Ringostarr Treb impressive in Olympiatravet

Next stop, the Elitlopp for the Jerry Riordan trainee who won Saturday in a mile rate of 1:52.3.

Jerry Riordan-trained Ringostarr Treb (Classic Photo) got a well-deserved invitation to the Elitloppet shortly after winning the \$345,000 final of the Olympiatravet at Åby racetrack in Sweden on Saturday afternoon.

The 8-year-old trotter more or less outclassed his opponents in the race after a quick start for driver Wilhelm Paal. Ringostarr Treb kept the pace at a mile rate of approximately 1:52.3 throughout the whole race and it was the first three horses out from the rail that won the medals in Olympiatravet.

4-year-old Giveitgasandgo (Yankee Glide) sat behind leader Ringostarr Treb with Italian-bred and French-trained Titty Jepson (Varenne) behind him. Cruzado dela Noche left three wide after 5/8ths of a mile and got On Track Piraten and Lionel ahead of him with two quarters to go.

With the fast pace in the race, horses that tried three wide never got really close to the leading trio, except for Lionel, who was placed outside the leader in the last turn.

The winning time over 1.3 miles is an incredible mark, even for elite horses.

"He's just a top class trotter, a horse that everyone should have in their barns. He can leave fast, he can come from behind and the tough meeting in Paris last winter made him strong for this type of race," Riordan said.

In nine starts at two, Spring Goal went 3-2-2 while earning nearly \$90,000 with wins in the Bluegrass 2YO Colt Trot (taking his record of 1:56) and a second place finish in the International Stallion Stakes. As an aged performer he took a career record of 1:53.1 and retired to stud with over \$225,000 in lifetime earnings.

By Yankee Glide, he is a half-brother to JJ ALEX 1:53.4f-'16 (\$189,313) and MISSY GOLDFIRE 4,1:54.1f (\$135,867) and to the dam of World Champion MUSCLE UP THE GOAL 4,1:52f-'16 (\$348,858). **Stud Fee: \$1,500**

Ringostarr Treb hadn't raced since the Prix de France at Vincennes in February. He received an invitation for Olympiatravet early this spring. Last year, Ringostarr Treb finished second in the Hugo Åbergs Memorial and won the Sundsvall Open Trot, both races in Sweden. As it looks for the present season, considering this victory in Olympiatravet, Ringostarr Treb should have a great year on the tracks.

"Probably I will take it easy until the Elitloppet. Of course I had positive thoughts about my horse before the race today and the way he did it impressed me. But as I said, Ringostarr Treb is a top class horse and I'm happy that he is in my barn," Riordan said.

Ultra Bright wins Lovely Godvias Minne

In the \$69,000 Lovely Godvias Minne for 5-year-old mares at Åby racetrack, Ultra Bright (Zola Boko) and Fredrik Persson controlled the field in front and won in a mile rate of 1:56.2 over 1.3 miles despite being seriously challenged by Double Exposure (Donato Hanover), who was parked outside during the race's last 5/8ths of a mile.

Ultra Bright won one of the biggest races for 4-year-old mares, the Stochampionatet, last year and it seems like the Zola Boko mare has improved and developed the necessary requirements needed to take on the elite trotters in Europe..

Other results at Åby

Åby racetrack had a great meeting with two racing days containing several top horses. On Friday (April 27), the eliminations for Kungapokalen and Drottningpokalen were held for the 4-year-old trotters and Hambletonian winner Perfect Spirit was one of the winners.

Örjan Kihlström drove the Daniel Redén-trained Andover Hall son and placed him in front after a bit more than a quarter into the race. Enterprise (Chapter Seven) followed behind the leader and held to place third and advance to the final later next month.

The two Pokal-races are scheduled at Åby on May 12 and Perfect Spirit will the begin from post 1 behind the gate over 1.3 miles.

Three eliminations were held last Friday and Breeders Crown winner Lucifer Lane (Infinitif) and Italian-bred Velvet Gio (Nad Al Sheba) won the other two races.

Among the mares, Roger Walmann-trained Dibaba (Ready Cash) impressed a lot when she won her elimination in mile rate 1:57.3 for Örjan Kihlström.

Franck Nivard drove the 10-year-old stallion, but the duo weren't first at the wire. Romanesque and Dominik Locqueneux won by a nose, but the judges at Argentan were not to pleased by the gait of Romanesque and decided to disqualify the 8-year-old son of Love You.

Harness racing needs to go back to wooden bikes – yes, seriously

Hall of Fame driver Ron Pierce agrees that something must be done to take speed out of the game to attract more bettors and increase excitement.

For years, most harness tracks that I followed, including Roosevelt, Yonkers, and the Meadowlands, had a percentage of winning favorites that was around 34 per cent. The payoffs were good and it wasn't hard to find good value bets.

But as we know, the racing changed. The favorites started to win more often, and the win percentage of inside posts increased sharply. This started as soon as the sulky changed from wood to steel, in the late- '70s. As a professional handicapper, I've always taken my job seriously. For the past 25 years I've kept my own speed tables for all harness tracks.

As soon as the "modified sulky" became the bike of choice, the races went about a second faster on the half-mile tracks, and a couple of seconds faster at the Meadowlands and other two turn tracks. At the half-mile tracks, the new bikes dramatically changed the racing. Post 1 started to win at a higher rate, the outside posts started to win at a lower rate, and the percentage of favorites increased. Payoffs, in general, decreased. As the payoffs decreased, so did the betting handle.

As years went on, the sulky evolution continued. Another profound change was in 2003. This is when the first off-set bikes were introduced. The first one was the Advantage bike, which was 6 inches offset. Once the off-set bikes were the norm, leavers dominated, as did chalk. Attendance and handle continued to decline. I've corresponded with thousands of harness bettors and fans in my career, including many regulars, and several professional bettors. Many of the regular harness bettors that I know stopped betting harness races and switched to thoroughbred racing, because the payoffs were better at the flats.

Those of you've followed the sport since the wood sulky days know that there also used to be a lot more action in the races. Years ago, you saw a lot of movement in the backstretch, horses barreling three and four wide from third or fourth over, horses winning from off the pace. Now, most of the races are won by the horse on the lead, or the horse sitting second. Speed biased nights are common, as are short payoffs. At Monticello this year, favorites are winning at 50 per cent. At Northfield, favorites are winning at 47 per cent. At Harrington, favorites are winning at 53 per cent. Short payoffs are the industry norm.

Another big change in the racing, when compared to when the sport was thriving, is the post position bias. The inside posts always won more than the outside posts, but not like now. On most half-mile tracks, for instance, the outside posts, 6, 7, and 8, win at half the rate they did in the wood bikes. Most five-eighths tracks have the same problem. This is one of the main reasons why there are so many short-priced winning favorites. The bettors know that the outside posts don't win, so all of the money gets bet on inside horses. For example, a horse that would have been 5-1 from post 8 years ago, is now 35-1. And a horse that has post 1 that would have been 2-1 years ago, is now 2-5. I've interviewed a lot of harness drivers, and the drivers are well aware of how the sport's changed.

So the question becomes, what can we do to help harness racing survive?

In my opinion, the first thing you have to do is fix the product on the track. There are only two ways this is possible. Either you have to race longer races than one mile, or you have to go back to the conventional wood bikes. The problem with longer races is that harness racing fans are used to the one-mile distance. Every time a track runs a race at something other than a mile, they get complaints, particularly about the fractions. Some fans complain that they can't figure out the last quarters, or they don't know how to compare the final time at a mile and a quarter, to the final time at a mile.

The problem with the faster races, and the bikes, is it's much easier for the horse on the lead to carry its speed. In an interview, Hall of Fame driver Carmine Abbatiello said that the speed bias has taken a lot of strategy out of the game. Hall of Fame trainer Brett Pelling was recently interviewed in this publication. Pelling said that the modern bikes are hurting the racing, and he also noted that the drivers lean back which makes it harder for horses to rally from off the pace. Pelling suggested a return to a slower bike, such as the Jerrold. He also noted that in Australia they don't allow the

drivers to lean far back.

I was chatting about this subject on Facebook, when Hall of Fame driver Ron Pierce dropped in to offer his feedback. Here is what Ron Pierce had to say:

"Bob, I agree 100% with your opinion about the race bikes, you are so right on. Harness racing was definitely more exciting and unpredictable and the fastest horse did not always win the race with the wood bikes. The driver's strategy was a huge factor back before we went to the modified sulky.

"After the first trainer started using the modified sulky everyone had to get one so they could be competitive. As soon as the faster bikes were made, everyone had to get one to be competitive. Now, racing is all speed, there is not nearly as much action and very little strategy.

The horses are so much better, but the bikes have made harness racing boring. That's the biggest reason I retired when I did. Harness racing was just was not as much fun. We can only blame ourselves for letting this happen in the first place.

Hopefully, Cammie Haughton, or someone, will take a long hard look at how conventional race bikes could improve racing that much more and benefit everyone. We've got to try something."

Pierce also mentioned that at some tracks the judges don't allow the drivers to back down the pace, which contributes to less movement in the race. When the pace is slower, the outside flow has time to get into position. This is why years ago you often had a very active outside flow with a lot of movement.

Whenever I bring up this subject, some people say that I'm crazy, how can we go back? But recently, at Yonkers Raceway, the new Director of Racing, Cammie Haughton, made several key changes that resulted in a significant increase in handle. One of those changes was to get rid of the "passing lane," something that many harness writers urged the sport to drop. This was a controversial move, because every time a track makes a change, some people will complain. But the passing lane was a mistake. It made the racing less exciting because the driver that was sitting third or fourth sat in and waited for the stretch. This resulted in more single file boring races. Someone finally had the foresight and guts to make a change. Hope springs eternal.

Many years ago the NBA created the 24-second clock to get a shot off. They did this to create more action because the players were just dribbling the ball and passing it back

and fourth, which was boring. The league knew that you need action and movement.

If harness racing continues to be dominated by short priced favorites and easy wire-to-wire winners, handle will continue to decline, and, eventually most of the tracks will close. Going back to the conventional wood bikes may be a gamble worth taking.

Prince of Indiana

Just four races into this career, sophomore pacer Always A Prince is undefeated and racing impressively for trainer Bill Dailey.

The 2018 race meet at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino is just under a month old and one of the early storylines to watch this summer is a relatively green sophomore that is thus-far undefeated. Shelved as a freshman out of concern for soreness, Always A Prince has started the season a perfect four-for-four. The most recent victory for the Always A Prince gelding was a 1:51.2 triumph in the \$15,000 final of the Jerry Landess Series. It was the latest in a string of impressive miles for the Bill Dailey-trained pacer.

“We qualified him twice and he was a little sore his first start. We ended up scratching him,” Dailey said of the freshman campaign. “He had a left hind issue. We had him bone scanned and x-rayed and never found anything. It could have been a bone bruise or something. We just elected to wait on him.”

Based on his early returns, Always A Prince has been worth

the wait. Bred by Emerald Highlands Farm, the gelding is out of The Panderosa mare Glorious Princess. The dam, a sister to Rock To Glory p,2, 1:52.4s; 3, 1:50.1s; 1:49.2f (\$807,323) and Bound For Glory p,2, 1:55.3; 3, 1:52s (\$317,709), had produced two winners in her first three foals when Dailey plucked the then-colt from the 2016 Buckeye Classic Yearling Sale for a price of \$30,000. The owner and trainer didn't have to look far for partners on the pacer, reaching out to his old friends Carl and Melanie Atley.

“I went to school with Carl. He and I have known each other since we were kids,” said Dailey. “We started buying a few horses together a few years ago and this is one of them.”

Atley is a farmer by trade, growing 7,500 acres of corn and soybeans each year in Xenia, Ohio. He and his wife owned harness horses in the past, but when Ohio's racing fortunes headed south, he left the business. Once slots arrived, he returned to racing, and the last few seasons have produced incredible results. Atley was involved in the partnership that owned 2016 Breeders Crown Mare Pace champion Lady Shadow. He also teamed with Dailey to capture a pair of Ohio Sires Stakes championships that same year with

freshman pacing colt Scotch McEwan and sophomore pacing filly My Tweed Heart. Always A Prince is one of 31 horses the Atleys own solely or in partnership with others.

“It kind of added up pretty quick. I’ve been in it for about three years or four years,” Atley said with a laugh. “We’ve been very, very fortunate.”

With Always A Prince, the partnership may have their next champion in the making. After qualifying at Miami Valley in late March, where he romped by 15 lengths in a time of 1:56.2, the sophomore shipped to Hoosier Park to make his debut. Racing over the Anderson, IN oval for the first time, Trace Tetrick guided Always A Prince to a 1:52.4 score. Since that first start, the gelding has competed in the Landess Series exclusively. In the first leg, he won by more than four lengths with a 1:52.3 clocking in the wire-to-wire performance. Always A Prince followed that with another dominant effort, this time stopping the clock in 1:51.1. Friday night, April 27, he completed the Landess Series sweep, this time capturing the event in a time one-fifth of a second off his best one week earlier.

“He seems like a very nice colt. He’s very professional; he does all the right things and has a great attitude. He acts like an old horse in a young horse’s body,” Tetrick said of the 3-year-old. “He’s done all the hard work so far and went some big miles, pacing all the way to the wire.”

Training down this winter, Dailey felt he had a horse capable of big things. In only four starts, Always A Prince has shown his ability and reinforced his trainer’s assessment. As some of Indiana’s top freshman colts from 2017 begin to return to the track as sophomores, the question is where this relatively inexperienced speedster fits into the division. In late May as Indiana Sires Stakes get underway that question will be answered.

“I knew I had a nice colt. I don’t know how nice, and I still don’t. But I knew he was kind of a high-end horse. He’s real intelligent, big-gaited, and willing to do the work. I’ve been real high on him all winter,” Dailey said. “I think he’s a very versatile colt. I think he’ll race any way right now. He certainly trained that way. You never know until you do it. He’s a real professional colt for as green as he is. I’m pretty sure he’s going to be competitive in there (sires stakes). He’s going to have to pace in 1:50 pretty quickly.”

One of the top horses coming back from last season is Always Bet De Grey, another son of Always A Virgin bred and owned by Emerald Highlands Farm. The colt captured last year’s \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final for trainer Brian Brown. Tetrick was in the bike for that victory, and more

recently steered the reigning champion to a 1:51.2 qualifying win Saturday morning (April 28) at Hoosier Park. The track’s leading driver feels Always A Prince is on par with the best young Indiana-sired pacers from last season.

“I think he’s a top-tier colt just because of how handy he is,” Tetrick said. “He could be one of the better ones, it’s hard to say just yet until they all match up. At this point he’s done everything we’ve asked him to do and he’s done it in the correct manner.”

With \$18,000 on his card this season, Always A Prince may not have earned back his purchase price yet, but he stands to do that, and more. With a little racing luck, this prince could become king of Indiana’s three-year-old division. For Atley, having another horse of this caliber is exciting, and something he savors.

“I’m pleased to death. Bill’s done an excellent job getting him ready and Trace has done a heck of a job driving him,” he said. “Having one this nice, they are few and far between.”

Scarlet & Gray produces track and season's records Friday at Miami Valley

A pair of \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray invitationals, featuring Buckeye-bred sophomore filly trotters and pacers, both produced Miami Valley Raceway track records – as well as national season's marks.

Looking For Zelda (Tony Hall) captured the trotting division in 1:55.2, topping Red Storm (Aaron Merriman) by three parts of a length with Sesame (Chris Page) another half-length behind. Hall was content to get away fifth with the winner of \$228,675 at two as the daughter of **Break The Bank K** was making her initial 2018 start off two winning qualifiers. Trainer Norm Parker had Looking For Zelda ready to roll, though and Hall drove her confidently.

After a :28.2 opening panel posted by Non Smoker (Dan Noble), Hall vacated the pylons just prior to the :57.2 half and moved up in first-over position to second by the 1:26.3 third timing station. A stride-for-stride showdown ensued for most of the final quarter until Looking For Zelda edged ahead in the final 50 yards.

"She's a nice one," said a jubilant Parker. "She won all four legs of the Ohio Sires Stakes last year before finishing second in the final. She won Grand Circuit stakes at Harrahs and The Red Mile and raced in the Breeders Crown at two, so we think a lot of her. I'm happy for Mr. Key (owner Robert J. Key)."

The \$50,000 filly pace went to Baron Remy (Chris Page) in a 1:52 track record, which is also the fastest mile by a sophomore filly pacer on a five-eighths mile track thus far in 2018. Page executed a quarter move from third to the lead just past the opening panel and held off all challengers to win by 2-3/4 lengths.

Hackett Memorial winner Up Front Flor Ida (Kayne Kauffman) enjoyed a pocket trip throughout, but could do no better than second. Grant Me This (Ronnie Wrenn Jr.) rallied in the stretch to grab the show dough.

"Pretty darn nice filly," Page said in the winner's circle. "Ronnie (Burke) always has them ready so I was sure she would put in a big effort and she did."

Silva, Purnel and Libby, Karr and Weaver Brussemi are all partners on the daughter of **Yankee Cruiser** with Burke Racing Stable.

It is expected that both Scarlet & Gray winners will be back at Miami Valley next Friday night (May 4) when the first leg of the 2018 Ohio Sires Stakes program kicks off with the 3-year-old fillies action.

Down Under wonders on display

There were three New Zealand-bred mares in last Saturday's \$373,000 Matchmaker final and they finished 1-2-3. All three are out of Live Or Die mares!

The winner, Shartin N, won three of her four Matchmaker legs and is now 10 8-1-0 for the year. The runnerup, Sell A Bit N, won two of her four legs and is now 11 5-2-1 for 2018 (And past \$750,000 lifetime). The third-place finisher, Motu Moonbeam N, won one leg and is now 14 3-3-3 for the season.

Bagdarin-Nomorenuiki and Top Tart – in order – are the three mares by Live or Die, a top performer in the mid-1990s for Val D'Or Farms.

Kiwi Legend

Bit Of A Legend N, the 2016 Levy winner, surged past \$2 million lifetime (\$2,124,356) with his runnerup finish to Keystone Velocity in the \$529,000 Levy final. He was the lone New Zealand representative in the field. Lifetime, the overachiever is 125 43-29-11-meaning that 57.6 per cent of the time he's been first or second. Rare as can be to see a \$2 million career earning pacer with a lifetime mark taken on the half-mile track at Saratoga (1:50.3).

Keying in on Velocity

The two horses that won back-to-back Levy finals are both still active – Foiled Again, the 2009 and 2010 winner and this year's champ, Keystone Velocity, who also won in 2017 en route to the Older Pacer of the Year Award.

Keystone Velocity has now won the last three \$500,000 or higher pots in the industry for the Older Pacing set – the Levy this year and last and the \$500,000 Ben Franklin at Pocono in 2017 – for trainer and part-owner Rene Allard.

And he has done his most significant damage at ages 9 and 10. He has 115 career starts, but in just those three \$500,000+ races from last year and this, he won \$780,500, an average of \$260,167 for each in the trio.

In his other 113 career tries, he's won \$863,913, for an average of \$7,645 per start.

This and that....

- April 30 marks the 15th anniversary of Brian Sears' arrival to the Meadowlands. He came in the door in 2003 with \$25 million in career earnings (He now closing in on \$190 million) and just as quickly had the 2003 Meadowlands Pace favorite and was on his way to a Hall Of Fame career.

- David Miller is back. The leading money-winner among active drivers first cracked the top five at the Meadowlands in 1999 in his debut season. He hit the top three for the initial time in 2001-2002 finishing third each time-and then hit paydirt in 2003 with his Triple Crown win with No Pan Intended, copping his very fist Big M title.

- It's the end of April, which means remembering a time when the Berrys Creek took some of the ink, especially in 1993-1994-1995 when John Campbell not only won it three straight times for three different trainers, but he posted the three fastest ever Berrys Creeks with:

1993 Vine Street 1:50.2 for Bob McIntosh

1994 Cams Card Shark 1:51 for Bill Robinson

1995 No Standing Around 1:51 for Joe Holloway

- A decade ago, Yannick Gingras within a 6 day span, got the drive on Foiled Again for the very first time (July 13, 2008), and six days later was in the Meadowlands Pace for the ages – the Art Official/Somebeachsomewhere classic.

- When is 3-for-30 not bad? When your name is Armbro Dallas and that was your record for the year entering the 1986 Breeders Crown in California against Forrest Skipper less than a year after he defeated both Forrest Skipper and Nihilator at Garden State Park. How about the 3-for-30 record (30 3-8-4 \$182,987) that Zoot Suit posted in his sophomore season (1976), but Norman Woolworth recommended he go stand stud in Sweden and he became the leading sire there for six straight seasons?

- Quick – who was the only driver to pilot Marion Marauder to victory at age two. Roger Mayotte \$2.30 won with the future trotting Triple Crown winner at Woodbine on Oct. 1, 2015.

Late April foals of note

April 24, 2007 – Sportswriter, the winner of both the Metro and the NA Cup.

April 25, 1994 – Western Dreamer. The 1997 pacing Triple Crown winner, the first in 14 years to do so at that time, had a wonderful career and is now at Kentucky Horse Park.

April 26, 1976 – Hot Hitter. When he banked better than \$800,000 in 1979, he became the first horse in harness history to surpass the \$750,000 mark in a single season.

April 27, 1994 – Yankee Glide. He won the Peter Haughton at 2, but wasn't up to the highlight-reel year of Malabar Man in 1997 at 3. As a stallion, he's been special and remains the last stallion (trotter or pacer) to go 1-2 in the HOY ballot with progeny – 2006 Glidemaster and Passionate Glide

April 28, 1984 – Call For Rain. Clint Galbraith's second best horse – sired by the second best horse of 1980, Storm Damage – was a two-time Breeders Crown winner.

April 29, 2007 – Rock N Roll Heaven. Though timed twice in sub-1:50 at 2, the colt from the first crop of 2005 HOY

Rockroll Hanover was a full-fledged star at 3, nailing down his last 10 races. He is the only colt to win \$2 million in a single season without capturing a million-dollar race (Wiggle It Jiggleit, a gelding, also did it).

April 30, 1983 – Laughs. Thought of mostly as a half-mile specialist, he 'laughed' off that notion in 1986 winning the Meadowlands Pace at 10-1-with Buddy Gilmour driving for Chuck Sylvester.

While driving my tech guru to the Cleveland Art Museum, his cell phone buzzed. I eavesdropped as he referred to the caller as both Beverly and sweetie and suggested they meet at Rodin's Statue of "The Thinker." The call gave me a chance to stick my nose into his business.

"Is this mysterious Beverley a rendezvous, a rekindling of an old fame, or a tryst? If I get a glimpse of this woman will I be sworn to silence?"

"Trey, you couldn't be silenced with chloroform."

"How do you know I won't take a picture of Beverley on your arm and threaten to send it to her husband or the faux news unless one of your lawyers pays a Trumpian silence fee?"

He gave me an eye roll and said, "Beverley is my niece." Then he surprised me, "Do you know a place we could stop for a beer on the way home?"

"I know every place and haven't refused a free beer since the Iraq invasion. We can try the Bad News Bar. The joint looks like a clone of the Cheers TV set and they serve nachos in an upside down plastic baseball helmet. I'm pretty sure my restraining order has expired."

"Restraining order?"

"Nah, just kidding. Well, there was an incident with darts, Tequila, challenges, the usual suspects."

He said, "You know the Art Museum is free, you can wander around and kill a few hours."

"Me, in an Art Museum? Please, I have a reputation to hold down."

Three hours later, we were in the friendly confines of the Bad News. Neither of us enjoyed small talk, so like a hungry bloodhound I got back on the trail and asked, "So what else do you have for me on harness racing, horse racing and gambling to kick around?"

He said, "I keep going back to the SCOTUS ruling and PASPA."

I held up my index finger and bowed my head. I spoke slowly and smugly, "The Supreme Court of the United States, and the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act."

He gave three quick claps, "Very impressive."

"Not really, I wrote the PAPSA thing on the bottom of my Nike Cross-trainer. See"

I showed him the bottom of my shoe.

He shook his head, grinned and said, "Any day now, the PASPA ruling is going to set off a chain reaction. Horse racing will be in the middle of a barrage of advertising and repositioning."

I said, "If, if, if the ruling opens the online sports gambling doors."

"The Supreme Court will rule in favor of New Jersey. The doors will open to states allowing sports gambling, bet on it. Actually, I discovered that you can bet on the court decision on offshore sites; I looked at a site located in San Jose, Costa Rica. The odds have moved up to 85-15 that New Jersey will win the case. Not only can you wager on the decision, you can wager on the month they will rule. May is the favorite. The prediction is 6 for New Jersey and 3 against."

“How in the hell would a betting outfit set those lines?”

“The same way I did. Read the complete transcript of the oral arguments that took place last December, all 85 pages. Read legal precedents, read previous rulings from these judges, and talked with veteran court watchers.”

“You read Supreme Court transcripts? That’s serious reading dude. Don’t you, like, own Netflix?”

“Following the Supreme Court is interesting, like watching a fistfight with words. Each case is sort of like a horse race; you read the past performances, watch the warmups and workouts and try to predict the winner.”

I shook my head, “This stuff we are talking about, well, the stuff you are telling me about, regular horse racing fans and players like me, 90 per cent don’t have a clue that a gambling tidal wave is around the corner. Before you stepped into my car, I thought PASPA was a brand of beer.”

“That’s true, shifts sneak up on people. Plus, regular fans, even racetracks, react. They don’t shape events. Horseracing is in a very tricky position. The legal status quo carves out horse racing and gives you an island where gambling is legal. When that status quo changes, if anybody can bet on any sport, we have a new ballgame for horseracing.”

“Suppose I play the PAPSA longshot, what if New Jersey loses?”

“Things remain the same for horse racing, a slow slide. Sports wagering remains illegal in 49 states, despite the open secret that wagering goes on at a variety of offshore sportsbooks, and hundreds of billions of dollars are not taxed.”

“Plus, even sketchy guys like yours truly, are suspicious about wagering offshore. I get tempted, but gambling offshore sort of feels un-American, so I stick to the horses and harness racing because they are the only legal game in town.”

“Trey, in my opinion, the comment you just made about “un-American” is why SCOTUS shocked everyone by taking this case in the first place. The idea that PASPA treats states differently appears to bother a few of the Supremes. Why should Nevada sports betting be allowed and other states are prohibited?”

“Let’s get back to the question I keep asking and you keep ducking. If the gambling doors open, is this good or bad for horse racing?”

He sighed, “We have thousands of people in our organization who are working at different turning points in hundreds of business cycles. Some of our people work on what we view a short-term, a couple of years, others work on projects 10 years out. The sports gambling business answer you want depends on time.”

“That’s not an answer.”

He sighed, “Okay, my early prediction on how PAPSA will affect harness racing, horse racing, and even casinos is a positive for the short term.”

“Why?”

“The early wagering will be located at existing bricks and mortar sites. Gamblers will show up on the premises. Racetracks will have an opportunity, because racetracks, especially ones with casinos, have the infrastructure to take advantage of the first wave of sports gambling. Racetracks will see plenty of new traffic.”

“Got to disagree with you here, Captain Silicon. Horse racing has been down that road with casinos and more gamblers went out the door than in the door. Just because people show up does not get them hooked on horses or racing.”

“True, but think about this, sports gamblers are a completely different customer base than slot machine players. People who drop in to make a wager of \$50 on a basketball game or on a golfer is a ‘possible get’ for horse racing. This type of person is more of a thinker, more of a sports fan and probably younger.”

“So you see a window for racetracks?”

“I believe you will have a short window, but only short-term, because bricks and mortar do not last, the next step in the process will find gamblers betting off the premises and on their phones.”

“If you had a meeting back in the Valley and you were trying to help our little sport, what would you tell your short term-team members if you sent them to racetracks in a PASPA free-world?”

“Work like you never worked before to filter sports gamblers to your doorstep. Drive them to the racing side, sweep them off their feet, give them products and races they like, if you had our resources, this little window would be for profit, rather to give energy and pluck out a few new. make the hay while you can and keep planting seeds for the future.”

“And long term?”

“That is a very different story, a strange story that very few involved in you sport have considered, a story where my folks may enter the scene. The Federal story, with a twist.”

“Is that story going to be happy or sad for racing? Does it have those loopy acronyms? Will I need another shoe to write things down?”

“Trey, it will be a cliffhanger for horse racing. Stay tuned.”

Humboldt “The Horse” wins for #HumboldtStrong

Funds have been pouring in from all over the World after the tragic Humboldt Broncos bus crash and Saturday evening a racehorse did his part to help the cause.

Humboldt, a four-year-old gelding, paced to victory in Saturday’s \$20,000 fourth-race at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The bay gelding is owned by Brad Grant of Milton, ON, who earlier this month graciously offered to donate the pacer’s earnings from this month to the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League’s (SJHL) Player Assistance Program.

“I know Bill Chow from the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League and I’m involved with the Ontario Hockey Association and then I have a horse named Humboldt,” Grant said earlier this month. “I thought what a great connection and maybe we can help use it to generate some funds for the program Bill and his group have put in,”

Grant, who is chairman of the Ontario Hockey Association, purchased the pacer back in January at a sale in New Jersey. The bay gelding was named Humboldt by his previous owner prior to his first-career race in June 2016.

“I’m a firm believer in health and well-being,” Grant said. “I thought it was quite ironic with me being involved in hockey, knowing the people and owning this horse, so I thought why not see if we can do it this way and get some other people on board and do some more good.”

Grant is one of North American harness racing’s top owners and the current leading owner at Woodbine.

Humboldt has now made two starts since Grant’s pledge. The bay gelding finished second on April 21, earning \$5,000. His win Saturday nets an additional \$10,000 towards the donation.

Ariana G, Hannelore Hanover, Atlanta, Stay Hungry and more solid in Big M qualifiers

Top trotting mares Ariana G and Hannelore Hanover – both driven by Yannick Gingras – drew a lot of attention at Saturday morning qualifiers at the Meadowlands.

Ariana G was up first in race six and looked fantastic in her first appearance of the season. Gingras put her on the lead and she strolled along comfortably right through the end of the 1:53.3 mile five in front with an effortless :27.1 final quarter. **Celebrity Ruth** (Trond Smedshammer), certainly no slouch on her own, was a willing second. Jimmy Takter trains Ariana G for Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

Hannelore Hanover came up next in her second go of the season and she made a very strong case to keep her driver. Gingras moved the champion mare to the front after **Yes Mickey** (Svanstedt) took the field by the quarter in :28.1, cut comfortable middle fractions then let her trot home in :27.1 ending the mile in 1:52.2 on her own, looking fabulous. **Broadway Donna** (Dave Miller) actually closed ground into that fast final stanza to get up for second, though no threat to the winner. **Lagerfeld** (Jim Marohn, Jr) rallied for third while Yes Mickey gave way to fourth.

The day began with Ken Jacobs' talented sophomore Chapter Seven filly **Seven Karats** (Scott Zeron) winning again, this time leading all the way through even fractions for the 1:54.3 / :29.1 win off by a few on her own. Linda Toscano is the trainer. **I'mwhygodmadegirls** (Gingras) was a solid second.

Zeron employed similar tactics in race 2 with another good Chapter Seven filly, his dad Rick's **Atlanta**. Scott got them in line behind him through even numbers then drew off through a 27.1 end to the 1:54 mile in verrrrrry impressive fashion. Rick trains for his own interest along with partners Holland Racing, HA Taylor and Brad Grant. **Vivacious Allie** (Svanstedt) and **Sevenbuyeleven** (Tim Tetrick) held their respective spots in second and third in a race where there was no passing.

Six Pack took a measured 1:54 win, closing out with a :26 and change final quarter for Svanstedt. He tracked Seven Iron (Tetrick) all the way then forged by with something in reserve. **Seven Iron** held grudgingly and **Fashionwoodchopper** (Dave Miller) flew home into the fast last quarter with no urging and no trotting hoppers. Svanstedt trains and owns the winner, a son of Muscle Mass, with Little E, LLC, Stall Kalmar and Lars Berg.

Top WEG driver Doug McNair was in to drive the morning and he nudged **Missile Hill** past Brothers In Arms (Jimmy Takter) right on the wire to get a 1:54.3 / :28.2 win. **Dawson Springs** was an even third in his first go of the year for Dave Miller and **Sonofamillonaire** (Svandstedt) finished fourth after cutting the mile. Brad Grant owns and Tony Alagna trains the winner.

Race 5 winner **Helpisontheway** (Tetrick) was originally programmed as #1 in race 4 but moved and left from post 9 in the next race. He landed in third as **Godspell Hall** (Gingras) led through unhurried fractions then was moving and drew clear when that rival went off stride at the $\frac{3}{4}$ pole. Helpisontheway was well in hand to Tetrick through a 27 flat end to a 1:54.2 mile. **Zephyr Kronos** (Takter) the enigmatic son of European star Ready Cash looked comfortable and closed considerable ground into the fast last quarter to get up for second. Linda Toscano trains the winner, another by her Horse of the Year sire Chapter Seven and owns the colt as Camelot Stable in partnership with The Bays Stable.

Race 8 saw the start of the pacing races and O'Brien Award-winning freshman of last season **Stay Hungry** made his 2018 debut from the rail with McNair driving for Alagna. McNair sat a pocket as **Pedro Hanover** (D. Miller) set an honest pace, emerged as they turned into the stretch and rolled right by the leader to win in 1:50.4 / :27.1 under no urging. **Babes Dig Me** (Brett Miller) rallied well late and Pedro hung in there for minor spoils. Brad Grant and Irwin Samelman own the winner, a son of Somebeachsomewhere.

There were a bunch of top sophs in the ninth and **Hayden Hanover** (Andy Miller) came away the winner in 1:52.2 / :26.1. Andy put the SBSW colt on the lead early in :29 – :58 when **American History** (Gingras) came calling, not content with those dawdling numbers. That one led into the stretch and gave way grudgingly as Hayden rallied by. **Sporting Chance** (McNair) was a solid third while the Dan Patch award winning top freshman pacer of 2017, **Lost In Time** (Zeron), was fourth after a conservative trip. Julie Miller trains the winner for Pinske Stables and Jim Simpson.

Another of trainer Alagna's seemingly endless group of sophomore pacing colts, **Captain Deo** is emerging as a top talent. He won back this morning in 1:51.2 closing into a :26.2 final quarter for Brett Miller, fighting past a stubborn **No Easy Day** (Gingras) and **Twin B Tuffenuff** for the score. He's a SBSW from the great race mare Worldly Beauty racing for Alagna Racing, Joe Sbrocco, In The Gym Partners and Captain Deo Partners.

Python Blue Chip (Gingras) was a winner in the 11th,

converting a perfect trip into a 1:53.3 / :26.3 score. **Hurrikane Shorty** (Jim Marohn, Jr) cut the mile and held second over closers inside and out. Ron Burke trains the winner, the owners listed are Ake Svanstedt, Blue Chip Bloodstock and Stable 45.

Kissin In The Sand took the exciting 12th race, sitting a pocket to Rainbow Room (D. Miller) then finding a seam up the inside to edge by the leader and hold off the closing **Youaremycandygirl** (Gingras) in a :26.3 end to the 1:52.1 mile. This match-up of the three top freshman pacing fillies of last season resulted in them finishing right across the track.

Filibuster Hanover was absolutely vicious in the last, following stablemate Rock N Tony through swift fractions then ripping from the pocket and driving off into the sunset with a 25.3 end to a 1:49.3 mile. It was his second go of the season and looks like trouble for potential foes in next week's Graduate Series opener. **Rock N Tony** held up for second while the great mare **Pure Country** (Mark MacDonald) was a solid third in her seasonal debut.

The Pepsi North America Cup is just seven-weeks away and several eligible three-year-old pacers took to the track Friday morning.

Blake MacIntosh trainee **Courtly Choice** not only posted the co-fastest mile of the morning (1:53.2), but also the fastest final-quarter of the day (:26) in his first appearance of the season.

The son of Art Major and Pepsi North America Cup eligible went third to first in the second-quarter and then proceeded to pace a :54.1 back-half to win by 15 lengths.

James MacDonald steered Courtly Choice to victory.

Owned by Hutt Racing Stable, MacIntosh, Touch Stone Farms and Daniel Plouffe, Courtly Choice won two of 12

starts during his rookie season, including the \$50,000 New York Sires Stakes Consolation.

The other 1:53.2 mile of the day came from Pepsi North America Cup eligible Ghost Dance.

A son of American Ideal, **Ghost Dance** and driver Mike Saftic converted off a two-hole trip by pacing home in :27.3 for a four-length victory. The Eric Adams trainee was making his second qualifying appearance of the season after winning two of five starts last season.

Ghost Dance, who won a New York Sires Stakes division last season, is a Millar Farms homebred.

Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Final champion **Western Passage** finished 6 ½ lengths back in third. The Casie Coleman trainee was nine-lengths back of the lead turning for home and did make up a few lengths by pacing a :27.2 kicker in his season debut.

The other Pepsi North America Cup eligible in Ghost Dance's qualifier was **Sports Legend**. The Richard Moreau trainee finished fifth and paced his mile in 1:57.1 (final quarter :28).

Sophomore pacing colt **Jimmy Freight** isn't eligible to the NA Cup, but the son of Sportswriter should be a big player in the OSS this season.

Jimmy Freight was a coast-to-coast winner Friday morning in 1:54. The Richard Moreau trainee was driven to victory by Louis Philippe Roy and paced a :26.2 final-quarter to secure the victory.

Owned by Adriano Sorella, Jimmy Freight won seven of 12 starts last season and banked \$186,552.

Pepsi North America Cup eligible **Summer Travel** paced a :26.1 kicker to finish just under two-lengths back of Jimmy Freight. Friday's qualifier was the first of the season for the speedy Coleman trainee.

Mark Steacy trainee **Hudson Phil** finished third in the same qualifier. The son of Shanghai Phil is eligible to the NA Cup and was charted with a :26.4 closer to finish off a 1:54.4 mile.

Sophomore pacing fillies also had their chance to shine on Friday morning.

MacIntosh trainee **Ubettergo Go** turned some heads with a 1:54.3 victory. The Art Major filly was turning in her first line of the season and converted off a two-hole trip from driver James MacDonald to power by Alexis Faith for a three-length score.

Ubettergo Go won three of eight starts last season, with all

eight starts coming in New York Sires Stakes competition. She is owned by MacIntosh, Tony Basile, Reginald Petitpas and Ozzie MacKay.

Alexis Faith, who was last year's New York Sires Stakes champion, had to settle for second after cutting the mile. The Coleman trainee paced her mile in 1:55.1 with a :27.1 final-quarter for driver Doug McNair.

Ciaran Morrison trainee **Firestorm**, who finished fourth in last year's Breeders Crown, was third (1:55.3) in the same qualifier.

Coleman trained pacing filly **Play The Bell** was also a winner in her season debut Friday.

Last season's Battle Of The Belles winner made a third-quarter move from fourth up to confront the leader and ultimately went on to win by a length in 1:55.3 (final-quarter :27.3).

Play The Bell was driven by Bob McClure. The daughter of Shadow Play won three of 11 last season and banked \$192,761 for owners West Wins Stable, Mac Nichol and Calhoun Racing Limited.

Shifting to the older horses, 10-year-old trotter **Slip Into Glide** was victorious Friday in 1:56.1. The 30-time winner and earner of over \$625,000 was making his first appearance since May 2016.

Slip Into Glide is now trained by Dave Menary and was steered to victory by Jody Jamieson.

\$1.8 million in purses for new Great Northeast Open Series

The fastest of the northeastern U.S.'s older performers will have approximately \$1,800,000 of weekly competition available to them in the May through September period, as the Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association (PHHA), in conjunction with The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono (Pocono) and Harrah's Philadelphia (Philly), introduces the Great Northeast Open Series for quality male pacers and trotters and fast-class mare pacers.

The series will provide racing opportunities for these three classes every week, going for \$30,000. The fast-class pacers will compete at either Pocono or Philly (Saturdays at Pocono, Sundays at Philly), with the trotters and mare pacers forming a doubleheader at the other track on Sundays. An exception comes during opening week, on Kentucky Derby Saturday (May 5), when the \$50,000 Van Rose Memorial Invitational at Pocono starts that division's series action that Saturday night, and the trotters and mares will tussle on a special Saturday afternoon card at Philly. All the races at Pocono are night events, and all the Philly action during the afternoon.

There will be as well \$30,000 series races on Sunday, May 27, the "Super Sunday" Invitational card at Philly, and for the open pacers on June 23 (Pocono) and July 1 (Philly), during the period when Pocono features its Sun Stakes Saturday eliminations and finals, which includes the Franklin Pace for older pacers. (The May 27 Super Sunday races at Philly count for points in the series; the Franklin races do not.)

Horses will earn points on a 50-25-12-8-5-4-3-2-1 (9th onward) finish, with 25 points awarded for each start to encourage continuous competition in the Great Northeast Series. The top pointearners will be eligible for their respective \$100,000 Great Northeast finals, which will be held at Pocono on Sunday, September 2, at a distance of 1¼

miles (providing a division fills at least six legs). September 2 is also the night of the \$1,000,000+ Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championships for three-year-olds, also to be held at Pocono, which should make that Labor Day Weekend night of racing one of the best in all of harness racing.

There will be no nominating or starting fees for the Great Northeast Series. The normal declaration days are: at Pocono, Monday for Saturday events and Tuesday for Sunday; at Philly, Wednesday for Sunday (but always check with the racing offices in case of a holiday rearrangement). Scratch time is usually the day following. Trainers and owners will be limited to one starter per event in the weekly legs, and two entrants in the Finals. A minimum of seven entrants will be required to race a weekly event.

May 15 deadline to nominate yearlings to NJSS, NJ stakes

Important payments are due Tuesday, May 15 to make and keep horses eligible to the New Jersey Sire Stakes Program and the Standardbred Development Fund.

Nominations are due for foals of 2017 that are yearlings in 2018. All horses nominated must be registered with the U. S. Trotting Association (USTA), Canadian Standardbred Horse Society (CSHS) or another appropriate breed registry.

The fee is \$50 for the NJSS Premier Division if a copy of the yearling's registration certificate accompanies the nomination. Without a copy of the certificate, the fee is \$75.

It is important to note that the yearling nomination fee is \$100 if the foal being nominated is the result of the interstate transport of a registered New Jersey stallion's semen to a mare outside the state of New Jersey, provided a copy of the certificate accompanies the fee. Without the certificate, the interstate semen transport nomination fee is \$125.

Yearling nominations are also due for the New Jersey Standardbred Development Fund for horses by non-New Jersey based stallions whose dams have been previously registered for the program. The fee is \$50 for the NJSD if a copy of the yearling's registration certificate accompanies the nomination. Without a copy of the certificate, the fee is \$75. Yearlings by sires located in New Jersey do not have to pay a separate fee as nomination to the Sire Stakes automatically results in nomination to the SDF program.

All pacing yearlings eligible to either the NJSS Premier Division or the Standardbred Development Fund are also eligible to be nominated to the Renaissance Pace. The Renaissance Pace nomination fee, which is also due May 15, is an additional \$25 for the open division and \$15 for the filly division.

RE: Towers and the 5 per cent marketing plan

With all due respect to Mr. Towers ([full story here](#)) he, in my opinion, has not addressed the fundamental issues with marketing and harness racing. There are several. First, you must understand that regardless of what the outside world thinks and what common sense would dictate: If the patient neither wants treatment or believes they are sick, then no amount of pushing, prodding or common sense will convince them otherwise. Secondly, the harness racing world with few exceptions rejects change and it is impossible to drive a square peg in a round hole. I fear that the requisite changes needed will not begin until there is turnover at the management levels within the various major tracks, corporations and entities or transparency clarifies all financial motives.

To date, the money still continues into the coffers and it will be "Business as Usual" until such a time the CFO raises the red flag at the corporate level. Because the majority of the racetrack bureaucracies refute outside interference, the end game could be to allow the tracks to shutter. If the racinos across this country and Canada have a net profit margin of 5-6 per cent from racing revenues compared to 25

per cent from casino revenues, a Harvard degree is not required to understand the dynamics and anticipate the changes.

My guess is that if we were to use Yonkers as an example and they were to roll-out their business model for us to see, I'm guessing their five (5) year forecast or perhaps the ten (10) year version would have the doors shutting on the track and an expansion in the casino end because, after all, they have still got their casino license.

In business, it is impossible to understand the moves and motives without a clear understanding of the dynamics.

amateur races provide an opportunity for a nice payout. There are some amateur drivers who are better than others and if you can pair them with a live horse the payout potential is far above what a payout would be on a Levy final. It's all about potential return. Betting short-priced, stakes-quality races just does not provide the return to get the blood going even in exotics. The second obvious reason is just the average win price on a half-mile track is below what it is on a mile track. A horse that draws the 6-7-8 hole at a half-mile is at a large disadvantage. Those same posts on a mile track and less so which spreads out the odds accordingly.

No doubt there are differences between our races and pros (no give and go, no holes in the first turn, unpredictable happenings, horses getting “back-doored” at the start, everyone drives like every race is the Hambletonian). I could

go on.

We acknowledge that driving in an amateur race is much different than a pro race and that there is a big difference between the drivers in our club and professional drivers.

That said, it is not an accident that this has been successful. If bettors didn't like our product we would not be racing at the Meadowlands.

What creates our handle is the unpredictability of our races. A 3-5 shot in an amateur race is a much different bet than in a pro race.

We are on the card weekly because the bettors have spoken with their money and put us there. If we were handling \$60,000 per race I do not think we'd be lucky enough to get to race at the Meadowlands every week. I believe that our record handle on a race is about \$295,000.
