Always stick close to nature

Why keeping stallions together in a barn isn't always the best policy.

Howard Beissinger always said you should always stick as close to nature as possible when dealing with horses. As many times as I heard him say that, it took far too long for it to really sink in.

As a case in point, when Dr. Lynda Stewart and I flew up to Quebec to check out Garland Lobell, he was stabled in a big barn completely surrounded by mares. There were no partitions on his stall walls. His stall was just as open as the mares' stalls, so he could sniff nose to nose with his neighbors anytime he felt like it.

After he was syndicated and relocated to Walnut Hall, I put him in one of the huge stalls in our famous stallion barn. If it

was good enough for such foundation sires as Scotland and Volomite, surely it was good enough for Garland Lobell?

Wrong, wrong, wrong. Whereas Garland had been a relaxed, laid back horse in his barn surrounded by mares in Quebec, he was a nervous, high-strung horse in his new, Lexington home. In our stud barn each horse's stall door has a yoke, so the horse can actually stick his head out. Whenever any of the other studs in the barn would take advantage of the opportunity to check things out up and down the barn, Garland would get visibly agitated.

His performance in the breeding shed was also affected. As long as he was stabled next to the other studs in our shedrow barn, he didn't breed as well as he had in Quebec. By which I mean, he had a problem settling his mares that he didn't have before.

At this point, enter, stage left, Dr. Phil Hunt. He was the manager of a farm in Pennsylvania, where they stood a trotter named Nearly Perfect. As a racehorse, Nearly Perfect was a star. He rumbled with Mack Lobell week after week at The Meadowlands, whipping him on occasion.

So when Nearly Perfect was retired to the Gettysburg farm run by Dr. Hunt, he was quite popular with mare owners. And as stud managers have been doing since time immemorial, and are still

doing today, Nearly Perfect was stabled in the same barn as the other two stallions the farm was standing.

The only problem with the whole Nearly Perfect caper, as we say in the detective trade, was that the horse had a problem settling his mares. I personally got involved here, when I took advantage of the opportunity to buy a share in Nearly Perfect at a bargain price.

Since the mares in those days had to be inseminated on site, that is, the stud's site. I called Tad Egloff to tell him I'd be sending a mare up to him who was booked to Nearly Perfect. Tad's reaction was the opposite of enthusiastic, to say the least.

As a shareholder in the Nearly Perfect Syndicate, I received regular reports from Dr. Hunt documenting his horse's progress, or lack thereof, in the breeding shed. That continued for several years, and then Dr. Hunt advised our hardy little band of remaining shareholders, that he'd made a drastic change in Nearly Perfect's routine, and the horse was now breeding at a higher level that he had only dreamed about before.

Following Beissinger's directive of staying close to nature, Dr. Hunt had moved Nearly Perfect out of the stallion barn and reinstalled him in a barn that housed only mares. He also now turned him out in a paddock where there were mares on both sides in the neighboring paddocks. Lo and behold, Nearly Perfect was now settling his mares at a better clip, as I said above, that previously belonged in the dream category.

Hunt explained that he could see that Nearly Perfect was intimidated by the two other studs when he was stabled with them. When he was moved away, his personality changed, and for the first time he took on the outward characteristics that go with a virile, sexually aggressive breeding horse.

Nearly Perfect became a moderate success as a progenitor after he went back to nature. He sired a number of useful racehorses plus the stakes filly Imperfection and the stakes colt Sierra Kosmos.

Sierra Kosmos was an interesting story in his own right. He was trained and driven by a true amateur Rick Beinhauer, although that didn't stop him from being a sharp horseman who could

hold his own with the big boys. His horse took a record at 3 of 1:53.4 and in two seasons of racing on the Grand Circuit earned over half a million dollars.

That was a good enough resume to earn Sierra Kosmos a stall in the Hanover Shoe stallion complex. There he was a modest success, getting three million-dollar-winning trotters, led by Jim Doherty's top mare, No Nonsense Woman.

Parenthetically, Jim Doherty was one of the last great trainers who was an equally skilled driver. I can still hear his wonderful New Brunswick accent, and our world is the poorer for not having him in it. Same goes for the loss this week of Osvaldo Formia. I was fortunate to know him well during my Howard Beissinger days. He was a great horseman, but more than that, he was a wonderful human being. I like to think maybe we'll meet up again someday, if I'm lucky.

As I've confessed before, it's almost a compulsion of mine to run a five generation pedigree of any horse that catches my eye. So I ran Nearly Perfect's. He was by Songcan and out of Exciting, by Super Bowl. Songcan was by Florican, and Florican is also the sire of Nearly Perfect's third dam, making him 2 by 4 to that horse.

In case you forget, when the sum of the generations in which the same name appears twice is six or less, that is designated as inbreeding. When the total is seven or eight, you have line breeding, and when the total is nine or higher, that is an outcross.

All one knows about Florican is that he raced as a stablemate of Star's Pride for the Arden Homestead Stable, the nom de course of the Gerry-Harriman family.

It's entirely possible that he was a shy breeder, although he wrote his name indelibly in the history of our sport when he sired Mistletoe, the dam of Speedy Crown.

I also picked up another tidbit when I looked over Nearly Perfect's extended pedigree. His fourth dam is Kashaplenty, and therein lies a tale.

Kashaplenty was bred by Castleton Farm, owned by the automobile heiress, Frances Dodge, late Frances Dodge Johnson, later still Frances Dodge Johnson Van Lennep.

"And what's the one named for me, dear?" Freddy asked.

"No Fun," Frances answered, and with that you have the whole book on one of the most prominent marriages in our amazing sport.

But all humor aside, both Fred and Frances made enormous contributions to our sport, which will continue to live on as long as standardbreds are bred and raced all over the world. And their generous spirits live on in their lovely daughter Rikki, and their equally lovely granddaughter, Elizabeth.



Burnsie reflects on 60 years in the game

John Burns, AKA "Burnsie" was 13 years old when he first met Clarence "Shorty" Lockhart at the Collingwood, ON fairgrounds. Lockhart had a well-known stable of trotters and pacers based at the fairgrounds. Burnsie would regularly ride his bicycle past the fairgrounds and often make a stop at Lockhart's stable. At the time, Burn's greatest interest, as with most young Canadian boys, was with hockey. It soon expanded to become horses and hockey.

Burns did for Waples essentially what he did for Lockhart. He groomed, trained and shipped horses to and fro between Ontario and Montreal.

He describes his time with Waples as the greatest learning experience a young man could have.

"Keith was the nicest person you could possibly work for. If you kept your eyes and ears open and your mouth shut, you would learn a whole lot," Burns said.


Waples' life-long partner in the stable was his brother Murray, who Burns describes as a gruff sort on the outside and a good guy on the inside. Cousin Ronnie Waples, who was destined to become a double Hall of Famer, as of course was Keith, was also working there. Among the owners in the stable was lumber man Hector Cloutier and the successful Quebec stable La Ferme Drummond. Burnsie well remembers Mighty Dudley winning the first 2.00 mile at Richelieu Park for Waples.

At the time, other than fair venues, the only operational racetrack in Ontario of consequence was Old Woodbine, which was to become known as Greenwood. They only raced in July and August. Burns began working for Lockhart and ended having two stints working with the Lockhart stable.

Burns did everything that a young man could do around a stable of horses, including grooming, trucking and training.

At the age of 14, Burns acquired his first horse, a pacer named J. R. Spencer. He won in 2:18 as a 2-year-old. Lockhart suggested to Burns that he send the colt to Keith Waples, who was racing in the big time as it were — the Montreal circuit of Blue Bonnets and Richelieu Park. Burns told him he didn't have the money needed to pay for the training and maintenance of the horse. Lockhart then made him the proverbial offer he couldn't refuse. Lockhart would guarantee all expenses for J. R. Spencer. The colt was sent to Waples and he won his first start for him in 2:06 on the Richelieu half-mile track. J. R. Spencer remained with Waples. Added baggage was Burns, who began a decadelong stint working in the Waples Stable. One of the highlights was winning the Centennial Pace in Peterborough with his J R Spencer.

Dr Rosario Gauthier, who Burns remembers as the greatest veterinarian he has ever known, oversaw the health of the horses as well as that for most of the successful stables in Quebec at the time.

"He was just the most amazing vet I've ever known and a real gentleman to boot. What he didn't know about a horse's health probably wasn't worth knowing," Burns said.

After 11 years with Waples, Burns decided to go out on his own. His first major owners were Dave Morrissey and Bob Hamather.

"Dave liked owning racehorses and would pay whatever it took to get good ones. He wasn't even slightly interested in buying yearlings. The first real top horses we got were Merry Isle and Dangerfield Bruce. By then I had moved my stable to The Meadowlands. John Campbell helped me a whole lot. He got me some owners and drove most of my horses. We won the Oliver Wendell Holmes beating Hot Hitter with Merry Isle. Dave had made a deal to buy Dangerfield Bruce for \$100,000. I was standing there with a lead shank waiting to pick up the horse while Dave was consummating the deal with a check. Some time went by. The horse and me were getting restless. I asked Dave what was the delay? He said that the man now wanted \$110,000 instead of the agreed upon \$100,000 for Bruce. I told him to just give him what he wanted. He did and Dave owned the horse.

"I was at The Meadowlands four years. I also had some horses at Greenwood and would race some at Roosevelt, as well. It got to be too much. I was traveling all over. No wonder my wife didn't stay with me. We got divorced. We were up to 72 head at one time. It was too much. I decided to go back home. Morrissey gave the horses to Dave Elliott to continue racing at The Meadowlands.

"I assembled a stable to race on the Ontario Jockey Club circuit. John Campbell was a big help in getting me started. He got me some owners. Among them were Bill Perretti and Arlene Traub. They both had a reputation for their horses coming with roller skates on their trunks. They lived up to their reputations.

"Among the first horses I got was a Dream of Glory pacer named Armbro Worthy. I got him from Joe O'Brien's stable. He was making breaks on the pace. I tried him on the pace and he continued to make breaks. I then tried him on the trot. After three races, he was in the invitational trot.

"I did like Perretti. I got along with him pretty well. One of the horses he sent to me was Wild Bill Skipper. He had been a \$250,000 yearling. I told Bill he was no good. He can go in 2:07. Bill had George Berkner pick him up.

"I loved George. What a character he was. I remember him telling me about Perretti, 'Don't take all his money. He has enough for both of us."

Q: You've had a lot of owners in your time in the game. You've already spoken about Morrissey, Perretti and Arlene Traub. Let's talk about some of the others.

"I guess in retrospect there weren't too many that I've missed. When I first came back to Canada I had a very diverse stable.

"One of the first owners I got was Earl Warren. Earl was a well-known radio personality in Toronto. He was a wonderful man, who was horse poor. He was paying the bills on 13 horses. I

told him that was ridiculous. There was no way he could sustain a stable with that many horses, especially since most of them were not very good. We began culling. Eventually, he reached the point where he may not have been making money, but he sure was losing a whole lot less.

"I suppose the one owner I was most associated with was Harold Shipp. He had his horses with Bill Wellwood. He contacted me and said he wanted to make a change. Would I take his horses and buy some yearlings for him? Is the Pope Catholic? You are darn right I would. We enjoyed a lot of success and had a lot of fun together.

"Here's couple of stories about Harold. He liked Dream of Glory. He instructed me to go to the Canadian Classic yearling sale and buy him some Dream of Glorys. I bought seven of therm. The best of them was a filly whose name he changed to Shipps Doll. She earned \$213,896. I was somewhat restricted in my buying for him, because he was friends with the Armstrong family and wanted to buy mostly from them.

"He had two dogs. They were named Trapper and Schnoops. He had bought a lovely chestnut Armbro Omaha colt from Armstrong whose name he changed to Shipps Trapper (\$225,795). For some reason he wanted to get a gray colt whose name he would change to Shipps Schnoops to go with his chestnut. We were in Lexington. Armstrong didn't have any grays in their consignment. Harold came upon a gray in the Almahurst consignment. He asked me to look at him. I told him that I didn't like the colt. Harold had to go home, but he told me to find him a gray colt. Stoner Creek was selling a gray colt by On The Road Again out of Watering Can. I thought he was alright and bought him for Harold. That was to be Shipps Schnoops. He ended up earning \$658,123. We parted perhaps not on the best of terms. However down the road we reconciled and renewed our friendship. He was as good an owner as there was to be found in the sport.

"Two of my dearest friends and partners were the sports figures, the hockey player John Ferguson and the baseball pitcher Dan Plesac. Both of them are wonderful guys who really loved their horses and harness racing."

Q: Let's talk about some of your best horses.

"We've already spoken of Merry Isle and Dangerfield Bruce. I claimed Fight The Foe three different times. I bought him first for \$12,00, then \$20,000 and finally for \$40,000. He kept going up the ladder, but I stopped at \$40,000.

"My all-time favorites would probably be a dead heat between Towner's Image and Hardie Hanover. If I had to, I'd give a slight edge to Towners Image. I looked upon her win in the Jugette as being my entrance to the big time.


"Then there were all the Shipps Horses — Shipps Scorch(\$755,065), Shipps Schnoops (\$658,123), Shipps Dream (\$643,757), Shipps Fella (\$478,191), Shipps Expectation (\$318,053), Shipps Belle (\$265,335) and Shipps Doll (\$213,896).

"Another really good filly we had in the stable was Triplet Hanover.

"Adding it all up, we've had five O'Brien Award winners and won two Breeders Crowns."

Q: Rate the best five trainers you've known in numerical order."

- "1. Billy Haughton Just an incredible horseman and an even better human being.
- "2. Bill Robinson It might have taken some time for me to acknowledge it. He ran a remarkable operation and always beat me.
- "3. Bob McIntosh Year after year, horse after horse. I believe he is still the leading Breeders Crown winning trainer. If not, he is darn close.
- "4. Brett Pelling He's a guy I've learned to respect. His entire body of work is incredible.
- "5. Ronnie Waples I hate to have to say it, but he is one great horseman (laughs)."



Q: Do the same for drivers.

- "1. John Campbell He leads in everything both on and off the track.
- "2. Keith Waples To quote Neil Diamond, 'It was a different time and a different place. But he was the first really great driver I've seen.
- "3. Bill O'Donnell For a defined period of time, maybe the best to sit behind a horse.
- "4. Doug Brown For several years as good as Canada ever had.
- "5. Steve Condren A great driver and a great judge of pace. Took very good care of a horse."

Q: What have you been doing with yourself since retiring?

"This past winter I worked with Bill Cass. He's a wonderful guy and a terrific horseman. We were two old guys taking care of three horses. He is now down to two. So I became redundant (laughs).

"As it has for many people, COVID has had a terrible effect on my life and lifestyle. It has prevented me from traveling and going to the sales. I miss doing some of the things I took for granted."

Q: What has been your greatest thrill in all your years of racing?

"That would have to be winning the Jugette with Towner's Image in 1993. A close second would be Hardie Hanover's Breeders Crown."

Q: Any parting words?

"I've been pretty fortunate. I've always had great teachers, great help and the benefit of being around and utilizing the best drivers and trainers. If there is one thing I've learned in this life of ours you cannot do it alone."

It was (almost) 20 years ago that No Pan Intended ruled racing

It's been 19 years since No Pan Intended won the 2003 Triple Crown and the Breeders Crown in his racing career finale. Not a single horse before or since has won both the Triple Crown and Breeders Crown.

David Miller drove for Ivan Sugg and the Peter Pan Stable. A son of Pacific Fella — a grandson of Cam Fella — No Pan Intended did not race in the North America Cup and was fourth in the Meadowlands Pace the only time all year he missed the board.

No other active driver not named David Miller has won a Pacing Triple Crown.

Twelve times No Pan Intended was the odds on favorite in 2003. He was 21 17-3-0 for the year, but in an oddity, in those three losses none were even close:

- 5 1/4 lengths to Whatanartist in the Meadowlands Pace elimination (1:49 for the winner)
- 4 1/4 lengths to Iced Yankee in a NW2
- 3 3/4 lengths to All American Captor in the Windy City Pace

No Pan Intended was actually second-placed-first in the Art Rooney (\$273,983).

He was a son of Classic Wish, a Hall Of Fame broodmare. His lifetime mark of 1:50.3 came the last time he ever was on the track over Escape The Wind. His highest odds in any race was 8.20-1 in the Meadowlands Pace. When he won the Jug, that was one of 10 wins on that memorable day for David Miller in his home state.

A HAMBLETONIAN BREAKTHROUGH?

Will 2022 be the year of a David Miller Hambletonian breakthrough? He will be 57 on Hambletonian Day, but, remember, Billy Haughton didn't get the Hambletonian ball rolling until he was 50 and then couldn't be stopped. He won in 1974 with Christopher T, 1976 with Steve Lobell, 1977 with Green Speed and 1980 with Burgomeister.

Seaside Hanover was unraced at 2. He debuted at Hoosier Park with a fourth on March 31. It may not be possible to be fourth in a race and be any more impressive that he was that night. He then romped in his follow-up for owners David McDuffee and Lee DeVisser. Melanie Wrenn trains and Peter Wrenn drives. Remember this name.

NOTHING AVERAGE ABOUT THESE TWO

What a difference a decade (or less) can make. In 1975, it was a special year for the first crop of yearlings by the Dynamic Duo of Super Bowl and Albatross. Their stud fees were \$5,000 for the 1971-1972 HOY Albatross and \$3,000 for the 1972 Triple Crown winner Super Bowl. Albatross' average yearling sold in 1975 for \$24,422 and Super Bowl's yearlings averaged \$24,359. Fast forward seven or eight years and this incredible pair, both standing at Hanover Shoe Farms, had stud fees of \$75,000 and \$30,000, respectively.

\$200 MILLION UPCOMING FOR GEORGE BRENNAN

George Brennan will turn 55 on April 20. He is next up in the \$200 million club, either very late this year or in 2023.

It's a long way from veteran trotter Indianapolis helping put Brennan's name out there in the winter of 1994 at the Meadowlands. It wasn't long at all before Brennan showed that he could handle the major stakes scene taking the 1995 Woodrow Wilson with A Stud Named Sue and then in 1996 the Meadowlands Pace with Hot Lead. It was Brennan's debut in both races.

HUGH GRANT REMEMBERED

Now here is a guy you probably wanted to follow around back in the middle of the 20th century: Hugh Grant. He once said, "The best investment I ever made was in Del Miller."


The Grants, from Bradford PA, sold the family oil business in 1948 to Pennzoil, though Hugh was still in the business holding properties and oil leases in Oklahoma, Texas and Florida. Son Andy Grant followed him at Georgetown.

Hugh tinkered with thoroughbreds, too. His best early buy was Adios Betty, the first 2-year-old filly to be clocked in 2:00.

He loved the breeding end and in 1975 said, "I get more pride now from what I breed than when I win."

In 1963, he sold Meadow Skipper to Norman Woolworth for \$150,000 as a 3-year-old. He never regretted the sale and was more than happy for all the success Meadow Skipper achieved. Meadow Skipper is one of the sires in which Hugh had shares. He also had shares in Albatross, Super Bowl, Nevele Pride and Most Happy Fella.







The Cardinal final is a chance for Starlit Dandy to make his case for a title bout

Mike Hollenback uses boxing as an analogy when discussing the challenges of getting a horse to Indiana Sires Stakes competition. If sires stakes are the headlining title bout on a card, early closing series at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino like The Cardinal are the vital undercard events for up-and-coming talent. Hollenback trains and co-owns Starlit Dandy, a trotter that has captured a leg of the series and recently finished second in another. The Dover Dan—Don't Miss A Tweet gelding will get a chance to answer the bell Wednesday (April 20) in the \$18,000 final in hopes of making a case for a shot at the title.

"You're working your way up to the big fight. You've got to have these kinds of races, one, to figure out if you've got that kind of horse, and two, to let him get that confidence to be that kind of horse when you're in against eight or nine of them that are really good ones," Hollenback said. "That's our big plan, just try to get in and mix it up in the sires stakes."

Starting the season with a successful 1:59.1 qualifier on March 30, Starlit Dandy broke his maiden in his April 6 debut. Steered by Robert Taylor, the 3-year old raced near the back of the field in a \$9,000 division of the opening Cardinal leg. Racing out of the final turn, Taylor could see nearly the entire field when he asked Starlit Dandy. The trotter responded with a :27.2 kick, dealing a knockout blow in the stretch to win by nearly three lengths and stopping the clock in 1:58.

"He got home in :27 with more or less a hand drive. I haven't even taken the hood off yet. I still race him with a hood on,"

said Hollenback, who has partnered with Peter Schmucker Jr. on the horse. "As I was telling Robert, we're just trying to teach him. I think he's a nice horse. He's no Dover In Motion, but he's a nice horse."

With a win under his belt, Starlit Dandy nearly added another April 13 in the second leg of The Cardinal, a series for non-winners of a pari-mutuel race lifetime with earnings of \$20,000 or less, or non-winners of \$8,500 lifetime. Using similar tactics, the favorite raced next to last in the field of seven through a :56.4 opening half. Leaving the pylons and advancing first up to third in the turn, Taylor steered Starlit Dandy home quickest of all (:28.1) to finish second behind four year old Swans King, a 1:54.3 victor. The sophomore, to his credit, trotted the mile in 1:55.1 in defeat over a track rated sloppy. The other Cardinal division produced a 2:00 winner.

"Nobody expected that mile to go in :54.3. When the half popped up in :56 and change, I thought we had a shot, because I know my horse can get home," said Hollenback. "One of them didn't come back enough to him. I felt like he was steadily gaining. Robert wasn't trying to drive the hair off him coming home. They had a good wind hitting them in the face again. Getting home in :28.1 the other night is :27 on a good night. We were happy."

How does a horse with two solid sophomore starts begin the year in The Cardinal? The tale of the tape shows that Starlit Dandy has made advances after nine 2021 outings that produced two on the board finishes, no victories, and past performance lines dotted with breaks.

"When we started out he looked like a really nice colt. I trained him down at Pinehurst and he was the talk of the track down there. Everybody thought he was a real deal colt," the conditioner said. "I drove him one night at Hoosier and he trotted in :57.2 and got home in :27 and change. After that start he got a little colt sore and he went downhill each start. He just looked worse and worse, and I couldn't get him right."

By late September, Hollenback and Schmucker decided to shut Starlit Dandy down. Their \$13,000 Michiana Classic purchase was turned out to mature for the 2022 campaign. When he returned to the track to train down this winter, the gelding had transformed.

"His whole body matured. He was like an underdeveloped kid when he was young, but by the time he got out of high school





and went to college, he looked like an athlete," said Hollenback. "He always showed speed last year, he just couldn't hold up to it. This year he's been really good. He's trained back awesome. I just cross my fingers all the time because I know the colt is talented. If you wanted to trot a 26-second quarter, he could do it. He just has a very efficient gait."

The next test comes Wednesday in the \$18,000 Cardinal final. Starlit Dandy has drawn the rail in the night's 12th race. The trotter has proven he is no tomato can, and a victory in the series would further prove he can slug it out in Indiana

Sires Stakes competition. Dover In Motion earned the title of freshman trotting champion in the Hoosier State last season after a stellar campaign. It remains to be seen whether Starlit Dandy has the mettle to beat last year's top talent and reach the pinnacle, but Hollenback knows he has a contender.







Goop's San Moteur impressed in front of home crowd

Björn Goop-trained **San Moteur** (Panne de Moteur) was at his very best when the \$52,500 Prins Carl Philips Jubileumspokal for 5-year-olds was held at Färjestad racetrack in Sweden on Friday afternoon (April 15).

Top trotters such as Önas Prince, Bepi Bi and Brambling gathered behind the car when the prestigious race over 1,640 meters was on the race card and ,as expected, Önas Prince left quickly from his inside position and kept the lead without any major problems. San Moteur got an early offensive order from Goop and the duo made contact with the leaders outside after 500 meters.

A high pace the first kilometer didn't stop San Moteur from disarming Önas Prince in mid-stretch and the talented trotter

more or less sprinted to safe win in an impressive mile rate of 1:51.3, the fastest time in the world by a trotter 2022, so far.

San Moteur finished second in the \$840,000 Kriteriet for 3-year-olds in 2020 (Brambling won) and third in the \$840,000 Derby in 2021 (Calgary Games won, Önas Prince was second), and has now 12 wins in 16 attempts.

Goop and the people connected to San Moteur will most probably face the enjoyable problem of whether the 5-year-old colt is ready for a start in Elitloppet at Solvalla in May, because the question will be asked by Solvalla.

HONEY MEARAS WINS FOLKE HJALMARSSONS MINNESLOPP

Last year's dominant trotter among the 4-year-old mares, Honey Mearas (Readly Express) made her 2022 debut from post 10 in the \$31,500 Folke Hjalmarssons Minneslopp over 1.3 miles and despite a tough trip where Honey Mearas landed outside the leader with a kilometer remaining of the race, she showed great strength over the stretch and won in a mile rate of 1:56.2.

The Ballad of Bert Griffleson

In the summer of 2008, at an estate auction in Ravenna, OH, I stumbled across the life works of Bert Griffleson. The estate was a suburban duplex with peeling lime green paint, untended bushes climbing to the windowsills, and a side entrance door nailed shut with two-by-fours.

My \$100 bid secured a large, shopworn mahogany desk that I planned on restoring to its former glory. While waiting for my brother-in-law to arrive in his pickup truck, I began to remove the drawers to lighten the load. To my surprise, I noticed the lower right-hand drawer had a false bottom, nothing fancy, just a square of plywood resting on small ledges of wood. I used my pocket knife to pry the plywood off.

Beneath the plywood was what appeared to be an oversized light blue cigar box, about four inches deep, wide enough to hold a school notebook. Snippets of black electrical tape formed the letters BG on the lid.

Like a man disabling a bomb, I removed the box and opened the lid. The strange blue box bulged with a large stack of single sheets of paper covered on both sides with tight, neat script handwriting. I didn't know what to do with the box or the contents, so after the auctioneer hammered down a fake Tiffany lamp for \$33 dollars, I stepped forward and whispered the situation to him.

He said, "Ask Gladys, the homeowner. She's in the living room, in a rocker."

Estate owner Gladys Griffleson was an ancient, sharp-boned woman with eyes magnified by thick eyeglasses. She propelled her chair like a human metronome. As I stepped into the room, she was cackling at a pair of teenage girls innocently examining a stack of board games stacked on a tattered red velvet sofa.

Without slowing her rocking chair, she snapped, "I'm 94, 95 next month, and I have all my marbles. I am departing these premises under duress." Her tone dared anyone to question her math or sanity.

The girls smiled nervously and hurried away. I stepped forward and congratulated her on her remarkable age and on keeping her marbles, and then I explained the box situation.

Gladys was not surprised or sentimental, "Oh, that was Bert's, my youngest son, the runt of the litter. Those papers ruined his life. I don't want 'em, take 'em, or just pitch 'em. There ain't no money, I checked."

I flashed her a thumbs up and took a step in the direction of the door.

Unprompted, Gladys Griffleson stopped me in mid-step and began to shed some light on the dark corners of her son's life.

"Bert's long gone, a coronary thrombosis in 1979."

Gladys slowly shook her halo of white hair and spoke with a heavy sigh. "My Bert, he was a lazy bastard, just sat up there typing away. Some days the fool would read and write from morning till night, year after year. He didn't read books like normal people. He called it his research. I always told him to get off his ass and research a real job."

"Was he troubled?"

"Pfft, he troubled me. But I supposed he might have had one of those letter obsession problems like OCD or PTSD. I'll tell you this, Bert single-handedly kept our little post office in business with all his mailing away for horse catalogs and information on races all around the country."

"Horse catalogs?" I asked.

She closed her eyes and pushed up her glasses with a crooked index finger, "He was my son, so I guess I loved him - but the stupid son of a bitch was wacky."

"A recluse?"

She finally stopped rocking. Gladys stared off into the distance and gave a wishy-washy wave of her ancient hand. "Oh, he got by, he would come and go around town, go to the diner, the library, and of course, he made his annual pilgrimages to the horse sales in September and October. My Bert got the notion that every year he could pick the baby horse that would become the champion trotting horse in the country. Ain't that the stupidest thing you ever heard?"

"Didn't he use computers?"

"No. Towards the end, he began fooling around with the Internet. He knew the computer would be a big deal, and he would have made a hell of a nerd. But back then, he didn't even use a typewriter. Like one of those hoarders, he kept boxes and boxes filled with papers and old catalogs. I burned them on July 4, the year after he passed away. Called it my bonfire of the insanities, like a movie or something."

"Did he buy racehorses?"

"Ha, he couldn't afford a used horseshoe. I gave him \$50 a month out of his father's railroad pension, and I paid for every other damn thing he needed."

Her memories of Bert were not fond. "What a jackass, the silly sponger never worked a day. He just wrote away for information on horses and studied the crap he got as if each page was a scripture from above, and he was sent to earth to figure them all out. For what? What a putz."

When I got home, I soon discovered that the paper in the blue box was in a diary form.

February 9

Dentist Payne took out a tooth this morning which was a relief. Mother informed me she was going to Bradford on the bus to see Aunt Grace tomorrow, but I told her I did not want to accompany her. I had a friendly chat with Miss Dalton (Ethel) at the post office. I sure hope I did not sound foolish. Oh well.

On page 49, Harrison states that it is apparent the identity of the sires of the dam is not crucial to the success of a sire. Volomite, Rodney, Adios, and Hoot Man are not among the horses that will go down in history as great sires, but their contribution is that they sired the dams of great sires.

The list of mares in foal from New York has not arrived, nor have the three books on order from the publisher. I did receive the three missing issues of Horseman and Fair World to complete my collection.

As I read Bert's entries in the blue box, I noticed he began each page with a month and a day but not the year. I'm estimating the time frame of this writing was in the 1960s. Each page started with a few personal events of that day. Then he shifted into his passion for pedigrees of harness horses. There were countless references to books and catalogs relating to horses, books about racing, charts of horse performance, horse magazines, and books on genetics. There is no doubt Bert was obsessed with his goal of predicting ultimate harness racing prospects.

The box contained 453 pages. When you factor in that Bert wrote on both sides, and more when you consider his tidy handwriting, that makes 906. The bulk of the writing in the box appeared to be part of his compilation of material for his master manuscript on yearling selection. I say this because Bert had outlined paragraphs, printed an asterisk, and printed the words "for the book?" beside one of the paragraphs.

Perilous is the life of an author. To my eyes, *Bert Griffleson's* pages were for a masterpiece opus on racehorse selection. Usually, I'm not much of a reader, but I found this material interesting and read over a hundred pages on the night of the discovery. And

I looked forward to finishing the opus the following morning. It crossed my mind to plagiarize the work and find a literary agent, but unfortunate circumstances intervened.

The following day, I took the blue box outdoors to my porch and sat on my glider, so I could put my feet on the porch rail and gently propel myself back and forth. Reading the pages was both riveting and slightly undecipherable. I felt that Bert was talking to me from his grave, and he certainly knew a great deal about harness racehorse pedigrees. I began to grow emotionally attached to this eccentric chap.

I was mesmerized by his theory about the performance of second dams on page 401 when my kitchen phone rang. I set Bert's work down and entered my house to answer what turned out to be a pesky salesman asking me to refinance my mortgage. I returned to the porch into a blizzard of swirling paper. A sudden gust of wind, a mini-tornado, had moved across the sky, sending the unbound sheets of paper into flight from their careful piles on my porch.

I tried valiantly to retrieve the swirling papers, but 453 are a lot of pages. Those few minutes before a summer storm are as windy as hell. My home is in a rough neighborhood. My street is very long and filled with neighbors who would not help me look for a missing child, let alone sheets of paper in a storm.

My final count was 177 pages successfully retrieved. Bert was a great theorist and writer who may have created the ultimate composition on selecting champion racehorses. Still, he did not back up his work or even invest in a binder and a hole punch because his manuscript is now a clump of 177 water-stained, non-sequenced, and unreferenced entries that end abruptly.

The mysterious Bert probably died of overwork, a broken heart, and unfulfilled dreams. I wonder what success he had in selecting champion racehorses. I wonder if his theories would hold up under testing. He took his secrets to the grave.

Too bad. Bert could have been the Stephen King of trotters.

Racine Bell will be tough to beat in Blue Chip Matchmaker final

Racine Bell stamped herself as the one to beat in the \$381,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker Series final on April 25 with a powerful performance, capturing the second of three \$40,000 divisions at Yonkers Raceway on Friday night (April 15) in 1:51.2, the second fastest leg victory in all five preliminary rounds.

Sent off as the 1-10 favorite from the pole position, Racine Bell saw McMarkle Sparkle and Andy Miller leave boldly to take control into the first turn. Lit De Rose and Pat Lachance also pressed forward in the early stages and was parked nearly to the quarter for the front. Jason Bartlett had Racine Bell on the move before the quarter, and the 5-year-old by So Surreal crossed to command at the :26.4 opening fraction, then never looked back.

Racine Bell cruised to the half in :56.1, and then Bartlett let the talented mare shift gears going around the third turn. A :27.1 third quarter kept a first-over Blue Ivy and Tyler Buter well at bay as the outer tier struggled to keep pace. Racine Bell separated from the field on the final turn, and Bartlett urged her confidently in the 28-second flat sprint to the wire. McMarkle Sparkle rallied for the place spot, with Lit De Rose settling for third.

Now a winner in three of the four legs she competed in, Racine Bell returned \$2.20 to win and keyed a \$14.40 exacta and \$42 triple. Owned by Chris and Dale Lawton, Racine Bell won for the 25th time in her career for trainer David Dewhurst.

Gia's Surreal won an intense stretch drive in the first \$40,000 Blue Chip Matchmaker division with Bartlett getting the better of favored Miss You N and driver Dexter Dunn right on the wire in a 1:52.1 clocking. The 6-year-old by So Surreal was racing in just her third leg of the series, and despite the victory, is destined for the Monday, April 25 consolation.

Miss You N blasted from the pole position, with Gia's Surreal settling in the pocket late on the opening bend. Miss You N carved out fractions of :27.1 and :55.3 for the opening half before taking on just mild pressure from Best Head West approaching three-quarters. Before Best Head West could cover her up, Bartlett pulled Gia's Surreal from the pocket into the final turn and went on the offensive following the 1:24 three-quarters clocking.



Dunn worked hard to preserve the win with the pacemaker Miss You N, but Bartlett shook the lines repeatedly, and the Ed Hardtrained Gia's Surreal responded when it mattered most to post the mild upset at 9-5. Miss You N held second, with Best Head West and Keep Rockin A following the top pair across the wire.

Gia's Surreal is owned by James Graham, Edward Peron, and Lee Winters and won for the first time in 2022 in just her third start. Gia's Surreal returned \$5.90 and keyed an exacta of \$10.80 with the favorite and a triple worth \$29.60.

Karma Seelster and driver Jordan Stratton pulled a minor upset (4-1) after chasing down 1-10 favorite Drama Act and getting the better of that one in a series-best 1:51.1 clocking in the third and finish division.

Drama Act took control for George Brennan off the opening bend and was stalked by Man Dontforget Me, Karma Seelster, and Dragon Roll through fractions of 27.4, 55.2, and 1:23.1. Stratton pulled the 5-year-old daughter of Sportswriter to the outside past the three-quarter pole, and Karma Seelster picked up the bit and made up ground in a hurry on leader Drama Act through the final turn.

In the homestretch Brennan worked feverishly behind Drama Act, but the daughter of Well Said couldn't hold on to the lead, was narrowly passed in the shadow of the wire, and had to settle for second. Tyler Buter rallied Dragon Roll to the outside,

and that mare flew home to be a close third, lapped on the top pair, with pocket-sitter Man Dontforget Me and Dexter Dunn squeezing between horses late and settling for fourth.

Owned by Karen Hauver and trained by Andrew Adamczyk, Karma Seelster won for the second time in the series and returned \$10.20 as the second choice. The exacta with the favorite paid \$10.20 and the trifecta was worth \$52.50.






Virgil Morgan, Jr. scores 7,000th career training win

Virgil Morgan Jr. became just the second trainer in harness racing history to reach the 7,000 wins plateau when Family Recipe from his stable captured the 13th race at Miami Valley Raceway on Thursday (April 14). The 56-year-old conditioner trails only Ron Burke is lifetime wins.

Morgan Jr. began his training career in 1992, notching six wins and six seconds in 22 starts for a .439 Universal Trainer Rating Score. For the next 29 consecutive years, Virgil's UTRS has always been above .300, including three additional years above .400. Morgan has recorded at least 100 wins from his barn in each of the last 27 years, with one season (2000) with over 400 triumphs, nine seasons with over 300 and another nine with over 200 wins.



In addition to winning 7,000 races, horses under Morgan's tutelage have earned \$63.7 million. He had back-to-back \$4 million earning years in 2007-08 and has surpassed \$3 million on four other occasions. Virgil has been the leading trainer at Scioto Downs, near his hometown of Grove City, OH, each season since 1995. He was inducted into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall Of Fame in 2021.

Miami Valley is dark until Monday (April 18) when racing resumes at 4:05 p.m.

McNair scores 4,000th driving victory

Doug McNair added to his impressive list of driving accomplishments by picking up his 4,000th career victory on Friday evening (April 15) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The Guelph, ON reinsman entered Friday's program just a win shy of 4,000 for his career and grabbed the milestone victory with veteran pacer Julerica in the \$18,000 sixth-race.

Sent off as the even-money choice, Julerica was moved to the lead by McNair on the way to the half racing and fended off rival Legal Bettor in the lane to collect the victory. The win gives the 10-year-old Julerica three wins this season and 43 career victories overall.

An O'Brien Award winning driver, McNair began his career in 2008 by winning his first career drive and has never looked back. Now in his 15th season of driving, McNair has surpassed \$1 million in earnings in all 15 seasons. His career high for wins in a year is 518 in 2010, while his top season for earnings is \$6.5 million in 2017.

McNair is off to a great start in 2022, ranking second in wins and earnings (\$1.3 million) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Mike Stevenson gets career win 2,000

Veteran driver Mike Stevenson picked up career win number 2,000 at Cumberland on Good Friday (April 15) by driving Rojas Blue Chip to victory.

Stevenson, a New Brunswick native that now calls First Tracks Cumberland home, has earned \$8,071,432 in career purse earnings in 14,308 lifetime starts. The new milestone marks a long journey of overcoming obstacles and perseverance in the face of adversity for the 57-year-old trainer/driver.

"This accomplishment feels really good," said Stevenson. "I have always tried to stick to the basics and prepare my horses as I was taught by the great horsemen before me."

Stevenson summed it up with three words, "Thankful, grateful and humble."

The regular pilot of last year's Maine champion 3-year-old pacing colt, Call Me Maverick, Stevenson looks forward to the Gordon Corey-trained standout to return to the fairgrounds for his 4-year-old campaign.

"The owners have turned down several offers and have said that they just want to have some fun with him," said Stevenson. "We all love that little horse and look forward to Gordon and Alison's annual return from Pinehurst."

As the wings of the starting car folded for Friday's eighth race, Stevenson sent Rojas Blue Chip right to the front from post four, with Kim's Day (Drew Campbell) getting a two-hole trip. Setting comfortable opening fractions of :29.2 and 1:01 with the 5-year-old American Ideal mare, the pressure started to mount down as Whatchagonnadoboo (Aaron Hall) popped the earplugs past the half and continued to chase down the 10-1 pacesetter.

Pacing up alongside the leader, Whatchagonnadoboo looked Rojas Blue Chip right in the eye down the backstretch into a 1:30.1 third stanza with Kim's Day locked in and nowhere to go. As the field turned for home the aggressor faded which let Drew Campbell sneak out with Kim's Day to chase down the frontrunner. Fortunately, Stevenson and Rojas Blue Chip had enough in the tank to hold off the late charge and prevail by a measured head in 2:00.4.

Rojas Blue Chip is also trained by Stevenson and paid \$22.00 to win for owner David Del Pozzo. Kim's Day finished second, Whatchagonnadoboo hung on for third.

Several other 'firsts' were realized on the beautiful, sunny day of Southern Maine harness racing.

Ron Cushing set a new track record with his own Swan Fine Lady, destroying the field in the featured \$6,000 Open II Trot, winning in 1:58.2 by over 12 lengths. Also trained and co-owned by Cushing along with partners Kevin Sywyk and Lance Downs, the daughter of Swan For All set a new benchmark for 4-year-old trotting mares at Cumberland.

Swan Fine Lady paid \$2.60 to win. Little Macabee (Aaron Hall) finished second, Make It A Double (Mark Athearn) was third.

Twenty-one-year-old Zachary Gray picked up the first training win of his fledgling career. Off to a good start in his inaugural season, the Maine-native has a win and a second in five starts this year, earning him a .311 UTRS.



Pompano Park shuts down

Sturman writes Pompano Park goes out with its head held high and it should (**full story here**). But wait a minute. Should Pompano be going out at all?

Though I am not privy to the roadmap leading to closure, there is a camp that believes Pompano lost its way with a strategic blunder. As casinos evolved in Florida the notion is Pompano elected to go it alone rather than partner with the more powerful thoroughbred lobby. Under advised, under-lobbied and underfunded, Pompano leadership found itself isolated from legislative powerbrokers while the thoroughbred cartel at Gulfstream Park wrote its own ticket.

The land value of Pompano Park, like that of Hollywood Park where SoFi stadium now sits, is far more valuable than any revenue harness racing could ever bring. So legislative protections were needed. Going in partnership with the thoroughbred lobby could very well have resulted in a different outcome. I recently visited Pompano for fun to watch Gulfstream's Announcer Pete (Aiello) cruise by Gabe Prewitt

in an eye catching stretch drive. Thankfully the excitement of this fundraising match race overshadowed the demise of the track itself. The main grandstand was shuttered, the PA system was not designed to be heard throughout, and not one railbird stood at the finish line (except me). Even there I used my mobile app to wager. And that says it all. What's the allure to be physically present at the track rather than a wagering den in your own space.

Pompano should have been the "winter racing capitol" of the world. Though most top tier horses shut down over the winter, efforts could have been made to attract stables from Canada and the Midwest. Dave Miller, Tim Tetrick and Dexter Dunn made treks to south Florida this winter and they, with other drivers, trainers and stables, could have further enhanced Pompano racing over the years. Track programs show Ron Burke owned horses in the hands of Devan Miller, for example. As Mike Wilder observed in HRU, wintering in Florida is far better than the Ohio and Pennsylvania cold and snow. Unfortunately it's too late. It will be interesting to see where Wally Hennessey, Dave Miller, Ricky Macomber, Rick Plano and the others take their winter tack.
