Record handle in sight as stars converge at Philly

Gangbusters card includes the rematch of Perfect Sting and Abuckabett Hanover in the PASS and three \$100,000 invitational stakes – the Commodore Barry, Betsy Ross and a star-studded Maxie Lee.

With wagering already up early this season at Harrah's Philadelphia due to a combination of bettor-friendly initiatives, a record handle isn't out of the question as many of the sport's most talented stars descend on the Chester five-eighth's mile on Sunday. In addition to eight Stallion Series divisions and two Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) for 3-year-old colt pacers featuring premier matchups, three \$100,000 invitational stakes including the Commodore Barry, Betsy Ross and Maxie Lee will be contested.

In figures provided by Gabe Prewitt, director of racing for Caesars Entertainment, the all-time daily handle record at Harrah's Chester is \$1,382,824. It came on a day when many other East coast tracks including thoroughbred tracks were canceled due to a heat wave. The next highest handle of \$1,079,335 came on a Super Stakes Sunday event. But just this past Sunday on a nondescript and typical card, the track handled \$1,037,261.

Granted, what's been driving handle over the past year for many tracks is racing when others aren't, far more-so than field quality. But the sheer amount of talent on display

Sunday combined with the free programs and low takeout multi-leg wagers that led to a \$1 million handle last week on its own, it would be hard to see Sunday not going over the \$1 million mark again with the additional eyes that will be watching. Additionally, last week's handle came over 14 races and Sunday will feature 15 races, so the total handle could come close to approaching that all-time mark.

Following the conclusion of the early Pick-4 (races 1-4) on Sunday, the \$0.50 Pick-5 begins in race 5 and includes the rematch of Perfect Sting and Abuckabett Hanover in race 6, a \$76,309 PASS division.

When they both last raced two weeks ago at Pocono, it was Abuckabett Hanover that put an end to the career unbeaten streak of Perfect Sting, though the tables could certainly be turned on Sunday. Whereas Abuckabett Hanover was favored in that last race on the strength of having a mile under him already this year (and a monster 1:49.1 mile no less), he had the conditioning edge over Perfect Sting and took advantage of it. McCarthy was aggressive in pouncing on Perfect Sting as soon as he moved to the lead and had enough to just last as Perfect Sting surged late up the inside after appearing a gap a bit from the pocket earlier up the backstretch.

Perfect Sting will now be favored as he deserves to be, but Abuckabett Hanover has the post edge and could do it again. Seems like it would be down to these two for pick-5 Purposes. Elsewhere in the field, Gambln Mo has been amazing in his transition from 2 to 3 for trainer John Butenschoen and will get the test for class. Chase H Hanover was uncharacteristically flat once into the lane last out but was excellent two back in his first start of the year. Liter! Lad Hanover surprised at big odds two back as easily the longest priced horse of himself and two other Burke stablemates that day.

The late Pick-4 starts goes as races 10 through 13, with all but the first race of sequence being the big three \$100,000 invitationals.


First up of the signature races is the Commodore Barry in race 11 for open pacers. Nicholas Beach, This Is The Plan and American History slugged it out through the stretch at the Meadowlands where it was Nicholas Beach that came away victorious in 1:47.2. That's around the benchmark that only a couple dozen or so in the history of the sport have ever went and I can't wait to see these horses bring this time around. Betting-wise, I'd probably let Nicholas Beach beat me if he can at the short price. Sometimes form from the Meadowlands to Chester doesn't always pan out, and he did need every inch of a perfect trip to get by and last. He's been a monster this year and it's not to take anything away from

him, but there could be better value elsewhere.

This Is The Plan lands post 8 again, and Gingras' drive on him from the same spot (even more amazingly that it came on a half-mile) in the Borgata final was one for the ages. He was getting to Nicholas Beach last week, too, when angled to his outside and it'll be fascinating to see how this race plays out with the fast American History presumably looking to leave as well directly to his inside. The one that could be overlooked in here is Leonidas A. His only loss of the year came when he drew post 7 in the Borgata final and he beat these types to close out last year in the Potomac Pace at Rosecroft. With a lot of speed to his outside, Siegelman could work out a decent cover trip as a square-priced possibility. Bllack Hole invades from the Midwest but was a 1:48 winner at the Meadowlands last year.


In the race 12 Betsy Ross for open mare pacers, Racine Bell rates a chance as an outsider from post 7. She may be overlooked due to the post and lesser heralded connections as some of the others in here, but all of her recent races would give her a big chance. After running it up at Yonkers, she was sprinting right with Soho Burning Love A through that 25 second final quarter at the Meadowlands two back and was deceptively good last week at the Meadowlands when she was stuck third on the inside after being used

prior. She can make the lead in about three steps if Bartlett wants, in career form.

JK First Lady makes her third start of the year and was hard used in last week's Meadowlands open when working hard to the lead through a :53.4 half in that 12-horse field. She will likely be made the slight favorite in a highly competitive field. Soho Burning Love A enters the Betsy Ross on a three-race win streak and went unchallenged en route to that 1:48.2 score last out. Machnhope was the upset winner of the \$232,800 Bluechip Matchmaker series four back and is another that got used early in her open last week. Any of these could do it, though if I had to pick one to include with Racine Bell, I'd go with Soho Burning Love A.

Leading the way in the Maxie Lee Memorial for open trotters is the number one ranked horse in the sport, Manchego. I still can't believe that Cutler race. After floating wide around the first turn and then parked first over for much of the mile, she was hanging around for most of the stretch but at no point did I think she was actually going to win. But somehow, she came on when it counted to put away the race leader and hold off Majestic Player A who rode dream cover off her back. If anything, it seems like she should be stronger in her second start back.

Amigo Volo lands the rail and was better last out in his second start of the year, no issue in running second to Beads who they've found the key for now as a 4-year-old. It's Academic held on in the Graduate though they were coming on late at him; guaranteed to be moving forward early from post 8. Forbidden Trade seems like someone that should be along for a share.

Though outside of any multi-leg wager other than kicking off the late double, One Eight Hundred and Southwind Gendry go round 2 with each other. And here's where harness racing needs to get more serious in its morning lines. I'm not guaranteeing he's going to win, but there is no possible way that One Eight Hundred goes off at his 7-2 programmed line, and maybe even ends up the favorite. Currently the co-second choice with Exploit, One Eight Hundred will go off at close to the same odds as Southwind Gendry, maybe about both at 7/5 if I had to guess. One Eight Hundred took the big step up in class last out and was able to sling shot from the pocket to beat Southwind Gendry, proving that he will be legitimate 3-year-old stakes contender this year. Let's see if the switch in post positions reverses the order of finish this time. Lou's Pearlman qualified so well in April but hasn't been himself in two starts this year, gets a new driver in Dave Miller.

Breaking down a wide-open 2021 Elitloppet field

The Elitloppet is one of the most prestigious races in the world for elite trotters and the 2021 edition that goes to post Sunday afternoon at Solvalla is expected to be no different. Sixteen trotters, eight in each heat, will try to reach the final that will take place at 6:10 p.m. (CET) (12:10 p.m. (Eastern time)). The Elitloppet can be viewed in the U.S. on TVG.

This year's contest is particularly wide open after the draw handed the eight hole to both of the probable favorites.

Daniel Redén trained **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin—Kissed By The West) developed to become one of the more interesting horses in Sweden last season and his pedigree with a pacing mare has made the 5-year-old coveted among breeders already this year. But what can a horse that made his racing debut in July 2019 do among considerably more merited top trotters from post 8 in a mile race at Solvalla? Well, since the 2021 Elitloppet is particularly unpredictable, anything can happen and Don Fanucci Zet might very well claim his spot in the final.

Very Kronos (Ready Cash—Glide About) also drew post 8 for his elimination. Svante Båth's horse is not well known as a super sprinter (just two of his 45 lifetime starts have been mile races), but his strength will most certainly play its role on Sunday. Luck is needed for both horses, for sure, especially since there are several horses on their inside, respectively, who can leave very quickly when the car accelerate.

Just like last year, the Elitloppet will be raced without spectators, though some of the restaurants at Solvalla will open during the weekend. It's obviously a strange feeling when a race card that contains so many great trotters will be held without fans. But Solvalla survived last year's Elitloppet and will stand strong in 2022 when the world might look a little more "normal."

The Elitlopp (shown in 2017) is usually a huge draw for spectators, but due to the COVID-19 pandemic this will be the second straight year there will be no spectators at Solvalla other than some people in the dining rooms.

Solvalla's big weekend begins today (May 28) and on Saturday's card, the 1.95 mile \$241,000 Harper Hanover's race is the event of the day. Fifteen top trotters will gather in race 11 (6:43 p.m. CET; 12:43 p.m. (Eastern)). The race has increased its status this year. The higher purse has attracted better horses and this can really be a memorable race.

Sunday's race card is, as usual, strong with many interesting fields of trotters. The \$241,000 Håkan Wallner Memorial – the final of Breeders Course for 3-year-olds – is one of them where younger European horses will meet for the first time at this level. Alessandro Gocciadoro, who to a very high degree is one of the main contenders at Solvalla this weekend, has two of the most interesting horses in the field, but when one million Swedish crowns awaits the winner, we can guess that there are other trainers who have

prepared their horses, respectively, to an absolute peak.

Fifty Cent Piece (Muscle Hill—Thatsnotmyname), comes from a triumph in the \$241,000 Drottningpokalen and will be paired with Örjan Kihlström in the \$72,500 Fyraåringseliten for mares and will most probably be first choice in the race.

The 4-year-old colts and geldings will be accompanied by American-bred mare **Sister Sledge** (Father Patrick—Behindcloseddoors), who has two consecutive wins in Sweden since she arrived in Europe last fall. The \$120,000 Fyraåringseliten also features horses such as **Chestnut Hill** (Muscle Hill—Poof She's Gone), **Hell Patrol** (Yankee Glide—Day At The Spa), **Rome Pays Off** (Muscle Hill—Order By Wish) and Italian star **Bepi Bi** (Donato Hanover—Lorraine Bi).

After a rainy week in Stockholm, it's been said that our yellow friend in the sky will show up.

1. Vivid Wise As (Bred in Italy)

Trainer and driver: Alessandro Gocciadoro

Vivid Wise As was first choice to win the Elitloppet ahead of the race last year, but at that time he wasn't at his best and the performances this spring makes him a serious

contender.

2. Moni Viking (Norway)

Trainer and driver: Björn Goop

Moni Viking collected several big wins last season and is now back in Björn Goop's stable after a journey in France during the past winter. A non-typical Elitloppet contender, Moni Viking is more of a hearty, long-distance trotter than a sprinter.

3. Milliondollarrhyme (Sweden)

Trainer and driver: Fredrik B Larsson

Milliondollarrhyme showed extreme speed behind the car in Finland in his last performance and from a perfect spot he can control the race. This is his third try in the Elitloppet.

4. Aetos Kronos (Sweden)

Trainer: Jerry Riordan

Driver: Magnus A Djuse

Aetos Kronos dominated as a 3-year-old in Sweden and last season was strong with five wins in 11 starts. Aetos Kronos with "his" trip and in perfect shape can beat them all. Jerry Riordan won the Elitloppet in 2018 with Ringostarr Treb.

5. Hickothepooh (Norway)

Trainer: Trond Andersen

Driver: Vidar Hop

Hickothepooh was the upset winner in the Finlandia-ajo on May 9. The victory sent him to Elitloppet and now he faces his toughest battle in his life. The most experienced horse in Elitloppet this year; Hickothepooh has made 90 starts so far.

6. Bahia Quesnot (France)

Trainer and driver: Junior Guelpha

Bahia Quesnot shocked the French people when she, from out of nowhere, won the monté race Prix de Cornulier in Paris in January this year, which is her only victory so far this season. The 10-year-old mare is tougher than the most.

Snyder, Riordan eye Elitlopp glory

Jeff Snyder is well known for his accomplishments as the owner of pacers, with Horse of the Year award winners in both the U.S. (Cam's Card Shark and Rocknroll Hanover) and Canada (Michael's Power) as well as holding or sharing the records for victories in the North America Cup, Meadowlands Pace, and Little Brown Jug.

And now for something completely different. Snyder will try to add one of the world's great trotting races, the Elitlopp, to his résumé when Aetos Kronos competes in Sunday's invitational event at Solvalla Racetrack in Stockholm, Sweden.

Aetos Kronos, a 5-year-old son of French stallion Bold Eagle out of U.S.-born mare Will Of A Woman, is trained by New England native turned Sweden-based conditioner Jerry Riordan. He races in the first of two eight-horse Elitlopp



eliminations, starting from post four with driver Magnus Djuse. The top four from each elim return later in the day for the final.

No spectators will be permitted at Solvalla because of COVID-19 restrictions. However, some track restaurants will be opened to accommodate a limited number of horse owners and guests. Snyder and his family will watch from the States because of travel restrictions.

"The horse is doing well and we're looking forward to the race and seeing what happens," Snyder said. "It looks like it will be a wide-open race. Just being in it, we're very happy. It's just too bad we can't be over there. It's such a great race,

such a spectacle normally, and we were looking forward to getting over there.”

For his career, Aetos Kronos has won 13 of 32 races, hit the board a total of 24 times, and earned the U.S. equivalent of \$1.07 million. He has captured a handful of Group 1 races in Sweden and is owned by Team Snyder (Jeff and son Michael) and Aetos Dios AB. He will represent the U.S. in the Elitlopp.

Among Aetos Kronos’ highlights was winning the Hakan Wallner Memorial with a world-record performance at the distance of 1-5/16 miles at age 3. Last year, his victories included the King Gustaf V Trot and the Solvalla Grand Prix.

This season, he won the Group 2 Prix Bold Eagle in France before a third-place finish behind Delia Du Pommereux and Face Time Bourbon in the Group 1 Prix de France. After a two-month layoff, he returned to win his qualification for the Paralympic Trot in late April. He finished third in the Group 1 final, won by Delia Du Pommereux, on May 8.

“The Prix De France was his first race against the older horses; they race against their own as 4-year-olds,” Riordan said. “So, he’s relatively young, just now kind of graduating into that group of older horses.

“I was happy with the effort (in the Paralympic Trot final) but it kind of puts things in perspective. To beat these horses, you can’t just overpower them. You have to get a trip. Aetos Kronos is a wonderful horse but he’s not going to be able to overpower these guys. Something has to work out a little bit in his favor.”

Riordan, who won the 2018 Elitlopp with Ringostarr Treb, has two horses in this year’s event, with Gareth Boko competing in the second elimination. The 8-year-old stallion has won 18 of 50 races in a career hampered by health issues.

“I’m very optimistic,” Riordan said. “There is no real standout. Vivid Wise As has beaten the best horses in Europe before and when he gets on the front he’s really a tough horse. But other than that, it is wide open.

“Both horses I have are very good horses. We have good post positions. It’s not like you feel you can go in and dominate, but you know if the race develops in the right way, they’re both good enough to capitalize on it.”

Online bookmakers have Vivid Wise As among the favorites to win the Elitlopp, with Don Fanucci Zet and Moni Viking. Aetos Kronos, Seismic Wave, Ecurie D, and Very Kronos are also receiving solid consideration.

“In the past, Aetos has shown he’s excellent at the mile-and-a-quarter races because he usually comes from behind,” Snyder said. “It will be interesting to see what

happens at a mile. He’s a beautiful horse and he’s been no problem, right from day one. He’s a very sound horse, takes care of himself. We’ve had a lot of fun with him.”

Snyder credits his son Michael for getting the family involved with trotters overseas. Their first horse in Europe was Treasure Kronos, a mare who was trained by Riordan and counted a Swedish Breeders Crown championship at age 3 in 2015 and the prestigious Criterium Continental in France at 4 among her victories.

“The last few years we’re getting more into trotting,” Snyder said. “Michael has been following the French racing and the Swedish racing for a number of years. It’s exciting to have horses in Europe. We like the longer races. It makes for more interesting racing.

“Aetos has a lot of races against the best horses in Europe all summer, for the rest of the season. They’re a tough bunch, that’s for sure. Hopefully, he’ll be competitive.”

And what would it be like to win the Elitlopp? Riordan can provide an answer.

“It’s surreal,” Riordan said. “It’s one of those moments when you know you’ve accomplished the greatest achievement you can have in this game. Nothing is better than winning the Elitlopp. There are things as good as winning the Elitlopp, but there is nothing better than that.”

Maxie Lee starter Manchego headlines star-studded Harrah's Philadelphia card

The Nancy Takter-trained Tall Dark Stranger was voted the 2020 Horse of the Year and when balloting was announced earlier this week for the first [Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll of 2021](#), she proclaimed, "And I'm starting off with the number one horse this year!"

This year's initial top-ranked horse for Takter is Manchego, who wasn't even supposed to be on the racetrack after owner Barry Guariglia announced last November that the daughter of Muscle Hill—Secret Magic would be retired.

But a change of heart over the winter led to the \$2.7 million-winning Manchego returning to the track this year as a 6-year-old, and if her first effort is any indication, the correct decision was made.

Despite battling sickness that kept her from a scheduled first start in the opening round of the Miss Versatility Series on May 8 at The Meadowlands, Manchego was at 100 per cent for her season's debut in the \$141,250 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial against male peers on May 15 at the Big M. Leaving from post nine with driver Dexter Dunn, Manchego was parked every step of the mile but was still game enough in the stretch to put her nose in front in 1:51.1.

"She was really good," said Dunn. "She's a major force, but that was a tough run her last start."

Manchego will attempt to make it two-for-two in 2021

when she starts from post five in Sunday afternoon's (May 30) \$100,000 Maxie Lee Memorial Invitational Trot at Harrah's Philadelphia. The race is one of a trio of \$100,000 contests on the 15-race card, joining the Betsy Ross Invitational for older pacing mares and the Commodore Barry for older male pacers. Also on the program are a pair of Pennsylvania Sires Stakes divisions for 3-year-old male pacers, with the first including a rematch between Perfect Sting and Abuckabett Hanover, who handed the former his first career defeat in the Sires Stakes opener two weeks ago.

Manchego capped off her 2020 campaign with wins in the \$300,000 Breeders Crown and \$320,000 TVG Open, paving the way for her to earn Dan Patch Award divisional honors, the second time she took home top honors (she was also the 2-year-old Filly Trotter of the Year in 2017).

Those races were to be her career finale efforts, until the reversing of the retirement decision. Manchego then finished third in her first qualifier on April 10 at The Meadowlands, race-timed in 1:52.3/last quarter :25.3). After a fifth-place finish in an April 24 qualifier, Takter had planned to drop Manchego in the box for the May 8 Miss Versatility.

"I was planning on racing her in the first week of the Miss Versatility, but after the second qualifier she was no good. I scoped her afterward and she was full of mucous," said Takter. "I put her on antibiotics and then the following Monday I trained her at the farm in the race bike and she was really good. I went a quick back half in :54 with her and she felt awesome.

"I was going to put her in the box on Tuesday for the Miss Versatility but on Monday afternoon Katie (caretaker Katie Remmerswaal) called me and said Manchego had a 103.5 fever. So there was no dropping her in the box then."

Takter, the 2020 Trainer of the Year, didn't train Manchego too hard prior to her May 15 Cutler debut, and was going to let Dunn know of the situation prior to the race.

"I was driving to The Meadowlands that Saturday and I thought to myself that I had to tell Dexter that she might be a little bit short, and then I remembered that the last time I told him that was when she had messed up her foot after the (2019) Maple Leaf Trot and

she hadn't raced in three weeks, and she was going to (Hollywood) Dayton (for the Dayton Trotting Derby). She broke the world record so maybe she likes a three-week layoff. Three weeks might be her thing," Takter said with a laugh.

Takter also thought about giving Dunn directions in the Cutler when Manchego drew post nine, but she had second thoughts in speaking to the 2020 Driver of the Year.

"I told Dex that, 'I'm not going to give you driving directions, I'm Trainer of the Year and you're Driver of the Year, you need to figure it out,'" she said. "But you can't get away ninth or 10th because you are not going to make up that much ground on the best horses in the country at this point."

In the race, Dunn left from the outside post but decided against dropping in a hole as he believed he would have been caught locked in.

"Before the race I thought it would be a tricky race because there would be a lot leaving," said Dunn. "There was a hole but there were horses outside on my back and they were going to go forward."

The Tim Tetrick-driven Guardian Angel As set all the fractions, reaching the respective stations in :26.3, :54.4 and 1:23.2. Dunn said the :28.3 third quarter worked to his advantage with the first-over Manchego.

"We got lucky the third quarter wasn't too hard when we were first-over," he said. "It wasn't too fast so I was able to sit there and save a little for later in the race. And she was doing it so nicely."

Takter agreed with Dunn's assessment as she watched from The Meadowlands' paddock.

"Dex was just sitting outside and not pushing the pace; Dex did a good job," she said. "He rated her on the outside. And she still had enough in the tank when he asked her to go."

With a last quarter of :27.4, Manchego was able to score by a nose over the late-closing Majestic Player A, with Guardian Angel As a neck behind in third.

"When she's feeling good she does not like to lose," Takter said of Manchego, whose 1:49 win in 2019 at Red Mile is the fastest ever by a female trotter.

Takter and Dunn will also team up with JK First Lady from post three [in the Betsy Ross](#). The 4-year-old daughter of Western Ideal is out of the At Major mare JK She'salady, who Takter trained to Horse of the Year accolades in 2014.

A winner of nearly three-quarters of a million dollars, JK

First Lady has a second and fourth in a pair of top-class overnight events at The Meadowlands this year. Takter admits the races went a little tougher than she had hoped for her newly-turned 4-year-old.

"She's been racing really well but she's been racing a little tougher than I would have wanted her to race," she said. "It's not how I would have scripted her 4-year-old season to begin with those two tough races that she had."

"She has a good post this week and I'd like to see her race off the pace. She's better off the pace but she keeps ending up on the front. Every race but one that she won she came from off the pace."

Takter said she plans on a pair of equipment changes for JK First Lady for the Betsy Ross.

"She raced with a lip cord all of last year and so far this year, but I think I'm going to take it off this week," said Takter. "And she'll race with a pull-down bridle. She used to get very grabby last year and she's a sweetheart to drive this year."

Persistence pays off for connections of Racine Bell

Racine Bell took time to get going, but there is no stopping her now.

A 4-year-old female pacer, Racine Bell will make her Grand Circuit debut in Sunday's (May 30) \$100,000 Betsy Ross Mares Invitational at Harrah's Philadelphia. For her career, the mare has won 16 of 34 races and hit the board a total of 27 times for trainer David Dewhurst and owners Chris Lawton and Dale Lawton. Purchased for \$9,000 at the 2018 Blooded Horse Sale, she has earned \$369,526.

Over 14 starts dating back to last October, the daughter of So Surreal—Ty's Artist has won eight times and finished worse than third only once.

"She's matured and grown up," Dewhurst said. "But she's been great for us at every point. There's never been a dull moment for her."

It required some persistence, though, to reach that point. The first time Dewhurst took Racine Bell to the track to begin preparing her to race at age 2, she refused to move.

"We stood for one hour; she wouldn't go," Dewhurst said. "It took a long time for me to get her to go. She would go to the track and stop. It took a lot of patience to get her where she would at least go one mile. But once she figured it out, she's been good ever since."

At 2, Racine Bell enjoyed success on the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) circuit and finished second in the series championship. Last year, she posted three NYSS wins in the preliminary rounds and finished fifth in the final, when she was hampered by a breathing issue. A month later, she beat older rivals in the open handicap for fillies and mares at Saratoga.

This season, Racine Bell opened with a third-place finish before putting together a six-race win streak against top-class mares at Saratoga and Yonkers, with the final two victories in that span coming from post eight at Yonkers.

Racine Bell then headed to The Meadowlands for two starts, finishing second to Betsy Ross contender Soho Burning Love A before last week's third-place finish behind Lyons Sentinel, a 2019 Dan Patch Award winner, and Keep Rockin A, another Betsy Ross invitee.

"She's very good on any size track," Dewhurst said. "She doesn't have to take the track with her, she will go anywhere. She's just professional about everything. She's well-mannered. You can do anything you want with her. She's just very laidback."

Racine Bell will face seven foes in the Betsy Ross, including Grand Circuit winners Machnhope, JK First Lady, Rocknificent, Treacherous Reign, and Snobbytown. Machnhope captured this season's first Grand Circuit final for pacing mares, the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series championship on April 19 at Yonkers.

"It's exciting when you're racing elite horses," Dewhurst said. "You don't have to get too nervous with her. She just goes out and does her thing."

Racing begins at 12:40 p.m. Sunday at Harrah's Philadelphia. The 15-race card also includes the \$100,000 Commodore Barry for older male pacers and the \$100,000 Maxie Lee Memorial for older trotters plus two divisions of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes for 3-year-old male pacers. How to score big at the betting windows - Part 2

All you need to know about handicapping harness horses and making money betting on them by recognizing when you have stumbled upon the equivalent of sperm whale poop.

Maybe this sounds nonsensical, but one cannot have inside information about a horse unless one has actual inside information on a horse. Such was the case as per my tangential involvement in the private life of Kassa Branca – a monstrous son of No Nukes that I still remember with great affection. Maybe you remember him too.

Kassa Branca's private life, apropos of my story, and not an isolated incident by any means, is literally the Rosetta Stone of why you can't etch anything in stone when it comes to a horse's past performances printed on the pages of a program or any mental notes made about its previous start or starts.

Okay, now we have arrived at those perfumery undertones; the rare ingredient you'll need if you really want to score.

Did you know that the costliest perfumes in the world contain an ingredient called ambergris?

Ambergris is a waxy blob, disguised as a floating rock, that washes up on beaches throughout the world. It's exceedingly rare, and illegal to possess in some countries. If you come upon a chunk, especially if it's big, you've made yourself a small fortune because it's a specific kind of sperm whale poop that is, pound for pound, far more valuable than gold. It's the ingredient in high-end perfumes that makes a fine fragrance stick to your skin. It doesn't evaporate and it holds down those elusive undertones.

If you find a big enough glob of ambergris, you can stop reading because you no longer need to wager on horses.

Stumbling upon genuine inside information about a horse, is like finding a glob of ambergris. This information, legally obtained by observation or happenstance, is the sperm whale poop of horse betting because it sticks. In the case of Kassa Branca, I'd discovered equine ambergris in the form of a priceless glob of inside information about the private life of the horse.

This is how I cashed in on my equine ambergris.

When I was first starting out, stabled one barn away from Kassa Branca, I made a fortune betting a few bucks against him when he jumped it off right out of the gate in a big race at Freehold at odds of about 1-9. The minus pool for show was huge and I walked away as a fearlessly young guy with thousands of dollars in my pocket simply because I knew

something that no analyst or grandstand gambler could have ever known – the horse was cooked.

I don't know exactly what was wrong with him at the time, and apparently neither did the cadre of veterinarians who came and went from his stall while wearing deeply concerned faces in the week preceding a big stakes race for which he was a gigantic favorite. Whatever was wrong remains a mystery to me, but I clearly remember how no one in that camp looked particularly happy.

Meanwhile, the handicappers, both professional and amateur, hammered Kassa Branca with oblivious praise and doomed bridge-jumper mutuel money. For me, however, it was priceless info about a horse who had absolutely nothing to do with me but who I knew for certain had no chance of winning. He did, however, go on to live a long, happy, and productive life. In fact, years later, I would go on to train one of his talented daughters. Her name was Kassa Girl, and I remember her fondly.

Remember earlier when I said that I never bet? Well, I kind of fibbed. To be perfectly clear, I will sometimes bet on horses, but I never gamble. I know that sounds like a clever use of a euphemism, but that's not my intention. Let me explain what I mean.

Throughout my career I have, on exceedingly rare occasions, invested money into a race, but only because I knew something. I'd found a few morsels of ambergris – usually about my own horses.

I had valuable inside information because it involved my own horses. I knew something that can't be assigned a sign or symbol on the program. Mind you, there was nothing shady or crooked about any of these scores. I won honest money by betting my own horse simply because of something that had changed since its last race. If someone had asked me about any of these horses, I would have told

them the absolute truth, but they should have already suspected something had they bothered to look for equipment changes which are unimpeachable sources of authentic information. In fact, as this story moves along, I will tell you about each score and how it happened.

Kassa Branca, a world champion, is a perfect example of how betting AGAINST a horse can be lucrative despite what the program or the professional analysts tell you to the contrary. But Kassa Branca was someone else's horse. Winning big on your own horse is a lot more fun because you get the betting money, the purse money and the glory.

Keep in mind that you should never look to make money by betting AGAINST your own horse. That's shady and I am fairly sure it's illegal. It's also unethical and inhumane for a trainer to race a horse if he or she knows for certain that it's sore or sick. Betting against your own horse because you know it's physically impaired is criminally foolish. Thankfully, I can't remember anyone I ever raced with who did that.

When I mentioned about the outside burr headpole before, I didn't mean to suggest that a trainer is intentionally racing a sore horse and rigging around that soreness. It's just that most horsemen go through the same motions as they slowly figure out why a horse is doing this or that in a race. Usually, they never figure it out, but on a few occasions, I did, and it paid off enormously.

Early on in my harness racing career, too early if you ask me, I was given a famous horse to rehabilitate. His name was Watchit Skipper. At least 50 per cent of my readers – especially some racing analysts – bugged out because Watchit Skipper was a punter's superman. He always finished exactly where he figured to finish – usually first.

If you wagered or raced at Yonkers or Roosevelt or Freehold in the late 1980s, you knew Watchit Skipper. Devoid of any personality, he was instead a determined robot who

could get around a half-mile turn like a Porsche Carrera.

Before he injured a ligament behind his right knee, Skip was one of the best open class pacers in the country. He was famous for his blue-collar grit. He loved being first over, and if he got the lead passing the three-quarter pole, he refused to be passed. Legend has it that Walter Case developed his patented three-wide at the half move while sitting behind Watchit Skipper. We'll have to check with Walt about that.

Before I got him, "Skip" had been trained by a few of the top trainers, and he always wore an outside burr headpole or Murphy blind. Apart from his talent, Skip's claim to fame at the time I got him was that his \$125,000 tag, along with the New York State sales tax, made him the highest priced claim in the history of harness racing. He had to dip into the high-end claimers whenever the season's stake horses dropped in for an Invitational event. His claiming price record has since been broken.

Odds were against him making it back to the races, but because the nature of his injury would never be life-threatening, and he always had a forever home waiting for him, I found it easy to give it a try.

After months of training and swimming, he was ready to go, but just before he qualified, I noticed that he was starting to grab that left line in the straights but coming off it in the turns. Now, what's the first thing anyone would do if a horse gets back on the left line but vets out sound? They'd put that headpole and Murphy blind right back on, right? Not me.

I had a gut feeling that something had never been 100% right in his left hind, and whatever it was, it eventually led to his right front injury. I mean, this horse was so determined to keep his nose in front that he abused his right front to keep off his left hind. Usually, a horse will figure this out, but with the really game ones, they wait until they've made a million dollars before they start protecting themselves.

I know that sounds like CARE AND TRAINING OF THE TROTTER AND PACER – the 1940 edition – but in this case it was true. Contrary to the norm, my youth and curiosity worked in my favor. Instead of reaching for a headpole, I reached out for an old veterinarian. Well, I thought he was old, but he was probably about 35. His name is Dr. Rick Balmer. He held up the horse's left hind and said, "Now, if I press here and he flinches, we found the problem." Doc pressed and Skip flinched. Problem solved. Headpole and Murphy tossed aside. Ambergris uncovered.

Every young trainer should start out with a great horse and a great veterinarian. It's like learning to speak English when you're a child and your teachers speak like Shakespearean actors. You're going to learn it and you're going to learn it right. Do you know what I mean?

Anyway, it was just a jack cord. It was the most minor thing. In fact, it was something that a lot of old-time guys used to look for. How had it gone undetected for so long? If you don't know what a jack cord is, you might be reading the wrong publication.

So, I qualified Skip and he was good. Because he was so well known, and I wasn't, everyone expected a disaster, but that's the opposite of what happened. He started winning again, and in time he had worked his way back to the upper classes. At 7 years old, however, he was starting to get old. After he won an open pace at Freehold ([see the video here](#)) I decided to put him for a \$75,000 tag. He wasn't great, and it was decided that \$60,000 was a better spot. He won that easily, but he got claimed.

For his new connections he raced so-so for one start but when I checked the equipment board the next week, the new connections had added the dreaded outside headpole and Murphy blind. The jack cord thing must have been coming back and he raced poorly. The following week, they added a

Murphy blind and an outside burr headpole, then a rolling burr, then a steering bar. He was running out so badly that throughout the course of several months, he earned nothing. The only thing he gained was more and more rigging. Had he looked lame I would have jumped in with heroics, but he was just locked on the line and pacing slowly because he'd finally figured out how to protect himself. Mind you, this horse was a total professional and I was the only person who knew what was wrong.

Just as I was about to intervene with my inside info – the key to the horse – I got a call from the new connections asking me if I wanted him back. They wanted \$20,000 – as is. I asked to sit behind him, they agreed. The moment I grabbed the lines I knew all I needed to know, so I drove away with him for a haggled \$18,000. I'm sure they thought I was an idiot. I guess I could have just told them how to fix him in an instant, but business is business. Those are easy words for most people to say, but I don't like that I did this. It always bugged me that I took advantage of that situation. I suspect that it's the least dignified thing I ever did in harness racing, unless you count the brocade jacket I wore to the Hambletonian in 2017. What was I thinking?

Anyway, I got Watchit Skipper back to my barn, called Dr. Balmer, got him off the line in three-seconds, waited two weeks and entered him in a race where he appeared to be buried – at least on poisonous paper. He was the longest shot on the board. Do you remember when I told you that horses have private lives, and that racing analysts and handicappers cannot factor this into their selections? Do you remember when I warned you about the poison on the paper?

If I had been interviewed prior to the race and asked the typical things about getting my classy old horse back, and how did I like him, what would I have said? Probably something like, "I'm excited to have him back. I made some changes and he trained well and with a little luck... blah, blah, blah."

See what I mean? I wouldn't be lying. I couldn't very well say, "There is a key to this horse, and I am the only person who knows it and he is going to crush these horses because I

fixed it."

I mean, that's what I was thinking, but If I'd said it, I would have sounded like a pushy neophyte. Naturally, I would have a thousand people singing my praises if he rolled over the field and won – which he did – but how long would my new fans have stuck around even though Watchit Skipper would yet again make a huge comeback? The guy who claimed him for \$60,000 and sold him back to me for \$18,000 with a hidden snicker got a dozen new horses from his owners. All I got was my horse back and about \$10,000 from my win bet when he won easily at odds of 60-1. For me, that seemed more than fair.

Why did a former champion pay \$60 to win after a 10-month layoff against horses he used to walk over? That's easy to answer. Everyone focused on the long layoff and the young nobody trainer, but far more importantly, no one bothered to notice the revealing equipment change: "Minus rolling burr headpole right side, minus Murphy blind right side. Minus steering bar."

Add to this mix, his general appearance in the post parade. Rather than pull and fret, something I had seen him do long before I had him, he simply loped along athletically, head down with that kind of blasé poise that a lot of great horses have.

Sure, I took advantage of what I knew, things that weren't at all apparent in the program, but the equipment changes and the way he scored down shouted, "BET ME!" No one bothered to sniff out either the overtones or the undertones.

It's also nice to see that Dr. Balmer, the only other person privy to the horse's key, was simply content to help the horse. He didn't involve himself in any other way. He's just a brilliant veterinarian who cares about the welfare of the horses he treats.

Okay, so we got one betting story out of the way. In the next issue I will finish up with two more examples.

Rising star Luke Hanners making the most of every second of his long days

The 'Phone Jockey' is equally adept at taking calls as he is at getting them.

Luke Hanners laughs seconds before he shares the nickname he acquired not so long ago, a moniker he admits is rather appropriate.

Whenever the young standardbred driver gets behind wheel and heads to the racetrack, the trek, which can be nearly two hours, one way, doesn't usually include a steady stream of music to keep him company.

Instead, Hanners typically occupies the time by either fielding or making phone calls.

Lots of them.

"I don't really listen to a whole lot of music when I'm in the car. I'm probably on the phone."

The Ohio native is definitely dialed-in both as a driver and trainer.

Four years ago, Hanners won two races and had five top-three finishes from 14 starts in the race bike. In 2018, he made eight trips to the winner's circle. One year later, he launched his training career, and earned seven victories to go along with his 12 driving scores.

It was 2020 when the young horseman really started to make others take notice of his talents. He recorded 43 driving wins from 498 starts and added 21 top-three finishes from 85 training starts.

In 2021, Hanners has been even more impressive, already surpassing his career-best driving marks across the board.

With more success comes more demand for his services. It also means he's spending more time on the road. In May, he's competed at Rosecroft, Freehold, and The Meadowlands.

But Hanners is hardly complaining about the hectic pace

that keeps him busy from early morning to late in the evening.

The long hours he puts in are certainly not in vain.

"It's starting to [pay off]. It takes a while, but it's nice when you finally can sense that it's coming together. The confidence the trainers have in me, and giving me the lines of good horses – it's really helped me. As long as they know you're trying – if you happen to get locked in, but have a lot of pace late – they'll come back with you. Recently, everything is starting to fall into position. I've been fortunate to be able to drive some nice horses – that's the biggest thing. When you get to grab the lines behind one that is 1-5 instead of 50-1 it definitely helps with your confidence. I have some good horses of my own that I train, which has helped out too."

Two trotters have been significant contributors to Hanners' hot hand.

Euro Gap, a 7-year-old son of Manofmanymissions (ON), has won a pair of races this year, including a 14 3/4-length romp at Rosecroft in March.

Docs Swan Song, a 5-year-old son of Swan For All (IN), trotted his fastest career mile, 1:54.1, at The Meadowlands on May 14, a fourth-place effort with Hanners in the bike.

"All of them have helped me this year. Each year, you want to do better than the year before. I want to win as many as I can, but the goal is to keep increasing all the numbers. I've been able to drive horses for some great people, including Brian Callahan and Megan Roberts, which has allowed me to go to Freehold and other places. When you can drive for those good stables and have those good horses, it makes all

the difference in the world. When you see people have confidence you, it really does give you that added boost. And when you have your own doing well, it all adds up.”

As for personal highlights, it’s a place, not a horse, that comes to mind for Hanners.

“I think it would be having the opportunity to go to The Meadowlands and drive there, to get those catch drives and compete there. That’s definitely been one of the big moments.”

When it comes to challenges, the answer doesn’t come nearly as quickly.

Not that there haven’t been hurdles.

“That’s a tough one. There are definitely some. I couldn’t think of one in particular right now, but I know there are some, for sure.”

Whenever he does face any difficult situations, Hanners is reminded of the words his late father, accomplished horseman Brad Hanners, would often share with him.

That advice continues to guide him as he works to construct a prosperous racing career.

“My dad always used to tell me that ‘Rome wasn’t built in a day.’ That’s always stuck with me and I hold on to that. You won’t achieve that instant success overnight and you have to work at it every day. After each night of racing, I always think about that. If I have a bad night, I just turn the page quicker, and focus on the next night and what I need to do to have better results.

“Watching my dad – he was a really good driver – so I wanted to live up to that. That makes me strive for greatness. My dad gave us a good name. My mom [Alicia] has always been there for me. Whether it’s helping me out in the barn or the paddock, she’s always there to support me. My brother [fellow driver, Austin ([full story here](#))] and my mom watch every race that I’m in.”

There isn’t much time for Hanners to chase other pursuits outside of the racetrack. In fact, when asked what his favorite interest outside of the standardbred world is, he came up with a fitting response.

“I guess it would be sleep. Right now, racing is five or six days a week. So, there’s not much to do beyond that. You start the day early and you’re not done until late at night.”

Perhaps he forgot his other calling, pun intended.

He didn’t earn the nickname ‘Phone Jockey’ without good reason.

“If it’s a two-and-a-half hour drive, I’m probably on the phone for two hours, at the minimum. A lot of it is business,

but some of it is just talking, either to my brother or my friends. I’m always on the phone.”

And with that, it’s time for Hanners to be on his way.

After all, there are plenty of miles ahead and conversations for Hanners to navigate.

Pompeo Gomez was born to ride

Meadowlands marshal Pompeo Gomez started riding at a young age. It just wasn't on horses.

"My first job when I was 5 or 6 years old, I used to help my grandma take care of the sheep and goats," said Gomez. "I started riding goats and sheep when I was 6 or 7 years old."

Gomez, 58, grew up on his family's farm in Mexico that produced corn and beans and had lots of animals.

"I was 11 years old when my daddy taught me how to plow the field. First with bulls and then with horses," said Gomez. "With the bulls, we had no reins, no nothing. It was just by your voice."

At 18, Gomez got a job at a factory in the city where he stayed for a couple of years because he needed the money, but he never enjoyed it because he wanted to be outside.

"We were always outdoors people," said Gomez. "We only were indoors for school. I think growing up there was one of the best times because you were always busy doing something."

Gomez came to the United States in 1986 wanting to work with horses, and he finally was able to four years later in Ocala, FL with thoroughbreds.

He continues to work with the thoroughbreds 30 years later as an exercise rider and a pony rider at Monmouth Park in New Jersey and even owns a couple of thoroughbreds with his brother, Aurelio.

In fact, the first time he worked at The Meadowlands was in 2000 as a pony rider for the thoroughbreds.

In 2012, while exercising thoroughbreds with Beth Cumberland, the outrider at Freehold Raceway, he found out that The Meadowlands was hiring. Gomez also spoke with Jack Folke, who had previously been The Meadowlands' outrider for many years.

"I talked to them and they said [The Meadowlands] is looking for an outrider and they gave me a number for Mr. Peter Koch, who was the race secretary back then," said Gomez.

Koch remembers getting a recommendation for Gomez from Debra Andrews, the retiring Meadowlands marshal.

"I'll tell you one thing, it was a seamless transition for him," said Koch. "He picked it up right away. And all I've ever heard is positive feedback about him. I don't think he had ever worked with harness horses before he came up there and he caught on great. I know the horsemen think a lot of him. He's 100 per cent reliable and he's probably one of the nicest people you'd meet. The guy is always upbeat."

"I would classify him as an ideal employee because you never have to worry, he's always going to be there and he does a great job. That to me is the best employee you could have."

Gomez now spends almost all of his time with horses. His typical routine has him up at 4 a.m. taking care of his own horses prior to 7:30 when he does exercise riding for trainer Holly Harris, among others.

He's at Monmouth – which is nearby his Long Branch home – in the afternoon as a thoroughbred pony rider before making the drive north to The Meadowlands on nights that they race.

"I ponied for three Haskell winners before I started working at The Meadowlands," he said.

Most followers of The Big M will see Gomez on a regular basis holding onto a horse right before the start of a race.

"A lot of the time a horse just doesn't want to turn to go the other way on the track, so we just need Pompeo there to help us make the horse do what it's supposed to do," said driver Andy McCarthy. "A big reason you need [an outrider] is if there is an accident, well then, they can go and scoop up a loose horse. He's very good at it as well. He's a great outrider."

Gomez works as a team with his retired thoroughbred that he named Red River.

"He's 16 years old and I got him when he was 5," said Gomez. "I feel blessed because at The Meadowlands we don't have many issues with loose horses."

Meadowlands' chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir appreciates the work Gomez does on track as well as the positive attitude he has while doing it.

"He's fantastic," said Settlemoir. "He's great out there on the racetrack making sure the horsemen and horses are safe and feel comfortable. If you've got a rank horse, or something like that, Pompeo is always right there. And he's always helping out with equipment on the track. He's very versatile as an outrider and I just appreciate all of his work out there because he is excellent. That's for certain. He's always nice to deal with and he's always smiling no matter what. It can be pouring down rain and he's out there doing 'God Bless America' and he's still got a smile on his face."

Gomez and Red River are also known for performing a routine on the track following the seventh race, with God Bless America playing on the loudspeaker.

The idea for the performance came from Big M chairman and chief executive officer, Jeff Gural.

Gural, in Kentucky for the meet at The Red Mile some time ago, went to the Kentucky Horse Park and watched the parade of breeds.

"My recollection is they started with having one of the riders carry the flag and they played one of the patriotic songs and I thought it was a great idea," said Gural. "We started doing it at Tioga and Vernon [in 2006] and it was well received up there. So, I thought I would try it at The Meadowlands [in 2012], and to my surprise, to a certain extent it worked. I think people appreciate it and stand for the most part.

"I believe very strongly in honoring our veterans and honoring America. You go to a baseball game and they have a seventh-inning stretch. I've been going to baseball games all my life and I always look forward to the seventh-inning

stretch. So, it was a combination of baseball and the fact that I saw it at the Horse Park."

Over the past year, with the pandemic and few or sometimes no fans in the stands, Gomez and Red River have not performed, with the one exception being on Friday, Sept. 11, 2020.

But, with restrictions being lifted in the state of New Jersey, Gomez was scheduled to return to action after the seventh race tonight (May 28) but a predicted thunderstorm may postpone his return until Saturday.

No matter the conditions, when you see Gomez at The Meadowlands he looks at home, which makes sense when you consider that his brother, Ausencio, a former groom and exercise rider, is now a blacksmith. And his brothers, Jesus and Aurelio, are exercise riders that also ride pony horses in the afternoon. Obviously, it's in his blood.

"I enjoy my life working with the horses, that's all I can say," said Gomez.

Too many winning favorites is a customer killer

We hear it time after time: there are too many favorites, harness racing is too predictable, and it's bad for the game. Are these people all wet, or do they have a point?

Let's talk some gambling.

We all know a game of coin flip can't be beaten long term. But there is a way to make this game somewhat attractive. For this 50 per cent proposition, with a one per cent takeout, a \$1,000 bankroll and \$50 bets (original bet size; five per cent of bankroll ongoing), we can flip a coin 20 times each week for 20 weeks and still mathematically have about \$820 of our bankroll left. With that much cash in the kitty many could keep playing, hoping to go on a run.

A casual sports bettor making 20 five per cent bets per weekend with that same \$1,000 bankroll for the NFL season plus some playoff games (20 weeks), mathematically will have about \$400 of their \$1,000 remaining. They can, and do, keep firing.

A craps bettor going to the casino once a week playing a \$10 pass line with 3x4x5x odds over an hour (about \$1,000 in wagers per session), will have approximately \$800 of their \$1,000 bankroll remaining after 20 weeks.

Meanwhile in horse racing (at current takeout rates) things are not attractive. If a casual bettor puts \$1,000 in an ADW account and makes 20 win bets of five per cent each week over a few racing cards, they would not be able to make a minimum \$2 wager at five per cent after 16 weeks. They'd essentially be broke.

Digesting those numbers, why would anyone play horse racing over these other games? That's easy, and I'm sure you're screaming it from the rafters. This sport *is not* a coin flip – there are not only two outcomes in a race.

If you flip on a thoroughbred race from overseas or a deep turf race at Keeneland or Belmont there are many possible

winners. For a Kentucky Derby it's common to see bettors digging into the past performances and liking a dozen horses or more. It's a huge asset – high takeout rates are somewhat muted when there is more choice.

But what about harness racing? On paper it should be the same. However, with favorite win rates approaching 50 per cent, it turns a game with lots of variance and choice into a game of coin flip. The game's edge is degraded.

We see this phenomenon more and more in the current speed favoring, slot fueled nature of the sport. Sure, there may be eight horses in a field at Yonkers, but the outside horses are waiting for a better post and there are two likely winners on the inside. Stakes racing is not much better, if at all. We usually have a choice between a 7-5 Burke and a 4-5 Takter, with a whole whack of horses hoping for a check. This is the major reason thoroughbred stakes races attract millions of dollars with ease, while harness stakes races do not.

A couple of weeks ago on these pages, harness racing gamblers discussed [why shutting holes might improve the sport, making it more unpredictable](#) and how it may help bring closers into play. You've no doubt seen talk about eliminating passing lanes, staggered starting gates, bonuses for winning from outside posts and the like. These ideas (whether good or bad) come from a good place.

Harness racing can't thrive as a gambling game with an exacta of high takeout and more and more chalk. The fields have to be deeper; the game has to be made more attractive. It's no grand conspiracy; there are no tin foil hats. It's just math.

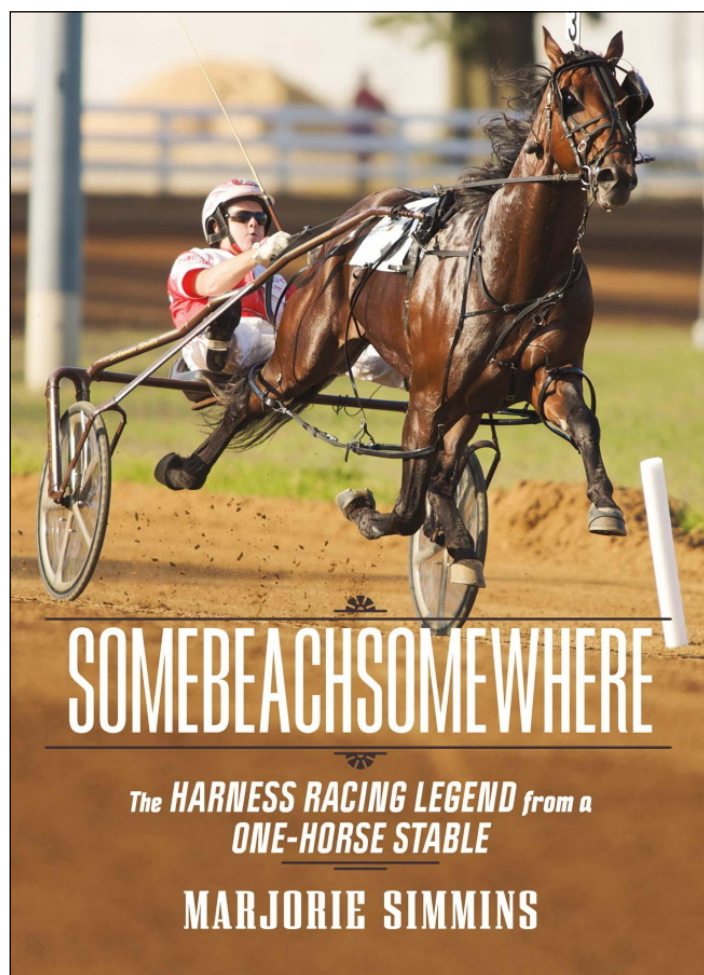
Somebeachsomewhere: The Harness Racing Legend from a One-Horse Stable

Marjorie Simmins calls her home in D'Escousse, NS “the center of the world.” It’s a fitting place for the author to introduce her new book about a Nova Scotian horse who became the center of the racing world in his all-too-brief lifetime. Tuesday (May 25) was the virtual launch for “Somebeachsomewhere: The Harness Racing Legend from a One-Horse Stable.” Nimbus Publishing and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame hosted the online event, with owner/trainer Brent MacGrath and driver Paul MacDonell answering questions alongside Simmins on the shared screen. More than two years after Somebeachsomewhere was euthanized, interest in his story remains strong enough to warrant a full account.

“Somebeachsomewhere: The Harness Racing Legend from a One-Horse Stable” is shaped by interviews with most of the major players in the late stallion’s racing and breeding careers. MacGrath, who purchased him as a colt and campaigned him in his two years on the track, provided much of the material; there are also contributions from fellow Schooner Stables members Garry Pye, Reg Petitpas, Jamie Bagnell, Pam Dean, and Stu Rath, as well as Brent’s wife Rhonda MacGrath. Simmins interviewed “Beach’s” breeder Stephanie Smith-Rothaug to learn of the unusual circumstances behind the colt’s pedigree and sale; explored his stud career at Hanover Shoe Farms with Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky; and discussed Somebeachsomewhere’s lone overseas breeding season with David James of Empire Stallions, Australia. Through interviewees’ accounts (which include remarks from HRU editor Dave Briggs), quotes from race calls and published articles on “Beach”, Simmins paid homage to a horse she never met or watched in his lifetime.

Simmins explained that despite her equestrian background in British Columbia, she never connected with the harness racing community in that province. It was too far removed from where her love of horses began: “I was raised in West Vancouver, where there’s a little pocket of rural land called Southlands. It’s 99 acres of horses. It’s unique in Canada, a beautiful, special spot.” With its proximity to Exhibition Park racetrack, off-track thoroughbreds found careers with riders at Southlands before warmblood horses arrived on the scene. “There were at least three harness racing tracks a little out of Vancouver in the suburbs that I was aware of, but I didn’t move in those circles,” she recalled. Hunter-jumper riders weren’t exposed to standardbred racing, or the post-racing



potential of harness horses, so “the standardbreds came into [her] consciousness later on.”

Why document Somebeachsomewhere? “There were a number of reasons,” Simmonds told HRU in an interview Wednesday. “I think writers are fascinated by big, wonderful subjects, and this was obviously a big, wonderful subject. I thought with my equestrian background, in some ways, it would make things a little easier for me.” She added that there was a learning curve in getting acquainted with harness racing: “In fact, I had to do two solid years of research and interviews and so on, so there was nothing easy about it.”

After relocating to Nova Scotia, Simmins had taken Western riding lessons from the wife of a Northside Downs driver, and soon took an interest in the North Sydney, NS track that was “somewhat in [her] backyard.” Listening to friends in Cape Breton and learning more about standardbreds, she realized Somebeachsomewhere “was the Secretariat of harness racing,” yet had no book to document his impact.

To gain an appreciation for Somebeachsomewhere’s accomplishments, the writer watched his race replays on YouTube. “I was watching his races, and I’d sit there crying,”

she recalled, feeling drawn into the magic of the pacer's 2007 and 2008 racing seasons. "It's the power and the majesty and the heart and determination. [...] I was just like, 'Wow – this is the best of the best I'm watching.'" She found that his performances moved her in the same way that watching a superior thoroughbred or show jumper in action would.

The author noted that she thought racing fans would have an automatic interest in a Somebeachsomewhere biography, but she also wanted it to transcend that niche audience. "My intent with writing the book was to make sure that anyone who picked it up would enjoy it," she explained. "That meant that I had to write in a particular way that wasn't going to put off the harness racing people and was not going to mystify the general reader. It was a careful dance that I had to do." Simmins added a glossary of harness racing terminology to help the story transcend boundaries.

But will there be readers who aren't already familiar with the famed pacer and his sport? Simmins is convinced, and convincing, about her book's prospects. "Remember, this was a Canadian hero," she said. "The horsepeople will find horse books, they simply do. I do! I'm always interested in whatever horse is being written about, but I wanted Canadians to know that they had a superstar and his legacy continues."

For animal lovers who might avoid a racing book due to disturbing media reports about poor treatment of ex-racehorses, "Somebeachsomewhere: The Harness Racing Legend from a One-Horse Stable" also visits the topic of life after racing, featuring an interview with Joanne Colville of the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society. "I knew there would be critics of the industry, because there simply are," observed Simmins. "These are our four-legged darlings and we need to take better care of them than we do. People like Joanne Colville have a very special place in Heaven."

Admittedly "still learning" about the sport, Simmins is an enthusiastic newcomer to harness racing, having made visits to Northside Downs and Inverness Raceway and occasionally Truro Raceway in the recent past. (All three tracks' seasons are currently on hold due to heightened Nova Scotia COVID-19 restrictions.) "It's been a treat to learn more, and I do feel lucky that there are great tracks here," she shared.

The author called her new release "ambitious" in scope, but "it wasn't a difficult sell, at all" when she approached Nimbus Publishing with her initial proposal. Brent MacGrath was also on board early with the idea of Simmins' book, from when she first called him about the project. Now, as copies of the finished book begin reaching readers, Simmins said she looks forward to being able to meet MacGrath's two colts and a

filly, all by Somebeachsomewhere, stabled at Truro Raceway.

"My hope for the book would be that all those wonderful things that people experienced watching 'The Beach,' hearing about 'The Beach,' reading short articles about him, etcetera, that they could experience that again in the book," she noted. "It's a feel-good book, because the world is not in a great place right now." As Somebeachsomewhere's descendants carry on his legacy in racing, Simmins' book keeps his name alive for a wider audience.

Beware of Caesars bearing gifts

By now most of you have heard about what has happened to pari-mutuel harness racing in the state of Florida. It's going to end after the 2021-2022 season at Pompano Park. In all likelihood, Pompano Park will close its harness racing stable area in May of 2022, never to open again. The word to remember is decoupling.

For 10 years the Florida Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association (FSBOA) had fought decoupling and was winning the fight until this last special legislation gambling session in Tallahassee last week. The bill passed both the House and Senate and has been signed into law by Gov. DeSantis.

The Florida Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association (FSBOA) did have a choice months ago to take a deal from Caesars (reported to be upwards of \$15 million cash and the racing license if they drop their lawsuit and go race someplace else). The FSBOA failed to take the deal in time and when the decoupling bill passed the FL Senate Committee unanimously, Caesars snatched the deal off the table).

This is a warning to every pari-mutuel harness racing track in the United States. Decoupling is headed your way.

Precedent has now been set and Caesars, Mohegan Sun, and any racinos not owned by a harness racing person, like a Jeff Gural, better watch out because they are already looking into how they can decouple and no longer have to conduct harness racing and still keep their casino(s) open. They are prepared for the long run. It took them 10 years in Florida.

And believe me, they are already wringing their hands.

Watch out Indiana, watch out Ohio, watch out Pennsylvania, especially Pennsylvania as the Wolf (Gov. Wolf) is already at the door. He may not get his way this year, but he won't give up and now that decoupling has happened, he will be loaded up for bear next year.

Read the signs everyone. Nearly every racino track has pretty much done away with publicity and marketing for harness racing.

Yonkers Raceway, The Meadows, Harrah's Philadelphia, Pocono Downs, Plainridge Racecourse and others all hire outside sources to do publicity or the horsemen's association hires outsiders to cover their races. In some cases, the only time a story is written is when there is a stakes race or a \$1 million handle night. Scioto Downs, Monticello Raceway, Hollywood Dayton, Miami Valley and others have GMs or the race secretary do the stories, if any are written at all.

Having worked 10 years as a senior director at Pompano Park for the Isle of Capri casinos taught me a lot of how the casino upper echelons work. They have no issues spending millions of dollars to get what they want. They know down the road they will earn it back three-fold. They have the financial backing, cut throat methods of trimming the so-called fat, and the ability to wait until the timing is right to strike.

If racing does not make enough EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization used as an indicator of the overall profitability of a business) then out the door they go. Stockholders only care about EBITDA.

Almost all forms of pari-mutuel racing (dogs, jai-alai and harness racing, though not the thoroughbreds) can now be decoupled in Florida. Everyone else in the USA better watch out as the racinos will be looking to decouple your racing.

USTA to donate \$40,000 and establish new funding mechanism for STA

The U.S. Trotting Association (USTA) announced Monday (May 24) that the organization will donate \$40,000 and establish a new funding mechanism to assist the Standardbred Transition Alliance (STA). The \$40,000 will come from the USTA's Support Our Standardbreds budget.

In their May 13 meeting, the USTA's Executive Committee voted to make the contribution and establish a new, opt-in option for USTA members to donate to the STA, which will be included on all new and renewal membership applications.

"The \$40,000 and the opportunity for our members to make voluntary donations through their membership applications reaffirms the USTA's commitment to the Standardbred Transition Alliance," said USTA executive vice-president and CEO Mike Tanner, who initially proposed the establishment of the STA at the annual board of directors meeting in March, 2018.

"The STA accreditation process ensures that their approved horse rescue organizations are operated with a professional structure and are accountable for their treatment of the horses, which provides assurance to donors that their contributions will be used responsibly," said Tanner.

"The more money that can be raised, the more of our retired racehorses can receive the type of aftercare they



deserve when they are retired. But besides the donation, there are many other ways that the USTA can promote and support the STA; and we're committed to doing that."

The STA operates under the guidance of its board of directors and is completely independent of the USTA, who previously donated \$75,000 in initial funding for the creation of the organization. David Reid serves as president and Jennifer Daniels is the STA administrator.

"The STA deeply appreciates the support of the USTA's directors, staff and membership, particularly in developing this opportunity for members to easily and securely transmit their aftercare contributions as they're submitting other USTA transactions," said Daniels.

According to its website, "The mission of the Standardbred Transition Alliance (STA) is to inspect, accredit and award grants to approved organizations that acquire, rehabilitate, train and re-home standardbred horses, using industry-wide funding. The STA is approved as a 501(c)(3) Internal Revenue approved charity and is also registered with the Ohio Secretary of State and Attorney General. IRS application for 501(c)(3) designation was filed in October of 2018 and approved in April of 2019.

"The existing groups are at or beyond capacity. There is a wide disparity in numbers of horses served, services provided, staffing, budgets and other resources. Horse adoption programs generally operate with no oversight and no way for donors to ensure their money is being used wisely. We need additional groups to help Standardbreds across the country.

"It is expected that the accreditation process will elevate the level of both business and equine care practices and identify groups whose work is sustainable and exemplary."

Ontario Racing announces purse payment program due to suspension of racing

Ontario Racing is pleased to announce that standardbred horsepeople now have the opportunity to access certain purse funds that remain available under the Funding Agreement with Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation (OLG) as a result of the continued suspension of live racing in the province as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The aforementioned funds were already committed to the industry through the Funding Agreement for Live Horse Racing between Ontario Racing and OLG. All undistributed relief funds will be added to purse funds for live races moving forward.

"Ontario Racing, OLG, and industry representatives, remain dedicated to supporting horsepeople and their horses throughout these challenging times," said John Hayes, chair, Ontario Racing. "While the past 14 months have been extremely trying for our industry and its thousands of participants, we appreciate your backing and look forward to the resumption of live racing across the province."

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ontario Racing created a task force, as it did during the spring lockdown in 2020, to address the financial impacts to Standardbred horse racing in Ontario.

Eligibility Requirements:

For horsepeople to be eligible for financial payments *for the month of May* pursuant to this program, the Standardbred COVID-19 Task Force has determined that horses must meet the criteria outlined below to be eligible to receive an equine benefit payment:

May Training Benefit Payment - \$1,000 per horse:

1. Any horse stabled in Ontario with a charted line in Ontario in 2021 and is not currently racing or training/stabled outside of Ontario without returning to Ontario April 5, 2021 shall receive \$1,000 in relief funding.

No application required.

2. The following horses that are preparing to race and are currently stabled in Ontario for the month of May are eligible to apply for **\$1,000 in equine benefit funding**:

- Unraced in 2021 3- & 4-year-olds
- Any horse who started in Ontario between Sept. 1 – Dec. 23, 2020 that was stabled in Ontario at the time of the start and remained in Ontario until Dec. 23, 2020

If the horses to be submitted for May are the same that were submitted for the April equine benefit payment, you do not need to submit an application for May to receive the May equine benefit payment.

All horses under both criteria must remain in Ontario for the month of May to receive funding and make their first start in Ontario once live racing resumes in Ontario. If a horse qualifies under both criteria, the horse is eligible for only a single \$1,000 payment.

Important information about return to racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park

Now that live (spectator-free) standardbred racing is set to resume in Ontario, our entire racing community has a collective responsibility to follow all COVID-19 Prevention Protocols for the safety of our horse racing community and to protect our racing program from future disruptions.

To that end, Woodbine Mohawk Park has updated its comprehensive COVID-19 Monitoring and Travel Restriction rules.

Horsepeople are to ensure that all their staff are familiar with and always following the below instructions. Please review thoroughly with your staff and reach out to manager, racing operations, Megan Walker at mwalker@woodbine.com, if you have any questions.

Travel Restrictions

Traveling within Ontario and Inter-Provincial Travel

Anyone traveling within Ontario and Inter-Provincial Travel will have to go through the daily screening process and online screening survey, per the normal procedures. In addition, individuals will be subject to WEG's enhanced screening requirements/rapid testing (see: Woodbine Enhanced Screening & Race Day Critical Stakeholders Access Action Plan)

Traveling from the U.S.

Horseperson/employees arriving from the USA will be

required to follow all Canadian immigration rules which currently includes a 14-day quarantine and will be permitted onto Woodbine Entertainment property on the 15th day. Any horseperson arriving from the USA who is granted a 'quarantine exemption' by Canadian Border Services, will be required to provide a negative PCR COVID-19 test to Woodbine Entertainment Security taken within 96 hours of their first entry to a Woodbine Entertainment property. For greater clarity, the PCR test can be administered by any accredited lab in the USA or Canada. Once a negative result is confirmed, the horseperson/employee will be permitted onto Woodbine Entertainment property through presentation of the test result document. For extreme clarity, only horsepeople or employees who are expressly granted a 'quarantine exemption' from Canadian Border Services are eligible for this exception. A signed WEG affidavit is required to confirm quarantine exemption. The responsibility of quarantine rules is entirely on the individual. Quarantine exempt individuals who have provided a negative PCR or Rapid Test result will be required to participate in Woodbine Entertainment's Enhanced Screening Program (rapid test).

Proof will be required by each person in the form of a boarding pass, border crossing or anything that shows the date of return to Canada. Once Woodbine Entertainment Security has that date, a COVID-19 Form will be filled out by Security management and the 14-day quarantine period will begin from date of re-entry (pending documented proof).

Anyone returning from the US, who did not expressly receive a 'quarantine exemption' will not be permitted into the stable area or paddock and must quarantine for a minimum of 14 days before accessing the property.

Note: All standardbred horsepeople will be subject to WEG's enhanced screening requirements/rapid testing (see: Woodbine Enhanced Screening & Race Day Critical Stakeholders Access Action Plan) that is in addition to these returning traveler requirements.

Meadowlands Task Force concludes

The Task Force assembled by Meadowlands GM Jason Settlemaier beginning on April 9 came to a conclusion with Thursday's (May 27) conference call. It proved to be an interesting and fruitful exchange between those who race the horses and those who bet on them.

The horseplayers on the panel had opinions on the angles and scope of the various shots on the simulcast signal that were addressed to their satisfaction. They also had several productive exchanges with the drivers on the nuance of racing that answered a few of their questions on tactics.

Settlemaier had these remarks, "This was a good thing. Some of our most knowledgeable customers had access to a few drivers where they could pose a question and get the answer right from 'the horse's mouth.' The calls were taken seriously by all of the participants and I think maybe we all gained a little knowledge.

"We have added important information on the wind velocity and direction and how that affects the races to the program and the simulcast feed. We are producing short informative videos with drivers addressing several topics that we take for granted but may be useful to a new fan. Those will begin to roll out this weekend.

"I appreciate the time and effort spent by all on the task force. We will take time to digest and observe and, if necessary, it is certainly something I'd certainly consider revisiting at a later date."

Million-dollar Mondays at Yonkers Raceway

When Yonkers Raceway management made the decision to scrap Saturday night racing in favor of Wednesdays and switch its upper-level events to the Monday card, hopes were high that the moves would provide favorable returns. Some five months into the experiment and the results are in... and positive.

Since the start of April, total handle has averaged just over one million for the eight programs contested on Monday. The high-water mark came on May 3 when handle was \$1,254,745, easily the largest single-night total seen by the track in nearly a decade.

"We really wanted to move the top-class races to Mondays and that's worked out great," said director of racing Alex

Dadoyan. "Many times those good races could get lost in the shuffle of a crowded weekend simulcast slate but now they can stand out on Mondays. Even if we add back Saturdays to the schedule the top classes are going to stay on the Mondays."

The "Million-Dollar Mondays" are bolstered by the fact that Yonkers has averaged just 10 races per card during the eight-week span, well short of other tracks that typically eclipse that handle bar. Taking the \$100,000 average per race as a barometer, a normal 14-race card offered by many tracks would push the Yonkers handle over the \$1.5 million plateau on some nights.

The Monday cards at Yonkers typically feature some of the best pacers in North America. The Borgata series was moved from Saturday to Monday in 2021 and was very well-received from a handle standpoint.

Planned Vacation: After racing concluded on Thursday (May 27), Yonkers Raceway will take a mini vacation from live racing while the track undergoes maintenance. Racing will resume on Monday, June 7 with the normal Monday to Friday schedule. Post time remains at 7:15 p.m. nightly.

Purse Increase: When the post-break condition sheet is released, owners, trainers and drivers will be delighted to see an across-the-board purse increase. All classes will get a boost with some seeing increases approaching 20 per cent.

The bottom condition of Non-winners-of-\$5,000 (Last 5)/\$12,500 Claiming will bump up to \$12,500 as the lowest purse offered at Yonkers. The top of the class ladder features multiple Opens getting a boost from \$37,000 to \$42,000. One of the largest purse increases are for younger horses, with Maidens now going for \$14,000 and Non-winners-of-2-races at \$16,000.

New to the class system at Yonkers will be a Non-winners-of-\$30,000 (Last 5) and \$75,000 Claimer which Racing Secretary Bob Miccuna is hoping will fill.

Triple Crown: Yonkers will play host to the first legs of both the Pacing and Trotting Triple Crowns on Friday, July 2. Eliminations for the MGM Yonkers Trot and MGM Grand Messenger Pace are slated for June 25. A total of 44 colts and geldings are eligible to the Yonkers Trot while 38 were nominated to the Messenger. Both events offer a \$30,000 supplement option for horses who are not eligible.

KYSS receives record nominations

Record nominations to Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) programs point to an exciting 2021 racing season.

- Overall 208 horses eligible, up 50 horses, for an increase of 32 per cent

“The enhanced Kentucky Proud Series kicks off this weekend with the Washington County Fair held at the Lebanon Fairgrounds with an exciting 17-race card. It is exciting to see this program grow. The Kentucky Sire Stakes Advisory Panel has really worked closely together to help the Kentucky Proud Series prosper,” said Brady.

As a reminder, all fully nominated horses will be eligible for the early closing races and series to be held as part of the new Corbin at The Red Mile meet that begins on July 4, with three racing days a week (Sunday-Tuesday) throughout the month of July, and the Oak Gove Racing & Gaming meet that begins on October 12 and runs through November 23 (Sunday-Tuesday).

Small takeouts lead to big play at Big M

The Meadowlands is popular with players given the half-dozen opportunities they are given nightly to dive into large pools that offer a low takeout of 15 per cent. What sometimes gets lost in the shuffle is the fact that almost all other Big M wagers have bets that have takeouts of just 17 and 20 per cent.

Here are the six wagers that offer the 15 per cent takeout, and what their average pools have been during the first three weeks of May:

- Race 1: 20-cent Pick-5 (\$90,897)
- Race 3: 20-cent Survivor Pick-7 (\$15,408)
- Race 6: 50-cent Pick-4 (\$119,634)
- Race 8: 20-cent Pick-6 (\$22,934)
- Race 10: 50-cent Pick-4 (\$113,522)
- Race 13: 10-cent Hi-5/Pentafecta (\$33,044)

“We have priced our wagering menu to attract horseplayers from all around the world,” said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. “The lower takeouts create more winners, and without winners, there is no game.”

“The lower minimums have attracted a new demographic of players who can now bet more combinations and last longer. When you put all those things together, along with fantastic races to wager on every weekend, you get the consistently monstrous handle numbers we have seen during 2021. Last weekend, we extended our streak of consecutive \$3-million-handle nights to 16, a record that can be attributed to our top-flight racing, low takeout wagers and an incredibly loyal fan base, for whom we are very appreciative.”

The competitive racing at The Big M always gives players a shot at a score, and thus far in May, score they have, with the Survivor Pick-7 leading the way with an average payoff of \$4,529.

The Pick-5 is next, averaging \$4,515, followed by the Pick-6 (\$3,582), Hi-5/Pentafecta (\$1,851), Late Pick-4 (\$1,321) and Early Pick-4 (\$668).

Across-the-board bettors get a fair shake at The Meadowlands, as win, place and show bets have a 17 per cent takeout. Daily Double and Exacta wagers are at 19 percent takeout while Superfectas and Pick-3s have a 20 per cent rake.

On Saturday, the Exacta was as popular as ever. Of the \$3.7 million in total handle, over \$1 million of that was bet on the Exacta alone, accounting for 28 per cent of all wagering on the 14-race card.

FASTER, FASTER! “We have seen an extraordinary group of fast horses competing during May,” said Settlemoir. “For example, we had 49 races for male pacers this month, and 23 of those went under-1:50.”

Proof of the high-octane horses competing at the mile oval came last Saturday (May 22), when the fastest mile of the

year in the sport was equaled by Nicholas Beach, who stopped the clock in 1:47.2 just one week after American History recorded an identical time for the mile.
