At long last, Pennsylvania harness racing returns

All three of the state's harness tracks will be back racing live as of this weekend after a nearly 100-day hiatus.

When harness racing resumed at The Meadows this past Monday (June 15), it marked the first time since March 9 (at Mohegan Sun Pocono Downs) that live harness racing was contested in the state of Pennsylvania. It's been a long road that at times has seemed far longer than three months, but as of this weekend all three harness tracks in the state will be back and running.

In addition to The Meadows, Pocono Downs restarts their season on Saturday, with Harrah's Philadelphia kicking off their season the day after on Sunday. With an abundance of horses needing to be raced, Pocono has carded 14 races on Saturday and again Sunday, with Chester kicking in another 14 races of their own on Sunday. When you throw in the Meadowlands — located at a shouting distance from Pocono and Chester — carding 36 races between Friday and Saturday, it is clear just how many horses there are to be entered.

The re-opening of the PA harness racing came as horsemen and women throughout the state — many of whom rely on racing exclusively in PA — were bordering on a crisis after three months of limited to no income.

Sam Beegle, the president of the Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association (PHHA) said horsepeople were, "all very elated. They're just tickled to death that we're back and that we're racing."

Presumably after working through some political issues, "The governor gave us the go-ahead and then we really got to work to get all the safety protocols passed with the state health department as quickly as we could," Beegle said. "It took a lot of work by a lot of people, and I want to recognize the efforts of our entire PHHA board and our two lobbyists. They were extremely instrumental and helpful throughout the entire process."

While Pennsylvania was the last major racing jurisdiction to have been given the green light to resume racing, Beegle notes the quick turnaround between the time racing got the go-ahead to resume and the time the first horses hit the track.

"Part of this is that we actually just got back, and we actually turned around and started back about as quick as any of them. And that's what tickled everybody. We had to work hard to not only get health insurance passed, but also we're continuing in paying real close attention to the safety protocols," Beegle said.

Just yesterday, the PHHA announced that the PA All-Stars initially scheduled to be held at Pocono Downs during the stoppage, has been rescheduled in dates throughout July and August. Beegle added that, "The rescheduling of the sire stakes is going to come out probably over the next day or so. Everything has been rescheduled except for the traditional four major races on Sun Stakes at Pocono (Earl Beal, James Lynch, Max Hempt, Ben Franklin).

"And under that situation, we only had to drop the purses minimally. In the first couple of weeks we're going to give a stipend to anyone that races a horse for the first week or two and help them get back on their feet. We've been helping with health insurance, and overall, we're just going to work hard to get everybody back and get everybody racing. And the more tracks that open up the more opportunities there are going to be for all of us."

Beegle said the minimal purse reduction was done, in part, as a precaution.



"We wanted to be careful that if there's a recurrence of (COVID-19) this year, that we'll be ready to go again next year. And that's the biggest reason we've done it. We want to mind our P's and Q's and be practical."

With the relationship of race purses to the casinos the tracks are connected with, further good news is that casinos, too, are re-opening. The Meadows gaming facility opened two weeks ago on June 9, and Mohegan Sun at Pocono is scheduled to re-open on Monday, albeit with limited capacity. At Harrah's in Chester, a date for that casino's reopening is still to be determined.

Though racing has been lost in recent months, most stakes in the state has been preserved, as Beegle noted earlier. And with a consolidated stakes schedule, racing is about to jump directly into stakes season.

Beginning next week, The Meadows features the Currier & Ives and the Arden Downs stakes for 3-year-olds, with PA Sire Stakes and Stallion Series going the week after that for the freshmen. Similarly, Pocono Downs will race the PA All-Stars in July while Chester goes right into Sire Stakes action for 2-year-olds in less than two weeks. Between the compact stakes season and the large number of overnight races, there will be opportunity for the race participants to make up for not racing earlier in the season.

With all of the state's harness tracks about to be back into full summer swing, there's a feeling that the nearly 100-day interruption may soon be a fading memory.

Racing resumes at Yonkers on Monday, but not without some hurdles for horsepeople

Empire City Casino by MGM Resorts has requested and been granted approval by the New York Gaming Commission to resume live racing operations at Yonkers Raceway beginning Monday (June 22). But the re-opening does not come without its challenges for horsepeople.

The Standardbred Owners Association of New York (SOA of NY) said in a release that it has been “advised by the director of racing at Yonkers Raceway that each horseman (trainers, drivers and grooms) seeking to participate in racing at Yonkers needs to get an antibody test. This is not something the SOA of NY agrees with in any way shape or form. The way we were told this is meant to work is that the first time a horseman comes on the grounds he/she will need to show the test document result to the race office or to the director of racing. Importantly, the current version of the Gaming Commission protocols requires that the test result shows that the individual is positive for antibodies. Without a positive test, we are told you will not be able to access the grounds. Accordingly, every horseman who wishes to race at Yonkers is encouraged to get tested.”

On Thursday, SOA of NY president Joe Faraldo released a

statement saying the SOA of NY was “working very hard to get resolved the ‘positive antibody’ requirement which is not imposed on other New York state harness tracks.”

Racing will begin with a three-night weekly schedule on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Post time is 7:05 pm nightly. Spectators will not be permitted but races will be simulcast, and available for viewing and wagering at www.EmpireCityBets.com.

Besides the antibody test, extensive health and safety protocols will be in place in accordance with guidelines issued by the Commission. Protocols include, but are not limited to, capacity limitations and distancing measures, temperature checks and health screenings, installation of no-touch fixtures and disinfectant stations, equipment usage and cleaning protocols, mandatory use of face masks, and hand sanitizer stations throughout the racing area.

Continentalvictory, Bit O Candy, Miss Wisconsin and Vernon Bluechip. The last two both won the Merrie Anabelle. Then two years ago a filly named Crucial, the first foal of Jolene by Father Patrick, joined this list but was far better than my four if that was possible. She didn't have the year I expected but she did sell for \$200,000 and between racing and breeding this writer predicts she will be a big success.

Last year, Jolene Jolene had a big beautiful Cantab Hall filly, who believe it or not was faster and more athletic. Can lightning strike twice? You betcha.

It's 2020 and here comes Effable (too great to imagine) and is she ever aptly named. Cantab Hall her sire is 19 years young, simply amazing.

No one ever accused me of being shy with my opinion, but I think we saw a great filly Saturday morning at the Meadowlands. She won in 1:58, last quarter in :27.3 and Brian Sears was like a statue in the bike.

This one could very well be another Greenshoe. By the way, she was well received at the Kentucky Selected Yearling sale being hammered down for \$600,000 to Lina Alm for SRL stable. Both fillies were bred, raised, and named at Hunterton Farm/

Murray Brown's column on Bret Pelling last Sunday ([full story here](#)) was a must read. The depth was amazing. Hopefully it answered enough questions for the Hall of Fame Selection committee to remove him from the Pete Rose list and realize that no one is perfect.

For those of you interested in thoroughbred racing, the \$1 million Belmont Stake is tomorrow and has an interesting sidelight worth discussion. Patrick Biancone, an excellent trainer, won an optional claimer with Sol Volante at Gulfstream on June 10 in doing so defeated a top Kentucky Derby selection in Ete Indien. Biancone has decided to race his colt back in 10 days and the morning line maker has him tabbed at 9-2. Very odd maneuver in a sport that tries its best to race prime colts sparingly.

Congratulations to Ron Burke, Matt Kakaley and the owner/breeders Burke, Weaver, Bruscelli, and Novak on the wonderful performance of the Sweet Lou colt Lou's Pearlman. A winner at Gaitway in 1:54 last half in :54.3 cutting the mile and defeating a very well thought of Betting Line colt who followed him around the oval and didn't gain an inch in the lane. He is from my good mare Lucy's Pearl. She was more than a pleasure to own and had tremendous ability in her own right. She has a beaten time of 1:48.4 finishing second in an open pace at the Meadowlands. Talking about small horses, she weighed about 700 lbs. The colt is no giant either. To be perfectly honest, if she wasn't a midget, I never would have owned her she would have remained at Brittany Farm for sure. Note: she is a sister to last year's 2-year-old filly Breeders Crown winner Reflect With Me. I would love to see the colt have a great career.

Just as I predicted, as the horses fled the confines of the Florida borders so did DEXTER. It was reported to me that he was sighted in the vicinity of Vernon Downs and is rumored to be working with one of the locals. It has been said that his magic wand has already reaped some startling results and we have only just begun. Stay tuned.

While on the subject of beyond the law, I have been in contact or heard stories about contact with a variety of defense attorneys involved in the Southern District of New York indictments. I really can't speculate as it's not proper but my take is that some will walk and some will fry. It's definitely not all cut and dry.

Tom Santoro asks: I just read Murray Brown's column on Bret Pelling. Bob Glazer owner of Peter Pan stable disappeared from the harness racing scene. Was Bob Glazer a friend of David Copperfield or did he know Bret Pelling was doing something?

Please let's stop more conspiracy theories. Don't you realize a person can reach a point when either their mind or their body say enough? Until you spend a long time training horses at the highest level you could never comprehend the unbelievable stress factor.

Of course, it's nice to spend your life out of doors instead of inside behind a desk, but that is just one plus. Go into the auction ring and buy a couple million dollars' worth of yearlings, plus valuable homebreds and see how well you sleep at night.

Having raced garbage for most of my life, when I reached the big time my baby race thoughts always included, 'Will I be able to spend another winter in Florida?'

You don't just worry about performance, you have to worry about sickness and lameness, too. Imagine the Hambletonian is two weeks away and your horse has been the early favorite for the past 10 weeks and you go to jog him and he is lame. You suffer so much more internally than people imagine.

We have seen this picture many times. It happened with Per Eriksson, Jimmy Takter and now Brett Pelling.

Every individual deserves a degree of privacy. I know all three and I am happy to say that I am well aware of the reasons for their seemingly early departure from our sport and I assure you none of them had anything at all to do with wrong doing.

Billy Bigler asks: I noticed that hardly any 2-year-old trotters make breaks in their first start as exhibited at the Meadowlands last week. Years ago it was commonplace. Can you explain this phenomenon?

We are definitely breeding a far more athletic and more efficiently gaited horse today in comparison to the bulky, almost uncoordinated, horse of earlier times.

Just as important is the fact that you were watching the best of the best, many yearlings costing \$150,000 to \$600,000.

On top of that, they are being drilled on the straight track by Swedish trainers with barns full of stock and most likely have been faster in training miles than they went Saturday morning. Please take note of the results to understand the difference. Swedish trainers represented approximately 75 per cent of the entries. Not one of the non-Swedish trained horses finished in front of a Swedish trained one and the trailers were beaten by a combined 180 lengths.

Just some interesting numbers to show what we are facing from across the pond.

There were only five qualifiers, \$3.5 million in combined auction prices of the Swedish contingent, plus, in my estimation, another \$1 million in homebreds.

Face the fact Burke, Miller, Alagna and Cecere are the Great American Hopes and they simply don't have the depth of quality.

I would be terribly remiss in my job if I didn't applaud the Always B Miki youngsters for winning all three of the pacing races on the select card.

Thanks to Ray Schnittker for saving the day for American trainers with a win with his Miki colt that he co-owns with Dr. John Egloff whose Vieux Carre Farm was also the breeder.

Joel Kravet asks: How important is it to have the same driver behind your 2-year-old trotter week after week? It seems some trainers shuffle them often.

There is no question that having one driver is an extremely important ingredient in the success of a 2-year-old trotter.

That is why the big stables have such a huge edge. If Burke, Takter, Alagna or Melander have a top prospect, notice the driver remains the same 95 per cent of the time from the first baby race to the Breeders Crown. The trainers you talk about shuffling drivers do it out of necessity, not by choice.

You can really take note of this when early in the year the finals of the Peter Haughton and the Merrie Anabelle are raced with 10 horses. Unfortunately, there aren't 10 trotting reinsman. Take note of the trainers that are forced to use a less talented driver. For sure the name doesn't appear above.

I was blessed with Michel Lachance, who for 15 years never picked off a stakes horse of mine. He did come close in the 1996 Hambletonian, but my sterling personality did prevail. You have no idea what a pain it is to have to contact the judges every morning to find out who the gods have selected to drive.

I consider myself very lucky because when Michel retired I had a small stable and found Yannick Gingras, Matt Kakaley and Corey Callahan very loyal to me. I truly thank them all.

Thank you all for the kind words. Please keep the questions coming in. I have put all the questions about the indictments on the back burner. I promise as soon as I have any information for you it will immediately in print. Wonderful weekend of racing with the 36 races at the Meadowlands that includes the beginning of the New Jersey Sires Stakes and will play host to Breakfast With The Babies on Saturday morning for the first time since the arrival of the virus. Have a wonderful week.

French star wins Norway's Oslo Grand Prix

The \$68,500 Oslo Grand Prix over 2,100 meters in Oslo, Norway was a spectacular show on Sunday afternoon.

Two trotters –and their drivers – gave it all to entertain the spectators at home watching the race on television, but none of them were winners in the end. Instead, a French trotter, now trained in Norway, stole the show and came home in a stakes record of 1:52.3 over 1.3 miles.

Elian Web left quickly, as usual, from his post 1, but from the outside, Björn Goop got Vitruvio on fire from the start and the Italian-bred seemed to trot out of Goop's hands. Jorma Kontio had no thoughts of letting Goop get the lead, so the pace the first three quarters of a mile landed on a 1:22.3 mark, with a half-mile remaining in the race.

Vitruvio disarmed leader Elian Web with a lap to go, but was obviously marked by the pace and when strong trotter Ble du Gers (Quinoa du Gers) came up on the outside of new leader Vitruvio in the last turn, the race was over for both of the hard-fighting, front-end horses.

Ble du Gers is known from racing in France, where the distances often are longer than 1.3 miles. Under the guidance of his former trainer Jean-Michel Bazire, the 9-year-old has fought against some of the best known trotters in Europe in previous seasons. The gelding, who is not allowed to race in the biggest races in France, was brave enough to easily pass Vitruvio in the stretch.

Driver Per Oleg Midtfjeld was entrusted behind Frode Hamre's new barn star. Midtfjeld is a well-merited trainer and driver in Norway. In 2005, he won Elitloppet paired with his Steinlager and the duo had some successful years on the tracks in Europe. Midtfjeld's star now is Ferrari B.R., who races among top trotters every time he enters a track.

Behind Ble du Gers, Tsunami Diamant finished strongly as the runner up and Vitruvio's bronze medal deserves the highest grades in bravery.

Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon is back

Sébastien Guarato's Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash), who won Prix d'Amérique in Paris earlier this year, is ready for a comeback. The 5-year-old champion hasn't started since Feb. 29, when he won \$220,000 Prix de Selection at Vincennes, but on Sunday (June 21), the super talented trotter will face Bold Eagle, among others, in \$165,000 Prix René Balliere over 1.3 miles in Paris.

Björn Goop will drive Face Time Bourbon and the duo draw post 7 behind the gate.

Pacer pedigreed trotter aims for big trophies

Four-year-old Don Fanucci Zet (Hard Livin—Kissed By The West by Western Terror) started this season pretty much as an ordinary trotter in low class after a 3-year-old season which ended in four wins in six attempts, in easy races.

Something big has happened with the horse during the winter and clearly Don Fanucci Zet has learned how to move his legs in the right gait lately. The Hard Livin son was runner up behind champion trotter Aetos Kronos in Kungapokalen at Åby racetrack in May and showed by then that he can be a serious threat when the really big races for 4-year-olds are on the schedule later this year.

Trainer Daniel Redén began to get big hopes for his "pacer" when Don Fanucci Zet made his third lifetime start last season, but even for Redén, the progress of the horse has been extraordinary and on Wednesday night at Solvalla, Don Fanucci Zet claimed the \$85,500 Prix Ready Express over 1.3 miles in a mile rate 1:55.3, via a trip in front all the way for driver Örjan Kihlström.

Aetos Kronos was on the outside the whole race and behind him, in second over, Green Manalishi was served a nice trip by Jorma Kontio.

Regarding Green Manalishi, the pace midway through the race was a bit too slow and when he attacked three wide in the last turn, the son of Muscle Hill couldn't challenge the two front horses in a :27.2 last quarter..

Aetos Kronos held bravely for second place and Don Fanucci Zet claimed his biggest check by winning by two lengths.

Aetos Kronos' trainer Jerry Riordan announced that the biggest and most obvious objective for his 4-year-old this year is \$855,500 Derby in September and it's no big guess that Daniel Redén has the same target in sight for his Don Fanucci Zet.

Green Manalishi will most certainly be aimed for \$213,000 Sprintermästaren over the mile in Halmstad in early July and if someone knows how to win that race among trainers in Europe, it's Stefan Melander. Rydens Sensation (2000), Scarlet Knight (2002), Nuncio (2015) and Uncle Lasse (2016) are his previous winners in the race.

Back to Don Fanucci Zet. Stallion Hard Livin was brought to Sweden in 2010, after two successful years in Jimmy Takter's barn, and after a career in Sweden which ended in 2015, Hard Livin has been serving as a low price stud in his new home country. And his results in 2020 are really great. In fact, already in 2019 his 2016-born filly Diana Zet won the

\$598,000 Oaks for 3-year-old mares and in May this year Diana won the \$215,000 Drottningpokalen, the same day that Aetos Kronos beat Don Fanucci Zet in the \$215,000 Kungapokalen.

And the mother of Don Fanucci Zet, Kissed By The West (Western Terror—Kissed By A Fool) was a \$15,000 purchase by Redén at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale in 2012, at the same event where he bought Monarch Kemp, later named Trixton.

"We really tried to get (Kissed By The West) trotting but it was impossible so we had to try to breed her instead and her first offspring (Kiss Of Judas, by Pastor Stephen) was a hard case. Now, we got Don Fanucci Zet and he is something extra," said Redén.

More about the evening at Solvalla on Wednesday night: Driver Örjan Kihlström experienced one his best racing nights in his career by winning seven out of 10 races on the card which is quite unusual in European countries.

The mindful approach of driver Jeremy Indof

Whether he's on the green, on the water or on the racetrack, Jeremy Indof looks to the same mindset in his quest for success.

Admittedly, he won't ever be a fixture on the PGA Tour, and he won't land a career as a professional fisherman, but it doesn't stop the 23-year-old standardbred driver from enjoying a pair of pursuits outside of his time spent in the race bike.

Known as "Catfish" in Pennsylvania racing circles, the reinsman sees one particular similarity between the three staples in his life.

"For whatever you are doing, whether it's driving, golfing or fishing, you have to use your mind first and foremost," said Indof, who was born and still resides in Belle Vernon, a 50-minute drive southeast of Pittsburgh. "Skill is one thing, but using your head to read situations and react the right way, that's what can really make the difference between being successful or not."

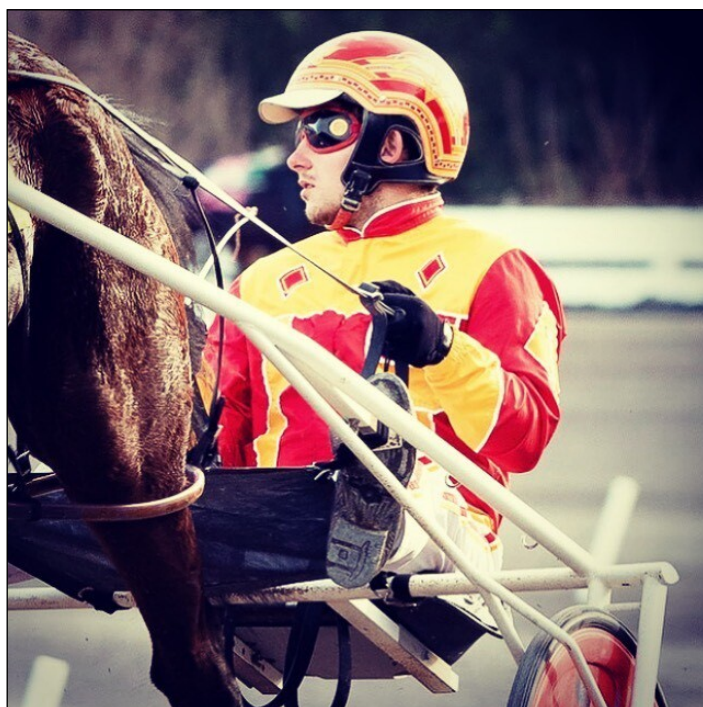
It's an approach that's helped Indof navigate through some difficult decision-making moments.

Like the time he had to opt for either a post-secondary life or a spot in the post parade.

"My dad [Jeffrey] trained horses, and it was something I always wanted to do, but I wasn't really sure if I would or not," said Indof. "I was applying to colleges and at the last minute, I thought I'd go look for a full-time job at the racetrack, to see if I could get in."

He got his answer soon after the search began.

"I was lucky enough to meet Dirk Simpson, a horseman who moved to Pennsylvania from Illinois. As soon as I graduated high school, he hired me and within two years I got my trainer's license and became his second trainer. That's

how I got my start. We did very well together. And it was Dirk who really helped me get my start as a driver."

Launching his career in 2016, Indof recorded one win from a modest five starts in that rookie campaign.

"[Veteran drivers] Tony Hall and Dan Rawlings, they really helped coach me up to my first start. So did Brady Brown and Mike Wilder. They were all accepting of me and they helped me out of a lot. That means a tremendous amount to me. It makes you feel like you are one of them."

Indof posted 30 wins the next year, going on to notch 46 and 43 wins, respectively, in 2018 and 2019.

Before live racing was put on pause due to COVID-19 this spring, he had accumulated 15 wins and earnings of \$162,108.

His final trip to the winner's circle, pre-shutdown, on March 13 at The Meadows, came with Western Tyrant, a 6-year-old son of Western Terror.

Now that live racing has resumed [June 15 marked the return at The Meadows], expect to see Indof, who piloted Leap For Gold, at 9-1, to victory in race seven on Monday, doing a little more-self promotion.

"The challenge for me is dealing with the ups and downs. You can have a good month and then a really bad one. It's also hard to get work as a young driver. I think one thing I can do more of is to be more vocal with owners. Sometimes I

go into a little bit of a mute mode, so I need to do a better job of getting myself out there,” he said.

He’s also certain to recall the words of advice he received early on in his career from a respected horseman.

When a race gets underway, look for Indof to do his best to grab a position in the top three before the field reaches the quarter-mile mark.

“A guy named Bill Bercury, after my second ever start, he told me, ‘Put yourself in position to be at least third and then the wins will come.’ I’ll tell you this – the more I reminded myself of that, the more the wins came. I’ve never forgotten that. I’m trying to find that happy medium where I’m little aggressive, but I’m also patient enough. You realize that it’s the little things you’ve learned along the way that add up to make a big difference in your career.”

Indof hopes it’s a blueprint that leads to personal-best numbers in 2020, despite an interruption to the campaign.

What would be a good year in his eyes?

“I would say if I could string together at least 50 wins for the rest of the year, that would make it a successful one in my mind. I’ve never had a 100-win season yet, and that is something I definitely want to achieve. I want to make the

most of any opportunities that come my way. I want to reach that winner’s circle as much as possible. That’s always my goal.”

In the weeks leading up to the return of live racing, Indof maintained his competitive edge on fairways and fishing holes, a way to keep his mind sharp for when he sat in the sulky again.

“I’ve been doing a lot of bass fishing, trout fishing, and going after catfish, too. I don’t have a great fishing story to share from this year. But whenever I get one on the line, I don’t give up. I just keep my head about me and do whatever it takes to land it.”

Just like the catch driver does on the racetrack.

For Indof, a huge fan of the University of Texas football team, there is always another catfish to catch, birdie putt to sink, and winning race to chase.

“I’m just really glad to get back at it, to be racing again. Being a competitive person, you miss the things that give you that adrenaline rush.”

Gimpanzee is a 4-year-old horse by Chapter Seven—Steamy Windows. He is now one for one in 2020. He now has 18 career victories. He was just a fifth of a second off his lifetime best mile.

Back-to-back 18-race cards on tap at Big M

Horsemen sent up a signal. They needed some help. Management at the Meadowlands answered the call.

After last week's overloaded entry box saw 777 horses hoping to get raced, many had to continue to wait on the sidelines in the wake of the COVID-19 shutdown. Two days ago, the box had over 600 horses drop in, hoping for a chance. What was different this time around, was that instead of the usual 26 races on the condition sheet, the Big

M race office – at the urging of track chief executive officer and chairman Jeff Gural – will have 36 this weekend, with gigantic 18-race programs tonight and Saturday that have a special first-race post time of 6 p.m.

"We made a concerted effort to get as many horses raced as possible, which will get much-needed purse money to as many connections as possible," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemyre. "Horsemen need racetracks and racetracks need horsemen, so with neighboring states still not racing, we felt it was the right thing to do to increase the number of races by 39 per cent over the upcoming weekend.

"Of course, we are happy to give our fans as many opportunities to play the races as possible, but this move is more with horsemen in mind. They have been waiting so patiently to get back to work and we wanted to give them as much opportunity as we possibly could."

COME OUT TO PLAY: There will be an expanded wagering menu offering an increased number of the more popular Big M puzzles tonight and Saturday.

The Meadowlands' "Big Four" bets will increase to a "Big Six" this weekend, as there will be an additional 50-cent Pick-4 and 20-cent Pick-5. Here is when the track's most popular multi-leg wagers will be offered. All will have a low 15 percent takeout:

- **Pick-4s** will be offered on races 6-9, 10-13 and 15-18
- **Pick-5s** will be offered on races 1-5 and 14-18
- The **20-cent Pick-6** will be offered on races 4-9

The remainder of the menu will look like this:

- **Win, Place, Show, Exacta, Trifecta and Superfecta** will be available on every race
- **Pick-Threes** will begin in races 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13 and 16
- **Daily Doubles** will be offered on races 1-2 and 17-18

Regular players of the **20-cent Jackpot Super High-Five** will no doubt get involved in chasing a pair of big carryovers. In the fifth race, the pool will have a \$50,358 head start, while in the 18th, the carryover stands at \$59,763.

HOW TO WATCH, HOW TO BET: For those anxious to be a part of the Big M action, they can watch the races on the Roberts Television Network (rtn.tv) or on the Television Games Network (TVG). To bet the races in New Jersey, go to 4njbets.com, and if out of state, go to tv.com or your favorite ADW (advance-deposit wagering) platform.

CONSISTENT PLAY CONTINUES: Betting remained steady last weekend at the industry's handle leader as a total of

\$2,650,358 was wagered Friday (June 12) before \$2,868,359 was put in play Saturday (June 13), marking the 11th straight program where wagering exceeded the \$2.5-million mark. Saturday's per race average was \$220,643.

FIRST THE BELMONT, THEN THE BIG M: The Belmont Stakes, this year the first leg in the thoroughbred Triple Crown Series due to the effects of the COVID-19 shutdown, takes place on Saturday and has a post time of 5:42 p.m., exactly 18 minutes before the Meadowlands card gets underway.

GETTING IT DUNN: Last weekend's leading Big M driver was Dexter Dunn, who won five of the 26 races, including a victory in the Preferred for pacers with Dancin Lou. Next in line was Tim Tetrick with four scores.

On the training side, Chris Ryder and Andrew Harris both had three winners.

CHECK OUT THE TEAM: For those who need to get a leg up on the action, go to playmeadowlands.com to see track oddsmaker and analyst Dave Brower's selections and commentary. Go to the "handicapping" drop down and then go to "race reviews".

Last week, the Big M TV team did well, as all four members – Brower, Dave Little, Warkentin and Jessica Otten – saw their best bets win on Saturday.

Meadowlands fans love the Pick-4, and the mile oval's "on set" team of Brower and Little shined a week ago. Brower picked both Pick-4s on Friday while Little added one. Then, for good measure, on Saturday, Little gave out the Early Pick-4, which paid a healthy \$543 for a \$32 wager.

When this weekend's pre-game shows get underway at 5:30 p.m., check out the team's best bets and value plays. Little and Brower will do some news and notes and will also look at each evening's feature races. They will give out Pick-4 selections during the evening before saying good night after the 16th-race replay with the segment "Little's Late Double", where the former Daily News handicapper tries to send everybody home a winner.

Racing action restarts Saturday afternoon at Pocono

The first pari-mutuel racing card in the "second part" of the season at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono will take place this Saturday afternoon, with the first of 14 races to be going postward at 12:30 p.m. (Pocono comes back with racing on

Saturday, Monday, and Tuesday at 12:30, with the Sunday card beginning at 7).

The top event scheduled on the return card is a \$17,200 contest for fast-class pacers, with the millionaire Rockin Ron drawing the rail in the field of seven. The Ron Burke trainee, who has amassed \$1,660,449 so far in his career, gets a bit of relief in company here after running into a 1:49 mile by Bechers Brook A while finishing fifth, timed in 1:49.4, in his first post-pandemic outing.

Bakersfield, who himself has a bankroll in excess of \$400,000 and a 1:49.1 lifetime mark at Philly, deserves a look from bettors if for no other reason than his trainer, Gilbert Garcia-Herrera, sent out five winners from ten starters during the first set of Pocono qualifiers last Saturday, with Bakersfield winning handily in 1:55.2.

Tyler Buter, who won the last pre-shutdown race at The Downs on March 9, has a chance to complete a "102-day consecutive driving double" with McBoogitty in the day's first race – this pacer shows two seconds and a third in his last three starts against similar company, but he has not raced since the last weekend here before the hiatus.

In the second half of the double, much respect will go to Cattlewash, another Burke trainee, who will be making his sophomore debut after winning in excess of \$300,000 as a baby and taking a mark of 1:50.3 at Lexington. Cattlewash will need to come back sharp to overcome the outermost draw in a field of nine talented youngsters.

On the trotting side, Lindsey's Pride may be the horse to beat in an \$11,200 contest after opening his 2020 account with two straight 1:55 qualifying wins at Wingate Farms Spa, an east-central Pennsylvania training facility which has raced qualifying events the last two Mondays for its local horsemen's colony.

Trainer Chris Ryder, conditioner of last year's 3-year-old champion Bettor's Wish, may have a pair of sophomores "waiting in the wings" as they come to Philly off 2020 winning debuts – Moneyman Hill in the third race and Barrage Hanover in the 14th race final contest.

Sunday's Philly action will begin at 12:40 p.m. As the track swings into its regular schedule, racing will start at 12:25 p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

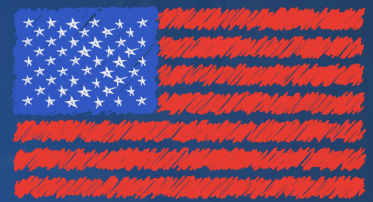
