A conversation with John Campbell, the man many consider the GOAT

How Campbell went from rural Ontario to the top of the driving world and is now the head of one of the world's great harness racing institutions, the Hambletonian Society.

I'm guessing that I would get very little argument in saying that John Campbell is the greatest harness driver of all time.

It would certainly be no surprise that becoming a driver was the road that he followed. Campbell is a third generation horseman. His harness racing background began with his paternal grandfather Duncan and then John's dad, Jack.

But John was somewhat different than his forebearers. They were all farmers first and became involved in harness racing second. Farming never interested John Duncan Campbell.

Like many Canadian youngsters, he played hockey and wanted to play in the NHL but quickly realized that he was too small and not nearly good enough to pursue a career on the ice. He was a really good hockey player in his town, but it was a really small town. He had also always wanted to become a harness driver. He began working around horses with his grandfather and father when he was only six years old. Looking forward, his destiny was to become a horseman.

Jack Campbell had a farm outside the small town of Ailsa Craig a few miles northwest of London, ON. John began racing at nearby **Dave Landry John Campbell** president and **CEO** of the Hambletonian

Harness Racing Update

Western Fair Raceway in London. Moderate success came early, but domination as a driver was some time in the making.

This scribe caught up with the quadruple Hall of Famer as he was driving to Grand River Raceway in Elora, ON to be at the celebration of life for two great lives well spent — Keith and Eileen Waples. Keith was someone John had read about and followed as a young man and later became a good friend.

Q: You are taking the long drive from your home in New Jersey to Elora to participate in the celebration of life for Keith Waples. What did Keith Waples mean to you?

"My family and the Waples family raced against each other going back to the 1940s. I raced against Keith when I started, but I missed the era when he was in his prime. When I was a very young kid, he had reached iconic status throughout Canada. Keith was a man who led by example. He could be a man of few words. He was also possessed of a keen wit and a great mind. He was a gentleman in just about every way possible,

both on and off the racetrack. You could have asked just about everybody that raced against or watched him from a distance, with few or no exceptions they would likely say that he could drive a horse as well as anyone and better than most. I'm a firm believer that the true greats of any sport are trans generational. There is no doubt in my mind that Keith and other great drivers of the past were talented enough and would adapt to the times and figured out what horses are capable of. They would have been successful in any era."

Q: Please take us through your driving career.

"I began racing in London driving horses for my father grandfather and Uncle Ray. I did okay, but was far from being a natural or any kind of standout. I raced at London and at many of the of the "B" tracks in Ontario. I then moved up to Windsor, the Ontario Jockey Club, a summer at Monticello followed by a couple of years at the Detroit tracks. All of these tracks were a huge part of a continuing education for me. My stable grew somewhat, both in size and quality. Windsor had a great drivers' colony. We had Bill Gale, Greg Wright, Ray Remmen, Shelly Goudreau, Ken Hardy and lots more. I held my own, but I never won a driving title during that time. When The Meadowlands opened, Joe DeFrank persuaded many of those racing at Windsor to come to New Jersey with him. I asked him about coming the second year, January of 1978, and he assured me he would give me stalls I did okay with my stable the first year but the following year is when everything kind of exploded for me and I certainly unexpectedly won the driving title."

Q: You mentioned that you had been driving for almost a decade before you began driving in stakes races.

"The first Grand Circuit race I won was at Wolverine in a Matron Stake. Jim Miller was married to my wife Paula's sister at the time. He had an entry in a \$50,000 stakes race at Wolverine. He put me up and I won. That was a big deal to me at the time. I did not start getting many opportunities in stakes until 1980. It kind of grew from there. I trained a stable and it actually grew to around 45 horses at one time. But I was so busy catch driving that I decided to cut back and by the end of 1985 I gave the remaining horses to my brother Jim."

Q: Your brother Jim had been working with you at the time?

"Jim came to work for me when he was 17 and worked for me for four or five years. He ran a division we had in Roosevelt for a time and also spent a year in Florida. When I cut back my stable, he decided to take a job with Glen Garnsey, who at the time had one of the top Grand Circuit stables. I believe that it was one of the wisest moves he ever made. After working for Glen, he went out on his own and has had a tremendous career that is still ongoing."

Q: Have you ever regretted giving up your own stable?

"Not in the slightest. I was doing more of what I loved doing most — driving horses. Not only horses, but great Grand Circuit types. In retrospect, it was one of the easiest decisions I had to make. It also allowed me to work less and to earn more (chuckles)."

Q: What led you to your current position as president of the Hambletonian Society?

"I think the opportunity came along at the right time for me. 1. I was getting older and not getting as many opportunities and that was going to keep diminishing. I was still quite competitive and still driving in most of our major stakes, but I said to Paula I would rather leave a year too early than a year too late.

- "2. I was leaving in fairly good shape physically. I had been in more than my share of accidents. I've found that older bones take more time to heal than young ones do.
- "3. The position was available. Tom Charters was retiring .I had been a long-time Society board member. I talked about it with Paula and my daughters and decided it might be a good fit for me. I researched what would be expected of me and talked with various board members. I took the position."



Q: Just think of your achievements. First driver to drive the winners of \$100 million, \$200 million and \$300 million. You are a four-time Hall of Famer — the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen (at 35, the youngest inductee ever); Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame; Canadian Sports Hall of Fame and the London Sports Hall of Fame. You have won over 600 stakes events, including 100-plus of our most important races; what this scribe would consider to be Classics races. They include 42 Breeders Crowns, six Hambletonians, six North America Cups, three Little Brown Jugs, eight Adios', eight Messengers, a total of 31 Triple Crown events and Sweden's most prestigious race, the Elitlopp. What allowed you to accomplish all that you have?

"I think it came down to doing what I loved plus opportunity, preparation, ability and maybe most of all great timing. I was lucky enough to be at my best in the golden years of The Meadowlands. A big part of my success came at The Meadowlands. I got the opportunity to drive great horses there. The success I garnered at The Meadowlands found its way to other tracks and I was put down as a driver of some of the best horses racing all over North America. Once again, success led to more success."

Q: You've driven against the best drivers in the last half century or so. How would you rank them?

"Everyone has their favorites and an opinion It is very subjective. I can't and I won't answer that. I will say that there have been many top drivers who would be great in any era. I will say this

though, I believe the pool of talented drivers is greater today than at any time in the history of the sport. You can go to just about any North American track and find drivers, especially young drivers with loads of talent. Many of these drivers just need the right opportunity to come along and they will be nationally recognized."



Q: Let's talk about trainers for whom you've driven.

"I won't rank them, but I will say a few words about some of the most prominent ones who gave me the opportunity to drive for them. Two things I will say about all of them. It goes without saying that they are or were great horsemen. I wouldn't have picked them out if they were not. They are all great human beings, people who I was proud to call my friends, either on or off the racetrack.

"Chuck Sylvester — Chuck is amazing in that he didn't come from a harness racing background. He is very much a self-made man. He learned by himself, mostly through trial and error. He is now 80, and looking for another champion. He isn't afraid to try something new. He isn't married to any methods either in general terms or when dealing with individual horses.

"Bob McIntosh — A truly great horseman in multiple areas and was very loyal to me as a driver right to the end. He is one of the minority who have stood up to Father Time and held his own.

"Jim Campbell — He is my brother of course. But he is also a great horseman. Jim is another who has been successful through several decades. Rare is the year, if ever, that he doesn't have a few good horses in his stable.


"Stanley Dancer — One of the all-time greats. He never gave me any advice going into a race. I never felt any pressure when driving for him. He knew about driving and was always the same after a race no matter success or disaster."

"Billy Haughton — What can I say about Billy that hasn't been said by many others? He's another from who I never felt any pressure driving. He was a tremendous horseman driver and person and so much fun to be around.

"Bruce Nickells — Another person I have so much respect for and is fun to be around. We had tremendous success together. He is a great horseman very innovative not afraid to try new things. He thinks he is still young."

Q: Which is the best horse you've ever driven?

"Without a doubt it would be Mack Lobell. Just look at his accomplishments. At 2, he was a world champion, two-year-old trotter of the year and finished the year in winning the Breeders Crown. At three, he was three year old trotter of the year, he won everything that was worth winning and finished the year winning the Breeders Crown. Then as an older horse, he raced mostly in Europe, competed against the best and won the Elitlopp as a 4-year-old, still the only 4-year-old to do that and then at 6 he won it again."



O: How about pacers?

"It's not as clear cut there as it is with trotters. Artsplace comes to mind quickly. His world record performance in winning the Breeders Crown at 2 was just awesome. Then his undefeated record at 4 was equally impressive. Real Desire would probably be close."

Q: Let's get back to your position at the Hambletonian Society. The Society has been in favor of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority and publicly stated so.

"It's a somewhat complex situation. Ultimately, harness racing will be in an enviable position. HISA will be in place this summer with only the thoroughbreds being governed by it and its rules. It will probably take some time to iron out the kinks. In the meanwhile, we will be able to watch and observe. The commissions will eventually want to opt in the other racing breeds, harness and quarter into HISA and our industry will have representation before the HISA authority. The rules and regulations only apply to thoroughbreds as of now A standardbred version of these rules and regs will have to be proposed to the HISA authority based on a myriad of issues in all of horse racing. I think our industry should be embracing change."

Q: You are a great family man. Please tell us about them.

"Paula and I have three adult daughters — Lisa, Michelle and Brittany. Between the girls they have a total of six kids. Lisa and Jeff have Emma, 18, and an incoming freshman at Syracuse this fall and Camden, 15 and Colten, 12; Michelle has twin 5-year-old girls — Lolly and Stella; Our youngest, Brittany and her husband Matt just had a baby, Lola, last week."

Q: What does John Campbell do for fun aside from his duties at the Hambletonian Society?

"I guess you might say that I am addicted to golf. I love the game and try to play two and often three times a week. I am not as good as I used to be. I've got an eight handicap at our course but like every golfer I think the next round is going to be special. I also follow sports fairly closely, especially hockey and baseball."



Campbell not tempted to drive, but he wouldn't miss Legends Day for the world

The 11th edition of the event — site of his retirement race five years ago — is on tap for June 12 at Clinton Raceway.

Asked if he was tempted to come out of retirement to drive one more time on June 12 at Clinton Raceway's Legends Day, Hall of Famer John Campbell gave a typical all-class Campbell answer.

"No, I'm really not. I thought it was a perfect exit for me leaving it at Legends Day before and I'm content to leave it at that," Campbell said.

Campbell, 67, a native of Ailsa Craig, ON, drove for the final time in his stellar career at the 2017 edition of Legends Day at the small, yet-magical, rural Ontario track not far from where he

grew up. Campbell retired from the sport with career earnings of \$299 million, making him the richest driver in harness racing history. His retirement at Clinton Raceway was a magical ending to a remarkable career. Campbell said he doesn't want to spoil that by returning to the bike for this year's event.

"I made that commitment that that was my last drive at the time and I intend to honor it for everybody that was there that day," Campbell said.

The good news is Campbell — who has been present at all 10 previous editions of Legends Day — will be making the journey from his home in New Jersey for the 11th Legends Day to sign autographs and rekindle old friendships — just as he did for the 2019 edition.

"It's always a great day for me and it always has been since the first one. It's just a chance to go back and see so many people... there's a certain segment of people and that's the only time I see them is on Legends Day – people I grew up with and started out racing with, people I knew when I was young. It's really an enjoyable experience for me. It's kind of a homecoming deal for me. I can't stress enough how much fun I've had over the years at Legends Day," he said.


Legends Day honours some of the greatest drivers in the sport's history. All have been inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Those participating in this year's edition have collectively earned nearly 1.2 billion — yup, that's billion with a b — in their racing careers.

This year, Doug Brown, Steve Condren, Wally Hennessey, Trevor Ritchie, Ron Waples and freshly-minted Canadian Hall of Famers Paul MacDonell and Randy Waples — who will both be officially inducted in August — will contest the \$15,000 Legends Day Trot. It is the first Legends Day for MacDonell and Randy Waples.

Campbell, Bill O'Donnell and Dave Wall will also be there to sign autographs.

The legends' legend, Keith Waples, will be sadly missed. Waples died a year ago at the age of 97.

"It is (sad), just because he's been such a part of Canadian racing and the history of Canadian racing," Campbell said. "Everybody that ever raced horses in Canada knows about Keith Waples and it's just that simple. I did make the trip up (to Grand River

Raceway) for his Celebration of Life and I was really glad I did. It was a great function and it was a celebration of life. I was just honored to be part of it."

Campbell said he's happy Randy Waples, the son of Keith's cousin, Ron Waples, will be at Legends Day for the first time to extend the family's immense harness racing legacy.

"It's always an evolution. Randy is another Waples and it goes to show how much the Waples name means in racing," Campbell said.

As for what makes Legends Day special, Campbell said it's two things.

"The first thing is the interaction – both ways – between the fans and the legends. It's a unique dynamic... that synergy between the legends and the fans, both ways, it's really special. The other thing is just (Clinton Raceway GM and Hall of Famer) Ian (Fleming) tweaking it and keeping it fresh and coming up with the concept in the first place."

This year, there will be an online auction from June 5-9 at www. clintonraceway.com. On Legends Day itself, there will be a silent auction, autographs with the Legends from 2-3 p.m., the Legends Day Trot will hit the track at 4 p.m. and a chicken barbeque will follow the races. All the food has been donated and all sales will, again, go to the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation.

Previous editions of Legends Day have raised more than \$260,000 for the foundation. In 2019, Legends Day raised \$50,000.

Then, the COVID-19 pandemic forced a one-year delay to the, normally, biennial event.

"I'm just like everybody else, I'm so happy that we can be together and we're travelling again. COVID hasn't left us, so we just have to learn to live with it and... I think everyone is just ready to move on with their lives. We have to deal with COVID, but it's not going to hinder us," Campbell said.

To Sweden, with apologies

An article about Jujubee caught my eye, and I compulsively ran off his five-generation pedigree. For starters, he's by Creatine and out of La Cantera, by Cantab Hall. He was made and driven in his first starts at 2 by Greg Wright, Jr. Wright is a top horseman, well known for developing outstanding young horses, a goodly number of which he then sold and watched them go on winning for their new connections.

Jujubee had a light campaign in overnights at 2, then came back last year at 3 to absolutely devastate his division, winning everything including the Kentucky Futurity and the Breeders Crown. Hambletonian week, to which he was ineligible, he won the \$50,000 Muscle Hill stake at the Meadowlands in 1:49.4.

By comparison, Captain Corey, a great colt himself, went in 1:51 winning the Hambletonian. And I have to point out that Captain Corey was started on his way to championship form when he was driven to a well-rated second in his first lifetime start by Sarah Svanstedt, aka Mrs. Ake Svanstedt. I'm sure I'm not alone in saying that if Mrs. S. offered to sell me a bridge, I'd only ask how much is the down payment?

But back to Jujubee, whose name, it turns out, is originally the name of a famous drag queen. How it became the name of a standardbred horse is a little beyond me. Like they still say, in certain circles, Go Figure.

Jujubee is line-bred, 3 by 4, to Garland Lobell, and also line-bred, 4 by 4, to Valley Victory. As a quick refresher, if the sum of the generations in which the same name appears is six or less, the horse so bred is said to be In-Bred to that ancestor.

If the sum of the generations in which the same name appears is seven or eight, a horse so bred is accurately described as Line-Bred to that ancestor.

If no horse's name appears in less than a total of nine, a horse so bred is described as an Out-Cross.

Here, a personal reminiscence about the great sire, Garland Lobell. When I was operating Lana Lobell Farms, Jim Harrison was my general manager.

Right before the annual Harrisburg Sale in 1971, he pointed out that Hanover had just bailed on Ayres as a sire, selling him to darkest Italy. But two years before they had bred him to some nice mares, and their yearling fillies were being sold that year at Harrisburg.

There was certainly no knock on Ayres as a broodmare sire, but the fact that the Shoe Farms had just sold him overseas took all the glow off his yearling fillies.

Jim and I bought five Ayers fillies in one session. The most we gave was \$9,700, for Genya Hanover.

Now it's a few years later, and I get a call from a smooth talking trainer from Illinois. He convinces me that his daughter of Genya Hanover is a steal at \$20,000, because he's going to put 1:58 or faster on her full brother which he's taking to Lexington the next week.

So I bite, hook, line, and wallet. But when I tell Jim about my purchase, he goes slightly bananas.

"Who the hell are we going to breed a daughter of Speedy Crown to when we're standing him and his son, Speedy Somolli?"

This followed by a crash of Jim's phone into its cradle. I should mention that Jim's office phone had to be replaced on a regular basis.

But by the next breeding season things had cooled slightly, and Gamin Lobell, my Speedy Crown filly, was bred to ABC Freight. The result of that mating was Garland Lobell, and like they say, from then on it was all rock n roll.

As for ABC Freight, he was another perfect example of a stallion's 2-year-old racing career pointing out his great sire potential. In a day when there weren't many races for 2-year-old trotters, ABC Freight won the only decent-sized purse offered, a stakes race at Roosevelt.

Then he went over to the newly opened Meadowlands, and beat a good field of aged trotters, in 2:00.4. On the basis of which he was shipped to California, where Joe O'Brien drove him to a new world's record of 1:57.2 in a solitary time trial. The USTA only shows him with earnings of \$176,965, but I'm sure that's wrong on the low side.

Although ABC Freight was plagued with low fertility, from limited opportunity he did sire a Hambletonian winner in Historic Freight. Retrospectively, Jim and I should have given him more of a chance, but at the time all our attention was devoted to Speedy Crown and Speedy Somolli.

* *

Finally, I had a brief chat with Dr. Rebecca Bellone, the lady who is doing the genetic research for the USTA. I did tell her that with all my compulsive printing out of five-generation pedigrees, I had not found one that was truly inbred. Which bodes well for our breeds of American trotters and American pacers, as both breeds now are well diversified.

And even more finally, I apologize to all the Swedes I've clashed with over their ban of all trotters who race with trotting hobbles (heartbreaking-news-about-monte-mikis-retirement). That apology especially applies to Anders Malmrot at Solvalla and Ulf Lindstrom. I fear I've also upset my dear friends Lina Alm and Thomas Moberg, which I deeply regret.

I hope they will all be coming to Lexington this fall, and I'll have the opportunity to offer my apologies in person.

Robert Taylor's dynamic duo finish 1-2 in Hoosier stakes final

Luv Lorelei and Jusmakinyalook swept the top two spots Friday in the \$22,000 Msnaughtybynature series for filly and mare trotters.

The early closing series held each April and May at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino can serve as a good primer for horses set to launch into Indiana Sires Stakes competition. Trainer Robert Taylor has utilized the Msnaughtybynature series to prepare his sophomore filly tandem of **Luv Lorelei** and **Jusmakinyalook**, and the pair swept the top two positions Friday night (May 20) in the \$22,000 final for filly and mare trotters. Taylor steered Luv Lorelei to a 1:55.2 victory as the favorite, with Jordan Ross following two lengths back with second choice Jusmakinyalook, timed in 1:55.4.

"I think these two fillies could be a good combination in the sires stakes this year," said the conditioner after their one-two finish.

Indiana Sires Stakes action is familiar territory for both fillies. As freshmen, both trotters qualified for the \$270,000 Super Final last October. Luv Lorelei began her 2-year-old campaign racing on the Indiana Sired Fair Circuit under the tutelage of Matt Rheinheimer. The Muscle Massive—Busybeingdreamy lass, a \$9,500 Michiana Classic yearling purchase, earned two wins on the fair circuit before capturing the \$25,000 Governor's Cup championship at the Indiana State Fair by three lengths in a time of 2:02.4.

"Matt broke and trained her and raced her through the fair championship last year. One of his owners sold out to the other group and I ended up taking over the training responsibilities after that," said Taylor.

Bred by Larry Troyer, Luv Lorelei proceeded to finish second in three of four Indiana Sires Stakes legs for the revised ownership group of Burt Paddock and Kyle Hupfer, gaining the points necessary to start in the Super Final. There, she raced fifth. The filly hit the board in 14 of 15 starts in 2021 and ended the year with \$94,630 in earnings. Now a winner in three of four sophomore attempts, the trotter is a six-figure earner.

"She went to Kentucky to Anvil And Lace Farm and was turned out down there for about eight weeks. She wintered good," the conditioner said. "We started back up with her after the first of the year. She came back in good flesh and looked good. She trained well all winter and all spring getting ready for this year. So far so good with her. The plan was to race her in this series because she fit it (non-winners of two pari-mutuel)."

Taylor's fillies will have to contend with M-M's Dream, last year's freshman filly trot divisional champion and Super Final winner, and Fleurie, the Super Final runner-up from the Peter Wrenn stable. Each filly has registered a qualifying effort at Hoosier Park. To prepare for the first start in a grueling eight-leg Indiana Sires Stakes schedule, Taylor hopes to bring a pair of fresh fillies to battle on Memorial Day.

"They'll get a few days off. We'll give them the weekend off and start back jogging Monday. Let

them freshen up over the weekend," Taylor said. "We'll get them ready for the first leg of the sires stakes, keep our fingers crossed, and hopefully we can do some good there."

By comparison, Jusmakinyalook raced exclusively at Hoosier Park last season, winning an Indiana Sires Stakes leg and finishing second in two more. Jordan Ross, who serves as second trainer for Taylor, regularly piloted the Pinetucky—Beldame Hanover filly. In last year's Super Final she made a break while racing second, eventually finishing last in the field of 10. This season, the \$10,500 Michiana Classic purchase has picked up two wins in four starts, and she looked poised to add another win before equipment issues intervened.

Coming off the equipment miscue, Ross and Jusmakinyalook pushed to the lead from post six in Friday night's series final. The two reached the quarter in :28.3 and dialed back the tempo to set up a :30.1 second panel (:58.4). Taylor, sitting in third with Luv Lorelei, sent the favorite to the front just before the half and never looked back. Kicking home in :27.1, the filly enters the opening round of sires stakes on Memorial Day with a commanding victory to her credit. Jusmakinyalook, owned by Devon Miller, distanced the rest of the field to manage second. Ross, who also works for the Taylor stable, knows the filly well, and is a tremendous asset in the bike for the conditioner.

"He's one of my second trainers. I give him the opportunity to drive quite a few horses in the stable. Most of the time we split the driving duties half and half. It was decided last year when we had both of these fillies going, I knew there would be a time I couldn't drive both of them," Taylor said of the arrangement with Ross. "He gets along with her really well, handles her really well. He's got a good set of hands and he's been real patient with that filly from start to finish. It's a blessing to be able to have him driving horses with me."

At Hoosier Park on May 14, Race 2 went to Rick Plano with Born To Thrive \$21.60 and Race 3 to Jacob Roglitz with Brooklets Desire at \$7.00.

Plano is 70 and has been in the business over half a century. He trains, owns and drives 21 horses.

Roglitz is 21 and a Maryland native and the nephew of veteran William Long. He was making his $10^{\rm th}$ career start and won for the fourth time. He actually had a Hoosier Park driving double May 5 in his fourth and fifth career drives.

There is 49 years between the two drivers.

What are Plano's plans this year now that Pompano Park is permanently closed?

"After December 10 (closing day at Hoosier Park) we don't know yet. My wife (Mary Ann) wants to cut back, but I work at it, keep in shape and like what I do. These are my horses. Unless it's a Burke horse or something, I only drive mine," he said.

Plano has been just about anywhere you can name.

"Canada, Monticello twice in 1973 and 1974, California from 1982-2012. We lived there. I've been to the Meadowlands and Delaware for a bit. I'll keep doing this for a while. I still enjoy it," he said.

RIP DR. GLEN BROWN

Dr. Glen Brown was 100 per cent a gentleman.

He had a quiet, yet dominating, presence — mostly because of his size, -not his demeanor.

You cannot think "Armstrong" and not think of Glen Brown.

He was a dedicated lifer and when he called your name across a crowded room, somehow it stood out. He was above the rest. I simply cannot think of a single example — ever, anywhere, anytime — when an approaching Dr. Glen Brown was not a welcome sight.

He was never too big or too busy to help you.

She won 31 of her first 35 starts, raced for Linda Lockey and Myra Masterson of Ontario and was a daughter of Most Happy Fella. Jim Rankin drove and trained.

Her name? Happy Lady.

REMEMBERING THE WORLD CUP

The World Cup started at the Meadowlands 40 years ago this month — in May of 1982.

Three legs, three different distances and the best pacers in the world on center stage -11/8th miles, 11/2 miles then a flat mile. The Meadowlands' general manager was Sam Anzalone and he was at Yonkers with a ringside seat in the 1960s for Cardigan Bay coming over and competing in the free-for-alls for five seasons. In the mid-1970s, Young Quinn also made the move from best free-for-aller Down Under to one right here, too. He was the first 1:55 winner at the Meadowlands on Sept. 25, 1976 with Joe Marsh Jr. driving for Charlie Hunter. So the decision was made to try it in the USA.

Well, the best laid plans.

San Simeon, 31-for-32 Down Under and termed the "Wonder From Down Under" never acclimated to North America. USA went 1-2-3 across the wire with Genghis Khan, Beatcha and Skip By Night in the final dominating. Beatcha had won the first two legs and was en route to the \$50,000 bonus if he could lower the existing track record of 1:53 from Abercrombie set 8/4/79. But an untimely break in deep stretch off a 1:25 three quarters cost him the extra money.

Cam Fella's last loss and first win of his epic 28 race streak to end his brilliant career both came in the 1983 World Cup in Year 2 (It would go four years in total). Perfect Out was the last horse to defeat the "Pacing Machine" that is if you don't count bad draws. Cam twice drew into the second tier in the series, but dominated when it counted.

Raffi upset at 25-1 in the 1984 wide open final with Mike Gagliardi. Horses such as Allan Bel, Classic Garry, Family Fun N and Classic Luca had Down Under roots, but failed to make any big splashes. Finals were offered all four years going from \$100,000 to \$125,000 then \$150,000.

On The Road Again made the World Cup all his own in 1985 by sweeping it. It helped him to briefly take over the all-time money lead before Nihilator would eventually pass him as the first ever \$3 million career pacer. OTRA ended with over \$2.8 million, not bad for a New Jersey Classic Sale \$10,000 buy.

One other note: entering the 1984 World Cup, everyone seemed to be excited about Popular Alm. Could he be the Down Under horse to atone for San Simeon? A modern day Cardigan Bay maybe? Or maybe a duplicate of Young Quinn who had established quite a presence during his tenure here?

Alas, it was not in the cards. The Australian superstar shattered a hind pastern prior and was ruled out. He had a 1:53.2 TT down under mark and \$698,733 to show for his efforts. He was 47-for-60 lifetime and 57-for-60 in the money. Another star, Frosty Imp, never was a factor here either.

In retrospect, the one horse who would have been the most apropos star from Down Under? Popular Alm. He was born Sept. 1,1976, the very day the Meadowlands opened its doors.

MAY I?

Look at some key moments in the sport's history that took place in the month of May:

- The 1966 Pace Of The Century at Yonkers Raceway took place in May. Featured were Bret Hanover, the 4-5 fave, and Cardigan Bay, winner of 10 straight. Cardigan Bay, still two years from retirement, won it.
- On May 22, 1987, in the \$200,000 New Jersey Sires Stakes, Run The Table for the Campbell brothers got the measure of Jate Lobell who had never lost a race. The track management at the Meadowlands doubled the purse to make sure Jate Lobell would take his unblemished record to East Rutherford. He had won a local overnight at 2 en route to a 16-for-16 mark. Run The Table's 1:51 mile would hold up as the sport's fastest.
- May 1979 at Vernon Downs was where Niatross got his career going 43 years ago.
- In May of 1984 at The Meadowlands the Miss New Jersey stakes began with Ray Remmen taking edition #1 with Showplace Trixie. The Chief would do it again in 1985 with Poplar Lil. Remmen turns 75 on May 28.









Marie Karlsson – Caretaker

In April of this year, a hardworking, dedicated, horse lover was nominated "April Caretaker of the Month" by SLS Equine. Her name is Marie Karlsson and I can personally testify she indeed deserves this wonderful recognition for she is by far one of the most diligent and dedicated grooms in harness racing.

I know this for she takes care of one of my horses, named Nikki The Nun. Nikki thinks Karlsson is her momma. Karlsson spends all day, every day, caring for Nikki, along with several others for trainer Tony Alagna.

Karlsson treats each horse like they are hers. Not only does she make sure they are shiny and dappled, but she spoils them with blueberries, strawberries and whatever else her kids crave.

It was back in her homeland of Hallstavik (Sweden) when Marie Karlsson began working with horses and would continue doing so for decades.

"I started out with riding lessons on ponies, and when I was 13 years old my father who was working at a breeding farm began training racing horses and breaking yearlings. I was still in school at the time, but began helping out in what would become my lifelong career," Karlsson said.

"My parents had both been involved with racehorses and breeding farms, but when mom had my sister and I, she got out of the business and took on a part-time office job. My sister and nieces are still involved with riding horses and are very good at it.

"Over the years, I have worked for numerous trainers, such as Leif Witasp, Tom Haughton, Robbie Siegelman, Dan and Wally Hennessey, Shane Arsenault and I started working for Tony Alagna in March of last year.

"Being in the business has given me the opportunity to travel and race at the tracks Solvalla, Axevalla, Rattvik, The Meadowlands, Garden State Park, and my 'home track' of Pompano."

Unfortunately, Pompano Park is no longer open for us to enjoy.



For Karlsson and thousands of others, we will greatly miss that track already.

"It's absolute heartbreaking that Pompano closed, for it was my 'home away from home,' and also a 'safe haven' for me. Since I wasn't able to be there on closing night in April, I think when I go back to Florida in November it will really hit me hard," Karlsson said.



Karlsson has worked with different trainers and has learned something from each one.

"I can't say that one trainer has taught me more than the other for there are so many ways of doing a job, and each trainer has their own way of doing things. You have to learn the way they do things, and adjust it to your style.

"I learned a lot working for my dad when it comes to young horses and when I worked for the Hennesseys (Wally and Danny) I got a lot of experience working on the track.

"I've seen a lot of different styles of training. Back home in Sweden there's a lot of training on the sand trails in the woods; intervals on the straightaway tracks, and also some under saddle.

"For some trainers it's been a steady schedule of training, while others choose to not train a lot – or at all – if the horse races every week.

"When I started working for Tony (Alagna) it was a big change, for when I worked for other trainers — Wally Hennessey for one. I actually did a lot of the track work myself with the horses I cared for.

My biggest thrill was when I won my very first race, but when my hard works pay off and my horse races great, I beam with joy and am a proud mom.

"While working for the Hennesseys I wasn't assigned certain horses, for their way of training was more of a community barn — meaning doing it all together, instead of specific horses to take care of.

"Tony Alagna has his second trainers help do the jogging and training. Because of the large amount of horses in his stable, the grooms are to follow the daily schedule, which is: clean stalls, getting the horse ready, bathing and cooling out, and doing them up if needed.

"It took me a bit longer to get adjusted to not actually being physically on the track, but the work duties are like any other barn, and I have a couple of really nice horses to care for.

"It doesn't matter to me if they are trotters or pacers, but I feel that it's a greater accomplishment as a horseman when you develop a good trotter from the ground up.

"No preference with mares or stallions/geldings, for they are all different with unique personalities and individual quirks.

"My biggest thrill was when I won my very first race, but when my hard works pay off and my horse races great, I beam with joy and am a proud mom."

As far as her all time favorite horse, Marie said it is Armbro Romance.

"I took care of her for trainer Tommy Haughton when she was 2 years old," Karlsson said. "But I love them all in different ways as they all have different personalities. A trainer once told me, 'Don't fall in love with the horse for it's a business.' My response was, 'If I don't love them, I shouldn't be working with them."

Here's a big thank you to all the caretakers out there. You are all unsung heroes in our sport.

Six-year-old **Click Bait** (Cantab Hall) took an impressive wire-to-wire triumph, paired with Per Lennartsson (who will drive Admiral As next week) and the duo landed a 1:53.2 mile meaning Click Bait is set for the Elitloppet.

During the same afternoon in Gävle, Solvalla invited **Brother Bill** (From Above) and **Mister F. Daag** (Conway Hall) to the race next Sunday. That leaves one spot left for Elitloppet and Solvalla will get help from the fans, finding the last horse.

Night Brodde, Calle Crown and Stoletheshow are the horses that can be voted for. From the beginning, another horse, Upstate Face, was one out of four options to vote for, but trainer Adrian Kolgjini chose to jump off this game.

The three candidates will chase votes until this morning (May 22) at 11 a.m. Stockholm time, and after that, the entire Elitloppet field will be set.

Hail Mary (Googoo Gaagaa) was set for Elitloppet earlier this week, meaning that trainer Daniel Redén has three horses in the race.

Mister poor example

While we cannot predict the future, we will surely live it. Every action and decision we make - **or don't** - ripples into the future. For the first time, we have the capability, the technology, and the knowledge to direct those ripples.

The future of gambling on harness horse racing is more than cloudy. Until recently, horses were the only legal gambling wager in many towns. Smorgasbords of gambling options are popping up on every corner, and at this point, we are barely on the new menu. Soon, other sports wagers will be a better gamble than trotters and pacers.

I offer myself as a poor example.

My harness horse gambling days are fewer. Despite a passion for the sport, there is more bang for my sporting gambling buck elsewhere. It pains me to admit this fact. Every dollar I wager on a baseball game instead of a horse race feels like a betrayal. Not gambling on harness horseraces is very sad on many levels.

Nobody asked for the horse racing gambling world to change. But it did, and it will. Nobody enjoys switching a business model, but we have problems. The list includes legislation, computers, casinos, artificial intelligence, human desire for instant gratification, aging demographics, drugs, perception, and presentation. As George Costanza would say, "The gambling seas are angry, my friends."

These problems are not breaking news. Questions are many, answers are rare, and coordination is complex. The big picture for our beloved sport is troubling but watching and waiting for the train to leave the station is not helpful. I agree with Winston Churchill, "I am an optimist. It does not seem too much use being anything else."

Change is inevitable. Shrinking our footprint seems unavoidable. But shrink to what? Change to what? Once again, my poor example may contain a hint of an answer.

For me, gambling on overnight racing and participating in overnight racing has always felt like a business, an industry, a grind where I do not belong. Businesses operate year-round. Winter races filled with warhorses feel like products on a factory assembly line. My interest in the racing aspect of our sport goes dormant each December.

Sports have seasons and off-seasons. Sports offer their fans and participants a pause, a period for renewal, a period of rejuvenation. When April rolls around, my attention blooms like the trees on my street. Young horses that we purchased, raised, and trained are on their way.

Stakes horses in nice weather change the game for me; I feel like returning to the high-risk, complex sport we enjoy. Stakes racing feels like a sport. Gambling on horses is more exciting.

And although my gambling interest in horse races has waned, my enthusiasm for purchasing and racing stakes horses has never been more robust. The recent yearling sales results seem to indicate others still find great joy in the stakes racing side of the business.

Perhaps downsizing the business side and emphasizing the sporting side is a survival pathway. Is pivoting and transitioning from a gambling engine to a private "ownership" game feasible? Could we go back to the future? When our sport was king, the wealthy and passionate did not have gambling revenue. Raising and racing horses was social, prideful, and intriguing. Raising racehorses was not a business to Leland Sanford or John D. Rockefeller. The wealthy pushed the sport, and others followed in their wake.

What about a hybrid model as a road forward?

Today, an either-or proposition is not necessary. Obviously, we want to keep every precious gambling dollar we can, but while we have a chance, why not lean into our game's ownership and sporting side and lean away from nine-year-old colts racing in the sleet on a February night? Why not have fewer races that mean more? Have a racing season. Turn the winter grind off and stash that money for the summer purses.

This rambling may sound crazy to most ears, and it should. Unless you are well over a century old, you have never lived a single day of your life without pari-mutuel wagering and horses intertwined. But you have also never lived in a period where everyone can wager on anything.

Let's not desperately race to the bitter end. Let's reconfigure, rejuvenate, and have some sporting fun in the brave new world. A dramatic shift to a model where stakes racing is prominent and gambling income is essential, but not everything, could be exciting and our best hope for a bright future.





Adare Castle, Silver Label take SBOA Finals; Card cancelled after five races

Adare Castle and Silver Label captured a pair of SBOA Stakes finals on an abbreviated Saturday evening card at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A severe weather event early in the day Saturday left Woodbine Mohawk Park and surrounding area without power. While Milton Hydro attempted to restore power to the area, the outage continued after sun down, forcing the cancellation of Saturday's card after five-races.

The five contested races did include a pair of SBOA Stakes finals for 3-year-old fillies.

Adare Castle crushed her rivals with a dominating five-length 1:53.2 score in the \$151,575 final for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

Driver James MacDonald allowed an early scramble to unfold before rushing to the top with Adare Castle from fourth. The Mark Etsell trainee hit the half in :56.1 and three-quarters in 1:24.4 before capping off the blowout win with a :28.3 kicker.

Saundra finished second, while Clockwork Orange was third.

A daughter of Muscle Mass—Pacific Edge, Adare Castle is now two-for-two this season after winning seven of nine starts as a rookie. The O'Brien Award winner has now earned \$574,324 for owners Etsell, Robert Newton, Graham Hopkins and Peter Porter.

Adare Castle paid \$2.30 to win.

Silver Label wore down a game I Love Ongait to win the \$147,575 final for 3-year-old pacing fillies.

I Love Ongait charged from post 10 to grab command, posting opening fractions of :26.3 and :55.2. Silver Label got away fourth and made the first up bid around the far turn. After reaching three-quarters in 1:23.1, I Love Ongait showed plenty of heart in an attempt to fight off the heavy-favourite, but Silver Label would not be denied, winning by three-quarters of a length in 1:51.1.

Big Bettor Hanover finished third, while Fade Out was fourth.

Longshots Samosa (18-1), Palermo Hanover (9-1) sweep PASS at The Meadows

Trailing by five lengths as they turned for home, **Samosa** found the "super-speed" gear and overtook heavy favorite Dreamonhigh to spring the 18-1 upset in Saturday's (May 21) \$67,190 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) division for sophomore trotting fillies at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows.

The other \$66,790 division of the event for 3-year-old filly trotters, known as the Meadow Bright, also went to a long shot, as 9-1 Palermo Hanover overpowered 2-5 favorite Mon Cheval to score.

Samosa had raced without hopples for her last four starts, but after she broke stride in the PASS opener at Harrah's Philadelphia, trainer Charlie Norris decided to restore them.

"Charlie told me she has a high turn of speed but be careful getting out of there," winning driver Mike Wilder said. "I was careful and kind of raced her the way a log snot should be raced. She did the rest. I moved her, and she was gone.

"I think the hopples helped, especially as quick as she can get into gear. There was never a moment when I thought she would run. She was crisp as ever."

Once Wilder unleashed her, the daughter of Cantab Hall—Kolachke not only erased the deficit, but she also downed the 1-2 Dreamonhigh by 1-1/2 lengths, meaning she improved her

position by 6-1/2 lengths in the stretch. That move is even more impressive when you consider that Dreamonhigh is the reigning PASS champion and the fastest 2-year-old trotter ever at The Meadows. Danznqueen Hanover completed the ticket.

Samosa triumphed in a career-best 1:54 and soared over \$100,000 in lifetime earnings for owners Fred Hertrich III and Scott McEneny.

Once Mon Cheval secured the point and got a reasonable :57.3 half, it appeared the others were racing for checks. Dexter Dunn, however, had other ideas. When he moved Palermo Hanover first over from fourth, the daughter of Father Patrick-Personal Style gobbled up Mon Cheval and defeated him by 2-3/4 lengths in 1:53.3, fastest win of her career. Virgin Mary S was third.

"With a small field, I was either going to be first up or caught in the three hole," Dunn said. "She'll follow speed all day, and she finishes it off, so you never know how good she might turn out to be."

Noel Daley conditions Palermo Hanover and owns with Lenny Zelin and The Gandolfo Stables.

PA STALLION SERIES — 3-YEAR-OLD FILLY TROTTERS

In Saturday's sub-feature, **I'll Have A Lindy, Gumdrop Hanover** and **Baptism** each captured a \$20,000 split of the Pennsylvania Stallion Series.

I'll Have A Lindy was stalking from the pocket when the leader, Vogue, broke stride. Winning pilot Yannick Gingras said the daughter of Cantab Hall—Martini Lindy handled the situation flawlessly.

"That didn't change anything for her," Gingras said. "She's the same filly she was last year. She's pretty simple and does her job. She was very mature last year."

It was the second straight stallion series victory for I'll Have A Lindy, a homebred who's trained by Domenico Cecere for Greathorse.

Wilder collected four wins on the 13-race card.

Ecurie D DK sets world record in Cutler

Mother Nature provided the heat. Ecurie D DK added the sizzle.

On an unseasonably warm, 86-degree night, Ecurie D DK made his seasonal debut a memorable one by scorching the one-mile oval at The Meadowlands in a world record 1:49.1 to win Saturday's \$170,450 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial for older trotters by 1-1/2 lengths over Cuatro De Julio. Bella Bellini finished third.

The time was the fastest May trotting mile in harness racing history, besting the 1:50 clocking by Katie's Lucky Day at The Meadowlands last week, and set the world record for an older trotting stallion on a one-mile track. It also equaled The Meadowlands track record established by mare Atlanta in 2020.

Ecurie D DK, a 6-year-old driven by trainer Åke Svanstedt, was fourth through the first half of the Cutler Memorial as Lovedbythemasses led the field to the opening quarter in :26.3 before Cuatro De Julio took control and got to the half in :54.

Cuatro De Julio was still on top at three-quarters, reached in 1:22.1, but Ecurie D DK was already up to second on his outside and ready to sprint home when they reached the stretch.

By winning his first start of the year, Ecurie D DK improved to 3-for-3 in the U.S. since his arrival from Europe. He entered the Cutler off one qualifier, a 1:54.2 win May 6 at The Meadowlands.

"Those aged horses, they are not like the young horses that might need a couple of races, at least our horses, so I had confidence," said Åke Svanstedt's wife, Sarah, who helps run the training stable. "Me and Åke said he could be at least around 1:50 today, but (1):49.1 was very impressive. I'm very proud."

Ecurie D DK's victories last season included the Breeders Crown Open Trot. An established star in Europe prior to coming to the States, the son of Infinitif—To Soon has won 18 of 24 career starts and has earned \$868,593.

"When you see him, at home too, he is always a happy horse," Sarah Svanstedt said. "But when he comes here (to the track), his energy goes to race mode and he loves to go out on the track. He's not a grabby, aggressive horse, but he knows his race day and he loves to go to work. I love those horses that know before a race that, 'Today is the day; I'm going to fight."

Ecurie D DK, who was born in Denmark, is owned by Marko Kreivi Stables Inc., Suleyman Yuksel Stables Inc., and Åke Svanstedt Inc. He was bred by Jean Pierre DuBois.

Sarah Svanstedt said there was no set schedule at the moment for Ecurie D DK.

"We will take it step by step," Svanstedt said. "The Breeders Crown is the main goal, and the International Trot would be nice to be part of too."

Sent off as the 3-5 favorite, Ecurie D DK paid \$3.40 to win.

The Cutler Memorial is named in memory of Arthur J. Cutler, the famed restaurateur and harness racing enthusiast who passed away at age 53 in 1997.

"I just can't believe it's been 25 years since we lost Artie," Meadowlands Racetrack owner Jeff Gural said. "I really miss him. For people who didn't know him, he was a great guy. He loved the races, loved The Meadowlands. It was a big loss, but we've been able to honor his memory all these years."



Ontario Sires Stakes season begins tonight at Flamboro

The 2022 Ontario Sires Stakes season begins tonight (May 22) at Flamboro Downs, on the \$458,300, Charles Juravinski Memorial Cup card. It will be a busy evening for local trainer Anthony Beaton, who has starters in three of the four \$22,000 Grassroots divisions for 3-year-old pacing colts.

Beaton, a resident of Waterdown, ON, had a strong OSS season in 2021, with 10 horses making 42 starts to earn over \$245,000.

"We are definitely looking to have a good season with our young stock and I'm hopeful we can have some success in the OSS," said Beaton. "(The OSS) is a great program for us up here. We go for good money, and it is very competitive."

Coligny Hanover (Sunshine Beach) – Beaton's second-highest OSS earner in 2021 – is part of the trio he is harnessing.

The gelding raced at the Gold level last year, posting three top-five finishes in five starts. He has three starts in 2022 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, including the SBOA Eliminations last weekend. James MacDonald is in the bike tonight, drawing the rail position in race 3.

"It's not that he didn't perform in the SBOAs, but he was pressed off the speed and it was too far to come," said Beaton. "I think James will get him away half decent on Sunday, and he'll be there to see who wins, or possibly win himself."

Stone Carver (Bettors Delight) comes in off a May 12 performance at Woodbine where he paced a mile in 1:52.3 to finish second by a head. He won a Grassroots Leg at Woodbine in 2021 before a tough trip in the Battle of Waterloo Final knocked him off balance for the remainder of the year. He'll start from post two in race 1 on Sunday.

"Towards end of year he was tired," said Beaton. "We're going to protect him and race him at smaller tracks this year to keep him fresher towards the end of the year, when the bigger money is available for the Grassroots."

Rounding out Beaton's three-pack is Lyons Pride, from the seven post in the final \$22,000 division, race 8. The son of Bettors Delight had a 0-1-1 record in five 2021 Grassroots starts and earned a spot in the Semi-Finals. He will be looking to pick up some early season points from a tricky outside post position.

The other \$22,000 Grassroots division is race 6. Sports Advisor (Sportswriter) is an 8-5 favourite.

The four Grassroots divisions serve as the appetizer for the feature race on the card, the Charles

Juravinski Memorial Cup. Formerly the Confederation Cup, this year Flamboro Downs renamed the \$273,500 race for 4-year-old pacing colts after renowned Hamilton philanthropist and former owner/operator of the Dundas oval, Charles Juravinski.
