Just like he did in his elimination, Incommunicado drew post position seven in the field of eight. That did not deter the betting public, who made him the 3-5 favorite.

At the start, Yannick Gingras immediately pushed the gas pedal, sending his drive up to the front. Without much trouble, Gingras got him to the lead and the inside at the opening quarter, trotting that split in 28.2 seconds.

Incommunicado slowed things down in the second quarter, trotting the opening half-mile in 58.4 seconds, but soon encountered first-over pressure from Believer. Believer moved up to Incommunicado's throatlach around the third turn, but Incommunicado held firm and would not let his rival by. Turning for home, he pulled clear and left his rivals in the dust. The final time was 1:56.3.

Incommunicado is owned by Knutsson Trotting Inc, Little E LLC, Arthur Geiger, and David Stolz, and trained by Ake Svanstedt. He made waves last year by sweeping the Massachusetts Sire Stakes at Plainridge Park, winning the final by 17 1/4 lengths. Subsequently, he was second in the Matron at Dover Downs by half a length. For his career, he's won six times from 12 starts, with earnings of more than \$250,000.

"I wanted to get him in the race and when (Credit Con) made a break in the first turn, it made things a little easier for me." said Gingras, who won his second straight edition of the Dexter Cup. "I knew (starting from post seven) wasn't ideal. I knew it was going to be harder than last week, there wasn't going to be a hole or something like that, but he still did it pretty easily. The horse raced well and did the job. He's

a nice horse. He does everything you ask of him."

Sunny Crockett, Fifty Ways, Ambassador Hanover, Believer, Chapolier, Credit Con, and Share the Wealth completed the order of finish.

# Izzy Demsky and Spruce Creek upset in Lady Suffollk

Each of the two divisions of the Lady Suffolk trot at Freehold Raceway on Saturday featured an odds-on favorite. In both cases, the odds-on favorite went down in defeat, as Izzy Demsky and Spruce Creek prevailed in their respective divisions.

In the first division, Illuminata, for trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt, was the 3-5 favorite in the seven-horse field. Izzy Demsky, a three-time winner in the Excelsior A series last summer, was 7-2. Svanstedt put Illuminata on the lead early as she cruised through fast fractions. Although she looked clear turning for home, she grew leg-weary in the last eighth, and Izzy Demsky surged by her tired rival to win by two lengths in 1:58.4.

Izzy Demsky is owned by Courant Inc, trained by Marcus Melander, and driven by Mattias Melander. In her career, she's

now won four times from nine starts, with earnings of over \$50,000.

Jula Shines On, also trained by Svanstedt, got up for second, while Illuminata was third. The Queen B, Victoriana, Just Joshing, and Lilybet completed the order of finish in the first division.

In the second division, Ron Burke trainee Hot As Hill was the overwhelming 2-5 favorite in the field of seven. However, while on the lead at the three-eighths point, she made a costly break. Joe Bongiorno quickly got her back trotting, but she was parked on the outside and lost precious ground.

Julie Miller-trained Alpine, with driver Andy Miller, inherited the lead as a result, and turned for home with the lead. However, 15-1 longshot Spruce Creek, who was rated on the pylons the whole way by Dan Dube, stormed up the outside late to win by 2 1/2 lengths in 1:58.

Spruce Creek is owned by Robert and Yolanda Fellows and Erna Corbeil, and trained by Ron Coyne Jr. She's now won four times from 11 career starts, with earnings of more than \$60,000. Three of those wins have come at Freehold.

Alpine, Insured Am S, Move Over Some, Hot As Hill, Presto, and Big Sky Suprise rounded out the order of finish.



# Southwind Gendry blazes PASS test in 1:49.4 at The Meadows

Literl Lad Hanover won the other division to give trainer Ron Burke a PASS sweep.

Southwind Gendry solidified his spot as one of the tops in his division Saturday (May 1) at The Meadows when he blazed a Pennsylvania Sires Stake split in 1:49.4. Literl Lad Hanover captured the other division in the \$153,856 event for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers, known as the Bye Bye Byrd, giving trainer Ron Burke a stake sweep.

Purchased as a yearling for a relatively modest \$30,000, Southwind Gendry exceeded expectations by winning the PASS Championship, the Matron and divisions of the Bluegrass and International Stallion stakes en route to banking \$583,069 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Phillip Collura, Knox Services and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby.

The Bye Byrd was his first outing this year after a pair of qualifiers, but winning driver Yannick Gingras had no interest in a get-reacquainted trip, eschewing an early hole and urging the Always B Miki—Gambler's Passion gelding to the point.

"I thought I had the best horse, so I put him in the race," Gingras said. "He's come back great. He's filled out nice, He looks great and feels great."

Southwind Gendry maintained the lead without a serious



challenge, downing the pocket-sitting Chase H Hanover by 3/4 lengths, with Sweet Angel Boy third.

Although Literl Lad Hanover earned \$101,478 last year, he paced somewhat under the radar in the powerful Burke stable. The Bye Byrd may have been his coming-out party, as he exploded off the cones for David Miller midway through the final turn and pulled off the 17-1 upset in a career-fastest 1:51.1. Stonebridge Reef was second, beaten a head, while Water Sports Teen completed the ticket.

"I think we've found the way to race him — he'll be a closer for a while," Burke said of the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Latte Lady, who races for the Burke stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and the Silva-Purnel group. "We opened him up today. Last week at the Meadowlands he was hot and didn't want to sit in a hole, he didn't want to relax. I think that made a big difference."

Burke indicated Southwind Gendry, Literl Lad and a number of his other 3-year-olds are eligible for the PA All Stars at Pocono but that he hasn't finalized their schedules.

## \$100,000 PA Stallion Series Stake

Rifleman, Highlandbeachsbest, Crunch Hanover, Coalition Hanover and Bazooka Hanover each won a division of the Kentucky Derby Day co-feature the Pennsylvania Stallions Series for sophomore pacing colts. Trainer Chris Ryder enjoyed a triple (Rifleman, Coalition Hanover, Bazooka Hanover) while Dexter Dunn and Scott Zeron each fashioned a double.

Highlandbeachsbest had some big-time performances in premier races last year, including an International Stallion win. But he had only one qualifier since shutting down last November, and Zeron said trainer Amanda Fine viewed the stallion series as a prep race for bigger things.

"This was a good tightener for him," Zeron said, "but I think he'll go right back to the sires stakes. He's definitely that caliber. He showed it last year, but I think they did the right thing by him by sending him to this race."

The son of Somebeachsomewhere—Rockn Highland shot the Lightning Lane to prevail in 1:51.1, 1-1/2 lengths better than Baklouva, with Mikibytheseaside third. Highland Thoroughbred Farm campaigns Highlandbeachsbest.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Wednesday (May 5), first post 12:45 p.m.

# Joe Morris brings impressive and extensive resume to management of Caesars Entertainment tracks

Joe Morris has likely occupied as many executive positions in all forms of pari-mutuel racing as anybody and many more than most.

I caught up with him as he was driving to the two Indiana racetracks that he oversees, the thoroughbred track Indiana Grande in Shelbyville and the standardbred raceway, Harrah's Hoosier Park in Anderson.

Those are not the only two racetracks that he is involved with in his role as senior vice president overseeing racetracks for Caesars Entertainment. He has just finished an excellent, but somewhat bittersweet season at Pompano Park and is looking forward to the coming opening of Scioto Downs just south of Columbus, OH.

In addition to a lifetime of being involved with both thoroughbreds and standardbreds, Morris has also held management positions in dog racing, casinos and horsemen's organizations.

He is known throughout racing as a reasonable straight shooter who is not only able to look at a situation from the side of the fence where he stands, but he is able to



empathize with those standing across from him. Above everything else, he considers himself to be a fair person.

Morris' roots with horse racing, particularly of the standardbred variety, run deep.

His uncle Loring Norton and cousin Bruce Ranger are Hall of Famers in their native state of Maine.

The Norton farm still operates as the longest continually run farm in the state.

Bruce Ranger can be mentioned in the same breath as other great drivers from Maine such as Walter Case Jr and Billy Parker Jr.

It was with Loring Norton that Morris got his first start working around horses.

As a 12-year-old he started working on the farm and with Norton's horses. It was at that age that he realized that if things worked out in the fashion he hoped they might, that is what he would like to spend his working life doing.

His racetrack experience began when he worked for the Sullivan family who owned the former New Hampshire harness track Hinsdale Raceway which was transformed into a dog track. There was a period of three years when they operated Bay State Raceway, AKA Foxboro Raceway in Foxboro, MA.

But operating those racetracks was not the only thing that Morris did in his 18 years with the Sullivans.

The Sullivan family were involved in many ventures, some of them quite successful, others not so much.

From there he went to the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) and to the Breeders' Cup when they merged with NTRA and was president of NTRA purchasing which sold sponsorships and provided large discounts to the horse world.

He ran the *Thoroughbred Times* where he became its publisher and the publisher of several other magazines.

Unfortunately, he picked a poor time to be in the magazine business. *The Times* and numerous other paper periodicals were among the biggest victims of the online explosion.

In 2010, he was offered a position with the Stronach group of racetracks. It was a great learning experience, especially working at Santa Anita.

Morris stayed with the Stronach group through 2013 when he was offered a position as the head of the Thoroughbred Owners of California.

It was working with that group that he became associated with prominent thoroughbred owner Mike Pegram.

Pegram was a director of El Dorado Casinos. When El Dorado purchased Caesars Entertainment, Pegram also became a director of the new entity.

One of the first things he suggested was that Joe Morris be placed in charge of all Caesars racetracks.

Thus, in early 2020, Morris assumed his new role.

# That's quite a resume. Are there any areas in racetrack management where you haven't been involved?

"If there are any, I am sure that they are few. The one area of which I am proudest is that with each step I've climbed a notch on the proverbial totem pole. Since I was old enough to know what I wanted to do with this life of mine, it has involved horses and the wonderful people involved with every facet of horse racing."

As far as harness racing is concerned, you are presently involved with Pompano Park, Hoosier Park, Harrah's Philadelphia and Scioto Downs. That's four different tracks in four distinct geographical areas. Do you have any trouble keeping up with them?

"Not really, the chief reason being that the day-to-day management of all four tracks is entrusted in very capable hands. Pompano and Scioto are under the control of Gabe Prewitt, who I consider to be the finest young executive that I've come across in track management. The day-to-day operations of Harrah's Philly have been run by Barry Brown for guite some time. Rick Moore has been in the front row of Caesar's Hoosier for awhile, as well. He has done an exemplary job. His work on the two years that Hoosier hosted the Breeders Crowns has been unmatched in the history of those events. I need add that each time that they were held, the racing gods did not act in his favor. The first was hampered by inclement weather, then COVID-19 tried to wipe us out last year. The day-to-day operations at Scioto Downs are administered by Jason Roth, who is also the race secretary and a USTA director."

#### Let's talk about Pompano and Gabe Prewitt.

"Gabe has done as good a job of managing the racing and wagering components of both Pompano and Scioto as any executive in racing today. He has responsibilities in those areas across all of our harness tracks. If I had to use one word to describe Gabe it would be talent. He has that rare attribute that is not often found in management in general, or racetrack management in particular. That is, he checks all the boxes. He studies and knows the numbers. He knows the people putting on the show. He is very well aware of their needs and wants. Perhaps, most important of all, he knows his customers, not only because he has been one of them, but also because he still is. He likes to gamble on horses. Because of this, he understands their likes and dislikes. He can relate. He is also very innovative in terms of increasing handle. He understands that Pompano or Scioto may not be The Meadowlands and Mohawk. He knows that we need to properly place our product against our competition. To use a baseball term, he will look to hit them where they ain't.

"In its 57th year of operations this year, Pompano set an overall all-time handle record and also had 21 days where the handle eclipsed a million dollars."

#### Do you see any future for harness racing in Florida?

"A lot would depend on whether you were speaking of a short- or long-term future. Insofar as Pompano is concerned, barring anything unforeseen, this coming season will be our last. We are in sincere conversations with the horsemen as to what the future of harness racing in Florida may look like. We both think that there are some viable options."

#### Have you been much involved with Harrah's Philadelphia?

"Probably not as much as I should. But good things are happening there, as well. Takeout has been slightly lowered to the benefit of the customer. They've added some new forms of wagering and will continue to try and improve the

wagering benefits to the customers. We feel the handle is underperforming there and we believe there is a great deal of opportunity available."

# The numbers you folks did at Scioto last year were astounding. What do you attribute it to.

"Motivation, inspiration and to a limited degree luck. Gabe, Jason Roth and their team did a great job. They created interest in wagering on the product, that had been previously been lacking. They instituted several new forms of wagering. They stayed on top of every race and did their darndest to generate the greatest pari-mutuel benefit from each. Unfortunately, COVID-19 also played a role. The absence of racing in several other venues contributed to interest in wagering at Scioto. I'd be remiss if I didn't mention the great competitive show that the horsemen there put on. They are there to race horses and that is what they do."

# Last is Hoosier Park where the folks have always done an exemplary job.

"Yes, indeed. They, led by Rick Moore, have done that. As I said above, their work on the Breeders Crowns have been great. They present a terrific, highly competitive product. Every stall in the complex is covered by a camera 24/7. It is a great deterrent for any improprieties and greatly adds to the safety of the stable area. The folks in that part of the country really enjoy their racing and their horses.

I hope that the Breeders Crown will be evolving into a three-way rotating roadshow that Hoosier can be a part of. We've enjoyed our partnership with the Hambletonian Society and hope that it continues indefinitely. Thanks need to be given to the Indiana Standardbred Association and the horsemen who bear part of the expense involved in putting this great show on."

#### What is our sport's biggest problem?

"I would say that there are two. The first is integrity and the second is getting people out to the racetrack. Integrity has always been my highest priority in horse racing but never so much as now. In the past, the problem was cheating with horses in order to set up a score. Today it's the use of performance enhancing drugs to give them an unfair advantage. We are especially vulnerable today with the presence of animal welfare and animal rights groups that wouldn't hesitate to use this as a means of shutting us down. My feeling is that HISA (the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act), like it or hate it, is now the law of the land. Even if the challenges against it are successful, the losses in public sentiment could be far greater than any gains they might acquire. I think we'd be better served inside the tent trying to

work with our thoroughbred brethren to resolve the issues that concern us, than outside it fighting them. The bottom line is that all horsepeople need to prioritize the health and safety of the horse first and foremost.

On track attendance is the meat of the sport. I would hazard a guess that the love of the horse is part of the reason that many people go to the racetrack.

"When I was at Santa Anita, we did numerous studies on how to get people to the racetrack. The one conclusion we reached is that with today's youth, just going to the races to bet on horses will not get them there with any regularity. There has to be something added. It could be handicapping contests, wine tastings, food trucks or several other things. But waiting 25 minutes until the next race is ready to go off isn't going to get or keep them there. It might keep a small core of gamblers, but it's not going to generate added interest in the sport by our youth. There have been over 40 racetracks go under in the last few decades. Unfortunately, we probably are not done."

# What is your favorite of all the sports with which you have been involved?

"My heart is with harness racing. I was born into it. Many of my best friends are and have been in the sport. I still enjoy occasionally jogging a horse. That's something in which we have a big advantage over our thoroughbred friends, but so few of us have taken advantage of. I love just about everything involving a horse, whatever its breed or lineage."

# You've been at this pretty much all of your life, what does the future hold for you?

"I can never see myself without horses in one form or another being part of my life. I own and live on a 20-acre farm outside of Lexington. It's rare that I'm not around a horse or more. I've got one broodmare that is carrying an Indiana-sired foal. I asked Myron Bell what he thought of her. In true Myron fashion, he answered quite honestly, for which I respect him. I'll still keep her anyway.

"As far as track management is concerned, I'll go on as long as I am wanted, still having fun and I can believe that I can make a difference."

## Man plans ... and God smiles

It's safe to say that a certain amount of brain power is exercised every time a standardbred mating is planned, and the more valuable the horses involved, the more thought goes into the choice of mates. There are those of us who study pedigrees, genetics, epigenetics, etc., etc., and so forth before finally deciding on exactly who bred to whom will produce the best horse you ever saw. And yet, there's an old saying from the Garment Center that says: Man plans and God smiles. And it's true in all our walks of life, including the breeding of horses.

Adios was foaled in 1940, by Hal Dale, out of Adioo Volo, by Adios Guy. He was a top racehorse, earning \$33,329 and taking a time trial record of 1:57 ½. Early on, he was trained and driven by Rupe Parker, and when Rupe's health failed, he turned Adios over to Frank Ervin. In those days every, trainer was also a driver, and Ervin was one of the best at both jobs.

Parenthetically, it was this kid's privilege to know Frank Ervin, and to listen to his stories was a true privilege.

At the end of his racing career, Adios was owned by Harvey Warner of Warner Bros. Hollywood fame. He consigned him to a Tattersalls mixed sale, and dispatched with his horse a movie extra in a cowboy hat with instructions to make sure he made \$20,000, or bring him home.

At the time, Delvin Miller was one of the top trainers in the business, such as it was, but he wanted to get into breeding. Adios caught his eye, and he was encouraged to buy him by a nameless old-timer who said, "He'll get fillies like you can't believe."

Miller found a backer who said he'd put up the money to buy Adios, then lived up to his role by backing out the night before the sale. Miller, frantic, finally found another money man just hours before the horse walked into the sales ring.

The sale quickly devolved into a two-way battle between Miller and the guy in the cowboy hat. The battle went on and on, with Delvin almost wearing out one of his fingers as he kept bidding in 100's. Finally the cowboy hat bid \$20,000, and that was all she wrote, as far as he was concerned. Delvin raised his faithful finger to signal a hundred dollar raise, and George Swinebroad, then not yet the legendary auctioneer he became, took it for a thousand and hammered Adios down for \$21,000.

There was never a more fortuitous horse purchase, and there never will be. It is impossible today to understand the dominance Adios enjoyed as a pacing sire through the late '50s and then the '60s. It was a usual thing for the first five finishers in all the 2- and 3-year-old pacing stakes to be sired by Adios. That included the Fox Stakes, the number one 2-year-old race, and the Little Brown Jug, for 3-year-olds. Not only did Adios also dominate the free-for-alls, horses such as Adios Harry and Adios Boy quickly rewrote the record books as far as time was concerned.

Miller stood Adios at his farm outside Arvella, PA, which he called Meadowlands. Harry Harvey was his farm manager. Harvey had previously been one of Miller's second trainers, and among his driving accomplishments was winning the 1953 Hambletonian with the great mare Helicopter. Harvey was a top horseman, and his daughter, Ellen Harvey, is one of the finest people I'm privileged to know.

By the time Adios was 15 years old, he was so overwhelming as a sire that two-thirds of him was purchased by the Hanover Shoe Farms and Max Hempt, who operated Hempt Farms. They each bought a third of the horse, and Miller kept the remaining third. The deal was based on a total value of \$500,000, an unimaginable amount to pay for a horse in those days. As Miller later told me, he gave his sale proceeds to Roland Harriman, a senior partner at Brown Brothers Harriman, and Harriman invested it in Polaroid stock, which made Miller and his wonderful wife, Mary Lib, financially secure for the rest of their lives. There are a few of us left who knew Mary Lib, and she positively glittered. I can still remember some of the jokes she loved to tell, but that's for another time.

In any case, it's past time to get back to God and his smile. During Adios' heyday, there was a top race filly named Countess Vivian, who lived at Delvin's farm and was bred every year to Adios. She was well bred, by King's Counsel, out of Filly Direct, by Billy Direct, and she earned \$43,262 on the track, with a 3-year-old record of 1:59. These amounts seem

like peanuts today, but back then they were all that was available, and it took a good horse to win them.

According to the USTA, Countess Vivian was owned by Hugh Grant, another of Delvin's racing owners. Grant was a wonderfully generous man who made a college education possible for a large number of well-qualified young people whose parents couldn't afford the cost of a college education themselves. That was not something widely known during Hugh Grant's lifetime.

But somehow my memory is that Countess Vivian was raced and then owned as a broodmare by someone with the last name Christy, from Columbus, OH. In any case, Countess Vivan lived at Meadowlands Farm, and she was bred every year to Adios. She hit the jackpot with her second foal, a filly born in 1957, named Countess Adios. Trained and raced by Delvin Miller, at 3 Countess Adios won the first two legs of the Triple Crown, the Cane and the Messenger, whipping all the colts. She earned a total of \$303,932, with a record at 3 of 1:57.3. Interestingly enough, Countess Adios raced free-legged, and then at 4 Delvin switched her over to the trot and gave her a trotting record.

Countess Vivian never reached the same level again as she did with Countess Adios, but she and Adios continued to turn out nice horses that could go fast and make money.

That was so until 1959. As usual, Countess Vivian foaled a nice filly by Adios. But when it was time to breed her back, Adios had suffered a problem that necessitated shutting him down in the breeding shed. So Harry Harvey had to call Countess Vivian's owner and explain that their mare was ready to breed, but Adios was out of commission.


"Have you got anything else there she could be bred to," her owner asked.

"Well," Harry said, "We've got another stud here called Dale Frost. He was a good free-for-aller for Delvin up in New York."

"Doesn't sound too great," the owner said, "But he's better than nothing, so go ahead and breed her to him."

The result of that pick-up mating was a colt named Meadow Skipper. And all Meadow Skipper did was raise the level of the American pacer to heights that we had only imagined before. And while that was happening, you can be sure that God was smiling as he looked down on us mortal horse breeders who thought we knew what we were doing.



# Is Party Girl Hill the greatest one-season performer ever?

Party Girl Hill, now retired due to injury after a one-season blur, is very likely at the top of the list of those who excelled in a single racing season.

She won the Tattersalls in 1:47.2, the identical time as Tall Dark Stranger to whom she will be bred.

She put on maybe the greatest Jug Day performance ever — male or female.

She had just the lone blemish in the Breeders Crown.

She was beyond spectacular.

Here's a look at some others who were also spectacular in a single-season career:

In 1958, Merrie Annabelle posted a 13-0-3 in 23 starts as a 2-year-old trotting filly. Her impact was so profound the race in her name (now renamed the Jim Doherty Memorial) is for the very best freshman trotting ladies.

In 1984, **Praised Dignity** posted the record for the most money made in a single season for those who raced only one. As a 2-year-old pacer the Bill Popfinger trainee banked \$1,194,715, almost half of it finishing second to Nihilator in the richest ever event — the \$2,161,000 Woodrow Wilson.

In 2001, **Western Shooter** was, to these eyes, the best male to ever race in just one season. He won the 2001 freshman Breeders Crown and then the Governor's Cup in dynamic fashion in 1:50 for trainer Bob McIntosh and driver John Campbell. Unfortunately a virus ended his life before we could see him ever again.

In 2002, **Broadway Hall** was a perfect 9-for-9 for Jim and John Campbell and Jules Siegel — including winning the Breeders Crown for freshman trotting colts — before an injury sidelined him from competing any further. He did somewhat make up for his own Hambletonian absence when he sired both the 2011 Hambletonian winner Broad Bahn and the Hambletonian Oaks winner Bold And Fresh.

Village Jasper did not race at 2, but in 1997 came back at 3 for the richest ever sophomore (only) season by those who did not go any further. He banked \$1,057,595 (following in the fine tradition of other Bill Wellwood "Village" horses such as Village Jiffy and Village Connection) in just that lone year.

**Dream Of Joy** in 1999 won \$826,601, winning just three races. But she picked just the right ones — the Breeders Crown, the Merrie Annabelle and the Goldsmith Maid. The Per Eriksson trainee was driven by Jim Meittinis. She could not make it back at 3 after that sparkling freshman season.

### Meanwhile in the breeding shed...

Party Girl Hill and Tall Dark Stranger will be matched together in the breeding shed, bringing them even closer together than they were when they each won their Tattersalls divisions in 2020 in 1:47.2. They finished the year as the two top finishers in Horse of the Year balloting.

## Injuries are part of the game

Party Girl Hill joins a list of some major notables who saw their careers end prematurely due to injury.

**Wiggle It Jiggleit** earned close to \$4 million at 3 and 4, but issues cropped up and more or less curtailed any activity at 5, 6 or 7.

**Western Ideal**, who George Segal referred to as his best sire ever, missed his entire 3-year-old season of 1998 due to a sliced tendon at 2. He did make it back and was the Older Pacer of the Year in 2000. And his first crop produced the three leading 3-year-old earners: American Ideal, Rocknroll Hanover and Cabrini Hanover.

**Tarport Hap** was the greatest female pacer in the sport in 1977. But she died on the track during a race on March 12, 1977. She finished the year 8-for-10 all versus the boys and was voted Older Pacing Mare of the Year.

**Four Starzzz Shark** suffered a career ending injury in 2004 on Hambletonian Day. He was the Older Pacing Horse of the Year with a 1:47.4 mark.

Jennas Beach Boy is still the only pacer to win three straight Breeders Crowns (1994-1996). He missed the entire summer of his sophomore season due to injury, but came back with a vengeance setting the all-time 3-year-old world mark of 1:48.4 on Sept. 30 of 1995 as he marched toward the second of three straight division titles.

# **Dragster upsets in Sweden**

Very Kronos or Sorbet? The two well-merited trotters were basically the only two horses that were mentioned when the final elimination for Paralympiatravet was held in Örebro, Sweden on Saturday (May 1) afternoon.

Sorbet from post 1 opened quickly for the lead and driver Örjan Kihlström noted that his worst opponent Very Kronos was on his right side, as first over and the front duo seemed to face a battle when they came into the last turn. But Very Kronos lost his gait and went off stride with 300 meters to go and Kihlström saw his chance to leave the rest of the field. Sorbet got a three lengths advantage over the short home stretch in Örebro and the victory looked safe, but from out of nowhere **Dragster** flew to a tight upset win for trainer Roger Malmqvist.

Malmqvist and Dragster got their invitation for the final at Åby on May 8, but Malmqvist declined. Back-to-back races for the 9-year-old Micro Mesh gelding does not interest Malmqvist, so the last horse for Paralympiatravet will be named this afternoon (May 2) in Sweden.

Dragster won in 1:53.1.

Örebro's race card also featured another stakes race. The \$95,000 Orebro Int'l over three kilometers has developed to become one of the most prestigious races during the spring in Sweden and when merited top trotter Moni Viking (Maharajah) visited Örebro, the 8-year-old chestnut colt showed that he is in great shape ahead of even more prestigious races in Europe in summer.

Björn Goop sent Moni Viking to position first over with two laps to go and he could comfortably control the field throughout the race. At the top of the stretch, Moni Viking received the signal that told him to leave the rest of the gang and the Norwegian bred trotter was superior this day. He more or less sprinted to easy win in mile rate 1:58.2 over 3.180 meters.

# Therres, Miller wins appeal of Rockin Mystery's DQ in Alberta stakes race

In the Sept. 20, 2019 Buzzworthy column (full story here), Garnet Barnsdale wrote about the social media outcry when Rockin Mystery — driven by Serge Masse for trainer Chris Lancaster and owners Rod Therres and Blair Miller, both of British Columbia — was disqualified after finishing first in the \$125,000 final of the Don Byrne Memorial on Sept. 15 at Century Mile in Edmonton, AB.

As Barnsdale reported, the incident was rare, "because it involved one of the horses leaving in front of the starting gate, which clearly did not get lined up properly leading up to the start, leaving at least two lanes next to the rail

uncovered by the wings. So there was no wings in front of the 2-1 favorite Rockin Mystery, who did get about a half-length ahead of the other horses before the start and then went on to lead at every call and win while never headed."

On April 14, Horse Racing Alberta's overruled the initial decision of the Appeal Tribunal to disqualify Rockin Mystery, returning the pacing mare to victory, adjusting the purse distribution to reflect the new order of finish and reimbursing Masse for a \$100 fine in the matter.

The revised order of finish is now:

1st - Rockin Mystery

2nd - Lady Neigh Neigh

3rd - Flash A Smile

4th - Black Cheddar

5th - Cayey Skye



## A Hansom idea

It is 8:50 a.m., and you are listening to National Public Radio station 89.7 FM. It's time for *Behind the Business*.

Theme music intro (5 seconds)

Hello! I'm Sarah Thomas, your host for Behind the Business. Today, we will discover how William J. Danforth turned his love for retired racehorses into a popular and profitable business. Mister Danforth, welcome to the program.

"Good morning, Sarah. Please, call me Bill and thanks for visiting."

I want to report to our listeners that Bill and I are at the open doors of a beautiful barn, sitting on bales of hay or straw. Which are these?"

"These are straw for bedding the floors of the stalls."

I want to remind our listeners that we will post videos and photos from this episode on the Behind the Business website. Let me set the scene for you. As I arrived this morning, I saw a renovated farmhouse and four large barns. Each barn has a fenced-in corral. Beyond the fences, I see patches of farmland as large as football fields. Woods surround this beautiful property. Also, I saw a few paths that look much like oversized golf cart paths. Some of these paths disappear into the woods. Bill, this farm is in the middle of nowhere. Where are your neighbors? Why this location?

"Remoteness was part of my business plan. Still, this farm is only three miles from Millersburg, which has restaurants, hotels, and shops. More than one million people are less than a ninety-minute drive away."

Before we talk about THIS business, while doing my homework, I read that a PREVIOUS invention of yours generated funding that allowed you to start this one.

"Yes and no, Sarah. I indeed hold the patent for a machine used in laser eye surgery. Some may call it an invention, but I think of it as a device solving a problem. However, this farm, this business, does not depend on the revenue from my patent. I planned to create a stand-alone company to solve another problem."

#### Problem?

"About 10 years ago, I became involved in harness horse racing, a quirky sport filled with great people. I truly enjoyed purchasing young trotting horses and racing them. I found every facet of the sport fascinating, but a problem took me out of the game."

#### A problem involving the sport.

"No, a personal problem – my emotional attachment to my horses. The day I bought a yearling, I began planning for their placement after racing or even if they did not race at all. Making sure my horses had post-racing homes was essential for me. I gave horses away, gave fillies to breeding farms, even found placement for a horse with a civil war cavalry re-enactor. They needed to have good lifetime homes."

# Accumulating retired horses was the problem that took you away from the racetrack?

"It was. The constant placement of horses became a hassle. Emotionally, saying goodbye took its toll on me. Most people in racing get used to the continuous churning of horses and they build up some immunity. But the lifelong responsibility of horses is a problem for certain people."

#### So, you are a PETA person?

"Not particularly. From what I have seen, racehorses live good lives compared to most other commercial animals."

#### Much better than pigs or cows?

"That is an age-old philosophical discussion, but racing owners and trainers need to cull the herd for business purposes.

Participants are not cold-blooded. Almost everyone I encountered respects and appreciates the horses, but the bottom line is that owners cannot keep non-productive horses."

#### So, you bought this farm to give them lifelong homes?

"No, not exactly. I thought about buying a farm for my retired racehorses. I could afford the costs, but merely warehousing these horses felt inefficient and wasteful. These horses had more to offer than just standing around. I believed that somehow my retired trotting horses could bring in revenue. They could earn their keep while living fuller lives."

# Your problem was how to make retired trotting racehorses productive ?

"Exactly. The answer originated in childhood memories. I grew up in Philadelphia and Baltimore, but I remember my dad taking me horseback riding in the country. They are great memories, especially for a city kid. I remember the sounds, sights, smells, the excitement, and the magic of the horses. Everything stuck in my mind.

"Like many things almost a half-century ago, running a riding stable was a reasonably straightforward process. My dad handed over some cash to the farm owner, and a teenage girl or boy brought out a pair of saddled horses for my dad and me. They were

usually docile swaybacked horses. We were helped onto our horses and then plodded down the path. No helmet, no lessons, no paperwork, no directions, except maybe, 'Be back in thirty minutes, or we charge you extra.'

"Of course, falling off a horse is dangerous, especially for greenhorns. It is a long way from a saddle to the ground. Riding stables had accidents. Times changed, and those mom-and-pop riding stables disappeared because a single lawsuit could lead to prohibitive insurance rates. Riding stables are rare today, and the few that exist are much different."

#### But you kept looking for a solution to your problem?

"I did. My first thought was that since retired racehorses had been in harness all their lives, maybe I could sell customers buggy rides. However, from the start, this idea never appealed to me. Passengers would find a driver sitting in front of them, an experience that did not appeal to me. And the liability aspect was still a problem. I learned that horse-drawn buggies and four-wheeled carts are still potentially dangerous vehicles. I had a sense of my game plan, but it took Sherlock Holmes to unlock the mystery."

#### Sherlock Holmes?

"I love Sherlock Holmes books and movies. One of my favorite parts was always when Holmes and Watson stepped out of 12 Baker Street where a horse-drawn cab was waiting to whisk them on to adventure. They would climb inside, close the half-door, and Sherlock would tap the roof of the cabin with his cane and bark to the driver seated above and behind the passengers, 'To Manchester Square my good man, and be quick about it, the game is afoot.' Do you understand what I'm babbling on about?"

# I do! Holmes and Watson would trot off down brick streets into the foggy nights. Were there cabs like that?\*

"Yes, tested and patented in 1834 by an architect from York, England named Joseph Hansom. They are unique vehicles called Hansom Safety Cabs that combined safety with agility. Safety was the game changer. With two large wheels and a low center of gravity, the cornering became stabilized. The cab interiors were comfortable, private, and weather resistant. The cabs ranged in style from very simple to very ornate. They were wildly popular in the Sherlock Holmes era. They were fast and light enough to be pulled by a single horse, especially on a solid, flat surface. The Hansom cabs were cheaper and safer than traveling in four-wheel coaches."

#### Hansom Cabs were the ingredient that made your idea doable?

"From the instant the vehicle jumped into my brain, I never had a doubt. The business model took five minutes - Hansom cabs, drivers, paved lanes, and wooded paths would combine to create a wonderful experience for passengers. Weather is not a problem. We book more rides in the winter because people love to bundle up under blankets. The passengers do not need to steer. They can reserve a narrated tour, a nature tour, or a trip where the driver does not speak. We are also thinking about a cab ride through the woods to Millersburg, where passengers step out and have lunch or dinner."

#### Did you expect it to be profitable?

"Absolutely. I put myself in my customers' seat and asked the question, "Would I pay \$150 for a thirty-minute ride in a Sherlock Holmes cab through country lanes and woods?" I never doubted that others of all ages and interests would see this as an enjoyable and repeatable experience, well worth the value."

#### And the startup costs?

"Very reasonable because this farm is a lease. The landowner continues to operate, so my lease is minimal. The horses are either my horses or are retired horses donated from other owners. The drivers are paid by the trip and double up by doing barn work between rides."

#### Where did you get the Hansom cabs?

"That was my significant capital investment. At first, I thought I would need to start from scratch, maybe hire a company to build them from Hanson's blueprint. I was pleasantly surprised to learn that a company not far away produces them, so I ordered six. My next six cabs will have modifications such as lighter materials, different tires, and seat belts. They are awesome."

#### And you were off to the races?

"Our problem is turning away business. We don't want the riders to feel as if they are in a parade. We stagger trips, so passengers rarely see other cabs. I hired a farm manager. I'm looking at other farms, hiring more employees, and hope to find happy homes for countless retired trotting horses."

# And now that you have homes for your retired horses, did you return to racing horses?

"I did! I bought a yearling last month because now I know that he has a beautiful retirement home. Or maybe I should say the horse will have an excellent JOB in retirement."

#### Another problem you solved?

"Indeed."

One final question. After this interview, could you take me for a spin?

"No problem, Sarah, 'The game's afoot."

I love it! That wraps up another episode of Behind the Business. I'm your host, Sarah Thomas, and I am about to get in a cab behind a trotting horse and clip-clop down the lane. Join us next week for another episode of Behind the Business.

## 38th Pepsi North America Cup moved to Sept. 11, other WEG stakes rescheduled

The stacked Pepsi North America Cup undercard of the Fan Hanover, Goodtimes, Roses Are Red, Armbro Flight and Mohawk Gold Cup have all been rescheduled to new dates later in the season.

The **Fan Hanover** and **Goodtimes** will join the 'Cup' on Sept. 11. The **Roses Are Red** has been moved to Saturday, Sept. 4, **Armbro Flight** to Friday, Sept. 17 and **Mohawk Gold Cup** to Saturday, Sept. 18.

The Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) schedule will be adjusted to accommodate the new dates for the various rescheduled stakes. The new OSS schedule will be confirmed once live racing resumes in the province.

Woodbine has also rescheduled the **SBOA Stakes** from May 22 to Nov. 13, **Somebeachsomewhere Stake s**from June 5 to Aug. 28, **Simcoe 3-Year-Old Open Pace** from Sept. 4 to Sept.

18 and **Simcoe 3-Year-Old Open Trot** from Sept. 10 to Sept. 25.

Along with the rescheduling of several races, Woodbine Mohawk Park is working with The Meadowlands to determine next steps for the **Graduate Series** and **Miss Versatility**, as both events were to visit Woodbine Mohawk Park in late-May and early-June. A decision on those events will be announced in the coming days.

# 2021 Ohio Sires Stakes season begins today

The 2021 Ohio Sires Stakes season kicks off this afternoon (May 2) at Miami Valley Raceway, with three OHSS divisions for sophomore fillies. As well, four divisions of sophomore colts will race at this same venue on Monday (May 3). Post time both days is 2:05 pm, ET.

A total of 27 fillies will race in OHSS events on Sunday, with one \$60,000 division of nine trotters and a pair of \$50,000 divisions of pacing fillies with nine contestants each. Likewise, on Sunday afternoon, two \$50,000 divisions of trotting colts and two \$50,000 divisions of pacing colts will line up behind the starting gate.

This season the Ohio Sires Stakes nominations are significantly, with 1,071 foals nominated as opposed to 930 in 2020. Of those, 314 are 3-year-olds, up from 300 in 2020, while 757 are 2-year-olds, up from 630 nominees during the same time period.

Last season's 2-year-old champion **Merry Ann** makes her seasonal debut today for trainer Ronnie Burke in the lone trotting division (Race 6). This daughter of Southwind Spirit, out of the SJ's Photo mare Witty Girl earned \$245,200 last year from five wins and two seconds in eight starts and captured the \$300,000 OHSS Championship on Super Night at Scioto Downs in a wire-to-wire effort in 1:57. Her career mark of 1:56h came at Northfield in an \$40,000 OHSS contest on Aug. 7. Most recently, she qualified at The Meadows in front-stepping fashion in 2:01. Bred by Knox Services, she is owned by her breeder in partnership with Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscemi.

Burke also sends out **Summer Touch** (race 9), who captured the 2020 OHSS \$300,000 Championship on Super Night, and who will be making her second seasonal start today. After earning \$285,550 as a freshman and pacing to a mark of 1:51.4h at Northfield on Aug. 7, this daughter of Well Said—Real Touch finished second by a head to Lady Arthur on April 23 in the \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray. This homebred speedster is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services,

Slaughter Racing and Weaver Bruscemi.

The aforementioned **Lady Arthur** (Race 3) heads up the first pacing division for Canadian-based trainer Dr. Ian Moore. This homebred daughter by Arthur Blue Chip, out of the Mach Tree mare April Three is owned in partnership by Moore, RG McGroup and Serge Savard. She earned \$60,931 last year at 2 and took a respectable mark of 1:53.2f at Scioto Downs on July 11 in a \$40,000 OHSS contest. This year, she has amassed \$25,000 from that lone start and victory in the Scarlet & Gray at Miami Valley.

On Monday afternoon, **Perron** leaves from post four in the second OHSS trotting division (Race 4). This son of My MVP captured the \$300,000 Championship on Super Night last season in 1:58f and is making just his second start this year. Trained by Chris Beaver for Steve Stewart, David Wright, Greg Wilcoxen and Kevin Doherty, Perron has amassed \$206,204 lifetime for his connections.

The Chris Beaver conditioned **Winning Ticket** has begun his 2021 campaign with a vengeance, rattling off three straight triumphs for owners Beaver, Steve Zeehandelar, Tim Homan and Jim Burnett. Bred by James Bender, the son of Triumphant Caviar, out of the Credit Winner mare Lotto Winner already has \$52,500 on his card this season, after earning \$95,047 at two. Most recently, he captured the \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray for Aaron Merriman on April 24 at Miami Valley in 1:54.1. Winning Ticket starts from post eight in the first OHSS trotting division (Race 2).

Seven colts move behind the starting gate in the first OHSS division for pacers (Race 6), headed up by **Charlie May**, last season's winner of the \$300,000 OHSS Championship for freshmen pacers. This McArdle gelding, who is out of the Western Hanover mare Stipple Hanover, had a fat pocketbook last season, with \$328,627 in earnings for owner-breeder Don Tiger of Canonsburg, PA and looks to pick up right where he left off. After two solid qualifiers at Miami Valley for trainer Steve Carter, Charlie May won his debut in a \$15,000 Hackett elim on April 10 in an impressive 1:51.4.

Heart of Chewbacca, a solid OHSS contender last season, heads up the second pacing division (Race 8) for trainer Ronnie Burke from the rail slot. The son of Bring On The Beach earned \$195,598 for owners Dennis Owens and Norman Race Racing last year and has added another \$48,750 to his coffers this season via two wins and a second in three starts. He lowered his 2-year-old record of 1:51.1f by a tick at Miami Valley on April 24 via his triumph in a \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray with Danny Noble at the lines. This hardy youngster was bred by Spring Haven Farm.

# Machnhope dominant in Big M feature

Talk about no respect.

Machnhope, last seen winning the \$232,800 Blue Chip Matchmaker at Yonkers Raceway on April 19, kept on rolling Friday night (April 30) at The Meadowlands, taking the \$30,000 featured winners over/preferred handicap for fillies and mares on the pace in wire-to-wire fashion despite going off as the fifth choice in the betting in the six-horse field.

"I wasn't sure how to play it," said winning driver Andy McCarthy after being asked about his thought process given how the extremely windy conditions favored speed all night long. "I didn't have a plan. I saw some of the horses to my inside weren't leaving, so I decided to step her off the gate."

A Noel Daley trainee, Machnhope, a 6-year-old daughter of Mach Three—Hope For Life, was on the point out of the first turn and cut out fractions of :27.4, :55.4 and 1:23.1 on a night that saw eight winners lead from start to finish. A challenge came down the backside from Gia's Surreal, who won at The Big M on April 17, but Machnhope turned that one away off the far turn before sprinting clear of the field through the stretch on the way to a 2¾-length victory in 1:51.2. Sweet Lucy Lou rallied for second, with Major Occasion A, the 2-1 favorite, grabbing the show dough.

"On a windy night like this," said McCarthy. "You have to follow the car out of posts five and six (Machnhope had the six) and let it break the wind for you. The Blue Chip was a tough series over there, but she's been terrific. She felt sharp tonight warming up. I figured she'd be good."

Machnhope, in winning for the fifth time in her last seven starts, now has 31 victories from 105 career starts. Her bankroll stands at a gaudy \$536,394 for owners Deo Volente Farms, T. Pontone, A Express Stables and Daley. She paid \$12.20 to win after going to the gate at odds of 5-1.

LONG LAYOFF, NO PROBLEM: With the COVID-19 shutdown continuing in Ontario, several drivers have moved their tacks temporarily to The Big M. One pilot, making his first appearance at the mile oval since 2016, was James MacDonald, who scored wire-to-wire in the first race with 3-5 favorite Majestic Virgin.

Last weekend, two other Woodbine Mohawk Park regulars, Bob McClure and Doug McNair, recorded their first Meadowlands victories of the meeting. McNair added to his total by guiding a pair to victory lane Friday.

**FABULOUS FRIDAY:** All-source wagering totaled \$3,516,276, the biggest night of business at The Big M this

year on a Friday. It marked the ninth consecutive card to see betting break the \$3-million barrier... Favorites continue to score at a high rate, as over the last six race cards, 41 post-time choices have won the 78 races (53 percent).

# Labelling them "strategy tucks" is semantics

Kudos to Jeff Gural for starting the Task Force. And to Debbie Little for her writing about it (full story here). Unfortunately, this initiative may not work.

Implicit in the first article is that the horseman interviewed is more interested in defending what drivers do rather than looking for positive change. The term "courtesy tuck" is accurate. Labeling them "strategy tucks" is semantics. A substantial majority of the time the drivers leave with the

favorites. They take the long shots, no matter what their natural gate speed, to the rear. What, they ask, leave with a 20 to 1 shot? And when a favorite doesn't get away fast but comes up on the outside, they get a courtesy tuck. A long shot gets parked. This consistent race "strategy" is likely the main reason the percentage of winning favorites in harness racing is so high. You don't see this in thoroughbred racing. If a horse has speed, the jockey will send him and give the horse his best chance. The harness drivers end the longshot's chances before the gate comes away.
