Harness trainer Ross Cohen admits to fixing between five and 20 races by bribing drivers

The testimony came on Day 3 of Lisa Giannelli's horse-doping trial in a New York.

Day 1 coverage is here.

Day 2 of Lisa Giannelli's horse-doping trial in a New York courtroom began Thursday (April 28) with opening statements and ended with testimony from an ex-harness trainer turned government cooperating witness.

"The defendant wasn't just in the doping business, she was in the deception business," prosecutor Benjamin Gianforti told the jury in U.S. District Court in New York.

But defense attorney Louis Fasulo countered by saying that his client couldn't be found quilty because her actions lacked criminal intent.

"Intent," he wrote in large letters on a computer screen for the jury of eight men and four women to read.

Fasulo said intent was the crux of the case. "What was Lisa Giannelli's intent? Why did she do what she did?"

Giannelli is challenging the government's evidence against her in a case growing out of the federal government's crackdown on horse doping at racetracks across the country.

The defendants included the prominent trainer Jason Servis who faces trial in early 2023.

Giannelli is being tried on one count of conspiring to violate federal law prohibiting the adulteration or misbranding of drugs.

Harness Racing Update

In his opening, Gianforti said that for more than two decades Giannelli distributed illegal performance enhancing drugs that corrupt trainers used to dope horses.

He said the drugs clearly violated racing regulations.

But that didn't stop the cheaters, he said.

"Why? Because fast horses win money," the prosecutor said.

Gianforti said the drugs Ginannelli sold were sought after because they were designed not to show up in post-race testing.

"Professional horse racing is highly competitive," the prosecutor said. "Winning highly lucrative."

Those create a huge temptation to cheat and defraud others, he said.

"That's what doping amounts to – fraud," he said.

Gianforti never mentioned by name a key figure: the veterinarian Seth Fishman who manufactured the drugs Giannelli sold at racetracks and training centers. Her customers were mostly harness trainers.

In February, Fishman was convicted of conspiracy.

Fasulo told the jury that Giannelli would testify that she did nothing wrong.

"She will tell you what she did and why she did it," he said. "We're not hiding from that."

He told the jury that horse racing was a sport in its purest sense and "how it is manipulated goes to the people in the sport."

He said the trial wasn't about PEDs or horse racing or whether animals should be subjected to drugs. And he said it wasn't about Fishman "with his own motives that he kept" from Giannelli.

At first, Cohen testified he couldn't remember how many races he fixed by bribing drivers to hold their horses back. "It was more than five, I don't think it was over 20," he told the jury.

He also couldn't remember how many drivers he paid off, then admitted, "maybe 10."

"At no time did he tell her she was doing anything wrong in fulfilling his orders," he said. "She was not the veterinarian; she was not the doctor."

The cooperator was former New York harness trainer Ross Cohen, who took the stand after an FBI agent and an FBI photographer testified about law enforcement searches conducted at Giannelli's home in Felton, DE in 2020 and at Fishman's warehouse in Boca Raton, FL in 2019.

Cohen was arrested in 2020 during the government's big takedown. He has since pleaded guilty as part of cooperation agreement with the government.

Cohen, 50, testified that he purchased performance enhancing bleeder pills from Giannelli when he was training horses in New York.

Under questioning from prosecutor Sarah Mortazavi, Cohen said Giannelli told him that he should give the pills to horses on the day of a race even though that would violate race regulations.

"She said they do not test for it at this time, but there was no guarantee they'd always not test," he testified.

He said testability was important to him.

"I did not want to get suspended and fined and have the owners lose the purse money," Cohen said.

Earlier in the day, prosecutors showed the jury a 2016 text that Giannelli sent to Fishman referring to Cohen.

"Propanthelene bromide? Ross Cohen is asking about it," Giannelli wrote.

"Have but it tests," Fishman replied.

Cohen testified the substance is a bronchodilator that increases a horse's airways.

He told Mortazavi he didn't remember talking to Giannelli about that.

His testimony resumes April 29.

Day 3 of Giannelli's horse doping trial on Friday (April 29) featured the cross-examination of a key government witness.

Cohen had testified that Gianelli had sold him performanceenhancing drugs that he used to secretly dope horses under his care.

He agreed to cooperate with the government after his arrest in 2020 in connection with the FBI's sweeping horse-doping probe.

The investigation led to charges against a number of individuals including the prominent trainer Jason Servis.

Under questioning by Fasulo in U.S., Cohen was asked about his cooperation agreement in which he admitted to fixing races years ago as well as to doping horses.

Fasulo wanted to know if that was his incentive for becoming a cooperator — to avoid being charged with bribery and facing substantially more punishment.

"My incentive was to try to make right for my wrongs and tell the truth," Cohen said in response.

Under further questioning, he said it could have been an incentive but then wasn't sure.

"I guess it could have been," Cohen testified. "I don't know if it was an incentive or not at the time."

Giannelli is on trial for conspiring to distribute adulterated and misbranded performance-enhancing drugs which were intended to enhance the performance of horses competing at racetracks across the country.

She worked with Seth Fishman, a veterinarian found guilty in February of manufacturing PEDs that were purchased by trainers to dope horses. Prosecutors say Fishman's drugs were designed to avoid post-race testing.

Fasulo told the jury that when Giannelli worked for Fishman out of her home in Delaware she didn't do anything wrong because her actions didn't involve criminal intent.

Cohen was reluctant to talk about his race-fixing past under Fasulo's probing, part of an effort to damage Cohen's credibility.

At first, Cohen testified he couldn't remember how many races he fixed by bribing drivers to hold their horses back.

"It was more than five, I don't think it was over 20," he told the jury.

He also couldn't remember how many drivers he paid off, then admitted, "maybe 10."

When questioned by prosecutor Sarah Mortazavi, Cohen said his cooperation deal doesn't prevent prosecutors from other jurisdictions from charging him with bribery. He hasn't been sentenced yet and said it would be up to the judge to determine his punishment.

The day concluded in the afternoon with the prosecution reading into the record portions of a witness's testimony from the Fishman trial.

The witness was Courtney Adams who worked for Fishman as an office manager for five years. She was unavailable to testify against Giannelli.

In her testimony, Adams said that Giannelli helped with labeling Fishman products. Prosecutors contend some of those labels violated federal regulations.

"She would suggest edits so the client would know what the product was," Adams said in her testimony.

During the reading, prosecutors also showed the jury a 2013 text in which Fishman said that Giannelli made over \$250,000 in 2012.

During her cross-examination, which was also read into the record, Adams admitted to Fasulo that she didn't know if that was true or not.

The trial resumes Monday.

Do GSY races at the Big M breed multi-leg value or are they a handle killer?

Strong opinions abound when it comes to the amateur racing series.

The amateur driver races at the Meadowlands, carded as a part of one of harness racing's staples – the Pick 5 – seem to elicit as much opinion as Elon Musk buying Twitter. To some, they add necessary chaos to a betting sport beset by low paying chalk. To others they are quite simply a giant stop sign for their betting wallets.

"The Pick 5 is my preferred wager in harness racing," said professional horseplayer Ryan Willis, 31, who regularly spends mid-three digits on the sequence at harness tracks like Woodbine Mohawk and the Meadowlands.

"Generally, by now I know Friday's Big M card is going to have at least two GSY races in the Pick 5 and I have gotten to the point where I don't even look at the Meadowlands on Fridays anymore. These races are built for chaos and confusion, but the chaos comes from some drivers who have no idea what they're sitting behind. I now only look at Friday's card if there is a Pick 6 carryover."

John Rallis, 26, of Toronto plays the Meadowlands religiously each week, and still dabbles in the GSY Pick 5's, but only to a point.

"I like the amateur races because there is plenty of action and they are entertaining, but truthfully, I don't want to play much into the Pick 5 when they are carded. There's just so much unexpected action that I find them hard to handicap."

By the numbers only, it's difficult to tell if the GSY races are a detriment, asset, or much-ado-about nothing.

Last Friday evening, the amateurs drew about \$77,000 in Pick 5 handle. On Saturday's card, with much better horses, the Pick 5 handled \$86,000. The previous weekend the gap was slightly more pronounced, but again it wasn't massively material.

This probably illustrates the see-saw of this sport in 2022. Bettors crave higher payoffs (as do computer assisted wagerers), but it can't be a dart board. They need to see form.

One thing we do know for sure, there is some value in the GSY races in the pick "n" races.

Just last Friday, for example, a sequence with winners paying \$6, \$4, \$12, \$3 and \$13 paid \$1,770 for a \$1 wager. That's something rarely seen in this sport, where \$200 or \$300 Pick 5s are commonplace. This likely comes from the chaos, where players have to go deeper to feel comfortable.

Personally, I don't spread these races, and keep my budget tight, but they do show the possibilities. I played that exact Pick 5 and was alive to a key at 20-1 in the last leg, and my small investment had me alive to cash over \$10,000. That's something that can keep bettors coming back.

On the flip side, the Meadowlands has always been known (and is branded) as a gambler's racetrack, and their Pick 4 wagers have been patronized in big numbers by traditional players since forever. Long-time player Les Stark noted to me via text that, "if I had a preference, I'd race all the GSY races in the Pick 5 so both Pick 4s contain races without amateur drivers. They can tarnish the Pick 4 sequences."

Can you be a true gambler's racetrack with amateur races in your main Pick 4 and 5 sequences? So far, the handle seems strong enough, but in the long-term every day players believe a case can be made they should not be raced in important multi-leg sequences, rather broken out on their own.

Two real heroes I've known

Both the name of the race and the name of the winner piqued my interest when I read that Toes In The Water had won the James K. Hackett Memorial.

I knew Jim Hackett well in my early days in our business. His wife, Mary, was one of Curly Smart's two daughters, and a truly wonderful person. Her sister, for the record, was equally nice, I still can remember Jean's husband, Richard, and Curly both snoring gently away in the living room after a good lunch.

Jim Hackett was an understated hero of the Second World War. A marine, he was part of the U.S. invading force that had the terrible assignment of recapturing, one by one, the Pacific islands the Japanese had captured immediately after hitting Pearl Harbor.

Hackett was momentarily captured by the Japanese when he somehow landed alone on one of those islands. He wasn't bilingual, but he still got the message loud and clear that they were going to shoot him.

Before they could, Hackett dove into the Pacific Ocean and swam to another, near-by island. There, he was joined by some fellow marines, and they all swam back to where Hackett had been captured, and took it. All Hackett told me about that part of it was that "there was some shooting, but we did most of it."

After he mustered out, Hackett went back to his original trade as a harness horse trainer and driver. He soon signed on to a private job with Sam Huttenbauer, a Cincinnati meat packer. Although he was somewhat of a free spirit, frequently quoting poetry he had learned as a boy, with his shirt tail out after maybe the third cocktail, he was a good horseman and yearling picker.

He was keen enough to pick up on Walnut Hall's full brother to Coffee Break when he walked into the sales ring at Tattersalls. For \$24,000 Huttenbauer became the owner of Best Of All. Hackett won a lot of money with the colt, and then sold him for a long price as a stallion to Hanover Shoe Farms.

Best Of All's main rival was Billy Haughton's Romulus Hanover. They met in the Jug, and after Best Of All won a tough first heat, Billy scratched his colt out of the second. When he did, he gave as the reason that his colt was not right, running a temperature over 102.00. (Average normal horse temp is between 99° and 100°.)

That Jug day was blisteringly hot. It was a Smart family joke that after those 3-year-old colts had warmed up two or three trips and then raced their hearts out in the near 90° degree heat, every one of them would have been running a temp over 102° if any had bothered to take it. But Billy was never at a loss for words.

The filly winner of this year's Hackett Memorial is Toes In The Water. She's by Long Tom and out of Royal Bikini, by RC Royalty. She's the first foal of her dam, and she brought \$12,000 as a yearling. It's a safe bet future siblings will make considerably higher prices in the sales ring.

Hers is an interesting pedigree. For starters, she's 3 by 3 to Muscles Yankee, making her inbred to that foundational sire. As a quick refresher, when the sum of two generations in which the same name appears is six or less, the correct term to describe the relationship is "inbreeding."

When the sum of the two generations in which the same ancestor's name appears is seven or eight, you have "Line Breeding."



As a breeder, no man, or woman, ever bred as many top horses from such a small band of mares as Keller's Yankeeland Farm.

When there is no relationship closer than nine, a horse so bred is correctly described as an "outcross."

In the case of Toesy, Long Tom, her sire is himself an interesting pedigree study. His dam, Ilia, is a masterpiece started by Charlie Keller, with the finishing strokes put on by Dr. Paul Spears, aka Pete.

Ilia is 3 by 3, or inbred, to Yankee Scottie, She was bred by the great Yankee ballplayer, Charlie Keller, who never got his true due either on the diamond or as a horse breeder.

As a player in the Yankee's outfield, Keller was always overshadowed by his teammate, Joe DiMaggio. However, there were a number of seasons when Keller outplayed Joltin' Joe, but the sporting press never acknowledged it. Likewise when it came to baseball's Hall of Fame. Keller's name belongs there, but it never happened.

As a breeder, no man, or woman, ever bred as many top horses from such a small band of mares as Keller's Yankeeland Farm.


Keller was drawn into the standardbred world by his neighbor, Joe Eyler, a Jack of all trades who trained and drove harness horses, put on sales, and dealt in livestock. At one of Eyler's sales Keller bought his first mare, China L.


China L was consigned by the Estate of Will Reynolds, and her appearance in the sale was

a tribute to Joe Eyler's horse hustling ability. She was beautifully bred, being a daughter of Jane Revere, one of whose daughters produced the legendary Rosalind and another was the dam of Worthy Boy. Also in the immediate family was Nora, dam of another legendary trotting Champion, Scott Frost.

Keller was smart enough to keep China L's daughters, and then the daughters of the daughters, etc., etc., and so forth in the words of the King of Siam to Anna. Our little harness racing world would be much the poorer without the horses Charlie Keller bred, and our world in the larger sense is the poorer without this soft-spoken gentle man who never got his due, and never, ever said one word of complaint.







The passion and generosity of owner Adriano Sorella

Adriano Sorella is one of Canada's leading standardbred owners. Perhaps his numbers might not bear this out completely. But in terms of his views and devotion for the sport of harness racing, there are very few, if any, that surpass him. His equine holdings at present number somewhere in the order of 25. This number is comprised of racehorses, broodmares, yearlings and foals of 2022, those already here and those still expected. The "favored son" of his horse holdings is obviously the promising young stallion and racehorse Jimmy Freight.

Adriano is the youngest of four boys and six children born to Italian immigrants Pasquale and Tilde Sorella in Toronto.

"I suppose my family might be considered to have been lower middle class," said Sorella. "My education was limited to being a high school graduate. Along the way to my present vocation in advertising and my sub-vocation of harness racing as it were, are stints of several years as a butcher and as an apprentice plumber. I was making good money in both."

Q: What led you to harness racing?

"I started out with thoroughbreds. My brothers and I were regular attendees at Woodbine. We all went there and developed a love for betting on the horses and a love for the horses themselves. I was introduced to a thoroughbred trainer named Bill Marko. He was very well known as the trainer of such champion horses as Deputy Minister and Frost King. He won Sovereign Awards as Canada's top trainer in 1982 and 1983. When I first met him he invited me to the backstretch to learn about the inner workings of what went on back there. He said that if I was looking to invest in horses to look him up. I was doing well with a decent amount of disposable cash. One day I decided that I was going to buy a horse. I went to Bill's stable with \$10,000 cash in my pocket. My goal was to have Bill get me a horse. 'That's not the way it's done,' Markos said. Instead he took the \$10,000 and put



me in ownership groups in buying some horses which raced as claimers and in the lower classes. I liked being involved, but I soon became bored. Far differently from our horses, these would generally race as infrequently as once a month. I needed more action. I got out.

"At about the same time the Ontario Jockey Club was sponsoring a New Owners seminar meant to attract new owners to harness racing. The idea was that 10 fledgling owners were each to put up \$4,500. The Ontario SBOA would contribute \$15,000. The grand total was \$60,000 per group. The idea was to buy two yearlings for the group. The trainers were to be Casie Coleman and John Kopas. At the time Casie's stable was just getting started with younger horses. That year she had Sportswriter and was doing very well. I approached her with a view to getting involved to a greater extent with yearlings. She was filled up. She recommended Blake Macintosh. I got a few claimers with Blake. I discovered that I really liked these harness horses. They

would race as often as every week instead of once a month. I went to Casie and told her I wanted to go big time. I wanted a top horse — like her Sportswriter. I wanted to get one like him. She agreed to let me in if there was a vacancy in her stable."

Q: So here we are, you are sitting on the sidelines, waiting for your chance to get into the game.

"Casie went to Lexington. She had a group of her small number of long time owners lined up. They were focused on Hip No 5, a Bettors Delight colt named Vegas Vacation. They expected him to bring more money than they were accustomed to spending on yearlings. As I recall they expected him to bring well north of \$60,000. Instead he fetched only \$32,000. Steve Calhoun was supposed to be in for half. He thought there must have been something wrong with him for him to bring only \$32,000. He asked Casie to find someone else to take that half if she were able. That someone was me. I am somewhat superstitious. I loved the name Vegas Vacation. I love Las Vegas. I considered his name to be a good omen for future success. I bought the half. Casie was in for the other half. She let her assistant trainer Anthony Beaton in for five percent and her

bookkeeper April Campbell for another five per cent. The rest is history. As you know, he turned out to be a wonderful horse. Among his notable triumphs was a victory in the 2013 Little Brown Jug. This yearling game is easy, I thought to myself. Little did I know."

Q: Since then you've bought into many more yearlings. You haven't come close to having the success that you attained with Vegas Vacation. Instead, your greatest success and the horse with which you are most associated was the then 2-year-old Jimmy Freight. How did this come about?

"Through the years I've done a lot of business with the horse agent Marc Reynolds. Marc had a horse that he thought was what I was looking for. It was for sale for \$150,000. I was ready to buy it. Then as sometimes happens, the owners decided that they had changed their minds. They had decided not to sell it.. A few days later Marc called back. He had found a very promising

2-year-old in Iowa of all places. I didn't even know where Iowa was. He had won five races in a row. He was by Sportswriter and was eligible to the Ontario Sires Stakes. The Ontario races were the only stakes to which he was eligible. But if I bought him I would have him in my own backyard as it were. I was interested.

"I told Marc I would look him up. It was true he was undefeated and had won five in a row. But he was going in 2:12. But even with five wins, all he had earned was only \$6,000. Marc said he was a lot better horse than he looked on paper. He had just gone in 1:8 on a lowa fair track. They wanted \$150,000 for him. I thought that was too much. I told Marc to see if he could get him bought for less, much less. I was thinking in terms of \$100,000 or thereabouts. They wouldn't budge. Furthermore, they said that he now wasn't for sale.

"Tony Alagna was training my horses then. Tony got involved. He said that he would try to get the horse bought. He did and the price was \$115,000. He was first shipped to Tony in New Jersey. Then he went to Ontario that same week for his first race with me as his owner. He won an Ontario Gold race in 1.52.3. I was ecstatic. I thought to myself, 'It looks like we really got a good one.' We finished the year with earnings of \$180,00 and a second place finish in the OSS finals. Then came his 3-year-old season. I

really messed up and still kick myself for not staking him more than I did. I didn't even put him in Canada's biggest race the North America Cup. We ended up supplementing him to some other races. He finished the season with earnings of \$900,000. I have only myself to blame. Looking back, I cannot give you a good reason why I didn't stake him more than I did."

Q: What you did with Jimmy at 3 and 4 was unique in that for all intents and purposes he was raced out of two stables - one in Canada and one in the States.

"It just made sense to me. In Canada I had him in Richard Moreau's stable and in the States, he raced for Andrew Harris. Of course, in order to do this you would need to have both of your trainers invested in the policy. Richard was cool with it, perhaps mostly because he only races in Canada. He has his stable here. He is here and his help is here. Andrew was just fine with it as well. He was going to have a high quality horse in his stable that he otherwise wouldn't have. It was a win-win situation for everybody concerned — Richard, Andrew, myself and most of all Jimmy."

Q: Then came his 4-year-old season. You decided to bring him back to race instead of taking him to stud.

"I don't regret doing that at all. Perhaps I could have got a better deal in the States if I had retired him at 3, but I love racing so much, especially watching Jimmy race. To some degree that's why I brought him back to race this year at 6. He is doing very well in both racing and breeding. I wonder why more people haven't done this. It might not be the panacea for all horses, but it certainly has been rewarding for me and Jimmy. If he continues to race as well as he has thus far this year, he should surpass his sire in lifetime earnings and has a good chance of getting over the \$2 million mark."

Q: You brought him to Canada to stand when there was the opportunity to stand him in the States. Any reason?

"Perhaps mostly because I'm a Canadian. I feel that the Sires Stakes program here in Ontario is one of the best, if not the very best in all of North America. From an owner's perspective, I believe it definitely is so. The stakes payments are very low. The shipping costs as well as the ease of transport are so much easier than those to be found in most American programs. I love going to the track to see my horses race. I also like the opportunity to see Jimmy in person whenever I have the urge to do so. Its so much easier to do it here than it is in places like Pennsylvania and New York where thew tracks can be significantly far away from each other. I was somewhat influenced by my good friend Dan Fisher of Standardbred Canada. I don't regret doing it at all."

Q: You are a big devotee of social media. On there you frequently make your views known. Not all of them are positive relative to the way we do things in our sport.

"I think that we are living in our own little world. We are not receptive to new ideas and outlooks. We speak mostly to ourselves when we should be speaking outside of our own little boxes. Most of the outside world has no idea that we even exist, let alone having any desire to be involved in the sport. We are losing owners every year without replacing them. Jeff Gural is right when he says that he worries that the young people in the sport have no future. Yet our so called leaders think that all is well in the sport, instead of addressing the problems that we have. Just check what the president and chairman of USTA had to say about the status of the sport at the recent annual meeting of the association. We are fiddling while Rome burns."

Q: You are well known for your generosity both in and out of the business.

"I suppose I got that from my father. He was an extremely generous person. When the ice cream truck would come by in our neighborhood, he would not only buy ice cream for all the kids, he also bought for the older people as well. He wasn't near being a wealthy person, but he derived a great deal of pleasure in sharing any bounty that he possessed. I suppose that maybe I've raised the bar a notch. Many religions tell us we should derive more pleasure from giving rather than taking. Even when I didn't have the wealth that I now have, I got a lot of pleasure from tipping well and picking up checks. That also applied to having functions where I can sit down with friends and raise a glass or two. One thing I have come to realize is that sometimes people you expect to be loyal and are disappointed when in a world that often lacks loyalty."

Q: You said that you sometimes are not recognized today by people who have not seen you for quite some time.

"I guess that's because I've lost well in excess of 100 pounds in about two years. Before they ask me, one of the first things I tell these folks is that I am not suffering from any sort of terminal disease. To the contrary, I am now more healthy than I have been at any time in my adult life."



Q: How did you accomplish this?

"During the pandemic I became somewhat depressed. I suppose that many people did. With me, it was the combination of a breakup with a lady with whom I had a relationship for quite some time and the general malaise that was and still is so prevalent during this period of time of great suffering. There is no magic bullet or diet. Simply put, I began walking. I started walking in downtown Guelph. At the start, in May 2020 I walked 3,500 steps a day. I gradually increased it to doing it twice a day — every day. I noticed that I was losing weight. It wasn't because I was dieting. I was still eating as much and for the most part the same foods that I had been. At the time, I weighed 365 pounds. I kept increasing the number of steps twice a day to 16,000. I kept losing weight. I got up to 24,000 steps. I set a goal of 260 pounds. When I reached that plateau, I then set what I thought was an unattainable mark of 200 pounds. I had never been at that weight at any time in my adult life. I did adjust my diet somewhat. When at home I ate fairly healthy. When I eat out, I eat and drink as I always have. I now weigh 180 pounds. I have never felt as good as I do now. I've lost over 150 pounds. I'm about to reach what I believe to be a significant goal. The circumference of the Earth is 24,901 miles. If my figuring is correct, I should reach that number sometimes this May. People ask me when will enough be enough? The truth is I don't really know."

Go fourth young man

Let's take a look at 20 famous fourth-place finishes in harness racing history (with a thoroughbred or two thrown in):

- **20. ART MAJOR** was fourth in the 2002 Jug final. But Mach Three (second in the North America Cup and winner of the Meadowlands Pace) was last in here. Million Dollar Cam won it. Art Major had no problem winning this division though in both 2002 and as a 4-year-old in 2003.
- **19. AMIGO VOLO** was fourth in the 2020 Hambletonian from post 10. He had terrible bad luck at the 3/4 pole when he got trapped behind a gapper. He still went on to win the Kentucky Futurity and the Breeders Crown and wrapped up divisional honors.
- **18. CRYSTAL FASHION** was fourth in the 2018 Hambletonian as the favorite. That was the year Atlanta won. Crystal Fashion set the elimination all-time Hambletonian mark with a 1:50.1 score the same day en route to a million-dollar season for Jim Campbell.
- **17. DOUBLEMINT** was fourth in the 1978 Hambletonian in the year Speedy Somolli won. Doublemint was trying to give Team Haughton a three-peat, which still has never happened for one barn in the Hambletonian. He went on to Roosevelt International glory taking it at age 4 in 1979.
- **16. ARMBRO KEEPSAKE** was fourth in the 1992 Hambletonian as the 2.20-1 favorite for John Campbell and Chuck Sylvester. It was the first time a female was favored in East Rutherford in the Hambletonian. That was year Alf Palema won.
- **15. LAUGHS** was fourth in the 1986 Meadowlands Pace elims, then won the final. He was the first 10-1 to win the Pace. Buddy Gilmour drove and it was his second Pace score in three years coming after On The Road Again won the richest ever edition in 1984 for \$1,293,000.
- **14. SEATTLE SLEW** was fourth in the race after he won the Triple Crown in 1977. He was fourth beaten nine lengths in his very next start in California to J O Tobin. It was the only time Seattle Slew was ever off the board.
- **13. KRAMER BOY** was fourth in the 1996 Hambletonian. Continentalvictory won it over Lindy Lane. Jimmy Takter trained Kramer Boy, who a year later was the Horse Of The Year in

- Sweden, making Takter the only trainer to have the HOY on two continents in one year. Malabar Man won the title in the U.S.
- **12. ARTISCAPE** was fourth in the 1998 Jug. Mike Lachance had chosen off eventual winner Shady Character for Artiscape. Artiscape would win the Breeders Crown in 1998 as a repeater and later would sire the 2004 HOY Rainbow Blue.
- **11. STRONG YANKEE** was fourth in the 2005 Hambletonian-he bounced back quickly, though. Taking the Kentucky Futurity in an epic three-horse duel and also the Breeders Crown right back at the Meadowlands. His brother Yankee Slide had won in the year before.
- **10. SUPERGILL** was fourth in the 1988 Hambletonian. He was easily the most expensive yearling in the field selling for a record \$500,000 in 1986. His dam Winkys Gill was a fast-closing second in the 1983 Hambletonian won by Duenna making girls 1-2 on the biggest stage— not repeated since.
- **9. JOIE DE VIE** was fourth in the 1983 Hambletonian final in John Campbell's Hambletonian debut.
- **8. STEADY STAR** was fourth in the 1970 Jug at 110.20-1. That's not a misprint, over 100-1. He would time trial in 1:54 at 3 and then 1:52 the next year at 4, the latter the standard that Niatross lowered in 1980 to 1:49.1.
- **7.ADIOS VIC** was fourth in the 1965 Jug-won by Bret Hanover. The only horse to beat Bret more than once? Adios Vic.
- **6. NO PAN INTENDED** missed the board once in 2003 in his HOY season, when he finished fourth in the Meadowlands Pace won by Allamerican Theory.
- **5. FOREGO** finished fourth in the 1973 Kentucky Derby. The gigantic, yet still inexperienced youngster, would make a lot more noise at 4, 5 and 6 in 1974, 1975 and 1976 when he was named Horse of the Year all three seasons. Since Secretariat was the 1972-1973 HOY, that meant the 1973 Derby had the most HOY titles ever in that one field.
- **4. MATTS SCOOTER** was fourth in the 1988 Meadowlands Pace elims and then turned around and won the final in his 1:48.2 TT season. He was the 23-for-30 the next year, when he won the Horse of the Year.
- **3. SECRETARIAT** was a bumpy fourth with Ben Feliciano, Jr., in his July 1972 debut, but six months later was named HOY at age 2.
- **2. CHAPTER SEVEN** was fourth in the 2011 Hambletonian. He had a late start that year and was behind the 8-ball on the first Saturday in August. He went off at 2.20-1, but was a non-threatening fourth. From that point on, he was a terror and added two Breeders Crowns a 1:50.1 mark and a HOY title.
- **1. NIATROSS** was fourth in the 1980 Meadowlands Pace elimination, making a brief break to which he quickly recovered. Clint Galbraith said this was his best race ever to even qualify for the Pace final after all this adversity.





Matt Riggle has luck on his side with new purchase

As activity leading up to the opening of Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino shifted into gear in early March, horseman Matt Riggle searched for a young prospect to add to his small stable. With only one pupil ready to race – and later claimed opening weekend – the owner/trainer needed another option. He took a chance on unraced sophomore Lucky Lil Lady, and the filly has quickly delivered two victories, the latest an impressive off the pace effort Thursday (April 28).

"I purchased her from LeWayne Miller. He put her up for sale after he qualified her. I'm just guessing he thought she probably wasn't going to be a stake horse or top horse like that," Riggle said. "I only had one horse racing, and he was claimed the opening weekend at Hoosier. I had a trotting filly I was getting ready. She had not qualified yet. And I had a 2-year-old I was getting ready. So I didn't have any racehorses, and I was looking for something. She's not the biggest filly, but she can cover some ground. She's got a great attitude. Everything has worked out so far with her. I don't know how far she'll go, but she's still learning."

Despite her lack of racing experience, Lucky Lil Lady has shown flashes of talent, particularly in how she closes out races. In her March 9 qualifier for Miller, the filly finished last in a field of six, yet paced a :27.1 last quarter. Two weeks later, she won a qualifying effort in 2:01, coming home in :27.2. Making her debut in a division of the Rosie Harness Memorial, Lucky Lil Lady wired the field to win by a head in 1:55.1, kicking home for Sam Widger in :27.3.

"I figured I could teach her a thing or two, take it easy on her. She was super impressive her first start. I was really happy with her," said Riggle. "She got in with some pretty tough horses there. Her start before this last one she got scorched and parked the mile."

Third her next time out, the Luck Be Withyou—Diorama filly missed the board in consecutive starts that followed, pacing sixth and ninth. In her last attempt on April 21, the sophomore was parked the entire mile after a lively :26.3 opening panel. She finished last for Riggle.

"Last week when she got parked, Sammy tried leaving with her. She had a horse on the inside of her and outside of her. To me, and Sammy thought so too, she just got a little panicky and wasn't sure what to do. She had never left that hard off the car. They went a quarter in 26 and change. She got a little fumbly and he had to gather her up and ended up parked the mile," the trainer commented.

At 41 years of age, Riggle has become accustomed to taking the castoff horses from larger stables and turning them into racehorses. He desired to make a career of racing horses from a very early age. His aspirations stemmed from watching his grandfather, Henry Carter, campaign horses throughout the years. Carter provided his grandson the opportunity to work with his stable as Riggle grew and matured.



"I've been doing this since I was five years old. My grandpa got me into it and I never got away from it," he shared. "He always had a couple, one or two. He always had racehorses, always something for me to fiddle around with. The older I got, he just let me take the reins with it and he supported it and I just went and raced them. It's always been my passion."

Growing up in the Mishawaka area of northern Indiana, Riggle didn't immediately jump into racing when he graduated from high school. He worked in the mobile home and recreational vehicle factories that are plentiful in the region, biding his time and putting away money. His grandfather had given him a broodmare, and Riggle waited for

the first foals to reach racing age. Once they were ready, he quit his factory job and shifted his focus to racing.

"I stabled at Balmoral for almost three years. Back in my early 20s I had anywhere between 10 and 12 up there. I've been all over the place just trying to make it," he said. "This business has ups and downs for a small stable when you don't have money supporting you. My backup was always going back to the factories. If I had rough times in the horse business I just went back to work there, got back grounded, and tried again."

Relentless in his pursuit, Riggle has pieced together back-to-back seasons that have allowed him to support himself and his family. In 2020, he sent out 13 winners with earnings exceeding \$85,000. Last season, his 63 starters collected nine wins and almost \$113,000 in purses. Dubious Claim, a son of Western Terror, accounted for five of those wins in 2021. Riggle also bought a JK Endofanera yearling in 2020 that he sold privately last June after her first start.

"I'm not in any position to turn down a decent amount of money, as much as I love some of these horses," said Riggle, who moved less than an hour north of Hoosier Park to Warren, Ind. last year. "Being a small stable, it's hard to turn down the dollars from the bigger guys, you know?"

After two tough outings, Lucky Lil Lady rebounded Thursday evening at Hoosier Park in a \$7,500 conditioned event. Drawing post five in the 10-horse field, Widger ducked the filly and raced in the rear of the field through a :57.3 opening half. Rolling out of the last turn, the sophomore used the long stretch to her advantage. Once in gear, Lucky Lil Lady swept by the field to win by two lengths, dashing to the wire in :27.1 and stop the clock in a lifetime best 1:54.4.



"She can get home good. It was just a matter of whether she could maintain that speed throughout the mile or not and still get home in :27 when they started stepping up a little bit," Riggle said. "She proved last night that she can make up a ton of ground if it needs to be. I'm not scared to duck her and race her off the back end of the mile until she learns to leave off the car."

The owner plans to drop Lucky Lil Lady back in the same condition next week. Despite winning her second race of the season, she still fits due to earnings under \$14,000. The filly will carry a claiming price of \$17,000.

"Going forward, what she does, she might not go in for a tag. For right now I'm going to leave her where she's at unless she shows me otherwise," he said. "She's already made \$10,000 for me. It's hard to replace one that races good. When I go down there, I go down there for the purpose of making money. For what I paid for her and what she's in to be claimed for, if someone wanted to give that kind of money for her, I'm in the green."

To date, Riggle has sent out three winners in nine Hoosier Park starts this season, with a second and third-place finish to his credit. He has a .432 UDRS and \$18,250 in earnings a month into the meet, thanks in part to the success of Lucky Lil Lady.

"She's been super. She's an absolute sweetheart in the barn and just to race in general," Riggle said. "I don't know how good she's ever going to be, but, hey, she's a gem to me. Kind of like a diamond in the rough."





Trainer Jason Grimson has stamped his name on the game in a hurry

"Who is this quy?"

That is what most harness racing followers were asking themselves at the height of the theatre that was last December's Inter Dominion pacing final at Menangle in Sydney.

And that's how quickly and stunningly that "guy" – young trainer Jason Grimson – has emerged into the big league.

Grimson had just watched his recycled and much-improved pacer Boncel Benjamin run a close second in the pacing final and felt he'd been robbed. He charged down to the track after watching the race, spoke with young driver Josh Gallagher, and the pair immediately fired in a protest against Expensive Ego's driver David Moran for taking their running halfway down the straight.

Once inside the stewards' room where the protest was covered live on TV, most people had their first glimpse of Grimson.

Polarizing, arrogant, shy, different cat ... just some of the ways I'd heard Grimson described before that protest hearing.

Although frustrated and impatient at times, Grimson argued his case well, Gallagher did his bit and – in a decision which still divides opinions – the protest was upheld and Boncel Benjamin crowned the Inter Dominion winner.

Whether you agree with the verdict or not, what's indisputable is the remarkable job Grimson did transforming Boncel Benjamin from a "has-been" claimer into winner of Down Under's biggest and most-sought after pacing prize.

"Even all these months later, I still marvel at it," Boncel Benjamin's part-owner and former trainer Steve Duffy said. "He'd only had a horse a few weeks when he told us he'd win a big race with him... he was right."

In those euphoric moments after the "win," I overheard a leading racing journalist ask Grimson: "Needless to say he (Boncel Benjamin) is the best horse you've trained?"

The always direct Grimson replied: "Nope, he's not even the best horse in my stable."

Grimson had been telling those closest to him for months that another recycled former Victorian pacer Majestic Cruiser was

the stable star.

Majestic Cruiser only finished sixth, albeit from a bad draw, in that Inter Dominion final, but Grimson knew it was a learning curve.

"It was the series he needed. He was a sit-sprinter, a bit one dimensional before it, but he had bad draws, had to do some work through the series and it really toughened him up," Grimson said.

Last Friday Grimson did what very few Aussies have been able to do, go to New Zealand and beat their best on their own patch.

And he did it with Majestic Cruiser.

More on that soon, but let's get back to that first question ... "who is this guy?"

Grimson grew up in the passionately strong harness region that is NSW's Riverina. Home was Young, about 90 minutes from the mecca of the region, Wagga.





"Dad was a trainer and I did a lot with the horses when I was really young, but then he gave it away," Grimson said.

"I had a long time away from the horses. I moved to Canberra and was a concreter there for five years, that's where I thought my life would be.

"It was hard work, really hard work, but you made good money. In the end, I just got sick of it and started to think about the horses again."

Grimson moved back to the Riverina, worked with a couple of local trainers, and then came an offer from Jarrod Alchin to move to the "big smoke" (Sydney) and work for him.

"He (Grimson) was just a natural horseman. You could see it straight away and people talked about it who'd worked with him (in the Riverina)," Alchin said.

After a year or so with Alchin, Grimson got the first horse of his own, filly Dont Think Twice, who won the Group 1 Bathurst (2YO) Gold Tiara.

"I was so lucky, the first horse I got won a Group 1 race. Then I was up and running," he said.

Grimson's stable continued to grow at Menangle, but it has been the past 18 months where he's stamped himself – first through NSW, then nationally and now internationally.

"To take a horse to NZ and beat their best is very satisfying. It's up with anything I've done so far, for sure," he said.

"It's another milestone for me and the people I've met and things I've learned in the few weeks here have been invaluable. I'm sure I'll head home a better trainer for it."

Grimson's sights are already set on more big race riches at Queensland's "Constellations" Carnival in June and July.

"Majestic Cruiser will have a week off in NZ and then come home to get ready for Queensland. He'll head a big team of horses I'll take up there for the major races," he said.

Majestic Cruiser's major targets will be the Group 1 double of the Sunshine Sprint (July 16) and Blacks A Fake (July 23).

Meanwhile, Majestic Cruiser's former trainer Geoff Webster, one of Australia's most decorated horsemen, keeps watching on in awe.

"He's a genius. He's taken two horses for me and had great success with them both, I've just sent him a third," he said.







Yes to Elitloppet – no to Paralympiatravet

Per Nordström-trained **Önas Prince** (Chocolatier) hit the lead at an early stage when Örebro racetrack played host to the last elimination ahead of Paralympiatravet, and when Nordström was allowed to keep the pace at a relatively low level, the challengers were out of chances to catch up with the efficient front runner.

Five-year-old Önas Prince dominated in the Swedish 4-year-old crop last season and Nordström has been very clear about the plans for his horse. Elitloppet at Solvalla has been the big objective and appropriately enough, the pink ticket was received

just minutes after the race in Örebro on Saturday (April 30). However, Nordström declined the free ticket to next week's final of the Paralympiatravet.

Önas Prince won in 1:52.3 and he became the eighth trotter invited to the 2022 Elitloppet.

The \$85,000 Orebro Int'l over 3,140 meters was claimed by Norwegian 5-year-old **Falcon Eye** (Father Patrick) after a perfect pocket trip, served by driver Erik Adielsson.

Ce Bello Romain, again in Argentan

The \$105,000 Criterium de Vitesse de Basse-Normandie was held in Argentan, France on Saturday (April 30) afternoon and title defender **Ce Bello Romain** (Jam Pridem) sprinted to safe win in a moderate 1:57.4 mile.

The pace was extremely low throughout the race, at least in consideration to the level of horses in the field, but Ce Bello Romain impressed when he finished very fast in the race's last half-mile after a pocket trip behind leader Express Jet. The 10-year-old Ce Bello Romain was successful in high staked races in northern Europe last season and the entourage around the French trotter will likely aim for another trip north this summer.

Open till five?

Daniel Featherstone, my college roommate, is a nice guy. A couple of times each year, we meet for coffee, where he never fails to taunt me about Flying Feathers. About 10 years ago, I talked Featherstone into a small percentage of a yearling. We bought a filly and named her Flying Feathers. Alas, Flying Feathers did not fly on the racetrack.

Featherstone is wealthy. Losing a few grand should have been an insignificant blip for a man of his means. It was not. Featherstone took the yearling losses hard and was one-and-done in the harness horse ownership game. Why rich people take losing money badly while poor mooks laugh it off is a fascinating topic for another time.

Featherstone set down his Starbucks latte and began, "I am essentially an outsider looking at your sport. I'm not privy to data, but a proposal has danced on the fringes of my mind."

I threw my hands up and wailed, "Whoa... privy to, danced on the fringes of my mind? You've been watching too much *Bridgerton* or *Masterpiece Theatre*," I said.

He smiled. "Just trying to elevate our conversation level. Anyway, what if standardbred racehorses were required to retire at the end of their 5-year-old season?"

I shook my head, "What if you lie down until your fever breaks? We already have a shortage of racehorses."

He returned my head shake, "That is mathematical nonsense. Racehorses will magically appear if racetracks create races with large purses for slower, younger horses. The problem is that your sport creates a situation where slower young horses are not economically feasible. Culling aged horses and replacing them with younger horses is a zero-sum equation.

"I call BS."

He said, "Remove stakes races from the equation. They are a different category."

"Okay."

"And remove emotions from the equation. This drastic change would be difficult, and I am completely aware that emotion can, and does, eclipse logic."

I winced. "We see a lot of that, but let's not get into politics."

"Think about this statewide racing model. Not the best model, but it is what you have in harness racing. Say a state races 1,000 race programs at their various racetracks over a calendar year."

"Okay," I said warily.

"Say the average state race program consists of 10 races with an average purse of \$15,000. They pay purses of \$150,000 per program."

"Okay," I mumbled.

"In reality, the type of racehorse, the speed of the races, the AGE of the horses is, for the most part, irrelevant."

"IRRELEVANT? Speed rules in this game."

"Speed is essential in your game. A fast racehorse is a goal in your game, but speed is not everything. Entertainment and economics are factors. You have watched a thousand horse races where a massive favorite wins by 10 lengths. Are they entertaining, profitable, or good for your sport? Or is a competitive race with additional variables more valuable?"

"Let me say clearly, no, I don't know, and I don't think so."

He asked, "Have you ever attended a minor league hockey game or a minor league baseball game?"

"Yes, they are a blast."

He nodded. "Those slightly lesser hockey players may have less skill. Using another analogy, the pitchers are one mile an hour slower with their fastball in some levels of baseball. The performers are not quite elite. People prefer good competition more than watching a stopwatch."

"People don't bet on Minor League games."

"They will."

I waved him off, "Apples and oranges. You are suggesting age discrimination. That's illegal. You can't do that."

"Your sport already does. If I'm not mistaken, racehorses must retire at 14. Why not 5 or 6 or 9?"

"You can't age discriminate people in sports."

"Not true. Making harness horses retire at 14 already is discrimination by age. I have investments in a professional baseball team that plays in a baseball league with age designations. The retirement age is very clear from day one. I have never heard a complaint in 10 years. (see attachment below) Sure, there were emotional moments when the league rules forced teams and fans to say goodbye to beloved veteran players, but the end comes for every sportsperson or racehorse. Those baseball players knew their glory days were ticking away. And ironically, in many cases, the older professional ballplayers were playing the sport better than ever, certainly better than the rookies, but the wheel turns."

I moaned, "Horse racing is different."

"Maybe it shouldn't be. What do you suppose is the average age of a professional sports athlete?

"Um, 34?"

"Twenty-eight. An exceptional few will break the mold. There are exceptions like Tom Brady or Max Scherzer, who play on until 40. They are exceptions. Other sports have churn based on age. In horse racing, how many racehorses improve after age 8?"

"No many, but heck, if you get one of those tough, ultraconsistent racehorses that race year after year, the thought of early forced retirement is repulsive."

He paused and continued, "Look, moving your favorite trotter to greener pastures will be difficult, heartbreaking, and devasting. But cycling out horses at a designated retirement date would be the rule and give owners ample time to find retirement situations and placements."

"You want to have that discussion? You want to break hearts?"

He raised his voice an octave, "An early retirement age could break fewer hearts and be good for the sport. Think about it like this. Old Race Time Ben is a gritty, outstanding 9-year-old pacer that has made over 100 starts. Great story. Suppose Old Race Time Ben races five more years and gets another hundred starts. Those additional starts could be races available to marginal young horses currently culled at age 3. Don't forget, we said a sad goodbye to Flying Feathers, a horse that was also loved but was on the fringes of competitiveness.

I sneered, "Basically, you suggest that a supply of young and slower horses will replace the supply of slightly faster veterans."

"Yes, somebody has to go. If left to the winds of fate and momentum, those aged warhorses will race to age fourteen. The optimal time for culling the racing herd should be a decision based on analytics, not emotion."

I grudgingly gave his idea some support, "That could be more fun for owners who invest in yearlings. How many of us do the dance, pay the money, dream the dreams, have a horse qualify, and then discover that the horse is qualified but not competitive?

He nodded, "Like Flying Feathers."

I said, "Right now, Flying Feathers does not belong. Your system would let him race a few years, provide the ownership some fun, and make enough to put a dent in the feed and training bills at the expense of a reliable old warhorse."

He nodded, "Once again, this age limit does not affect the stakes racing programs. The cream of owners and racehorses still want to be the best and race for the most. That's fine. The age rule would only change the racing scene in the commercial racing segment. And, of course, there would be more churn in the breeding market if owners would need to restock more often."

I heaved a big sigh, "Asking an owner to pull the shoes off their racehorse does not feel right."

"Run the numbers, look at the big picture. It's better business, my friend."

AGE RULES FOR THE FRONTIER PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL LEAGUE

No player or player/coach may have attained twenty-nine (29) years of age prior to Oct. 1 of that playing season — with the exception of the **four veteran classification players** as described below.

Players without prior affiliated baseball (MiLB) experience must be **at least 18 years** old to play in the Frontier League.

Rookie Classification: The Rookie classification will be split into two sub-classifications, Rookie-1 and Rookie-2. The Rookie-1 sub-classification will be for players who made their professional debut in the current season and therefore have no prior professional experience or whose experience does not meet the minimum appearances listed below. The Rookie-2 sub-classification is for **players who have one year of professional experience.**

Experienced Classification: The Experienced classification is for all players who do not meet the requirements to be classified under the Rookie or Veteran classifications.

Veteran Classification: The Veteran classification is for a player who is **over twenty-nine (29) years of age prior to Oct. 1** of that playing season. For the 2021 season, any player born on or before September 30, 1993 will be a Veteran classification regardless of their prior playing experience.

Burke Stable poised for monstrous Ohio stakes season after second Hackett sweep

Trainer Ron Burke should feel extremely confident about his talented troupe of Ohio-sired sophomore pacers as the first leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes season is set to kickoff at Miami Valley Raceway next week. After sweeping the top three positions in the \$50,000 James K. Hackett Memorial for fillies on Tuesday (April 26), the colts from the Burke Brigade matched the feat on Thursday (April 28) in their championship tilt. The Hackett has been recognized as a preview and springboard into Ohio Sires Stakes action for decades.

Elimination winner **Barry's Berries** (Tony Hall) was gunned out of the gate to secure the early lead in :27. He yielded to favored stablemate Seaside Way (Ronnie Wrenn Jr.) before the :54.1 half.

The pair remained that way through the 1:22.1 three quarters and into the stretch. At that point Barry's Berries moved out to mount a successful challenge, collaring Seaside Way in the final strides. A third Burke pupil, Terminator (Chris Page) rallied to finish third and complete the trifecta sweep. The winner paid \$5.60, the exacta was worth \$12, and the correct 50-cent trifecta returned \$9.

In addition to being trained by Burke, the trio of top colts are all sons of the dominant Ohio sire Downbytheseaside.

Starting today (May 1), Miami Valley will present seven straight days of racing through May 7 to complete the 87-day 2022 meet.

Fashion Schooner has Oaks hopes after Big M score

Fashion Schooner had a rough go of it last year as a 2-year-old, but you wouldn't know it if you saw her Friday night (April 29) at The Meadowlands.

The daughter of Walner—Broadway Schooner won her first outing of 2022 in impressive fashion, grabbing the top after the quarter-mile marker and rolling home to a dominant score in a non-winners of two for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

It was her first win from five career starts, but trainer Jim Campbell has high hopes for his filly, whose dam – a Campbell trainee – was victorious in the 2009 Hambletonian Oaks.

"I was very happy with her," said Campbell of Fashion Schooner. "She's got a lot of ability. We've got to make sure she keeps her composure. She's the type of filly who can get herself nervous and worked up, so we've been working with her. She was good in both of her qualifiers and was good tonight. We've been doing a lot of teaching."

Fashion Schooner went around leader Mrs Taylor, who hit the quarter in :29.3, and made the top soon thereafter. Driven by Tim Tetrick, she hit the half in :58.1 and three-quarters in 1:27.1 before sprinting home in :27.1 to record a powerhouse 8¼-length destruction in 1:54.2 as Mrs Taylor held on to second. Ever Lovin was third.

As the 4-5 favorite, Fashion Schooner returned \$3.60 to her backers.

Were she to continue to improve, big things await in 2022.

"Last year, she got sick back in the spring and we had to stop with her until she got over it," said Campbell. "She got a late start because of that. We raced her one time at The Meadowlands and she was good but then we went down to Lexington and she wasn't very good. So, we shut her down."

Campbell is crossing his fingers, looking for a possible Hambletonian Oaks win this August.

"Any 3-year-old trotting filly in my barn, I have those aspirations," said Campbell. "Me, and 50 other trainers."

Fashion Schooner is owned by Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms, who also bred the filly.

"It's been a very good family," said Campbell. "A lot of good horses have come from that line. She'll be back next Friday in the first leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes."

Buckeye Stallion Series champions look to repeat

Two 2021 Buckeye Stallion Series Champions will begin defense of their titles in the first leg of the series starting today (May 1). Miss Cowboy Star, the 2-Year-Old Filly Trot champion and All Gas No Brakes, the 2-Year-old Colt Trot champion are both scheduled to race in the first leg of the \$17,500 Buckeye Stallion Series.

The pacing champions from last year, filly champ Bittrsweetsymphony and colt champ Western Ready have their sights set on the Ohio Sires Stakes to start the year.

Miss Cowboy Star, the daughter of Long Tom, will make her second start of the season on Sunday. In her first race of the year, an elimination for the James K. Hackett Memorial, she broke stride at the start and was never a factor.

"We were hoping that she would be a Sires Stakes horse this year, but after making her break we are just going to start her in Buckeye Stallion Series first," said trainer J. Duke Sugg.

Last year, Miss Cowboy Star won eight of eleven races including two legs of the Buckeye Stallion Series and the \$60,000 finals.

Sugg says hopefully she can build up her confidence in the Stallion Series before racing in the Sires Stakes. "Realistically, you want to build some confidence after making a break so it's probably best not to start her with the best horses. I've always said a horse is like a prize fighter. You need to beat someone up to get stronger, but if you go against the best and get beat up, they go the other way."

All Gas No Brakes has started three times in 2022. The best finish so far was a third-place finish in his first start of the year.

Trainer Todd Luther says they are still fine-tuning things.

"Last week I changed a couple pieces of equipment, and it really didn't sit well with him. We'll go back to where he was and see where he is for the Stallion Series."


Luther says the son of Uncle Peter has calmed down after being hot as a 2-year-old. "He is way more mature this year. He is a nice horse and has a lot of speed."

Luther and Sugg agree that it is difficult to repeat as a champion.

"You don't know if there is a sleeper that didn't race last year, you have health issues and soundness," said Luther. "Sometimes you don't know if they have any more left in the tank because the fastest they go is as a 2-year-old.

Sugg says times have changed. "Back in the day it was easier because there were not as many good horses. Now there are so many horses that make it to the races, and they are so fast." Sugg says it comes down to post position and having some luck on your side.
