

Crunch Time

Moments before going to post in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup, trainer Nancy Johansson called on her secret weapon and Captain Crunch went out and recorded an epic 1:47.2 Canadian record in the nation's richest race.



With millions on the line, trainer Nancy Johansson wasn't about to screw around. After her star 3-year-old pacing colt Captain Crunch warmed up for last Saturday's \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Johansson called on her secret weapon — her 14-year-old daughter, Ella, who was back home in New Jersey and ready to give her boy a pep talk via FaceTime.

A week earlier in his NA Cup elimination, Captain Crunch — the 2018 2-year-old pacing colt of the year in the U.S. — jumped at a shadow near the quarter pole and made an uncharacteristic break in stride. He rebounded to finish fifth to grab one of the two final spots in the final.

But don't count Ella among the sudden doubters and bandwagon leapers heading into the final where Captain Crunch went off at a generous 4-1 out of the eight hole, making him the fourth betting choice in the field of 10. After all, Ella was the one that insisted her mother find a way to buy the pacer at the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sales yearling auction in Harrisburg, PA; a request Nancy scrambled to grant, eventually finding owners willing to pony up \$85,000.


"It's the weirdest thing – (Ella) doesn't really go to the barn a lot and it's not like she really goes out of her way to see (Captain Crunch) or anything like that, but I FaceTimed her (from the Mohawk paddock) and, all of a sudden, his ears went up when he heard her and he was trying to eat my phone and he was just all into it. It was just very weird. He responds to her in a weird kind of way. He must know that she was the first one to have confidence in him, so it was, 'I'm not going to disappoint you.'

"She said, 'You've got this, big boy. You're the best and don't let anybody tell you different.' She was just motivating and has a whole motivational speech for him before races."

Soon after, Captain Crunch posted an inspiring 1:47.2 Canadian record with Scott Zeron at the controls.

MILLIONS ON THE LINE

Working with great horses is nothing new to Nancy. She's been around more than her share — such as 2014 U.S. and Canadian Horse of the Year JK She's alady — since she went out on her own in 2013 and, before that, working for her father, Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter.

Nancy Johansson said Captain Crunch is brimming with confidence and likes to shout in the paddock. "He lets everyone know that he's there."

But managing a stallion prospect potentially worth millions? That's a whole new ballgame for Nancy, who turns 38 this Sunday.

"I've had a lot of good fillies, but managing a colt is obviously different than managing a filly. This colt could go on and have a big stallion career and there's a lot riding on what happens every week with a colt," Nancy said of the son of Captaintreacherous out of Sweet Paprika, a mare who is a half-sister to stallion Sweet Lou. "You're almost dealing with a stock and you want to keep the value of the stock where it's at all the time. I had Kissin In The Sand last year and her value kind of stayed the same all last year. As long as she was racing well, she had good value. She'll go on and be a great broodmare for Marvin Katz and Bud Hatfield."

Captain Crunch was initially purchased by the 3 Brothers Stable of New York (and JK She'salady fame), Rojan Stables of Wilmington, DE and Caviart Farms of Vienna, VA.

"Then, once the hammer had fallen and the partners were standing there, my dad called me right away and said, 'Did you buy that Captaintreacherous colt out of Sweet Paprika?' I said, 'Yeah, I bought him.' He said, 'See if the partners would let your mom take 10 per cent of him? He's a beautiful looking horse."

While the NA Cup was one of the few big races Takter never won before retiring as a trainer at the end of 2018, Nancy joked on NA Cup night that her parents made out better winning it for the first time as part-owners.

"If you can't do it as a trainer you may as well do it as an owner. (My dad) wasn't going to not get (the NA Cup), you know," Johansson said, laughing. "Seriously, it's probably more lucrative to do it as an owner than as a trainer. I'm only getting five per cent and he owns 10 per cent of the horse. Well, actually, my mom does."

It is tradition at the Takter household to drape the blanket from major stakes victories over the statue of a horse that stands outside Jimmy and Christina's house. Nancy was delighted to place the Pepsi North America Cup blanket there the day after Captain Crunch's huge victory.

"I thought to myself, 'We've been waiting a long time to

get a North America Cup.' There's been Hambletonian blankets on there, Breeders Crown blankets, Jug blankets and it took a long time to get a North America Cup blanket on there, so I'm really hoping that in a few weeks we can put a Meadowlands Pace blanket on there and we can be good," Nancy said. "We'll complete the circle, then we can just start trying to double up on things."

Nancy's parents were in Sweden when Captain Crunch won the Cup. When it was done, Jimmy texted his daughter a simple message.

"People assume my dad is really involved in everything," Nancy said of her larger-than-life father. "He did not text me a single time (on Saturday) or say anything to me until after the race, when he said, 'Good job, I'm so proud of you.' That was it. He's been really good like that. Obviously, that makes me feel good that my dad would trust me, especially with a horse that he and my mom have a share in.

That said, Nancy said she knows she has an in-house expert when it comes to stallion management. Jimmy estimates he had a hand in creating some 50 stallions worldwide in his career.

"There's nobody that does that side of the business better than he does and I'm sure he'll be very useful in the future when I need advice," she said.

BIG RACE PEDIGREE

In the meantime, she will trust her skills and instincts. That big-horse, big-race, big-reward mentality was firmly planted in her mind long ago.

It's the reason June 15 has long been circled on Nancy's calendar.

"Going into this year, obviously the North America Cup was the first big thing on the calendar that was circled with a big, red circle because that's our first goal. Everything was 'When we go to the North America Cup...' So to go there and actually get the job done, is very, very rewarding," she said.

"You always have to believe in your system and what you're doing in the winter and spring when you're preparing these horses for the stakes races, but to be able to win and then win in a stakes and Canadian record and track record, you know, it's a nice affirmation that what you did all winter actually was working and it paid off."

Not that it was an easy journey, especially when Nancy's heart nearly crumbled watching Captain Crunch break stride in his elimination.

"At that point, I didn't even realize there was a shadow or anything and I was like 'What the heck just happened?' but

then I saw him get back on stride pretty quickly and I thought, 'Okay, he's going to be stuck on the outside now' because no one is going to give him an easy ride from there, because everyone was probably like 'Okay, that's good he ran, let's get him out of the finals.' When he was on the backside, I thought he still looked comfortable. He got tired coming down the stretch a bit, but he's just such a tough horse and he will give you 110 per cent effort every time he can. He will not disappoint in that way, so I actually felt like even when they were at the three-quarter pole, I was still hopeful that he would make the final and be able to get it done."

She trained Captain Crunch at Mohawk three days before the Cup final.

"I trained him a doubleheader, he went in 2:30 and then I walked him for five minutes and then he trained in 2:10, with a 1:02 back half, so I just wanted, mainly, to have him go around the track just for some experience.

"I didn't think that there was any physical issue or equipment issue or anything like that that needed to be taken care of. He trained super on Wednesday, so I wasn't really concerned about anything... I think it was just for my peace of mind, and maybe a little bit for his, too, that the first turn was okay and there wasn't going to be a big monster shadow jumping out at him when the gate let go (for the final)."

Bobble aside, Nancy said she was a little baffled the bettors somewhat jumped off Captain Crunch for the final.

"He was amazing in his two previous starts and in his qualifiers. And he was the Dan Patch Award winner and he won the Governor's Cup and the Breeders Crown. I was just kind of, 'Oh, that was quick with everyone jumping off his bandwagon.' Really, it wasn't that he raced badly or that he wasn't good enough, it was just weird. I think, too, it was having Post 8. If he had the five-hole or something like that, people would have been more inclined to stay on the bandwagon. But, you know what, that doesn't really matter to me now."

Nancy laughed as she said this. Winning a huge race has a miraculous way of dulling the memory of a troubled journey to get there, especially when the Crunch Crew is bursting with supreme confidence that starts with the horse himself.

"He's actually really confident. I think that's the best way to describe him. He's cool as a cucumber. He's quiet. He's a pleasure to work with and never gives you a hard time. He'll let you do whatever you need to do with him. You never have to fight him to do anything. With that confidence, he screams a lot," Nancy said, laughing. "He's very loud in the paddock. He will let everyone know that he's coming into the paddock and when he's walking out of the paddock, but he's not a bad stud in any way. He can go out into the field and have other fillies or mares in the paddock next to him and that won't bother him at all, but when he's at the race paddock, he lets everyone know that he's there.

"They are very accommodating at Mohawk, I asked for one of the new stalls with the higher walls, otherwise he would have been screaming all night. It wouldn't have been good for anybody in the paddock."

Nancy said Zeron shares Captain Crunch's confidence.

"Scott's been talking about this race all the time, like, 'I'm going to win the North America Cup. I've never been so sure about winning the North America Cup...' When he came back (after winning) and I met him with the horse and we hugged and everything, he said 'I got it, the last thing on my bucket list!' And I looked at him and said, 'You're only 30 years old, you should really add to that bucket list of yours."

Nancy stressed Captain Crunch's success is a huge team victory — something she posted about on Facebook the morning after the Cup triumph thanking everyone by name, including her husband, Marcus, the owners, Zeron, the vets, farriers and caretakers Annette Zackrisson (at home in New Jersey), Katie Remmerswaal (for crossing the border with the stable's horses) and Ben Hollingsworth for paddocking Crunch at the Cup.

"It really is a team type of thing. If you think of it, running a stable is kind of like running a cruise ship," Nancy said.
"Maybe I'm the captain of the ship, but there's so much other stuff that goes on that needs to keep things moving."

In Captain Crunch's case, it all started with a girl named Ella that made a deep connection with a horse in Harrisburg.

"When we were at the sale Ella said, 'Mom, you have to buy this Captaintreacherous colt' and then she left and that was the last thing she said to me. I just had this feeling like, 'You need to buy that horse. You need to get this done, find partners for him and you need to buy this horse."

After the Cup was won, Nancy rushed out of Mohawk to fly home to New Jersey.

"I wanted to get home to my family because I was in Canada for 10 days," she said.

Sunday morning, she sat down and watched the replay with Ella.

"She said 'I can't believe how good he was.' I said, 'Well, he's a great horse. You picked a great horse, Ella."

Less than 24 hours after her richest career triumph, Nancy Johansson finally had the time to process the enormity of the victory and realize it wasn't a dream.

"You get a chance to sit back and think, 'Wow, he actually won the North America Cup. That actually happened."

Clinton Raceway's Legends Day is a trip back in a harness racing time machine

The biennial event in support of the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation — featuring Doug Brown, John Campbell, Steve Condren, Wally Hennessey, David Miller, Bill O'Donnell, Trevor Ritchie, Dave Wall and Keith Waples and Ron Waples — is on tap for this Sunday at Clinton Raceway.

If you have ever dreamed of hopping into the DeLorean with Marty McFly and travelling back in time, Clinton Raceway's Legends Day should be on your bucket list.

A biennial fundraiser for the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation, Legends Day has the feel of an old-time fair meet. The crowd is robust and multigenerational, the atmosphere is laidback and the horse tales are colorful and abundant.

This year's edition goes postward on Sunday, June 23 at 1:30 pm and features 12 races, including the \$15,000 Legends Day Trot, five Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots divisions for the 3-year-old trotting colts, the Ian Fleming Hall of Fame Induction Race and the Sharpe's Summer Series Final for pacing fillies and mares.

Aside from the races, the day's highlight is an opportunity to meet Hall of Fame drivers Doug Brown, Steve Condren, Wally Hennessey, Dave Miller, Trevor Ritchie, Dave Wall and Ron Waples, who will all drive in the Legends Day Trot. Joining them for the autograph session will be John Campbell, Bill O'Donnell and Keith Waples.

"I'm going to be able to socialise quite a bit more when I am not racing, because I can spend most of the day on the front side, so I am looking forward to that aspect being different," said Campbell, who made his final drive in the 2017 Legends Day Trot. "It's going to be a little more relaxing for me.

"It's a day that I always look forward to, it's just a great day for me. So many people that I see were around when I started out at Western Fair, and I've still got a lot of friends and family in southwestern Ontario, so it's really a great time for me to catch up and see people that, a lot of the people I only see them at Legends Day."

Campbell and his fellow Hall of Famers will sign autographs between 2 and 3 pm, or until the line abates. Two o'clock also marks the grand opening of the new playground facility on the grounds, where the first 200 kids will be treated to free cupcakes and hot dogs. There will also be face painting and a chance to win a bicycle and a season-long family swim pass for the public pool located

just off the first turn.

"Since the last Legends Day the municipality and the raceway and a bunch of community groups have gotten together and we've got a splash pad, a skateboard park, a new playground and a picnic pavilion, all put up since 2017," said Clinton Raceway's general manager Ian Fleming, whose upcoming Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame induction will be celebrated in Race 5. "The grand opening is this Sunday, so we're excited about that, it will add to the day obviously."

While the youngest members of the family enjoy the new park facilities, the adults can size up the offerings in the silent auction and bake sale or pick up their 50-50 draw tickets. Since its inauguration in 2001, Legends Day has raised more than \$210,000 for the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation, with 2017 hitting a record-setting \$60,000 thanks to the addition of a pre-event online auction.

"Right from Day 1 (the silent auction) always raised between \$20,000 and \$25,000 on the day, but two years ago we started an online auction and we got \$60,000," said Fleming. "That was our record by a mile so we're hoping, in a perfect world, to get a little over \$60,000. It's one charity, I mean every cause is a good one, but that's one charity that everybody can subscribe to.

"The foundation staff is a great help to us and they sell a lot of the barbecue tickets. And the online auction, there's lots of horse stuff on there, but there's lots of local stuff too, dinners and golf and condos and that, so it's a real community effort."

The online auction closes between 7 and 9:30 pm tonight (June 21), so there may be time to place a bid at http://www.legendsdayauction.com/. There may also be a few \$20 tickets left for the Pineridge Chicken Barbecue, which sees 100 per cent of the ticket sales donated back to the Foundation. In addition to visiting with friends and steering A J Cash from Post 4 in the Legends Day Trot, Dave Wall will be paying special attention to the five OSS Grassroots divisions.

"I have a trotting colt (Gold Creek Drive) this year that I like a lot. I haven't qualified him yet or anything, but he's a nice colt. He's three now," said Wall. "He's an Angus Hall, out of a good mare I had, a real good mare, Dell Ridge Savanna, I think she sold as a yearling for \$70,000. I had trouble getting her in foal so she hasn't had a foal for a few years. This is the last one she had."

A two-time winner of the Lampman Cup as the top driver in the Ontario Sires Stakes program, Wall earned the nickname "Mr. OSS" for his willingness to criss-cross the province with sires stakes mounts. Among the horses Wall guided to stardom in the program were Armbro Luxury, Arrochar Wendy, Daisy Harbor, Dovers Dottie and Dovers Surge, Goodtimes, Gypsy Balance, Northern Bailey and Odies Fame.

"I did a lot of them, you're right," said Wall with a chuckle. "But it's been a good thing, not only for me, it's been a good thing for the industry, that's for sure.

"It seems to be that people still go to those type of races, whether it's Grassroots or Gold, they seem to show up at them, no matter where they're at."

Wall looks forward to being asked to drive in the Legends Day Trot each year, noting that Clinton was one of the first places he appeared as a young driver.

"When I started out racing years ago, that's kind of where I started. I made a lot of trips up there," said the Komoka, ON resident, who soon graduated to the 'A' circuit and spent three decades making nightly trips to Greenwood, Mohawk and Woodbine racetracks.

"It's nice to go, I enjoy it. They make a nice day of it and they seem to really have a big crowd for that day. You see people you haven't seen for a while and it's just an enjoyable day for me anyway."

Those who cannot make the trip to Clinton to experience Legends Day first hand can enjoy the event vicariously through the 'Facebook Live' broadcast sponsored by the Central Ontario Standardbred Association. The show, featuring Greg Blanchard, Mark McKelvie and Jaimi

Thoughts on hyperbaric chambers, the USTA's opposition to the integrity act, trainers that overly support their own stallions and why we don't see as many top trainers paired with top drivers anymore

Tidbits: To all my readers on the northern side of the border that are in total denial and went crazy over the FACT that I said your fans were classless by cheering when Kevin Durant went down hurt in Game 5 of the NBA finals, I offer proof in the following articles that I was right on the money:

What a weekend of racing. I don't know who to start applauding. Absolutely great show put on by Woodbine Mohawk Park the entire evening. All the top finishers in the Pepsi North America Cup raced great. It amazes me how quickly people react to a misstep. Captain Crunch was odds on when they announced the original field and looked totally unbeatable. After jumping a shadow he was diminished immediately to third choice in the betting even after a miraculous comeback. Certainly some sharp punters got well. Congratulations to Nancy Johansson who did what dad was unable to in winning the Cup, and Scott Zeron for a fabulous



drive. Can I say more than DEXTER DUNN? The Meadowlands Pace should be spectacular. Congratulations to all the other winners it would take up too much space to list.

One note that's a breath of fresh air, there were six major stakes at Mohawk won by six different drivers and five different trainers Tony Alagna had a double. Parity is a wonderful thing.

Someone should check the sex on Shartin N. To me she looks like a stallion. What an amazing mare.

What a shock! Bill Mott has announced that Country House will be out for the remainder of 2019. He hasn't done well after having a fever the day after winning the Kentucky Derby and missing the Preakness and the Belmont. It wouldn't shock me if he attempted stud duty next season rather than race again. "Even a blind pig can find an ear of corn."

I have a pet peeve and I am not alone. Why can't announcers study the program PRIOR to the races with enough time to ask when they are not sure of the pronunciation of the name of a trainer, driver, horse or owner? It's not only annoying to hear it it's disrespectful to the individual. There is no reason whatsoever for this not to be accomplished. Maybe if my name was Ronnie Smith I wouldn't care as much, but when your last name is Gurfein and you hear 50 versions of your name over the years it becomes trying. I am not singling out the Woodbine Mohawk Park announcers at all because they could be the least offenders. The bad ones know who they are. With TVG covering a great deal of the Grand Circuit races this situation becomes more important.

Speaking of race callers, here's one with today's first question:

Frank Salive asks: Could you please comment on Workin On A Mystery in the NA Cup? You probably heard or watched the draw press conference as trainer Brian Brown explained the horse was sent to Kentucky after the elimination. Have you ever used the hyperbaric chamber (loosely defined as oxygen therapy to improve athletic performance). The travel time from Mohawk to Lexington is nine hours each way. Won't the shipping time have an effect on the colt? Was shipping that far a necessity? There was no chamber closer? Mike Hamilton mentioned this angle in his column.

Great questions I feel all lead to a conspiracy theory. Not so!

Brian Brown is a smart man and would not subject himself to strange queries if he thought there was anything improper with what he was planning.

To start with, the end of the questions first. There are very few Hyperbaric Chambers for horses north of Kentucky. Most are based there or in Texas.

What the chamber does is increase the air pressure three times that of normal. Pure oxygen is pumped in, therefore the horse is receiving far more oxygen to his lungs than under normal circumstances. The blood carries the oxygen throughout the body. It helps fight bacteria and stimulates the release of substances called growth factors and stem cells which promote healing.

Brown's colt was recovering from a serious upper respiratory infection and he obviously felt that a few days in the chamber would help the process immensely.

The process does enhance the blood count and the ability of the body to retain oxygen, but I never heard that it did it enough to enhance performance. Horseman today have far less expensive ways to increase red blood cells. It will in fact creating a healthier animal, like calming sore joints like EPM medication.

Unfortunately, I did use the chamber and only once with not so great results. I was training a colt named Cadillac Hall a brother to Cantab Hall, for Alan Leavitt and he thought that the chamber was "the cat's meow," so I did what any trainer would do and listened to the boss. To make a sordid long story short, the colt freaked out and fell down and broke his knee. That was my first and last endeavor to the chamber.

Bill Bigler asks: What do you think about the USTA coming out against the Integrity Act as proposed in congress on June 12?

The statement published by the USTA in regard to their reasons for opposing the act are so terribly misinformed it's embarrassing. Two weeks ago, the Federal government didn't know the difference between a harness horse and a mouse, and all of a sudden they are going to attempt to level the playing field in our sport and we don't want it? Give me a break. Sacrifice Lasix for uniform drug enforcement nationwide it's a panacea.

The USTA statement claims there are no other existing drugs to replace Lasix. Not that I care, but I can name a few. They go on to say that drugging is not a problem in our sport because 99 per cent of our testing is negative.

How about if we had tests that work maybe 60 per cent of our testing would be negative.

To me it's pitiful that a drug can be used in Pennsylvania 24 hours out and the same drug in New Jersey must be withdrawn in six days. For the rules to be equal would be a major positive step to parity.

For positive tests to become a Federal crime in itself would be a deterrent.

I don't want to go step by step on the points discussed, but if you read the statement you will surely understand where I am coming from.

Craig Gordon is at it again, and I promise this will be the last of my answers to him. He says, in answer to my reply to his question last week, "U can twist it any way U want. Qualifiers don't pay the bills. He (Tony Alagna) has 100 horses. How many are making a profit? He has like 40 Captains none are any good. Tall Drink Hanover is a homebred not one they picked out."

Why am I answering this guy, only god knows, but he infuriates me. I really would like to know why Alagna's success or failure has anything to do with him.

Just for the record, just this past weekend the Alagna barn won two major stakes at Mohawk with Pilot Discretion and Treacherous Reign another of his "no good" Captains and had Captain Trevor and Major Deception both win at the Meadowlands in 1:49.

That said, how could Tall Drink Hanover be a homebred as she was sold to Tony as Hip# 160 at the Harrisburg sale 2017 for \$35,000. Please find another subject!

I will repeat it's not my job to defend Tony, most of all because he doesn't need it, but to set the record straight you can't figure success by the earnings numbers vs. the costs as the math will never work. The owners in his barn are in for the long hall and are trying to make stallions that provide major income. You have no idea how much the Captaintreacherous syndicate creates in available cash every year, and he is just one of many stallions from Tony's barn standing stud in 2019.

END OF THE STORY.

Jim Connors asks: What's your opinion on trainers going to the sales and loading up on yearlings by sires that they trained?

I think if you really loved the horse it is perfectly natural you buy his foals not only to have good horses but to help make your stallion.

This can also be very dangerous, and on the other hand can reap great rewards.

I loved Victory Dream and bought his son Self Possessed who I loved and bought his son Cantab Hall. Tony Alagna trained Captaintreacherous and many of his sons and daughters are great, Linda Toscano trained Chapter Seven and is doing great loading her barn with his yearlings.

However, I must point out that the failures are far more abundant than the successes.

Two sorrowfully come to mind and cost two Ronnie's a fortune. Mr Vic financially buried me, as was Ronnie Waples misfortune of having a barn full of Ralph Hanovers.

I could go on and on down this road, but I don't want to depress you early on Friday morning.

To all the young trainers out there, remember just because you broke and trained a new sire doesn't insure he will be a good one.

Ed Dugan Asks: How come drivers are no longer hooked up with trainers like they used to? I remember you and Mike Lachance and Chuck Sylvester and John Campbell were almost inseparable.

Basically, the dynamics of the sport have radically changed. When Mike and John we're driving all Chuck's and my horses it was easy for them because we had small stables and they weren't tied to only one barn. Plus we had a lot of power.

Today, with a few barns of 100 or more horses, no driver has the ability to race them all.

Chuck and I raced mostly trotters. He had a few pacers and I probably didn't have a pacer in my barn for 20 years. That left about 75 per cent of the card for Mike and John to drive for others.

I think there was a definite loyalty factor involved then that still exists but not nearly as strong. Mike would always pick my 20-1 shot over a 3-5 from another barn. Yannick Gingras drove first call to Burke and Takter but if they had 30-1 shots and he was named on a 3-5 from another barn many times he would jump ship. To be honest, I think Ron Burke and Jimmy Takter were okay with it.

Somehow winning major races together as trainer/driver creates a bond. I still see it today with Tim Tetrick with the Kings and Linda Toscano. Tetrick rarely, if ever, goes elsewhere.

After all is said and done, I promise you no driver trainer combo had more FUN in this sport, traveling the country and racing from Montreal to DuQuoin and even to Europe, than Lachance and Gurfein. The stories I could tell.

TrackMaster president David Siegel opens up about his company's ratings and more

Nearly one year ago to the day this column wrote about the potential for TrackMaster to become the new standard in classifying horses in race conditions. (full story here) Best known for its electronic past performances and handicapping data including horse speed ratings, TrackMaster has since expanded into the creation of automated morning lines and now racetracks use their horse ratings to determine race classification. It's the most recent move that's been received with some controversy, including a letter from one of those detractors that was published here in HRU last week (2019-06-16 Feedback).

What began last year with Ocean Downs, a total of 10 tracks including the Meadowlands now employ the TrackMaster horse ratings to some degree in determining their race classification as a substitute or complement to other conditions such as earnings. The two main questions are: 1. Shouldn't the horsepeople and public know specifically what goes into the numbers since it now effects how horses are entered? 2. Is the TrackMaster rating system even reliable enough to be used as a classification tool?

TrackMaster president David Siegel was extremely candid in his discussion over those very topics.

"The system is totally transparent," said Siegel. "There is a website that explains the entire algorithm, so anybody out there could calculate the same number that we calculate. Any person can look up the TrackMaster rating for any horse in North America and how that number has changed in the last 30 days. On the site there is 30 files and in those 30 files are roughly 30,000 horses and each one of those has a rating."

What Siegel says is correct insofar as being able to see daily horse ratings and how those final calculations are determined, what it doesn't tell you is how the underlying speed ratings are derived in the first place. This is TrackMaster's intellectual property, though Siegel did provide the four key ingredients for the speed rating – or, in other words, a way to normalize a horse's finishing time.

"Specific things that go into the speed rating are final time, an inter-track variant, a daily track variant which is how the track is playing that day relative to normal, and the fourth one is post position," Siegel said. "So as an example, it's actually possible at Yonkers where if you came out of the 8-hole and I came out of the 1-hole and I beat you by a neck, it's possible that you would come out of it with a higher speed rating than I would."

Siegel was firm in stating that TrackMaster doesn't dictate how tracks are to use their figures. TrackMaster only provides tracks with one number for a horse and it is up to the tracks how to use that information, which nearly all tracks use in a variety of ways. Further, as for transparency, "If I were running a track I would have the TrackMaster explanation front and center in the program or maybe even in the header of the race condition. I believe in transparency and our information is there more than anything else. There's a lot of other stuff in the condition sheets that you can't always tell by looking at the program how a horse got in."

There is no doubt whatsoever in Siegel's mind that while not perfect, the TrackMaster horse rating system is the best alternative to traditional means to classify horses, provided that the goal is to put together the most competitive races possible.

"In fact, I have personally had a race secretary say to me, 'I need to spread the money around.' Now that's a different goal; spreading the money to horsemen is a different goal than forming a competitive race."

There are many obvious pitfalls and ways to game the system in using earnings as a way to classify, and there is also far too much subjectivity in the A-B-C system. What the results have shown over the past year seem to be an undeniable success for the TrackMaster ratings when comparing races that don't include TrackMaster conditions and ones that do.

Siegel cites statistics from this year for Plainridge Racetrack, one of the tracks that heavily utilizes the TrackMaster ratings. From their opening this year in April up through June 17, there have been 173 non TrackMaster races and 164 TrackMaster races, where a race is being considered TrackMaster if at least one of their conditions used their figures (such as Also Eligible horses with under an 80 rating). From those races, the field sizes were 7.3 in non TrackMaster races and 8.4 in TrackMaster races. In fact, every single one of the 10 tracks using TrackMaster showed larger field sizes in

TrackMaster races, which in turn provide more opportunities and larger potential payouts for bettors. Back to Plainridge, 61 per cent of their non TrackMaster races had an odds-on favorite, but only 35 per cent of races using at least one TrackMaster condition had an odds-on favorite. The same positive measures hold true at the track for percentage of winning favorites and the average odds of each winning horse. Every metric result's in a positive variance for the track.

Issues that some have with TrackMaster – including ones brought forth in this column previously – go deeper than their horse ratings and more towards their overall industry standing. Siegel believed it was completely fair to discuss the company's position in the sport and whether or not it's a net positive.

He disagreed with my premise over the perception that TrackMaster has a hold over the sports data.

"We pay handsomely and it's in the USTA's annual report so I'm happy to disclose it because it's in there — \$900,000 a year to the USTA," Siegel said. "We pay to have an exclusive on distribution of electronic handicapping information — those are the three magic words — electronic handicapping information. We have a decent number of customers who get all our data and who use it and who build programs from it. The only thing they are precluded from doing is commercially exploiting it. So, I think the question is, is the fact that we have an exclusive good or bad for the industry and what would happen if we didn't?

"I think we're terrific for the industry because the industry is so small that if the USTA decided to de-exclusive when the contract is up and take on other licensees kind of like Equibase does, I think given the relative size of the industry, it would mean while there would be here and there some small amounts of innovation, nobody could never undertake the things that we have done over the course of the past 22 years. The very fact that speed ratings exist and are out there in the public and they are in all the programs that are out there and, I don't think those would have been developed at the same scale that we've done. And that's just one example. When you look at the free services we have out there including the virtual stable as well as the automated morning lines that are now in use by more than 55 per cent



of starts right now and is better on average than humans, that wouldn't have happened on the same scale otherwise."

Siegel also took exception to the notion that if past performances were made available for free in the U.S., as they are in Canada, that handle would grow.

"To the people who say that handle goes up, they're wrong," said Siegel. If you are experimenting, you can look at the trend of handle in Canada and handle in the US. That's the best controlled experiment you're going to find, where in one location there are free past performances and in the other place they're not. That's the macro view. And when you get into specific examples where we did have fights along the way, about 10 years ago we had a dispute with Pompano Park where they wanted to provide online past performances for free on their site. I asked them one simple question, 'Do you give away your track programs on site?' And the answer was 'No, it's too big of a line item for us."

One year ago, it was widely unknown how the rating classification angle would be embraced or how successful it would be, but by any reasonable or objective measure the results speak for themselves. Through this process, TrackMaster continues to show why it believes itself to be a strong positive for the sport.

Cotolo further explains his comments about takeout

Frank Cotolo's Alternative Actions column published June 16 (full story here) drew some reader feedback from people that didn't exactly agree with Cotolo's take on takeout.

One reader tweeted the following question he wanted Cotolo to answer:

If takeout doesn't matter or nobody cares about it, then why when there is a carryover, which is strictly a takeout reduction, do pools increase by an average of 5x over the normal sized pool? When you have the answer, please let me know.

We asked Cotolo for his take and he responded as follows:

Mammoth exotic pools attract casual players and professional players (solo or in cartels) due to the raw amount of the prize. It is simply lottery mentality, not a

reduced takeout, that lures them to play. Betting (investing) a little to make a lot is a matter of human nature, not principal. No one who wins a huge lottery carryover is concerned with the amount of taxes due them; they are overjoyed with all the free money they have left over after the legal obligation. As such, ask anyone who wins, let's say, a thousand per 20 cents in a carryover pool, if they would not have played were the takeout increased. When you find that person, get back to me. Plus, this does not even touch the number of people who play super carryovers in exotic pari-mutuel pools or lotteries while ignoring the awful odds smaller tickets offer, rationalizing the gamble by saying, "Hey, someone's gotta win."

Greenshoe tops Hambletonian hopefuls in Beal elims

Five of the 10 horses in the Road to the Hambletonian rankings produced by Meadowlands Racetrack announcer/analyst Ken Warkentin will be in action Saturday (June 22) in eliminations for the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, with No. 1 Greenshoe headlining the event.

Greenshoe, who also is the top-ranked 3-year-old trotter in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, is 2-for-2 this season, with his most recent victory coming in the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship on May 31 at The Meadowlands. His times of 1:51.2 in the opening round of the NJSS and 1:50.2 in the final are the fastest miles of the season for a 3-year-old trotter.

The colt prepped for the Beal with a 28-length victory in a qualifier at Pocono on June 12. He was clocked in 1:52, which equaled the third-fastest win time of the season by a 3-year-old trotter.

Last year, Greenshoe won two of four races despite going off stride in each start. For his career, he has won four of six races and \$189,223 for trainer Marcus Melander. The colt is owned by Courant Inc., Hans Backe, Lars Granqvist, and Morten Langli.

"Talent and ability are not the issues, that's for sure," said Greenshoe's regular driver, Brian Sears. "He showed a lot of speed last year, but he's maturing every start behind the gate; every time we get a good experience it's a plus. Hopefully we get some more good trips in him and keep him on schedule. He just needs experience. He's a smart horse, he's just a little anxious at times, but he's definitely starting to grasp it."

Greenshoe is the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the second of two Beal eliminations Saturday. The six-horse field also includes Osterc, who won the Dexter Cup in May, and 2018 Kindergarten Classic champion Reign Of Honor. Osterc is No. 7 in the Road to the Hambletonian rankings and Reign Of Honor is No. 10.

The top-four finishers from each elimination plus the fifth-place finisher with the highest 2019 earnings advance to the \$500,000 final on June 29 at Pocono.



"It's early yet," Sears said, referring to the journey to the \$1 million Hambletonian on Aug. 3 at The Meadowlands. "It's easy to get excited (about Greenshoe), and why wouldn't you

be excited, but that's not my job to get excited. My job is to keep everything in perspective and know it's a long way to getting there."

Osterc, trained by Per Engblom, has won three of four races this season. His only loss came went he went off stride in a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes race he was leading at Pocono on June 2. He rebounded with a 1:52.2 victory in a PASS division at Harrah's Philadelphia on June 14.

"He made an uncharacteristic break at Pocono; he had everything under control and then he hit a knee and went off stride," Engblom said. "We adjusted his front shoes for (Philly), and he was good again. He was very good, actually; that's the best he's been all year. He was just cruising with ear plugs in.

"I know that we're in (Saturday) with Greenshoe, but aside from that I'm feeling confident with my horse. He's been so solid all year."

In the first Beal elim, Ron Burke-trained **Swandre The Giant** (No. 9 in the Road to the Hambletonian) is the 2-1 morning-line favorite, followed by **Summit In Sight** at 5-2. Summit In Sight raced only twice at age 2, but has four wins in six starts this season for trainer Julie Miller and driver Andy Miller. The colt was a \$300,000 yearling purchase at the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sale and is owned by Stroy Inc. and the Andy Miller Stable.

Summit In Sight, whose development last year was slowed by a bout with colic in the spring, enters his Beal elimination off a 1:53 win in a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes division on June 14 at Philly.

"We thought he could be a nice colt, so we put him away after two starts to try to get him ready for a nice 3-year-old year," Julie Miller said. "Training down, I don't know that he was very flashy, but he did everything right. That last start at (Philly) sort of stamped his ticket for the Beal; we were really happy with him."

Summit In Sight's only finish worse than second this year came in his seasonal debut in a conditioned race at The Meadowlands.

"That's the learning curve with him," Miller said. "We changed his equipment a little bit, trying to make him better every start. The last start was the best he's been."

Also in the first Beal elim is **Green Manalishi S**, a multiple stakes winner in 2018 who is making his seasonal debut for Melander. The colt is No. 4 in the Road to the Hambletonian.

All totaled, 11 of the 12 horses in the Beal eliminations are eligible to the Hambletonian. White Tiger and Sheer Muscle join that group in the first elim and Marseille, No Drama Please, and Goes Down Smooth join it in the second.

Saturday's card at Pocono begins at 7 p.m. (EDT) and also includes eliminations for the Ben Franklin Pace for older pacers, Max C. Hempt Memorial for 3-year-old male pacers, and James M. Lynch Memorial for 3-year-old female pacers. For complete entries, click here.

Svanstedt dials 'M' for magical in Graduate

With a returning Dan Patch Award winner (Six Pack) and multiple world-record-holder (Plunge Blue Chip) among his 4-year-old trotters, it's no surprise to find trainer Ake Svanstedt with a horse tied for the points lead after three rounds of the Graduate Series.

Except for the surprise.

The horse is Muscle M Up.

"He's a surprise. He's surprised me," Svanstedt said with a laugh about the 4-year-old stallion, who has a win and a second in his two Graduate starts. "When he came to me, he did not train so good before he qualified. But when he qualified, he was a different horse. He was a real racehorse. He wants to race. He has a good heart, very good heart."

Muscle M Up has won three of four races overall this season, earning \$54,000. The stallion was purchased by Knutsson Trotting Inc. at last fall's Standardbred Mixed Sale for \$65,000 after campaigning for breeder/owner Fashion Farms and trainer Jim Campbell. As a 2-year-old, Muscle M Up won two of three races including a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes. He was limited to eight starts, winning two, at age 3.

"I talked with Jim Campbell and he said he had a lot of problems when he was young," Svanstedt said. "Maybe he is older now and stronger. I think the time has helped. He feels like a good horse."

Muscle M Up, a son of Muscle Hill out of stakes-winner Fashion Athena, won his first Graduate start in a career-best 1:51.2 on May 18 at The Meadowlands. On June 9, he finished second to mare Custom Cantab in a Graduate division at Tioga Downs. Custom Cantab and gelding Crystal Fashion are tied with Muscle M Up with 60 points apiece in the series.

On Friday, Muscle M Up competes in the first of two \$50,000 final preliminary rounds of the Graduate Series at the Meadowlands. He faces a challenging task, meeting a field that includes newly minted Canadian record holder Atlanta, Crystal Fashion, Custom Cantab, Plunge Blue Chip, and 2017 Dan Patch Award winner Manchego.

Atlanta, the 2018 Trotter of the Year, is unbeaten in four races this season and heads to Friday's start off a 1:50.2 win in the Armbro Flight Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The Ron Burke-trained mare is the even-money favorite on the morning line.

"This is a tougher race for him, but I think he can do a good race," Svanstedt said about Muscle M Up, who will have Andy Miller in the sulky because Svanstedt will drive mare Plunge Blue Chip. "I think he is going to race good."

Plunge Blue Chip finished second to Atlanta in her elimination for the Armbro Flight Stakes but got sick the day after the race and was scratched from the final. She shares the world records for 3-year-old filly trotters on a half-mile

track (1:53.1) and mile track (1:49.4).

"She grew a lot during the winter," Svanstedt said about the mare, who has won 17 of 27 career races and earned \$1.01 million. "She is bigger and taller. She is a bigger horse. She did not grow so much between (ages) 2 and 3, but this winter she grew a lot. I'm excited to see what she can do this summer.

"There are some tough horses, but she raced (1):49.4 two times last year, so she's not so bad either. She trained a lot of miles but not so fast before she qualified, so every race is going to move her forward."

Svanstedt expects the same from Six Pack, improvement in every start. Six Pack, who last season became the fastest 3-year-old trotter in history (1:49.1) on his way to Dan Patch honors, is in the second Graduate division, where he is the 2-1 morning-line favorite over Fiftydallarbill (5-2) and Phaetosive (4-1).

Six Pack, a stallion who has won 16 of 25 career starts and \$1.38 million, captured his Graduate debut at the Big M before finishing third behind Crystal Fashion and Fiftydallarbill at Tioga.

The \$250,000 Graduate Series finals for trotters and pacers are July 6 at The Meadowlands.

Friday's card at the Big M also includes the third round of the Rainbow Blue Series for female pacers. Caviart Ally is the 8-5 morning-line favorite in a field of six going for a purse of \$40,000. Caviart Ally won the May 18 leg of the Rainbow Blue and enters Friday's race off a third-place finish in the Roses Are Red Stakes. Kissin In The Sand, the 2018 Dan Patch Award winner for best 3-year-old filly pacer, is the 2-1 second choice.

Bartlett wins 8,000th career race

Jason Bartlett, perennially Yonkers Raceway's leading driver, used his home away from home for his latest milestone.

Bartlett racked up career win No. 8,000 Monday night (June 17), easily knocking off the four victories needed to reach the plateau.

He won the \$15,000 pacing opener with favored Lounatic (\$4.40) in a life-best 1:55, then the \$18,000, third-race pace with odds-on Topville Angelina (\$2.30) in 1:54.1. That matched the ma'am's life-best effort.

Bartlett was making short work of the \$15,000, seventh-race pace as odds-on Passa-Grille Beach (\$3.30) widened to 834 lengths in a life-best 1:53.1.

He had to wait all of two races before turning over the odometer, getting No. 8,000 in the \$25,000, ninth-race pace with Charm's Lil Sis (\$9.30) in another life-best effort, this one in 1:54.1. The milestone miss is a

homebred 4-year-old daughter of Mach Three owned and Millar Farms and trained by Scott Blackler.

The same owner/driver/trainer troika combined to win last month's Lismore here with the 3-year-old pacing filly Bestseller Hanover.

"It's nice to do it here (Yonkers), with my family able to join me," Bartlett said. "I want to race here as often as I can, especially Fridays and Saturdays, since the money is so good."

Bartlett isn't an every-night local fixture, as he makes the rounds for New York Sire Stakes and some open-stakes engagements.

"I went to Northfield a couple of Saturdays ago (for the Battle of Lake Erie)," he said. "I had the chance to drive Jimmy Freight. He's a special horse and I enjoyed it, but I prefer Yonkers as often as possible.

"When I first came down here for good, I had maybe 2,000 wins, so to win as many as I have driving against the best there is, I appreciate that.

The 38-year-old Bartlett, a native of Augusta, ME, is trying for a ninth local driving title.

"Just thanking all the owners and trainers that have supported me and keep going."

Grand Swan remains perfect in stakes action at Hoosier

Indiana Sires Stakes action returned to Harrah's Hoosier Racing & Casino on Wednesday, June 19 as they play host to the second round of the stakes action for the 3-year-old competitors throughout the week. Indiana-sired sophomore trotting fillies were the featured attraction on the evening's 14-race card with two \$47,500 divisions for the 3-year-old trotting fillies.

In just her second start of the season, Grand Swan continued her winning ways to capture the opening division of the stakes action and deliver as the heavy betting favorite for driver, trainer LeWayne Miller. Stopping the timer in 1:54 over a track rated good, **Grand Swan** recorded her second win from two starts and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Leaving from post eight, Miller took no chances and his sent his filly straight to the front. Grand Swan would have to work for position as Kota's Swan and Sam Widger also left alertly to grab the lead through the opening quarter in :27.4 before relinquishing command just before the half. Grand Swan dictated fractions of :57.3 and 1:26.1 before being joined on the outside by Morairtime and John DeLong.

Employing a :27.4 final panel, Grand Swan was able to hold off Morairtime and also a late rally by Haylie Ivy and Ricky Macomber Jr. As the 3-5 favorite, Grand Swan returned \$3.40 to her backers at the betting window.

"I thought she might be a little short given the time off



because I wasn't able to train her as fast as I would have liked but she raced tough tonight," Miller said after the win. "It wasn't her ideal trip but she raced tough.

"She likes to work and likes to train so I think with a few more starts she will be even better. If she comes out of the race okay and everything checks out, we will probably try her in the Star Destroyer next week."

The \$50,000 Star Destroyer Stakes for three-year-old filly trotters is scheduled for June 26 at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The daughter of Swan For All—Queen Mum recorded her second win of the season and 10th lifetime victory from 14 trips behind the gate. With the win, Grand Swan pushed her lifetime earnings to \$235,625 for owners, Grand Swan Racing, Go Fast Stable, and Never 2 Late Stable. The win was also career driving win number 998 for driver LeWayne Miller who is on the verge of reaching the 1,000 win milestone.

The second division saw **Summit City Swan** and Brandon Bates spring the 13-1 upset and score in 1:55. Trained by Byron Hooley, Summit City Swan recorded her second consecutive win and recorded a new lifetime best.

Bates sent Summit City Swan away from the gate from post six to grab a pocket seat behind Kissesforall and Peter Wrenn who dictated first half fractions of :27.1 and :56.3. Trace Tetrick pointed Woodside Chelsea to the front approaching the third station in 1:26.1 with Summit City Swan tracking intently from the pocket.

As the leader began to tire, Bates found late racing room and Summit City Swan did her part, trotting home in :28.3 to get the victory. Sophia Lia and John DeLong rallied gamely for second while Savannah's Lucy and Todd Warren also closed well for third. Summit City Swan returned \$29.80 at the betting windows.

"She's one of those borderline fillies," Hooley said after the win. "She's always been a nice filly but I wasn't sure if she was a top stakes filly. I knew she was capable and could be competitive if it worked out for her, I just wasn't sure if she could go with the rest of them."

"She's been racing well. She is eating well and looks good so I thought we would give it a shot tonight. She's a really nice filly to be around and very easy to work with."

With the win, the daughter of Swan For All-Earls Miss

Muffit recorded her fourth win from 10 seasonal outings. Summit City Swan now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$82,033 for owners Summit Pacing Acres LLC.

The Grand Circuit returns to Plainridge Park

After a one year hiatus, Grand Circuit racing will return to New England when Plainridge Park plays host to the second edition of the \$250,000 Spirit Of Massachusetts Trot for 3-year-old and older trotters. New for 2019 will be the \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace for 3-year-old and older fillies and mares.

Both races will be contested on July 28 and are presented by Plainridge Park Casino and the Harness Horseman's Association of New England (HHANE).

With the final sustaining payments having been made, the list of eligibles for the 2019 edition of the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot is complete and includes a total of 24 trotters comprised of 23 horses and geldings and one mare.

Among the group of possible entrants are two Hambletonian winners, six millionaires, the world's record holder for the gait and a roster of top notch trotting talent that could headline at any track in North America.

Horses that are likely to start include 2016
Hambletonian winner, trotting Triple Crown winner and
Dan Patch Trotter of the Year Marion Marauder (Muscle
Hill—Spellbound Hanover 1:51.2, \$3,140,880), 2015
Hambletonian winner and Dan Patch Trotter of the Year
Pinkman (Explosive Matter—Margie Seelster 1:51,
\$2,795,539) and the fastest trotter in the history of the
sport Homicide Hunter (Mr. Cantab—Evening Prayer
1:48.4, \$1,730,177).

The first edition of this stake was held in 2017 when JL Cruze (Crazed—Topcat Hall 1:49.4, \$1,354,202) and Andrew McCarthy toured the Plainridge Park oval in a track record time of 1:51.2 to upset the field at 60-1. Although JL Cruze is not nominated to this year's race, his track record still stands and it will be in the cross-hairs of this stellar field in July.

The inaugural \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace has drawn 24 mares and could prove to be a powerhouse race considering the horses that are eligible.

The field is led by the 2018 Dan Patch Older Pacing Mare of the Year Shartin N (Tintin In America—Bagdarin 1:48.2, \$1,635,728), the 2018 Dan Patch 3-year-old pacing filly award recipient Kissin In The Sand (Somebeachsomewhere—Kiss Me Kate 1:47.4, \$1,096,945), the 2017 Dan Patch 2-year-old pacing filly award recipient Youaremycandygirl (American Ideal—Sweet Lady Jane 1:48.2, \$1,469,938) and Bettor Joy N (Bettors Delight—Joyfulbelle 1:50.4, \$226,917).

The track record for older pacing mares at Plainridge Park is held by Shesjustadelight N who scorched the five-eighths mile oval in 1:51 back in 2016. Clearly there is sufficient firepower within this group of side-wheeling lasses to lower that mark in the first edition of this exciting new stake.

Notice of Breath Analyzer Requirements for New York County Fair events

New York Sire Stakes participants are notified that they may be subject to breath analyzer tests at non-pari-mutuel meets this year, including all County Fair events at fair tracks in New York, and County Fair, Excelsior and Landmark events at Goshen July 4 through 7.

The testing and penalties will follow United States Trotting Association rules, which include disqualifying any offending drivers for the remainder of the program. In addition, the conditions of the New York County Fair Program provide that any person taking a horse into the track, including grooms and trainers, will be subject to testing.

Anyone who refuses to submit to a test or whose test results detect alcohol or prohibited substances as detailed in USTA Rule 5.12 and 5.13, will be barred from handling any horse on the track for the remainder of the day.
