

It's a good thing Michael Goldberg didn't take my advice

A few years ago, I received an email from a man who said he was contemplating getting into the breeding business after nearly 30 years racing and buying yearlings. He did say that he was only considering doing it on a very limited basis. Although he raced all over the country, he wanted to breed horses to take advantage of the newly enhanced Mass Sires Stakes which allowed for dual eligibility for horses bred to out of state sires and foaled in Massachusetts.

My initial response to him was "DON'T DO IT!"

From my experience, it was almost always a fool's errand, which almost always resulted in at best, many thousands of dollars wasted, often leading to that person's exodus from a business in which he previously had experienced a great deal of enjoyment, satisfaction and often some pleasure.

"Leave the breeding to the breeders," I told him. "There are so many reasons why you do not want to be breeding and raising your own horses, the chief of which is it is a money drain. It's especially daunting when you want to breed to race them yourself. You end up training horses that you wouldn't even have looked at if they were not those that you had a hand in raising."

Michael Goldberg responded that he appreciated my candor and that he understood the risks involved. Nevertheless, he had recently sold his business, had his own small farm, more time and resources and wanted to take a shot.

He thought he understood the risks involved and was prepared to only invest an amount that he felt comfortable losing.

He asked if I would help him get started.

The Harrisburg sale was coming up and he wondered if I would meet with him to go over some of the breeding prospects in it.

Considering that he understood the risks involved, I said that I would be more than happy to render whatever expertise I could add. So, I met with him in Massachusetts and then met with him and his trainer at the time at Harrisburg.

It is now several years later. Goldberg has stood fast with his initial plan. In all but one case, he has kept the yearlings which he raised. The one exception was a beautiful Walner yearling Legal Scholar. He consigned it to Harrisburg two years ago and the yearling brought \$300,000. Goldberg still owns the

broodmare, Religulous, and is hoping that Andrew Harris can get Legal Scholar racing to meet his early expectations.


A mare, Ace Of Pace, that he purchased on that trip to Harrisburg where I accompanied him has produced the filly Beantown Ace who finished second in the Mass Sires Stakes final last year. She is now a 3-year-old and has earned \$123,710. He has (barely) avoided the likelihood of as I warned him of becoming horse poor. When I met him, he maintained a race stable of 30-40 racehorses. For the past few years, he has liquidated most of his racehorses and focused on his homebreds. His horse holdings — including two older classy racehorses, broodmares, 2-year-olds, yearlings and sucklings — number about a dozen. He isn't about to say that he has made money, but if he has lost some, it hasn't been considerable. He still fantasizes about one colt becoming a champion and of one of his two Down Under broodmares proving themselves. If he is in the debit status, it has more than been superseded by the immense pleasure he has derived from participating in numerous facets of a sport in which he has been involved for almost all of his adult life.

You've been involved in harness racing as a participant for decades. How and when did it begin?

"I grew up on Long Island. My friend Howie Kurzrok's dad Eugene was a prominent owner who later owned parts of great horses such as Mission Brief, Mission Hill, Southwind Frank and Golden Receiver. We went to Roosevelt Raceway and cheered his horses on. I really enjoyed it.

"Fast forward 14 years, I was interning at Boston's Children Center. My brother presented me with the opportunity to partner with him on a \$1,500 horse. The horse, Slapstruck, actually won a few races and gave us a lot of fun. We didn't make much money, but we didn't lose any. Our father saw the fun we were having and decided to join us in claiming a horse, Doctor Paul, from Ray Schnittker. What small time Massachusetts people claim from Ray Schnittker? Only people who don't know better. We fit that profile well. Nevertheless, we got lucky. Ray had paid \$1,000 to enter Doctor Paul in the Sampson Pacing Series, a one-and-half mile late closer at Yonkers. The first week our driver/trainer Jimmy Hardy didn't have him rigged right and he raced poorly. However, Jimmy figured him out before the second start and he went down to Yonkers and won at 36-1. We are not big gamblers, but we all bet on him, and we won so much money that they had to go to the back cash room to get enough money to pay us."

Author's note: Doctor Paul finished second in the late closer final and went on to win 21 races for the Goldbergs from 1993 to 1997. Goldberg quipped "that might have been the worst thing that ever happened to us since we were now hooked."

Aren't you a psychologist by profession?

"I built an outpatient mental health business which ultimately became the biggest of its kind in Massachusetts. I sold it for a good sum in 2017. Part of the deal was that I had equity in the new company. I continued to work and run the Northeast operations through 2020. The company eventually went public and is now the largest outpatient mental health company in the country.

"I had continued to dabble in horse ownership. Now that I had more time and money on my hands I decided to expand my participation. I enjoyed racing then, as I still do. But I wasn't content just being a spectator. I wanted to get back to more hands-on involvement that I had when I was starting my career. I drove in an infamous amateur race at Yonkers in the 1990s which helped me understand how difficult driving really is. I enjoy warming up my horses occasionally. I wouldn't call myself a trainer, but I would also sometimes help out, some might call it, get in the way, in training my horses.

"I increased my participation in the sport by buying a few yearlings. The next thing I wanted to do was to breed a few of my own. I now own a small farm in Massachusetts with a third-of-a-mile training track on it. I foal my horses on farms in Massachusetts and send them to Chris Coyle's place [Olive Branch Farm] in North Carolina to be raised. Chris Coyle has been an amazing caretaker and advisor in my breeding adventure."

What does your horse "empire" now consist of?

"We have two old classy racehorses, JK Willpower and Pappy Go Go, both of which have had great careers. JK Willpower broke one million in lifetime earnings in November with his 42nd win. Pappy Go Go, the greatest son of Tad The Stud, has 54 wins and over 500,000 earned. Both have been racing poorly this year. However, now that I am back in Massachusetts they will come back to my farm where my friend and most trusted horseman, Jeff Lieberman, will help me get them back to the form I believe they are capable of. I ride them both and expect to own and take care of them for the rest of their lives. I have four broodmares and their 2024 foals. I have my now 3-year-old

Mass filly Beantown Ace [\$123,710] who is coming back strong. Three 2-year-olds, one of which has been turned out and is at Chris Coyle's to grow more. All of my younger horses are Mass eligible and are in training with George Ducharme. As are most owners, I am looking forward to seeing them compete in stakes races as the season goes on."

Am I correct, that your interest in sports is not entirely focused on harness racing?

"Harness racing is the only sport in which I have a dollar investment, but I consider myself invested, at least emotionally in all of the major sports teams, specifically those based in

Patti Murphy loves being farm manager at Hanover Shoe Farms

Although Patti Murphy's family was not involved in harness racing, one day she would grow up to manage the largest and most renowned standardbred farm in the world, Hanover Shoe Farms.

When she was little, Murphy's father's secretary had a brother — John Paul Boyd — who raised and raced standardbreds in Newbury, OH. Murphy and her sister Becky would do small jobs on his farm, such as painting fences and picking up apples in the orchard so Boyd could turn out his mares in the field and not have them colic due to overeating the juicy reds.

"In 1977, Boyd leased my sister and I a 4-year-old trotter named Soxs Rhodil to ride," Patti said. "We would ride him from the farm where we boarded him to the Geauga County Fairgrounds, down trails, and along the road. He was such a good horse except he wouldn't canter, but he loved when we hand grazed and groomed him. When 'Soxs' went back into training, Mr. Boyd took us to the matinee at Painesville Fairgrounds to watch him race."

That was the beginning of Patti working on some prestigious farms and tending to some famous horses. Her resume is as strong as it gets.

From 1982 through 1984 Patti worked at a private owned training center, owned by Peg and Tom Jones and Barb and Phil Milstein.

"I cleaned stalls, jogged horses, wrapped their legs, aided in swimming the horses in the pool and worked with the broodmares and foals," Patti said. "At the time two of their best mares were Springwood Tami and Springwood Barb. I also took paddocks at Northfield, but loved working on the farm the best."

From 1986 through 1995, Patti worked at Success Acres; at the time it was owned by Merle Mullett. Patti started "foal watching" on weekends and once she graduated from

Otterbein University with an Equine Science degree and minors in English and Business, Patti worked full time at the farm collecting stallions, breeding mares, stallion handling, yearling prep, etc.

From the years 1995 through 1998 Patti co-managed a 100-acre farm in Slate Lick, PA owned by Bob and Patty Key, helping to build sheds and fences, pasture management, foaling, and yearling prep.

In 1999, Patti was employed at Perretti Farms. The farm was owned by Bill Perretti, Marty O'Hare was farm manager and Keith Feister was breeding manager.

At Perretti Farms, Patti acted as assistant manager in charge of mare and foal care, stallion collections, did record keeping and assisted the outside veterinary team at Walnridge Farm.

This highly respected and significant resume would pave the way for Patti to one day work at the nation's No. 1 standardbred horse breeding facility, Hanover Shoe Farms.

"Marty O'Hare recommended my husband and I for the position at Hanover located in Lambertville, New Jersey and we met with Jim Simpson and Dr. Jablonsky," Patti said.

From 2000 through 2012, Patti worked for Hanover's president/ CEO Simpson and Dr. Jablonsky, collecting stallions, maintaining 60 acres of property, including mowing, fence repairs, public relations, researching racing news and stallion write-ups for Hanover Shoe's website.

From 2012 through 2019, she was appointed to oversee the hiring and firing of horse caretakers, disciplinary, assistant farm Manager (under Dr. Jablonsky), payroll recording, coordinating moving horses around, collecting stallions and supervision of employees.

"Presently my job at Hanover is [during the breeding season] to tease mares, bringing mares to the breeding shed on breed days, collecting stallions on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, record keeping of mares cycles, coordinate with blacksmiths, and foal micro-chipping/freeze-branding," Patti said. "We foal everything ourselves on the main farm so we rotate the pregnant mares; a continual process until all mares to foal by June...

Once the foaling is done, focus shifts to the sales and beyond.

"After Harrisburg, plans for the upcoming breeding season are underway so I plan for weaning week and decide how the weanlings will be grouped," Patti said. "After weaning we work on booking mares and start frozen semen season by December for export which usually lasts until the end of January and then



the cycle repeats: foaling and breeding all over. It's a neverending process, but I absolutely love what I do."

Breeding season is the busiest time of the year at Hanover and all other breeding farms. Every year at Hanover they foal close to 300 mares and have eight active stallions they stand commercially at stud. The four trotters are Greenshoe, International Moni, Captain Corey, and Volume Eight. The four pacing stallions are Captaintreacherous, Tall Dark Stranger, Papi Rob Hanover and Stay Hungry.

"As of [May 1, 2024] the farm population at Hanover was 1,104," Patti said. "We have had 35 foals born since then so that brings the total to 1,139 as of May 22, 2024 and are expecting 33 more foals. Hanover Shoe Farms has 287 active broodmares, nine stallions, 222 yearlings, 10 teasing stallions, 17 retired mares and miscellaneous horses. There are also 212 outside owned horses on the farm including broodmares, yearlings, foals and retired horses."

Patti cared for some very famous horses throughout the years, but she definitely has a couple that stand out.

"My favorite horses will always be Cam's Card Shark and Western Ideal who both moved with me from the New Jersey farm," Patti said. "Sadly, Cam's Card Shark passed away in July 2020, which was extremely sad for my husband Joe and I.

"Western Ideal is now a ripe, old man. He is 29 years old and lives in a paddock next to my office. He's very sweet and has slowed down a lot but still loves 'girl watching and the foals' when he's turned out in the paddock."

No Nukes was said to be one nasty horse to work with, but Patti was able to keep things good between them.

"By the time we worked with him, No Nukes was older," Patti said. "He was still a big, powerful horse, standing 16.1 hands tall and yes, he was intimidating to say the least, but when it was time to give him his carrots, he would be accommodating, so I would keep my pockets full of carrots whenever we needed to handle him for the breeding shed.

"He had a breeding halter with rings and a chain that you would hook a pole on him to lead him. We always had to have two lines on him for collections. Otherwise, he was pretty well-behaved to groom or trim hooves."

Patti also had something to say about some of the other stallions at Hanover.

"Papi Rob Hanover and Tall Dark Stranger are both drop-dead gorgeous who stamp their foals," she said. "Volume Eight is standing his first year here and he has been getting a lot of respected, beautiful mares. Captain Corey's first crop sells this fall and they are nice, solid individual with good temperaments.

"Captaintreacherous is a classic! Stay Hungry always cracks me up for he is the class clown with a great personality. He has



steadily climbed up the stallion rankings and International Moni and Greenshoe are showing some decent 3-year-old earnings so far this year."

Patti also shared some good and sad memories from her years at the farm.

"My most memorable time was when my husband and I worked at Hanover in New Jersey," she said. "It was a great place to raise our two daughters, Emily and Sara. We had four stallions: No Nukes, Cam's Card Shark, Donerail and Western Ideal. It was so peaceful there. You could mow for hours and enjoy the wildlife and scenery. We raised our own horses there, too, and I took pride in how they turned out.

"The most heartbreaking time would have to be whenever we had to euthanize a horse. No Nukes and Cam's Card Shark are two that stand out, but there were numerous mares and foals that had to be put down and each time it's heartbreaking. When we euthanized Cam's Card Shark, he was ready, and he went quietly.

It's obvious that Patti is very proud of where she works.

"Hanover Shoe Farms is a legacy, No. 1 by progeny in earnings that has been the breeder and birthplace for many, many world champions," Patti said. "They have always been respected because they are honest, good people who want their customers to succeed. They strive for their yearlings and stallions to be the best.

"They sell their yearlings and don't compete against our customers in the racing industry and their business is to breed 'The best to the best' then present and offer the results at public auction. Some years we may take a lump at the sale, but always come back the next year with a wonderful crop."

Authors note: Some historical tidbits about the farm.

Hanover Shoe Farms is a North American standardbred horse breeding facility that traces back to the early 1900's. In 1926 the farm began to sell small consignments of yearlings and in 1928 Hanover's Bertha was the first to be sold. She went

on to set a 2-year-old trotting record of 2:02, paving the way for other Hanover future champions. such as Armbro Romance, Super Bowl, Bret Hanover, Romeo Hanover, Laverne Hanover, Ralph Hanover, Donato Hanover, Rocknroll Hanover, Delmonica Hanover, Western Hanover and many others. In more recent times added to that list are Hannelore Hanover, Bulldog Hanover, Papi Rob Hanover, Caviart Belle and the list goes on.

Taking the plunge with Hoosier Park's First Turn Stable

I've decided to take the plunge... sort of. After more than two decades covering harness racing and profiling horses and the connections behind them, I wanted to pursue a different angle. Instead of chronicling the highs and lows of a campaign as a bystander, I wanted to be more invested. Thanks to Harrah's Hoosier Park's long-running First

Turn Stable program, I'm now scratching that itch of horse ownership, albeit in a slightly different way.

Seize the Grey's storybook Preakness Stakes victory in May illuminated the benefits of fractional ownership. For the group of 2,570 shareholders that make up the 3-year-old's partnership, the Triple Crown campaign has provided the experience of a lifetime. Fractional ownership is not a new concept. The idea of splitting up shares of a horse and dividing the liability (and, fingers crossed, profits) among multiple owners can make entry into the business more palpable to some.



The shareholders approach seen with Seize the Grey has taken this model to a new level and made racing available to most people. In a previous career I worked in email marketing (yes, I was personally responsible for the junk in your inbox). For more than two years, I sat back-to-back with a co-worker involved in fractional ownership... and was never aware of this fact. It was only after overhearing a small snippet of a phone conversation that this fact came to light. I inquired, and he explained that he and his wife had shares in three runners, with hopes of buying into another after the Saratoga sale. Fractional ownership made that possible.

To their credit, the management at Hoosier Park seized upon the opportunity to engage fans and provide a unique experience when First Turn Stable was created nine years ago. The program gives individuals the chance to 'buy in' via 50 shares available in the stable at a cost of \$250 per share. Participants must be 18 years of age and Indiana residents. The track partners with a trainer, claims a conditioned horse, and away they go. I anted up by the June 1 deadline and I'm now along for the ride.

Upon joining, I learned that First Turn Stable had already acquired a horse and racing was well underway. Fast Feet, the stable's racing interest, is a gelded son of Breeders Crown and Indiana Sires Stakes champion, Freaky Feet Pete. He made five

Stable members can follow along throughout the season on First Turn's Facebook page. We receive email notifications when Fast Feet is entered, as well as after the race. Despite joining a few starts into the endeavor, I reached out to Taylor Owen, the program's coordinator, and received previous emails sent to the members. Catching up on the progress of Fast Feet, the

sophomore has raced in the non-winners of one class, finishing second his first time out for the stable followed by a pair of fifth-place efforts. He raced third on May 30 with Trace Tetrick in the bike, and the following day First Turn members received a recap. Below is a post-race summary from Ancora.

"We really can't be any happier with the effort he continues to give us each week," he said in the summary, "We thought we were going to get the cover we needed turning for home, unfortunately he got left out first over again. Trace did recommend we try



opening his bridle up a little more. Trace said 'Feet' loves to dig in and race with horses, but when he gets clear he can get a little bit lost so we may try him with cut outs in his blinkers next week to help so he can still see horses even when he clears. He keeps knocking on the door, we're hopeful things will come together soon for him!"

Through four starts, Fast Feet had earned \$2,935 for the stable, but that would soon change, as everything finally came together. In his next outing — my first as an official member of First Turn Stable — the pacer scored his first career win. Fast Feet was sent off as the favorite in a June 5 contest for non-winners of one pari-mutuel race or \$5,000 lifetime. Tetrick sent him to the front from post 4 when the wings folded, and the tandem set all the fractions on their way to winning by 2½ lengths, pacing the mile in 1:56.

I had planned to be there that night. Unfortunately, some looming deadlines in my day job kept me close to home, so I was relegated to watching the race on RTN. It wasn't the Belmont Stakes, but for a first-time owner, it was a pretty big thrill. In that moment I wished I could have joined my fellow First Turn members in the winner's circle, but I'm optimistic there will be more opportunities this summer. After five straight weeks of racing, Fast Feet receives a week off before his next start. Ancora gave the following update on the pacer's status.

"Following the win last week, we had a little bit of vet work done to Fast Feet and decided it was best to give him a week off," he said. "He jogged just a little bit sore the first day back after his race last week and we found a slight abnormality in his cannon bone. There is nothing major wrong, we just decided to treat it and following a week off he should be ready to get back in action next week!"

The victory nearly doubled what Fast Feet has earned for the group, now \$5,435 and counting. First Turn Stable members don't immediately receive purse earnings, but they aren't on the hook for a training bill or veterinary work either. We will see monthly statements on what it takes to train and care for a racehorse, but our responsibility ends there.

At season's end, Hoosier Park will tally all the costs compared against the earnings. If Fast Feet (or his replacement, should he be claimed) covers his bills and there is money left, those funds will be distributed amongst the members.

I'm looking forward to the journey ahead as the season unfolds, sharing this experience with other First Turn Stable members, and getting a small glimpse into the world of racehorse ownership.







Loving what he does drives Colin Kelly



Few embody the phrase, "If you do what you love, you'll never work a day in your life" better than Colin Kelly.

The Nova Scotia native began his driving career in his home province at age 19. Three years later, he found himself halfway across the country with nothing but a suitcase and an opportunity.

"I left home with a car full of clothes and a job lined up, but I knew nobody in the province," Kelly said. "I had just turned 22 when I moved here, and I didn't know where I was going to end up. I didn't know if I was going to be back home in 60 days, or if I was going to make a real go of it."

The answer was what he had hoped for.

Kelly, now 30, has spent the past eight years touring around the Ontario standardbred circuit as one of the sport's most consistent reinsmen.

After seeing limited action in his first season away from home, the young man from the Maritimes burst onto the scene in 2018, eclipsing previous career-best marks in starts (1,745), wins (271), and purse earnings (\$1.7 million).

Kelly has since exceeded 230 wins and \$1.5 million in five straight seasons, reaching personal bests of 278 and \$1.84 million in 2021 and 2022, respectively.

Through 543 starts this season, the horseman is on pace for yet another banner year.

"Driving's been really great," he said. "It's busy, but if you want to do something you really enjoy, you don't think of it as work.

"It's very taxing on your body and mind but I like to take a step back and think about how lucky I am that I get to do something I love"

Moments of reflection, although few and far between, have helped Kelly stay present in his 12th professional campaign.

"Time flies when you're busy," he said. "Between racing and spending time in the barn, you don't really have any time to reflect on anything because you're always thinking ahead to the next race, what has to be done tomorrow or where you have to go on Wednesday, and you don't really get a chance to appreciate everything."

Looking too far forward was something Kelly struggled with at times, especially as a neophyte driver trying to make a living in an unfamiliar place.


Kelly, now equipped with the added benefit of lived experience, harkened back to the days that sometimes felt more like a rollercoaster than a chariot ride to offer his former self a few words of advice.

"When I first started, I'd get tired and a little frustrated at times but it's not worth it," he said. "I'd remind myself to take a step back and to be grateful because not too many people get to say they actually love their job.

"There are very few people in the world that can go to work every day and say, 'I love what I do.' You should be very thankful for what you do and take everything in stride."

An unfettered mind has gone a long way in helping Kelly map out a successful career, and so too has the city he's embraced as home.

"I'm only 20 minutes from Grand River, about an hour to Georgian, and an hour and a half to Hanover," Kelly said. "I'm kind of right in the middle of everywhere. I've made Guelph home base now. I've been here seven and a half years, and it works out well that way because even in the wintertime, I'm 40 minutes to Flamboro and then an hour-twenty to London."

Pin on a map aside, the Southwestern Ontario city has been just as impactful in Kelly's life away from the oval.

Whether it's going to the gym every day to clear his mind, playing pickup hockey at the local university after driving for trainer Chantal Mitchell in the morning, or going out for a nice dinner, Guelph has everything Kelly needs.

"I don't have much time to do anything else, horse racing takes up a large portion of your time, so trying to take a step back from it when you can to appreciate the little things in life is very important to me," he said.

A well-rounded athlete growing up, Kelly also spent time on the hardwood, playing three years of high school basketball.

Kelly isn't picky when it comes to watching sports, either. As he put it, he watches just about everything.

So, when the respected horseman mentioned that he is an avid NFL fan, spotting the draw to his favourite team was simply a matter of connecting the dots.

"I'm a big football fan, unfortunately a [Denver] Broncos fan," Kelly said with a rueful laugh. "I've loved them since I was a little kid when they used to ride the horse out on the field at the start of the game."

The once wide-eyed east coast kid who left home in pursuit of a dream is now on the cusp of an accomplishment that 12 years ago would have bordered on absurdity.

Kelly is 52 firsts shy of reaching the 2,000-win milestone for his career. Not bad for someone who wasn't sure he'd make it two months.

Sitting on the verge of something spectacular, the savvy veteran remains committed to the very mindset that's helped him develop into one of the best that Ontario has to offer.

"I take everything day-by-day and try not to focus so much on the numbers because it's easy to drive yourself crazy that way,"



Kelly said. "When you start forcing things on the racetrack it doesn't exactly play to your favor.

"Drive the horse the best you can every race and the numbers will follow."

It may be too early to tell which pacer or trotter Kelly will steer across the finish line to secure the momentous achievement, but there's two, in particular, that would make the feeling that much sweeter.

Maple Shadow, a 3-year-old filly, and Gentleonmymind, a 4-year-old are both part-owned by Kelly, who shares stock in the pacers with Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Famer and childhood hero Luc Ouellette.

"As a kid, I always looked up to his drive and watched a lot of The Meadowlands when he was there," Kelly said. "He's a very good horseman and a very interesting person to be around."

Staying true to form, the selfless Kelly cast a wide net in his acknowledgement of others, both human and equine, for playing an integral role in his ongoing success.

"I've been so fortunate, and I can't thank everyone enough for everything that's happened in my life," he said. "It's been a really cool ride. You get to drive some nice horses and meet some great people. Just stay at it and do the best you can every day. That's all you can ask for.

"I get to work with some pretty amazing athletes, there's a lot of special horses out there. Whether you have a great night or a bad one, all it takes is one horse to put a big smile on your face."

The power of a horseplayer's least-common denominator, Part 3

No one expects a moment of epiphany. Yet it is in the nature of neuroscience for the human brain to experience a sudden wisdom; the kind needed to split an atom or at the least be able to tell David Copperfield how to rearrange the presidents' heads on Mount Rushmore. When it happens either way the brain blooms. Dopamine dumps come in quarter notes. You are showered in Amazing Grace.

When I was hit with the power of a horseplayer's least common denominator, I could not put it into words. Nor was I able to use an equation to create a mathematic definition. Let me explain the moment it struck me in the context of handicapping and betting on horse races. Then I will give full credit to the person — or should I say guru — who made me feel as if I was a caveman discovering fire.

Mark Cramer taught a class in handicapping horse races on the Los Angeles Community College grounds. Once in a while I joined him and we spoke to his class on the mornings before a Hollywood Park thoroughbred program. I made sure not to miss the particular class featuring a seminar by James Quinn.

His seminar was a rare public appearance. He was unlike others in my league of gentleman handicappers. Quinn was hard to find at the track. Though he dressed like the CEO of MetLife he was a loner. I only met with him twice and both times in the presence of Cramer. Though I saw him about the tracks now and then I never approached him alone because I respected his privacy as well as I had nothing more in common with him — as I did with Cramer and Meadow — than pari-mutuel play.

Quinn's books are delicious. In them he covers simple and intricate methodology. One critic wrote he "demystifies the handicapping process." For me his message was more dynamic than demystifying and during the seminar it came down to one simple product of the human mind. He was clear about many simple things important to a novice horseplayer, the audience of the seminar. But one generic definition was an epiphany for me and it made me want to jitterbug.



"Does anyone know the three elements that make a person an expert in anything?" Quinn said.

Responses were many but no one hit the motherlode. I did not offer an answer because I was apt to respond with something more like a punch line than a surge of smartness. Then he revealed the answer:

- 1. Knowledge The psychological result of perception and learning and reasoning.
- 2. Experience Skills resulting from direct participation in events or activities.
- 3. Intuition Instinctive understanding without the use of rational processes.

KABOOM!

Intuition? Of course. None of the experts gave credit to instinct. Not in their books or in their math or in their computer programs. Each of the league's eggheads taught the process of handicapping by ignoring any stitch of emotional input. They were repelled by any feeling that could not be expressed in a number.

Up until my moment of epiphany I thought they were correct in blocking notions and impressions and any emotive influence. But in the context of the other two elements making a person an expert in anything it was obvious to me that intuition contributed monstrous energy to the trio. It flavored the richness of the other two; it needed to be trusted in the same way an artist knows without thinking how to create a painting or a song or any skill. Without intuition there is only a linear explanation to anything. Without intuition the other two qualities have no depth.

Quinn also said, "How many times do you look at a race's past performances and one horse jumps out at you?"

We've all had that sensation. Quinn says we all know sometimes the message in the strange emotion demands attention; it craves attention and stays with you while the brain explains other conscious reasoning.

I was sold on Quinn's acknowledgment. It is the frog DNA completing the Jurassic Park dinosaur ingredient; it's why d'Artagnan is not a Musketeer (there must only be three); it is "a common structural and thematic element." Three wishes; Three Stooges; joke structure; little pigs; Wise Men; baseball bases... aspects of the human experience; and not numerology.


And I already knew it because the third element of expertise was cooked in all of my creative work. It kept me afloat and delivered the push I needed to craft a lyric or a sentence or a joke or anything else calling upon my knowledge and experience to partner closure. Recognizing it at last took me past the Rubicon; I was forever settled with irrevocable commitment.

And I began the process of profiting from wins and losses and embracing their common denominator. Results pending in Part 4.

There are always backstories in horse racing and movies

Imagine, if you will, the final of the Pennsylvania Sires Stake 3YO Colt Trot. You purchase a program, wager, and wait for the race. It was a fine race. You watched the race and turned the page. Ordinary people, ordinary harness racing fans, will follow this sequence of events.

However, not all people are ordinary. Some members of our harness racing tribe go deeper. They want the complete backstory. They burn to know who originally bought that champion horse, who trained the horse, the deep pedigree, the quirks in the story of this champion horse, the bidding at auction, who prepared the horse, where this winning horse trained, and what obstacles were in its path to the winner's circle. These people also want to know the details of every other trotter in the race. They are insatiable in their search for the backstory. You may be one of these harness fanatics.

A movie is much the same story. Most people view a film, give it a quick thumbs up or down, and move on. Avid cinephiles are not most people. They want to know — and understand — the whole story. When and where was this movie shot? Who were the writers, producers, screenwriters, sound editors, directors, and cinematographers? What was the funding, the budget, the profitability, the process; and so on.

People who crave backstories may never get to the bottom, but the dive is fascinating.

So it was when I viewed an obscure harness horse racing movie – Eden Valley.

After watching the docudrama, my questions were: How in the hell did this film happen? Who was responsible? What were the creators thinking? Who paid the bills? Who had the original concept? Where was it filmed? How long did the project take? Did anyone pay to see the movie? Often, the backstory of a film is more compelling than the finished product. Every movie, even movies that never are completed, has a backstory. Often, the backstories of film projects are riveting dramas.

The backstory of Eden Valley began in 1968 when a group of film and photography students at London's **Regent Street Polytechnic** School moved to **Tyneside** to document cultural, political, and economic life in **North East England**.

The creators were sometimes known as the Amber Film & Photography Collective but, more often, they were known simply as the Amber Collective. Collective is the keyword. The filmmakers, usually eight members, worked on projects as a group and shared tasks like writing, camera work, editing, preand post-production, performing, script doctoring, building sets, and making decisions by committee.

The group of filmmakers attempted to capture working-class life in England using a combination of professional and non-professional actors and crews. Few would have conceived this small band of pioneering filmmakers would evolve into possibly the most successful 'studio' — in terms of sheer longevity — in British film history.

It appears the collective made movies under challenging conditions with an arresting display of determination and passion. North East England has hardscrabble sections and rough characters. Although my mother was born and lived in this area, I have never visited. Eden Valley was my first window into what life was like there. Discovering that this area had a tradition of harness horse racing and that someone took the time and effort to document the sport in a film was astonishing.

But again, who, how, why, and when did a film on harness racing happen?

Seventeen years after their humble beginnings, Amber Films, still alive and kicking, released Seacoal, a full-length docudrama film about the harsh industrialized beach of Lynemouth, Northumberland, the coal collectors, and the residents of the Lynemouth traveler's camp. Seacoal was the product of two years of working and living alongside the locals. For a short sample of this film, click here.

The Amber Collective became very immersive with its subjects in each film. They bought a fishing boat for Fading Light, a movie about fishing in this area. While working on Seacoal, the members of the Amber team lived on the site to embed themselves with the people they wanted to film. During the making of Seacoal, the Amber collective met the Laidler family, a traveling dynasty with a passion for horses and the sport of harness racing.

The Amber crew caught the harness racing bug from the Laidlers. Amber collaborator Brian Hogg was especially afflicted with the passion for harness racing. The harness racing seed took root as the subject of a possible film project for the collective and demonstrates that one never knows where a potential harness racing fan lurks.

Over time, the basic plot of Eden Valley emerged, with Hogg taking the central role of Hoggy. The Laidler family showed the Amber team the basics of harness racing and appeared in the film. Almost a decade later, Eden Valley was a finished film that gives a realistic slice of life and an era in time for a segment of our sport. The film will stand for time without end.

Situationship is a gelding by Chapter Seven. He is trained by Svanstedt for owners Knutsson Trotting Inc., Little E LLC., and Tomas Andersson. He is two-for-two in 2024. He now has three career victories.

Wild Ticket (Dexter Dunn) notched a victory in the \$101,500 EBC second division for colts and geldings.

Wild Ticket (\$6.00) went to the front and led to the quarter in :28.1. Dame Good Time (Scott Zeron) took the lead going down the backstretch and was first to the half in :57.3. He stayed in front going around the final turn and led to three-quarters in 1:25.2.

As they made the turn for home Wild Ticket came after Dame Good Time. Dame Good Time dug in but then broke stride in deep stretch. Wild Ticket took advantage and went on by to win in a lifetime best of 1:53.2. Fly By (Jason Bartlett) was third and placed second. Dame Good Time was second and placed third.

Date Night Hanover (Dexter Dunn) was first to the quarter in :27.2 and to the half in :56.2. R Melina (Tyler Buter) then took over the top spot heading to the final turn and led to three-quarters in 1:24.

As they reached the stretch Date Night Hanover came first-up to challenge as Senorita Palema (Ake Svanstedt) slipped through on the inside, Sadbirdstillsing (Jason Bartlett) came three-wide and Honey's Sweet (\$13.40) came four-wide like he was shot out of a cannon and won in a lifetime best of 1:52. R Melina held on for second. Sadbirdstillsing finished third.

Honey's Sweet is a filly by Chapter Seven. She is owned by Crawford Farms Racing and trained by Tony Alagna. It was her second win this season and she now has five career victories.

Driver Matt Kakaley and trainer Travis Alexander combined to win both divisions of the NYSS with **Howlenthehills** and **Reggie The Fourth**. Both divisions raced for \$59,200 each.

Boston Rocks (Jason Bartlett) went to the lead in the first division

As they reached the stretch, second place finisher Boston Rocks came all out after Howlenthehills but Howlenthehills was too strong and won in a lifetime best of 1:50.1. Spring Blake (Yannick Gingras) finished third.

Howlenthehills is a gelding by American Ideal and is owned by Symmetry Stable LLC. He is five-for-five as a 3-year-old after being winless as a 2-year-old.

The glamour boys put on a speed display on Friday (June 14) at Harrah's Hoosier Park as two \$50,000 splits of Indiana Sire Stakes for the sophomore pacing colts highlighted the 14-race card. The second of eight rounds of stakes action for the pacing colts saw **Tellmeitmatters** and **Sabonis** earn the victory in their respective division.

Sent off as the 3-5 bettor's choice in the first division, driver John De Long settled Tellmeitmatters into fourth off the wings of the gate while Packedwithluck (Trace Tetrick) sped to the quarter pole in :26.1 on the lead. Tetrick tapped the brakes to the half in :55.1 when De Long had seen enough and angled

Tellmeitmatters out from fourth. The pace picked up on the final turn, with Packedwithluck bracing for the challenge at three quarters in 1:23 while Tellmeitmatters powered to the leader's wheel first-up.

Turning for home, the gauntlet was thrown down between the leaders as Tellmeitmatters powered alongside Packedwithluck. Thundering home in :25.4, Tellmeitmatters wore down a deadgame Packedwithluck to cross the wire first by a length in a career best clocking of 1:49. Martz Telly (Marvin Luna) held for the third spot, with Goodness Graycious (Mike Oosting) finishing fourth.

The homebred gelded son of Tellitlikeitis—Art Matters is trained by Roger Welch for owners William C. and William P. De Long. A winner of two of three in 2024, Tellmeitmatters has now banked \$242,550 lifetime following his sixth career victory in 13 outings.

In the second division, Sabonis looked every bit the part of a 1-9 favorite as he scored from post 6. With regular pilot Joey Putnam in the bike, Sabonis landed in the fourth position while So Into You (Atlee Bender) soared to the lead in the first turn to cut the first quarter in :26. Sabonis began his charge to the front on the backstretch, clearing to the lead just beyond the half in a blistering :54. Opening up by 2 lengths on the final turn, Sabonis steamrolled to the third-quarter station in 1:22.

The lead expanded to 4½ for Sabonis at the top of the lane as Sabonis looked to give the field the slip in the stretch.



Noblesville (John De Long) shook loose and uncorked a late rally up the passing lane in pursuit of Sabonis, but behind the strength of a :26.2 final-quarter, Sabonis held sway to hold the challenger at bay in a national season's record time for 3-year-old colt pacers of 1:48.2. Rolling Image (Trace Tetrick) rallied for third, So Into You held for fourth.

Trained by Aaron Stutzman, Sabonis has been a winner in seven of eight in 2024. The son of Tellitlikeitis—Gypsy Bellevue was bred by Karl Dean Miller and has banked \$102,950 lifetime for owner Pat Miller.

GRUESOME TWOSOME, KNOWYOUCANDO SCORE IN ISS 3YOCT

Indiana Sire Stakes continued at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Thursday (June 13), with two divisions of the second round for 3-year-old trotting colts featured on the 14-race card. Sire You Know You Do completed the stakes sweep on the night, with **Gruesome Twosome** and **Knowyoucando** each scoring in their respective divisions.

Leaving from post 3 in the field of five with trainer Daryl Bontrager doing the driving, Gruesome Twosome grabbed command early from fellow leg 1 winner Dashing Danny (Kyle Wilfong) to lead to the quarter in :28.3. The four chasers were content to allow Gruesome Twosome to have things his way on the backstretch, leading the field to the halfway point in :57.2. A pair of breakers on the far turn allowed Gruesome Twosome and Dashing Danny to lift and separate from the field on the way to three quarters, with the 4-5 co-favorites reaching that station in 1:25.4.

Turning for home, Gruesome Twosome reached the top of the lane with Dashing Danny in hot pursuit on the Bontrager helmet. Despite the homestretch headwind, Gruesome Twosome powered home in :27.3, putting distance between himself and his pursuer midway down the lane. Dashing Danny re-rallied late in the lane to reach the leader's wheel crossing the line, but victory belonged to Gruesome Twosome in a lifetime best effort of 1:53.2. Water Torpedo (Mike Oosting) completed the trifecta, with Gruesome Twosome paying \$3.60 to win.


Bontrager co-owns the son of You Know You Do—All Set Lets Go along with Ira Steinberg. Bred by Merle Yoder, Gruesome Twosome is undefeated through two starts of his sophomore campaign, having banked \$275,625 lifetime following his eighth career victory in 11 outings.

The \$49,500 second division saw Knowyoucando pull the upset, capitalizing on a pocket trip for his maiden breaking victory. Driver Atlee Bender found the pocket off the gate while Ira Who (Jared Finn) cut the :28.2 opening quarter for the field of five. The order remained unchanged to the halfway point with Ira Who taking the quintet to that point in a slowed down :58.4 before leading to three quarters unchallenged in 1:28.1.

Ira Who brought the field to the top of the stretch, before Bender tugged the right line and popped the pocket with Knowyoucando. Trotting home in :27.3, Knowyoucando powered to the lead in deep stretch to cross the wire three parts of a length in front over a hard-charging A Blue Million (Mike Peterson), Ira Who held for third. Sent off at 9-1, Knowyoucando paid \$21.40 for the victory.

Trained by Jeff Cullipher who co-owns along with Pollack Racing LLC., Knowyoucando rattled off three straight runner-up finished to begin his 3-year-old campaign before breaking through with the Sire Stakes score. Bred by Dale Wittmer and Danny Ray Graber, the gelded son of You Know You Do—Appomattox Lady has banked \$31,300 at 3 following just a lone start at age 2.

Brett Miller sweeps Ohio Sires Stakes with Volstead fillies

Brett Miller will have a tough decision to make at some point in Ohio Sires Stakes action for 3-year-old filly trotters, but he's able to put off making that choice as his luck continued Friday (June 14) at Eldorado Scioto Downs when his two hot fillies drew into separate \$65,000 divisions.

Jurassic Hattie put in a dominating performance in the first division of OHSS action, winning in 1:52.3.

Leaving from post 4 Jurassic Hattie took a big lead after Justasiam AS, who had settled in the pocket, went off-stride. Cruising through fractions of :27.2, :56.4 and 1:24.4, Jurassic Hattie won by 9½ lengths to continue her perfect win streak on the year, going 5-for-5. Butter N Syrup (Chris Lems) tracked the winner to finish second with Createaqueen (Dan Noble) finishing third.

"I can't say enough about her; she takes care of herself and race day she just goes," said her trainer, Eric Nesselroad. "She's been really sound this year; we put her behind the gate to jog her, keeps her relaxed and she's been good that way."

Jurassic Hattie is by Volstead out of the Striking Sahbra mare High Gear Sahbra. The 3-year-old filly is owned by breeder Jerry Welch. In 12 lifetime starts, she has earned \$252,334, never finishing worse than second.

"I couldn't be any happier, Eric's done a fantastic job with her and he's let her develop on her own," said Welch. "We don't know how good she is... I'm just proud that I own her."

In the second division, Legacy Affair (Sam Widger) left from the rail to lead to the opening quarter of :27.1. Midnight Nolan (Tyler Smith) sat second with the 1-9 favorite **Sugar Instead** in third. By the :56.3 half, Sugar Instead was underway to challenge Legacy Affair and took the lead by the 1:24.4 third-quarter. Sugar Instead coasted home to win by a length and three-quarters in 1:53.2. Legacy Affair was second with Roxanna (Aaron Merriman) getting up for third.

Sugar Instead is by Volstead out of the Windsong's Legacy mare Sugar Pop. Bred by Elmer Dean Miller, Sugar Instead is trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr. for Joyce Mc Clelland and Larry Wills. The filly now has \$431,425 earned in 15 lifetime starts.

FIVE DIVISIONS OF 3YOCT BUCKEYE STALLION SERIES

Five divisions of the \$20,000 Buckeye Stallion Series for 3-year-old colt trotters were also held at Scioto on Friday (June 14).

Irresistible Son (Anthony MacDonald) took an early lead in the first division, yielded to Smokitsteady (Chris Page) for the :26.4 opening quarter and quickly re-took, leading through :56.4 and 1:24.3 fractions. **Hung Over** (Miller) made a first over bid, tucked in briefly in the last turn and courageously powered past Irresistible Son to win by a half-length in 1:53.1 with Sir Maverick (Kayne Kauffman) finishing third. Hung Over is owned by Bluestone Farms & Lynda Stewart. Bob Stewart trains the son of Creatine who now has \$160,493 earned in 12 lifetime starts.

In the second division, Iwanabtheonlyone (Aaron Merriman) took the early lead but yielded to Sup (Kurt Sugg) by the :27.3 quarter. The action continued with Mr WWC (Chris Lems) making the front as the field crossed under the wire for the first time. Eventual winner **Tom Swifty** (Noble) was sitting fifth and came first up just before the :56.4 half. When I'm Gone AS (Tony Hall)

picked up the cover and drafted towards the 1:26.1 three quarters. Coming down the stretch Tom Swifty went on by to win by a length and a quarter over When I'm Gone AS; Mr WWC held on for third. Tom Swifty is owned by Norman Rae Racing and breeder Sandra Burnett. Christi Noble trains the Long Tom gelding who now has \$83,261 in earnings in 17 lifetime starts.

The eighth race Buckeye Stallion Series won by Tom Swifty was also the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association Charity Race. With the win, Home for Families took home \$10,000 to continue their mission to reduce the trauma of homelessness and empower low-income families to achieve safe and stable housing and financial independence. When I'm Gone AS earned his charity, the Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Ohio, \$5,000 with his second-place finish, while Mr WWC earned the Ohio FFA Foundation \$3,000. The rest of the charities each received \$2,000.

Trevor Smith sent **Papa Nordin** straight to the top from post 9 and led the third division of the BSS to an opening quarter of :28.2. Long Ridge (Noble) took over and led the field through fractions of :58.3 and 1:28.2. Long Ridge looked home free, but Papa Nordin went up the passing lane to sneak by and win by a head in 1:57.1 TT's Magnum Force (Sugg) made a first over bid going to the three-quarters and finished third. Papa Nordin is owned by Danny Collins, Alan Swayne, Jr., Keith Gisser and Hurley Racing. The win was the Volstead gelding's second in five seasonal starts and now has \$22,500 earned in 10 lifetime starts.

Super James (Daren Harvey) left from post 5 in the fourth division of the BSS to lead the field to the :28.4 opening panel. Pleaseandthankyou (Cameron McCown) settled in second, with 4-5 favorite **Gypsy Hill** (MacDonald) sitting third. The outer flow started to develop by the :58.1 half but when the field straightened out on the backside, Pleaseandthankyou popped the pocket to challenge the leader. Nose-to-nose by the 1:27.3 three quarters, Super James held tough to the challenge. Midway through the last turn Gypsy Hill tipped three-wide and took the momentum to win by a length in 1:56.4 over Commander Tom (Austin Hanners), who came up the passing lane to finish second. Super James held on for third. Gypsy Hill, by What The Hill, is owned by Thestable Gypsy Hill Group and Hutchison Harness. He has now earned \$89,827 in 14 lifetime starts with seven wins.

Scioto's leading driver, Jeremy Smith, took the final division of the BSS with **Zoned** for owner/trainer John Payne, also in 1:56.4. The duo got away third from the rail and let the dust settle between Flash Of Fame (Page) and Forever A Lion AS (Hall) as Flash Of Flame hit the quarter in :27.4. Hill's Espress (Sandy Beatty) started the outer flow at the :56.3 half. Zoned continued to stay along the rail at the 1:26.3 third quarter and went up the passing lane to win by a nose over a fast-closing Chipstead (Lems). Flash Of Fame held on for third. Zoned, by What The Hill, now has \$36,378 earned in 29 lifetime starts.

The 90-day 2024 Eldorado Scioto Downs race meet runs through Saturday (Sept. 14). Races are held Tuesday-Saturday with a first post of 5:45 p.m. each day, except for Thursday (July 4) with a post of 3:15 p.m. and Friday (Sept. 13) which will have a 6:15 p.m. post to help accommodate horsemen attending the Ohio Selected Yearling Sale. Perfect trip puts Nijinsky in Pepsi North America Cup winner's circle

In a race chock-full of contenders, it was Nijinsky, courtesy of a flawless journey orchestrated by Louis-Philippe Roy, who came out on top in the 41st edition of the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup on Saturday night (June 15) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Showcasing a wide-open field with no shortage of sophomore horsepower, the premier North American event for 3-year-old pacers promised plenty of drama to be played out in front of a packed house at the Milton, ON oval.


And it certainly delivered on that front.

The action began as soon as the starter car sped away, with Funtime Bayama grabbing the early lead, followed by Captain Albano, Captain Luke and slight 5-2 choice Captains Quarters.

It got more compelling after Funtime Bayama carved out an opening quarter in :26.1, as Captain Albano sped to the front, only to be passed by Captains Quarters. Nijinsky was seventh but travelling comfortably with a patient Roy at the controls.

Jody Jamieson had Captains Quarters on top by 1½ lengths through a half in :54.1, followed by Captain Albano, Funtime Bayama, and Legendary Hanover, who announced his presence from in fourth.

Heading into the turn for home, Captains Quarters, a length clear through three quarters in 1:21.2, was still calling the shots as Legendary Hanover looked to reel in his rival. Captain Albano was third, but a hard-charging Nijinsky arrived on the scene and was rolling mid-way down the lane.

Captains Quarters dug in gamely to the inside, but Nijinsky had the momentum and went on to notch a 1½-length win in a lifetime-best mark of 1:48.1. Funtime Bayama, who had been locked-in at the rail, re-rallied to finish third. Captain Albano was fourth.

"[The trip] worked really well," said Roy, who won his first Cup in his fourth appearance. "I have to give credit to the horse himself. You can do whatever you want, and he'll respond to you any time in the mile. He's just so easy to drive.

"I knew coming down the lane. I didn't know how much Jody had left, but I really liked my chances there. I knew coming off the helmet, he would give me a pretty good kick."

It was the fifth win in as many starts this year for the bay colt trained by Tony Beaton for the ownership group of West Wins

Afterward, Roy hugged Nijinsky's co-owner and (now) three-time NA Cup winner Casie Coleman while trainer Tony Beaton looked on.

Stable (Casie Coleman and Ross and Margaret Warriner), John Fielding, and Mark Dumain.

As a 2-year-old, Nijinsky, who was runner-up in two Ontario Sires Stakes Gold divisions, went 1-2-3 from 10 starts, accompanied by \$99,862 in purse earnings.

"He was a very nice colt last year," said first-time Cup winner Beaton, who spent 10 seasons as assistant trainer to Coleman. "He just had a little immaturity and that, but he was always showing these high speeds at the end of the miles.

"This year, he came back and he's so much more mature... You could just do anything with him, and he's still got that high speed."

Nijinsky, a son of Bettors Delight—Pirouette Hanover was a \$120,000 purchase at the 2022 Harrisburg Yearling Sale. The colt was bred by Jeffrey Snyder, the man that holds the record for the most NA Cup wins by an owner with four: Cams Card Shark in 1994, Red River Hanover in 2002, Rocknroll Hanover in 2005 and Well Said in 2009.

Nijinsky's win also marked the third NA Cup triumph for Coleman. She trained and co-owned 2010 winner Sportswriter and 2016 winning Betting Line.

Nijinsky, the 5-2 second choice, paid \$7.90 for the win. He was sold as a yearling for \$120,000 at the 2022 Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in Harrisburg, PA.

Beaton's other Cup trainee, Legendary Hanover, finished fifth.

Driver Tim Tetrick positioned **Call Me Goo** off the speed and caught a covered ride to vault effortlessly by 1-5 favorite M-M's Dream in the stretch and win the \$233,000 Armbro Flight final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday (June 15).

Leaving from post 5, Tetrick floated Call Me Goo off the wings and landed in fifth just behind M-M's Dream to a :26.4 first quarter clicked by post-10 starter Tipsy Moni. Tipsy Moni, clearing Tactical Mounds for the point, then managed to slow the tempo up the backside to a :56 half as M-M's Dream waited until the final turn to make a move.

Once M-M's Dream was pulled off the pegs, Call Me Goo had cover to the final turn but found herself third over when Chake swiftly angled outside to make a charge after Tipsy Moni. Chake drew alongside her tempo-setting stablemate by three-quarters in 1:23.3 and slid to the lead while M-M's Dream and Call Me Goo fanned wider for open racetrack. M-M's Dream gathered momentum and began inching forward, though Call Me Goo furiously hit the center of the track with a menacing challenge to the favorite. Tetrick simply worked to keep Call Me Goo straight as she barreled forward in the late stages and edged away to a half-length win in 1:51.2. M-M's Dream settled for second, Chake took third and Tactical Mounds wove around horses for fourth.

"When she's on a helmet, she's perfect," Tetrick said after the race. "But when you give her half a cue, she wants to take all of it. She's really nice to drive until she gets free lane [because] she wants to go real fast.

"I wanted to be able to trip her out, put her on a helmet, because I think she's really good off a helmet. Just the last couple of weeks we haven't been able to do it because of circumstances. She still got the job done both times, [she]

Call Me Goo, a 4-year-old daughter of Googoo Gaagaa—Callmemza, collected her fourth win from five starts this season and her 20th win from 28 starts in her career, good for \$619,959 in earnings. Jason Skinner trains the hallmark mare of his barn for owner Graham Grace Stables LLC.

"She's by far the best I've ever trained," Skinner said after the race. "She's put me on the Grand Circuit. I've been here a couple of times, but never with a dominant horse like her. She's definitely the best one."

Sent off as the second choice in the betting, Call Me Goo paid \$8.70 to win.

Highland Kismet, with Bob McClure in the race bike, stamped himself as a superstar-in-the-making courtesy of a stupendous score in the \$225,000 Goodtimes Stakes on Saturday evening (June 15) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Sent on his way as the 2-5 choice in the final, Highland Kismet arrived at his latest test off a polished 1¾-length winning performance in his elimination last week at the Milton, ON oval.

On Saturday, he took things to a whole new level.

It was an early scramble as Top Mast, Private Access, and Shermont battled into the first turn, while Highland Kismet was fanned nearly four wide.

Top Mast led the pack through an opening panel in :27.2, but Highland Kismet, in fourth, was given his cue by McClure and the son of Father Patrick—Highland Top Hill responded by seizing command shortly before the half in :55.3.

Private Access, the second choice on the board at 6-1, came calling on the leader soon after and then turned up the pressure into the turn for home.

Highland Kismet, a neck on top after three quarters in 1:24.4, fended off his foe and then strolled away from his pursuers with ease down the lane.

McClure sat chilly in the sulky as the bay colt stormed home in :26.4 to post a 31⁄4-length win over Private Access. Top Mast was third. The final time was a stakes-equaling and personal-best mark of 1:51.3.

"He's two fingers to drive," said McClure. "You can start him up, shut him down. I didn't mind. I was fully intending to half-miss the gate because I knew all the outside speed was going to be pushing so I wasn't worried about them dropping in front of me.

"This colt, super, super stepped up, and I couldn't believe how big a kick he had coming home, and how easy he did it, and how great he's been."

Unraced at 2, the Mark Etsell trainee was a two-length winner in 1:54.4 in his May 2 debut. Scratched out of his next start, Highland Kismet returned on May 23, just missing top spot by a head.

One week later, he was back on the winning track courtesy of a 51/4-length victory in 1:53.1.

"He's come a long way quickly," said Etsell. "He's been a bit of a surprise, actually."

Added McClure, "He was a real troubled 2-year-old. He had a lot of trouble with his gait, and you wouldn't know it now with the job that Mark has done with him. He's perfect."

Bred and owned by Highland Thoroughbred Frm of Ingersoll, ON, Highland Kismet paid \$2.90 for his Goodtimes victory.

The race presentation was made by John Bax, who campaigned world champion and Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee Goodtimes to a 50-win career and over \$2.2 million in lifetime earnings.

In rein to James MacDonald, the son of Betting Line—Lillian Hanover paced the mile in a lively 1:47.2.

"I was able to slip out at top of the stretch," said MacDonald. "And the horse is just... he's an amazing animal. He's had a couple tough trips this year, and he just bounces back like a pro. That's what great horses do."

Trained by Anthony Beaton for owners West Wins Stable, McKinlay and Fielding, and Mac Nichol, the 6-year-old bay gelding is now 18-8-7 from 44 starts, to go along with over \$800,000 in lifetime earnings.

A half-brother to North America Cup starter Legendary Hanover, Linedrive Hanover paid \$23 for the win.

Once Dexter Dunn got **Twin B Joe Fresh** rolling for the lead, her peers could mount no fight as she registered a geared-down 1:48 win in the \$305,000 Roses Are Red final on Saturday (June 15) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Dunn floated Twin B Joe Fresh out of post 4 into fourth and sat unhurried through a :26.2 first quarter cut by Tells On A Roll. But as Silver Label popped the pocket

and Always B Naughty followed overland out of third, Dunn tipped Twin B Joe Fresh into the flow up the backside and exited the shuffle on the point after a :54.2 half.

Twin B Joe Fresh stayed on the throttle through the final turn under no encouragement from Dunn and clicked by three-quarters in 1:21.2 before lifting flight for home. Opening several lengths in the sprint for the finish, Dunn coasted to the line in parallel with the ground keeping Twin B Joe Fresh under a grip to a 1¼-length win. Sylvia Hanover surged from a first-over trip in the back half to take second with Always B Naughty settling for third and Tells On A Roll taking fourth.

"She's such an easy mare to drive, so we just got away in a good spot," Dunn said. "Once Sylvia [Hanover] got on my back I thought to follow Louis [Roy and Always B Naughty] to the front; I didn't want to give Sylvia a tow up. She just felt great. She cruised down the lane pretty strong tonight."

"The horse does the talking," trainer Chris Ryder said. "She's just a powerhouse, she's got natural speed and she can carry it. I'm just lucky to have her. I came across her and got her, and all the credit goes to her. She's just got the goods."

A 4-year-old daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze bred by Brittany Farms, Twin B Joe Fresh has now won three races from four starts this season and 22 races from 31 starts in her career, banking \$1,698,923 for owners Chris Ryder, Dexter Dunn, Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak. She paid \$3.10 to win.



Dave Menary trainee **Its A Love Thing** sustained through a first-over push and forged forward in the homestretch to win the \$425,000 Fan Hanover on Saturday (June 15) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, tying the stakes, track and Canadian record with a 1:48.2 mile.

Its A Love Thing landed in fifth from the pylon post through a :26.3 first quarter as even-money favorite Geocentric powered forward to take command from My Girl EJ. Geocentric coasted up the backside to a :54.4 half while James MacDonald was forced to send Its A Love Thing uncovered on the rim to the final turn.

Despite getting caught first over, Its A Love Thing persisted against Geocentric to three-quarters in 1:22 and thrusted to the lead when the favorite came up empty for home. Caviart Belle tipped to the center of the track off her second-over tow and aimed at Its A Love Thing late and in futile chase as she muscled by the beam a length in front. My Girl EJ kicked into action late for third and Canigetalouploup rallied through a seam at the pylons for fourth.

"Obviously [the trip] wasn't how we drew it up but it's a horse race and you just have to wait and see how things go," MacDonald said. "I'm just lucky that Dave [Menary] and his crew had her amazing tonight. She was able to overcome a bad trip and showed what kind of a horse she is."

"I was just hoping she didn't get away too far back," Menary said. "She's a big filly to try and push through from the rail, and I figured there would be outside leavers. So I just left it up to James – as long as she doesn't get pinned. She did all the work tonight and went right on by."

A daughter of Bettors Delight—Love For Sail, Its A Love Thing won her third race from five starts this season and her ninth from 17 overall, earning \$928,906 for owners Eric Good, Thomas Biederman, Josh Green and Rich Lombardo Racing LLC. Sent off as the third choice in the betting, she paid \$10 to win.

The 1:48.2 mile paced by Its A Love Thing equaled the stakes, track and Canadian record established by American Jewel in 2012 and matched by Sylvia Hanover last year.



MacDonald doubles up in Graduate at Big M

James MacDonald is the two-time defending O'Brien Award-winning Driver of the Year in Canada, but Friday night (June 14) at The Meadowlands, the 38-year-old pilot proved he can travel south and still do quite well, as he guided the winners of two of the four \$50,000 divisions of the second leg of the Graduate Series for 4-year-olds.

MacDonald scored in the first of two trots with the Nancy Takter-trained **Hasty Bid** (a gelded son of My MVP—Sunshinenlollipops), who scooted up the inside late after a pocket trip to best 2-5 favorite Special Way by 1½ lengths in a lifetime-best 1:51.3.

"He's been a good horse his whole life," said MacDonald. "His first two starts this year were probably the worst two of his life. We sent him down to Nancy and they said they wanted to try him barefoot. Nancy did a great job and the horse was phenomenal tonight."

Hasty Bid raised his lifetime bankroll to \$445,000 after winning for the fifth time in 26 lifetime outings. As the 6-1 fourth choice in the betting, he returned \$14.60 to his backers.

Currently the leading driver at Mohawk with 174 wins, MacDonald scored his second Big M victory of the night — and the year — with 8-5 second choice **Coach Stefanos** in the second of two dashes on the pace.

"When you get to sit behind power like that, it makes things pretty easy," said MacDonald. "We were lucky tonight. We had him in a good spot. I know what he's capable of. It was set up and he knew what to do."

After getting a live tow from Command to three-quarters, Coach Stefanos (a gelding by Tellitlikeitis — Watch N Be Watched) tipped off that cover in the straightaway and rolled to a three-quarter-length win over a hard-charging Voukefalas in a lifetime-best 1:47.3. Seven Colors, the 3-2 favorite, led to the top of the stretch before wilting to fifth.

The Erv Miller-trained Coach Stefanos now has 16 wins from just 33 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$846,731. He returned \$5.20 to win.

The first pacing event went to 29-1 longshot **No Control** (a gelded son of Control The Moment—Dani Hanover) for driver Jordan Stratton and trainer Tan Micallef in a lifetime-best 1:47.3.

After an alert getaway led to a pocket trip, Stratton had more than enough horse late to overtake leader Christchurch, who ended up fourth, and more than enough horse to hold off a late-charging Seafire by a half-length. Huntinthelastdolar, the 6-5 favorite, finished third.

"I think he was getting overlooked on the board," said Stratton. "He went parked in the Juravinski [when fifth as the 8-5 public choice]. He's really fast off the wings. The fractions [:26.4,:54, 1:21.1] were fast, and it worked out. He was really good. I'm just thrilled."

No Control is now nine-for-19 lifetime and has earnings of \$182,807. He returned \$60 to win.

The least surprising result of the night came in the second division for trotters as the Takter-schooled **Winner's Bet** scored as the 1-5 chalk in a lifetime-best 1:50. The son of Walner—Side Bet Hanover picked up a perfect second-over tow from 22-1 outsider Black Magic and rolled by his foes to record a 1½-length score over a stubborn, speedy Ponda Jet, who led from the quarter to the stretch.

Takter's tactic of racing in the Graduate after three winning qualifiers paid off perfectly.

"He's a really nice horse, I expected him to race well," said Takter, who had 16 wins from just 37 Big M starts at the start of the night. "I knew he had a good mile in him, but maybe not 1:50 over a track rated 'good.' He's become really versatile. [Driver] Dexter [Dunn] gave him a great trip. It couldn't have worked out any better."

After winning for the seventh time from 21 career starts, Winner's Bet, who returned \$2.60 to win, upped his lifetime earnings to \$602,967.

TIME AFTER TIME: The 1:47.3 clockings by Coach Stefanos and No Control have the twosome tied for the fastest mile of the year at The Big M.

Winner's Bet's mile time of 1:50 tied Jiggy Jog S and Lexus Kody atop the leaderboard for the fastest mile of the year in the sport on the trot, with all three coming at The Meadowlands. In addition, Winner's Bet is now tied with Six Pack (2019) for the fastest mile in track history for a 4-year-old horse.

A LITTLE MORE: The Joe Holloway-trained **Nuclear** (a 3-year-old son of Always B Miki—Can'tgetenuffofyou) sparkled in his seasonal debut, popping out of the pocket to score in a conditioned event in 1:48.4. The gelding is Meadowlands Pace eligible. All-source handle on the 15-race card totaled \$2,688,289.

Breakfast with the Babies, 2024 edition, sponsored by Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms, caught another perfect Saturday morning (June 15). The sky was clear, temperatures in the 70s and track fast when the baby races began at 9:00 a.m.

Deja Blu, first foal of the great race mare Atlanta by Muscle Hill, made her debut in race 10 and rallied late to be third for owner/breeder Crawford Farms and partner Tom Pontone, trainer Nancy Takter and Yannick Gingras, trotting home in 28 seconds while gaining ground on the winner, **Swoop** (Tim Tetrick) who ended the 1:59 mile in :28.1. On The Radio (David Miller) was second.

Swoop is by Walner, owned by trainer Lucas Wallin along with partners Sbrocco, JAF Racing, Harbor Racing and Van Camp Trotting. She was an \$80,000 (LEX) yearling, bought from breeders Steve Stewart and Michael Andrew.

The potent team of Takter and Gingras took the opener with the Downbytheseaside filly **Sea Her Rule**, a homebred owned by the 3rd Floor Stables, LLC. Held back early, Sea Her Rule caught a second over tow in the short field, fanned and went by on her own over Caviart Rose (Todd McCarthy) for a 1:57.3 win.

Bella Vita (Tetrick) rolled up uncovered and wore down a stubborn Odds On Dr J (Scott Zeron) through a 28 second end to the 1:56.3 mile. The Huntsville filly is another homebred and is owned by V. Louis Chianca, Karen Williams and Beverly Schiffman and is trained by Bruce Saunders.

Tetrick came right back with the \$250,000 (LEX) Captaintreacherous colt **Fallout** to win in 1:55.4, sprinting home in :27.2 and demonstrating nifty balance when he took a cautionary few steps out mid-stretch but never lost his momentum while sailing by. Luminary (Andy McCarthy) rallied up late for the place. The winner is a Brittany Farms bred, owned by Rob Leblanc, Pryde Stables and Caviart Farms. Tony Alagna trains.

It was natural hat trick time for Tetrick as he sent **Manolete** right to the front, rolled through easy numbers then outsprinted his rivals with a :27 flat end to the 1:56.1 mile, also the second on the day for trainer Bruce Saunders. Papis Pistol (Dave Miller) rallied impressively late for second. The winner is a product of the first crop of Cattlewash, who has impressed thus far with several sharp looking individuals preparing for the upcoming New Jersey Sires Stakes. Manolete was a \$52,000 Harrisburg (HBG) purchase for M&L of Delaware and M&M Harness Racing and bred by The OK Corral.

Smoken Bob (Zeron) was a 1:57.1 winner after a close-up trip, wearing down Knockout Round (Anibal Borjas) in the shadow of the wire. Linda Toscano trains for Kenny Jacobs who paid \$80,000 (HBG) for the Hanover bred Sweet Lou colt.

The Tony Alagna stable sent out another winner on the day when Andy McCarthy sent **Caviart Delight** through an opening inside stablemate Be My Princess A (T. McCarthy) through a :27.3 end to the 1:57.1 mile. The Caviart Farms bred Always B Miki filly went through Harrisburg for \$45,000 and they took on trainer Alagna as a partner.

Alagna and A. McCarthy came right back with the Walner filly **Tagalong**, who led all the way under a firm grip and had plenty late, ending the 1:59.1 win with a 29 second final stanza. Get It All (Dexter Dunn) followed the winner throughout and held sway for second, though no match. The Brittany Farms bred brought a winning bid of \$65,000 (LEX) from Rob Leblanc, Grant & Pryde Stables, Coyote Wynd Farms and Odds On Racing.

Spicy Nice, a Tactical Landing from the top race mare Maven, roared down the stretch for Gingras through a :28.3 final quarter

to get the 1:58.2 win. Takter trains for Morrison Racing and John Fielding. Fielding also gets a breeder's credit along with Irv Liverman and Joyce McClelland who put her through the Lexington sale for a price of \$135,000.

Wallies Dolly (A. McCarthy), Alagna and A. McCarthy's third of the day, is another expensive (\$210,000) Walner filly who put up all the numbers then sprinted home in :28.4 to hold of the closing Margareta Hanover (Dunn) at bay. Kenny Jacobs owns the winner, who was bred by Carter Duer.

Green Manalishi had his first U.S. winner as **Galen Erso** (Mattias Melander) inherited the lead when stablemate Sky Legacy broke and trotted through the wire for a 1:58.3 - :29-win over a closing Kentucky Colonel (T. McCarthy). Galen Erso is a true homebred by Marcus Melander who raced the sire and raised this successful son on Grange.

The Melander barn came right back with the Muscle Hill colt **Go Boom** (Dunn) who sat up close throughout, avoided a few breakers then closed stoutly into the :28.1 end to the 1:58.3 mile over Camera Man (Ake Svanstedt). Windsong Stable bred the winner, a \$220,000 Harrisburg purchase by AMG Stable, Mantorp, Heights Stable and Fredrik Nielsen.

Mr Walner Fashion (T. McCarthy) turned in the fastest trot of the day when he closed wide to track down Civilian Drone (Gingras) in 1:56.4. Jim Campbell trains this homebred son of Walner, the sire's fourth winner on the card, for his longtime client and gracious sponsor of BWTB, Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms.

Ocean Downs announces summer late closers

Ocean Downs will offer a quartet of late-closing series — two for 2-year-olds and two for claiming pacers — through the balance of its 2024 meeting.

The Bucky Gray, Jr. Memorial Pace and the Tom Cooke Memorial Trot are open to 2-year-olds (Maryland Sire Stakes or Race Fundeligible horses preferred) and will span July. Both series consist of \$7,500 and \$8,500 preliminary legs leading to a \$12,500-added final. Nominations, accompanied by a \$100 fee per horse, are due to the Ocean Downs race office by July 1 for the Gray and July 2 for the Cooke.

Two claiming series are slated for the second half of the meet. The Diane 'Mum' Stevenson Memorial, for horses with a base claiming price of \$7,500, spans July 11 through Aug. 8; while the David Hill III Memorial, for horses with a base claiming price of \$10,000, will take place from Aug. 15 through Sept. 5. Both series offer three preliminary legs and a final, with progressively higher purses and claiming prices in each leg. To take part in these series, horsepeople must pay a \$250 declaration fee in conjunction with a given horse's first start in the series; no nomination prior to entry is necessary.
