Lisa Giannelli guilty of conspiracy to misbrand and adulterate drugs

She faces a maximum sentence of five years in prison.

The federal government's crackdown on horse doping notched another courthouse win Friday (May 6) with a jury finding Lisa Giannelli guilty of conspiracy to misbrand and adulterate drugs after an eight-day trial.

The jury of eight men and four women in U.S. District Court in New York returned the verdict after less than two hours of deliberations spanning two days.

Giannelli, 55, of Felton, DE, faces a maximum sentence of five years in prison at her sentencing Sept. 8 before Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil.

The jurors rejected Giannelli's testimony in which she defended her actions selling medications for veterinarian Dr. Seth Fishman when she was his employee for 18 years at Florida-based Equestology.

As part of their verdict, the jury also agreed that Giannelli's intent was to defraud and mislead.

Giannelli stood at the defense table and turned towards the jury during the reading of the verdict. She was wearing a mask and had no visible reaction. She remains free on a \$100,000 bond.

She rushed out of the courtroom with her husband.

"I'm disappointed," defense attorney Louis Fasulo said. He plans to file a motion challenging the verdict.

New York U.S. Attorney Damian Williams said, "For almost two decades, Lisa Giannelli peddled untestable

performance-enhancing drugs to give racehorse trainers the tools to dope racehorses. As a former standardbred racehorse trainer, Giannelli knew firsthand the dangers of selling illegal, injectable performance-enhancing drugs to trainers who were recklessly injecting horses to gain a competitive edge. The jury's swift conviction demonstrates the gravity of Giannelli's criminal scheme. This office remains committed to holding accountable those who would engage in the kind of fraud and animal abuse exemplified by Giannelli's crimes."

The charges against Giannelli grew out of a lengthy FBI investigation into horse doping at thoroughbred and harness racetracks two years ago that resulted in the indictments of more than two dozen people.

Just before announcing their verdict, the jury came to the courtroom to inspect a seized drug bottle that the government introduced into evidence during the trial.

The bottle was labeled BB3 which prosecutors said was a misbranded and adulterated PED designed to boost a horse's red blood cells.

Ten jurors walked past the bottle before two stopped to inspect the bottle with gloved hands.

"The government's case was very strong," juror Joe Coughlan, 56, of Valley Cottage, NY, said after the verdict. "It was a preponderance of the evidence. I couldn't see any other verdict but guilty."

Coughlan said it's "obviously not a good thing" that horses were being doped at racetracks.

"That amounts to cheating," he said.

He said he had no idea how extensive the problem was until the trial.

"It's a sport and you've got bettors who are relying on everything being okay," he said. "You want things to be above board. If they are not, what do you do?"

Prosecutors said the products Giannelli distributed for Fishman were illegal substances meant to enhance a horse's performance while being undetectable in tests conducted by racing authorities after races.

Fishman, a Florida veterinarian, was found guilty at his own trial in February. His sentencing is May 26.

Since the initial indictments, the number of defendants has grown to 31.

Of those 14 have pleaded guilty including two former harness trainers who became government witnesses against Giannelli.

Two other defendants agreed to deferred prosecution agreements.

Defendants with charges still pending include the prominent trainer Jason Servis, whose 3-year-old Maximum Security finished first in the 2019 Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (Grade 1) and then was disqualified for interfering with another horse during the race.

DAY 7 COVERAGE

Jury deliberations began Thursday (May 5).

The jury of eight men and four women got the case in U.S. District Court in New York late in the day and deliberated for about 30 minutes before going home for the night.

Before leaving the courthouse the jury requested a large batch of government exhibits and a transcript of the testimony of a government witness, Conor Flynn. He is a former assistant harness trainer who became a cooperating witness after his arrest in a related horse doping prosecution.

Prosecutors allege Giannelli engaged in the conspiracy while working at a Florida company called Equestology that was owned by veterinarian Dr. Seth Fishman. The doctor was convicted at his own horse doping trial in February.

In closing arguments Thursday, prosecutor Sarah Mortazavi described Giannelli as Fishman's "trusted partner" at Equestology.

But defense attorney Louis Fasulo countered that Giannelli was just an employee of Fishman's who did what she was told.

"At no time during her employment did Fishman tell her you can't do that," Fasulo said during his summation.

"Lisa Giannelli was a high school grad relying on her boss, doing her job as instructed and no one tells you it was wrong," he said. "No one from the inside. No one from the outside."

Fasulo went on, "What was her intent? Was she acting in good faith? Was she doing the right thing."

He argued Giannelli was acting in good faith without criminal intent.

Fasulo also told jurors that he wasn't going to tell them that trainers didn't use drugs purchased from Giannelli "in an illegal manner."

But he said that was their decision, not Giannelli's.

He argued that at the track there is the "ultimate trainer rule" that says trainers are ultimately responsible for any drugs administered to their horses.

"There was no benefit for Lisa Giannelli," Fasulo said.

If a trainer won a \$60,000 purse, his client didn't benefit," he argued. She got none of the purse money.

"What she wanted to do was as good a job for Seth Fishman as she could and work her 16 hours a day," Fasulo told the jury.

He argued that the government had failed to prove the Giannelli intended to defraud the racing commission. Intent is an element of the crime that Giannelli is charged with in the indictment against her.

But in rebuttal to Fasulo's argument Mortazavi told the jury the government had more than met its burden in establishing Giannelli's guilt.

The government called 12 witnesses and introduced dozens of pieces of evidence, including emails, texts, wiretapped phone calls, photographs. Prosecutors also presented physical evidence seized by the FBI in a search of Fishman's business and Giannelli's residence.

She argued it wasn't true to say Giannelli didn't have a stake in races won by trainers using banned substances obtained from Equestology and Giannelli.

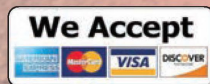

She added, “All the talk who is leading Equestology, who the veterinarian is, who makes more money is just a distraction.”

Another distraction was the defense argument that Giannelli never gave a trainer instructions on how to dope a horse before a race, Mortazavi said.

“The defendant had the needles and the drugs and the instructions telling them how to treat a horse on the day of a race and assuring them they wouldn’t get caught,” the prosecutor said.

Mortazavi had begun her closing argument discussing criminal intent and how she said it related to Giannelli.

She said one proof of that intent to defraud and mislead was the untestability of Fishman’s drugs. She said they were designed to avoid being detected in post-race tests.

She pointed to a text exchange between Giannelli and Fishman. Giannelli wrote that a client was asking about a particular drug and Fishman responded, “have it but it tests.”

Giannelli knew that mattered to trainers bent on cheating.

She said additional proof of that intent was the lack of any labels on some products.

“It’s unlabeled to be untraceable,” Mortazavi said pointing to an illegal blood builder known as BB3. A government expert testified BB3 enhanced a horse’s performance.

But Fasulo told the jury that expert could still tell what that drug was even without a label.

“If she knew, who is Ms. Giannelli deceiving,” he said.

Streaking trotter Oney Hall aims for six straight at Woodbine Mohawk Park

It's another week, and that must mean that another horse is streaking at Woodbine Mohawk Park. This time it's the 6-year-old trotting gelding Oney Hall. Owned by Alan Leavitt and bred by his Walnut Hall Limited, Oney Hall is by far the most successful progeny of his dam, On With The Show and the fastest progeny of his sire Deweycheatumnhowe.

Oney Hall, who sports a 1:51 mark, is trained by Bob McIntosh.

Following breaks in stride in consecutive preferreds in February, Oney Hall's current streak began with a two and a quarter length win on the drop to a NW22000L5C on March 14. From that race, it was back into the preferred ranks where Oney Hall has taken another four of those in a row. The most recent of which came last Monday, and there hasn't been much of an anxious moment in nearly all races in that span.

Oney Hall came into the barn on McIntosh late in fall of 2020 as a 4-year-old, and at that time had only about \$50,000 lifetime on his card. (The trotter now has earnings exceeding \$400,000 (by Standardbred Canada accounting), making him among Deweycheatumnhowe's top earners).

Oney Hall then reeled off a win in his first four starts for McIntosh, the fourth of which was first preferred win (in his first attempt), before making breaks in the late-race stages of two preferreds (both as the favorite) to close out that year.

"When I first got him, he was in good shape and well fed and everything, but he just didn't have a lot of manners," McIntosh said. "He was hot, and I managed to get him slowed down and relaxed and I think that made a big difference."

In 2021, Oney Hall began the year at Woodbine but due to another government imposed COVID-19 shutdown that impacted the province, Oney Hall spent time between April and June at the Meadowlands racing under Brett Pelling. But from July onwards it was back to Woodbine, where Oney Hall became a stalwart in the preferred division.

Much of that success from his 5-year-old season has carried into this year, where Oney Hall has been virtually unstoppable.

“He’s a big horse, he’s 17-hands and he’s got a huge stride to him,” said McIntosh. “He will get out once in a while (referencing breaks made in back-to-back races in February), and that’s when he was sent down to veterinarian Dr. Melissa McKee, and she seems to have the key to him. She tuned him up, and then you’ve got the horse reunited with Trevor Henry who gets along with him great and really does hit it off with that horse. It’s the combination of those people, I just train him,” said McIntosh, graciously.

Indeed, there is something to the Oney Hall and Trevor Henry tandem. Oney Hall’s 1:51 lifetime mark from last year came with Henry in the bike in a race just off a track record for older male trotters, as did his nation’s best 1:52.3 mile this year, taken last week. Career-wise, Oney Hall is 16 for 25 with Henry driving and miraculously has only missed the board once in that entire time, a race in which he broke. Just the fact Henry kept him flat 24 out of 25 is amazing in itself.

During the course of the current win streak, it was announced that Oney Hall’s chief rival, Perfetto, was selected as the invited representative from Canada into the prestigious 2022 Elitlopp in Sweden. Perfetto had gotten the better of Oney Hall throughout the tail end of last year, but this year has been different. Perfetto ran second to Oney Hall in three consecutive preferreds between

March 21 and April 25; two of those wins had occurred at the time the Elitlopp announcement was made on April 17 (*For more on that story, see pg. 14 of Leavitt’s column The Art of Breeding*).

“I would have loved to have sent him over there, but they’ve made their choice,” said McIntosh. “Oney wears trotting hobbles and he’s on Lasix, and they don’t allow either one there. But he could race with no hobbles and no Lasix and that wouldn’t have been a problem. I’m sure he would have been okay.”

While racing primarily in overnights, Oney Hall did have limited tries last year against some of the sport’s best trotters in stakes such as the Caesars, Earl Rowe and Cutler. This year, he’s currently nominated to the Maple Leaf Trot later in the summer at Woodbine, and it’s possible he could surface in stakes elsewhere as the year goes on.

As if he needed it, Oney Hall landed the rail in a field of seven in Monday’s preferred where he’ll face others he’s beaten in form or another routinely over the past couple of months. McIntosh notes that as the season shifts into summer, things will get tougher. For now, though, it remains to be seen how much farther the streak will go.

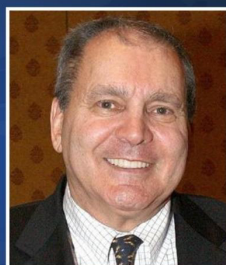

Heartbreaking news about Monte Miki's retirement

It's always disheartening when a top horse breaks down, especially so when it's last year's champion 2-year-old pacing colt, Monte Miki. A son of Always B Miki, out of Montenegro, by Camluck, M.M. won \$665,778 and took a record of 1:50.4 during his 2-year-old campaign in 2021.

Here is a star studded stallion prospect who only lost one race last year, while winning both The Metro Pace and the Breeders Crown. Looking at his extended pedigree, you don't hit the same name more than once until you get to the fourth generation, where Big Towner checks in three times.

As a quick refresher: when the sum of the generations where the same name appears twice is six or less, that is inbreeding.

When the sum of the generations where the same name appears is seven or eight, that is line breeding. (So Monte Miki is line bred three times to Big Towner).

When the sum of the generations where the same name appears is higher than eight, that horse is accurately described as an outcross.

It was amusing to me to note that in M.M.'s fourth generation, you not only see Big Towner three times, you also see Most Happy Fella's name. Both horses stood at Blue Chip in days of yore. Various wits of that day, technically described in the King's English as smart arses, would hint that maybe Big Towner was really by MHF, not Gene Abbe.

Since Bill Brown was the Blue Chip farm manager during those years, anyone lucky enough to know him knew that he was meticulous in everything he did, and everything was strictly by the book.

Regarding Gene Abbe, thanks to Hal Jones, who managed Walter Michael's Pickwick Farm in Bucyrus, OH, he was the first standardbred stallion to take advantage of artificial insemination.

Gene Abbe was a decent racehorse, as far as his phenotype or the living horse went. But he clearly had a superior genotype, or genetic profile, which determines a stallion's ability to sire speed. To think of it in simplest terms, imagine a deck of cards, which runs from a low card of two to a high card of ace.

Somewhere in each horse's deck is the speed gene. For an average stallion, his high speed gene card is probably a seven.

For a top sire, it's probably a 10, or even a jack. The genetic inheritance of every horse is determined at conception, with each parent contributing 50 per cent of the foal's genetic inheritance, although what each one contributes is entirely different.

In the case of Gene Abbe, every foal he conceived obviously started with a high card, or fast gene, so he always sired a horse with a respectable amount of speed. When the mare, or dam, also came up with a high card for her speed gene, you had a stakes winner.

In Gene Abbe's day, there were more standardbred mares in Ohio than any other state, and they flocked to the horse and Hal Jones. He rewarded his followers not only with a lot of good raceway horses, but also horses that could compete at the highest level. Two of the best free-for-allers in my early days were Stephan Smith and Irvin Paul, and they went at it every Saturday night at either Roosevelt or Yonkers.

There was an interesting angle to those two full brothers. In 1924, a mare named May Dodge was foaled. She had only four foals, all by The Senator, but two of her three fillies changed the course of the American pacing breed.

They were Romola and Nora Adele. In 1946, May Dodge produced a filly by Hal Dale, named Romola Hal. From her has descended a great family of crack pacers, led by Romola Hanover, one of the best pacing producing mares in the Register. Her influence is still alive and well today.

Nora Adele also was a standout producer, and she still plays a part in today's pacing pedigrees.

Then there was May Dodge's third daughter, Ripples, foaled in 1930. She only produced three foals, including two mares by Cold Cash. One of them, the musically named Jackie Jingles, produced a number of horses that were just horses, and those just horses produced more of the same.

But the other mare, also by Cold Cash, was Edalena. Bred twice to Gene Abbe, she came up with two colts named Irvin Paul and Stephan Smith. In a time of limited purses, Irvin Paul won \$548,518, and Stephan Smith won \$335,527. A credit to May Dodge and her family, and to Gene Abbe and Hal Jones, who showed the way to a brave new world for all of us to become part of.

ONEY HALL SNUBBED BY THE ELITLOPPET?

On a more personal note, this kid has had an exchange of emails with Anders Malmrot, the Big Dog of Solvalla Racetrack in Sweden.

The ostensible subject was our trotting gelding, Oney Hall, who has been racing well at Woodbine Mohawk Park (see *Between the Lines*), where he's won the last five preferred trots, the top purse race for Ontario trotters at the moment.

The caper started when I got a call from Oney's trainer, Bob McIntosh, who wanted to know if I knew why one of Oney's competitors, Perfetto, had been invited to the Elitloppet and we hadn't, even though we cleaned his clock the last three times the two horses met.

So, I wrote to Mr. Malmrot, seeking enlightenment. It wasn't immediately forthcoming, but under heavy urging, as they say at the runners, Mr. Malmrot said he hadn't invited Oney Hall because in all his races at Mohawk he was treated with Lasix and wore trotting hobbles. And they – heaven forbid! – are verboten in Sweden.

I patiently replied that both Lasix and trotting hobbles were totally sanctioned by the Ontario rules of racing. I also said that it had always been an article of faith that every harness racing jurisdiction respected the rules of racing of every other jurisdiction.

Until now, and until it concerned Oney Hall. How, I asked, could a horse be excluded from one of the sport's biggest races when he was simply complying with the rules in the jurisdiction, in this case Ontario, where he raced.

Mr. Malmrot was having none of it. Clearly the Swedish rules were not only sanctified by him, but also by the Racing Gods themselves, who presided over Swedish racing from high upon Mount Olympus.

It meant absolutely nothing to Malmrot to say that if we were invited, of course we'd race under the prevailing Swedish rules, meaning no Lasix, no hobbles. Unspoken, but crystal clear, was if I didn't like it, Tough Turtles. And the same for the hobbled trotter I rode in on.

So, Oney Hall, who is clearly the top trotter in Canada at the moment, will not get to represent Canada in one of the most prestigious trotting races in the world. And when I find myself thinking of words that start with "S" other than Sweden, the first ones that come to mind are "self righteous," and "stuff it."

Q: Let's speak about something more pleasant. Please tell me about Cane Run Farm.

"My mom had been boarding her horses at Castleton Farm. In 1982, she purchased 215 acres in Georgetown, the land that is now Cane Run. At the time, she had one of the two mares that were destined to become the foundation mares for the farm. The other one was Deanella Hanover who was purchased from the Castleton Farms dispersal. From these two, several champions are descended — horses like Moni Maker, Nans Catch and Propulsion. We presently have 82 horses here on the farm. We have had 17 babies foaled here so far this year. There are eight more expected."

The incredible legacy of Elizabeth Caldwell and Cane Run Farm

In this scribe's opinion the three most important words when buying prospective breeding stock are family, family and family. When we refer to family in this manner, we are generally speaking of the maternal side of the pedigree. In all of harness racing, there are no families of the human species that are deeper than that of Elizabeth Caldwell, who with her brother Danny manages Cane Run Farm in Georgetown, KY. The maternal side of her pedigree is without peer in our sport. Her grandmother was Frances Dodge Johnson Van Lennep, the founder of the greatly missed and lamented Castleton Farm. Elizabeth's mother is Fredericka "Rikki" Caldwell who established and still owns Cane Run.

Asked what she does at Cane Run, Elizabeth said, "a little bit of everything, I suppose. Myself and my brother Danny are present when every mare foals. We either do or supervise everything that goes on here."

Sadly, I spoke with Elizabeth at a somewhat traumatic time. Her long-time show and riding horse Aragorn had perished in a barn fire two days prior.

Q: Please except my condolences on your loss. It's an experience no horse owner should ever have to go through.

"It was terrible for me, but much more for the Brannon family who lost everything in the fire. A [GoFundMe page](#) has been established to help

Q: From a relatively small number of yearlings that the farm has raised and sold, you have had some remarkable success. Tell us about some of your graduates.

“Without a doubt the most well-known horse bred by us was the remarkable Moni Maker. She was one of the last Speedy Crown yearlings ever sold and a daughter of the great Hambletonian Oaks winner Nan’s Catch. Nan’s Catch was described by master horseman Jan Johnson, as being in his opinion the best horse ever trained and raced by himself and his Hall of Fame partners Hakan Wallner and Berndt Lindstedt. Moni Maker won \$5,589,256 and was the winner of classic races all over the world. We followed her career avidly. It was such a great thrill to be at the Prix d’Amerique and the Elitlopp and see a horse that we raised beat the best horses in the world. Another great one is Propulsion who won the Elitlopp and numerous other Classic races throughout Europe. Unfortunately, his owners were stripped of all the money he earned because the Swedish breeding authorities were unaware of the fact that he had been nerved, even though it was right there on his registration papers. It was a very sad ending to a remarkable racing career. Another really good one we raised and sold was Habitat who earned \$1,262,221.”

Q: You will have 90 horses on the farm after all the mares have foaled. Would that be the greatest number you’ve had?

“Without a doubt, This new Kentucky program has been amazing. Of the 90 horses that we will have at the end of the foaling season, the majority will be owned by Cane Run in partnership. The remainder are outside owned. Obviously, the impetus for the program was meant to get more horses to Kentucky and rejuvenate the breeding and racing industries. It has succeeded beyond expectations and it appears as though it will continue to grow.”

Q: You mentioned partnerships. How many of the mares you own are owned with partners?

“We presently own 18 broodmares. All but one of them are owned in partnerships. The majority of the partnership mares are owned with Bluestone Farms as our partner. I get together with Mitchel Skolnick who is the managing partner of Bluestone and we determine which stallions they are going to. Of course, we run our choices by mom before we finalize them. We foal and raise them and prep them here for the sale. We also own breeding rights to Cantab Hall who is now retired, Muscle Hill and Captain Corey. Counting the outside owned mares, we will be breeding 40 mares this year.”

Q: Are all of your horses trotters?

“We now actually have two pacing mares. But our focus is certainly on trotters.”

Q: You also have some thoroughbreds. Do you find any differences in keeping and raising thoroughbred as opposed to standardbreds?

“We own three thoroughbred mares and have one yearling hat was be sold in February this year. One of the mares is a maiden. I find there to be a tremendous difference, especially in their demeanor. I find the thoroughbreds to be more high strung and flighty. Although the present breed of trotters exhibits more and more of the temperament of the thoroughbreds. Although we only have three thoroughbred mares on the farm. I suppose that’s a small sample – certainly not enough to make an all-encompassing judgment.”

Q: What do you like most about running the farm?

“It would probably be having a safe foaling season – seeing the fruition of our efforts in producing healthy babies makes me very happy. Of course, the opposite side of that coin would be all the things that can go wrong in attaining that goal, including, but not limited to getting the mare in foal, having the mare carry the foal full term and then getting a strong healthy foal that is able to stand and nurse. There is nothing worse than having to phone a client and tell them that the mare they were expecting a foal from aborted or sometimes worse, that the foal died. Another area that I really enjoy is that period before the sale when people start coming to the farm to look at the yearlings.

It's especially rewarding when the yearlings put on a good show when they are turned out in the paddock. Of course, that is also a stressful time. The results of our entire year's work is determined by how the public reacts to what we have in the sales ring in the time frame of only a few days."

Q: Two years ago you sold a yearling Muscle Hill colt out of Danae named Damien for a million dollars. What was that like?

"It was surreal. He was a lovely colt and checked all the boxes. He had a lot of traffic by all of the major trotting horse trainers and owners. We thought he would sell well and that he would certainly top our sale. But a million dollars! We never even dreamed that could happen. Normally my mom, Danny and I stand in back of the auction ring where the yearlings are walked before entering the ring. We watch the numbers as they progress on the televisions back there. We anticipated that this colt would do really well, so we went in front to watch him sell. It was just amazing."

Q: You like to travel especially to Europe when and where some of the classics races take place.

"That was before COVID came along. However since it became a factor I've stayed close to home. I really enjoyed going to Paris for the Prix d'Amerique and Sweden for the Elitlopp. If a person doesn't like Paris, then maybe something is wrong with him or her. Stockholm at the end of May is delightful. The weather is usually great and the long days are filled with sunshine."

Q: You are a Kentuckian, then you must be a Wildcats fan.

"Of course I am!. Although last year because of the concern about COVID I wasn't able to get to many games. Basketball is still the top gun as far as our sports programs are concerned, but football is making some inroads. We had really good teams in both sports this last season but we had an unhappy ending."

Q: Speaking of COVID, how has it affected you.

"I had it and it wasn't fun. I got sick with it in early November of 2020, while the sale at Timonium was going on. It really knocked me for a loop. I was very tired and wasn't myself for a few weeks."

Q: Do you race as well as breed?

"We are essentially a commercial breeding operation. Occasionally, but rarely, we will keep a filly from a good mare who's blood we want to extend in our broodmare band. We now have a 3-year-old filly in training with Per Engblom."

Q: How about your yearling crop that will be sold this Fall?

"I think it's quite solid. We have two Muscle Hill colts and one filly by him. We also have a Chapter Seven filly and an Always B Miki colt. Unfortunately we have an absentee from our consignment. We do not have a yearling out of Danae this year. She took a vacation in 2020. She does have a suckling colt by Muscle Hill that will be in our 2023 consignment. We were kind of hoping that she would have a filly that we could possibly retain to enhance our broodmare band — maybe next year."

Q: What do you do when you're not tending to the horses and the farm?

"I like to read. I follow racing, both the trotters and the runners. I love to ride. I sometimes go to the races. I follow the Wildcats."

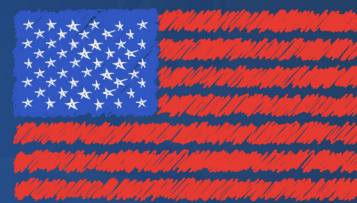

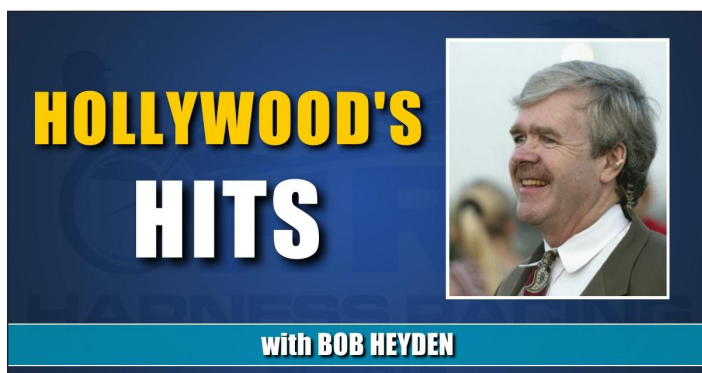

From Good Time to Foiled Again

The history of the pacing earnings record.

September 1 will mark the 10th anniversary of the day Foiled Again became the richest pacer in history.

By winning the 2012 Canadian Pacing Derby at Mohawk that night, Foiled Again surpassed Gallo Blue Chip as the top pacer in history.

Foiled Again went on to become the richest standardbred of all time, retiring with earnings of \$7,635,588.

Prior to Foiled Again's CPD victory, Gallo Blue Chip had held the pacing money title for 11 years, originally taking it over in 2001 and ending his career with earnings of \$4,260,957 in a career that spanned from 1999 to 2005.

Foiled Again is now closing in on another record. He's currently chasing down the record 16 years that Nihilator held the money title from 1985-2001 with career earnings of \$3,225,653 (Somebeachsomewhere fell \$4,000 shy in 2008).

With no other pacer within shouting distance of the record, it looks like Foiled Again will take Nihilator's crown in 2028, the year he turns 24.

Let's take a look at the progression in the last 70 years of the all-time leading money-winning pacer:

In 1952, Good Time was number one with two Horse of the Year trophies. He held the earnings title for six years until 1958. Good Time retired with earnings of \$318,792.

In 1958, Adios Harry took over and held it for a season at \$345,433. He held the speed record, too, with a 1:55 mile lowering Billy Direct's mark from 1938.

In 1959, Belle Acton put the ladies on the board for Team Haughton with \$353,063 to claim the top spot upon retirement. She held it for a year.

In 1960, Bye Bye Byrd erupted past \$500,000 with a total of \$554,257 racing from 1957-1961. He held it approximately two years.

In 1962, Henry T Adios went past \$700,000 (\$702,698 to exact). He held it for the better part of three seasons until Bret Hanover reset yet another record.

In 1966, Bret Hanover wound up at \$922,616 on the strength of a spectacular 62-for-68 career.

In 1968, Cardigan Bay gave Stanley Dancer his second all-time pacing leader when the horse hit seven figures and was then paraded on the Ed Sullivan show for a national audience.

In 1971, three years after "CARDY" got it done, Rum Customer just edged by with earnings of \$1,001,548.

In 1972, Albatross was the first to better \$1 million combined in consecutive seasons (1971-1972) and wound up at \$1,201,470 – a mark that would hold until near the end of the decade.

In 1978, Rambling Willie took over passing Albatross, but then a son of Albatross would eclipse \$2 million first.

In 1980, Niatross was the first to win a million-dollar race and was the first to \$2 million lifetime (\$2,019,213).

In 1983, Rambling Willie re-took the lead in the fall of 1983, only to have Cam Fella on Dec. 10 wind up his career with some \$3,000 more.

In 1983, Cam Fella ended his career at \$2,041,367.

In 1985, On The Road Again briefly moved into the #1 slot in the fall as a 4-year-old (\$2,819,102).

In November of 1985, Nihilator concluded his brilliant career with a victory in the Breeders Crown at Garden State Park and became history's first \$3 million winner (\$3,225,653).

In 2001, Gallo Blue Chip backed up a \$2 million season with a \$1 million campaign at 4 to move into #1 all-time. Only Wiggle It Jiggleit has done the same (among pacers; 2015-2016).

As mentioned, it 2012 Foiled Again surpassed Gallo and went on to earnings of \$7,635,588. And that where we are.

ETERNAL CAMNATION – 18 YEARS LATER

Eternal Camnation is still tops on the female pacer earnings list with \$3,748,574. Anndrovette made a good run at it with a career of \$3,544,930 and finished about \$204,000 away.

Interestingly, Eternal Camnation (racing from 1999-2004) was sold at the same yearling sale as Gallo Blue Chip – 1998 Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in Harrisburg, PA – as All American Coin. It was \$35,000 for her, \$32,000 for him. Think anyone was thinking then that these two would reign for over a decade and would be the richest male and female pacer in the sport's history?

ADDING IT UP

Overall... 17 horses on the pacing side have eclipsed \$3 million and four have topped \$4 million.

I think Boulder Creek (he raced from 2002-2010) gets the award for the quietest member of this club. He earned \$3,425,857 and had a career slate of 173 42-31-22. Those 173 starts are the closest of anyone to Foiled Again's 331 tries.

Mach It So appears to be the only one on the bubble. He is still racing in 2022 with \$2,945,902 earned.

EFFORT, PERSISTENCE, STUBBORNNESS

Pick one. They all seem to apply to a 14-year old (career 440 64-76-67, \$382,808) who very likely holds the world record – or is at least very close – to the most consecutive starts made without lowering his lifetime mark.

On April 30, he made his 441st career try at Pocono Downs in a \$20-\$25,000 claiming handicap. His career mark is 1:52.4, set at age 2 at Balmoral Park in the Orange And Blue in his seventh career start. So that means he has gone 433 STARTS in a row without taking that down a notch.

His name, you ask?

Hopetobefirst.

No kidding.

Stephanie Bowie – Owner

It was 2009 Stephanie Bowie was first introduced to our wonderful sport of harness racing by her (future) husband, legendary basketball star, Sam Bowie.

Although you may call her a “newbie,” her husband had been involved for years.

They went to The Meadowlands to watch one of Sam’s horses, Before He Cheats, win the Su Mac Lad with Tim Tetrick in the sulky.

“I remember standing in the winner’s circle thinking, ‘This horse racing thing is easy!’” Stephanie said, laughing, “Not realizing how hard it is to actually win!”

Sam is not only a legend in the world of professional basketball, but is well known in our sport, too

Both Sam and Stephanie were born in Lebanon, PA, but now reside in West Palm Beach, FL.

Sam played 12 years in the NBA for the Portland Trailblazers, the New Jersey Nets and finished with the Los Angeles Lakers.

But he is not the only basketball player in the family. Stephanie was also a basketball player –receiving a full Division 1 scholarship to play basketball at Stony Brook University.

“As fate would have it, when the first Stony Brook men’s basketball team made it to the NCAA tournament – their first opponent was the Kentucky Wildcats,” Stephanie said, referring to Sam’s college team.

Sam and Stephanie have been a couple for 15 years (married for four), and have owned several nice horses through the years; but the horse that won their hearts is a mare that stole the spotlight last year – Hot Mess Express.

The 4-year-old mare by Panther Hanover out of My Heart Was True, is every horseperson’s dream horse. In the past two years of racing, Hot Mess Express has accumulated \$766,699 in earnings and took a

lifetime mark of 1:48.3, which she got winning the Mistletoe Shalee.

In 2021, Hot Mess Express won all six legs of the Indiana Sire Stakes; the \$250,000 Indiana Sire Stakes Final; The Pegasus; The Circuit City, the Nadia Lobell and her division of The Fan Hanover. Thus, Hot Mess was rightfully named 3-Year-Old Pacing Filly of the Year in Indiana.

Not growing up around horses, Stephanie had always been a little apprehensive around the powerful animal. However, Hot Mess Express changed that.

“I feel comfortable around Hot Mess for she is so sweet and gentle. She’s one special horse,” Stephanie said.

As far as watching their mare race, Stephanie says she can’t watch the entire race for she gets way too nervous.

“I’m extremely nervous when Hot Mess races – especially when we are there live. When we are at home watching, I let Sam watch it and tell me how it went – and then I watch the replay.”

In 2021, the Bowies accumulated lots of travel miles, flying from track to track to watch their mare compete in stake races at



The Meadowlands, Hoosier Park, The Red Mile and the Poconos. Although her husband would rather drive than fly to watch Hot Mess — for he is not a fan of flying. Though, love conquers all, for Stephanie convinced Sam to fly to Costa Rica to be married.

Unlike her husband, flying is Stephanie's second nature. She has been a flight attendant for the past 15 years.

"I've been with my current airline, Jet Blue, for the past nine years but I've been flying the friendly skies for 15. I love traveling and getting to meet different people, for travel has always been my passion.

"My first job with the airlines was a charter and we did mostly international, so it was such a blast to travel the world. I feel so blessed to have traveled and seen over 60 countries."

Currently the Bowies have a small stable — two horses trained by Tony Alagna. They are Hot Mess Express and a Captaintreacherous gelding named Captain Butler.

They are anxiously waiting to start both horses, hoping for a year like they had in 2021.

"Our trainer says both horses are training well and we got to watch them this winter at Sunshine Meadows. I never realized how much work goes into racing and caring for a horse. The trainers, grooms, blacksmiths and veterinarians — it really does take a village."

As far as the future for Hot Mess Express, Stephanie said, "She's going to race this year. Although she's coming back really good, they say this will be a tough year for the transition of 3-coming-4 is really competitive for racehorses.

"But Hot Mess is one tough mare. We've been offered good money several times to sell her, but I told Sam, 'No way!'

"We would eventually like to breed her and either race or sell her offspring, but you never know what the future holds."

Initially thought to be an open contest, Pasi Aikio-trained **Who's Who** (Maharajah) made the race into a slow dance when driver Örjan Kihlström was allowed to reach the first kilometer in a mile rate of 1:59.3.

The only dramatic part of the race happened in the first turn, when Who's Who lost the gait in front. Quick starter Night Brodde (post 8) hit the front as Kihlström had to save Who's Who from making a break, but the driver was quick minded and pushed Who's Who to the lead once again at the back stretch.

But after that, pretty much nothing more happened and the son of Maharajah easily defended himself when Extreme finished quickly on the inside. Who's Who won in a mile rate of 1:55.3, Extreme was strong as runner up and Night Brodde followed as third.

It's not a wild guess to say that Who's Who will get an invitation to Elitloppet after this victory and that's a goal that trainer Aikio set during the past winter.

Speaking of the Elitloppet, Admiral As (Ready Cash), trained by Reijo Liljendahl, was invited by Solvalla for the big mile race on Saturday afternoon.

THE KING STAYS ON THE THRONE

Father Patrick son **Francesco Zet** dominated the high staked races for 3-year-olds in Sweden prior to the season and when it was time for the \$205,000 Kungapokalen for 4-year-old colts

and geldings on Saturday (May 7) afternoon, the Daniel Redén trained trotter established his position as king of the crop.

The big talk ahead of the race was about whether Iznogoud Am could challenge and even defeat Francesco Zet and as the race went on, the two drivers Örjan Kihlström (Francesco Zet) and Björn Goop (Iznogoud Am) began the tough battle in the first turn. Kihlström managed to hit the front position as the field turned into the back stretch for the first time, while Iznogoud Am had to face a tough first over trip. One can say that the race's outcome was told at that point.

Because Francesco Zet is hard to beat, when Kihlström leaned back in the bike at the top of the stretch, the fans at Åby understood who would capture the trophy.

The mile rate was 1:55.3 over 1.3 miles and behind Francesco Zet, Power Doc and Aquarius Face finished strongly as second and third.

Chebba Mil (Readly Express), was the least merited trotted in the \$205,000 Drottningpokalen. But the Italian bred trained by Paul Hagoort and piloted by Dutch driver Robin Bakker won her elimination at Åby racetrack two weeks ago. After a perfect trip, served by Bakker, the mare bested a brave first over trotter Deborah S.H. in Saturday's (May 7) final meters.

The triumph is big for Dutch harness racing and both Hagoort and Bakker know how to be competitive in stronger harness racing countries like Sweden. They have earlier competed with great success with horses such as Robert Bi, Mister F Daag and Wild West Diamant in high staked races in Europe and Chebba Mil's victory in the Drottningpokalen must be considered one of their greatest wins on the international level.

Chebba Mil came home in a strong mile rate of 1:55.2 over 1.3 miles. Deborah S.H. finished second and Glamorous Rain third.

Racing, a business for pleasure

Business start-ups are dreams marinated in hard work, planning, and preparation. Some dreams come true, and some do not. Every business start-up seems like a good idea, but the world of commerce often teaches harsh lessons. Still, chasing a business dream holds a great fascination for a particular personality type.

In 1991, I entered the print publishing business. Objectively, this was a terrible idea. Print publishing was great in the 1930s, not so great in the 1990s, and headed for disaster in the new century. More red flags were flying than at a Chinese parade.

My experience in the publishing business was zero. Research showed that one in ten new American companies failed in the first year (worse in publishing). In addition, my finances were sparse, I had a wife and infant daughter, and I would be competing against other individuals who had resources and years of experience. Dozens of additional reasons screamed that I should set aside my pipe dreams and pursue less risky paths.

In publishing, one of the challenges was the trajectory of the entire industry. I was playing in a field ebbing in popularity. New competitors, new tastes, and new delivery forms were lining up that could crowd me out of the picture. Success has always been problematic in publishing, but the print field was drying up as quickly as the Serengeti.

Like countless thousands of Americans, I did not listen. Like moths to the light, something propels us to jump into the pool of entrepreneurs. We believe we can make our business a success. We think we're a little more imaginative, a little luckier, and a little harder working. We believe we have a better business model or a rejuvenated product. And we think we will succeed where others have failed.

Some of us are stubborn. When told that we can't enter a business, that advice is a prod, not a prohibition.

The publishing business was indeed a challenge. Research and study took time, and each day brought new decisions. There

were many new fields to plow: budgets, markets, supply, demand, hiring, business models, purchasing, and selling. Some of my new ideas were not so new and not so great but meeting new people and traveling new roads made each day a new adventure.

The close of the first year found me excited to try the second year - eager to eliminate parts that held me back and bolster positions that worked out well. I was excited to try new strategies. For me, money was not everything. I did not put my daughter's inheritance at risk or borrow money. The publishing business was about a challenge, learning, and competition. I enjoyed it. Eventually, it became a wonderful part of my life.

If you reread the above few paragraphs and substitute the words *harness racehorse ownership* each time you see *publishing business*, you will see the point I am trying to make.

After some success in publishing, I invested some of my earnings toward the sport of harness racehorse ownership, another territory where I had little knowledge and zero experience. Entering the horse racing game 20 years ago was a mystery. The ownership and breeding worlds were insular and confusing. The entrance to the sport was daunting for a person who possessed very scant knowledge of a complex game. In the pre-Internet age, finding answers to complex issues was a challenge.

While the harness racing ownership game remains endlessly intriguing, technology has made access remarkably easy. You can get into the game with a laptop and a smartphone.

For business-minded people, the motivating principles that inspire you every day are imminently transferable to the world of racehorse ownership. Each foal raised and each yearling purchased is a small business that faces long odds. Approximately two out of ten horses will be successful financially, a small percentage will be moderately successful, and one in a thousand horses will earn a considerable profit.

As a horse owner, you buy, sell, hire, fire, invest, divest, select, diversify, liquidate, or any other business verb you want to insert. You think you can beat your competition. You believe you will be one of the few who make it work and make a profit. Owning a young racehorse is a hybrid; part sport, part business, part hobby, and lots of fun for business-oriented people.

These days retired business folks are on every corner. Bored millionaires are on every block. Many people with money to burn are looking for new challenges. Should you fit in this category, have disposable assets, and want to get into harness or back into harness, you might want to try to beat the odds and buy a yearling.

The barn door is open. Walking through can be fascinating.

Brave By Design wins Dexter; Little Pink Lies takes Lady Suffolk

Brave By Design braved rain and wind on a chilly afternoon at Freehold Raceway to win Saturday's (May 7) \$150,505 Dexter Cup for 3-year-old male trotters by 1-3/4 lengths over Justice in 1:57.2 over a track labeled sloppy. Pour Mea Double was third.

The top-three finishers were the only horses in the eight-horse field not to go off stride in the race, which was the season's first Grand Circuit event for 3-year-old male trotters and kicked off the road to the Hambletonian Stakes.

Brave By Design, driven by Joe Bongiorno for trainer Jennifer Bongiorno, is eligible for the \$1 million Hambletonian, which is Aug. 6 at The Meadowlands.

Earlier in the day, **Little Pink Lies** captured the \$58,025 Lady Suffolk for 3-year-old female trotters at Freehold. The filly is not eligible for the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks, which is the Hambletonian's filly companion event.

In the Dexter Cup, Brave By Design grabbed the lead from post two as Grizzly Bare from post three, Bar Coins from post five, and Pretender from post six battled for position around the first turn. Grizzly Bare and 1-5 favorite Pretender went off stride, leaving Brave By Design, Bar Coins, and Justice in the top-three spots in a :29 opening quarter.

Justice, who started from post seven, and driver Ake Svanstedt made their move for the front heading to the half-mile point and cleared Brave By Design to lead as they hit the midpoint in :58.4. Justice remained on top through three-quarters, reached in 1:28, but was unable to hold off Brave By Design in the stretch.

"The race worked out really good," driver Bongiorno said. "With (Bar Coins) leaving out of there, it had (Pretender) out wide in the first turn and that one went off stride. At that point, I wouldn't have minded being on the front, but Ake kept coming. I know that horse from racing against him in the New York Sire Stakes last year and he's a nice horse, so I figured it was okay to follow him.

"Up the backside, it looked like he wasn't doing it as easy as I thought he would be, so I decided to put a little pressure on him in the last turn and it worked in our favor."

Brave By Design, who was making his 2022 debut, is owned by the Brave By Design Stable. A son of Walner out of Nuvola, the

gelding was bred by Al Libfeld. He has won two of five lifetime starts and earned \$98,802.

"He's Hambletonian eligible, but he's got to prove a lot more to be that caliber of a horse," Bongiorno said. "But let's enjoy today and we'll worry about tomorrow, tomorrow."

Sent off at odds of 7-1, Brave By Design paid \$16.20 to win.

In the Lady Suffolk, 8-5 favorite Little Pink Lies started from post one, took the lead heading to the first turn, and never looked back to win by 1-3/4 lengths in 1:58.1 for driver Ake Svanstedt. What Should I Goo finished second and Bomb Hugger was third.

Fractions for the race were :28.2, :59, and 1:28.4.

"No drama," said Svanstedt, who also trains Little Pink Lies. "She can leave fast, so No. 1 was the best post. The race worked out how I expected."

Little Pink Lies, a daughter of Chapter Seven-To The Question, was making her seasonal debut. She won for the third time in 11 career races and pushed her earnings to \$139,090.

The filly is owned by Svanstedt, Triple Play Trotters, and Tomas Andersson. She was bred by Crawford Farms.

Little Pink Lies paid \$5.40 to win.

On this date 75 years ago, USHWA was founded

Harness racing got its pari-mutuel start in 1940, after years of Grand Circuit racing being contested without betting. Roosevelt Raceway on Long Island was the birthplace of the pari-mutuel tracks, and after World War II the prospects for the endeavor became quite favorable, and local newspapers began to send “beat” reporters to the track to cover the races. A dozen of these writers, on May 8, 1947, “over hamburgers after the races,” formed the United States Harness Writers Association.

Elected president was 36-year-old Mike Lee, sports editor of the *Long Island Press*, who would serve as president for 13 years – no president since has served for more than three. Five of the founding fathers would eventually become members of the Communicators Hall of Fame – the longest-surviving was Murray Janoff, who died in 2015 at age 100.

Originally, the Writers Association contained solely writers – the print media. With the explosion of radio and then television early in the Association’s existence, these groups became part of USHWA; also accepted are photographers, racing publicists, and anybody contributing to professional media.

As racing’s popularity spread in the Northeast and Midwest, people outside the New York City scene (Yonkers opened in 1950) became USHWAs, first in an At-Large category. When pockets of communicators developed around racing circuits, USHWA embraced the concept of “chapters” in 1953; today there are twelve Chapters in addition to an At-Large grouping for those not associated with a chapter.



USHWA began selecting the champion horses of the sport, along with people who made select accomplishments during a racing year. The first “banquet” was held in 1948, and the dinners were held in the New York City, the hub of harness racing, for many years. Philadelphia’s Delaware Valley Chapter were the first to sponsor a national dinner away from Gotham.

In the late 1950s, it was decided that the sport needed to honor its “best of the best,” the most influential on the fortunes of the sport, and the idea of a Hall of Fame was born. The trustees and the Harness Racing Museum in Goshen NY agreed with the writers on the criteria for selection, including the stipulation that elected members had to be living. (There are sections in the Hall for “Immortal” horses and people, and outstanding racers/producers.) Today, the harness racing “family” gathers at Goshen on the first Sunday in July to honor those who are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

In 1983, a Communicators Hall of Fame was introduced to commemorate the leading media figures so important to the sport. Each summer the Hall of Fame and Communicators Hall of Fame ballots, consisting of USHWA chapter nominations "whittled down" by veteran, knowledgeable committees, are sent to eligible voters, with the stricture that a candidate must receive 75 per cent of the yes-no votes returned to receive the sport's ultimate honor.

Harness racing continued to grow and grow in the 1960s and 1970s, and so did the membership of USHWA, which at one time numbered over 400, and who were beneficiaries of a small insurance policy from national USHWA.

During the following period of change in harness racing – contraction, off-track betting becoming more prevalent, simulcasting growing, casino expansion -- USHWA had three leaders who served as Officers, lending stability and ability for 30+ years in each case. Bill Brown (Western New York) and Alan Prince (Florida) both served for 49 years on the Board of Directors; Brown was secretary for 36 years, including a two-year term when he acted as both president and secretary, and Prince as treasurer for 42 years. The third towering figure is also an Allen from Florida – Allen Finkelson, who rose through the ranks to become president, then after that term stayed on for 21 years as chairman of the board, alternately insulting and charming people into getting people to help USHWA be a major presence in the sport.

Women have long been an important part of the publicity and communications of the sport, and they have had the same role within USHWA. There are six female members of the Communicators Hall of Fame, and four women have served as president of USHWA. A couple of years back, USHWA also developed a Youth membership category, allowing aspiring communicators to gain more "inside exposure" to the sport in their formative years.

Over the last few years, USHWA's executives began asking frequent award-winners, whether for their own achievements or those of their horses, how best to present the annual Dan Patch Awards Banquet, and they responded with it to be hosted in a first-class facility in a vacation or resort atmosphere. Thus USHWA has scheduled five of its last six scheduled banquets (one was held in Las Vegas) at the renowned Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, FL, which has received near-universal praise from those participating in the first-class awards dinner.

This focused banquet format has also allowed a synergy to develop between the association and some of the biggest organizations, horsemen, and racetracks in the sport, allowing a sponsorship relationship to help improve the quality of the Banquets while also helping USHWA's bottom line, so it can go forward with continued hosting and other major projects such as its relationship with the Hall Of Fame.

JD, American Ticket victorious in W.N. Reynolds Stakes

JD and **American Ticket** were the winners of the two W.N. Reynolds Memorial events for 3-year-old pacers that took place on Friday evening (May 6) at Yonkers Raceway.

In the \$41,100 Tar Heel for colts and geldings, PJ Lou (George Brennan) took the lead away from JD (Tyler Buter) going to the :27.2 opening quarter and maintained the lead through middle-half fractions of :55.4 and 1:23.4. A :29.2 final quarter got PJ Lou to the wire a length and a quarter ahead of JD in a 1:53.1 mile, but the judges quickly lit the inquiry sign to examine if PJ Lou had committed a pylon violation approaching the half-mile marker.

After consulting the video, the judges determined that PJ Lou had completely left the course as he raced under the wire for the first time, and as a result, he was placed from first to last. That promoted JD to the victory, Pleaseletmeknow (Matt Kakaley) to second, and Letmecallyouback (Austin Siegelman) to third.

Last year's New York Sire Stakes champion for the division, JD is a So Surreal gelding trained by Ray Schnittker. Schnittker also co-owns JD, who now has a record of 4-1-3 from 12 starts and earnings of \$168,866, with breeder George Zitone and their partner Melissa Beckwith. JD, making his first pari-mutuel appearance of 2022, was sent off at 6-1 and paid \$15.60 to win. The exacta was worth \$77.50 and the trifecta kicked back \$277.00.

There wasn't nearly the same drama in the \$34,400 Leta Long for fillies, as American Ticket (Jim Marohn Jr.) clicked off panels of :28.1, :57.1, and 1:25.3 on her way to a 1:53.4 triumph. She defeated pocket-sitter Nadina Hanover (Brennan) by a length, and Find Happiness (Jordan Stratton) came in third.

Jessica Fallon trains American Ticket, a daughter of American Ideal bred by Winbak Farm, for owners Hutt Racing Stable, Blake And Ozzie Stables, James Giannuzzi, and Robert MacNeil. American Ticket is now a three-time winner from 11 career efforts, and she pushed her bankroll to \$68,320. Dispatched at 7-2, American Ticket returned \$9.10 to win and was atop a \$36.00 exacta and a \$101.50 trifecta.

Next Level Stuff, Herculisa prove 'Versatile' at Big M

In the first leg of the Miss Versatility series on a rain-soaked Friday night (May 6) at The Meadowlands, the first division went as expected while the other did not.

In the first dash of the series for open mare trotters, **Next Level Stuff** went wire-to-wire for driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Jim Campbell. The 5-year-old daughter of Sebastian K S—Nantab went parked past the quarter in :27.4 and went down the road from there, upping her seasonal record to two wins in as many starts after hitting the wire a neck in front of a fast-closing Bella Bellini, the 2021 Hambletonian Oaks winner who looked good in her seasonal debut.

Next Level Stuff finished the mile in 1:52.4 and returned \$3.40 as the odds-on public choice in the betting.

The second split provided a big surprise as Atlanta, the lifetime earner of better than \$3 million who is back for trainer Ron Burke as a 7-year-old, got gunned down by 12-1 chance **Herculisa** for driver Dexter Dunn and trainer Virgil Morgan Jr.

Atlanta, the 2-5 favorite, made a huge move to grab command off the far turn and led by 2 lengths when they turned for home, but Herculisa, who was kept in contention throughout in the

pocket by Dunn, wore down Atlanta in deep stretch to record a neck win in 1:52.1.

A 4-year-old daughter of My MVP—Herculotte Hanover, Herculisa paid \$27.00 to her backers in winning for the 14th time from just 22 career outings.

BETTING TOPS \$3 MILLION: With three races seeing total betting in excess of \$300,000 – two of them GSY (Gural Settlemoir Yarock) Racing Club events – total wagering for the 13-race program topped \$3 million for the eighth time in 2022 as a total of \$3,118,436 was pushed through the windows despite the sloppy conditions.

NJSS KICKS OFF: The New Jersey Sire Stakes season began with five \$30,000 dashes for 3-year-olds on the trot in the first leg of the series.

In the first of three divisions for colts and geldings, **Temporal Hanover** (\$21.00 to win) scored by a half-length in 1:54 over Classic Hill for driver Brian Sears and trainer Marcus Melander. The son of Walner—Think Twice now has six wins from just 13 career starts.

B A Superhero (\$3.00) made it two-for-two in 2022 for Tetrick and Lucas Wallin, coming from off the pace to catch Looks Like Moni by a length. The son of Muscle Hill—Win Missy B stopped the clock in 1:54.1.

Periculum (Muscle Hill—Amour Heiress) exploded home in :27.1 to score by four widening lengths over Tachyon in 1:55 for Mattias Melander and brother Marcus. He returned \$9.80 to win.

In the first of two dashes for fillies, 2021 Mohawk Million and Jim Doherty Memorial winner **Venerable** scored from off the pace, nipping Jiggy Jog S by a nose in 1:55.1 for Dave Miller and Nifty Norman. The daughter of Walner—Jolene Jolene, who earned over \$1 million last year, returned \$6.20 to win in her first start of the season.

Peyton Hanover (\$6.40) sat a pocket trip behind even-money favorite Gracelynn Hanover and gunned that one down nearing the wire by three-quarters-of-a-length in 1:54.4. The daughter of Muscle Hill—Pennies From Above gave Marcus Melander a Sire Stakes training triple. Tetrick was in the bike.

NON-BETTORS: Before the wagering card, a pair of New Jersey Sire Stakes events for 3-year-olds on the pace were contested.

Count Mara, a gelding by Lis Mara—Madam Countess, hit the wire 13¼ lengths in front of Dry Ridge Caldwell in recording his first career score in 1:59 in the split for colts and geldings for Dunn and John Pyott.

Bee Aware, a daughter of Great Vintage—M A Jackie, took the filly event in 1:57.3 for Steve Smith and Laurie Molnar by gunning down Not So Evil nearing the wire by a neck.

A LITTLE MORE: Tetrick led the driver colony with three winners while Melander's training triple was tops among the conditioners.

Racetracks' right of exclusion complements HISA

The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) is a welcome diversion from the status quo solutions that have failed to revive harness, thoroughbred and quarter horse racing. As racetracks utilize their right of exclusion, a before unseen formidable duo will enhance our public perception. Bob Baffert's exclusion from Churchill and NYRA constitute a seminal precedent for a racetrack's right of exclusion.

The malignant combination of inefficient suspect regulation and trainers with the wherewithal to exploit the system have exacerbated our already poor reputation. Recent notorious commission transgressions have poured fuel on our already public perception bonfire.

The California Horse Racing Board contributed when it **surreptitiously deviated from protocol** and the rule book in allowing an ineligible horse to participate and win the Kentucky Derby leading to a \$75 million syndication).

The Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission augmented our fans ire when attempting to conceal an illicit drug positive in a \$275,000 harness stakes race directing the steward/presiding judge to defer any penalties. When he refused, **he was fired**.

New York completes the Triple Crown of **compromised racing commission negligence** with its decade-long confession of known serious impropriates.

These recently released documents indicate stewards/presiding judges hiding evidence, discrimination, gambling, and preferential treatment when entering horses just to name few issues. I imagine as with all these sins of racing a finger of blame will be directed at others without any effort to mitigate or remediate the unethical activities of these regulators.

The fact that most regulators are inexperienced political appointments with obvious inclinations to obfuscate their responsibility is a given we can no longer tolerate. Racetracks utilizing their right to exclude any licensed individual that does not comport with their best business interest is an absolute. The

right of exclusion should not create an adversarial relationship with our regulating agencies. This racetrack house rule is a tool that regulators do not have in their tack box. Quite simply, the policy complements their regulatory obligations. Kudos to Churchill Downs and NYRA for utilizing their right of exclusion. The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority combined with an expansion of the right of exclusion can enhance our waning public perception.

The bottom line...the status quo cannot continue! Our regulatory system is seriously flawed allowing miscreant trainers to ply their trade. The Horse Racing and Safety Authority is a step in the right direction albeit the racetracks must step up if we are to reverse our poor public perception.

Australian breeders' association opposes current funding of new \$2 million slot race

We need to talk about Australia's first harness slot race, recently announced by Harness Racing Australia (HRA) as the TAB Eureka – at \$2.1 million the world's richest harness race. The race is limited to 10 elite "Australian born" (mare served in Australia, foal born in Australia) 3- and 4-year-old performers.

First let us make it very clear that Australian Breeders and participants in general do not object to a harness Slot Race being run in Australia (or anywhere) for \$2 million or any other amount. Many don't see the point of having "the world's richest race", but are not opposed to those wanting to participate. They do universally expect that slot holders fund the race from which they reap benefit. This is not what is happening – two separate actions that will extract over \$1.7 million per year from Australian breeders are being implemented.

Across all States of Australia there is a unanimous view of breeding bodies, based on their breeder responses, that the TAB Eureka, or any similarly proposed race, should not be funded by breeders through implementation of a tax or levy or tariff or call it what you will. The view in fact is well supported across the whole gambit of participants including owner organisations, who are aware it will most likely impact their prices and the quality of their purchases. Clubs also expect an impact from the reduced sponsorship they are likely to receive from Studs and stallion owners. Even studs who stand locally based sires expect a negative outcome – they need to attract owners to breed their mares to both resident and external stallions to make the business viable.

In the HRA release of 20 April 2022, reference is made to "Like thoroughbred racing's hugely successful The Everest, The TAB Eureka will be a slot race." There is no reference to the fact that slot holders entirely pay for the stakes in The Everest, along with race sponsors who are attracted to the model. No breeder payments are involved. No coercion.

Also in the HRA release was the comment "Importantly for prospective slot buyers, the majority of the prize money will be funded by Harness Racing Australia."

We seriously challenge and dispute the notion that the balance of the stakes (after slot holders have provided \$1 million) is being provided by HRA. The money being provided by HRA is coming from a mix of mum and dad breeders, who just want to breed a nice horse that they can enjoy watching on the track, and commercial breeders who provide the yearling sale market with their produce. With the actions of HRA, everyone gets to pay more to play in the industry.

To start with, import fees paid for horses being imported to Australia by their owners (fundamentally introduced in 2013 to support the breeding industry in Australia, and until July 2021 distributed to states in approximate proportion to the number of

horses imported into that state), are now being entirely retained by HRA. That's approximately \$800,000 that previously went to support breeding in each of the states, in the form of breeding incentives.

Then there is the just-announced stallion levy. Ignoring the \$500 registration fee per stallion per breeding season (most people would consider this reasonable), there is an additional 8 per cent per live foal from pacing stallions not domiciled in Australia who provide either fresh or chilled semen. There is an additional 15 per cent per live foal from pacing stallions not domiciled in Australia who provide frozen semen.

These are new charges to commence from September 2022, and payable by the stallion owner. Will he pass that fee on? In all likelihood – yes.

Breeders have already had to withstand the introduction of stallion book limits in Australia (not New Zealand, which retains no limit on books and no service fee levies or imposts), introduced in June 2020 after most stallions had commercial arrangements in place (in readiness for the stud season just over two months later), service fees set and mares being booked. Stallion owners were forced to compensate the following year with increased prices on breeders' stallions of choice. Small breeders were finding it difficult to book their preferred stallion – not just because of the price increase but the choices were reduced by their first preference stallions being booked out very early.

On HRA's own reckonings, \$900,000 will be collected via the new pacing stallion registration fees, and it will affect nearly 50 per cent of pacing foals in Australia. Therefore, just by withholding import fees (that would normally go into breeding incentives) and imposing a levy, \$1.7 million is being taken annually by HRA from breeders, who need all the support they can get to encourage them to continue in this discretionary industry. Breeders need to produce competitive foals to be able to compete successfully with unfettered New Zealand imports, as well as the best performed horses that Australian commercial breeders can produce. There is nowhere to hide in Australian harness racing.

How can anyone really believe that staging the 'world's richest harness race' will help the local industry, and somehow grow the pie? And what happens to the "income" if those shuttle/frozen stallions cannot be viably imported, or patronage drops due to increased fees?

For many of the conglomerates or groups that will be involved, paying the full amount for their slot (\$200,000 instead of \$100,000) is not an impost, so why has HRA decided to contribute half when in thoroughbred racing the slot holders pay the full amount and the "rush for slots" suggests there is no shortage of money. Many of the people taking an interest are "more than ready" to part with quite significant amounts for their other racing interests.

This race concept, as exciting as it may be locally, is about waiting for a ready-made elite level horse to present itself so that you can take a chance on earning a minimum of 45 per cent of your money back in one race per year (\$45,000 is the stakes for placing last). If all wagering platforms guaranteed this percentage of money back on every losing bet we would

have a very attractive industry. The initial proposal also included a welfare component – a percentage was set aside to support animal welfare initiatives. That's gone.

There can be no international flavour to the race. In the long run these are Australian based sires and dams. Adding salt to the wound, those potential slot holders involved with racing interests elsewhere can race for more than 5 times the money that harness can offer, almost every day of the week. There is no compelling reason to stay involved in racing or breeding, outside of this race. If you were from North America, you might like what you see and buy it, hence any advantage of breeding such a horse is lost to the Australian market, and that horse, just like Lazarus, becomes a shuttle stallion with an applicable additional cost of service.

Alternative funding methods were put forward, including those that would have raised \$1 million without costing more than \$100 per racing animal per season – spreading the money evenly across the entire industry in a painless way. All alternatives were rejected by HRA in preference to targeting stallions in particular, and by inference, breeders.

We want slot holders to be aware that Australian breeders are actually paying for your slot. If you happen to be successful, we would like you to consider paying back the people who have funded your stakes. Or talk to HRA and tell them this is not the way forward.

We all want to advance Australian harness racing. We have made generational improvements in a very short time and do

have world class horses, male and female. We do not want to recede to where we have come from by reducing our access to the best available stallions at various price points – colonial, southern hemisphere or northern hemisphere. This defies the objective of continuous improvement in breeding. Breeders are held responsible for the results of their breeding decisions. They should not be taxed to the point where their choices for their mare on their budget are reduced.

We hope that the stud farms from which the stallions (hopefully continue to) journey are aware that we did not ask to be part of this race by compulsorily funding the major component. Can we restructure service fees to represent the actual component, given that there are significant maintenance, agistment and transport costs associated with stallions? Perhaps. Can we negotiate lower service fees by reviewing how the various components of the business of stallions are priced? Perhaps. Can we find a way to encourage slot holders to pay the full amount, and HRA to rescind their levy? Probably not but we should, with your assistance, try.

Please find a way to work with breeders in Australia.

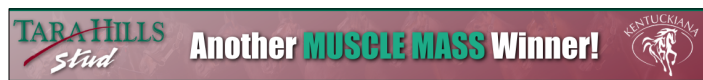
