Hold off on the "Lazarus is the second coming" expectations in the U.S.

Recent Down Under stars have not delivered on unrealistic projections.

With news this week that New Zealand pacing super horse Lazarus will be heading to the United States for a brief, but ambitious, campaign later this year to close out his racing career, biblical expectations are already being set sky high by those closest to him.

A press release issued on behalf of new owners Taylor Made Stallions noted that in addition to supplementing to the Breeders Crown, that Lazarus "will be pointed for the Red Mile's Grand Circuit meet in a direct attempt to lower the

existing world standard of 1:46 set there in 2016 by Always B Miki."

Lazarus will be trained in the U.S. by Always B Miki's last conditioner, Jimmy Takter.

As someone with a tremendous amount of appreciation for foreign racing, I'd love nothing more than for Lazarus to pace in 1:45.3 at the Red Mile and then win the Breeders Crown at Pocono by a Secretariat-at-Belmont winning margin. The only problem is that it almost certainly isn't going to happen.

On May 5 at the Meadowlands, Horse of the Year and \$2.5-million winner **Hannelore Hanover** won the Cutler Memorial in her first start of the season — from the 12 hole. On the same card, Jug winner **Filibuster Hanover** showed that his blazing Q's were no fluke, as he won his first start back in the Graduate Series. And at Mohawk, **Easy Lover Hanover** won his 9th straight in the Preferred and became the year's fastest pacer with a 1:48.1 mile.

The intent is to line up Lazarus (Bettors Delight– Bethany– Christian Cullen NZ) as the first New Zealand-bred horse to serve as a shuttle stallion; standing in both hemispheres at different times of the year. Already well positioned to do just that, being able to impress in the States would only add to his already impressive appeal.

Regarded as arguably the best horse ever from the southern hemisphere, it would be foolish to doubt Lazarus' ability based on his career accomplishments. A winner 35 times in 45 races, he's New Zealand's richest horse ever with \$3.8 million in earnings (\$2.6 million USD). His fastest mile-rated winning time was 1:49 in Australia, which up until not too long ago was a time unheard of in those parts.

Despite all the accolades and Group One wins, perhaps it was a defeat from earlier this year that best added to the lure of Lazarus. In the \$300,000 (AUD) Group One Fremantle Cup in Australia, Lazarus got caught three-wide immediately from the onset and was forced to race three wide the entire length of the 1 and 5/8th mile race. Lazarus was nosed out by a horse that came from off him, but the three-wide trip earned admiration and if you think about it was kind of reminiscent of a more familiar three-wide trip – Always B Miki in the 2014 Meadowlands Pace.

What Lazarus has going against him, however, is history. There's been a long line of highly-regarded Australasian horses to come to North America with the loftiest of expectations, only to never deliver.

It's always a mystery as to how Down Under horses will acclimate here. It was just a few short weeks ago when former dominant Group One winner Waikiki Beach was brought here to compete in the Levy. After an impressive beginning to his stateside career at Pompano, he quickly fizzled out when moving north and has looked lost since. But as the most obvious example of how things may not pan out, it's already been seven years now since the highest regarded pacing import from New Zealand came here, Auckland Reactor.

In fairness to the Mach Three horse, it became obvious that Auckland Reactor simply wasn't the same horse by the time he left the southern hemisphere as he was there earlier in his career. But just the same, he arrived in a very similar fashion to what Lazarus will be arriving to – the intent to possibly break the (at the time) world record of 1:46:4 to improve the prospects of a breeding career, only to go back home a few races later without ever coming close to winning a race here.

Since that time, Auckland Reactor has gone on to be a nice sire of horses racing in Australia and New Zealand producing

multiple Group One winners early in his stallion career. But for Lazarus, the goal is to sire both there and in North America.

And maybe Lazarus is a better horse than Auckland Reactor was. Lazarus is faster than Auckland Reactor ever was, but even with that said, when was the last time a New Zealand import was able to beat the true free-for-all types in North America? Young Quinn in the 1970s or Cardigan Bay in the 1960s? That's an awful long way to go back in history to find a winning precedent to point to.

The good news for Lazarus is that if he comes here true to his Down Under form, he should be reasonably expected to

beat what the older pacing division here has to offer. While far from a disgraced group of aged pacers, there aren't any Always B Miki's in the group or other types of true killers that he'll have to contend with.

Based on everything we've seen and heard, Lazarus "should" win the races he's sent to later this year. I would think that if Lazarus is his usual self and for whatever reason still can't adapt to win at the Red Mile or the Breeders Crown at Pocono, then that may have the ability to slightly diminish his standing.

The world record is a completely different story. For Lazarus to win at the Red Mile, by default he'd likely win in the 1:47 to 1:48 range provided that the weather is agreeable. But he's not likely to approach 1:46 and almost certainly not break it for many of the reasons I talked about in this column last year (full column here).

If Lazarus were to dominate his competition here and even come close to 1:46 in a limited number of starts, he'll go down as one of the all-time greats anywhere in the world.

To say that I don't think it will happen doesn't mean that I don't want it to; quite the contrary. It's rare in horse racing that deals like these come together. Horses with nothing more to prove don't often travel outside of their safer and friendlier confines to take on unnecessary risks, so situations like this should be enjoyed and appreciated.

In recent years, I've bought into the hype for similar horses as Lazarus, so for now I'm skeptical. I would love nothing more than to be proven wrong.





Ontario racing industry officially signs long-term funding deal

Despite a few holdouts, most of the province's horse racing groups signed the deal that calls for up to \$105 million in annual funding for a term that could stretch as long as 19 years.

It took a bit longer to ratify than expected, and there are some holdouts, but on Tuesday, May 8 the board of directors of Ontario Racing (OR) announced the signing of the long-term funding agreement with the Ontario government.

The agreement provides up to \$105 million to the province's horse racing industry — standardbred, thoroughbred and quarter horse — for a seven-year term beginning April 1, 2019, with two six-year extensions that can be automatically granted by the Ontario Lottery and Gaming corporation (OLG) so long as OR member racetracks conduct the number of race dates approved in their annual business plans. The \$105 million commitment is \$10 million more per year than the industry is currently receiving through the Horse Racing Partnership Funding Plan.

"This agreement is a significant step toward ensuring the vitality of horse racing in Ontario. It is designed to benefit the entire industry and is the result of years of collaboration with the sector and the Ontario government," said Cal Bricker, senior vice president for horse racing at the OLG, via email. "OLG will contribute nearly two decades of stable funding to promote sustainability and industry-led success."

Signing onto the deal were nine standardbred racetracks — Clinton Raceway, Dresden Raceway, Flamboro Downs, Georgian Downs, Grand River Raceway, Hanover Raceway, Rideau Carleton Raceway, The Raceway at Western Fair District and Woodbine Mohawk Park — two thoroughbred racetracks — Fort Erie Racetrack and Woodbine Racetrack — and quarter horse racetrack Ajax Downs.

Also signing, on behalf of their members, were standardbred industry associations Central Ontario Standardbred Association (COSA), Standardbred Breeders of Ontario Association (SBOA), the National Capital Region Harness Horseman's Association (NCRHHA), thoroughbred association Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) and quarter horse association Quarter Racing Owners of Ontario Inc. (QROOI).

Three standardbred racetracks chose not to sign the agreement — Hiawatha Horse Park, Kawartha Downs and Lakeshore Horse Racing Association, operators of Leamington Raceway — nor did the Ontario Harness Horse

Association. Hiawatha, Kawartha and Leamington are classified as Grassroots level racetracks. In 2018 they are approved for 21, 18 and 13 race dates, respectively.

The three non-member racetracks will continue to receive funding through the Horse Racing Partnership Funding Plan until their current transfer payment agreements expire, and the door remains open for them to join Ontario Racing prior to the April 1, 2019 rollout of the new deal.

"Racetracks and associations that are not yet members of Ontario Racing have the opportunity to apply for membership at any time," said OLG senior manager of media relations Tony Bitonti via email. "Membership is guaranteed until April 1, 2019. After that time, membership is granted at the discretion of Ontario Racing."

Bricker added that OLG will remain available to all racetracks and associations in the months leading up to the launch of the agreement.

"OLG continues to meet with racetracks, associations and horse people to discuss the long-term funding agreement and answer questions from the industry," said Bricker, via email. "Our goal is to help create a unified industry that is led by an association that provides the opportunity for fair representation of the horse racing industry in Ontario."

In addition to the race date requirements, the new



agreement requires regular reporting — financial, operational and wagering — from the member racetracks along with the need to meet 12 key performance indicators ranging from average field size to gross wagering commissions to average Ontario yearling sale price.

The board of Ontario Racing, currently comprised of Jessica Buckley (premier standardbred racetrack members), Hugh Mitchell (signature standardbred racetrack members), Ian Fleming (grassroots standardbred racetrack members), Jim Lawson (premier thoroughbred racetrack members), James Thibert (signature thoroughbred racetrack members), Bob Broadstock (quarter horse breeder and horseperson group), Walter Parkinson (standardbred breeder group), Bill O'Donnell (standardbred horseperson group), Peter Berringer (thoroughbred breeder group), and Sue Leslie (thoroughbred horseperson group), is responsible for providing administration, governance and decision-making on behalf of the industry.

Day-to-day management of Ontario Racing's obligations under both its membership agreement and the funding agreement will be the responsibility of Ontario Racing Management (ORM), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Woodbine Entertainment Group. On Wednesday, May 9 Ontario Racing officially introduced the first two employees of the newly

formed ORM, executive director Katherine Curry and director of marketing, communications and stakeholder relations John Siscos. Curry formerly served as Woodbine Entertainment's vice president, legal and compliance, while Siscos was the director of communications.

The pair, along with future ORM staff, will work closely with Ontario Racing members to meet the obligations of the funding agreement and implement the vision of the board of directors, all with the goal of putting the province's horse racing industry on firm footing for decades to come.



Farewell to Johnny Takter, one of the greatest

Last weekend, one of the most successful drivers in Europe told his fans that he would retire after the races on May 10 at his home track Jägersro.

Sweden's Johnny Takter ended his magnificent career by winning five of his remaining 14 races in May and as many as 19,243 spectators came to the racetrack in Malmö, Sweden on Thursday afternoon to see the top driver leave the scene for, what's been said is the last time.

Johnny is the older brother to Jimmy and together they've won valuable trophies around the world.

Johnny, born in November 1958, won his first race in 1977 and followed his father Bo William when he moved from racetrack Mantorp to Jägersro the year after. In 1984, Johnny became the winningest driver in Sweden and with his mare Nealy Lobell he made it to five consecutive finals of the Elitlopp between 1988 and 1992. The year 1992 was also when Takter reached the milestone of 1,000 victories in the bike. When he left Jägersro on Thursday afternoon, he had collected 3,783 victories in his successful career.

Johnny has many times been named as a poet in the bike and it was poetry in motion when he was at his best. He could adapt to harness racing rules and styles wherever he raced.

To Swedish harness racing TV, Johnny said that he's been fighting with motivational issues since he considers himself a 100 per cent competitor.

"My worst side appears from time to time when I compete, that's something my closest friends and family know by now. I was born with social phobia and it's been tough for me to handle the issue with people around the game. The competition... then I've known what I've been doing but my self esteem has not been the best along the way. There are still horses that I love to drive and I've been attached to some of them, so it might be possible that there is an opening for something different in the future. We will see what happens, but I figured out that I sit alone in my car for 40 days per year and thank God for good music and books that I could listen to," Johnny told reporter Matteus Lillieborg

for Swedish harness racing TV.

In 2010, Johnny won the Elitloppet with Stefan Melander-trained Iceland (Scarlet Knight) and in 2007 he drove Petri Puro trained Commander Crowe to victory in Svensk Travderby at his home track Jägersro.

Improving the Hall of Fame, thoughts on conformation flaws and trying to fix a troublesome trotter

Please forgive me if I take up a little space to editorialize.

First of all, we must applaud the job Bob Baffert did training a complete monster of an equine. There have been many big athletic thoroughbred colts in my lifetime such as Secretariat, Monarchos, and more recently California Chrome. But I have never seen one with the presence of Justify. I have seen all his races and every one was earth shattering. The slow pace in the Santa Anita Derby was just a bit of nonsense that the knockers could grab hold of. He is truly poetry in motion.

The trouble is that he is so good, who will run against him? My prediction is the Preakness will come up very light. If he is successful, as I would assume, the horrid thought is that three weeks later comes a gruelling mile-and-a-half in the Belmont is to follow, where I assume he will meet a fresh group of challengers.

I sincerely wish Baffert, Winstar and the rest of the team the best of luck and good fortune in the coming weeks.

I hate to criticize two of my best friends, as well as some strangers, for their knee jerk reaction to the Facebook posts on a certain trainer's ALLEGED Ponzi scheme.

I am not here to protect anyone, nor do I have enough information to have an opinion on the matter. I do however equate the ridiculous stampede to hang, to that of a police state. It is similar to the idiotic chanting at the Republican convention "lock her up" referring to Hillary Clinton. We live in the United States Of America. Our constitution provides that when accused of a crime we are INNOCENT until proven quilty.

Y'all step back, take a deep breath and let justice take its course.

Murray Brown asked me on Facebook to react to the question of what we can do to make the Hall of Fame selections more equitable to us all?

I wish there was an easy answer to this, and I will step on a lot of toes with my answer but I feel good inside doing it.

Since the beginning, the HOF was a good ole boys club totally catering to their own. But just like the board of governors at Augusta (home of the Masters) they were forced to alter their ways because of the changing times. To be honest, I think the Georgians have come full circle faster than our Hall members. I am not going to say who should be in and who shouldn't. In my gut I can say that I do not question the credentials of any member today. I do question the committee proposing so few candidates per year. In recent years, not enough trainers have been inducted and so many great owners died before the powers that be recognized them.

My proposal is, let the living Hall of Fame members select one trainer, driver, owner and they will select the slate of proposed inductees. The selection committee must have 100 per cent (4-0) vote on the matter and they have to get 75 per cent of the vote of the living members.

I realize this is radical but it is fair. If the members aren't happy with the selections then they need not vote for the candidate.

Now the old guard will say what about our vetting process? I will say I went through it and was impressed with how thorough it is, but looking to my left and looking to my right, not all candidates receive the same scrutiny. Moira Fanning does a great job in that respect and I am sure she will be of great help.

My parting wish is that we fill the Hall with many deserving horse people before they leave us.

Bob Marks asks: How do the following conformation flaws affect soundness, gait, performance etc.: Back in knees, toed in, toed out, long or short pasterns, sickle hocked, or cow hocked?

Great question because it will give young trainers the ability to overlook some of these faults that I consider old wives tales.

Back in the knees, if a severe deformity, can be debilitating. A horse with this defect is constantly pounding on a joint with a totally improper angle. Imagine running with a half-inch block of wood nailed to the toes of your shoes. The pressure on your knees would be excruciating. This fault will most certainty create sore knees limiting your horse's potential to a great extent. Another important point, if you are buying a filly, no breeder will buy a mare severely back in



the knees. Toed in or out is another story altogether. To exhibit how difficult this business can be, I will never buy a toed-out horse. Every time I get one to train, they always hit their knees. Chuck Sylvester, on the other hand, buys them all the time and although I did catch him with a very expensive failure, I have seen him perform miracles with them. I have no problem with toed in horses and most trainers won't touch them.

I won two Hambletonians with Continentalvictory and Self Possessed. Both were toed in and obviously showed no effect.

Long or short pasterns are rarely a problem today as compared to 40 years ago. Somehow we have bred this conformation fault out. I still will not buy a long pasterns horse. Not only does this fault compromise soundness, as it puts excessive pressure on knees, tendons and suspensories, it will increase the size of the gait in a trotter and in essence slow him down. On the other hand, excessively short pasterns would be an oddity.

Sickle hocks are a definite No No. Although there have been many fast horses with this deformity, I personally would advise against buying one. To begin with, a trotter will be far more inclined to hit his shins and will almost certainly have problems with curbs. To some trainers, this is no problem. To me, it is cancer. I have trained trotters for over 50 years and never trained a colt with a curb that amounted to anything.

Cow hocks are another fault that I don't like, but can live with. Most yearlings are cow hocked to some extent and seem to straighten up as they grow older. I prefer the ones that are straighter to begin with. Cow hocked colts are more likely to interfere and more likely to have hock and stifle problems.

Of most importance buying a yearling, the more correct they are, the better your chances of success and if you are lucky enough to have a great one, the chances of a great career as a stud or broodmare are enhanced immeasurably.

Dirty_deere asks: I can't find anyone to help me with this colt. He scalps and I flipped his shoes around and it cleaned him up enough to get down to :30, but now if I try to go faster he makes breaks even with the trotting hopples. I think my problem is that he doesn't reach out enough. Any help will be awesome.

This is not an easy one without sitting behind the colt. My first thought is that you may be right and all horses were not born to trot and you can't create a good gait on a bad-gaited horse. Fortunately my ego gets me to think I can create miracles, or at least help you get him to the races. First, realize you have to work with what you have. If the colt doesn't reach out, nothing you can do will make him. Pull his hind shoes and get his angle as high as possible. Now put a three-quarter inch half round reversed with an aluminum rim pad. Keep his head rather low and don't take it up unless he hits his shins. If this doesn't work, leave the shoes the way I suggested and take his head way up and put the hopples that attach to the bike on the way you normally would. STOP now and take them up 5 more holes. If he still doesn't trot, trade him for a dog they are more fun and less expensive to keep.

Is \$13,000 exacta a North American harness record?

It looks like I might have picked the wrong week to take a betting sabbatical.

There was quite a buzz coming from Northfield Park Wednesday night, all caused by 179-1 shot Royal Player winning race 4 and topping some monster payouts – one of which I believe might be a North American record for payout in a harness race.

It's not every night that you see horses paying \$361 for every deuce win from the 8-hole on 1/2-mile tracks, but everything lined up for this six-year-old gelded son of Strong Player out of the King Gypsy mare Gypsy Doe at the start when 2-5 favorite Howabouta Big Guy broke stride.

Despite that stroke of luck, though, Royal Player made his own trip and was full value for the tote-board-exploding win. In rein to Luke Ebersole, Royal Player – who was winless in four starts – rocketed right to the front off the gate and led to just before the opening 1/4, timed in :29.1. At that point, he relinquished command and sat in new leader Diggity Dog's pocket until the 3/8ths pole where Ebersole re-moved him to the front.

Royal Player shook off an attack from three-wide challenger Smell That Rock as they passed the 3/4 pole in 1:28.1, then held 71-1 shot Dundee Dan safe by a length at the wire to record a 1:57.3 maiden-breaking score for trainer/driver Ebersole and lessee owner Ray Gingerich from Ohio.

Things got really interesting when the official sign flashed and the payouts were posted. Royal Player returned \$361.40, \$96.80 and \$31.20 across the board and with a 179-1 shot combining with the 71-1 Dundee Dan for the exacta, the payout was a pool shot. One lucky winner that held a \$1

exacta – perhaps playing numbers or names – took down the entire pool of \$13,142.20 with an 8-4 combination. The winning trifecta was also a \$1 pool sweep with 23-1 shot Smell That Rock finishing third. The 8-4-3 combo returned \$14,638 for a buck.


I couldn't verify it for certain, but I believe the exacta payout of \$13,000 for a dollar is a North American record for the wager. No one I asked on social media could tell me of a payout that topped it. Anyway, when 179-1 shots top 71-1 shots in exactas, you can be sure there is going to be a buzz.

Between Two Worlds

Harness racing lessons from a mysterious ocean cruise.

In 1944, Warner Brothers released a motion picture called, "BETWEEN TWO WORLDS." You'd have to be a real film buff to know anything about the famous actors involved, but for my money, the two standouts in this picture are Eleanor Parker and John Garfield. It's a terrific flick, and it pre-dates M. Knight Shyamalan's, "I see dead people" routine by two generations. If you see it on TCM or wherever, you might want to watch it – especially if you work in the harness racing business. I'll explain why later.

Basically, the story involves a bunch of people who find themselves traveling in dense fog aboard a luxury ocean liner. At first, it's all about champagne cocktails, cigarette holders and the polite banter of traveling strangers, but tensions slowly rise as the passengers, some swanky and others conspicuously inelegant, gradually realize that they neither know how they got on this ship, nor where the ship is headed. Everyone seems to be wandering around in the wrong class — beleaguered by a nagging sense of doom and uncertainty. Sound familiar? Like I said, I'll explain later.

Of course, like everything in Hollywood that was once inventive and riveting, the theme of this film has been copied and bastardized into mindless oblivion. In fact, BETWEEN TWO WORLDS (1944) is itself a remake of the film OUTWARD BOUND (1930).

Okay, so what's this movie about a ghostly cruise ship transporting dead people to their final reward got to do with harness racing? Oh, wait, I should have given you a spoiler alert about that, right? Sorry, but yes, the passengers are all dead and the ritzy ship is just a ruse-cruise to the hereafter. It's kind of like THE SIXTH SENSE. You know, when you find out that Bruce Willis has been dead all along and... oh dammit, there I go again with the spoilers.

The thing is that the passengers are deceased and the





luxury liner, is taking them to their assigned afterlife destinations. The ship's itinerary consists of only two stops. Count 'em! Two! Get the idea?

Geez, how am I going to tie this all together? Let's start with the old man in Florence.

This past fall I went to Florence, as part of a vacation during which I would make stops throughout the south of France to visit my maternal family. Italy was not an integral part of my trip, but I decided to start there because I wanted to feel like a tourist. I'd already been to Italy a bunch of times, but because of past family obligations, I'd never made it to Florence. This time I was on my own.

Intent on seeing Michelangelo's David, I got into a line outside the Galleria dell 'Accademia. The wait time was three hours, so I shrugged in resignation and walked off. As I stepped away, and before I could react to his touch, an elderly Italian gentleman, neat as a pin and charmingly continental, cupped my elbow and gently ushered me towards a small door. He said a few words in Italian to a uniformed guard, and almost instantly I found myself walking down the main hall of the Galleria towards the David. I didn't know the old gentleman, and I have no idea why the guard moved me through the private entrance as per his request. There's no plot twist to this. It just happened, and it made no sense. I wondered if perhaps I looked like someone else, or if I'd been chosen at random. I never found out.

Later, as I stood beneath the David, I was reminded of exactly how I'd felt ages ago when I stood alone beside an aging Niatross in a blacksmith shop. There I was, a conspicuous mediocrity standing in the presence of a miraculous creation. Horses, fast or slow, and classic works of art are very evocative in the sense that they can make you

feel amazingly unimportant. Movie stars.... not so much.

At the time, I decided that the elderly man and the guard were aberrations, and that I'd simply stumbled upon the David the same way I had stumbled upon Niatross. That had to be the answer. Nothing else could explain it.

The following day I found myself aboard a Windstar Luxury Liner bound for Marseilles. I'd purchased a bargain basement ticket on Orbitz for a ho-hum Grimaldi Ferry, but when I presented my passport at the check in, I was again gently led elsewhere. A meticulously-dressed young gentleman summoned for a baggage cart and, in a blur of confusion and crisscrossing gangplanks, I found myself standing aboard a very private ocean liner where the passengers, I assumed, had to be very wealthy.

Again, this caught me off-guard and confused me because at the time I hadn't been clued in on the quadruple upgrade that had been arranged for me by a class-conscious aunt. That's when I started to worry. I recollected that my plane had had a very rough landing in Rome a few days prior, and that I'd completely forgotten how I even got from Rome to Florence. I chalked that confusion up to jet lag or fatigue, but then there was that puzzling incident with the delicate old man at the Galleria dell 'Accademia who snatched me out of a long line, and now this luxury liner that carried a handful of very affluent passengers. Could it be...?

Here's the thing. In psychiatric medicine, there's an illness called Cotard's Syndrome. A person afflicted with Cotard's lives in a calmly delusional state wherein they firmly believe that they're dead, and because no one believes them or acknowledges their death, they're forced to live between two worlds. Those afflicted insist to whomever will listen that their demise and decay is not being recognized or duly noted by the proper authorities. There's no cure for Cotard's, except perhaps to put the patient into a casket, dig a hole, bury them and say, "Happy now?" I think that might be against the law.

Regrettably, I'd read about Cotard's in school, and of course, like all the diseases I read about, I deduced that I was in the early stages. I assumed that my landing in Rome had actually been a fiery crash, and that I was now one of the dearly departed. It wasn't so bad either. From the get-go, death offers a lot of perks. You don't have to wait in any lines, you travel on exclusive ships, and you get a full balcony with 24-hour steward service.

For every disease known to man, there is at least one variant of that disease, and I firmly believe that there is a variant of Cotard's Disease supplanting itself in harness racing. I call this variant, "Reverse Cotard's."



In Reverse Cotard's, the people affected are fundamentally dead, yet they persist in believing that they're alive and vibrant. They're not zombies, but they're headed in that direction. They don't eat your flesh and they semi-function like everyone else, yet they will not go gently into that dark night. They rage against death, but not because they're brave or courageous or anything like that. They stick around because they're delusional. They concoct elaborate dreams and schemes to reinforce the deception that they're alive.

In my opinion, Reverse Cotard's is a much worse disease than regular Cotard's, and for that reason, like a train wreck, it's curiously entertaining to watch or observe. Do you know anyone with Reverse Cotard's Syndrome? If you work in harness racing, you probably do, but don't tell them. To quote a line from the film SUNSET BLVD, "You don't yell at a sleepwalker. He might fall and break his neck."

Anyway, I was now aboard this ridiculously upscale ship, and at best there were 100 passengers. My cabin steward, a man from Senegal named Wade, suggested that I go to the top deck for cocktails prior to the ship's departure. He said that bathing attire would be appropriate as I might enjoy sitting in the effervescent bath. In other words, I could get drunk and sit in a hot tub.

When I stepped up and onto the Sky Deck, the bartender knew my name. That was creepy and made even more creepy by the fact that a character named Scrubby, the kindhearted bartender on the ghost ship featured in BETWEEN TWO WORLDS, knew every passenger's name as though it had been inscribed upon the pages of some secret book.

The best thing about the hot tub was that it wasn't hot, and it wasn't bubbly. It was truly effervescent just like Wade said. I was content to sit there and dissolve away all by myself, but that didn't last. Within minutes, some men and women climbed in and started gabbing about their lives. I figured out quickly that this gaggle was comprised of three

married couples - two American and one Canadian.

Gradually the inevitable wheel of conversation spun around to me. One woman, a flighty type who reminded me of Lovey Howell from GILLIGAN'S ISLAND, said, "So, tell us about you." I started out by reminding Mrs. Howell that I tend to talk too much and that she would regret asking me that question. "Don't be silly," she said. "The six of us are bored to death with one another. We're practically starved for some new blood. John, fetch him another champagne cocktail."

I started out by saying that I was a harness racehorse trainer and a writer.

Before I could elucidate, Lovey replied, "A racehorse trainer? Oh, how fabulous! Have you ever raced in the Kentucky Derby?" In my mind, I plucked her out from the hot tub and enthusiastically flung her overboard. In real life, however, I opted to continue the conversation politely. Her husband John explained that he didn't know what I meant when I said harness racing. As I explained further, Mrs. Howell nodded along knowingly and enthusiastically, as if to show her husband that she was a very knowledgeable person and that he wasn't.

"John, honestly, you really don't know anything about anything," she said. "He's talking about chariot racing – like in Ben Hur." That last quip made me glad that I hadn't tossed her into the Mediterranean. That would have been too kind. Poor Mr. Howell (John) was probably living from one nitroglycerine tablet to the next. So, he didn't know anything about harness racing. Big deal. I've gotten used to that.

The oddest thing is that Mr. and Mrs. Howell, as it turned out, lived only five miles from Pompano Park, yet they thought it was a dog racing track. Stranger still, the Canadian couple had never been to Mohawk or Woodbine despite living in Toronto. Normally, this would have annoyed me, but it was a relief in the sense that I figured that maybe I wasn't dead after all. I mean, if I was existing between two worlds, wouldn't it be a place where harness racing is the only thing anyone wants to talk about?

The third couple, older folks from New York, knew exactly what I was talking about – especially the husband. While the distant harmony of a mandolin and accordion offered the appropriate accompaniment, Mr. New York said, "The trotters are all fixed. The horses are all doped up and you can see the drivers holding the horses back. They're all crooks."

How rude, right? No, it wasn't rude. It was the best medicine I ever got. As soon as I heard Mr. New York's ignorant opinions, I knew instantly that I wasn't dead. I wasn't dead at all. Dead people aren't cynical or coarse or



gritty. They don't hold grudges, or say rude things in polite company, and they're probably very conversant and enlightened about a lot of things. From what I've heard, dead people are very well-informed and contented. Okay, so maybe there are a few who tell you to "GET OUT" of their house, but I think that only happens in movies. Dead people love harness racing because a lot of them work in it. They're not going to say anything negative or disparaging. Why would they? In spite of their demise, they have great plans for the future of their industry.

In my effervescent submersion, I instantly put all the puzzling pieces together. My landing in Rome was a little bouncy, so what? It was a windy day. Then, I got from Rome to Florence via car service, and for most of the three-hour ride I was asleep. Of course, my memory of that would be foggy. The old man who snagged me out of the long line probably thought I was cute or something — that happens — and my Aunt Olympia had paid for me to travel in luxury because she can afford it. The bartender knew my name because my photo and pertinent info appears on his screen as soon as I enter my key card into the door at the private entrance.

End of story. I was alive and well, and the following morning I got off the ship in Marseilles where I met my cousin Phillipe. This wasn't heaven or hell. It was just a city in France. So there you go. I thoroughly explained to you what all of this has to do with harness racing just like I said I would... didn't I?

Fifth straight year of handle growth at Miami Valley

conditioner Dan Ater garnered his first MVR title by a single victory, 39-38 over Nicole Stewart. With a UTRS of .304, Ater's barn earned \$520,932 for the session. Next in the standings were Tyler George, Bill Dailey, Jeff Brewer and Dan Noble. A total of 13 trainer stables earned over \$200,000 at Miami Valley in 2018, while an additional 23 surpassed the \$100,000 earnings plateau.

The Lebanon, OH track brought the curtain down on its fifth and most successful season with a pair of Grand Circuit events that both established national season's marks over a five-eighths mile track.

Barn Girl (Aaron Merriman) copped the extremely competitive \$81,600 Miami Valley Distaff for older trotting mares, wearing down Churita (Trace Tetrick) in 1:52.4 despite a grueling first-over trip. The 6-year-old daughter of Cash Hall, who has now won exactly half of her lifetime starts (48 wins in 96 tries), allowed Churita to lead the talented field past the :26.3 quarter but was out and rolling before the :55.1 halfway point. Up to the leader's wheel at the 1:24 three-quarters and around the final turn, Barn Girl dug deep in the stretch to establish the new national season's standard.

"She is a very gritty mare," said Merriman in the winner's circle. Trainer Bill Bercury and his wife-owner Renee were ecstatic. "She never disappoints," Bill said. "I get butterflies before every race," added Renee, "but she always comes through!"

The 1:52.4 clocking was also a new lifetime mark for Barn Girl, whose best previous win was in 1:53.

The super sharp Shartin N (Tim Tetrick) captured the

The Jim King Jr. trained winner glided effortlessly along after reaching the front, widening the margin on the field from one length at the half to three lengths at the three-quarters. With just mild urging Tetrick guided Shartin N through the wire with longshot Medusa (Tony Hall) rallying for second and Blue Moon Stride (Corey Callahan) garnering the show dough.

A total of seven \$15,000 divisions of Buckeye Stallion Series first leg action was also featured on Miami Valley's closing card. Winning 3-year-old filly trotters were Infrontandforgetit (Kayne Kauffman, 1:57.3), Bugs MVP (Aaron Merriman, 1:58.3) and Momentsoffire (Tyler Smith, 1:57.4). Sophomore filly pacers who reached the winners enclosure were Osborne's Ellie (Tyler Smith, 1:54), Crosswind Butercup (Kyle Ater, 1:55.4), Velocity Gretchen (Mark Evers, 1:53.4) and Our Miss Reese (Sandy Beatty, 1:54.2).

USTA launches Medication Collaborative

The United States Trotting Association, through the Medication Subcommittee of the USTA Board of Directors, has established a group, to include both academic and practicing veterinarians, to be called the Harness Racing Medication Collaborative (HRMC).

The HRMC's purpose is to assist in identifying and developing the scientific background for medication regulation in standardbred racing. Scientific research projects may be conducted if needed to support standardbred regulatory policy, once funding can be organized.

The USTA plans to provide the HRMC's reports and supporting data to the Association of Racing Commissioners International, which would transmit those reports to its regulators in the various racing commissions.

New York Sire Stakes 2018 county fairs schedule confirmed

"County fair racing is part of the rich tradition of harness racing and both horsemen and fans alike look forward to the New York Sire Stakes County Fair Series each summer," said M. Kelly Young, executive director of the Agriculture & NYS


Horse Breeding Development Fund. "We love having the opportunity to introduce harness racing to new audiences at the fairs and we hope they will show an interest in the sport for years to come. These events also provide a great proving ground for young horses and young trainers and drivers to begin their careers."

The County Fair Series will also include Racing Under Saddle (RUS) events at nine separate fairs. RUS is similar to Europe's monte racing in which riders race atop standardbreds, usually at a trot. RUS-NY was formed in 2014 to increase interest in the sport and showcase the versatility of the Standardbred breed.


