Heavyweight slugfest on tap tonight as Perfect Sting looks to remain undefeated

The 2020 2-year-old Pacing Colt of the Year will start his sophomore campaign by taking on Abuckabett Hanover, Sumna Cum Laude, Lou's Pearlman and others in a PASS division at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Tonight (May 16) marks the first huge slugfest of the year in the heavyweight division and undefeated superstar Perfect Sting has, arguably, the most to lose as he takes on three chief rivals in a \$51,045 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) division at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

"I'm excited for it," Perfect Sting's trainer Joe Holloway said of the 3-year-old pacing colt's seasonal pari-mutuel debut in a \$51,045 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) division at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono against top colts Abuckabett Hanover, Sumna Cum Laude, Lou's Pearlman and others (race 9, 5 p.m. first race post time).

While the Hall of Fame trainer said he is pumped to see how his top pupil fares against such tough foes, Holloway had hoped for an easier assignment to kick off Perfect Sting's 2021 campaign. The fact the colt has yet to be beaten and was crowned the 2020 winner of the Dan Patch Award as the top male freshman pacer in the nation makes him a huge target.

"Everybody is going to be gunning for you," he said of tonight's start. "I didn't expect to be drawing in easy, but... it would've been nice if (his debut) was at The Meadowlands or

a nice, big racetrack where he would've had more opportunity. It's kind of cut and dry the way the race is going to go on the five-eighths. You're not going to let Lou's Pearlman or Summa Cum Laude or Abuckabett (get away from you) and they aren't going to let us get away easy, but we're not looking to be third-over coming for home. You can do that if you're at The Meadowlands and that's how the race unfolds itself."

Holloway, 64, has conditioned such stars as Jenna's Beach Boy, Always A Virgin, She's A Great Lady and both of Perfect Sting's blazingly-fast parents, Always B Miki and Shebestingin, but he said Perfect Sting is the best horse he's ever trained.

"He's tougher than his mother, but he's as fast as his mother. And he could live as long as his father," Holloway said. "Miki had a big set of lungs. (Perfect Sting is a) pretty good combination of both of them."

As for managing the all-important sophomore campaign, Holloway said some of his previous stars were fortunate to be able to ease into their 3-year-old seasons before hitting the major stakes races.

"(Always A) Virgin, (Always B) Miki and other horses weren't expected to be the best when they first started (their 3-year-old seasons). They kind of grew as they started racing, but Jenna ('s Beach Boy), he'd been 2-year-old of the year and was forced to race in the 3-year-old open his first start and then the second week, the owner had him in the regular open and he raced older horses."

WAIT, HE WAS PASSED?

Perfect Sting comes into tonight's race off two strong qualifiers at The Meadowlands on April 23 (1:52.2) and April 30 (1:52.3), respectively. In the latter, driver David Miller even allowed the homebred colt to be passed before retaking the lead and cruising to victory much to the consternation of part-owner and breeder Marty Granoff of Val D'Or Farms, who shares Perfect Sting's ownership papers and breeding credits with Brittany Farms of Kentucky.

"Marty Granoff didn't like him getting passed," Holloway said, laughing. "Dave will say he'd like to sit behind someone for a change. I'll just have to keep Marty happy, that's all... He said, 'Look, look, that horse went on by him!' That's Marty, he

wants to win every race by five or six. He does like the pressure of it, though, so it's funny.

Holloway said remaining perfect, "would be nice" but the important part is winning the right races.

"Horses like that, there's times when they get beat. Actually, Jenna, he lost twice, but he was still the best horse out there. Somebeachsomewhere lost in the (Meadowlands) Pace... They don't lose often, but they can get beat. It happens.

"Would I like to be undefeated? Oh, I think that would be the thrill of a lifetime and coming at the end of my career, that would be pretty cool, but meanwhile I'm pretty realistic and I doubt it's going to happen and not because the horse isn't good, it's just that anything can happen."

JUG BOUND?

As for managing Perfect Sting's schedule to try to win the biggest stakes, Holloway said the fact the Pepsi North America Cup at Woodbine Mohawk Park has been moved from June to Sept. 4 due to a lockdown of racing in Ontario opens up the possibility Perfect Sting will race in the Little Brown Jug on Sept. 23.

"I'm disappointed, like everyone else, with the Cup being moved. His schedule was set up the way it was – June for the Cup, July for the (Meadowlands) Pace, August for the Hempt and then on down to Kentucky... It probably brings the Little Brown Jug into play now, whereas before I would have definitely done the Tall Dark Stranger route (and skipped the Jug)... I'm not a fan of the heats anymore."

MORE MATURE MENTALLY

As for how his champion has changed from a freshman to a sophomore, Holloway said the pacer is, "more mature mentally. He's been training extremely well, which you could never say that about him before... you always had to make him do his work, but right now he's much more up for it.

"He's all play. In the morning, he's tough to handle because all he wants to do is play and he doesn't get tired. He's light on his feet. He's got it all... He's good-looking, he's good-gaited, he's sound and he's fast and he's tough."

Holloway injured his shoulder in a training accident in early April and said the toughest part has been not being able to sit behind Perfect Sting since April 10.

"I'm handling (the pressure) part fine, but I'm not real thrilled about sitting on the sidelines right now, but I think that'll only be another couple of weeks. There's all kind of ways to skin a cat and the horse hasn't missed a beat without me being the one sitting behind him. It's just the way you're used to doing things, you know? I like to sit behind them, I like to see everything. Other people think they can see just as much or more from the sidelines, so that's neither here nor there, just what I would like."

In the interim, Miller has been handling Perfect Sting's training trips.

"He knows the horse and he believes in the horse. So, that's been good that he's done that. They are overpaid anyway, catch drivers, he needs to do some work," Holloway said, laughing.

Tonight we'll find out if Miller can help Perfect Sting extend his undefeated streak to 11 career races and push the pacer's career earnings over \$550,000 as the quest to win the biggest sophomore races on the continent begins in earnest.

One Eight Hundred readies for showdown with Southwind Gendry

Last year's 2-year-old champion Perfect Sting highlights the three Pennsylvania Sire Stake (PASS) divisions at Mohegan Sun Pocono Downs today (May 16) (see story pg. 1), though the most intriguing head-to-head matchup could come in the race immediately after that one. That's when One Eight Hundred gets to see just how good he is when going up against Southwind Gendry, who comes off a lifetime best mile of 1:49:4 when making his first start of the year two weeks ago at The Meadows.

Carded as the 10th race on the 14-race card, One Eight Hundred enters his PASS division in the form that's been expected of him since his beginning. The highest yearling pacer ever at \$800,000, One Eight Hundred was in the midst of storming through the Bobby Weiss series in April when misfortune struck through no fault of his own in that series final. But he rebounded strongly from that last week to win a PA All Stars race where fellow Meadowlands Pace-eligible and rival again today, Water Sports Teen, couldn't gain ground on him from the pocket in that race. Tim Tetrick assumed the drive last week for the first time on One Eight Hundred (Somebeachsomewhere–Economy Terror) and will be piloting the colt today once again.

Howard Taylor, along with Chuck Pompey and Edwin Gold campaigned One Eight Hundred's dam, the 2-year-old pacing filly champion Economy Terror, during her race career along with trainer Chris Oakes. Those same connections who bred One Eight Hundred went to the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling sale with the full intent to buy this colt, named Some Terror at that time.

"I was the underbidder on that horse," said Taylor. "Chuck Pompey wanted to buy the horse at any cost. He told Chris Oakes to buy him and he was prepared to go to whatever it took and that the plan was to bring him home. And while Chris Oakes was bidding, Chuck fell asleep and when the bidding got to \$700,000, I was panicking because I didn't want him at that price. And I knew that Chris bid the \$700,000 and that they were still going. I was on tape delay because I was watching the sale on the computer and knew that I had to do something quick. So, I texted him 'Stop' because that's all I had time for. Chris said that he was going to raise his hand for \$825,000 and was scared to death to do it because he couldn't get

a hold of Chuck but then he looked down and saw my text."

That anyone would go up to \$800,000 for a yearling pacer was a surprise, but it wasn't a number out of the question to Taylor based word he had received in months prior. "These trainers spend all summer going to farms and looking at yearlings every chance they get, and I received 10 calls from trainers just to tell me that this is the most magnificent yearling they ever saw, said Taylor."

Though Taylor and team didn't get the colt that day, they're still part of the horse as its breeders. One Eight Hundred is owned by Brixton Medical Inc. and the colt's trainer, Nancy Takter.

"Chuck was pissed," said Taylor, regarding not getting One Eight Hundred from sale. "I said, 'Chuck, you own the mare, the colt's brothers, and the main thing is the breeder's awards.'; It's like the gift that keeps on giving. You keep getting money and there's no risk. You got your \$800,000 and that will never go away and if the horse is great, all you do is make money from this horse. The breeder's awards are substantial in Pennsylvania."

As Taylor referenced, he is part of a group that bred and owns a Sweet Lou 2-year-old half-brother to One Eight Hundred. The horse was for sale last year as a yearling, but the group bought him back. "He went through the sale and for some reason nobody was bidding on him. Everybody said he was extremely good looking – though One Eight Hundred was magnificent – and we couldn't understand it but we're not going to give him away, so we bought him back for \$50,000."

That One Eight Hundred has come back as good as he has is a testament to both himself and to his trainer, Nancy Takter. Lou's Pearlman set last year's fastest mark for a 2-year-old colt of 1:49:1, and it came in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes at the Red Mile when it was a revved-up One Eight Hundred that blazed the way on the front through a :52:4 half-mile.

"He lived to tell about it," said Taylor. "And Nancy is very good at bringing them back, too. Her 2-year-olds come back as 3-year-olds, and most of the time even better. Recent examples are No Lou Zing and Tall Dark Stranger."

For One Eight Hundred who is staked to mostly everything as you'd expect a \$800,000 purchase to be, Sunday will give a read as to just how far he's come from that 5-1-1-1 record with \$16,798 in earnings as a 2-year-old. There were some nice, younger horses in the Bobby Weiss series, but today will be where the rubber hits the road. In addition to Southwind Gendry, the race also features stakes star Chase H Hanover and Hellabalou who comes off a PA All Stars win. One Eight Hundred didn't win last year in limited starts against these types. He might be able to do so now.

Drivers giving holes – good or bad for the game?

There are a lot of contentious issues about how harness racing is presented and raced, and the argument regarding the giving or not giving of tucks (especially on the first turn) is certainly one of them.

There appears to be a couple of schools of thought on this: 1. Closing holes, as per the current rules, creates more contentious racing and a better product, especially by encouraging closers and 2. For a proper race flow and to allow drivers to use strategy, tucks need to be available.

I asked the venerable John Campbell via email about his thoughts on the state of the game regarding tucks or no tucks, and he was increasingly wary about the speed favoring nature of the sport.

"As an industry we have to make every effort to make our races as entertaining to watch and as attractive to bet on as possible. I think almost everyone agrees that this is accomplished when the closers are brought into play," Campbell wrote.

"The rules that are written and in place [rules not allowing

the giving of holes or tucks] should be enforced on a consistent basis. If there is concerted pushback from the fans and horseplayers on a certain rule or the calls pertaining to that rule the tracks and Commissions should then go through the proper channels and either modify or change the rule.

"We must be more attentive to our customers as we move forward."

With that, I thought we'd ask a few of harness racing's regular customers this exact question.

What are their thoughts on drivers giving (or not giving) holes?

Greg Reinhart (public handicapper): "I can see both sides of the argument on drivers being allowed tuck in rather than getting left out, and it would be intriguing if it wasn't allowed to see how drivers adjusted and how race shape changed. However, for me, if I pick a horse that's offering a square price, and the driver on my horse opens a hole that allows him to follow a contender that then results in at least getting a chance at a victory, then I think that's a sound strategy on his part. The same goes for letting in a longshot that a driver wants to get out of the way and then re-move around. So, with that said, I would not be in favor of rules being significantly altered to not give drivers those type of options."

Les Stark (professional horseplayer): "The subject of tucks, whether strategic or otherwise, yields opinions from both sides of the coin. Drivers are adamant that they need to be able to develop a game plan which may include allowing a live horse in front of them to follow. Others, hoping for more of a flow which would allow more horses to enter contention, insist that holes must be closed. Many, myself included, would like the speed/favorite barrage to be slowed



down. There is no easy answer for this complicated issue. In my view, I believe the closing of holes would lead to more of a contested pace, and allow horses which get away in the back to enter contention. One only needs to look at races from the '90s to see how this could be accomplished. While the changes in bikes, the breed etc, have made horses able to carry speed longer, it's worth a shot to try and create a better environment for closers."

Ryan Willis (customer): "I think it [the current system of not being draconian on tucks] works out pretty evenly overall – for customer and driver. The exception, however, would be the guys that don't drive regularly; they are never finding that same courtesy tuck everyone else is. It would be interesting to see what would happen if judges disallowed giving holes completely. I think I would hate the chaos it would cause, but some that want extra randomness in the races may really enjoy it. In fact, we see these types of races every week in the amateur races – the only two holes are at the front and the back. For every day racing, I would be scared about the guy landing 3rd or 4th not being allowed to give a hole and the outside horses just sitting beside your bet for an eternity."

Brett Sturman (horseplayer, Harness Racing Update): "I don't think that allowing holes is generally good for the product. In some cases where there truly is a direct strategy involved, such as making a hole so that a horse can then immediately have clearance to make a quarter move to the front, is one thing, but most times that isn't the case. People can characterize the holes however they want, but the perception is awful. Plus, it stifles the flow of the races and anyone can see it by comparing any random race today to a race of 20 years ago. I do agree that with many others that

the breed has changed and that horses carry their speed more, but the lack of flow in races only compounds that issue."

Garnet Barnsdale (public handicapper): "I don't mind holes being given in the first 1/8th or 3/16th of a mile when horses are sorting themselves out and looking to get positioned. I don't think forcing drivers to close every hole immediately after the start would improve the product. The sport is already too speed-favoring, and, having horses left out there that will never be able to clear is likely to only help the leader. I don't like the optics of drivers leaning way back to give a hole on the backstretch and the danger in doing it at that point of the race is others may be on the move and leave the hole-giver locked in. If you haven't found a hole by the time they reach the 1/4, you should be out of luck at that point."

From our unscientific sample, the conclusion seems to be that closing more holes would likely bring more back markers into play, but no one appears to want to see the wild west, with every hole closed like an amateur race.

Perhaps the judges being extra vigilant when it comes to "courtesy tucks" versus "strategic tucks" might help satisfy our group? Or perhaps we need a lot more discussion on this polarizing topic.

A conversation with PR maven John Berry

I have been fortunate enough to interview persons in just about every phase of harness racing. They include breeders, trainers, drivers, owners, gamblers, grooms and those from track management.

One area I've yet to touch upon — and one in which I, myself have been intimately involved — has been in the area of publicity and public relations.

My good friend Wally Hennessey called me a few weeks ago and suggested that I write a column about his good friend — and the good friend of just about everybody who knows him — John Berry.

John, who is known to be quite humble in his involvement in our sport has a long history going back to his first writing some 57 years ago. He has been involved in publicity, public relations and just about every other facet of promoting our sport — almost, but not quite as long as yours truly. He said that rather than admitting to our true ages of 78 and just about 80, we should convert them to Celsius which would come to 25 and 26. As for me, I'm okay with that.

How did John Berry become involved in the sport that was to become his life's destiny? On Aug. 22, 1959, he was at the Bryn Mawr Bowling Alley in Chicago. He describes himself as a pretty good bowler. He was Illinois State Singles Champion in 1970. On that August day, he bowled a three-game series of 774 and won \$15.

He thought he was walking in pretty high cotton. He was just a kid and winning \$15 bucks was a pretty good payday.

He was approached by a man named Luke who told him that he owed him. He said that he had made a pretty good wager on Berry and felt that he should share some of the gains with him. Berry felt awkward about taking the man's money and turned him down. Instead, Luke invited him out to dinner to which Berry was agreeable.

They went to a place that Berry had heard of, but had never been to. It was called Sportsman's Park. It seems that Luke was pretty well known there. He had a box near those of

Gene Riegle, the Grahams, the Pletchers and many others. The feature race that night was the American National headlined by the great Senator Frost driven and trained by Dick Buxton. Berry bet his \$15 on him and he won — what Luke said he would do. John Berry was hooked. He instantly loved this sport called harness racing.

Something else that Luke told Berry was that in the very next race there was a young trotter who he thought could become even better than Senator Frost. That horse also won. His name was Su Mac Lad and he was trained and driven by John Peat.

That was the last race that Su Mac Lad had for his Illinois connections. Irving Berkemeyer was a prominent owner in the Stanley Dancer stable. His major occupation was as a funeral director. Somehow he had convinced Dancer's right hand man Dick Baker to go to Chicago to pick up a new hearse. While he was there, he asked Baker to look at this trotter that was for sale. Baker was also in attendance that evening. He liked what he saw and Mr. Berkemeyer bought Su Mac Lad for \$35,000.

In his first start for Dancer, he unfortunately made a break. From that point forward he was at or near the top of trotting for the next five years.

While this was happening, John Berry became involved in the more mundane chores of everyday life, but his advocation had become the sport of harness racing. After completing school, he went to work in a brokerage house.

"I did alright, but I didn't like it. I just didn't have the right disposition to handle the ups and downs of it," Berry said.

From there, he became a salesman in a family-owned furniture business. As with the brokerage business, he did okay, but he didn't like it at all.

But this job had a hidden benefit. Two thirds of his territory included the states of Ohio, Illinois, Kentucky and Indiana. They all had harness tracks. That suited John just fine.

On his many sojourns to Sportsman's, Park, Berry met Don Stevens, one of the finest people he and I ever met. At the time, Stevens was employed at the track, but went on to become a prominent owner in the sport and, among other pursuits, a person at least partially responsible for the development of future Hall of Famers Tom Crouch and George Segal's interest in harness racing.

Stevens was involved in doing charity events which also coincided with the promotion of harness racing.

Berry took his cue from Stevens and began doing charity work at rehabilitation institutions, all on a voluntary basis.

He would assign a horse in a race to each of the patients. That would be that person's "drive" in the race.

He specifically recalls one event at the Johnston R Bowman Rehabilitation Center. One of the "drivers" was a stroke victim who had been unable to speak since her stroke six months before. Her horse won. Although extremely difficult, she spoke with great happiness for the first time since her life-altering episode. The feat rendered the doctors and nurses who were witness to it speechless.

Harry Porterfield, a well-known television personality on CBS in Chicago heard of the story. He was doing a show called "Someone you should know" and called upon John Berry to appear on it saying, "If this is what harness racing can do to make miracles, it's something that has to be told."

Don Stevens told Berry, "You need to get involved



professionally in harness racing. You hate selling furniture and you love racing. That's what you need to be doing."

Stevens told him that he needed to go see Stan Bergstein. Berry did and was helped by Bergstein to get a job with the Illinois Harness Horseman's Association (IHHA), all the while continuing his charity gig with hospitals and rehab centers.

From IHHA, he became publicity director at Balmoral Park.

After a few years at Balmoral, Berry was offered a position with the New Jersey Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association. Among his several responsibilities at the NJSBOA, the one he was proudest of was helping in getting all the major races at the Meadowlands, Freehold and Garden State Park on the local Public Broadcasting System's channel. It began with a relatively small donation by the NJSBOA to the PBS station. A relationship was formed and it grew. Eventually, that became the genesis of the harness racing TV shows, proving once again that from little acorns, tall oaks can grow.

After three years with the SBOANJ, Berry was invited to join the United States Trotting Association (USTA) and worked with the northeastern tracks from an office in Freehold, NJ.

Eventually, the USTA wanted him to make a move to Columbus, OH

Berry saw that as a deterrent to serving the tracks with which he had become involved and wouldn't move.

"Ironically, I had just turned down an offer from the legendary Frank Defrancis to go work with him at Freestate Raceway because he needed me immediately. I felt that I couldn't leave USTA without giving adequate notice."

Berry has done announcing, morning lines, TV commentary, even some work in the race office at several tracks including Balmoral, Freehold, Garden State, Plainridge and Pompano.

He also was partially responsible, together with the late and sorely missed Bill Galvin, co-hosting the first Grand Circuit event on Canadian television live from The Red Mile.

Sometime in the interim, Berry decided to go to auctioneer's school. He has sold just about everything that there is to be sold from horses to domain names as an auctioneer. It was with the latter that he achieved his claim to fame as an auctioneer. He believes that it still is the largest price ever for a domain name. He was selling them at an event in the Venetian Hotel in Las Vegas. He sold the web name "sex.net" for the price of \$450,000.

John, you've done a whole lot of things in this business of ours but you are best known, at least presently for your work at Pompano Park.

"I first came to Florida in 1986 to work at Pompano Park. I worked there from '86 through '88. I then went to work for Eric Cherry at his fledgling National Raceline. That was often my voice you might have heard while checking on race calls

and race results. I came back to Pompano in 2004 and have been with them ever since."

Would you care to talk about some of the highlights of your years at racetracks?

"Two things come to mind. I was doing a live handicapping show at The Meadowlands one night and couldn't split two horses — the six and the seven. So I predicted a dead heat. It was a dead heat. I thought it was just like Babe Ruth calling his home run shot in 1932.

"One night at Pompano, we had a pop up series and the six entries were so evenly matched that I made the morning line 7-2 on all six — the first and only time in pari-mutuel history that this happened. So a nondescript race for four claimers got all the headlines. Mission accomplished."

Speaking to you about our sport and our breed, one cannot be helped but be impressed by your great love for them.

"I am a great history buff when it comes to the harness horse. I truly believe that they are the greatest of all equine breeds. Their combination of great looks, great ability and sound disposition is unequalled. Their greatest asset, perhaps more in the past, than today was their amazing stamina. Way back when, a standardbred actually raced a hundred miles. It wasn't unusual to see horses race into their twenties. Neither was it surprising for harness horses to race five heats or more in a single day."

If I asked you to pick just one favorite horse, who would it be?

"That's not an easy question. I've loved a lot of horses through the years. I suppose that if push came to shove it would probably be Albatross. He did some things, especially as a 2-year-old that no horse ever will do. He was an iron horse. He raced full seasons at 2, 3 and 4 without the slightest bit of unsoundness, at least none of which that I was aware.

"My favorite race of all time was the world record for slowest race set by the 3-year-old Scotsdam on March 17, 1962 at Maywood Park. Winter was in a war with spring with snow, sleet, rain and a freezing temperature. Scotsdam won the race in 3:38.3, the slowest pari-mutuel mile in history."

How about some of your favorite horsemen?

Curly Smart: "Curly was one of my early favorites. I first met him in 1961. He said to me, 'The next time you are in the area, look me up. We'll have lunch.' That's something that we did for several years. He was a truly delightful man. One time, I was on my way from Columbus to Cleveland. I somehow lost his phone number, so I called information. I asked the operator for the number of T. Wayne Smart. She answered, 'Oh, you mean Curly.' Everybody in Delaware or around there knew Curly."

Dave Magee: "I became friends with him before he became the star that he was destined to be. I told him what was coming, but in his mild, aw-shucks manner he told me he had a long way to go."

Any other horsemen in the Chicago area?

"Quite a few including but not limited to Walter 'Butch' Paisley, Del Insko, Bob Farrington, Bobby Williams and Dwayne Pletcher. I'd often jog horses for Gene Vallandinghsm."

How about horsemen in your Florida years?

"Of course, Wally Hennessey, also Peter Blood, Mickey McNichol and Lucien Fontaine. It's one darned shame and injustice that Loosh isn't in the Hall of Fame. I have to also give great praise to Tim Tetrick and David Miller who have come down here each of the last few years to drive in competition against each other. We've got two young drivers down here Braxton Boyd and Joe Chindano Jr who I believe will be heard from."

You've also been a fairly prolific writer through the years.

"I'm pretty sure it's that area that got me into the Communicator's Corner of the Hall of Fame at Goshen. I've written for numerous publications. I'm proud that I've won a national and four regional Hervey awards. You name a harness racing journal past or present in my lifetime and chances are that I've written for it."

Presently at Pompano you co-host the daily evening racing program with Gabe Prewitt.

"It's a great honor to share a microphone with Gabe. He's just fantastic. I know of nobody in the game that is any better. He knows the sport from just about every viewpoint possible. If our great sport has a future, I'm sure that Gabe will be a leading component of it."

You've had some serious health concerns for some time. Would you care to speak of them?

"I was diagnosed with polycystic kidney disease in 1988 and I am in stage 5 now. It's considered renal failure, but I have a good attitude about it and I still try to go full speed ahead. I am on the waiting list for an artificial kidney being developed by UCSF Medical Center."

Redén trotters dominated in Umea

American-bred **Missle Hill** (Muscle Hill), paired with Örjan Kihlström, dominated the \$48,000 Guldbjörken in Umeå in northern Sweden on the V75 race card on Saturday (May 15) afternoon.

From post 1 behind the gate, the 6-year-old Muscle Hill son quite easily kept the opponents on the outside when the car accelerated and from the lead the heavy favorite was hard to reach, even if Antonio Trot's finish as runner up was a high grader. The mile rate over 1.3 miles was 1:56 (replay here).

Missle Hill participated in the Elitloppet final last year, but a slot among the 16 in this year's big race is not at all a given.

Still, trainer Daniel Redén already has two horses in Elitloppet that will be held on May 30 at Solvalla. **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin) received his ticket earlier this spring. Redén's second Elitloppet horse is Heavy Sound.

The trainer opted to prepare Don Fanucci Zet for the Elitloppet by racing the 5-year-old Hard Livin son in the \$48,000 Berth Johanssons Memorial on Saturday where Hail Mary, the giant in Sweden's 5-year-old crop, was the main opponent.

Don Fanucci Zet came to the lead early into the race and Hail Mary connected on the outside with a lap to go. The pace was pretty slow until the last turn when the top duo started the big battle. Hail Mary on the outside seemed to get control over the leader and three wide Brother Bill (Breeders Crown winner as a 3-year-old) flew home for driver Magnus Djuse. Brother Bill's finish was strong, maybe too strong, because the Timo Nurmos trained trotter went off stride just 50 meters before the wire and at the same time Don Fanucci Zet came back on the inside.

The photo showed that Don Fanucci Zet held his nose ahead of a brave Hail Mary (replay here).

Normally, Hail Mary would be expected to go to Elitloppet after this performance. But Robert Bergh received a three-day whipping penalty for May 29-31. It would be a surprise if Bergh wants to race in the Elitloppet with one of his best horses ever if he can't drive the horse himself.

Don Fanucci Zet came home in a mile rate 1:57 over 1.3 miles.

\$1 million yearling Damien in Sweden

Speaking of Redén, Damien (Muscle Hill—Danae), purchased for \$1 million as a yearling at Lexington 2019, has left Marcus Melander's stable in New Egypt, NJ and has a new home in Redén's barn in Sweden for owner Brixton Medical AB.

Moni Viking to Elitloppet

Norwegian bred Moni Viking (Maharajah), now trained by Björn Goop, received an invitation for Elitloppet on Friday (May 14) afternoon. Six names remain before the field of 16 horses is set and the last chance to qualify for the race takes place in Gävle on Saturday (May 22) in the \$96,000 Prins Daniels lopp. The remaining five tickets for Elitloppet will be offered during next week.

Copenhagen Cup today

Today (May 16) is the \$98,000 Copenhagen Cup time in Denmark and it's obvious that Solvalla's sports general Anders Malmrot has his eyes focused on the track of Charlottenlund. Even if the race has diminished over the years, the Copenhagen Cup still is a prestigious race to win and an impressive performance in it will most certainly be interesting in the hunt for a new name for the Elitloppet.

The Copenhagen Cup, contested over 2,011 meters, features a 10-horse field where Johan Untersteiner's Cyber Lane chases his second win in the race.

Overtrick and me

The first part of this story can be read here.

Overtrick was a 2-year-old in 1962, and Johnny Patterson had been hired as the Buck's private trainer after John Chapman had gone out on his own after breaking Overtrick when he was still a yearling.

The first early 2-year-old stake that year was won by Majestic Hanover, a high-priced Adios yearling trained by Stanley Dancer. But Majestic Hanover's season was cut short by a cracked bone in his next start, and from then on it was all Overtrick. There weren't a lot of 2-year-old stakes in those days, but Overtrick won them all. His best performance came in his last start at Lexington. He made a break at the start, recovered, and then went on to circle the field and win comfortably. After the race, Patterson said, "I know Mr. and Mrs. Buck like those silver trophies, which is why I pushed my colt back into the race after that break. And it paid off."

Patterson, by the way, had a great sense of humor. Lyndon Johnson was the president during Overtrick's years, and he was known as LBJ. Leonard Buck's initials were LJB, which is how Patterson often referred to him.

While Overtrick was clinching his title as champion 2-year-old of 1962, another 2-year-old, Meadow Skipper, was finally eking out a 2:00 record in an overnight in California. In those days, the race meeting in the fall in California was *de rigueur* for the major stables. Their card was topped by a big 3-year-old pacing stake and a big purse, for its day, for free-for-allers.

Meadow Skipper at 2 was trained and driven by Delvin Miller for Hugh Grant, one of his major owners. It's worth mentioning again that Hugh Grant's generosity made a college education possible for many deserving young people whose parents could not afford their tuition fees. One of the most deserving was Ellen Harvey, the daughter of Harry Harvey, who managed Meadowlands Farm for Delvin. Also,

please forgive the repetition, but I'm proud to say again that Ellen is one of my most cherished friends, and one of the finest people I've been privileged to know.

In the spring of '64, Overtrick came out swinging, but he was suddenly faced with a serious rival in Meadow Skipper, who was a different and much more dangerous version of his two-year-old self.

That came about because of a change in ownership and trainer. During the '60s and the following decades, Norman Woolworth was one of the major players in our sport. He and his trainer, Earle Avery, were always on the lookout for a promising prospect that they felt had the potential for further development. Woolworth raced under the *nom de course* Clearview Stables, and he was a major competitor on the Grand Circuit. Every year he and Avery would buy one Adios yearling, which is how they got world champion Muncy Hanover, who finished 1-2-2 to Bullet Hanover in the Little Brown Jug.

Avery saw something he liked about Meadow Skipper, so Norman bought him just as the 3-year-old season was beginning. The price was reported to be \$82,000, and money was never better spent in the horse biz.

Avery made one change in Meadow Skipper's rigging, switching from leather hobbles to the new plastic ones. Now, Delvin Miller was a truly great horseman, and it's entirely possible that Meadow Skipper would have gone on to be equally successful for him. But Miller was also a seller, and at the time regarded the colt as expendable for such a high price as it was then.

In any case, Overtrick and Meadow Skipper waged some incredible battles as 3 year olds. Overtrick beat Meadow Skipper in the Little Brown Jug and the Messenger, while Skipper whipped him in the Cane. Interestingly enough, there was another colt who could go with both of these two. That was Country Don, who had been bred by Vernon Dancer, from his foundation mare, Miss Norah.

Country Don took a record at 3 of 1:57.4, and earned \$234,149, both more than respectable at the time. He also had the distinction of finishing in front of Overtrick on three separate occasions. He was owned in Canada, and the story was that when he changed hands at 2, his new owner counted out \$32,000 in cash on the hood of his car. As I recall, Ron Feagan trained and drove him, and he was a good third in both the Jug and the Messenger.

Overtrick came back at 4, but he made only a few starts because of lameness. Meadow Skipper also came back, and he held his own both at 4 and 5 against a tough bunch of

free-for-all pacers. By then, Norman and David Johnston had bought Stone Creek, which had been a celebrated thoroughbred farm under the ownership of John Hertz, of Hertz Rental Cars. Hertz won two Kentucky Derbies with Reigh Count and then his son, Count Fleet, who was supposedly galloped into championship form along the Stoner creek.

Meadow Skipper was retired to the stud at Stoner Creek as a 6-year-old, where he attracted little notice from outside breeders. To show how prescient this kid was, Norman told me that he was syndicating Skipper, and I could have a share with the proviso that I could pay for it whenever I felt like it. I was smart enough to politely turn him down. Very smart, indeed.

But as we say in the detective trade, back to the Overtrick caper. Mrs. Buck sat quietly on Overtrick through the rest of '64 until the Red Mile fall meeting. There she announced that Overtrick was for sale for \$400,000.

There were no immediate takers, although there was one very disgruntled breeder in the form of Lawrence Sheppard. Shep was under the impression that Overtrick would be standing at Hanover under a lease, as so many other top horses had, with no money changing hands. At that point, he thought Mrs. Buck would soon come to her senses and Overtrick would be arriving at the Shoe Farms any day now.

Instead, Mrs. Buck sent out a telegram to whom she considered major breeders in the business, telling them that Overtrick was for sale at the newly-enriched price of \$450,000.

In point of fact, Mrs. Buck couldn't come up with 10 names she considered to be the top dogs, so to fill out her list, she included me.

I was gobsmacked when my telegram arrived. While I found it immensely flattering, it had no actual significance. My chances of coming up with that amount of money were only slightly better than the odds for me being tapped for the forthcoming mission to the moon. Actually, the odds were probably even.

Norman Woolworth also got Mrs. Buck's telegram. In those days we were close. I had stood Muncy Hanover for him at Lana Lobell, although unfortunately we lost him to colic after he sired only one crop.

He called me, and said: "Why don't you syndicate Overtrick? I think you could do it."

"I don't know anything about syndicating," I said, "And besides, nobody knows who I am."

"Well," Woolworth said, "Mrs. Buck knew who you are. That's

a good start."

Woolworth not only encouraged me over the phone, he told me to meet him in the lobby of The Metropolitan Opera House at 7:30 that evening, where he'd give me copies of the syndicate agreements for Trader Horn and Demon Hanover. As I recall, Traviata was the opera playing that night.

Working from those agreements I cobbled together the Overtrick syndicate agreement. Fortunately Delvin Miller heard what I was trying to do, and he gave me invaluable help. That was the first time, but not the last, when that great man came to my rescue out of the goodness of his heart, and my debt to him is still as strong as it ever was, only now it's to his memory.

Between Woolworth and Miller, I put together an Overtrick syndicate, and the horse took off. I set his fee at \$2,000, and it turned out to be irresistible to a lot of mare owners. In a matter of weeks, Overtrick was overbooked, and suddenly I was someone in the horse breeding business, with the hot pacing stallion, and for better or worse, that's where I've been ever since.







EquineX making its Mohawk Million slots available to those that register

An independent panel will select the best colt and filly to use the slots in the \$1 million race from a list of horses registered with the company.

Paul Simmonds said there's two main reasons EquineX is spending \$200,000 (Cdn) to buy two slots to this year's \$1 million Mohawk Million. First, the standardbred owner and chairman of EquineX wants to support the concept of a major buy-in race. Second, he sees it as an opportunity to promote EquineX by making the slots available to those that register with the company.

"We bought two slots and we've designated one slot for colts and one slot for fillies. Basically, anybody that registers – and it's \$400 (U.S.) to register – they have an opportunity to use one of our two slots," Simmonds said. "What you get for that is you get registered to use that slot if your horse is chosen. In addition to that, we're giving 20 complimentary months to the (EquineX) trainer/owner app. Basically, you're paying \$400 for a right to use the colt slot or the filly slot.

"Once we have those horses registered, starting in July, every week we'll list the top 25 colt earners and top 25 filly earners that are registered in our promotion. Obviously, if you're not registered, you're not included in that list... Then, on September 17, (a three-person) selection committee will choose from the list of 25 fillies and 25 colts. They'll choose the ones that they think best represents the best opportunity to win the race. They'll end up being the candidates and there will also be an also-eligible for both colts and fillies, because that's written in the rules of the Mohawk Million that each slot owner can pick an also-eligible in case a horse in unable to race... In the event that the colt that was chosen was also the winner of the William Wellwood Memorial, then that horse gets a bye because of that win, so then we'd pick another horse from the colt slot.

"Then, after the post-race draw, we're going to pick 25 names of registered horses that weren't selected to be the candidate and each one of them is going to receive \$500, sort of a consolation."

The advantage is that it gives many more people a shot at a slot in the race at a less expensive entry point.

The deadline to enter is June 7. Full rules and details of how EquineX is administering the slots can be found on its website here.

This year, the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) made nine slots available for purchase at the cost of \$100,000 (CDN) each. The deadline to purchase a slot was reached on Feb. 15 with all slots sold. The 10th and final slot will be awarded to the winner of the William Wellwood Memorial on Sept. 11. Each slot is considered an entity that may be sold, traded or leased. The slot holder does not have to declare a horse for the Mohawk Million until the week of the race.

The second annual edition of the million-dollar race for 2-year-old trotters is set for Sept. 25 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The race debuted in 2020 with Venerate winning for trainer Julie Miller (full story here) en route to the Dan Patch Award as the 2-year-old Trotting Colt of the Year in the United States.

EquineX is the third party that owns two slots for the 2021 race. Ontario-based trainer Gino Toscani and Montreal-based Determination Stable also each hold two slots. As well, Brad Grant, Crawford Farms and Steve Heimbecker purchased a slot apiece (full story here). Grant also purchased a slot in 2020 and was the one that negotiated a deal with the connections of Venerate to use it.

FRACTIONAL OWNERSHIP

Next week, EquineX will also launch a fractional ownership initiative, Simmonds said.

"Initially, we have five horses that we're featuring, three standardbreds. Two of them are 2-year-olds, one is with Chris Beaver and that's a Muscle Hill filly and one is with Nancy Takter, a Father Patrick colt. One is an aged trotting mare with Chris Beaver," Simmonds said. "Then we have two really beautiful thoroughbred fillies that we're featuring. They are 2-year-olds and both of them are with Phil Antonacci, being overseen by Jimmy Takter."

EquineX, featured previously in HRU here and here, is an app-based system that aims to use transparency to increase accountability and integrity in the sport by creating secure, detailed records for every horse placed on the platform.

"We've got a number of new products coming out this summer and fall and we really think this industry needs — not just standardbreds, but in thoroughbreds—to pay attention to the whole integrity issue, especially in view of what's happened with (thoroughbred trainer) Bob Baffert," Simmonds said. "Had his horse (Medina Spirit) been on our platform, you would've known exactly what that horse had been treated with in the timeframe that it was treated. It would also have been an issue in that Propulsion case, too. That would've been recorded and it would've been right there in black and white when it happened. That's what this industry needs, especially, as you know, from one jurisdiction to the next these rules are pretty complicated. You've got to know what's going on. If you're in Ohio and racing in Kentucky or racing in Indiana, you've got to know the rules there as well as your own state."

Manchego scores impressively in seasonal debut, wins Cutler Memorial in 1:51.1

Manchego made an auspicious start to her 6-year-old pari-mutuel season on Saturday night (May 15) at The Meadowlands, winning the \$141,250 Arthur Cutler Memorial by a nose over Majestic Player A in 1:51.1 from the nine hole.

The victory pushed the daughter of Muscle Hill—Secret Magic to \$2,793,806 in career earnings and improved her career record to 34-6-10 in 57 starts.

With Dexter Dunn at the controls, Manchego was fifth through the opening quarter, third by the half and second through the three-quarter pole as Guardian Angel As and Tim Tetrick cut the mile through fractions of :26.3, :54.4 and 1:23.2 before being passed by Majestic Player A (Yannick Gingras) and Manchego in the lane. Guardian Angel AS held on for third. Hambletonian winner (2019) Forbidden Trade (Bob McClure) and Reign Of Honor grabbed the final two checks, respectively.

Manchego, the reigning Dan Patch winner as the 2020 Older Trotting Mare of the Year, is trained by Nancy Takter for owner Barry Guariglia's Black Horse Racing of Lebanon, NJ.

Poseidon Seelster, Ruthless Hanover win Graduate legs

In the first of two \$50,000 second-leg Graduate divisions for 4-year-old open pacers, 14-1 **Poseidon Seelster** (Sunshine Beach—Porsche Seelster) nosed out favored Warrawee Vital in a career best 1:47.4.

George Brennan drove Poseidon Seelster to victory for trainer Nik Drennan owned by Don Lindsey, Paul Kleinpaster and Garth Bechtel of Ontario and Will Alempijevic of New York.

Warrawee Vital and Tim Tetrick cut the mile through fractions of :26.2, :53.4 and 1:21 before Poseidon Seelster cruised home in :26.1 to eke out the victory by a nose hair. Tattoo Artist (David Miller) was third, followed by Captain Barbossa (Joe Bongiorno) and No Lou Zing (Dexter Dunn).

The victory pushed Poseidon Seelster over \$150,000 in career earnings (to exactly \$154,757) and was his third victory in five 2021 starts.

In the second Graduate leg, **Ruthless Hanover** (Somebeachsomewhere—Rockaroundthetrack) posted a career-best 1:48 victory from the eight hole for driver Andrew McCarthy and trainer Tom Cancelliere to remain perfect after two 2021 starts, the first also coming in Graduate action.

McCarthy put Ruthless Hanover in command just before the :53.4 half and didn't look back, winning by one length over Save A Dance For Me (James MacDonald). Chief Mate (Scott Zeron) finished a close third.

The victory pushed Ruthless Hanover over \$100,000 in career earnings (to \$116,875) for owner John Cancelliere.

The procrastinator

I sighed. "Well, it didn't happen again."

My friend clicked his seatbelt and asked, "What didn't happen?"

"Not a single breeding farm or stallion owner contacted me to breed my mare to their stallion."

He smiled. "Are you offended?"

I slipped the Lexus into drive and said, "Nah, I'm rarely offended, but often exasperated. *Trey Incorporated* may be a small outfit with just one or two products each year, but someone missed a few bucks. A simple phone call, a text, an email, even a letter would have made a sale."

"How would they know that *Trey Incorporated* has a broodmare open for business?"

I tsked. "They could research who owns broodmares in their state. Stallion owners I booked with in the past know I'm a last-minute booker. They can figure who might have a May or June birth. They can research which mares foaled and when they foaled last year, and in what states the mare owners have a history. You can do a lot with computers and filters instead of just waiting for customers."

"Why do you wait until the last minute to book your mare? Normal people sign a contract early."

"The question is, why do people book early? Of course, I'm not normal, but I always wait for everything. Say you send me an invitation to a Fourth of July party, Trey will not commit, nor does Trey enjoy being asked to commit."

"Why not?"

"Because your party is a long way away. Who knows if I get another invitation between now and the Fourth of July. Maybe a supermodel calls me on July 1 and asks me to accompany her to Monaco. It's about keeping options open. I never book a cruise in advance or buy a new car until mine breaks down. Trey puts the pro in procrastination."

"That puts you under a lot of pressure."

"No, it doesn't. For me, a looming commitment is a pressure. In stallion selection, it's not like there is a shortage of semen. The day after my mare foals, I can call and book any stallion I want."

He shook his finger at me as he said, "Not any stallion. Some will be full and closed."

"I have suspicions that the full book concept is a bit of a gambit based on the *I gotta have it psychology, I gotta be in the inner circle*, or the *If I don't act now, I'll get shutout*. The same marketing pressure probably applies in the netherworld of buying stallion shares and brokers. That stuff doesn't play into my mindset. My thinking is very primitive — there are plenty of good stallions out there. The connections of some decent stallion will welcome my contract at any point. I am not, nor do I need to be, in the clique."

He said, "Commercially, you may not be thinking clearly."

"Look, I know that procrastinators like me are a small, crappy corner of a small market, but it amazes me that in a dozen years of owning a broodmare or two, nobody ever knocked on my door."

"And you don't knock on their doors until the last minute."

I smiled. "This breeding booking dance has turned into a yearly stalemate. Farms wait and do nothing. I wait and do nothing. The waiting doesn't bother me. I enjoy letting the winds of fate blow. I always stumble into a sire for my mare."

I was getting a little fired up. "I also don't understand why every stallion owner doesn't wheel and deal when they have open seats as the breeding clock ticks down to June."

"Maybe people in this marketplace prefer a little stability, not a mad rush at the last minute."

"On the other hand, some of us enjoy the excitement of Christmas shopping on December 24 when stores are buzzing with fellow last-minute shoppers. We may overpay or underpay for grandma's scarf, but it's more fun than ordering from Amazon in November. Besides, every day we wait to make a decision, we are a little older and wiser."

"Breeding your horse involves a lot more money than grandma's scarf and should require more research and analysis."

"It's not like I'm pulling stallion possibilities out of a hat. I have three or four sires in mind. And I'm not scraping for a deal. Sometimes I pay full freight, sometimes not. The seller makes the call on any offer, no hard feelings on my part. However, I must admit it confuses me why stallion connections refuse someone willing to pay less for a Hail

Mary breeding. Money in a stallion owner's pocket and a potential champion in the belly of my mare is better than nothing."

He shook his head. "Dealing like that might be frowned upon if word gets out. Early bookers at a full price might be offended or want a rebate. Marketing along these lines could cause chaos. Side deals like that could hurt the brand."

"Hurt the brand.? Horse semen is a weird commodity. The business of breeding horses is like a lottery masquerading as a business. In my opinion, every stallion breeding deal should be a private transaction. There should not even be stallion fees."

"No stallion fees? Now you're getting crazy," he said.

"It's not crazy. I find it annoying when a seller slaps a price on something and says to me, take it or leave it. A stallion breeding should be more like a Suggested Retail Price. There are too many variables that should make a difference in the breeding market. Factors such as the time in the breeding season, the quality of the mare, the number of breedings purchased in bulk, the quality of the Stakes Racing programs, etc."

He interrupted my babbling, "Whoa, whoa, slow down, pal."

I chuckled. "Yeah, I do get wound up. Once a therapist told me that my life could be negatively affected by my chronic procrastination. He said he could help me if I signed up for therapy."

"And?"

"I'll get back to him... one of these days."





Lindy flexes Muscle in NJSS at Big M

Lindysmusclemania threw his hat into the ring as a major Hambletonian player Friday night (May 14) at The Meadowlands, taking one of three \$25,000 divisions of the first leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings in a sparkling 1:51.4.

The Ake Svanstedt trainee, a son of Muscle Hill—Possessed By Lindy, displayed a big brush to assume command at the half, then rated the third fraction in :28.2 before trotting a final quarter in :26.4 to lower his previous lifetime best by one-and-three-fifth seconds, set two weeks ago in a blowout qualifier. Really Fast was $2\frac{3}{4}$ lengths back in second with Bee Forever third.

"There was a lot of hype about him after his qualifier," said winning driver Dexter Dunn, who sat behind the horse for the first time. "I'm obviously impressed. I settled in early and made a move down the back. It was like driving a car when I asked him to go. I then asked him to stretch out a bit in the stretch and the rest of the way was just a ride for me."

Lindysmusclemania returned \$3.00 as the 1-2 favorite.

In the first division for male horses, **Cuatro De Julio** (Trixton—Clarabelle) cleared the top at the three-eighths and powered down the road from there to score by an easy length in 1:53.1 for trainer Marie Ortolan Bar and driver Lucas Wallin as the 2-5 public choice. Mon Amour was second with Locatelli third.

Svanstedt earned a training triple – and driving double – after his Narzario pulled off a 19-1 upset in the third division for colts and geldings in 1:53. The gelded son of Trixton—Gerri's Joy emerged from a loose pocket late to rally and finish a neck in front of a resilient Kildare King, who just missed in a bid to go wire-to-wire. After 6-5 favorite Take This Society was disqualified for interference, Cricket Fashion was placed third in the official order of finish.

With his loaded barn on display, earlier on the card Svanstedt sent out a winner in the first of two \$25,000 NJSS divisions for trotting fillies as his **Wet My Whistle** sat a pocket to 6-5 public choice Eazy Pass before closing along the inside to record a nose win in 1:53.1 as the 5-2 second choice. Svanstedt drove the daughter of Muscle Hill—Slightly Tipsy.

The Ron Burke-trained **Hot As Hill** took the second division for fillies in 1:53 by a length as the 9-5 favorite. Dave Miller moved the Muscle Hill—Smarty Pants miss off the rail before the half and made the top on the far turn before going on to an easy score over a fast-closing Awesome Trix.

EARLY BIRDS: Prior to the wagering card, a pair of non-bettors for New Jersey Sire Stakes 3-year-olds on the pace were contested. Each had a purse of \$20,000.

In the two-horse division for fillies, **Anna Jeans** led at every call to defeat Neverendingproject by 3¼ lengths. The daughter of Great Vintage—Early Go Hanover, who is trained by John Urbanski and was driven by Jason Thompson, stopped the clock in 2:01.1.

Fika Time went wire-to-wire in the three-horse split for colts and geldings, hitting the wire 3¼ lengths in front of Neyreit. Beda Too Quik was third. A gelded son of Sunfire Blue Chip-Raiders Favorite, the Chase Vandervort trainee finished the mile in 1:53.2 with Tim Tetrick in the sulky.

A LITTLE MORE: The 20-cent Pick-6 pool, fueled by a \$14,686 carryover, took in total action of \$65,858, and those who correctly selected all six winners walked away with \$8,761... A shrewd player betting into the Ontario hub held the only winning ticket in the 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 and cashed in for \$13,368... All-source wagering totaled \$3,485,163, the 13th consecutive program to see betting exceed the \$3-million mark.

Hambletonian hopeful In Range kicks off campaign with PASS win

In Range was one of the top male freshman trotters last year, and the Hambletonian eligible was looking to kick off a huge sophomore campaign in Saturday's (May 15) \$150,507 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows. But midway down the backside, he was passed by local favorite Jujubee. How would he respond?

Quite nicely, thank you. In Range overtook Jujubee in mid-stretch and scored in 1:52.3, matching the stake record

established by Valley Of Sin in 2013.

The stake, known as the Hickory Smoke, was contested over three divisions, with Whiskey Blu and Johan Palema taking the other splits.

Marcus Melander, who trains In Range for AMG Stable, Kenneth Kjellgren, Tomas Ansell and Rick Wahlstedt, said he wasn't overly concerned when the son of Bar Hopping—Ilia yielded the lead to the local upstart.

"That horse came at him very fast, and In Range is a very laid-back horse," Melander said. "Last year, he sometimes looked at butterflies, but he came back more mature this year. He has a lot of class, and he passed in the stretch pretty easy. We'll keep him in Pennsylvania until the Hambletonian."

The game Jujubee held second, beaten 3/4 lengths, with Lepanto third. In Range boosted his career bankroll to \$436,087

Speaking of local upstarts, Whiskey Blu and Jujubee had taken turns winning late-closing series at The Meadows, and Whiskey Blu also was facing what regular driver Dan Charlino considered his toughest test yet. He aced it.

"I absolutely think he's competitive with these," Charlino said. "He hasn't run his best race yet. He likes the front, but I'm sure he'll sit in the pocket if they go along a little bit. He's come a long way, and we're very proud of him."

In the Hickory Smoke, Charlino gunned the Southwind Frank—Kendall Blue gelding to the point from post 5, where he held off the pocket-sitting Capstone by a neck in a career-best 1:53.4. Mister Boinga completed the ticket. Ron Burke conditions Whiskey Blue, who has won nine of 11 career starts and never has finished out of the money, for Burke Racing Stable, Kitefield Stable and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

Johan Palema was winless in six outings last year, but he was competitive in big races, leading trainer Ake Svanstedt to believe he would come back strong this year — with an adjustment in racing style.

"Last year he was on the front too often, and I think he got tired mentally," said Svanstedt, the colt's pilot Saturday. "I think we'll race him from behind this year."

Svanstedt's insight was right on, as the son of Bar Hopping—Sobti Hanover followed the live cover of Arnold N Dicky and roared past in the stretch to break his maiden in 1:53.2. Arnold N Dicky was second by 2 lengths while Take All Comers earned show. Bender Sweden Inc. campaigns

\$60,000 PA Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Colts & Geldings

The three splits in Saturday's sub-feature went to Sunny Crockett, The Irishman and Ginger Tree Knox.

Sunny Crockett banked more than \$110,000 at 2 and might have been looking to graduate to sires stakes this year. But driver Andy Miller, who piloted the son of Father Patrick—Moonlight In Miami for trainer Julie Miller and owners Willow Oak Ranch and Andy Miller Stable, said the horse is most comfortable in the stallion series.

"He's just a notch below the sires stakes, but he's pretty good in the stallion series," Andy said. "Unless he really steps up, that's where he'll race. He's very handy. He goes about his business and does his job."

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Wednesday when the program features a \$1,783.25 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5.

Prewitt does incredible job at The Pomp

It's true, The Pomp fills a void where bettors are looking for value and action on off-peak nights, but Sturman's article (full story here) understates the incredible job that track announcer Gabe Prewitt has done in progressively building a social media following. He has created an online community that constantly communicates throughout each night's card, and Gabe makes himself so accessible to that entire crowd. His program picks have a very high success rate, he's knowledgable about the sport and has a keen eye for every element of the races, and communicates with the bettors as if he's one of us—whether it's joining the "Send It In Army" in lamenting a bad drive, explaining that the camera angle favors the outside horse in photo finishes, or just answering every message with patience, empathy, and light-hearted humor, he makes you feel like you're part of a group.

That experience is more fun than simply going through the motions of betting your other preferred tracks. Being a horseplayer can be a lonely pursuit, and Gabe has instead turned every night into a party. Players across the country share in each other's successes and failures, discuss picks, and crack jokes throughout the card. Once Gabe grew the handle substantially through this grassroots effort, other players took note of the larger pools and sizable carryovers, and it has ballooned from there. Each meet has been more successful than the one before since he arrived, and now you've seen 21 nights where the handle exceeded \$1 million at a previously-discounted third-tier track where the plan for several years has been to eliminate racing in favor of Jai Alai. To the point where Caesar's Entertainment purchased the track and casino, and made Gabe the director of racing for all of their horse racing operations. It's truly an amazing success story in an embattled sport.
