Are things, finally, looking up in Chicago?

As Hawthorne Race Course prepares to open its harness racing season, a number of possible expanded gambling initiatives that could support racing appear to be gaining traction in Illinois.

After hibernating for seven months, Chicago harness racing will resume its struggle for survival on May 3 when Hawthorne Race Course begins a 71-program meeting that will continue through Sept. 22.

Meanwhile, at the state capital in Springfield, the new governor, J.B. Pritzger, and legislators are considering a number of gaming expansion proposals that conceivably could bring renewed vitality to the once robust sport that has fallen on hard times in Illinois.

"I think the month of May is going to be very, very interesting," said Tony Simone, executive director of the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association (IHHA). "There are plenty of bills and ideas. I'm cautiously optimistic that this will be our year."

Among the gambling expansion proposals under consideration are allowing sports betting at existing casinos and racetracks and permitting slot machines at the state's three racetracks — Hawthorne and Arlington International Racecourse in suburban Chicago and downstate Fairmount Park, across the Mississippi River from St. Louis

When bankruptcy forced Maywood Park and Balmoral Park out of business after their 2015 meetings, Hawthorne resumed harness racing for the first time since 2008, becoming the only standardbred venue in the metropolitan area of the third largest city in the U.S. The status quo is in sharp contrast to the time-frame of the late 1960s up to the late 1970s when there were six tracks on the Chicago circuit.

This is the skimpiest schedule since the mid-1940s when pari-mutuel betting on standardbreds was inaugurated at Maywood.

It's a far cry from 1995 when an all-time high 516 programs were held at Hawthorne, Maywood, Balmoral and Sportsman's Park and 1997 when Hawthorne raced double-headers galore and put on 70 programs between Jan. 1 and Feb. 13.

And, from 1968 through 2015, there was racing for at least 11 months a year (except for years in which horsemen's contract disputes delayed the start of the season).

Total handle on Illinois harness races fell from \$531,442,911 in 1990 to \$79,029,607 last year and on-track handle plummeted from \$256,855,703 to \$10,545,832 during the same time frame.

Because Hawthorne holds spring and fall thoroughbred meetings and Arlington limits racing to a May through September thoroughbred meeting there has been a standardbred diaspora, sending many horsemen to other states. A ripple effect can be seen in Illinois breeding as attested by significantly smaller foal. As a result, there are increasingly fewer young horses available for racing.

Hawthorne held short winter meetings in 2016 and 2018, but to build up purse money it applied for only spring/summer 2019 dates. That objective also has produced an abbreviated racing week.

Racing will be limited to Friday, Saturday and Sunday from May through mid-June when Thursday programs will be added. Hawthorne will go back to a three-day meeting in August when many horsemen will go to the Illinois State Fair in Springfield for a four-day meeting, the DuQuoin State Fair for a two-day meeting and the Brown County Fair for a (tentatively scheduled) two-day meeting. In September, Hawthorne will resume the four-night format.

"With fewer racing dates we've been able to increase purses compared to last year," said racing secretary Robin Schadt. "Those people who had faith in Illinois will be rewarded. I think we'll be able to offer a nice product."

Last year, Hawthorne's average nightly purses were \$79,096; this year the IHHA is projecting a 20 per cent

increase. Stakes racing again will be limited to seven Illinois-bred races on the closing weekend of the meeting. Last year, their purses ranged from \$160,080 to \$99,032.

Schadt and Simone are hoping that another substantial increase is in the offing.

"The Department of Agriculture has requested (to the legislature) that the recapture be reimbursed," Schadt said. "They haven't requested that for many years."

"Recapture" is a 1995 provision in the law that allowed Illinois racetracks to conduct full-card simulcasting. Unique to Illinois, it stipulates that if wagering on live racing is less than 75 per cent of the 1994 total tracks can "recapture" two per cent of this amount from the horsemen's purse account.

Every year since then, the amount has been under 75 per cent, enabling the racetracks to take in excess of \$284 million out of thoroughbred and standardbred purse accounts.

Starting in 1999, the state authorized the Department of Agriculture to reimburse horsemen for the amount the tracks recaptured, but in 2002 the state was confronted with a severe budget crisis and the funding was discontinued.

According to Simone, if the Department of Agriculture's current request is granted it would add \$2.3 million to the purse account at the upcoming Hawthorne meeting.

One-term Republican Governor Bruce Rauner was anti-union and opposed efforts by the collective bargaining agents of the harness and thoroughbred horsemen to win approval for slots at the racetracks. His Democratic predecessor, Pat Quinn, vetoed a slots-at-the-racetracks bill, but pushed for the successful passage of a bill permitting video gaming machines in restaurants, convenience stores and truck stops, except where ordinances prohibit them (most notably in Chicago). The video gaming began in September 2012 and currently it is being conducted at 6,834 locations throughout the state.

In contrast to his two predecessors, since taking office in January, Governor Pritzger has been encouraging the Democrat-controlled legislature (which was continually engaged in conflicts with Rauner) to send him a sports betting bill. The fact that a member of his transition team is Jim Edgar, a former Republican governor who has owned and bred standardbreds and thoroughbreds, would appear to be a good omen for the inclusion of racing interests in the legislation.

In his spending plan for the budget year that begins July 1, Pritzger is counting on \$200 million in upfront revenue from selling 20 sports betting licenses for \$10 million apiece. Four proposals were introduced by legislators on March 22 with options ranging from creating licenses for the 10 existing riverboat casinos and three racetracks to allowing betting at wherever lottery tickets are sold. The latter would create thousands of sports betting locations across the states.

"We're very pro-sports betting and we'd like to see us and the horse tracks be able to have sports betting and online sports betting," Tom Swoik, executive director of the Illinois Casino Gaming Association that represents all but one of the casinos told the Chicago Tribune. "I think it's doable."

In Simone's opinion, "A sports betting bill certainly is not a savior for our sport but every little bit helps. I'm confident if that bill goes through horsemen will be included.

"In the bigger picture, the gaming (at the racetracks) bill is

starting to pick up steam. We anticipate in the next few weeks a bill will be introduced that is very similar to the one that was passed and then vetoed by Governor Quinn. With that said, it's still a very, very complicated issue — the riverboats have a lot of political strength in the state and they don't want the competition.

"We're going to have to convince the legislature that it's the right thing to do — that the jobs of horsemen and the people they employ are as important as any other jobs in the state. What's interesting this year is we have about a 25 per cent turnover in legislators compared to about 18 months ago. There are about 40 in all. Many of them don't know much about racing. We've been working to get them up to speed so they understand the intricacies of our industry."

The recent Chicago mayoral election also has produced a new element in the equation. Mayor Rahm Emanuel decided not to run again and fellow Democrat Lori Lightfoot was elected.

"She already is working and already has been to Springfield (to meet with the governor and legislators) but she doesn't officially take over until she gets sworn in (May 20)," Simone said. "So far, I like everything she has said. She is very interested in a casino for Chicago and I'm hoping we (in racing) would be included in that legislation."

Complicating the situation, the spring session of the legislature is scheduled to adjourn on May 31, which won't give Lightfoot much time to make her pitch.

"If we don't get anything done by then it isn't over because we still would have a chance in November when the legislature comes back for its two-week veto session," Simone said. "I still will feel very good about getting something done within the year."

Propulsion tough in victory in Olympiatravet

Trainer Daniel Redén's 8-year-old Muscle Hill son Propulsion didn't get anything for free in the \$315,000 Olympiatravet at Åby racetrack on Saturday afternoon. From post seven behind the gate, Örjan Kihlström took a safe start with Propulsion and the duo was placed in fifth over after a quarter of a mile.

Cyber Lane and Muscle Hustle were in front positions and Propulsion got an order to attack three wide after 450 meters. Björn Goop, driver of Muscle Hustle, made a move and parked Propulsion three wide and Kihlström really had to force Propulsion to reach position first over with a lap to go.

At the back stretch, Cyber Lane and Propulsion fought side by side while Muscle Hustle started to get problems to follow in second over.

Åby racetrack has open stretch and pocket-racing

Handsome Brad seemed to challenge Propulsion mid home stretch, but the Muscle Hill son once again showed that he has the will to race, more than most other horses in the world.

"I don't know what he is made of. I get emotional when he performs like this. Normally, you don't win after a tough race like this. He's just phenomenal," said Kihlström after the victory in mile rate 1:54.1 over 1.3 miles.

A shot at the Elitloppet is not yet set for Propulsion.

"I haven't looked where he can start before Elitloppet. I'm just so proud of him and I've never trained a horse that has strength like him," Redén said.

Handsome Brad finished strongly on open stretch to the silver medal while French trotter Bahia Quesnot was third.

Jean-Michel Bazire trained Aubrion du Gers (Memphis du Rib) won the \$100,000 Criterium de Vitesse de Basse Normandie on Saturday in Argentan, France. It was the trotter's first race over the mile.

From the lead, Aubrion du Gers had to fight hard to keep Bille de Montfort behind him, but the gelding's 14th straight win was a fact in a moderate 1:58.1 mile.

Sports betting, table games could be coming to Indiana racetracks

The Indiana General Assembly approved a wide range of gaming changes this week that, if signed by Governor Eric Holcomb, could be very good for horse racing in the Hoosier State.

The Indiana General Assembly approved sweeping gaming changes this week, and, if signed into law, the racing industry is in line to be a major benefactor. The legislation, which now heads to Governor Eric Holcomb, allows for live table games at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and Indiana Grand beginning in 2020, as well as sports betting at casinos, racinos and off-track facilities. The proposed changes could result in millions in additional revenue flowing into the state's racing program.

"The industry always looked at live dealers and table games as where the next bump in purse money would come from. Who knows what that will be, but I do believe it will be significant," said Harrah's Hoosier Park vice-president and general manager of racing, Rick Moore. "It goes back to that old saying, a rising tide lifts all boats, and that's what's going to happen here. We all benefit from having live table games."

House Bill 1015 was approved Wednesday, April 24,

passing the Indiana House by a 59-36 margin and adopted by the Senate with a 37-12 vote. The most significant change is the ability of Caesar's Entertainment to add live table games at both racinos beginning January 1, 2020. Under current state statutes, the operator would have to wait until March 1, 2021 to submit a plan. Revenue distribution for live table games follows the same model as outlined for slots revenue, with 12 per cent of adjusted gross receipts (AGR) earmarked for the industry and split between the breeds. If live table games are a boon at Hoosier Park and Indiana Grand, the Indiana Standardbred Association will receive

additional revenue for promotion and benevolence, and the industry will see a boost in purses and funds devoted to breed development. Last season, nearly \$12 million in slots revenue poured into the breed development program which funds Indiana's fair circuit, Indiana-sired late closers and mini-series, breeders' awards and Indiana Sires Stakes.

Joe Putnam, president of the Indiana Standardbred Association and an owner and trainer, said that some preliminary estimates showed live table games could contribute another \$4-5 million in revenue that could be directed to purses and breed development. Time will tell what the impact will be, but it will create a boost of some kind.

"In my opinion, it turned out about as good as it could be for us," he said. "The legislation helps everyone involved. I think it will be a big help for us. Going forward, we're pretty excited."

According to Indiana Horse Racing Commission statistics, AGR for the casino operations at Hoosier Park and Indiana Grand have combined to total nearly \$351 million in the first nine months. Indiana's racing industry has received a little over \$42 million, with just over \$8.5 million going toward standardbred purses and nearly \$8.9 set aside for standardbred breed development.

There are also some lesser items in HB 1015 creating tax relief for Caesar's Entertainment, kicking in after June 30, 2021. Currently, casino adjusted gross receipts exceeding \$100 million are taxed at a rate of 30 per cent, increasing to 35 per cent for AGR in excess of \$200 million. The recently approved legislation would keep the wagering tax at a flat 30 per cent for gross receipts over \$100 million. Additionally, the operator can deduct up to \$9 million in adjusted gross receipts attributable to qualified wagering, defined as "wagers made by patrons using non-cashable vouchers, coupons, electronic credits, or electronic promotions." Now the maximum deduction is \$7 million in a fiscal year.

As part of HB 1015, legislators also approved sports wagering on professional and collegiate sports. Adults age 21 and over will be able to place bets on mobile devices, at casinos/racinos or off-track locations operated by Caesar's Entertainment. Wagering is prohibited on e-sports, high school athletics, amateur sports or pari-mutuel racing. Sports betting could become a reality in Indiana as early as Sept. 1, 2019. Applications for a vendor's license will be accepted beginning July 1. Application for licensure requires a \$100,000 non-refundable fee, and licensees will pay a \$50,000 annual administrative fee thereafter. Wagers will be taxed at a rate of 9.5 percent.

Moore said that the live table games and sports wagering is yet another opportunity to attract a new demographic that may not visit Hoosier Park otherwise. Once they are on the property, a secondary benefit is exposure to harness racing, which might indirectly produce an increase in wagering on the racing product.

"Any way that you can get people to the track, to the casino, to the entire property, that's a good thing," said Moore. "It gives us a chance to show them what we have to offer here, with horse racing being a big part of that."

Though the first 17 days of racing, Hoosier Park is averaging 8.39 starters per race, an increase of half a starter compared to 2018, with a five per cent increase in export handle. The track has partnered with the USTA and ISA on a \$10,000 Hoosier High 5 wager on the last race of the program each night. It has produced \$334,000 in handle, resulting in a nightly increase of \$20,000.

"I couldn't be more pleased with the start of the meet," Moore said.

Baillargeon's breeding and racing stallion Musical Rhythm something of a miracle horse

There was a time in the spring 2018 when it was unknown if top Mohawk Park trotter Musical Rhythm would ever race again. But the 7-year-old Team Baillargeon star has not only recovered from injury to the point where he's king of the WEG trotting castle again, he's even breeding the morning of some of those races, then winning 12 hours later!

"I've been told that breeding in the morning usually makes them better that night, that it has a positive effect on them," says 28-year old Sara Baillargeon, who works closely with her father Ben, head trainer for Team Baillargeon.

"I like to say that I'm dad's right-hand man," she says of the trainer who is a winner of 2,293 races and purses of more than \$38 million.

When you look at the results of Monday night's preferred trot, it's hard to disagree with her regarding her about the affect a morning's breeding has on that night's racing. Musical Rhythm was sent to the front by regular driver Mario Baillargeon in a :27.2 opening quarter then forced to take cover when his stablemate P L Jill loomed up boldly to take command before the half. But he was back out just after the three-quarter pole and he powered home in :27-flat to take a new season's mark of 1:53.3.

"I guess he was pretty proud of himself," Baillargeon said, laughing.

But it was never a surety that the son of Cantab Hall out of the Valley Victory mare Musical Victory — a winner of 32 of 85 starts and close to \$770,000 — would even be racing this year, or ever again after the ordeal he went through last spring with his health.



"We were getting his ankles injected and they got infected," Baillargeon said. "So we sent him to the University of Guelph for a joint flush, which is a common procedure. It just all kind of went wrong, with one thing after the other."

The news that they got regarding Musical Rhythm's joint flush result was unexpected, and disturbing. "We found out that the infection had traveled into the bone and that type of infection was extremely difficult to detect which in turn made it difficult to treat," Baillargeon said. "He spent almost three months at Guelph and I have to give huge props to the entire team there and Dr. Cote, who never gave up."

Four medical procedures later, Musical Rhythm was out of the woods and on his way home to the Baillargeon farm. "It was just to get him home and give him the retirement that he deserved, maybe train him to ride or stand him at stud if there was any interest," Baillargeon said. "One day, dad comes to me and tells me: throw the harness on him, he's bored. I'll take him for a walk."

Walking led to trotting which then led to giving their trotting champ another go...and, "boom! He's back!," said Baillargeon.

Some say Musical Rhythm looked as good as he's ever been last Monday and Baillargeon agreed, but she says that he is staked only "lightly" this year for a reason. "We don't want to stress him or make it too demanding, and really, we don't know how many races he has left. It's a miracle that

he's back and dad doesn't want to chase any of the big dances, he's just enjoying the ride and his horse being happy."

While noting that they have had some other high-quality racehorses such as Voelz Hanover and Yursa Hanover, Baillargeon said Musical Rhythm, whom they call "Marty", is held in the highest regard.

"Marty is the most important horse for us because he has touched all of us and he's such a fun horse to be around because I've never seen a horse who enjoys his job as much as he does," she said.

Musical Rhythm is both breeding and racing this year only because Team Baillargeon has limited him to breeding to six mares, which shouldn't add a lot of stress. "We're only breeding the mares that we own, and that's why we continue to race him," Baillargeon said, "because more than anything else, he loves his job, and because we are only breeding to a

handful of our mares, it doesn't affect his training schedule much."

Going forward, there is hope that Musical Rhythm will have a full stud career. "We are very thankful for Mr. Heffering and Tara Hills Stud for their support in assisting with the breedings," Baillargeon said while noting that some people have expressed interest in Musical Rhythm's future breeding career. "They are attracted to the Cantab Hall line, plus his mother was a Breeders Crown winner, so he's very well-bred, and this story especially shows the kind of heart he and a lot of people have shown interest in breeding to him... So next year we'd like to stand him at stud for the public."

For now, "Marty" is enjoying the best of both worlds.

Queen Of The Pride, Only Take Cash victorious in Scarlet & Gray

The 2018 Ohio Sires Stakes champions are in fine form so far in 2019.

Two exceptional fillies scored impressive victories in a pair of \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray Invationals for Ohio-sired 3-year-olds on Friday (April 26) at Miami Valley Raceway.

Queen Of The Pride copped the distaff pacing division in 1:51.2 to run her young career scorecard to 7-4-3 in 17 starts, with her earnings growing to \$396,454 early in her sophomore season. **Only Take Cash** ([full story here](#)) triumphed in the trotting split in 1:54.3, winning for the ninth time in just 10 career starts with earnings of \$297,140. Both fillies won their respective Ohio Sires Stakes championships as 2-year-olds by capturing the \$275,000 finals at Scioto Downs last September.

Tony Hall, who grew up just a few miles from Miami Valley and got his career started at old Lebanon Raceway, was the sulky-sitter behind Queen Of The Pride. The daughter of McArdle pushed her main foe, Rylee Roo (Aaron Merriman) to a :26.3 opening panel before relenting for a pocket ride the next half mile. After tracking Rylee Roo, who had upset Queen Of The Pride in last week's \$40,000 James K. Hackett Memorial final by benefitting from a two-hole trip, Hall flipped the script by angling to the outside as the

three-quarter station was approached in 1:23.2 and coasted to victory through the stretch. Avaline Hanover (Chris Page) rallied late to close within a length of the winner at the finish, while Rylee Roo hung on for third.

Frank Chick of Harrington, DE, owns Queen Of The Pride and entrusts the training duties to Kevin Lare.

Only Take Cash (Merriman) was floated from the gate while a trio of challengers battled for early supremacy in the tandem \$50,000 trot. As soon as those fillies sorted things out and lined up along the pylons at the :28.1 first quarter pole, Only Take Cash rushed to command and soon the outcome was in little doubt. The daughter of Cash Hall, trained by Bob McIntosh, coasted through middle fractions of :56.4 and 1:25.4 before tacking on a :28.4 final split to win by open lengths.

Bella's Rose Power (Kayne Kauffman) who trailed in the nine-horse field coming out of the second turn, staged an impressive rally to nose out Well I'm Fancy (Page) for the place laurels.

McIntosh bred Only Take Cash and co-owns her with partners Dave Boyle and Mardon Stables of Ontario.

Both fillies and a host of others are expected back at Miami Valley next Friday (May 3) when the 2019 Ohio Sires Stakes program kicks off with first leg action.

Atlanta returns to the track with easy qualifying victory

An impressive performance was also turned in by Hambletonian hopeful Greenshoe.

The stars were certainly out on Saturday morning for the day's qualifying races at the Meadowlands contested on a very windy morning over a track that was dry but dulled a bit by overnight rains. A steady, strong wind was blowing hard across the track, helping most around the final turn and somewhat against them in the stretch with the temperature at 54 degrees when they began at 10:00am.

The great Hambletonian-winning filly **Atlanta** (sans trotting hobbles made) her first appearance today for her new trainer Ron Burke with Yannick Gingras at the controls and she was fabulous. Sent to the front from post eight, Atlanta set all the fractions in a 1:52.3 mile, final half in :55.2 and into the wind last quarter of :27.3 with no urging. **The Veteran** (Scott Zeron) was impressive in his first go around to hold second over a clearly in hand **Cruzado Dela Noche** (Brian Sears). Crawford Farms, Brad Grant and Howard Taylor own Atlanta.

Marcus Melander brought his imposing team of sophomore colt trotters up for the day and clearly the most impressive performance of the morning from his string was turned in by the enigmatic **Greenshoe** (Brian Sears) who looked composed and imposing at the same time. Greenshoe trotted an impressive 1:54.1 mile with a back half in :56 and :28.1 final quarter well under wraps, leaving his competition in some disarray 20 or more lengths in arrears. The Father Patrick colt is insanely talented and can certainly trot with anyone if his connections can keep his focus on business for owner Anders Ström's nom de course, Courant, Inc.

Melander's Dan Patch Award and Breeders Crown winning **Gimpanzee** (Sears) sat last in the field of six and closed some late as **Hudson River** (Marcus Johansson) set even fractions in an easy 1:57.2 win over **Captain Krupnik** (Svanstedt) and a closing **Southwind Avenger** (Dexter Dunn).

Gerry (Melander) put in a solid front stepping 1:56.3 effort, closing it out in :28.1 under no urging. **Soul Strong** (Ake Svanstedt) closed a bit up the inside to take the place over pocket sitter **No Drama Please** (Tetrick). Gerry is owned by SRF Stable.

The Millers opened the day with the good Father Patrick filly **French Café** cutting the mile for Andy to a 1:58 win off a 1:01.3 and 1:30 three quarters. **Sister's Promise** (Tim Tetrick) was second and **Susy** (Zeron) third. For perspective, she trotted in 1:55.4/:27 in her first try two weeks ago. Julie

Miller trains the winner for owner/ breeders Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

Evident Beauty (David Miller) looked sharp in her first effort for trainer Nifty Norman passing fillies from well back in the stretch for a 1:57.4, with a wind compromised 30 second final quarter on the board. **Winndevie** (Trond Smedshammer) was second and **Whispering Oak** (Zeron) third. The White Birch Farm bred Trixton filly was a multiple Grand Circuit winner at Red Mile last fall for owners Mel Hartman, Little E and R A W Stable.

The pacers began with the 7th qualifier and Captaintreacherous sired the winner of the first two sophomore colt races. **Major Deception** (Tetrick) was a winner in 1:55.3 leading through the :56.2 closing half comfortably holding on over **No Mas Amor** (Gingras). Tony Alagna is the trainer while In The Gym Partners (John Fodera & Steve Wienick), Martha Frank, Robert LeBlanc, Steve Head and Joe Sbrocco own the colt.

Captain Victorious (Gingras) was giant in his first start from the Ron Burke barn. He set a solid pace then closed out a remarkable 1:51.1 mile in :27.2 with mild encouragement from the driver. **Best In Show** (Tetrick) was a good second and **Dancin Lou** (Matt Kakaley) third.

Major March (D. Miller) raced right back to his good mile behind Captain Crunch last week with an effortless 1:52.1/:27.2 daylight win over a closing **Buddy Hill** (Sears) and **Escapetothebeach** (Tetrick). Linda Toscano trains the Art Major colt for Bay Pond Racing.

Last year's top freshman filly **Warrawee Ubeaut** (Gingras) has come back beautifully for Burke and the Sweet Lou lass was an easy 1:53.2 winner, settling nicely off the pace early and rolling by good fillies late under her own power. **Odds On Clearwater** (Dunn) and **St Somewhere** (D. Miller) followed the winner, owned by Burke, Collura, Silva, Purnell & Libby and Weaver Brussemi in.

Youaremycandygirl (Gingras) closed in tandem with 3-year-old **Treacherous Reign** (Dunn) to nip **Percy Blue Chip** (Kakaley) in 1:53.1. Bill Donovan owns Youaremycandygirl and Ron Burke trains.

Done Well was scary good in the last Saturday, dragging Dexter Dunn around in 1:50.4 to win by seven over a really good bunch of horses. **Dorsoduro Hanover** (Kakaley) left into play from post 10 and was really good for second with **Filibuster Hanover** (Gingras) completing the Burke sweep.

The results are available on the web. Racing resumes tonight at 7:15 pm.

Hanover closing in on its 25,000th career winner

Hanover Shoe Farms is about to have their 25,000th career winner. They had 24,842 through April 24. Hanover Shoe is also going to hit three-quarters of a BILLION dollars sometime in the next 12 months. They were closing in on \$731 million as of the last week of April.

Winbak Farms is next at over \$300 million, while Armstrong Bros is third at \$199,235,450.

Castleton Farms is one of four outfits that had at least 10,000 starters (10,483) and they are in fifth, right ahead of Perretti Farms.

In total, eight different breeding operations hit \$100 Million.

Back to back

Wiggle It Jiggleit holds pacing record for earnings over two years at \$3,901,057 in 2015-16. He put up a Horse of the Year season at 3 with earnings of nearly \$2.2 million in 2015, followed by more than \$1.7 million at four.

Supplements helped

Both the top two single-season earners of all time among pacers were aided some by a supplemental entry that didn't pan out. It did pump up the yearly total for the top two single-season earners. In 2008, Somebeachsomewhere's earnings record of \$2,448,003 was helped by Bullville Powerful's \$100,000 supplement to the Meadowlands Pace (in which SBSW finished second to Art Official).

In 2000, Gallo Blue Chip was aided by P B Bullville's \$150,000 supplement to the Pace that was a bust. Gallo earned \$2,428,816 that year, but he received \$75,000 extra in the Pace from that supplement.

Backing it up

Gallo Blue Chip, Market Share and Wiggle It Jiggleit are the only three North American-breds to have a \$2 million season, then come back the next year and add \$1 million. Gallo did it in 2000-2001, and Market Share in 2012-2013, while Wiggle did it in 2015-2016.

2yo pacers – all-time earnings leaders

The top four freshman pacing seasons of all time took place in the 1980s.

1986 – Redskin \$1,407,263 (despite no money in the Woodrow Wilson)

1984 – Nihilator \$1,361,367

1982 – Fortune Teller \$1,313,175

1984 – Praised Dignity \$1,194,715

In the last 14 years, not a single 2-year-old has made this list among the top 16 of all time.

Double Nickells

Hall Of Famer Bruce Nickells has the distinction of being the only trainer to have had a \$1 million single-season 2-year-old pacing filly – and he did it twice:

Miss Easy \$1,128,956 and Immortality \$1,033,028

Broad brush

Broad Bahn is the only one on the list of top 25 single-season earning trotters to have more seconds than wins. The Hambletonian winner posted a record of 5-8-2 in 19 starts.

In the pink

Pinkman's \$1,892,865 season of 2015 represents the single biggest season for any Jimmy Takter trainee – ever!

Sears towers

Brian Sears had both the undefeated trotters on the list of top single-season earnings – Bee A Magician in 2013 (17-for-17) and Muscle Hill in 2009 (12-for-12). Muscle Hill set the bar very high when he averaged \$204,670 a start in 2009 – easily the highest total for any standardbred in any season.

Freshman trotters

On the list of freshman trotters ranked by single-season earnings, only two topped \$1 million – Snow White (\$1,252,646) and Poof She's Gone (\$1,036,956). The top three earning freshman trotters in a single season are female. Costa Rica holds down third with earnings of \$970,126.

Three undefeated freshman trotters appear in the top 25 ranked by single-season earnings:

Deweycheatumnhowe, who was 10-for-10 with earnings of \$936,191 in 2007, Manchego, who was 12-for-12 with earnings of \$873,948 in 2017 and Wheeling N Dealin, who was nine-for-nine with earnings of \$696,112 in 2012.

Only Ray Schnittker has a colt and a filly in the top 25 of all time on this list – Deweycheatumnhowe and Check Me Out – whose combined record is an astounding 26 24-2-0, \$1,836,810.

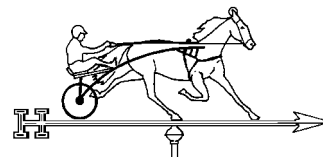

The Guru makes his Kentucky Derby picks

Because of time constraints I am going with this early, missing the possibility of jockey changes and fabulous final works. If there is a major change in my opinion I will list it in my Ask The Guru column next Friday as well as selections for the Oaks and some other Derby weekend races. My selections only rank the top five the others are listed in order of points earned to get in the starting gate.

RANK, HORSE, SIRE, DAM, EARNINGS, COST, TRAINER, JOCKEY, LAST RACE, WORKS, COMMENT

1. OMAHA BEACH c. War Front—Charming, \$1,121,000, \$625,000 Keeneland, Richard Mandella, Mike Smith; Won the Arkansas Derby 4/13 at Oaklawn, 3 bullet works including 6f 110. Won last three starts. Mike Smith's choice over Roadster, a very good Baffert trainee, tells a story of how good he thinks this colt is. To me, the fastest horse in the race and has the ability to get position early, a must in the bulky field.

2. GAME WINNER c. Candy Ride—Indian Giving, \$846,000, \$110,000 Keeneland, Bob Baffert, Joel Rosario; 2nd in the Santa Anita Derby 4/6, some good works no bullet sprints.

Two-year-old Eclipse Award winner. Lost two tough races in a row, including a horrid ride in the SA Derby where he was three and four wide the entire race in a six-horse field. Would be my top pick but Mike Smith's decision haunts me.

3. ROADSTER c. Quality Road—Ghost Dancing, \$634,000, \$525,000 Keeneland Bob Baffert, Florent Geroux; Won the Santa Anita Derby 4/6, no impressive works, Baffert is a genius, Smith deserted, colt's best may be enough.

4. MAXIMUM SECURITY c. New Years Day—Lil Indy \$649,400, Homebred, Jason Service, Luis Saez; Won the Florida Derby 3/30, worst work out record I have ever seen, was the slowest of the day the last three works with 50 or so horses training each day. Was in for a maiden tag of \$16,000 first outing. Undefeated in four attempts this very fast colt has very formidable connections.

5. LONG RANGE TODDY c. Take Charge Indy—Pleasant Song \$854,459 Homebred, Steve Asmussen, Jon Court; Sixth in the Arkansas Derby 4/13, no fast works, won the Rebel and has speed. Wouldn't shock me. It would be the first Derby win in 19 attempts by Asmussen and Jon Court would become the oldest jockey to ever win the Derby.

TACITUS c Tapit—Close Hatches, \$653,000, Homebred, Bill Mott, Jose Ortiz; Won the Wood 4/6, no impressive works, also won the Tampa Bay Derby. Great pedigree, great connections, needs lifetime best.

VEKOMA c Candy Ride—Mona de Momma, \$788,850, \$135,000 Keeneland, George Weaver, Javier Castellano; Won the Bluegrass 4/6 no great works, I think he needs more racing.

PLUS QUE PARFAIT r. Point of Entry—Belvedra \$1,590,400, \$135,000 Keeneland Brendan Walsh, Ricardo Santana Jr.; won the UAE Derby in DuBai, no great works, I don't think he is fast enough.

HAIKAL c Daaher—Sablah \$373,900 Homebred, Kieran McLaughlin, Rajiv Maragh ; Third in the Wood Memorial, very good works 4f 47b most recent 4/19, winner of the Gotham earlier must return to that form to be a factor,

IMPROBABLE c City Zip—Rare Event \$619,520, \$200,000 Keeneland, Bob Baffert, Iraq Ortiz Jr.; Second in the Arkansas Derby, no fancy works, has the speed and the top connections in the sport, must get the perfect journey to beat these.

WAR OF WILL c War Front—Vision of Clarity, \$501,569, \$298,550 ARQ 2 yr olds, Mark Casse, Tyler Gaffalione; Ninth in the Louisiana Derby, two recent bullet works Won the Risen Star, but just not fast enough.

TAX c Arch—Toll, \$326,300, Private Sale, Danny Gargantuas, Junior Alvarado; Second in the Wood Memorial, no fast works, Must improve

CUTTING HUMOR c First Samurai—Pun, \$516,967, \$400,000 Saratoga, Todd Pletcher, TBA; Won the Sunland Derby 3/24 had two recent bullet works but never raced good horses. Best win was in a grade three event. Look elsewhere.

WIN WIN WIN c Hat Trick—Miss Smarty Pants \$367,300, Homebred, Michael Trombetta, Julien Pimentel, second in the Bluegrass some bullet works earlier but didn't race up to them. Beat cheaper earlier cannot recommend.

COUNTRY HOUSE c Lookin At Lucky—Quake Lake \$260,175 Homebred, Bill Mott, TBA; Third in the Arkansas Derby, fair works always near but doesn't win. Not enough talent for these.

GRAY MAGICIAN c Gradar—Burg Berg, \$584,140, \$18,000 FT

Ky, RNA, Peter Miller, TBA; Decent works hasn't won since breaking his maiden, not in here.

SPINOFF c Hard Spun—Zaftig, \$260,000, Homebred, Todd Pletcher, Manny Franco; Okay works, hasn't been back of third in four career starts, needs more racing and more speed.

MASTER FENCER c Just A Way (JPN)—Sexy Zamurai , Homebred, Koichi Tsunoda, Julien Laparoux; Works and charts not available but losing four of six starts with no stakes wins at all is enough for me to exclude.

I would be happy to share in any of your successes but I am not responsible for any of your failings. Remember if there are any major changes in my decisions I will post them in my column on Friday.

They Said It

with David Anderson

Last week, standardbred owner and thoroughbred breeder David Anderson celebrated a major victory for his Anderson Farms of St. Thomas, ON when Wonder Gadot was named Canada's thoroughbred Horse of the Year for 2018. Anderson bred Wonder Gadot, who won Canada's Queen's Plate and Prince of Wales and was second in the Grade 1 Longines Kentucky Oaks en route to earnings exceeding \$1.5 million under the tutelage of Mark Casse for owner Gary Barber.

Anderson, who has owned such standardbred stars as Pampered Princess and Cabrini Hanover, among others, is the son of the late Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Famer Bob Anderson who founded Anderson Farms and was a long-time director at the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG).

Asked recently about the prospects of WEG, which is actively trying to develop both of its racetrack properties, David gave a particularly optimistic opinion about horse racing at Woodbine.

"I'm really excited about the future at Woodbine," Anderson said. "I know a lot of people are poo-pooing it right now, but I think they've got a vision and I think that five years from now you're going to see Woodbine with the biggest purses in the world... For those of us breeders that can stick around and continue to tough it out through these tougher times, I think we're going to reap the rewards one day."

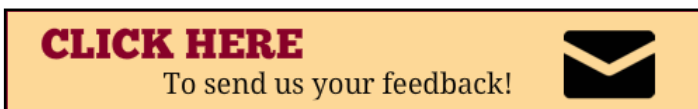

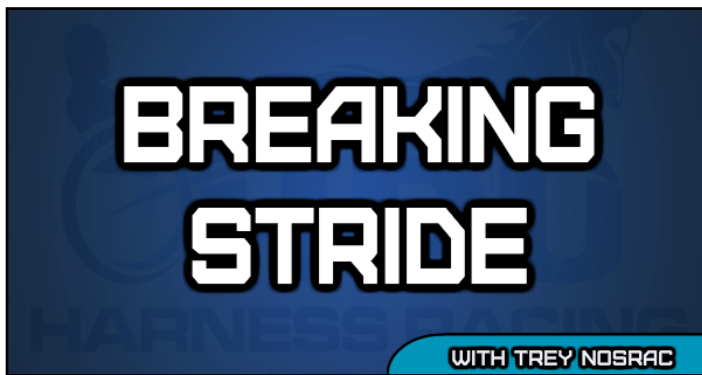

The Real Life Ventures and Adventures of Trey and Batman

"I'm slightly miffed."

We sat in a booth at a hole in the wall vegan restaurant named Kale Me Krazy on East Ninth Street. My new harness horse racing recruit looked up from his Half Tofunafish Sandwich and Kale Salad Special. He asked, "What are you miffed at?"

"Something on Facebook."

"You told me you don't use Facebook."

"I said I don't POST on Facebook; I just lurk for a few minutes with my morning coffee. Today I spotted a few lines about the Guru, a fellow who writes an interesting column for HRU. He doesn't just write about harness racing; he also offers commentary on many topics."

"So?" he asked.

"Someone in the thread whined about the low number of likes and forwards on a recent column of his. That's not his fault, it's the fault of the readers. The Guru could be F. Scott Fitzgerald, he could post *The Great Gatsby*, and not get much liking or forwarding."

My friend pushed around a piece of kale with his chopstick as he looked up and said, "In my years working in Silicon Valley, we spent every day on this topic - social content, how to get certain material forwarded. We called it supplying the pushers. There are oceans of data as to what type of people share what type of information. Not as many people share as is believed."

With a dismissive wave of his chopstick, he gave a frustrated sigh, "The whole subject is crazily complicated with variants and psychology."

"Well, Mister Silicon Valley, your reply suggests that I can't keep up with your brilliance. Now I'm twice miffed."

He snorted a laugh, and pointed his chopstick at me, "You



are part of a large segment that suffers from Visio bibliophobia, a fear of social media. Many people have a touch of this and some researchers refer to this fear as prosopobibliophobia."

"Now you're just messing with me. I have no phobias, that makes me an antiphobiatic. And put down that chopstick so nobody gets hurt."

He grinned and slipped into professor mode, "A large percentage of harness horse participants grew up before the Internet. They didn't grow up with phones glued to their heads. This type of audience has a bias against posting. They are very good about reading and absorbing information digitally, but they are not nearly as prolific at sharing."

I nodded in agreement, "I never post anything unless it has a stamp. My first thought isn't always great, usually in the range between smart ass and dumb ass. If I want a stupid remark on my permanent record and if I want to bicker, I could get remarried. I don't do Facebook, tweet, or any of the fifty different free and fast ways to make a fool of myself - I like to do it slowly."

He continued as Professor Batman, "Of course there are outliers, but members of the racing community are not teenagers keeping up with Arianna Grande. Social media is still a bit uncomfortable for many people. They have a fear of starting something they can't keep up with, a fear of rejection, and they have a level of discomfort with arguments. We used a variant called the 1-9-90 Rule. This is a rule of thumb about people who share user-generated content - one per cent are power users, nine per cent are occasional contributors, and 90 per cent just lurk."

He finished with a flurry, "So accordingly, 90 per cent to 99 per cent of any community, like horse racing, are lurking in the shadows, passively standing by, and watching as a small active minority engage with one another."

"So let me ask you this, what sort of stuff gets shared on the Internet?"

"We have known that answer for a long time, status and emotion. These forces drive digital and social sharing."

"Status?"

"Sure, if I share a book, an article, a story, a column, or a joke with you, it boosts my status. It's sort of like bragging that I know this and now I'm sharing it with you."

"Emotion?"

"Yes, and this does not just mean you love something like harness racing. Sharing is tricky. Just because you love a sport doesn't necessarily lead to sharing it."

"Besides posts of cats, what sort of posts break through the clutter and get shared?" I asked.

He set down his chopstick next to his plate and leaned back, "A story about a struggling waitress getting stiffed on her tip can set off wild social sharing. A post like this stirs up angry emotions, and the person who shares the story is attempting to improve their status by implying they always tip."

I thought about this for a few seconds and gave a thoughtful reply, "Huh."

He added, "If the waitress got a \$10,000 tip, it could do the same thing because positive emotion can drive sharing. Stories, articles, photos, jokes, sounds, anything that touches one end of the positive or negative emotion spectrum are the best bets."

I said, "So The Guru can write about races, breeding, or harness racing sires until the cows come home and he's not going to get much sharing or liking."

He shook his head, "His audience is not filled with hyper sharers. Informational content is limited. He needs to put up content that tugs at our heartstrings, make readers fall on the floor laughing, be very unusual, or causes great outrage - anything that falls between gets lost. And then there is another level of sharing that is even more complex."

"Go ahead Batman, I can take it."

"What platform you decide to share content on is dependent on what type of person you are or what type of content you are sharing. Facebook is far from the only choice on social media, and the options for social posting are staggering. Smaller, more exclusive sites that most people have never heard of are trending. Whether you are an altruist, a careerist, a hipster, an attention seeker, a connector, or you are into a small niche - these days, every person has a place to share and those places multiply like rabbits."

I sighed, "Everyone says harness racing needs to get into the social media world to grow."



"This is true, but also very difficult. Shares, likes, links, they are often false barometers. One share that reaches a billionaire who gets enthused about your sport because of something funny or quirky can be more powerful and productive than a million shares that are unproductive."

"So what is the moral of this story?"

"Keep sharing, step out of the shadows if you find content that might help grow the sport, share smart, share outside the racing choir, and hope that a smidgen of engaging content lands on the eyeballs of a Jeff Bezos and he leaves a billion-dollar tip for an altruistic harness horse trainer."

Burke Stable and Palone dominate as racing resumes at The Meadows

The Ron Burke Stable won five races on Saturday's 14-race card including three of the four Late Closer Finals, and Dave Palone steered home six winners on a busy day in Washington, PA.

Firedbyindie moved to the front for driver Dave Palone going to the half mile point and never looked back winning the \$28,700 Margaret Provost Memorial by 2 ¼ lengths in 1:56.4. The winner trained by Ron Burke now has lifetime earnings of \$47,500. Following the winner home was the Wilbur Yoder trained entry of Lindy Missunshine and Giant Possession.

Next up for Burke was the pair of 3-year-old Sweet Lou fillies, Pretty N Fast and Walk On Air. Using similar tactics as with Firedbyindie, Pretty N Fast moved to the lead approaching the half and went on to victory in the \$26,300 Ruby Cook Memorial Pace by 1 ½ lengths over her stablemate in 1:53.1. Crew Sock Hanover grabbed third money for David Brickell.

The third late closer winner for the Burke Stable was Capt Chaps Hanover, winning the \$31,100 Ben Wood Memorial Trot in 1:56 over 50-1 longshot Explosive Form and Cash Hit. Dave Palone steered Capt Chaps Hanover for his third consecutive win on the card. Sent off at 2-5 Capt Chaps Hanover went gate to wire and paid \$2.60 to win.

Norm Parker trained, and Mike Wilder driven Wild Wild Western won the Tom Kirwan Memorial late closer final with an impressive wire to wire win from post 9 in a lifetime best 1:52. With a masterful drive by Mike Wilder, Wild Wild Western paced through a pedestrian half of :57.1 before pacing his last half in :54.4 for the win. The Ron Burke trained Yacht Week followed the winner home but was no match. Captain Hill grabbed the show spot.

Racing resumes Monday with a 1:05 p.m. post. On Kentucky Derby Saturday, May 4, The Meadows will have a special 11:25 post time.

Tubo Hill wins Weiss at Pocono

Throughout the preliminary events of Bobby Weiss Series for pacing males at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, the motto has been "The post means the most." And so it continued in the \$30,000 series Championship event on Saturday night, as Turbo Hill drew inside his archrival Sports Legend and went on to defeat him by ¾ of a length in a lifetime best 1:51.

The pair did not draw in together in the first prelim. In the second, Turbo Hill drew inside Sports Legend and controlled the pace; the reverse was true last week, when Sports Legend prevailed. In the championship, driver George Napolitano Jr. looked to his right, saw Sports Legend, and gave his horse double-time leaving instructions, controlling the pace and forcing Sports Legend in behind him late in the :27 opener.

After a soft :56.1 half, the victorious son of American Ideal hit a higher gear, reaching the three-quarters in 1:23.1, with Sports Legend right on his back, and that one moved outside late on the far turn, auguring for another classic battle. But it's been the pacesetter who's won all of their confrontations, and that trend continued, with Turbo Hill withstanding the game potential pocket rocket by ¾ of a length.

Turbo Hill thus righted himself after he lost his six race winning streak last week – he's now 7-for-9 this year, and 9-for-11 lifetime, for trainer Hunter Oakes, and owner Tom Hill, who probably stayed up until 3 a.m. Sunday in his home in England to watch his budding star win again.

Team Napolitano / Oakes were the powers behind the veteran Rocknroll Hanover gelding Scott Rocks, a veteran Pocono lover (the nine-year-old took his 1:48 mark here at six), who was a length winner in the \$21,500 featured fast-class pace, clocked in 1:50.4. The winner of \$862,049, owned by Northfork Racing Stable and Chuck Pompey, raced out to the pocket early, was able to slip out when favored Tiger Thompson N brushed to the lead nearing the ¾, then powered home in classic fashion to withstand the large charge of Mariner Seelster.

Hunter Oakes was in the sulky when the American Ideal gelding Hitman Hill equaled his own 1:50.1 clocking, the fastest time of the year at Pocono, in winning a \$17,500 pace. The coast-to-coast winner is trained by Hunter's father Chris (Homicide Hunter), while Tom Hill, who shares ownership in the winner of \$385,656 with Northfork Racing Stable, may have extended his TV viewing by about 40 minutes.

After the features, the story of the night was the Allard brothers, driver Simon and trainer Rene, teaming for five victories. Rene, leading trainer here five of the last six years, increased his lead in the 2019 standings, while the quintuple boosted Simon into second in sulky wins this season behind perennial leader George Napolitano Jr.

Reclamation rolls to third straight at Big M

Reclamation has been nothing short of dominant of late at the Meadowlands and the Ron Burke trainee ran her win streak to three with another easy victory Friday night at the Big M in a conditioned event for pacing fillies and mares.

Around the first turn, it appeared that Reclamation and longshot Truth And Liberty were in close quarters and possibly locked wheels as Reclamation made her way toward the front and Truth And Liberty was alongside three wide, but driver Yannick Gingras urged Reclamation to the top while parked past the half in :55.3 and said there were no issues.

"I was just protecting position in the first turn," said Gingras. "Nothing happened to her."

Reclamation hit three-quarters in 1:23.4 while in high gear and sprinted clear to a 4½-length edge at the head of the stretch before hitting the wire 3½ lengths of front of 25-1 chance Rockin Praline. Brazuca was third.

"She fits this (non-winners of \$12,500 or \$125,000 lifetime) class for a little longer so hopefully we can wait to find out if she can compete with the preferred mares," said Gingras. "She doesn't have much experience and is learning every week."

Reclamation paid \$2.20 to win as the 1-9 public choice and covered the mile in 1:51.1 over a track labeled 'good' to score for the 10th time in 18 lifetime outings. The 4-year-old daughter of A Rocknroll Dance-Art Sale now has career earnings of \$63,655 for owners WJ Donovan and Donal Murphy.

CAP4 BET BIG AGAIN: The Can-Am Pick-4 was a hot commodity once again as the wager that requires one to select two winners at the Meadowlands and two more at Woodbine Mohawk Park took in wagers totaling \$64,937, coming just short of reaching the \$65,000 mark for a third time in six tries.

Odds-on favorites scored in the first two legs but after a 34-1 and a 23-1 won the back half, the payoff for the 20-Cent base wager was \$361.70.

A LITTLE MORE: Trainer Linda Toscano has a Hambletonian hopeful on her hands. Guaranteed, a Muscle Hill–Beauty Of Gray colt, won his career debut in a non-winners of one in impressive fashion as the 2-5 favorite in 1:53.4 with Tim Tetrick in the bike... Gingras drove three winners on the card... The team of trainer Allen Sisco and driver Tyler Buter scored twice at a big price, with Say You Do (\$33.80) in the second race and Starsaboveallergage (\$48.00) in the 11th... All-source handle on the 13-race card totaled \$2,597,293.

Qualifying races at Bangor will be conducted Tuesday, May 7 and Saturday, May 11. The racing schedule through July 19 will be Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday evenings with a 5 p.m. post time. A special Thursday, July 4 race card will be offered with a 6:30 p.m. post time. After a break in August the track resumes live racing September 10 for a 16-date fall season ending November 5.

Richard Young: don't lump standardbreds in with thoroughbreds

Recently I wrote an article in HRU concerning the advantages of owning a standardbred harness horse versus a thoroughbred ([full story here](#)).

I don't have to repeat them, although I had pointed out the incidence of career-ending injury was more than significantly higher in thoroughbreds. We then had the horrendous story of the high rate of horses that had to be put down at Santa Anita.

This only accentuates the standardbreds advantages. We need to exploit the differences.

I seriously doubt the cause of any particular drug played a roll. If that was true then the rates would be the same yearly. Hard to ignore the obvious. Can it not be that the weather having broken records for rain and cold temperatures be the primary cause?

This cannot be just a co incidence.

However, the reason for this piece is we must educate the vast differences from our sport to thoroughbred racing.

The general public has no clue that there are any differences whatsoever. PETA (The People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) is out there trying to eliminate racing and, let's admit it, without providing education, if any action is taken against thoroughbreds, standardbreds will be included.

We need to eliminate reasons why we should be lumped together. The uneducated will look to any reason possible to ban racing. Here are a couple of points to consider: We need to eliminate racing two heats. There are arguments on both sides.

I happen to think it's time to eliminate them for many reasons already outlined by others. But, we need to add one more reason. The uneducated public view it as too hard on the horses. It's cruelty to animals. We actually don't need

another reason.

That reason alone is enough.

Also, (recently) I was watching Yonkers and noticed what would appear to the general public as excessive use of the whip. I can only see PETA's reaction in trying to determine if harness racing falls in the same category as thoroughbreds as we are just as cruel to the animals. Again, we don't need another reason. We must stop the use of the whip or curtail it some way.

Again, with all the issues surrounding thoroughbreds today, this is a good time to highlight harness racing as safer with far less situations for extreme monetary losses.
