



Ranking the 15 greatest Canadian horsemen of all time

My list of the best from the Great White North.

On Dec. 8, 2019, I authored a column headlined on HRU: Ranking the ten best horsemen of all time (full story here).

A few days ago, that column was reincarnated by Norman Glazer on the Facebook page Harness Racing History.

To say that the column brought about a whole lot of interest and not just a minimum of criticism would be somewhat of an understatement.

Most of the criticism was levied against those missing from the story. Chief among these was the absence of Canadians on

the list, in many instances, specifically the absence of Joseph Cyril O'Brien.

Mr. O'Brien certainly should have been included among them. I plead guilty as charged.

This led to this column giving my opinion of the best horsemen to emerge from Canada.

In order to some degree duck criticism that is bound to come my way, I decided to enlarge my list from 10 to 15.

Whereas the previous list was focused on trainers, this one includes drivers as well. However, extra credit in my excuse for a mind, was awarded to those who I felt were multi-talented in terms of driving and training.

All are Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame members, with the majority also being member of the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen.

Here they are in descending order:

15. Jack Kopas

Together with Ralph Baldwin, one of two Saskatchewan natives on this list. Like Baldwin, an inductee in both Goshen and in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Jack Kopas with his wife Alice first set up camp racing a stable of mostly young horses

Mike Lachance ranks fourth on Murray Brown's list of alltime Canadian greats. in Trois Rivieres, QC and occasionally racing some of the better ones at the Montreal tracks Blue Bonnets and Richelieu Park. After a few years, he moved to Ilderton, ON when he purchased the first great star in his stable Dr George Boyce's Super Wave. Super Wave was a mainstay in the Kopas stable for several years. As a 5-year-old in 1971 Super Wave was voted the Canadian Trotting Association Horse of the Year. Not to be outdone by his pupil, Kopas was voted Canadian Horseman of the Year in 1969 and 1976. The success of Super Wave was followed by a progression of top horses including Super Wave's full brother Springfield, Areba Areba, Nat Lobell, Jade Prince, Armbro Evita and Shadow Star.

14. Bill Wellwood

Inducted in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility. He was the trainer of the Breeders Crown winners Aviano and Village Jiffy and millionaires Village Connection and Village Jasper; also Metro winner Rustler Hanover and such notables as Keystone Gary and Surge Hanover. Not only a great driver and trainer in his own right, but also a trainer of the two future Hall of Fame inductees Bill O'Donnell and Ben Wallace.

13. Blair Burgess

An inductee in both Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Blair is a specialist in making lemonade out of perceived lemons, certainly in terms of buying modestly-priced yearlings and developing champions from them. Among the great horses he developed were the Triple Crown winner Glidemaster, the Hambletonian winner Amigo Hall and the

champion pacers Frugal Gourmet, Amity Chef, Real Desire and Tell All. Sometimes forgotten is the huge role that Burgess played in the rehabilitation of the great Western Ideal after suffering a near severed tendon in a racing accident as a 2-year-old.

12. Bob McIntosh

A member of both the living Harness Racing Hall of Fame at Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, McIntosh is world renowned for developing and often breeding his own champion after champion. He was twice honored as the recipient of the Glen Garnsey Award for United States Trainer of the Year and twice as the Canadian Trainer of the Year. He is the former leading trainer of Breeders Crown winners. Among his numerous trainees were Horses of the Year Artsplace and Staying Together; Canadian Horse of the Year Whenuwishuponastar, Artiscape and the great sire Camluck.

11. Buddy Gilmour

In the entire history of harness racing, there are few more beloved personalities than Buddy Gilmour. He is a member of both the Living Hall of Fame at Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. He started out working with multiple Hall



of Famer Clint Hodgins before heading out on his own. He was always among the leading drivers and stables in the glory days of Roosevelt and Yonkers Raceways. Among the multitude of great horses he has been associated with are On The Road Again, Matts Scooter, Joie de Vie, Laughs, Follow My Star and Steinam.

10. Bill O'Donnell

A member of the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen, the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame and Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. Considered by many to have been at least for a period of time to have been the greatest to have ever sat behind a horse. Together with John Campbell, he dominated drivers from 1981 through 1988, leading the money list four times and finishing second to Campbell another four times. He was the first driver to ever drive the winners of over \$10 million in a single year. Driver of the Year in 1982 and 1984. Horses he has driven read like a veritable who's who in the history of the sport. They include Nihilator, Valley Victory, Prakas, Camtastic, Cambest and Napoletasno.

9. John Campbell

The vast majority of people when asked who was the greatest driver ever respond John Campbell. I certainly would concur. As with most of these horsemen, Campbell is a member of both the sport's living Hall of Fame in Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. He was the youngest inductee ever at Goshen at the age of 32. He is also a member of Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. He is the driver of the winners of nearly \$300 million. He has won just about every Classics race worth winning, many of them numerous times. The horses he has driven consist of a Hall of Fame unto themselves. They include, but are not limited to, Mack Lobell, Peace Corps, Artsplace, Pine Chip, Cams Card Shark, Muscles Yankee, Armbro Goal, Art Major, Glidemaster and Real Desire.

8. Clint Hodgins

Another member of both the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Hodgins' first claim to fame was with the world champion 2-year-old trotting filly Acrasia. He then drove and trained Prince Adios, the first top horse sired by Adios, a horse that was to rule pacing for over a decade. In 1949, Hodgins led all North American drivers in both wins and money winnings. He drove and trained Bye Bye Byrd who was Horse of the Year in 1949. He drove Adios Butler to wins in the Little Brown Jug and Cane Pace as a 3-year-old. Among other renowned horses that he drove and trained were the great trotting mares Proximity and Elaine Rodney.

7. Ralph Baldwin

Yet another double Hall of Famer in both the United States and Canada. Baldwin, along with Jack Kopas are the two horsemen on this list who come from the Western Canadian province of Saskatchewan. The soft spoken Baldwin trained and drove the world champion, Triple Crown winner, 1963 Horse of the Year and successful sire Speedy Scot. He was also responsible for training and driving the Hambletonian winner Flirth and trained the Hambletonian winner Diller Hanover. Other notable horses that Baldwin trained and drove were Race Time, Carlene Hanover, Dartmouth, Snow Speed, Egan Hanover and Geranium.

6. Ron Waples

Perhaps the hardest worker this writer has ever known in harness racing. A man of perpetual motion whenever I saw him, both as a trainer and driver. He came out under the best of teachers, his cousin Keith Waples before he went out on his own. He has won every race of consequence including but far from limited to the Hambletonian, Little Brown Jug, numerous Breeders Crowns, Meadowlands Pace, Kentucky Futurity and North American Cup. Among the many outstanding horses with which he was associated were Ralph Hanover, No Sex Please, Sugarcane Hanover, Park Avenue Joe, Presidential Ball, Fake Left, Sportsmaster and JM Van Gogh.

5. Herve Filion

Per W. R. Haughton: "There are a lot of good harness drivers, a few great ones... and there is Filion." Where does one begin in describing Herve? He retired as the all-time leading

race-winning driver with 15,180 wins. He is a member of three Halls of Fame — add the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame to the two major harness racing ones. Winner of the Lou Marsh Trophy as the Canadian Athlete of the Year. Ten consecutive years from 1968 to 1978 as the leading dash winning driver in North America. HTA Driver of the Year 10 different times. Canadian Horseman of the Year.

4. Michel Lachance

Thought by many to be the best all-around horseman of the modern era. Before embarking on a career as one of the greatest catch drivers of all time, Lachance trained and raced a stable of about 30 head, almost all of them owned at least in part by himself. Among his numerous feats were winning 770 races in 1986, the most ever in a single season to that time; the leading race winner in four separate years; the leading money winning driver in 1996; the winner of four Hambletonians, five Little Brown Jugs and numerous other classics events on a regular basis throughout all of North America. Among the numerous great horses with which he is associated are: Bettors Delight, Continentalvictory, Matts Scooter, Self Possessed, Victory Dream, Dragon Again, Western Dreamer and Magical Mike.

3. Joe O'Brien

Joe O'Brien leaves the greatest legacy of perhaps all Canadian horsemen in the form of the O'Brien Awards named after this quiet master horseman from Alberton, PEI. Joe passed away in 1984. The O'Brien Awards were instituted in 1989. They could not have chosen a better subject trophy with which to honor



the recipients of Canada's greatest horses and horsemen. It was said that there was not a hole too small that Joe O'Brien could not find his way out of. As a driver, he was noted for his almost never needing to use the whip. O'Brien's accomplishments were numerous. He trained and drove the Hambletonian winners Scott Frost and Blaze Hanover. He had given more horses their initial 2:00 mile than any other driver in history. He trained and drove the Little Brown Jug winners Shadow Wave and Melvins Woe. He also trained and drove the Roosevelt International winners Fresh Yankee and Armbro Flight. Among the numerous other horses his names is associated with are Flower Child, Ima Lulu, Nero, Armbro Ranger and Governor Armbro.

2. Keith Waples

Voted by the readership of the Canadian Sportsman and of Trot magazine as the most outstanding Canadian horseman ever. Much to the embarrassment of Trot, they didn't even have Mr. Waples on their list of those they suggested as eligibles. Nevertheless, their readership voted him in as a write in candidate. When it came to harness racing, there was very little that Keith Waples couldn't and didn't do. In addition to training and driving numerous champions, Waples was involved in the building of three harness tracks Orangeville, Cloverdale and Sandown Raceway. It was as a driver where he received the most fame. He was the first to drive a horse in 2:00 in Canada with Mighty Dudley in 1959, the first Canadian Roosevelt International Trot winner with Tie Silk in 1962 and winner of the Little Brown Jug in 1972 with Strike Out. However, as great a driver as Keith was and he was most certainly that it was as a role model and teacher of drivers where he might have been most adept. Great drivers such as Herve Filion, Mike Lachance, his cousin Ron Waples, Ron Feagan and Bill O'Donnell among others credit him with being the driver from who they learned the most about how to conduct themselves both on and off the racetrack.

1. Ben White

Ben White is the only one of these horsemen that I was never privileged to see. From 1922 on into the 1930s, he dominated harness racing like no other. A good deal of my information was gathered from a masterful article on him written by Jerry Shively that appeared in the October 1985 issue of Hoof Beats magazine. The article can be accessed by googling Ben White



harness racing. Mr. White excelled in every area of the sport it was possible to excel at — as a trainer, driver, breeder and was among, if not the best conditioner of young horses in the history of the sport. He was the first trainer to winter train his horses in the south, training for 30 years at Seminole Park and then later moving to the lamented training center that was to bear his name, Ben White Raceway.

He trained and drove four Hambletonian winners — Mary Reynolds, Rosalind, The Ambassador and Volo Song. The Ambassador was a maiden and reportedly offered for sale for \$1,500 before the Hambletonian. The thought was that he might have had one or two more Hambletonian winners because some years he had several candidates for the race.

He also trained and drove seven Kentucky Futurity winners, six Matrons and four Review Futurities, then for the most part all the major Grand Circuit events of the sport.

Like numbers two and three on this list, Keith Waples and Joe O'Brien, Mr. White was known for not using the whip for anything other than as a guiding tool. His horses were known for their outstanding manners and great gaits.

A listing of his horses include several who have been a great influence on the breed. Horses such as The Abbe (paternal grandsire of Hal Dale), Scotland, Mr McElwyn, Volga, Kashmir, Iosola's Worthy Sumatra and Ruth M Chenault are still found in numerous pedigrees today.

He believed that in addition to Rosalind, his greatest horse to be the ill-fated Volo Song who many people thought was the greatest trotter ever to that time, perhaps even better than his contemporary Greyhound.

ICSI - an acronym you should know

ICSI (pronounced ick-see) is an acronym for Intracytoplasmic Sperm Injection, and it represents a major breakthrough in equine reproduction. It can be the salvation of top mares who, for any reason or another, are unable to produce a foal by normal reproductive methods.

Basically, ICSI is a specialized form of invitro fertilization. It involves the injection of a single sperm into a mature egg.

We, here at Walnut Hall, have been doing ICSIs for two years, and I can best explain the process by describing what I, a total layman, have observed and learned.

We are blessed to have the services of Dr. Karen Wolfsdorf, recognized as one of the world's leading equine reproductive vets. She's backed up by a full staff of other world class equine specialists at her clinic, Hagyard Equine Medical Institute.

Dr. Wolfsdorf recommends doing an ICSI on a mare that is well-nigh impossible to get in foal, or one who has a history of getting foal but never carrying to term. Although it gets trickier the older a mare is, by doing an ICSI we have successfully gotten a foal from Canland Hall, at age 24, when she could not reproduce in any other way.

The process starts with a vet, in our case, Dr. Wolfsdorf, scanning the uterus of the mare in question. This can be done at any time for these purposes, although it is best done when the mare is not in season. On her ultrasound screen, her trained eye can pick out and count the number of eggs, or oocytes, on each horn of the uterus. You like to have 12 or more, but you can still go forward with as few as seven or eight.

The mare then goes to the Hagyard Clinic, where another specialist removes all the eggs, technically oocytes. This is a simple procedure, for someone who is highly trained and skillful, and there's no discomfort to the mare. Let me emphasize, it is not a painful procedure. The technical term for removing the oocytes is aspiration.

Once the oocytes are retrieved, they get shipped off, in our case,

to the Equine Medical Services Clinic, in Columbia, MO. Dr. Foss is the major magician there, and it is his clinic.

The day after the oocytes arrive at Dr. Foss' clinic, a full dose of shipped semen from the stallion of choice must also be delivered there. That is fresh, chilled semen, exactly what is shipped every day of the breeding season in our business.

Once Dr. Foss has both the oocytes and the semen, he isolates single sperm cells and injects one sperm into each egg. Then there's a wait of about five days, and if the process has succeeded, at least one of the injected oocytes will develop into an embryo. Then it's a simple matter for Dr. Foss to transfer the embryo into a recipient mare, wait till it's been at least 12 days, and then check to see if the embryo took. If the ultrasound exam shows a pregnancy, voila!, you're on your way to the foaling barn in 11 months.

If the ICSI process should produce more than one embryo, the additional one can be frozen and used the following breeding season.

I'm sure this whole deal sounds complicated, and it is, but it does work, at least most of the time. And if it doesn't, you can just start over and try again. And the complications can be well worth it if the end result is a good looking colt or filly from a great mare, who otherwise would be condemned to being barren for the rest of her life.

ABOUT THE COST

The whole process will cost a good \$7,500, and that will probably go up every year. On top of that, you also have the cost of the recipient mare, both the shipping from Missouri and then her expenses after she arrives. With Dr. Foss, you can return the mare, so you pay a \$1,000 "rental fee."

As I said earlier, I think of ICSI in terms of old or problem mares, but there is also a totally different and important aspect. Because the mare can be anywhere when the oocytes are aspirated, this process can be used to great advantage while the mare is still in full training and racing every week. If I were lucky enough to own Manchego, I'd be doing an ICSI on her every year, and still not miss a beat on the racetrack.

As to who to breed her, that's beyond this kid's remit, but it sure would be a nice problem to have. And there's still time, if one moves fast, to do an ICSI on her this season.







Sarah Lauren Scott – caretaker and much more

Born and raised in Halton Hills, Ontario, Sarah Lauren Scott has worked for some of the sport's top conditioners, such as Brett Pelling, Mark Harder, Joe Stutzman, and Nifty Norman.

"Those who know me, know that I take things into my own hands and get things done. I guess you could say I began doing this at the early age of 7 when I came across an ad in the newspaper listing a horse available for part board, so I made an appointment to go and meet him and the rest is history," said Sarah Lauren Scott.

"Horseman Joe Stutzman kept his turn out and lay up horses at the same farm where I was riding, and it wasn't long before I found myself riding less and focusing on the care of the standardbred. My family was not involved in the business; however, they are now.

"My father worked for over 45 years in the police force and my mother completed her career in the school system. Looking back now, I cannot believe what they gave up for me to follow my dreams and am forever grateful for what they have given me.

"My parents can always be found by the rail waiting for me to lead out my horse.

"We've shared Breeders Crown victories together, as well as being 'my support' when my trotter Fork (who I owned and trained) would make a break. My father would be the first to say, 'Let's get ready for next week."

When Scott was 16 she spent the summer working for Joe Stutzman at Gaitway Farms in New Jersey.

"I took my job as a caretaker seriously and developed a work ethic that I apply to everything I do. I don't stop until it's done."

Besides a caretaker, Scott has been involved in the racing industry in many ways, as she's worked for Joanne's Staking Service and the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society (where she actually placed 67 horses in new homes the last year she worked as the program coordinator).

"I very much enjoyed working at the staking service. To me it was very exciting, yet very stressful with the deadlines — but rewarding.

"The Standardbred Retirement is something I strongly believe in. I was the vice president for three years there before I ended up as the program coordinator.

"I was also the track photographer at Grand River Raceway and worked at System Equine where I designed custom stalls, barn layouts and fencing solutions.

Working under some of harness racing's top trainers, Scott has been blessed to have been the sole caretaker for many top horses — two being world champions Rocknroll Hanover and Syrinx Hanover.

"These horse are beyond special. Syrinx was my girl – she was everything. She really took me to the next level, though by no means was she easy. She without a question was the one who made me the caretaker I am today.

"I remember the day as of it were yesterday. Nifty Norman (while working for Brett Pelling) had horses coming up from New Jersey to the Canadian barn and asked me if I wanted Hez Striking or the 'wild 2-year-old.' I told him I would leave it up to him — hoping the open trotter would end up in my stall; but

he didn't. Instead, it was Rocknroll Hanover — the ever so smart 2-year-old who ended in my stall.

"We became inseparable. Rock was all class and it still makes me feel emotional thinking about him. To me, he was perfection and wish he could be here today. To my knowledge he is the only horse in harness history to win three one-million dollar events, and the first 2-year-old to break the first sub 1:50 mile. What I would give to live 2005 over again."

People who know Scott know her first true love was a horse named Music Director, whom she fell in love with as a child while working for Stutzman.

"Music Director was a kind, gentle gelding that taught me the ins and outs. He was the horse I dedicated all my time to and I was heart-broken when he changed homes.

"Being so young I didn't understand the full capacity of buying and selling racehorses. Remember, at that time there was no social media and you had to work to keep a horse on your radar, and I did just that.

"Music is now 32-years-old and living and loving his best life with my trotter Fork at a farm in Milton, Ontario. (During his racing career Music earned \$960,254).

"The day Fork crossed the finished line first in 1:53.4 was the happiest day of my life. He is 'a box of chocolates' for sure, and has a best-selling story to tell in his own right. He is now 12 years old and will be forever under my dedicated care. Fork was the \$900 yearling that gave me the ride of a lifetime."

In June of last year, Scott made the choice to move to New Jersey to expand her career. Today, she works full-time as a respiratory specialist for Nortev Flexineb of Ireland. As a key member of the Flexineb team, Scott brings an unrivalled knowledge of the harness racing industry.

"Sarah possesses a warm, pleasant and knowledgeable personality — all traits that help veterinarians, trainers and owners in their uses of technology," said Gavan O'Sullivan of Nortev.

Launched in 2013, Scott created SLS Equine, which has become one of the leading suppliers of custom horse equipment. Her equipment has been worn by many champions, such as Captaintreacherous, Lather Up, Atlanta, Ramona Hill and many more.

"I have worked so hard creating the original printed brow bands and buxtons, and my work speaks for itself. Every detail is as important to me as the last. I design equipment to last, be comfortable, lightweight and personalized.

"I formed Platinum Equine Services with focus to horse health. I have a very strong team that works with me in Canada and the USA. We have therapeutic products available to help equine athletes reach their fullest potential. Our feature devices are the Flexineb and Bemer therapy system. We offer direct sales, rental, full education, support, and direction to ensure that horses are

Scott is by far one of the most dedicated and hard working horsewomen in harness racing. However, three years ago she was dealt a blow that would forever change her life.

"December 2018, I received a phone call in the middle of the night that forever impacted me. First Line Training Center (Barn 7) where my horse Fork was stabled was on fire. This is every horsemen's nightmare.

"Because of this horrific situation, (my friend and firefighter) Riley (McGilloway) and I incorporated a barn fire prevention and education program called HINDSIGHT, which entails public events, hosting seminars, and training first responders. We are dedicated and committed to do our best preparing and educating as many people as possible to ensure they never receive that phone call.

"I have been quite fortunate with the opportunity to follow my passion, and will continue to stay involved in the harness racing industry. I enjoy spending time with the horses of Pit Bull Stable and love them as my own.

"There is not a better feeling then seeing the yearling you have selected go behind the gate under the lights the first time. I still get that rush."

The slot owners for this year's Mohawk Million are listed below:



Breakfast With The Babies begins at The Meadowlands

Saturday morning (June 5) signaled the start of the 2021 Breakfast With Babies, sponsored by Fashion Farms, on a perfect morning at The Meadowlands with the temperature in the low 70's and virtually no wind. The races began at 9 a.m.

Perfect Sting (Dave Miller) opened up the day's activities with a 1:48.4 conditioning mile in the day's very first qualifier. Miller put him on the front through fractions of :27.2, :55:3, 1:22.4 before a :26 sprint home under minimal urging. Joe Holloway trains the 2020 Dan Patch award winning sophomore for Brittany Farms and Val D'Or Farms. Hot Mess Express was a comfortable second under no encouragement by Andy McCarthy and Summa Cum Laude (Dexter Dunn) third.

The first crop of Walner has been well received as winter training reports have been optimistic and Saturday's performances did nothing to dissuade that opinion. His sons and daughters won five of the seven trotting races on the day.

The results suggest a quote by the late, great Ron Gurfein who observed early in the first crop of another great trotting sire of a few generations ago, "You're going to have to have a Valley Victory to beat a Valley Victory."

The 2-year-olds began with filly trotters and Walner fillies were first and second with Penelope J (Scott Zeron) edging by leader American Beauty (Yannick Gingras) late through the 28-second final quarter of a remarkable 1:56.1 mile, with both only mildly asked for trot late. Manon (Lucas Wallin) was a good third. Linda Toscano trains the winner, who is out of the mare Decadence, for Ken Jacobs who paid \$160,000 to breeders KR Breeding and Preferred Equine Marketing for her at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale (LSYS).

Peyton Hanover (Tim Tetrick) rewarded Jeff Snyder and Four Friends Racing for their \$400,000 investment by winning her debut in comfortable fashion in 1:58.4 with her final panel clocked in :27.2. She was held off the early lead and closed beautifully to get up as Moni Heist (Zeron) rallied in tandem through the inside to be second with Pardon My Lindy (Gingras) third. Marcus Melander trains the Muscle Hill—Pennies From Above lass who is a Hanover Shoe Farms bred that sold at the Standardbred Horse Sale (SHS).

Another Walner filly impressed in race four as **Misswalner Fashion** (Tetrick) rallied by the early leaders through her 27.4 second end to a 1:56.4 mile. Brickhouse Babe (Mark MacDonald), also by Walner, closed late as well to be second with Jaya Bae (Walner—Mission Brief), the highest priced yearling of 2020 at \$725,000, held third after cutting the mile. Jim Campbell trains the winner, a Fashion Farms homebred out of Sweet Love owned by Jules Siegel and Judith Peres.

Sophomore pacing colt Perfect Sting (David Miller) recorded a 1:48.4 conditioning mile on Saturday morning (June 5) in the Meadowlands' first qualifier.

Temporal Hanover (Tetrick) won impressively in 2:01.3 / :27.4, closing to an easy score over mile cutter Fashiononthehill (Dunn) and Ramses (Wallin). The winner is a Walner colt out of Think Twice that was a relatively inexpensive \$55,000 purchase by AMG Stable, Kjellgren, Wahlstedt and Heights Stable at SHS from breeder Hanover Farms. Marcus Melander is the trainer.

Tetrick strung four straight together when he drove **Wall Of Moni** (Walner—All Our Moni) to an effortless 1:56.3 / 27.3 come from behind win. The colt is a Moni Maker Stable homebred from the family of that great mare and is trained by Domenico Cecere. Classic Hill (Brian Sears) was second while Theresnolimit S (M. Melander), from the first crop of Nuncio, held for third.

King Of The North (Mark MacDonald) lived up to his imposing pedigree, by Walner from the champion mare Check Me Out, with an impressive 1:58.2 score from the pocket, home in 27 seconds. Chulo (Gingras) cut the mile and gave way grudgingly to be second while Periculum (Mealnder) came third. Breeders Ray Schnittker and Steve Jones share ownership of the colt (who went through the LSYS sale for \$190,000) with Arden Homestead Stable and Nolamaura Racing.

Pacers began with fillies in the eighth race and **Onecrookedleg** (A. McCarthy) overcame that name and a bargain price to sprint home in :26 flat for the win in 1:59.4 over Treacherous Kiss (Gingras) and The Ideal Huntress (Dunn). Trainer Brett Bittle spent a mere \$9,000 in Lexington for the Sweet Lou filly out of Rock My Girl and kept her for himself.

Bermuda benefited from a ground saving Dexter Dunn steer to close up the inside for a 1:55 / :27 score over Lake Dora (Gingras) and Captain's Princess (A. McCarthy). The winner is a daughter of Captaintreacherous out of Sweetest Emotion owned by Diamond Creek Racing, bred by Let It Ride Stables and trained in the Nancy Takter barn.

Captaintreacherous had another winner when **Atlas Hanover** (A. McCarthy) went pretty much all the way on an easy lead before

sprinting home in :26.2 for a 1:56.3 score. Wearinmysixshooter (Gingras) was flying late, :25.4 into the fast last quarter to get up for second with Danger Zone (Todd McCarthy) third. Tony Alagna trains Atlas Hanover, out of Ameraway, for Robert LeBlanc, David Anderson, Ken Jacobs and In The Gym who paid \$170,000 at last year's SHS. Hanover is the breeder.

First crop pacing sire Huntsville had his first Meadowlands winner this morning in Foxhunt (T. McCarthy) won a 27-second stretch long battle over Nautical Hanover (Dunn) for a 1:56 mark. Caviart Scout (Gingras) was a late rallying third. **Foxhunt** is the first foal of the good mare Wrangler Magic and was a \$75,000 Lexington purchase by Ken Jacobs from breeder Crawford Farms. Trainer Tony Alagna picked up his second win of the day.


The homebred Sweet Lou colt from Economy Terror, **Market Based** (Gingras) scored from off the pace in 1:55 flat with a strong close to get up over Captaingiddyupngo (Dunn) after Colby Jack went offstride in the stretch after looking like a winner. Nancy Takter trains Market Based for Chuck Pompey, Howard Taylor and Edwin Gold.

Indiana fair circuit opens, provides first glimpse at progeny of some first-crop sires

The first week of June in Indiana marks the beginning of fair racing. Often, the opening stops on the fair circuit provide an early look at this season's 2-year-old crop, particularly the first progeny from a sire new to the Hoosier State. The initial program of the season was slated for Thursday (June 3) at Converse, IN, but was cancelled and carried over to the following day. As a result, the Miami County Fair offered a double feature Friday (June 4), with 31 races carded. Billed as the Governor's Cup Racing Series, this pair of programs kicked off a schedule which includes 35 dates scattered over 10 locations throughout the state, concluding in October.

Doug Rideout, a perennial top driver and trainer on the Indiana fair circuit, reached the winner's circle more than any other horseman on the day. The Winchester-based conditioner sent



out 10 winners, each of which he also steered. In addition, he picked up two more victories as a catch driver. Six of Rideout's scores came with freshman trotters seeing their first racing action, with four representing the highly-anticipated first crops of Crescent Fashion and Dover Dan.

Crescent Beauty captured the first race on the second program at Converse which featured 11 trotting events. Rideout guided the Crescent Fashion—Overt filly through a gate-to-wire performance, winning in a time of 2:11. The freshman is owned by breeder Peter Schmucker Jr. and Rideout's wife, Julie. Lonestar Fashion, a gelded son of Crescent Fashion, recovered from an early break to win by nearly five lengths in his \$3,000 division. Bred by Lonestar Stables, the 2-year-old is owned by Julie Rideout and John Graber. Crescent Fashion was also represented by three runners-up on the card.

Hot Dan, another of Rideout's winners, was one of four freshmen from the first crop of Bluegrass Stake winner Dover Dan

to claim victory. The homebred gelding, out of Glide Sally Glide, is a half-brother to Indiana Sires Stakes champion Just Jess 4, 1:54.4f (\$352,354). Bred and owned by Alan White, Hot Dan circled the Converse oval in a time of 2:14. Filly Dover Dance turned in one of the fastest miles of the day for young trotters. Piloted by owner and trainer Greg Runyon, the Dover Dan-Antsy Dancey lass stopped the clock in 2:07, matching the time turned in by Jailhouse Jesse filly Tori Tori one race earlier. A trio of Dover Dan babies also registered runner-up performances.

Four divisions were offered for sophomore trotters; two for fillies and two for colts. **Northern Rocks**, a Guccio—Matriarch gelding, turned in the fastest mile of the four splits. Trained and driven by Alvin Miller, the homebred, owned by Martin Schmucker, took control from post three and trotted away by more than eight lengths in a time of 2:01.2.

On the pacing side, three freshmen from the first crop of Breeders Crown champion Luck Be Withyou collected wins on the first card of the day. **Luckychris**, the first foal from six-figure earner Diamond Amber, produced the fastest mile of the day for 2-year-old pacers. With Clifton Bell in the bike for Curtis Rice, the colt received every call on his way to a 13 and one-half length romp, tripping the timer in 2:00.2. Bred by Cletus Christner, Luckychris is owned by D and R Racing Stable. Luck Be Withyou's other winners included gelding Luckbewithalex (2:03) and colt Be A Lucky Star (2:04.3).

JK Endofanera's first crop made a big splash in the Hoosier State last season, and three collected victories in five events for sophomore pacers. **Frontier Metis** registered the quickest mile, pacing the circuit in 1:57.3. Mike Hollenback owns and trains the gelding, bred by Frontier Farms. The sophomore was driven to victory by Charlie Conrad. Filly Jk's Shining Star turned in a 1:58 performance for trainer Peter Redder. Bred by Victory Hill Farm, the three year old is co-owned by Redder and Therl Hensley. Rideout steered the pacer to victory for one of his two catch driving triumphs.

The sire was also represented by a pair of freshman winners. LeWayne Miller sent out filly **Ever A Jk** to a 2:01 score. Bred by Fred Wittmer, the 2-year-old is owned by Wittmer, L & S Racing and Kevin Lambright. Lambright steered the pacer to victory. Filly Zig Zag Zoom left the field in the dust in her \$3,000 division, drawing away by 14 lengths at the wire and recording a 2:06 mile. Conrad trains and drives the homebred, owned by his wife, Sarah, and children, Carson and Carder. The freshman is out of the mare Zoom Past You, who took a 1:52.3 mark at three with just shy of \$180,000 in earnings.

With the opening round of freshman Indiana Sires Stakes set for mid-July, the first of many two year olds logged qualifying miles Saturday morning (June 5) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. **Callmesue**, one of two young trotters to line up behind the starter, finished second in her attempt. Owned, trained and driven by James Yoder, the Dover Dan—Lisas Mission lass covered the mile in 2:00.3 and kicked home in :28.2.JK Endofanera colt **Soaring Now** wired the field and won by nearly 12 lengths in his qualifier for trainer Aaron Stutzman. Stopping the clock in 1:56.2, he was followed across the line by fellow freshmen **Bestaluck** (Luck Be Withyou, 1:59) and **Running On Faith** (Fred And Ginger, 1:59.3).

Continualou outduels stablemate for second straight PASS win

If **Continualou** had sneaked a pick to her left while she was charging through the lane Saturday (June 5) at The Meadows, she might have noticed that the horse gaining on her was her stablemate, Blue Diamond Eyes. But Continualou gave no quarter, edging Blue Diamond Eyes by a nose for her second straight Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) win.

The \$149,532 event for sophomore filly pacers, known as the Adios Betty, was contested over two divisions, with **Mikala** taking the other split.

Blue Diamond Eyes circled the field from post six for the early lead, but when Continualou quarter-poled to the top for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., it appeared she had he field where she wanted it. Yet the daughter of Sweet Lou—Continual Velocity, a homebred for Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscemi LLC, needed a :27.4 final quarter to score in 1:51 and hold off her stablemate by a nose. Incaseyoudidntknow completed the ticket.



"It's a great feeling to win with a homebred, and that's a great filly she beat," said trainer Ron Burke of Continualou, who soared over \$300,000 in career earnings. "She just keeps getting better and better — maybe over-achieving. I don't know that she's sharper than Blue Diamond Eyes, but she's had easier trips. Before this year's over, Blue Diamond Eyes will be heard from."

A five-race maiden entering The Adios Betty, Mikala moved willingly second over for George Brennan and roared wide through the stretch to triumph in 1:50.1. Early leader Thebeachiscalling finished second, 1-1/4 lengths back, with Marsala Hanover.

Winning trainer Nik Drennan said he liked the way the race set up for the daughter of Always B Miki—Shes Some Treasure, an \$180,000 yearling acquisition at Lexington for Joseph Davino, Brad Shackman, Anthony Perretti Farm and Drennan Stable.

"She had a perfect trip," Drennan said. "Her last couple starts, she's closed pretty well. She likes to run horses down. She's progressed immensely from 2 to 3. She's bred unbelievable; I thought she was one of the best fillies in the sale. She'll go next to the Lady Maud at Yonkers."

Tony Hall gave Classicist a pocket trip but said there was no quarantee that would be the best spot for the daughter of Captaintreacherous—Mother of Art.

"She's been aggressive before, so they added a mini-bit. I was very thankful to have it today in that position," Hall said. "She was really loaded and finished up strong. She wasn't stretched out at all, and she still seemed to have something left."

Classicist prevailed in 1:51.1, 1/2 length better than Darby Hanover, while Captains Maid earned show. Tahnee Camilleri trains the winner for David Kryway.

This Is The Plan blazes to 1:47.3 world record in Battle of Lake Erie

This Is The Plan dominated the \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie at MGM Northfield Park, setting a 1:47.3 all age, half-mile track world and track record while winning gate-to-wire.

Yannick Gingras drove the Ron Burke trainee to the record victory that was 5-1/4 lengths better than Western Joe (Aaron Merriman) in second. Catch The Fire(Brett Miller) was third. Stars Align A (Joe Bongiorno) finished fourth and Hesa Kingslayer N grabbed the final check.

The mile surpassed the 1:48.1 world record on a half set by Pet Rock and David Miller at Ohio's Delaware County Fairgrounds in 2013.

The performance was also a career best for This Is The Plan, whose previous best was a 1:48.2 mile set at 4 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Sent off as the 2-5 favorite, This Is The Plan (Somebeachsomewhere—That's The Plan) led the invitational for older pacers through fractions of :26.2, :53.3 and 1:20.3 and scooted home in :27 to win for Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby and Lawrence Karr.

The win pushed This Is The Plan's career earnings to \$2,206,200 and his seasonal bankroll to \$449,500. The gelding, bred by Moni Market Breeders, has a career record of 17-23-8 in 78 career starts and a 2021 slate of 3-6-0 in 10 starts, including a win in the \$514,000 Borgata Final on April 19 at Yonkers Raceway.

Merriman and Beaver dominate OHSS trots

Aaron Merriman and trainer Chris Beaver captured both \$50,000 divisions of Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) for 3-year-old colt trotters on a lovely Saturday summer evening (June 5) at Northfield Park.

Spaaaartners' Panzano captured the first OHSS contest in a brisk 1:55.3, in a dramatic, multi-length finish after stalking the leading Street Gossip (Brett Miller) throughout the mile.

"Chris' (trainer Beaver) horses are always tight and ready to race," said Merriman, who drove the son of Corraggioso, pushing his career earnings to \$139,724, to his fourth career victory in 13 starts.

Panzano was bred by Chris Coyle and is the first foal out of his dam Grace N Charlie (by SJ's Caviar), who earned \$225,830 and took an 8-year-old record of 1:55.4f. Both Panzano and Street Gossip left the gate at 4-5 odds, while third place Elliotstone (DeWayne Minor) was the 24-1 choice among bettors.

Winning Ticket kept his unbeaten win streak intact with a front-stepping 1:54 victory in the second OHSS trotting division for sophomores. With Merriman driving for Beaver, the son of Triumphant Caviar is now two-for-two in this series.

"I love this horse," said Beaver. "He's the nicest son of Triumphant Caviar that I've trained. My goal is to keep him on track for the

3-year-old Championship here at Northfield in September. He should have won last year's 2-year-old Championship but came up sick for that race."

Lockbox (6-1) got up for second for driver Chris Page, with 45-1 longshot Omyheart finishing third for Tyler Smith.

Winning Ticket is owned by Beaver, Steve Zeehandelar, Tim Homan, and Jim Burnett and was bred by James Bender. He upped his career coffers to \$199,547 with this win, the ninth of his career and fifth in as many starts this season. Winning Ticket is the second foal out of his dam, the hardy Credit Winner race mare Lotto Winner, 7, 1:56.1H (\$166,461).

Summer Touch, Smothastenesewisky win OHSS for 3YOFP

In the first of two \$50,000 OHSS divisions for 3-year-old pacing fillies, 1-9 favorite Summer Touch notched her second straight victory in the series for driver Chris Page and trainer Ronnie Burke, clocked in 1:52.3. The daughter of Well Said had captured her first OHSS event in 1:53.1 at Miami Valley for owners Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services, Slaughter Racing and Weaver Bruscemi.

"There's no other word for this filly than special," Page said. "Last year she won the Ohio triple crown and came back great this year at three."

Last year's \$300,000 OSS Championship winner now has homebred lass has \$353,800 in her coffers from nine career wins and two seconds in 11 starts. Summer Touch scored her triumph in wire-to-wire fashion, besting longshot rivals 60-1 Ball Diamond (Billy Davis, Jr.) and 45-1 Lacey (Brett Miller).

Smothastenesewisky, the 7-2 choice, pulled off a mile upset in the second OHSS division, stopping the timer in a career best 1:52 for driver Hunter Myers, who was piloting the daughter of Nob Hill High for trainer Brian D. Haynes of Washington Court House, Ohio.

"She didn't leave the gate the way I had wanted to, so I got a second over trip and then when I pulled her three-wide down the backstretch, she had a lot of go and it worked out," Myers said.

The victory was the first this season in four tries for Smothastenesewisky, who was bred by Robert Mondilio and Donald Robinson. She now has \$105,981 in career earnings. Shameful Eyes was second for Aaron Merriman at 6-1 odds, while 7-1 Rainy Day Chic got up for third with Tony Hall in the bike.

She has earned \$1,195,584 lifetime.

It's Academic (Tim Tetrick) won the second Graduate division for trotters with a three-quarter-of-a-length victory over favored Ready For Moni in 1:51. It's Academic (Uncle Peter—Muscle Hill) is trained by Ron Burke for Brad Grant of Ontario. The trotter is now 5-1-2 in 10 starts this year and sports a career bankroll of \$618,688.

Captain Barbossa (Dexter Dunn) won the first of two pacing Graduate tests by three-quarters-of-a-length over Warrawee Vital in a career best 1:47.1 for trainer Tony Alagna and owners Robert Leblanc, David Anderson and Alagnafrankinthegym Stable. Captain Barbossa (Captaintreacherous—Swinging Beauty) improved to 3-1-0 in 5 starts this year and upped his



career bankroll to \$533,438.

Allywag Hanover (Tim Tetrick) took the final Graduate test of the night with 1:48.1 victory that was a half-length better than Ruthless Hanover.

The gelded son of Captaintreacherous—Anderosa Hanover is owned by Allywag Stable and trained by Brett Pelling. It was the second win in five 2021 starts for the pacer who sports career earnings of \$297,668.

I sighed. "It took me a while, but I realized people are not especially interested in listening to tragedies."

He nodded. "Most of your racing reports do seem to involve losing photo finishes, broken strides, mysterious juices, lousy drives and locked wheels."

I sipped my double cream and triple sugar, smiled, and said, "Dude, you can't call yourself a harness horse handicapper without scapegoats and villains. In wagering on horse racing, it is always somebody else's fault. Heck, a few of my pals have not picked the wrong horse since 2002."

"And yet, you remain a player."

"Yeah, but Trey doesn't play the races as much these days."

"Any particular reason?"

"I never was a good handicapper, and I'm getting worse."

He took another sip and nodded. "Math and logic are skills best learned at a young age."

"I can handle math. I took ninth-grade math three times."

"Then what's your problem?" he asked.

"I could never overcome my psychological quirk."

"Which one?"

"I have a part of my psyche that prevents me from wagering on a favorite, and in harness racing, some racing cards have plenty of heavy favorites that win plenty of races. Trust me, pal, in the real world of horserace handicapping, tossing every favorite in every race is a recipe for disaster."

"Interesting. Maybe, deep down, you are always trying to prove everybody wrong, everybody being the smart money."

I shrugged. "Smart money may be an oxymoron in horse race wagering. But really, what is the fun in cashing a ticket on a horse that goes off at 1-9 and wins by ten lengths?"

"More fun than ripping up a 20-1 ticket."

"Not for me. To me, winning a race with ridiculous chalk in a race would feel like cheating or aiding and abetting a crime."

"With that type of emotional bias, it's probably good that you are no longer wagering with enthusiasm, but I understand where you are coming from. Deep down, most of us want the world to be fair. We want everyone to have an equal shot."

"I have another theory."

"You have a thousand theories." He said.

"Maybe the reason I put my money on longshots is that in my mind, I have less to lose when my horse loses and a lot more to gain if it pulls off an upset."

He nodded. "Getting more joy from unexpected successes than expected ones is theoretically logical. However, the logic fades fast when you are trying to make money."

"I KNOW that. Gambling on horse races with my heart instead of my head is ridiculous, and cashing tickets on longshots seems to have gotten more difficult the past couple of years. Favorites seem to win more often. And these chalky dynamics have pushed my gambling from lousy to hopeless."

He cupped his hands around his white mug, leaned forward, and said, "Maybe the powers that be should make the races more competitive. How difficult can that be?"

"Very difficult. Racetracks tinker around with different distances, postpositions, and classification systems. Nothing seems to stick."

He paused and then said, "I'm from the technology world, but I will tell you this, the people who set up the races could use data from the 100 horses entered in a horse program and set up very competitive races if they wanted to."

I explained, "Race secretaries, the people who set up races are called racing secretaries."

"If race secretaries had the freedom to shuffle gaits, drivers, postpositions, distances, and handicap starts, they should be able to spit out a dozen races that would not have a single prohibitive favorite or a single hopeless longshot."

"Yikes, that's ridiculously radical and wild, a whole new ballgame."

"It would be a new paradigm. The structure would be logical and efficient. Every horse in every race would be competitive. Every race would be more exciting."

I said, "Top drivers, trainers, gamblers, and owners would rebel."

He asked, "Is your sport for drivers and trainers? Is excitement better than monotony? Theoretically, where all horses have an equal chance in this system, the top drivers will be revealed, making great drivers more important. Suddenly, the human becomes more important, which is a great dynamic because people are relatable."

I drained my cup and asked, "If every race is a blanket finish with no heavy favorites, how would that affect handicappers? What is the point of studying a program when every race could be a photo finish? How would that affect handle?"

He spread his hands. "To be determined. The margins and handicapping factors will be smaller, but every race WILL have a winner, and the return on investment could be much more significant."

I sighed deeply. "A whole new earth-shattering, revolutionary world. I see one big problem. Half, no, make that 90 per cent of the harness racing hemisphere will have heart attack should races ever be manipulated as you are suggesting."

He stood and reached for his jacket dangling from the back of his chair, "Yeah, but it could be a remedy for your psychological attraction to hopeless longshots."

U.S. harness racing wagering up in May and overall for 2021

Total wagering on harness racing in the U.S. during May was up more than 10 per cent despite a decrease of 166 races compared to May 2019, two years ago. The comparison to 2019 is due to the COVID-19 pandemic that limited races to only 154 in May 2020.

Through the first five months of this year, total handle on U.S. races is up \$78,755,596 (11.96 per cent) compared to 2019. This year, wagering through May 31 was \$737,177,866 versus the \$658,422,270 bet through the end of May in 2019.

The increase in wagering to \$186,002,994 this May was an increase of \$17,337,784 (10.28 per cent) from the \$168,665,210 bet in May 2019.

The 3,355 races in May 2021 was a 4.71 per cent decrease compared to the 3,521 races in 2019.

For the year, the 12,280 races are 657 (-5.08 per cent) less than the 12,937 races in 2019.

NYSS sophomore trotters shine at Vernon

Vernon Downs played host to two divisions of the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) for 3-year-old trotting colts & geldings as well as two divisions for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Friday (June 4).

Ahundreddollarbill (Andrew McCarthy) held off a late charge by Incommunicado (Ake Svanstedt) to win the \$56,000 first NYSS division.

Dewey Arnold (Jason Bartlett) jumped out to the early lead and led to the first quarter in :27.2. Ahundreddollarbill (\$3.30) made his move taking the lead going around the first turn. He held the lead to the half in :56.0. He continued to lead and hit three-quarters first in 1:24.4.

As they made the turn for home, Incommunicado came firstover from third and came charging at Ahundreddollarbill. Ahundreddollarbill dug in and held on to win in a lifetime best of 1:52.2. He was just two-fifths off the track record for 3-year-old geldings. Incommunicado had to settle for second. Dewey Arnold finished third.

Ahundreddollarbill is a 3-year-old gelding by Chapter Seven out of Swinging Royalty. Trained by Tony Alagna for owners Crawford Farms Racing and James Crawford IV. He is two-fortwo in 2021. He now owns four career wins.

Ambassador Hanover (Ake Svanstedt) coasted to a win in the \$57,000 second division of the NYSS for trotting colts and geldings.

Balenciaga (Scott Zeron) led to the first quarter in:27. Steel (Andy Miller) then took the lead but it was short lived as Credit Con (Wally Hennessey) took control and led to the half in:56.3. Dee's Red Delicous (Corey Callahan) came first over to gain the lead. Ambassador Hanover (\$7.20) used a second-over trip and went to the front taking them to three-quarters in 1:25.0.

As they reached the stretch the battle was now for second as Ambassador Hanover poured it on to win in a lifetime best of 1:53. Balenciaga finished second as Latin Lover (Leon Bailey) got third.

Ambassador Hanover is a 3-year-old colt by Chapter Seven out of Angel Eyes Hanover. Svanstedt is trainer and part owner with owners Order By Stable, Howard and Judith Taylor. This was his first win this season and fifth lifetime.

Moni For Lindy (Wally Hennessey) was an upset winner in the \$57,000 first division of the NYSS for trotting fillies.

Illuminata (Ake Svanstedt) took the lead to the first quarter in :27.1. Soukup Blue Chip (Andy Miller) battled with Illuminata around the clubhouse turn. Soukup Blue Chip cleared to the lead and led to the half in :56.1 and three-quarters in 1:25.4.

As they made to turn for home, Moni For Lindy (\$44.80) came flying down the stretch and won in a lifetime best of 1:53.4. Darlene Hanover (Andrew McCarthy) made a late move to finish second. Contested Hanover (Scott Zeron) finished third.

Moni For Lindy is a 3-year-old filly by Credit Winner out of Live Moni. She is owned by the Moni Maker Stable and trained by Domenico Cecere. It was her first win this season and the third victory of her career.

Iteration (Brian Sears) slipped by Sweeping Rainbow (David Miller) to take the \$57,000 second division of the NYSS for trotting fillies.

Iteration (\$4.00) led to the first quarter in :27.1. Sweeping Rainbow then took command hitting the half first :57.0. She maintained the lead and hit three-quarters first in 1:26.1.

As they reached the stretch Iteration jumped out of the pocket and dueled with Sweeping Rainbow all the way down the stretch. Iteration gave one last lunge to get an exciting win in 1:54.0. Sweeping Rainbow had to settle for second. Aela Jamieson (Andy Miller) finished third.

Iteration is 3-year-filly by Chapter Seven out of Steamy Windows.

She is owned by Courant Inc. and trained by Marcus Melander. She is one for one in 2021. She now owns six career victories.

Hambletonian hopeful 'dances' to victory in Big M feature

Dancinginthedark M was positively airborne through the stretch in the Friday night (June 4) feature at The Meadowlands, taking the \$21,000 high-end conditioned trot in 1:52.3, and in the process, marked himself as a Hambletonian contender for trainer Marcus Melander.

He was so good, in fact, he might even have surprised his driver a bit.

"He wasn't mentally strong last year," said Tim Tetrick. "He wasn't strong enough to do what he had to do. But tonight, I was super impressed with him."

Backers of Dancinginthedark M, the 4-5 favorite, were likely a tad concerned down the backside as 16-1 longshot Beyond Ordinary led at the quarter in :27.4 and the half in a leisurely :57. The outer flow did not begin to develop until after the half, when 5-2 second choice Nylander popped out of the fourhole to provide live cover for the eventual winner, but as they straightened up for the stretch drive, Nylander stalled.

But Dancinginthedark M, who still had a lot to do racing in fifth, got the job done.

Racing out in the four path, Dancinginthedark M started to roll as he reached mid-stretch, and the 3-year-old son of Readly Express—Leila powered past an overmatched field by trotting his final quarter in :26.3 to win by a length over a stubborn Beyond Ordinary. Chiplosive was third.

"The big races aren't until August," said Tetrick, "so we wanted to win, but it was more important to have him passing horses as we neared the wire. He trotted the lane pretty well tonight."

Dancinginthedark M, who is owned by Menhammar Stuteri Ab, returned \$3.60 to win in his 2021 debut after a 2-year-old season that saw him win three-of-seven starts and bank \$91,961.

A PICK-4 HIGH: Wagering picked up as the 13-race card marched forward. Proof positive was the sixth race, where a 2021-best \$138,450 was wagered into the 50-cent Early Pick-4 pool. A night's-best \$411,979 was pushed through the windows on the race.

The Late Pick-4 was also extremely attractive to the betting public as a total of \$126,990 was put in play. Total betting on the ninth race was \$357,588.

All-source wagering totaled \$3,144,344, marking the 19th consecutive program to see betting exceed the \$3-million mark.

A LITTLE MORE: Todd McCarthy led the driver's colony with three winners on the card. Tetrick and Yannick Gingras had a

pair of victories each.

Meadowlands Championship Meet honors Joe DeFrank

Harness racing Hall of Famer Joe DeFrank left an unforgettable legacy at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Together with the Hambletonian Society, the Meadowlands made the decision to name the 2021 Championship Meet in honor of Joe DeFrank, who died in December at the age of 87.

"The Meadowlands owes its tremendous success to Mr. Joe DeFrank," said Jason Settlemoir, COO & GM of the Meadowlands Racetrack. "Honoring him on the biggest stage in harness racing is a fitting tribute."

Joe DeFrank was recruited by the N.J. Sports & Exposition Authority management team tasked with opening the Meadowlands Racetrack in 1976, and GM Bob Quigley went on the hunt for a rising star rather than cull from the ranks of existing talent.

He found DeFrank at Windsor Raceway, recognized his keen abilities to assess both horse and driver talent along with his fresh approach to racing, and convinced DeFrank to come east to the Meadowlands. DeFrank was the first and only race secretary at the flagship racetrack for 25 years. He created many popular winter series along with races such as the Meadowlands Pace and Woodrow Wilson, both of which offered purses of more than \$1 million. The Woodrow Wilson purse also reached as high as \$2 million, the most ever offered in the sport. The Meadowlands Pace, an instant classic, remains one of the most sought victories 40 years later.

DeFrank was also instrumental in bringing the Hambletonian from the Midwest to the Meadowlands in 1981. Always the innovative race secretary, DeFrank introduced a new concept to the Meadowlands in 1986 - a number of big-purse races for youngsters on the same night, called the Million Dollar Babies.

Joe DeFrank was inducted into the harness racing Hall of Fame in 1994, with presenter Stan Bergstein, a former race secretary himself, noting, "I realized quickly and instinctively that he was going places. I simply underestimated how far he was going, how fast he was going, and how impressively he would get there. No one in our business has mastered his craft more completely, elevated its power and stature, introduced more new ideas, commanded more respect or ruled with such absolute power as the man we now honor."

John Campbell, Hall of Fame driver and now president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society, stated in his Facebook tribute to Mr. DeFrank, "Every driver, trainer, owner, stallion owner and breeder in our industry today is deriving benefits as a result of Joe DeFrank's vision, innovation and presentation of major stake races. Harness racing had never imagined purses that

the Meadowlands Pace and Woodrow Wilson were going for and, imitation being the best form of flattery, other tracks soon changed their outlook and approach to their stake programs. The Metro, North America Cup, Breeders Crown and many others all evolved after the success of Joe's vision at the Meadowlands and he started the Final Four races at Garden State Park, as well."

The 2021 Meadowlands Racetrack Championship Meet in honor of Joe DeFrank culminates Saturday, Aug. 7 — Hambletonian Day.


New Jersey breeders' annual awards luncheon set for June 16

Thoughts on the sport after 50-year hiatus

Just some thoughts on the harness racing industry. I have returned to the industry after a 50-year hiatus. I was a groom at The Meadows in the late '60s and loved it. My father loved the sport and he and I would often buy a program and a six pack and go sit on the final turn hill in the parking lot to watch the races. Sometimes, we would actually go into the track. Our mutual affection for the sport only increased after I started working at the track. However at this point I went off to college and life interrupted with marriage, kids, and work. I still loved and followed the sport from the stands and at the betting window.

Last year, my plan for retirement kicked in and I started my racing stable with great trainers and two filly yearlings I purchased in Timonium. With my future in mind I started looking at the state of the sport with not just an owners perspective, but with my personal experiences buying, selling, and investing in many different types of businesses.

Even with my limited experience at this level, I do believe the sport needs to evolve more to ever grow and maintain relevance as a viable entertainment option in the future. These thoughts are my own.

- The industry needs more women and minority owners, trainers, grooms, officials, and everything else surrounding the sport. Mirroring the real America can only enhance our product and our fan base.
- We need to concentrate on educating young people on the beauty of the sport and older people and investors on the thrill of owning a standardbred. How watching a race totally is transformed into an emotional experience when you have your beautiful horse in it.
- Every track should have a "Winner's Circle" right in front of the stands so they can see themselves in it getting THEIR picture taken with their horse. Also, there should be an area where the trainers can bring a horse up close to the stands so the kids can see the horses up close without a bike and harness to make it real. Look a horse in the eye or pet one and most kids and adults are swept away.
- Have more family days after these changes with giveaways, ice cream, etc. for the kids to entice them to give us a chance.

- Encourage owners and trainers to host one or two school field trips to the tracks or training facilities to get a feel for the opportunities the sport offers both as a career and as a future interest. (schools always look for field trip options)
- Continue to make the fan experience at the track more than watching their bet run around an oval. Pick seat numbers that will be drawn every race for a prize, free bet, paddock visit, free something, etc to get them to watch. Have the best drivers and trainers give short talks live to the stands on subjects of their choosing right before or after the race cards. Have the drivers give autograph sessions. Let the fans see them as real people not just numbers in helmets.
- Run the USTA more like a business entity starting with cutting down the number of directors. Too many makes sure nothing will get done in an efficient or timely manner. Having been on and reported to many BOD's in my business career, I have never seen many successful corporations with more than 6-12 board members.

Eric Cherry: The problem with higher purses for claimers

My first thought was" WOW!" when I saw first saw the purses for the claimers at Yonkers. My second thought was "this is something I need to get back into." And therein lies the problem. We already have a horse shortage, even including the many horses bought from Down Under. The issue is if we go down the path of giving so much of our purse allocation to claimers instead of the young horses, we are creating a bigger horse shortfall down the road than we have today.

I have a filly racing in the PA Stallions Series for 15 per cent less purse than a 25K claimer at Yonkers. If you play this out, why buy yearlings that you have to put more money into that might never even race and if they do, they will probably race for less than the 25k claimer? True, when you buy a yearling you're chasing rainbows but, as we all know, there aren't too many of those. As people pay less for the yearlings, breeders will breed less. My main concern is not the top 5 per cent. It is the bread and butter buyers and breeders that support our industry, since today's yearlings are tomorrow's overnight horses. My partners and I bred well over 100 mares this year. If the current purse structure stays in place I am confident that we will re-evaluate what we do with our funds next year. But, for the time being, it looks like I will probably getting back into the claiming game, at least for the short term.
