John Campbell: Industry better prepare itself to answer animal rights activists

In light of the horse deaths tragedy at Santa Anita thoroughbred track, the president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society said harness racing better be prepared to answer some serious questions about horse safety.

Harness Racing Update

John Campbell said the harness racing industry should be prepared to answer questions about horse safety following the tragedy at thoroughbred racing's Santa Anita Racetrack in which 22 horses have died since the current meet opened the day after Christmas (full story here).

Campbell, the president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society, said Saturday the Santa Anita issue is not officially on the agenda for today's society meeting in Florida, but it needs to be.

He said he doesn't know what specific questions will be coming the harness racing industry's way from animal rights activists and mainstream reports, "but there are going to be some and I think we better be prepared as an industry. It's just a tragic disaster (at Santa Anita) and if you don't think it affects us, you're sadly mistaken. I think it'll be a discussion and the industry has to take notice and see how the thoroughbreds handle it."

That said, Campbell stressed statistics show standardbreds break down far less often than thoroughbreds.

"I think we have to get it out there that we don't have a breakdown issue, that it's very, very rare to have the catastrophic injuries in our game that they do (in thoroughbreds)," Campbell said. "The horses are different. They are built differently, they train differently and the business model is different. Everything is different and we do not have that catastrophic breakdown problem that they do, fortunately, and I think we should be trumpeting that. Having said that, once the animal rights people get involved they are not going to differentiate between thoroughbred and standardbred. A horse is a horse to them."

And one horse death is too many.

"Exactly," Campbell said. "So, it's something that we are going to have to be aware of and be prepared to be proactive, rather than reactive."

Santa Anita is currently working with the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) to improve horse safety and Campbell said it is better to work with PETA than against them.

"I don't think there's any question that you have to work with organizations like PETA and show them and educate them and, when things aren't working, make changes," Campbell said. "I don't have the answer on what changes are going to work for them, but you cannot make them an adversary. I think that's a big mistake by any breed to do

that."

One thing Campbell said would likely help is establishing universal rules throughout North America for whipping.

"I think if we could just get uniform on the whipping rule, that would be a big step and a positive one," he said.

I will not bother to mention the usual suspects but there were however many new faces in attendance, they included: Big Al, Marvin Katz, the famed Breeders' Cup president Fred Hertrich, Anthony Peretti, who gave me the great news that he and his partner are on the right track to purchase the working part of Peretti Farm and market yearlings once again. He is a wonderful man and I wish him well. Dr. John Egloff of Vieux Carre Farm was here with his son, Jay, Dave Briggs was running all around gathering subjects for the HRU live feed interviews with the amazing Heather Vitale.

John Campbell and I had a very nice discussion on the pros and cons of a two-heat Hambletonian that I found very enlightening. I will discuss it in detail in my Friday column. Two old training buddies were in attendance — John McDermott and Carl Garafolo, as well as Eric Cherry and his lovely bride Lisa. I met the very pretty young wife of David Reid, Jeanette, for the first time and she had the pleasure of taking a ride on a jog cart built for two. Other faces not often seen were: Mike Saunders, recently-retired Jim Simpson, Ebby Gerry, Marty Sternberg and Charlie Keller.


My training reports were throughout the week and I will start by thanking Mark Herlihy for his help with his and Casie Coleman's barn. This was from last week and today.

Indictable Hanover (c Bettors Delight—I'm Sassy), Golden Sand (c Somebeachsomewhere—Canne Cammie) and Examiner Hanover (c, He's Watching—EZ Rock) all went a mile in 2:28/:35 and were all strong to the wire. Sam McKee Hanover (c Sportswriter—Sammy's Magic Girl), Better Focus (c Bettors Delight—Royal Distraction) and Aces Rock (c Bettors Delight—Double Jeopardy) went 2:28/:35 with Sam McKee finishing three wide and strong.

Saturday, they trained two sets both in 2:24. All were good, but outstanding was **Play Lady Play** (f Shadow Play—Fancy Lady) who finished the mile four-wide with no urging and **Golden Sand** (see above) a half-brother to Alexis Faith driven by Ray Domminico.

Earlier in the week, I had the privilege of training with Frank M. Antonacci and Domenico Cecere and most of the Lindy Farms contingent. All the 3-year-olds trained around 2:10. Kings County, Throw Out The Tab, Union Forces, and Magic Joe Lindy were exceptional.

For the 2-year-olds, I personally trained three that were all better than good. **Dazzling Lindy** (c Crazed—Lindy On The Rocks) may be the best Crazed ever, **Pastor Lindy** (c Father Patrick—Lindys Crazy Dolly) is a very fast, sound, good-gaited colt and **Lifestory Hanover** (f Somebeachsomewhere—Livin Life) a very talented pacing filly I really loved. She seemed to have endless gears as I nosed out a very good filly in **Truth Hanover** a (Western Ideal—The Art Museum). The **unnamed** filly by Muscle Hill from the great Moms Millionaire looks

like a champion in the making.

Saturday from Team Zeron came **Fortune Tellin Lady** (f Trixton—For A Dancer) besting **Ripley Muscles** (f Muscle Mass—Fin de Maye) and **Burberry** (f Father Patrick—High Heels).

A trio of fillies all from Webster/Croghan looked great: **Middleton** (Somebeachsomewhere—Jolting Kate), **Booty Call** (Somebeachsomewhere—Love Canal) and **Sweet Beachtime** (Somebeachsomewhere—Sweet Paprika).

Another nice trio of fillies were on display for Paul Kelley, they included, **Flying Glider** (Cantab Hall—Highland), **Mambo** (Yankee Glide—Dance To Market) and **Allswell Hanover** (Cantab Hall—Aunt Mel). In another nice Kelley set, **Amos Hart** (c Trixton—Zeta Jones) defeated **Inspiring Credit** (f Credit Winner—Sakra Brae) and **Cover Girl** (f Muscle Hill—To Dream On).

From Webster/Croghan the highly-regarded yearling **Das Deo** a \$300,000 Lexington purchase

(Captaintreacherous—Lisjune) bested two homebreds **Baydis** (c by Artspeak out of Quick Babe) and **Odds On Daytona** (c American Ideal—Odds On Moinet).

Fred Grant showed of two very nice fillies that I have infrequently seen **Test Match** (Andover Hall—Widdershins) and **Undersong** (Cantab Hall—Ginevre) both looked quite athletic.

The top set of the day went to the Alagna barn that included three of the top prospects for 3-year-old pacing colt in 2019. This group that paced easily a mile in 2:05 included my favorite **Captain Ahab**, a much improved **Shipshape**, along with **Captain Trevor**, **Odds On Palm Beach** and **Odds On Cape Coral**.

Two nice sets of 2-year old both timed in 2:20 were **He Refuses To Lose** (c Captaintreacherous – Fox Valley Zena), **Reflect With Me** (f Captaintreacherous—Remember When the sister to my last good horse Lucy's Pearl timed in 1:48.4), Captain Kirk (c Captaintreacherous—Aria Hanover), Odds On Hollywood (f Captaintreacherous – Western Graduate), and Speak The Peace (f Artspeak—Keep The Peace), then Force N Fury, the \$300,000 Captaintreacherous—My Little Dragon, Ideal Perception (c American Ideal - Southwind Siren), It's **Showtime** (c Captaintreacherous—Uffizi Hanover), **Chief Mate** (c Captaintreacherous—Heaven Forbid), and Rollnthejoe (c Roll With Joe-Sweet Bonnie) all looked strong to the wire. I noticed the only two 2-year-old trotters in the Alagna barn are both fillies and showing well: **Confidante** a Brittany homebred by Father Patrick from Anywhere With You and Ramona Hill, a Muscle Hill from Lock Down Lindy.

The next set of the day belonged to an expensive group and all looked ready to rock and roll. They included the \$400,000 Captain Nemo (c Captaintreacherous—Hana Hanover), the \$350,000 Captain Midnight (c Captaintreacherous—It was Fascination) my favorite Harrisburg pacing colt along with Radiant Bluechip (c Roll With Joe—Incredible Beauty), Surf the Web (c Somebeachsomewhere—Donna Lee) and Rouser Hanover (c Captaintreacherous—Romantic Moment).

There is no question that in this writer's mind the amount of equine talent at Sunshine Meadows this year is overwhelming. The next three months will separate the men from the boys, but very few look disappointing as of this writing.

I look forward to writing about the discussion I had with John Campbell for next week's column. In the meantime, I hope you all have a wonderful St Patrick's Day.

Cat Manzi tanned and grinning in Florida

The Hall of Fame driver is spending his first winter in Florida working for trainer Tony Alagna — and loving it.

Despite a Hall of Fame driving career that features 14,812 wins from a whopping 95,690 starts, Cat Manzi said he's, "never, ever, had a chance to be around horses like this."

Tanned and grinning, Manzi points to the shedrow behind him at Sunshine Meadows in Florida where he has spent the winter working for trainer Tony Alagna.

"One after another, every one better than the next. It's a lot of fun," Manzi said.

Manzi has worked for Alagna since last April, but has been in Florida with the crew since the first week of January 2019. It's a major departure for the man that made his career through numerous cold winters in the U.S. northeast.

"This is the first winter that I've spent this much time (in Florida), for sure. I've never worked here. I've always stayed north and drove all winter," said Manzi, who was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2002.

Cat Manzi (with Linda Toscano on Saturday at Sunshine Meadows) said he's enjoying working with great young horses in Florida this winter as part of Tony Alagna's team. Manzi retired from driving in 2014, but last year approached Alagna about working for him after watching the trainer talk about his operation on video.

"I got in touch with Tony. I liked the sound of the way he does things, because a lot of it sounds like the way I grew up with horses," Manzi said. "It was a chance to be around a lot of well-bred horses, which I hadn't... when I was training horses, they weren't like these back in the old days... I'm having a good time.

"Tony is a hands-on trainer. I don't have to do anything except tell him what I see or don't see and he takes it from there. It's more of a learning experience for me coming down here. Of course, I can handle horses and I know them and I'm pretty sure I can point them in the right direction, but he doesn't really need that because he's a terrific horseman.


"As far as being able to tell how they will be next week or the week after, I don't think it's very easy. They change. Some of them get better, some don't. I'm just happy to be able to do this, to have something that I can do every day that I like."











Bagel Talk with Murray Brown

The man that procured the spread for HRU's Live from The Deck event, explains the difference between Montreal and New York bagels and talks about the rise of the flagel.

Few people are as well positioned to discuss bagels as Murray Brown. He grew up in Montreal — one of the world's greatest bagel cities — and lives part of the year in New York City, home to what many say are the best bagels on the planet.

"I'm kind of a self-proclaimed bagel expert," Brown said.
"Actually, Montreal bagels and New York bagels are two
different things. They are both called bagels, but it's like
saying that standardbreds and thoroughbreds are both
horses. They are totally different and I think they should be
judged differently. They both have their pluses and, as far as
I'm concerned, the Montreal bagels have no minuses, but
that's the way I see it.

"When I go to Montreal, I always bring six or seven dozen back. We freeze them."

For the second year in a row, Brown was asked by HRU to procure the breakfast spread for visitors to The Deck at Sunshine Meadows the day before the annual Hambletonian Society winter meeting in the area. He did not disappoint.

"It's become THE place, certainly for me. Saturday mornings here are pretty unique," Brown said of The Deck. "It's a gathering for horsepeople, new people and old people, people who just love to watch horses, people who have a significant interest in the game. I'm usually here, probably three or four times a week, but I never miss Saturdays."

Brown explained the evolution of having food at The Deck on Saturdays.


"Myron (Bell) started bringing coffee and I started bringing bagels and different things evolved and it's become THE place to be," Brown said. "It used to be bagels and cream cheese, then we starting bringing some nova and different times of cream cheese. Frankie Antonacci doesn't like his bagels with cream cheese, so he demanded butter, so we bring butter. Then we started bringing fruit and, the last few years, (HRU) started to bring champagne and we had mimosas. Each year, I try to figure out something different. This year, I brought assorted cakes. I don't know how they went over, but there's always something new. It's kind of fun. I love to shop. I'm a woman in disguise."

This year's offerings also included something called a flagel — essentially a flat bagel without the extra fluffiness.

"Somebody came up with the idea, 'Why go through all the trouble of scooping them, just try to make a flat bagel.' Thus, the evolution of the flagel," Brown said.

Saturday's gathering was the best Brown said he's ever seen at The Deck.

"Without a doubt, this is the biggest crowd we've had here. It's a great group of people and it's really been gratifying," he said. "It's a small thing, but it's fun. It really attracts interest. There are often owners that come down here and they may only be here on a Saturday. They enjoy it. As much as it is watching the horses, it's also a social gathering... schmoozing and lies."

Readly Express equals stakes record in Criterium de Vitesse

Timo Nurmos' trained Readly Express (Ready Cash) followed up his victory in Prix de France by winning the \$191,000 Criterium de Vitesse over the mile in Cagnes-sur-Mer at the French Riviera last Sunday afternoon (March 10).

Readly Express had never before tried the mile and with a ticket to Elitloppet in his hand, Nurmos surely wanted to see what his champion was able to do over shorter distances than he's used to.

From number one behind the gate, driver Björn Goop was not even close to the front with the 7-year-old top trotter, but shortly after the start, Readly Express was placed in second line, without obstacles to victory.

Dijon opened quickly for the lead and Bold Eagle's driver Franck Nivard was eager to try to get that same position, but Romain Derieux was determined and defended the lead with Dijon while Bold Eagle was left first over.

Bold Eagle was a beaten horse with more than a quarter to go. At that point, Bahia Quesnot attacked three wide and gave cover to Readly Express, who seemed to have problems accelerating in the beginning of the home stretch. The stretch is long in Cagnes-sur-Mer and just a few meters before the wire, Readly Express caught leader Dijon and the Swedish champion won in 1:50.4, which equalled the stakes record in Criterium de Vitesse. Bold Eagle noted the same mile 2018.

Readly Express' victory was, of course, an important indication of the horse's ability over the Elitlopp distance.

Nurmos can exhale and feel comfortable that his horse will be one Solvalla spectators will love to cheer for.

Dijon's performance as runner up gave him a ticket to both Olympiatravet at Åby in April and Elitloppet at Solvalla in Mav.

Bold Eagle's performance, however, was not what the fans expected and since trainer Sébastien Guarato declared that his horse was not tired after the race, many question marks surround Bold Eagle.

Number of broodmares in Europe

The Swedish harness racing breeding association held its annual meeting last week and showed the numbers of broodmares in the European countries in 2018.

The numbers in the biggest harness racing countries, France and Sweden, are quite stable, but these figures don't tell the whole truth since there have been years with higher amounts of bred mares in, for example, Sweden between 2005 and 2018.

In addition to the biggest countries in the sport in Europe, there were mares bred even in more uncommon standardbred nations. Serbia (251), Hungary (128), Slovenia (88) and Ireland (35) are all in the game of harness racing and reported bred mares during 2018.

Purse money report

Harness racing magazine Sulkysport (sulkysport.se) published a list over the purse money paid in European countries in 2018. France is still the biggest nation regarding money in the sport and in 2018, the French association spent approximately \$283,496,000 dollars in prize money.

Bazire: King in Paris

Jean-Michel Bazire did not just win the Prix d'Amérique during the winter meeting in Paris 2018/2019. His horses dominated the whole period and Bazire was superior both as trainer and driver.

As trainer, Bazire made 220 starts in Paris, 71 ended with victory and his horses earned \$3,825,588 between November to February. Runner up Philippe Allaire's horses earned \$2,172,110 and Franck Leblanc took third place with \$1,895,208.

Bazire's 88 victories as driver was 40 ahead of runner up Franck Nivard. Bazire dominated the meeting totally this season. Unfortunately for the racing fans in Europe, the champion trainer and driver doesn't like to leave his home country very often, due to differences in rulings within U.E.T. (the European Trotting Associaton), but it might be possible

that Bazire will send some of his top horses to one or two of the biggest races this spring.

Looking Superb wins in Laval

Prix d'Amérique runner up Looking Superb, owned in Norway, won Prix Conseil Departemental Mayenne (\$62,000) in Laval on Wednesday afternoon and the Orlando Vici son would be an interesting card in both Olympiatravet at Åby and Elitloppet at Solvalla this spring.

Belina Josselyn suffers fracture

On Wednesday afternoon, French media reported that Prix d'Amérique and Prix de Paris winner Belina Josselyn unfortunately has a fracture in a leg.

"If everything works fine, she will be back on track in September, October", said Jean-Michel Bazire to French magazine Paris-Turf.

Maybe it's time to stop legalizing juice

This week, the Stronach Group announced that all race-day medication, including Lasix, would no longer be permitted at two of its thoroughbred race tracks, Golden Gate and Santa Anita.

So I ask the question: should harness racing ban race-day meds? Harness racing legalized race-day Lasix years ago following the legalization of the drug by the thoroughbred industry. This is in North America alone. Horses don't race on Lasix in Europe, Asia, or anywhere else, for that matter.

I think we can make a case that Lasix has not been good for harness racing. Here's my argument against it:

Admittedly, I tend to look at things simply. And I know that when harness racing in North America was much more popular than it is now, the horses weren't racing on Lasix. And there was no shortage of horses. In countries where harness racing is still very popular, they don't use Lasix. Sweden has 33 harness tracks.

In many harness races, every horse in the race is on Lasix. Perception does matter, and this doesn't look good to the public. Everyone knows that most horses don't need Lasix in order to compete. If they did, then how did we get by without it for so many years? And how do they have so many horses racing without Lasix in Europe, Asia, and Australia? If you gauge the popularity of horse racing by wagering, the amount of money wagered on thoroughbred races in Hong Kong and Japan is enormous. No Lasix. The biggest betting pools in harness racing are in Sweden. No Lasix.

When I posted something about Lasix on the Internet, a few people told me that I don't know what I'm talking about because I'm not a trainer. Well, just for the record, some of the most successful thoroughbred trainers, including a few living legends and Hall of Famers, have given their support,

in writing, to banning Lasix and other race-day medications: Here is the complete list of trainers: Thomas Albertrani, Roger Attfield, Christophe Clement, Jose Corrales, David Donk, Neil D. Drysdale, Jeremiah C. Englehart, Eoin Harty, Neil Howard, Michael E. Hushion, D. Wayne Lukas, Richard E. Mandella, Claude R. McGaughey III, Kiaran P. McLaughlin, Kenneth G. McPeek, H. Graham Motion, William I. Mott, Todd A. Pletcher, Kathy Ritvo, Jonathan E. Sheppard, Albert M. Stall, Jr., Dallas Stewart, Barclay Tagg, William Van Meter and George Weaver.

There's also a common belief that Lasix can be used to mask other drugs. Some people tell me that this simply isn't true. But, in the past, some Olympic athletes who were caught doping admitted that they used Lasix to mask other performance enhancing drugs. The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), which was founded by the International Olympic Committee, is very clear about the use of diuretics, which includes Lasix. They consider all diuretics to be potential masking agents, and therefore, these drugs are prohibited.

And let's not pretend that Lasix isn't a performance enhancer by itself. Do you know why there are races where every horse in the race is on Lasix? It's not because the horses all need it to curb bleeding. It's because the trainers feel that they're at a disadvantage if they don't use Lasix. In other words, they believe that Lasix is a performance enhancer. So, basically, we're admitting that most of the horses racing today are being "juiced". Just because it's legal, doesn't mean it isn't a performance enhancer. Is that the perception we want?

And everyone knows that drugs have side effects, especially with long-term use. Remember, if a horse races 40 times this year, and 30 times next year, that's 70 injections of Lasix in two years. If you watch TV, you've surely seen the commercials for drugs and the long disclaimer that comes at the end of the ad where the announcer tells you that although this drug may help something or another, it may also destroy your health. Some studies have shown that a side effect of Lasix is bone loss. Is that why our horses don't race as many starts as they did years ago? Do we want to show the public that we're giving our horses a drug that most of them don't need, might hurt their health, might be used to mask illegal drugs, but, may make them go a little faster? Is that the face we want to put on our sport?

Ron Pierce's speed connection

Everyone is likely familiar with the 2008 Meadowlands Pace when Art Official upended Somebeachsomewhere and handed him his ONLY career loss. The unbelievable race was timed in 1:47, which was a Meadowlands and world record for a 3-year-old. Ron Pierce drove the winner.

But, 30 years prior, in July of 1978, another horse, Senior Skipper, set the all-age track record of 1:53.3 and Ron Pierce was the caretaker.

"I was working for Ernie Spruce, I worked for him twice, once for 18 months," Pierce said. "He had some good horses — Bregman Hanover, Calabogie Road, Pumping Iron. That night, he set the track record, Benny Webster was driving. That time was the fastest in Meadowlands history to that point-and only Warm Breeze (1:53.1 — Sacramento) had ever gone faster. Ernie had a strict routine for training his horses then. The day after they raced, they were off. Then, they jogged five miles every day, but had to keep the bit in their mouths no matter what. Then, the day before they would race, he would tell you to blow them out a mile in 2:35, last quarter in :33 or :35 — again they had to keep the bit in. By the time they would race, they knew to keep it in for the entire race."

What a legacy

How would you like to have this kind of pressure on you? In the 1988 Meadowlands Pace, Courageous Legacy became the first horse to race in the Pace that had both parents compete in it, also. Sonsam won it in 1979, and his dam Courageous Lady, was third in her elim in 1978 as the 4-5 choice, then was sixth in the final. Courageous Legacy was off the board the year Matts Scooter won.

Swede youth

Marcus Melander, 28, went 1-2 in the Breeders Crown for freshman trotters and has the winter book favorite Gimpanzee in the 2019 Hambletonian. The native of Sweden is trying to be the first trainer of a Hambletonian winner

born not only after the race switched to New Jersey in 1981, but even after the 1989 Dead Heat Hambletonian of Probe and Park Avenue Joe. But, he would NOT be the youngest SWEDE to win the Hambletonian. That honor still belongs to 24-year-old Per Eriksson from 1985 with Prakas.

15 years ago

Three Hall Of Famers teamed up and sent out a million-dollar winner — Modern Art. Ted Gewertz was part-owner, David Miller the driver and Joe Holloway conditioned the son of Artsplace who was second in the Breeders Crown at 2 to I Am A Fool and then the NJ Classic winner at 3.

Tetrick's seven

Seven of the top nine driving seasons by earnings in the sport's history belong to Tim Tetrick (1-2-3-6-7-8-9).

The seven year-end titles in 2012 by Tetrick are the most in the sport's history.

Harness Racing Update

Less is more

Just two of the top 25 driving seasons of all time, ranked by earnings, came when the driver had fewer than 2,000 starts that year.

In 2001, John Campbell earned \$14,182,238 and had 1,803 drives.

In 2017, Yannick Gingras earned \$12,949,920 and had 1,989 drives.

Palone brothers

Mike Palone is now past 10,000 career starts as a trainer (10,114) and Dave Palone is about 1,265 wins away from 20,000, lifetime, as a driver

10,000 club

Casie Coleman is fast closing in on her 10,000th career starter.

Jimmy Takter ended up with 9,972 starts, but his stats don't include the pre-1992 seasons.

Ron Burke is on pace to hit the 10,000-career win plateau — never before approached in our sport — somewhere around Hambletonian Day.

As for drivers, there are 17 in the 10,000-win club and nine of those are in the Hall Of Fame. Eight of the 17 are either retired or deceased.

THE HORSE THAT CHANGED MY LIFE

Dulcimer, the horse who lived

In the mid-1970s, my father owned an unremarkable mare named Dulcimer. She raced for a while at Blue Bonnets, and Richelieu Park too, and she was awful even by the standards of the time. Pathway tells me today that she was by Big John out of a Demon Rum mare and that she took a mark of 2:09.4 in 1975 and made \$4,730 lifetime. And she is a horse that "changed my life" because she almost died of colic one night right there in the barn off Decarie Boulevard in Montreal.

I was either 10 or 11 years old. It was before my dad owned the best horses he would ever own. It was a Sunday night. It was spring or summer. We had been to the afternoon races that day and like all other kids I was dreading school the next morning. The phone rang and all of a sudden there was a great commotion in the house that we lived in about 15 minutes from Blue Bonnets. Dulcimer had collicked, my father said, and asked me if I wanted to go with him to the barn to see if we could help.

So, we rushed back to Blue Bonnets and got to the barn. It was dark. I had never been on the backstretch before in the dark. Everything about the place was different. Gone was the hustle of the morning routine, the washing of jog carts, the banter between grooms in French, and the smell of the disinfectant. Instead, inside, everything was quiet and orderly and somber. The frantic mare stood in the center of the barn, on cross ties, while a vet and a few other folks tended to her.

I remember a man with a garden hose. I remember castor oil. I remember a discussion about whether the horse should be walked around or kept still. I remember the other horses whinnying in their stalls at the break in their evening routine. I remember my father being genuinely worried that Dulcimer was going to have to be put down. And I remember being at the barn for a very long time. So long, in fact, that my father had me go into the dusty tack room to call my mom to tell her that we were okay.

And then it was over. Whatever they had done to Dulcimer finally had worked. My father and I got home really late that

night. After midnight, for sure, and at the time it was the latest I had ever been up. I remember a brief discussion about whether I had to go to school the next day. I remember my mom winning that argument. And so I got up the next morning and went across the street to school at Algonquin Elementary like every other kid. Except on that morning I felt differently. Like a grown up.

I cannot remember if Dulcimer raced again for us after that night. I don't think so. I know she soon became a broodmare. Pathway tells me she foaled at least six babies. Three made it to the races in the late 1970s and early 1980s; two on the trot and one on the pace. Those three, collectively, made about \$90,000 at the time. Dulcimer turned out to be a better broodmare than she ever was a racehorse. I don't know if I would feel the same way about horses and harness racing if she had died that night 40-something years ago. I'm just really glad she didn't.

Beggars can't be choosers; bettors must be choosers

Last time, Bettors Banquet (BB) addressed the need to pass races in order to help you win money (full story here). We did this with a prime example from an actual race with our two fictional bettors, Delaney and Ollie (you will read about them a lot in BB when we use examples from actual races). Now, BB adds further support to the topic by exploring more reasons for passing and/or playing and how it affects your chances to profit.

These days and nights there are more races at more racetracks made available to wager upon and there are actual and virtual platforms in which a bettor can witness and wager. You can wager on just about every breed racing anywhere in the world. And, due to time differences, it is possible on some days to bet over a 24-hour period. It is awesome for anyone who invests in the game to be presented with such a variety, but one has to learn how to use the volume of possibilities to his or her advantage.

Thank you, new technology.

However, even if I go to a restaurant with the appetite of a grizzly bear coming out of hibernation, I cannot eat all the food on the restaurant menu. Nor could I afford to buy all the food on the menu. Nor do I like to eat most of the food on the menu. So, as awesome as it is to have such a variety, nothing good could come from gorging myself merely because I could afford it.

Choice is not an option in that case; choice is mandatory.

Betting pari-mutuels for profit also demands making choices. For a moment, ponder two questions you may never have asked yourself when you're locked and loaded to be challenged by pari-mutuels: Which races will you play and why?

If you cannot choose specific races to wager, no less have specific reasons to choose those races, then we cannot even begin to talk about the best ways for you to manage your bankroll (topics for future BB columns). You see, if you have no reasons why you choose to play and you play anyway, you

will soon be broke, so the last thing you will need is money management advice.

My rules for choosing hardly ever make it to post time. I make choices while reading past performances (PP). If I do not care for a race while perusing the particulars in the PPs, I turn the page. There is never a reason to waste time juggling handicapping elements just to find an excuse to play a race.

There never was time to waste, even in the old days, when all we were offered were nine races a program at a single track and we had to take a two-hour round trip to bet at all. The phrase "time is money" means as much today as it did then.

There are at least three reasons it is imperative to choose to play as few races as possible and they have to do with the stark realities of betting on any horse race.

First — You will always lose more races than you win, no matter how few races you choose to play. This is sad but true. Over the long run, the raw number of races you win will never exceed the raw number of races you lose. This connects with the reason to play for profit and not pride, since you can make a profit winning one out of ten races but you can lose money winning two out of three.

Second — Ultimately, your skill predicting any winners is merely a victim of circumstances entirely out of your control. As consistent and reliable as is the sport, once a bet is made, every intelligent reason to make that bet can disappear in the blink of an eye. Murphy's Law — "If anything can go wrong, it will" — can cause a duel between two horses that sets the stage for a longshot closer which never had a chance otherwise. A pacer with a super gait breaks stride. A trotter with a super gait breaks stride. Sulky wheels hook, impeding horses' progress.

Third — There are people playing against you (the other bettors, your enemies), many of them having talents you lack; others having wagered on horses that will race better than your horse for reasons no one will ever discover.

And so on and so forth.

There is, however, good news that comes from playing as few races as possible. Among the few races you do bet, things may go your way, things you did not expect when you handicapped, things that occur during the mile trip that benefit the horse you bet. As well, sometimes the race can go from start to finish exactly the way you predicted. But the best thing that can happen from one of the few races you decide to bet is a win — no matter how it occurs — that puts you in the minority of winners, paying a bold price; in other words, a time when you defeat the enemy.

Harness Racing's Hall of Fame election process

Who is the greatest 3rd baseman of all time? My pick is Brooks Robinson, perhaps your choice is Wade Boggs, Chopper Jones or Mike Schmidt. We can agree to disagree. Who belongs in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame, like the baseball topic it is cause for much healthy lively debate as we rally behind our choices like reading off our favorite baseball card and rattle off stats like Hollywood Heyden for support of our star.

Everyone has their own viewpoint on the many of the possible outstanding candidates, along with and their opinions on the process such an individual goes through to be enshrined in Goshen's Hall of Fame. What most people don't realize is that there is already a lengthy and involved process with checks and balances that must be adhered to for a worthy candidate to even be considered. First and foremost, in order to receive any consideration a candidate's name must be put forth to a United Stakes Harness Writers Association (USHWA) Chapter and approved.

The Process

Each chapter of USHWA nominates individuals that their membership feels have met the criteria and warrant being in the Hall of Fame, Chapter meetings are usually conducted between now and the end of May.

USHWA's Advisory Committee, a group of veteran USHWAns, annually prepares biographies for 20 top candidates for the Hall. Chapters may nominate up to two candidates from these 20. Chapters receive this "Book of 20" on May 1.

Each chapter may also nominate one individual outside this 20, providing they send in a 350-700-word biography clearly capturing why this person deserves recognition for their North American lifetime accomplishments.

Integrity Committee

USHWA's Integrity Committee gets involved in this nominating process twice – to examine the Advisory Committee's 20 people before the list is distributed to the Chapters, and then again to examine anyone else the Chapters may nominate. The Integrity Committee checks the records and background of nominees, assuring they meet with the sport's highest standards.

HOF Screening Committee

Once all the candidates have been reviewed, vetted and approved by the Integrity Committee, the Hall of Fame Screening Committee, consisting of six long-time journalists and the president of USHWA, will meet in Goshen the first weekend of July. They will discuss the candidates among themselves, get the advice of a specially-appointed committee of present Hall of Famers, and then decide who will advance to the midsummer balloting

Don't be a Monday Morning Quarterback, If you feel strongly that you have a viable candidate with **national recognition** that warrants Hall of Fame consideration, contact the president of your local USHWA Chapter to discuss inclusion of your candidate.

He flipped open the sipping lid of his cream and no sugar coffee and asked, "How did you get involved in breeding a harness horse?"


"The normal progression of gambling, owning, and then breeding.

"Yeah, but like most horseplayers, anytime we made a few bucks, we recycled the money back into the game. Our third filly grew into a big Cantab Hall mare. This time we kept her after racing to try the breeding side."

"And you got rich!"

"Yeah, I live in a double-wide for the ambiance. I drive you around town for the exercise."

I pulled up the farm address on my GPS and locked it in, "I always get lost on these back roads, they have signs the size of postcards."

"Which is your favorite part of the sport, gambling, racing or breeding horses?"

I thought a few seconds, "Breeding. Raising a baby horse is interesting as hell, much more complicated than it looks from the outside. Breeding takes a long time, and has just as many pitfalls as gambling or racing."

"Which brings us back to the big choice for your next sire; who is it going to be, Prestidigitator, Whataworkout or Enterprise?"

"I'm 90 per cent sure, but I still have some time. The broodmare you're going to meet today is not due until the end of April, maybe early May."

We drove through the gently rolling hills, past tidy farmhouses and frozen fields.

I broke the silence, "Picking a stallion is easy. The daddy is the only choice a broodmare owner makes for a long time. You just keep your head down and hope the phone doesn't ring with bad news."

I explained, "You know how when you gamble you can play a pick five, a bet where you need to win five races in a row?"

"Sure"

"Breeding is like a pick-five gamble where you only get one horse in each race. Each step in the process is a yes or no. If the answer is a no you are out. For example, when we order semen from one of these stallions, either my mare gets pregnant or she doesn't. As a breeder, if you get a no, it's like having a thirty-year-old kid moving into your attic, a slightly annoying unproductive presence that eats your food for a year."

"You don't have kids."

"I'm speaking metaphorically."

"Actually, you're speaking incorrectly. I was an English Major, you used similes."

"What's the difference?"

"The difference is the word LIKE. When you said, "Breeding is LIKE a pick five gamble, or when you said. "A mare that is not pregnant is LIKE having a 39-year-old kid move in.' Using the word LIKE makes the comparisons similes. It's a small difference."

"Batman, you are a diphthong, a big diphthong."

"That's a metaphor."

"If you say one more thing about grammar I'll punch you in the throat. What do you call that sentence Mr. Dead Poet Society?"

"Sarcasm, with a twist of cliché."

Grinning like kids turned loose at the fair, we exited vaudeville and I returned to breeding, "Getting my mare in foal is winning the first race. Then it continues, the mare carries to birth, yes or no. The foal stands well or it doesn't. The baby gets sick or stays well. The weanling gets kicked in the field or doesn't. Maybe the yearling needs a procedure like an OCD removed or not. The yearling gets into the select sale or not. At least two bidders think your yearling is worth your price or not. You need to run the table in the breeding game."

"For a type Z person like me, I just roll with it and call the ride fate, or karma, or fortune. My thinking is that when I pick a stallion, I feel as if I started the Fibonacci sequence in motion."

He shook his head, "I don't think the Fibonacci sequence applies."

"Don't start with me, Mr. Big Bang."

He made a lip-zipping motion.

We had a chuckle and I said, "Plus I enjoy the heck out of



visiting the farm, sitting on the porch, and watching the babies grow."

"And this is how you plan to get rich, breeding a trotter."

"Hah, I'll be lucky to get a triple-wide. The thing that trips up amateurs is that we don't plan on bad things like having a mare abort, but bad things do happen. I've only had six or seven babies, but there have been pitfalls. A few years ago, I was talking to a breeder who has been in the business for 50 years. He asked me what I thought the percentage was of mares that are bred, carry to term and have a marketable yearling."

My friend didn't guess, he just gave me a shrug.

"My guess was 90 percent."

"And the answer was?"

"Mid-sixties, and of course plenty of them that are marketable don't bring what the breeder hopes to get."

I turned my Prius into the lane that led to the farm. Horses, big and small, young and old raised their heads to take note of the car disturbing their world. I stopped and slid down our windows. We watched the herds as we sipped our coffee and breathed in the crisp, fresh air as the sun suddenly climbed out of the clouds.

I said softly, "Days out here with nature, peace, horses, and friends. This is absolutely the greatest place in the universe."

He smiled, "That's hyperbole."

"Maybe not."

From post position No. 2, Odds-on Ideal Lifestyle A took over from lone leaver Twinkle (Scott Zeron) before a :27.3 opening quarter-mile, then held sway (:57.2, 1:24.4, life-best 1:52.3). Twinkle tried the winner inside through the lane, but missed a length.

Write Me a Song (Jordan Stratton) was a non-threatening third, with Newborn Sassy (Tim Tetrick) and Caviart Cherie (Joe Bongiorno) settled for the minors.

For Ideal Lifestyle A, a 7-year-old Down Under daughter of Western Ideal owned and trained by Tahnee Camilleri, it was her second win in five seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$15.40, the triple returned \$40.60 and the superfecta paid \$153.50.

Second division — Delightmemphisn (Jason Bartlett, \$6.60)

With the rain teeming down, a first-up — from post No. 4 — Delightmemphisn (Jason Bartlett, \$6.60) snapped 2-5 choice Bettor Joy N (Tetrick) at the (1:53) wire. First leader Magic Forces (Brenan) was a best-of-the-rest third, with Freakonomics (Zeron) and Sell a Bit N (Stratton) picking off the final pay envelopes.

Bettor Joy N had laid down early intervals of :27.2, :56.1 and 1:24.2, but just faltered by a short nose.

For second choice Delightfulmemphisn, a 6-year-old Down Under daughter of Bettor's Delight owned by Enzed Racing and trained by Nifty Norman, it was her fifth win in eight '19 tries. The exacta paid \$11.40, the triple returned \$24.80 and the superfecta paid \$57.

Third division — Apple Bottom Jeans (Corey Callahan, \$2.60)

Rain continued and so did formful results. It was a down-the-road — from post No. 3 — Apple Bottom Jeans

(Corey Callahan, \$2.60) winning as she pleased (:28.1, :56.3, 1:25, 1:52.2).

Rockstar Angel A (Zeron) chased from a loose pocket, beaten 3½ lengths. A weak, first-up Queen Lostris N (Mark MacDonald), Bettor's Up (Bartlett) and Lakeisha Hall (Brennan) were the other payees.

For Apple Bottom Jeans, a 6-year-old daughter of Mr. Apples co-owned by Ed Gold, Howard Taylor, Thomas Lazzaro & Robert Cooper Stables and trained by Dylan Davis, it was her third win in five seasonal starts. The exacta (two wagering choices) paid \$9.20, the triple returned \$52.50 and the superfecta paid \$160.50.

Fourth division — Seaswift Joy N (Jim Marohn, Jr., \$5.50)

From post No. 6, favored Seaswift Joy N (Jim Marohn Jr., \$5.50) eschewed an early three-hole, then completed her wet rounds (:26.4, :56.4, 1:24.3, life-best 1:52.1). Feelin' Red Hot (Brennan) took a shot from the pocket, but missed by three-quarters of a length.

For Seaswift Joy N, a 6-year-old Down Under daughter of Bettor's Delight owned by Brad Grant and trained by Tony Alagna, it was her third win in five '19 efforts (3-for-3 here). The exacta (two wagering choices) paid \$15.60, the triple returned \$87 and the superfecta paid \$339.

Fifth division — Shartin N (Tim Tetrick, Jr., \$2.20)

Defending series champ Shartin N (Tetrick, \$2.20), began her purse season by fooling very few. From post No. 2, she found herself away third before finding front. From there (:27.4, :56, 1:24.3, 1:52.2), she was a puny pari-mutuel proposition.

Don't Think Twice A (Bartlett) made first lead, yielded and missed, beaten a half-length. Bettorb Chevron N (Stratton) closed for third, with Dude'salady (Marohn Jr.) and Mach it a Par (Brennan) settling for the small change.

For Shartin N, a 6-year-old Tintin in America Kiwi lass, co-owned by her chauffer, Richard Poillucci and Jo Ann Looney-King, she comes off a 19-for-24, million-dollar season. The exacta paid \$5.60, the superfecta returned \$10.40 and the superfecta paid \$34.40.

Earlier Friday evening, Dan Dube knocked an item off the to-do list, getting career win No. 8,999 with Rural Art (\$6.30) in the \$20,000, third-race pace (1:54.4).

"This is the leggiest thing and the quickest thing I've ever seen at two days old," Young said proudly, showing the video to his trainer. Linda Toscano.

"We don't want to forget that Put On A Show has another colt that's only three, and in training, that might be good," Young said of Best In Show, a Bettors Delight colt. "He raced three times and ended up with something they call 'colt soreness', but in those three starts, he lost to Stag Party and Captain Ahab and won the race in the middle. That's not too bad."

"He was big and he was growing all the time," Toscano said of Best In Show. "We brought him along slowly... He's a Bettors Delight, and so they are going to get better as they go along. So I brought him along with that in mind, to let him find himself. He was doing everything that he was supposed to do."

USTA Call to Action Committee update on battling hidden trainer issue

Following the U.S. Trotting Association's 2019 Board of Directors Annual Meeting held March 8-11 in Columbus, OH, the USTA's Call to Action Subcommittee issued the following announcement regarding the issue of hidden trainers on Thursday (March 14).

At the Call to Action Subcommittee meeting on Friday night (March 8) the committee updated their plan regarding the initiative to prohibit hidden trainers from continuing to ply their unethical trade by using program trainers (commonly referred to as "beard" trainers) when that hidden

trainer is banned from being licensed or has been suspended.

"The essence of the beard trainer problem is that trainers currently under suspension or whose license has been denied are conducting business as usual, they are making a mockery out of the industry," said Call to Action Committee chairman Mark Loewe. "Currently, we have to rely on the state regulators and licensing is their only tool to combat this problem.

"It is important to note that beard trainers are cooperating in a scheme to defraud the regulators and the public, so they are also culpable."

USTA director and subcommittee member Joe Faraldo previously presented the concept of "regulatory discovery" to end this unethical practice.

Essentially, regulatory discovery requires suspected beard trainers to provide a series of documents to regulators, who could examine the flow of money and other communication to ascertain they are just acting as a shill for the hidden, unlicensed trainer. If so, the beard trainer would also be suspended or have his or her license application rejected.

"It is important to note that this process is not expensive for the regulators because it requires no additional detectives or other investigatory expense" said USTA president Russell Williams.

"And it should also be noted that it is very likely that it won't be necessary to get every commission to adopt regulatory discovery or to catch every beard trainer. A few prosecutions will go a long way."

The USTA first presented the regulatory discovery concept at Association of Racing Commissioners International meetings in Omaha, NE last July, and will pursue it to a conclusion. As a result, the proposal was assigned to an ARCI subcommittee for further consideration. The committee determined that it will submit it again for discussion at the ARCI meeting scheduled for Aug. 8-10 in Saratoga Springs, NY.

The USTA is also prepared to take the concept directly to regulators, track operators and horsemen's organizations. In fact, Faraldo indicated that the policy has already been implemented at Yonkers Raceway, where he is the president of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York.

At this year's Call to Action Subcommittee meeting, the committee drafted three proposals regarding guidelines for regulatory discovery to be distributed to racing commissions, racetracks, and horsemen's associations, respectively.

In addition, the USTA is also looking at its own licensing and membership structure to determine whether it can act as an association to implement regulatory discovery.
