Rising costs are worrisome for racing business

Trainer of the Year Nifty Norman on the impact of high inflation on the bottom line. Plus, a update on his exceptional trotters Venerable and Bella Bellini.

Just like any other industry, harness racing in North America is no exception to feeling the impact of inflation and the associated sharp rise in food and energy costs.

I've seen firsthand the predicament that trainers have been put in by the rising costs. Between the cost of hay, personnel, and everything in between, trainers are walking a fine line between how much they can bear on their own before needing to pass the rising expenses to owners in one form or another. For example, one trainer has elected to slightly expand how they charge commissions rather than increase their daily rate. Another has found a source for specific medication at a rate lower than what their vet typically charges.

But what's unmistakable is that the increase in costs is already starting to have an impact in an industry where most participants are operating on already extremely tight margins.

Reigning Dan Patch Trainer of the Year Nifty Norman — who is the feature of our next Twos in Training video with Heather Vitale. It debuts Monday (April 11) at 7 p.m. More info here: HarnessRacingUpdate.com/twos-in-training-2022/ — operates his stable out of New Jersey, and his costs alone to transport horses to the races illustrate the challenges.

"It's terrible, actually," Norman said. "I've had to put my rates up, and to be honest I haven't gotten any complaints at all because I think everybody is aware of how much things have changed. For example, a bag of feed has gone up \$5 in the last 12 months and the cost of diesel fuel has increased almost 100 per cent; it's crazy. I took a horse to Yonkers last Monday and just between the fuel and tolls I was at around \$240, so that

gives you an idea. Owners see a bill for \$300 and it may seem ridiculous, but when you factor in the driver, wear and tear on the truck; it's very tough right now."

Jumping from one crisis to another, the impact from inflation is far more likely to have greater impact at first on the smaller operations, just as COVID-19 did when racing was shut down two years ago. In a scenario where costs continue to increase for a prolonged or indefinite period, Norman said, "I think it could force some of the smaller people out for sure. It always does. It always hits those people the most because no matter how good the horse is, the costs are still the same."

In addition to food and energy, another ongoing area of increased spending has been for personnel expenses as the industry remains in a shortage of caretaking help.

"Everybody in the country is short of staff," said Norman. "And we've seen that you have to pay more in wages to attract people, and you just sort of get hit right now from all directions. One thing you can try to do is work with other trainers and coordinate rides to the

races and so forth to try to save a buck here and there, but that's hard too. Shipping to a place like Pocono is three hours for us, and that's a lot of diesel you're chewing up. Between the shortage of staff and the inflation it's tough going. I have a big team that cares for around 60 horses but there's a lot of aggravation right now and it really can make you feel like cutting back."

Norman echoes prior comments made in Harness Racing Update regarding the staff shortage.

"The crazy thing is, everyone knows that the Spanish help is basically our main help right now and they're actually very good help, they have a natural connection with the horses and are very good. You would think that with the border being the way that it is, you would think there would be a lot more people available looking for work, but I haven't had a single person walk through the gate this year looking for a job," Norman said.

"Overall, the immigration process has changed. We used to have a lot of Australian and New Zealand kids come over for six or 12 months or around that, same thing with Swedes or



Scandinavians, but you don't see that much either anymore. They can't get here, or they can only come for vacation. They can't stay and work for six or 12 months and it has really hurt too because they were high quality staff that was an asset for you and that doesn't happen anymore."

On the racing front, Norman heads into 2022 with much to look forward to coming off his award-winning 2021. Norman won 141 times last year from 659 starts, and stable earnings cleared \$6 million. Powered by two Dan Patch award winners, trotters that both earned over \$1 million last year, Norman likes what he's seeing thus far in stars Venerable and Bella Bellini.

"I brought her back on the first of February, she was turned out down in Kentucky and she did very well," Norman said of Venerable. "She came back in really great shape, she grew quite a bit and filled quite a bit too. I was pleased with that because

towards the end of last year she lost some weight, but the break did her good and I couldn't be happier with how she looks now and has been training well, so all good so far."

Venerable, a filly, defeated male rivals last year in the Mohawk Million, so the natural, albeit super early question is: if Norman would consider the Hambletonian this year.

"Basically, that's something that you think about the week of the race more or less. We're aiming her towards the Oaks at this stage," he said. "But, usually, you just size up the competition and see what your situation is. If it's a situation where I had maybe two fillies in the Oaks and the colts looked a little suspect, then you might think about it. But it's definitely not something we're thinking about right now."

Norman won last year's Hambletonian Oaks with eventual and near unanimous 3-year-old trotting filly of the year Bella Bellini. Training down for her 4-year-old season, Norman said, "She looks absolutely incredible right now. And by the way, I had no clue she was going to do something like what she did last year. I didn't expect that, and it was just unbelievable. I've never seen a horse do that before (between ages 2 and 3). She was just average at 2, and it just shows that she needed to mature. Because now she's an absolute bull, she's filled out even more and I think she's going to be an incredible horse again this year."

I hope I'm wrong, but...

Obviously, Jeff Gural and his faithful lieutenant, Jason Settlemoir, don't buy my thesis that "dragging" is destructive to the integrity of our sport (HarnessRacingUpdate.com). I say this having just read a Meadowlands release that states the track will do as much dragging as it needs to do to achieve a \$3 million nightly handle.

Let me quickly make it clear that I've known Gural for many years, and there's no question that his personal commitment to integrity is beyond reproach. The issue here is that he doesn't view dragging as an integrity issue, and I do.

The reality is that dragging has become an essential element in the minds of harness track operators, and you don't mess with something so essential to your bottom line. This thinking ignores the fact that intellectually and logically dragging is indefensible.

Every thoroughbred track in North America gives the lie to the belief that betting handle suffers sans dragging. In the biggest betting race in North America, the Kentucky Derby, the horses are being loaded into the starting gate when the clock hits zero minutes to post time.

But dragging presents two major threats to the welfare of harness racing. The first is its totally negative effect on any effort to create new bettors or new owners. Who in his right mind wants to participate in a sport where the official clock means nothing?

Every other sport is scrupulous in observing its official time keeper. It's the source of the highest drama of many football and basketball games, where the seconds are often counted off aloud on national television.

Beyond that, however, is something deadly serious. We are handing our enemies a perfect weapon to use against us. The casinos, who supply virtually all of our purse money, would love to be rid of us. They are much stronger politically than we'll ever be, and sooner or later the tracks will wake up to the concept of decoupling. What better weapon to use against their mandated support of our business than dragging?

The same logic applies to the state legislatures and governors of the harness racing states. To a man, or woman, the politicians could find far better uses for the money that now supports a business that doesn't even bother to operate honestly.

The sad aspect of all this is that the tracks could and would handle just as much money if they didn't drag. The thoroughbred tracks are proof positive of it. But logic carries no weight here, and so we go blithely on, every night working our way toward our own destruction.

We're now at close to the midpoint of the breeding season. From here until July 4, my arbitrary final day of the breeding season, the pressure on the popular stallions will increase incrementally. It's a sad but true fact that the American trotting stallion is frequently a compromised breeding animal.

This has been true ever since my earliest days in the breeding business, which probably go back farther than many people alive today.

I syndicated Noble Victory in 1964, and he was, for the record, the first million dollar standardbred.

Pedigree-wise Noble was inbred 2 by 4 to Volomite, his paternal grandsire and maternal great grandsire. Volomite himself was a strong breeding horse, but Noble wasn't. I had what in retrospect was an interesting experience regarding his fertility, although I would have used other words to describe it at the time.





You must understand that this was before the advent of artificial insemination, so every breeding was live cover, and mares were checked for pregnancy at 42 days. Operating in Hanover, PA, there was only one other breeding farm, Hanover, so there were no equine vets in the vicinity. You had to have a resident vet, and by the end of March mine had become unhinged and made only infrequent guest appearances. And as far as I could tell, Noble Victory hadn't yet settled his first mare.

Somehow I knew the name Bill McGee, of the Lexington vet firm, Hagyard, Davidson, McGee. In desperation I called him, and he agreed to charter a small plane and fly up on the following Sunday. For good measure, I also mentioned that I needed a resident vet, and he said he'd bring with him a possible candidate for that job.

Under Dr. McGee's direction we bred Noble to a tease mare, with Noble wearing a breeding bag, a euphemism of that day for a horse-sized condom.

Dr. McGee took a drop, made a slide, and put it under our microscope.

"Take a look," he said to me. "Those salamanders aren't very lively, are they?"

I looked and agreed, noting at the time that the foremost equine repro vet maybe in the world regarded sperm cells as salamanders. The he added something to the slide, and told me to look again. "Those salamanders have just gotten a lot livelier, don't you think?" he said.

"What did you do to them?" I asked, and Dr. McGee said he'd added something made from milk, called semen extender.

He then told me that things weren't as bad as I thought, because he was sure some of our mares were in foal, it was just too early to call.

Then he introduced me to his companion whom he'd brought with him from Lexington. He took me aside and said that he was the best young vet he'd ever worked with, and he would do a good job for me. His name was John Mark Egloff, aka Tad.

That worked out great, and I take great pride in what a success Tad has become in our business.

One thing that sticks with me all these years later is a conversation we had shortly after Tad started at Lana Lobell. I repeated to him what Dr. McGee had said about him being the best young vet assistant he'd ever had.

Tad listened, and then he said, "I'm not sure what he based that on, since 90 per cent of the time all I did was open and close gates."

Hail to The Chief: A conversation with Hall of Famer Ray Remmen

It began for Ray Remmen mostly from the influence of his maternal grandfather Art Hunter.

Hunter was a farmer in the western Canadian province of Saskatchewan. In the course of his farming, he sometimes worked with horses.

Art Hunter was a World War I veteran. He had a son, Ray, who was a Royal Canadian Air Force pilot. His plane was shot down

over the Mediterranean in World War II. Life was never the same for Art Hunter.

To keep his life steady after the loss of his only son, he became involved with horses, first a thoroughbred which wasn't any good and then some standardbreds. In 1947, his daughter, Irene Remmen, had a son who was named after his lost son.

Thus began a great journey between son and grandfather. Hunter and Remmen became inseparable. Remmen recalls going to the races with his grandfather from the age of 4.

Wherever Hunter's horses were racing, young Remmen was to be found with him.

Though, it should be noted, that it wasn't as if the family skipped a generation from Hunter to the Remmen boys. The boys' father, Ivar Remmen, was a lifelong racing official in the sport in Western Canada.

As for the racing stable, the first several years of it were mostly unsuccessful.

"We went to the ill-fated Phoenix track when it first opened. We had no stock and we weren't very competitive. From Phoenix we went to the Ontario Jockey Club tracks and did just as poorly. From there we went to the Buffalo-Batavia Circuit where we barely made enough to eat and pay the bills. Windsor Raceway had opened. With the help of the presiding judge Don Perfect, we were able to secure two stalls. Over some time our stable grew. We thought we were in heaven. For quite a few years, what a wonderful place to race that was. It had as great a colony of

drivers as any track outside of the New York metropolitan area ever had. Even the stables were heated. Joe DeFrank, the greatest race secretary ever was running the show. It was wonderful."

Then came The Meadowlands. Joe was going there to do for New Jersey what he had done for Windsor. He took with him most of the top stables that had been racing at Windsor. Ray Remmen and his younger brother Larry were among them.

Through the intervening years, Ray spent some time racing on his own turf in Western Canada. His resume includes the first 2:00 mile ever there with Storming Stephen in 1964 and four Western Canada Pacing Derby wins.

Q: What was it like first coming to The Meadowlands?


"It was glorious. We had all the best stables the best horses and the best drivers in the world. Bob Quigley ran the place. If there has ever been a better general manager of a racetrack I've never met him or her. The horsemen, the owners and most importantly the fans were treated as they have never been before or since. The aura of the place was tremendous and it sure showed in the numbers."

Q: You opened the place by winning the first race ever held there.

"It was won by Quick Baron. a horse owned by the Whebby Brothers from the Maritimes. It was a great thrill. I like to think that there have been other drivers who have done more and better things than I have. But I'm the only driver to win the first race ever held at the temple of harness racing."

Q: You mentioned the great driving colony that you had at Windsor Raceway, most of whom came with you to New Jersey.

"They were really exceptional. In addition to the greatest driver that ever sat behind

We had Shelly Goudreau, Bill Gale, Ronnie Waples and Greg Wright. People have a tendency to forget how great a driver Greg was. He really drove one exceptionally well and took great care of a horse as well as anybody when driving it. He was exceptional. But two things in my opinion might have kept him from being considered one of the best ever. One was that he had his own stable and that prevented him from being used as a catch-driver as much as he probably could have. The second was the terrible accident he got into where he really messed up an ankle.

"We had our Windsor guys, plus all of the great New York based drivers like Buddy, Benny, Herve, Carmine — you only needed their first names — Ted Wing, Jimmy Doherty; the Grand Circuit Hall of Famers like Haughton, Dancer, Sholty, Insko and Beissinger. Then along came a guy from Saratoga named O'Donnell, who for a period of time might have been the best of us all. Those were the days. I consider myself quite fortunate to have been a part of them."

Q: Tell us about some of your best horses.

"I guess the two that most people think about are Shiaway St Pat and Beach Towel.

"I think that people tend to diminish Shiaway St Pat and his win in the Hambletonian. He might not have been a great horse but he was a damned good one. I'm guessing the fact that he was a gelding and his pedigree was a somewhat unfashionable one had a lot to do with it. His win in the Hambletonian sure wasn't a surprise. I think he went off at 7-2. He should have won it in straight heats. But I think I moved him too quickly and set up a perfect trip for Super Juan and Howard Beissinger. After the race, I was interviewed on national television by Howard Cosell. I think more people have asked me about Cosell than the race or the horse.

"Cosell did make me look good, though. The next season, it looked like the horse was going to come back really strong. He qualified well. In his first start, he won the open trot at The Meadowlands. That's a pretty good feat — a 4-year-old beating the best trotters around in his first start at 4. After that race, he just was never the same.

"Beach Towel was a great horse. He had ability at 2, but he also suffered from a host of allergies. I remember training him at Garden State Park and his coming a last quarter in 26 seconds. That was unheard of for a 2-year-old, especially back then.

"Lana Rosenfeld, Seth's mother, knew an allergy specialist at New Bolton Center, so we sent him there. She suggested that we give him lots of fresh air and try to keep him outside. We turned him out 24/7 in a paddock at Showplace Farms and the allergies pretty much disappeared.

"He came back really fresh at 3 and was simply outstanding. The best part of that was that his opposition knew he was the

best and drove their horses accordingly, sparing Beach Towel any torturous trips. He was a pretty sound horse. I remember only doing his hocks before the Jug and the Breeders Crown. Other than that, he was pretty much vet free. He never went a bad race, although he usually raced much better with a week off between races. He was the very first horse to win \$2 million in a single season. Aside from siring Jennas Beach Boy, he was fairly disappointing in the stud though. We got a lot of his offspring to train. I sensed from the beginning that he might be lacking as a stallion. I kept hoping against hope that I was wrong, but I wasn't. One good thing though is in about 20 years from now, it will be hard to find a pacer that doesn't carry his blood, since he is the sire of the dam of the great Somebeachsomewhere.

"Two other exceptional horses that we were fortunate enough to have in our stable were the great filly Halcyon and Shark Gesture, who in my opinion, when he was at his best could go with any horse ever. There were a bunch of other ones, but those four were probably the best that we have had."

Q: You rarely use the word "I" when speaking about your stable. It is almost always "we."

"My brother Larry and I have been a team from the beginning of our time at The Meadowlands. Gord was also with us during that period. He preferred to be on his own. He is the only one of us still training. He trains and races a few horses at Mohawk. Both brothers were exceptional athletes in Saskatchewan. They were not as early to get into the game as I was. People don't realize that before he became a full-time horseman, Gord was a practicing attorney, specializing in real estate law. He realized that he liked being around horses and horsepeople more than he liked being round a bunch of lawyers. So he switched lifestyles."

Q: You and Larry have now been retired for five years. Do you miss it? What do you guys do to keep yourselves occupied?

"I do. I miss it a whole lot. Most of all I miss the friendships and camaraderie. The downhill trend began when the stable area at The Meadowlands was closed. The sense of community was gone.

"As far as what we do, Larry has to be one of the greatest fathers and grandfathers ever. His kids and grandkids live nearby and he is able to spend a whole lot of time with them. Unfortunately, mine don't live close and I don't get much chance to see them. I still follow racing regularly. I live close to The Meadowlands and I'm often at the qualifiers. I find that I enjoy them as much as I do the regular races, especially when the babies begin to race."

Q: Who are the best horsemen you've known?

"I'll try to stay away from the obvious ones. For me, Doug Ackerman is a great choice. He did things his way and he did them right. He had a lot of common sense and he used it. Another that maybe doesn't get the credit that he deserves is Bruce Nickells. He is best known as a great trainer of fillies. But before he got all those good fillies, he had some really good male horses like Batman and Kentucky. His philosophy when training fillies was different than most. Most people try to get along with the desire of the fillies and keep them sweet. Bruce believed that the fillies should do things his way. Another great trainer who's achievements sometimes get overlooked is Bob McIntosh. Never does a year go by when his horses do not race consistently well. Not only does he train all of his good horses, but he also breeds and raises most of them."

Q: You were a friend of Keith Waples.

"Yes I was and like most people, I really admired, make that, revered him. Our friendship began at a time when he wasn't actively training and driving horses. What a wise man. He didn't have a whole lot to say. But when he spoke, if you were smart, you listened.

"One of the greatest compliments I've ever received was when he would ship a horse to race at The Meadowlands, he would send it to our stable. Actually, we have often been honored in that respect. There have been so many great horsemen who through the years sent their horses to our stable. Among them were Delvin Miller, Jack Kopas, George

"I cannot think of a greater compliment than to be respected by your peers in such a manner.

"We've also been honored to train for many wonderful people. Among them were my grandfather Art, Wilbur Thompson, Seth Rosenfeld, the Whebby Brothers, Brad Grant and his father John and Charlie Myers."

Q: You are a member

of four Halls of Fame, Goshen, the Canadian Horse Racing and the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame.

"They were all great honors. One thing I've learned about Halls of Fame is that it doesn't hurt to have good backing. Of course, you have to have achieved something to get installed. But there are a lot of people who may have done as much, or more without getting there. I was nominated at Goshen by Bruce Stearns and from my understanding strongly supported by Norman Woolworth. Neither one of them hurt my chances."

Q: Yours was the first stable to reach a thousand wins at The Meadowlands.

"I won't say that we didn't work hard to get there, because we did. But we were also lucky. We often got the right horses at the right time. We had a great group of owners through the years who supported us — often through thick or thin. I'd like to think that we always did our best for them."

Q: Ray, you've been around a long time through many phases of the sport. How has it changed?

"I'll start with old guys refrain. It has changed very significantly, in most cases, not for the better. The good is the horses. Today's horse is so much better than that of a generation or more ago. They are sounder, smarter, stronger, generally better conformed and most certainly faster. The latter, unfortunately has led to something that is not that good. They have the ability to carry their speed longer. This has led to what I believe to be more predictable and less interesting racing. With exceptions of course, in order to be competitive today you've got to be on top or close to it. The difference is in the horse. Today's horse can cut it out and still be there at the end. In the early days of The Meadowlands, that type of driving was the exception. Now it has become the norm. I believe that it has taken a lot of the strategy out of racing. It is even more prevalent at the smaller tracks. If you are sitting worse than fourth at Yonkers, then there's a good chance that you can tear up any tickets that you have.

"Another thing that I've alluded to elsewhere is the absence of stable areas at more and more racetracks. It has taken the sense of camaraderie away. It's something that I believe we miss terribly."

Happy Birthday, John Campbell

A look at his early days. Also, some hard-to-believe history.

John Campbell celebrated his 67th birthday on Friday (April 8).

Let's take a look at some of his early days.

Campbell's first New Jersey free-for-all type was To Ri Johnny (circa 1980), a son of the new world setter from 1955 Adios Harry. That was the same year Campbell was born, meaning that in 1980, at age 25, Campbell was four years younger than To Ri Johnny's sire.

In 1980, Campbell won the very first New Jersey Classic with Bold Rush (\$4.20).

The 12-horse field was laden with Hall Of Famers already in the Hall or heading there:

1st – Campbell (1990 Hall of Famer) with Bold Rush. **2nd – Herve Filion** (1975 Hall of Famer) with Still The One.

4th – Billy Haughton (1968 Hall of Famer) with H H Serene.

5th – Buddy Gilmour (1989 Hall of Famer) with Action News.


6th – Bill O'Donnell (1990 Hall of Famer) with Rathmore.

9th – Stanley Dancer (1969 Hall of Famer) with Lester H.

One Freehold patron bet \$150,000 to show on Kassa Branca and one Garden State Park simulcast bettor another \$50,000.

YOU JUST NEVER KNOW

In April of 2004,12 experts were polled and asked in a national magazine to rate the 10 best 3-year-olds. Six did the pacers, six the trotters. The name Windsongs Legacy did not appear on any top 10 list.

The names Timesareachanging and Western Terror also were not mentioned.

IS THIS REAL?

In May of 1981, 25-year-old Mark O'Mara from Adrian, MI, won back-to-back races at Maywood Park with a full-brother and sister, one-fifth-of-a-second apart for the same connections.

Ashley Eldred – Trainer

Seven years ago, Canadian trainer Norm Dessureault was looking to sell some of his racehorses. Ashley Eldred had been watching a certain horse named Traverse Seelster and inquired about purchasing him. Eldred did just that and Traverse would turn out to be her best and favorite horse.

"Although when I purchased Traverse he wasn't the horse 'he used to be at one time,' it didn't matter to me. He went on to win many races for me. He was 'one of a kind' for whether he was a tad sore, tired or just not himself — he would give his all. Travis, as I call him, even raced under saddle for me and won.

"When he got sore, I knew it was his way of telling me he had enough and was ready to hang up his harness and saddle, so I retired him. He is now enjoying life in my back yard and will remain so until he crosses that rainbow bridge in the sky.

"So it's no surprise that whenever I have a bad day or need a pick up, Travis is the one I go to. Not my family or friends, but Travis. He is my all-time favorite horse, although Jake, Lulu, Michael and Richard are up there with him," Eldred said.

"I tend to fall in love with all my horses and that can be a problem. How can you not fall in love with a horse you work with 24/7, and who gives you all they have?

"Recently I had a bunch of my horses claimed during the claiming series at Pocono Downs. I hated losing them but you have to race your horse where he is competitive. It's not fair to the horse to race over his head, for it doesn't do you or the horse any good.

"Losing these horses diminished my stable for now I'm down to five horses. The numbers jump around, for at times I may have 15 horses in training, but now I'm down to five."

Eldred was born into a harness racing family. Her father Michael Eldred, mother, Ann Yurenka, and stepfather, William Bailey, are all involved. (Stepdad has since died.)



"I was born in Cooperstown, New York, but raised in Vernon. I spent a lot of time at Vernon Downs before moving back to Cooperstown, and shortly thereafter, I ventured out on my own.

"Growing up, I spent more time in the barn than anywhere else for I had to do my chores. After graduating from high school I began grooming horses, which took me to Florida and all over New York to race in Sire Stakes.

"Around three years ago I started working 'full time' and developed my own stable.

"Early on I started working under trainer Dan Dailey in Florida. Dan taught me a lot of horsemanship skills and the power of 'hard work'."

"I also worked for Norm Dessureault who taught me the most for he really took the time to explain things and taught me everything I needed to know to be a good trainer/horsewoman.

"And my stepfather, William Bailey, also taught me a lot. All of these men had a lot of faith in me and it just seemed so right and natural for me.

"I thank each and every one of them. Unfortunately, harness racing lost a great horseman and friend when Norm (Dess) passed away last year."

Eldred trains her horses at Mark Ford's farm located in Middleton, NY and uses drivers Greg Meron at Monticello and Matt Kakaley at Pocono and Yonkers.

She prefers training trotters, but most of the time her stable consists of pacers.

"I don't normally claim horses, but at times I will. I like to buy horses that I have taken care of before or have previously trained for other trainers."

As far as breeding her own horses, Eldred recently became a proud owner of a beautiful, Surreal filly, which her broodmare Art Candemonium gave her.

"It is so exciting to watch a little one grow. I'm not sure how involved I will be in breeding at this point, but it is thrilling for now."

Eldred is an all-around horsewoman — the kind harness racing needs more of. She trains, breeds, rides and rehomes horses.

"I know I'm what you would call a 'newbie' as far as a trainer, but I'm so happy and blessed to be doing exactly what I love to do. I'm not sure where the sport is heading, but I pray it flourishes for I'd like to do this forever.

"Presently, I am taking online courses for business management just in case I need a fall back. I also help my boyfriend, Jared Bako, with his stable.

"And I occasionally outride my horse, Paco, mostly at Vernon and Freehold.

"Although it may be chaotic and heart breaking at times, I wouldn't change a thing. The standardbred breed is truly amazing and they deserve the best."





Signs of change

He never needed an alarm clock, not for 72 years. Every day, he rises with the first glint of daylight, dresses for work in a flannel shirt, overalls and steel-toed boots. He brushes his teeth, trims his grey beard and steps into the kitchen. He pushes the button on the Keurig, watches the red light, then drops in a pod of Mountain Blend. After the pop of the puncture that begins the trickle of coffee into his mug, he enjoys the familiar smell in a 100-year-old house, the Tweedy House, the house his father built.

Each day he sits in his kitchen chair for half an hour with no radio, no food, no newspaper, or iPad. His thinking time. He looks through his kitchen window to the elm tree in his backyard, waiting for the first flutter from a robin or cardinal, doing the math in his mind.

Twenty-six years since the Ford plant closed, 11 since the racetrack closed, nine since Louise died, and almost two years since he last saw his daughter and grandson. Constantly, he searches for blame. Someone was responsible. Someone did something or didn't do something. He is not ready to forgive or forget the faceless, nameless, invisible forces that ruined everything. Blame eases his pain.

One by one, they fell, slow-motion dominos. After the plant closed, training harness horses and Louise were still in his life. When the racetrack closed, he still had Louise. Today, it's just morning coffee, silence, and an awkward truce with his daughter and 6-year-old grandson. They moved to Chicago because he would not take down the campaign sign after the election.

After his final shift, his walk out of the Ford plant gate was more surreal than shocking. He knew the end was coming. Like his father, he started at age 20, so seniority kept him around until the end. He got most of his pension, and he tried to view the closing as a good thing. He no longer would need to leave home at five in the morning and drive to the Butler Fairgrounds to train his horse before clocking in. Hell, he figured without

a job on the line, he could work with a couple of horses and spend more time with Louise.

The years after the Ford Plant closed were good cycles, mornings at the fairground, family and home with Louise fixing up the old house until it shined like a museum piece. Evenings were for racing, reading, or television, never more than 90 minutes at a sitting.

The only interruption was when he worked from three in the afternoon until closing at Richardson's Hardware. He never enjoyed the work, but the owner, Pete Richardson, became a good friend. The Hardware spat the bit when a Builder's Square went up down the road, so he did not have to quit. He was no quitter.

He took pride in being self-taught as a horse trainer.

He leaped from the grandstands to the backstretch alone. For several years he was another face in the grandstands. Eric Mullens and Slim Poduski, friends from work, joined him every Friday night at Jackson Raceway. Eric, good old Eric, gone 10 years now, and Slim, half gone in the nursing home. Both said he was crazy, but he suspected that they began to wish they had stepped into his new world of racing harness horses.

He puffs his chest out a bit, remembering he was the one who took the initiative to wander around the fairgrounds, hoping to find someone to watch and learn from, and he did. A woman, Jessie Marion, a crusty crone with a sad past, was one of the dearest souls he ever met.

Old Jessie not only mentored him, but she also watched his horse, or horses, when he had a wedding, a birthday, or went on vacation. For five years, two while he was working and three after the Ford plant closed, he was a sponge, and Jessie was a river training horses. The morning he found her in the stall, her big heart stopped, a mare laying in the straw next to her, his river went dry.

He was always a bit of an outsider in harness horse racing circles, which was mostly his fault. Most everyone on the backstretch got along. Racing folks help each other, but he did not grow up in the racing world. He knew it, and they knew it. They probably viewed him as an odd duck that crawled out of the woods and began to paddle around in their pond. Somehow, though, this situation made him happy.

He was a man of routine, his life a steady path, so he never understood his leap into the world of training harness racing horses. Taking a chance and risking time and money on such an odd passion was out of character. It was one of the strangest detours in his life, but his feeling of pride never faded, and he never regretted a single day in those barns or on that racetrack.

He never made money racing horses, never had a great horse, or more than two horses at a time. He always had racing dreams. Who doesn't? But they were small dreams, and if he was honest with himself, thoughts of owning a champion horse frightened him. The challenges of his few horses were like mysteries that both filled and eased his mind. He loved the solitude at the Fairgrounds, his favorite place.

For 15 years, whispers of the track closing were in the air, but he didn't want to believe them. Every year it was the same old rumor until it wasn't. He cared for both of his horses as if the racetrack closing was a bad dream. There was no Plan B. There were no other racetracks around, and he was not a nomad. He had Louise, a house, a life.

His life became empty without racing and desolate without Louise. He found homes for both horses. The second buyer bought his horse trailer with the horse. A silent tear fell on his steel-toed boot as he watched the trailer carrying his horse away from the Fairgrounds.

He does not like the anger that tugs at him. His daughter, who moved to the city and different politics, troubles him. He watches television shows that feed his anger towards people and things he knows he should not be angry about, but he cannot stop. Words come out of him that sound like a stranger, but the talk shows make him feel something. The anger takes away the hurt of the empty stalls at the fairgrounds, the absent touch of Louise on his shoulder.

He aches to go back to Louise's arms on a quiet morning. He yearns to hear the soft snort from a trotter in the barn. All gone, daughter and grandson are distant. Maybe it is time to take down the yard sign and pick up the phone.

Maybe tomorrow.









"You have a choice"

"Sir, you have a choice," says the waitress in the hotel breakfast room on your first jetlagged morning in Lexington. Eggs now come in 12 different varieties and I wish I were back in old East Berlin: "Eiern? Gibt's nicht."

Fine, but you have a choice also *not* to join the community of owners of trotters, pacers and runners. If, however, you elect to spend your money on a yearling, the outlay will incur a fee on registration with the authority.

Now, add \$100 for each standardbred head, making them eligible for eight North American stakes, appropriately named for Mr John H. Wallace, founding father of the breed. Incidentally, his bicentennial is coming up on Aug. 16.

The USTA registered close to 5,000 trotters born in 2020. That means a pot of almost \$500,000. Sponsorship and similar sources will accumulate to offer decent purses for the eliminations and finals.

A crisp Franklin entitles you to enter the eliminations in two national stakes (trot and pace) for free at 2 and 3 (preferably 3 and 4, or 2 and 4 for come-back kids), no further questions asked; no sustaining payment; no matter changes of ownership; no deadline. Stay out of trouble, pay your taxes, don't commit any misdemeanor, and you're allowed to dream about what to wear on the big day at the finals. Miracles still happen.

But my filly is by Goodfnothing out of Localheroine whose motherline is, well fuggedaboudit.

So? What about earlier out of the blue crosses that upset the industry's received wisdom on racing and bloodlines? What about the sturdy stallions who came in from the cornfields to serve the local mares? His crops were raced against each other in some overlooked sections of the Midwest, colts and fillies that — had they been shipped to the Red Mile, Good Time Park — would have, at the wire, been able to laugh at the fancy production of the fancy farms.

You don't have to hold a Ph.D. in marketing to guess what still makes the big splash in our sport: local, local, local. The filly of modest pedigree, out of a dam that almost died at the foaling, trained by the humblest, owned by the family of moderate means... Already one local factor ticked off, off-Broadway home

turf, may suffice for extensive media coverage such as that afforded to Somebeachsomewhere. Sports journalists, thank God, still know a few lines from the canon of American letters: "... the past... it's never dead. It's not even past."

Downside? Of course. Home-built longshots will be around for breeding down the stock, the production bought by hoodwinked customers. Animals will fare ill by bungling amateurs. Quack vets will get away with their prescriptions of banned substances.

Indeed, hazards, but with a shrinking stock of stellar material — standardbreds and thoroughbred — owned by the less pitiful among us, with federal legislation looming on the horizon of D.C. and Ottawa, horse racing is a sitting porcelain figurine for PETA.

It has been off the political agenda for 2,000 years, though:

No, the past, like the Volstead Act too, is not past. It still inspires forces that dream of reinventing the entire entertainment scene of East Germany.

All that remains for us is to relocate to France? Appropriately, *Omelette vallé d'Auge* is an excellent choice, a local egg dish originating from Normandy, France's equine heartland.

This year, Plainridge Park will be providing free programs for the entire 2022 meet, downloadable from the website (www.plainridgeparkcasino.com) under the "Racing" tab. The link will become available over the weekend.

The live racing schedule for 2022 has changed format from last year. It starts out with a Monday-Tuesday-Thursday rotation for April, May, June and July until Friday is added on July 29 and continues through the end of August. Post time for all race days from April through August is 4 p.m. The one exception is the Grand Circuit card held on Sunday (July 24) that features the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot and the Clara Barton distaff Pace. Post time for that day is 2 p.m.

In September, racing reverts back to Monday-Tuesday-Thursday until Sept. 18 when Sunday is added through the month of October, with the exception of Oct. 30. Post time also moves back to 2 p.m. Sundays are then dropped in November and the Monday-Tuesday-Thursday schedule returns for the final month of the meet until Thanksgiving Thursday (Nov.24) which will be dark and raced on Friday (November 25) which is closing day. Post time in November is 1 p.m.

The betting menu features an early and late Daily Double in races one and eight, Exactas and Trifectas available in every race, Superfectas available in every race (except Wicked Hi-5 races), Wicked Hi-5 Pentafecta in the sixth and last race, Pick-3 in races three and six and Pick-4 in race four. The minimum wagers for each are as follows: Daily Double \$2, Exacta \$1, Pick-3 \$1, Pick-4 50-cents, Trifecta 50-cents, Superfecta 20-cents and Wicked Hi-5 20-cents.

The 2022 season will also see the most robust stake schedule ever offered by Plainridge Park and for the first time, features four Grand Circuit events.

Besides the return of the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot and the \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace, two new stakes have been added this year and both are presented in conjunction with the Harness Horseman's Association of New England (HHANE). The \$100,000 Paul Revere Pace for 3-year-old pacers will be held on Thursday (April 28) and the \$100,000 Battle of Bunker Hill Trot for 3-year-old trotters will go behind the gate on Monday (May 16). These races were made possible by the continued support of the Race Horse Development Fund and this additional Grand Circuit presence at Plainridge Park will bring even more national attention to the quality harness racing product in Massachusetts.



After those spring and summer events conclude, the stake action will continue well into the fall when the \$2.24 million (est.) Massachusetts Sire Stakes return for another record breaking season. The stakes that highlight the quality trotters and pacers being foaled in the Commonwealth have produced 14 new stakes or track records over just the past two years and this year's crop of eligibles looks to be the strongest ever to hit the track. The meteoric rise in the quality and number of Massachusetts-bred Standardbreds in recent years is another direct result of the positive effect the Race Horse Development Fund has had on the sport in the state.



The overnight racing is also expected to be the most competitive ever as a result of the rock-solid returning driver colony teaming horses from some of the top trainers in the region.

Last year's dash driving king was Bruce Ranger who won 181 races and just over \$2 million in purses. Runners-up Shawn Gray (151 wins and \$1.5 million) and Drew Monti (135 wins and \$1.7 million) will also be back along with Nick Graffam, Kevin Switzer Jr., Drew Campbell, Jay Randall and many more. Also joining the regulars on opening day are Luke Hanners and Brad Irvine.

On the training side, last year's leader Jimmy Nickerson (60 wins and \$798,640 in purses) will be back in full force after moving his base of operations away from Saratoga to race full time at The Ridge. Nickerson wintered his entire barn in Pinehurst, North Carolina and has everything fresh and ready to go. Sheena Cohen (46 wins and \$503,794 in purses) and Melissa Beckwith (41 wins and \$470,457 in purses) were forces to be reckoned with all season long in 2021, finished right behind Nickerson and are expected to do the same again this year.

Plainridge Park's opening day card on Monday features a \$25,000 winners-over pace with a full field of eight going postward. The group is led by morning line favorite Put to Right, who has been racing successfully at the Meadowlands over the winter and ships in off his season's best 1:50.3 victory last week. Trainer Joe Nelson has Kevin Switzer Jr. at the lines, who was his regular driver at Plainridge last year where he started 28 times in 2021 winning twice, finishing second 10 times and third seven more. He earned \$71,750 as a result of his efforts and posted a seasonal mark of 1:51.4 as well.







Lit De Rose, Drama Act and Keep Rockin A win in Blue Chip Matchmaker Series

Lit De Rose, racing with Lasix for the first time, angled off the pylons in early stretch and rallied furiously to get by favored Easy To Please in the first of three \$40,000 divisions in round four of the Blue Chip-Matchmaker Series on Friday night (April 8) at Yonkers Raceway. Trainer/driver Pat Lachance guided the 7-year-old by Leader Bayama to a 1:52.3 score.

Man Dontforget Me and driver Dexter Dunn marched away sharply from the pole position, forcing Lachance to duck in behind her on the opening bend with Lit De Rose, a 7-2 proposition. Easy To Please, in search of her third victory in the series for driver Jordan Stratton, left hard from post six but settled in fourth on the opening bend. With the field in line, Dunn set fractions of :26.3 and :55.4 for the opening-half with Man Dontforget Me. Stratton asked Easy To Please to move past the half, and the 4-year-old rallied up to the pacemaker with three-quarters hit in 1:24.2.

Late on the final turn, Easy To Please surged to command and appeared destined for her third straight win, but Lachance was able to angle Lit De Rose out behind her, the mare kicked into high gear, and rolled by in the shadow of the wire. Easy To Please settled for second, with Man Dontforget Me third.

Owned by Guy Corbeil, Lit De Rose returned \$9.60 to win and keyed a \$22.40 exacta and \$62.50 trifecta. With her fourth win in 2022, Lit De Rose has earned \$109,610 this year.

Drama Act then made it three victories in four Blue Chip-Matchmaker legs, posting the fastest division to date with a 1:51.1 mile for driver George Brennan.

Action was fast and furious at the outset of the second division, as Best Head West and Mystical Carrie engaged in a bitter battle into the opening bend, with Matt Kakaley and Best Head West finally seating her rival midway on the turn. Drama Act settled in third in the early going, but Brennan pushed her to the front just past the :26.4 first fraction.

Once on top, the 1-5 favored Drama Act rolled to fractions of :56 and 1:23.4 before facing a brief challenge by pocket-sitter Best Head West in the late stages. Brennan shook the lines, and Drama Act completed her mile with a 27.2 final quarter, holding Best Head West at bay. Mystical Carrie tried to make a second move down the backstretch but was unable to engage the top pair, yet did hold third gamely.

Drama Act is owned by The OK Corral and trained by Ron Burke. The winner returned \$2.40 and led a \$4.20 exacta and \$8.40 trifecta.

Keep Rockin A and Tim Tetrick broke the ice with first victories in the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, scoring a 17-1 upset in the final \$40,000 stanza of the evening.

Getting away from the pole position, Tetrick saw three horses leave to his right but protected position, forcing multiple tucks before ceding the lead to 7-5 choice Gia's Surreal prior to the :27.2 first quarter. Jason Bartlett had full control with Gia's Surreal through fractions of :56.3 and 1:24.1 as Blue Ivy and Tyler Buter attempted a coverless trip down the backstretch, followed by 3-2 second choice Karma Seelster.

Gia's Surreal had a clear lead as Blue Ivy tired on the final turn, but that gave Tetrick ample room to pull Keep Rockin A from the pocket and pounce on the leader. The Jeff Cullipher-trained Keep Rockin A responded to Tetrick urging to roll past and posted a 1:51.4 mile in winning for the first time in six tries in 2022. Gia's Surreal, making her second start of the year, had to settle for second, with Karma Seelster and No Win No Feed A following in third and fourth.

Owned by Cullipher and Pollack Racing LLC., Keep Rockin A returned \$36 to win and keyed a \$169 exacta and \$340 trifecta. With fourth place finisher No Win No Feed A added, the 10-cent superfecta returned \$65.20. The 6-year-old Keep Rockin A is a daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven.

The fourth round of the MGM Borgata Series is featured on Monday night's (April 11) 13-race Yonkers program, with four \$50,000 divisions on tap. Additional stakes action follows on Wednesday (April 13) with four \$25,000 splits of the second leg of the John Brennan Trotting Series.

Muscle Hill's dam Yankee Blondie dead at 26

Winbak Farm is sad to announce the passing of 2009 USHWA Trotting Broodmare of the Year, Yankee Blondie. The 26-year-old was euthanized on Wednesday (April 6) due to complications from colic.

"We are heartbroken over the loss of Yankee Blondie," said Jack Burke, general manager. "She may have lived until the age of 26 but her death still seems unexpected because she was in great shape for her golden years."

The daughter of American Winner was a half-sister to TV Yankee, 2, 1:56 (\$572,024), and Yankee Yankee, 2, 2:00.2q (\$272,638).

"We are proud to have been the owners of a mare as great as Yankee Blondie," said Joe Thomson, Winbak Farm owner. "We were privileged to be able to raise and sell her offspring."

"We will always cherish the memories of Yankee Blondie's son Muscle Hill and the thrills that he brought us," said Burke. "Muscle Hill winning the Hambletonian is still one of my favorite victories by a Winbak graduate."

Yankee Blondie was best known for being the dam of 2009 USHWA and O'Brien Horse of the Year, Muscle Hill, 2, 1:53.3; 3, 1:50.1 (\$3,266,835). Muscle Hill was the USHWA 2-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year. He was also the Dan Patch and O'Brien 3-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year. Muscle Hill was a World champion and winner of 20 races. At 2, Muscle Hill won the Breeders Crown elimination and Final, Peter Haughton elimination and Final, New Jersey Sire Stakes Final, Bluegrass Stakes, International Stallion Stakes and Simpson Stakes. At 3, he won the Hambletonian elimination and Final, Canadian Trotting Classic elimination and Final, Breeders Crown Final, World Trotting Derby, Kentucky Futurity elimination and Final, American-National Stakes, Stanley Dancer Memorial, and a New Jersey Sire Stakes leg and Final.

Muscle Hill was inducted into Harness Racing's Hall of Fame in 2016. He is the sire of offspring who have earned \$81,655,957.

"Muscle Hill was one of the best trotters to ever look through a bridle," said Burke. "As a sire, his impact on the breed is unmeasurable and it all started with Yankee Blondie producing a world champion."

Yankee Blondie was also the dam of Diesel Don, 2, 1:56.4; 3, 1:55.3 (\$247,117). At 2, Diesel Don won the American-National Stakes Final and Valley Victory Stakes elimination and Final.

Her last foal, All Star Yankee, is now 2. He is in training with the Blake Macintosh Stable.

Yankee Blondie's legacy will continue to impact Winbak Farm's broodmare band.

"Winbak Farm is the proud owner of Yankee Blondie's daughter, Met's Rival, and granddaughters, Commando Queen and Met's Inn," said Burke. "Commando Queen is the second dam of millionaire, Gimpanzee, and Met's Inn is the dam of Millionaire, Met's Hall."

Yankee Blondie will be fondly remembered by the Winbak Farm team.

"Yankee Blondie will be missed," said Burke. "She was a truly special horse, and we will be forever grateful for her and the impact she had on our farm."

Harrington Raceway live racing opens Monday

Harrington Raceway's 76th season of live harness racing opens April 11 with a 4:30 p.m. post time.

USTA director Siegel criticizes **USTA**

Last week, the USTA, in its online newsroom, posted an article titled "Texas District Court Dismisses HISA Constitutional Challenge" with a byline of sorts, "April 1, 2022, from the USTA Communications Department."

Let me be clear that I am a supporter of HISA (the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority) which lands me in a minority of USTA directors. I have no issue with the fact that the board support HISA as our board is based on fair democratic principles and on this one, I have a dissenting opinion.

That said, I have huge problems with the aforementioned article. Most importantly, other than the first two paragraphs which factually state how the case was resolved in the district court of Texas, the piece is an editorial, not news. In addition, it clearly was not constructed by the USTA Communications Department, but rather drafted by an attorney quite familiar with the dispute. My best guess is that attorney is Russell Williams, our president. Whether or not he is the author, I would strongly surmise he approved this editorial masquerading as news.

The difference is that news is supposed to be fact-based. I would have no issue if this were placed in some other forum where opinions are expected and belong.

Another big picture issue is that the site is aimed to inform the USTA members and anyone else interested in standardbred racing and other standardbred activities. Using the news section of the site when it goes beyond fact (and not clearly labeled as such), is problematic in that it does not allow for dissenting opinions. An editorial section of the site with op-eds is perfectly appropriate for debating major issues such as this.

However, even if the USTA feels that there is no room for opposing views on its site; it should not effectively broadcast propaganda masquerading as fact on its news page.

That is my OPINION.

The Big M amateur racing

As a harness racing gambler since the days of Joe Marsh, Jr. and Dave Magee (of Midwest lore), I read with interest Debbie Little's question on the "pale" of amateur racing (**Read here**). While I'm not sure the question posed was answered, I can say — not because of amateur racing. I have learned that serious gambling is more rewarding when betting pools are deep in cash like the Gulfstream thoroughbred winter meet.

On the profitable days that lingered over to Meadowlands racing, I initially ignored the amateur races and chalked them up to post time lag. Having known of Mark Silva's travels from Cali to the Meadows to the Meadowlands, I pitched a heavy bet (no pun intended) on Silva the "A" driver against the amateur drivers, and he clicked. Since then, while still preferring the Meadowlands best, I gradually saw opportunity in the amateur races, rating the drivers, post positions and the betting pool (not necessarily past performance lines). Little notes that about a third of favorites win these races. My quess is over time these favorites have yielded much better payouts than a typical piping hot odds on favorite. So I have begun to pay more attention to these races as gambling opportunities. Amateur races pose more gambling risk, but can yield greater reward. Let's just avoid pro-am races as past events, such as at Yonkers, will send the faithful to the exits.
