Lawson retains hope for return to racing in Ontario despite latest shutdown

Ontario's third province-wide shutdown due to COVID-19 will halt racing after today, but Woodbine's CEO believes local health authorities will approve a return to racing before the month-long lockdown ends.

If you can, just for a second, put aside the inconsistency, startling lack of logic and sheer idiocy of which businesses will remain open and which ones will be forced to close in Ontario's latest COVID-19 shutdown orders set to begin Saturday (April 3) and last at least 28 days.

Yes, the rules and zones and colors keep changing in Ontario as the province enters its third lockdown/shutdown/hiatus or whatever new name the politicians have dreamed up.

Yes, many businesses, including horse racing, are going to take another beatdown as Canada continues to lag behind most of the western world in delivering vaccines to its citizens.

Yes, it makes absolutely no sense to ban horse racing, an outdoor sport that has operated safely in Ontario – without one known positive COVID-19 case related to its activities – since the pandemic began.

But at this point, with horse racing ranking extremely low on the list of provincial priorities – despite its notable economic impact – it's also mostly wasted breath and time and it doesn't help people make crucial decisions about their livelihoods.

Instead, it's important to figure out what can be done to get horse racing back as quickly as possible. Woodbine CEO Jim Lawson retains some hope. Though, allow him to be frustrated like most of us.

"Now they are allowing golf. I'm a golfer and looking forward to getting out golfing, but you and I both know that when you go out to the golf course, you might show up with your mask on, but there aren't any real strict protocols and procedures like those you've seen at the racetrack with no spectators at the racetrack... it's very frustrating and I share the frustrations of the racing industry that people can go out and golf, but these people aren't allowed to go outside and earn a living in a business that has had zero transmission of Covid. It's extremely frustrating," Lawson said as he kept one eye on the province's press conference announcing the shutdown. "It's really in some ways hard to watch. They just had a question about small restaurants and why they are being picked on... They've already been closed and they are not the source of the problem. And here I am thinking, 'Well, they are closing horse racing down again, but there's been zero transmission at the horse racing tracks' and it's frustrating."

That said, Lawson believes he is making some headway with provincial officials that could allow horse racing to return much sooner than 28 days.

Woodbine CEO Jim Lawson said there is some hope local health authorities will allow horse racing to resume.

From his discussions with officials as recently as Thursday morning (April 1) Lawson said the province is, "prepared to support live racing, provided that the chief medical officer of the local health authority is supportive and onside with approving live racing going ahead. So, that gives us a window of hope.

"As of today, we have contacted Halton Health relative to Mohawk and are expecting to have a discussion with them... I'm not so sure it's been set up yet, but they are prepared to talk about it. We have explained to them that there may be an opportunity to commence racing and that the province

will support it, as long as the local health authorities are onside... We delivered a package to Toronto Public Health this past week (in relation to Woodbine Racetrack being able to open its thoroughbred season on April 17 as scheduled). I personally had very constructive discussions with Toronto Public Health last week and this week and I expect we'll be able to have the same with Halton Health.

"I'm not giving up... The good news is they are talking to me, they are listening to me and generally I would say that they are supportive."

Lawson is well aware that the situation is dire. This is the third shutdown of racing since the pandemic began. Racing was shut down for six weeks in April and May of 2020. Most recently, racing was halted for seven weeks beginning just after Christmas.

"On the standardbred side, my big fear — as it was in January and there's some truth to it — is that people are going to pull out of the province and go elsewhere. We've already had discussions with standardbred trainers that are expecting to leave. The economic damage done to the racetracks and to the industry is huge and, in some ways, might be irreparable. We'll never make that back, for one, and this is not like people closing down temporarily and then coming back, we might lose those horses for the whole year. It's going to do big damage," Lawson said.

"On the thoroughbred side, we've got 1,300 horses (at Woodbine) and we have over 2,000 stall applications. They've stopped shipping in. We've had a number of calls from people who aren't coming up now. It's going to do irreparable damage to the economics of Woodbine and that does real damage to the whole industry in this province, if Woodbine can't generate income."

"With the whole province, we're talking 15,000 or 20,000 people (employed in the horse racing business). They make a lot — and I believe them when they say it — about mental health... When you start to consider the mental health issues

coming from people being off work and out of work and being frustrated at not being able to earn a living there's so many issues that come with that."

Lawson also continues to speak about horse racing's, "impeccable record, especially when you're talking about Mohawk... We've operated there for the better part of 10 months at Mohawk, four to five nights a week, with zero transmission of COVID. It's an outdoor activity with strict protocols and strict procedures. It's been proven and established that it is a safe activity. It's been allowed to operate in the United States and, for that matter, around the world in France, the United Kingdom, Ireland and Australia with great success as an outdoor activity.

Therein lies Jim Lawson's hope and, by extension, the hopes of an entire industry in Ontario.

In a time when facts and science are allegedly driving policy, he believes logic will ultimately win out.

Given the lunacy of recent decisions, forgive me if I find that tough to believe, but I hope he's right.

Family gives Delaware-based trainer Jason Johnson inspiration every day

Jason Johnson doesn't always hear the cheers, but he knows they are there.

Whenever one of his horses hits the finish line first, the trainer's smile lasts nearly as long as the time it took to run the race.

He has good reason to sport that big smile.

"My family are my biggest fans," said the Delaware-based horseman. "Having them on my side gives me inspiration every day. Even on a bad day, they can pick me up. When a horse of mine wins, I know they're excited for me."

Support, from his wife Amy and their children Jayden and Ava, along with backing from friends and horsepeople, has been a staple in Johnson's career since the day he began his life in standardbred racing 13 years ago.

"I grew up in the business even though I never started training on my own until recently. My brother [Mike Johnson] and I are 18 years apart and when I was younger, he had horses with George Teague Jr., George Dennis and Eddie Dennis. My parents [Stan and Pat Johnson] took me to races almost every night, Harrington Raceway, Dover Downs and good old Brandywine Raceway. I actually learned how to read via the race program."

That early horse racing education, unbeknownst to him at the time, would help galvanize a love for the game, and eventually lead him to the racetrack looking for work.

Johnson's knowledge of the sport, keen attitude and strong work ethic quickly drew the interest of several Delaware trainers.

"I've been lucky enough to work for top trainers around our area, people like George Dennis, Josh Green, Kevin Lare, Trish Foulk and Ed Gannon Jr., where I was able to learn different

styles of training from each one."

They weren't the only ones to take notice of Johnson's talents.

In 2020, he was named as the recipient of the Delaware Standardbred Owners Association (DSOA) James T. Case Jr. Horizon Award, an honor given to a rising star in the industry.

"I got a letter in the mail from the DSOA telling me that I had received the award. That's how I found out. It's a good feeling to be recognized, especially for something that you love doing."

It's been over the past few years where Johnson has felt he's hit his best stride as a trainer.

His numbers certainly help back up that belief. In 2018, he won 27 races, upping the total to 35 the following season. Last year, in a COVID-19-impacted campaign, he posted 29 wins and \$259,953 in purse earnings.

"I've been on my own for about seven years, but it's been the last few years that have been really good to me. A few years ago, Dave Neilson sent me a couple of really good horses. One of them is Need Luck [an eight-year-old New Zealand-bred trotting son of Great Success]. We got him going."

"I would say Tour De Lindy [a 7-year-old trotting son of Lucky Chucky] is the highlight. He was bought out of the Mel Hoover Amish Sale and cost around \$10,000. I trained him down and he really took off for us. He had a good year in 2020, even with COVID shutting things down for a while. He made close to \$60,000, which was nice to see. I also have a new owner, Josh Graber, who I picked up last year. He sent me a couple of trotters and some others as well. Another one of his, Somebaddude [a 6-year-old son of Somebeachsomewhere], came to me this January. His first few starts were a little rough, but he finished second in 1:49.4 on March 25 [at Dover Downs]. It was an impressive race and it looks like he's really rounding into form."

Johnson doesn't need to be racing to enjoy the sport.

"I watch races every day, even when I don't have any racing. I look at the horses and I study them. I look at the equipment they're wearing – this one has a hood on, that one has an open bridle – I really look at everything. And it's not just the local racing that I watch. I watch races from everywhere."

Currently, Johnson has 14 horses – half racing, the other half training back – in his stable.

Closing in on 200 career wins, the 39-year-old is working as hard as he ever has, eager to continue his stable's winning ways.

He hasn't forgotten what it took to get him there.

"I like the industry as a whole. It's kind of laid-back, in that you do your own thing. It's long hours. You work early in the morning and then race at night, but every day is different. That's what I like about racing. Nothing is ever the same. You learn something new every day... actually you might learn something new every hour. I just love what I do. I guess the only difficult part of this job is that it takes you away from the family a bit, which isn't easy."

For Johnson, it's tougher than most.

His youngest daughter, 21-month-old Jayden, was born

with a congenital heart defect.

She has already undergone three surgeries and has another procedure scheduled near the end of 2022 to have two valves replaced.

"Everything is good right now. We haven't been able to go as many places because we don't want to her get sick, especially now with COVID. That could take a big toll on her, so we don't go too many places. We'll go out for walks and she comes to the barn a lot. Both of my daughters love the

horses. It's going to be a long process for Jayden, but so far, knock on wood, everything has been good. The biggest thing is to make sure she doesn't get sick. We're doing everything we can so that doesn't happen. We're staying strong as a family."

Thanks in large part, noted Johnson, due to his better half.

"I really need to give a shout-out to my wife for keeping things in order around the house and taking care of the kids since I'm at the track most nights. Right now, I'm just racing at Dover Downs, so it's not so bad. But traveling will be on the horizon soon and I'll be going out of state at times, to places like Chester, Pocono and possibly, The Meadowlands."

Whenever he hits the road with his band of trotters and pacers, he'll be reminded of the support that waits for him back home.

And whenever he wins, he knows he won't be the only member of his family celebrating.

For Johnson, that's always something worth cheering about.

Ontario to have two yearling sales again in 2021 – one virtual, one live

The Ontario Select Yearling Sale will be a traditional live auction held on Sept. 26. The London Virtual Yearling Sale will be an online only auction beginning Oct. 16 on ongait.com.

Ontario's yearlings sales will be conducted in 2021 as they were in 2020, sale organizers have confirmed. **The London Virtual Yearling Sale** will be held entirely online again this year. **The Ontario Select Yearling Sale** will be a traditional live auction – most likely at Winbak Farm of Ontario – with the ability to also bid online.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, most Ontario yearlings were sold through a traditional auction at the London Select Yearling Sale at the Agriplex at The Western Fair District adjacent to The Raceway. Due to health restrictions and the fact the Agriplex has been used as a COVID-19 field hospital and vaccination site since early in the pandemic, the loss of its traditional home led London sale organizers to move the sale to an online auction only through www.ongait.com in 2020.

"It will be entirely online again," said sale manager Ann Straatman of the 2021 auction. "That's because our venue is still a field hospital and the rental is going to continue until November, so there's not a chance for us to put a sale set up in there while it's still being used for vaccinations."

So far, Seelster Farms – where Straatman serves as reproduction manager – and Stonebridge Farm have committed to selling at the Virtual sale. Winbak, Preferred Equine, Twinbrook, Erinwood and Princeton Farms have committed to selling at the Select sale.

Ontario Select Yearling Sale manager Pat Woods said the reason for holding an in-person, traditional auction is, "we just feel with yearlings that people want to see them. They want to see what they are buying. They want to just take that last look at it before it goes into the ring. It's what the trainers and owners are telling us they want."

"I've always felt that a live auction is good for the business. It's good for people in the business to get together and have a drink, a talk, go out for dinner. There's been a lot of great partnerships on horses that came out of the sale. You know, two guys are bidding that maybe don't have enough money separately, but they come together to buy the horse that they want and it goes on to be the next great champion... and it all happened because they were sitting next to each other at the sale or gave each other a nod to go partners on it and

then they own the horse. You just can't do that online, or at least not as easily."

LAST YEAR'S VIRTUAL NUMBERS

In 2020, the London Virtual Yearling Sale – the only major standardbred sale in North America conducted entirely online – saw 102 yearlings collectively grossed \$3,312,990 for an average of \$32,480 (Canadian dollars). As a comparison – which is admittedly imperfect since the 2019 auction was a traditional live auction where nearly three times the number of yearlings were sold – the 2019 two-day London sale grossed \$6,285,000 for 291 sold, producing an average of \$21,598. By that imperfect measure, 2020's online average was up more than 50 per cent over last year's traditional sale average.

"I think most (consignors) would say that they had a successful sale," Straatman said. "I didn't have any negative feedback. That's the only thing that I can say for sure. I got a lot of negative comments before the sale, and mostly from buyers, but they were the same buyers that participated in the sale."

"It does mean more planning on the part of the buyer (to inspect yearlings). People think it's easier for the consignor, but there's really as much or more work to do it this way for consignors because people are coming more to the farms, so it's more weeks of preparation ahead of time to accommodate people inspecting your yearlings. It's a compromise on both sides, but I think we've proven that it's a successful model and I think we can build upon that. I'm certainly open to suggestion on how we can make it better, but I'm pleased with how last year's sale turned out."

"One thing I'm hoping is that, by the fall, a lot of people will be vaccinated and that the pandemic restrictions may be lifted enough that we could hold an Open House with all consignors in the sale, to welcome people on the weekend that traditionally would have been our sale... Even if we can all plan an Open House at the same time, then buyers and owners and trainers can go around to the farms on that weekend, much the same as they would go to the sale, and view the horses that they are interested in and see them as close to the auction time as possible... Of course, that will be pandemic pending and restrictions pending for Ontario," Straatman said.

Virtual auctions will open on ongait.com beginning Oct. 16 and will begin closing on Oct. 18. Last year, the first of three blocks of horses went on sale at 8 a.m. with bids closing approximately 52 hours later beginning at noon in 10-minute intervals for each horse on the block. Any bids

that came in at the last second before a horse's auction closed extended the bidding window an additional two minutes to allow other bidders to make counter bids.

Entries for the Virtual sale will close on April 30.

LAST YEAR'S SELECT TOTALS

The inaugural Ontario Select Yearling Sale, held at Winbak Farms in Inglewood, ON, saw 110 yearlings collectively gross \$2,247,000 for an average of \$20,427.

This year's Select sale will be held on Sunday, Sept. 26 – likely at Winbak, but not 100 per cent set as the location as of press time. The sale date falls the day after the Mohawk Million, a \$1 million event for 2-year-old trotters at Woodbine Mohawk Park, which is located about 45 minutes from Winbak Ontario.

"People can come down on the Saturday and pop by Winbak Farms and... look at over 100 horses here and then go to the racetrack that night and come back the next day and spend some of their hard-earned money," Woods said.

Woods said the amenities offered to those that attend the Select sale will be dependent on, "following with the public health and government restrictions 100 per cent. Whatever they put in place is what we'll follow, to the tee, the same as we did last year. We're hoping that things will be more open and we'll be able to have more people here on site... Depending on the number of people, we will be adding more food trucks, more seating and all the rest of it."

Last year, the Select sale was held on Oct. 17.

"We're always going to try to be more efficient and do things better, make it easier for people to see. One of the reasons that we moved it up to September was for weather purposes. We still have nice weather, here in Ontario in September, so it just makes it better because part of the venue is under a tent," he said.

Entries for the Select sale will close on June 1.

MERITS OF A VIRTUAL SALE

Straatman said a virtual-only sale proved to have, "a lot of merit. It's certainly safer for the yearlings, to only have to be transported once. Safer, as far as a control method. If one horse is sick in the building there's the potential of all of them getting sick, so that's easier on the horses. It's nice to have them just picked up from the farm afterward, and certainly there were a lot of questions ahead of time about horses getting picked up, but I think everyone was able to

work it out with their buyers and horses were picked up promptly. I think that's an advantage.

"Certainly, the rental of the facility is one of our biggest costs and being able to do it without that rental is a big savings for the sale company."

Straatman said after this year's auction concludes, sale organizers will discuss whether to go back to a traditional sale or stay virtual only for 2022.

"I think we would have to weigh how the 2021 virtual sale goes and weigh it against the wishes of the buyers and the sellers," she said.

Straatman said last year's Virtual sale was a learning experience, "but I think we've created a template of what buyers want to see. The photographs and the walking videos are certainly new for this industry, but I think it's a good advertising tool and the amount of exposure you can get for your yearling by doing it virtually was even more than I thought. The statistics that I got from our London site, almost 1,500 views for each yearling and then on the ongaits site, more than 4,000 views per yearling on average. I think that's huge exposure."

This year, the Virtual sale has a new, flat-fee model to equally share the cost of the pedigree production, catalogue creation, catalogue distribution and centralized website, Straatman said.

Also, this year, horses will be sold in Canadian dollars on ongaits.

"The reason they were not sold in Canadian dollars last year was that the terms and conditions in our catalogue, which was printed well before the sale, had terms that the horses would be sold in American dollars and I couldn't change that before the sale," she said.

Regardless of whether horses are sold live or virtually, Woods said, "in all honestly, it all comes down to quality of horse. Some horses are going to oversell, some horses are going to undersell. At the end of the day, if you have the right horses that people are looking for, you'll get paid for it."

"Exactly," Straatman said. "I've always said, 'Buyers are very smart, you can't hide a good horse from them. They'll find you.' They are very savvy business people and they will find the horses they are most interested in."





Anatomy of The Big M's latest purse increase

This is Jeopardy! The category is "The Meadowlands," the clue is "They're going up" and the correct response is "What are purses?" You don't need to be Ken Jennings to know why.

"In the wintertime, there's no [Harrah's Philadelphia], there's no Pocono, so you have the horse supply that you need to fill the box," said Big M race secretary Scott Warren.

With Pocono Downs adding a fourth day to their race week and Harrah's Philadelphia opening today, it's that time of the year when the competition for horses heats up.

The Meadowlands had cut purses in 2020 when they reopened after the three-month COVID-19 shutdown, because they had no income during that time, they didn't know what was going to happen and they didn't know whether there would be another shutdown.

Then, in mid-November, they had a significant purse increase, and now, just five months later, they're raising them again.

According to Warren, Meadowlands chairman and chief executive officer Jeff Gural sent an email following a recent weekly purse report inquiring whether they had the wiggle room to raise purses.



"I've always said that we, as far as employees, and we, as far as the horsemen, are very fortunate [to have Gural in charge at The Meadowlands]," said Warren. "He is a casino operator and a sports betting operator, but he is still horse racing first. He is a horse racing person and you won't find that in just about any other casino people."

After crunching the numbers so far during 2021, Warren was confident they could increase purses.

The track's great handle this winter – as well as the horsemen who supported the entry box – definitely made this boost possible, giving The Big M some of the best purses in the Northeast.

"Even before [this] purse increase, we were beating a lot of the purses in Pennsylvania," said Warren. "For the most part, we're comparable if not higher than Yonkers, except for their top class. It's going for \$33,000 and if we fill a preferred, it goes for \$30,000. Some classes are going for more than Yonkers. [Big M purses] may not be entirely the same, but they're in the same general area of what the purses were before COVID hit."

Before deciding what to do, Warren studied an Excel spreadsheet of Pocono, Yonkers before and after their own recent purse increase and Harrah's Philadelphia once their new condition sheet came out.

"I tiered it so the bottom classes got the smallest increase and the higher-end classes got the biggest increase," he said. "I bumped up the non-winners lifetime a good chunk, too, because The Meadowlands is always tough racing. The objective is to fill better races, but your bread and butter, it doesn't matter what track you're at, your bottom classes help you fill races whether you're at The Meadowlands or Ocean Downs. Bottom classes help you fill cards."

"They're racing for a good chunk of money right now. Before the increase the \$7,500 claimers were going for \$8,125. So, they're going for more than their claiming price."

The increase for the \$7,500 claimers is definitely appreciated by trainer Chubby Stallworth, who just happened to claim two of them at The Meadowlands last week.

"I was claiming something anyway and then I found out the purses were going up," said Stallworth. "I'm glad they're raising the purses on those claiming races because that gives incentive to people to jump in and get a horse that doesn't have a lot of money."

"They can get a \$10,000 claimer with a partner or a \$12,500 with a partner that's going to race for good money. Some people can't afford to put up \$20,000 or \$30,000 to get a horse."

Stallworth has a 10-horse stable but is definitely looking to claim more at The Big M.

"You might have to go a little faster at The Meadowlands, but if you're going to go faster for that kind of money, it's okay," said Stallworth. "I don't want to go to [Harrah's Philadelphia] to go 1:52 and go for no money when I can go to The Meadowlands for more and go the same speed.

"Most of my owners want to claim at The Meadowlands. Most people want to race at The Meadowlands. They love to race at The Meadowlands. It's just the spot to be. I love it there."

Another trainer who enjoys racing at The Meadowlands is Ron Burke.

"I love to race there, but it's still by far the hardest place to win a race," said Burke. "But when you feel that you're getting compensated for it then you don't mind that you're going there as much.

"It's the only place that matters and I hate to say that. I'll win races there and I'll get 20 texts immediately, 'great job,' 'horse was awesome' and anywhere else I win it's like it didn't happen, so it's still the premier track."

Hesa Kingslayer N prevails again in MGM Borgata Pacing Series

Hesa Kingslayer N improved to three-for-three, **Rockapelo** repeated impressively, and **Western Joe** picked up his initial triumph in the event in Monday night's (March 29) trio of \$40,000 divisions of the third leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for free-for-allers at Yonkers Raceway.

Driven by Jim Marohn Jr. in the opening section, Hesa Kingslayer N was able to get into the pocket from post four and had a great view of a battle for the lead between Pat Stanley N (Jordan Stratton) and a parked-out None Bettor A (Todd McCarthy).

Pat Stanley N gave None Bettor A the cold shoulder through fractions of :27, :56.4, and 1:25, and when None Bettor A began to back up on the final turn, that gave Marohn Jr. and Hesa Kingslayer N the escape route to the outside they needed. Once he had clear sailing, Hesa Kingslayer N pounced on Pat Stanley N, going by him in upper stretch on his way to a 2 1/4 length victory in 1:53. This Is The Plan (Yannick Gingras) was also on the outside throughout in the second-over position and checked in as the runner-up after going three-high on the final bend, and Pat Stanley N held third.

Trainer Mike Deters also co-owns Hesa Kingslayer N, an 8-year-old gelding by Christian Cullen, with partner Joel Warner. Hesa Kingslayer N is now a 20-time winner in his career, and he has now earned \$189,962. The 2-5 favorite, Hesa Kingslayer N paid \$2.80 to win and led an \$8.40 exacta and a \$24.00 trifecta.

In the next split, Rockapelo (George Brennan) motored directly to the lead from post three and fronted his rivals through opening-half stations of :27 and :55.2. Mach N Cheese (Joe Bongiorno) watched the early proceedings from the three-hole, then came with a quick burst off the third turn that nearly put him on even-terms with Rockapelo as three-quarters went on the board in 1:23.2. Rockapelo was

able to fend off Mach N Cheese's bid, though, and when Rockapelo kicked it into another gear entering the lane, Mach N Cheese couldn't match strides with the pace-setter, who went on to an impressive 2 1/4 length victory in 1:51.2. Mach N Cheese did end up second over San Domino A (Todd McCarthy).

The victorious 6-year-old Rock N Roll Heaven gelding is trained by Ron Burke and owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC., Weaver Brussemi LLC., and Phil Collura. Rockapelo now has a record of 21-19-11 from 83 appearances, and he has banked \$491,106. Rockapelo, the 2-1 favorite, returned \$6.60 to win and was atop a \$72.50 exacta and a \$148.50 trifecta.

Monday night's final flight saw leg one winner Lyons Steel (Austin Siegelman) charge out to early command from post two, but round two victor Backstreet Shadow (Tim Tetrick) was out and on the move from third, and Backstreet Shadow landed on the point after the quick :26.3 opening quarter. Backstreet Shadow would go on to the half in 55.3, with Ostro Hanover (Tyler Buter) coming first-up from fourth prior to that marker and Western Joe (Dexter Dunn) grabbing the cover to sit second-over.

Ostro Hanover advanced on the rim into second before the 1:23.2 three-quarters, but that was as far as he could get as Backstreet Shadow rebuffed any further headway. Meanwhile, Western Joe had gapped on the third turn and into the backstretch, but after being high-lined along by Dunn, he caught back up to Ostro Hanover entering the far turn before going three-wide. Backstreet Shadow still looked good as he turned into the lane first, but Western Joe had a full head of steam on the far outside, and he powered by Backstreet Shadow on his way to a two length score in 1:51.4. Backstreet Shadow came in second, a nose better than Lyons Steel.

Western Joe is a 7-year-old Western Ideal gelding trained by Chris Choate for co-owner/breeder Anthony Ruggeri and co-owner Richard Tosies. Western Joe picked up lifetime win 32 from 104 trips behind the gate, and he has now put away \$761,858. Western Joe, sent off as the 2-1 second choice, paid \$6.40 to win and keyed a \$10.20 exacta and a \$37.20 trifecta.

The MGM Borgata Pacing Series has two preliminary rounds remaining on Monday (April 5) and Monday, (April 12). The final is scheduled to take place on Monday (April 19).

The fourth leg of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series on Monday (April 5) saw 20 horses drop in the box, meaning

there will be three \$40,000 divisions (races four, six, and seven).

After taking March 29 off, round one winner Let It Ride N (post five, Dexter Dunn/Richard "Nifty" Norman) returns and headlines the first flight. Let It Ride N saw his undefeated streak in the United States end on March 22 when he couldn't get involved from post eight, but has an improved draw this time. He will be up against the likes of This Is The Plan (post four, Yannick Gingras/Ron Burke), who has finished second in all three of his MGM Borgata Pacing Series attempts.

In the second section, Rockapelo (post four, George Brennan/Ron Burke) will look to build on his two straight victories in the series. Western Joe (post seven, Dexter Dunn/Chris Choate) picked up his first win in the event last night and will get another chance at Rockapelo after finishing just a nose behind him when they battled on the 22nd of March.

Leonidas A (post four, Austin Siegelman/Sheena McIlhiney) also bypassed the third leg, but will be back in action in Monday's last split. Leonidas A won in the series on both March 15 and March 22 and looks like he's sure to be a heavy favorite. Lyons Steel (post two, Siegelman also listed for trainer Dennis Watson) has a win and a third-place result in his two series attempts, and while he'll likely need a new driver, he certainly has the credentials to threaten.

Upsets aplenty in the John Brennan Trotting Series

Hunting AS was the only favorite to prevail as the John Brennan Trotting Series began with four \$20,000 divisions on Wednesday night (March 31) at a soggy and sloppy Yonkers Raceway.

Driven by Todd McCarthy, Hunting AS worked out a pocket trip behind Halo Its Me (Yannick Gingras) in the third flight and watched as that foe clicked off fractions of :30.2, 1:00.1, and 1:28.3. Halo Its Me was still in command as they turned into the stretch, but McCarthy had Hunting AS finishing well two-wide, and Hunting AS surged by the pace-setter on his way to a one and a quarter length decision in 1:57.3. Blue And Bold (Jason Bartlett) finished third after sitting on the inside in fourth.

A 4-year-old gelding by Lionhunter, Jenny Melander trains Hunting AS for owners Melander Racing Inc., Clark Stables LLC., and Robert Bernaski. Hunting AS has a record of 6-11-2 from 32 starts, and he has now earned \$81,956. Sent off at even-money, Hunting AS paid \$4.20 to win and led an \$18.40 exacta and a \$112.00 trifecta.

While second-best in that split, Gingras had already

collected a win in the event after he guided **Lady Jeter** to a 10-1 upset in the opening section. Lady Jeter went straight to the top from post five, laid down panels of :28.4, :58.2, and 1:27.4, and kicked home in :29.3 to win by a length and a quarter in 1:57.2. Impulse Buy (Bartlett) was the runner-up, followed by Windsong Pioneer (Brent Holland). Heavy favorite Some Chapter (Dexter Dunn) made a break while advancing first-over on the third turn.

Lady Jeter, a 4-year-old Muscles Yankee mare, is trained by Ed Gannon Jr. for owner Zippett Racing Stable. Lady Jeter is now a seven-time winner from 37 tries, and she pushed her bankroll to \$98,668. Lady Jeter returned \$22.00 to win and keyed a \$246.00 exacta and \$556.00 trifecta.

Another surprise came in the second of the four series tilts when 21-1 offering **Look In My Eyes** (Jordan Stratton) darted to the engine from post eight, put up stations of :29.1, :58.4, and 1:28, and couldn't be caught in a 30-second final panel, as he kept a first-over McMatters (Mark MacDonald) at bay to win by a length and a half in 1:58. Manhattanup No Ice (Bartlett) wound up third from the pocket.

The second winner for sire Lionhunter, Look In My Eyes is a 4-year-old gelding bred, owned, and trained by Anette Lorentzon. Look In My Eyes picked up his seventh lifetime victory, and he has now pocketed \$98,215. Look In My Eyes paid \$44.20 to win and was atop a \$136.00 exacta and a \$786.00 trifecta.

Gingras then toppled the apple cart again in the final flight with 11-1 **Guilty Desire** in a 1:58.2 mile. Guilty Desire yielded to sit in the pocket behind 1-20 favorite Get Legs (Andy Miller) after the 29-second opening quarter, but Get Legs miscued on the second turn, putting Guilty Desire back in command. He didn't relinquish it again, as a :58.3 half and a 1:28.1 three-quarters was followed by a :30.1 final panel to secure the victory. He downed a closing Bazillionaire (Austin Siegelman) by half a length, with Get Legs recovering and finishing full of trot for third.

Betty Clegg trains Guilty Desire, a 6-year-old gelded son of Deweycheatumnhowe, for owner Nick Clegg. Guilty Desire collected his 15th career win, and he has now pocketed \$109,866. Guilty Desire paid \$25.60, the exacta was worth \$726.00, and the trifecta kicked back \$1,136.00.

The John Brennan Trotting Series has two additional preliminary rounds on Wednesday (April 7) and Wednesday (April 14), and the final is scheduled for Wednesday (April 21).

Stakes action at Yonkers resumes tonight (April 2) with two \$35,000 divisions of the fourth leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series for pacing mares and continues on Monday (April 5) with three \$40,000 splits of the fourth round of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series for free-for-allers.

Machnhope looks to resume Matchmaker success

After watching Machnhope win her first two starts in the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series for older female pacers, trainer Noel Daley held the mare out of last week's action. As she prepares to return for tonight's (April 2) fourth round, Daley is happy with the decision.

Machnhope is the 8-5 morning-line favorite in the second of two \$35,000 divisions of the Matchmaker at Yonkers Raceway. Ten mares were entered this week, with three of the top-seven in points including unbeaten Alexa Skye sitting out. Blue Ivy, who has a win and two seconds in the series, is the 9-5 favorite in the first division.

"I figured some of the good ones might take this week off, so I took last week off," Daley said. "I think it worked out as the right thing to do. We ended up with two five-horse fields and no Alexa Skye. I'm happy enough with that decision.

"It doesn't work out all the time, but we can look smart occasionally," he added with a laugh.

Machnhope, a 6-year-old daughter of Mach Three out of Hope For Life, has won three of eight races this year and hit the board on three other occasions, earning \$54,765 for owners Daley, Deo Volente Farms, Tom Pontone, and L.A. Express Stable.

Daley's group purchased the mare last July after she spent five months with the trainer following her arrival from Canada, where she had raced most recently for owner-trainer Gary Lance.

"She's a big, strong, good-looking mare," Daley said. "She can be a bit of a cantankerous old thing, but I'm really happy with her. She's done well for the guys that bought into her. They've gotten their money back, so that's good."

Machnhope has raced consistently since the sport returned from last spring's COVID-19 related shutdown. She has started at least twice in every month since then and hit the board in all but four of her past 23 races. She brings a three-race win streak to Friday's Matchmaker start.

"We don't do much with her during the week," Daley said. "She has a bit of a canter and seems to keep herself fresh enough. She looks great and is acting great. She's pretty much the same mare every week. She's just always there."

"Everything will depend on the draw the next several weeks, but this girl has handled the racing pretty well. She should be fine for the next three weeks in a row."

The six-week Blue Chip Matchmaker Series concludes April 19. Following are the top 10 mares in points through three rounds of the series. The top eight will qualify for the final.

1. Alexa Skye 225, 2. Blue Ivy 175, 3. Snobbytown 158, 4. Machnhope 150, 5. Caviart Cherie 135, 6. Seaswift Joy N 125, 7. My Ruebe Star N 113, 8. Siesta Beach 109, 9. Monica Gallagher 95, 10. Maczaffair N 93.

Wilder back after a winter of learning

After a new experience, Mike Wilder is ready to return to the familiar.

Wilder spent the winter with father-in-law Dan Altmeyer at Spring Garden Ranch in Florida, where he helped prep 2-year-olds for their upcoming campaigns. Wilder is now back home in western Pennsylvania and ready to drive this week at The Meadows.

The trip to Florida to train young horses was a change for Wilder, who has won 8,388 races in his career and in 2020 finished second in the driver standings at The Meadows for the fifth time in the past seven years.

Altmeyer Wilder Racing had 11 2-year-olds and nine 3-year-olds in training at Spring Garden Ranch. Wilder and his wife Heather are among the owners of 17 of the horses.

"I always wanted to try my hand at it a little bit, just turn another page in my career," said Wilder, who turns 49 on April 10. "Not that I'm going to stop driving, I'll go back to the grind there, but I'm just trying to evolve into being an owner-trainer more, at least four months out of the year (in Florida). Then I'll go north for eight months and race.

"This wasn't a spur-of-the-moment type thing, we talked about it for several years. We finally just took a shot. It was a thrill for me; I can't say enough about it. I'm going to do it again."

Wilder, who began driving at matinees at the age of 14 and got his first raceway win at 18, enjoyed the relaxed atmosphere — not to mention the weather — in Florida.

"It was different, but it was a good different," Wilder said. "Not that we didn't have a schedule, but there was no hustle and bustle about it like when you're racing. That's part of the game, but this was a real good change. You just went to the barn and enjoyed what you were doing with the youngsters."

Wilder said the most enjoyable aspect of his time off was learning with the 2-year-olds.

"Everybody has different ways of doing it but watching Dan Altmeyer do it was really neat," Wilder said. "I asked him a ton of questions. (When racing) I kind of get the 2-year-olds

when they're almost finished off. You don't see what it takes to get them to that point. It's a lot of patience and a lot of positivity, too.

"Patience is the big word. You can't be anxious with these guys. You never want to get frustrated or get in a rush. Some of them naturally come along pretty good and some of them you need to slow down with. This was a whole new learning experience for me. It was pretty neat being a part of watching these 2-year-olds evolve into racehorses."

Wilder's familiarity with the stable's young horses could be beneficial when they begin racing later this season.

"Not that they won't throw you a curveball, because they will, but I'll know most of these pretty well," Wilder said. "If I see them doing something out of character, I'll pretty much know really quickly. If I don't, Dan will. That's the neat part to be around them all the time. If you see something good or bad you can talk it over."

Wilder called his time in Florida "the fastest four-and-a-half months of my life."

"It's amazing how fast it went," Wilder said. "The weather is nice, the people around you are nice, everybody's got a smile on their face. I enjoyed myself, obviously, and things go fast when you're enjoying yourself. I couldn't believe it was time to go home.

"It just was a heck of a ride."

Woodbine CEO's letter to standardbred horsepeople

Woodbine Mohawk Park Horsepeople,

The Government of Ontario announced (Thursday) that it is activating a province-wide 'emergency brake' shutdown as a result of an alarming surge in case numbers and COVID-19 hospitalizations across the province. Currently, the measures included in the shutdown allow for training, but not live racing without spectators.

In advance of today's news of a province-wide 'emergency brake' shutdown, I had a conversation with the province this morning regarding our request to be permitted to safely operate live racing during the shutdown. The province indicated its support for this request so long as the local health authority also approves.

We are in contact with officials from the Halton Region where Woodbine Mohawk Park is situated. Over the coming days we will continue to make our case with the region's health authorities by demonstrating our commitment to safety, sharing our industry-leading COVID-19 Prevention Protocols, and reminding them that we have not had a single case of on-site transmission of the virus at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

As of Saturday (April 3), we will be required to suspend racing until we receive the necessary permission from local health authorities to safely operate live racing during this shutdown. Please prepare accordingly but also rest assured that we are doing everything we can do be able to resume racing as quickly as possible.

In the meantime, and in accordance with the measures of the shutdown, we will continue to offer training at Woodbine Mohawk Park. More details regarding this will be shared by the race office shortly.

While you are at Woodbine Mohawk Park this weekend for live racing, please continue to be safe and follow all COVID-19 Prevention Protocols as you have done so well over the past year.

Ontario's SIP program to offer more than \$18 million in 2021

The 2021 Standardbred Improvement Program (SIP), based upon the recommendations of the industry representative Standardbred Advisory Group, has been approved by the Ontario Racing Board of Directors.

The 2021 program total, which includes participation fees, is projected to be \$18.043 million, with projected Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) purses of \$14.620 million and total reward incentives totalling \$2.630 million. The \$18.043 million program includes the \$4.5 million that is contributed through the Enhanced Horse Improvement Program (E-HIP).

Of note, OSS Grassroots legs will carry a purse of \$19,000 per division. Grassroots semifinals are \$20,000 per division and finals are set at \$50,000 per division, but the latter number could increase based on certain financial factors over the season. OSS Gold events feature a purse of \$190,000, while Gold Super Finals will have a purse of \$225,000 per event. The Ontario Racing Prospect Series divisional races will feature a purse of \$6,500 per division with finals worth \$15,000.

The SIP program, which continues to be one of the most successful of its kind in North America, consistently produces Ontario Sired and Ontario Bred standardbreds that compete and win against the best in the world.

"Despite several difficult challenges faced by the industry, we are still able to offer a lucrative, world-class program, that provides strong purses for owners and participants, as well as exceptional breeder-based awards," said John Hayes, independent chair, Ontario Racing. "Although OSS purses have been adjusted slightly as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic – and we are subject to further risk if live racing is shut down again as OSS purses are funded through Ontario-based wagering – we look forward to another exciting season of racing across the province, which will once again feature some of the very best Ontario Sired and Ontario Bred horses."

This year's OSS season gets underway with a 3-year-old colt pace on May 22 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. For a full schedule of OSS events, as well as important news and updates, visit: <https://oss.ontarioracing.com/>.

Revisions to the Rules of Racing in Ontario go into effect April 6

As previously [announced](#), effective April 6, 2021, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) will implement a number of rule changes to the Thoroughbred and Standardbred Rules of Racing, following consultation with horseperson representatives and racetrack management staff from across Ontario.

The rule changes are to both the Standardbred and Thoroughbred Rules of Racing (Thoroughbred Rule changes apply to Quarter Horse racing except where noted).

Harrah's Philadelphia opens 2021 racing season today

A 12-race card has been drawn for today's (April; 2) opening program of the 2021 racing season at Harrah's Philadelphia, which will begin at 12:25 p.m.

The richest purse race on the day will be the last event on the program, a \$12,800 pace for up-and-coming male horses. Father Nuno, fastest qualifier during the inaugural qualifying session here last Friday at 1:53.3, will be looking to make up for lost time as he starts from post four for driver George Napolitano Jr. and the brother team of trainer Tom and owner John Cancelliere: he has not raced in 497 days, since he was second to Papi Rob Hanover in the 2019 Governor's Cup final.

The \$11,600 fast-class co-featured pace, slotted for race six, will see Rock The Town (post one) and Joesstar Of Mia A (post four), who were 1-2 in the fastest mile of last week at Pocono, 1:50.3, taking on High Impression (post two), second to the blooming star Nicholas Beach last time out.

Harrah's Philly will race on a four-day-a-week schedule of Wednesday-Thursday-Friday at 12:25 and Sunday at 12:40; the one exception in the month of April will come immediately after this inaugural card, as Philly will not host live racing this Sunday, Easter Sunday.

A revamped, aggressive wagering schedule, aiming to give patrons the opportunity for more big-money payouts, has been put in place. There will be two Pick-4s, both with 15 per cent takeout and a 50-cent base, on Sunday comprising the first four and last four races; and a Pick-5 (18 per cent takeout, 50-cent base) will be offered on races five through nine.

The Super Hi-5 wager, also with 15 per cent takeout and a 50-cent base, will replace the Jackpot Hi-5s and be offered on the third, ninth, and last races. The new Super Hi-5 will pay out if a winning combination has been sold, but there will be a carryover if there are no winning tickets, as will be the cases with Superfectas (which along with Trifectas will carry a lower takeout this season) and all Pick-3/4/5s.

The Harrah's Philadelphia driving colony, which can go with any group in North America, is scheduled to include on Opening Day George Napolitano Jr., the defending dash champion; last year's UDR king Tim Tetrack; Yannick Gingras, the only other driver besides Napolitano and Tetrack to win a Philly driving championship after the track's first year; and two-time North American/USHWA Driver of the Year Dexter Dunn. On the training side, 2020 champion and perennial North American powerhouse Ron Burke will send out Sailboat Hanover and High Impression in the featured

Jujubee snaps Whiskey Blu's unbeaten streak in Meadows Series; Hall wins 5

Jujubee controlled the tempo with a leisurely 1:00.3 half in the slop, then outsprinted Whiskey Blu to the wire to snap that rival's career unbeaten streak at seven in Wednesday's \$12,500 opening leg of the Terry Altmeyer Memorial Trot. The series for sophomore colt and gelding trotters honors the memory of Terry Altmeyer, a fixture at both The Meadows and the Pennsylvania Fairs.

Although Whiskey Blu entered the series with impeccable credentials, Jujubee was no slouch in that area, boasting four victories in seven outings and nary an off-the-board finish. Indeed, players installed him as the 2-5 choice over Whiskey Blu's 3-2.

The pocket-sitting Whiskey Blu unleashed a furious stretch drive but fell a nose short of Jujubee, who prevailed for Tony Hall in 1:57.3. Shane Patrick was a distant third.

Greg Wright, Jr. trains the winner, a son of Creatine—La Cantera, for Jon Erdner.

Wednesday's card also featured the \$12,500 opening leg of the Ruby Cook Memorial Pace for 3-year-old fillies, a series named for the late Ruby Cook, long-time switchboard operator at The Meadows. **Filly Speaks** was hammered down to 1-5 and justified the heavy play, zipping to the lead and collecting an unpressured win — her third straight — in 1:55.1. Captains Maid shot the Lightning Lane for second, 1-3/4 lengths back, with Realization third.

Hall piloted the daughter of Artspeak—Fillys Victory for trainer Scott Betts and owners Tim Betts, Nick Catalano and Keith Pippi.

It was a big Wednesday for Hall, who totaled five wins on the 13-race card.

Swedish agent Robert Lindstrom reports he has brokered a deal to buy Pat Matters (Explosive Matter—Dibrizzi) from her owner/breeder Patricia Stable of Massapequa, NY for an overseas client.

Pat Matters will be retired from racing with a record of 17-9-4 in 53 career start over five racing seasons, a mark of 1:52.1f and earnings of \$374,902.

Lindstrom reported the mare will be bred to Walner.

Big M paces huge opening quarter

A fast opening quarter is sometimes a bad thing in a harness race, given that in the latter stages of the mile, the horse who sprinted to the top might be on fumes in deep stretch.

But management at The Meadowlands is thrilled at the giant opening quarter the track has experienced in 2021 from a business standpoint and hopes to continue that momentum right through the end of the year.

In fact, the first quarter of 2021 at the mile oval — which concluded last Saturday (March 27) — has been one not seen in at least 10 years.

"As the United States and New Jersey rebound from the pandemic of 2020," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemyer. "The handle during the first quarter of 2021 at The Meadowlands indicates that our track has become an increasingly popular wagering destination with horseplayers around the world. The comparisons to previous years are staggering."

Thus far in 2021, there have been 25 programs that have seen 341 races contested. The total handle of \$81,192,515 computes to an average handle per card of \$3,247,700, good for a per race of \$238,101.

Those numbers were far better than just one year ago, when 2020 saw an opening quarter of 21 nights (four were lost due to COVID-19) and 276 races account for total action of \$55,149,060, which averaged out to \$2,626,145 per night and \$199,815 per race.

When you make the comparison to 10 years ago, immediately before Jeff Gural saw fit to see racing continue



at The Big M when the State of New Jersey decided it was getting out of the harness racing business, the differences were even more staggering.

That year – 2011 – nightly business averaged \$2,280,293 and the per race was \$186,723, excellent on the current national harness racing scale, but a huge 28 percent less than the action seen this year at the industry's handle leader.

When comparing nights where all-source wagering is \$3 million, the numbers look favorably on 2021.

During 2011, the first quarter saw one night where \$3 million was bet. Last year, the magic number was bested twice during January, February and March, but so far this year, action has already busted the \$3 million barrier a remarkable 16 times.

Highest single handle of the quarter? Not surprisingly, 2021 has it by a lot, at \$4.56 million, followed by 2011's \$3.09M and 2020's \$3.06M.

"The Meadowlands and the State of New Jersey are proud to say that we are both coming back from the pandemic in a big way," said Settlemoir. "Thanks to the help of Gov. Murphy and the State Legislature, The Big M will once again be turned into a valuable asset, a sparkling facility that is full of life."

That appears to be accurate, given the number of choices a patron has when they arrive at the facility.

Take this Saturday (April 3), for example.

During the day, simulcast fans can bet all the best thoroughbred action in the country, as well as the NCAA basketball tournament's semifinals.

Racing fans will have the Kentucky Derby on their minds as the three final major preps for the May 1 "Run for the Roses" take place. New York's Aqueduct Racetrack will host the Wood Memorial (which has a post time of 5:58 p.m.), California's Santa Anita Park has the Santa Anita Derby (6:30 p.m.) and Kentucky's Keeneland Race Course has the Bluegrass (6:35 p.m.).

College hoop fans will have the opportunity to watch and wager on the Houston vs. Baylor (-5, -215 money line) game, which tips off at 5:14 p.m. Then, at 8:34 p.m., tournament favorite Gonzaga (-14, -1100) takes on UCLA. The two winners will meet in the championship game Monday (April 4) at 9 p.m.

Of course, for those who like The Big M for the world's best harness action, clear weather is expected for Saturday, which will allow on-track patrons to relax outdoors in a safe socially distant setting, watching the races while enjoying

the action with their favorite food and beverage.

MORE MONEY: Effective tonight (April 2), The Meadowlands will offer purse increases ranging from \$500 to \$2,500, with the lower classes getting smaller boosts and the higher classes' purses swelling even more.

There are several factors that went into the added green.

"We take over a million dollars a year from sports betting for purses," said Jeff Gural, the chairman and chief executive officer of the mile oval. "We have sponsors and we received a subsidy from the state."

The larger purses should give The Big M a leg up on area tracks with slots-revenue bloated purse structures in the never-ending battle for horses as the mile oval continues to card 13 races a night with as many 10-horse fields as possible.

THE SCHEDULE: Live racing continues every Friday and Saturday with a first-race post time of 6:20 p.m.

Big M TV's live "Racing from The Meadowlands" pre-game show, which provides news and notes, features, a look at that evening's featured action and staff selections, gets underway at 5:47 p.m.

Red Shores announces spring meet openers; qualifying dates

Red Shores Racetrack & Casino at the Charlottetown Driving Park is pleased to announce the opening date for the spring meet is Saturday, May 8, one week later than initially planned. Post time is 6 p.m. The decision was made after consulting with horse people and harness racing industry groups. This will officially launch the countdown to the 62nd running of the Guardian Gold Cup & Saucer. Red Shores will be announcing an exciting line-up of promotions and events in the coming weeks.

Saturday May 1, and Thursday, May 13 race dates will be moved to later in the season. All originally planned 79 race dates will be held at Charlottetown .

The May racing schedule at Charlottetown will now be Saturdays May 8 and May 15, Thursday May 20, Saturday May 22, Thursday May 27 and Saturday May 29.

Red Shores Summerside will open for the season on Monday May 24 at 1 p.m. The Prince County oval will also hold a card on Sunday May 30 at 1 p.m. kicking off stakes season with the PEI Colt Stakes featuring the 3-year old pacing fillies and colts. Summerside will race the planned 27 race dates during the 2021 season. The 53rd running of the Governor's Plate, presented by Summerside Chrysler Dodge, is Saturday July 10.

Qualifiers will be held on Saturday May 1 at 12:30 p.m. and

Tuesday May 4 6:30 p.m. at Charlottetown, and Sunday May 2 at Summerside beginning at 12 p.m. For entries contact the race office at 902.629.6636. The complete 2021 racing schedule will be available at www.redshores.ca.

Red Shores and the Prince Edward Island Harness Racing Industry Association are pleased to update the Industry on the Return To Racing Plan for the 2021 harness racing season.

Through adherence to the Bio Security protocols outlined for everyone stabled at Red Shores at the Charlottetown Driving Park, together we have been able to address the threat of strangles onsite. At press time, only one horse is waiting for their second negative test which is expected back early next week out of 199 horses tested on site.

Owners and guests are welcome onsite by signing in with the Security officer at the stable area entrance.

Numerous horses have returned to their assigned stalls at Red Shores at the Charlottetown Driving Park, with two negative culture tests.

Horses are coming in the train and jog currently, once they have received a negative culture test and have a second test scheduled. Trainers must provide the race office with their trainer equine health verification before receiving ship-in allotted times.

Horses off site are being culture tested, through the support of the provincial government.

Horse Health Requirements for 2021:

To ensure the continued good health of our racing population, two negative culture tests are required for all horses stabled off track on Prince Edward Island before you will be allowed to enter to race. There will be no time limit on your negative cultures, i.e. if your horse has received two negative culture tests in order to come train at Red Shores at the Charlottetown Driving Park, you will not need another negative test to enter in May, pending a Trainer's Equine Health Verification Form on your horses health.

The protocol for off Island horse people shipping to race on Prince Edward Island for 2021 is being finalized , and will be released next week.

For the 2021 racing season, trainers will have to sign a Trainer's Equine Health Verification form which will detail that they have closely monitored their horse health and confirm that all horses entering the grounds and entering to race are healthy.
