Chicago finally hits the jackpot

Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association executive director Tony Somone says, "There's not a better (slot) deal in the country" after Illinois legislature passes bill to deliver slot machines, table games and sports betting to the state's beleaquered horse racing industry.

Harness racing is expected to return to prominence in Chicago thanks to new gaming legislation passed in Illinois.

Slot machines, table games and sports betting are coming to Hawthorne Race Course as part of a massive multi-faceted gambling expansion bill passed by the Illinois legislature at the conclusion of its spring session.

Hawthorne — which is conducting a 71-night meeting that will continue through Sept. 22 — is the state's only standardbred track with an extended meeting after bankruptcy forced the sister tracks Balmoral Park and Maywood Park out of business following their 2015 meetings.

However, the current situation that is limiting Hawthorne to five months of harness racing because it also has spring and fall thoroughbred meetings, is certain to change because the bill permits a new harness racing/gaming venue to be built in one of seven suburbs south of Chicago.

Hawthorne will be allowed to have 1,200 gaming positions and will have to pay a \$250,000 fee for an organizational license and a fee of \$30,000 per position.

There are guarantees on racing dates. The law stipulates that if only one harness track (namely Hawthorne) is operating in 2020 it can race between 80 and 100 dates. If the second track opens in 2021, the number goes up to a combined minimum of 160 dates and then in 2022 it would increase to 200.

Sports betting will be permitted at three off-track betting parlors operated by each of the state's three racetracks — dual-purpose Hawthorne and the Arlington International Racecourse and Fairmount Park thoroughbred venues.

The General Assembly was scheduled to adjourn on May 31, but lawmakers extended the session, enabling the House of Representatives to pass the monumental gambling bill on June 2 and the Senate to give its approval on June 3.

All that remains is for new Governor J.B. Pritzger to sign the legislation. That's considered a certainty in view of the fact that he was the driving force behind this and several other major bills that the Democrat-controlled legislature passed — often with bi-partisan cooperation — as the legislators approached the session's finish-line. This is in stark contrast to the gridlock and hostility that were a constant throughout the four years that his Republican predecessor, Bruce Rauner, was the governor.

The gambling bill amendment to previous laws on the books contains 716 pages and has a clarifying amendment of 816 pages.

"There's not a better deal in the country," said Tony Somone, executive director of the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association (IHHA), referring to the financial windfall the legislation is expected to have for horse owners, trainers and breeders. "Of the gross revenue from the slots and table games (at Hawthorne and the new harness racino) a minimum of 12.75 per cent will go to purses. That's the best percentage of anybody. And as the tracks do better our percentage goes up.

"We've worked so hard for this for so long. I'm ecstatic that this piece of legislation will allow harness racing to thrive in the future. I'm looking forward to restoring the pride in Illinois harness racing and bringing back the breeding industry."

Not only will the bill transform the Illinois racing landscape by enabling Hawthorne to compete with racinos in Indiana and Ohio it also will have a dramatic impact on casino and on-line betting in Illinois.

The state's 10 existing casinos can expand up to 2,000 gambling positions (an increase of 800) and conduct the newly-legalized sports betting. Six new casinos with sports betting will be allowed to open in Chicago, the city's south suburbs, Waukegan, Rockford, Danville and Williamson County.

The Chicago casino can have up to 4,000 positions, making it the biggest in the state. The city has the option of using some of these positions to install slots at what would be tantamount to branch offices at O'Hare and Midway Airports.

Illinois sports venues with more than 17,000 seats — such as Wrigley Field, the home of the Chicago Cubs baseball team, and the United Center, where the Chicago Bulls basketball team and the Chicago Blackhawks hockey team play — also can obtain licenses to conduct sports betting. The number of these licenses is limited to seven.

A sports betting license will have an initial cost of \$10 million. Thereafter, it can be renewed every four years for \$1 million. The state will get 15 per cent of the revenue after payouts. In Cook County an additional 2 per cent will be withheld with the additional money going to the offices of the Cook County Circuit Court, state's attorney and public defender.



Hawthorne's Tim Carey, who is the president of the family-owned track, said his priority "first and foremost is the sports betting license" and he hopes to be taking bets by Sept. 1.

"We're going to apply as soon as we're able to," Carey said. "Because we thought (casino gambling at the tracks) was going to happen in 2010 and again in 2013 we have a master plan and have spent quite a bit of time on drawings. Now, we're working on putting a sports betting venue in our master plan.

"We're contemplating putting the sports book on the first floor of the grandstand, separate from the casino. We're going to build a parking garage on the second level and people will be able to walk from there right into the beautiful gaming room floor on the second level."

Carey envisions that the casino phase of the venture will completed by September or October of 2020 — "possibly sooner so we can generate money for the purse account and breeding that's so desperately needed.

"My intent is to build horse racing, which is the whole idea behind this legislation. We have 11 OTBs and we're allowed 16. I want to open more so we can introduce more people to horse racing. We've heard the phones at the Department of Agriculture are already ringing off the hook with calls from people who want to come back to Illinois and race."

Carey also hopes to have his advance deposit wagering platform, Club Hawthorne, participating in sports betting.

On-line wagering has been confined to horse racing, but under the law it will be expanded to include a complete menu of sports betting for three licensees selected by the Illinois Gaming Board. The cost of a license is \$20 million.

Rules governing on-line sports betting and the sports betting at all of the venues will prohibit wagering on games involving teams from Illinois colleges and universities. There

also is a ban on contests involving athletes from kindergarten through grade 12.

The Illinois Gaming Board will continue to supervise casino gambling and will add sports betting to its jurisdiction. The Illinois Racing Board will continue to govern standardbred and thoroughbred racing.

While the amount of adjusted gross revenue casinos at racetracks must allocate to horsepeople is written into law, the horsepeople will have to negotiate with the tracks to get a cut of their sports betting booty.

"We'll figure out something and it'll be successful, but I don't think it's going to be a lot of money for horsemen," Somone said.

The legislation even extends to the Illinois State Fair meetings at Springfield and DuQuoin, allowing them to have video gaming terminals in their beer tents. Springfield will be allowed 50 and DuQuoin 30 and 15 per cent of the take will be earmarked for purses at these two state fairs and the county fairs. A Standardbred Advisory panel made up of



representatives of the IHHA, the Racing Board, Department of Agriculture and the tracks will decide on how to split this amount.

An added benefit to slots at the racetracks is that their legalization will end the much-maligned Recapture provision in the 1995 law that allowed Illinois thoroughbred and harness tracks to conduct full-card simulcasting. It stipulates that if wagering on live racing is less than 75 per cent of the 1994 total, tracks can "recapture" 2 per cent of this amount from the horsepeople's purse account.

Every year since then, the amount has been under 75 per cent, letting the racetracks extract in excess of \$284 million from thoroughbred and standardbred purse accounts.

"It will end when the first nickel is deposited in a slot machine," Somone said. "That's when it will stop accumulating. Let's say under the best circumstances we have these things up and running sometime next year: what we would have to pay in 2021 is what we owed prior to that (2020 stoppage). The following year recapture (payments) would stop completely."

The IHHA executive director said that since Balmoral and Maywood closed his organization has "had inquiries" from entities expressing an interest in building a harness racino if legislation permitting slot machines at the racetracks was enacted.

According to the Chicago Sun-Times, "the early favorite to land the racino is commercial real estate developer Rick Heidner, who also is an owner of Gold Rush Gaming." (Gold Rush Gaming is one of the state's largest operators of the video gambling terminals in restaurants, convenience stores, truck stops and veteran's and fraternal organizations that were legalized in 2009 and launched in 2012.)

"You have to be a racetrack first to get a casino," Somone said. "A new track would have to get an organizational license from the Racing Board and apply for racing dates. Once they apply and are awarded dates they are a racing licensee, which allows them to be eligible for slots and table games.

"Then, after being approved by the Gaming Board, they'd have to go back to the Gaming Board to get a sports betting license. It's unclear at this point if the new racino could get a sports betting license because there are only seven out there and they will go to the three racetracks and four casinos (which are the biggest revenue producers among the 10 in

the state)."

Although Illinois harness horsemen have reason to believe they are on the road back to national prominence they have a lot of ground to make up.

Even with the guaranteed dates the opportunities won't be anywhere near as abundant as they were historically. From 1968 through 2015, there was harness racing for at least 11 months a year (except for those years when contract disputes produced stoppages). In 1995, an all-time high 516 harness programs were held at Hawthorne, Maywood, Balmoral and Sportsman's Park.

However, all over North America the racing climate will be much different in the 2020s than it was in the "good all days."

What this week's massive and multi-faceted gambling expansion legislation has done is enable Illinois harness racing to survive and perhaps ultimately to thrive.

Big M judges need to penalize drivers for giving holes

Also, thoughts on why there are a small number of dominant sires, Brett Sturman's recent column and whether Melander's Big 3 rival Takter's 2014 trio.

Tidbits: Great news! Illinois is back in action. By a large margin, the house and senate of the state of Illinois passed a bill to have gambling at the racetracks in the state, as well as a provision to build a new standardbred racino. It will provide money for the breeding programs, as well. There is a provision for sports betting, but it is not contractually attached to the horseman's purse account. At this point, anything would have been better than the direction the sport was headed. They have lost three major racetracks in the past two decades, Sportsman's Park, Balmoral Park and Maywood.

Truly hope my good friend Eliot "Doc" Narotsky is somehow involved in the new venture. I am also very happy for the breeders in the state who have taken a hard hit in the last 10 years.

"Marcus Melander wins everything," should be the title of this week's headlines. After winning major stakes all over the place, he won four of the five 2-year-old races on Saturday



morning at the Meadowlands and lost the other by a nose. It's too early to make comparisons, but I am getting close.

Talking about qualifiers, The Guru has a question. I have been very disappointed in the performance of my favorite pacing colt (at public auction 2016) De Los Cielos Deo, who has been awful in all his 2019 starts. Saturday he ran off in a qualifier in 148.4 and I watched David Miller closely and he was like a stone in the bike, never asked him at all. What happened?

YOU CAN'T MAKE THIS UP. My daughter Lauren, received a text asking her how to fix a colt that is paddling, from a top harness driver we will call individual #1. She is very bright, teaches at Yale and Boston University, but this was beyond her pay grade. Realizing the error, she forwarded the text to The Guru knowing it was meant for me and asks that I get to the bottom of how a crazy thing like this happened. I contact individual #1 who with full disclosure reveals the facts. He had contacted a person we will call individual #2 to obtain my phone number and somehow individual #2, gave him my daughter's phone number instead of mine. What really makes this strange is that individual #2 was the first one to text me about my mistake listing Woodside Charm in my Road to the Hambletonian, informing me that she was not eligible. How is it possible that in two weeks he forgot my number. Very strange.

For those of you that have exhibited displeasure at my refusal to handicap the Preakness Stake, I find myself totally void of opinion on the Belmont. Maybe it's just me but it looks as exciting as a C-1 Pace at Monticello circa 1970 with a million-dollar purse. I think the racing secretary had to call in a bevy of favors to fill that box.

Paul O'Neal asks: I have been watching the Meadowlands and don't understand why the judges don't penalize drivers for creating holes for parked "friends" in the first turn. It makes for a terrible show.

Paul, I agree. It seems there is a "gentleman's agreement " to make room for parked buddies. Personally, I think some of the smarter drivers do it all the time because they know they are going to improve position with little or no consequences. It's horrible for racing and I am truly surprised that Jeff Gural hasn't cracked down on it as I remember hearing him declare that this situation would not exist at any of his tracks.

It's definitely not a push-button situation. The judges must declare themselves before they start handing out

suspensions. You can't let this situation exist as long as it has and then crack down with no warning. I think that the judges at the Big M are among the best in the industry and will listen to constructive suggestions. I have been in contact with Jeff and he was irate about the situation to say the least. "I think it's horrible, and have tried for years to get the drivers to stop, and the judges refuse to enforce the rule," he said, and went on to add that the presiding judge told him that if he sat in the booth and pointed it out they would enforce it.

I am not saying that if a hole is there a guy should whip his horse to close the hole, but no driver should be seen putting a stranglehold on a horse to let another driver back into a spot he has already passed.

I contacted the judges and found Peter Koch the presiding judge to be away until this weekend. I spoke to Larry Julian, whom I imagined to be an associate and asked if he would discuss the matter with me as the PJ was among the missing. He was very kind to inform me that "we are not permitted to discuss anything without the permission of the commission." STAY TUNED.

Robert LeBlanc asks: I noticed in the Kentucky Derby the number of different sires represented. In our big races they seem to be dominated by a few sires. Why the difference?

It is basically a matter of numbers. To begin with, there are nearly 20,000 thoroughbred foals born in the U.S. plus most likely double that in Great Britain, Ireland, France and Japan. Whereas, only about 7,000 standardbred foal every year in the U.S.

Then take into consideration that thoroughbred mares are only bred with live cover and our mares are bred artificially. According to my sources, the chances of the thoroughbred mare conceiving is 90 per cent, way less for the standardbred. I looked up some foal information on a few of the top stallions in the sport. Muscle Hill and Captaintreacherous had a little over 100 foals in the last few years. Tapit, a premiere thoroughbred stallion was in the high 90s the past two years.

We have only a handful of stallions whose foals could bring \$200,000 at auction. There are at least 100 thoroughbreds that could have a \$1 million yearling.

I had the pleasure of visiting Coolmore Stud in Ireland last year and they have 10 horses of their own in Ireland that could have a seven-figure colt, as well as the two Triple Crown winners at the Lexington farm, American Pharoah and Justify, that, without a doubt, will have multi-million-dollar offspring.

Of course there is no guarantee that the expensive colts will win the classics, but the people that can afford them are more likely to enter a major race with a marginal horse for the fun of it than the expedient owner would.

In the 2019 Kentucky Derby, from 20 horses there were 18 different sires represented.

In comparison with the Hambletonian the past few years (credit to Nick Salvi for providing the programs) with an average of 19 horses going to post, the represented nine different sires and each year one sire had five or six offspring present — they were by Chapter Seven for two years and Muscle Hill for two years. In 2015, Muscle Hill represented one third (six) of the 18 entries.

On the pacing side, it was even more evident. In the 2018 Cane Pace, there were 12 entries 5 sires and 8 by Somebeachsomewhere.



On the whole I think it will get worse before it gets better. In my Road to the Hambletonian 2019 five of the 10 horses listed are by Muscle Hill.

Eddie Muisenga asks: I am convinced that Brett Sturman's article on 5/31 (<u>full story here</u>) was genius, the idea of racing horses by purchase price at auction will show the average Joe that you can't buy success anymore. What are your thoughts?

To be honest with Mr Muisenga his question was like a novel and I cut it very short because although I agree that the Brett Sturman article was great and his ideas more than valid, the question showed that Eddie really didn't understand the premise of the article.

Brett wanted us to follow the thoroughbreds and make some big purse maiden races for yearlings selling at lower prices. Although this creates a bit of mediocrity, it does have some merit in certain situations. On the other hand, Mr Muisenga's take on the situation was that we should have our regular races filled on the same premise, which to this writer is impossible and ridiculous.

I suggest that Eddie study the Meadowlands program that includes yearling prices.

The basic result would be creating 1-9 shots in most races and have field that are spread by 50 lengths at the wire.

It is difficult enough with the shortage of horses to create a condition sheet that makes for competitive racing, but as we all know yearling price and ability have little to do with one another and in no way would create better parity as Mr Muisenga suggests.

I appreciate your love of the sport and I can tell how sincere you are by your letter but there must be a better way to achieve your goals.


My only regret is that the buyers changed his name from RIFLEMAN.

Three offspring of Transference win on same Mohawk card; Bettor B Going jaw-dropping at Kawartha

Two horses caused a buzz in Ontario last Saturday (June 1), one for his exploits on the track, and the other for contributing to a feat that was achieved by a trio of her offspring racing at Mohawk Park that is believed to be unique.

The first horse, Bettor B Going, was ripping off an incredible mile rarely seen at five-eighths mile Kawartha Downs, located bout 60 miles east of Toronto. The other horse, the Camluck mare Transference (out of the Artsplace mare National Gallery), was sending out three of her offspring on the same night at Mohawk Park, and all three won.

Bettor B Going was making his second lifetime start in a \$4,500 maiden race and coming off a debut effort where he showed some late pace, it was reasonable to expect improvement on his 1:58.2 fifth-place finish. But no one in the crowd could have predicted the incredible mile the son of Bettors Delight (out of the Western Ideal mare JK Letitgo) was going to uncork.

Sent right to the front from the inside post by Kawartha's second-leading driver Nick "Ralphie" Boyd, the \$50,000 Lexington purchase improved his position at every call, parlaying a wicked :55-flat opening half-mile time into a remarkable 29-length score in 1:52.1.

Teamster Boyd said he certainly had no plans on going that fast with the sophomore gelding in only his second start.

"Looking at the program, my intention before the race was to try to ease him away third or fourth and ease him to the lead at 3/8ths or the 1/2 depending on how it was setting up," he said, which obviously didn't materialize. "As the gate picked up speed, he began to hit the bike (he was hooked short) and was scaring himself. The more I took ahold, the more he would hit.

Boyd, who was quick to give credit to fellow horseman Rob Doyle for schooling and qualifying the gelding, said he had no intent to bottom out the field by such a wide margin. "Especially with a young horse, I never want to win in that

fashion," he said. "It was merely a circumstantial occurrence. If you watch the replay, you'll see I didn't move a muscle the whole mile.

Bettor B Going – owned by Grant R & Joanne E Curnow of Pefferlaw, ON and trained by Wilford Perrault – likely won't see Kawartha Downs again anytime soon after showing he's capable of that kind of speed.

Meanwhile, 100 miles west at Mohawk Park, there may have been a record being set by broodmare Transference, who was sending out the winners of three separate races on the same race card. While unconfirmed, it is believed to be a first. Interestingly, all three victors were sent out by trainer Ben Baillargeon.

The Transference Pick 3 of sorts was kicked off by a ½-lengtn 1:52.4 win by solid pacer Torrin Hanover in race 4, a \$15,000 conditioned-level pace. The son of Well Said was steered to victory by Bob McClure. Next up was Somebeachsomewhere son Tyga Hanover winning a division of the race named after his sire. The 19-1 upset winner was driven by Sylvain Filion and the one-length win over some more-heralded rivals earned the gelding a trip to the North America Cup eliminations tomorrow night at Mohawk Park. Finally, the most predictable winner of the night came in the last race when 2014 Two-Year-Old Breeders Crown Pace winner Traceur Hanover dominated a field of conditioned pacers.

Considering that Transference has only three of four offspring currently racing based in Canada, to have all three show up at the same track on the same night and all win may be a feat we never see repeated.

For the next 10 days, harness racing fans from across North America will be focused on Woodbine Mohawk Park as the Campbellville, ON oval prepares for the biggest night on its racing calendar.

The excitement will begin to build tonight (June 7) with eliminations for the Armbro Flight and Goodtimes stakes and continue on Saturday, June 8 with eliminations for the Pepsi North America Cup and Fan Hanover. The finals for those, along with the Roses Are Red, which did not require eliminations, and the Mohawk Gold Cup, go postward on Saturday, June 15 when over \$2 million will be up for grabs.

Among the people paying special attention to the events at Woodbine Mohawk Park are Sanford and Jan Zimmerman. Standardbred breeders based in Gorrie, ON, the Zimmermans will be tuning into the June 8 broadcast to watch Century Farroh compete in the North America Cup eliminations, the first horse with their Century Spring pre-fix to ever make a bid for Ontario's \$1 million prize.

"There have been several good ones that we've raised, and that we've bred too, but with him going into the elimination for the North America Cup we haven't had anything like that that we've bred ourselves. So, he's certainly standing out a bit that way," said Sanford. "I hope he can qualify for the final, that's all I can hope for."

The Zimmermans have been aware of Century Farroh's recent success — the son of Mach Three and Beachy Girl is undefeated through his first four sophomore starts — but they have yet to see him compete in person. If the colt advances to the final however, they will press pause on their farm chores and head to Woodbine Mohawk Park to cheer

him on.

"We just finally finished foaling a week ago and we're still breeding some, and there's some construction here. We're putting up a building for a horse exerciser and they're working away at that so it's been very hectic lately. And then with the colder weather the mares and babies haven't really been able to stay out until a week and a half ago. So, there's more work... We haven't really been anywhere for quite a while," Sanford said with a laugh. "But we do like to go down and if he gets to the final, yes, we'll definitely be there."

The Zimmermans acquired their first broodmare in 2004, one year after their wedding and one year before they decided to transition their historic Huron County farm from dairy cattle to standardbreds. Sanford's father, Harry, had kept a few standardbred mares on the farm as a hobby prior to his passing in 1995, but shifting to a full-time equine operation required a retooling of the barn and surrounding pasture and for one year Lady Sammie (Jennas Beach Boy–Autumn Mindale) was the sole occupant.

Once the rebuild was complete, Century Spring Farms opened its doors with a focus on boarding standardbreds and the Zimmermans started to expand their broodmare band.

"Things slowly kind of grew, we ended up with four or five mares and boarders, and then when 2012 came along, that really changed things. The boarders were slowly leaving, and the writing was on the wall. The business was getting smaller and we had this facility and we said, 'What do we do?'" said Sanford. "We really didn't want to get out. We thought things may change, we didn't know for sure, but we thought, 'Well, we'll have to start buying more mares of our own. If we don't have boarders, we'll have to have more mares of our own and if we have to sell all U.S., I guess we'll have to.

"We've got probably 15 of our own now, so we don't have

as many boarders, but we don't need as many either. It was maybe 80 per cent boarding and 20 per cent yearling sales before, now it's almost like 80 per cent yearling sales and 20 per cent boarding."

The transition, their second in less than a decade, required the acquisition of new skills. Four years ago, Jan attended an equine ultrasound course in Texas and the couple acquired their own ultrasound machine. Sanford said his highly-capable partner now handles most of the health care needs for their herd and is continually adding to her knowledge. They have faced many of the challenges commonly faced by breeders, along with a few situations that required a Sherlock Holmes-level commitment to problem solving.

"This mare, Lady Pixie, we actually found out through trial and error that, I think, she's allergic to a type of semen extender," said Sanford, who had observed that the Yankee Glide—B Cor Peatra mare caught easily when bred to U.S.-based stallions, but either did not catch or quickly absorbed the embryo when bred to Ontario-based studs.

After being assured by two different veterinarians that Lady Pixie did not have any medical problems that prevented her from getting in foal or carrying to term, Sanford wondered if the issue was the product that extends the viability of semen. With the help of breeding staff at Tara Hills Stud and Hanover Shoe Farms he discovered that semen shipped from the U.S. to Canada requires a different extender than what is commonly used in domestic shipments. With support from Tara Hills for Lady Pixie's 2017 breeding, the extender used for international shipments was added to Muscle Mass's semen and the mare caught on the first attempt and delivered a healthy filly last spring.

"When she was catching almost with ease to U.S. (studs), I said there's got to be something going on here. And the only thing I could think of is if it's a different extender, because it was three different studs up here — Kadabra, Royalty For Life and Muscle Mass," said Zimmerman. "And then when we used that extender up here to Muscle Mass again, and she caught right away."

While his accumulation of knowledge produced a positive outcome in Lady Pixie's case, albeit at a significant loss to the mare's productive years, Zimmerman admits that there have been some tougher moments over the past 19 years.

"Things that you learn along the way, some are kind of weird, but if you keep plugging away you'll see a lot of different things. Some are pretty heartbreaking, but it is part of the business. There's times, especially when we started we lost, in two days, two mares, they both had bad foalings and had to be put down and it was like, 'Why are we even doing this?'" recalled the breeder. "You either quit or you keep going, and you say, 'Well I'm not quitting so...' You have to toughen up, you just do. Foals die, and it's too bad, but you

just move on, there's nothing you can do about it and if you can't do that you probably won't stick in it. It's high risk, high reward, but sometimes the downside can drag along a lot longer than the good side, so you have to be optimistic."

Risk taking is built into horse racing at every level and Zimmerman says breeders are no different. Almost every decision involves some level of chance, whether it is deciding which mare to buy or sell, which stallion to match with each mare or which yearling sale to attend.

"If it was as simple as the best mares breeding to the best studs made the best racehorses, most of us wouldn't be in the business," he said. "It's kind of not the shots in the dark, but that the average-bred could throw a good one, that keeps everybody going. You don't know where they're going to come from."

The Zimmermans typically make their decisions about breeding match-ups and whether to alter the composition of their broodmare band after their last yearling sells, which is usually at the Harrisburg Black Book Sale in November. At that point, they assess the results of the sales, calculate potential expenses on stallion fees and examine the broodmare catalogue. The breeder says the expansion of the farm's broodmare band has actually made the annual process an easier one.

"The more you have, the more flexibility you have. If you're relying on one or two mares it's pretty tight. Say you want to breed one mare to this stud and his stud fee is \$15,000, it's really a lot of money, but if you average out all the stud fees you are paying and your average stud fee comes to \$6,500, even with that \$15,000 one in there, it's really not that bad. Things start to average out a little better," he said. "But just to have one mare and breed her to that stud and get a crooked foal, it's just a higher risk. The numbers can help a little bit with stuff like that."

With 15 mares, the Zimmermans typically have nine or 10 yearlings to offer buyers each fall. The odd time they will retain a daughter of one of their top mares, but most years everything bred on the farm is headed to a sale, either the London Selected Yearling Sale or Harrisburg. They prefer to sell their Ontario Sired yearlings in London, which is where Dave Ratchford acquired Century Farroh for \$17,000 in 2017.

On Saturday, the colt will step up to the biggest test of his young career from Post 9 in the first \$50,000 North America Cup elimination, carrying the hopes of his owner, breeders and supporters from across Ontario.

Locally based Bully Pulpit looks to score big in \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie

The late blooming gelding is campaigned by Northfield Park's leading driver/trainer combo.

Northfield Park's leading trainer, Brian Loney, was quick to accept the invitation to race in Saturday's \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie from the track's executive vice president of racing and simulcasting Dave Bianconi. Especially when Loney realized his star pacer, Bully Pulpit, would be eligible for an open post draw.

Based on his recent sharp efforts, Bianconi forced the 6-year-old to start from the outside post each of his last two open handicap events.

"I am not sure he'll know what to do with the inside post," joked the 41-year old trainer.

The gelded son of Well Said-Cupcakesnwhipcream started his current three-race win streak on April 29 with a 1:50.1 score over a sloppy Northfield surface.

The following week, Bianconi saw enough to give Bully Pulpit the outside post #8 in the open handicap. In what could be described as an old fashioned brawl, Bully Pulpit and Southwind Amazon, who also earned a coveted Battle invite, went toe-to-toe the final quarter of a mile in an eye-popping 1:49.4. The winning time equaled his lifetime best and was a national season's record.

Last week, again on an off surface, he scored a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ length victory in 1:51.4 from the outside post #7.

"He has been racing really good, really sharp," said Loney.

Bully Pulpit missed his scheduled May 20 start when he was scratched "sick."

"It was nothing serious, he was just a little sick. He was probably 70 per cent, but I wasn't willing to chance it," said Loney.

Bully Pulpit is owned by Cleveland native and current Chicago resident, Bradley Schwartz and will be piloted by North America's leading driver, Aaron Merriman. The pair will leave from post #2 and is 12-1 on the morning line.

"(A Battle of Lake Erie win) would be huge for Aaron and me," said Loney. "We have raced together for a long time now and we have always done well.

"Aaron drives a lot of good horses, but this is my first Grand Circuit chance. It would be really special to win it with him. We are going to be gunning for it."

In 13 seasonal starts, all at the Route 8 oval, Bully Pulpit has seven wins and has finished off the board in just one start. With his \$65,970 in 2019, his career earnings now sit at \$291,259.

As a yearling, Bully Pulpit was purchased by the Ohio-based quartet of Country Club Acres, William J. Robinson, Joe Sbrocco and Richard M. Lombardo at the 2014 Harrisburg Sale for \$25,000.

After his 3-year-old season, Bully Pulpit was once again at Harrisburg, this time as hip #1561 in the 2016 Mixed Sale where he went for \$32,000.

Bully Pulpit has been getting better with age - 32 on the board

finishes in 67 starts at four and five.

"He was good when he first started (this February) when I bought him off Keith Pippi," said Loney. He was on a break and I brought him back. He qualified well and the last four or five weeks he has been great."

Billy Pulpit will face some sharp competition in the 34th edition of the "War on the Shore."

The Wall (Post 3 – Brett Miller) comes into the Battle off an upset win in the \$116,180 Camluck Classic. Jimmy Freight (Post 7 – Jason Barlett) has a chance to go over the \$1 million mark in career earnings with a first or second place finish. The 2017 Little Brown Jug champ, Filibuster Hanover (Post 8 – Chris Page) rounds out the deep field.

On the Battle of Lake Erie undercard will be a pair of \$50,000 legs of the Ohio Sire Stakes for sophomore filly trotters. Trainer Chris Beaver conditions six of the 14 entries, including the two morning line favorites. Post time for the 16 race card will be 6 p.m.

Eliminations drawn for 36th Pepsi North America Cup

There are two \$50,000 eliminations this Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park to determine the finalists for the June 15 \$1 million final.

The 36th Pepsi North America Cup has attracted 18 entrants to compete in this Saturday's eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The group of 18 3-year-old pacers have been split into a pair of \$50,000 eliminations. The top-five finishers from each elimination will advance to the \$1 million final on June 15. The elimination winners will earn the right to select their post position for the final.

Captain Crunch is the top contender heading into the eliminations. The Dan Patch Award winner will start from post four in a stacked first division.

Trained by Nancy Johansson, Captain Crunch sent a statement to his competition with a pair of stunning

victories to start his sophomore campaign. The son of Captaintreacherous posted a 1:49.1 victory in his season debut over a sloppy track at Pocono on May 19 and followed it up with a 1:49.2 open-lengths score on May 26 at Philadelphia. His dominate start is no surprise after finishing his rookie season (six wins in 10 starts) with victories in the Breeders Crown and Governor's Cup.

Captain Crunch is from the first-crop of 2013 North America Cup winner Captaintreacherous, who was from the first-crop of 2008 winner Somebeachsomewhere when he captured Canada's richest race.

Trainer Johansson is the daughter of now-retired Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Takter. The Pepsi North America Cup is one of few signature races that Takter never won during his career.

Regular driver Scott Zeron will be at the controls of Captain Crunch. Based in the United States the last several years, Zeron is a former leading driver at Woodbine and is searching for his first Pepsi North America Cup.

The depth of the first Pepsi North America Cup elimination

will likely mean a top contender will be on the outside looking in to the final.

Dr. Ian Moore trainee Century Farroh (PP9, Sylvain Filion) is undefeated in four starts this season and will face his toughest challenge to date. The son of Mach Three was last season's Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots champion and most recently won his Grand Circuit debut in a Somebeachsomewhere division.

The first elimination also features Art Rooney winner Bettors Wish (PP1, Dexter Dunn), who is three for three this season. Regally-bred Best In Show (PP2, Bob McClure) has won two of his last three starts. New Jersey and Kentucky Sires Stakes champion Hurrikane Emperor (PP3, Daniel Dube) has won 10 of 12 career starts. De Los Cielos Deo (PP5, David Miller) recently posted a 1:48.4 qualifying victory.

The field is completed by Air Force Hanover (PP6, Miller), Shake That House (PP7, Tim Tetrick) and Fixed Idea (PP8, Randy Waples).

The first elimination has been carded as Race 3 (7:50 p.m. EDT)

The second elimination will see former Cup-winning trainer Brian Brown send out the almost-perfect Workin Ona Mystery. The Ohio-based trainer won the 2016 event with Fear The Dragon.

A son of Captaintreacherous, Workin Ona Mystery is two for two this season to bring his career record to seven wins in eight starts. The Brown trainee posted easy victories in two Pennsylvania Sires Stakes events before most recently tuning up for the Cup with a 1:52.3 qualifier on May 29 at Hoosier Park.

Tim Tetrick, who is a two-time North America Cup winner, will drive Workin Ona Mystery. The pair will start from the outside post-nine.

O'Brien Award winner Stag Party will line up from post-five with driver David Miller in the second split. The Casie Coleman trainee has been off to a slow start by his standards this season, posting a pair of third-place finishes in two starts.

A son of 2001 North America Cup winner Bettors Delight, Stag Party won six of nine starts as a rookie, including the Metro Pace. Reinsman Miller has won two of last three editions of the North America Cup, while trainer Coleman is seeking her third victory in the \$1 million event.

Local trainees Bronx Seelster (PP6, Trevor Henry) and Tyga Hanover (PP8, Sylvain Filion) will look to make the final for their Canadian connections.

Wayne McGean trainee Bronx Seelster was an Ontario Sires Stakes standout as a rookie, winning seven of 12 starts. The son of Big Jim has a runner-up and fourth-place finish in two starts this season.

Tyga Hanover surprised some with a victory in last Saturday's Somebeachsomewhere for trainer Ben Baillargeon. The gelded son of Somebeachsomewhere has won three of four starts this season after going winless in six as a two-year-old.

The field for the second split is completed by Captain Victorious (PP1, Yannick Gingras), Lyons Night Hawk (PP2, Tetrick), Semi Tough (PP3, Matt Kakaley), Caviart Rockland (PP4, Scott Zeron) and Aflame Hanover (PP7, Tetrick).

The second elimination is carded as Race 8 (9:30 p.m. EDT).

The final for the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup will take place on Saturday, June 15. The post-position draw is scheduled for next Tuesday (June 11) during a special luncheon at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The 2019 Pepsi North America Cup event on June 15 will feature over \$2 million in live racing, live music, food trucks and a beer garden. The first 1,500 fans to arrive on Pepsi North America Cup night will receive a free commemorative hat. Tickets are now on sale at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Burke's North America Cup trio looks to step up

Ron Burke leads all trainers in starters for Saturday's (June 8) Pepsi North America Cup eliminations at Ontario's Woodbine Mohawk Park, and although his three 3-year-old pacers are winless this season, the sport's leading conditioner is anticipating improved performances from his group.

Burke, the 2018 Trainer of the Year in the U.S., sends out **De Los Cielos Deo** in the first of two \$50,000 eliminations and **Captain Victorious** and **Semi Tough** in the second. Nancy Johansson and Brian Brown are the only other trainers with multiple horses in the North America Cup elims, with two each.

The top five finishers from each nine-horse elimination will advance to the \$1 million final on June 15. The connections of the elimination winners will select their post positions for the final and the remaining eight horses will be put in an open draw. The draw will be Tuesday during a luncheon at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

De Los Cielos Deo won his first five races last season before finishing second in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes final and his elimination of the Metro. He was no better than fourth in three remaining starts but was dealing with a foot issue.

So far this season, the colt is winless in three races, but he heads to his North America Cup elimination off a 1:48.4 win in a qualifier last weekend at The Meadowlands.

"I knew he had that in him," Burke said. "Things have just gone terrible for him the first few races. I knew he was good, so I just told (driver David Miller) to stretch him a little bit in the qualifier to make sure I'm right. I was very happy with him."

Semi Tough, who was second to Stag Party in last year's Metro Pace at Mohawk, is winless in four races this year, but has hit the board three times. Captain Victorious was a three-time winner last year on the Pennsylvania circuit for trainer Julie Miller. He was purchased by the Burke-led Captain V Stable in April and finished third in his debut for his new connections but was off the board in two starts since then.

"We scoped Captain Victorious and his stomach has ulcers," Burke said. "I think that's led to his last couple bad

performances. I'm hoping we'll have him ready to go. Semi Tough, every start he's gotten progressively better. He's heading in the right direction.

"I think we're going to be all right."

The first elimination features Dan Patch Award winner Captain Crunch, who is one of Johansson's two entrants, along with Caviart Rockland in the second elim. The second elimination also includes O'Brien Award winner Stag Party in the nine-horse field.

Captain Crunch is 2-for-2 this year and is among six horses entering the first elimination off a win (not counting De Los Cielos Deo's qualifier victory). The others include Art Rooney Pace winner Bettor's Wish, New Jersey Sire Stakes champion Hurrikane Emperor, and Somebeachsomewhere Stakes division winner Century Farroh.

Bettor's Wish, Hurrikane Emperor, Century Farroh, and Shake That House join Captain Crunch as the field's undefeated horses this season, a combined 15-0.

The second elimination has one unbeaten horse this year, Brown's Workin Ona Mystery, who is 2-for-2. Tyga Hanover brings a three-race win streak to the elim, including a victory in a Somebeachsomewhere division.

Saturday's card at Mohawk also includes two eliminations for the Fan Hanover Stakes for 3-year-old female pacers and a prep race for the Roses Are Red Stakes for older female pacers. Racing begins at 7:10 p.m. (EDT) at Mohawk.

Pilot Discretion aims for new heights in Goodtimes

It is often said that sometimes the moves you don't make, or in this instance the races you don't make, turn out the best. Such appears to be the case for 3-year-old male trotter Pilot Discretion, who brings an undefeated slate to Friday's Goodtimes Stakes eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Pilot Discretion, from the stable of Tony Alagna, developed slowly last season at 2. When he was ready to go at Lexington's Red Mile in late September, he proved the trainer's patience was well invested by winning a late closer by 6-1/2 lengths in 1:56 and following up a week later with a five-length 1:55.1 score.

After returning home to New Jersey in October, Pilot Discretion got sick. He was soon able to return to training and looked set to compete in a preliminary round of the Kindergarten Series at The Meadowlands, which would serve as a prep for the Valley Victory Stakes, but he spiked a temperature again. Alagna decided it was best to quit with the colt rather than push on.

"It may be the best thing that ever happened to him long term because he's come back really good," Alagna said this week as he prepared to send Pilot Discretion to Canada for the Goodtimes. "Sometimes things work out the way they're supposed to."

Pilot Discretion pushed his perfect slate to 4-for-4 by winning two conditioned races last month at The Meadowlands. His most recent victory came by 2-1/4 lengths over 5-year-old Stenhouse Hanover in a career-best 1:52.4. That time is tied for the fourth fastest by a 3-year-old this year.

"He was an immature colt and we took our time with him," Alagna said. "He's really matured into himself nicely. It's a nice time to try him against stakes company. He couldn't be any sharper than he is right now. He trained great (Monday). For an inexperienced colt last year, he's really come back good."

Pilot Discretion was one of 19 horses entered in the Goodtimes. The field was divided into two eliminations, with Pilot Discretion landing in the second. He will start from post No. 6 with regular driver Andy McCarthy. He is among three horses in the group, with Valley Victory winner Southwind Avenger and stakes winner Kings County, eligible to August's \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes.

The first elimination features eight Hambletonian eligibles: Smart As Hill, Trix And Stones, Swandre The Giant, Forbidden Trade, Magical Winner K, Blazing Trail, Only For Justice, and Super Schissel. Forbidden Trade was last year's Ontario Sire Stakes champion; Super Schissel captured the Matron Stakes.

Pilot Discretion, whose four wins have resulted in \$26,000 in purses, is a son of Muscle Hill out of Self Indulgent. He was purchased for \$100,000 at the Lexington Selected Sale and is owned by Robert Leblanc, Dave Anderson, and John Fodera.

"He acts like a horse that's going to be very versatile," Alagna said. "He acts like a horse that can leave, that can sit, he can do a lot of things. He's not aggressive, he's a nice horse to drive. That goes a long way. He's really done well."

Friday's card at Mohawk also includes two eliminations for the Armbro Flight stakes for older female trotters. The first elim includes 2018 Trotter of the Year Atlanta and world-record-holder Plunge Blue Chip, who is making her 4-year-old debut. The second elim includes 2017 Horse of the Year Hannelore Hanover, 2018 O'Brien Award winner Emoticon Hanover, 2017 Dan Patch Award winner Manchego, and Darling Mearas S, a Swedish standout making her North American debut.

Racing begins at 7:10 p.m. (EDT).





With rivalries new and old, stakes season picks up big-time at Woodbine Mohawk Park

This is one of my favorite racing weekends. Sure, there's been stakes racing that's taken place over the past few weeks, but historically the weekend that contains eliminations for the Goodtimes, Fan Hanover, Armbro Flight, Roses Are Red and the North America Cup is when you know that all of the top horses are back and it's time for business. It's when rivalries from last year are renewed, and it's when new ones can take shape that will last throughout the season. Here's what I see as the highlights this weekend.

Beginning with Friday night, the most highly anticipated horse to race is arguably Swandre The Giant, last year's 7-figure dollar amount private purchase. Going from post 3 in the first of two Goodtimes eliminations for 3-year-old colt trotters, he makes his first return back to Canada since his ill-fated venture here last year from the Wellwood. After winning impressively in the sloppy going last week at Hoosier in his seasonal bow, he now gets reunited with Gingras and I'm anxious to see if he's as good as advertised now being with Burke.

In the same race albeit starting from post 10 is Super Schissel, last year's Matron champ. He's on some of the top Hambletonian contenders lists, though he's been dismissed at 80-1 in the most recent Hambletonian future pool wager that closed this past weekend. On that topic, Swandre The Giant closed at 16-1 which seems awfully inviting for whoever got him locked in at that price. Conversely, Greenshoe closed at 3-5. That colt has been nothing less than spectacular this year and most recently won in 1:50.2, but taking 3-5 on a race that still isn't for another two months seems quite excessive. Things are bound to change between now and then, and it picks up with the two Goodtimes eliminations on Friday.

Going in two eliminations as well, the Armbro Flight for older mare trotters is absolutely stacked. The first elimination pits familiar foes Atlanta and Plunge Blue Chip against one another. Atlanta has been untouchable in her two starts this season and is another Burke already has in high gear; seems like the race is hers to control from the inside post. Starting right next to her is Plunge Blue Chip, last year's 1:49:4 winner who makes her first start finishing third from the Matron in November. It would be a lot to ask her to beat Atlanta while making just her first start back, but let's see how close she can stick to her.

The second Armbro Flight elimination features two big names again who happen to be starting 1-2 from the inside two positions. Emoticon Hanover and Hannelore Hanover are no strangers to one another, and over the course of the last year Emoticon has gotten the better of Hannelore more often than that. Ake Svanstedt has two entries in this race including the fresh Sweden import Darling Mearas S who Doug McNair gets the call to drive. That recent qualifier against Hannelore Hanover looks encouraging and she's certainly an intriguing contender. Barn mate Ice Attraction surprises every once in a while against these, and Manchego is now squarely a longshot from the outside.

Onto Saturday, a number of key females square off in addition to the colts taking center stage in the North America Cup eliminations. In the second Fan Hanover elimination, last year's 2-year-old pacing filly champion Warrawee Ubeaut takes on Tall Drink Hanover. These two had a bit of a back and forth last year with Warrawee Ubeaut ultimately proving best when stylishly winning the Breeders Crown, though both have been equally as impressive in their three combined seasonal races to date this year. It could be the start of a rivalry that continues throughout the year.

Though strictly a prep race for the Roses Are Red final next week, Shartin N faces Kissin In The Sand for the first time. I suppose a little bit of luster has been taken away from last year's divisional champion as Kissin In The Sand is yet to win this year in three starts, but her along with a few others could give Shartin N a real challenge either this week or in next week's final. Bettor Joy N is in career form for trainer Jim King, and he's holding all the cards in here between that mare and Shartin N. In addition, Seaswift Joy N hasn't lost in the Woodbine F&M preferred since returning here, Caviart Ally is always formidable and even Youaremycandygirl is capable of big miles when she keeps everything together.

The weekend's main event at Woodbine are the two North America Cup eliminations. Only 18 horses in total were entered which is the smallest number of entrants in this race that I can recall, though it remains a seemingly talented group. In the first elimination (race 3) all roads go through last year's freshman pacing champion Captain Crunch. He really turned it on the end of last year and has wasted no time in picking up this year right where he left off. He sizzled last out at Philly in 1:49.2 and there's no real reason to go against him. Bettor's Wish lands the rail fresh off his win in the \$300,000 Art Rooney at Yonkers, and the aggressive drive

from Dexter Dunn paid dividends as this one was able to romp home by 6 lengths in 1:51.4; no stranger to this oval either. Post 8 got the better of Air Force Hanover at Yonkers last out though I'm not sure it would have mattered anyway, I could see him saving his best stuff for next week with a spot in the finals likely assured with a cautious drive. Hurrikane Emperor gets the test for class after beating up on overwhelmed foes in limited NJSS competition; very fast in his own right – just like his dad. De Los Cielos Deo would seem outclassed based on his recent PASS races but that 1:48.4 qualifier out of nowhere could to lead to him getting a deeper look.

The second elimination in race 8 features Workin Ona Mystery who has flat out jogged in his two PASS races this year and has run his career record to seven wins from eight starts. He'll be heavily backed to capture his elimination and could have his sights set on bigger things next week. Lyons Night Hawk drew an advantageous post coming off a fast 1:50 score for a notoriously high percentage trainer; enters his elimination in sharp form. Captain Victorious and Semi Tough are both to be respected coming out of the Burke barn and are both possibilities to qualify for the final. Stag Party is tough to figure but I guess you can't back him now after tiring last week – he just isn't the same horse he was when his career first got started.

Jerry Knappenberger dead at 76

Jerry Lee Knappenberger, 76, a longtime general manager of the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association and former second trainer for the Terry Holton stable, died June 3, 2019, at the Inn at Chapel Grove in Heath, OH.

He was born October 9, 1942, in Newark, a son of the late John H. and Mildred G. (Barnes) Knappenberger. He was a graduate of Newark High School and received a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from The Ohio State University. He remained a life-long Buckeye fan, as well as a Cleveland Indians and Browns fan. He had also been a member of the Newark Maennerchor.

Mr. Knappenberger began his 50-year harness racing career as a second trainer for his high school classmate, Terry Holton. After a 25-year career with the Holton stable, he was hired as the assistant general manager of the OHHA. Mr. Knappenberger took over the top spot with the OHHA upon John Stanley's retirement in 1998. He served in that position until retiring in 2015.

Mr. Knappenberger worked tirelessly for the introduction of Video Lottery Terminals in the state of Ohio. The VLTs allowed the standardbred industry in Ohio to return to its place of prominence with increased purses at the four commercial tracks and the 65 county fairs.

Mr. Knappenberger was elected in 2015 into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame by a vote of the Ohio chapter of the U.S. Harness Writers Association. He received the Award For Service for 17 years as general manager of the Ohio Horseman's Association; the Harness Horseman's International Award of Appreciation in 2014; the Scioto Downs 2nd Annual Appreciation Award in 2014 and was honored by the 131st General Assembly of the State of Ohio for Outstanding Achievement on his induction into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2015.

Surviving are his sister Linda Ann (Russell) Ault; dear friends Bob and Nancy Richardson; nieces and nephews, Leigh Ann Ault, John (Lorie) Ault; Dr. Matthew (Heather) Ault, Jennifer Ault and several great nieces and nephews.

A funeral service will be held at 9 a.m., on Saturday, June 8, 2019, at the Brucker-Kishler Funeral Home in Newark. Pastor John Ault, Mr. Knappenberger's nephew, will officiate. Burial will follow in Cedar Hill Cemetery. Family and friends may call from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. tonight (June 7), at the funeral home, 985 N. 21st Street.

American Mercury takes NYSS at Buffalo

American Mercury (\$6.50) overcame the outside post to start the race then overwhelmed Major March in the stretch to collect the victory in the \$118,800 New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) event for the 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers on Wednesday (June 5) at Buffalo Raceway.

Covering the mile in 1:52.4, in was the second straight NYSS victory for American Mercury.

"It's a steep hill to climb from the eight post here at Buffalo," Buter said after the race. "I left hard with him but when things straightened up, I let the leaders soften each other up."

Starting from the outside, American Mercury was able to use some early speed and drop into fourth heading up the backstretch the first time. Major March, Melodies Major and Price Hanover showed no mercy toward each other as they battled for early control.

With a smoking opening panel of :26.4 put up by Major March (Jason Bartlett), American Mercury went first over and was able to come to even terms with the pace-setter at the three-quarter pole in 1:24.1. In the meantime, the remaining six entrants found those splits too hot and started to retreat.

It boiled down to a match race in the stretch as American Mercury was just too strong for Major March and never looked back in scoring the 1-3/4-length win. Reigning Deo (Jim Morrill Jr), the 2-year-old NYSS champion, was third 10-1/4 lengths behind.

Trained by Chris Oakes and co-owned by Crawford Farms, Northfork Racing Stable, C. Pompey and S. Bice, it was the third win in fourth tries this season for American Mercury

(American Ideal—Tessa Hanover). The gelding has now earned \$105,050 this season and \$142,670 lifetime.

There were two \$15,000 divisions of the Excelsior A Series. Buter drove **Quake Blue Chip** (\$3.00) to the opening bracket triumph with a neck score over Murrow Boy (Bartlett) in 1:55.3. Buter made it a sweep at this level with a half-length win aboard **Rickybobbynthehaus** (\$4.10). They beat the front-stepping Rollonhighway (Morrill Jr.) in 1:56.3.

The \$6,600 Excelsior B Series race saw **McNulty Z Tam** (Pat Lachance) register a head victory over Dancing To Heaven (Shawn McDonough) in 1:57.3 and return \$2.50 to his backers.

Buter and Billy Davis Jr. completed the evening with triples while Oakes had three training victories and Sabrina Clevenger two.

Racing will resume on tonight (June 7) at 5 p.m. with a 12-race card slated.

Odds On St Lucie, Philly Hanover head PASS hopefuls

With World Champion Warrawee Ubeaut elsewhere, a number of talented 3-year-old filly pacers will be looking to earn their spurs in Saturday's \$168,074 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows. Two who appear especially promising are Odds On St Lucie from the Tony Alagna stable and Philly Hanover, sent out by Ron Coyne, Jr.

The Belmont Day card kicks off at the special post time of 11:25 a.m., with the sires stake spanning races 7-9. Odds On St Lucie leaves from post 3 in race 9 while Philly Hanover goes from post 6 in race 8. Both will have the services of Dexter Dunn.

Warrawee Ubeaut and several other divisional standouts will compete in Saturday's Fan Hanover eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk, which is fine by Alagna.

"I knew some of them would be heading there," he said, "so I thought it would be a good chance to get her in some stakes company without some of the top-tier fillies."

A daughter of Sweet Lou—Shes Some Treasure who races for Dana Parham's Odds On Racing, Odds On St Lucie brought \$110,000 at the Lexington yearling sale, but she popped a curb early in her training.

"We had to give her some time to get that set," Alagna says. "She got really good at the end of the year and finished up well. She trained back well in Florida."

Indeed, she won the \$148,700 final of the Kindergarten series at The Meadowlands. She'll make her seasonal debut Saturday after three qualifiers — the last in 1:50.

One question about Odds On St Lucie remains. Why would Alagna, who trained Captaintreacherous and belongs to the Captaintreacherous syndicate, give \$110,000 for a daughter of Sweet Lou, the Captain's chief rival in the breeding shed?

"Her dam is a full sister to Captain," Alagna said. "She was meant to be a very good mare and won her first start in a PA All-Stars event. The next morning, she spiked a fever of 106. She about died on us on several occasions. I knew I'd buy her first foal no matter what it took."

Philly Hanover (Captaintreacherous—Paris Hanover) banked \$111,415 at 2 and nearly pulled off the shocker of the year when she rallied from well back to finish second by a neck to Sylph Hanover — at 39-1 — in the PASS championship at The Meadows. That day, Warrawee Ubeaut was third. This year, she's captured three of her four outings, including a PASS split at Harrah's Philadelphia.

"There's no one particular thing she does really well," says Coyne, who owns Philly Hanover with Blair Corbell, "but she does a lot of things pretty well. She's handy, has a little speed if you need it and can close off cover. I guess versatile is the word I want."
