Death of The Guru marks the passing of a larger-than-life legend

Hall of Fame trainer, HRU columnist and wholly original life force Ron Gurfein dead at 80.

About five minutes after learning of the death of Ron Gurfein, Frank Sinatra's *My Way* ominously came on the Internet radio station that was playing. For a station that predominantly plays rock music, it certainly felt like a message from the beyond from a man that was a true original.

Even in death, The Guru did things his way — and I'm not talking about sending me a song from harness racing Valhalla, though I'm not putting that past him.

When he mysteriously walked away from his popular HRU column Ask The Guru more than three months ago — after filing 165 consecutive weeks without fail (a complete archive of his columns is available here) — he did not give a reason. He sent a one line email on Jan. 21 saying he needed to take some time off and asked for privacy. I never heard from him again, despite sending him messages from time to time, including a final one 10 days before his death when I heard he likely didn't have many days left.

Reportedly, few people in the industry — many very close friends — heard from him either. While I struggle to

understand this, I have nothing but respect for how he choose to spend his final days before dying Wednesday (May 5) of brain cancer.

"If you're only allowed one thing in life, that would be the thing to have the way you want it," Art Zubrod, one of Gurfein's closest friends, told me Thursday referring to being able to choose how you spend your final days.

"You know Ronnie and how vain he was. He didn't like not being able to speak clearly. That was really, I believe, the first thing that led to his diagnosis was speech pattern... He wasn't diagnosed until January. It went downhill fairly fast."

Gurfein's death was announced by his children, Lauren and Blake via a simple message on The Guru's Facebook page that said:

It is with profound sadness that we share that our dad, Ronnie Gurfein (a.k.a. "the Guru"), passed away earlier today. His was a long life filled with many joys, successes, and love. His wit was second to none and he had us laughing till his final moments.

Per his wishes, there will be a small family-only ceremony. We know he will be missed by many, so please stay tuned for information about a future celebration of his life and career.


A LIFE FORCE LIKE FEW OTHERS

Best known as a Hall of Fame trainer with three Hambletonian victories to his credit, Gurfein was a life force like few others; a giant in both accomplishment and ego that carved an indelible path through life.

While he could be utterly charming and confident and a complete rascal, in all honesty, he could also be an infuriating, never-wrong, pain in the butt.


What fewer people saw was that behind the sizeable bravado — and his love of great meals and status symbols — was a man of beauty and emotion and generosity that cared more than most will ever know.

"Everybody had a story about Ronnie, there's no doubt about it. I'm not sure everybody knew what a nice man he was. He was generally a nice person and people didn't get to

see that side of him," said Zubrod, emphasizing that he and Gurfein talked much more about life and family than horses.

"I remember several times, we'd be at the sale and he'd buy a horse for \$50,000 and the guy next to him would say, 'Ah man, I was wanting that horse, but I knew that I couldn't outbid you' and Ronnie would just hand him the ticket... you know, more than once. That's the kind of guy he was."

As for Gurfein's brashness, Zubrod told me 22 years ago that he loved that side of Gurfein, "because it's one thing that keeps his stable small."

Zubrod chuckled Thursday when he was reread that quote.

As for Gurfein, he once said he could live no other way.

"I think just being as outgoing as I am, I'm such an easy target," Gurfein said. "I wear my heart on my sleeve. I tell you the truth about everything. It's great for your life. I sleep very well at night."

SUCCESSFUL SECOND ACT

As for his column in HRU, Gurfein had the rare ability to allow his personality and perspective to take form through his words. His column was filled with passion, wonder and a deep knowledge of the game, particularly from the perspective of a trainer that tended to side with his fellow horsepeople. Ask The Guru was also a work of unshakeable opinions, conjecture, contradiction and, on occasion, BS.

Yet, above all else, it was must-read entertainment best consumed with a dose of salt.

Being his editor wasn't easy at times. Like many readers, I didn't always agree, but I tried my best not to tinker too much with his work lest I strip it of its originality. It was always his forum and I like to think he enjoyed having it, though he never said.

At the very least, Ask The Guru allowed one of our game's most colorful personalities to have a successful second act to mutual benefit.

The column officially launched in November of 2017, but my personal relationship with Gurfein went back nearly 20 years before that.

I first met him in 1999 at the Meadowlands after he won his third and final Hambletonian with Self Possessed. He

made an indelible impression if my feature in *The Canadian Sportsman* about that day is anything by which to judge:

He entered the room to a wave of applause, from reporters no less, and from the minute Ron Gurfein grabbed the microphone he was rolling.

"Come on, everybody clap," he said with a sly grin and a wave of his arms, as if he had just been introduced for the first of three gigs in the Catskills.

For 20 minutes in the Meadowlands' press box, The Guru of Trotting cracked jokes, told stories and even brought tears to his wife's eyes by thanking her for her role in his life.

About the only thing missing was a little soft shoe and a rim shot...

This is, after all, a man whose first words to a reporter in the winner's circle were: "Who is the most media-pro horseman that ever lived? Me."

When it was all over, the silver-haired trainer departed the press box while he still had them eating out of his hand.

The only surprise was he exited stage left without shouting, "Thank you, Thank you" and encouraging his audience to try the quiche.

AUDIENCE WITH THE GURU

A few months later, I was on a plane to Florida to spend a few days with Gurfein at Sunshine Meadows for a more in-depth feature.

That experience led me to appreciate that Gurfein was much more than a successful horse trainer:

Today the Guru is speaking about empowerment. He points to a couple of motivational nuggets he has saved from one of those thought-for-the-day calendars.

"I have two things — 'Everything is possible," he said, reading from the two slips of wisdom. "And, 'Success is creative fullness. That is why the Latin word for genius also means spirit."

The words come from the mind of Deepak Chopra.

Ron Gurfein is something of a fan of such new age thinkers. He has the perfect place for a couple of motivational cassettes — inside his Lexus sport utility vehicle...

When people say Gurfein is cocky, he begs to differ.

"Cocky is a very bad word for it because I believe it's my spirit that creates this. In other words, when I had Victory Dream and the media would say, 'Do you think you'll ever have a horse this good again?' I would say, 'Sure.' They take that as cockiness. But that's not cockiness, because I know myself," Gurfein said, leaning back in his leather office chair and stroking the back of his head.

"Any person who is a student of all these things I believe in, will tell you that everybody has that power. We have not begun to tap into the resources of our own spirit. Mike Lachance always kids me because Wayne Dyer wrote a book called, 'You'll See It When You Believe it.' (Lachance) knows that's my theory."

A LONG, STRANGE JOURNEY

Gurfein grew up in Manhattan and the journey from the big city to harness racing's highest heights was a long, interesting one with many stops.

Gurfein was introduced to racing by his father, Sidney, a diamond importer.

"My father was a typical middle-class merchant. He bought single stones from Europe and sold them in America. He wasn't a rich man," Gurfein said.

On family vacations to Florida, Sidney would take Ron to see the thoroughbreds at Hialeah.

The family lived in an upper-middle-class neighborhood in Manhattan. During the summer, Gurfein and his friends would often hang out at Roosevelt and Yonkers.

Gurfein went to high school at the famed Bronx School of Science.

"It's a school for intellectually-gifted kids. I was pretty intellectually gifted. I still think I am," he said with a wink and a



grin.

When Gurfein graduated, he enrolled at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. His goal was to become a pathologist.

"I wanted to be a doctor, didn't really like the sight of blood and didn't want to involve myself in that aspect of medical science, so I had two choices — to cure diseases, or to be a psychiatrist," Gurfein said. "All the psychiatrists I knew were crazy. So I said, 'I better not do this,' because I was probably crazy to begin with."

He stayed in school for two years then returned home to New York when his grandfather died.

"My grandfather manufactured fire hose in New Jersey. He died and there was no man (to run the business)," Gurfein said. "There was my mother and my grandmother... So, I left school and went to help my mother run a business that I knew nothing about. We fought like cat and dog every day. This went on for six or seven months and then I couldn't take it."

While on vacation in Florida, Gurfein struck up a conversation on the beach with a man who was president of

Gurfein was certainly larger than life.

a women's clothing store named Paraphernalia. The company was looking to franchise its operation in New York. Six months later, Gurfein had opened three stores and business was booming. The year was 1965.

"It was avant garde stuff. Light up dresses. Mini dresses. Wild stuff. Wild sixties stuff," Gurfein said.

Meanwhile, on the side, Gurfein bought into a few standardbreds.

Gurfein was only in the women's clothing business for eight months before the company bought him out.

He took his new-found riches, invested almost all of it in the stock of the company which had purchased his grandfather's fire hose company from his mother and then took off for a European vacation. In short order, the stock plummeted from \$76 to \$9 and when Gurfein returned to the United States he could not afford to pay his horse trainer.

So with time on his hands and not much money, Gurfein took up training himself. In 1967, he moved his operation to Monticello.

Dr. Paul Nolan, Gurfein's long-time veterinarian, told me for that 1999 story that Gurfein's earliest days in the horse business were spent learning all he could from his colleagues.

"He had the good sense to go to good people and knowledgeable people along the way," Nolan said.

"I was the biggest pain in the butt on the racetrack," Gurfein said. "You ask Jimmy Cruise, or Buddy Gilmour, or Frank Popfinger, people like that. They'll tell you I was the biggest nuisance there ever was, because I would be asking questions until two o'clock in the afternoon trying to learn.

"I remember following Billy Haughton around watching him buy yearlings. I never told him I was following him. I just snuck around, watching what he looked for. I made mental notes myself on the horses and then saw the ones that he bought and the ones that he didn't buy."

MIGHTY M TO BIG M

Gurfein raced mostly at Monticello for the next 20 years. While he was away on vacation in 1987 with his family, his stalls at Monticello Raceway were given to another trainer.

It was the jolt he needed to point him toward the big leagues. Before that, thoughts of winning Hambletonians, training world champions and having million-dollar years never even occurred to him.

"I never had any desire. Couldn't care less. I lived in Monticello. I was happy. I had my own life. I had my own circle of friends and everything like that.

"The most expensive horse I had in Monticello cost about \$500. It's a completely different kind of life. Monticello was like trying to bang out money. Buying horses, selling horses, racing. I didn't race a lot of horses for a long period of time. I would go to sales, buy horses, bring them to the track, race them, sell them, go buy some more," said Gurfein.

That all changed when Sonny Antonacci and his son, Frank, started giving Gurfein decent horses to train. Five years after moving to the Meadowlands out of necessity in 1987, Gurfein came up with the impressive trio of Imperfection, Baltic Striker, and Lady Starlet. He hit the pinnacle of the sport later that decade with horses such as Victory Dream and Beat The Wheel. He won the Hambletonian three times in six years between 1994 (Victory Dream) and 1999 (Self Possessed) with perhaps his greatest pupil, Continentalvictory, winning the holy grail in between (1996). She also captured the Yonkers Trot en route to earning Horse of the Year honors that year.

Gurfein also trained such top horses as 2003 Trotter of the

Year Cantab Hall and his first Hambletonian hopeful MB Felty, among other greats.

He was named Trainer of the Year by the United States Harness Writers' Association in 1999 and was inducted into harness racing's Living Hall of Fame in 2006.

As for how Gurfein will be remembered, Zubrod isn't sure.

"You think back on 20 or 30 years and you see how Stanley (Dancer) and (Billy) Haughton are remembered and then (Glen) Garnsey and (George) Sholty are remembered a little less so, so hopefully Ronnie will be fondly remembered by a lot of people 20 years from now."

As for Zubrod, he will never forget his dear friend Ron Gurfein.

Bets are many others — myself included — won't soon forget him either.

I've already had a sign from the other side that The Guru would never allow that.

Meadowlands comes to the rescue

The New Jersey track has added races to keep horses pointed to Ontario stakes races on the track now that major races north of the border have been moved to the fall.

As Ontario racing remains in limbo, The Meadowlands paces to the rescue.

Last week, Woodbine Entertainment announced that the North America Cup, originally scheduled for June 19, and several other stakes, have been moved to later in the year. Since the Cup is normally the first major stakes race of the year for 3-year-old pacers, as well as being a major prep for The Meadowlands Pace, its move would leave trainers scrambling for quality starts.

The Meadowlands, in cooperation with the Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ), will add open races for 3-year-old pacing colts and fillies to be offered on each Saturday in June with a preference to Meadowlands Pace, Mistletoe Shalee, North America Cup and Fan Hanover eligible horses.

In a Tuesday press release, Meadowlands' president and chief executive officer Jeff Gural said: "It's clear that many owners and trainers are affected by the situation in Canada. With the NA Cup and its companion stakes moved to September, there really aren't many options for the 3-year-olds to get races on a big track that they need to be in shape for our marquee stakes. It seems like the right thing to do."

But it's not just the 3-year-old pacers benefitting from the benevolence of The Meadowlands and the SBOANJ.



Trainer Nancy Takter reached out to Meadowlands' chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir about older pacing mares, which dovetailed into the track and SBOA coming up with additional races.

"I have those returning 4-year-old mares JK First Lady and Peaky Sneaky and now that the Roses Are Red has been moved from the schedule in June at Mohawk, they don't have a stakes race until July," said Takter. "So, they've ended up with this big gap and the open mare races [at The Meadowlands] don't always fill.

"So, I just reached out to Jason to see if there was something they could add. Mainly because we've got them qualified and got them going now and if you can't get them in you can't keep them race-fit and then the stakes at The Meadowlands are going to come up this summer and they might not be ready. So, I was obviously very thankful that The Meadowlands was able to put together a series not just for the mares, but for all those horses that end up with little gaps in their stakes schedules."

A series to be contested in late May and early June was added for pacing mares, while events for older pacing and trotting horses and geldings are still to be scheduled. In addition, on June 11 and June 25, there will be open races for 3-year-old trotting colts and fillies. All of these races will be written with preference going to horses paid into Meadowlands stakes.

Trainer Ron Burke also appreciates what The Big M and SBOANJ are doing for the horsemen.

"We'd be turning horses out and restarting them," said Burke. "We'd be giving horses six-week breaks if it wasn't for this. It's going to make a big difference. They really thought it

out. It's going to be a big help for everybody."

When Flamboro Downs announced in April that it would be cancelling the Confederation Cup (scheduled for May 23), The Big M filled the void by adding a Graduate leg for pacers on May 15.

"We decided to do it because we felt it was necessary to step up for the industry since Canada is facing continued shutdowns and cancellation of races," said Settlemoir. "We felt it was best for all the horsemen and horsewomen so that they could have somewhat of a normal schedule."

But now, The Big M is going above and beyond by picking up the Graduate legs for both trotters and pacers, originally scheduled for June 5 at Woodbine Mohawk Park (WMP). The date of the races remains the same.

Nick Salvi, Meadowlands director and administrator of stakes races, contacted Scott McKelvie, racing secretary for Woodbine standardbred racing, regarding the Graduate and Miss Versatility, two races hosted by The Meadowlands.

"I'd like to thank the SBOA of New Jersey, because they stepped up here," said Settlemoir. "We spoke to Mark Ford on Monday evening and they got back to us right away and they were very happy to step up along with us to do this for the industry."

Saturday (May 8), The Meadowlands will play host to the first leg of the Miss Versatility for trotting fillies and mares. The track also graciously will play host to the second leg – originally scheduled for Woodbine Mohawk Park for May 28 – which will now be raced on May 29. They're also adding a leg on June 12, expanding the series to a total of six legs.

"We were ready to ask [Jeff Gural] to do something and he beat us to the punch," said Ford, president of the SBOANJ. "So, kudos to him. Jeff is always very good at times like this trying to accommodate the horsemen.

"We don't want people to get the idea that we're handing money out to Canadians. That's not it at all. We're not just handing money out to anyone. You still have to earn it. We're just trying to add to our schedule. We're trying to fill holes in the schedule created because of the pandemic."



Hawthorne kicks off 2021 season

The 63-night harness meet begins tonight.

These are by no means the best of times in Illinois racing, but like hard-core horseplayers the hierarchy at Hawthorne Race Course and the people who race there are going into the 63-night harness meeting that will begin tonight (May 7) with an upbeat attitude.

Despite having last year's scheduled 92-night meeting interrupted for 2 ½ months and shrunken to 59 nights because of the COVID-19 pandemic and even though there were virtually no spectators from the resumption of racing June 10 until the meeting ended on Sept. 20 there was a 34 per cent increase in all sources handle versus the 70-night 2019 total.

"The momentum carried through our fall thoroughbred meeting and again (was in evidence) at this spring's thoroughbred meeting," said Jim Miller, the track's director of publicity and horsemen's relations.

"People were seeing racing on TV and betting before the other sports got going last summer and it seems like some of the people doing the betting on horses have stuck around



and continue to wager on them."

After last year's reopening, Hawthorne had no spectators until licensed owners were allowed in for the meeting's premier event, the Night of Champions, on Sept. 19. There also was limited attendance when the meeting concluded the following night.

At the start of the current harness meeting that will continue through Sept. 26 attendance will be confined to 50 per cent of capacity but hopes are high that restrictions in Illinois will be lifted sometime during the summer.

All of the programs will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

In contrast, at Indiana neighbor Hoosier Park's meeting that began March 26 and continues through Dec. 4 there will be racing five nights a week from May 23-Sept. 26.

The addition of Sunday racing during the five-night time frame concerns Miller.

"In the past they did not race on Sunday so we're anxious to see what impact the change will have on us," he said. "On Sunday we would get drivers from there for our races—we would get Mike Osteen and Brandon Bates and every once in a while Sam Widger. Now, we're not going to see those guys because of the schedule.

"I think the change will hurt both racetracks. Trainers used to have an option. If you couldn't get in a Sunday race at Hawthorne there might be a race at Hoosier (later in the week with the same conditions) and vice-versa."

Bolstering the Hawthorne trainer ranks will be the return of Bob Phillips, an absentee for a few years, and the migration of Roman Lopez, Jesse Pacheco and Nathalie Tremblay from California.

Defending trainer titlist Mike Brink will be trying to repeat and will be challenged by Steve Searle, who trailed by a single winner, and Terry Leonard, who was three back after reigning as champion in 2018 and 2019.

Terry's son, Casey Leonard, will be in quest of his six consecutive driver title.

Also on Hawthorne's VIP list are Kyle Wilfong, the runner-up in the driver standings who also will be overseeing the string his father, prominent trainer Brett Wilfong, is sending from the family's farm in Indiana.

"We're going to have a good summer," predicted race secretary Robin Schadt, who also is director of racing at Cal Expo. "We've had a good response to the summer series nominations, and that begins on opening weekend. Our 2-year-old crop is nominated for the Night of Champions series, and that's exciting because we have many more than last year.

"It sounds like all the county fairs are going to happen as scheduled (after being moved to Springfield last year) and the State Fairs (at Springfield and DuQuoin), as well."

Hawthorne's management team operates the State Fairs.

"Those are in mid-and-late August, and it looks like we will be able to have crowds at both," Miller said. "There's more time for vaccinations, enabling people to get out there."

The fairs are very important because since the closing of the sister tracks, Balmoral Park and Maywood Park at the end of their 2015 meetings, Hawthorne is the only track in the state conducting harness racing. While the harness horses and thoroughbreds have a time share arrangement at Hawthorne, the thoroughbreds enjoy exclusivity other Chicago metropolitan area track, Arlington International Racecourse, and at Fairmount Park, in downstate Collinsville across from St. Louis.

Next year, a major scheduling problem figures to confront both breeds because Arlington's owner, Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI), plans to discontinue racing there after this summer's meeting and sell what *Architectural Digest* has categorized as "the world's most beautiful racetrack" for redevelopment of the 326-acre property for other purposes.

Bill Carstanjen, the chief executive officer of CDI, said the decision was made "so that we can more effectively deploy this currently locked-up capital into high-growth projects."

Prospective buyers' offers are anticipated by June 15.

Although the leaders of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the track's leading trainer for the past eight years, Larry Rivelli, are organizing investors to make an offer to buy Arlington and preserve it for racing the odds are stacked heavily against them.

The reason is because CDI has a 61 per cent interest in the most lucrative of the state's 10 operating casinos, Rivers Casino, in Des Plaines, which is located only 10 miles from Arlington.

Ironically, the massive Illinois gambling expansion law that was enacted in June, 2019 permits racetracks in the state to add casinos and Hawthorne and Fairmount are in the process of doing so.

When Arlington president Tony Petrillo and CDI attorneys were hauled on the carpet by the Illinois Racing Board (IRB) for an explanation of the track's refusal to apply for casino license they said the reason was because the horsepeople's cut of the adjusted gross revenue was too high.

But that was an obvious pretext, given the fact that Arlington had joined forces with the other tracks and the thoroughbred and harness horsemen to lobby legislators for a casino for years before CDI acquired majority ownership of Rivers Casino in March, 2019.

"As has been made perfectly clear...the 'shareholder value" of CDI holdings trumps all other considerations," Jim O'Donnell wrote, expressing the consensus, in his *Daily Herald* column.

Now, more than ever, those who race at Hawthorne consider the \$400 million casino that is under construction there to be a godsend.

Last year, the casino was scheduled to open during this fall's thoroughbred meeting but now Hawthorne president Tim Carey anticipates "probably looking at the third quarter of 2022."

"It's going to be a state of the art facility that we'll be very proud of," he said.

Regarding the likelihood of Arlington closing, Carey said: "We've been handed the mantle for both thoroughbred and harness and we are proudly taking on that challenge."

Although Carey said a decision hasn't been made on which breed will be racing the summer dates at Hawthorne after Arlington's anticipated shutdown, the impact will be detrimental for both thoroughbred and harness racing. If, as expected, the thoroughbreds get the summer dates it will be the first time since pari-mutuel harness racing was introduced in Illinois at Maywood on June 6, 1946 that the standardbreds haven't had a prime-time spot on the calendar.

The current situation is light years removed from that of 1995 when there were 516 harness racing programs at Hawthorne, Maywood, Balmoral and Sportsman's Park. Now-defunct Sportsman's had its last night of harness racing on Oct. 10, 1997, prefacing the ill-fated attempt to remake the track into a combination thoroughbred and auto racing facility, but most years thereafter the sport was on the calendar for 12 months before the demise of Maywood and Balmoral.

To rectify the problem the 2019 gaming expansion legislation called for a new harness track/casino to be constructed in any one of six south suburban townships in the Chicago metropolitan area.

Carey and Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association executive director Tony Somone believed the sport was on the verge of a renaissance when real estate developer and video gambling magnate Rick Heidner announced plans to buy a former mental health center in Tinley Park and build a state-of-the-art racing.

However, a month after the IRB in the fall of 2019 approved Heidner's request for a Dec. 6-29, 2020 meeting Gov. J.B. Pritzer announced that the state-owned land on which the racino was to be built was no longer for sale and the board revoked the dates. The governor's decision was prompted by *Chicago Tribune* disclosures detailing Heidner's long-standing business relationship with a bank chairman who allegedly had dealings with members of the Mafia.

While Heidner has denied any involvement with these individuals, as a consequence of the bad publicity it appears highly unlikely that the IRB would give its blessing to any further attempts he might make to build and operate a racino.

Nevertheless, Carey remains steadfast in his support for a south suburban racino and calls finding somebody to construct, own and operate it "a work in progress."

"We'll get that thing going," he said. "We have our game plan and Arlington has theirs. We're going to grow Illinois racing — both thoroughbred and harness. Right now, we're holding our own. We're very excited to switch over the racetrack (following the April 25 conclusion of the thoroughbred meeting) and bring on the harness horses."

Carey also is upbeat about the PointsBet Sportsbooks he has opened this year at the track and at its Club Hawthorne off-track betting locations in south suburban Crestwood and northwest suburban Prospect Heights.

Sportsbooks were part of the 2019 gambling expansion legislation but, unlike casinos at the racetracks, there's no allocation for purse money.

In the opinion of Hawthorne's assistant general manager, John Walsh, "there is some crossover" between horseplayers and those who bet on mainstream sports. He is hopeful that "some people will bet on horse racing when they come in for other sports and vice-versa."

Time will tell.

In the meantime, while the long-range forecast for Illinois harness racing appears to be favorable, continued turbulence is in the offing for the next few years.



Tim Lane's game plan for standardbred success continues to pay off handsomely

There's a chance that Tim Lane could have excelled as a football player, but the gridiron's loss is standardbred racing's gain.

It was during the course of a conversation with the man who had recruited Lane to play U.S. collegiate football when the horseman was asked about assembling a winning team of racehorses.

"I trained some horses for some of the coaches at Bowling Green, including Steve Devine, who recruited me to play there," Lane said. "He went on to be a scout for the New York Giants. Typically, we throw around the terminology from athletes to horses because there are a lot of comparisons. We were having lunch one time and he asked me, 'What makes a trainer successful with these babies?' And I told him, 'If you could have the first 10 picks in every draft..." He stopped me and said, 'Well, you'd be pretty successful.' But you can't have that. Some of the bigger trainers have a little bit of an advantage, so you just have to do your homework and pick the best ones you can."

Foxy Rigger would be a prime example of Lane's penchant for discovering top talent in the later rounds, so to speak.

The daughter of Riggins, bred by Wilker Family Farms [OH], caught the attention of Lane at the 2018 Buckeye Yearling Sale.

"I paid \$5,000 for her. She was the only Indiana-bred in the Ohio Sale. I'm not sure how she got in there, but she caught my eye and as they say, the rest is history."

Foxy Rigger was a pacing sensation as a 2-year-old, fashioning a 7-2-0 mark from nine starts while boasting an impressive bankroll.

"I trained her down, qualified her a few times, and a very good friend of mine, [trainer] Brian Brown, approached me

about buying her for his owners. I kept a good chunk of her. She won about \$220,000 at 2, but didn't come back as good at 3. It was a real pleasure to watch her race at 2 in the Indiana Sires Stakes. She's now a broodmare for Country Club Acres."

The bay is just one of several success stories for Lane.

A prosperous winter campaign has carried over into the spring. In fact, Lane already has more wins this year than he did in 2020.

"We have a nice group of mares that are racing mainly in the upper classes, which is a good problem to have. We have three or four of them that have worked their way up into the open ranks. We've had them competing at Hoosier Park and Miami Valley, so we had a good winter.

"Sweet Filly has been a really good one for us. She won three in a row at Miami Valley and went to Hoosier and raced really well there. She won an open 2 at Hoosier in 1:50.3 on April 17."

Pansys Image, a 5-year-old daughter of Rockin Image [IN], is another mare that comes to mind for Lane.

Bred and owned by Emerald Highlands Farm, of Mount Vernon, OH, the bay has been a model of consistency throughout her career.

"Pansys Image might be the hottest one in the barn right now. She's had some horrible racing luck, but she's a really nice one."

As is Can B Perfect, the last foal out of Perfect Gesture, whose offspring includes accomplished pacers Dave Panlone, Long Live Rock, and Perfect Panderosa.

In 2019, the son of Big Bad John, owned by James Stambaugh and Lane, breezed to a Scioto Downs track record clocking of 1:51.2 in the first of three \$40,000 Ohio Sires Stakes for 2-year-old pacing colts.

"I've been lucky to have had some really nice horses since I began training. I also have a great team, including my grooms, Ali Hudson and Lily Spurlock. It's hard to be successful without a good supporting cast. I'm thankful for them. Hopefully, we can continue to be successful."

If he had any trepidation about joining the training ranks in 2011, Lane certainly doesn't anymore.

Contentment is par for the course these days.

"My family has been in the industry for a long time. I was in it as a kid, but then high school came, and then I went on to play football at Bowling Green, so I got away from horse racing for a time. After school, I got into the golf course business – in golf course construction, and as a superintendent – and I did that for 19 years. I owned horses with Jimmy Arledge, my cousin, pretty much the whole time, but the golf business ended up taking a turn.

"Being a trainer is something I always wanted to do. I actually worked for Brian Brown for about a year and he had

a big operation. Then I started from there. Brian left a couple horses when he went to Florida and I ended up picking up some new owners. I have some great owners. Bruce Trogdon always gives me around eight or 10 horses. I've had a lot of luck with Bruce's horses, including Warp Factor Three and Dragons Successor. Spring Haven Farm, we've put a little group together. They're in the baby business, so we race some 2-year-olds for them."

Lane's game plan for standardbred success continues to pay off handsomely.

Goals, short and long term, are ever-changing.

Consider them horse racing's version of calling an audible.

"It always varies. I just like to be successful with the group we have. I'm happy if I do it the right way and have success doing it that way. That's the main thing. Hopefully we can win some Sires Stakes and be competitive on the Ohio circuit. I think we have horses that compete. I have 20 total right now, and we are looking to branch out a bit. We're looking to race in Pennsylvania and see how that goes. That's something to look forward to."

Lane will also look to keep his sound game plan skills sharp.

After all, tackling the art of adding talent to his racing roster is a proven skill.

"I like that challenge, to go to a sale and see what is available. When you find one that you think can be a good addition to the team, and it all works out, that's a pretty great feeling."

Another example of the problem with harness racing's breaking rule

Twitter got buzzing after the completion of race 10 at Pompano Park Monday night (May 3) (unfortunately a replay was unvailable) and the tweeting topic was about how the breaking rule is applied as it related to the winner of that race who was on an extended break during the stretch run.

DRF Harness editor Derick Giwner got the Twitter ball rolling with this initial comment on the events: Race 10 at Pompano is the problem with the breaking rule in #harnessracing. The horse on the lead complied with the rule in terms of losing ground and regaining stride yet was still taken down. Maybe John Campbell's idea of 25 strides without being on gait makes sense.

We'll get back to the 25-stride breaking rule in a minute. In the race in question, 6-5 favorite Entranced, driven by JD Wengerd, broke stride inside the 1/16thpole and appeared headstrong and he didn't lose ground for about 10 strides. He appeared to start to lose ground just as he was regaining his stride nearing the wire. In this case, watching the replay, the correct call to disqualify him was made based on rule 18.10 c) of the USTA 2021 Rulebook:

18.10 Horse Breaking from Gait. When a horse breaks from its programmed gait, the driver shall at once, where clearance exists, take such horse to the inside or outside and pull him to its gait.

The following shall be considered violations:

- (a) Failure to properly attempt to pull the horse to its gait.
- (b) Failure to take to the inside or outside where clearance exists.

(c) Failure to continuously lose ground while offstride.

(d) Committing an extended break, in which the horse may be placed last.

But maybe Giwner has a point when he questions the judgement call part of this rule. What's an extended break? Should it be a number of strides? At what point after the horse starts to gallop must he begin to "continuously lose ground"? It also wasn't explained why the horse was placed fifth in an eight horse field, only that he was disqualified for violating the breaking rule during the stretch drive.

Giwner's take: The thing for me is how long is realistic for the driver to react before the horse has to lose ground? I'm thinking 4-5 strides is fair. If after 5 strides the horse hasn't started losing ground he comes down. But there is no rule... which is my issue.

The 25-stride rule that he mentioned in an earlier tweet is a universal rule that was passed by the USTA that states any horse that is off stride for 25 strides or more is automatically disqualified. But the rule has not been adopted or is being used by all racing commissions (full story here).

A logical argument can be made that breaking rule 18.10 leaves to much room for judgement calls. Perhaps harness writer Greg Reinhart has the answer as noted in his tweet: Just make it like Europe where if you run, you're DQ'd and you don't have to worry about judges making subjective rulings. I'm personally for that with pylon violations too, though everybody would hate it lol.

Pylon violations? Don't get me started. That would be another full column.

Hard work is paying off for Dan Noble

Dan Noble is a busy man, and it's paying off. Noble entered Monday (May 3) ready to put the finishing touches on his meet at Ohio's Miami Valley Raceway, where he is the leading driver, and ranks among North America's top-six drivers in both wins and purses this year.

For the season, Noble has visited the winner's circle 158 times and posted earnings of \$1.69 million. In addition, he helps his wife Christi with a 30-horse stable that ranks among the top 20 in North America in purses, with \$407,936, and is fourth in wins at Miami Valley.

All of Noble's victories this year have come at Miami Valley, where he previously captured a driving title in 2018.

"It feels good," Noble said. "It's just a lot of hard work and paying attention to your drives."

Following Monday's conclusion to the Miami Valley meet, Noble will turn his attention to Eldorado Scioto Downs, which opened Tuesday (May 4). Noble has won the past three driving titles at Scioto Downs and will look to maintain his momentum through the location change.

"I take it in stride because you never know what will happen," Noble said. "You might have a good meet at Miami Valley and your next meet at the next track, it could just be so-so, or (success) might carry over. You just never know how it's going to work out.

"I'm just hoping the stable my wife and I have with our 2and 3-year-olds has a good meet, as well as my catch drives. I hope all the young horses I get to sit behind, and work for other trainers and owners, have good years."

Noble, who began driving in 1999 and has 6,300 career triumphs, started training in 2013. The Noble Stable has posted million-dollar seasons each of the past three years and focused increasingly on 2- and 3-year-olds.

"The work we've done the last eight years has helped us get where we're at right now with the younger horses," said Noble, whose late father, Chip, is a member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame. "That's been the goal, to get away from the racehorses and do 2- and 3-year-olds, a lot like dad had. I had a good teacher. Dad taught me a lot.

"We're not quite there yet, but we're almost there. I thought I would just be a catch driver after I worked at it for 13 years. But then I kind of figured I'd like to carry the name on, and I always did enjoy the training just as much as driving. It's paying off. It's just a lot of hard work and a lot of hours."

In addition to his career, Noble's family life keeps him busy too. The Nobles welcomed home a son, Nash, eight months ago.

"I want to be home with my family," Noble said. "It's tough when you're in this business; we don't have many days or many hours to do that. With my older children, when I was younger, all I worried about was being at the next track, the next drive. Now I'm realizing what I missed out on. I'm hoping I don't miss out with Nash."

In 2020, Noble took off from driving the last two months of the year.

"We've had such good success that I can work through the summers and take the winters off to be at home," Noble said.

A busy man, and it's paying off.



Matt Kakaley gets 5,000th driving victory at Pocono Sunday

Driver Matt Kakaley, a "youthful veteran" of the sport at age 33, recorded the 5,000th victory of his still-young career when he got Traffic Jam home first in the fourth race of Sunday's (May 2) twilight card at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Kakaley let the Artiscape mare work her way to the lead at the quarter, rated the pace to the half, then kept her ahead of her pursuers for her second win of the year – Matt was in the bike for her first seasonal victory as well, on March 14.

In addition to the 5,000 victories, Kakaley-driven horses have won over \$81 million. His best year for victories came in 2011 when he was first 441 times, including 289 of them at Pocono to be the last driver not named "George" to top The Downs in that category; Matt guided the winners of over \$9 million in 2017, including Kentucky Futurity winner Snowflake Hanover and three \$100,000 wins with All Bets Off.

Kakaley also accounted for the \$15,300 featured pace for mares, putting heavy favorite Shouldabeenatd on the lead and keeping her pace strongly, including her own last half in :54.4, to cross the wire first in 1:51.3. The daughter of Sweet Lou won her second straight for trainer Ron Burke and the partnership of Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. In all, Matt had four victories on the card.

Billy Davis Jr. records 3,000th career win

Billy Davis Jr. made his 3,000th trip to the winner's circle after winning with Vintage Grand in Northfield Park's fifth race on Sunday (May 2).

"Coming to Northfield made sense for me because I needed a place to race that fit well with the Buffalo Raceway schedule and the Northfield racing program is lucrative," said Davis. "I have been given a lot of opportunity already and although I am still undecided where I will be in the future, I am strongly considering staying here at Northfield."

Derby weekend at Big M was a decade in the making

Saturday (May 1) night's handle at The Meadowlands was a sensational \$4,451,363, to come within \$100,000 of the track's biggest night of action during 2021.

It's not a coincidence that the big action occurred on Kentucky Derby Day, which, for many fans, is their favorite day of the year to come out and play. Betting at The Big M was huge by a historical perspective not only last Saturday, but all of last weekend, when one compares the numbers to 10 years prior.

During Kentucky Derby Weekend 2011, The Meadowlands' wagering menu offered only one bet with a low 15 percent takeout. Over the course of those 23 races, total handle was \$3,304,912, good for an average per race of \$143,691.

This past weekend, those numbers exploded. For 26 races, the total handle was \$7,967,639, by far the biggest weekend of play at the mile oval this year. The average wager per race was \$306,447. As a point of comparison, to bet \$3 million over a 13-race card, the average per race must be \$230,769.

"When our first race went off on Derby Day," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir, "most of the top thoroughbred tracks were still going and we still handled almost \$400,000. The Derby went 25 minutes later and set the tone for the rest of our live program. The excitement in our building was simply electric all day and night."

A look and the "now and then" of some of the track's more popular pools reveal huge gains. In 2011, there was one Pick-4 per card, and the handle was \$75,000 Friday and \$30,958 Saturday during Derby Weekend. There was no Pick-5 and the Pick-6 took in \$880 and \$747, respectively.

Fast forward to last Friday and Saturday, when the track's 15 per cent takeout bets took in big action. The Early Pick-4s had total play of \$106,305 and \$125,605, the Late Pick-4s \$90,838 and \$135,377, the Pick-5s \$83,774 and \$85,416 and the Pick-6s \$46,618 and \$19,733.

"We have certainly learned to respond to the consensus of horseplayers," said Settlemoir. "They wanted lower takeouts and we gave them a wide assortment of wagers as low as 15 per cent. They wanted more multi-race action, so we adjusted our wagering menu. Judging by our results this year, the horseplayers have responded in huge numbers to our product, and they love the fact that we are listening to them."

As a result, three single-race pools exceeded \$400,000 Saturday night, including race eight, when a 2021-best \$498,525 was pushed through the windows.

"We had a \$100,000 win pool and a \$150,000 exacta pool Saturday, which is simply extraordinary," said Settlemoir. "Before Gov. [Phil] Murphy and the New Jersey Legislature stepped in to give an enormous boost to New Jersey racing, these numbers would have been unthinkable. With their help, The Meadowlands and New Jersey have risen once again to be the most popular nighttime signal of any breed."

One Eight Hundred tops PA All-Stars action Saturday at Pocono

The opening of the stakes season for national-caliber Pennsylvania-sired stakes horses at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono begins this Saturday afternoon (May 8), with four divisions of a \$120,000 Pennsylvania All-Stars event for the sport's "qlamour division," the 3-year-old colt pacers.

Looking to regain a bit of his early-season glamour is the Somebeachsomewhere colt One Eight Hundred, an \$800,000 yearling purchase who startled fans with a 1:50.2 seasonal debut here on April 3, with a :26.4 last quarter, and then followed up with a 1:52 off-track win, making him the heavy favorite for his Weiss Series Championship. But in the Weiss final on April 24, One Eight Hundred got locked in the pocket and badly shuffled, although he recovered to be beaten only two lengths in fifth.

Unraced since then, One Eight Hundred will be looking for a clear chance to exhibit his talent, starting from post seven in the field of eight for trainer Nancy Takter, who has put down Tim Tetrick for the driving assignment.

The two winners in the first preliminary leg of the PA Sire Stakes last week at The Meadows, Southwind Gendry (1:49.4) and Literl Lad Hanover (1:51.1), will not be competing in the All-Stars, although they are likely to be at Pocono on Sunday the 16th for the second PASS leg. But there are plenty of other proven 3-year-olds joining One Eight Hundred Saturday – a second-place finisher and both third-place finishers in the Sire Stakes; three winners in the Stallion Series; both Weiss Consolation winners; and Always A Miki, in his seasonal debut after winning the Governor's Cup at two. These youngsters and other swift colts and geldings should ensure fast, competitive races in the All-Stars events.

Grand Circuit events for 3-year-old pacers tonight at Yonkers

Harness racing's Grand Circuit rolls back into Yonkers Raceway tonight (May 7) as the oval plays host to divisions of the W.N. Reynolds Memorial for 3-year-old pacers. Colts and geldings will face off in a pair of splits, worth \$23,250 and \$23,750, in races four and seven, and the fillies will match up in two flights, with purses of \$28,500 and \$29,000, in races five and six.

Coalition Hanover (post six, Dexter Dunn/Chris Ryder) won a section of the Pennsylvania Stallion Series most recently at The Meadows in 1:51.3 and will look to keep sharp in the first Reynolds test for the boys. He'll face off against the likes of last year's New York Sire Stakes Excelsior A Series and Massachusetts Sire Stakes champion Mullinax (post four, Scott Zeron/Mark Ford), and Whichwaytothebeach (post three, Andrew McCarthy/Brett Pelling), who won a few stakes

events as a rookie, including the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes consolation.

King James Express (post three, Jason Bartlett/Mark Harder), last year's New York Sire Stakes champion in the 2-year-old colt and gelding pace division, will look to get his sophomore campaign started on the right foot in the second Reynolds tilt for the fellas. He will see two familiar faces from the NYSS program in American Courage (post six, Matt Kakaley/Travis Alexander) and Town Gossip (post eight, Joe Bongiorno/Jenn Bongiorno). American Courage won his elimination and the final of MGM Springfield Stakes at Yonkers and then added four NYSS legs to his ledger, and Town Gossip was the runner-up in the NYSS final and won two preliminary rounds.

Heart Of Mine (post one, Scott Zeron/Linda Toscano) was second to eventual 1:48.4 performer Test Of Faith in the New York Sire Stakes final for 2-year-old pacing fillies a year ago, and she tops Friday night's first Reynolds rumble for the ladies. Heart Of Mine, a daughter of Roll With Joe, won an overnight race at Yonkers in 1:55 on April 28. Her biggest competition could come from Let 'Er Buck (post seven, Mark MacDonald/Ray Schnittker), who won three stakes events in Pennsylvania as a freshman and is a Betting Line half-sister to \$1.7 million earner Huntsville.

MacDonald and Schnittker also have Carrington (post three) in the other section for this group. Carrington, a So Surreal filly, recently finished second in the Bobby Weiss Series final at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono and was the runner-up in the 2020 New York Excelsior A Series final for 2-year-old pacing fillies. Another stakes winner in this field is Podium Girl (post two, Dunn/Ryder), who collected her triumphs at New Jersey's Freehold Raceway. Also entered is DC Batgirl (post seven, George Brennan/Britney Dillon), who qualified for last year's New York Sire Stakes final and comes in off a fast 1:51.2 qualifier at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

In addition to the stakes action, Friday's ten-race program also has a \$37,000 open handicap trot (race eight) and a \$24,000 Preferred Trot (race nine). Post time is 7:15 p.m.

Colts tangle in 2021 Ohio Sires Stakes debut

Four \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) divisions for 3-year-old pacing and trotting colts went postward on a rainy afternoon at Miami Valley on Monday (May 3). Despite the gloomy weather, all the tail-sitting events offered excitement for harness racing fans.

Winning Ticket began the afternoon by taking the first of two OHSS trotting events with Aaron Merriman driving for trainer Chris Beaver. The son of Triumphant Caviar, out of the

Credit Winner mare Lotto Winner now has four straight triumphs to his credit in 2021, with seasonal earnings of \$77,500 and career earnings of \$162,547. Bred by James Bender, Winning Ticket is owned by Beaver, Steve Zeehandelar, Tim Homan and Jim Burnett. The bay gelding used front-end tactics to score the win, snapping off fractions of :29, :58.4, 1:26.3 with a final panel in :29 to fly under the wire in 1:55.3. Peter's Royalty was second for Josh Sutton, nearly three lengths behind the winner, while Tango With Me (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) was a distant third.

The same driver/trainer combo of Aaron Merriman and Chris Beaver was back in the winner's circle for the second OHSS trotting division as **Spyder The Striker** prevailed in 1:56.3 for owners Beaver, Beaver, Fleming and VIP Stable. The bay son of Uncle Peter—Elena hinted in his last start, losing a head decision in a Miami Valley overnight. This OHSS victory was his fifth lifetime start as he bested rivals Perron (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) and Lockbox (Chris Page) by a nail-biting nose. Bred by Wilbur Lang, Spyder The Striker won two OHSS events as a freshman in his only two start last year. He now has \$68,125 in career earnings.

The Brian Brown-trained **Four-Star Flash** kept his unblemished 2021-win streak intact by posting a 1:52 victory in the first of two \$50,000 OHSS events for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings. The son of Western Vintage, out of the Bettor's Delight mare Keladi Blue Chip is now four-for-four on the year for owners Hutchison Harness, D. Wozniak, D. Van Dusen and Acadia Farms. Bred by Marion Beachy, Four-Star Flash, with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., at the lines, now has \$80,010 in his lifetime bank account and was three-quarters of length in front of I'm Sorry Man and Chris Page, followed by 48-1 longshot Sir Charles Of Sky and driver Trace Tetrick.

Heart Of Chewbacca added another \$25,000 to his already hefty \$244,348 bank account by capturing the second OHSS division for 3-year-old pacing colts in spry 1:51.2. Trained by Ron Burke for owners Dennis Owens and Norman Rae Racing, the son of Break On The Beach—Jt's Chewbacca notched his eighth career triumph in 11 starts. Bred by Spring Haven Farm, the black colt was driven by Danny Noble to his third straight victory this season in wire-to-wire fashion and finished 7¼ lengths ahead of Truly Noble (Greg Bateson), with Bare It Hill (Chris Page) nabbing show honors.

Fillies sparkle in 2021 Ohio Sires Stakes openers

The 2021 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) season got off to a sizzling start on a sunny and breezy Sunday afternoon, May 2 at Miami Valley Raceway.

In the first of two \$50,000 divisions of 3-year-old pacing fillies it was the favorite **Lady Arthur** who stole the show for trainer and co-owner Dr. Ian Moore. The homebred daughter by Arthur Blue Chip, out of the Mach Tree mare April Three used front-stepping tactics to nail down her second triumph of the season in 1:53.3 with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. at the lines. Owned in partnership by Moore and the RG McGroup and Serge Savard, she now has \$110,00 in her career coffers. Lady Arthur finished two lengths in front of 11-1 rival She Knows It All (Brett Miller), with Bab's Jansen (Kayne Kauffman) half a length back in third.

The lone \$60,000 trotting division saw Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., back in the winner's circle; this time with the Ron Burke-trained **Celebrate With Me** (4-1), who got the garden trip before scoring the victory in 1:54.2 by half a length over Katie's Lucky Day (Trevor Smith), while Aaron Merriman brought 16-1 longshot Ozma up for third-place honors. Bred by Marvin Raber, Celebrate With Me is a daughter of Full Count, out of the Andover Hall mare Glisten Hanover and now has \$202,472 in lifetime earnings. She is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Howard Taylor, Weaver Bruscemi and Knox Services.

Burke harnessed the winner of the second pacing division, the even-money favorite **Summer Touch**, who paced to a winning time of 1:53.1 with Chris Page at the controls with a front-end effort. Last year's winner of the \$300,000 Championship on Super Night, Summer Touch is a daughter of Well Said, out of the Real Desire mare Real Touch and is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services, Slaughter Racing and Weaver Bruscemi. The homebred winner of \$323,000 lifetime finished 2½ lengths ahead of Leave Her Wild (Mike Wilder), with Rainy Day Chic (Andy Shetler) nabbing third.

Ontario Sires Stakes yearling nomination update

The deadline to nominate Ontario Sired yearlings, foals of 2020, to the Ontario Sires Stakes program is Monday, May 17.

Yearlings must be registered with Standardbred Canada at the time of nomination and will be eligible to compete in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program at 2 in 2022 and at 3 in 2023. To maintain eligibility sustaining payments are due in the two and three-year-old seasons.

Ontario Sires Stakes staff members continue to work limited hours and may not be able to respond to calls and messages regarding telephone payments before the May 17 deadline.

Yearling owners are encouraged to mail their payments before May 17. Forms can be found **here** on the OSS website.

To confirm the receipt of a payment please send it by registered mail, Priority Post or courier (addresses below) rather than calling the OSS office.

Those who prefer to pay by credit card over the telephone should:

- 1) Call well in advance of the May 17 deadline.
- 2) Clearly leave a name and telephone number if staff members are unable to answer.
- 3) Telephone messages regarding credit card payments received before the May 17 deadline will be considered on-time payments even if the deadline has passed before staff members are able to return the call.

Please allow 10 to 14 days for your payment to be processed and be aware that payments made through the SC Stakes Online portal are not processed until the May 17 deadline has passed. New betting options at Red Shores

Red Shores will be offering some new betting features that will begin with the start of the meet at both Charlottetown and Summerside tracks.

Firstly, Red Shores will now be offering a Jackpot Hi5 wager during the 2021 racing season. The pool will have an industry low takeout of 15% and will have a single winner format.

The Jackpot Hi5 requires the selection of the first five finishers of the race in correct order. If there is a single winner, they will receive not only the payout from the day's current pool but also the full jackpot that has built up from previous events.

"We tested the Pentafecta at the end of our last meet and there was some interest there," said Lee Drake, manager of racing and broadcast. "The single winner Jackpot format is something that will provide the potential for some big prices for the pool."

The Jackpot Hi5 pool will be offered at both Charlottetown and Summerside. The carryover will follow the two tracks to maximize the opportunities to build the carryover and create some big payouts.

In addition to this, Red Shores has also reduced the minimum bet amounts required for several pools. The Superfecta, Pick 4 and Jackpot Hi5 now all have a \$0.20 minimum bet option.

The Jackpot Hi5 and the lower bet minimums will begin with the opening day program at Red Shores Charlottetown on Saturday May 8 with a first post of 6pm pm ADT / 5pm EDT. Red Shores Summerside kicks off with the season opener on Monday May 24that 1pm ADT/12pm EDT.
