# Early opinions vary as Mohawk unveils slanted starting gate

The Ontario track debuted the new gate Friday for its return to racing, thus ending its experiment with having the number 10 horse in a trailing position.

There was a bit of a buzz on social media this week as some tweeters wondered about people's opinions on Woodbine Mohawk Park moving the number 10 horse out of the trailing position and back on the starting gate.

The gate is also slanted on the outside to give the horses that draw widest a seemingly better chance at getting positioned near the front leaving the gate. Mohawk Park announcer Ken Middleton had the perfect description of the new slanted gate in response to a curious tweeter: "A traditional gate would be like attaching a ladder to the back of a truck. It's straight across for everyone. This gate has wings that are slightly tilted — the outside horse further ahead than the inside horse."

To find out why the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) terminated the 10 horse as a trailer experiment and why they slanted the gate I went right to the horse's mouth, the director of standardbred racing Bill McLinchey.

"When we moved the 10 horse to the trailing position, our goal there was to make the 10 more playable, and not have horsepeople feel like the race was over before it started," McLinchey said. "I thought the pilot with the 10 starting as a trailer went okay, but as we went on it seemed apparent that horsemen like to be

in control of their own destiny. They don't want to follow anyone."

Switching to a slanted starting gate seemed to be a case of perfect timing with the idea of giving the outside horses a better chance of leaving.

"We were in the market for a new starting gate," McLinchey said. "To stick with our plan of trying to make our odds board as level as we can and make the 9 and 10 horse a little more playable, we thought let's try a slanted start and see if that will get those horses into the race a little more."

McLinchey also mentioned that lining the horses up 10-wide will help put together bigger fields in stakes races.

"Let's say you have 21 enter. Now you can run two divisions with 10 and 11 horses instead of three fields of seven horses, he said.

Drivers Louis Phillipe-Roy and Johnathan Drury shared the opinion that being on the gate will help certain horses who can leave quickly whereas others might be better off in the trailer position to immediately save ground and some positions heading to the 1/4 pole.


"It really depends on the horse," Roy said. "If you have a big favorite that deserves to have a great chance, you're better off starting with your nose on the gate. But I think from the trailing position you could get into the race easier and get a trip with a horse that seemed to

have only a medium shot in that race." Roy added that he wasn't sure that the slanted gate would make as much of a difference on the big Mohawk oval. "I believe in slanted gates on 5/8ths or 1/2-mile tracks where the first turn comes quickly," he said. "At Mohawk, there is almost a 1/8th of a mile before you reach the first turn, so, if you have a decent horse you have your time to get placed."

Drury had similar thoughts.

"The trailer helped you get into the race in many cases," he said. "I guess it all depends on what type of horse you are driving. If





you are sitting behind one that wants to leave and you have a good shot then you probably want to be on the gate."

He added that the slanted gate can help some horses that might not normally leave out of there when they draw the widest post. "It's definitely going to help some horses that you know have a bit of gate speed but normally can't get out of there that well," he said. "I think its going to help put those types in play a little bit more, more so than if they had the 8, 9 or 10 hole before."

The flipside though is the horses that draw inside might be affected negatively. "They will have to work a little harder to get away closer to the front now," Drury said.

Trainer Blake MacIntosh thoughts flowed with the two teamsters.

"I like being on the gate with some," MacIntosh said. "But I'd rather be in the trailer with most."

As for the slanted gate, he said he hadn't noticed much of a difference yet, but it should be noted he was interviewed after one race card of 11 races was run.

"It might take the drivers a bit of time to see if they can leave from out there," he said.

Bettor Ryan Willis, who is never shy to provide his opinion when it affects his wagering dollars, was never a proponent of having a 10 horse start in the trailing position.

"I like having the 10 back on the gate," Willis said. "You actually get to handicap again and try to figure out what the drivers intentions are instead of them sometimes getting extremely lucky trips from the second tier that you never see coming. I like them trying a staggered gate, but hopefully it doesn't hurt the rail horse even more."

At press time, three #10 horses won the first eight races Saturday night at Mohawk Park.

One thing seems certain, Woodbine Mohawk Park's management isn't afraid to tinker and try new things to improve the wagering

product. Time will tell if the staggered gate makes a difference, but at least they are trying to level the playing field and make the outside horses more bettable.



# Feisty anniversary gift proves precious for Brian and Mackenzie Haynes

Smothastenesewisky, the couple's first yearling purchase, has earned over \$100,000 and now is an Ohio Sires Stakes winner after being purchased on a whim for \$3,000.

Some men buy their wives diamonds and exquisite jewelry to celebrate an anniversary. Others plan extravagant getaways. Ohio horseman Brian Haynes purchased a pacing filly for his significant other, Mackenzie. And while Smothastenesewisky may seem an untraditional gift to give a loved one, the sophomore recently pushed past \$100,000 in earnings after capturing an Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) division Saturday, June 5 at Northfield Park.

Haynes is very familiar with racing in the Buckeye State. His late father, Keith, was a long-time horseman that made his living as a trainer in Ohio and later at Winbak Farm. The 34-year-old has punched a time clock at Red Color Pet Foods, near his home in Washington Court House, for the last eight-and-a-half years. He has always had an interest in harness racing and registered his first starts as a trainer in 2006. After not sending out a single starter in 2018, the couple decided to play the claiming game.

"We just saved up some money and in the late winter or early spring of 2019, we started claiming horses," he said. "It took off from there."

At work by 6 a.m. and done by 2:30 in the afternoon, Haynes would immediately head to the Fayette County Fairgrounds to train his small stable. He had success during the 2019 campaign, harnessing 36 starters that produced five wins, seven runner-up performances and five third-place efforts. Purse earnings totalled just shy of \$44,000. Mackenzie floated the idea of buying a baby, but Haynes was a bit reluctant. Still, the couple found themselves at the November Blooded Horse Sale.

"We went to the sale and wanted a trotter, but we couldn't afford one," Haynes said. "We really didn't pick her out. We were just standing there and looking at her and I said, 'What do you think of this one?' My wife said, 'She looks okay.' I bid one time and bought her."

Sired by Nob Hill High out of the unraced Western Ideal mare Tender Spirit, Smothastenesewisky was hammered down for

\$3,000. The rigors of teaching a young horse to race can test a man's patience. Haynes was battle tested and up for the challenge, with two boys at home under the age of 3. As he worked with the filly, the conditioner felt she had potential. His instincts were soon reaffirmed.

"We had a friend of ours that helped break her and trained her down a little last year. He told me, 'This filly is very nice,'" said Haynes. "I thought she was nice, but it helped that someone else was telling me that. After we took her to Delaware and qualified her, it kind of set in that he was being serious."

Not made eligible to sires stakes, Smothastenesewisky raced primarily in the Buckeye Stallion Series and a few fairs during the 2020 campaign. She made her debut at Circleville in June, wiring the field by four-and-a-half lengths in a time of 2:03.3. The filly would go on to win her first six starts before tasting defeat. In the Buckeye Stallion Series, she collected six victories, including a 1:52.3 score in the \$60,000 championship at Hollywood Gaming Dayton Raceway.

Smothastenesewisky finished the season claiming victory in eight of nine starts while accumulating \$77,981. Her accomplishments are further highlighted by the fact she drew post seven or further outside four times, and battled female issues

and tying up throughout the year.

"I kind of regretted not sire staking her last year, but it might of worked out better," said Haynes. "She learned to race, we made real good money last year, and had a lot of fun."

Around the barn, Smothastenesewisky is affectionately known as "Snips," a name given by Haynes' oldest son, Ryker. Snips refers to the red-headed character Snips Stone in the television series Spirit Riding Free, described online as "rude, mischievous, lovable, and energetic." Ryker's nickname couldn't be any more appropriate, as the spoiled filly likes to keep things interesting in the shed row.

"She'll do things just to make me mad. If I put her in the cross ties and go to get the jog cart, she'll run to one side and try to turn around. Just stuff where she knows better," the trainer commented. "She's something else, I'll say that."

Added Mackenzie, his bride of seven years, "She's like a person. She's like an ornery little kid; she's like dealing with my boys. She fits right in with the kids."

Now a sophomore, Smothastenesewisky has not fired out of the gate stringing together multiple wins as she did last season. The familiar struggles of 2020 continue. She kicked off the year with a third-place effort in the Scarlet & Gray Invitational at Miami Valley, pacing a mile in 1:53. The month of May proved challenging beginning with a ninth-place performance in the opening round of sires stakes.

"She tied up and had female problems again that day. That whole month of May I dealt with her having female problems and tying up," Haynes said. "I would get one under control and the other would flare up."

An abscess resulted in a scratch from her next scheduled start,

and the pacer returned two weeks later to race fourth at Scioto Downs. Finally, she reclaimed her form in the second round of Ohio Sires Stakes. The couple's first yearling purchase delivered Haynes' first sires stakes victory as a trainer. Steered by Hunter Myers, Smothastenesewisky looped three-wide on the backstretch to take command and pulled away by four lengths on June 5 at Northfield in her \$50,000 division, crossing under the wire in a lifetime best 1:52.

"The 3-year-old filly division is pretty tough. I've said that if she's anywhere close to being right, she'll be right there with them," said the trainer. "I really don't think she was all the way right, but I think she was pretty darn close."

Bred by Robert Mondillo and Donald Robinon, the sophomore now possesses earnings of \$109,981. Prior to claiming her first victory of the year, Smothastenesewisky employed her typical antics, biting Haynes and drawing blood as he prepared to sponge her off after warmups.

"My wife reminds me all the time, 'You know this is my anniversary gift, you have to be nice to her," he said, laughing.

In any other stable, a first sires stakes win would be the most memorable event of the week. This time, the feat was overshadowed, sandwiched between the birth of the couple's third son, Clayton, on Thursday, June 3, and the celebration of Aiden's second birthday on Sunday, June 6. Brian and Mackenzie Haynes have their hands full right now managing three precocious boys and the gift of a feisty filly. They couldn't be happier.





## Italian success in Östersund

Italy's Alessandro Gocciadoro, who delivers top trotters to several European stakes races every year, has recently collected his Swedish training license.

His 7-year-old Vernissage Grif (Varenne) came to Sweden with a good reputation earlier this season and trainer Gocciadoro aimed for a spot in Elitloppet with his chestnut trotter.

When the \$169,500 Jämtlands Stora Pris was held in Östersund, Sweden on Saturday afternoon (June 12), Vernissage Grif was ready. From post 9 behind horses, Gocciadoro used an offensive tactic as he placed his horse outside leader Hail Mary with a lap (one kilometer) to go. Hail Mary seemed like a beaten horse with a quarter remaining of the race, while Gocciadoro had his hands full of power in Vernissage Grif. Vernissage Grif cruised to superior win in a mile rate of 1:54.4 over 1.3 miles and Wild Love (pocket trip) sprinted strongly as runner up ahead of strong finisher Click Bait (replay here).

"I was very pleased with my horse in the warm-up heat, but he almost lost the gait behind the car but solved it by himself and then he felt nice. When we came to position first over it felt very safe," said Gocciadoro, who entered the winner's circle with 500 spectators surrounding the Östersund track thanks to new restrictions allowing tracks to permit 500 people at some events in Sweden.

"It gets very emotional when spectators are here. It feels like a victory for the entire sport when we finally can see people at the tracks again," Gocciadoro said.

#### Silver became gold for Violetto Jet

Both winner Dorgos de Guez and third-place finisher Diable de Vauvert were disqualified from the \$121,500 Prix Chambon P at Vincennes in Paris on Saturday afternoon.

The critical moment came in the last turn when Dorgos de Guez interfered with inside horse Chica de Joudes at the same time as Diable de Vauvert did the same thing from an inside position. Chica de Joudes had no chance keeping on-stride and her race was over as Dorgos de Guez (Jean-Michel Bazire) got control. Bazire's trotter lost his gait for a moment in the last turn and the judges at Vincennes disliked the way Dorgos de Guez came home, leading to his disqualification.

Violetto Jet (From Above), trained by Fabrice Souloy and driven by Franck Nivard, finished strongly after a trip in third over and after disqualifications, the 7-year-old Italian bred colt got the victory. The mile rate over 1.7 miles was 1:56.3.

Italian 7-year-olds dominated the big races in Europe on Saturday afternoon.

Bazire-trained Ganay de Banville (Jasmin de Flore) impressed a lot in \$121,500 Prix L. Jariel for 5-year-olds at Vincennes. A first over trip didn't stop Bazire's trotter who sprinted home to a safe win in a mile rate of 1:53.4 over 1.3 miles.

## The many suits of Bobbo Marks

From the fertile brain of Dr Peter Boyce, who said: "First there was Chico, followed by Harpo, Groucho, Gummo and Zeppo. Then came a misspelling, but the same pronunciation, Bobbo Marks, not Marx."

Bob Marks is what this author would refer to as maybe the only renaissance men that it has been my pleasure to have known.

If you are reading this column, chances are that if you know Bob, you know him only as a harness racing maven.

He has worn several suits in this sport. He started off as a bettor, then became the author of the tip sheet Top Trotter which was sold on a nightly basis at the New York tracks Roosevelt and Yonkers with a short life at The Meadowlands. In the interim, Bobbo fed himself by working days at several advertising agencies in New York and South Florida.

From writing a tip sheet, Bob was hired by Sly Bonem to doing the grunt work for the fledgling Boardwalk Enterprises, which had been formed through the purchase of the equine interests of Tony Pedone and Barry Rubenstein. The price was beyond plausible. But as in every transaction there was a willing seller and a group of willing buyers. The purchasers were made up of a group of wealthy horse racing fans who's knowledge of the intricacies of the harness racing marketplace, specifically the breeding end of the business was to put it very kindly, quite limited. They were not the first, nor the last to be affected by this affliction.

When Boardwalk was dispersed at a huge loss for the partners, Bobbo became a freelancer. Among the people he did work for was a gentleman by the name of Bill Perretti. Although there are some who might say that referring to Wild Bill Perretti as a "gentle" man would definitely be a mischaracterization.

In 1988, Wild Bill opened his showplace Perretti Farms with Bobbo as his right hand man and constant whipping boy. Through the next 25 years Bobbo remained there until the Farms' final dispersal in 2013. In that time, there were numerous farm managers, veterinarians, office managers and other employees. The only constant was Bobbo Marks in his cubby

hole above the stable where the stallions were domiciled.

Since then, Bob has resided in Southern Florida in semi-retirement, but doing some freelancing, still writing about horses, some poetry and some music.

## Let's start near where I began. I called you a renaissance man. Your interests are multiple and varied.

"Although my first love still is and has always been the horses, I also have some other interests. I write poetry. I write music. I've actually produced some of my own music. I know the lyrics to thousands of songs most old standards. I've been involved in the writing of three books. I've probably written or have been involved with the writing of thousands of ads, the majority of them involving harness racing. I was once even written up in Advertising Age for an ad I produced for the Pan Am building with the title "Tell the Executives where to Get Off." I was always and still am a voracious reader. I'm never comfortable unless I have a book waiting to be read. I've always taken delight in plants. I could call myself a horticulturist, but I'd probably be over rating myself by a lot. I suppose that such as it is, the only area where I've been somewhat successful has been in harness racing."

## Let's start at the beginning. How did you get involved in harness racing?

"The beginning was Manhattan where I was born and lived until I was 10 years old. My father could be described, as The Temptations did, as a rolling stone. I only met him once in my

life at the age of 23. He was, from what I understand, a very good doctor, but had some limitations insofar as being a good husband and father. My mother and sisters moved to Long Beach which wasn't too far from Roosevelt Raceway. I was a terrible student, except in history and geography. I was very fast and a pretty good athlete, but much too small to go anywhere at five foot six and weighing 120 pounds.

"At the age of 16, I began hearing about this place called Roosevelt Raceway where they raced horses. There was this guy who went to Roosevelt Raceway every evening. He enthralled the neighborhood kids with stories of great horses with names such as Adios Harry and Dotties Pick. I couldn't wait to go to this magical place.

"I finally turned 18 and was eligible to attend. I was told that two horses Hundred Proof and Mr K Braden, respectively driven by two up-and-coming drivers named Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton would probably win. I collected \$36 from my \$2 investment. This was just great. They gave money away at this place. I soon disavowed myself of that conclusion.

"I recall the first horse I bet on that I picked myself was Tar Boy, driven by Levi Harner. He won and paid \$11. I was a pretty good card player. In the day time we'd play cards. If I won \$4 or \$5, I had my stake for that night's action at Roosevelt."

## From there you started picking winners for a tip sheet called Top Trotter. How did that evolve?

"I had gained a fair reputation as a decent handicapper. A fellow by the name of Wally Rottkamp published a tip sheet called Top Trotter which was sold at Roosevelt and Yonkers. He asked me if I would consider coming to work for him. Of course, I did. In the day time I worked in advertising in Manhattan. At night, I was at Yonkers or Roosevelt. Wally also had a monthly harness racing magazine for which I picked horses to watch out for and wrote the occasional story."

#### Then came Boardwalk.

"Sly Bonem engineered the deal for Tony Pedone and Barry Rubenstein. He had a way of ingratiating himself with people — especially people who had a whole lot of money. He was a great front man. He didn't know near as much about horses as he wanted people to think, but he had a special knack of finding those he led to believe that he did.



"He assembled this group of wealthy men that included Herman Green, Vincent Vinci and Ted Gewertz, the latter who of course is still in the business and will be installed in the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen on July 4th.

"Sly was Mr Outside dealing with the partners and I was Mr Inside doing the grunt and most of the horse related work.

"After awhile, things started to go south. The yearlings weren't bringing as much money as Sly told the partners they would. Herman Green became the managing partner. He and I sat down. I told him that the horses were never worth what they had initially paid for them. Furthermore, that as time went on, barring a miracle they would continue to depreciate in value. Horses were not like cars. With cars you wouldn't expect much difference in sticker price from year to year. With horses there were no guarantees. A mare's yearling could bring six figures one year and five or even four figures the next. Mr. Green didn't become a multi-millionaire by being dumb. He decided to cut his losses. The horses were dispersed. Boardwalk was finished."

#### What then Bobbo?

"I tested the waters. I did some freelancing including doing some work for Fair Winds Farm. Through Vince Vinci and Steve Demas, I met this wild man named Bill Perretti. He was standing a horse by the name of Walt Hanover at Steve's farm. I did the advertising for Walt Hanover. In 1988, Bill had built Perretti Farms. He asked me to come work for him as his consultant. I did and I stayed there until after the farm's final dispersal sale in 2013."

Twenty-five years working for Bill Perretti? I'd bet that you were the only one including his sons who were not fired by Bill Perretti. How did you do it?

"Like you've told me, I suppose it didn't hurt that I am somewhat deaf. Although, with as loud as Bill could yell, there was no way you could escape hearing him. He could probably wake the dead. I remember one time Mike Kimelman was at the Farm and asked Bill how could Bob have possibly taken the constant abuse. Bill's answer was, 'He just ignores me and does whatever he wants.' There might have been a little truth to that, but just a little. One only ignored Bill Perretti if he were ready to accept the consequences if things didn't turn out right. If they turned out well, it was all his idea. If they turned out badly, even though I was following his instructions, it was always my fault."

#### Tell us some Bill Perretti stories.

"The date was January 13, 2011. Bill comes into my office screaming as only he could. 'Why didn't you tell me it was f---ing Antny's birthday? I'm too busy keeping you from ruining this farm. How can he expect me to remember his birthday?' He had forgotten his son's birthday and it was my fault for not reminding him about it."

#### Another?

"Many people don't realize that Anthony Perretti and I had Muscle Hill all but signed and delivered. The deal was in place. Muscle Hill was coming to stand stud at Perretti Farms. At the very last minute, Bill backed out. I don't know this as a fact, but I'm fairly certain that someone influenced this happening, probably only because Anthony and myself had put the deal together."

#### One last one?

"It was on Labor Day 1997. Bill and Jim Wheeler were drinking some wine at the farm. It was well before the days of the Internet. I had gone to Freehold simulcasting to watch the stakes races from Woodbine. Bill already owned 25 per cent of Muscles Yankee, even though for some unknown reason he wasn't even listed on the program. Muscles Yankee impressively won the Champlain in a new season's record time. I called Bill. He started screaming at me for disturbing him on Labor Day, especially when he had company, although that would never stop him from calling me on any day, at any time that suited him. He calmed down when I told him the good news. Before that day was over, he had managed to secure Wheeler's 25 per cent interest in the horse giving him control."

#### You've mentioned Anthony Perretti, Bill's son.

"As much as Bill could be spoken of as not being the best person this world had ever seen, the opposite could be said for Anthony. He is a true gentlemen in every sense of the word. He is smart, loyal and a genuinely good person. I'm honored to be his friend. We still speak regularly."

#### Let's talk about horses. Who is your favorite one ever?

"At one time it was Tarquinius, then Overtrick, then I grew a huge admiration for Meadow Skipper who remains my favorite, so much so that the horse chose me to write his biography. His grit was absolutely amazing. In the modern era it would be Rocknroll Hanover."

#### How about trotters?

"That would have to be Speedy Scot. He was a giant among men at 2, 3 and 4. I don't believe, or at least I cannot remember him ever losing a race unless he made a break at the start. In the modern era it would have to be Muscle Hill."

#### How about horsemen?

"In order, I'd say Stanley Dancer, Jimmy Cruise and Jimmy Takter."

#### **Drivers?**

"In order, Buddy Gilmour, John Campbell, Brian Sears."

## I'm giving you an unlimited budget. Who are you going to use to pick four yearlings for you?

"You will probably be surprised. I'd pick the pedigrees. But as far as conformation is concerned, Abe Stoltzfus."

#### What keeps Bobbo occupied these days?

"I'm what you would call semi-retired. It's not really what I want to be, but age and circumstances have put me in a position where I don't have enough work to do to keep me as happy and occupied as I'd like to be. Regardless I'm still able to do the things that I enjoy doing."

#### **ADDENDUM**

Last week's column on the 15 most notable horsemen to come out of Canada (full story here) elicited more emails and responses than any in the almost two years that I've been writing this column. Surprisingly enough, there was not a single disagreement with any of the 15 chosen, nor their numerical standing. When it came to the listing of the also eligibles, there were numerous suggestions all of them with a great degree of merit, they included Marcel Dostie, Gilles Gendron, Yannick Gingras, Honorat Larochelle, Jacques Larente, Paul Emile Larente, Jack Moiseyev, Luc Ouellette, Bill Robinson, Dave Wall and Greg Wright. To all of you, please accept my apologies for the omissions. I'm certain that there are others as well to whom I say I am sorry.

The biggest problem I've found with getting old is that so many of my contemporaries and friends leave before me. Last week, we lost one of the greatest drivers that ever sat behind a horse and a darned good horseman as well in Benny Webster. I have two Benny stories that I'd like to share with you.

Benny and I were both pretty young. I'm not even sure he was at the New York tracks yet. He might have still been in Western New York. He came to the Hanover consignment in 1975, introduced himself to me and said that he had a limited budget of, if I recall correctly, \$20,000. Were there any colts that I could recommend to him in that price range? I was a Bullet Hanover fan. We had a real nice colt by Bullet out of an old trotting bred mare named Fame Hanover that I really liked. She had initially been bred to trotters, then had a couple of foals by Knight Dream I believe. This was her first by Bullet Hanover and her eighth foal. He sold for somewhere in the teens and Benny bought him. I believe he might have been the first really nice horse that Benny developed. His name was Ferric Hanover and he ended up making over \$250,000 which was a lot of money back then. From that point forward, every time I saw Benny he would say, "You helped me buy my first good horse."

## That's a good question

Joel Kravet has asked me a question I'm happy to answer. Because the recipient mares carrying embryo transplants are generally quite placid, he wonders if that quietness could be passed on to the foal they're carrying.

The answer is a resounding no. Both the phenotype, which is the visible horse, and the genotype, which is the invisible, genetic makeup, are fixed at the moment of conception. There is no way the recipient mare carrying an embryo transferred (ET) foal can have any effect on that foal, either physically or genetically. The one proviso here is that the recipient mare should be fed exactly the same as a naturally pregnant mare.

Ever since ETs were first introduced, foals produced by that method have gotten an undeserved bad rap. That particularly applies to yearlings. Every year a smart, informed buyer can get him or herself a bargain at the yearling sales when a nice, embryo transferred yearling walks into the sales ring.

There is another Old Wives Tale that needs to be laid to rest. Down through the years there has been a belief that an aggressive mare will produce an aggressive foal, ergo a better, gamer racehorse.

During the years we stood Valley Victory here at Walnut Hall, there were two breeding seasons when Moni Maker was bred to him and boarded here. Both years she was accompanied by her long time companion, also a standardbred mare, but about half Moni Maker's size. Seeing them together in a big paddock, she looked like Moni Maker's mascot.

But if you watched them closely, you'd quickly see that all the little mascot had to do was back one ear, and Moni Maker would flee to the other side of the paddock. At this time, this was the greatest money-winning mare of any racing breed, yet she was totally dominated by someone half her size.

This is also a good place to point out that horses, regardless of breed, should always be turned out in even numbers. Horses are buddy animals, and if there is an odd-numbered group, one of them is going to be a lonely only, always at the bottom of the pecking order.

On the subject of embryo transfers, they are something to consider as the breeding season winds down. Despite the fact that some breeders don't even start breeding their mare until March 15, there is always a sales premium on bigger, better developed yearlings, and the earlier they're foaled, the bigger they'll be at sales time.

So when you have a good mare, and she's still open in June, an embryo transfer isn't the worst idea in the world. That way you still are getting a foal from the mare, but you're starting the next breeding season with an open mare whom you can put on an early breeding cycle. Again, you do have the unreasonable bias against an ET yearling, but one can always hope that reason will finally prevail here.

A related issue to June breedings can be whether or not to breed on a mare's foal heat. As I've said, we here at Walnut Hall are blessed to have one of the great reproductive vets in Dr. Karen Wolfsdorf. But when she will very occasionally check a mare more than 10 days after foaling and she has a 40 follicle, with no bruising, the question about whether to breed her arises. My answer after a lifetime spent breeding horses, is not to breed her.

Statistically, the odds are much worse for both getting a pregnancy and carrying it to term when you breed on a foal heat. It's very tempting, late in the season, but you're still better off to pass her foal heat and short cycle her.

Finally, another rite of summer has started, i.e. the baby races. Over the early years, this kid made it a rule of thumb that the eventual top 2-year-old of the year didn't appear on the track until after the fourth of July.

I haven't followed things closely enough to know if that's still true. But there is a new, first year sire, that could change the trotting sire equation. That's Walner, a horse I've touted to everyone who'd listen. I hasten to say I don't own a hair in his tail, so there's no self-interest involved here.

While I'm mentioning stallions, some smart farm operator is going to land another horse with great potential in Captain Corey. He showed enough at 2 to meet my criterion there, and he's blessed with a pedigree that leaves him wide open for all the fashionably-bred fillies now racing. Again, a purely objective opinion. But if and when he becomes the sire this kid thinks he can be, you heard it here first.

## Breakfast With The Babies: Captaintreacherous takeover

Breakfast With The Babies at The Meadowlands Act II, sponsored by Fashion Farms, was held Saturday morning (June 12). Temperatures were in the low 70's, skies overcast and flags limp when the races began at 10 a.m.

It was "Captaintreacherous Day" as that top sire and his trainer Tony Alagna swept all five pacing races with the colt **Atlas Hanover** the last and perhaps most impressive on the day.

Atlas Hanover won in 1:56.3 on the lead last week and this week displayed versatility by sitting well off the pace for Andy McCarthy before unleashing a furious finish to get up in 1:55 with his final quarter in :26.2 with no asking.

Atlas is a Hanover-bred and brought a bid of \$170,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale from the ownership group of Robert LeBlanc, David Anderson, Ken Jacobs and In The Gym Partners.

Also of note, late on the day "Road To The Hambletonian" leader **Venerate** qualified for the second time with an ultra-impressive 1:52.3, home in :26.3 mile, trotting strongly on his own to draw away from an accomplished older horse in The Veteran. Andy Miller was in his familiar spot behind the Love You colt for trainer Julie Miller. The Millers own Venerate with Pinske Stable.

Southwind Tyrion, who went the fastest mile ever by a 2-yearold trotter of 1:51.1 last fall at The Red Mile finished third in his first appearance this year, trotting in 1:53.4, home in :27.2 for Ake Svanstedt.

Trotting fillies opened the program and **Baptism** (Ake Svanstedt) trotted home impressively in :29.2 to finish the 1:58.4 mile. Svanstedt sat her in third throughout then fanned off the cover of Vivian's Crown (Dexter Dunn) as the pair of fillies trotted in tandem past early leader Quick Bet (Brian Sears) who held third. Baptism is a Diamond Creek Southwind Frank homebred out of Fall From Grace, trained in the Svanstedt barn.

Diamond Creek had another homebred winner in race two when

Another Swedish-bred filly, **Joviality S** (Mattias Melander), the Chapter Seven lass from the very accomplished race mare Pasithea Face S, closed alertly off cover through a sub-:28 final panel for the 2:01.3 win. Selfie Queen (Jimmy Takter) weaved her way through traffic late for second and Tiltheloverunsout (A. Svanstedt) held for third after cutting the mile. Anders



Strom's Courant, Inc owns the winner and bred her via his AM Bloodstock, Inc.

After a training break, the trotting colts came up in the fifth race. The Muscle Hill colt **Southwind Drover** (Sears) was a 2:00 /:28 winner for trainer Melander, getting through on the inside to pass early leader Chelios (Tim Tetrick) then holding off the determined close of Justice (A. Svanstedt). Bred by Southwind Farm, the winner raced in the farm's name today. He was a \$55,000 Lexington Selected Sale purchase.

Looks Like Moni (Takter) outlasted Tachyon (Sarah Svanstedt) then held of the late-charging Distance Learning (Sears) by just a nose to post a 1:59.2 win with a :27.3 final quarter. Takter moved Looks Like Moni first over on Tachyon just past the 1:00.2 half and they traded blows the length of the stretch. Tachton stayed on for third, beaten only a neck. The winner is a Brittany, Katz & Libfeld homebred son of Muscle Hill from That's All Moni. Nancy Takter is the trainer.

Majestic J (Dave Miller) was dialed in this morning and led all the way to post a 1:59 / :27.3 win with great ease. The Walner colt went off-stride early last week before exhibiting unusual speed to catch the field. Saturday, he was flawless. Takato (Dunn) rallied up to be second after fussing about in the stretch while Talismano (Tetrick) was an even third. Ken Jacobs paid Coyote Wynd Farms \$115,000 for the son of Walner from Upfrontluckycarol and has entrusted Tony Alagna to train him.

Pacers started in the eighth race where the Captaintreacherous filly **Don't Fence Me In** (Dunn) impressed with a :27.2 end to a 1:56.4 win. Dexter put her right on top, loped along on an easy lead throughout then said go and got a willing response from the Riverview Farms homebred, now owned with Steve Head, Jerry Glantz and trainer Tony Alagna, when asked. Aida DeVie was second and Tally's Treasure (Chase Vandervort) third.


Alagna came right back with another homebred daughter of Captaintreacherous, this one named **Captain's Princess** (Andy McCarthy), winning in 1:56.3 / :27. Put on the point by McCarthy, the filly set sensible fractions before the stretch sprint with the driver remaining motionless in the sulky. Alagna shares ownership on this one with Brad Grant and Mel Segal. Twenty Grand (Mark MacDonald) followed along for a good second while Ideal Huntress (D. Miller) was third.

The theme continued in race 10 as another Tony Alagna Captaintreacherous, this time the colt I Did It Myway (Todd McCarthy), turned heads with an effortless 1:54.4 mile, ripping home in :26.2 easily. It was the second appearance for I Did It Myway and the Joe Sbrocco homebred looks like he's ready for anything. Country Club Acres, Alagna & Fodera along with D. Latore share ownership on the colt with Sbrocco. Nautical Hanover (Dunn) was second while JK Victory (Tetrick) flashed late speed to get up for third.

Alagna stepped it up in the 11th by sending out three Captain colts and they swept the first three placings with **Danger Zone** (Todd McCarthy) a winner in 1:56 out of the pocket, home in :26.4 on his own. Rule Of Law (A. McCarthy) held second after

setting the pace and Captaingiddyupngo (Dunn) had late pace to be third. Alagna bred and owns the winner out of his Ontario champ of a few years ago, Thatsoververynice, with partner Ron Ruggles after going through at Lexington for \$35,000.

## **Behind the data lines (Part 1)**

Information is the oil of the 21st century, and analytics is the combustion engine.

"I have an idea that would make buying and selling yearlings more fun, a little bit less of a crapshoot and perhaps generate additional revenue for the sales companies."

My pal rolled his eyes and said, "And we're off. The Trey Express to Loony Town is leaving the station."

I smiled and said, "The conductor will be around to punch your ticket. This sport has many places where additional data would be valuable, but we begin with a yearling catalog page. The page must be online so that customers can link."

He widened his eyes, "The original Troglodyte suddenly needs hyperlinks?"

"Yes. While it is true that every catalog page has a great deal of data, my idea is to take people in the yearling marketplace behind those lines in the standard catalog page and offer an additional level of information."

He said, "What is this additional data of which you speak?"

"There are several, but I believe the most obvious place for more data depth is the production of the dam listings. When dams have had babies that raced, you find basic data on race times and earnings of the offspring. Good or bad, much of the production seems clear. However, in real life, the complete story of the dam's production may not be clear at all. Not all information is in black and white, and more information and data are always available."

"You want a deeper dive into the history of the foals of a mare?"

"Yes. For example, a broodmare I once owned has had five foals. Most went through the sales ring, and four made it to the race-track. Potential buyers will open the page, and they will be familiar with the various stallions. What buyers would value is a more in-depth report on the life and career of each foal."

"I don't follow. Buyers can see every race line of every horse that raced or did not race."

I shook my head, "Incomplete data that can be misleading in both positive and negative ways. Let me use the first few foals out of this mare. Maybe I will make myself clear."

"Doubtful, but proceed."

"This is what the first colt looks like on the HIP page."

LORD OF THE REIGNS 3, 1:552, BT 1:55 (\$77,096) (Dejarmbro). 2 wins at 3. At 2, second in Ohio Fair at Canfield, Upper Sandusky; third in Ohio State Fair S., keg Ohio Sires S. at Scioto. At 3, winner of Ohio Sires S. at Miami Valley and Scioto; second in Scarlet and Gray Invitational. (ADA)

He said, "Very clear, what's the problem?"

"No problem. The listing is fine, but there is more information that remains unknown. My suggestion is that for both buyers and sellers, in many instances, additional information could be an option. For example, at the end of the above entry, a blue hyperlink - ADA, Additional Information Available."

"Such as?"

"When they click the blue link, the customer will receive this information:

This 3-year-old beat the best in Sire Stakes action two times and was already eligible for the final when the groom found his leg injured in the stall one morning in June. He never raced again. An injury ended his career prematurely."

My friend said, "I'm sure there were sharp horsemen who took note of this horse's production and injury."

"Maybe, but time passes. It was years later when the next foal showed up in the sales ring."

"What happened to the second foal?" he asked.

"This is what a catalog page would show:

Far from A Wish (M) BT 2:00.4 (\$9,400) Wishing Stone. At 2, Third in Marion Dancer Memorial. She should have an ADA link."

"Why?"

"Her story on the HIP page is both incomplete and somewhat misleading. An ADA link would flesh it out. Buyers glancing at the page will notice a stakes filly, a positive, who did not race at 3, a negative. Both are misleading and not part of a typical listing.

This filly was a member of a tiny pool of eligible yearlings guaranteed a slot in the NJSS final. Immature in June, she grabbed a couple of checks in stake races at age 2, when staying on her feet was good enough to cash. She was a stakes performer at age two, but that is misleading. After the stake's races at age two, in July, she was listed and sold OnGait. Oddly, despite a virtual guarantee of stakes money as a three-year-old, the top bidder purchased her for her physical appearance, not

for horse racing nor for harness horse breeding. She was out of the sport after a few early races."

He said, "Keep going."

"The third yearling did not have a catalog page. If he ever does, it would look something like this:

Worth A Whisper (C) Wishing Stone. Now 5, 7 wins, (\$44,365) (1:57.2)

Once again, this colt has a story that buyers will not know, information which could be of interest to people looking at purchasing a yearling that could be available with an ADA."

In his last training trip before qualifying for his 2yo season, in the final turn, he took a misstep and fractured a coffin bone ending his season before it began. He had a tough break. After healing, as a green 3-year-old, this horse found more rough sledding. He drew outside posts in his first five races, and other horses ran into him twice. Things leveled out, and the rest of his record reflects reality. He is still racing at age five. In May 2021, he took a new lifetime mark.

He asked, "Isn't information like this subject to fraud and manipulation? Sellers could hype their horses, unraced horses in training could be, 'The best I ever had until the colt put his foot through the fence."

I nodded. "That is unlikely. Buyers should always beware, but you may notice all this information on my mare's production is verifiable. In the examples above, buyers can check vet records for broken bones, you can document a series of poor posts, you can verify sales, and you can watch races."


He recapped, "So what you are suggesting is that sellers with the time and the inclination could add supplemental data linked to the sales page."

"Absolutely. You now know more about the production of my mare than you did five minutes ago, some positive information and some negative information. If data is the gold, as you are always claiming, this deeper dive into production could be both valuable and interesting to buyers and sellers."

He asked, "Who would harvest the data? Who would profit? Who would pay? Who would take responsibility? Who would do the work?"

I smiled. "Next week, the Express to Looney Town will roll on to the next station behind the data lines."

## Perron grinds out Currier & Ives victory at The Meadows; Palone wins 6

Prior to Saturday's (June 12) \$99,370 Currier & Ives at The Meadows, trainer Chris Beaver predicted that his horse Perron would win some big races this year by roughing it on the outside. It was a bold forecast since Perron, the reigning Ohio champion, was winless in five starts this year.

But Beaver's crystal ball was in focus, as Perron moved first over to wear down Whiskey Blu and capture the prestigious test for 3-year-old trotters. Panzano, also trained by Beaver, finished third.

When Whiskey Blu quarter-poled to the top, he was able to discourage any challenges until the three-quarters where Perron took up the chase. Winning driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. indicated that was about the best scenario he could draw up for the My MVP—Long Island Tea gelding.

"The four hole is a good leaving spot here, and that's about as good as he can leave," Wrenn said. "I knew I would have to grind it first over, but he can go all day long. He's just not super-handy. He'll eye a horse down, and he just doesn't quit."

Perron and Whiskey Blu dueled through the stretch until Perron inched away to down his rival by 1/2 length in a career best 1:54.

Beaver said Perron has about a five-week gap in his schedule before his next engagement, an Ohio Sires Stake leg, and that he might look for a race for Perron or give him time off and qualify him for his return.

Perron lifted his career bankroll to \$272,389 and helped Beaver extend his distinguished record in the Currier & Ives, which has been contested since 1975. Beaver won the 2017 edition with Fraser Ridge, took a 2009 heat with Triumphant Caviar and captured a 2014 division with Il Sogno Dream, who scored in a stake-record 1:53.2.

Dave Palone was aboard a third Beaver-trained Currier & Ives contestant, Kildare King, who broke stride early and often. Palone managed to enjoy a pretty good day anyway, winning six of the 13 races on the card.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Wednesday when the program features a \$12,467.41 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5. First post is 12:45 PM.

The Irish Harness Racing Association (IHRA) have reported extreme satisfaction with its inaugural Irish American Weekend held June 5 and 6 June at Portmarnock Raceway.

"In some ways this was a dry run for 2022," said IHRA chairman Mark Flanagan. "We were constrained like all sporting organisations by the COVID situation. We reached out to the rest of the world with our live streaming and a series of interviews with world figures and some home grown talent.

"The IHRA is grateful to the connections of Cattlewash, Betting Line and Heston Blue Chip for donating breedings to these top class stallions. We have created the Invest in Ourselves Initiative which will improve our breeding and some of the proceeds set up the first Irish American weekend. The weekend was to celebrate the help from the USA.

"We have invited Yannick Gingras and John Campbell for 2022, travel restrictions permitting. The IHRA will also invite a few sponsors, breeders and administrators from America in 2022 and in future years."

€75,000 was on offer across 17 races. Pre-recorded interviews were shown with the live stream. The programme featured eliminations (or heats as they are known in Ireland) and finals for older pacers and trotters as well as the Derby, Oaks and 4-year-old 'Graduate' series.

There was a fairytale result when Donovan's Betting Line gelding Bequest took out the €3,000 Irish American Derby for his West Cork based partners the Murphy brothers. Driver Donal Murphy helped select the colt (now gelded) in Lexington in 2019.

"Bill always likes to buy one to race in Ireland," was part of the post-race interviews.

#### Doherty should have been ranked higher




