# Trainer John Butenschoen on a lifetime of doing what he enjoys most

The Midwesterner on working for Delvin Miller and his close relationships with Erv Miller and the late Brian Pinske.

When I asked John Butenschoen if he was born into the sport that has been his means of making a living, his answer was, "Well, sort of."

His roots are midwestern, Illinois to be specific. His dad, Walter, farmed corn, soybeans and wheat and then sort of migrated to harness racing.



Walter had a friend, Dave Samuelson, who owned a bar in their home town Marengo, where the two friends would occasionally get together. En route to the bar they might stop at Maywood Park, where they would enjoy the racing.

John speculates that perhaps one evening the friends might have had one beer too many. They decided to claim a harness horse with which they could have some fun racing at Maywood.

It was 1975 and young John Butenschoen was all of 12 years old. That one claimer led to several, all of the cheaper variety. John became quite interested in his dad's horses and began to help in taking care of them.

They were trained by Bob Welch, Roger's dad. John and Roger were about the same age and became friends.

John's dad began boarding a few horses, mostly turnouts at the farm. Eventually a training facility and a track were added.

In 1982, John received a call from his friend Roger Welch who was at Pompano Park working for Jack Ackerman. "We are stabled next to Delvin Miller. They need some help. Are you interested?"

"Am I interested? Of course, I am." What aspiring young horseman wouldn't be interested in going to work for the man that many then considered to be among the greatest of all horsemen ever. He quickly packed his car and was on his way to Florida.

When he arrived he was given two head to take care of under the direct supervision of Delvin's right hand man, Aime Choquette.

"Aime was a great, great horseman," John said. "What he didn't know about horses probably wasn't worth knowing. He had tremendous patience both with horses and with people."

John Butenschoen spent four years with the Miller Stable. He wintered during the golden years of Pompano Park. Most of the great Grand Circuit stables were headquartered there.

"Those years I spent at Pompano were fantastic. I'd love to have the opportunity to relive them. I was having a great time, but maybe I was too young to really appreciate what we had. You know the old saying, 'Youth is wasted on the young.' That wasn't completely so for me, but the business was at its height. The Meadowlands had just opened. I was living life to its fullest."

Delvin asked me to enter, train them, take care of them and ship them to their next race. All I had to do was keep in touch with him and let him know how they raced.

Delvin gave the young man what John felt was the opportunity of a lifetime. He allowed him to take two head on the road and race them on the Pennsylvania Fair Circuit.

There was a huge added benefit with being able to work for Delvin Miller. John met Jackie Kiger the woman who was to become his wife. Jackie's dad, Jack, was the manager of the Miller Brothers (Delvin and Albert) Bancroft Farm and its adjoining Meadowcroft Village in Avella, PA. Jackie grew up on farm. John had been sent to Bancroft to help with the worming of some mares and their foals. It was there that he met Jackie.

"She has been a godsend to me, not only by being a great wife to me and mother to Tyler, but also in being a big part of running the entire business end of the operation. I train and pick the horses. Jackie does just about everything else. The stable would be lost without her."

John worked with Delvin and Aime for four years before deciding to return to Illinois with his new bride and set up his own stable.

There he remained, racing horses, mostly Illinois breds on the Illinois circuit for the next 23 years.

While there, he retained his friendship with Roger Welch and made numerous lifelong friendships including a young Minnesotan name Brian Pinske whom he met while at The Meadows. Pinske and his grandfather Bob were there racing a few horses.

In addition to the Illinois breds, John would train a few youngsters eligible to stakes in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. When these out of staters were ready to race, he would ship them to stables in the respective states to which they were eligible.


When things began to go bad for racing in Illinois, John saw the writing on the wall and decided to move his operation to the east, when he saw the tide turning.

He has now been headquartered at Wind Gap Farm in close proximity to Pocono Downs during the racing season and spends his winters at the Pinske-owned training center Southern Oaks in Central Florida.

It was at Southern Oaks where this scribe caught up with him.

# Q: What can you tell me about your career in harness racing?

"As is the case with a lot of the folks involved in the sport, I've been lucky to make a living doing something that I thoroughly enjoy. I've been fortunate enough to be moderately successful. I've had wonderful group of owners who have stuck with me through the good horses and the ones that maybe weren't good enough."



#### Q: Tell us about the makeup of your stable today.

"If I were to use one word to describe it, that word would be diverse. We have a total of 43 horses in training. We left three racehorses up north with our son Tyler. It has been somewhat of a chore getting them raced because of the uncertainties of the weather up there. We have 40 down here in Florida of which 26 are 2-year-olds. They are eligible to race in a bunch of jurisdictions — Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Ontario, Indiana and Kentucky. Ironically, we do not have a single yearling from my home state of Illinois. Dual eligibility, especially including Kentucky, has been a great boost. With the new track opening there, we will now be able to race there for good money from Spring through late Fall. Dual and in some cases even triple eligibility has become a significant factor to yearling buyers. Those breeders that have them have and will benefit, those that do not will likely be negatively impacted."

Q: If this scribe were to pick the 10 trainers who spend the most time in doing their homework in looking at yearlings and being prepared for every major sale and even some of the minor ones, you would certainly be included.

"I'm kind of lucky in that I don't consider that part of the job to be at all onerous. I actually love looking at horses. It's not work to me, it's enjoyment. There is very little that I enjoy more than going to the various farms and looking at the yearlings in their home environment and then, if at all, possible seeing the ones that I have enough time for being turned out in the paddock. I also enjoy the banter with the farm managers and other horsemen that I encounter on my visits."

Q: You used the word "I." However, from my experience, when you visit a farm to look at yearlings, you are almost always accompanied by your friend Erv Miller. You are somewhat of a consignor's dream. You generally look at the same ones at the same time, thus making things easy for the farms, the help and of course the horses.

"Erv and I have been friends for a long time. We have so many things in common. We are both about the same age. We both have sons the same age in the business. Our wives are friends. We both train at Wind Gap in the Summer and at Southern Oaks in Winter. We met indirectly through Delvin Miller. Delvin had a one-eyed gelding named Tarport Ramey that he said would set the world record for a 2-year-old trotting gelding. He did, winning in 1.58. Delvin sold him to one of Erv's owners. Tarport Ramey was at Hawthorne scheduled to race in the Dygert there. I went to visit him. I met Erv. We've been friends ever since."

Q: One of your good friends was Brian Pinske who accomplished a whole lot in the terribly short period of time allotted to him. His loss at such a young age was a great loss not only to all that knew him, but also to the entire industry.

"Brian was a special guy. I first met him when we were both racing at Quad City Downs. He had an abundance of energy and made friends with just about everybody that knew him. He was an exceptional horseman as well. His unexpected death was just a horrible loss to us all. That was one of the most terrible days I've ever experienced. His parents had lost another son in a car accident several years before. I'll never forget his dad Tim's tearful words to me, 'I've only got one left.' It was beyond horrible. He hadn't yet told his remaining son Karl and couldn't imagine how he was going to do it. To a limited degree I knew how he felt. Jackie and I had lost an infant son. Nothing could be worse for a parent. It happened while the Harrisburg sale was taking place. Brian had bought several yearlings. We didn't know for whose account they were. Several of us got together and together with Brian's parents Tim and Marlys and before the sale was over we had found owners for all of them."

# Q: You began training in South Florida when working for Delvin. You are now in central Florida, where you prefer to train and live. Why?

"Probably first and foremost is the Southern Oaks Training Center owned and managed by the Pinske family. If there is a place that I'd describe as Horse Heaven this might be it. As you know, it was originally built and designed by Mr. Simpson. His son, Jim, supervised its building according to Mr. Simpson's instructions. As I understand it, he wanted the racetrack to be modeled after Springfield which he considered to be the best track in existence. He wanted paddocks — lots of roomy paddocks where horses could be turned out. As great a job as Jim did in building it, the Pinske family have taken it a step or two beyond. We now have three tracks on which the horses can be trained. Everything that can be done to make it a great experience for both horses and people is there. The only possible negative is that once we leave here, the experience for both people and horses can only go in one direction."

# Q: In the racing season you train at Wind Gap which is fairly close to Pocono Downs.

"We've been there for quite a while now. We have a home on five acres. There's an interesting story that goes with the place. I was in Canada racing. I called home to check on how things were there. Jackie told me, 'I bought a house.' 'You did what?' I said. 'I bought a house.' 'What if I don't like it?' I responded. 'It doesn't matter. We are moving there anyway."

# Q: Do you do anything different now than when you were starting out?

"Most definitely. I expect that 10 years from now I still will be doing things differently. The breed has changed and keeps changing. In addition to changing with it, we have to realize that what is good for some horses may not be beneficial to others. Generally speaking, I try to do what has worked for me in the past. However, if that doesn't work, I am always open to change. If there is one overriding philosophy it has to be to try to keep our horses fit and happy. There are times when we are too hard on them. It's not easy being a racehorse. When we are too hard on them, such as racing them too hard or too often, they under perform. That is usually not their fault. It is ours. We need to try to look into them and empathize with their needs. If we do that successfully, they will perform accordingly."

# Q: Do you have a philosophy when shopping for yearlings?


"That can probably be summed up in one word — value. I would describe myself as being a middle of the road or maybe even a slightly below middle of the road shopper. That doesn't mean

that I won't look at as many of the higher-priced yearlings as I can find. Chances are that I will look at close to all of them. There are several reasons why. The first is that I really enjoy looking at horses. I don't consider it to be hard work. The second is that there is an advantage to being prepared. You never know when one that you expect to bring big bucks, just doesn't. Sometimes there may be a good reason for that happening. Occasionally there won't be.

"I've found that in looking at yearlings by the 'flavor of the day' stallions — those are at the top of the heap — there is a tendency for those to bring higher prices than I might think they are worth. On the other hand, I find there is often to be great value to be found in those stallions who I know to be capable of siring good horses, but for whatever reason are out of favor. An example in recent years might be a horse like Cantab Hall who is a proven great stallion, but whose yearlings sometimes now get overlooked in the sales ring. I'd much sooner have a Cantab Hall that I consider to be at or near the best of his breed than a Muscle Hill or Walner that might be in the lower segment of those being offered. Other sometimes overlooked stallions I've had good luck with are Life Sign, Explosive Matter, Western Terror and Yankee Glide."

#### Q: Pacers or trotters. Which do you prefer?

"Trotters of course. That's obvious with me. We have 26 2-yearolds and 20 of them are trotters. I would say though that last

- 2. All horses must be declared to start in the elimination races, by the regular box closing date and time.
- 3. The top (8) finishers in the eliminations and two also eligibles will automatically be drawn in to the final. No also eligible will draw in to race after wagering has opened.
- 4. All ties will be drawn by lot.
- 5. There must be five (5) or more starters declared to start or the race will be declared off and all money returned as paid.
- 6. Purse distribution: 50 per cent, 25 per cent, 12 per cent, 8 per cent, 5 per cent.
- 7. Nominations will be divided by sex and gait and added accordingly to each final. No starting fees required.
- 8. All races to be raced over a distance of one mile (1609 M).
- 9. Ontario Sired means bred by a sire that was registered in the Ontario Sires Stakes program in the year of the breeding.
- 10. U.S. Funds will be accepted at the fees designated on the stake conditions. U.S. funds will be converted to Canadian funds when deposited to the bank. U.S. funds will be converted at Woodbine Entertainment's internally published buying rate for US dollars.
- 11. To be raced pending approval of race dates by the AGCO.
- 12. The Management of Western Fair District accepts no responsibility for accidents which may occur on the grounds

year's sales were somewhat of an anomaly. The pacing market, especially for fillies, was red hot. Although trotters were strong, they were not on a relative basis as strong as pacers, especially in the price range where I do most of my shopping."

# Q: How much credit do you give to seeing one turned out in a paddock?

"A whole lot. It certainly gives you some insight to their athleticism and attitude. You have to be a little careful there, as well. Some horses do have bad days. That's where the farm manager and your trust in him or her come into play. This might be the fifth time that the particular yearling has been turned out and it is just tired or has had enough for the day. If I ask for one to be paddocked, there is a good chance that I already like it. In most cases, it would have to show me something that I don't want to see in order to get it crossed off my list."

# Q: What's the best horse you've ever had in your stable?

"Without a doubt, that would be Plesac. He might not have been the greatest trotter ever, but he was darned good. If I were going to use one word to describe him, that would be consistency. He never went a bad race. He didn't win them all, but he was usually right there and rarely didn't get a check. We bought him as a yearling for \$24,000 and he earned \$2,501,758."

# Q: Do you have a special type of yearling, a prototype?

"Yes and no. I've had big and small horses in my stable. Short and tall. But most of the yearlings I buy have a certain look about them. If you asked me to describe it, I couldn't. But just about all have that 'it' factor — whatever 'it' might be."

# Q: Who are the greatest horsemen you've known?

"Of course, I'd have to start with Delvin and Aime. Then there have been others, lots of others. In order to survive in this business, you've got to be good. It would be a long list, some well-known, others not quite as well thought of. Some names that would have to be included would be Jim Dennis, Brian Pinske, Ray and Larry Remmen and Erv. Then of course there are the obvious ones — guys like Ronnie Burke and Jimmy Takter. One guy who I don't believe gets the credit he deserves is Danny Altmeyer. He is not only an excellent horseman, he is perhaps even more importantly an exceptional human being."

# Q: Do you have any favorite breeders that you like to buy from?

"Not really. If I believe the breeder raises a good horse I will look at their yearlings. I'd be remiss if I didn't mention Doc and Pat Walker, though. They gave me my start in the yearling game. I'll be eternally grateful to them. There are a few, very few who I won't patronize, mostly because of the way I've felt I've been treated or maybe mistreated. The buyer holds all the cards in this game. He alone decides who to buy from, which ones to bid on and how high to go. Most breeders realize this and treat their prospective patrons accordingly."

#### Q: How would you liked to be remembered?

"Probably as just a good old farm boy, who was lucky enough to spend his life doing what he most enjoyed."

# Let your conscience be your guide

As someone who has advocated inbreeding as a way to produce superior racehorses, it gave me pause to read that the American buffalo is now suffering losses because of a genetic deficiency caused by inbreeding.

Although there were once millions of buffalos roaming the plains of this country, indiscriminate hunting, both for meat and hides, virtually erased them from North America. From the few survivors, the breed was slowly regenerated, and they now number in the tens of thousands, all raised domestically, on ranches.

As with any breed being created, or, in this case, recreated, intense inbreeding has to be part of the process. When it comes to our breed, the standardbred, the early pacers would have frequently been the winners of the annual I'm My Own Grandpa Awards, assuming I was around to give them.

When smart ranchers were recreating the American buffalo, they could only do it by inbreeding. Which has worked fine, insofar as producing a beef animal with real commercial value. But now there is a problem. Buffalo are succumbing to a fatal disease because their immune systems aren't strong enough to fight it off.

I'm certainly not saying that our trotters and pacers are about to start dying off to a mysterious disease, but it does mean that unchecked inbreeding could someday cause a similar condition in our beautiful animals. This is in a context of decades, and assumes that the USTA of the future doesn't take the necessary steps to keep our breed safe.

Some untoward comments from various carpers notwithstanding, I believe that the USTA of the future will act to protect our breed. This already happened in 2009, when the breed organization imposed book limits on stallions of both gaits.

The basis then was a peer-reviewed thesis that showed that the American trotter had lost 17 per cent of its heterozygosity, which is the variability factor. The first manifestation of this loss is a loss of fertility in the males of the effected breed, in our case our trotting stallions.

Anyone in the breeding trenches in the early days of this century can testify, or swear, usually quite loudly, about the problem of getting mares in foal to Valley Victory and his sons. Because there are practical and commercial considerations that had to be part of the final equation, the USTA set every stud's annual book limit at 140 mares.

If there weren't these other, material, considerations, I would have liked to see a limit of 100 mares, or better still, 75. The lower the book limit, the more breeders would be forced to turn to less popular stallions with less fashionable pedigrees. And that would, in turn, bring new blood into the breed, which would eliminate the loss of heterozygosity, the variability factor, and with it, the loss of stallion infertility.

As I've already said, I've been a big proponent of inbreeding, to get a superior racehorse. But I also have to admit that in the long run, it would be very bad for our breed. So I leave it to you to decide whether to take the high road or the low road. In Jiminy Cricket's immortal words: let your conscience be your guide.

Regarding the USTA continuing to make freeze branding available on an optional basis, it represents a triumph for

my dear friend Ellen Harvey. She was by no means alone in advocating for freeze brands, but she was the most articulate and persistent advocate.

For anyone who has ever tried to identify the standardbreds in a kill pen, which is exactly what the words mean, sans a visible freeze brand, it's virtually impossible to identify our horses by their micro-chips.

No one resisted freeze branding more than this kid, to the point that at the end, Castleton and Walnut Hall were the only two farms which insisted on lip tattoos rather than freeze brands.

But this new consideration takes precedence over any aesthetic considerations. All our foals will be freeze branded this year, as will all the foals of our clients. I live for the day when the law makers in Washington outlaw the transportation of horses for slaughter.

Last week also was the deadline for submitting your yearling entries to the annual October sale at Fasig-Tipton. Fasig-Tipton has a special meaning for me, because my McDonogh Military School classmate, John Finney, was, for years, the president of Fasig.

Finney and I stayed in touch long after our marching days were over. He called me one day when we were both living in New York.

"There is a \$40 million thoroughbred market in Lexington," he said, "And I'm going down there to get my share of it."

The beautiful arena and the attractive but practical barns were all designed down to the last nail by my friend.

Finney was not only a great guy, he was smart, both academically and practically. He went to Princeton and graduated either Magna or Summa Cum Laude, with a Phi Beta Kappa Key. He also had a lightning fast wit.

One night long ago, I was with some friends in a Lexington night spot that had a dance combo. To my surprise, I saw Finney on the dance floor with a woman I didn't recognize. When he saw me, he let me know he'd be over shortly.

The music ended, his partner was redeposited at the table, and he arrived where I was sitting, visibly perspiring.

"That's Harry Somebody's wife," he said, "And she loves to dance and Harry doesn't."

Then, as he wiped his brow with a damp handkerchief, he added, "And it's hard work exercising another man's horse."

# When was the last time you saw this?

It's now been 22 years since there was a repeat winner in the Horse of the Year race. Moni Maker was the last to do it in 1998 and 1999. Her 1999 earnings of \$1,494,972 was a single-season record for female trotters that stood for 14 years until Bee A Magician bested it in 2013 (\$1,547,304) en route to her Horse of the Year title.

Moni Maker also posted earnings of \$1,229,828 in her first Horse of the Year season of 1998. No other horse — male or female, trotter or pacer — has won back-to-back HOY titles reaching seven figures in both seasons.

In fact, no other female standardbred has been

Amity Chef sold as Hip #602. He went on to win the 3YOCP of the Year award and sired Miss Easy in his first try. She was the richest ever female pacer upon retirement (\$1.777 million).

Sugarcane Hanover sold as Hip #648. He has two unique places in harness racing history. He won the 1987 Breeders Crown Trot at the Meadowlands — the first Breeders Crown race ever held there. Then he won the March Of Dimes Trot at Garden State Park on Nov. 17, 1988 in Cherry Hill, NJ — over HOY Mack Lobell and Ourasi.

#### **ONLY HARNESS RACING CAN SAY THIS**

Only harness racing can boast that a single race, the Hambletonian, will go for \$1 million (as of the 2022 edition). Thoroughbred racing's Breeders' Cup is on year 38 this year.

#### OUIZ

Q. Who are the only two horses that raced in the same million-dollar race in North America two straight years?

**A. Magician and Nikki Cole.** Both raced in the \$1 million Breeders Crown Open Trot in 2000 and 2001. Magician was 1st and 4th and Nikki Cole was 4th and 8th.

This takes on added significance when you realize what Luke McCarthy just did Down Under. In the Miracle Mile, for the third straight year, McCarthy drove King Of Swing to victory.

King Of Swing 82 44-18-3, \$3,390,546 lifetime has now been retired to stud.

He's followed that up with three straight wins in Mohawk overnights and now sports earnings of \$55,854 for West Wins Stable (Ross Warriner and Casie Coleman), McKinlay & Fielding and Mac Nichol.

He's certainly one to watch.


#### **A SIGN OF SPRING**

#### Opening leg of Blue Chip Matchmaker Series held at Yonkers

**Drama Act** was a dominant winner in the first of four \$40,000 divisions in the opening round of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series for pacing mares at Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (March 18). The Ron Burke-trained mare led virtually wire-to-wire for driver George Brennan and sprinted a final quarter in 27 seconds flat at the end of the 1:52.2 mile.

The Bethinator and Lit De Rose left inside of Drama Act, with Lit De Rose securing the front for trainer/driver Pat Lachance late on the opening bend. Brennan had Drama Act move alertly to take command before the quarter, and the pair were able to set fractions of :27.2 and :57.2 for the opening half with little movement. The Bethinator (Tim Tetrick) tried to attack without cover going to the three-quarters, but Drama Act flashed through a 1:25.2 three-quarters and marched away from all her rivals. Lit De Rose was clear for second, with 46-1 shot La Bella Vita N (Marcus Miller) moving along the pylons for third.

Sent off as the 2-5 choice, Drama Act returned \$2.80, \$2.10, and \$2.10 across the board. Lit De Rose paid \$2.90 and \$2.80 to place and show, with La Bella Vita N returning 6.40 to show. The exacta returned \$6.20, with the triple a healthy \$62.50 with the longshot finishing third. The OK Corral owns Drama Act, a 5-year-old daughter of Well Said that won for the 23rd time in her career. Ron Burke trains Drama Act.

The Stratton brothers — driver Jordan and trainer Cory — teamed up to post a mild upset in the second \$40,000 division with 9-2 choice **Easy To Please**.

Jordan Stratton blasted out of the gate with the 4-year-old New York-sired Easy To Please from post seven and drove right into the pocket behind speedster Sweet Heaven late on the opening turn. Sweet Heaven and driver Dexter Dunn carved out the :27.1 opening quarter and were still in command through the 56-second opening half. Best Head West, the 4-5 choice with Matt Kakaley, tried to go coverless into the third turn but stalled on the backstretch as Sweet Heaven sped to three-quarters in 1:24.2. Stratton seized the opportunity to pull into the final turn with Easy To Please, and the daughter of Roll With Joe was full of pace, disposing the pace-setter and cruising home in 1:52.3, with Best Head West closing belatedly for second. Bolt Of Beauty and Marcus Miller rallied up the pylons for third, with Sweet Heaven fading to fourth.

Cory Stratton trains and co-owns Easy To Please along with Our Three Sons Stable LLC. The winner returned \$11.20, \$3.90 and \$3.10 across the board. Best Head West returned \$2.20 and \$2.10, with Bolt Of Beauty paying \$5.40 on the end. The exacta was worth \$26.80 and the triple \$140.50.



**Dragon Roll** and driver Todd McCarthy bravely held off two determined rivals in the deep stretch to capture the third Blue Chip Matchmaker division.

McCarthy had Dragon Roll off alertly from post four and secured the front from Blue Ivy off the opening bend. McCarthy guided Dragon Roll through first half fractions of :27 and :55.3, with Scarlett Hanover (Yannick Gingras), last year's Jugette winner, on the move early without cover, followed by Miss You N (Dunn). The pace picked up noticeably on the backstretch, with Scarlett Hanover working closer to the leader and providing live cover through three-quarters in 1:24 flat.

Dragon Roll, owned and trained by Ricky Bucci, put some distance between herself and pocket-sitter Blue Ivy into the homestretch, with Miss You N and Dunn coming wide on the final turn and making up ground quickly. Along the pylons Racine Bell and Jason Bartlett were moving quickly, but neither challenger was able to get the better of a determined Dragon Roll, who stopped the timer in 1:52.1 for her fourth win in seven starts this year. Racine Bell was second, with Miss You N settling for third after the overland journey.

A 5-year-old and second daughter of Roll With Joe to capture a Blue Chip Matchmaker division, Dragon Roll returned \$7.20, \$3.60, and \$2.90 across the board. Racine Bell paid \$3.30 and \$2.70, with Miss You N paying \$5.10 to show. The winning exacta was worth \$19.40, with the triple coming in at \$107.00.

**Mystical Carrie** was up in the final stride to capture the final \$40,000 division for Marcus Miller, tracking down 2-5 favorite Karma Seelster on the wire in a 1:52.3 mile.

Karma Seelster and Jordan Stratton took charge early, racing three-wide into the first turn overtaking the eventual winner and Jody (Brennan) in the process. Karma Seelster set fractions of :27.3, :56.2, and 1:24 virtually unopposed in the field of six. Mystical Carrie sat third most of the trip, and Miller was able to come out first-over into the final turn, where the 5-year-old daughter of Tellitlikeitis accelerated before chasing down the winner late. Keep Rockin A and drive Tim Tetrick shadowed the winner's cover and also rallied late but could only manage third. Mystifying (Austin Siegelman) finished fourth.

Trained by Erv Miller for owner Mystical Marker Farms LLC., Mystical Carrie won for the second time in seven starts this year and returned \$9.90, \$2.60 and \$2.10 across the board. Favored Karma Seelster returned \$2.10 and \$2.10, with Keep Rockin A's show price at \$3. The exacta was \$16.80, and the triple came back at \$58.

The opening leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for free-for-allers, with five \$50,000 divisions, is scheduled for Monday night (March 21) as part of a 12-race program at Yonkers. There will be a Pick 6 carryover of \$1,284.41 on the card, which gets underway at 6:55 p.m.





# One Eared Max waits in the racetrack wings

I might have a touch of dyslexia when it comes to remembering names. I think my daughter's name is Kate, but when she was burrowing in and out of our bedcovers as a baby, I began to call her Worm. The weird thing is, while names like Joe, Jim, and Sarah slip away from me, nicknames stick like horse manure sticks to the bottom of a new Nike trainer.

Sometimes I give people more than one nickname. One Eared Max is also Maximum Effort since the groom is always hustling around the stables. Max does not have one ear ala Vincent van Gogh, but he does his barn work wearing a single earbud that looks like a hearing aid.

To me, the guy with the bushy beard is Grizzly Adams, the girl with the pigtails is Heidi, and the older guy who always jogs horses wearing blue striped overalls is Choo-Choo or Casey Jones. Sometimes I say their nicknames out loud. Other times I file them away.

I wonder if those people at the training center peg me with nicknames such as shades, stretch, or motormouth.

One Eared Max is in his mid-twenties, a quiet guy, stocky, and wears one of those black balaclavas over his face in the winter that makes him look like he's on the way to a bank heist. He rolls up the sides into a ski cap and looks like a stevedore in warm weather. Until last Friday, we never really got past conversations along the lines of, "How's it going? Good morning, or, it looks like rain."

Last week, my filly, Blank Book, was supposed to arrive at the training center around noon from a month at the turnout farm. The staff was running late, so when I arrived, Max was in the process of hooking up the trailer to fetch her. Rambling Acres turnout farm is only a half-hour drive. The owner Jeffery Marley, or, of course, Da Rastaman, is a pal.

"Mind if I tag along?" I asked.

Max shrugged, "Sure, hop in."

He dropped the truck into drive, and we rolled out of the driveway. The first few seconds were a touch strained, so I

opened with, "Where's your ear thingy?"

He smiled. The kid's smile flashed a nice set of white choppers, "The earbud? That's a sometimes thing, a compromise."

"Compromise?"

"Yeah, the boss has a rule about no headphones at work. He's worried about us not hearing him, or not hearing a horse, or the cords getting tangled in something. After a few months, I asked him if ONE small earbud, flesh-colored, low volume, no wires, tucked under my cap would be okay."

"He said yes?"

"On a trial basis. I use the earbud very judiciously. We worked it out."

I bobbed my head. "The world could use a little more of that these days."

"My boss has people skills. Horse trainers, yowzah, need to be in charge but not tyrants. A few owners can be royal pains, and trainers interact with racetrack staff, vets, grooms, and drivers."

"How did he handle the covid stuff?"

"Followed the rules and asked us to follow them." The kid chuckled, "My boss hates the masks. For some reason, maybe the shape of his head, his mask slides down near his chin when he talks. He's an intense guy and doesn't realize it, so anybody talking to him, including us grooms, spend much of the day tapping out morse code on our chins to remind him to pull his mask up."

"What about the jabs?"

"He said if we didn't follow the guidelines, he understood and would not hold it against anyone who wanted to move on."

"No problems?"

"Just one guy, William Devers."

"High Boots? The older guy who wears those leather boots that almost go up to his knees, like a world War I soldier."

"Yeah, William is sorta macho and got all huffy. I wasn't there, but I heard the boss tried to be reasonable, find him some stuff to do off-site, but William puffed out his chest and stomped off into the welcoming arms of his favorite radio talk show."

Max was proving easy to talk to, but I sensed he regretted his "radio show" wisecrack. I tried to put him at ease, "Dude, Trey ain't in no tribe. I'm a freelancer with flowers in my hair." I shifted and asked, "What brought you to the horse racing game?"

"The pandemic."

I tilted my head.

"COVID struck right after I graduated from college, so going on three years, I'm waiting to launch my career. I worked mucking stalls during college summers, so I had some experience. Working as a groom pays well, and in a covid world, it is relatively safe. So here I am, and when things clear up, working in the barns will still be a great side job because my future career is, well, unstable."

#### MGM Yonkers International Trot scheduled for Oct. 15

The MGM Yonkers International Trot is unique in the standardbred world as a race that attracts top talent worldwide. On Oct. 15, 2022, the \$1 million invitational race for trotters will return from a two-year COVID-19-related hiatus to anchor a multimillion dollar program at Yonkers Raceway, featuring the best horses in the sport.

Launched in 1959 at the now defunct Roosevelt Raceway and originally contested as a mile-and-a-half race, the International Trot was revived by Yonkers Raceway in 2013 and has played host to the greats of the sport, both human and equine. From drivers and trainers such as Stanley Dancer (1961, 1963), Jean-René Gougeon (1968, 1969, 1971) and Billy Haughton (1978, 1979) to trotting royalty in Mack Lobell (1988) and two-time champions Su Mac Lad (1961, 1963) and Delmonica Hanover (1973, 1974), the International Trot has always been a showcase for harness racing.

The International Trot moved to Yonkers Raceway in 1988 and was contested as a mile-and-a-quarter event on the historic half-mile track for a few years and was revived in 2015 after a decade of dormancy. Over the last five editions of the race, four different countries have taken home the prestigious trophy: Zacon Gio (2019) and Twister Bi (2017) both have Italian roots, Cruzado Dela Noche (2018) won under the Swedish flag, Resolve (2016) kept the trophy at home in the United States, and Papagayo E (2015) was a winner for Norway.

Now officially rechristened as the MGM Yonkers International Trot, it is one of the few stakes races which is fully funded by the host track and requires no financial commitment from owners.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome back the International Trot that was unfortunately lost to the global pandemic for the last two years," said MGM Yonkers general manager Ed Domingo.

"This is the signature annual event at Yonkers Raceway, one that attracts worldwide talent. As a staple of the historic legacy of harness racing that MGM Resorts is proud to be the steward of, we could not be more thrilled to be hosting this event again this year."

Joining the 42nd MGM Yonkers International on the Oct. 15 card will be a pair of \$500,000 races for older horses – Aria Invitational Pace and the Robert Miecuna Invitational Trot – that are also completely funded by the track's purse account.

Another highlight on the calendar is July 1, when a pair of Triple Crown races — MGM Grand Messenger Stake and MGM Yonkers Trot — will be contested.

The complete schedule of stakes races at Yonkers Raceway can be found here. Live racing continues at Yonkers Raceway on a Monday to Friday schedule with a first-race post time of 6:55 p.m.

# Keith Kash Jr Reaches 3,000 Career Wins

Keith Kash Jr. made his 3,000th trip to the winner's circle after scoring with Fulton's Fury in MGM Northfield Park's sixth race on Wednesday (March 16).

Kash sat chilly early in the mile and let his competition carve out expeditious fractions of :26.4 and :55.3. Kash began his bid in the third panel and was challenging for the lead at the 1:25.4 three-quarter pole, eventually besting his competition by 1-1/2 lengths. The 1:56.1 final clocking represents a new lifetime mark and sixth career score for the seven-year-old trotter, who returned \$4.60 to win.

The 42-year-old Kash began driving in 1997. His 3,000 wins have helped him garner over \$15 million in purse earnings.

Kash is a third-generation horseman and grew up immersed in harness racing.

"My grandfather won a horse through at promotion at Northfield in the 1950's. The horse's name was Northfield Pick. He was a money pit, but that is what started it all," Kash said. "I started jogging when I was nine and hated it at first. I found it to be monotonous and boring."

However, while attending Brunswick High School, Keith Kash Jr. began working at the local K-Mart and paddocking horses.

"I was making \$5 an hour at K-Mart and was making \$35 paddocking horses for Ray Fisher Jr. Simple math taught me that I could paddock two horses and make \$70 or I could work 14 hours at K-Mart," said Kash.

Keith drove his first race in September, 1997 at the Ashland County (Ohio) Fair. It resulted in a seventh-place finish in a \$600 conditioned race with Company Exec. However, in his second drive on the same program, he won with Improvise Hanover in 2:03.4 for a purse of \$525.

Kash's richest wins have been victories in the Battle of Lake Erie and an Ohio Sire Stake Championship.

Kash maintains a stable of horses with his wife Melinda and father, Keith Kash. The elder Kash has piloted nearly 1,500 victories and was a leading driver at Northfield Park in the 80's and 90's.

"We currently have 24 in the barn right now," said Kash. "It feels good to hit these milestones on one of your own horses. I have trained the horses I won my 1,000th, 2,000th and now 3,000th race. It just makes it mean more."

When driver Trace Tetrick crossed the line first with prohibitive favorite Annerie N in a conditioned race for mares early on the Thursday (March 17) card, he became the first local reinsman to notch 100 victories in 2022. Tetrick also was the first Miami Valley driver to eclipse the \$1 million mark in seasonal purse earnings earlier in the week.

Another pair of top Ohio sulky sitters, Brett Miller and Dan Noble, are on the brink of surpassing the coveted \$1 million mark as well. Another trio — Chris Page, Tyler Smith and Tony Hall — are likely to reach the same lofty plateau by season's end on May 7.

The dash standings after 51 days of the 87 day meet are: Trace Tetrick 102, Dan Noble 79, Brett Miller 74, Chris Page 72, Tyler Smith 68, Tony Hall 52, Kayne Kauffman 46, Jeremy Smith 42, Sam Widger 37, Josh Sutton 37 and Trevor Smith 27. The top 1- drivers on the list have all exceeded \$500,000 in purse earnings already this year.

# Dr. Karyn Malinowski to receive HHYF Service To Youth Award

"Dr. Malinowski's passion for harness racing and dedication to educating youth through her work at Rutgers is unmatched. She and HHYF have collaborated for years so her selection as this year's recipient was an obvious choice and perhaps a bit overdue," said Allison Conte, HHYF president.

In hearing of her award, Dr. Malinowski enthusiastically replied, "young people are the future of the horse industry and anytime we invest in engaging them in our industry is a positive investment of our future. Harness racing is something that youth can actually have hands on experience with, plus it is extremely thrilling and exciting."

Dr. Karyn Malinowski, an accomplished equine scientist, is the Founding Director of the Rutgers Equine Science Center at the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station (NJAES).

She has served as a faculty member at the School of Environmental and Biological Sciences since 1978 in various roles. These include: as an Extension Specialist in Equine Sciences, Animal Sciences Professor, Founding Director of the Equine Science Center, and Director of Rutgers Cooperative Extension. Her research and extension programs concentrate on improving the well-being and quality of life of the equine athlete while ensuring the vitality and viability of the equine industry, both statewide and nationally.

Malinowski is the recipient of many awards, including the American Society of Animal Science – Equine Science Society Equine Award, 2012, the United States Harness Writers Association – Unsung Hero Award, 2012, Governor's Trophy for Horse Person of the Year, 2010, and the Marjorie Van Ness Award from the American Horse Council, 2001. In 1995, she became only the second woman in fifty years to receive the New



York Farmers Club Award, which was given by the prestigious and venerable Northeastern Agricultural Society to her for her contributions to agriculture.

Dr. Malinowski is a strong advocate for youth as reflected in her extension project entitled, "Careers in the Green Industry: Youth Sow Seeds for Their Future," which involved horses and adjudicated youth, and has served as a model for similar programs around the globe. She also led the effort in developing the "Horse Industry Handbook" during her presidency of the American Youth Horse Council. The handbook is used by young people around the world as they study proper horse care and management.

Presentation of Dr. Malinowski's award will take place later this summer at the Meadowlands in East Rutherford, NJ.



# **USTA** director David Siegel on freeze-branding issue

As the lead (USTA) director sponsor of the suggested rule change proposals to reinstate mandating freeze-branding (in addition to micro-chipping), I thought it would be valuable to sum up what occurred at the annual (USTA) directors meeting, and where things will likely go from here. There have been unfair accusations from both supporters and detractors of the proposed rule, and I hope those on both sides view me as someone who is quite fair and attempts to see all sides of an issue. That said, I strongly supported the mandating of freeze-brands.

The proposed rule change to mandate the brand in addition to the microchip was voted down by the board. The discussion was fair and those who wanted to voice their opinions and recommendations were heard. The points that were raised by those opposed all had merit. I don't think they had enough merit to deny the rule change but clearly the majority did. It is a democratic board.

I think it is unfair to criticize the (entire) board for not caring about horses. Such commentary is far too general and largely not true, as the vast, vast majority of its members, do truly care — though there are some that I do think view the horses as chattel. Also, I think some of the commentary is greatly exaggerated — such as those that might say the lack of action on this rule change will kill "thousands" of horses. Such comments are made emotionally, rather than based on anything factual.

Remember, that the brand is still OPTIONAL to be used, and the folks who read this should not waste time focused on what might have been, but rather doing all they can to raise awareness of this option. I have already spoken with the USTA and it will be taking steps to improve the clarity of this option when a horse is being registered – much like a Southwest Airlines clearly markets the availability of the "early bird" upcharge. I am expecting to see this change in the very near future as it is a high priority for their development team. The current cost of \$40 will also be reviewed such that the charge will be cost-neutral to the USTA so perhaps the final charge will be lower.

Furthermore, the debate already has resulted in terrific action. Several breeders, including two of the largest (Hanover Shoe Farms and Blue Chip Farms) have committed to brand all 2022

foals. The rule change included a 2023 start, so such commitments are resulting in earlier action that the proposed rule stipulated.

I expect and urge proponents to spread the word about the option. I hope they will push breeders they may know or work with to brand their horses. I would expect them, if they own a horse, to spend the \$70 (higher fee when not branding while microchipping) and brand any unbranded horse they may own.

The USTA will be able to tell us after year's end how many of the microchipped horses were also branded to see what kind of progress has been made, and perhaps, improve this number in the years going forward. While 100% of our horses won't be freeze branded, perhaps a sizeable enough number can be reached to make a measurable impact. Also, if the issue is important enough to enough members, they have the option to vote unsupportive directors out of office or run for seats themselves.

In sum, progress for more brands has already been made. I hope that the proponents will turn their energies in a productive direction given the cards they have been dealt.

#### Not addressing drag is "penny wise and pound foolish"

I use a computer program I designed to pick winners at harness tracks. In the old days, I could spend the morning handicapping every track in the country and then place "If" bets online in all the races at all the tracks. I bet every race with the "If" condition that if the odds were what I considered an overlay at one minute to post, the bet would be automatically entered. If the odds were not to my liking, then no bet was made. I pushed hundreds of dollars every day into the game. To tell the truth, I barely broke even, but the small bonus I got from the online betting services put me ahead.

Then drag hit. One minute to post was now eight minutes from the start of the race and the odds at "one minute to post" are not even close to what they go off at. I found the computer "IF" bets were being made on horses that finally went off at prohibitive odds, and I was losing money. So, I stopped pushing hundreds of dollars every day into a game I was losing. Now, I'll just make an occasional bet on races that I'm watching live. Instead of pushing hundreds a day into the game, I might bet about \$100 a month now. Drag is a drag. Delaying the post time might squeeze a few extra dollars from the pockets of race fans at the track, but it turns off online bettors like me who used to bet thousands of dollars a month. It's penny wise and pound foolish.

# Long list of reasons post-time drag has to go

I'd like to reply to Richard Young's "Feedback" letter from March 13 (read more here). In it he suggests that there really isn't a post drag and I disagree but not so much as if there's a drag, but does it help or hurt the sport.

What I am hearing is that by creating this drag it increases handle. And one should get used to it as Mr. Young suggests. He said it's like a clock that is set ahead 5 minutes so you're not late. You eventually get used to it, but what about those that visit? They have no idea of the real time or what your "fantasy" time is. It's confusing and frustrating.

This isn't much different than post drag.

I think decisions made should be based on the pros and cons.

#### PRO:

- · Increases handle
- Helps NOT to run races at the same time as other tracks

#### CONS:

• For me if I just log on and I see 0 minutes left, I wait till the next race, because I'm not sure if they're going off in one minute or five, so why try to rush a bet.

- It's aggravating. Sorry, but when I am handicapping, I'm not sure how long "0" has been up. So do I have time to get up, grab a snack, a drink, look at a different track, whatever... I've done this and when I get back they're at the half-mile pole.
- The next two are the most important:
  - **1.** It's not transparent. This sport is scrutinized on its integrity. Read this publication. Someone is addressing racing integrity in every release. There's nothing transparent about an unknown start time. When I was in the stands in the '70s '90s, if there was a delay in start, the first thing I heard was, "they're fixing the race." I know that's absurd, but how about new customers? What are they thinking?
  - 2. Speaking of new customers, the 20-30 year-olds already have a short attention span. They hate waiting 20 min for "action." Now throw in 0 minutes to post and then make them wait 5-10 more minutes. You lost them. At least if they see the clock ticking down they know it's only one minute away from the start and that will keep them engaged. Remember, if they are playing slots, poker or dice, when they pull the handle, shuffle the cards or when dice are in hand do you think it's okay to have them wait five more minutes? Slot machines would be empty if every pull took five minutes to start spinning! Slots are jammed because you get action every 30 seconds you pull.

And in my opinion the pos can be fixed. I know the Meadowlands did a test of starting on time and said it decreased handle, but



the sample size was too small. I believe the test was only seven or eight racing nights. One, that's not enough time to condition bettors to start getting bets in at 2 minutes instead of 0. And second I believe there were some bad weather nights and that usually decreases handle. Let's try it for three months in the summer.

And for not butting heads with other tracks, when you're going to set the next race's time, look at Mohawk, Yonkers, Hawthorne, whatever tracks give you the most handle competition and set around it. It doesn't have to be perfect. I know for myself I never bet more than two tracks anyway. So, if one time you run up against another, so be it. It's more important that you can start your race when the clock strikes 0.

Please reread the important two points above. If we want NEW bettors then it's far more important in the long run to maintain integrity and keep bettor's interest than playing the "better hurry up there's 0 minutes to post" game.

#### **Examples:**



- **2.** Allowing multiple infraction of the rules such as listed on the track's website with the fines.
- **3.** A tier system being provided by the facilitator booking our bets so that if you're a big player you can get service with a much quicker "Re-Fresh Rate" enabling the customer to see true odds before the bet so that you don't think the horse you want to bet is at a true odds of 2-5 not the 6-5 you think your betting.
- **4.** No explanation provided nor questions satisfied when the favorite backs up through the field.

**5.** With administered drugs being checked more often, today's crooks have now adopted the tried-and-true method of "stiffing" their horse for a few races then suddenly showing up in the gimmicks with a 15-1 or 30-1 horse. Tell me you haven't noticed this trend and it's prevalent in both the runners and harness.

These are just a few of my complaints and with the USTA's Russell Williams comments from a couple of weeks ago you can see just how far out of touch oversite is with the officials charged with their administration.
