Industry rallies in response to Hunter Myers tragedy

The outpouring of support and grief proves, once again, that harness racing has the best people.

Under devastating circumstances that saw driver Hunter Myers lose his life from injuries sustained in an accident on Wednesday (March 19) in a race at The Meadows, the response from the harness racing community has been nothing short of uplifting in an otherwise tragic time.

The outpouring of love and emotion that can be seen throughout all social media and other forms of communication by countless individuals and organizations that have come together to honor Myers and provide support to his fiancée and young son has shown how close knit the industry is. An Ohio native who drove most often at The Meadows and at Northfield Park, the response from the industry to the Myers accident transcends any specific driving colony.

This weekend, drivers at Woodbine Mohawk Park have come together to pledge earnings from their races across Friday and Saturday towards Myers' family. Those drivers are far from the only ones who have committed to donate varying amounts of their earnings in support of Myers, though in these times of cross-border tensions, it's touching to see the amount of support from our friends to the North.

Drivers and horsepeople gathered in moments of silence over the past days in Ontario not only at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but also at Flamboro Downs. Drivers at Mohawk drove with Hunter Myers decals on their race bikes Thursday, and a touching

moment came from the track when James MacDonald gave a point to the sky approaching the wire en route to winning that night's fourth race.

More locally, the industry response has been overwhelmingly inspiring. As one example, The Meadowlands honored Hunter Myers as they resumed racing on Friday for the first time since the accident. Like Mohawk, the track offered human and horse ribbons to be worn, as well as race bike decals and arm bands. They also announced along with the SBOANJ that next Saturday there will be a race in which all revenue's generated will be matched by owner Jeff Gural and donated to Myers' family.

The outpouring of similar support including direct contributions and fundraising efforts seen just over the past couple of days from different tracks, horsemen's organizations, individuals, and charitable groups that Myers supported has truly been vast. It hasn't been limited only to people working currently within the industry, either.

In one Facebook post where condolences were being expressed, a person wrote "What about us fans, can we contribute somewhere?" which prompted similar responses by those who may have been involved in the sport at one point and by those who are simply enthusiasts, wanting to contribute. And contribute people have.

A GoFundMe campaign in honor of Myers was created on behalf of his family, and as of this print there has been over \$35,000 raised in just over one day, easily exceeding the listed campaign goal of \$10,000. There has also been links shared where those can contribute directly through Venmo to Myers' fiancée, Chloe.

As unfortunate as it is, it's moments like these that put in perspective what's important. For all the problems harness racing has, and that does include an increasing number of accidents that should be looked at in due course, in this exact moment none of the day-to-day issues matter.

The magnitude of the industry response is a direct reflection to who Myers was as a person, and perhaps that's why this loss has taken on a bit of a different feel than prior on-track tragedies. Peer and friend Anthony MacDonald summarized it well in a video published Thursday. Beyond being described as a great talent with a great set of hands, Anthony thought about it more and said "A really great kid... The way he acts, behaves, the way he approached his life was much like how anyone would want their sons or daughters [to be]. Happy, upbeat, respectful, polite, loved his family."

As has been widely noted, Myers was just 27 years old at the time of his death and was a rising star in the sport.

By the numbers, Myers was coming off three consecutive years in which he posted over \$4 million in earnings, with 2024 being his best year yet with \$4,582,394 in earnings. With 2,450 lifetime wins, he has touched the connections of every one of those horses and for that matter has done the same with connections of the 19,608 lifetime drives.

There have only been a handful of trotters to win in a time under 1:50, and Myers is part of that group, owning the trotting all-age track record at The Meadows with Jujubee in 1:49.3 taken in 2021. Earnings-wise, Myers' biggest career win came last year when he drove Allegiant to a win in the \$100,000 Moni Maker at Scioto Downs. That win had come one race after Myers drove Allegiant to a win in the Currier & Ives stake at The Meadows, and he was quoted after the Moni Maker win describing the race, "Me having to come first up, I was a little worried about it, but knowing how good she was the previous weeks, I was pretty confident on how she was going to handle herself."

Having won both of those stake races without being favored, Allegiant turned it on in the latter stages of the year and would go on to win Dan Patch honors as the division's best 3-year-old filly trotter. There's a picture that's made the rounds in recent days that shows Myers in the winner's circle at Scioto following the Moni Maker win, surrounded by Moni Maker's training and driving connections of Hall of Famer's Jimmy Takter and Wally Hennessey – what better of an illustration to show a young driver who had emerged as one of the sports better ones.


These past days have shown not only a deeper glimpse into Myers as a professional and as a person, but all the positive the harness racing community is capable of when coming together.



Sylvain Filion's request for stay denied by Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel

The Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel has denied the Canadian Hall of Fame driver's request to put a stay on his 10-year suspension and \$40,000 fine while the penalty is under appeal.

Sylvain Filion and Richard Moreau are both currently serving 10-year suspensions and were each fined \$40,000 on Oct. 31, 2024. The penalties were levied in relation to June 10, 2024 out-of-competition testing for Funtime Bayama (p, 3, 1:49.1s; \$303,108), who finished second in his June 8, 2024 North America Cup elimination at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The gelding subsequently tested positive for darbepoetin-alfa (DPO), a prohibited blood doping agent.

In a March 7 virtual hearing, Filion and legal representative Jennifer Friedman presented the case for a stay that would have allowed the 56-year-old reinsman to return to driving until his appeal hearing date. Discussion considered whether Filion, not Moreau, was Funtime Bayama's de facto trainer at the time of the test, which the AGCO (Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario) had determined to have been the case, as reported last week in HRU.

In a decision issued Wednesday (March 19), Filion's request for a stay was denied.

HRAP chair Stanley Sadinsky considered whether Filion's appeal met the "three-pronged test" for a stay. In his decision, Sadinsky ruled that Filion met the first criterion for a stay, having reasonable grounds for an appeal, but questioned whether the Canadian Hall of Fame driver would suffer "irreparable harm" if not granted a stay, the second criterion.

"There is no doubt that [Filion's] financial, reputational and emotional well-being have been adversely affected by the ruling in question," read the decision. "However, that is a natural consequence of a ruling such as the one in this case. Whether reputational harm in particular can be somewhat alleviated by the granting of a stay as Ms. Friedman submitted, is conjectural."

Filion's case did not meet the third criterion of the test for a stay, which Sadinsky noted "requires a balancing of the convenience as between [Filion's] interests on the one hand and the public interest as represented by the [AGCO registrar] on the other." He ruled that "protecting public interest and the integrity of racing" outweighed the driver's concerns.

Sadinsky's ruling noted that the Filion hearing was "a unique case unlike any other" because Funtime Bayama's catch driver was being investigated as his actual trainer. Moreau was considered "the trainer of record," while Filion was "alleged to have performed acts that are ordinarily done by a trainer while he was performing his duties as a catch driver thereby constituting [him] a trainer of the [horse] as well."

The decision ended Filion's bid to return to the racetrack as he awaits his appeal hearing.

FILION'S TESTIMONY

When Filion appeared before the Horse Racing Appeal Panel March 7, the four-time O'Brien Driver of the Year stated that his educational background kept him from finding work comparable to his vocation as a driver in Quebec and Ontario.

"I went to school 'till halfway through Grade 12, then I kind of focused on working with horses," he told Friedman. "My dad [Yves Filion] had a bunch of horses, so I followed my love for horses and started grooming horses... I always had that feeling that I could connect with horses easier than the next person."

When Friedman asked Sylvain "in what capacities he's been licensed," he replied, "As a driver, mainly."

Sylvain denied active involvement in training racehorses, stating, "I trained a few horses when I was young. I had my trainer's license ever since, but I never was active as a trainer, only when I was a young age, 18 to 21, 22." He said he preferred catch driving, to experience "the thrill of winning races.

"I just wanted to focus on driving horses. I felt that if I would train and drive, I wouldn't be as good a driver as I should have been."

The 1999 World Driving Champion said that he had not driven anywhere since his Oct 31 suspension.

Retired horseman Stephane Larocque and Sylvain's wife Dominic Pare had testified earlier in the March 7 hearing that he would "train" horses in the sense of taking them on-track for fast miles, but he was never the trainer of record for the particular horses. Sylvain himself explained that "in this day and age, if you want to compete as a driver at the top level, you've got to earn your spots, earn your relationships with your trainers, so... you do a lot of work with the trainers in the morning, because if you don't, the guy next to me will, and he'll steal my spot [as a catch driver]."

Sylvain denied ever being the trainer for Funtime Bayama.

"What I was doing was more or less exercising the horse a few times a week," he said. "All the rest was under Richard's care, Richard Moreau."

Friedman raised the topic of Funtime Bayama's background. Sylvain said, "He's a horse that was born and raised on the [Filion family's Bayama] Farm, and he was kind of a pet for my dad [Yves]. He always liked him since Day One. He likes them all, but this one was a little extra special for him. I don't know why. Maybe because he knew he was going to be a good horse. So obviously when he got to Toronto, he asked me to exercise him whenever I could, to be a center of advice for him."

Sylvain said that Yves selected Moreau to train Funtime Bayama because of the family's long-standing relationship with the 10-time O'Brien Trainer of the Year.

"We've known him a long time and I'm good friends with him and he's the best, the best you can get," Sylvain said.

Sylvain stated that his duties did not encroach on Moreau's role as trainer.

"I would jog [Funtime Bayama] once or twice [weekly]... train him two days out, one single," Sylvain said. "Every time he raced, right after, I would call my dad, tell him how he felt, and we would discuss if he needed vet work, and get some vet work done."

Friedman asked Sylvain whether he had ever administered DPO to the gelding.

"No," he replied.

"Did you tell someone to?" she asked.

"Absolutely not," Sylvain replied. "It could be harmful for the horse. I would never, never, never go there."

A social media post by Justin Filion, Sylvain's younger brother, was next displayed on-screen. It read, "Pourquoi il m'arrive rien [Why is nothing happening to me]... I'm ready to cash out."

Justin was indefinitely suspended on Aug. 16, 2024 for refusing to make a statement to AGCO judges during last year's Funtime Bayama investigation. Friedman asked Sylvain if he recognized the Facebook post.

"Yes, I've seen this before," Sylvain replied. "It's my brother. My brother's under heavy intoxication. He's on heavy drugs and he's kind of writing stuff. He thought he was going to die or something."

Friedman asked him about transcribed notes from an AGCO investigator's interview with Moreau.

"It seems to, among other things, refer to Justin [Filion] being in touch with a Quebec veterinarian about EPO," she said. Were you aware of this?"

"No," Sylvain replied. "I don't know this vet."

The suspended driver denied having much contact with his brother during the AGCO investigation.

"We rarely communicate," said Sylvain, adding that he encouraged Justin to make a statement to the AGCO investigators. "You know, he's in and out of rehabs. I saw him once in Toronto. He came to see the horse race. That's it."

Friedman referred to an exhibit showing a letter of complaint by a former employee of Moreau.

"What does the complaint indicate about Richard, Justin Turcotte, and EPO?" she asked.

"Well, the employee seems to have seen Richard, witnessed Richard and Malik Smith injecting horses with DPO and cobalt... I would never want my name to be beside that," Sylvain said. "I got so much respect for the game; I would never go close to that."

Friedman asked about Sylvain's interview with AGCO inspectors last Aug. 7, the afternoon before his evening Canadian Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

Sylvain said he was unaware that he had become a subject of the Funtime Bayama investigation at the time, and he had spoken without counsel.

"It seemed like they were in contact a lot with [Moreau], and I only seen them once," Sylvain said. "They never offered me help or whatever... I didn't feel that I was treated fairly."

Sylvain said he was also contacted by a private investigator hired by Moreau on Oct. 31.

Friedman asked Sylvain if he had a call with judges to discuss his case or a chance to defend himself after his fine and suspension were imposed.

"None whatsoever," he replied.

Sylvain's counsel then asked, "I understand that beginning on Nov. 11 and repeatedly thereafter, you sought a stay from the deputy registrar?"

"Yep," he answered.

"Why were you making those requests?" asked Friedman.

"Because I felt that it was unfair to me that I couldn't work, couldn't make a living," Sylvain said. "I've been doing this for the past 38 years and they decided I couldn't do it no more, so I wanted the decision to be held until I had the chance to defend myself."

Asked about two racing news articles that suggested that Sylvain planned to retire for good, the driver told Friedman that the reporting was inaccurate.

"I had a couple of accidents this past year when I was driving, and I was thinking, maybe take the winter off, so I'd be a little fresher when I come back in the spring," he said, denying any intention to retire. "There's a few drivers I know that did that for a while: Trevor Ritchie, Steve Condren. They would take the winter off and come back in the spring and have a great summer."

Letters defending Sylvain were displayed, showing support from horsemen Dr. Ian Moore, Mario Baillargeon, Tony O'Sullivan, Jody Jamieson, Patrick Lachance, Herb Holland, and Bill O'Donnell.

"Why do you think a stay should be given to you?" asked Friedman.

"So, I can get a chance to restore my reputation and go back to work, to earn a living, and give a little faith to my family, and keep my clean record," Sylvain responded.

Brendan van Niejenhuis, counsel for the registrar, next questioned Sylvain about whether the driver was really unaware that AGCO investigators would want to speak with him about Funtime Bayama last August.

"Well, it was a bit of a surprise," said Sylvain, adding that he consented to an interview on the afternoon of Aug. 7 because he didn't think he could reschedule it. "I wanted to comply with the AGCO. I had nothing to hide. I wanted to get it over with."

Van Niejenhuis countered Sylvain's claim that a stay was needed to clear his reputation, noting universally positive remarks in the letters of support shown on-screen during the hearing, including one from Ted Smith, a past president of Standardbred Canada.

He asked Sylvain about a "big decision" the driver had alluded to in an interview. "That big decision is whether you will drive again in the future or whether you will actually hang them up and retire, right?"

Sylvain disagreed.

"No, I'll drive in Ottawa and Three Rivers," he responded, clarifying that retirement "wasn't for the near future. I was thinking more four, five, six years down the road."

Two AGCO investigators in the case, Mike Weber and Brad Capes, did not attend the virtual hearing.

"There was a request to apply for an interim stay, pending their availability, and that was declined," said Friedman.

Appeal hearing dates for Sylvain and Moreau were yet to be announced as of Thursday (March 20).

Australia's The Locomotive is Elitlopp bound

The reigning Inter Dominion winner looks to become first Aussie to make the final in Solvalla.

It is amazing what a chat over a few beers in a Brisbane pub at 2 a.m. can do.

When Swedish megastar Bjorn Goop made the long trip across to be part of last month's hugely successful Ultimate Driver Challenge at Brisbane's Albion Park, Glenn Holland and Brad Hewitt seized the opportunity to ask him about the iconic Elitlopp.

Holland owns Australia's reigning Inter Dominion winner The Locomotive, while Hewitt trains and drives him.

There had been talk of an Elitlopp invite coming The Locomotive's way.

"Bjorn really sold us on what an incredible experience it would be," Holland said. "Brad and I had so many questions, and Bjorn was great. It sort of started to grow from there.

"Bjorn went home and obviously put a word in for us. We've stayed in contact since. Put it this way, I'm sure they [Solvalla] knew we were serious about going once Bjorn had spoken to them."

Speculation turned to fact this weekend when Solvalla formally confirmed The Locomotive would contest the Elitlopp on May 25.

Holland and Hewitt are even sacrificing an Inter Dominion title defense in Brisbane in July to head to Sweden.

"When it became clear they wanted us, I said to Brad, 'We have to do this, it's a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity," Holland said. "Everyone who's been before says it's the best thing they've done."

While Goop has played a key role, Holland praised Harness Racing Australia CEO Andrew Kelly for "making everything happen."

"We've arranged everything through Andrew given his great relationship with Anders Malmrot and Solvalla," Holland said. "Given the enormity of it all, it's been quite smooth pulling it all together.

"Much of last week was spent working on logistics, including the best possible way to get the horse over there."

Just Believe, one of just three Aussie-trained trotters to contest the Elitlopp so far, had to endure over 60 hours of travel by air and road to get from Melbourne to Stockholm in 2023.

"I heard about that, but thankfully the options are a lot better now," Holland said. "We can get a flight from Melbourne to Doha and connect to Amsterdam. Instead of a 17-hour road trip from Amsterdam to Stockholm like Just Believe, we can go three hours to Paris and fly from there to Stockholm.

"It's crucial because Just Believe was a gelding, but our guy is a stallion."

It still makes for a busy time with the New South Wales-based The Locomotive going across to New Zealand for a feature race before embarking on the Swedish trip.

The Locomotive is booked on a flight from Sydney to Auckland on March 29 to tackle the \$600,000 TAB Trot at Cambridge in New Zealand's North Island on April 4.

"He's then on a flight back to Sydney two days later," Holland said. "From there he gets a couple of days rest, then goes by road to Melbourne to catch that plane out of Melbourne on April 10 [to Doha]."

Holland isn't daunted by the fact the three previous Aussie racers in the Elitlopp heats — Just Believe, Maori Time (2018) and Sundons Gift (2009) — didn't qualify for the final.

In fact, when you include the Kiwis, only the great mare Pride Of Petite has made an Elitlopp final. She finished fourth in a heat in 1997 and sixth in the final.

"Our trotters have just gotten so much better over the past 10 years or so," Holland said. "Nothing went right for Just Believe in the heat and he should've made the final. He proved it with two big runs at his next two starts in Sweden.

"The Swedes have done their own analysis on him and they said on the times he ran winning his Great Southern Star heat, he would be in the mix."

The plan is for Hewitt to go across and supervise The Locomotive's key training for the Elitlopp and drive him in the heat, and hopefully final.

Hewitt, who has enjoyed a breakthrough 12 months in his career, is thrilled with the opportunity.

"It's an amazing opportunity," he said. "We're confident he's the right sort of horse with the class and speed for a race like the Elitlopp.

"As long as he travels well, settles in and has some luck with barrier draws, he can make and be very competitive in the final.

"Glenn and I are hugely thankful for the faith and support Solvalla have shown in us and The Locomotive and we hope to become the first Australian-trained horse to make an Elitlopp final.

"Like everyone here, we watched with great interest when Just Believe went over a couple of years ago and was so competitive in a couple of big races. We're sure our guy won't just be making up the numbers."

Like Just Believe, The Locomotive will stay in Sweden after the Elitlopp for some other feature races.



For Dr. John Mossbarger, family is the key to success at Midland Acres

If one were using one word to describe Midland Acres and its influence in Ohio standardbred breeding and racing, that word would be family.

Dr. John Mossbarger, the present head of one of the leading nurseries in the state of Ohio said, "Any and all success that Midland Acres has achieved in standardbred breeding is due entirely to our team, our family, here. It is led by my brother Jay, myself, Jay's son Jake, and Dr. Robert Schwartz. It's been a long, but very satisfying road that we have traveled since my dad, Dr. Don Mossbarger, first established the farm and transitioned his practice from one specializing in large animals, primarily cattle, to one where all we do is breed and raise trotters and pacers."

You are a man wearing several different hats in harness racing. Can you tell us about some of them?

"My dad used to say that I spent most of my time attending meetings. To some extent that is true. However, I believe my primary duty, and where I spend most of my time, is as the equine veterinarian here at Midland Acres. I was raised on the farm and rode with my dad from the time I was just a kid. There was never any doubt in my mind that I was going to become an equine veterinarian. Both before attending vet school at Ohio State and since, I've done most of my work here on the farm.

"However, as the Ohio program grew, it became quite evident that in order for it to become successful, it was imperative that we and other breeders be available to help guide its progress both within and outside of the industry.

"Thus, I began wearing several hats. I became a director of the USTA and rose to the chairman of the registration committee. I'm the past president of the OHHA [Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association] and a trustee of the Ohio farm bureau.

"I'm also quite active politically. It's of great importance that the politicians know our story. We think we've done a good job of it, but it's never quite enough. I believe our biggest selling point is the value of agriculture to the state, its economy and its quality of life."

At the recent USTA meetings a proposal was made to raise the limit of the mares bred to a stallion each season to 160. Do you have any thoughts on it?

"Actually, that proposed rule change was first made last year. It was in effect tabled pending the results of a genetic diversity study. Those results are not yet available, so it was once again tabled.

"At this point, I would probably say that we are doing alright with the limit as it is. The factors involved in limiting stud books are not only related to genetic diversity, but also to commercial diversity. It's likely that raising the limit would only affect a handful of stallions, probably at the most. Nevertheless, we would be creeping into uncharted territory.

"How many mares to a stallion in a given year is too many? I really do not know. We might be aiding those stallions, but are we hurting others which might be adversely affected by not getting some of those surplus mares?"

Midland Acres is an all-purpose standardbred farm, standing stallions of your own and other breeders' mares, but you also breed and raise yearlings for Ohio primarily and sometimes occasionally dip into the North American marketplace. What can you tell us about that?

"We like to believe that we do it all and hopefully do it all reasonably well. For all intents and purposes, we began as a standardbred farm in the 1960s. Through the years we have stood many stallions, some with varying degrees of success. Among them were Flower Child, the first trotter to win in 2:00 in Europe, Speed In Action, a horse that dominated the trotting sires stakes here in Ohio, and Nobleland Sam who did the same with pacers. 'Sam' came along when the industry here in Ohio was hurting.

"Many other states had adopted successful sires stakes programs connecting gaming and racing. We hadn't yet done that. I look upon that as both being a negative and a positive. It was a negative in that people had stopped or certainly lessened their breeding in Ohio. We realized that we had to do something

and do it reasonably rapidly. The result was that significant unity was achieved between all segments of the industry here in Ohio. We worked together with the legislature, to the point where I believe our program, both at the tracks and the fairs is unrivaled in North America.

"A positive was that we were able to look at all the other programs and add the good parts and delete those that we didn't like. The result is that, in my far from unbiased opinion, we have the best program for both pari-mutuel and fair racing in North America."

You mentioned that you occasionally dip your toe out of Ohio into the North American market.

"A fortuitous example of that was when my nephew Jake bought the mare Margie Seelster, then in foal to Explosive Matter for us. The foal she was carrying was named Pinkman and he went on to win the 2015 Hambletonian. We aren't the official breeder of record, but he was foaled and raised here on the farm and sold by us as a yearling. It is something of which we take great pride."

How is Midland Acres presently constituted?

"When dad first bought the farm, it was an old dairy farm and covered 75 acres. Today we have 500 acres. We stand six stallions T C I, Summa Cum Laude, Monte Miki, Ready For Moni, Long

Tom, and Bit Of A Legend N. We own about 100 broodmares. From those mares we are able to raise somewhere around 70 commercially marketable yearlings each year. Of those 70, I would guess that 10 or so enable us to remain a profitable enterprise. Nobody ever said that breeding horses is an easy pursuit. If they said that, they were lying."

It is no easy feat to have existed and often thrived when so many other Ohio breeding farms no longer exist. Names like Fair Chance, Hill Farms, Sahbra Farms, Pickwick, Fairmeade Greenacres and others come to mind. To what do you attribute this longevity?

The song remains the same, sometimes

When it comes to drivers' comeback songs at The Meadowlands, sorry Led Zeppelin, but the song remains the same is not always applicable.

Take The Big M's leading driver for the meet, Brett Beckwith, who began the year with one song — Can't Stop by Red Hot Chili Peppers — but flipped to another on Jan. 31.

"Honestly, I wanted to switch it up and I have a really good friend of mine, and I was asking him what song I should switch to, and he goes 'You got to use **Who Let The Dogs Out** because you got that dog in you.'

"I've had a lot of mixed reviews so far. Most don't seem to like it, but I laugh when it plays, so it is what it is."

This wasn't the only song change for Beckwith, whose first Big M song choice back in 2022, **Pursuit of Happiness by Kid Cudi**, was replaced in the end of 2023 by Can't Stop.

Although Beckwith said he's superstitious, and therefore may have waited a bit on changing up the song, he's happy so far with results as he won three that first night and five for the weekend.

"I'm very superstitious," Beckwith said. "Thankfully, I'm not as much as I used to be, but I was shooting a little bad at the time and I wasn't really winning much and I was like, you know what, it's time to switch it up."

One driver that has not changed his song is Scott Zeron, who explained why to **HRU back in 2022**.

"Scotty's got by far the best song because everyone calls him the money man," Beckwith said of Zeron using **Pink Floyd's Money.** "That song is like a perfect match to a person."

Patrick Ryder, who just made his first song choice last weekend, agrees with Beckwith about Zeron's song.



"I love the beginning of that song; it's so cool in the beginning," Ryder said. "What's funny, when I first started driving... I heard that song at The Meadowlands, and before I ever heard that that was Scott's song, that was the one that I thought was the coolest one. The sound of the coins clicking and stuff, I thought, that's so cool."

Ryder, who had been taking his time making his song decision, had also been getting suggestions from others for songs including the word rider. In addition to songs like **Riders On The Storm** and **Midnight Rider**, driver John Calabrese suggested **Low Rider**.

"That song that John Calabrese said to me, it's good for having the last name Ryder, but I don't really like the song. I was like, I can't pick a song I don't like," Ryder said. "I don't want to just take something super generic and lame, either."

Ryder favors electronic dance music.

"The problem is, all the music that I listen to, for the most part, doesn't have a ton of words in it," Ryder said. "I listen to house music and dubstep and dance type music where there are not a ton of words."

After listening to a bunch of songs, Ryder said he finally settled on **Turn On The Lights Again** by Fred again, which he hopes will be with him for a while.

Unlike his brother, Andy, who last year changed to his third song — Thickfreakness by The Black Keys — Todd McCarthy is still going strong with Cardi B's I Like It.

"I heard the song not long after I got here [to the U.S. from Australia] and liked it," Todd said. "I thought it had a cool beat and it just stuck."

Although the comeback music has become synonymous with The Meadowlands, it's not where it started.

"I believe I had originally heard the music with drivers at Hoosier Park several years ago and thought we should be doing that here as well," said Meadowlands chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "Then I got an email from Jeffrey [Gural] saying the same thing I had just thought about, so we instituted it here at The Big M as well.

"It's actually pretty cool when the winning horse and driver are headed to the winner's circle, and I hear customers all the time start singing the song as they come back. I think the most popular ones right now are John Ahle's, **Johnny B. Goode**, and Brett Beckwith's, Who Let The Dogs Out. I just smile now as it's caught on with the on-track customers."

In a way, getting a personalized comeback song is a bit of a reward for winning often enough at the track and drivers who don't yet win on a regular basis no longer come back in silence. The Meadowlands now has instrumental music that is played for anyone not having their own song.

"My dad [Chris Ryder] calls it elevator music," Patrick said.

The instrumental music is also played on Hambletonian Day and Meadowlands Pace Night when the track is on network TV.

"As far as the generic music goes, we always want some kind of music or chatter in the background as I can't stand dead silence while we are on air," Settlemoir said.

And for any interested, we now have the answer to Who Let The Dogs Out?

"My good friend, Carl, is the one who told me to make it that song," Beckwith said. "He's my only friend that's outside the business. Knock on wood, it's been pretty good the last few weeks."

For The Big M meet which started on Jan. 1, Beckwith currently has 43 wins through Friday (March 21), putting him five up on David Miller (38) in second, with Jason Bartlett (37) in third.

Although Beckwith is sitting at the top of The Big M standings right now, he said he doesn't know how long it will last, especially since he got off to a rocky start.

"If you asked me at the start of this year [if I'd be on top], I would have laughed," he said. "I mean, I was a 4 per cent driver at the start of the year. I was getting my head kicked in."

As for whether the song change has made a difference he said, "Every now and then you've got to let the dog out."







Peter Core hopes Wayne Stone is a 'Great One' just like his namesake

Wayne Stone doesn't need a hulking physique to command the attention of his peers. Instead, his unassuming stature provides the perfect cover for his dogged spirit.

Following a brilliant maiden campaign in which he hit the board in all nine starts (3-4-2; \$19,678 banked), the gritty grey established himself as the top rookie performer to compete at The Raceway at Western Fair in 2024.

After making eight of his starts at the London, ON, oval last season, Wayne Stone's outstanding efforts were formally recognized during the track's annual awards night on Feb. 22.

In light of the well-deserved distinction, lifelong horseman and trainer of Wayne Stone, Peter Core, couldn't help but be proud of his driven youngster with a knack for racing.

"When we broke him, his timing was so good right from the start," Core said. "We'd jog him, and he'd be picking them up and putting them down in rhythm, right from Day One.

"He's probably the best gaited horse I've ever broke."

Core also co-owns and bred Wayne Stone with his now 90-year-old father Raymond Core, who Peter said remains an active part of the barn each morning, helping to jog horses and clean stalls.

That natural feel for the game was evident early on, noted Peter, who had a front row seat of Wayne Stone's first qualifier and start from inside the sulky.

"When we trained him down, even when we went to qualify him, we never, ever went top speed with him," Peter said. "He always had determination at the end of the mile, so we never did. We kept him with the other ones.

"Then, he showed me a little something his very first start. I was fourth back, a long way, and he paced real well back half, and I let him loose a little bit at the end. I saw that he had something, and we went on from there."

The Sarnia, ON-based horseman enjoys driving his young horses at first to better gauge how they feel behind the gate and make any necessary equipment adjustments.

Peter would go on to pilot his peppy pacer four more times, including in two legs of the Ontario-sired Autumn Series, before handing the reins to Natasha Day in late November.

"Natasha's very patient, and handles the horse really well – nice, light hands," Peter said of Day, who steered Wayne Stone to a 1-2-0 record in their three starts together. "She's driven a few for me, and I like the way she drives my young horses."

As Peter recalled, October's Autumn Series was a little uneven for Wayne Stone, especially during the lead up.

"I didn't race him in the first leg of that series because he wasn't a great eater after he raced," Peter said. "It was difficult to keep the kind of weight I like to have on him. I missed the first leg of it, but with pretty good assurance that he would race well enough to make the final."

Peter's intuition was correct, as Wayne Stone made the Autumn final after finishing third in the second leg on Oct. 22.

While the pair were not victorious in the \$20,000 final, another third-place finish validated Peter's belief in his homebred racer.

"He showed me a lot of ability," Peter said. "He's a game little horse. He's very, very determined."

Ability has by no means been in short supply at the Peter Core stable over the years.

Among the top performers to come out of the respected horseman's training program are B Cor Timgo and Image Control.

Peter remembers the former as the "first good horse" he had. Looking back, good was a bit of an understatement.

B Cor Timgo won the Ontario Sires Stakes Gold final for 2-year-old trotters in 1995 and followed that up with another OSS Gold final tally in the 3-year-old class the year after.

The son of A Go Go Lauxmont—B Cor Tamara went on to record a 39-26-24 line across 146 lifetime starts for \$666,267 in total prizes.

With Image Control, Peter found himself not only a reliable racer, but a horse that would later blossom into a prolific mare.

"I raced her three times at 2," he said. "As a 3-year-old, every race she competed in was a stakes race. She missed the board once and made \$150,000 before I sold her to Harry Rutherford for a broodmare. He raced her five more times and then retired her.

"She was the dam of Pure Ivory, who was the dam of Forbidden Trade. Pure Ivory made \$1.4 million and, of course, Forbidden Trade won the Hambletonian [in 2019]."

In Wayne Stone, Peter sees the similar relentless motor that defined Image Control during her days on the track.

"She'd get parked the whole mile, and it wouldn't make any difference," Peter said. "She'd still grind right to the end and hit the board. She was incredible. Wayne's maybe on those lines"

Peter can't say for sure that tenaciousness alone will be enough to propel Wayne Stone to a Gold level horse. What he does know, however, is that Wayne will always give his all.

"I know he's determined enough," he said. "Whether he's talented enough to go those big miles against the big boys, we'll see."

Peter reported that Wayne Stone had grown about two inches since their last training session of 2024. He mentioned that part of the plan going into year three is to add and maintain more muscle.

Phase two in the quest to build on Wayne Stone's impressive rookie campaign involves a change in strategy.

"The next step in his progression is to try to get him a little closer to the lead early," Peter said. "He's just chasing horses down all the time, but from well back. As a 3-year-old, I think

he's going to have to be a little closer to the lead. That's one thing we're going to have to do. I'm hoping that he's a Grassroots competitor, but we'll see how it goes.

"He'll tell us what level he is as we go."

For all the questions Peter faces concerning Wayne Stone's size and ceiling, they pale in comparison to the volume of questions he gets about the origin of his award-winning gelding's name.

Naturally, a human sounding name comes with the expectation that the horse is named after a particular person. In this instance, London, ON-based horseman Wayne Stone appears the logical fit.

But as Peter will tell you, and the dozens of other people who have asked, it is merely the coincidence of all coincidences.

"I've been asked about that numerous times by people that work for Wayne Stone," Peter said with a laugh. "But no, we just had two babies – we called one Walter, and we said, 'What should we call the other one?' They said, 'Call him Wayne, like Walter and Wayne Gretzky.' He got the barn name Wayne, and his dam was Molly Moonstone, so we just called him Wayne Stone."

Like "the Great One," the equine Wayne Stone knows what it takes to chase down his goals.

Italian trainer/driver Alessandro Gocciadoro is probably the most well-known competitor in European harness racing media. His rampaging on the tracks has developed to be significant for the yellow-dressed driver and Gocciadoro's horses are also well known for their abilities in tolerating tough trips in races.

In Sunday's (March 16) \$155,000 Gran Premio Duomo in Florence, his winning weapon was **Dany Capar** (Exploit Caf), who took a safe wire-to-wire win in 1:53.3. Dany Capar and runner-up Callisto were both invited to Naples and the Gran Premio della Lotteria in May. A wild card was also given to Gocciadoro's Chance Ek.

From the \$200,000 Grand Criterium de Vitesse in Cagnes-sur-Mer, the top trio Emeraude de Bais, Etonnant and Ampia Mede Sm have been invited to Naples and among other horses that are expected to go to Italy, Nicolas Bazire trained Hooker Berry can be named.

On April 6, three additional wild cards, or invitations can be delivered. The Gran Premio Costa Azzurra will take place that date and it feels like interest in the Lotteria is high this year.

MATS SUNDIN'S TROTTER READY FOR ELITLOPPET

Last year's runner-up in Elitloppet, Borups Victory, received an invitation to Elitloppet as he was named the Horse of the Year in Sweden on Saturday (March 15) night.

Daniel Wäjersten had a nice evening at the award night as he claimed the title of Trainer of the Year and Best 3-Year-Old of the Year (Bullet The Bluesky).

And, as an extra bonus, Solvalla invited Borups Victory to the great event in late May. Borups Victory finished second to Horsy Dream in Elitloppet 2024 and later claimed the Hugo Åbergs Memorial at Jägersro racetrack.

Former NHL-star Mats Sundin (Toronto Maple Leafs) co-owns Borups Victory and the Wäjersten trained horse is the third invited trotter to Elitloppet 2025.

French champion Go On Boy and Canadian record holder Logan Park were invited earlier this spring.

REDÉN'S AMERICAN DUO BOTH GREAT IN 2025 DEBUTS

Daniel Redén's Double Deceiver (Cantab Hall—Sarcy) went undefeated in his 4-year-old season in Sweden 2023 and claimed two races in five attempts in 2024. On Wednesday (March 19) night, the 6-year-old gelding made his first start in six months and from the lead Double Deceiver had everything under control for driver Örjan Kihlström. Double Deceiver held stablemate Missle Hill behind him in the finish and Double Deceiver came home in a mile rate of 1:55.4 over 1.3 miles.

It was also a first start on European soil for American-bred trotter, now trained by Redén, Keep Asking (Chapter Seven—Sensibility), who was purchased by Brixton Medical AB (Stall Zet) in Harrisburg in November 2024. The 4-year-old colt showed no problems in testing a new, longer distance than what he was used to in America. Kihlström sent Keep Asking to the front and was then allowed to keep the pace down during the race.

American-bred 4-year-olds is something of a specialty for Redén and it all began with Shaq Is Back and Delicious.

The latter became one of the best mares ever to race in Europe and in three consecutive races in the fall of 2015, Delicious garnered three world records, over three different distances and was later named Horse of the Year for her achievements.

Love Matters, Missle Hill, Sister Sledge, and Double Deceiver all won the \$100,000 Fyraåringseliten at Solvalla and last year, Crown was one of the most successful 4-year-olds in Sweden.

Keep Asking will most certainly visit the winner's podium several times more this season.





Vicki Mattison's harness racing dreams came true thanks to Panocchio

Vicki Mattison was not born into the business, but she happily married into it.

Vicki's husband Jim Mattison's family was involved. At the age of 12, Jim jogged his first horse for his uncle Clyde and it was over, he was hooked.

Racing mostly at the New England tracks Jim took a hiatus when he got drafted in 1969. When he was released two years later, he moved to Hinsdale, NH, and it didn't take long before he became the leading driver in 1975. Three years later in 1978 Mattison moved his stable to Saratoga. It was a family affair as brothers Gerry and Brian worked for Jim and they are still involved in harness racing today.

A novice at that time, Vicki said, "My family was not involved with horses and the sport. I didn't know the first thing about a horse, especially a standardbred.

"I was born in Vermont but moved to Bennington in 1963. I met my future husband Jim there and we married in 1985."

After Vicki and Jim married, along with Vicki's two young daughters, they bought a ranch house in Wilton and built a barn and paddocks.

"I learned how to harness and care for a horse at the fairs with a trotter we owned, Gussy's Filly, named after our dog," Vicki said. "She raced mainly at the Rutland fair in Vermont.

"One of my most melancholy times in the business was when 'Gussy' got claimed. It was my first heartache in the business and having your horse claimed is a pain you can't describe. I was devastated and cried like a baby. When I first started working in the barn Jim told me 'Don't fall in love with the horses.' Of course, I didn't listen.

"For those who work with horses know that not falling in love with their horse is impossible for the horse becomes their child. Although that was my first real heartache in the sport, my love for horses grew and grew."

Vicki said she refused to jog, although Jim persistently tried to get her to do so.



"I wasn't comfortable sitting behind a horse but loved being in the barn and working with the majestic animal," she said. "In the beginning I spent five days a week, from 9 to 5, having weekends and holidays off, but that quickly changed.

"I fell in love with the amazing animal and my entire family became involved in the sport. In 1995 we sold the farm and moved our stable to Pompano Park in Florida to race.

"When my daughters grew up, neither of them wanted to pursue a career in the sport so there was no reason to keep the farm. Jim and I moved to Pompano Beach and lived there racing our horses until that melancholy day when the doors were closed in 2022 after nearly 60 years of racing."

The demise of Pompano Park, one of the greatest harness racetracks — known as the "Winter Capital of Harness Racing" — was sorrowful for thousands of horsemen and racing fans. At one time the top trainers and drivers such as Bill Haughton and Stanley Dancer trained there, and many celebrities were often spotted on the sixth floor such as Mickey Mantle and Whitey Ford.

When the track closed its doors, the horsemen had to pack up and relocate their families and leave what had been their home for many years. The Mattisons were no different, for they not only had to look for a new home for their family, but also a new place to race.

"This business is very demanding, and the horse is not a machine you can turn on and off with a button, but a living creature who has feelings and emotions, too," Vicki said. "They require constant attention, feeding, grooming, exercising every day, so the barn becomes your home away from home.

"We have had very nice horses throughout the years, but there is one that will forever hold a huge place in our hearts. His name is Panocchio."

If you have raced at or visited Pompano Park, you have most likely heard of Panocchio, one of the track's all-time favorite horses. The Mattisons purchased the superstar when he was 2 years old at the Harrisburg sale.

"My husband loved his pedigree and I thought Panocchio was cute and friendly," Vicki said. "Panocchio has brought us our greatest times and was that 'once-in-a-lifetime' horse that horsemen dream of owning. From all the awards that Panocchio received in Saratoga and holding the track record of 1:48.3 at Pompano Park in 2015, which will hold forever, Panocchio will be missed by not only us, but by many fans.

"When Panocchio started to get sore at the end of his racing career and was getting up in age, my husband decided to retire both himself and the horse."

But the night that Panocchio was retired he disappointed no one and went out with a bang. Closing night at Pompano drew a large crowd with a near-record handle of \$1,430,824, the third largest in the track's history.

The most emotional victory of the evening saw track record holder Panocchio cross the finish line first, his 53rd lifetime win at Pompano Park and his 77th overall. Sitting behind the superstar was another superstar, driver Wally Hennessey. Giving the crowd something to remember, Panocchio won the race as Hennessey stood in the sulky and cheered as he guided the veteran into the winner's circle for a final time.

"Panocchio, what a joy," Vicki said, adding with a laugh. "A lot of racing fans called him Pinocchio and the name would have been appropriate for many of his races he won were by a nose. He was bred by Peter Pan Stables so thus he was named.

"He is certainly, my favorite horse and I always said when it was time to retire him, we would retire with him. I'm happy to say today he is living a wonderful life at Michelle Clark's farm in Athens, PA and is an awesome saddle horse for his best friend Grace. Michelle gave him to Grace for the 4-H shows and the two learned a lot from one another. Grace has ridden him both English and Western pleasure at 4-H shows, and they have won many ribbons at both types of events."

The Mattisons stop and see Panocchio every year when they drive back to New York.

"He remembers us and knows that we have his favorite treats for him," Vicki said. "We feel very blessed to have people in his life to love him like we do.

"There is and will never be another Panocchio for us. He has definitely brought us the most memorable times: not only holding the track record at Pompano, but in 2014 at Saratoga he was Horse of the Year, Pacer of the Year, and Aged Pacer of the Year, and in 2015 he was both Pacer of the Year and Aged Pacer of the Year at Saratoga.

"He was a dream come true and we were so blessed to have had him all those years. He is still our baby and always will be, but we are so happy he is enjoying the retirement he deserves.

"Another time I will always cherish is when I received the award for Caretaker of the Year in 2009, thanks to Panocchio.

Today, Vicki said she and Jim are retired and living in Pompano Park in the winter, with summers in Saratoga.

"We have been blessed, and being involved in the harness racing business has definitely fulfilled it," Vicki said. "I miss the horses and all the friends we have made. The harness racing family is amazing."





Father Patrick missed his shot at Hambletonian glory by making a miscue off the gate

The Hambletonian Stakes presents a field of the best sophomore trotters in the division. That is one of the reasons it takes unpredictable circumstances for the finest among a field of the foremost to suffer a loss. Even the best of the greats satisfy their connections and backers.

But great horses carry great expectations. They become huge favorites and their odds to win reflect positive speculations. Then there are times when great expectations offer great disappointments. Like when the graceful gait of a spectacular blue-blooded standardbred becomes a gallop.

The gallop is no stranger to the racing trotter. And Father Patrick — one of the all-time best colt trotters — galloped away from Hambletonian history in 2014.

The year before, when he was a freshman, the smooth-sailing Father Patrick (driven by Yannick Gingras and trained by Jimmy Takter) won a stakes race at Mohawk from post 10. The post was no problem. Father Patrick floated faster than any in his division at 2 and no handicapper in the world considered the starting post would matter. And it did not.

The sophomore Father Patrick was assigned post 10 in the 2014 Hambletonian at The Meadowlands. The post still meant nothing to bettors; they made him 2-5 and were poised to collect their money when the best of the three Jimmy Takter-trained colts in the \$1-million race lined up with his foes behind the starting gate before more than 20,000 fans and industry members and a CBS Sports Network television audience.

In the scant moments it took for the wings of the starting gate to close, the 10-horse, Father Patrick, resorted to galloping; surrendering his unconstrained gait in a shocking display of movement that no one ever witnessed him make in a betting race. The event that was supposed to be his with which to make history, was history for him the moment he broke stride.

This is the official past-performance line for Father Patrick's 2014 Hambletonian Stakes final:

10x 11/57¾ 11/63½ 11/63½ 11/65 11/70

Trainer Takter never saw exactly what the crowd saw when the starting gate closed because he was driving another colt he trained, Trixton.

"I was waiting for 'Patrick' to come," Takter said about the stretch drive after the race. "I had no clue. I didn't see him so I knew something must have happened to him."

John Campbell was no stranger to the race as a winning and losing driver over the years. He took charge of the race early with the third Takter-trained colt in the field, Nuncio. Trixton and Takter chased Nuncio. Trixton and Takter won. Nuncio and Campbell finished second. The Takter-trained exacta pair was so fast that the rest of the field struggled to finish far behind them.

Takter told press-box reporters later he was elated to come in first and second in the classic race and happy to be the winning driver, but that he was convinced it would have been different if Father Patrick stayed on gait and trotted his usual brilliant mile.

"If Father Patrick stayed flat, he would've wound up behind me [and Trixton] and come up in that position and he would've blown by both of us in the stretch," Takter said.

Trixton and Nuncio had a good deal of supporters in the win pool; both went off at variables of 4-1. The non-Father-Patrick-involved exacta paid only \$39.60.

For the best part of that season Hambletonian-champ Trixton won races powerfully but he could not beat his stablemate Father Patrick. Trixton was clearly the second-best in the division. And as he trotted into history as the 89th Hambletonian winner almost everyone knew the second-best trotter was the real horse that caught a break.

Fans and reporters long for the emotional punch felt when seeing a special horse roll down the stretch grabbing the ground and gliding to victory. We witness a certain magnificence so rare. We were robbed of that glorious moment when Father Patrick refused to get back on gait in the 2014 final.

It was certainly not the first time and won't be the last time that a revered horse lost a big event. But to many of us following the impressive steps that Father Patrick took to victory at 2 and at 3, we were left with a performance to grieve over; because Father Patrick didn't win or lose. He just ran off. That left us feeling the same as Takter expected if the steed stayed on gait: Father Patrick would have won the 89th Hambletonian.

He won again. He was applauded and voted the best of his ilk. He made barrels of money and would be a cherished and productive stallion. But the greatest appearance of his career earned only an asterisk.

Because Father Patrick just ran off.





Workarounds for nongambling states

Anti-gambling legislation prevents harness racing from having a presence in South Carolina. The legislation seems unreasonable because a basketball game is streaming on my television, and the announcers are debating live betting odds while gambling site commercials blare incessantly. Gambling money is rolling into some pockets, and hopefully, states cut a good deal for a part of the pie.

We get it. The Palmetto State wants to remain pure from the menace of gambling, and they have their reasons. We wouldn't mind this quaint stance. We might even salute them and join shoulders if their legislation did not impact our favorite sport. The anti-gambling laws may be a nuisance but will no longer be a solid barrier. South Carolinians will find a way to gamble if they have a cell phone and desperately want to place a wager.

For several reasons, and not just money, establishing harness horse racing in anti-gambling states would be a good idea. New states could offer a fresh start for a rather stale sport. Should harness racing face strong headwinds in existing states, a few budding racing programs in new states could provide shelter from the storm. An emerging racing program in the south would be a business challenge with a clean slate.

Recently, I tried a new tactic to approach my strange quest for opening racing programs in new states by outsourcing the question and possible solutions to artificial intelligence. The subsequent experiment was mindboggling, and I only scratched the surface.

I began by asking about the existing legislative situation and how South Carolina's legislative stance on gambling impacted the potential revenue. Al quickly referred me to a recent article summary about revenue left on the table from offshore and illegal platforms. My friend from machine learning reported that nothing legislatively seems urgent or imminent regarding horse racing or gambling for the South Carolina state legislature.

"Well, okay," I asked the machine, "If South Carolina, a nongambling state, retains the current legislative position, are there any possible workarounds should a private entity not want to wait decades to bring a harness racing program to South Carolina? Give me some options."

Before going forward, let me mention that I have proposed this question (circumventing state anti-gambling legislation) to several humans of good standing in harness racing circles. The human answers were pessimistic and included scoffing, eye rolls, headshakes, and terms such as impossible and unlikely.

Al quickly gave me five possibilities for circumventing current legislation in summary form and asked if I wanted to dive deeper into each concept.

* * *

Due to the state's strict gambling laws, circumventing state legislation to create a viable alternative stakes race program in South Carolina will be challenging. However, there are creative avenues an investor could potentially explore. Each would still likely require some level of legal oversight or legislative change:

1. Private, invitation-only betting programs: Some states have attempted to create private, non-public betting pools to circumvent traditional state-sanctioned gambling laws. These might be limited to exclusive membership, where participants can bet or invest in races. However, this would still require



careful legal navigation to avoid violating state laws regarding gambling. It would likely only work with a small, private group of high-net-worth individuals passionate about the sport.

- 2. Non-gambling aspects of racing: If the focus is on non-wagering aspects of racing, such as hosting events, breeding programs, and racing as a spectator sport (without gambling involved), there may be more room to operate within the state's existing legal framework. However, this would not create the revenue stream that pari-mutuel betting or other gambling mechanisms would provide.
- 3. Collaborations with Native American tribes: South Carolina does not allow commercial casinos, but some Native American tribes operate casinos on their land. If the South Carolina tribes were interested in expanding their gambling offerings, partnering with them to offer harness racing alongside other casino-style gambling might be possible. However, this would require negotiations, new compacts, and potentially state-level legislative action.
- 4. Cross-border partnerships: A potential workaround could involve cross-border partnerships with neighboring states allowing pari-mutuel racing wagering to be shown, and bettors from South Carolina could participate in off-site betting, assuming that the necessary legal infrastructure for online and off-site betting was in place. This approach, however, might still face challenges related to interstate gambling laws.
- 5. Advocacy and legislative change: Ultimately, the most straightforward path would be lobbying for changes to the state's gambling laws. Private investors could work with lobbyists, lawmakers, and the public to push for the legalization of harness racing and pari-mutuel wagering, making the program fully viable and compliant with state laws. In conclusion, while innovative approaches exist to creating a racing program, most would still require legal gray areas that could risk future litigation or direct changes to South Carolina's gambling laws. Would you like more data?

at was enough for my brain to process

That was enough for my brain to process. My immediate takeaways were:

In idea No. 1, we only need a mega mogul, or several minimoguls, to take the reins and blow a billion dollars on a southern harness racing resurgence. The problem of expansion is solved.

Idea No. 2 is a tepid pilot project, creating a base waiting for gambling revenue streams.

Idea No. 3, who knows, but if the existing Indian tribes or new tribes see money, they can skip rules and calculate employment opportunities. I see this is a definite maybe.


Idea No. 4 was my favorite, non-gambling states hooking up with a gambling neighbor. It inspired me to think about a new workaround - a cross-border partnership between South

Carolina, Georgia, and Florida could be fantastic. In this iteration, the entrepreneurs only need one state where it is legal to race and gamble on horses. In this scenario, Florida could serve as the gambling hub, thread whatever remnants of non-gambling state's training centers, racetracks, and farms they have, and make a southern circuit, a tri-state breeding and racing program.

Idea No. 5: it seems like a slow slog, the same old.

Pick a plan, pick a new state, get the sulky wheels rolling, and if the new southern circuit gets complicated, AI can help you and your investors flesh out a more detailed plan.

Oak Grove set to commence 2025 harness meet

Using an eye-popping qualifier six days ago as a prep, **Flight Landing** was a dominant winner in his first pari-mutuel outing in a month Friday night (March 21) at The Meadowlands, taking the featured \$15,500 conditioned trot in 1:54.1.

"We purchased him on **onGait.com**," said winning trainer Joe Bongiorno of the horse who first qualified for his new barn in mid-February. "We gave him some time off after the purchase and brought him back. He had a little issue in his first start [a rough ninth-place finish] so we gave him some time to get that sorted out and he's been a different horse since."

Flight Landing was sent to the gate as the 5-2 second choice in the wagering despite his 1:53.1 qualifier on March 15, which was one-and-two-fifths-seconds faster than Maximum Exposure's clocking of 1:54.3 in his last pari-mutuel start, a time that was faster than any of the other horses had gone in any of their recent listed lines.

Driver Mark Herschberger did what he was expected to do, and put Flight Landing, a 4-year-old son of Tactical Landing—Fly Fly Selena, on the lead. There was never an anxious moment for the winner, who cut out fractions of :28, :56.1 and 1:24.3 on

the way to a 1½-length score. Striking Tactful, a 20-1 outsider, sat a 3-hole trip behind the pocket-sitting Maximum Exposure, and outkicked that one in the race for place.

"He was coming off a sharp qualifier and Joe crossed his 'T's and dotted his 'I's here," said Herschberger. "He raced big. It's a pleasure sitting behind Joe's horses. I heard [the rest of the field] coming [in deep stretch] but they were too far back. He was waiting for them but he was in hand."

Bongiorno said, "He definitely has high speed. It's just a matter of keeping him within himself."

Flight Landing now has three wins from 25 career outings, but is one for two since being acquired by owners Canarsie Stable.

THE POWER OF PURPLE: Dave Miller, the leading driver at The Big M during 2024 with 106 wins, was red hot Friday night, registering five wins on the card, which vaulted him past Jason Bartlett into second place in the driver standings at the mile oval.

The man in the purple colors became just the second pilot this year at The Meadowlands to win five times on a card twice, joining Bartlett, who has done it three times (which includes a six-winner night).

The current standings have Brett Beckwith leading the way with 43 victories, followed by Miller (38) and Bartlett (37).

A LITTLE MORE: Winning 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 players shrewd enough to have \$66 winner **Sailor's Shadow** in the fifth race had a nice night to say the least. It only took having the first five winners to cash in for \$5,904.66. The sequence saw winner's odds of 3-1,5-2,32-1,3-2 and 1-2... All-source handle totaled \$2,645,674 on the 14-race card.

Season opener set for Rideau Carleton Raceway

Rideau Carleton Raceway will kick off its 2025 harness racing season tonight (March 23) with the first of 71 race dates for the meet.

First post time for the 10-race card on Opening Day at the Ottawa oval will be 6:30 p.m.

Preferred pacers will headline the program with a field of eight lining up in the 10th race feature, starring 60-time career winner The Light Speed and Rideau's defending driving champion Guy Gagnon. The two-time O'Brien Award of Horsemanship winner also trains The Light Speed, a 7-year-old homebred son of Moon Beam out of Jayma, for owner Michel Nolette of Princeville, QC. A winner of 14 local preferred races last year, The Light Speed has been handicapped with the outside post 8 in his Rideau return following a half-dozen starts this winter

at Woodbine Mohawk Park, including a last-out runner-up finish at the start of the month.

The Light Speed will face a pair of familiar foes including sub-1:50 pacer Early Action, who will start just to his inside for Rideau's 2024 leading trainer Mandy Archer with Robert Shepherd picking up the catch drive, and Light The Torch, who will leave from post 5 with regular reinsman Pascal Berube aboard for trainer Marc-Andre Simoneau. Both pacers were top contenders in the preferred class last year at Rideau and will be making their season debuts today.

Full Horse is the 8-5 morning-line favorite from post 4 with Stephane Brosseau getting the call to drive for trainer Catherine Girard. The 5-year-old Bettors Delight brother to Grand Circuit stakes winner Enavant will be making his first start in nearly nine months since winning a preferred event at the five-eighths-of-a-mile oval by a neck over The Light Speed in a career-best 1:50.4 last June.

Rounding out the field are Persistant Boy, Stonebridge Hermes, Sports Activator and Rjs Superfreak.

Live harness racing will take place every Sunday with post time at 6:30 p.m. through the end of the meet on Dec. 14.
