Once a horse goes behind the gate, the public owns that horse

In the push and pull between the best interests of participants and bettors, never forget it's a gambling game and the gamblers fund the vast majority of the non-stakes purses that the owners, trainers and drivers win. The sport's survival depends on bettors being top of mind more often and racing officials doing their jobs.

I am neither a bettor nor a horse owner (though, one day, I'd like to be the latter), but I've been around both long enough to form pretty strong opinions about who is right in the latest donnybrook pitting the best interest of harness racing gamblers versus the participants.

At the end of his column in Friday's HRU, Brett Sturman said it was "inexcusable" that reigning Horse of the Year Test Of Faith went off at 1-9 last Saturday in a fillies and mares open at The Meadowlands and was "inexplicably taken back to last in a field of six, (where) all she could do was close belatedly to just get up for second." Don't forget this was her third pari-mutuel start of the year — coming off a 1:49.4 win in the Graduate — not her first start of 2022 where an easier trip should be expected by handicappers.

Never forget it is the gamblers — whether directly through the pari-mutuel system or indirectly by betting in casinos that give a cut to racing — that fund the vast majority of the non-stakes purses that the owners win.

Sturman's main point was, basically, just put her in play or, at the very least, be a little more aggressive.

This isn't really about that race in particular and I'm not in the least suggesting anything nefarious happened. Rather, Sturman's column spawned an interesting online debate about the broader issue of where drivers' strongest motivations should be in the equation — to the bettors or the owners/trainer.

I agree with Sturman on this one because it goes back to an old horseman's adage more people would do well to remember:

Once a horse goes behind the gate, the public owns that horse.

Yes, horse owners are extremely important in the equation. We need more of them. Yes, the horse is the owner(s)' very expensive asset. But it's a gambling game.

Never forget it is the gamblers — whether directly through the pari-mutuel system or indirectly by betting in racinos that give a cut to racing — that fund the vast majority of the non-stakes purses that the owners, drivers and trainers win.

Yet, all too often, the bettors are forgotten in the equation — or worse, treated as deplorables — imperilling the entire operation. Bettors are the sport's lifeblood, but it's clear they are heading toward extinction. Not getting a fair shake is a big part of the reason.

Yes, stakes races — which the above example was not — offer a slightly different loyalty conundrum since they are mostly funded by the owners, but it still doesn't change the fact those races are bet on and drivers need to be even more conscious of that to protect the public the sports needs to survive.

I stress this does not in any way mean horses should be gutted just to satisfy the bettors.

Owners should more often accept their horses will be "owned" by the public when they race. But gamblers need to more often accept that a horse might not be able to perform up to form on a given night. The health of the horse should always be tantamount.

But there is also a very easy way to protect the betting public if it's clear a horse isn't in the best shape to race up to the conditions before going to the gate — scratch.

That best protects the owner(s)' investment, as well. It simply needs to happen more often.

I also recognize drivers often have a tough gig. They are caught between doing what's right for the horse, themselves, the people they drive for and the betting public. All can be competing interests.

They also are human and make mistakes as surely as we all do — myself, most definitely,

Also, I've never driven a horse and I'm not going to tell drivers how to do so.

included.

But what I'm talking about isn't *how* to drive, specifically, but the broader issue of where the driver's priorities should be once the gate rolls.

That means doing what's best for the bettors — within reason, of course — so long as it doesn't imperil the health of the horses or the drivers.

Yet, I honestly believe doing what's best for the punters is rarely a prime guiding force. Realistically, drivers are much more beholden to trainers and owners than the betting public. But

once behind the gate, that's what needs to change if the game ever hopes to survive.

While I'm not going to start critiquing drives, that's exactly what racing commission officials are paid to do to protect the public and the horses. It is incumbent on them to act consistently and decisively every time — and lord knows that rarely happens.

A lot of the blame falls to them.

If officials were vigilant about enforcing the racing rules, this column wouldn't be necessary.

If, in their professional opinion, a drive isn't adequate, they have the power to penalize.

Finally, a small side note. Please spare me the argument that it was dumb to bet on Test Of Faith at 1-9 and people that make dumb bets don't deserve to cash them. Whether she **should** have been 1-9 is completely irrelevant. **That's what bettors decided she was** and to paraphrase that old horseman's adage: drive accordingly.

And to be fair, the reigning Horse of the Year in a six-horse field in her third start, coming off a 1:49.4 victory, should be well bet. Bettors should expect her to at least be in more in play than she was. That's not false bettor hysteria or dumb betting even though 1-9 is always a stretch.


The real problem here, beyond ineffectual, lazy officiating, is competing harness racing interests. What's best for the gambler often is contrary to what's best for the connections.

Other than keeping bettors top of mind more often, and better appreciating the gamblers that fund much of the operation, I'm not sure how to solve that one.

I just know that unless these competing interests figure out how to row in the same direction we are doomed to be sucked into the whirlpool.

While I'm not going to start critiquing drives, that's exactly what racing commission officials are paid to do to protect the public and the horses. It is incumbent on them to act consistently and decisively every time — and lord knows that rarely happens.







Pick-4 analysis for today's 'Super Sunday' card at Harrah's Philadelphia

Anchoring today's stellar card at Harrah's Philadelphia is a \$10,000 guaranteed pool for the late Pick-4. The sequence features a trio of \$100,000 invitationals, and here is how I see the races shaping up.

Race 10 \$0.50 Pick-4 ticket: 2-6 / 1-4-7-8 / 5-7 / 1-2-8 = \$24

RACE 10, \$68,116 PASS 3-YEAR-OLD FILLIES PACE

The headline here is the return of 2-year-old champion Niki Hill (5-2). Following a brilliant campaign last year in which she lost just a single time, she's qualified three times for her usual connections of Ryder and Dunn. The Pick-4 has the potential to pay well if this one loses to kick off the sequence, let's see how she comes out in sophomore debut. Lyon's Serenity (4-1) and Boudoir Hanover (4-1) are both formidable adversaries. The latter qualified a length behind Niki in that recent qualifier at the Meadowlands and got close to Niki last year on occasion; the same could be said for the former. Silent Crossing (8-1) enters on a six-race winning streak; will need to go faster but she's been excellent since arriving from Canada. St Nevis (8-1) was competitive against some of the better 2-year-old fillies last year, I wouldn't disregard completely for DM and Norman.

Picks: Niki Hill, St Nevis, Lyon's Serenity

RACE 11, \$100,000 BETSY ROSS PACE

Double millionaire and two-time divisional champion Lyons Sentinel (4-1) makes her 2022 debut in a highly competitive spot, following a qualifier right in behind last year's open pacing division champ, Allywag Hanover. It took three tries to get off the mark last year and trainer Jim King was quoted this week as

saying he feels his champion mare may need the race. Because of that and the outside post I'm inclined to play against for win, though I think Tetrick will have her in play at some point.

This looks like a good spot for Racine Bell (7-2) from the rail. I know she couldn't carry her speed all the way at the Meadowlands last out or even at Yonkers three back when she got nailed in the Blue Chip Matchmaker final, but she'd be able to do so here at her best; very consistent mare. Drama Act (9-2) upset Racine Bell to win the Matchmaker though has come up short in her next two at Yonkers; could take action for Burke and Gingras connection. That was maybe a chink in the armor we saw last week from Amazing Dream N (3-1). She took a somewhat weak run at Racine Bell last out at the Meadowlands and this will be her biggest test to date in North America; let's see how she responds.

Majorca N (9-1) was actually impressive two back as a big longshot at the Meadowlands where she went a parked out first-over trip from post 10 and hung in there bravely; I wouldn't rule out. Easy To Please was used hard last out into a fast opening quarter in a leg of the Graduate; still has something to prove against these. Keep Rockin A (15-1) won this race last year but that seems like a long time ago; she's upset against this group prior though. Watch Me Now (12-1) seems bound to attract attention off her double-digit morning line. Tripped out last week when a huge gap to the inside opened up into the stretch but Dunn may very well have her in a striking position once again.

Picks: Racine Bell, Lyons Sentinel, Majorca A

RACE 12, \$100,000 MAXIE LEE INVITATIONAL PACE

Lovedbythemasses (9-2) has made a living this year beating overmatched foes in the earlier season Meadowlands Open's and made a decent account himself last week on the step up in the Cutler. Showing speed and parked early, it looked through the stretch like Tetrick could have used a little bit of room as part of that 1:49.1 record mile won by Ecurie D. I like him in this spot.

If this were a mid-season race for When Dovescry (5-2) I'd be more confident, but it's just her third start back and frankly, she's yet to fire in her first two. Everyone knows what she's capable of but this seems like a challenge. Amigo Volo (4-1) is another well-storied champion, and he makes his first start back since January. Qualified a few days ago and is in good hands, going for Dunn and Norman.

Hillexotic (5-1) changed connections a couple of months ago and has been highly competitive for Burke in that time. Him and #7 have both beaten each other and this one comes off a walk in the park from post 8 at Yonkers; part of the early pace for sure. Tough call on the Back of the Neck (3-1). He found his better gear in the latter stages of last year but his only race this year was a bit underwhelming, maybe a play against. Sermon (8-1) beat Back of the Neck in a recent qualifier but was no threat as a longshot last out in the Cutler. Similar could be said for Mississippi Storm (7-1). Eurobond (6-1) enters in sharp form for the duo of Spaccarelli and Kakaley; maybe can land a share at his very best.

Picks: Lovedbythemasses, Amigo Volo, Hillexotic

RACE 13, \$100,000 COMMODORE BARRY PACE

Nicholas Beach (3-1) won last year's edition of the Commodore Barry and did so in dramatic fashion when Joe Bongiorno piloted him to the win less than 24 hours after being involved in an accident the night before at the Meadowlands. Nicholas Beach returns now fresh off a career best 1:47 win taken last week at the Meadowlands; will be interesting to see if he can follow it up.

Workin Ona Mystery (7-2) has been remarkable in working himself back into elite form the past couple of seasons. He simply outpaced Nicholas Beach two back at the Meadowlands when he tied his lifetime best of 1:48.1 and then had no chance

last week when racing from the back on a night where no one could close. Another exciting matchup between these two is coming again.

Ignatius A (7-1) had a tough go of it two back when he went first-over into fast fractions and then came back for a sharp wire-to-wire score; I think McCarthy takes an early chance from post 8. American Dealer N (5-1) just missed to Ignatius last out, though I feel he has something to prove against these. Nandolo N (9-1) is another who has shown success against this kind at Yonkers where he's been very fast at times but needs to show he can do it here. Wild Wild Western (7-1) enters the Commodore Barry on a six-race winning streak at the Meadows where all of which he's beaten Dorsoduro Hanover in the process; impressive. Jack's Legend N (7-1) makes his third start after going from Josh Green to Nifty Norman. Southwind Ozzi (10-1) steps up in sharp form.

Robert LeBlanc thriving as a horse owner after retiring from IBM

People might think of Robert LeBlanc as a relative newcomer to harness racing. In fact, he has had a lifetime interest and involvement in horse racing, both harness and thoroughbreds for all but 10 of his 63 years on the planet. When Robert was about 10 years old, his grandfather owned two cheap claimers one a standardbred, the other a thoroughbred. "They weren't very good," he says, "but I loved going to Greenwood Raceway in my hometown Toronto with my grandfather to see them race. I quickly became interested in the challenge of betting on the horses. I started doing so when I was about 10 years old and I still love to bet and always make a wager on every horse in which I have an interest."

He made a vow to himself that when and if he was in a position to own horses he would become involved in owning them.

He was born and raised in Toronto, however his employment with IBM resulted in his being moved to New York City where he has lived for much of his adult life. He retired in 2017 after 37 years working for IBM. It was at that time that he decided to take the plunge of obtaining significant ownership in the sport to which he had a great interest. It has been an enjoyable and somewhat profitable journey in harness racing since then.

Although he is now retired, he is very involved with his journey through a life that he has and continues to enjoy.


It was prior to the beginning of the baby race schedule at The Meadowlands when this scribe spoke with him.

Q: Robert, after living in Austin which is often regarded as one of the great and growing cities in the United States, you picked up and moved to Gotham - New York City. Any particular reasons?

"I suppose it's because it's the only New York City. There are many who regard New York as the center of our universe. On several counts, I would suppose that it might be. Austin was great. My wife Cathy and I lived there for five years. It has a lot that New York does, but not everything. New York is centrally located. It has great theatre, restaurants, sports, museums – you name it. Whatever it may be, it's there or close by, including our daughter. I'm near all sorts of golf courses. Golf is a game to which I suppose I am addicted. I generally play three and sometimes even four times a week. New York is a city from which so much of life flows. Of course, the most important racetrack in North America, The Meadowlands, is just across the river from where we live. My two chief trainers Tony Alagna and Nancy Takter are stabled nearby. I get to see them and my horses as I please. I will get to see most of my babies begin their first lessons on Saturday mornings during Breakfast with the Babies."

The year was 2020. Even though I was having a pretty good season, the real fireworks erupted at The Meadowlands on Aug. 8. The Hambletonian was won by our Ramona Hill. We received a little criticism for putting a filly in against the best 3-year-old trotting colts, but Ramona proved our confidence by soundly winning the race. Shortly thereafter, I was part of two spectacular upsets in classics races. On Sept. 22, our Captain Barbossa won the Little Brown Jug. Then only two days later, Exploit won the Metro Pace at Woodbine Mohawk. What a great run that was!

Q: You are one of likely relatively few owners in this sport who has hit the ground running insofar as almost immediately doing well in the sport. How did this come about?

"I think I need to correct you a little. It might seem that I've done well from the beginning, but that has not entirely been the case. The beginning of any significant success I've enjoyed began with my retirement in 2017. My first venture in the sport was in 2007 when my brother Dan and I bought a Western Terror filly in Harrisburg. She wasn't very good and we quickly sold her. The next year I bought into a Rocknroll Hanover filly with Jason Libby, Cool Jazz, who was okay. We got a big thrill when she finished second in the Bluegrass at The Red Mile. John Campbell drove her in that race and that was another thrill."

Q: It is 2017. You've retired after 37 years at IBM. You had a lot more time on your hands. What happened then?

"I'd always wanted to become seriously involved in harness racing. What better time than then? I had retired. I had some time on my hands. I love golf, but there is a limited amount of time one can spend on the golf course. I'm a big believer in analytics. The question was if I could put that belief to use in harness racing. One could say that I got lucky. To some extent I certainly did. I am also a great believer in youth. I hitched my star to a fantastic trainer Tony Alagna. I was lucky to get in with one of the best.

"My favorite time of the year is the early fall. Not only is that when a lot of the great stakes racing takes place, but it is also the time when I receive the catalogs for the two major yearling sales in Lexington and Harrisburg. It's probably difficult to quantify how much time I put into studying those 'bibles,' but it is significant. I pick the yearlings that I am most interested in based on their bloodlines. I'm a great believer in pedigree. Without it you are destined to climb much higher mountains than you would encounter with having it. I make my picks. I then check to see what Tony and Nancy and my partners think of them. To a great extent, they usually coincide. I buy into several yearlings. We try to run it on a business basis. Our goal is to develop top 2- and 3-year-olds. Those that don't reach that status are usually sold by the beginning of their 4-year-old season. Their spots in our lineup are replaced by yearlings. We had moderate success the first two years, but the best was yet to come."

Q: What happened?

"The year was 2020. Even though I was having a pretty good season, the real fireworks erupted at The Meadowlands on Aug. 8. The Hambletonian was won by our Ramona Hill. We received a little criticism for putting a filly in against the best 3-year-old trotting colts, but Ramona proved our confidence by soundly winning the race. Shortly thereafter, I was part of two spectacular upsets in classics races. On Sept. 22, our Captain Barbossa won the Little Brown Jug. Then only two days later,

Exploit won the Metro Pace at Woodbine Mohawk. What a great run that was! There are many who have been in the business all their lives who haven't had the good fortune to win even one of those races. Here we were, winning three Classics events in less than two months."

Q: You often make reference to your partners and how big an influence they have had in your great experiences in the sport.

"All of my horses are and have been owned by partnership groups. In addition to being involved with great people. We share in the ups and downs — hopefully more of the former than the latter. The combined knowledge of such as Tony Alagna, John Fodera, David Anderson, Myron Bell, the Crawfords, Brad Grant, Ken Jacobs and Steve Wienick is without equal in the sport. Perhaps every bit as important as their knowledge is the fact that without exception, they are all fine people who I am privileged to call my friends."

Q: What is the makeup of the horses in training with which you have an ownership position right now?

"I presently have 15 head in training. They are made up of 10 2-year-olds — five with Tony Alagna, four with Nancy Takter and one in Canada with Jason Libby — and five 3-year-olds — four with Alagna and one with Nancy. They are fairly evenly represented with trotters, seven, and pacers, eight."

Q: Which horse that you've owned would you considered to have been the best?

"Undoubtedly, that would be Ramona Hill. She was absolutely wonderful. Any time you have not only a Hambletonian winner, but one of the greatest trotting fillies ever — that would be exceptional."

Q: What is your preference trotters or pacers?

"Any time you have a great horse it's special. However trotters are more challenging. Having said that, I would have to say that of the two gaits, trotters have improved more than pacers. I remember way back when the Grand Circuit came to Greenwood Raceway in Toronto, I would always go. A big part of the trick then was to try to determine which of the 2-year-old trotters, especially the fillies, would not make breaks. It was sometimes the case that half the field or more would go off running. Now, especially early in the season, it can be somewhat rare that any of them make breaks. I suppose that trotting hobbles probably play a part in that happening. But I believe that the biggest factor is that the trotting gait has made such great progress. They are more natural and are more adept at staying on gait regardless of how fast they are going."

Q: You told me that you always bet on your horses. Have you been able to make any big scores?

"Betting on horses is the biggest part of what got me interested in the sport. It is certainly the major reason for our existence. I made a bet on Exploit when he won the Metro at 36-1 odds. Just last year, I made a substantial wager on Queen Of Success when she won the Breeders Crown elimination over Niki Hill at 23-1. I also had the exacta."

Q: What can we do to help get more people not involved in the sport to get more people in it?

"We need to get creative. We need to learn how to concentrate on getting people to wager on our product. The days when you get big crowds to the racetrack on ordinary race days are over. Most people, myself included, prefer to sit comfortably in our homes to watch and wager. Legal sports betting presents another challenge. We need to figure out a way in which we can attach ourselves to the areas, where people, especially young people are most interested in betting — areas linking lotteries and even major sporting events to our races. Our audience continues to shrink. We need to figure out ways to go with the trends rather than to try to compete against them."

Q: What are you most looking forward to in the 2022 racing season?

"We have two 3-year-old trotters which we are hoping will be Hambletonian or Oaks horses. Fast As The Wind is a colt with Tony Alagna who we have great hopes for and Selfie Queen is a filly who was the fastest 2-year-old filly last year. She is being prepped by Nancy Takter. Next week the baby races will begin at The Meadowlands, Gaitway, Magical Acres and other venues. Some hopes will be sustained and unfortunately some dreams will be squashed. Right now they are all undefeated champions."

The B.A. Superhero caper

An article about B. A. Superhero, a 3-year-old trotter, and his owner, Mrs. Patty Key, caught my interest for a couple of reasons.

I knew Mrs. Key's late husband, Bob, fairly well through the years, both socially and as a buyer of our yearlings during my Lana Lobell days. B. A. Superhero's pedigree is an interesting study in Inbreeding, properly done.

Again, for those with short memories, Inbreeding occurs when the sum of the generations in which the same name appears twice is six or less.

When the sum of those two generations is seven or eight, you have Line Breeding.

When no name appears twice for the sum of those generations to be eight or less, then that horse is defined as an Outcross.

One further note about Inbreeding, which I advocate, but with an important proviso; you should only inbreed with superior individuals. Never forget that when you breed close, you're enhancing two essential qualities, i.e. conformation and speed.

Parenthetically, the USTA commissioned a study of the American Standardbred's genotype, by Dr. Rebecca Bellone. She reported that she found no loss of heterozygosity, which is the variability factor. As a practical consideration, when the variability factor begins to be lost, the first manifestation is a loss of fertility in stallions.

Although no one, including Dr. Bellone, has any interest in the research I've done for years, my analysis of hundreds of five generation pedigrees has shown me that there is virtually no inbreeding today in the American Standardbred.

However, the pedigree of B. A. Superhero tells a different story. He is inbred, 3 by 3 to American Winner, a horse this kid had a little something to do with.

Bob Key was a smart yearling buyer, and he showed it quite vividly when he came to one of our Lana Lobell sales and bought a filly out of Matina Hanover. He renamed her BJ.'s Pleasure, won almost a quarter of a million with her, then bred her to Super Bowl and got the Hambletonian winner American Winner.

There's a little story that goes with Matina Hanover. Jim Harrison was running Lana Lobell for me, and one day he called me in New York.

"I bought a mare today, even though she's not all that well bred," he told me. "But she was a good race mare on that half-mile track at Buffalo, and the quy took a \$12,500 yearling credit."

That was Matina Hanover. Jim downplayed her breeding because her first three dams were duds at the Shoe Farms when Jim was running it. But her fourth dam was Miss Bertha Hanover, one of the great sisters who were the basis of the Hanover's original claim to breeding greatness.

Matina Hanover was one of the great modern day foundation mares. She herself produced Mack Lobell, still regarded as one of the best trotters the world has ever seen. She lives on in the pedigrees of many of the best trotters of the present day.

B. A. Superhero is sired by Muscle Hill, and out of Win Missy B, by Conway Hall. Both of those two stallions, Muscle Hill and Conway Hall, can best be described genetically as "high card horses." I'm talking about translating a horse's genetic range to a deck of playing cards, with a low card of two and a high card of ace.

Both these two great sires have a speed gene that probably starts with a ten or even a Jack and goes up from there.

So in every mating, for their 50 per cent contribution they bring, say, a face card. Assuming the mare contributes a mid-level card, say a seven, the average with still be high enough to result in a nice trotter, although not a star.

But if the Mama can pull out a better than average card, you're looking at stakes speed potential. And just as great sires like Conway Hall or Muscle Hill can be blessed with a genetic speed deck that holds only high cards, so can a great producer like Matina Hanover.

Here we're talking about what is technically a horse's Genotype, it's genetic profile. It has no connection whatever to the horse's Phenotype, which is the living horse and includes its racing performance.

But here I know I'm shouting in the wilderness, because since Fido was a glean in his furry father's eye, there has always been a premium paid for fast mares with good earnings as future broodmares.

So that, as we say in the detective trade, is the B. A. Superhero caper, and I wish Mrs. Key the best of racing luck with him.

On other fronts, two quick words. I've read about some problems doing embryo transfers with top race mares while they're still in training. A better approach would be an Intracytoplasmic Sperm Injection, or ICSI.

It is a much surer method of getting a foal, and it can be exactly scheduled. You simply allocate 18 days in February, and, Viola, mission accomplished.





Indiana Sires Stakes showing robust growth as 2022 season kicks off Monday

The program has the most horses nominated since 2015.

The opening leg of Indiana Sires Stakes competition kicks off over the holiday weekend at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Sophomore trotters and pacers will square off in their respective divisions as part of a special Monday (May 30) Memorial Day card at the Anderson oval. A total of 10 divisions will be contested over the course of the 13-race card with each of last fall's Super Final winners lining up behind the gate Monday evening.

If nominations are any indication of a program's health, 2022 Indiana Sires Stakes numbers show a robust program. Over 12 divisions – including freshman, sophomore and older horses of each gait – 1,368 individuals were nominated, an increase from the 1,276 eligible in 2021. It is also the highest number since 2015, when 1,510 horses were nominated across all categories. Increases were posted in seven of the 12 divisions, with nominations for 3-year-old trotting fillies growing 30 per cent from a year ago.

M-M's Dream, last year's \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final winner and divisional champion, begins her sophomore campaign in the night's seventh race, one of two \$47,000 divisions for filly trotters. A winner in six of eight starts in 2021 for owners Eleven Star Stables, Frank Baldachino and Hillside Stables, the Swan For All—Trading Place lass has drawn post four in a six-horse field. Trained by Henry Graber Jr., the filly won a qualifier and finished second in another May 18 at Hoosier Park, trotting the mile in 1:54.3 with Sam Widger in the bike.

Melanie Wrenn will send out a pair of contenders in the card's second race. Fleurie, Super Final runner-up, will make her sophomore debut. She has drawn post three and will be guided by Mike Oosting. Bluebird Dove, a 1:56.2 winner on April 20, will start from post two. Peter Wrenn is set to drive. Luv Lorelei, coming off a two-length victory in the Msnaughtybynature final, lines up fifth for trainer and driver Robert Taylor.

Trick Of The Light has drawn the outside post in one of three \$34,500 Indiana Sires Stakes divisions for sophomore filly pacers.



A 1:51.1 winner last season in the Super Final for freshman fillies, the Brian Brown trainee enters Memorial Day with two starts to her credit. After beginning the year with a 1:51.4 score, the Odds On Equuleus—Gordjus three year old raced second on May 14, falling three parts of a length short while registering a 1:50.3 clocking. Steered by Trace Tetrick, Trick Of The Light is owned by Country Club Acres Inc, Joe Sbrocco and Kirk Nichols. She starts eighth in Monday's 12th race.

Always Gonna B You, third-place Super Final finisher, is the 7-5 favorite in race 10. Trained by Jeff Cullipher, the Always A Virgin filly comes to Hoosier Park off a 1:52 score at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Hoosier Park's 11th race could provide fireworks as a trio of last year's leading 2-year-old pacing colts have drawn into the same Indiana Sires Stakes division. Super Final winner Dalby Hanover will start from post six in the last of three \$35,000 divisions. The Rockin Image-Don't Deny Me gelding enters the event with two qualifying wins under his belt. Moved to the Joe Putnam barn after Brittney Dillon's suspension earlier this spring, Rising Stein Stables, LLC owns Dalby Hanover.

Lining up to his outside in post eight is last year's divisional champion, Fulfullnmydestiny. Bred and owned by Brett Boyd Racing LLC, the son of Tellitlikeitis—Driven By Destiny was a five-time winner in 2021. He established a new Hoosier Park speed record for freshman pacers with a 1:49.2 score for trainer/driver James Yoder last September. The sophomore enters sires stakes action off a nine-length romp in a May 14 qualifier.

The field also includes Breeders Crown finalist Gentle Giant, who has missed the board in two outings this season. Ponda Warrior, who turned in a 1:51.1 triumph May 20 for trainer Jay Hochstetler, is the 2-1 favorite in race five, the night's first division for sophomore pacing colts.

Dover In Motion, who dominated the freshman trotting colt ranks last year at Hoosier Park, will make his debut Monday in one of two \$50,000 Indiana Sires Stakes divisions for sophomore colts and geldings. Undefeated in Indiana in 2021 with eight wins in nine starts (he raced sixth in the Mohawk Million), the Jamie Macomber trainee earned \$309,400 last year for M&M Racing and Norbert Maza. The partnership of M&M Racing and Macomber Racing will campaign the Dover Dan—Keystone Sadie gelding in 2022. Dover In Motion and Ricky Macomber Jr. will line up sixth in a field of 10.

Ponda Adventure, runner-up in the \$270,000 Super Final, is the 8-5 choice in the second division, carded as race 13. Trained by Erv Miller, the son of Swan For All won eight of 10 events in 2021 and has two qualifying wins to his credit. Trace Tetrick will guide the gelding from post seven.

As part of the Memorial Day program, Hoosier Park is honoring the military. Special tributes for each military branch will be held in the winner's circle throughout the evening. All military members will receive a 15 per cent discount at all dining options at Hoosier Park.

Family activities will be available at the front paddock from 5-9 p.m. including the Honey Hill Farms Petting Zoo. Guests can



Italian joy in Sweden Cup

The first Elitloppet division will go at 10:28 a.m. (Eastern), the second at 10:55 a.m. (Eastern) and the final at 11:45 a.m. (Eastern). The races should be available to watch in North America via the Swedish website www.atg.se.

Alessandro Gocciadoro dominated Saturday's (May 28) \$125,000 Sweden Cup at Solvalla and after an impressive wire-to-wire win in the elimination, Gocciadoro drew number 1 in the final, which was important since the other two elimination winners are well-known quick starters.

Officer Stephen (Pastor Stephen) and trainer Dion Tesselaar played with the opponents from the lead in the first heat, while Usain Töll (Googoo Gaagaa) used the same recipe in the third elimination.

But when Gocciadoro was the lucky guy in the draw ahead of the final and got post 1 with **Bepi Bi** (Donato Hanover), pretty much the race's outcome was determined. Bepi Bi managed to defend himself against outside trotter Officer Stephen when the car accelerated at the back stretch and when Gocciadoro was allowed to keep the pace at an unusually low level, Bepi Bi was outstanding in the pouring rain at Solvalla.

NBA star Nikola Djokic entered the winner's circle together with Bepi Bi's entourage after the comfortable elimination win and the double MVP also showed up in a warm up heat at Solvalla, driving one of Gocciadoro's horses racing on Saturday's race card.

Bepi Bi came home in a moderate 1:55.1 mile, but the track got sloppy on Saturday afternoon, due to the heavy raining.

Officer Stephen followed as runner up ahead of strong finisher Milliondollarrhyme.

FRENCH STRENGTH SHOWN IN HARPER HANOVERS

Ninth over!

The 3,140-metre, \$205,000 Harper Hanover's race is traditionally one of the last races on Solvalla's Saturday card on Elitloppet weekend and this year, a French super horse added pizzazz





to the event. Prix de Paris winner **Diable de Vauvert**, driven by Gabriele Gelormini started 40 meters behind the front horses and with a little more than lap to go, Gelormini left his position in ninth over.

Usually, ninth over is an impossible position to have with a kilometer to go, even in a race over 1.9 miles at Solvalla, but when Gelormini gave Diable de Vauvert the order to attack four wide at the back stretch, the duo quickly closed in on the leading horses.

Diable de Vauvert finished as he's used to, strongly, and Gabriele Gelormini's leg went up in a celebration of joy as his horse hit the wire as winner in a mile rate of 1:56.3 over 1.9 miles.

Diable de Vauvert was the big attraction on Solvalla's Saturday race card and horses bred outside of Sweden dominated strongly this rainy day in Stockholm.

AMPIA MEDE SM OUTSTANDING AT VINCENNES

Vincennes, Paris, was in focus on Friday (May 27) night when two races with group-status was on the menu. In the \$95,000 Prix du Crepuscule, Fabrice Souloy trained **Ampia Mede Sm** (Ganymede) impressed, winning after a first over trip for driver Franck Nivard.

Ampia Mede Sm and toughest opponent Elie de Beaufour battled for the lead in the first turn and Franck Nivard had to give up the fight when Jean-Michel Bazire pushed Elie de Beaufour hard on the outside. Nivard quickly opted a first over trip with

his 6-year-old Italian bred mare and when the field turned for home, Nivard had plenty of power to use in his drive.

Ampia Mede Sm sprinted to safe win in mile rate 1:54 over 1.3 miles while Elie de Beaufour held on to second place ahead of good finisher Rebella Matters.

In the \$75,000 Prix Caecilia for 4-year-olds bred in Europe, upset winner Caio Titus Bond (Varenne) got a calm inside trip, served by Mathieu Mottier and when the door opened for the duo at the top of the stretch, the Italian bred colt could disarm the inside horses just before the wire. Mile rate was 1:58.2 over 1.6 miles and Sébastien Guarato trains the winner.

CLEANGAME RETIRED

French media Paris-Turf announced on Friday that Jean-Michel Bazire's top gelding Cleangame has ended his career due to an injury in a front leg. Cleangame has belonged in the top among French bred trotters for several years, but since he is a gelding, he's been out of the really big stakes races, such as the Prix d'Amérique, Prix de France and Prix de Paris.

Ten-year-old Cleangame collected 42 wins and earned \$1,949,365 in his career and among his biggest wins was the \$160,000 Prix d'Ete (two times) and the \$150,000 Grand Prix du Sud-Ouest (two times).





Nearly a year in, Greg Gangle breaks down his first impressions of life in Australia

Former Canadian administrator Greg Gangle has been pleasantly surprised by the quality of horses in Australia since moving Down Under with his family almost a year ago.

Gangle, 35, built a good reputation as assistant racing manager and then moved into the top job during a four-year stint at The Raceway at The Western Fair District in Canada.

The prospect of expanding his knowledge and experience, along with a family connection, lured him to move to the other end of the world for the next chapter of his career.

"We arrived across on June 5 last year and, such was the time, we went straight into quarantine for two weeks," Gangle said.

He officially started his new gig as CEO of the Wagga Harness Racing Club, in the rich and historic harness heartland of NSW's Riverina, on Sept. 5.

"I just wanted to advance and diversify my career and to continue to learn," he said. "It certainly helped that my wife (Anna) is from Victoria (Australia), too.

"I'd had the four years at Western Fair and loved it, but it was the right time of life to try something new and different."

Gangle's timing was perfect to see two of the pacing "giants" of Down Under – King Of Swing and Ladies In Red – really strut their stuff.

King Of Swing finished his stellar career in a blaze of glory with a second Hunter Cup win and then unprecedented third Miracle Mile victory before being retired to stand at Cobbitty Equine, run by Belinda and Luke McCarthy, who trained the champion pacer for his glory days.

Meanwhile, Ladies In Red stamped herself as the greatest filly Down Under has seen for at least 20 years, finishing her 3-year-old season with 20 starts for 17 wins and three seconds.

"I did time my arrival well, didn't I?" Gangle said, laughing. "Seriously though, I want to start with Ladies In Red first. She's as good as anything I've seen. She's out of this world.

"Even when she got beaten at Menangle last start, it was as good as a win. The fractions they ran with her back in the field made it impossible, but she still almost won.

"It wouldn't surprise me if she smashed the boys in some big races this year, she's that good."

And that raises a point where Gangle thinks the U.S. does something much better than Down Under – catering for top-flight mares.

"It's a problem down here. Look at Ladies In Red, she's turned 4 and now she'll have to take on the boys in so many big races because there just aren't enough feature mares' races," he said.

"It's so different in North America. Look back to what Shartin did and no doubt it's the reason we've lost Amazing Dream from Australia to continue her career in North America... because there

are so many more opportunities with big purses for her to race against her own sex.

"It's something which urgently needs addressing in Australia, in my opinion."

Harness Racing Update

More broadly, Gangle thinks Australia needs to be increasingly mindful of the loss of horses to North America.

"We're losing lots of horses and think the number will keep growing," he said. "I know of trainers in North America who are basing their business model around importing horses from Down Under.

"It's because they know the breed and quality of horses Down Under has improved so much over the past decade.

"I see that myself. The first time I came to Australia was eight or nine years ago. The quality and speed of the horses is night and day compared to back then.

"And so, the challenge is for Australia to look at its prize money structure and see if it can boost the free-for-all purses for a start. Take a horse like Ignatius for example, he's gone to the U.S. simply because of lack of suitable opportunities down here."

King Of Swing is one horse Gangle would love to have seen take on the best in North America.

"It was never going to happen because of his stud value, but I think he would've been up with anything in North America, especially if Luke McCarthy had taken him across and campaign the horse himself," he said.

"As great a horse as he was, I was in awe of the way Luke and Belinda (McCarthy) managed the horse. They were able to peak him every time it mattered and were very structured in where they went and what races they aimed at."

The King Of Swing package was amplified by the sheer presence and charisma of the horse himself.

"When I was back in my media days, about 15 years ago I was at the North American Cup and watched Somebeachsomewhere come back after the race and literally bow to the crowd. He knew he was a special horse," Gangle said.

"King Of Swing was like that. I say they should build a statue of him at Menangle where he won the three Miracle Miles and I mean that because he was such a relaxed stallion and had such presence, he would stand there like a statue, facing the crowd, after his big wins."

Having been a lot more exposed to trotting "back home," Gangle also thinks trotters are still largely untapped in Australia.

"Victoria does a great job promoting the trotters and Menangle is starting to do it as well, but they can be so much more than that," he said. "In NSW, I'd love to see them racing at places like Bathurst and down in the Riverina where I am as well. There's a gap in the market."

Some other comparative observations Gangle has made since moving Down Under include:

ANIMAL WELFARE:

"It's huge down here and that's a great thing. Clerks of the Course and Track Attendants are not mandatory back home for the most part, so sometimes there won't be anybody following the field if a horse gets loose," Gangle said. "There are no Track Attendants in North America which is something they need to look at, especially to prevent a horse returning to the paddock for an equipment adjustment which delays the race. Also, to monitor the race and be first at the scene if there is an accident."

DRIVER SUPERANNUATION/MATERNITY LEAVE:

"People back home won't believe it when they read this. I'm based in NSW and HRNSW here pays the superannuation for all the drivers. Now that's leadership for you. It's amazing really," Gangle said.

"Throw in the fact there is a paid maternity leave program in some states as well and that's really impressive."

FUNDING/COMPETITION BETWEEN TRACKS:

"The funding is so different. So many tracks back home rely on the money from slot machines, but you don't get that here. Instead, you get a higher take of the wagering money from the TAB and Sky International (betting turnover)," Gangle said.

"There is a lot more competition between states down here, especially between NSW, Victoria and Queensland. I think that's a good thing. It drives more innovation and change, which continues to move the industry forward."

BREEDERS BONUS:

"That's something which really stands out for me. Back home the rewards are for excellence with bonuses at the top end, but here it's about looking after the little guy with bonuses for your first win which keeps everything even regardless if you're a hobbyist or a full-time trainer," Gangle said.

"It is a different model. In North America you have a commercial breeder and a trainer and not much in between, but here there are a lot more hobbyists and part-timers who are important back bones of the industry."

In summary, Gangle is thrilled he made the move, loving the (much) better weather and said the hospitality has been incredible.

"Aussies remind me of Canadians so much. I think if you pulled people from all over the world and put them in a bar, you'd find the Aussies and Canadians drinking together in the same corner," he said.

"I'm also starting to get my head around the lingo and the Aussie slang, too."

And, fittingly, that's how Gangle signed off when I thanked him for his time.

"No worries, mate. Too easy."

Jimmy Freight dazzles in \$150,000 Camluck Classic

After a two-year hiatus, the \$150,000 Camluck Classic returned to the Raceway at Western Fair District on Friday night (May 27), and did it ever deliver.

Following a two-year layoff, Jimmy Freight continued to turn heads with a track record 1:50.2 victory, but it wasn't an easy road to victory.

Poseidon Seelster (Bob McClure) and Tattoo Artist (James MacDonald) played hard ball around the first turn, with Tattoo Artist finally able to clear through an eye-popping :26.1 first quarter.

MacDonald tapped the breaks entering the far turn the first time, trying to catch a breather. Entering the stretch, eventual winner Jimmy Freight (Louis Roy), flipped to the outside after getting away in fifth.

Hitting the half in :55.1, Roy was in attack mode at the fiveeighths, making his way into third and creating some separation from his outer tier competitors. Jimmy Freight and Tattoo Artist would match strides around the final turn, with 'Jimmy Jets' wearing down Tattoo Artist through the stretch to win by two lengths.

Tattoo Artist finished second, pocket-sitting longshot Poseidon Seelster was third, and Funatthebeach N (Jordan Stratton) finished fourth.

"I've never seen him that strong and confident," said winning driver Louis Roy following the gutsy performance. "People have watched the last time he raced at Mohawk – he came back in :51.4, his own back half, with :25.1 on the end – that just proved the horse is so incredible."

With the victory, Jimmy Freight is now 10 for 16 in 2022 with just shy of \$200,000 in the bank. He is trained by Richard Moreau and owned by Adriano Sorella. The victory also earned the connections an invitation to the \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie at MGM Northfield Park on June 11.

The track record was one tick faster than the 1:50.3 mark set by former Moreau pupil Evening Of Pleasure in 2016.

Grassroots card a tale of two halves on Camluck Classic Night

The four \$22,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots divisions on the \$414,000 Camluck Classic presented by Seelster Farms card at The Raceway at the Western Fair District were split between driver Trevor Henry, and the driver/trainer/owner trio of James MacDonald, Nick Gallucci, and Millar Farms.

The first of four Grassroots divisions for 3-year-old pacing fillies went in race two with Henry driving **Fade Out**, a daughter of Sportswriter, to a come from behind win.

The Arthur, ON resident positioned the filly sixth at the quarterpole, settling off a :56.4 half-mile pace set by Louis-Philippe Roy and Addictivebehaviour, before moving past everyone over the next quarter mile and winning by two lengths.

"It was a really good trip," said Henry. "They slowed up the third quarter and I think it kind of caught Louis off guard a bit. She felt good, and that's why I moved her there. She raced great."

Fade Out, a trainee of Gregg McNair, now has \$113,141 in OSS earnings for McNair and his ownership partners Dean Lockhart and McKinlay & Fielding.

In race four, the second Grassroots division, Henry drove **Goudawon** to a gate-to-wire win. Leaving from post two, he manoeuvred the Betterthancheddar filly into first position by the quarter-pole and never looked back.

Halfway through the evening the former top driver at the London oval was enjoying his return.

"I like it here, and I have some fairly live drives, so that makes it nice, and everything is good," said Henry.

It was the second career Grassroots victory for the Murray Brethour trainee and pushed her over \$40,000 in career earnings for owners Brenda, Mark, and Anthony Lane of Norwood, ON.

The final two Grassroots divisions saw Millar Farms homebreds trained by Nick Gallucci take over, with James MacDonald in the race bike.

In division three, and race six, MacDonald piloted **Velvet Stinger** home in a final quarter mile of :29 to overtake Girl in a Tavern (Big Jim) and hold off Power Of An Angel (Sunshine Beach).

"She has such a good late kick that I was able to flip her three deep in the turn, and that's where she paces her best," said MacDonald. "Velvet Stinger was Velvet Stinger. She hipped and skipped but got there first."

The Bettors Delight daughter is now two-for-two as 3-yearold, after being held out of the winner's circle in her novice campaign.

Raptors Won followed in her namesake's footsteps and won the final Grassroots division of the evening, the eighth race on the card. Leaving from the rail as the odds-on favorite, she didn't disappoint her backers.

"She's a nice big strong filly," said MacDonald. "I put her on the gate, and when it opened, it was the first time I've asked her, and she blasted pretty good."

The daughter of Big Jim held off a late charge from Jody Jamieson, and Warrawee Xpat to win by a length. She was unraced at two, but now has two wins on the season, to go along with a pair of second place finishes.

"When Jody popped down the stretch, she had a lot left," said MacDonald. "Like I said, she's a big strong filly, and I'm expecting a lot from her this year."

TWO-YEAR-OLD OSS STARS TWIN B ARCHIE AND DULY RESOLVED HEADLINE GOLD OPENER

The first OSS Gold Leg of 2022 goes Monday (May 30) at Woodbine Mohawk Park with a pair of 3-year-old trotting colt divisions. Each division features a returning 2-year-old star with Super Final winner Twin B Archie and Mohawk Million runner-up Duly Resolved both entered.

Twin B Archie had an impressive showing last time out in the SBOA Final for trainer Scott McEneny, who co-owns the gelding with Domenic Chiaravalle, Floyd Marshall, and Martwest Racing Stable.

The son of Archangel shot to the early lead, before settling into the pocket and popping out around 3/8's to re-take top spot, and best Esplosione by four lengths.

"He was very handy. (Driver) James (MacDonald) said if somebody had of come to him, he would have stepped up and went faster," said McEneny. "He said he still had some horse left and didn't pull the plugs."

MacDonald has driven Twin B Archie in each of his 12 lifetime starts and will be in the race bike Monday evening, leaving from post five, in race six on the card.

"He does whatever he has to do. He's a very versatile horse," said McEneny. "You can race him on the front, or you can race him on the back. James has lots of options with him."

Esplosione, from Kadabra's second last racing crop, will get a shot at redemption from the SBOA final. However, the Meg Crone trainee will have to overcome a tough post position after drawing the outside in the field of eight for owners Melvin Hartman, and Enzed Racing Stable Inc.

"Meg's horse raced great last week," said McEneny. "He drew outside again, but he was second to us, and we also just beat him in the eliminations."

A third name to watch in the division is Simcoe Seelster. The Royalty For Life son was unraced at two but is coming off back-to-back wins, in the non-winners of one, and subsequently, non-winners of two class at Mohawk.

He will have solid post position as he jumps in class for owners W G James Stables Ltd., John James, and Deborah Aubin, leaving from post three with a driver change to Doug McNair.

Duly Resolved, trained by John Bax, is the marquee name in the other Gold Leg. The star of Resolve's first crop is looking for his first win of 2022 after earning over \$630,000 for owners Bax Stable, David Hudson, Don Allensen, and Gaelic Stable as a novice.

"We were a little disappointed with the way he finished last time out," said Bax. "But he looks good, and he's eating good. We will just put it down to not tight enough."

Hall of Famer Paul MacDonell gets the drive from post seven, in the second race of the evening.

"We don't see anything wrong with him," said Bax. "We just have to make sure he doesn't get off his feed, and he gets a lot of paddock time. I think he will get tighter."

Stable Genius, a son of Muscle Mass, makes his OSS debut as the second favorite, leaving from post two for trainer Stephen Bossence.

A homebred for Richard Thompson, and owned in partnership with Bossence and Derek Reid, he was scratched from the SBOA final, but has posted a pair of wins in four starts this season.

Rounding out the contenders is Evil Guy.

Wife and husband, and trainer/driver duo, Shannon and Trevor Henry will harness the son of Il Sogno Dream from the rail position. The Bill Manes and William Cripps homebred is making the jump to the Gold level after three on the board Grassroots finishes in 2021.







Fashion Schooner, Pretender score in NJSS at Big M

The Friday night action at The Meadowlands featured a pair of \$240,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes Finals for 3-year-olds on the trot, and **Fashion Schooner** and **Pretender** were the winners of their respective divisions.

Fashion Schooner, a daughter of Walner and 2009 Hambletonian Oaks champion Broadway Schooner, impressed in the split for fillies, making the lead while parked past the quarter in :26.3 and going down the road from there, recording a safe 1-length win over 2-1 second choice Jiggy Jog S in 1:51.3, a new lifetime best. Misswalner Fashion was third.

"I was very impressed by her," said winning trainer Jim Campbell, who conditions both the winner and third-place finisher. "I was happy that [driver] Timmy [Tetrick] was able to use her to get good position. He then backed down the second quarter very well. She did whatever Timmy wanted her to do. She dug in and couldn't have been better."

After a 2-year-old season that saw her make only three starts and win none, Fashion Schooner upper her 2022 stats to three wins in four tries, good for lifetime earnings of \$150,062.

"She got off on the right foot this year," said Campbell. "I still really believe that even though she raced only three times last year, it really prepared her for this year. She didn't race much because she got sick in early springtime and took a long time to get over it. The Hambletonian Oaks is definitely something we are aiming for."

As the 6-5 favorite, Fashion Schooner returned \$4.60 to win.

Trainer Nancy Takter no doubt has Hambletonian dreams dancing in her head after her Pretender took the division for colts and geldings in 1:52.1. Driver Yannick Gingras had to make a bold decision down the backstretch, as he had to steer Pretender three-wide around a struggling Classic Hill at the three-eighths, but for the Muscle Hill-Maven product, it turned out to be the right move, as Pretender cleared the top just after the half before withstanding a wicked late charge by 7-5 favorite Temporal Hanover to record a neck win in 1:52.1. Periculum was third.

"I would rather have not gone three deep but it was a straightaway, so I thought it was the move to make," said Gingras. "You're going for that kind of money, so people are going to try. Week by week, Pretender is getting better and better. I was confident in the horse but nearing the wire he was a little lonely. I'm very happy with his performance."

Pretender has now won three of four this year and five of 16 lifetime. His bank account stands at \$253,128.

As the 8-5 second choice, he paid \$5.40 to win.

KEEPING PACE: Before the regular 13-race card, a pair of \$100,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes Finals for 3-year-old pacers were contested as non-betting events.

In the split for colts and geldings, **Count Mara** surged to the lead around the far turn before going on to a 7¾-length score over a sloppy track in miserable, rainy conditions.

The John Pyott trainee, a gelded son of Lis Mara—Madam Countess, was driven by Tetrick and won for the third time from 10 lifetime starts while establishing his lifetime-best of 1:58.3. Polaris Breech was second.

Not So Evil took the division for fillies in 1:56.3 for the husband and wife team of driver Pat and trainer Traci Berry. The daughter of Great Vintage-Evil Fight surged to the lead at three-quarters before holding off second-place finisher Bee Aware by three-quarters-of-a-length to record her fourth victory from 10 lifetime outings.







"Glamour Boys" in PASS on Monday at Pocono

The "glamour boys" division in harness racing, the 3-year-old pacers, will be featured on Monday afternoon (May 30) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, in second preliminary round action in their Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) and Stallion Series program, with \$138,758 to divided among three Sire Stakes divisions and four \$20,000 cuts of Stallion Series racing.

Neither of the first round PASS winners, All Or Nothing and Greatest Ending, will be making the journey to the mountains, but returning will be all three winners in recent Pennsylvania All-Stars action at Pocono. Five of the top nine rankings in the "Road to the Meadowlands Pace" are also among the Monday combatants.

The 10ths race division is probably the "feature" division, as it matches up two of the All-Stars divisional winners. The fastest All-Stars winner, Night Hawk, will start from post three for driver David Miller, trainer Brian Brown, and the ownership of Leeman Lombardo Stable, Joe Sbrocco, In The Gym Partners, and Acadia Farms. His victory here came in 1:50, with a wicked last quarter of :26.1, giving the Betting Line colt two wins on the year and a Sire Stakes second in three starts.

Just outside of him behind the starting gate will be the Always B Miki gelding Mad Max Hanover, third in his Sire Stakes cut and then following up with a 1:50.3 victory in the All-Stars for driver Tim Tetrick, trainer Jake Leamon, and owner Marvin Rounick. Night Hawk and Mad Max Hanover rank as the first and second favorites, respectively, in this tenth race PASS division.

The early program choice in the twelfth race division is Market Based, who won in 1:50.2 in the All-Stars. Dexter Dunn will have the lines behind the Sweet Lou colt as they start from post three for trainer Nancy Takter and owners Chuck Pompey, Edwin Gold, and H&M Taylor Stable.

The morning line favorite in the third race division will be Six Feet Apart, another from the stable of Brian Brown, who was just a neck behind Mad Max Hanover in the All-Stars. David Miller will drive Six Feet Apart from post three for the ownership of Michael Robinson, Robert Mondillo, David Meola, and Rich Lombardo Racing LLC.

All three of the Stallion Series first prelim winners – Code Cracker, Dancin Sancho, and World For Two – will battle other developing hopefuls in Monday's Stallion Series action.

The Dyeatlestones

Like the harness horse racing business, show business is not all excitement and sunshine, but both unusual fields are hard to get out of your system once you get hooked. My first professional show business gig was playing bass guitar in a cover band, *The Dyeatlestones*.

Artie Levy was a skinny young guy with Buddy Holly glasses who operated *In the Groove*, a record store on Euclid Avenue. Artie lived three houses down from my Aunt Jane and was the brains behind the group, or, as we say in show biz, the creative genius. Artie had zero musical chops, he could not play the radio, but he had a cousin, Sheppard Grant, who worked in an agency that booked entertainment on cruise ships.

Artie dreamed up an angle, a hook, and an idea with legs. He put together four of us from the neighborhood who did have some musical ability and told us to rehearse some of the greatest hits of Bob Dylan, The Beatles, and the Rolling Stones. We played the early songs, the easy songs, nothing complex, and then we made a Beta Max recording that Artie could get in front of Sheppard.

This idea was pure genius. Five thousand groups could play and sing these songs, and four thousand six hundred could play them better than us. But Artie paved the path so that we merely needed to show a modicum of competence, and *The Dyeatlestones* were on, without schlepping around waiting to write the next great rock epic.

Less than two months from our first rehearsals, we debuted by playing two sets on the *Panama Queen* that left from Miami every week to island-hop in the Caribbean. *The Dyeatlestones* played one set at six, the other at nine. We played on a small stage that was a six by ten platform eighteen inches high, in the *Midship Bistro*, capacity 82, rarely filled.

The first part of the show was a breeze. Jimmy Hayes was our lead guitar player and lead singer, the only one I would call a talented musician. When Jimmy did the Bob Dylan set, he did not even need the other three of us; he could efficiently run through the set acoustically. After a 10-minute break, we did a Beatles segment, took another break, and finished with the Stones. I will say this; we did not dress up in goofy clothes, tell corny jokes, or banter. We played the music straight.

Getting paid to play great music and travel must sound like a dream for a 22-year-old kid, and for a while, it was. Like harness racing, behind the scenes were not always happy times. The four of us were crammed together in a tiny stateroom. Our pay was meager. The gig quickly turned from great fun to a real drag. I know this is hard to believe.

You may be familiar with the song, *Last Time*, by the Stones. **www.youtube.com/watch**

The intro is unforgettable, real ear candy, and it is a great song, straightforward to play. Rehearsing, we did the song about 20, 30 times, then, when the cruises started, twice more every day. Around the 93rd rendition, I wanted this to be the Last Time — boredom set in, same songs, night after night.

Things began to get on my nerves. Artie was making the same money sitting on his ass in Brooklyn. Jimmy Hayes was wearing sunglasses at breakfast and acting like he WAS Dylan. Al Contrera, the drummer, snored like he was choking on an olive pit and often borrowed money for the slot machines that he forgot to pay back.

One of my pet peeves was the audience. They sat at round tables drinking and did not always engage with the music. Sometimes the customers talked during our tunes, which infuriated me. I believed this chatting during a performance was rude. One night, during the nine o'clock set, after we finished *Time is on Our Side*, I snapped at a beefy cruiser with a tidy beard sitting at one of the front tables. A hot mic picked it up.

"Hey, buddy, who gives a shit if you ate two breakfasts and are going on the Mayan excursion tomorrow."



There was a scene. My bad. Very unprofessional. I played two more nights on the *Panama Queen*, one stoned, one drunk. Artie had my replacement waiting at the port, but I had my union card. I could still work in showbiz.

It's a long story, but I moved from music to movies. I started at the bottom as a Best Boy, moved up to a Gaffer, then a Grip, but never wanted to be a Key Grip because of the paperwork. These jobs are in the same family — we move around all the stuff on a movie set.

The big difference between the cruise ship and the movies was that every movie was different. Some films were huge budgets, tiny budgets, independent budgets, comedies, dramas, whatever. And there were always new people, stories, and locations. Every movie was unique for 26 years until my back gave out.

After inking a movie contract with my union guy, Pete DeBenedetto, the first thing I did was to see if there was a racetrack near the set, preferably a harness racetrack. In LA and New York, finding a racetrack was a snap. Other shoots were a problem. I got into the sport and met a few people on the backstretch, primarily through Bobby Jay, a character actor who owned a pacer.

After a few back surgeries, with some money in the bank and a solid pension at age 54, I turned to act three in my story, the Speedo Johnson story. I bought a couple of trotting yearlings and sent them to Clarence Quick, a trainer from Pennsylvania that I got to know.

I never had the urge to be a trainer, but I was, and am, a very involved owner. I like jogging my horses. And I enjoy studying horse sales catalogs and trying to pick out a yearling that falls into my price range. Clarence taught me a lot about horse racing, and there is a lot to learn. We got along great and had some good times until he got sick. After the funeral, Clarence's second trainer, Waldo Chapman, took over the stable, and I have been with Wally for six years now.

I bought and raced a few yearlings that were break-even investments and had a few clunkers. So far, no blockbusters. My money-making odds are longer than most because I only play the staking game in harness racing. I never was interested in keeping a racehorse to race a hundred or two hundred times.

Like my *Dyeatlestones days*, I need to move on to new pastures. Heck, if I had played Last Time another hundred times, I would have required medication or institutionalization. Moving my horses after their age-three season may not be wise but clearing the deck and starting fresh keeps me involved.

Act three of the Speedo Johnson story is the most enjoyable. The harness racehorse ownership game is like a movie where I'm the director, producer, and financier. I never know where the story will go. And I never need to set foot on a cruise ship or perform the Last Time again.

Amigo Volo returns in Maxie Lee

Amigo Volo and the words "world record" seem to go hand in hand. Over the course of his award-winning career, the 5-year-old male trotter has set at least one world record at ages 2, 3, and 4, and done so on half-mile, five-eighths-mile, and one-mile ovals.

His most recent world-record performance came in December at Yonkers Raceway and started a stretch that saw the gelding win four of five races before embarking on a four-month layoff in mid-January.

Now, Amigo Volo is ready to return to work. Today (May 29), he heads to the \$100,000 Maxie Lee Memorial Invitational Trot at Harrah's Philadelphia, where he posted one of his world-record efforts as a 2-year-old in 2019. He is the 4-1 third choice in a field of eight and will leave from post five with Dexter Dunn driving for trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman.

Amigo Volo prepped for his comeback with a 1:53.4 qualifier win this past Tuesday at Philly. The Maxie Lee wasn't in Norman's plans originally, but when an invitation was extended, the trainer accepted.

"They came up short on horses and he qualified good," Norman said. "I have to race him somewhere anyway, so I thought we would throw him in. It's a good field of horses, and I think having him in there gives it a little more interest.

"He normally takes two or three races to get himself tight, so I'm not expecting big things, but the horse has been great and training back good. He'll be all right. We'll see how it goes. You never know."

Amigo Volo, a Dan Patch Award winner at age 3, suffered with sickness issues last season. He was winless in his first six races, but after an 11-week respite and addition of Lasix went on to post six wins, three seconds, and three thirds in his next 13 starts.

"Since we've had him on Lasix, he's been a lot better," Norman said. "He was very good at the end of the year, and his last race at Yonkers (in January), he was dynamite."

For his career, Amigo Volo has won 21 of 46 races and \$1.69 million for owners Pinske Stables and David J. Miller.

The Maxie Lee morning-line favorite, at 5-2, is When Dovescry. The 6-year-old mare, also a Dan Patch Award winner in 2019, finished third in her seasonal debut on May 6 in a division of the Miss Versatility Series at The Meadowlands and last week was sixth in the Arthur J. Cutler Memorial, won by Ecurie D DK in a world-record 1:49.1 at the Big M.

Back Of The Neck, who saw his connections turn down an invitation to Sunday's Elitloppet in Sweden, is the 3-1 second choice in the Maxie Lee followed by Amigo Volo.

Rounding out the field are Lovedbythemasses, Hillexotic, Eurobond, Mississippi Storm, and Sermon.

"This is a good opportunity for (Amigo Volo); a nice place to start off, just down the road," the New Jersey-based Norman said. "If you get a piece, it's pretty good money. Post five is a good spot for him. And Ecurie D isn't in there."

The Maxie Lee is part of a star-studded card at Harrah's Philadelphia that also includes the \$100,000 Commodore Barry Invitational Pace and the \$100,000 Betsy Ross Mare Invitational Pace, with Dan Patch Award-winning pacer Lyons Sentinel making her 5-year-old debut.

In addition to Amigo Volo, Norman will send out a starter in the Commodore Barry. Jack's Legend N is 7-1 on the morning line, leaving from post seven with Dunn driving. The 8-year-old gelding has won 33 of 94 career races and earned \$784,976. Earlier this season, he had two wins in the preliminary rounds of the MGM Borgata Series at Yonkers.

He heads to the Commodore Barry off a third-place finish behind Nicholas Beach and This Is The Plan in last week's Open at The Meadowlands. Nicholas Beach, the Commodore Barry's defending champion and 3-1 morning-line favorite, won the Open in 1:47. Jack's Legend N came home in :25.4 and was clocked in 1:47.3.

"I was hoping he would get a good draw because he's been racing good," Norman said. "He needs some luck, but he's a very good horse. He's good on the front, but he's a better closer. He's a horse that would really benefit from a strong pace, and if he got dragged into the race, I think he could beat a lot of horses if he was raced the right way.

"He's a big, beautiful horse, that's good gaited and has a big engine. He's an easy horse to be around."

Action begins at 12:40 p.m. (EDT) at Harrah's Philadelphia. The Maxie Lee is race 12 on the 15-race card, sandwiched between the Betsy Ross and Commodore Barry. For complete entries, click here. Free program pages will be available at the PHHA website.





'Sentinel' seasonal debut set for Betsy Ross

After putting together the second Dan Patch Award-winning season of her career in 2021, female pacer Lyons Sentinel is ready to launch her 5-year-old campaign today (May 29) by meeting seven rivals in the \$100,000 Betsy Ross Mare Invitational at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Lyons Sentinel, who received her first Dan Patch Award in 2019 at the age of 2, is the only horse in the race making her seasonal debut. The group includes the top-three finishers in this year's Blue Chip Matchmaker Series — Drama Act, Racine Bell, and Easy To Please — as well as highly regarded New Zealand-import Amazing Dream N.

Trained by Jim King Jr. and driven by Tim Tetrick, Lyons Sentinel closed last year with a win in the TVG Series championship for female pacers to push her lifetime earnings to more than \$2 million. For the season, she won 10 of 19 races and hit the board another six times. For her career, she has won 22 of 47 starts and finished in the top three on 41 occasions.

Lyons Sentinel heads to the Betsy Ross off two qualifiers, finishing second in both. In the most recent, May 17 at Philly, she was timed in 1:53.1 and beaten three-quarters of a length by Allywag Hanover, the 2021 Dan Patch Award winner for older male pacers.

"She seems fine," said King, who trains Lyons Sentinel for Threelyonsracing. "I was pretty satisfied with her qualifier. She's not right up on her toes. It took her a few starts last year to really get her feet under her. I don't expect to get embarrassed by any means, but I think that she needs a race.

"The ones that have been in the Matchmaker and the top classes, I think they're going to be a step ahead as far as fitness. But she did some pretty good things last year, and at the end of the year there wasn't a horse all day long that went a better trip than she did in the TVG. That was ferocious."

Last year, Lyons Sentinel picked up her first win in her third start and had two victories after eight races. She then reeled off seven triumphs in a row, including the Clara Barton, Lady Liberty, Roses Are Red, Milton, and Dayton Distaff. She dropped her next three races, including a second-place finish in the Breeders Crown Mare Pace final, before bouncing back with a lengthy first-over trip from post nine in the TVG to win by three-quarters of a length in 1:49.1.

"Things didn't work out in the Breeders Crown, and people were kind of having doubts about her," said King, who trained 2019 Horse of the Year Shartin N. "But I was really happy with what she did accomplish. I was really proud of her. To date, she's not a Shartin, but by golly she's a good one. She's pretty darn nice."

Lyons Sentinel will start today's Betsy Ross from post seven and is 4-1 on the morning line. Amazing Dream N is the 3-1 favorite, followed by Racine Bell at 7-2. Drama Act is 9-2.

The Betsy Ross is part of a star-studded card at Harrah's Philadelphia that also includes the \$100,000 Maxie Lee Invitational Trot, which features two past Dan Patch Award winners in Amigo Volo and When Dovescry, and the \$100,000 Commodore Barry Invitational Pace, with Nicholas Beach fresh off his 1:47 win last week in the Open at The Meadowlands.

Also racing at Philly today is Dan Patch Award-winning filly pacer Niki Hill, who makes her 3-year-old debut in a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes.

Action begins at 12:40 p.m. (EDT) at Harrah's Philadelphia. The Betsy Ross is race 11 on the 15-race card, followed by the Maxie Lee and Commodore Barry.

Indiana fair horses begin 'Quest for the Governor's Cup' on June 1

Indiana's 2022 county fair harness racing season is just days away, and this year's program features new branding and social media initiatives. Two and three-year-old trotters and pacers as well as horsemen and women from around the state will participate weekly in the "Quest for the Governor's Cup," which culminates in the fair championships in August. Racing fans can follow along and participate using #Quest4GovCup on social media channels. Each week's racing stop is a round in the Quest, the first two kicking off at Converse on June 1 and 2, and returning June 8 and 9.

The circuit then travels to Corydon (June 16, 17); Shelbyville (June 21, 22); Frankfort (June 27, 28, July 4, 5); Kentland (July 9); Kendallville (July 9); Portland (July 13); back to Shelbyville

(July 18, 19); Goshen (July 23, 25, 26), returning to Connersville (August 1, 2) and again at Portland (August 6). At each location, horses will accumulate points based on their performance. The top eight point earners in each division that have also made the prerequisite seven fair starts will compete in the \$25,000 Governor's Cup Championships at the Indiana State Fair on Aug. 11.

In an effort to better recognize new track record holders at the Indiana county fairs, Indiana Standardbred Advisory Board has partnered with USHWA Indiana chapter to launch a new endeavor. Each horse who breaks a speed record in his/her division will receive an elegantly-designed neck sash to honor the achievement.

"Prior to last season we documented the records for each location, and by season's end, there were more than a dozen new speed records across the fairs. We want to present a sash to new record holders as a way to recognize their accomplishment. Hopefully the sash will be a visual source of pride for horsemen investing in the Indiana county fair program," said James Platz, USHWA Indiana chapter president.

Indiana fair races will be available via livestream this season through a partnership between the Indiana Standardbred Association and Indiana Standardbred Breed Development. Fans can watch fair racing by visiting the ISA website, indianaharness. com, on race days. Races will be archived on the website.


