# It's time for racing to nuke the jackpot bet

The hard-to-hit bets are eroding the bankrolls of racing's most important customers: the everyday ones.

Everyone has heard of the jackpot wager where one single ticket winner takes home the whole shebang, sometimes to glorious riches. The wagers have been promoted far and wide for years and quite honestly on the surface they make some sense. These bets — some with low 20 cent minimums — should theoretically give the little guy or gal a shot to compete against

the big bettors. They fulfill horse racing's mantra of "bet a little to win a lot" and of course, tracks can promote them daily or weekly, then reap big handles on mandatory payout days. They seem like a good thing.

So, what's the beef?

The problem is these supposed advantages have been exposed as the exact opposite.

"Jackpot wagers unnecessarily erode retail players' bankrolls," said Ed DeRosa of Horse Racing Nation. "The grim reality is that some of racing's best customers — those who wager between \$1,000 and \$10,000 a month with minimal or no rebate schedule — lose more than 40 per cent of their handle on jackpot wagers. This is money directly out of racing's ecosystem, and it's not being replaced."

What DeRosa partially references, is that the wager's takeout rates on non-mandatory days are usurious and these are the



exact instances smaller or everyday players are enticed to patronize them. Arguably our most important and faithful cohort — those who have been with this sport for years — are the ones having their bankrolls degraded most.

This is echoed by a high-end professional player (whose name I withhold by request), who the jackpot bet actually does benefit. And in this case, he refers to the mandatory payout days, which are supposed to be an edge for all customers for the low or no takeout they provide.

"This bet [on mandatory days] basically caters to the computer groups but is cleverly hidden behind the veil of life-changing scores to bring the casual horseplayers out to slaughter," he said. "There are no life-changing scores with groups getting a lot down, fading square action and covering it to 20 cent precision."

This lambs-to-slaughter metaphor isn't just an opinion from a sharp, well capitalized player.

Pat Cummings of the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation recently acquired and examined data from mandatory payout days through Florida public records. He found retail players **were 32.5 per cent underwater** on these mandatories. That's about 50 per cent more than overall blended takeout; much worse when we factor in the overall lower takeout benefit the carryover provides.

Reviewing **other public records**, I was completely floored by some of the numbers.

In the not so recent past at the Fresno Fair in California, a jackpot carryover Super High Five pool from the previous year was paid out, but apparently the casual player didn't get the memo that their money was finally being distributed. About \$710,000 of the \$764,000 (93 per cent) wagered on the Super High Fives (with the carryover free money) was from the betting teams, with nary a casual player to be found.

Back in 2010 when jackpot bets began, professional horseplayer @insidethepylons penned a post on a popular racing chat board asking how the sport is supposed to grow when a regular player who goes to the track with \$200 and churns it five or six times, suddenly begins to wager into a bet with almost no return and zero churn, leaving the track broke each day.

More than a dozen years on, I think the answer to his question is pretty clear.

Fortunately, unlike most problems in this sport, this one has a very easy fix: Nuke the jackpot bet and make sure it never returns.

# Revisiting the concept of 2-year-old in training sales for standardbreds

This past week in the thoroughbred industry, the Ocala Breeders Sale Co. conducted their annual OBS March sale for 2-year-olds. One of the larger 2-year-old in training sales of the year, 460 horses grossed over \$70 million, including a few that individually went for \$1 million or more.

What makes the 2-year-old in training sales unique to harness racing (in addition to the prevalence of 2-year-old sales at all), is that in the days prior to bidding, every horse is officially timed breezing either an eighth or a quarter of a mile, and the clocking and video replay becomes part of that horse's sale profile.

The business of purchasing yearlings with the intent to sell as 2-year-olds is a huge part of thoroughbred sales, but for whatever reason, it's never really caught on in the standardbreds. Though, that's not to say it hasn't been tried.

I have a faint recollection of the standardbred 2-year-old experiment a few years back and after a bit of digging to even find what was documented for those efforts, here's how it looked.

Brought forth in 2014 by David Reid of Preferred Equine, the idea was essentially to test the buying and selling waters for 2-year-olds and mirror the thoroughbred concept by having a Spring Mixed Sale at The Meadowlands along with having horses conduct a special training session at the track where they could work out and have their final quarter or eighth of a mile time recorded and published.

Back then, the results were largely uninspiring. In 2014, 22 2-year-olds were catalogued as part of the overall sale with \$35,000 being the highest sold price. Many horses were sold in the \$3,000 range. The next year was better, though. There were only 14 2-year-olds in that Spring sale, but two horses purchased by Tony Alagna were sold for \$60,000 and \$50,000. In 2017, the final year of the inclusion of 2-year-olds, only 11 horses went through the ring following a slew of Outs.

Of interesting note from that 2016 sale, a horse named Summer Side was consigned and bought back by Preferred Equine after failing to meet reserve. Bid up to \$77,000 in the days following an impressive baby race, Summer Side would go on to win over \$430,000 lifetime, including being second in the Art Rooney final at 3. Also, in that same sale — though later became an Out — was Derf Hanover, a trotter that went onto earn over \$360,000.

I'm sure there were many reasons why the initial concept was abandoned and least of which had to do overall with an industry notoriously reluctant to change, but I wonder if changing dynamics would now allow for the 2-year-old in training concept to have a better chance at success.

For one, technology has changed. Back almost 10 years ago when the 2-year-old concept started, there wasn't widespread online bidding for physical public sales. For the most part, if you wanted to bid, you or representation had to be present onsite. Now, that's all changed. Online sales have become far more mainstream and produce an exponentially greater number of seller eyes from around the world on a sale.

Second, on the similar topic of greater visibility, is being able to see the 2-year-olds workout or race. I can't recall if The Meadowlands produced live video or video replays of baby races from the time of those sales like they do today, but overall, the availability in seeing the 2-year-olds perform is nothing like it is today. A massive success has been the production of "The First Mile," a professionally conducted high-definition live streaming



of 2-year-old qualifiers held throughout June across Gaitway Farms and Magical Acres. It was reported that there were over 14,000 views two years ago from the initial season, and with the broadcast being sponsored by companies such as OnGait and Northwood Bloodstock, among others, the natural and mutual interest between consignors and online sales companies as it relates to the visibility of early 2-year-olds in training is obvious.


Reid was on the right track, in my opinion, with the idea of having a special training session in the days leading up to the sale. But what I didn't see then, and couldn't see even at this moment despite a lot of searching, was any information related to those workouts. Not that it was conducted in secrecy. It's just that I don't recall the results of those training being highly promoted. In April or May when a horse is 2 and they're training down and almost ready to baby race, their training performance begins to take greater weight than their pedigree page and certainly more weight than an Owners Statement as to why the horse is for sale in the first place. Now, the technological mechanisms are in place for the workouts to be broadcast live, and then have the video replay and performance results updated live to that horse's sales profile.

What could also be tweaked is what the training session itself consists of. Rather than a horse training a mile with an emphasis on the final quarter, perhaps the entire session could simply be a quarter mile in total, or an eighth of a mile brush. At any of these mile tracks such as The Meadowlands or Gaitway, a horse can gather momentum behind the starting car as always, and then once released, can brush for 13 seconds or so through the stretch straight away and be done with it. This way, it's not putting the stress on a 2-year-old of having to go through a more extended workout.

Of course, having a horse brush an eighth of a mile in April or May isn't necessarily indicative of how the horse will eventually perform in an actual race at a mile, but that's part of the sales game. Sure, you could wait until the horses are in real baby races against one another in June, but by that point, it's much less of a guessing game and the obviously decent horses will go for large amounts of money and then underperforming horses will be more devalued.

Though conducted privately, all the time today 2-year-olds that are training down impressively are already having shares of them sold. The idea of expanding that market to a more public forum combined with evidence of the performance is something that doesn't seem as farfetched in the industry as it once did. If given another chance, the timing today for it to succeed could be better.

# Ron Burke and George Brennan are approaching major milestones

Ron Burke, 53, is approaching the \$300-million mark.

He is at \$297,623,198 through March 24 and no other trainer in the industry is close.

Only these four thoroughbred trainers have more money than Burke and they're all older than him:

- 1. Todd Pletcher, 55, \$454,843,720
- 2. Steve Asmussen, 57, \$407,648,594
- 3. Bob Baffert, 70, \$341,430,502
- 4. Bill Mott, 69, \$326,488,699

George Brennan, who turns 56 on April 20, is at \$199,187,630 through March 24.

He will soon be the seventh member of the \$200-million club and the fourth oldest.

John Campbell turns 68 on April 8 and he has held the all-time earnings top spot for an incredible 37 years this July 31.

As of March 25, the 32nd and 33rd leading money-winning drivers in North America were Tim Tetrick and Dave Miller. They are the two richest drivers of the 21st century.

#### A LOOK BACK AT THE '80S

What kind of an impact did the Woodrow Wilson, now over a decade extinct, have?

In the 1980s, eight of the 10 leading money-winning horses were not Horse of the Year.

Even Odds, the 1987 Wilson winner, made more at 2 than his sire, Bret Hanover, did for his entire career. Even Odds made \$950,108 and Bret Hanover made \$922,616.

In 1980, the very same weekend Niatross won the Meadowlands Pace, 24-year-old Ron Pierce had two drives 90 miles or so north at Monticello and both were longshots that did little.

In 1987, then 30-year-old Ron Pierce started off The Meadowlands' meet 1-for-49 and by mid-May was 17-for-286, tied for 16th in the driver standings.

Does this sound like the only driver to win either the Hambletonian or Meadowlands Pace five straight years (from 2007-11)? He was, apparently, a late bloomer.

\* \*

One of the craziest race results ever? Maybe the 1981 Sweetheart at The Meadowlands.

Savilla Lobell, the heavy favorite, won for fun but was disqualified. The filly put up was Willow Bust (95-1) with Herve Filion. That filly would not win a single race at 3 (0-for-21).

The top four drivers in the race — in pre-superfecta days — were all driving bombs. Bill O'Donnell was second with Allwin Bunny, John Campbell was third with Elvira Childer and Billy Haughton was fourth with Nut House. If that's not enough, the winner of the consolation in a faster time (1:57.3 to 1:57.4) was the easy division winner (185 votes to48) Three Diamonds who broke the week before in her first attempt in the mud.

Her 304 divisional votes the following year (1982) remain the most in the sport's history for any divisional winner.



- 6. Purse distribution: 50 per cent, 25 per cent, 12 per cent, 8 per cent, 5 per cent.
- 7. Nominations will be divided by sex and gait and added accordingly to each final. No starting fees required.
- 8. All races to be raced over a distance of one mile (1609 M).
- 9. Ontario Sired means bred by a sire that was registered in the Ontario Sires Stakes program in the year of the breeding.

# Strolling memory lane with Tom Merriman

If one were looking for the mythical "Mayor of Sunshine Meadows," most people might be inclined to name Myron Bell, Sam Bowie or Jerry Glantz. These three are certainly in the running. However this scribe's vote would go for Tom Merriman. Rare is the day when Tom is not sitting alongside The Deck in his trusty golf cart, stopwatch in hand clocking the horses as they go their miles. He admits that the job is now much more difficult since the horses do not wear numbers which enable them to be easily identified.

Tom has spent every winter since 1998 at what I would now call the Winter Capital of Harness Racing in South Florida.

# Where did it all begin and how has it progressed through the years?

"My first drive was at the age of 17 at the Marshall Michigan Fair in 1957. That same year, I also drove at Northville Downs. I stayed in Michigan racing horses at Wolverine and Hazel Park until 1974 when I moved to the so-called big time at Roosevelt and Yonkers.

"Sadly Wolverine, Hazel Park and Roosevelt are now gone and Yonkers is just a shadow of its once mighty self. I was basically working for one man, Robert Kalish, for who I raced for 18 years. While racing at the New York tracks I would occasionally move over to The Meadowlands if I had a horse that was competitive."

# Tell us about those early years at The Meadowlands.

"What else can I say other than it was the place to be. Harness racing never had a better venue. The horses were great, the drivers were the very best and all the best stables raced there. It was there that I raced Energy Burner, likely the very best horse that I've had in my stable. He was the New Jersey Sires Stakes champion at 2, 3 and 4 and earned over a million dollars."

# You've also raced and trained in Florida for a long time.

"I am among the very few still around who opened Pompano Park. I did quite well there during the track's formative years. I was the leading trainer there in 1964 and I and Tom Wilburn were the leading drivers there in 1965. We did reasonably well.

"We had a circuit which consisted of Pompano in the winter and the Michigan tracks and subsequently the metropolitan New York tracks during the main racing seasons.

"In 1990, I was at the Harrisburg sale and got to speaking with my friend Doug Ackerman. Doug said that Howard Beissinger was looking for a good American trainer to go to Italy to train the horses owned by the noted clothing designer Roberto Cavalli. Howard had trained the horses that Signor Cavalli raced in the States and was good friends with the clothing impresario. My stable had winded down somewhat. Doug thought that I might be a good man for the job, if I were interested. I talked it over with my wife, Anne. We were soon on our way to Italy. We did pretty well over there, but we soon got homesick and came home after two years."

#### You were, in effect, born into the sport.

"Yes indeed. My dad was a horseman. Chris Boring and I were raised together. All I ever knew was horses and horse racing. I suppose if I know something now it all relates to horses. My wife, Anne, is also a horse person. She generally rides for one of the stables at Sunshine Meadows until they ship north. We used to ship north as well as soon as the season was over down here. Anne and I would ship north to The Meadows where we would help out with the Parker stable. From The Meadows we would go to Lexington for the Grand Circuit meeting and then start the cycle anew."

#### You gave up your stable in 1998.

"Fred Monteleone offered me a job as his contract trainer and Anne and I went to work for him. We were with Fred for five years. We did pretty well. We had some pretty good horses from a relatively small number that we trained including Civil Action (\$1,123,053), Monte Hall (\$834,513) and Cincinnati Kid (\$744,606)."

# You've worked for and with some Hall of Famers and perhaps a future Hall of Famer in Tony Alagna.

"Starting out, the first Hall of Famer I worked for was Dick Buxton. When I was with Dick he put me up to drive his world champion trotter Senator Frost. The horse wasn't quite what he had been, but I still considered it to be a great honor to sit behind him. I worked for Chuck Sylvester when he had Mack Lobell as a 2-year-old. He was a wonderful colt pretty much from the beginning. His great feats were monumental, but they didn't surprise me at all. The last person I worked for was Tony Alagna. What a great operation that is. They've got a whole lot of horses, but the operation runs like clockwork. I had to give up riding because of troubles with my back. Nowadays I don't ride but Anne still does."

# You've mentioned Mack Lobell as being great from the beginning and he turned out to be everything one might hope for. Have you ever had one that you thought was going to be great but didn't turn out as well as you thought?

"I had this Cam Fella filly that I thought the world of. Training down, she was more than impressive. However, when she hit 1:57, she decided that was as fast as she would go. I put Mike Lachance up thinking that maybe he would wake her up. She still hit that brick wall at 1:57. But that's not the end of the story. Her name was Where's Sarah. She is the second dam of the great Somebeachsomewhere. I suppose the speed that I thought she had was there, but it was, in fact, hiding. It just took a couple of generations for it to come out."

# You've been around for several generations. Tell us the main differences you've seen.

"The biggest difference is in the horses themselves and the way we train them. Today's horse is physically more akin to the thoroughbreds. For lack of a better term, I'll say that they are more streamlined. They are bred for speed while many of the horses of yesteryear were bred for stamina. I think that a lot of our horses now couldn't take the intense training we used to give them. It was the norm back then to go three heats with a horse. Now many only go one. Today's horse is also better conformed. As yearlings at the sales, they exhibit fewer physical faults. It used to be that they would be coarse boned often having blemishes such as curby hocks. It's rare that we see that today."

#### Who are the best horses you've seen through the years?

"It's generational, but through the years with pacers, the first great one I think of is Adios Butler. He was followed by Bret Hanover, Cardigan Bay, Albatross and more recently Somebeachsomewhere.

"With trotters I think it's more varied probably due to the European influence. Among them were my emotional pick Senator Frost [plus] Su Mac Lad, Nevele Pride, Speedy Crown and Super Bowl. Then you need to add the great French trotters who's dominance in International racing began with Jamin."

#### How about drivers?

"The drivers of today are much like the horses. They are more streamlined. You aren't going to see too many good drivers built like Frank Safford and Clint Hodgins. They are in the best of shape and don't weigh much. What they can do is make horses go fast and they do. It used to be, in most races, you'd maybe have a few who I would consider to be 'professional' drivers, with the rest being trainer/drivers who were not. You can go to most racetracks today and find that there is not that much difference between drivers one to eight. It's mostly up to the horse.

# Any final thoughts?

"Two of our Hall of Fame brethren, Chris Boring and Chuck Sylvester, lost their wives in the last few days. How ironic is it that two great Hall of Fame horsemen, who basically started in the game together and were lifelong friends, would suffer such heartbreaking loss within a matter of a few days.

"My sincerest condolences to the Boring and Sylvester families."

# Lancelot Bromac closing in on 500<sup>th</sup> career start

The 13-year-old ageless, Aussie wonder shows no sign of slowing down.

Almost a decade after he started racing, pacer Lancelot Bromac is on the verge of becoming the first Down Under pacer to have 500 starts.

The 13-year-old son of Art Major has already broken a record most never thought would be bested when he raced for the 487th time and finished a close-up fifth at Albion Park on Dec. 27, last year.

It topped the previous Down Under record for race starts of 486, set by the then 16-year-old Destreos back on Feb. 21, 2020.

"Someone said a few years back we might have a chance of eventually beating Destreos' record, but I laughed," said partowner Mitch Manners, a well-known Aussie race caller. "I think he was in the low 300's then and it seemed so far away.

"Even when he got into the 400s, you start to think about how old he is and the fact he'd still have to have more starts than most horses have in their career to get past the 486 starts Destreos had. But once he got to 450 and was still racing competitively and without any soundness issues at all, you just knew he'd get there."

It hasn't been a grind, either.

Although Lancelot Bromac hasn't won since Aug. 30, last year, he's finished in the top four 13 times and continued to bank checks for Manners, along with his trainer and part-owner, 73-year-old Stewart Dickson.

What's more remarkable is the fact Dickson has trained Lancelot Bromac since day one. His first start was at the now defunct Gold Coast harness track way back on May 11, 2012.

That's the month and year the great Donna Summer died, Barack Obama was president and songs like PSY's *Gangnam Style* and Carly Rae Jepsen's *Call Me Maybe* dominated the airwaves.

That first race at the Gold Coast was an anomaly as Queensland's home of harness racing, Albion Park, has been Lancelot Bromac's playground.





Incredibly, when he lines up for his 499th start at Albion Park on Tuesday (March 28), it will be his 465th start at that track.

If all goes to plan, that 500th start will be a week later on April 4.

He's got his own stall these days, stall 43, and could almost walk to it himself when Dickson gets him off the trailer each Tuesday, except for the white line fever the old boy still gets when it's race day.

"He's great at home but put him on the [trailer] and he knows it's race time," Dickson said. "When he gets to the track, he'll kick, headbutt and try to bite you. That's him, he's always been the same and it tells he's still enjoying the routine of it all."

Despite his aging legs, Lancelot Bromac races most weeks, usually Tuesdays. He had 43 starts last year and his 499th race will be his 12th already this year and it's not even the end of March.

And there is no end in sight.

"I think he's a marvel and I think I know him best, but we have our knockers, don't you worry," Dickson said. "There's plenty saying, 'Why do I keep racing him?' and 'Surely, he deserves to be retired,' but he would hate that. I gave him a spell once and he was pacing the fences and standing at the gate wanting to get out and work again.

"I think he had two weeks off that time and it's the only spell he's had, but he is trained from a paddock. He's never had an injury, not even a day of being unsound. How many horses could you say that about?"

Dickson, who trains about an hour north of Brisbane at Caboolture, is into his 56th year as a trainer, including an 18-year stint with at least 35 horses in work in Brisbane itself.

These days he's working eight and admits Lancelot Bromac is a driving force for him still being in the game.

"It's a bit of a chore at times these days, but if I couldn't get up in the morning and see the horses, including this old guy, out the back door each morning, I think I would get pretty sh --- y," he said. "I'd be lost without him. He's part of the family and he's a real people's horse. So many come up to him, pat him and say hello every week at Albion Park and he's starting to get his share of media coverage now, too.

"We suit each other. He's getting old and I'm getting old, too. But there's no end in sight. There is no rule that says he's got to stop racing at a certain age. I love him and I know him. He'll tell me when he's had enough. Sure, he's lost a bit of his speed, but he still loves racing and tries so hard. He just needs them to run along in the race, so it's not a sprint home. He went 1:53.8 earlier in his career and he ran second in 1:56 a few starts back, so he's not far off the mark, is he?"

Dickson recalls buying the unraced Lancelot Bromac from Queensland owner/breeder Tony Prince almost 11 years ago.

"Tony and I are from Cairns [in northern Queensland] and we both went to the same school," Dickson said. "We had that connection and I used to break in some horses for him in Brisbane.

"He rang one day and said this horse didn't quite fit what they wanted, which I read as he wasn't quite good enough, but he also had some quirks. He said I could have him for \$5,000, but Tony being Tony said: 'Don't pay now, pay me when he's won it in prize money.' He won his third start and had basically paid for himself by then."

Dickson admits the 500th start will be both satisfying and exciting.

"For both of us, I reckon," he said with a laugh. "The old boy's done a fantastic job and I'm proud we've been able to keep him going and hit the milestone still being very competitive and loving racing.

"Who knows, he might have another six or 12 months left in him yet, but he'll tell us that. We're not planning much fanfare for the 500th start. Mitch [Manners, co-owner] will come up from the Gold Coast for it, but otherwise I travel light so there won't be an army of people there, at least not that I know of. Wouldn't it be a fairy tale if he could come out and win his 500th? He's going well enough and he's due."

Lancelot Bromac's remarkable career has already seen him win 33 times with another 71 seconds and 61 thirds.

He's been an equine ATM or cash machine, earning more than \$750 per start.

"Just looking at him now, I think there's still plenty more to come," Dickson said with a laugh.

# V75 finals in the books at Solvalla

Three- and 4-year-old trotters met in four divisions of the \$57,500 Margaretas Tidiga Unghästserie when Solvalla played host to V75-finals on Saturday (March 25) afternoon.

Conrad Lugauer's 4-year-old mare **Narita** (Muscle Hill) tried the first edition of the young horse series at the Stockholm track in February, but was handicapped by a post 12 start that day. On Saturday, Lugauer defended the front position from post 1 and Narita answered by easily winning in a mile rate of 1:59.1 over 1.3 miles.

Next up was the 3-year-old fillies division, where first choice Larah Westwood made a move towards the lead when the field reached the back stretch for the first time. Everything looked safe for the leader as they turned for home, but when first over trotter Madewithlove made a break at the top of the stretch,

pocket sitter **Loveletter In** (Father Patrick) got her lucky break. In the hands of Erik Adielsson, the Per Nordström-trained horse bested leader Larah Westwood just before the wire. The mile rate was 2:00.3.

Fourth Dimension has had a promising start to his stallion career in Sweden and when the 3-year-old colts battled, Fourth Dimension son **Frank S.H.** (trained by Fredrik Persson) proved to be the best after a third-over trip. Driver Thomas Uhrberg trusted his horse and easily disarmed the leader Noah Boko at mid-stretch. Frank S.H. came home in a mile rate of 2:00.3 over 1.3 miles.

The division for 4-year-old colts and geldings was really appealing in advance with horses such as **Bedazzled Sox** (Brillatissime), named as the best 3-year-old in Sweden 2022, Ante la Roque, third in the Kriterium at Solvalla in September and Tetrick Wania, impressive and outstanding in the crop as a 2-year-old in 2021, showing up behind the gate. When Ante la Roque's driver Örjan Kihlström wanted to get a cover trip behind first choice Bedazzled Sox, the race turned into quite an uneventful show where the leader had everything under complete control all the way towards the wire.

Bedazzled Sox proved that he will be a factor in the bigger races even this season as he hit the wire as winner in a mile rate of 1:57.2 over 1.3 miles.

The \$96,000 final in the Gold division, included in the V75, ended with an impressive win. Jerry Riordan's Bold Eagle son **Aetos Kronos** posted a comeback win. Aetos Kronos was one of the best trotters in a crop that included horses such as Power, Don Fanucci Zet and Hail Mary, but a serious illness in connection with medical treatment stopped Aetos Kronos from continuing racing in the fall of 2021.



With some recent races complete, Riordan's top trotter has shown better condition and when driver Magnus A Djuse opted for a very optimistic trip for his horse, it was understood that Aetos Kronos was back at his best level again. From position first over, the duo won in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.3 miles.

#### **HUSSARD DU LANDRET A WINNER AGAIN**

Benoit Robin-trained **Hussard du Landret** (Bird Parker) has been racing on the tough Vincennes winter meeting circuit and when the gates at Vincennes opened once again on Saturday (March 25) afternoon, Robin found a perfect spot for his 6-year-old colt.

The \$95,000 Prix du Bois de Vincennes gathered several well-merited trotters and Hussard du Landret was one of them. His success can be attributed to Robin's tactics in the bike. A quick opening between horses resulted in Hussard du Landret grabbing the front a half-mile into the race. Hussard du Landret controlled the pace at a moderate level throughout the race and it seemed to be an easy victory for the Bird Parker son. But Hokkaido Jiel's sharp finish three wide at the stretch came close to resulting in victory. The photo showed that Hussard du Landret, who was seventh in Prix d'Amérique and fourth in Prix de Paris, claimed the title in Vincennes' biggest race on the Saturday card.

The mile rate over 1.6 miles was 1:58.3.

# Mikaela Del Giudice – trainer / owner / marketing manager for Blue Chip Farms

While attending high school in Minnesota, Mikaela Del Guidice took a job at the DeLong Stable.

Working and learning the 'ins and outs' of harness racing from top horsemen Jay and John DeLong, was something completely new to the young girl.

Until then, Del Guidice had showed Arabians and although she had been around horses since she was little, racing was something out of her comfort zone.

Del Guidice was born in Scandia, MN, a city about 10 minutes from Running Aces Casino and Racetrack, which opened in 2008.

"I'm a first generation in the sport; although my grandpa used to jump over the fence at Saratoga Raceway when he was a kid to watch the horses' race," Del Guidice said with a laugh. "I guess you could say horses and racing are in my blood.

"Running Aces only races in the summer months so working in the barn during the summer was a great job for a high school kid."

In 2012, the summer after Del Guidice graduated from high school, she got a job with horseman Rick Magee.

"I took online classes from Oregon State University and received my bachelor's degree," Del Guidice said. "I opted to pursue my education online for that gave me the freedom and opportunity to travel, racehorses and still get my degree.

"I remember riding shotgun on the way to race at Maywood Raceway while finishing an organic chem exam or writing a paper on statistical analysis and I've been involved in the sport full-time ever since."

And that's an understatement, for Del Guidice does it all.

Typically, Del Giudice spends her winters at The Meadows Racetrack in Washington, PA, involved in everything that has to do with horses and the sport.

"I train, groom and own racehorses," she said. "I also have a marketing business and do all the marketing for Blue Chip Farms. I love being in all different capacities of harness racing."

Last year while at the horse sale in Harrisburg, Del Guidice took on another venture: she purchased her first colt named Verified Blue Chip.

"Verified Blue Chip is my first baby," Del Guidice said. "So far, the colt is doing everything right. But you know that anything can happen along this exciting, but unpredictable journey."

Del Guidice recalled what her most exciting time in the sport was.

"That's an easy one," she said. "It was when my horse Margin Call swooped the field, charging from last to first in the open trot at Running Aces. The race announcer, Darin Gagne, knew how much I loved my horse and made the race so exciting. I never get emotional about winning races, but there were definitely tears shed in the winner's circle that day."

"Another exciting memory was last year when I got my first training win with my horse Zanetti. It was my very first training start. What a thrill."

As far as her favorite horse, Del Giudice had an answer without hesitation.

"It is definitely my open trotter Margin Call," she said. "This is a whole story in itself. I got him as a yearling and I promised him he would be with me forever. He was the most difficult horse to get to trot [and keep on the trot] but he was stupidly talented and the most beautiful horse you've ever seen.

"One day while in the pasture he somehow broke his leg in five places. The vets said he would never walk again, let [alone] be a racehorse and told me he had to be put down. I'm not one to see a horse suffer, but deep down inside I just knew he would beat the odds. These days Margin Call is enjoying his life galloping in the field and is "King of the Pasture."

Del Giudice has raced at Running Aces, the Minnesota and Wisconsin Fair Circuit, Maywood, Hawthorne, The Meadows and Pocono Downs.

Del Giudice is an up-and-coming harness racing hopeful and something the sport desperately needs. She is dedicated, hardworking, ambitious and a total horse lover.

"I've sent a lot of horses that were no longer able to race to New Vocations and, in a more unofficial capacity, I've helped many horsemen place retiring horses to local, loving homes," Del Giudice said. "Having connections in the surrounding horse community really helps. One person, in particular, is a well-known radio personality here in Minnesota, who actually adopted two former Running Aces' racehorses that he and his family adore."

What are Del Giudice's hopes and aspirations?

"I'd like to continue training on a smaller level and am looking forward to my 2-year-old's future; but my main focus is marketing and Blue Chip Farms. They have been extremely good to me, and I believe in going where you're most valued."

At four o'clock in the afternoon, near the open French doors leading into the empty dining room of Mulligan's Restaurant at Columbia Hills Country Club, a stocky young woman with blonde hair pulled back into a tight ponytail paused and brushed invisible lint from the right shoulder of her blue sweater.

She stood in the doorway, nervously scanning the empty room. Her eyes settled on a fish tank in the center of the room. The silo-shaped glass aquarium was unique, perhaps five feet in diameter and six feet high. The woman noticed a green turtle, the size of an upside-down soup bowl, laboring across colored pebbles as zebra fish darted above. As she watched, a stranger, a young man in a crisp blue long-sleeved shirt, stepped to her side and removed his sunglasses. She gave him an exaggerated shrug.

Before they could say anything, a voice behind the couple startled them. "Lily, Michael."

They turned to find a man, perhaps 60, very fit, barely over five feet tall, removing his golf visor from his gray buzz cut and extending his right hand, "Art, Art Pfeifer. Thank you for coming."

Michael shook the hand first. When Lily shook Art's hand, she hung on and asked, "What are we doing here?"

Art gestured with his visor to a round oak table close to the fish tank. "Let's have a seat. I'll tell you all about it."

When they settled into chairs, a middle-aged waitress, or possibly waiter, a tweener in tight blue jeans and circus clown red hair, appeared from the kitchen and asked if they needed something to drink. A vetting process brought you to this table and someone you know received a stipend, a finder's fee. You both have education and a host of assets we appreciate. My company specializes in re-energizing the cream of apprentice dropouts."

Michael said, "Was it Tucker from the Union, the guy I worked with for three months?"

Art nodded. "Tucker and others were very positive. You learn quickly, have a personality and show a solid work ethic."

"But if you talked to Tucker, you know I quit. Who recruits a guy who quits?"

"A guy who knows why you quit."

The red-haired person appeared with our drinks, set them down and told Art, "Jack just pulled in."

Art gave a thumbs up and turned to his guests, "One of the secrets to my success is that I employ good people. You know plumbing is a lucrative business, the work is steady and immune from most market fluctuations and you understand there are not enough good employees available. Oh, I know that plenty of candidates begin apprenticeships. Still, the drugs, the laziness, the lack of initiative, the dependability problems. So many factors wean away a high percentage of applicants." He paused, then added, "For most companies."

Lily said, "We also know it is four friggin years until you start making serious money, pardon the language."

A man approached the table looking like a magazine model in his sports coat and open-necked white shirt. He nodded at Art, slid into the remaining chair, sat down and said, "I'm Jack. I work for Art. Ten years ago, I sat where you are sitting now. I started an apprentice program with another company and bailed after a few months."

"Tell them what you earned last year?" Art said.

"\$125,000 before perks."

"Perks?" asked Lily.

"Paid health insurance, five weeks' vacation, childcare, membership to this Club, individual tutoring during your apprentice, half ownership of a racehorse, other things."

"A country club membership? Half a racehorse?" asked Lily.

Art leaned back and said, "Let me be as clear as possible. My success depends on my employees. If I have a secret, it is recruiting, employing and retaining good people like you. After much snooping, research and interviewing, I believe in you."

Michael sipped his tea and said, "I know plumbing is a good business. I know what a country club is, but what the hell is with the horse?"

You're going to be surprised. The horse perk is fun and participating in the sport is addictive. I'd guess about half of us get into the sport to some degree. The longer you stay with the company, the higher the percentage of ownership Artie offers. After 10 years, you own 50 per cent of your horses' earnings.

Jack took the reins, "That's the same question I asked 10 years ago. Here's the deal, Artie raises these racehorses, harness racehorses. He has a couple of beautiful farms where he raises horses and then sends them off to learn to be racehorses. Artie cedes each employee a percentage of one of his horses. If your horse earns money racing, you get money at the end of the year, like a bonus."

Lily googled her eyes and said, "That's crazy. What if you don't like horse racing?"

Jack said, "You still get the money. You're going to be surprised. The horse perk is fun and participating in the sport is addictive. I'd guess about half of us get into the sport to some degree. The longer you stay with the company, the higher the percentage of ownership Artie offers. After 10 years, you own 50 per cent of your horses' earnings.

Art said, "It's different, hopefully not crazy. Twelve years ago, when I began the horse bonus programs, I carefully considered each perk. The horse ownership, the country club and several other perks have a serious purpose. Our employee retention rate is the best in the business and over 90 percent of Pfeifer employees remain for over a decade."

The room was quiet for a few moments, then Artie continued. "Plumbing work is essential and in high demand, but not glamorous. All the concepts I enacted into my business are for a reason. Michael and Lily, you check all the boxes we look for, but we know the four-year apprentice is a huge obstacle. Union rules prevent us from throwing money at you, so we attempt to bridge the gap with perks. Perks are normal in white-collar work, but not in blue-collar work."



When you backed out the first time, you were unsure this career was viable. My job is to make you see this is a viable career by bridging the early years using fun and perks."

"Me, a country club member, a racehorse owner?" repeated Lily. Artie smiled, "After lunch, we will ride to my farm. I'm determined to harness your talents."

# Racine Bell became harness racing's newest millionaire in Matchmaker

Amazing Dream N, Lydeo and Lucky Artist A also division winners.

**Racine Bell** and driver Jason Bartlett found room to the inside in the stretch and forged to the front late to capture one of four \$40,000 divisions in the second leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (March 24). A 6-year-old mare by So Surreal, Racine Bell scored in 1:52.3 and became harness racing's newest millionaire with the victory.

First leg winner Karma Seelster and Delitfulcatherin N both left outside the rail-starting Racine Bell and Bartlett allowed

Karma Seelster to clear the lead off the opening bend, with Delitfulcatherin N and Jordan Stratton content to tuck in third. Bartlett, driving the 3-5 favorite, did not look to regain and instead took his chances behind Karma Seelster and Matt Kakaley and that pair led the field through fractions of :27.1 and :56.3. Stratton put pressure on the pace-setter when he put Delitfulcatherin N in motion at the half and the pace accelerated to the tune of 1:24.4 at three-quarters, with the leaders racing head-to-head.

On the final turn it appeared that Bartlett might regret not retaking the lead as Delitfulcatherin N appeared to be surging by, but she made a costly break in mid-stretch. Karma Seelster also bore out enough to give Racine Bell clearance and the veteran mare knew exactly what to do. In posting her 30th career triumph, Racine Bell defeated Incaseyoudidntknow and Dougs Babe A, with Karma Seelster fourth across the wire.

Trained by David Dewhurst, Racine Bell is owned by Chris and Dale Lawton. Racine Bell returned \$3.40 to win, the exacta paid \$36.60 and the trifecta was worth \$119.

**Amazing Dream N** was the only back-to-back winner in the second round of the series, rolling past defending Blue Chip Matchmaker champion Drama Act in the stretch on her way to a 1:52 mile and her second win in as many starts in 2023. Yannick Gingras guided the Bettor's Delight-sired 7-year-old for trainer Linda Toscano.



Amazing Dream N and Drama Act took turns on the lead in the first turn, with the latter surging to control off the bend for George Brennan. From there it was a two-mare contest through fractions of :26.4,:56 and 1:23.4, with Brennan trying to separate from the pocket-sitter. Gingras kept Amazing Dream N interested and once in the homestretch she blew right past the 3-5 favorite. Drama Act settled for second, with Morning Has Broken and Easy To Please following in third and fourth.

Owned by Enviro Stables, Gutnick, Pontone and Lozito Jr., Amazing Dream N, who won for the 28th time overall and pushed her earnings to \$1,290,486, returned \$5.70 to win. The exacta paid \$8.20 and the trifecta returned \$45.20.

In the first \$40,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division of the night, **Lydeo** and driver Scott Zeron converted on a pocket trip to paydirt, overtaking the pacesetter Mabalene N late in the homestretch for her first win in six 2023 starts. The 4-year-old by Sweet Lou stopped the clock in 1:52.3.

Mabalene N and Bartlett assumed quick command as the gates opened, with odds-on favorite Wahs Fire Bug N resisting a quarter move and settling in third. Lydeo and Zeron held the pocket as Mabalene N cut fractions of :28.1 and :57 for the opening-half. When Wahs Fire Bug N and driver Tyler Buter pulled to attack off the third turn, Bartlett asked the leader for speed and Mabalene N paced a third quarter in :27.2, giving the favorite the cold shoulder and limiting the chances of McMarkle Sparkle in the second-over position.

There was ample room for Zeron to pull at the head of the stretch and Lydeo shifted gears quickly, powering on past in the :28.1 final quarter. Mabalene N held for second with Alta Madeira N gaining third along the pylons. Favored Wahs Fire Bug N settled for fourth.

Trained by Ed Hart, Lydeo, who made her seventh trip to the winner's circle and has now put away \$161,201, is owned by

Randy Bendis, Reed Broadway and Pollock Racing LLC. and as a 7-1 offering, she returned a flat \$16. The exacta returned \$77, while the trifecta paid \$308.50.

Driver Braxten Boyd, behind **Lucky Artist A**, grabbed the pocket early and then pounced on speedster Sweet Treasure before the three-quarters in a powerhouse performance, capturing the second \$40,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division. The 10-year-old imported daughter of Artistic Fella won for the fourth time in 2023 with a season's-best 1:51.4.

Boyd's aggressiveness early worked for two reasons. Not only was Lucky Artist A able to work out a solid pocket trip, but Sweet Treasure and driver Andrew McCarthy worked hard to gain control from the pole position and then the leader was hard to control.

Sweet Treasure set opening fractions of :27 and :56, with Boyd recognizing her vulnerability before the 1:24.1 three quarters, getting an edge over Goththegreenlight and Gia's Surreal, the two mares who got into the action off the third turn. Once in control Boyd was confident with the Ricky Bucci-trained mare, with Lit De Rose and Pat Lachance scooting up the inside for the place spot. Gothegreenlight faded to third with Gia's Surreal fourth.

Owned by Flatland Racing, Lucky Artist A, who now has a record of 36-22-25 from 160 efforts and a bankroll of \$488,177, returned \$5.30 to win. The winning exacta returned \$32 with a \$91 trifecta.

Stakes action will resume at MGM Yonkers Raceway on Monday night (March 27) with four \$50,000 sections of the second leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for free-for-allers on the 12-race program.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday through Friday live racing schedule with post time at 7 p.m. (EDT).

# Burke-Gingras quartet set for Borgata round two

Yannick Gingras heads to Monday's (March 27) MGM Borgata Pacing Series with no morning-line favorites, but each of his four Ron Burke-trained horses is no worse than third choice in the event's second of five preliminary rounds at MGM Yonkers Raceway. Among that group is Hellabalou, who brings a fiverace win streak to the third of the night's four \$50,000 divisions.

Hellabalou, the 2021 Adios champ, won his first-round Borgata start by a neck over Jimmy Freight and Backstreet Shadow in 1:52.1 last week. Starting from post one, Hellabalou took the lead at the start and never relinquished the top position.

"We had the rail and were able to control the race, but he won pretty easily," Gingras said. "It looked like they were coming at the wire and they were, but the plugs were still in. I was more managing [Jimmy Freight] in the two-hole, so I wasn't going to get beat by him. I think if I turned [Hellabalou] loose at the top of the stretch, he had more than he even showed."

Hellabalou has won seven of his past nine races dating back to mid-October. Last week's appearance was his first pari-mutuel start since Jan. 6, when he captured the open handicap at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows. On Monday, he leaves from post six and is the 7-2 second choice in a field that includes fellow first-round winners Leonidas A, the 3-1 favorite, and Idealsomemagic A, who is 5-1.

"He was coming into last week fresh, but off some really good starts in late fall/early winter," Gingras said about Hellabalou. "We've got post six this week and it would be nice to get him in the race somehow. Whether that's at the beginning or following cover, we'll see how it shakes out.

"It's important to try to get as many points as you can early in the series because then it gives you the chance to maybe get a week off somewhere. Everybody is thinking the same, so that's why it's such competitive racing."

This Is The Plan, an 8-year-old who was the 2021 Borgata champ, represents the Burke Brigade in Monday's fourth division, where he starts from post seven and is the 5-1 third choice behind Tattoo Artist at 5-2 and Priceless Beach at 3-1.



Last week, This Is The Plan made his seasonal debut from post eight and finished seventh but was beaten by only 2-1/2 lengths as he closed with a :27 final quarter-mile.

"He drew the eight-hole and it was really the toughest division on top of it," Gingras said. "I took a look out of the gate, but they were leaving pretty hard. He had good pace in the stretch, just a wall of horses in front of him. I was really, really pleased with him.

"He's got post seven this week, but he's going to be more involved than last week. We'll try to go forward and if that doesn't work at least we should be able to get him out in the flow. It's time to go."

In the second division, Semi Tough will look to rebound from an eighth-place finish in round one. The 7-year-old led at the opening quarter from post three but dropped back from there.

"He's always a little bit lazy in the middle part of the race, so going up the backstretch I was thinking it was maybe just typical Semi Tough, but he didn't respond," Gingras said. "He'll always pace the stretch and he didn't. He wasn't himself."

On Monday, Semi Tough will start from post one and is co-second choice at 7-2 behind favorite Jimmy Freight at 5-2. Backstreet Shadow also is 7-2.

"I've seen him be not so good one week and really good the next," Gingras said. "He's got a good spot and he's a good horse."

Completing the Burke-Gingras quartet is Bee Two Bee, who finished sixth from post eight last week. This week, the 6-year-old starts from post three and is the 4-1 third choice behind first-round winner Lochinvar Art A at 9-5 and None Bettor A at 2-1.

"He actually was really good," Gingras said. "I went up the inside with him and it didn't open up until late. I never really got to let him pace. He's ready. I don't know if he can win the final, but he's a horse that can make some money in the legs. This week I think is one of them. I think he's in a good spot and I'll see what we can do. I like him. He's a big strong horse and he tries. He's not out of place in this series."

The top-eight horses at the completion of the series' five preliminary legs are eligible to advance to the Borgata final on April 24 at Yonkers. Horses receive 50 points for winning, 25 for second, 12 for third, eight for fourth, and five for fifth. In addition, all starters in each round receive 25 points.

# Betterinpinehurst best in Big M feature

A new acquisition from the potent team of owner Tom Pollack and trainer Jeff Cullipher made it to the winner's circle Friday (March 24) night at The Meadowlands.

Making his second Big M start (after finishing fourth in his debut one week ago), **Betterinpinehurst** came from well off the pace to score in the feature, a \$20,000 high-end conditioned trot and in doing so, lowered his previous lifetime best by two-and-two-fifth seconds, stopping the clock in 1:53.3.

"[Last week] was his first start in over a month for a new barn," said winning driver Tim Tetrick. "So I just took him off and he responded well. It paid off today because he trotted home very strong."

Well back in the early going, Betterinpinehurst picked up live cover down the backstretch and raced third-over as 2-1 second choice Dreamonhigh cut out fractions on the point of :27.2, :56.3 and 1:24.3.

Betterinpinehurst swung wide off his live tow for the stretch drive and trotted home in :27.4 to record a neck win over 25-1 longshot Champagne Hanover, who was also closing well inside the eventual winner. Pocket-sitting A New Leader, seeking his fourth win in seven starts, had a big shot along the inside, but had to settle for third.

"Maybe I should have been a little closer," said Tetrick. "But he got the job done. My horse really made up a lot of ground."

A 4-year-old gelded son of Better Caviar—Sheer Delight, Betterinpinehurst returned \$5.80 as the 9-5 favorite. He's now won six-of-24 lifetime outings, good for earnings of \$63,301.

"We got him four weeks ago or so," said Cullipher. "Tom Pollack knows [former trainer] Dave Wade [who had the horse at The Meadows], so it was a private sale. We are going to play it by ear with him. He's not an open stock kind of horse, but he should do well in the high-end conditioned races."

So , instead of excoriating Jeff Gural — as some are prone to — we should be lauding his actions to eradicate this anathema.


Thank you Mr. Gural for having the courage of your convictions and your efforts to blunt this dagger before it eviscerates the horse racing industry.
