



For Super Bowl champ Devin White, horses have healing powers




The linebacker for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers said horses helped him deal with the death of his brother Jae Jae. White plans to be at Northfield Park next week to see his Pick A Rock compete in the opening leg of the \$50,000 Iron Maiden Series.

At first, as a young boy, it was the popular mode of transportation around his tiny hometown in northwest Louisiana. Tragically, as a teen, its existence became his escape, the protagonist in his quiet place. And today, as a premier professional athlete, it's his fresh challenge to extend Sunday triumphs on 100 yards of manicured turf to success on half to one mile ovals of crushed limestone.

It's the horse, a simple but majestic beast, that Devin White, a 24-year-old Super Bowl champion linebacker for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, keeps in the barn, at his side and near his heart.

I learned to ride a horse before I learned to ride a bike," said White. "I was about five. It's how we got around. I grew up in a horse town.

No longer does he need one to get around — a four-year \$29 million contract from the Bucs took care of securing luxury horsepower — so White now bonds with trotters and pacers to ease the lingering pain of losing his older brother and to satisfy his urge to win when he's not flattening quarterbacks.

White, who has nearly a dozen horses in training, plans to be at Northfield Park on April 10 to see Pick A Rock, his promising 3-year-old pacer, compete in the opening leg of the \$50,000 Iron Maiden Series.

"I learned to ride a horse before I learned to ride a bike," said White. "I was about five. It's how we got around. I grew up in a horse town."

Apparently, tykes didn't ride trikes in Cotton Valley, a town of about 1,000 that is less than an hour's drive from Shreveport. Instead, they threw a leg over a horse and went on down the road.

"That's just the way it was. I rode Tennessee Walkers," said White, who turned to the care of horses to get him through a very dark time. His older brother Jae Jae, a standout high school athlete, was killed in a highway accident in 2011. He was 19. White was only 13.

"Horses helped me deal with his death," said White. "When I'm with my horses, I'm in a good state of mind. I'm happy. There's no time to go into dark moments, no bad memories. You know, I haven't named a horse for Jae Jae just yet, but I will. It might be a race horse, or a horse just for me."

"When I'm with my horses, I'm in a good state of mind. I'm happy. There's no time to go into dark moments, no bad memories. You know, I haven't named a horse for Jae Jae just yet, but I will. Ironically, his brother's favorite NFL team was Tampa Bay, the team that took White in the first round (fifth overall) in the 2019 draft in Nashville. White said Jae Jae was with him on draft night in spirit. As he awaited the phone call from the Bucs, he looked over at a framed photo of his brother that he had brought with him and placed on a table next to his chair.

White's love of horses extended to the racetrack in 2021 with the creation of his stable, a partnership with fellow Louisianian Adam Ivan Hawthorne. Their friendship began years earlier when White went horse shopping.

"Devin came to my farm looking to buy a horse for trail-riding," said Hawthorne. "We hit it off and I eventually introduced him to harness racing."

With Herman Wheeler, breaking and training the White-Hawthorne trotters and pacers at his farm in Monroe, LA, success came quickly. Last June 27 at Chicago's Hawthorne Racecourse, with White in attendance, the aptly-named First And Goal shot to the lead at the start and went wire-to-wire in a \$17,500 leg of the Night of Champions trotting series.

"That was our first winner as a team," said Hawthorne. "We're just getting started. Devin is really getting into the harness sport, including breeding."

Pick A Rock, a son of Ohio sire Pet Rock, is the barn's rising star. An \$18,000 auction ring purchase at the 2020 Buckeye Classic Yearling Sale, and under the care of trainer Bill Rhoades, he ripped off victories in his first two starts and failed to win a third by a mere half-length.

Although White left LSU after his junior year to become eligible for the NFL draft, he remained an academic Tiger. In August of last year, with his studies complete, he returned to Baton Rouge to collect his bachelor's degree diploma in sports administration.

Graduation capped a memorable year for White. Six months earlier came Tampa Bay's 31-9 Super Bowl victory over Kansas City. A week later, White, with one of his horses in tow, drove over to Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, the site of the championship game.

He had asked Jason Licht, the Buccaneers' general manger, for permission to take a victory lap around the field on horseback and was given the green light.

"You earned it, cowboy!" Licht tweeted. "Giddy up!!!."

With the Vince Lombardi Trophy in hand, White rounded the

field astride a horse the media was told was named Dream. That was only half of her name. It was actually Artistic Dream, an unraced pacing daughter of Major In Art, winner of the 2008 \$1 million Metro at Mohawk Racetrack.

"She's one of my girls," said White. "My love of horses is through the roof. "They bring a lot of joy to my life."

Stay tuned. The joy may be exhibited at a racetrack near you. White was asked that if one of his charges should win the Little Brown Jug or the Hambletonian, would he gallop another horse around the Delaware Fairgrounds or the Meadowlands, trophy aloft?

"Damn sure would," he said.

Kentucky "breakage" bill is a win for bettors

This past week, the Kentucky Senate overwhelmingly passed a bill that's widely seen as a win for horseplayers. Known as HB 607, the bill includes a provision that essentially eliminates the long-outdated concept of breakage.

The bill passed through the Kentucky House in March and now following minor procedural steps, is expected to be sent to Governor Andy Beshear where it will be signed into law. Depending on timing, the bill could go into effect towards August, around the same time that the 2022 meet at the Red Mile is underway.

Either when the Red Mile meet begins on July 31 or shortly thereafter – and with more certainty by the time the Grand Circuit begins on September 30 – the way race payoffs are calculated and distributed at the Lexington KY harness track will be different as it will be with all thoroughbred tracks in the state. Rather than wagers paid out rounded down to the nearest 20-cent increment for \$2 based wagers, payouts will be rounded instead to the nearest penny of the true calculated payout.

As with many other jurisdictions that round breakage to the lowest 20 cents, a horse today that wins at 2-1 odds could hypothetically be calculated to pay out \$6.5617. But with the 20 cents breakage format, the actual amount paid out would be only \$6.40. The difference is retained by the entity taking the bet, either a track or online wagering service. Now, with HB 607, the true amount of \$6.56 would be paid out in full to the bettor, rounding down to the closest penny instead of 20 cents.

It might seem like we're talking about insignificant numbers, but anyone who's seen the film Office Space knows how fractions of pennies can add up. Across both the standardbred and thoroughbred industries, current breakage rules equate to tens of millions of dollars a year. And for an individual bettor, the impact will be noticeable as well.

At the high end of the spectrum, a horse that is 3/2 odds and pays out \$5.00 for a \$2 bet, might have paid \$5.19 if not for the breakage. For a \$20 wager, it comes out to the difference of \$1.90 and for a \$200 wager it's a difference of \$19. Multiply this out by however much you personally handle over the course of a year and you can see that it becomes much more material than simply small rounding. For horseplayers who continue to deal with takeout rates that exponentially exceed takeout rates from emerging gaming competition, the breakage win is at least a small dent into the built-in disadvantages horseplayers have before they even place a bet. Returning money back into the pockets of where it rightfully belongs is a huge positive, and in the process, it will incidentally help to drive handle.

The move in Kentucky will make that state the first to move to a penny breakage, and in the process will exceed states like New York that already have in place more favorable breakage rates. In New York for example, the breakage model is calculated to the lowest 10 cents rather than 20 cents. Which is why at harness racing tracks currently running such as Yonkers and Saratoga in addition to NYRA thoroughbred tracks, you see payoffs ending in odd-numbered amounts (\$3.70, \$5.30, \$4.10, etc.).

It remains to be seen if other states have any desire to follow suit, but in the meanwhile, this is a rare win that should be celebrated by horseplayers and enthusiasts alike from both breeds.

ELSEWHERE... BIG M HELPS WOODBINE DRIVE HI-5 WAGER

Last Saturday, Woodbine Mohawk Park was able to reach \$1.5 million in new money during a highly publicized mandatory payout in its Hi-5 wager. And it did so with some friendly help from a fellow track, the Meadowlands.

Throughout the night, as is customary, Woodbine Mohawk and the Meadowlands had their races comfortably spaced out from one another. But heading into the last race of the night for both tracks, a late scratch from the Meadowlands nearly jeopardized anticipated late-night handle for both tracks though especially for Woodbine.

As described by director of standardbred racing at Woodbine Entertainment, Bill McLinchey, "It's just another example of tracks working together and having races go off at opposite times. That (mandatory jackpot) race, our goal was to have it go off at 11:30. And at that point, I was focused on our product and the post parade and it was then I received a call from Michael Antoniades at the Meadowlands and said that they have a late scratch and for us to add some time if we could. And thank goodness he did because we could have ended up right on top of them which could have been a disaster. I know the horsemen were probably wondering what we were doing but it was really to avoid the Meadowlands and just trying to get the simulcast board to ourselves. That includes wanting to make sure TVG was on us, so staying off the Los Alamitos signal as well."

When the coordination was updated, the Meadowlands' final race went off at 11:23 and Woodbine Mohawk trailed nicely thereafter at 11:36. "Because of that, we were expecting \$1.5 million Canadian in new money and that's what we got," said McLinchey. It worked out for all sides, because I'm sure the Meadowlands wouldn't have wanted their last race going off at the same time as another track with \$1.5 million wagered on a race there.

The case study proves once again the simplistic yet successful formula of extending post times and coordinating to not be on top of competing signals. It's shown that Woodbine can continue to have successful Hi-5 mandatory payout nights without having to extend the races as late as possible.

"When we first started doing the mandatory payouts and didn't realize they were going to be as successful as they were, they were going off at midnight," said McLinchey. And we kind of thought that worked well because we had the simulcast board to ourselves. But right now, with an earlier post time starting at 7:00, it wasn't feasible to drag it out that long until midnight, and nor do we have to if we work together and coordinate."

What one can't lose sight of here is the fact that someone has to load a syringe, someone has to slip a twitch on a horse's nose, and someone has to depress the plunger on the syringe after sticking the needle in the horse's neck. And there is someone who is either directly involved or aware of what's going on, and for five hundred dollar bills will be happy to tell you about it.

Now to the horses, specifically the year-end champions of 2021. Both of the 2-year-old Dan Patch pacing champions were sired by Always B Miki, and both of the trotting champions were by Walner. Clearly each of those two stallions have a speed gene that, in a deck of cards would start with a 10, and go up from there.

717-638-7100 office@diamondcreekfarm.com In the case of the champion pacing filly, Niki Hill, her dam, Road Bet, is a mare with her own stacked genetic deck. From three foals of racing age, she's already produced two world beaters, Niki Hill and Cattlewash. They're by two different sires. To me, she's a pearl beyond price, and I predict she'll keep turning out fast horses who win big money.

The champion 2-year-old pacing colt, Monte Miki, is a different kettle of fish. His dam, Montenegro, was a top race mare, who won more than \$699,000. (Although Road Bet also was good on the track, winning \$380,315). M² is her first foal, and the only one by ABM. The next two are by more obscure studs, and it will be interesting to watch them on the track.

About both of these dams of champions, popular belief would say that they produced top horses because they themselves were top race horses. I beg to differ.

There is no known connection between a horse's genotype, or genetic profile, and its phenotype, or living horse, i.e. the racehorse. In these two cases, two top race mares also happen to be blessed with high card speed genes. But I don't think their ability on the track foreshadowed their production of champions.

Both of the 2-year-old trotting champions are also by the same sire, in this case Walner. Being bred by a Scandinavian, it's a safe bet that Walner is named after Håkan Wallner, one of the first great Swedish horsemen to make his mark on American trotting. Operating as Continental Farm, Wallner had as his partners Jan Johnson and Berndt Lindstedt. They could pick yearlings, train them to their best, and drive competitively against our best native drivers. (I probably should say best North American drivers, because both John Campbell and Mike LaChance were Canadian-born).

The champion colt, King Of The North, is the fourth foal of Ray Schnittker's great race filly Check Me Out, who won almost \$2 million. Her first three foals were by good stallions, but not exceptional on the track. One has to wonder if Walner is on his way to being a super sire. I've learned you can't make any final judgments from a horse's first crop, although Walner gave me (and Federico Tesio) every indication he'd be a top sire by his undefeated campaign at two, where he was in a class by himself.

The champion 2-year-old trotting filly was Venerable, also by Walner, as noted, and out of Jolene Jolene. Here we have another mare who, from three foals of racing age has produced Venerable, who won over a million at two last year, and Crucial, who won over half a million. She could well be another mare with a stacked genetic deck, although I suspect she'll be a regular in Walner's book from now on.

For the record, looking up the names of Steve Stewart's partners who bred Venerable with him, I counted a total of six

Schmuckers. Obviously thar's gold in them thar Indiana hills.

Thinking back to what I wrote earlier about the role of snitches, I'm reminded of a true Kentucky story from long ago.

There was a guy here in the bluegrass state who owned one good mare, and to his despair she foaled before midnight on New Year's Eve.

The next morning he and his total staff of one were standing in the stall door, looking over the mare and her new foal.

"What terrible luck," the owner was moaning. "I was counting on that foal to make the next mortgage payment. And now he's practically worthless."

"Boss," the hired man said, "Why can't you just say he was born after midnight?"

"I can't," the owner said. "Too many people know."

"What do you mean, too many people know? It's just you and me."

"That's what I mean," the owner answered, as he walked back to his car.







One and done

The following happened exactly one time. A Look at some pivotal/noteworthy moments in harness racing history:

- **1.** Commander Crowe winning the 2014 Breeders Crown at age 11 at the Meadowlands.
- **2.** A race that debuted with a purse under \$1,500 that reached over \$845,000 The Canadian Pacing Derby, which debuted in 1936.
- **3.** Bob Blanton, Jr. winning his lone million-dollar race drive. He did so with S Js Caviar in the richest Canadian Trotting Classic in history, the 2001 edition that went for \$1,120,250.
- **4.** Roger Hammer winning his lone Hambletonian drive in 2005 with Vivid Photo. At age 59, he also became the oldest winner that was in the race for the first time.
- **5.** Ross Croghan winning in 1998 at Colonial with Ultimate Falcon in 1:47.4. Why is this on the list? He is the only driver to win in sub-1:48 but have no other sub-1:50 driving wins.
- **6.** Varenne had just one North American visit. He arrived in the summer of 2001. While Moni Maker was globetrotting on six continents in her glorious career, the horse who passed her \$5.6 million lifetime total visited these shores just once and dominated in the second \$1 million Breeders Crown ever held, in track record time of 1:51.1.
- 7. Only once has there been a pacing Triple Crown race dead heat. It happened in 2004 at Freehold in the Cane Pace. Ron Pierce and Timesareachanging and John Campbell and Western Terror tied. They were stablemates and 1-2 in the year-end ballot, as well. They were also 1-2 in the Jug, with Timesareachanging getting the nod.
- **8.** Valley Victory won the only Triple Crown race he was in (the 1989 Yonkers Trot). But, his sons swept the 1994 Triple Crown and he had seven credits overall.
- **9.** A 20-year-old winning a HOY title? It happened in 1986 when Forrest Skipper took down the hardware. Lucien Fontaine's son Marc was just 20 when he conditioned the

- son of Scarlet Skipper. That same year, another 20-year-old won a major race. Halcyon won the Breeders Crown with 20-year-old Seth Rosenfeld as part-owner.
- **10.** Gene Riegle once brought us Artsplace, Western Hanover and Life Sign three years in a row (1990-1991-1992). But a decade before that he drove Fundamentalist in the very first million-dollar race the 1980 Meadowlands Pace won by Niatross (finishing fourth). That would be the only million-dollar drive for the Hall of Famer.
- **11.** Linda Toscano is the only trainer to have the 1-2 finishers in the Horse of the Year balloting. Both the winner, Chapter Seven (\$1,023,025), and the runner-up, Market Share (\$2,001,405), were million-dollar earners in 2012.
- **12.** Only one name Takter has won three HOY titles in both the 20th and 21st century.
 - 20th: Jimmy with Malabar Man in 1997 and Moni Maker in 1998 and 1999.
 - 21st: Jimmy in 2016 with Always B Miki and Nancy in 2014 with J K She's A Lady and 2020 with Tall Dark Stranger.
- 13. Howard Beissinger got the nod in a tight five-horse photo in 1987 in the Breeders Crown with Defiant One. Beissinger was 64. It was the only Breeders Crown for the three-time Hambletonian-winning driver/trainer. In



- **15.** The one and only time we had the March of Dimes (1988 at Garden State Park) it produced a classic with Sugarcane Hanover over Ourasi over HOY Mack Lobell. It was the first race in standardbred history where all 10 starters either had or went on to a million-dollar career.
- **16.** A 16-year-old won a race at the Meadowlands. It happened on July 2, 1984 when Susan Looney drove One For All to victory. Kevin Lare won at 17 years of age a couple seasons later to set the male record at the Big M. Both still stand.
- 17. Remember the famous Robust Hanover Breeders Crown race where Bill O'Donnell had a certain quote for the ages? That was the only Breeders Crown ever held at the Westbury, Long Island track Roosevelt Raceway, the home of the debut of night racing in 1940 and the Phillips starting gate in 1946.

- **18.** Jimmy Morrill, Jr. has a pair of "only he did this" notables on this list. He is the one and only driver to win a Breeders Crown race in 1:47 (2009 Won The West for Ron Burke). Morrill, Jr. is also the only driver in 45 editions of the Meadowlands Pace to win it with a \$100 plus horse 58-1 shot Holborn Hanover in 2004. Holborn won his first Meadowlands race that night.
- **19.** Carl Lecause with Escort in 1977, Dr. John Hayes with Conquered in 1981 and Clint Galbraith with Niatross in 1980 all were Meadowlands Pace winners that never again trained or drove a Meadowlands Pace starter.
- **20.** The following never appeared in another Hambletonian: Roger Hammer in 2005 with Vivid Photo, Dave Magee in 2000 with Dreamaster (5th as the favorite), Walt Paisley at age 18 in 1959 (10th) and Stefan Melander with winner Scarlet Knight in 2001.







Always Sugary looking to finally show dam Don't Sugar Me's potential for breeder Karl Dean Miller

In the speculative business that is breeding, it is hard to know just what characteristics will be passed on to a foal, and whether that mix of genetics will culminate in a winner. Ligonier, IN-based breeder Karl Dean Miller placed his hopes in Dontgetinmyway mare Don't Sugar Me as his next producer, but has experienced mostly disappointment from unfulfilled potential. Always Sugary, the fourth and final foal from the dam, could break the pattern established by her siblings. The sophomore is two-for-two in the early going at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino, a 1:56.1 winner on March 31.

"I try to look for mares with early speed. I like to see something that did well at 2 and 3. Then you breed them to the latest and the greatest and hope for the best," explained Miller. "I liked her family. She was just a real good-looking mare. For a Dontgetinmyway, she was 16.2 and perfect conformation."

Out of the Steady Special mare No Sugar Added, Don't Sugar Me won 14 times over the course of her career, topping the dam's 11 foals (10 winners) with earnings of \$271,376. The family includes three other six-figure earners – More Sugar Added, Sugar Nips and No Sugar Needed – and Don't Sugar Me is a half-sister to Challo B B, dam of millionaire and Indiana Hall of Famer Go On BB and Breeders Crown champion Sayitall BB. Several of the mares foaled by No Sugar Added have gone on

to produce winning families of their own, yet with Don't Sugar Me, replicating success has proven difficult.

Miller said that each foal possessed a great gait, but they inherited qualities from the dam that impaired their ability to succeed. The first three foals – Freakie Fritzie, Meant To Be Mine and Velocity Gator – each had issues with kicking, a trait passed down from Don't Sugar Me.

"She would pin her ears a lot and pretend to kick you, but she never would. The mare would get excited," Miller said. "The mare always threw good sized foals that were good looking. The foals were just always tough."

Freakie Fritzie, the first foal, never made it to the races. Bringing \$30,000 at the Hoosier Classic sale, the Rockin Image colt proved a challenge from the beginning. An incident when breaking the young pacer led to his tragic demise.

"When he was a baby, he was just really, really tough to handle. I worked with him a lot, all the way up to the yearling sale," said Miller. "I received a call from the guy that bought him saying they were having a hard time with him and they sent him on to Schwartz Boarding Farm to break. They had him harnessed and he got away from them, went on a kicking spree and went out across a frozen pond. He broke through the ice and went down."

Owner Merrill Hobbs liked Freakie Fritzie so much that he bought the full-sister, Meant To Be Mine, that fall. She also proved tough to handle and only produced one victory during her time on the track.

"They said they had such a hard time shoeing her, putting hobbles on her, stuff like that. Even as a 3-year-old, it took one cc of Dormosedan and one cc of Torb, which is a Class 3 drug, just to shoe her," Miller said. "I thought she looked unbelievable. A rear end on her like a diesel truck. Just looked like a legit filly but never came through."

Although Velocity Gator is the most productive of the foals to date, the Always A Virgin gelding also displayed a tough disposition. The four-time winner paced in 1:50.1 as a freshman at The Red Mile, but has only managed \$42,280 in lifetime earnings. Now four, Velocity Gator is still racing, carrying a 1-1-1 record in six starts this season.

"Mark Evers said that when he was trying to put hobbles on, he was such a kicker and would cow kick so badly, he gave him to a guy that would train zebras. The guy said he's never had a zebra kick this bad," the breeder said.

For all the challenges that the three previous foals presented, Always Sugary was different. From a marketability standpoint, the damage had been done. Miller opted not to enter the filly in a fall sale due to the reputation and lack of production.

"The others really had not done much. I don't think any one of them had made \$10,000 by that time. If you take a yearling to the sale and the mare has had three misses, you can't expect to get a whole lot of money for them," he said.

Miller broke Always Sugary and as he worked with the young pacer, it was evident her temperament did not match her older siblings.

"She was different. She just seemed to have a little more common sense to her. She showed a little bit of toughness along the way, when we trimmed her feet as a yearling, but never like the others," said Miller. "I always thought that mare would throw a good one."

Dale Hiteman, who was familiar with Velocity Gator, reached out last January to inquire about the filly. He traveled four hours to sit behind and jog the then 2-year-old before buying her privately to race under the Dtm Stable banner. Soreness last season while training resulted in the pacer being turned out. While her pari-mutuel debut was delayed until this spring, she made good once on the track. Lining up behind the gate in

the first race on Hoosier Park's opening night program, Always Sugary and Hiteman used a pocket trip to perfection, kicking home in :28.2 to score a 1:58.1 triumph.


"He's trying to teach her to float out there and not get crazy going for the front," Miller said of Hiteman's work as conditioner and driver. "I think Dale is a perfect fit for the filly."

Building on her opening night win, Always Sugary was entered into a \$12,500 division of the Rosie Harness Memorial for fillies and mares Thursday night. Drawing post five and sent off as the favorite in the night's fourth race, Hiteman eased his charge out to second racing into the turn. The duo then sat patiently through fractions of :28, :57.1 and 1:27.4. In the stretch, the veteran reinsman dropped to the inside and surged past leader Start Takin It Off before reaching the wire comfortably in front by one and one-quarter lengths. The filly shaved two full seconds off her winning time from one week earlier, and she shows the potential to develop into the type of racehorse her breeder believed Don't Sugar Me could produce.

"I'm her biggest fan," said an enthusiastic Miller. "I thought she went a really nice mile. I look forward to seeing what she does the rest of the year."







The journey of career race secretary Ralph Swalsky

What segment of harness racing haven't I written about? I've spoken with owners, trainers, drivers, breeders, grooms and sales personnel. Who have I left out?

From my first introduction to the sport, I wanted to become a race secretary. Due to several reasons, primarily, the fact that I loved to bet on the horses and my inability to speak French in a French speaking city, that was a dream that never got anywhere.

My good friend Ralph Swalsky began a 40-year career in harness racing at about the same time as yours truly. We lived two blocks apart from our mutual residences in Cote St Luc, QC, a 10-minute drive from Blue Bonnets Raceway in Montreal.

My career was destined to be in in the breeding area of the sport, while Ralphus (AKA Ralphus Azoff L) was in the racing end, most specifically in the racing offices of at least 13 different racetracks.

Actually, his race office stints were preceded by working with Joe Lepage in the bilingual Canadian harness racing periodical Canadian Trot in 1965.

Ralphus — he says I gave him the name — credits Lepage with giving him his first lead in racing by introducing him to Roger Trudeau, the president and general manager of Sherbrooke Raceway in Sherbrooke, QC. Mr. Trudeau was a cousin of Hubert Soucie, a prominent horse owner of the day, who owned le Ferme Richelieu and the Richelieu Hotel, which was a horseman's hangout adjacent to Richelieu Park.

Sherbrooke Raceway was a small racetrack in the Eastern Townships, roughly an hour's drive southeast of Montreal. The track raced twice a week. Swalsky was to become its racing secretary.

Sherbrooke was one of the very few bilingual towns in the province, exclusive of Montreal. Most other towns were all or almost all French speaking.

Although this scribe's first ambition was to become a racing secretary, Swalsky had a huge advantage over me. He is fluently bilingual. He became the racing secretary that I wanted to be.

Becoming involved in the breeding and sales end of the sport, certainly was not too bad. It certainly made for a very gratifying career. On reflection, I would say that as they often do, things likely turned out for the better.

Speaking French was an absolute necessity to being a race secretary in the several harness racetracks in La Belle Province. At the time, they consisted of Blue Bonnets in the west end of Montreal, Richelieu on the extreme east end of the island, Quebec City, Trois Rivieres (Three Rivers), Connaught Park in Hull, Jonquiere and Sherbrooke. Sadly, only Trois Rivieres remains in operation. What was once by far the hotbed of harness racing in Canada, now remains a virtual bare shadow of its former self.

It was 1965 when Ralph and his wife Phyllis took up residence in Sherbrooke. Their first son, Stephen, who I referred to as First Ralphus Junior was born in Sherbrooke in December of 1965. It was a very small track. Financially, they just barely got by.

I received an offer to go to Rideau Carleton Raceway in Ottawa as the assistant race secretary. The track was then in its fourth season. Gaston Valiquette was its racing secretary. I went there as Gaston's assistant. Al Grillo was the general manager. Valiquette left shortly after the track opened in 1966 to work with Joe DeFrank at Freehold Raceway. Thus, I inherited the job, but only for a short period of time. Rideau Carleton was undergoing a power struggle. Swalsky 's good friend Al Grillo was odd man out. Swalsky was considered to be too close to Grillo, so he was also left out in the cold.

"They asked me to come back in 1967, but after undergoing through what happened at the end of 1966, I just didn't feel that I could trust them, so I turned them down."

From Rideau Carlton, the Swalskys returned home to Montreal where he became an assistant under the director of racing at Blue Bonnets, Mike MacCormac and race secretary Bill Slack. Strangely enough, even though the other Montreal racetrack Richelieu Park worked under alternate dates, the race offices were operated under different administrations. Georges Giguere was the director of racing and Bob Pare was the racing secretary. Ralphus recalls working well together with MacCormac and Slack, however his relationship was not near as good with his cross town rivals.

As sometimes is the case with rivalries, Swalsky's feeling was that there was somewhat of an effort to undermine the Blue Bonnets staff by those at Richelieu. It's likely that the Blue Bonnets personnel being operated staff being operated by English speaking people (les Anglais) while Richelieu being run by French speaking folk, might have had something to do with it.

While working at Blue Bonnets, Ralphus was presented with an opportunity to go to Monticello as the assistant race secretary to Phil Tully. He worked with Tully for four years, before Tully decided it was time to go on his own to operate his Woodstock Stud in nearby Bethel, NY. Swalsky describes Tully as being a wonderful man as well as being an extremely talented person to work for and with.

"He was an extremely bright person, a great salesman, extremely knowledgeable about just about every phase of harness racing. He might have been one of the few people who Leon Greenberg didn't abuse and push around — at least not much that I know of."

After Tully left, Swalsky succeeded him as racing secretary and remained in that post from 1971 through 1975. He was to work under the man that he describes as the most miserable excuse for a human being that he has ever known.

"In your recent story on Jerry Glantz, Jerry has nothing good to say about Leon Greenberg. Trust me. He might have barely touched the surface. He was a man who took delight in being miserable towards others. Don't get me wrong, though. Insofar as running a racetrack, he was very good. But in terms of how he treated people, I've never know anybody worse. I encountered him some years later at a dinner in Albany. He came up to me and put his arm around me and said, 'I guess I wasn't very nice to you' as though that would somehow make up for the five years of torture he put me through. But I wasn't alone. Everybody else I worked with at Monticello was good people. John Manzi was like a brother to me. He was a great public relations person. Allen Finkleson was one of a kind. Jerry Glantz was like an adopted son. Allen Gutterman started as an intern there. Phil Tully took him under his wing and made sure that he got a good start in his chosen field. To this very day Allen remains a dear friend.

"We did some wonderful things while I was there. We inaugurated the Monticello OTB Classic which was the richest race of its time. All the great drivers put in appearances with many of the top Grand Circuit stables having satellite operations there. My Canadian, perhaps more specifically my Quebecois roots, helped somewhat in getting several Canadian stables to spend their summers at Monticello.

"In 1976, I found myself out of work. My old friend Al Grillo was running Tioga Downs which was then running a quarter horse meet. I didn't know anything about quarter horses, but I needed a job. I helped in the racing office and as the clerk of the scales.

"Then, another old friend, Gaston Valiquette, came to my rescue. I worked with him for three years at Buffalo Raceway, the New York State fair at Syracuse and the Great Barrington Fair.

"Gaston was a truly great person. He really cared about people and felt a special responsibility to the horsemen. He wanted everybody to do well.

"In 1979, I came back to Canada. I became the race secretary at Flamboro Downs where I worked with Charlie Juravinski. What an experience! How would I describe Charlie? If you could put eccentric, incredibly interesting and brilliant into one person, you'd come up with Charlie Juravinski.

"When starting out at Flamboro, he didn't know that much about racing, but he learned as he went along. When it came to horses, not only was he a quick learn, but he was also incredibly lucky. He did not own that many horses, but among those that he bought into were the Meadowlands Pace winner Conquered and the world champion Matts Scooter. He didn't breed many, but the great mare Ellamony was among them.

"He was good to work for. Generally speaking, as long as you did your job well he left you alone.

"Some issues of disagreement between the horsemen and Charlie developed. They were going to go on strike. I decided that it might be time to leave.

"I had known Colin Forbes when he was vice-president of the Canadian Trotting Association. He was now the vice-president of the Northlands Park, which encompassed several recreational facilities of the city of Edmonton including the Northlands racecourse.

"In 1982, Albert Hanna, a close friend of mine, who was also a close friend of Colin's approached me. It turned out that Northlands was looking for a race secretary. Albert asked if I might be interested in the position. He hooked me up with Colin. Colin invited me out to Edmonton and we spent a few days with him. He offered me the job and I accepted. That was in the midst of the oil boom out there and racing was thriving. I loved the people and loved working for Colin. The problems were that the winters were extremely harsh and even worse we were so far from our family. Phyllis grew extremely lonesome.

"In 1987, I was offered the racing secretary's position at Saratoga. It was the ideal job for me and especially for Phyllis. We were only three and a half hours from our family in Montreal. We had become increasingly tired of the nomadic existence from track to track and city to city.

"We bought the home in Saratoga in which we raised our two sons Stephen and Gary.

"Stephen was destined to become a lawyer and also became a New York State Associate Judge. Gary is a dentist who set up shop in Halfmoon a small town close to Saratoga.

"Warren DeSantis was the general Manager at Saratoga. We got along just fine.

"Frank Fitzgerald owned the track. All was going well. After he passed in 2002, a power struggle between several parties developed.

"Then in late 1993, and stretching into 1994, came the infamous strike. It was beyond horrible. It pitted family against family and brother against brother. It was civil war. There were scores of fights, arguments and vandalism. Equipment was destroyed. They tried to prevent me from going into the race office. There is still lots of bad feeling about it now, numerous years later. The shame of the situation was that it was encouraged and somewhat created by outside interests. If it were in the hands of the local horseman, it probably wouldn't have taken place.

"I found myself in a very awkward position. I was right in the middle. I had and still have friends on both sides.

"In the midst of all the turmoil and bad feelings, I still had to put on a race card. There were days when we had only 20 to 30 entries for a full race card. We would sometimes race horses on consecutive days.

"Looking back, I still have difficulty comprehending how we got through it. "Racing at Saratoga has not been the same since. I doubt that it ever will. Certainly the feeling of brotherhood on the backstretch probably never will be what it once was.

"New management took over.

"I guess I was on the wrong side of the fence. After 16 years at Saratoga, I found myself expendable. A new broom came in and I was among those who were swept out.

"I took a stop gap position at Vernon Downs under Dennis Dowd. Dennis just might have been the finest person I worked with in all my career. He is a true professional who understands the sport and its people.

"But the job was a temporary one. I returned to Saratoga where I went to work for the city for 15 years until I retired in 2017.

"Throughout my time at Saratoga, I pursued my advocations of pottery and painting. I'm still indulging in both.

"I've actuality had some shows where my artistic talents, such as they might be, have been exhibited.

"I'm now just short of 82. Phyllis is a few years younger. We are still living in the Saratoga area having just moved from our residence of over 30 years to the town of Halfmoon about 20 miles to the south of Saratoga Springs. We are now closer to my son Gary and his family.

"I recently got back into the sport as an owner. I own a piece of a 2-year-old Huntsville colt named Gretzky The Great that is training with Paul Kelley. Right now the training reports on him are quite encouraging. Hopefully he will turn out to be competitive enough to hold his own in the New York Sires Stakes this summer.

"As with most horsepeople, especially those that dabble with 2-year-olds, I am a dreamer."

This Father Patrick colt out of pacing mare Naughtytiltheend arrived recently at Diamond Creek. Naughtytiltheend is a Western Ideal mare out of Cam Swifty that earned \$700,048 and had a mark of 1:49.3S. Her first six foals were all sired by pacers. This colt is the first sired by a trotter. Naughtytiltheend's second foal, gelding Razor's Edge (by Sweet Lou), earned over \$150,000 lifetime. Her third foal, gelding Revolt (by Somebeachsomewhere) earned over \$135,000.







Drama Act highlights third round of Blue Chip Matchmaker Series action

If horseplayers were looking for drama, they found it Friday night (April 1) in the first of three \$40,000 divisions in the third leg of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series at Yonkers Raceway. **Drama Act** and George Brennan overtook pace-setter and 4-5 favorite Miss You N right on the wire after the pair engaged in a spirited duel through the final quarter. The Ron Burke-trained Drama Act, a first leg winner, put a nose in front late as the 8-5 second choice, stopping the clock in 1:52.4.

Brennan left the gate well with Drama Act this week, and she settled in fourth as first Keep Rockin A and then Miss You N exchanged the top. Miss You N, with Dexter Dunn, controlled the action in :27.2 for the opening quarter and managed to rate a :56.3 half before pressure arrived.

Brennan sent Drama Act out at the half, and the Well Said-sired mare advanced with purpose on the backstretch, leaving second-over Bolt Of Beauty unable to maintain contact. A third quarter in 28 seconds was paced by the leader, with Drama Act nose-to-nose with her through the final quarter. Both Brennan and

Dunn asked the most of their respective charges, and on the wire Drama Act got the job done. Miss You N, a second leg winner, had to settle for second on this night, with Bolt Of Beauty third and early leader Keep Rockin A fourth in the field.

Owned by The OK Corral, Drama Act returned \$5.20 to win and keyed a \$9.10 exacta and a \$33.40 trifecta.

Karma Seelster pushed to the front at the quarter for driver Jordan Stratton and dominated her field in the second \$40,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker flight, getting her first victory in the series.

The Bethinator and Tim Tetrick left alertly from the pole position, forcing second choice Gia's Surreal to take a seat. Stratton then moved from the pocket with Karma Seelster to gain control at the :26.3 quarter. Karma Seelster had the top to herself from there and cruised through middle-half fractions of :55.3 and 1:23.4.

Gia's Surreal and Jason Bartlett pulled before three quarters, providing cover for Blue Ivy at that station.

Stratton and Karma Seelster kicked it into high gear, leaving her rivals in the dust on the final turn, and sprinted home in :28.1 to complete the 1:52 mile. Blue Ivy and driver Tyler Buter rallied for second, with Gia's Surreal settling for third and early leader The Bethinator fourth.

Trained by Andrew Adamczyk, Karma Seelster won for the second time this year for owner Karen Hauver. As the 6-5 favorite, Karma Seelster returned \$4.40 to win. The exacta came back \$14.20, with the triple an even \$31.

Racine Bell stamped herself as the one to beat in the series following another devastating performance in the third and final section of the evening. A 5-year-old daughter of So Surreal, Racine Bell overcame post seven for the second straight week and cruised to a 1:52.2 victory, leaving second choice Scarlett Hanover in the dust on the final turn for driver Jason Bartlett.

Racine Bell was three-deep briefly in getting around Scarlett Hanover on the first turn, but then waltzed around the track through fractions of :28, :57.1 and 1:24.4. On the final turn she gained separation from the field as Man Dontforget Me and Dunn moved coverless into second. A final quarter of :27.3 sealed Racine Bell's third victory of the year for trainer David Dewhurst and owners Chris and Dale Lawton.

Racine Bell returned \$2.50 as the prohibitive favorite. The exacta with Man Dontforget Me returned \$11.60. Third-place finisher Best Head West helped the triple return \$60.50.

Racine Bell was a winner for the 24th time in her career.

Five \$50,000 divisions of the third round of the MGM Borgata Pacing Series are on tap on Monday's (April 4) program.



Kakaley looks to stay hot

Matt Kakaley rolled through the first quarter of 2022 and hopes to continue to build momentum as the year goes on.

Kakaley, who recently turned 34, is No. 2 among all drivers in North America in purses with \$1.78 million and leads the driver colony at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono in wins with 44. In addition, he is third in wins among drivers at Yonkers Raceway with 66.

This past Saturday (March 26), Kakaley swept the two Game of Claims Series championships on the card at Pocono, where he is clicking at a nearly 26-per cent win rate. At Yonkers, he has been sitting behind top horses in both the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series and MGM Borgata Series as they

head to their third of five preliminary rounds.

"It's been a really good start," said Kakaley, who has won 5,405 races in his career and was 10th in earnings in North America last year. "I'm driving for some live barns right now. At Pocono, I was fortunate enough to pick up the right horses in each leg of that claiming series and won the two finals. It just worked out really well. Yonkers has been going good for me too. I've been driving for people whose barns are doing well, they have them all ready, and that helps immensely.

"Once you're on a little bit of a roll, people start noticing and start using you more too. My goal is to hustle hard, do Yonkers and Pocono, and hopefully catch a couple stakes horses along the way. We'll see what happens."

In the Borgata Series for older male pacers, Kakaley won a second-round division with Jack's Legend N this past Monday (March 28). Kakaley drove the Josh Green trainee four times last year and had two wins and a third in the Open Handicap.

Jack's Legend N, an 8-year-old son of Bettor's Delight—Larissa Rose, is part of a crowded leaderboard in the Borgata's point standings. Nandolo N, who is 2-for-2 in the event, leads with 150 points, followed by returning champion This Is The Plan with 125. Jack's Legend N is among a group of seven horses tied for third with 100 points.



On Monday (April 4), Jack's Legend N is the 2-1 morning-line second choice behind Nandolo N in the fifth of five third-round divisions at Yonkers. In his previous start, Jack's Legend N won by a head over American History in 1:51.2. It was the fastest mile of 12 races on the card that night, and one of only two to go faster than 1:52.4.

"He was awesome last week," Kakaley said. "He's a very good horse. He wants to win, he knows how to win, and he can handle any trip you throw at him. I think he's one of the top ones. I'm very confident with him."

Kakaley has two more drives Monday in the Borgata Series, one with longshot Shoobee Doo A and the other behind None Bettor A, who was a second-place finisher in the first leg of the series but missed the second round when he was scratched sick. It will be Kakaley's second time with None Bettor A; he won an Open Handicap with the 9-year-old gelding last August.

Cautionary tales of fragility

A Long Day's Journey into Night, widely considered one of the finest American plays of the 20th century, was written in 1942 by American playwright Eugene O'Neill. The play is a posthumous autobiographical work concerning addiction and dysfunction in a famous family.

In 1851, Edward and Mary O'Neil, along with their young family, emigrated to America from County Kilkenny, Ireland, and settled in Buffalo, NY. In 1857, the family moved to Cincinnati, OH, where Edward abandoned them to return to Ireland. To help his family, young James O'Neill apprenticed as a machinist and then sold military uniforms during the Civil War.

At some point, the handsome young man found his way into a Cincinnati theatrical company. At 21, the talented James O'Neill made his stage debut in a Cincinnati production of Boucicault's 'The Colleen Bawn.' He quickly rose to national stardom, but with his celebrity came scandal and tragedy - and a son, Eugene O'Neill, who would eventually tell his tale.

The remainder of this 2,500-word feature and accompanying historic photographs remain in a dusty desk drawer. The historical magazine set to publish the article ceased publication.

The baby blue Bass Cat Deluxe fishing boat was cleaned and prepped. The right to fish in the upcoming tournament was earned via accumulating points during five tournaments in the previous six months. Traditional employment jettisoned to follow fishing dreams. Friends and relatives were ready to watch the action on live streams.

The tournament never happened. The organizers went bankrupt.

Each summer since 1999, a trip to see a baseball game in the New York-Penn League was part of my calendar. Some years the trip was for business, other years for pleasure. The name of the League was misleading. Since the inception of the NYP League in 1939, towns in Vermont, West Virginia, New York, and Connecticut hosted baseball at jewel box parks nestled in small towns.

There are no more seasons. In 2019, the New York-Penn League was among dozens and dozens of leagues and teams eliminated during Major League Baseball's restructuring.

A breeding contract for a Canadian stallion was filled out and placed in an envelope. We had one broodmare and no connections in Canada, but the Slots at Racetracks program looked promising. We had watched and studied for a couple of years and decided to try our luck north of the border.

We never mailed the breeding contract. In 2012, a day before posting the breeding agreement in the mail, a Canadian government policy staggered horse racing and gave us cold feet.

We are all painfully aware of the harness racing situation in Florida.

In the above situations, and in situations that you may be familiar with, heartbreak unexpectedly appeared. In all cases, the culprit was money.

To assume your sport, pleasure, or business will roll on is human nature. But history is not a shield; it lulls us into complacency. Just because a magazine, baseball league, restaurant, or sport has been around since before you were born, there is no quarantee it will be around tomorrow.

From A (American Football league) to X (XFL League), from 1900 to 2021, the list of failed sports leagues is dishearteningly long. Many of these failed sports leagues or passions and appeared popular. But the world of commerce is cruel. Only a handful play today.

Existence does not necessarily depend on the quality of a product; it depends on the bottom line. Passion and quality were abundant in a thousand magazines and newspapers, fishing leagues, and cities with baseball teams. But at the end of the day, the cash flow told the story.

Our sport races on in several states. We are still standing. Reports have harness racing in a bit of an upswing; let's hope those reports are accurate. Why not use these relatively good times to prepare for the future?

Today is an excellent time to repurpose some breeding dollars and purse money, a perfect time to explore new states or fortify struggling states. Perhaps state programs could institute a rainyday fund. We could use a portion of our money at every branch of our twisted revenue tree to promote our sport as never before. We could take some chances. The more youthful in our ranks should create contingency plans for transition to new formats of harness racing if the gambling and casino money runs out.

The day the plug is pulled is too late.

USTA take on Texas district court dismissal of HISA constitutional challenge

On Thursday (March 31), the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas dismissed a constitutional challenge to the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) brought by the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. Judge James Wesley Hendrix held that, under current precedent, HISA does not violate the United States Constitution's private nondelegation doctrine.

(Story here) The "current precedent" to which Judge Hendrix referred is a line of cases decided by the United States Circuit Court for the Fifth Circuit which are extremely tolerant of delegation of governmental authority, and which are binding on the Texas court that decided this case. The language in Judge Hendrix's conclusion tells the tale:

The Court recognizes that HISA's regulatory model pushes the boundaries of public-private cooperation... [D]espite its novelty, the law as constructed stays within current constitutional limitations as defined by the Supreme Court and the Fifth Circuit. Perhaps the Supreme Court or the Fifth Circuit will cabin [i.e., limit] their private-nondelegation precedent in light of HISA's reach. But this district court will not "read tea leaves to predict where [the doctrines] might end up..." [U]nder present articulations of the private-nondelegation doctrine, the plaintiffs' challenge must fail.

The Fifth Circuit's permissive view of private nondelegation has not been accepted throughout the other circuits. At the August 2021 Racing and Gaming Conference at Saratoga Race Course, respected racing legal scholar Bennett Liebman opined that the Supreme Court is looking for the right case in which to rein in Congress's delegation of its authority to private organizations. Liebman was proved right in March of 2022 in the *Rettig* case, a Fifth Circuit decision on which Judge Hendrix relied heavily.

The Supreme Court has discretion to grant or deny certiorari (to decide or refuse to decide an appeal) in cases without respect

to the merits of the cases themselves. When *Rettig* was appealed from the Fifth Circuit, the Supreme Court denied the petition for a writ of certiorari, which is normally a onesentence entry on the docket. In *Rettig*, however, Justice Alito took the unusual step of appending a lengthy statement explaining that although *Rettig* involved the issue of limits on the federal government's authority to delegate its powers to private actors, "the case presents threshold questions that could complicate our review of that important [issue], but the statutory scheme at issue here points up the need to clarify the private non-delegation doctrine in an appropriate future case."

We respectfully await the National HBPA's announcement of its plans regarding appeal. The HBPA's decision, however, will be reached partly by evaluating the need to convince the Fifth Circuit and possibly the Supreme Court thereafter that HISA goes beyond the permissible limits of the private nondelegation doctrine.

The other HISA challenge, which involves the USTA, nine states, and a group of other entities as plaintiffs, is awaiting decision in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky. This case also presents the private nondelegation issue, and because it arises the Sixth Circuit where there is no unusually permissive interpretation of this doctrine, it could well reach the opposite result to the one reached in Texas. Moreover, the lead argument in our case concerns the anticommandeering rule, a Constitutional doctrine that Justice Alito, mentioned above, applied restrictively in the Murphy case, which rejected Congress's attempt to deny regulatory authority over sports betting to the states.

A challenge to a forwardlooking track - eliminate claiming races

I would like to challenge just one track to completely do away with claiming races. Claiming races were a brilliant innovation forcing economic rationality of the entrants which would by definition result in the most competitive races. However four major factors challenge the logic of continuing to offer such races while there exists superior ways to write more competitive races, which will be addressed later.

- **1. Drugs.** This is the biggest reason for challenging the viability of claimers. Trainers that cheat and use illegal medications can "jam" horses in lower claimers than might otherwise be rational and it puts the fear of God into potential claimants to claim a horse from a trainer with a reputation for doping horses. These trainers can put horses in a class week after week, finish 1-2-3 with little to no fear of losing their horses.
- **2. Horse unloading.** Related somewhat to drugs, rather than finding a home for a marginal horse, trainers will drop and dump a horse hoping that the animal becomes someone else's problem. This is obviously bad for the industry overall. Some states have enacted regulations mandating some kind of vet exam after a race, but often maladies may be hidden through chemicals. My former employer, TrackMaster did a 10-year study comprising millions of starts which showed a 25 per cent higher rate of DNFs (horses that did not finish a race) for claimers versus non-claiming races (the study excluded all 2-year-old races and all races with any accident), highlighting that such unloading happens disproportionately in claiming races.
- **3. Rent-a-horse.** While none of us can feel how a horse feels, it is surmised that when a horse switches barns, it undergoes some kind of higher stress level than if it stayed in one home. With the high purses in claimers at many of the casino tracks, horses can be claimed almost weekly, bouncing from one trainer to the next.
- **4. Owners.** An owner, especially one that buys a yearling or 2-year old, typically likes to have consistency in his or her stable. The owner follows the horse through its career much like baseball fans like to be able to follow the players on their team year after year (which is much tougher now than 40 years ago). After a horse runs through its conditions, a trainer is faced

with putting the horse in the typical NW\$ last x races and yo-yo up and down the classes, or, enter in claimers which give the owner a more consistent chance to earn purse money. However, doing this includes the detrimental risk of losing the horse the owner has connected with for several years.

At this point in our industry's possible life cycle, I think it is time to experiment doing away with claimers for all of the above reasons. Racing secretaries can use the NW\$ last x races to field somewhat competitive fields as they have done. However, the TrackMaster rating system, which gives each horse a rating based on its overall level of competitiveness, allows secretaries to write the most competitive races without the yo-yo issues of the non-winner races. More than 60 per cent of tracks have already used these ratings in some fashion, and studies have proven these races to be more competitive (based on frequency of odds on favorites, frequency of long shots, and spread of odds) than those of the non-winner varieties.

I would like to see a major track rise to this challenge and dispense with writing any claimers and use the other tools available to write competitive races. Then after a full meet, compare handle numbers, but more importantly, measure how competitive these races were compared to claimers from prior meets. There are so many variables that can affect handle year over year, but the other metrics mentioned above would give excellent insight to see if the races are just as or more competitive while simultaneously addressing the four big negatives mentioned above associated with claiming races.

We will tell you the end of the story because it has a happy ending. We got the call March 7, 2021. He was in a kill pen in central Pennsylvania awaiting shipment to Canada. Had we ever owned him? Yes we did till he was 10 and yes we wanted him back although, at the time, we had no clue as to how we would deal with him, find a place to keep him and provide care for him. He will probably outlive us so he is in our will.

We bought him as a 2-year-old in 2010, the second horse we ever owned, club foot and all, raced him nine times as a 3-year-old, won serious money with him in Delaware, then found he had stifle issues, probably had had them all his life, and raced through them as long as he could. His driver described him best. "A thousand pound horse with a thousand pound heart."

We took him to the best vets. Could he ever race again. Sure, till he was crippled.

Not going to happen, we told the vet at the University of Pennsylvania clinic. He remained with us till 2018. We jogged him a couple of times a week. And we both enjoyed it. He shared a paddock with a retired race horse and they had a grand time together till his field mate died of colic.

No one wanted him in their paddock. He was too spirited and would run the hell out of their horses.

Horses are herd animals and they like company. He had none. I had back surgery, jogging was out. Stall bound most of the time was no life for him so my wife, who I think loved him even more than I did, made the painful decision to sell him to what we believed was a good home. Why sell? Our theory was if you pay for something you will value it. Free involves nothing obligatory.

Do we know what happened to him between September of 2018 and March of 2021? We know COVID happened. Who knows what circumstances his owner found himself in. His cost-benefit analysis caused him to behave in a certain way and treat his animals accordingly. How many times was he sold? Was he fed properly, overworked, given proper medical care? Feel free to add to the list. You all know what can happen to retired racehorses.

So we got the call. He quarantined at a facility near Shippensburg, PA, got wonderful care from a placement arranged by the Standardbred Retirement Foundation, and came home to Dagsboro, DE in late April, thin, dull eyed, no top line, bad teeth, and defeated by life and the cruelty it bringers to victims.

A year later, he is back to being his wonderful self and brings great joy to us, our grandchildren and our friends and neighbors who proudly wore his celebratory tee shirts and joined us in the winner's circle to cheer his successes when he raced.

So it has a happy ending. Sadly there aren't enough of them. Thank the Lord for the Standardbred Retirement Foundation, its amazing leadership and the many volunteers who facilitate hundreds of rescues and the people who donate to it. Does the USTA? Thanks goodness for freeze brands for that's how we were identified and given the opportunity to rescue our horse. Are you listening USTA? Clearly you did not in your recent decision to make the process optional. Thank goodness for the owner of our present facility who allows our horse and two other retired standardbreds the use of a paddock and a run in shed at no cost.

So what can and should be done to correct what we hope you will agree is a horrific situation? Money talks so nobody walks. And where does it come from? From the breeders who sell yearlings for record breaking prices at both Lexington, Harrisburg and other venues. From sports books like Xpressbet and Twin Spires and the many others that grow rich on the bets made by those who gamble on racing. From casinos that do the same. From horsemen's associations out of dues paid by their members. Out of purses offered by the racing venues. The list is a partial one. Feel free to add donors of your own. What's the slogan, something like "If we all pay a little, we all gain a lot."

Someone much smarter than we are summed it up well. One of the best way to judge the decency of a society is the way it treats its old. Horses don't choose to get on the proverbial ice flow unfeeling humans put them there.


