Dr. Patty Hogan on a brewing PETA storm

The renowned equine surgeon said harness racing cannot afford to ignore Santa Anita's troubles.

Equine surgeon Dr. Patty Hogan said it is inevitable that harness racing become the focus of the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals.

There's very little that Dr. Patty Hogan doesn't know when it comes to the equine athlete, harness and thoroughbred racing, as well as the groups that have been attacking the thoroughbred game since the rash of breakdowns at Santa Anita led to a crisis in California. The situation has been so dire there that some fear the end result will be a ban of the sport.

The renowned equine surgeon is heavily involved with both breeds and has often sat across the table from members of the People for Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) and other animal rights groups. And she is certain that any efforts to bring down thoroughbred racing in California or elsewhere will include harness racing.

"That racing could be banned in California is a legitimate fear," she said. "If they were to ever ban racing in California, I

definitely think it would include Cal Expo. They just have an agenda and so this is a convenient way for them to convince the public, who knows so little about racing, that this is what needs to happen. I think that they're painting all of racing with a broad brush and harness racing would be under that same brush."

Beginning with the opening of the current Santa Anita meet on Dec. 26, 23 horses have been euthanized after breaking down during races or while training in the mornings. Though there have been no fatalities there since March 31, the damage has been done. The stories were carried prominently by the media in the Los Angeles area and Congresswoman Judy Chu, who represents the district where Santa Anita is located, called for a congressional committee to investigate the treatment of racehorses at racetracks throughout the country. California Senator Diane Feinstein called for Santa Anita to shut down until track management could come up with concrete reasons why so many horses had been breaking down and solutions for how to fix the problem. The Los Angeles County District Attorneys' office has launched an investigation into the deaths.

The biggest threat, however, may come from PETA. In California, a state with 39 million residents, an initiative can

make it on to a statewide ballot if a group can collect about 620,000 signatures. If PETA were to push for it, acquiring some 600,000 signatures on a petition to put a vote to ban horse racing on the ballot would be easy to accomplish.

Quinnipiac University recently conducted a poll that showed just 19 per cent of California voters had a “favorable opinion” of horse racing, while 20 per cent had an unfavorable opinion of the sport. Fifty-nine percent had no opinion.

In 2008, a group called Grey2K led a fight against dog racing in Massachusetts and managed to get an initiative on the ballot to ban the sport. It passed by a 56-43 margin. That started a domino effect. Once a recent ban on greyhound racing voted on by Florida voters goes into effect, only five states will still have legal dog racing.

Obviously, harness racing is a much safer sport than thoroughbred racing is. They are a sturdier horse than the thoroughbred and their gaits, whether trotting or pacing, do not put as much stress on the animal as galloping does.

“There's definitely a genetic/breed difference in the way they're built, the size of their cannon bone, just things like that, which we know to be different,” Hogan said. “That includes the size of their feet. They are a physically different breed.”

According to the Jockey Club, 1.68 out of every 1,000 starters in a thoroughbred race died in 2018. To see a standardbred break down on the racetrack is extremely rare.

Common sense might tell you that harness and thoroughbred racing should be viewed completely differently when it comes to animal rights issues, but Hogan said people outside of the racing industries fail to see it that way.

“I don't think (animal rights activists) understand the difference between the breeds,” she said. “But I also think it doesn't matter because with the animal welfare advocates currently involved in the situation, they already have the end in sight that they want. It's convenient opportunity right now that it's come up (due to the Santa Anita breakdowns).”

Hogan said she started her dialogue with animal rights activists two decades ago over the horse slaughter issue. She has seen how much more inclined society as a whole has come to demand that animals are not mistreated and she believes than many animal rights groups, even if there were no such things as breakdowns, believe horse racing is cruel.

“I thought about this 'big picture' almost 20 years ago when I was involved heavily in the equine slaughter issue, that the animal welfare issues were becoming huge,” she said. “And it doesn't matter if it's the break down injury rate or it's the whipping or the slaughter issue, people really care about animals to an incredible degree now. To the animal rights activists, it's just the whole aspect of horses being confined, being whipped, being made to do something that these people feel is not natural. That's basically it, the same way they felt about greyhound racing. They feel it's just using an animal for a monetary reason and that they're not allowed to live in what we all consider to be a natural environment, so I think that's the basics of their argument. I don't think (the Santa Anita breakdowns are) the real issue. I think it's an opportunity right now for the people that have long said they wanted to get rid of racing.”

Harness racing, too?

“Definitely. Why would it be any different?” she said.

Shilling for The Captain, thoughts on PETA and the story of feisty Vernon Blue Chip

Tidbits: What more can I say than that the phenomenal Tiger Woods once again catapulted himself to the top of the sports world. In winning the Masters, his fifth green jacket and 15th major he turned the world on its ear. To be honest, until the last putt went in the cup, my nerves were frazzled. His return from serious surgeries as well as mental and social issues is nothing short of astounding. Congratulations to an amazing man and I am sure if he stays healthy there will be more to come.

My first thought was if he could do it, I could do it, as training horses is a bit easier on your body than playing golf. Serious health issues that are since past helped me decide to call it quits. But then reality struck. I would need knee, hip, and back surgery to return full time. Sorry, I am not having my body replaced yet.

With the Kentucky Derby eight days away, there are too many variables to pick a winner at this point. I will wait for the jockeys to decide on their mounts and see the final works before I critique the field. As of this day, I have narrowed it down to two horses — Omaha Beach who comes off three sensational performances including a resounding win in the Arkansas Derby over a nasty muddy surface, and Game Winner the early favorite for the race that has lost two heartbreakers in a row. It will certainly be the best betting Derby in a long time and I could see the favorite at no less than 7-2 or 4-1. News flash! Not sure if it's real but I just read that Mike Smith chose Omaha Beach over Roadster. That would make Omaha Beach the slight favorite as it is not like Smith to jump off a Baffert horse that figures in a race.

Congratulations to my friends Jimmy Takter and Trevor Ritchie for their entry into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall Of Fame. This may be the first time that I have seen an American trainer receive that honor.

I feel extremely lucky to have visited the Cathedral of Notre Dame before the horrid fire tore it apart. The French are very resilient as demonstrated by the pledges of funding (enough to rebuild two cathedrals) immediately after the blaze had toppled the tower. I hope that they determine it to be accidental as finding it a planned incident would be most unfortunate.

I will never understand the panic to get the last spot in the NBA playoffs the last week of the season. It's like being in a rush to your own funeral. Poor Detroit getting thrown around like a rag doll by Milwaukee and the Killer Greek. Miami was dying to be in that spot. Why? They lost the last three outings to the Bucks by around 75 total points. Detroit is a better team than the Heat. Why were they trying so hard to put themselves in a foolish position?

I am saddened to report that my good friend, owner, and one of the most formidable characters in harness history has passed. Wednesday morning we lost Sigmund "Ziggy" Wolkomir. I can only guess his age at 80 as he was a student at the Bronx High School of Science shortly before me. He lived in Squirrel Hill a suburb of Pittsburgh and was a permanent fixture at The Meadows. He was a kind, loving man with an extraordinary knowledge of our sport. He was an owner and a breeder and had some nice colts with Chuck Sylvester. He will be missed. Thanks to Dave Palone for informing me of his passing.

Kirk McKinnon asks: Thoroughbred racing is receiving tremendous scrutiny because of the 23 deaths at Santa Anita recently. PETA has been on the move once again and certainly will be a presence in Louisville for the Kentucky Derby. Could the standardbred business be the next target? Will PETA potentially attack a race like the Little Brown Jug? Would you train a horse in 1:50 and come back in 45 minutes?

Comparing the two breeds for soundness is ludicrous. Our horses went multiple heats in past years, they were bred to. Believe it or not, there were many events that took four or more visits to the gate to declare a winner in an event. The thoroughbred was definitely not created to endure this scenario. Those horses are way too fragile. I have been to many Jugs and I don't remember one instance of a horse dying. Same goes for all the heat racing in the past. The Hambletonian, World Trotting Derby and the Kentucky Futurity among others.

My reasons for changing my mind about heats in the Hambletonian were purely based on John Campbell's narrative that the second heat cripples the handle on the entire race. Soundness or horse deaths never entered the picture. No one can predict where PETA will strike next and they must develop a better understanding of any kind of racing before they cause such a fuss.

Craig Gordon (Pacing Guru) asks: I understand all your gloating about the Captaintreacherous horses. You are like a paid spokesman. But please tell me how an owner can expect them to make any money when one trainer has so many from the same breeding. There are only so many sire stake races! It seems like Alagna has a lot of horses competing against each other for the same pie. If I was an owner why would I want to be with someone who is training horses to compete with mine in the same stable?

A pacing guru you are not. You miss the point of the whole business. To begin with, I am the furthest thing from a paid spokesman for the Alagna Stable. Is Tony my friend? Yes, but that's where it ends. I write about what my eyes tell me. I have no favorites. It's a matter of fact that I am a paid consultant of Lindy Farms and I probably go out of my way not to exalt any part of their operation. I am most likely to be more critical of their horses than the rest of the training stables.

The basic thought you have of winning sire stakes money is so unimportant to the Alagna barn. Last year with all the viable colts he had going I don't remember that one of the top five ever entered a sires stake race, if any of them did.

It's great to win money, but that's not the priority of the owners in the barn. George Segal and the Myron Bell group along with Dana Parham and Brad Grant and too many others to list here, with the competent guidance of Tony Alagna, are committed to selecting future stallions and are in the business to make champions like they did with Captaintreacherous. That is the only way to make real money in this business.

With the expense of the average yearling with a champion's pedigree, staking, and training the odds are stacked against you to make substantial money in the long run. But if you come up with 10 per cent of a Captaintreacherous you are an instant millionaire if you weren't one already.

If you want to be in a stable that will not have an owner that will compete with you, it's a tough road to hoe. I relate it to first-year stallions. I say let someone else find out if they are great or duds. A good small trainer will surface eventually, but I would not be combing the weeds to find the right one. To me it's harder to find a good trainer than a good horse. There are fewer of them. Great horses are born, not made and it takes great patience and knowledge to let a true champion reach his full potential. It's a simple equation to be on the right track: you must go to a trainer that has been there before. I would never name names but I have seen many potentially great horses destroyed by inexperienced horseman.

Kurt Hansen asks: How did Vernon Blue Chip end up in your barn? What made her such a top filly and now a broodmare as the second dam of Atlanta?

Great question and a good story.

I like to go to farms and watch horses perform in their own environment. I saw Vernon Blue Chip in the field at the farm and fell in love with her. Her pedigree was a little on the common side, but she was bred similarly to one of my favorite mares, Spirea, who I raced for many years, as well as the fact she could trot a hole in the wind. Thankfully, there were not many that agreed with my opinion and when she entered the ring in Harrisburg they knocked her down to me for \$17,000. When she arrived at my barn in Sunshine Meadows she didn't have an owner. One of my clients, a wonderful (but not so lucky) Dr. Jerry Semmer, came to see her on the track. After jogging her a couple of miles she shied from the tractor, ran off the track and tried to wrap me and the jog cart around the tree next to The Deck. As my help grabbed the filly and I lifted myself from the wreckage, Dr. Semmer declared, "I don't think I want that filly."

Fast forward to June of her 2-year-old year. I trained her behind the gate a few times but could not get her to go straight leaving. When the gate sprung, she would always go right instead of left. Mike Lachance to the rescue. By now it was late in the year and baby races were in full swing, but I wasn't ready to start her till she learned to go straight. Mike schooled her three weeks in a row and she would trot in 1:56 the last two times. She was ready. She won the Merrie Annabelle easily and had a great 2-year-old season. However, she wasn't able to finish her miles as well as a 3-year-old, and had a less-than-stellar season.

She has had some very fast foals. However, in my opinion they were much like her and lacked the class to be all around great horses. Fortunately, 2-year-old trotters that have extreme speed don't need to have class because they are just so much faster than the competition. Miss Wisconsin is a good example. I broke and trained four Merrie Annabelle winners and two more after the fact and none of them were classy fillies with the exception of Lady Starlet, who was undefeated at two. The odd thing about that race was I had two big favorites in the race that were the classiest fillies I ever raced – Continentalvictory and Possess the Magic – and neither found their way to the winner's circle.

Shartin N out to repeat in Matchmaker against competitive group

If fans are looking for a horse in top form entering Saturday's (April 20) \$401,600 Blue Chip Matchmaker championship for older female pacers, they need to only look at... well, just about everyone.

Six of the eight mares are heading to the Matchmaker championship at Yonkers Raceway off a win (thanks to four horses skipping last week's fifth-and-final preliminary round of the series). Furthermore, a look at each of the finalist's past three starts show only three finishes worse than second in the 24 total tries, and two of those occurred from post eight, which is the least favorable post position at the track.

"It's been a very good series," said Jason Bartlett, who drives Andrew Harris-trained Dont Think Twice A. "There have been a lot of different winners every week. It's basically the same times too, right around (1):52.

"Shartin is Shartin, but otherwise it's a very competitive group. It's going to come down to who gets the better trip."

Shartin is defending Matchmaker champion Shartin N, the New Zealand-bred mare who was the 2018 Dan Patch Award winner for best older female pacer. She won three of her four preliminary rounds in the series and was fourth from post eight in her remaining start. She will start Saturday from post six, one spot outside of stablemate Bettor Joy N, who was a nose from being undefeated in four races in the series.

"They're both pretty powerful girls," said Jim King Jr., who trains both mares. "Hopefully everybody behaves in the first turn and no one causes any bad luck for somebody else. From there, let the best horse win. At least let them all have a chance. If they all behave around the first turn and everyone gets where they're going, I think I've got a little better chance than most. I've got two good horses and they're in respectable spots."

Shartin N was a known quantity entering the series, but Bettor Joy N has made a name for herself as well. She has won once by leading from start to finish and twice by rallying from fourth at the top of the stretch.

"We had a little adjustment to make (after she lost in the first round) and fortunately it all went well," King said. "We opened her up and got her more quiet, got her to pay a little more attention to the driver rather than be so anxious. She's very versatile. I don't think we've seen her best work yet."

Dont Think Twice A, who starts Saturday from post four, has two wins and two seconds in the series. She is one of four mares to finish no worse than second in all her Matchmaker prelims, along with Apple Bottom Jeans, Feelin Red Hot, and Bettor Joy N.

"I think I drew a good spot," Bartlett said. "There is speed inside and Shartin got the six so (driver Tim Tetrick) has to make a decision what he wants to do. I have a good mare, coming off a win, so I think she's got as good a shot as anybody. She's handy. She can do just about anything you ask her to do and she's got a great attitude. I've loved her since day one."

Apple Bottom Jeans, who was a neck from being unbeaten in four Matchmaker starts, will start from post two. She has gone

gate-to-wire in all three of her victories in the series and was caught by Feelin Red Hot just prior to the finish in the other.

"She should be a perfect 4-for-4," driver Corey Callahan said. "That week (she lost) was my fault. Everybody was kind of walking to the half, so I went ahead and did that too. I shouldn't have done that. I should have let her keep moving along. She's got a big, long gait. I took full responsibility for that."

"She's been winning on the front because that's how the races have set up and she's been such a heavy favorite. I've been able to cut it or get away quiet to the lead. But she is a better horse tracking horses down. She might be in that spot (this week), or she might be in a spot where she can cut it. I don't really think she will be, but you never know when they say go."

Apple Bottom Jeans did not race during the fourth week of the series but returned with a win in the fifth round. Dont Think Twice A, Bettor Joy N, Shartin N, and Ideal Lifestyle A all took off last week. Kaitlyn N, Feelin Red Hot, and Seaswift Joy N each competed in all five preliminary rounds.

"We'll see which one of us went the right way," Callahan said with a laugh.

"Until somebody beats her, Shartin is the one to beat," he added. "There are a lot of other nice mares in there. It's not like she's going to be able to get away quiet and brush to the lead and have things her way. I don't think anybody is going to be able to do that."

Racing begins at 6:50 p.m. (EDT). The Matchmaker is race nine on the card, which also includes the \$662,800 George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series championship (race 11).

Series leader Western Fame looks to close the deal in Levy final

Dan Dube is hoping for business as usual when Western Fame competes in Saturday's (April 20) \$662,800 George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series championship at Yonkers Raceway, where the 6-year-old stallion has won four of five starts in the event and led nearly every step of the way.

He knows it might not be that easy.

"I'd like to think I'm going to go around the track like I usually do, but for big money somebody is going to take a shot," Dube said.

Dube and Western Fame will start the Levy championship from post five. Western Fame has seven wins and two second-places finishes in his past 11 races at Yonkers. He finished seventh in last year's Levy final.

For his career, Western Fame has won 20 of 73 starts and earned \$1.15 million. He was trained by Jimmy Takter before heading to the stable of Rene Allard at the end of last year. Dube and Allard have teamed to win three of the past four Levy championships.

"(Post) five is really good, it's a perfect spot for my horse. I'm happy with that," Dube said, adding about Western Fame's work in the series, "He's been doing it nice and easy."

"He's got a lot of good qualities; he's quick off the gate and he's quick turning for home. He's just a nice horse. He's strong. I hope he keeps going that way. If he doesn't get sick or something he should be good."

Western Fame finished the Levy's five preliminary rounds with a series-best 350 points. Ideal Jimmy was second with 325 points thanks to three wins and two seconds. But the 6-year-old gelding did not fare well in the draw and will start Saturday from post eight, which has produced only 14 winners in 508 tries (2.8 percent).

Last week, Ideal Jimmy and driver Brent Holland started from post six in their preliminary division and led from start to finish.

"He's razor sharp, but from (post) eight you've got to have a lot of luck," said Ideal Jimmy's trainer, Erv Miller. "It's pretty hard to get out of there on the lead from the eight hole, but you never know. We'll see what happens."

"He's a very handy horse, which he showed the last start. He can do what he needs to do. He's been real good racing from behind too. We'll just have to see how it works out. He's really come into his own. He's really good now. He's real sharp for the final, but the eight hole makes it tough."

Of the eight Levy finalists, all but two competed in all five of the prelims. JJ Flynn skipped last week's round and Rodeo Rock sat out April 6. Rodeo Rock, who starts Saturday from post six, returned last week with a second-place finish behind Western Fame.

"I would have liked to draw a little bit closer (inside) but it's not a horrible position," said Andy McCarthy, who drives Rodeo Rock. "Hopefully things get mixed up pretty good the first half. I think that's a possibility. I don't know what (Holland) will do with Ideal Jimmy. He leaves the gate so fast, he might take a chance."

"It could be a bit of a rush into that first turn. A lot of horses can leave fast and I think they're all going to try to push for a good position there early. I just hope they don't line up. I've got to hope they mix it up pretty good the first three-eighths of a mile and see what happens after that."

Rodeo Rock won his first two rounds in the series before a third-place finish on March 30.

"He was very good the first two weeks," McCarthy said. "I probably drove him bad that third week. I should have pushed off harder and tried to trip him out a little more, but I came first over. He got just a little tired at the end of the mile."

"I thought he raced terrific last week. I had to come first up out of the third turn into a very fast back half and he didn't lose ground. He kept pacing."

Racing at Yonkers begins at 6:50 p.m. (EDT). The Levy championship is race 11 on the card. The card also includes the \$401,600 Blue Chip Matchmaker championship for older female pacers (race nine).

Levy series in 2019 leaves something to be desired

Maybe it's just me, but this year's Levy series at Yonkers seems unsatisfying. Heading into Saturday's Levy final with a monster purse of \$662,800 (the richest Levy final ever in history), let's take stock of the series thus far and some ideas for what to do about it.

For starters, if you're already someone who isn't a proponent of the racing at Yonkers to begin with, then this series hasn't been kind.

Nearly every race throughout the last five weeks of racing follows the same pattern. A sensible enough :27 and change opening quarter followed by backed-down second quarters of times ranging from :29 to :30. For example, the opening leg of the series there were six divisions. The half mile times of those divisions were :56.2, :57.2, :57.2, :57, :56.3, :56.4. These are times that would be acceptable for a bunch of \$12,500 claimers, but not for a supposed group free-for-allers.

In last Saturday's final preliminary leg there were four Levy divisions, as horses from the start had either defected from the series or had earned enough points to take the week off and rest. But the racing was still the same. The second quarter times of each of those races were :29.3, :30, :29.2, :29.4. In those races, every horse on the lead won with the exception of I'm Some Graduate, who folded to finish last though to his credit worked through a fast opening quarter. In two of the races, the half-mile splits were :57.4 and :57.1. Almost every race at Freehold earlier that same day went to the half mile in quicker than those times.

The reason for the slow fractions with little movement until the later stages of the race is because of the purse structure of the series. With five preliminary legs that go for \$50,000 each, where is the incentive to try hard one week when you may fall into a more advantageous position the next week? It arguably makes sense to not leave the inside

for as long as possible (even with no passing lane) and accumulate as many points as you can by finishing in the top 5, as opposed to doing anything "risky" in taking a bolder race-to-win strategy.

With five preliminary legs, a horse can afford less than an all-out effort for a couple of the races and still qualify for a big money consolation or final. Plus, even if it's not a realistic goal for some horses in the series to compete for the final, there is still a ton of money that can be earned by getting thirds and fourths each week when racing for \$50,000 a pop. And don't get me wrong – there is nothing wrong with any of this if you're an owner, trainer or someone in anyway connected with the horses in this series – in fact it's tremendous. But if you're an observer or better yet someone betting, it's a tough product to get into.

Maybe a solution could be to reduce the number of preliminary legs. Would it create more action if instead of five preliminary legs going for \$50,000, there were only three preliminary legs that went for \$100,000 each? You'd still have horses that are happy just to be there and will race conservatively to get whatever share of those purses they can get, but you'd have other horses that wouldn't have the luxury of taking it easy in a leg knowing how much more critical it is to earn points with fewer opportunities available.

While the slow fractions are nothing new to Yonkers or the series, the overall talent level of the horses competing in this year's series seems like a drop off from recent years. Not surprisingly, Western Fame will be heavily favored on Saturday as the lone horse in the field who also competed in last year's final. What it comes down to is that with the exception of Western Fame, is this series going to produce any horses that go onto compete as legitimate FFA's elsewhere. In recent years, Keystone Velocity and, of course, Foiled Again went onto do big things following the Levy; even Bit of a Legend N and Atochia were winners of the Levy that made their presence felt in other big races. I can't see that happening with this group.

Many of the horses in Saturday's final fall into a similar category of horses that will probably make a ton of money racing in upper level conditioned races at Yonkers and Pocono throughout the year. JJ Flynn had two races in January at Dover in NW7500 (he lost one of them) before quickly climbing the ladder. Anythingforlove A, More The Better N, Rodeo Rock, and The Wall are all horses that may or may not be favored in mid-upper level conditioned races depending on the post. What they all have going for them though is that they race out of super high percentage barns and without that factor, they maybe wouldn't be in the Levy

final other lesser percentage conditioners. Again, there's nothing wrong with these horses having the chance to race for big money, but it doesn't have the feel to a series that one should have when you think of free-for-all horses.

The Levy is slated for race 11 on Saturday, fairly late into the night considering that race 11 went off last Saturday at 10:39, and that last year's Levy featured an infamous 18-minute post drag between 0 minutes-to-post and the actual time of the race. Hoping to still be awake come time of the big race, here is what it looks like.

WESTERN FAME has been heavily backed in every one of his Levy races thus far, including last week when he won at 1/9. He's the obvious class of the field and would give trainer Rene Allard his 3rd straight Levy win and 4 out of the last 5 years (twice with Keystone Velocity and Domethatagain). **JJ FLYNN** actually beat Western Fame three races back as a big 20/1 longshot, so his very best would give him a chance; I'd

imagine he'll be going forward when the race begins. Give **IDEAL JIMMY** a ton of credit for racing as good as he has in this series considering he essentially missed all of last year. The post is the only real reason to go against because he's been superb in the series. **RODEO ROCK** has consistently closed well off cover in this series and could do so again if the race unfolds for him. **THE DOWNTOWN BUS** has raced admirably throughout the series as a newly turned 4-year-old against older. **ANYTHINGFORLOVE A** or **MORE THE BETTER N** could sneak into an exotic because of their inside posts.

Flamboro's Marnie Bochenek has done it all

Over more than 30 years, the hard-working Waterdown, ON resident has been a caretaker, trainer and key member of the Flamboro Downs staff.

Caretaker, trainer, racetrack staffer, all-around industry promotor — in three-plus decades of involvement in the harness racing industry Marnie Bochenek has played a wide variety of roles and the Waterdown, ON resident has enjoyed every one of them.

"I can't picture doing anything else with my life," she said. "I've kind of fulfilled it the way I want."

First introduced to harness racing by a high school friend who took her along to Jim Whelan's barn at Flamboro Downs, Bochenek jumped into the industry with both feet when she graduated and has never looked back, or slowed down. Her first job was for Norm McKnight, Jr., followed by stints with Steve Condren, Rob Fellows and Larry Walker, along with a couple of return engagements with McKnight.

"I don't know how many times I worked for that man," Bochenek said with a laugh. "It was just, I don't know, you start working for your first employer and he liked your work ethic and I liked the way he did things, so I guess I just kind of stuck to him."

"He's one hell of a horseman."

After absorbing all she could from McKnight and her other mentors, Bochenek started her own stable in the mid-1980s, one of just a handful of women running their own operation at Flamboro Downs at the time. Campaigning horses such as Burning Pockets and Mac Dale in the claiming and conditioned ranks on the Ontario "B" circuit she would accumulate 96 wins and almost \$600,000 in earnings before hanging up her colours in 2011.

Throughout her training career, Bochenek always had a variety of side jobs on the go, and in the late 1990s she took on the role of Equipment and Tattoo Inspector at Flamboro Downs. That role, and the energy Bochenek brought to it, led to other opportunities in both the backstretch and grandstand. Currently employed full-time at the Dundas, ON oval, Bochenek wears a variety of hats during the track's live and simulcast racing operations.

"I do multiple jobs — money room mutuels, paddock judge, backstretch manager, race office — whatever is needed I try to do it for them," she said. "Woman of many hats, but I love it, it keeps me busy."

Anyone who has raced at Flamboro Downs has met Bochenek. Hers is the friendly face that greets drivers as they check in and complete their breathalyzer test and the voice on the P.A. marshaling horses into order for each race. She is the backstretch quarterback on race nights — coordinating staff, keeping the judges informed and responding quickly and efficiently to whatever the night throws at her.

On the grandstand side, Bochenek's role is more backstage support. She ensures the mutual tellers, many of them long-time Flamboro employees, have everything they need to serve customers on live and simulcast nights.

"Saturday is a 15-hour day for me at Flamboro. By the time I do the qualifiers and go back to do my money room mutuels, and then come back for the races, you know, it's a full day," said Bochenek with a rueful chuckle. "But I love it, I do, I really love it and I wouldn't change it for the world."

Bochenek's family has also joined the Great Canadian Gaming Corporation family, with long-time partner Gary Rivest serving as the starting car driver and race night blacksmith, daughter Ashley (soon to be 21) checking equipment and tattoos and helping out in the race office on race nights, and son Matt (19) working full-time on the grandstand maintenance crew.

"I think if we didn't have our family working for Great Canadian they'd have an issue trying to run the races," said Bochenek. "And my sister, Tammey (McEneny), she does the food and beverage reservations. She does a really great job, and plus she runs the tote, so she does multiple hats too. Our family is like that, we were raised that way, Tam and I. We had to do a full day of work, we weren't sitting up on the couch watching TV, we were out doing the barn chores or wherever."

Bochenek and Rivest also operate a small training facility near Flamboro Downs where Rivest has two horses in training – Two Of Clubs and Piston Popper. Sharing Bochenek's can-do attitude and willingness to promote

harness racing, Rivest and the racehorses can occasionally be found offering rides around the Flamboro Downs half-mile to visiting media or dignitaries. ([See Two Of Clubs and Rivest in action in the CHCH-TV preview for the 2017 Confederation Cup - 6:00-8:00 mins](#)) The farm also houses a pair of broodmares, Going With The Flo, a 6-year-old Zorgwijk Lustre mare owned by Rivest's daughter Natasha who is in foal to Wheeling N Dealin, and Ringing Ofthe Bell, an If I Can Dream mare in foal to Dali.

"We're experiencing the breeding business. We just bred our mare to Dali and right at this point, hopefully she's only going to have one, but right now there is two showing. So now we have to wait for 14 days, I think it is, to see what is happening," said a somewhat worried Bochenek. "Hopefully, one stays and one leaves, because I don't know how that works."

Bochenek will have a bit of extra time to worry about Ringing Ofthe Bell when racing shifts from Flamboro to Georgian Downs on June 1, although she does make the trip north any time general manager Chad Gates needs an extra pair of hands at the Innisfil, ON oval. After three months at Georgian Down, action shifts back to Flamboro on Sept. 3 for four nights of racing per week – adding Tuesdays in September and Wednesdays from October through December to the current schedule of Sunday, Thursday and Saturday.

Construction of the expanded casino facility at Flamboro Downs is expected to be complete during the fall meet and Bochenek hopes the additional gaming brings new people to the site and gives them a taste of the industry that has been at the centre of her very full life.

Slader wins 2019 World Harness Handicapping Championship presented by DerbyWars.com

Russell Slader of Nutley, NJ captured the \$43,200 grand prize in the 2019 World Harness Handicapping Championship presented by DerbyWars.com on Saturday, April 13 at Meadowlands Racing & Entertainment.

Slader finished the tournament with a \$2,518 bankroll to top the field of 108 players from across North America who competed for \$108,000 in prize money. Slader won his seat via the April 11 DerbyWars.com qualifier. This was the largest prize pool ever offered for the WHHC.

The WHHC contest format required contestants to bet 10 races: eight Meadowlands races of their choice, plus one mandatory race each from Buffalo Raceway and the Meadowlands. Bets had to meet a \$30 minimum, \$100 maximum per race. Contestants could only bet one horse per race and wagers could either be win, place, show or a combination of the three.

Slader cashed on five of his 10 bets and steadily moved up the leader board through the night. He cashed on the mandatory sixth race from Buffalo for \$96 with a \$30 Win wager on #2 (Harry Hoo N) and again on the fifth race at the Meadowlands for \$264 with \$60 to Win on #8 (JK Parlay). His biggest score came from a \$40 Win & Place wager on #3 (Sweet Rock) in the Meadowlands eighth race which put him in third place. Russell cashed on a \$50 Win & Place wager on #9 (Prophet Blue Chip) in the Meadowlands twelfth race for \$495 putting him in first place with a \$1,763 bankroll with one race remaining. He solidified his win with a \$855

score in race 13 with a \$50 Win & Place wager on #10 (Camwiser). Slader finished with a final bankroll of \$2,518, taking home the \$43,200 grand prize.

Jim Videtic, the 2018 WHHC champion, was leading for the majority of the contest and held both second and third place (he bought in for 2 spots) with two races remaining. Videtic cashed for \$1,150 in race 13 on a \$100 to Win on Camwiser to finish in second place. His second entry held on for seventh place with \$1,270 in bankroll. The 2018 champ walked away with \$23,760 in total prize money.

Spring In Paris remains undefeated in Weiss action

Spring In Paris, a sophomore daughter of Explosive Matter, went three-for-three in her Bobby Weiss Series preliminary action at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, taking one of Tuesday's \$15,000 prelim divisions in a lifetime best in 1:55.3.

And she's economical in her energy dispersal: her total winning margin in her three victories was eight feet, or one length.

On Tuesday, Andrew McCarthy moved her uncovered on the second turn, then picked up the cover of pocketpulling Critical Hanover, who went to the lead near the $\frac{3}{4}$, leaving Spring In Paris uncovered. The gritty three-year-old just kept her mind to business and finally wore down her rival by half a length – the largest margin in her three Weiss victories. Steve LeBlanc conditions the consistent miss, now undefeated her four seasonal starts, for LeBlanc Racing Inc., Glenn Dyke, and Douglas Johnson.

The only other horse in this division to notch two Weiss prelim wins was the Cantab Hall filly Fade Into You, who moved to the lead early and went on to a handy five-length triumph in a personal best of 1:56. Fade Into You has now sandwiched wins around a break in Weiss racing, and must

be respected as a Weiss Final contender for trainer Ron Burke and the ownership of Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Brusceci LLC, J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby, and Phil Collura.

Town Hall Justice picked the occasion of her moving into the Rene Allard barn to break a 19-race losing streak and earn enough points to make the Weiss Final. Driver/brother Simon Allard made two moves with the Justice Hall mare and lowered her mark two seconds to 1:56.4 while defeating Cayenne Victory by two lengths. Rene Allard is also the owner of the victress.

The Weiss Series \$30,000 championship for this division, in addition to a \$15,000 consolation if it fills, will be conducted on Tuesday, April 23, and the unofficial top pointwinners in the prelims are: 1. Spring In Paris, 2. Fade Into You, 3. Lollipop Lindy, 4. Nicole Hanover, 5. Royal Esteem, 6. (tie) Moshannon Magic and Town Hall Justice, 8. Meadowbranch Vicki, 9. Run Lindy Run; Dawn Of Glory and Whip N Neigh Neigh are next in the points, in that order, and thus would be the AE1 and AE 2 “on the bubble” for the Championship, and likely among the top contenders in the consolation.

American Ideal mare Ghosttothepost became the only distaff to be victorious in all three of the preliminaries for the Bobby Weiss Series for pacing fillies and mares, coming home in :56.2 on a cold Monday with swirling winds at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono to triumph in 1:54.3.

George Napolitano Jr. got early fractions of :28.3 and :58.1 with the five-time seasonal winner, then turned on the back half jets, with a :28.2 second quarter and then a :28 last quarter into the win. Ghosttothepost, who suffered broken equipment during the contest, needed the speedy finish to keep pocket-sitting Cardiff a neck away at the finish for trainer Darren Farrell and owner Peter Paul Venturini.

Ashlee Sparkles came to her third Weiss prelim with a pair of series victories, but this week she couldn't catch the Sportswriter filly Girl's Got Rhythm, who clocked splits of :28.2, :57.2, and 1:25.3, then held off Ashlee Sparkles by a length in 1:54. Girl's Got Rhythm was unraced as a freshman, but she has begun her career with three straight victories, including one previous Weiss success, for driver Tyler Buter, trainer Nicholas Devita and owner John Cummins.

Charms Little Sis lowered her record 4 1/5 seconds when

she won the other Weiss cut in 1:55.2, giving Tyler Buter victories in two of the three series divisions. Charms Lil Sis, a Mach Three mare, also used front-stepping tactics en route to the winners circle, opening a big lead down the backstretch and staying three lengths clear at the wire for trainer Scott Blackler and the Millar Farms.

The \$30,000 Weiss Championship for this group will be featured next Monday, April 22, with a \$15,000 consolation also to be available if enough horses enter. The unofficial point leaders after this group's preliminary round action, from highest to lowest points, are: 1. Ghosttothepost, 2. Ashlee Sparkles, 3. Cardiff, 4. Girl's Got Rhythm, 5. Final Escape, 6. Charms Lil Sis, 7. Flippin Fun, 8. Linda Lace Hanover, and 9. JK Lockherup; Take Abit Of Life and Barbs Beach would be the two AEs “on the bubble,” in that order of preference, and would be the top eligibles for the consolation if it fills.
