Pace preps, please

With the 3-year-old open at The Big M rarely filling, trainers of top sophomores are having trouble finding prep races for their star pupils heading into the Meadowlands Pace.

With three weeks until the Meadowlands Pace eliminations, the top contenders are focused on finding prep races.

Most expected their Pace path would go through Canada, but with the Somebeachsomewhere and North America Cup rescheduled to later in the year, trainers are left scrambling.

"I'd just like to get raced," said Hall of Famer Joe Holloway, trainer of Perfect Sting.

Holloway has been looking for starts for his 2020 Dan Patch 2-year-old colt champ, but has not had much luck.

Perfect Sting's only 2021 start came on May 16 in a Pennsylvania Sire Stake (PASS) where he finished second to Abuckabett Hanover. He was scheduled to race again the following week in a PASS event but was scratched sick. He was last seen qualifying at The Big M in 1:48.4 on June 5.

Ideally, Holloway wanted to compete at The Meadowlands against his own division, but those open races rarely fill.

"I went back and looked at 2019 and 2020, and in the 3-year-old pacing colt category, the number of entries topped out at two," said Scott Warren, Meadowlands' race secretary. "It's not like it's something new where a race is not filling for a top pacer going into The Meadowlands Pace.

"Look at last year. Tall Dark Stranger [in his] first start had to go in non-winners of \$22,500 against [older foes] and he beat them. Ideally, even though he won – and won impressively – that wasn't probably the ideal spot that [trainer] Nancy [Takter] wanted to be in. But she had to have a race in him."

Holloway finds himself in a similar position this year taking on older horses Saturday night (June 19) in a N/W \$12,500.

"I really didn't want older horses but this is the best-case scenario," said Holloway. "There were only two entries in the 3-year-old open and I called people [Monday night] trying [to get more to drop in]."

In his first start last year, Tall Dark Stranger went 1:47.4 on June 27 and his next outing was in The Pace elims on July 11. No 3-year-old has gone that fast this year.

"It's different to race against older horses, because there's not as much of a breather in the races as there is maybe with 3-year-olds," said Takter. "And just the switch of speed is different because those horses are more mature and able to switch gears quicker than maybe a 3-year-old would be able to. For Joe, I'm sure it's not an ideal situation, but it is what it is. It's the curse of having a good 2-year-old year.

"Perfect Sting had a good qualifier and he went a fast time but everybody has to remember that qualifiers and races, you can't compare them, because a qualifier is more like a training mile. You never get pushed to the quarter. You never get held out. And you're rating and dictating your own mile in a qualifier, especially when you get to the front like Perfect Sting did."

Trainer Ron Burke's Southwind Gendry was the other colt who dropped into the open, but rather than going up against older competition as well as Perfect Sting, Burke will qualify him tomorrow morning at The Meadowlands and then race in a PASS event on June 26 where he could possibly face Perfect Sting.

"I don't race for experience. I race to win," said Burke. "If I beat [Perfect Sting] I want to beat him going for a million, I don't want to try and race him going for \$30,000 or whatever."

Takter's Always A Miki took on older competition at Harrah's Philadelphia on Sunday (June 13) and got up by a neck in a gutsy performance.

"That's a little bit of the problem with these horses that have good 2-year-old seasons and they have a lot of wins and a lot of money on their cards because you really don't have anywhere to race them unless you have a stakes race," said Takter. "If you want to find them a tightener race you have to go against older horses because the 3-year-old races don't fill.

"At this point I think everybody wants to play a little bit of chess. You want to give your horse a good mile but you don't want to burn your horse up too much, you want to leave a little bit in reserve all the time when they race now."

Burke has never had a problem racing a 3-year-old against older

competition, and in fact, did so with his 3-year-old filly pacer Blue Diamond Eyes last Saturday (June 12) at The Meadowlands.

"She did fine. It depends on the horse," said Burke. "They don't make each other check their birth certificates behind the gate, so I don't really stress about s - - - as much as other people do. I worry about my horses, not what everybody else's horses are."

Burke's Summa Cum Laude, Takter's One Eight Hundred as well as Hellabalou for trainer Eddie Dennis, all featured in Dave Little's "Road to The Meadowlands Pace", will meet three Pace

eligibles and four ineligibles in a conditioned race for 3-year-olds tomorrow night at The Big M. Blue Diamond Eyes is also on that card in an open for 3-year-old fillies.

"Right now, I'm happy," said Burke. "Everybody's going the right way instead of the wrong way. When we get close, I'll have these things tight enough. I won't get beat for lack of being fit.

"I did learn that I can race them a lot harder than I thought. Last year, I decided I needed to make up a lot of money and I just entered them in every race that they were eligible to and my horses were just as good at the beginning of the year as they were at the end of the year. I think we've gotten too much into babying them and turning them into thoroughbreds. They're not thoroughbreds. These are standardbreds. I used to race Foiled [Again] 40 times in a year and he made it clear to 14."

Amanda Shaw's first training win was cause for reflection

A pair of thoughts crossed Amanda's Shaw mind as she posed for the win picture at The Meadows on June 3.

Moments after Onlythetuffsurvive, a 9-year-old son of A Stud Named Sue, crossed the wire a 2 ½-length winner in race five, Shaw flashed a big smile alongside her husband, trainer Jason Shaw, their daughter, Aria, and the connections of the veteran pacer.

Sent off as the 3-5 favorite, the bay gelding, owned by the couple's son, Mason, held a two-length lead at the stretch call and easily fended off his rivals to notch his 41st career victory in a time of 1:52.2.

It was a far smoother journey than the one he encountered in his previous race on May 28, also at The Meadows.

"The week before, the horse had a tough trip. He ended up being pulled first-up and he was hung the rest of the mile and finished fifth. He still had a good effort, but I wasn't sure what to expect this time. He got away in the two-hole and he was a lot stronger than I thought he would be when he pulled him out. I was just hoping he would get there and he wouldn't stop. He just kept going."

And Shaw's voice kept reaching higher decibel levels.

"I'm pretty vocal when all my horses are racing. People laugh at me and think I'm crazy, but if you're not passionate about it, then you shouldn't be in racing."

It represented the first career training win for Shaw, a moment she had long dreamt of.

"I thought of two important things to me," said the Pennsylvaniaborn horsewoman. "One, being that I proved to myself that I could do it on my own, and the second thought that came to me on the way over to the winner's circle was that I hoped I made my mom and grandpa proud."

She no doubt delivered on both.

There was, however, one regret.

"I wish my Mason could have been there, but he had school. Otherwise, it was a great moment, something that I will always remember. We had a couple of other horses that day, so I just focused on them after that. We ended up going out for dinner as a family the next night, a nice chance to celebrate together."

Shaw, who can trace her family connection to horses to the 1950s, was destined to find her way to the racetrack. Her mother, Lisa Beinhauer, started her career at the fairs at 16 and went on to head her own stable for several years.

Married to fellow trainer Jason Shaw – the couple first met when they were 16 – Amanda, a fourth generation horseperson, worked as an assistant to her husband before making the decision branch out on her own this year.

One of her biggest joys is in sharing her love of the sport and the animals with her children.

"Having that chance for them to be part of this world, it's very important to me. There are a lot of industries and businesses where that opportunity isn't available, so we're pretty lucky. This is a family business. The kids will come to work with me, we travel to the fairs together, horse sales – wherever I'm going, they are going. Mason, sometimes he loves it and sometimes he doesn't. Aria, she loves giving the horses hugs and petting them. Both of them pretty interested."

Shaw views the times her kids are around the barn and seeing first-hand what their parents do as a seemingly endless educational experience.

There are life lessons to be learned as well.

"They really do learn something every time they are at the barn. It teaches them the value of hard work and what you get out of it. That's important. A lot of kids these days don't understand that. You won't go anywhere if you don't put in the time and effort. It's not just handed to you. You have to work for it."

Shaw has heeded those words for as long as she can recall.

She's hopeful the commitment to her craft leads to bigger successes in the days and years ahead.

"I don't really know what my short-term goal would be. We just purchased a baby, a 2-year-old at the Harrisburg Sale. We bid on her online. My husband wasn't interested in working with the babies any more – that's all we used to do when we did the Pennsylvania fair circuit – because we've gotten away from that over the past few years."

Early on, Shaw figured she'd be in for a rough ride with the new addition to her stable.

"So, I bought this filly, Judge Joy Bean, and she was kind of difficult early on. She didn't want to pace and cross-fired all the time. She would take her shoe off and lost a shoe every time we jogged her."

A bay daughter of Western Ideal, owned by Mason and Aria, the \$8,000 purchase had her first qualifier on June 8 at The Meadows, crossing the wire in 2:01.1.

"She is starting to coming around. She's a pretty big filly. We hope she could be Stallion Series material, but time will tell. Even if that doesn't happen, we'll get her to some of the fairs and race her there."

Currently, Onlythetuffsurvive and Judge Joy Bean are Shaw's only trainees. But her days are full with tending to the nine horses Jason has as well, leaving her one short of dozen horses that are under her care.

Is it as simple as the husband and wife that races together stays together?

"Sometimes," she said with a laugh. "I feel like if you can manage racing horses together and be around each other almost the entire day, you can handle almost anything."

And as Shaw proved to herself, she can also achieve a longheld goal.

"Winning a race as a trainer, it's something that I had always hoped would come and when it did, it was a really amazing feeling. Hopefully, there are even more of those moments to come."

Hamre dominated in Oslo

Norwegian trainer and driver Frode Hamre dominated the \$133,100 Oslo Grand Prix over 1.3 miles at Bjerke racetrack on Sunday (June 13) afternoon.

Hamre sat behind Bill's Man and from post 1 behind the gate the duo kept the front position. The first half mile was tough for Bill's Man. The pace was high and before the final lap, stablemate Ble du Gers (Quinoa du Gers) connected on the outside of the leader.

The high pace left its mark on Bill's Man, who was beaten at the top of the stretch. Instead, Ble du Bers cruised to an easy win in a moderate mile rate of 1:56.3 for driver Åsbjörn Tengsareid.

Bill's Man held strongly as runner up ahead of Dragster.

"My horses performed very well. I had some expectations ahead of the race and the outcome became better than I thought. I know that Ble du Gers is a tough horse when he's on the outside of the leader and the hard opening for Bill's Man was too much for him today," said Hamre after the victory.

Top race in Finland

The \$195,000 Kymi GP in Kouvola, Finland is on the European schedule this Saturday (June 19) with a post time of 5:45 PM (CET).

Kouvola has attracted many interesting trotters to the race this year and the big star of the event is French super mare Delia du Pommereux, who, among other victories, won the Paralympiatravet at Åby in May.

Open story in Boden

Frederick Bourgault appeal dismissed by Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel

Trainer penalized with \$2,500 fine and 45-day full suspension, plus conditions on license

Racing is increasingly under scrutiny as the general public condemns actual or perceived animal abuse. When the Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel (HRAP) heard the appeal of trainer Frederick Bourgault last month, testimony was sometimes disturbing enough to provoke the question: If the racing community accepts such treatment of a racehorse as normal, how long will the sport survive?

The background: On Feb. 1, 2020, Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) judges imposed strict conditions on Bourgault. They ruled he should serve a 45-day full suspension running Feb. 17-April 1, 2020 (inclusive) and be fined \$2,500, plus have conditions on his license for one year. This was in relation to the 23-year-old trainer's aggression toward Sunny Billion after the pacer finished fifth at The Raceway at Western Fair Dec. 2, 2019. Judges determined Bourgault's actions were "misconduct prejudicial to the best interest of racing by committing an act of cruelty."

On Feb. 11, 2020, Bourgault filed a notice of appeal, requesting stays of rulings against him. On Feb. 14, the HRAP Registrar initially opposed his request. The HRAP requested submissions from both sides, then allowed Bourgault the stays on Feb. 18. At that time, HRAP Chair Stanley Sadinsky found that if stays weren't granted and Bourgault was punished while awaiting hearing, "he will likely suffer the reputational stigma of being penalized for cruelty to a horse, notwithstanding a final determination of the matter."

Originally, Sadinsky ruled for the appeal hearing to be set within 30 days. On March 11, 2020, the HRAP issued a notice of hearing, with Bourgault's appeal set to start May 26, 2020. It was effectively postponed for almost a year.

May 4, 2021 was the first day of Bourgault's appeal hearing. Western Fair Raceway manager Greg Gangle, track veterinarian Dr. Chris Robson, and paddock judge Leslie Jackson described observations from Dec. 2, 2019, but none of them had witnessed what others would describe in their accounts of what transpired between Bourgault and Sunny Billion.

Day two, horseman Mark Horner answered questions about what he saw on the night in question. He stated that when he was

leaving the track after race 3, "Freddy was hitting the horse with the headpole" ahead of Horner's horse on the ramp to the paddock. He described Bourgault's two-handed action as "like a crosscheck." Horner said he was "kind of in disbelief" as he watched "the action of the headpole going up and down" for "at least three hits" on the gelding's neck.

Horner testified he later "heard something" in the paddock that sounded "like thrashing." He recalled quickly saying something to paddock judge Jackson, then moving on to other race-night obligations. Contacted later by investigators, the trainer/driver reported that although he was "just guessing" what he'd heard, it sounded like "the horse was getting body-slammed against the walls."

William Leon was the second witness to appear, by phone. A trainer/caretaker with a small family stable, he testified that the incident he saw took place across from his horse's stall in the Western Fair paddock. He recalled Bourgault "was pretty aggressive toward the horse," hitting Sunny Billion in the face and striking his hock with a burr-wrap headpole: "The horse was in the crossties, [Kant See Back] bridle on, and didn't know where he was being hit."

What Leon saw went beyond the bounds of what he considered normal after a disappointing race. "I was going to intervene. I was concerned about the welfare of the horse," he told the panel, adding that Jackson handled the situation "professionally." When

investigators contacted him later, Leon provided a statement. "I'm not saying [Bourgault] tried to break the horse's leg or kill it," he explained. "What I witnessed shouldn't be happening. We have enough black eyes in this sport. If anybody in the public would've seen that, they would've intervened... We're all looking out for the animal."

The day's third witness was trainer/caretaker Stacey Currie, initially referred to as "Source #1." She told the panel that after she reported seeing Bourgault hit Sunny Billion, she feared retaliation: "I worried a lot that one of my horses would be claimed by him... I would be absolutely devastated... I have concern for any animal in his care."

She described concerns about being shunned within the industry if she went on the record, as she did not have her trainer's license at the time.

Appellant counsel Larry Todd cross-examined Currie, asking about her past relationship with driver Brett MacDonald, who would sometimes drive his father's horses in competition against Bourgault's. She described paddocking horses at The Raceway on the controversial night, reporting that she witnessed Bourgault delivering "a two-hander with the headpole" to Sunny Billion outside the paddock entrance. She notified the paddock judge, while others nearby did not. "It's just like everything else," she told the panel, "Some people just don't want to get involved if it doesn't involve them."

When Todd suggested to Currie that "the front part" of the headpole "is going to come flying out" if the equipment is used to strike a horse, she responded that she didn't know, because "I haven't done that." Currie was asked about Dr. Robson's inspection of Sunny Billion, which found "no abnormalities." She responded, "It doesn't mean that just because it didn't leave a mark, the skin wasn't bruised."

Currie said she was interviewed further about the incident, in person at Mohawk and again by phone. "I was very unsure of how involved I wanted to be," she said, "I was intimidated."

Day three, Tyler Durand, current manager of racing for the AGCO Regulatory Compliance Branch, gave statements about Bourgault's whip use at Grand River Raceway on June 25, 2020. "I witnessed Mr. Bourgault strike the horse several times, for whatever reason, using an arm motion that was very aggressive and excessive," he said, noting the trainer was "bringing his arm up above his head" to whip during warm-up.

"These are the kind of strikes that a person would use because they mean it," explained Durand, "Because they want the horse to feel it." Questioned by Registrar's representative Nicolle Pace about what "it" was, Durand responded "pain." He added, "Nowadays, this would not be tolerated, even during a race." Some horsepeople on the track also reported what they saw. Last October, Bourgault was fined \$500 for the violation.

Durand remarked that only under "exceptional circumstances" do horsepeople break rank to report, which spoke to "how passionately they felt that this situation was wrong." When Pace asked him how Bourgault's treatment of Sunny Billion met the

"standard of care" expected of an Ontario-based trainer, Durand was clear: "It does not. It flies in the face of it."

Todd cross-examined Durand about why Bourgault might be scrutinized by peers. "It's a competitive industry. People get jealous," suggested the horseman's representative. "The distinction here is that several people have come forward" as whistleblowers, replied Durand.

The Zoom hearing resumed May 12, with Bourgault's girlfriend Danielle Cassell making statements. She was Sunny Billion's caretaker Dec. 2, 2019 at Western Fair, and denied anything unusual happened. "He was a little antsy after the race, but was manageable, to a point," she told the panel. She testified that she removed his headpole and held it in her hand while Bourgault was behind Sunny Billion removing tail tie, earplugs and sulky in the "hustle and bustle after the race." Cassell told Todd she didn't see cross-checking with a headpole, and didn't recall what the paddock judge said to Bourgault.

Registrar's representative Faye Kidman cross-examined Cassell, questioning her about the accuracy of her memories. She pointed out that Cassell's testimony was inconsistent with earlier statements: "December 9, [2019] you told AGCO officials that Mr. Bourgault removed the headpole from that horse," said Kidman. "I always take off the headpole," replied Cassell. "You were lying to officials on December 9th, and on December 2nd you took off the headpole?" continued Kidman. "Would it surprise you [that on] December 2 that you weren't the one who removed the headpole?" Cassell insisted she "always" removed it.

Cassell explained that Sunny Billion's "lurching forward" outside the paddock was normal behaviour: "He's always dancing after the race." She acknowledged her boyfriend was "slightly upset" post-race, and answered Todd's one question (could Bourgault have done what was alleged?) with a "no."

Bourgault testified next, confirming he was now training in New Jersey and raced his first horse at Monticello Raceway that week.

"You mentioned that you are at present excluded from racing," said Todd. Bourgault agreed: From late September/early October 2020, Western Fair and Woodbine Mohawk Park had refused his entries. Before pandemic restrictions caused a shutdown, The Raceway "did let me race three horses on the last day, but they wouldn't let me on the grounds," said Bourgault. He was previously racing "at least 10 horses a week" at London, which he identified as the venue where he had the most success.

During Todd's questioning, Bourgault disagreed with Horner's and Currie's accounts, arguing that it was impossible to swing the headpole without it extending and that driver Travis Henry hadn't stopped Sunny Billion on the ramp from track to paddock. The trainer attributed Horner's and Leon's statements to unfriendly competition. He also noted he had claimed Grey Bell, a horse groomed by Currie, from Ronald MacDonald in 2019. After the events at Western Fair, AGCO compliance officials had turned up at his farm, but found no evidence of abuse.

Kidman cross-examined Bourgault about whether he had discussed the case with Cassell, or logged into the Zoom hearing under her name to hear testimony, which was not permitted. He denied discussing the matter, and also denied arguing with Travis Henry after Sunny Billion's race. This contradicted his Dec. 9 statement to officials, in which he said he and Henry "had an argument" and he "was pissed off" with the driver. Kidman stated, "You don't have a clear recollection of what you did with the horse." Bourgault countered, "I remember what I did." He denied hitting the gelding that night, on the head or body.

HRAP Chair Sadinsky asked Bourgault, "Can you help me as to why these three people would tell these three separate stories if they were untrue?" The trainer replied, "I'm racing against those people every week." Grey Bell had won over \$15,000 since he claimed her and she left Currie's care. Horner and Leon "are people who don't like people coming out to race there" at Western Fair, Bourgault added, noting "Lots of jealousy in harness racing, Mr. Chair."

On the last day of testimony, Travis Henry was interviewed. He said he never saw Sunny Billion "slammed with a headpole," but some competitors disliked Bourgault because he was successful and "French, so he might come off a little arrogant." Henry admitted that as a catch driver in Ohio, the specifics of long-ago races and conversations were hard to remember, but he "never saw Fred touch the horse."

Jeffrey Williamson, Stephen Quinn, and Andy Moore raced horses at London on the night of the alleged abuse. All testified they hadn't witnessed anything unusual. Owner/trainer Williamson said he'd had horses with Bourgault, and saw too much influence from "troublemakers": "People are trying to cause too much drama and problems at the racetrack... If somebody was beating on a horse, you wouldn't have had five complaints, you would have had a hundred." Quinn, a groom/owner, said his horse Larjon Lucky was in a paddock stall that gave him full view of Sunny Billion's, yet saw nothing problematic. Owner/

trainer/driver Moore said he has bought horses from Bourgault, and "everything seemed the way it should've been" with Sunny Billion Dec. 2.

Closing submissions were presented May 14. Kidman stated, "the position of the Registrar [is] that this horse was simply caught in the crossfire" when Bourgault "was mad about what happened in this race." She argued that absence of visible marks on Sunny Billion did not rule out abuse, and that no one alleged Bourgault made a "long or overdrawn attack" or caused "long-term damage." Kidman stressed that cruelty was independent of intent to commit cruelty.

Much came down to who was in position to witness what were alleged to be quick, sudden hits on Sunny Billion, and whose memory of the night's events was reliable over a year later. Cassell and Bourgault both reversed position on what they told investigators Dec. 9, 2019, diminishing the trainer's anger and placing the headpole in Cassell's hands in their May 2021 testimony. Kidman suggested Cassell "intentionally tried to mislead this panel," while Jackson, Gangle, Robson, Leon and Currie gave statements that were "internally and externally consistent" nearly 18 months after the incident. She asked the panel to dismiss Bourgault's appeal on grounds that his "conduct must be denounced," adding "the economic stability of the racing industry" depends on equine welfare.

June 3, the HRAP issued its ruling, finding it improbable that witnesses had fabricated evidence or maliciously colluded against Bourgault. His appeal was dismissed and original \$2,500 fine and 45-day full suspension confirmed, to begin at a future date set by AGCO judges. Conditions on his license were extended from one to two years: After the suspension, he must "keep the peace and be of good behaviour" or face immediate suspension if a conduct violation occurs, "until the matter is considered and disposed of."

The panel concluded "[t]his case turns on issues of credibility." Credibility of witnesses decided the outcome, but a second layer of credibility was concurrently at stake: Could harness racing be considered a "credible" sport by the general public and government if it allowed acts of abuse to go unchecked? "Striking the horse even once in the manner described by the complainants may constitute conduct prejudicial to the best interest of racing, and cruelty to the horse," stated the HRAP's written conclusions. "Striking the horse on three separate occasions makes the conduct even more egregious."

At press time, Bourgault was driving in qualifiers at Monticello Raceway. Sunny Billion, trained by Gardner McCallum since last year, finished third in his Truro Raceway qualifier Sunday.



Racing Night Live presented by OLG returns tonight on TSN

When Racing Night Live presented by OLG returns tonight (June 18) on TSN, the broadcast will once again, noted Woodbine Entertainment CEO Jim Lawson, have all the angles covered. Literally and figuratively speaking.

Back on track starting tonight, June 18, at 7 p.m. ET, Racing Night Live (RNL), a partnership between Woodbine Entertainment and TSN, will showcase world-class thoroughbred and standard-bred action from Woodbine Racetrack and Woodbine Mohawk Park, respectively.

For Lawson, it's not just the dual-breed live horse racing offering – seven or eight races over two hours – that makes RNL must-see TV.

"I really loved what we did last year," said Lawson. "We had become mired in the traditional broadcast of racing, handicapping, and wagering. It was hugely successful, a show that was largely geared to a new fan base and a new audience. The work of our production crew and TSN's production crew really came through in the show. It exceeded my expectations. I looked forward to it every week because it was fun and it was new. It certainly took racing to a new level of fun."

The idea for RNL was born after Lawson and Christina Litz [former vice president, digital media, business and revenue development with Woodbine] approached TSN with the idea of broadcasting live horse racing on Thursday evenings, a night that is traditionally dedicated to CFL action.

When the pandemic hit last March and live sporting events

were eventually halted, including the CFL, Lawson and Litz got their plan out of the gates quickly, reaching out to TSN to find out if there was interest in airing horse racing on their channel.

"Christina and I have a long association with TSN through our time with the CFL," said Lawson, who was the league's Chairman of the Board of Governors from September 2013 to December 2019. "When it became apparent that TSN wasn't going to have CFL games to show on Thursday nights, I reached out to Stewart Johnston [Bell Media's SVP of Sales & Sports] and told him we'd be ready to go – that was at the time the premier announced the reopening of the economy, in what was then called Phase 1, on May 27. I asked Stew if he would be interested in airing horse racing. After talking with Stew and Christina speaking with Paul Graham [Executive Producer, TSN], we got the nod to go ahead with it."

However, like any live TV production, Racing Night Live required support from sponsors to make it happen. Not surprisingly, industry partners OLG, HBPA, and COSA all stepped up quickly as sponsors to help bring the show to life and have committed to return for 2021. The show was also supported by Woodbine partners Pepsi, Kraft-Heinz, DRF and Budweiser.

With TSN's interest, combined with support from key industry partners, the show still faced some unprecedented challenges brought on by the global pandemic.

"TSN saw it as a good testing ground on how to broadcast live sports during a pandemic. There were all kinds of procedures and protocols they developed with us. Wearing masks, physical distancing – there were many things to go over and adapt to ahead of that first show. There were a lot of different challenges."

The day prior to the first show, Lawson sat down with TSN's Brian Williams to discuss how the pandemic had impacted the horse racing industry and how Woodbine would operate live racing to ensure the safety of all participants. The segment was featured the following evening on RNL.



Despite several hurdles to overcome, including navigating a broadcast in the midst of COVID-19, RNL's first show of 2020 aired on June 11, making it Canada's first live sports broadcast production during the pandemic.

"April and May had passed, so there were a couple of months of just nothing in terms of live sports. People were starving for something live. The idea for RNL was mostly spawned because there were no live sports available for fans. We put it together really quickly."

In racing parlance, the debut proved to be a winning trip, a chance to highlight top-level thoroughbred and standardbred racing, open up the sport to a new breed of fan, showcase racing and its community through a human-interest lens, all packaged in an engaging viewer experience.

From having Juno Award-winning Canadian music group Arkells contribute their talents to the first show, to different camera angles capturing all of the on-track action, to the hosts seamlessly keeping pace between the two breeds, to Brodie Lawson presenting a weekly segment called 'Top 5 presented by Pepsi', and a clever and fun way to educate fans about the sport through a segment called "Angles", RNL resonated with fans at the outset and continued to evolve throughout the season.

"The show took on a new life, bringing a fun experience to viewers. We had never taken that approach before where there was a new target audience. It had a new look and feel to it. I give a lot of that credit to Christina Litz. There was music, up-and-coming bands – it just had a different feel to it. I think that made it a lot of fun, to have the music, and a new, fresh approach. The Top 5 was interesting, not only for newcomers, but for also for people that have been around racing a long time. I looked forward to what music and what band was going to play, what slant the show would have on racing that week. I think it was great.


"Having the two breeds was also fantastic. No one had ever been in the position we are, to have what we do, two breeds racing at the same time. I can't think of any racetrack in the world that can go back and forth on the same show. That was also a great aspect for me. It was interesting to see the two breeds spotlighted in one broadcast."

Perhaps most importantly, the show cumulatively reached more than 2.4 million viewers, showcasing racing to a new audience in 2020.

"We were able to sell our sport. We spent a lot of time with the jockeys and drivers, in particular, getting people to know them, to hear their stories. Those human-interest stories we did were fascinating and they really resonated with people. That makes our sport more interesting to the consumer. I think we did a good job with that."

Lawson is eager to tune-in for the upcoming season of RNL, which will feature a total of 15 shows starting tonight. After the first five broadcasts, RNL will have a three-week break for the upcoming Summer Olympics, and then air 10 more shows.

"I absolutely am looking forward to it. I can't wait for that first show and all of our broadcasts this year. I think that everything RNL offers is great for horse racing across the country."

La Vie En Blanc leads winners on Monday at Gaitway

La Vie En Blanc is following in big hoof prints, but the 2-year-old female trotter made her first public appearance a winning one at Gaitway Farm on Monday (June 14). The filly, a half-sister to two-time Dan Patch Award-winner Ramona Hill, captured her debut qualifier in 2:00.2 with Andy McCarthy driving for trainer Tony Alagna.

A daughter of Chapter Seven out of Lock Down Lindy, she is owned by Crawford Farms Racing and was bred by Crawford Farms. Later in the day, Ramona Hill finished second by a nose to two-time Dan Patch Award-winner Atlanta in a 1:53.3 qualifier at Gaitway.

"There are a lot of similarities," Alagna said about La Vie En Blanc and Ramona Hill. "They're very willing; both have a great work ethic. They have a little different way of trotting. (La Vie En Blanc) trots a little lower, but you know they're sisters. She covers the ground."

Ramona Hill, who won last year's Hambletonian and has earned \$1.32 million lifetime, was qualifying for the third time. Her previous efforts came April 30 (a fourth) and May 8 (third) at The Meadowlands. Alagna then gave the 4-year-old mare time off to work on her back, which hampered her at times last season.

On Monday, she lost a front shoe at the quarter-mile point but still trotted a :54.2=second half, coming home in :26.4.

"Andy didn't push her (because of losing the shoe) but he said she was very good," Alagna said. "It took us a little while, but today is the best she's been, so I think we have her going in the right direction."

La Vie En Blanc was one of four winning 2-year-olds for the Alagna Stable. The others were filly trotter **Valentina Blu**, male trotter **Fast As The Wind**, and male pacer **Flying Tiger**.

Valentina Blu (Chapter Seven—Corazon Blue Chip) won in 2:00 with McCarthy driving. The filly is owned by Crawford Farms Racing and was bred by Spring Haven Farm and Doug Millard Holdings Usa. She is a full sister to Dan Patch Award-winner Fourth Dimension.

A whim is paying off for Paula Wellwood and Wolftrax

If it seems unusual to see Paula Wellwood working with a pacer, it is.

In fact, it's been nearly 20 years since the trainer welcomed anything other than a trotter into her stable.

But that changed when Wellwood and her family's Dreamville Stable purchased Wolftrax for \$40,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Sale. The colt is Wellwood's first pacer since soon after her father William, a Hall of Famer in the U.S. and Canada, passed away in 2003.

Wolftrax, by Betting Line out of Cathedra Dot Com, is a half-brother to millionaire Simply Business. He was Cathedra Dot

Com's 10th foal, and Wellwood hoped to rekindle the magic her stable enjoyed with multiple Dan Patch Award-winning trotter Marion Marauder, who was his dam's 11th foal.

As a racehorse, Cathedra Dot Com was an O'Brien Award-winning millionaire while Marion Marauder's mom, Spellbound Hanover, was a Nova Award-winner of nearly a million.

"On a whim, we decided to try a pacer," Wellwood said. "We kind of like Betting Line and she was a really great mare, his mother. We've bought horses like that before, a trotter, that was a later foal, so we thought we might try it again.

"I had gotten rid of every bit of pacing equipment. We didn't even own a set of hobbles. We owned nothing. It's been a long time. We had a couple nice pacers when my father passed away. Then we went solely into trotters."

On Wednesday at Magical Acres, Wolftrax won a qualifier in 1:59.3 with Scott Zeron driving. The colt finished second in his debut on June 9 at Magical Acres, timed in 1:55.3.

A sale headliner is sure to be the stakes winner and open-class trotter Eurobond 4,1:50.1 (\$336,650), who's coming into the sale off impressive back-to-back wins in the \$20,000 Open Trot at Plainridge, with those scores in 1:53 and 1:54.1 over the 5/8-mile track.

The last Tattersalls Summer Mixed – in 2019 – posted the highest average in the summer sale's history, and with the current demand for racehorses, Reid said another record could be on the way this year.

Heart Of Mine still perfect with NYSS win at Buffalo

The win was her fifth straight win in as many starts this season.

Her triumph highlighted the three (approx. \$37.000) divisions of the traveling series at Buffalo Raceway.

While Heart Of Mine didn't disappoint, it was Rightfully Mine (\$3.10) who was the fastest of the three brackets as she went 1:55 over the fast track in topping So Diva by 2-3/4 lengths.

Summer Rae won the battle of attrition in the other leg as she toppled Tava by a length in 1:57.3 to register the shocking \$50.00 payoff.

Heart Of Mine (Scott Zeron) settled in early but popped out to the lead just before the quarter pole. Setting the pace with

Trained by Linda Toscano, Heart Of Mine (Roll With Joe—Acquavella) has now produced winnings of \$73,217 on the year and \$204,632 lifetime.

Rightfully Mine (Shawn Gray) inherited the lead approaching the home stretch as the favored Blue Me A Kiss broke stride and comfortably rolled home, beating So Diva (Mark MacDonald) by 2-3/4 lengths. Party Queen (Matt Kakaley) grabbed the show spot.

"She made a little bobble at the start but once I got her straightened away, she was good," Gray said of Rightfully Mine.

He said of the stretch drive, "I think we were going good enough and I felt we would have nipped her (Blue Me A Kiss)."

Co-owned by Anthony Scussel and Monique Cohen and trained by Sheena McElhinney), it was the fourth victory in five appearances in 2021 for Rightfully Mine (American Ideal—Leah). The win jacked her seasonal bankroll to \$41,765 and \$147,777 in her career.

After four second place finishes to start the season, Summer Rae broke into the win column for the first time and did so in a big way, with a length score over Tava (Kakaley) in 1:57.3.

Going off as the longest shot on the board, Summer Rae was in hot pursuit of the leaders heading past the final marker and was aided as Roll On Mama, Carrington and Albergita Hanover all jumped it off turning for home.

Conditioned by Tom Fanning, Summer Rae (Roll With Joe – Solar Eclipse) has now earned \$38,549 on the year and \$76,103 in her lifetime.

In the lone \$15,000 Excelsior A race, **Seafood Sweetheart** (Gray) led the entire mile and turned back Itzpapalotl (Zeron) by a comfortable 2-3/4 length in 1:56.2, producing a \$4.00 win ticket.

Abby Rose (Ray Fisher Jr.) blasted out to an early advantage then held off the late charging Elegant Blue (Kakaley) by a head to post the surprising \$10.20 score in the first \$6,400 Excelsior Class B event. Abby Rose covered the distance in 2:01.1.

The second division had **Miley Rose** (Morrill Jr.) beating stable-mate Dealonimo (Kakaley) in 2:01.4. The triumph was worth \$2.80 to her backers.

Morrill Jr. led the way for the drivers with a triple while Gray posted a double. McElhinney had a pair of training victories.

Bella Bellini, Dazzling reign winners in PA All Stars

Bella Bellini and **Dazzling Reign**, both winners at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono June 6 in different classes, both won again this past Sunday (June 13), each capturing a \$37,500 division of a Pennsylvania All-Stars event for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

The Bar Hopping filly Bella Bellini, successful in a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) last week despite having to go uncovered, again had to overcome first-over duties, but she did so in spectacular fashion in 1:54. The 2020 Breeders Crown winner Lady Chaos got command past a :27.4 quarter, and after getting a stroll to the half in :58.1, with Bella Bellini still five lengths behind, the path looked good for Lady Chaos, winner of the other PASS cut seven days prior. But Dexter Dunn got the Nifty Norman-trained filly underway down the back, and "Bella" uncorked a sizzling own last half of :54.4 - :27 to easily sail past Lady Chaos by 2½ lengths; Anoka Hanover, well-placed on the winner's back, ruined her chances with a break.

After going winless in seven starts at two, Bella Bellini has now put together a 7 5-2-0 tally this season, with the two losses each by only a half-length in PASS legs. Owner David Mc Duffee appears to have a filly fully capable of competing on the national stage.

The Father Patrick filly Dazzling Reign had posted two wins and a second in her last three starts against Stallion Series horses; here she showed he could handle tougher company, including odds-on favorite Love Muffin, while equaling her mark of 1:54.1. The chalk, winner of two straight PASS events before a miscue last week, was used hard to a :26.3 quarter for the top, but she backed the midrace splits down to :56.3 and 1:25.1. Dazzling Reign kept inching up uncovered, and in the end driver Todd McCarthy was able to get her by Love Muffin by a nose for trainer Claude Huckabone III and owner James Crawford IV.

Dr. Scott Woogen replaces Russell MacKinnon on USTA board

Dr. Woogen, a board-certified gastroenterologist practicing in Virginia, is a long-time horse owner and breeder as well as amateur driver. He has owned more than 200 horses and bred 100 to date.

"I'm excited to be able to help the sport that I'm very passionate about on the national level after being involved locally in Virginia," said Dr. Woogen on his appointment to the board.

Named the 2005 Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame Amateur Driving Champion when he had a career best year with 21 wins, Dr. Woogen has participated nationally in the Capital Area Amateur Drivers Association, C.K.G. Billings Harness Driving Series, Florida Amateur Driving Club, GSY Amateur Racing Club and North American Amateur Drivers Association races. In addition, he has driven internationally in Canada, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Italy, Russia, Spain and New Zealand. He's known as the "Driving Doctor" in the Billing Series.

Dr. Woogen became interested in harness racing as a youth when a NYC police officer recruited him to sell his Top Trotter tip sheets. While selling those sheets and programs, he occasionally went to Yonkers Raceway to watch the races.

"I started reading the programs and taking an occasional bus up there to Yonkers Raceway and watched the races," Dr. Woogen told the USTA's Ken Weingartner for a 2014 story on **ustrotting.com**. "I really liked it. When I was old enough, I got working papers and worked a little bit in the stable area on the weekends."

His studies took him away from the track until he returned as an amateur driver in 1998.

Dr. Woogen has practiced with Richmond Gastroenterology Associates since 1994. He graduated Magna Cum Laude from Columbia University in 1977 where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He followed with medical school at New York School of Medicine where he graduated in 1981 and was a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha, an honor medical fraternity. Upon graduation he was offered a residency at the Medical College of Virginia becoming board certified in Internal Medicine in 1984. He also completed his fellowship in Gastroenterology at the Medical College of Virginia and became Chief Fellow in 1986. While Chief Fellow, he was awarded a grant for Intestinal Immunology Research from the National Institutes of Health.

He was board certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine-Gastroenterology in 1988 and began his career as an Assistant Professor at the Medical College of Virginia.

Currently, Dr. Woogen serves as a Clinical Professor of Medicine for the Medical College of Virginia and is a member of the American Society of Internal Medicine, the American Gastroenterological Association, the Virginia Gastroenterological Society, Richmond Academy of Medicine, and the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation.

Originally from the Bronx, NY, he enjoys spending time with his two children and five grandchildren as well as playing golf.

PEI announces racing protocols for off-island participants

The Prince Edward Island Harness Racing Industry Association and Red Shores properties wish to announce the required biosecurity and horse health protocols that will be in effect at Prince Edward Island racetracks starting July 1, 2021, until further notice.

These new protocols have been recommended by the Atlantic Veterinary College and attending veterinarians to ensure the continued health of the Prince Edward Island standardbred population while safely allowing off Island horses to compete at Stake, Overnight, and Feature racing events.

Effective July 1, 2021, any horse shipping to Prince Edward Island will require:

For horses who will be shipping in from another Province to PEI

to compete at a Red Shores property at Summerside Raceway or Charlottetown Driving Park in a stake, overnight, or feature event, and who will not be stabling overnight at either track, will require an Off Island Trainer Health Form to access the designated ship in area. By completing, signing, and submitting the Off Island Trainer Health Form, the trainer of record attests that the competing horse has not tested positive for or been exposed to any horse that has Streptococcus equi subs equi, and that the competing horse has been monitored for any signs of such. Forms will be available online at the redshores.ca website and must be completed and submitted to the Race Office before the time of declaration. Forms can be submitted by email to tara.poulton.myers@alc.ca or kathy. carragher@alc.ca or by fax at 902-892-1052.

For those horses who will be shipping in from another Province to PEI to compete at a Red Shores property at either Summerside Raceway or Charlottetown Driving Park in a stake, overnight, or feature event, and who will be requesting stabling for one night or longer at either track, will require either a) proof of vaccination for Streptococcus equi subs equi Or b) proof of two negative culture tests for the Streptococcus equi subs equi bacteria on nasopharyngeal washes which were completed in 2021. This documentation accompanied by the Off Island Trainer Health Form must be submitted to the Race Office before the time of declaration. Forms are available online at theredshores.ca website and can be submitted by email to tara.poulton.myers@alc.ca or kathy.carragher@alc.ca or by fax to 902-892-1052.

The current protocol for horses permanently residing on Prince Edward Island who wish to move to a stable at Red Shores at the Charlottetown Driving Park or Summerside Raceway remain in place, namely the need for proof of two negative culture tests for the Streptococcus equi subs equi bacteria on nasopharyngeal washes which were completed in 2021 and are submitted **toapril.myers@alc.ca** for approval prior to arrival with horse(s) on the grounds.

All horse owners are strongly encouraged to continue to follow approved Bio-Security protocols as they will continue to be in effect for both Red Shores locations. Further information is available at www.redshores.ca.

U.S. horse racing leaders, aftercare organizations endorse federal amendment to stop horse slaughter

Leading U.S. horse racing professionals have joined in solidarity to support a U.S. House amendment that would ban the transport of American slaughter-bound horses across state lines and over the borders for butchering abroad. Led by U.S. Representatives, Troy Carter (D-LA), Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA), and John Katko (R-NY), the amendment will be offered to the Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Surface Transportation in America (INVEST) Act, H.R.3684, which is slated to be on the House floor in the next few weeks.

There are no horse slaughter facilities currently operating within the USA. However, every year over 30,000 American horses are live-exported over the borders to Canada and Mexico to be slaughtered—thousands of them being former racehorses and breeding stock. In addition to anti-slaughter policies at the majority of U.S. racetracks, there are numerous aftercare programs and sanctuaries across the nation to help safeguard racehorses from ending up in the slaughter pipeline. Despite these policies and programs, racehorses are slipping through the cracks and find themselves at auction houses that make them vulnerable to being acquired by kill-buyers, the middlemen who send the horses to a grisly death at slaughterhouses. The

only way to ensure that every U.S. equine is protected is to pass federal legislation that would make it illegal for any horse to be transported or sold to slaughter.

Last month the Save America's Forgotten Equines (SAFE) Act, H.R.3355, was introduced in the U.S. House. If passed into law it would prohibit horse slaughter facilities from opening on U.S. soil and ban the export of horses across the borders. Similar legislation has been introduced in Congress over the last two decades, but has always been thwarted by industries and legislators that want the practice of slaughtering American horses to continue. While efforts to advance the SAFE Act rightly continue, the bipartisan Carter, Fitzpatrick, Katko amendment is being offered as an alternative pathway. The amendment garnered the support of nearly 150 U.S. House members on the day it was announced, and that number is expected to increase exponentially.

"After years of pressing for a ban on the slaughter of our American horses, I am thrilled with this latest development and applaud our leadership in Washington for their commitment to the issue. Stopping the transport of slaughter-bound horses will be a game changer." said Staci Hancock, whose Stone Farm has raised Three Kentucky Derby winners. "It is time to end this brutal practice in the U.S. once and for all. Horses are bred for sport, competition, and companionship, not to be part of the food chain. As owners and breeders we must be the stewards of our horses' safety and welfare. They look to us for their care and protection and to allow them to go to a horrific slaughter is unconscionable."

"We had a close call this year getting our Grade 1 Santa Anita Derby winner The Deputy released from a kill pen. And this was far from our first rodeo." said Barry Irwin, owner of Team Valor whose Animal Kingdom won the Kentucky Derby in 2011. "I support any initiative that will end this cycle."

Leading U.S. Trainer, Graham Motion, who conditioned Animal Kingdom said, "It is high time that we end the transport of American slaughter bound horses across state lines and over the borders. We at Herringswell are committed to finding other careers for thoroughbreds once their racing days are over. The practice of transporting horses for slaughter is abhorrent and it must come to an end."

"Now that the state legislators of New York have done the right thing, I would hope that the Federal Government will join and ensure that our racehorses are provided a fitting home when their careers are over." said Jeff Gural, proprietor of Allerage Farm and owner of the racetracks The Meadowlands, Tioga Downs, and Vernon Downs. "Allowing them to be sold for slaughter should have been eliminated years ago."

"As a multiple Kentucky Derby winning jockey and a person who has enjoyed a Hall Of Fame career, my passion for my outstanding equine athletes has never wavered. The Carter, Fitzpatrick, Katko amendment to the INVEST Act that will stop interstate

travel across state and international borders for horse slaughter is a must." said Gary Stevens. "There is always a place for our beautiful friends to retire and live out the life they all deserve."

"Everyone in racing should support the Carter, Fitzpatrick, Katko amendment—and every effort to end the slaughter of our horses. Aftercare organizations work tirelessly and at great expense but the slaughter of our horses, or the extortion of our horses under threat of slaughter, will never end until slaughter is stopped at the federal level." said Victoria Keith, president of the National Thoroughbred Welfare Organization. "We urge every racing entity to step up now and make this push together to stop this profound injustice to our horses and public relations nightmare for racing."

"If at the very least, you care about horses, and at the very most, you make your living working with horses, then providing support to the Carter, Fitzpatrick, Katko amendment is so obvious that one should not have to think twice about it." said Dr. Patty Hogan, of Hogan Equine. "Welfare issues are at the absolute forefront of public concern for any sport or industry associated with horses in this country, and to ignore that fact is to do so at your own peril and demise. Getting this amendment passed will finally close the dangerous loopholes that still exist out there for our most vulnerable members of the U.S. equine population."

According to national polls, over 80 per cent of Americans oppose the slaughter of horses and want to see them protected from such a fate. It's long overdue to stop the slaughter of American horses, and the Carter, Fitzpatrick, Carter amendment is an opportunity we must embrace. Additional horse racing professionals who endorse the amendment include; Claiborne Farm, Cobra Farm, Crawford Farms, Equine Advocates, Fawn Leap Farm, Foxie G Foundation, Gainesway Farm, Jack Knowlton-Sackatoga Stable, Lael Stable, Machmer Hall Thoroughbreds, NP Zito Racing Stable, Neil Drysdale, Pin Oak Stud, R.A.C.E. Fund, Shadowlawn Farm, Shaun Dugan Agent, Tranquility Farm, West Point Thoroughbreds, and numerous others.

Individuals can help pass the Carter, Fitzpatrick, Katko amendment by urging their U.S. Representative to support the measure. The amendment is expected to be offered to the House floor before the August recess, so time is of the essence.

Since 2018, the US Harness Writers Association (USHWA) has welcomed youth members, a category of membership for aspiring or early-career harness racing media 21 years of age or younger. It continues into its fourth year, with new youth members' first-year dues generously paid by continued sponsor Tim Konkle, 2017 USHWA Member of the Year.

Last year's three newest USHWA Youth members all had a

successful 2020. Grady Hachey is now one of the sport's youngest regular columnists, covering New Brunswick harness racing in his Atlantic Post Calls column. Edison Hatter has become a regular presence calling races and handicapping at tracks ranging from Rosecroft to Freehold to The Meadowlands. Tony Elliott was named assistant to the general manager at Hanover Raceway in 2020, later joining the broadcast team at The Raceway at Western Fair, being named assistant general manager at Clinton Raceway in 2021, and assisting with communications at Grand River Raceway.

The 2021 nomination deadline is Monday, July 5, and potential youth members can be nominated by anyone familiar with their contributions to harness racing. Self-nominations are also welcome. A nominee must be a writer, photographer, race caller, video producer, podcaster, or other contributor to the media side of the sport. Youth members do not need to be paid employees in the industry; students, volunteers, and freelancers are welcome to apply.
