here I offer the service of my professional betting performances over decades. All pro harness journalists and broadcasters throughout North America should be ready and able to contribute.

She won the Fan Hanover Stakes consolation at Mohawk, Lismore Stakes elimination and final at Yonkers, Mistletoe Shalee Stakes elimination at The Meadowlands, Pennsylvania Sire Stakes at The Meadows, and Tarport Hap Stakes at The Meadowlands. She was second in the Helen Dancer Memorial division at Freehold and third in the Fan Hanover Stakes elimination at Mohawk and Jugette heat at Ohio's Delaware County Fair. She was trained by Kevin Lare.

Thong was purchased by Winbak Farm at the 2015 Harrisburg Mixed Sale and resided at the Maryland farm.

Nominations spike for 2025 MGM Borgata, Blue Chip Matchmaker

Changes made to the scheduling and conditions of the MGM Borgata and Blue Chip Matchmaker pacing series have resulted in sharp nomination gains for the 2025 editions which get underway in late March at MGM Yonkers Raceway.

The MGM Borgata series for older male pacers saw nominations jump from 30 in 2024 to 42 this year, the highest number of horses to pay the \$5,000 eligibility fee since 2021 when 46 signed on. The Blue Chip Matchmaker had a similar increase, going from 21 mares last year to 33 for the 2025 edition. The last time more than 33 nominated for the Blue Chip Matchmaker was back in 2019 when 43 paid into the event.

Both series are set to get underway two weeks later than in 2024, with the first of five preliminary legs of the Blue Chip Matchmaker set for March 28 and the opening round of the MGM Borgata commencing a few nights after on March 31. Another major change in 2025 revolves around the added money for the final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, which gets a boost from \$125,000 to \$200,000, equaling the MGM Borgata total. With that increase the Blue Chip Matchmaker final will certainly offer the richest purse in recent history and far eclipse the \$276,200 purse from 2024.

Following five consecutive weeks of \$50,000 preliminary legs, in another scheduling adjustment for 2025, the finals will occur after a week off to provide horses some much needed rest before racing in the rich events. Both finals are slated for Friday, May 9 and will be accompanied by a pair of \$100,000 consolation events.

In terms of equine power, Hellabalou has paid his nomination fee and will look for his third consecutive victory in the final of the MGM Borgata. The 7-year-old won the \$457,000 finale in 1:50 2/5 last year defeating Coaches Corner and Desperate Man, who are both among the list of eligibles for 2025. Others looking to take home the title include double millionaire Charlie May and last December's MGM Grand Prix winner Typhoon Banner N.

The lucky winner of the Borgata will receive an invite to the June 7th Battle of Lake Erie at sister track MGM Northfield Park and be grandfathered into the MGM Grand Prix series which kicks off on November 24 at Yonkers Raceway.

Headlining the mares lined up for the Blue Chip Matchmaker is 2024 champion Lit De Rose. The now 10-year-old has made nearly \$1.3 million in her long career and recently prepped for the series with a qualifying effort at Yonkers Raceway. Joining her in the field are last year's second-place finisher Coachellabound N, \$1.9 million earner Grace Hill, and some talented 4-year-olds like multiple stakes winner Rocket Deo and Ohio champion Seaside Diva.

In addition to the purse money, the winner of the Blue Chip Matchmaker final also gets a free breeding to either American Courage, Cannibal, Shadow Play or Sunshine Beach.

Yonkers Raceway is currently racing on a Monday to Friday schedule with first race post time set at 6:45 p.m. (EDT) nightly.

USTA allocates more than \$200,000 in broadcast and promotions funding for 36 organizations

On Sunday (March 9), the U.S. Trotting Association board of directors approved the funding recommendations of the USTA broadcast and promotions committee for \$210,150 to 36 different organizations.

The broadcast and promotions committee is comprised of seven USTA directors chaired by Joe Pennacchio.

Each recipient of funding is required to acknowledge that their allocations will be utilized for the purposes stated in their request and provide the USTA with analytics upon the completion of their broadcasts and promotions.

Harness Racing Update

"In the past, and prior to the formation of the broadcast and promotions committee, the USTA provided funding for a short list of national broadcasts," said USTA executive vice president/ CEO Mike Tanner. "However, the significant growth in technology in recent years has provided new ways to promote harness racing on the internet through livestreams and podcasts.

"The recommendations of the committee and the endorsement by the USTA board of directors will provide 36 organizations nationwide with financial assistance to broadcast and promote harness racing in a variety of ways on national and local television, and the internet, along with promotions to support them that will expose our sport to hundreds of thousands of people across the country as well as around the world."

National broadcasts will be on FOX Sports and CBS Sports Network.

The 36 organizations that received financial assistance were broken down into four categories — racetracks and Hambletonian Society, horsemen, owner, breeder or state associations, county fairs, plus other industry organizations.

The complete list of the 36 organizations is: Hoosier Park, Northfield Park, Scioto Downs, Batavia Downs, The Red Mile, Yonkers Raceway, The Meadowlands, First Tracks Cumberland, Hambletonian Society, Pennsylvania HHA, SOA of NY, Indiana Standardbred Association, Florida SBOA, Kentucky HHA, Delaware SOA, Maine HHA, Illinois HHA, Pennsylvania Horse Racing Association, Michigan HHA, The Meadows SOA, Little Brown Jug, Goshen Historic Track, Newton (IN) County Fair, Iowa Fairs, Iowa (WI) County Fair, Cuyahoga (OH) County Fair, Chautauqua (NY) County Fair, Pennsylvania County Fairs, Elkhart (IN) County Fair, Sirius Radio, Daily Racing Form, In The Money Media, Harness Tube, WazUpDoc Media, Midwest Event Promotion, and Martin's Starting Gate.

"The USTA greatly appreciates the efforts of these 36 organizations to help promote harness racing," Tanner said.

Outside The Fire smokes foes in Big M feature

Outside The Fire had maintained good form over an eight-race stretch dating back to late November of last year, and with a drop in class Friday night, he had little trouble taking the featured \$15,000 conditioned trot in 1:52.4 at The Meadowlands.

In the early going, Bully Boy Hill, bumping up in class seeking a third straight win, was on the point, and led at the quarter in :27.2 and the half in :56. Outside The Fire, the 4-5 favorite, vacated the 3-hole at the five-eighths mark and quickly made up ground while racing uncovered on the rim, and just after Bully Boy Hill hit three-quarters in 1:24.3, moved to the lead as they straightened up with three-sixteenths remaining.

"He's been sharp," said Tyler Buter, who guided Outside The Fire to his third win in his last seven tries. "Last week, he got a bad

trip. Tonight, it worked out well. I saw Scott [Zeron] had a handful there with Bully Boy Hill, [so I took back before] we took over."

Through the stretch, Outside The Fire effortlessly maintained the lead, and despite providing perfect cover for Dribbling Bi, that one was no match for the winner, finishing three-quarters-of-a-length back in second. Seven Sins was third.

Were you concerned that Dribbling Bi was right behind you?

"You never know until it's over here [at The Meadowlands]," said Buter. "But he raced well."


