Australia proves that expanded gambling reach and a better wagering game grows the pie

Wagering in 2021 continued to show strong growth and North American racing can learn something from it.

Back in 2008, Australian racing was facing change. New technologies and betting exchanges were being allowed, and sports betting was moving beyond its nascent stage with corporate bookies. The business was opening up.

To some in the industry, these new outlets and increased competition meant the sky was falling, and it had to be stopped at all costs.

The head of Racing New South Wales at the time said, "this is the biggest problem the racing industry has ever had. We are not being paid to put the show on, and it means that all our 50,000 participants will lose."

We can't really blame him, can we? New ways to wager (including much at low takeout like betting exchanges), sports betting and a virtual destruction of the TAB horse racing monopoly could not possibly be a positive development.

A funny thing, though - the exact opposite happened.

Thoroughbred racing turnover grew from (all figures, \$AUS) \$14.3B to \$29.1B

Harness and greyhound handle moved from \$6.1B to \$14.3B

Sports betting – which we might surmise would cannibalize horse racing if it was successful – increased from \$3.2B to \$16.6B

Yes, all wagering is up.

The argument that growing handle but taking less off a wager (lowering takeout) and allowing those outside the industry to offer wagering would lower purses, certainly hasn't borne fruit either.



The number of races and race meets, unlike here in North America, did not decrease. They have held their own. Foal crops are down from 2011, but they too have leveled off the last several years.

What's fairly remarkable is over the past 10 years, in Australia, like in North America, horse racing is less popular than it was with gamblers. According to **Gambling Research Australia**, the number of people who gambled on horse racing last year was down over 20% from 2011. Dr. Alex Russell, the reports' co-author, noted that fewer people are betting, however, those who wager, are "betting a ton, driven by more and more online gambling."

This a very important fact, and one you're no doubt bored of seeing me type: The existing bettor base is pre-qualified to play the sport; they have disposable income, they have ADW accounts where they are captured. If we increase their churn rates with low takeout, incentives, better wagering mediums and better education to get them to bet more, they will.

These people are the sport's lifeblood, and maximizing their handle is vital. Purses, more race meets and better foal crops are the fruit of such endeavors.

Here in North America the sport, in my view, thinks far too much like 2008 Australia did. It plays scared. It fears entering a world of betting exchanges (they were tried here, at 12 per cent takeout, which defeats their purpose); it rarely embraces or invests in anything new that can help a customer; if bettors win more with lower juice, they seem to fervently believe the industry loses.

Everything is not rosy Down Under. The sport is still less popular than it once was. Harness racing has its issues and

the overall sport has problems just like everywhere else. But one thing they have proven without a doubt – if you don't fear the future, you can be a part of it. And the future's not half bad.









Bongiorno is well positioned in Yonkers Borgata Pacing Series

The headline coming out of last week's first leg of the 2022 Borgata Pacing Series was the emphatic return of defending champion, This Is The Plan. Trained by Ron Burke, This Is The Plan coasted to the easiest of wins in 1:51.3 in his first start since November and put the field on notice that the Borgata series will once again go through him.

Another race that caught the eye from Monday was the division in which Sheena Cohen-trained Leonidas A surged by the Chris Ryder-trained Tattoo Artist in 1:50.3, easily the fastest of any race that night. In that race, Tattoo Artist, who remains one of the favorites to win the series, cut excessively fast fractions after blasting from post 7 and was visibly tiring late when beaten by Leonidas A, who is proving once again to be a formidable threat throughout this series for the second consecutive year.

And right there with them includes contenders from a solid quartet sent out by last year's leading trainer at Yonkers, Jennifer Bongiorno. In 2021, Bongiorno's barn outpaced all others with 133 wins at the Hilltop oval, and through the first leg of the Borgata series the trainer is liking what she sees.

Coming off just that one qualifier into last week's race, I was really happy with (Nicholas Beach)," said Bongiorno. "... I was happy to see him sit comfortably in the pocket and finish with the ear plugs in. And he came out of the race great, which is what's most important with him.

Bongiorno's best Borgata chance comes likely in the form of last year's 1:47.2 winner, proven free-for-all standout Nicholas Beach. Coming off a career year, he seemed loaded when finishing a close third last week to Western Joe and Covered Bridge in his first start of the year. "Coming off just that one qualifier into last week's race, I was really happy with him," said Bongiorno. "I thought he had a ton of pace on the end and didn't have much room late, but I was happy to see him sit comfortably in the pocket and finish with the ear plugs in. And he came out of the race great, which is what's most important with him."

As has been a pattern since last year, Nicholas Beach had the misfortune of landing another poor post for his upcoming second leg of the series on Monday, post 8 directly outside of Leonidas A. "I could see a conservative start coming possibly from the 8-hole because it's a long series and you want to take it week by week," said Bongiorno. "But I one thousand percent think he can be very competitive when he's in a good spot. He's going to be tough in this series. He's beaten those horses before multiple times, and that mile as an example at Chester last year in the Commodore Barry was incredible. I think the world of this horse as do his owners and he's completely staked this year. He's going to have every opportunity to prove the horse that he is."

Bongiorno has further ammunition with the 5-year-old Well Said gelding, Dragon Said. Making his Borgata series debut last week, Dragon Said went wire-to-wire en route to a 1:52:3 score over None Bettor A and Elver Hanover. He flourished last year under Bongiorno and his mark of 1:49.4 at Yonkers is a record for a 4-year-old; he's another that's beaten many of the Borgata series participants at one point or another throughout his collection of Yonkers open wins.

"You couldn't ask for a cooler horse, he's just a complete overachiever," said Bongiorno. (Owner) Robert Devine bought him for \$10,000 and what he's done is truly incredible. He keeps surprising us and continues to get the job done. He's fully staked as well. My owner really wanted to take a chance with him and let him prove to us what he really is. He's won open's as a 4-year-old here at Yonkers and has had great success for us over this track starting with the M Life Rewards series last year and all the way through, so putting him in the series was something we thought he could handle. And last week he showed he certainly belongs; he's going to continue to be very competitive."

Bongiorno has two other horses racing in the series that she wouldn't be quick to write off either, Town Gossip or Ostro Hanover.

"Town Gossip is kind of our pride and joy," said Bongiorno. We bought him at sale for \$25,000 and he's gone on to become such a nice horse. Of last year's Empire Breeders winner and NYSS Final runner-up, Bongiorno said, "Normally I wouldn't put a 4-year-old such as Town Gossip in the Borgata because it's a tough series against older, more seasoned horses, but he gets around Yonkers so great and I couldn't have been more impressed with his two qualifiers coming back. He's very strong and powerful now and when (my brother, driver) Joe (Bongiorno) got off him last week he was like, 'Trust me, he was very good.' I think this upcoming week he's actually in one of the best spots for me. Ostro Hanover is one that we claimed for \$100,000 in November and he's been getting better and better for us. We gave him a little break over the winter, and he can definitely


get checks throughout the series, even race in the consolation, so that was the aim there."

Bongiorno notes although her stable has been viewed generally as a racehorse barn, the number of opportunities with stakes horses has been increasing. Today, the stable has 70 horses, including 10 2-year-olds, a couple of Stay Hungry fillies and a nice looking filly from Muscle Hill and another from Father Patrick.

Notable stakes opportunities Bongiorno sees thus far includes the 3-year-old trotting filly, Dreamonhigh. "Dreamonhigh was incredible last year and I think she's flying a little under the radar because she wasn't staked last year to the year-end races. And I personally think that division is one of the toughest, but she's coming back really good after being sent to North Carolina this winter. She grew so much, looks good and strong, and set the 2-year-old track record last year at the Meadows for either a colt or a filly. Hit Me Up is a 3-year-old pacing filly that finished 2nd in the sire stakes finals last year. She actually broke a coffin in that race but she's currently doing well, is sound, and I'm aiming her more towards the latter part of the year. I have a 3-year-old New York gelding Secret Rule and he's another who is training back really well and I'm excited to see what he has this year. I'm really looking forward to all of it. I'm proud of the way the barn has grown, and I think we have a great mix going."

Gary Rath: "I wish I had a whole bunch of them like" Romantic Warrior

Each fall after the yearling auctions, Gary Rath makes the rounds looking for horses which didn't sell that he can buy for a decent price. In the case of Romantic Warrior, the veteran conditioner didn't find the trotter using traditional methods.

In this instance, the breeder reached out to him. Now a sophomore, the gelded son of Cassis—Zorgwijk Delighted has turned out to be an investment that regularly delivers returns for Rath and co-owner Bobby Beggs.

"He's a pretty nice colt," said Rath, who serves as trainer

and driver. "I wish I had a whole bunch of them like him."

Romantic Warrior closed out the Hawthorne Race Course winter meet on a hot streak, winning three of his last four starts. In the latest, a March 19 triumph, Rath sat patiently with his charge along the pylons in third through fractions of :30.2; 1:00 and 1:30.4. Moving three-wide racing out of the last turn, the duo trotted past Killjoy and Mr Mizzou while holding off a charging Lous Lancelot by three parts of a length. Romantic Warrior captured the \$30,000 event for Illinois conceived and foaled 3-year-olds in a 1:59.3 effort as the favorite, producing back-to-back victories.

When Rath fielded the call from breeder Kris Becker in late 2020, it helped that he had familiarity with Romantic Warrior's family. The trainer had worked with a half-sister that was a freshman that season. The twist was that the sibling, named Toopher, was sired by pacing stallion Duneside Perch.

"She was supposed to be bred to trot, but she was bred to pace. I guess there was a mix-up at the farm. She was a big mare and she did everything right too, but she just wasn't fast enough," said Rath. "I just liked the way she was gaited. So we took a chance on this one and it worked out."

To say it has worked out is putting it mildly. In a business that is predicated on earning checks as frequently as possible, this private purchase has a knack for increasing his bankroll each time out. As a freshman, the trotter made 11 starts, picking

up a lone victory in the Cardinal Stakes in 2:02.1. Romantic Warrior was race timed in 1:58.1 at Springfield. While he finished off the board five times, he missed a check only once on the way to banking \$35,639. All the while, Rath was teaching the spirited gelding how to race.

"When he was a 2-year-old he got pretty hot headed. I was taking my time with him and trying to get him to come off the gate. He did, but he didn't like it," said the 61-year-old, who became a co-owner last September after buying Alan Beals' interest in the horse. "But he still raced good as a 2-year-old. That was a big factor there with him, he was trying to be a real hot-headed horse. We just tried to take him off the gate as much as we could without making him run or mad."

The time spent educating the trotter last year has produced a versatile sophomore that is off to a fast start in 2022. Racing almost exclusively in open company at Hawthorne,

Romantic Warrior has finished first or third in eight of 10 seasonal attempts. Once again, he has finished out of the money only once, raising his seasonal earnings to \$31,969. The gelding has collected \$67,608 in 21 career starts, hitting the board two-thirds of the time.

"He's a very nice horse to be around. He does anything you want him to do. He's just an all-around nice horse," the trainer and co-owner said.

He raced good as a 2-year-old against the bigger horses, and he raced against open company pretty much all winter until this last week. He trotted in (1):59. He trotted in (1):58 last year in the heat of the summer. This is cold weather now, so I'm hoping he picks up a couple seconds this summer.

Romantic Warrior will get six weeks of well-deserved time off before Rath begins preparations for Hawthorne's summer meet, which kicks off the last day of June.

"That will probably help him, let him grow up a little bit more, and get over the aches and pains that he has," Rath said. "Hopefully he'll develop a little bit. He's a pretty tall horse as it is."


Beggs and Rath have staked Romantic Warrior to everything in the Land of Lincoln, and his conditioner hopes the trotter can compete with the best in the division. He held his own last season and has only improved since then.

"Maybe with someone else, growing up with a predestined life would have created problems. However with me, I was both compliant and used to my father's rule, so pursuing veterinary medicine, it has been. Farm life and horses were what I knew, so becoming a vet agreed with me. It has been a great life. I'm now 73. Except for an occasional bump in the road there's nothing that I would change.

"My father was a strong willed man, but also a very wise one. He wasn't always right, but he was more often than not.

"I had a great childhood and upbringing."

From tending to the family farm in Oshawa, ON, Hayes Sr. progressed to becoming a bookmaker — a legal one. He along with Cliff "Chappy" Chapman (brother of renowned horseman John) had purchased bookmaking charters from the Province of Ontario for fall fair racing.

"Father was a gambler, a pretty smart one. He always carried a substantial bankroll of cash, although at any

given time that might have been all the money in the world that he possessed. There was a time when he had started training horses where he might have starved, if not for the poker games in which he took part in the afternoons, before racing in the evenings."

The younger Hayes recalls being an observer at some of those games.

Dr. John has now been retired from actively training horses since 2013.

Q: Let's begin with your name. You've been known by several, including but not limited to, Robert John, John Jr., Dr. John and Doc. One could understand all of those, but the one by which I and others have occasionally known you by was Sam. Where in the world does Sam fit in?

"You knew father quite well. Anybody that knew him knew that he rarely, if ever lost an argument. If he did lose one, he'd be loath to accept it. When I was born my mother and sister wanted to name me Robert John which became my legal name. Father wanted something like Paul, I think. He didn't want Robert John. So he nicknamed and called me Sam which caught on with everyone outside home. Soon others picked up on it and I became Sam to some who knew me, occasionally you."

Q: Do you miss the sport?

"Not too much. I'm still involved as a member of the Horse Racing Panel of Ontario. We hear appeals of violations of the rules of racing for all three breeds in Ontario. I still follow



most of the big events. I enjoy seeing good horses. But I do not miss the business aspects of the sport. In 2012, when the slots agreement was terminated, I saw the handwriting on the wall and decided that the direction the sport was heading into was not for me. I decided to get out. I have no regrets. When some doors close, others open.

"Things have been very good for me. I've embraced a new lifestyle and group of friends. I exercise a lot. I love playing

online fantasy sports, pretty much all sports, but especially baseball. I'm intrigued by the stock market and dabble in it. I am actively involved with managing my portfolio. The sudden passing of my wife of 37 years in 2015, just as we sold the farm, with retirement in view, has been difficult. She was a gold standard person and partner. We raised two great sons and now have four grandchildren. Christopher and Robert and their families are enjoying successful lives in Toronto. I regret that Heather who sacrificed as a horse trainer's wife, didn't get the retirement opportunity that she so deserved."

Q: Let's start near the beginning with your career in harness racing. What are your earliest recollections?

"Father raced a small stable comprised mostly of fairly cheap trotters at Blue Bonnets and Richelieu Park. That was destined to become quite different when he decided that he hated trotters and only wanted pacers in his stable. I'd help out wherever I could or more truthfully, when I was told to. In the afternoons, he and a group of horsemen would play poker in a tack room. They'd get thirsty and would give me a five dollar bill and send me out to get some soda. The treat was that I'd get to keep the change.

"I remember father sending me on a horse van when I was about 10 years old with two horses to race in Quebec City. I didn't speak any French and very few there spoke English. Father taught me how to say bacon and eggs in French. So all my meals were bacon and eggs for two days."

Q: Tell me about the Shapiro brothers and Beejay Stables.

"Brothers Bob, Conrad and Leo Shapiro were women apparel manufacturers and wholesalers in Montreal. They were also avid harness fans. You would find them at their reserved dining room table at Blue Bonnets during every racing program. Father and the Shapiros became partners in the mid-50s as Beejay Stables. That partnership continued for almost 50 years.

"It began with one unrated mare, Lassie York, who became the dam of their first good horse Sharp N Smart. It grew to several prominent racehorses and a large breeding operation. All the breeding stock, the mares, foals and stallion interests were sold to Dr. Phil McCarthy and Walnut Hall Farm for a seven figure sum.

"Strike out was undoubtedly their best racehorse, but they had many other good pacers including Conquered, Penn Hanover and Keystone Pat. Bob, who acted for the brothers was extremely supportive of me and my career.

"For example, while I was in university, with Bob's encouragement, I had many occasions where I'd leave vet school on Friday or Saturday and drive Keystone Pat in a feature at Yonkers or Liberty Bell. I might take a physiology text along for reading in the paddock.

"In 1970, again at Bob's behest, I spent the summer with a truck and trailer and Penn Hanover going from track to track, racing him in Saturday Night preferreds. I groomed, trained and drove him and slept in front of his stall for three months. It was a magical coming of age experience thanks to the Shapiros."

Q: Was there ever any doubt about you becoming a veterinarian?

"Father wanted it and I complied. Unlike some kids, I always loved school and did well. While I was going to vet school at Guelph, I'd work in the stable while school was out. I was sure that I was going to become an equine vet. While at Vernon Downs I met Dr. John Steele. He encouraged me to work a locum with them after graduating to gain experience, which I did. I would work with one of the practice vets during the day and in the Vernon Downs paddock on race nights. I also did emergency calls at night and on weekends. I was busy, but I had a great time. I learned a lot and met many wonderful people."

Q: What was your greatest thrill in harness racing?

"Without a doubt that would have to be the 1981 Meadowlands Pace with Conquered. Conquered was a very nice horse, but not a great one. I went into the race as a beaten favorite in my elimination and had an outside post in a 12-horse field. I hoped that I could get a piece of the purse, but winning the race probably didn't even cross my mind. I was sitting 10th at the top of the stretch, realizing that I was going to be somewhere.

He just kept on eating up horses or perhaps they just came coming back to him. It was nevertheless a great thrill that very few get the privilege to enjoy. Another great thrill for me was winning the inaugural North America Cup with Legal Notice in 1984. Ironically it was the same horse, that same year that was responsible for my biggest disappointment in the sport. I was boxed in full of pace in the Little Brown Jug. If I would have been able to get out, I'm sure I would have won. Instead Colt Forty-Six was the winner. But, as they say, that's horse racing."

Q: Let's talk a little more about The Senator and some of the quotes by which he was best known.

"They mostly revolved around the Little Brown Jug, which was then the ultimate in pacing. When he said he would rather win the Little Brown Jug than go to heaven, he absolutely meant it. The Little Brown Jug to him was heaven.

"When he was asked if he thought he could win the Jug with Strike Out he said, 'I didn't come to Ohio to run for governor.'

"When he was asked if he had any driving instructions to give Keith Waples who was driving Strike Out, he said, 'I told him to just make four left turns."

Q: It's well known that you are a runner and have loved running for quite some time.

"Not so much now as it used to be. This body and my joints are not able to take the running near as well as before. I've qualified and entered in 12 and competed in seven Boston Marathons. I was a late scratch in the ones in which I didn't run. I was in the terrible one with the bombing in 2013."

Q: Through the years which horsemen have you admired the most?

"I'll start with father. There were two people who he absolutely placed on a pedestal. They were Keith Waples and Carter Duer. It took someone very special to impress my father. Those two certainly did.

"Myself, I admired the journey of Ronnie Waples. Parlaying a modest beginning, hard work and abundant talent, he created his own brand. Three others who I've admired from afar and up close as well were Michel Lachance, Benoit Cote and Jacques Hebert. Not only were they great horsemen, but all three are gentlemen in the truest sense of the word. It's no surprise that all four of them are members of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, with Ronnie and Michel also being members in Goshen.

Q: Who was the greatest horse you've seen through the years?

"That would have to be Niatross. He did it all, on all size tracks and everywhere. I'm fortunate enough to have lived through multiple eras starting with Adios Butler, then Bret Hanover, Albatross and in recent years Somebeachsomewhere. Maybe not by much, but Niatross was the best."

Q: Who was your favorite?

"Certainly not one of my best, but a pacer converted to the trot, Decked, helped me gain stable decision independence from father. He was a homebred by father's first Grand Circuit horse Penn Hanover. His dam was a chestnut mare from Adios' last crop named Battling Bess. For the era, Battling Bess was probably as well-bred a pacer as one could find. She was a half-sister to Best Of All and Coffee Break. Although Decked was bred to be a pacer, he wanted to be a trotter. I wanted to let him trot, if that was what he wanted to do. Father was winding down his physical involvement with the horses at the time. He just scoffed at me when I told him that I wanted to let Decked trot. 'There's no way he will be a trotter. When he goes faster, he will just switch onto the pace. You are just wasting your time and effort.' But Decked and me had other ideas. He wanted to trot and trot he did. He was a stakes winner from the very beginning at 2. He went on and earned of \$140,000 on the trot. We did try to get him to pace. To say that he was an ordinary pacer would be giving him too much credit."

Dragging is a blight on harness racing

Dragging is the term used to describe the practice by racetracks of holding the field long after the official clock has reached zero minutes to post time. It is a blight upon our sport, and totally destructive of the integrity of harness racing.

If there is any hope of creating new bettors or new owners, dragging makes that impossible. Especially in this climate of Federal doping charges against both standardbred and thoroughbred participants, there is already a dark cloud hanging


over our business. And anyone who has been in it for any length of time is well aware that the general perception of harness racing is that it is crooked.

Parenthetically, I was aware that many years ago there had been a smattering of harness races in Japan. So Morty Finder and I decided to scope out the possibility of getting it restarted there on a pari-mutuel basis. Alas, we quickly learned that harness racing had floundered and died at the one Japanese track that tried it, because it had "the appearance" of being fixed.

This perception had entirely to do with the fact that horses hitched to a racing bike had none of the flexibility of horses under saddle. Can one imaging the multiples by which that perception would be heightened if the races hadn't gone off until six or seven minutes after the clock hit zero?

For me, the notion that betting will be enhanced by dragging is a self-fulfilling construct. If the track drags, the bets come in late. But it's obviously a learned response, because the biggest single race handle in the civilized world is on the Kentucky Derby. In the Derby, when the clock hits zero, the horses are entering the gate.

How dragging came to be is irrelevant, and whatever defenses of it the tracks can muster is basically sophistry. One doesn't have to be a Nobel quality economist to understand that there is a finite amount of betting money available for every racing program, and, drag or no drag, it is going to be bet.



This touches on another subject, the fact that most of today's handle is bet off-track. For a hard-core bettor, he or she wants the off-times at the best betting tracks to be staggered so he or the unlikely she can get down on more than one track. It only stands to reason that if the published post times are observed, those times can be staggered, for the convenience of the bettors.

(Here I should disclose that I personally do not bet. Whenever I've been asked about it, my answer has always been: "I don't bet on horse races. I'm a true longshot player, so I'm saving my money for my old age.")

If some smart track operator would screw up his courage, there would be some good PR in a public statement that the published post times and the official clock would always be respected. It would be totally in character for Jeff Gural to take such a step and enhance the integrity of the racing at his three tracks.

The same goes for my three friends who own The Red Mile. George, Joe, and Frankie have already shown the world how committed they are to the best interests of harness racing. It would be totally in character for them to eliminate dragging and make The Red Mile a leader in this vital matter.


RE: The Red Mile, I have a personal interest here. I have a new partner in two 2-year-old trotters who, if all goes as planned, will be racing shortly here in Lexington.

When she and her husband come to their first harness race, I desperately do not want to have to explain that zero minutes to post time is a fiction. These are the kind of folks our sport desperately needs.

Please, my friends, let them and the world see that The Red Mile is totally committed to the integrity of this sport we all love.

Ashleigh Hensley – Trainer

Some horsepeople come from a harness racing family, and others do not.

For Ashleigh Hensley, her parents Ron and Jodie Cullen, and her grandparents on both sides (Carol and Morley Cullen), (George Manning) her great-grandpa, Alfred Siliphant, trainer/blacksmith Uncle Greg Manning and Aunt Debbie McLeod trainer/driver (now a presiding judge in Alberta), were all heavily involved.

So, it is no surprise that Hensley and her brother, driver Travis Cullen would follow their path. Hensley's sister, Brittany Cullen, is also involved in the sport as she owns and runs a small business called "Britt's Custom Creations" where she makes customized horse attire and clothing for everyone in the industry.

"I was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba. My parents were both actively involved their whole life in harness racing, and I have worked in the barn for as long as I can remember," Hensley said. "I got really involved in the sport when I was 13 years old. That is when I owned my first horse – Ednas Pomme — who was given to my brother and I from my parents' long-time owner and friend Earl Stewart.

"Ednas meant so much to us in many ways, so when her racing career ended we gave her to our great-uncle where she lived her life out until she passed away of old age.

"In 2008 (at age 17), I got my first trainers license and trained a couple horses that my brother and I bought together with our own money. My brother and I worked together until we graduated from high school, and then I ventured out on my own.

"I began my racing career on the Manitoba fair circuit, then raced at Northlands Park, Alberta Downs and Century Downs. From there I went on to race at Pompano Park in Florida and Hoosier Park in Anderson, Indiana."

In 2014, Hensley would meet her future husband, Ed Hensley, and the two would teamed up in 2015 and have worked side-by-side together ever since.



"We have different ideas on certain things, but at the end of the day we are very competitive and just want to do the best we can with the horses and win races.

"I guess in a way it's good to have different opinions because every horse is different, but I don't question my husband for he's a great horseman. He does all our own blacksmith work, which is a big asset, and drives our horses.

"Our teamwork is pretty simple: in the barn I get the horses ready and Ed does the majority of training on the track these days. It's a good system and works very well for us."

Racing in the frigid, winter months in Canada is very challenging and at times dangerous.

"Yes, racing during the winter in Canada is definitely challenging and this is where my husbands' talents as a blacksmith really come in handy.

"The horses' shoes need to be sharp and corked up, which takes a lot of extra time. And in the winter months, the upkeep of our farm track can be quite difficult. We are lucky to have my father onboard, for he takes care of the track and does a great job! Bless his heart, for dad spends a lot of late nights and very early mornings on the track during the winter making sure it is safe for all."

The track Ashleigh is talking about is the one on the farm that they purchased from horseman/trainer/driver Kelly Sheppard.

"In 2017, Ed and I purchased the 50-acre farm with my brother, Travis Cullen. We bale our own hay and get roughly 2,500 to 3,000 square bales every year.

"There are 11 turnout paddocks, 50 stalls, and the track is ½ mile. One of our horses holds the track record there, taken a mark in 1:54.

"Since moving to Ontario, we have bought only one yearling, but we have decided to get into breeding our own mares, since we can't compete with the big owners and huge prices the horses are bringing at the sales.

"Today, we have four pacers and four trotters. We have a 2-year-old homebred in training named Floyd The Freak, who is out of our mare Escuela; and we have a 3-year-old in training named Radio Lab." Ashleigh said her all-time favorite is a horse called Terrorizer.

"Terrorizer is super special for he was the very first horse I owned 100 per cent of. I bought him for \$1,000, but, remember, horses don't know how much they cost.

"Although he wasn't too much, he did take a mark of 1:52.4 and banked \$123,148 in lifetime earnings. He is now retired and living the good life on our farm.

"As far as the highlight of my career, it was when the mare Scarlett Hanover won the Super Final in 2021-2022 and the O'Brien Award in both 2021 and 2022. At that time we trained Scarlett for our good friends Ron Burke and Mark Weaver. They are great memories and I'll forever be grateful.

"Ed and I usually only train horses we personally own. I guess, as far as the 'best ones' I've had, it would have to be Request For Parole, Audrey's Dream and April Rose."

As for what direction racing in Canada looks to be going, Ashleigh said, "I think racing in Canada looks promising, so far. Although it's definitely not like it used to be, it's still going pretty strong. The Canadian people love harness racing and as long as they get to go to the track and watch and bet, I think Canada racing will be around awhile."

Choices.

Our minds are strange. We don't seem comfortable when we are undecided. It is easier to take a position. There is a moment when we decide to get a vaccine jab or not to get a vaccine jab. You may go left or right, and your reasons are complicated,

but it is difficult to reverse once you begin down the road. It is annoying and usually futile when others try to convince you that you are misguided.

Many things — that third tequila, the latest tattoo, a time-share condo, a mullet haircut, your long-term relationship with a high-maintenance waitress named Wanda, supporting a political candidate and buying a snowmobile — all seemed like good ideas. Once upon a time, they all made perfect sense.

I could choose any trotting stallion for my lone broodmare. The list of potential sires goes from A to Z. I went with Volstead. Why? My choice began with a misunderstanding followed by questionable reasoning and contrary thinking but ended with me sticking by my decision.

Last month, perusing a stallion directory, looking at glossy equine photographs, and pretending to understand the information and data, I stumbled across a trotting stallion named Volstead with a series of (F)'s behind his impressive yearly racing performance

results. I assumed Volstead was a French sire and raced in France. This quirky news planted a seed in my mind.

Despite only visiting France one time, 20 years ago for one week, I am a bit of a Francophile. Except for eating snails and finding the humor of Jerry Lewis amusing, everything else about France jazzes me up.

I became smitten with Volstead. A coin slipped into my mental slot. Each shred of information was about to be influenced from that point on.

For example:

Not even the colossal detail that my original premise/hunch was completely bogus could derail my Volstead train.

The (F) listing on the pedigree page was fake news due to my ignorance. A few days after choosing Volstead, an informed source told me the letter (F) in the stallion directory did not indicate France. Instead, it meant foreign.

Volstead raced in Sweden and was born in the USA. Here is where our minds can go astray. When I learned the French Connection was nonsense and existed only in my brain, I changed my thinking instead of switching from Volstead. Sweden is sort of close to France, and hey, they have nice trotters.

I contacted an extremely knowledgeable breeder and asked if the genetic pedigree cross between Volstead and my broodmare was okay. Due to the sire of my mare, he gave a lukewarm thumbs up. I interpreted this modest green light as a rave review.

Also, in my mental playbook, I felt a sense of discovery. Every professional, scientific breeder in the world was, and is, aware of this excellent sire. Because I am an amateur, I was only vaguely familiar with Volstead until a few weeks ago. Nevertheless, I began running around like I had discovered plutonium.

I viewed replays of Volstead in action. He looked magnificent on the racetrack, without trotting hobbles, long strides, and perfection in motion. Of course, all 50 of the trotters look fantastic in those European races, but my guy was a touch better in my eyes.

I discovered he also stood for stud duty in Australia and found that his first Australian crop sold very nicely. This discovery thrilled me. Honestly, I don't know dilly squat about Australian horse racing or the Aussie breeding market, but now that I had some semen in the game, this information was excellent news.

When googling Volstead, I found that it was either one of Jacksonville's best-loved bars based on its inspired cocktails and speakeasy attitude or related to the National Prohibition Act, ratified in January 1919, sponsored by a man named Volstead. On and on I go. On and on we go. We pick a team and cheer like maniacs. We believe we are analytical and not subject to strange rivers that push our boats. You say neigh, but choose an issue, a political party, a hobby, a candidate, or an opinion. Have you changed your mind lately?

My unexpected choice of this stallion has me pumped. Time will tell. Apple stock, Enron, tattoos, politicians, mullets, penicillin, and seat belts seemed good ideas. Some worked out better than others. In their way, they were all intriguing.

Wanda was the exception. She was in the mistake column from day one. I finally admitted it three years later when she torched my pick-up truck.







Majorly Sexy debut majorly rewarding

Not often does a racehorse make his career debut at the age of 6. Even less often does that horse travel from one continent to another to do so.

But that was the case with Australian-born Majorly Sexy, who made his first start last week at The Meadowlands. The 6-year-old male pacer was one of the horses Team Tritton, the driver/trainer tandem of Lauren and Shane Tritton, brought to the U.S. when they relocated their harness racing stable from Down Under in 2020.

Lauren purchased Majorly Sexy, a son of Art Major—Sexy Lady Whitby, as a yearling. In the ensuing years, she watched as the horse's career was thwarted by a variety of injuries and illnesses.

When the decision was made to move to the States, she needed to convince Shane that the unraced pacer was worthy of the journey.

Any reservations were abated by the fact both Lauren and Shane knew the horse was talented. No matter which of the award-winning Team Tritton stablemates Majorly Sexy faced in training, he was the boss and handled them easily.

"He was always better than all those horses but never got any further, no fault of his own," Lauren said. "I always knew that he had something there, I just couldn't prove it. But I had faith in him. He's such a beautiful horse. He never really did anything wrong but give me heartache."

Lauren's heartache turned to a heart filled with joy last week when Majorly Sexy finally made his debut. She was in the sulky as the gelding finished third from post eight in a \$14,500 conditioned pace at The Big M.

"He has no idea what he's doing, he's just making it up as he goes," Lauren said. "He was a load of TNT in the race. He kind of over-raced a little bit and got a little weary up the straight. The first thing I said to him after was 'Good boy, buddy, but next time I'll show you what to do and you react when I tell you to react.' But we were stoked with his run. It was really rewarding."



A week prior to his debut, Majorly Sexy finished second to Grand Circuit winner Covered Bridge, who is racing in the MGM Borgata Series, in a qualifier at The Meadowlands. He also won a qualifier at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono on March 2 and trained once at The Big M, clocking a :26.1 final quarter.

"We wanted to let him stretch out," Lauren said. "I just let him slide out at the top of the lane and he did it under a hold on his own. I've driven a lot of good horses in my career and this horse feels really special. I know he's got a motor; you can feel that when you're sitting behind him."

Majorly Sexy returned to action Saturday (March 26) in a \$17,500 conditioned pace at The Meadowlands (results unavailable prior to press time). Lauren again handled the driving, leaving from post three in a field of nine. Majorly Sexy was the 7-2 morning-line second choice.

Lauren, who was the youngest person in Australia to drive 500 winners and captured multiple premiership titles Down Under, recently returned to driving following the birth of the Trittons' second child, Emily. She turned 1 on Wednesday. The couple's son Levi will be 5 in July.

"I'll drive when I can; it won't be a full-time thing," Lauren said. "I really enjoy it and I miss it, but it's a long night. That was the idea coming over here, to have a better life, and settle down a little bit. I'm really enjoying the training side of things as well. Hopefully (Emily) is the next generation female driver."

Lauren drove at The Meadowlands for the first time in race when she sat behind Majorly Sexy in his debut last week.



"It was great," said Lauren, who has driven 12 times in the States. "It really reminds me of home. It's the spitting image of Menangle, just faster. It was a good experience, and the atmosphere was great."

Even greater thanks to Majorly Sexy.

"It was a long time coming," Lauren said. "I'm taking everything day by day. Hopefully he stays sound for us because we could be on a really good ride."

Racine Bell clocks fastest mile in round two of Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

Following a nose loss in the first leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, **Racine Bell** came to play in the second round and obliterated her rivals, overcoming post seven and powering off to a 1:51.4 victory in the first of four \$40,000 divisions Friday night (March 25) at Yonkers Raceway.

Jason Bartlett had the whip out at the start, and Racine Bell, sent off as the even-money second choice in the field, took control from 4-5 choice Scarlett Hanover off the opening bend. Racine Bell hit the opening quarter in 27 seconds flat with the field stretched out and the favorite on her back. Bartlett managed a :29.3 second fraction, putting the field to sleep with minimal dispute, and from there the race to catch her was on, with few getting within hailing distance.

Racine Bell hit three-quarters in 1:24.4 and after that, Bartlett asked her for a response. He got the one he was looking for, as the 5-year-old by So Surreal flew around the final bend and coasted off to an open-lengths victory with a final quarter of 27 seconds flat. Scarlett Hanover and driver Yannick Gingras managed to hold second, with Lucky Artist A finishing well along the pylons for third. Mystifying finished fourth.

Owned by Chris Lawton and Dale Lawton, Racine Bell was a winner for the second time in five 2022 starts and returned \$4.10,\$2.10, and \$2.10 across the board. Scarlett Hanover paid \$2.10 and \$2.10, with Lucky Artist A returning \$4.00 to show. The exacta paid \$5.40 and the triple was worth \$27.80.

David Dewhurst trains Racine Bell, who won for the 23rd time in 55 lifetime starts.

Easy To Please and driver Jordan Stratton made it two straight in the series in the next division, catapulting off of perfect cover to victory as the 7-2 third choice in the field. Easy To Please drove past pace-setter Dragon Roll in the stretch and was well clear of first-over Blue lvy, who finished second, with 3-5 choice Drama Act coming on late for the third spot.

Dragon Roll put the field in line from the start for Todd McCarthy as the 2-1 second choice. A first round winner, Dragon Roll set

rated fractions of :27.4 and :56.2 for the opening half. Blue Ivy and driver Tyler Buter pulled late on the third turn without cover and pressured the leader through a 1:24.1 three-quarters, with Easy To Please second-over and Drama Act third-over for George Brennan.

Stratton tipped Easy To Please, a 4-year-old by Roll With Joe, wide on the final turn, and the Cory Stratton-trained mare responded under urging to surge to a 1:52.1 victory. Owned by Our Three Sons Stable LLC. and Cory Stratton, Easy To Please now has three wins and two seconds in five starts this season.

Easy To Please returned \$9.80, \$4.90, and \$2.60 across the board. Blue Ivy paid \$13.80 to place and \$5.70 to show, with Drama Act at \$2.50 to show. The exacta was worth \$155.50 and the triple paid \$481.00.

Miss You N and Dexter Dunn were decisive winners in the third division of the Blue Chip Matchmaker, scoring in 1:52.3 over 60-1 shot Bolt Of Beauty, with No Win No Feed A third after a coverless trip. The Virgil Morgan-trained Miss You N is owned by Carl Howard and Bottom Line Stable LLC.

Lit De Rose took control early from Siesta Beach and had the lead through the :27.4 opening fraction. The 2-5 choice Miss You N and Dunn tucked on the first turn but made a move before the quarter to secure the front and never looked back. Miss You N cut fractions of :56.3 and 1:25 as Lit De Rose struggled to hold down the pocket and No Win No Feed A advanced without cover, followed by Bolt Of Beauty. Dunn shook the lines on Miss You N, and the mare sprinted off with a :27.3 final quarter. Marcus Miller guided Bolt Of Beauty up for the place spot, with No Win No Feed A and Man Dontforget Me following her home in third and fourth, respectively.

Miss You N paid \$2.80, \$2.30 and \$2.10 across the board as the prohibitive choice. Bolt Of Beauty returned \$16.40 and \$9.40, with No Win No Feed A at \$4.40 to show. The exacta paid \$105.50, and the triple was worth \$546.00.

Mystical Carrie made it two straight in the series, lasting on the lead and gamely holding Best Head West off along her inside to score in 1:53.4 for driver Marcus Miller.

With just a field of six, Mystical Carrie controlled from the pole position and set a :27.4 opening quarter and :57.3 half. Last year's champion Machnhope and Andrew McCarthy came to challenge at the half, followed by 6-5 favorite Keep Rockin A second-over and second choice Karma Seelster third-over in the flow. Miller let Mystical Carrie pace up the backstretch, hitting three quarters in 1:25.4 and holding her position through the final turn.

In the homestretch Machnhope continued to press, with Best Head West coming along the pylons late, but Mystical Carrie, trained by Erv Miller, held gamely for the victory. She downed Best Head West in a photo, and Machnhope was third.

Owned by Mystical Marker Farms LLC., Mystical Carrie won for the third time this year and returned \$10.00, \$5.20 and \$3.10 across the board. Best Head West paid \$6.80 and \$3.40 and Machnhope paid \$3.90 to show. The exacta came in at \$27.60, with the triple worth \$169.50.

The second round of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series highlights Monday's (March 28) program at Yonkers, with five \$50,000 divisions on tap.

After Dave Palone gave him a :29.3 second-quarter breather, he was able to withstand the Lightning Lane challenge of the pocket-sitting Pack Your Bags and defeated him by a half-length in 1:53.4. Treasurer Delight completed the ticket.

Ron Burke trains Good Deal for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, J&T Silva – Purnel&Libby and Larry Karr. It was one of four wins for Palone on the 11-race card.

Friday's "must pay" Jackpot Pick 5 generated a pool exceeding \$104,000 and multiple winning tickets returning \$281.18.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Wednesday when the 11-race program features an \$11,102.28 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5. First post is 12:45 PM.

Plainridge Park opens for training March 28

In advance of their first scheduled live day of racing for 2022 on Monday (April 11), Plainridge Park will open its track to trainers wishing to work their horses on Monday (March 28) and it will be available for workouts every day (except Sundays) from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. until the meet begins.

There will also be two days of qualifying races offered prior to opening and those will be held on Monday (April 4) —enter by 9 a.m. on Friday (April 1) — and Thursday (April 7) — enter by 9 a.m. on Tuesday (April 5). Post time for both qualifying days will be 1 p.m.

The condition sheet for the first week of racing (April 11-14) is now available on the United States Trotting Association's website.

Please note that the live racing schedule for 2022 has changed. It starts out with a Monday-Tuesday-Thursday rotation for April, May, June and July until Friday is added on July 29 and continues through the end of August. Post time for all race days from April through August is 4 p.m. The one exception is the Grand Circuit card held on Sunday (July 24) that features the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts trot and the \$100,000 Clara Barton distaff pace. Post time for that day is 2 p.m.

In September, racing reverts back to Monday-Tuesday-Thursday until Sept. 18 when Sunday is added through the month of October, with the exception of Oct. 30. Post time also moves back to 2 p.m. Sundays are then dropped in November and the Monday-Tuesday-Thursday schedule returns for the final month of the meet until Thanksgiving Thursday (Nov. 24) which will be dark and raced on Friday (Nov. 25) which is closing day. Post time in November is 1 p.m.

Harrah's Philly plays host to qualifiers, season starts April 3

The trotters and pacers returned to southeastern Pennsylvania on Friday morning (March 25), as Harrah's Philadelphia held 10 qualifying races in preparation for its 2022 opener on Sunday, April 3.

The star of the show was Shake That House, a 6-year-old son of American Ideal who has earned over \$800,000; he won the Hempt and Progress Finals at three and last year was second in the William Haughton FFA Final. Trainer Chris Ryder had the horse ready at the opening bell, coming out of the two-hole for driver Dexter Dunn to win by 7¼ lengths in 1:52.2 for owners Crawford Farms Racing and Alan Johnston.

There will be another set of qualifying races at Philly on Tuesday morning (March 29), the day of the week that will be the regular qualifying day at Harrah's; horses should be entered by 11 a.m. Monday. (Declaration day for Tuesday qualifiers will be Sunday once the meeting gets underway.) The day after these qualifiers, the draw for the first card of the season, Sunday, April 3, will be conducted, with entries to be sent in by 10 a.m.

After Opening Day, Harrah's Philadelphia will operate on a Sunday (12:40), Thursday and Friday (12:25 both days) schedule throughout the month of April, with the exception of a dark day on Easter Sunday, April 17.

A sad ending after 45 years

I have lost interest in harness racing and here's why: I consider myself a die-hard life-long harness racing fan for over 45 years. My dad owned a few horses and I owned a fraction of one. I've been in the winner's circle. I know how it works. I'm not really into betting but just loved following the sport. I saw Albatross, Niatross, Super Bowl, Mr Muscleman and Somebeachsomewhere, etc. in person. These horses were like superstar athletes. I loved following the records and the breeding and I loved going to the fairs to see it on the ground level. I've made weekend trips to Canada and the Hambletonian. I was really into it. There are so many things that have turned me off though. Here's a few of them.

- 1. I feel owners, trainers and drivers treat horses like property instead of the living beings they are (with feelings). Horses are discarded like garbage when they can't race anymore with many going to the kill pens after they have raced hard for their owners and trainers over the course of years. They have made them money and or enjoyment. Do they deserve being sent on overcrowded trucks without any food or water hundreds of miles away to Canada or Mexico to get slaughtered? What a grisly sight that must be, just horrifying. I don't see any trainers, drivers or race track owners doing anything to find homes or raise funds for these older horses who can't race anymore. Pure greed. Sure there's the Standardbred Retirement Foundation but how many horses can they handle? Why is there not a percentage of all purses going to retired horses and finding them new homes? Their well-being after racing is TOTALLY ignored by all in the sport. Sure there are a few good people who care about them but way too many who don't. Greed I guess.
- 2. This sport just doesn't get it. Every time there is a new superstar horse that people recognize and adore, they retire them for breeding at the end of age 3. Gee, the horses are not even fully grown at 3. We as fans are missing so much by not seeing these superstars at age 4. (Muscle Hill, Donato Hanover, Somebeachsomewhere, etc., etc. the list is endless and virtually the who's who of racing stars retired after their 3-year-old campaign). The public can't relate to a new crop of stars every year. Look at Greyhound and Dan Patch and the buzz they created by racing for a much longer period. Even Niatross raced at 4.
- 3. I owned a share of a nice trotter a few years ago and he just won in 1:56. 1 at Saratoga's half-mile track. Not too bad right? What did that get him? Some jerk in Maine bought him two weeks later to watch him at the fairs once a year and when he didn't win after a few starts he sold him to the Amish. He's now pulling a buggy in PA. Sickening. Why would I like a sport who does that?
- 4. Now the freeze brands are not required. All that means is

those horses can go to the kill auctions and not be known who they are and what they did. Some really bad decisions were made without the horses well-being in mind and the non-caring USTA. It's all greed. There's no compassion for horses there. Why support a sport who doesn't care about their voiceless stars?

- 5. I found out the horse that I owned was involved with a trainer who got busted using illegal substances in horses a few years back. Why would I like the sport? Even when my dad owned horses, he found out the drivers were taking turns winning with their horses and not trying 100 per cent all the time. Yet, they were taking his money for training bills each month. This is nothing new.
- 6. It's like the tracks are trying not to have fans since much of the racing occurs when people work. Post times are in the afternoon, dinner hour, etc. when its physically impossible to get there for the working class. Oh I know you can bet online but that won't get you new fans, unless people can go look at the horses in person. If you only want retirees to see the races, then keep it the way it is and when they are gone there are no fans left.

Harness racing is just a shell of what it was (see Pompano Park) and it's really sad it has come to this. I'm not sure it can be fixed.
