Influx of Canadian drivers hoping for success at the Big M

Tonight, James MacDonald joins fellow Canadian Bob McClure and Doug McNair at the Meadowlands.

This week, The Big M could stand for MacDonald, McClure, McNair and Mojitos.

Driver James MacDonald is making his Meadowlands' season debut tonight (April 30), joining Canadian countrymen Bob McClure, who arrived two weeks ago, and Doug McNair, who flew in last week.

MacDonald is excited to finally be back racing having last competed at Woodbine Mohawk Park on April 2, the last night of racing before the current COVID-19 related shutdown.

"The more you race, the sharper you are and it's a good opportunity to go down there and learn," said MacDonald. "It's good experience to race against everyone down there. It's such a stacked driver colony. It'll be cool just to line up behind the gate with everyone down there and try and do my best.

"We would want to go race anywhere just to race instead of what we've got going on here and just try and make a little bit of money. Unfortunately, it's just the norm for everyone in Canada right now. If you're a horse driver there's not much for you up here. It could always be worse but it isn't ideal, that's for sure."

MacDonald, whose last drive at The Meadowlands was in

2016, reached out to a couple of Canadian trainers, such as Carmen Auciello and Blake MacIntosh, prior to coming south, to see what his prospects might be.

"I've got four of five down here that [James] was driving back home pretty well every week and some of my better ones like Buck Dancer Kickupyaheels N and Nothing But Muscle, just to name a few," said Auciello. "James is always the first one to offer in the mornings to come help me train at Mohawk or qualify or school and he puts the work in, so he deserves the loyalty in return."

Even though MacIntosh has his go-to drivers at The Meadowlands, he will keep both MacDonald and McNair in mind, especially for his Ontario Sire Stakes horses.

"When I can get them a shot, I'll give them a shot and let them drive," said MacIntosh. "Dougie's driving one for me at [Harrah's Philadelphia] and when James comes down, he'll for sure get drives from me. They'll pick up drives, but it's not going to be easy for them right off the get-go, and I'll try and help them out as much as I can."

Driver James MacDonald said of temporarily driving at the Meadowlands, "It's such a stacked driver colony. It'll be cool just to line up behind the gate with everyone down there and try and do my best."

McNair, who last raced at The Meadowlands in 2018, is fortunate that his dad, Gregg, sent some horses down, so at least he has a good starting point.

"It's like anything, you've got to know people to get your name down on the sheet," said Doug. "There are so many good drivers, I'm not expecting to come down here and be driving in every race and taking people's drives. I'm just here for a month or so until we get back going."

McNair drove in 13 Big M races last weekend and got his first seasonal win at the mile oval. He is down on 15 this weekend, including three for Auciello.

"What's going to be nice with Dougie and James down here is that I think they will show some loyalty to me. Already, I've listed Dougie on quite a few," said Auciello. "And I'm going to show some loyalty to them and hopefully we can all have a bit of luck."

For McClure, it was an easy decision to compete in the States since it was the Determination Stable asking him to do so.

"They have a situation where they have some Grand Circuit horses that can't be a month behind everybody when we start back up, if we start back up," said McClure. "So, they had to make the tough decision to go south and when they made that decision, they asked me to come and it was an easy decision to oblige. If Determination Stable hadn't left, I wouldn't have left, either. Obviously, if you're going to travel stateside to drive racehorses you've got to have some power behind you. It's not as easy as picking up, going to a track and

saying I'm here to drive. You have to have somebody that's willing to list you."

McClure, unlike MacDonald and McNair, will be racking up the frequent flyer miles heading home to Canada on his off days. But he'll fly back whenever needed as he did last Friday, getting his first Big M win this season in three starts with Mycrownmykingdom. The 3-year-old trotting colt is one of the reasons Determination came to town.

"[We're here now] because [Mycrownmykingdom] was ready to race and he needed to race," said trainer Luc Blais of Determination Stable. "We staked him everywhere and he doesn't have too much experience so he needs experience. And I have a few horses that need to race if you want to be ready for the stakes races. We plan to stay here for the summer. I think we have a big month in July here and we need to get ready for that."

The fortunate situation for Auciello, Blais and MacIntosh is that they have established stables in the U.S., so sending down more horses is not as difficult for them as it is for others.

"I'm lucky, I can keep 25 down here, that's about all I have room for," said Auciello. "But a lot of people aren't as lucky as me and aren't in that situation. So, if you have a small stable with five or 10 horses and your owners want to race then that's it, you're losing them. They're getting sent down to a trainer down here and there's going to be a lot of people suffering really badly and going out of business. If I didn't have a stable down here these horses would be coming down here, they'd just be going to somebody else. It's just been a nightmare."

Typically, Frank and Kristin Calcagni look after Auciello's New York stable at the Pine Bush Training Facility, but with the influx from Canada, Auciello has had to temporarily move down to help his small team with the increased volume of work.

"It's been an experience," said Auciello. "We normally only have 12 to 15 horses down here and I've got three people and it's a breeze. My people down here have been great. They haven't shied away from the work at all, which is nice."

Blais has already brought 11 horses down to his brother Coco at White Birch Farm in New Jersey, with more on the way.



"I'm going to bring all the 2-year-olds that are eligible for Jersey and PA," said Blais.

MacIntosh already had 25 stabled at New York's Mark Ford Training Center under the watchful eye of second trainer Jessica Fallon, but that number grew when another seven came down to race this week.

"I feel sorry for Jess," said MacIntosh. "She's overloaded right now and she's doing a hell of a job just keeping everything going."

MacIntosh is currently still in Canada, but that will change in the next couple of weeks.

"So, at some point, I have to leave my wife and go down and be with the racehorses that are racing and take the American babies down because we can't finish them off at the farm like we want to. I have to ship them into The Meadowlands to train them to see the track and the tractors and get used to stuff. So, at some point next month, I have to bring down the 10 or 12 American babies and go from there."

All the trainers are thankful to have such good owners supporting them in addition to their staffs on both sides of the border, especially their grooms.

Grooms have been in short supply for a while now, so hanging onto the ones they have is most important.

"My grooms up here are upset seeing their horses that they've been working on for two years going down and winning and those grooms are getting the win bonuses," said MacIntosh. "Sure, they get the one per cent but they're still losing out on the \$100 paddocks and \$100 win tips. So, that's \$200 out of their pockets when one wins down there."

Auciello finds himself in the same position as MacIntosh, trying to hold onto grooms that are rubbing and perhaps, more importantly, paddocking fewer horses.

"That's their bread and butter, the paddocking," said Auciello. "They can make a couple hundred in a night plus the hundred-dollar win bonus. And you do that five nights a week and they can make themselves an extra seven or eight hundred bucks a week when we're racing and the horses are doing well. Plus, a little percentage of my 5 per cent I give away. We all know what grooms make in this business, it's not very much."

Changes in tactics no friend to the harness racing customer, or the business

This weekend the racing world is filled with Kentucky Derby handicapping. There's workout watching, form analysis, and for many who want to hit an elusive Derby tri or superfecta, pace projections.

As for the latter, thoroughbred racehorses, as you probably know, race to a running style. "E8" horses will go to the lead, pressers press a lead and stalkers will come from off the pace. Making projections to how a race will be run is handicapping 101, and the jockeys for the most part race their horses based on their style of running, because they really have no choice.

In harness racing it's not like that.

For example, last Saturday evening in the third leg of a \$109,000 Pick 4 pool at the Big M, Sweet Lucy Lou was sent to the front and paid \$27. The mare won like an 8-5 shot. In her previous races this year she had been no better than second last off the gate – what most would characterize a closer. In addition to the tactics change, it was coming off a vet scratch, and it was a move-up in class.

How could your customer – like the people scouring over Kentucky Derby pace projections this weekend – handicap for this scenario off the past performances? They can't. And in my view, it's a bad for the business.

In harness racing today, the sport is more and more reliant on multi-leg wagers and carryover pools; they are driving most of the handle, and your regular customer spends hours handicapping them. When one horse – like a Sweet Lucy Lou – jumps up and does something off form it kills thousands of dollars in tickets and it can leave players scratching their heads. If these horseplayers find this happens too frequently, they naturally become former horseplayers.


As for thoroughbred players (who are very important to harness racing; they are easier to attract because they know horse racing and have cash-filled ADW accounts) they too see this, and it turns many of them off the sport. I wrote a

series of articles years ago titled, "What thoroughbred players think about harness racing" and one respondent replied, "I know what a jockey will do with a horse, but drivers in harness racing have so much power they can take my money completely out of a race with one decision."

In other jurisdictions, this harness racing phenomenon has been on the regulator radar. In Australia, they passed Rule 44 in 2017, which requires the connections of a horse to contact the judges if a change of tactics is going to be employed, so they could let the public know. This rule has since been amended to primarily focus on driver tactics with horses from the same barn in the same race. Australia is a mature gambling market with a lot of competition for the betting dollar; they had no choice but to be proactive with these customer complaints.

Can anything be done in North America? With so many jurisdictions and so many moving parts it seems like a monumental task, however, I believe it should at least be examined. With millions being bet in multi-leg wagers and customers at times finding themselves with ticket confetti through a tactics change, the sport may wake up in five or 10 years and wonder where all that money went.







Saturday's 3-year-old PASS event at The Meadows could be Meadowlands Pace preview

Now into May, we're officially into 3-year-old stakes season. In recent weeks, some of the higher acclaimed 2-year-olds from last year have made their way onto the track both in pari-mutuel races and in qualifying races, including last year's champ Perfect Sting. Yet, Saturday's (May 1) Pennsylvania Sire Stake (PASS) races at The Meadows (11:25 a.m. post) mark the highest number of sophomore pacing stakes caliber horses on a single card this year. Not to be outdone, the unofficial road to the Hambletonian gets underway Saturday afternoon as well with the Dexter Cup at Freehold.

On the pacing side first, of the 42 current eligible nominations to the Meadowlands Pace in July, nearly 20 per cent (8) of them are featured in two separate opening leg PASS divisions at The Meadows. What's more interesting looking into the numbers is that of those 42 nominations, 10 of those were February supplements. Those supplements racing in the PASS include **Hellabalou**, last year's PASS Final runner-up Chase H Hanover and most surprisingly that he wasn't previously nominated, **Southwind Gendry**. Amazingly, **Lou's Pearlman** with his 1:49.1 mark as a juvenile might be favored Saturday in his PASS race (7-2 morning line) and hasn't been nominated to the Pace. It's only the first race of what will be a long season for many of these, yet how some of these horses perform could give a glimpse into what's to come in the months ahead including how races such as the Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup could take form.

Starting with last year's winner of the \$253,000 PASS final for the division and a narrow third in the Breeders Crown final, Ron Burke trainee Southwind Gendry returns to the races off two winning qualifiers; the most recent in a time of 1:51. It did look like Gingras was giving some encouragement throughout the stretch in that April 24 qualifier, though in the end he was able to hold off an oncoming Governor's Cup runner-up **Exploit** with a margin to spare in the end. But he's not going to have an easy race to

re-acclimate and that's because he drew into the same race as other Burke-trained horse, **Summa Cum Laude**. A winner of five races from 15 starts last year at 2 (with five additional second-place finishes), Summa Cum Laude dead-heated with Perfect Sting in the Breeders Cup and closed out the year with an ultra-game try in the Governor's Cup.

Not to be overlooked in the stacked second PASS division is Chase H Hanover. Trained by Scott Cox, he was first or second in all but one of his 10 races last year. A bridesmaid to Southwind Gendry on three different occasions last year including the PASS final, he was extremely impressive when going wire-to-wire by open lengths over Lou's Pearlman in the Standardbred on Jug day last September. It's hard to get a read on those Northfield qualifiers, but it's certainly a sign of positive intent that Sears is down to get the call – he almost pulled off a 16-1 upset with him last year. The other colt in this division nominated to the Pace is the Always B Miki colt, **Billy Clyde**. Trained by Ray Schnittker, he's started off his 2021 season with two easy wins in non-winners of 2 competition at Pocono. He'll need to step up, but he wasn't totally disgraced either last year in limited attempts against

the divisions' best, losing by only a few lengths.

The first PASS division as race 4 may not be as end-to-end deep as the other one, but it's highly intriguing, nonetheless. There's three Burke horses in the race, and only **Literl Lad** Hanover with a 1-for-14 record has been nominated to the Pace. Not nominated or supplemented as of yet are Lou's Pearlman and morning line favorite Lunar. In the case of Lunar, the unbeaten Sweet Lou gelding didn't even debut until less than two months ago, though he looks like he could be turning into any kind. Lou's Pearlman is more difficult to figure. Perhaps there were doubts of his ability on a big track, but he looked awfully good in back-to-back qualifying wins over Summa Cum Laude at the Meadowlands. He seems like an imposing proposition from the rail and it'll be fascinating to see who is the better of the barn-mates. Impressive performances from either or both could determine what stakes they target going forward this year.

Starting from post 2 in the race is Hellabalou – one of the February Meadowlands Pace supplements. It's interesting to see Delaware-based trainer Eddie Dennis target the Meadowlands Pace, so he must think highly of this one. Hellabalou showed some speed and potential early last year as a freshman, and couldn't have been any more visually impressive off cover in his seasonal debut two weeks ago at Chester. He was a relatively unknown last year but could make a name for himself now; Andrew McCarthy retains the drive.

DEXTER CUP


At Freehold and on the trotting side, eight horses will go for the \$115,583 Dexter Cup final for 3-year-old trotters. From recent history, the Dexter Cup isn't likely to produce a serious Hambletonian challenger though there is one in here that is at least Hambletonian nominated. That honor goes to one of the two Svanstedt horses in here, **Ambassador Hanover**.

Ambassador Hanover was never involved in his lone attempt outside of the New York Sires Stakes which came in an International Stallion Stake, but it could be a much different story starting from post 2 on Saturday. He comes into the Dexter Cup after receiving a bye and I'd expect Svanstedt to be aggressive from the inside draw.

Incommunicado will be the race favorite and is the stablemate of the latter. The Dexter Cup elimination winner needs to overcome post 7 for the second straight week. Gingras is down to drive Incommunicado, as well as slated to drive Southwind Gendry and Lou's Pearlman at The Meadows just a couple of hours earlier, making it a busy day for him.

While sharing the stage with stars from another breed on this year's first Saturday in May, the PASS 2021 opener as well as the Dexter Cup and other stake races over The Meadows and Freehold cards means it's possible that more than a few of these horses could be seen in the summer classics as well as deep into the fall.







Young driver Dustin Bothman believes in the individuality of each horse

Whenever Dustin Bothman walks through the barn, he sees something meaningful in each face that peers out at him. It's a feeling never lost on the horseman from Chillicothe, OH, the one he experiences every day he sets foot in the barn run by Steve Carter, his step-father.

To many, the nearly three dozen standardbreds who gaze out of their stalls might appear to look the same in color, size and markings.

For the 26-year-old Bothman, they couldn't be any more different.

"All of them, they are just like people, and that's how they should be treated. The horses all have different personalities and ways of doing things. Some people might look at a horse and think, 'That's just another horse.' But you have to look at them as people. Every one is different."

It's been a long-held view for Bothman, who knew what his career calling was before he sat in his first high school class.

From the moment he started hanging around the barn, he realized the driving life was for him.

"I work for my stepdad and I've been with him since I was nine or 10.My grandfather had horses for a hobby, but was really good at it and he would take me to the barn with him when I was little. We would work with the horses and I would sit on his lap when we would jog them. He sparked my passion for the horses and introduced me to them. He passed away when I was 10 and my mother got remarried to Steve. I was very fortunate that he worked with horses too and he got me right back into it.

"So, I've always loved the horses. You've got to live and breathe the horses to be good at what you do. When I was around nine, I kept telling everyone that I wanted to drive horses one day. My stepdad would tell me all the time when I was young that it all starts in the barn – cleaning stall, knowing every piece of equipment like the back of your hand, all the ins and outs of the game. It's not something that you start at and then take off driving

right away. You need to know everything about the horses so that you can help them."

In 2017, Bothman, who also credits Ernie Gaskin in his development, won three of 19 starts in the race bike. The following year, he posted 13 top-three finishes from 29 starts. After a six-win campaign in 2019, he upped his game, and win total, with a 37-win season.

He's hopeful this year can be his most successful in the sulky.

"I just have to keep going, keep learning and being dedicated to it. The more seat time, the better. You learn something every time, win or lose. A lot of it is experience level. I've sat behind a lot of horses when it comes to training. Driving, you have to know the horses and the races. You also have to know how to work things out with them in a trip.

"Really, it would be awesome – I know it sounds far-fetched – if I could win 100 races. That would be sweet. I think the main thing is teaching our horses. We have some really nice 2-year-olds. As long as they do what we think they should and they are taken care of, and we keep them safe, that would mean the world."

Just seeing the horses compete as the racing world continues to navigate the worldwide pandemic has been a source of joy for Bothman.

"You treasure that connection. It makes you feel a lot more grateful and fortunate to work with them every day. When the pandemic hit, you thought, early on, just how much it would impact racing. So, every day that I get to be around the horses, and every time they are on the racetrack, it makes it all that much more special. You never take any of it for granted."

It's exactly how he feels whenever he's holding the reins, training or driving.

Bothman doesn't see any of it as a teacher-student dynamic.

"We are both teaching each other. I learn from them and they learn from me. And that's exactly how it should be."

He's also a big believer in the county fair circuit, specifically, in what it can offer rookie pacers and trotters.

"I love having the 2-year-olds at the fairs. The competition is different when it comes to the levels and stages of racing. People might look at it and think a horse is at the fair for a reason, that they can't compete at the big track, but a lot of it to me is that a lot of 2-year-olds should experience starting

at a county fair. It teaches them to race, but they also see a lot more and get a lot more action there than they would at a bigger track. If they start at a fair, it might help them become a tick smarter or a tick handier, to show how nice they are. I think the county fairs are great for that."

On this day, Bothman has spent a little longer than anticipated in the barn. Not that it's a bad thing.

Spending time with the standardbreds is never a chore, especially when there are plenty of different personalities to interact with.

Two, in particular, come to mind.

"There's one – the only one – that I own. His name is I Forget Alittle [a bay son of Dontyouforgetit, bred by Dublin Valley Farm]. He turned 3 this year. He didn't race as a 2-year-old. He needed his time to grow. He was immature when we got him, but he's come around. We're hoping we can start with him this year. He's kind of a little rug rat. He likes to chew on everything he can and he has to have a Jolly Ball in his stall to throw around and play with."

Charlie May, bred and owned by Don Tiger, is the other.

The 3-year-old son of McArdle, trained by Carter, has rhymed off three straight wins on two occasions, including an OSS Final score at Scioto Downs last September.

"Charlie May, I think it's his personality that makes him such a good horse, the character he has. He obviously has great talent, but his competitive drive and professionalism is amazing. Really, I'm just happy to be around all the horses."

Perhaps a line found in the 'About' section on Bothman's Facebook page perfectly captures his love of horses and horse racing best, 10 words that speak volumes of his passion for standardbreds: *I love my job... wouldn't have it any other way.*





Strong-willed filly Lady Arthur set to tackle OHSS opener

The Dr. Ian Moore trainee will make her second 2021 start in the first leg of the \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stake on Sunday (May 2) evening at Miami Valley Raceway.

The state of Ohio has been special to trainer/owner Dr. Ian Moore and thanks to a promising 3-year-old filly pacer, Lady Arthur, Moore is expecting more great things in the Buckeye State.

Lady Arthur is the homebred daughter of Arthur Blue Chip—April Three. She is owned by Moore, R G McGroup and Serge Savard, the same connections who hoisted the Little Brown Jug in 2008 thanks to Shadow Play's gutsy two-heat world record performance over the Delaware, OH oval.

Last Friday night (April 23), Lady Arthur started her 2021 campaign by capturing the \$50,000 Scarlett and Gray Invitational at Miami Valley Raceway, surviving a fast-closing Summer Touch, the defending Ohio Sire Stake champion, and



a lengthy inquiry.

Lady Arthur and driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. took the early lead as the gate's wings folded. When Free Thinker and Dan Noble cleared the lead before the quarter mile station, Lady Arthur was not content sitting in the pocket and retook the lead as the field crossed under the line for the first time.

As she turned for home, her old issue of being hard to control resurfaced. Lady Arthur drifted in the lane causing the judges to take a long look at the stretch drive.

"There was a bit of that (headstrong) stuff the other day, which didn't totally surprise me, but she's been so good down (in Florida)," said Moore. "She grew and filled out a lot over the winter. We didn't do anything different with her except try to settle her down."

As a 2-year-old, Lady Arthur quickly made a name for

herself in Ohio. She won the opening leg of the Ohio Sire Stake (OHSS), finished third in the second OHSS leg and took a \$49,300 division of the Ohio State Fair Stakes — all at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

"The first few months she raced every two weeks," said Moore. "I would send her down on Thursday and bring her back to Ontario on Sunday. When I had to leave her there (in Ohio) things kind of fell apart."

She broke stride in the third OHSS leg and was parked for much of her mile, finishing fourth in the fourth and final leg.

"She had trouble with the half-mile track (at Northfield Park)," admitted Moore. "She became headstrong and hard to control on the track."

Thanks to her early season performance, she garnered enough points to qualify for the \$300,000 OHSS final at Scioto Downs.

Lady Arthur left the gate alertly from post 7, but once again broke stride going into the first turn.

Moore brought the filly back to Ontario for her final three starts of the season.

With Bob McClure in the bike, Lady Arthur finished sixth in the \$65,865 Champlain and thanks to a fifth-place finish in her elimination, she qualified for the \$341,250 She's A Great Lady final.

In the final, Lady Arthur and driver Jody Jamieson had an adventurous trip to say the least. Leaving from the outside post #9, they were three-wide into the first turn, were able to get into the three-hole at the quarter. She was shuffled to eighth at the top of the stretch. While gaining ground in the lane, she was run into by the eventual unofficial winner Scarlett Hanover, pinballing into two other fillies. She was placed up to sixth after the review.

She finished 2020 with a 2-1-1 record in 10 starts, earning \$60,931.

"She's got to be the strongest-willed filly that I have ever trained," said Moore. "If you get into a battle with her, you are going to lose because she will fight you to the bitter end."

Lady Arthur's second 2021 start will be in the first leg of the \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stake on Sunday (May 2) evening at Miami Valley Raceway. She will leave from post #4 in the first division with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. listed to drive. The second OHSS leg is scheduled for June 5 at MGM Northfield Park.

"We are going to make a couple of minor equipment changes for Sunday," said Moore. "We got to get her through this weekend, before we try some wholesale changes."

Moore knows Lady Arthur's family quite well. He trained and co-owned her sire, Arthur Blue Chip (1:50.1f; \$524,707).

"Arthur Blue Chip is probably the only horse I've ever had that never got to meet his full potential," said Moore. "He had so many self-induced injuries, in stalls and paddocks. There was so much left in the tap that we never got to see."

Ohio breeders didn't see the potential during his two years standing in Ohio. He only had 13 registered foals in his first crop – twelve of which made the races. His second year, he was only bred to 11 mares.

Moore moved the stallion to Woodmere Standardbreds on Prince Edward Island for the 2019 breeding season.

"This filly looks a lot like him, built like him. She's been tough as nails. She's one of the toughest fillies I have ever trained."

Big Boss Hill faces toughest test to date in tonight's Buckeye Stallion Series

The Buckeye Stallion Series kicks off tonight (April 30) at Miami Valley, with seven divisions carded for sophomore pacing colts. Trainer and owner Scott Cox will send out hopeful Big Boss Hill in the night's fourth division, carded as race six on the program. Purchased via ongait.com last fall, the Racing Hill—Cosmo Blue Chip gelding arrives at Miami Valley after winning two of three starts upstate at Northfield Park.

"Jason (Ash) and I bought him as a 2-year-old," Cox said of the online purchase. "We had a decent 2-year-old last year that made some money in Pennsylvania so we thought we could take a chance. We liked his pedigree. The family shows that with a little age they get better."

The sixth foal out of the Art Major mare, the dam has yet to produce a foal that hasn't reached the winner's circle. Big Boss Hill is a half-brother to 18-time winner Western Hill p,3, 1:50.1 (\$355,702) and two other six-figure earners. As a freshman, Virgil Morgan campaigned the pacer, yielding two wins and a trio of third-place performances on the Ohio fair circuit. By late August, Big Boss Hill's campaign was done, and in early September, Cox had bought the gelding. A few months later, the trainer would get his first look at his acquisition.

"When we bought him we just had him sent to the turnout. I didn't see him until December," Cox said.

When he did set eyes on Big Boss Hill for the first time, he noticed the horse had some conformation issues up front. His concerns were eased once he began to work with the pacer.

"The first day I jogged him I thought he had a nice gait," said Cox, a Streetsboro, OH resident. "He's trained down well, and he's nice to be around."

Ohio C

After a pair of qualifiers at Northfield, Cox dropped his charge in the box for a non-winners of one event at the Cleveland oval in late March. Steered by Chris Lems, Big Boss Hill raced first over and paced clear by more than four lengths to win in 1:55.2. The sophomore has competed in the Iron Maiden Series his last two trips behind the starting gate, registering a 1:54 triumph over Northfield's half before finishing third on April 18.

"If he can just not regress from where he is at, we'll be happy. Right now, he's still learning. He still has some little quirks in him. He'll throw a shuffle in here or there, but he paces right through it," said Cox.

Big Boss Hill was staked to the Buckeye Stallion Series, but his owners chose not to make him eligible to the ultra-tough sires stakes where he would face the likes of 2020 Ohio 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year Charlie May and Heart Of Chewbacca. Instead, Friday will be a test that will help clarify plans for the 3-year-old this summer. If he handles the five-eighths configuration well, Cox says his charge could spend time between Scioto Downs and The Meadows once the Iron Maiden Series is complete. A few fair starts are also on the schedule.

"I think he'll be fine. Virgil probably trained him on the five-eighths last year at his farm and he qualified at Scioto. I'm just hoping the five-eighths will help him a little bit," Cox said. "He's not an overly big horse, but he's a nice size horse with a good gait."

Big Boss Hill will start from post three in the sixth race on the program. The gelding is the 9-2 third choice in the \$17,500 event, guided by Dan Noble.

"I think we've got the right driver on him for Friday. I've had a lot of luck with Danny," the trainer said. "There are a couple decent ones in there, but I think Danny's style will suit him very well."

Tonight's outing will be the toughest to date for the sophomore. Regardless of the outcome, Cox likes the characteristics exhibited by his trainee thus far.

"He's got a good attitude," he said. "The way I like him is that he likes to pass a horse and he doesn't like to get passed. He's got a lot of heart."





Callmethebreeze flew to victory in Italy

Callmethebreeze (Trixton), driven by Andrea Guzzinati, won the \$186,000 Gran Premio Tito Giovanardi in Modena, Italy on Sunday (April 25) afternoon.

The 3-year-old Trixton son is owned by French trainer Philippe Allaire and Callmethebreeze now belongs in the barn of the owner. Last season, the horse was trained by Alessandro Gocciadoro for whom he won the \$265,000 Mipaaf Allevamento Maschi.

Callmethebreeze opened quickly in Modena last Sunday and Guzzinati opted for a pocket trip with Allaire's trotter. At the home stretch, free space was given to the Trixton son and Callmethebreeze sprinted to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:59.4 over 1.3 miles.

Allaire continued on the winning path when Vincennes offered some nice races for 3-year-olds on Tuesday's (April 27) race card. Allaire's **Italiano Vero** (Ready Cash) was the heavy favorite in \$120,000 Prix Paul Karle and driver David Thomain hit the lead at an early stage of the race. Outside trotter Ideal Ligneries challenged seriously over the stretch, but Italiano Vero fought courageously and held on to victory in a mile rate of 1:56.1 over 1.3 miles, a new stakes record.

Three-year-old fillies gathered around Vincennes' black track when the \$120,000 Prix Masina was on the card and Allaire collected another big win in Paris on Tuesday afternoon. Franck Nivard sat behind Allaire's It's Now Or Never (Charly du Noyer) and used the filly's ability to leave behind the gate. Despite a tough post position (8), Nivard hit the lead while first choice Inoubliable got a trip as third on

the inside.

When Inoubliable attacked at the top of the stretch, It's Now Or Never had gained some lengths in advantage and Philippe Allaire's horse won in a tight finish in mile rate, stakes record, 1:57.2.

New invitations for Elitloppet

Ecurie D. got the first ticket to Elitloppet 2021 and during the past week, four additional names were put on the list of horses that are welcome to Solvalla on May 30.

Jerry Riordan-trained **Aetos Kronos** (Bold Eagle), who impressed a lot by winning an elimination for the Paralympiatravet last Saturday, received his ticket on Sunday afternoon. Solvalla invited three horses at the same time and the second horse on the list was **Vivid Wise As** (Yankee Glide), who won Prix de l'Atlantique at Enghien for trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro last weekend. Vivid Wise As entered Elitloppet 2020 as the bettors' first choice and he has really showed that he belongs in the European top.

Daniel Redén trained **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin), winner of the \$240,000 Sprintermästaren and runner up in the \$860,000 Derby last year, got his invitation for Elitloppet in connection with the latter-named horses. And Solvalla announced on Wednesday night, that French champion trainer Jean-Michel Bazire will enter the Elitloppet with his **Dorgos de Guez** (Romcok de Guez). French trotters are always interesting at Solvalla and Dorgos de Guez has, among several big wins, won the \$133,000 Prix du Luxembourg at Vincennes.

Finlandia-ajo up next

Vermo racetrack in Helsinki, Finland gets ready for \$133,000 Finlandia-ajo on May 9 and eight out of 10 horses are ready for the race, where an invitation for the Elitloppet is at stake.

Dear Friend, Grainfield Aiden, Hickothepooh, Le Gros Bill, Milliondollarrhyme, Next Direction, Ubertino Grif and Zarenne Fas are all set for Finlandia-ajo where Jerry Riordan's Zarenne Fas is title defender.

Incommunicado looks to make statement in Dexter Cup

Incommunicado exceeded expectations last season. On Saturday (May 1), he will try to meet them.

Incommunicado is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in Saturday's \$115,583 Dexter Cup for 3-year-old male trotters at Freehold Raceway. The gelding heads to the race off a season-opening 1:57 win in last week's single elimination and starts Saturday from post seven with Yannick Gingras driving for trainer Ake Svanstedt.

Last year, Incommunicado won four of 10 races, hit the board a total of nine times, and earned \$201,375 for owners Knutsson Trotting, Little E, Arthur Geiger, and David Stolz. Three of his victories came in the Massachusetts Sire Stakes, including the series final. His remaining score was in a division of the New York Sire Stakes.

"He did better than we expected," Svanstedt said. "He's a good-gaited horse and he has a good attitude. He's a horse that always does what you want. He handles all tracks and he trained back good this winter. He qualified very good (in 1:54.3 on April 10 at The Meadowlands) and then he raced good also. I am happy with him."

Svanstedt could have accepted a bye and advanced directly to the Dexter final but opted to race Incommunicado in the elimination rather than see the horse untested for three weeks following his qualifier.

"He needed to race, and he raced good," Svanstedt said about the son of Chapter Seven—Gran Cavalla. "I hope he is even sharper this weekend in the final."

Svanstedt also sends out Ambassador Hanover, the 7-2 second choice on the morning line, in the Dexter. The trainer accepted a bye for the colt, who qualified in 1:58.3 on April 17 at The Meadowlands and is making his seasonal debut Saturday. He starts from post two with Svanstedt driving.

"He didn't need the race (in the elimination)," said Svanstedt, who owns Ambassador Hanover with Order By Stable, Howard Taylor, and Judith Taylor. "He qualified good. I just sat and had a lot of power left. I didn't want to go faster than (1):58.

"I hope he is good also on Saturday."

New Jersey 🖇

Ambassador Hanover, a son of Chapter Seven out of Angel Eyes Hanover, won his first four starts of 2020, all in the New York Sire Stakes, before finishing fourth in the final. Svanstedt said the colt lost a front shoe early in the race, which hampered his performance. He was beaten by three-quarters of a length.

"He made a break for a couple of steps, but he found the trot again," Svanstedt said. "But he couldn't go so good. He had heavy shoes also, so it bothered him a lot when he lost the one. He was good to finish fourth with three shoes.

"This year, he is different. Last year, he had a lot of weight in the front. This year, he doesn't need so much weight in the front, just normal shoes. He has changed. He is better gaited now."

Ambassador Hanover raced one time following the sire stakes final, finishing seventh in a division of the Bluegrass at Red Mile. He was scratched sick from his next scheduled start in the International Stallion and turned out. He finished the campaign with \$123,425.

"He had a long rest after Lexington and he has trained back good," Svanstedt said. "We'll race him and see if he is a Hambletonian horse. We will see."

The Dexter Cup is the season's first Grand Circuit race for 3-year-old trotters on the road to August's Hambletonian Stakes, the sport's premier event for sophomore trotters. Ambassador Hanover is the lone Hambletonian eligible in the Dexter.

In addition to the Dexter Cup, Freehold plays host to two divisions of the Lady Suffolk for 3-year-old female trotters on Saturday. Svanstedt-trained Illuminata, a Matron Stakes winner last year, is the 9-5 morning-line favorite in the first division. Ron Burke-trained Hot As Hill gets the 8-5 nod in the second.

Kelley hopes Balenciaga has designs on winning

After seeing Balenciaga stymied by a lung infection last year at age 2, trainer Paul Kelley is hoping to get a good look at the unraced male trotter this spring. Balenciaga, a \$270,000 yearling purchase, made a favorable impression Saturday, winning a qualifier in 1:56.3 at The Meadowlands.

"We've got a lot of work to do, we're not there yet, but that was a good step forward the other day, for sure," Kelley said this week. "I was really happy. He didn't race last year, but I think physically he's a pretty strong animal. We'll see."

Balenciaga, by Chapter Seven out of Iluvmyjimmychoos, is owned by Lennart Agren's S R F Stable and Crawford Farms Racing. He was the second-highest priced yearling sold during the second session of the 2019 Lexington Selected Sale, behind \$320,000 buy Red Redemption. Balenciaga finished a head in front of Red Redemption in Saturday's qualifier.

"When I was at Sunshine Meadows (in Florida in 2020) he was probably our best 2-year-old through the winter," Kelley said. "He trained down really well. We were pretty excited about him when we came north. Once we got up here, he didn't progress as much as I hoped. We really weren't sure what was going on.

"We qualified him one time and he just wasn't any good. We found out shortly thereafter that he had a lung infection. That pretty much explained that. We tried to get it cleared up, but we ran out of time. So, at that point, the best thing to do was to turn him out."

New Jersey 3

Kelley is happy with the way Balenciaga matured during this past winter.

"Last year at 2, physically he still had some work to do in terms of getting stronger," Kelley said. "He was a little bit weak behind, and we were kind of battling with that a bit too. Now as a 3-year-old, he's matured a lot, especially physically. He's a really strong horse now."

In Saturday's qualifier, Balenciaga and driver Scott Zeron sat third for three-quarters of a mile before taking a one-length lead at the stretch call.

"You couldn't have asked for a better job by Scotty," Kelley said.
"He sat up close and said the horse was feeling good and strong in the last turn and he moved him. What we liked the most, is that when he cleared to the front and got a little bit lost up there, as soon as he had a horse with him, he went right back on and didn't want to let (Red Redemption) get by. That was pretty encouraging."

Kelley plans to qualify Balenciaga once more before looking for a race at The Meadowlands in mid-May.

Balenciaga is eligible to the New York Sire Stakes series, which begins June 4 at Vernon Downs, and also is staked to numerous events on the Grand Circuit, including the \$1 million Hambletonian in August.

"We paid him in pretty good," Kelley said. "There was some concern this winter, but the truth is, I'm not really sure how handy he's going to be on the half-mile tracks in New York. He might be okay, but I'm not sure.

"If I take New York out of the equation, what's left? He showed enough last year and when I worked him at The Meadowlands (in February) I was encouraged enough to say we better roll the dice here a little bit and give him a chance. The S R F Stable and the Crawfords, they like to play at a high level. It didn't make sense not to take a shot with the horse."

While Balenciaga will be looking to make his name on the stakes circuits this year, several Grand Circuit winners from 2020 were back in action this past weekend in the Big M qualifiers and posted victories. They included 3-year-old male pacers Perfect Sting, Southwind Gendry, and Lou's Pearlman, 3-year-old female trotter Hello I Love You, 3-year-old female pacer JK Alwaysbalady, and 4-year-old female trotter Hypnotic AM.

Party Girl Hill retired due to injury

Party Girl Hill, the world-record-setting 2020 Dan Patch Award winner for best 3-year-old female pacer, has been retired because of an injury discovered after training this past weekend. Chris Ryder, who trained the mare for breeder-owner Tom Hill, said Party Girl Hill was nearly ready to qualify in preparation for her 4-year-old campaign.

"We're all devastated," Ryder said Monday (April 26). "She had been training back terrific. It's just a shame; a shame for her and a shame for us not to be able to see what she could do as an aged horse. It's a real loss. She was so special."

Unraced at age 2, Party Girl Hill won 15 of 16 races last year and \$880,345. Her victories included the Fan Hanover, Jugette, Matron, Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship, and a division of the Tattersalls Pace, when she became only the second pacing filly to beat male rivals in a race worth at least \$100,000 in the last 30 years. She was driven primarily by Dexter Dunn, with Doug McNair in the sulky for her Canadian starts in the Fan Hanover.

In the Jugette, Party Girl Hill won her elimination in 1:49.3, the first sub-1:50 mile on a half-mile track by a female pacer in history, and returned to capture the same-day final by 3-1/2 lengths in 1:50.3 at the Delaware County Fairgrounds in central Ohio.

Following the Jugette, owner Hill described the daughter of Captaintreacherous—Look Cheap as "a Rolls-Royce with hair."

Said Ryder on Monday, "If you had to pick out one performance from last year, maybe you would say the first heat of the Jugette. But that was just part of a wicked stretch of five or six races for her, where she went to Canada, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Lexington and raced great."

What made Party Girl Hill great?

"She had no weakness," Ryder said. "She had super speed. She was just fast, like 'right now' quick. And she had a great attitude. Even now, she's happy. She has her ears up, she's not sulking.

"I want to thank everyone who worked with her, all her fans, and Tom. It was special to have a horse like her."

Oklahoma Attorney General, joined by the USTA, Hanover Shoe Farms, State of West Virginia and others, files lawsuit against HISA

The State of Oklahoma, joined by the U.S. Trotting Association, Hanover Shoe Farms, the State of West Virginia and others, filed a federal lawsuit in the Eastern Division of Kentucky U.S. District Court challenging the constitutionality of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act on Monday (April 26).

Other plaintiffs in the complaint filed for a declaratory judgment and injunctive relief are the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission, West Virginia Racing Commission, Oklahoma Quarter Horse Racing Association and three Oklahoma racetracks – Remington Park, Will Rogers Downs and Fair Meadows.

"The U.S. Trotting Association has been pressing these unconstitutionality objections for more than four years and we have been ignored," said USTA president and Hanover Shoe Farms president and CEO Russell Williams. "Instead, Senator McConnell sneaked HISA through at the last minute, without any hearing or debate, in the middle of a 5,500-page, must-pass omnibus funding measure.

"Now two states are challenging HISA in federal court alongside the USTA, and more states are considering joining us. HISA must be struck down.

"Along with the National Association of Racetrack Veterinarians, the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, and legal counsel, the USTA has prepared a draft federal bill named the Racehorse Health and Safety Act that does not violate the U.S. Constitution and does protect the health and welfare of the horse for all racing breeds. This is the bill that should have been introduced in Congress years ago, but the Jockey Club had other ideas.

"The American Quarter Horse Association, the Association of Racing Commissioners International, the state racing commissions, and even the recently-formed harness racing industry round table will be studying this legislation in order to have a legal and appropriate regulatory plan ready to introduce as legislation once HISA has been declared unconstitutional and is out of the way."

A press release issued by Oklahoma Attorney General Mike Hunter's office on Monday stated that, "HISA disregards foundational law within the Constitution, including the Tenth Amendment. Congress cannot force a state legislature to either appropriate dollars for a private corporation, like the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority, or be banned from passing legislation imposing certain taxes or fees. That puts Congress in control of state branches of government, which violates the law."

Defendants named in the lawsuit are the United States of America, Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority, Inc., Leonard S. Coleman, Jr., Nancy M. Cox, Federal Trade Commission, Rebecca Kelly Slaughter (as Acting Chair of the FTC) and three others in their capacities as Commissioners of the FTC – Noah Joshua Phillips, Rohit Chopra and Christine S. Wilson.

Shawn Gray reaches \$20 million in career earnings at Plainridge

Shawn Gray reached a major career milestone on Thursday (April 29) when he surpassed the \$20 million career earnings mark after he won the seventh race at Plainridge Park with Marcus Seelster (1:54, \$4.40). The \$5,500 winner's share of the \$11,000 purse pushed Gray's lifetime total to \$20,002,755.

Gray came into today's races needing \$17,370 to reach that plateau and once "The Maine Event" got rolling, it was clear that he would easily hit the mark during the afternoon.

Marcus Seelster was only one of four wins on Gray's Grand Slam day as he also scored with Cornerd Beach (1:56, \$25.60), Firstup (1:54.2, \$2.60) and Levi At Play (1:55.3, \$4.00).

A native of Waterville, ME and currently based at Saratoga

Raceway, Gray has been driving since 1993 when he got his first pari-mutuel win with Timer Choice at Presque Isle, ME. He has since been a regular on the New England circuit for his entire life, but has also been a major force in New York State.

Gray is currently the leading dash winning driver at Plainridge Park and sits second at Saratoga Raceway. A perennial high percentage reinsman, Gray boasts a .397 Universal Driver Rating so far this year, putting him eighth among all drivers in North America with under 300 starts in 2021.

Gray's single best career earnings year was 2018 when he bankrolled \$2.397 million. His best season for wins was 2012 when he captured 356 victories and his highest percentage performance came in 2011 when he posted a UDR of .440.

For his career, Gray has 21,681 starts with 4,580 wins, 3,507 seconds and 3,058 thirds, putting him in the money 51% of the time during his career. It also gives him a lifetime UDR of .348.

Eazy Pass easy winner in Weiss Series championship

Eazy Pass justified her backing as the heaviest sort of favorite by brushing to the lead nearing the three-quarters and going on to tie her mark of 1:54.3 in the \$40,000 Bobby Weiss Series Championship for sophomore trotting fillies Tuesday afternoon (April 27) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

32-1 shot P L Olivia was hustled away and put outsiders in behind her before the :27.3 quarter, and she went on to parked second choice quarter-mover Trip Sevens, leaving that rival out in the air past the :56.4 half. Eazy Pass, whom Dexter Dunn had moved out behind Trip Sevens perhaps in anticipation of her clearing, thus had the second-over journey, but before the 1:26 third panel the victorious filly was on her way to the lead, which she maintained to the wire. Eazy Pass won by four lengths over the resilient P L Olivia, with Frankly My Dear third.

Carrington was quickest away from the gate, with So Irresistible and driver Scott Zeron bypassing a tuck and going on to the lead in the vicinity of the :27.4 quarter. The half went in :56.4, and then came first-over Beach Crazy, with Incaseyoudidntknow, a winner of all three of her prelims and the favorite, second-over.

Incaseyoudidntknow rolled three-wide not much past the 1:24.2 three-quarters and loomed as a major stretch danger, with Carrington getting a clear path in the Pocono Pike to launch her bid. But So Irresistible was irresistible in winning

by a neck over Carrington, who in turn won a photo over Incaseyoudidntknow for second.

Brian Sears sent the heavy favorite to the lead nearing the :28.4 quarter, rated the half to :59, then put in a pair of :28.3 quarters to win off by himself for trainer Marcus Melander and Stall TZ Inc.

Picture-perfect finish for Burton in USHWA Canada 'Capping Contest

Truro Raceway track photographer Kyle Burton captured Sunday's (April 25) USHWA Canada #BetTruroChallenge, beating six other harness handicappers on the track's 2021 opening day.

"I thought I was going to win going into the 7th race, the feature of the day," he said. "I liked Imalookertoo, a lot. His lines in Ontario didn't show much, but just being fit and tight with only a 28-day layoff was a huge advantage for him. Everyone else hadn't raced since December. Garnet Barnsdale, who had the lead through race six, had #4 Dont Ask Logan and I was turned off by how he looked in last week's qualifier. I figured I had him beat before the wings opened and Imalookertoo delivered, big time."

The top handicapper's total return on investment for hypothetical \$2 win/place/show bets on each race of eight races was \$53.90 (five winners). Barnsdale, a top handicapper for Ontario Racing, finished second with \$43.30 (four winners). In a tight battle for show, Manitoba race caller Trey Colbeck (\$36.80; three winners) beat out former Yonkers Raceway publicity director Frank Drucker (\$35.70, two winners).

Burton said there's no substitute for watching how horses train and qualify. "My biggest strategy was watching the qualifiers closely. I took a lot of mental notes about when and how much drivers were urging in the qualifiers. I wanted

to see how fit to race each were and if they were going easy during their first charted line of 2021. That gave me a sense of who was at 100 per cent for the first program. Another strategy was looking for horses who recently shipped in from Ontario. If they were tighter than the rest of the competition, then that was a big advantage. That's how I landed on Immalookertoo (race 7) and Cliff Drummond (race 2)."

His vantage point is a definite advantage. "Being a track photographer helps in handicapping. Being able to pick up subtle differences in strides or maneuvers that most miss due to lack of image equipment is something that I incorporate into my handicapping strategy."

Besides bragging rights, Burton got to select a charity to receive donations on behalf of the USHWA Canada chapter. He opted for the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society (www.osas.ca), an organization that rehomes retired racehorses. "OSAS was an easy choice. They do great work and I was really moved by the Rambinlingamblinman story [on the OSAS site]. We need better options for retired racehorses and OSAS does a tremendous job in giving horses a new lease on life," he said.

USHWA Canada Chapter president Ryan Clements and contest organizer Melissa Keith didn't play the contest ponies with Burton's or Barnsdale's success, but they ponied up for the winner's choice of charity on behalf of the chapter. Contest participant Mike Carter also made a donation to American racehorse adoption program New Vocations (www.horseadoption.com), to settle a friendly side bet with Barnsdale.
