Dancing from hell to heaven

Nijinsky went from being scratched in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals to a Pepsi North America Cup champion for trainer Tony Beaton.

As Nijinsky danced free of cover and exploded past stablemate Legendary Hanover and two others in deep stretch of last Saturday's (June 15) \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup at Woodbine Mohawk Park, trainer Tony Beaton felt his body turn cold as driver Louis-Philippe Roy pumped his whip skyward in victory.

"I got a cold chill. [It was just] excitement," Beaton said. "I just wanted to make sure Louis didn't fall off, that was the main thing. When you get that close, it would be awful, right?"

"Roy flips off cover. Here's Nijinsky breathing fire. Still there Captains Quarters. Nijinsky sails by and it's Nijinsky in deep stretch drawing clear. Nijinsky hauls home the Pepsi North America Cup."



Nijinsky defeated Captains Quarters by 1½ lengths. Funtime Bayama was third, Captain Albano was fourth and Legendary Hanover grabbed the final check. In a wide-open field, Nijinsky — who is undefeated in all five 2024 starts — was sent off at 5-2. The mile was 1:48.1 (replay here).


Beaton is loath to talk much about it, but winning the Cup marked a remarkable trip from hell to heaven for the trainer.

Eight months prior, at this very same track, judges with the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) scratched all four of the horses Beaton had entered in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals — including Nijinsky — as well as two others the trainer was scheduled to race that night in overnights. Based on an anonymous tip, judges accused Beaton of abusing a yearling during the breaking process. He was slapped with a two-year suspension that effectively ended his season. However, on Valentine's Day, **Beaton won his case on appeal** to the Ontario Horse Racing Appeals Panel (HRAP) with his lawyer, Jean-Marc MacKenzie, calling the complaints against the trainer "highly exaggerated." Beaton's license was immediately reinstated.

"We were having a good year last year and it was cut short," Beaton said. "I just want to do well and try to have some success and that's kind of the name of the game in this business, right?"

While Beaton is reluctant to say much about the case, Nijinsky's co-owner Casie Coleman is quick to rush to the defence of her friend and former protegee.

"I still can't believe what happened, happened," Coleman said.
"I have fired people for simply yelling at a horse too loudly and scaring them. If anyone knows me at all and knows what I'm like with my horses in my barn and how I run my operation — and [Beaton] worked for me for that many years — it was unbelievable that what happened, happened and they got away with suspending him for as long as they did. It's bull----. It finally came out in the end, where everybody that got him scratched,





all their stories were different. Obviously, [the HRAP] did right and got him unsuspended but they could've ruined this guy's career and he's a fantastic horseman, a good person and far from abusive to a horse."


Beaton said he's just happy Nijinsky and his owners — Coleman, Ross and Margaret Warriner, Mark Dumain and first-time Cup winner John Fielding — had an opportunity for redemption.

"It was the [other] end of the spectrum," Beaton said of Super Final night. "It's very unfortunate that all of the owners had to suffer — and myself and everybody involved — but it is what it is. We've got to move on and get stronger from it."

As for his ongoing working relationship with Coleman, Beaton said he's blessed to have her in his life.

"The horses are exceptional horses," Beaton said. "I'm very fortunate to get my hands on them."

Beaton spent more than 10 years as a second trainer to Coleman before going out on his own in 2015. He was on Coleman's team when she won the 2010 NA Cup with Sportswriter, but opened his own stable late in the year before Coleman's Betting Line won the 2016 Cup. Coleman, who is based in Florida year-round, now sends her Ontario horses to Beaton to train.

He said he's proud to have had a lot of success as part of Coleman's team when she was the trainer, but having his own name down as the winner of a Pepsi North America Cup is special.

"Sometimes you can build on that when you get your name out there," he said.

The working relationship between Coleman and Beaton is paying major dividends beyond winning stakes races.


BEATON INSTRUMENTAL IN NOT GELDING NIJINSKY

Today, Coleman is hailing Beaton as something of a hero for opting not to geld Nijinsky as she recommended. After a stirring NA Cup triumph, the son of Bettors Delight out of Pirouette Hanover is now at least in the discussion for a potentially-lucrative career as a stallion.

Team Nijinsky (from left): Casie Coleman, Tony Beaton, Ross Warriner, Margaret Warriner, Louis-Philippe Roy.









"There were multiple times I was going to geld this horse, very many times," Coleman said. "I'll never forget, it was the last time I trained him in Florida and he did it again – he was being a little jackass and he made a break training in Florida and I said, 'That's it, I'm gelding him.' And I was looking at when the shippers were coming, but I didn't want to geld him and then put him on the truck for a long ship. So, I literally told Tony Beaton, 'When this colt gets here, I really like him and he's very talented, but he needs to be gelded. I should geld him now, but it's too close to the ship. So, when he gets there, we've got to geld this horse.'

"I'm very thankful that Tony never did geld the horse. Saying that, all through the summer, there were different times when he did make mistakes and I still felt, 'We've got to geld him' and it just didn't work out with when his next Gold was or when his next stake was."

Apparently, the universe was trying to tell her something when it came to Nijinsky.

"This year, I had totally intended to geld him after [his 2-year-old] season was over," Coleman said. "I said, 'Okay, for sure we're gelding him.' The owners all okayed it. I like to keep them jogging when I geld a horse, so you don't just geld them and turn them out. So, he went to Anvil and Lace for his turn out and I said, 'As soon as I ship him back to Florida, I'm going to geld him right away.' We shipped him back and my vet that does my gelding just wasn't available, so we waited, waited, waited.

"Then, his manners were a lot better. So, I thought, 'You know what? He's growing up and he's matured... He's got a lot to prove before we can say he's going to go to stud, but winning the North America Cup doesn't hurt any so he's got that possibility if we can win some more big ones down the road... he could be a future stallion, so I'm very, very happy we didn't geld him at this point and he doesn't have those bad manners anymore."

Beaton laughs when he hears this. "Yeah, we were talking about that the other day," Beaton said. "I said, 'You're pretty lucky I didn't make an appointment to get him gelded, because you told me, 'If he's bad when you get him just go ahead and geld him.' He was never really dirty or bad or rough with anybody, just a colt that liked to play. If he wasn't too bad and we could deal with him, I didn't mind giving him the opportunity and I'm very glad we did give him the opportunity now."



SNYDER ADDS A FIFTH CUP

That Nijinsky was bred by the man that has won more Pepsi North America Cups as an owner than anyone else in the race's 41-year history is a fun fact. Jeffrey Snyder of New York City said he was watching and cheering Nijinsky on to victory despite no longer owning his dam, Pirouette Hanover.

"That was great," Snyder said. "I was rooting for Nijinsky, of course [and now] I'm involved in a fifth one," he said of the Cup victory to go along with the four he won as an owner: Cams Card Shark in 1994, Red River Hanover in 2002, Rocknroll Hanover in 2005 and Well Said in 2009.

"[Pirouette Hanover] won the Sweetheart out of the 10-hole with Ron Pierce driving and that was great," Snyder said. "She had soundness issues as a 3-year-old. So, we decided to keep her."

Snyder, once a force in the pacing side of the business, has recently turned his attention to trotters. Despite the fact Pirouette Hanover made more than \$600,000 for Snyder on the track and produced both Macadoodledoo (\$449,091) and Alexa Skye (\$560,774) for him, he sold Pirouette Hanover — in foal to the Bettors Delight colt that would become Nijinsky — at the 2020 Standardbred Horse Sales Company mixed auction at Timonium, MD to All American Harnessbreds for \$53,000.

Turns out, that was quite a deal for All American.

Rob Tribbett of All American told HRU he named the foal Nijinsky.

"It's an homage to [famed ballet dancer] Vaslav Nijinsky, since the dam's name is Pirouette Hanover," Tribbett said via text message. "[Nijinsky's name was also] inspired by the thoroughbred champion of the same name."


As for how Coleman and partners ended up buying Nijinsky for \$120,000 at the 2022 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA, Snyder believes pedigree had something to do with it.

"She had another horse that she trained that was racing against Pirouette Hanover as a 3-year-old," Snyder said. "I remember having conversations with her and she said, 'You know, you've got the best filly there this year."

Coleman said pedigree certainly played a part, but it was Nijinsky as an individual that sold her. She picked out the colt and asked the others if they wanted to buy in.

"I'm one that goes off the horse itself, the individual, and then it's the breeding second," she said. "I'm always the individual first. Yes, I want breeding, too, but I don't like paying a lot of money if I can help it.

"[Nijinsky is] an average, typical Bettors Delight. He's mediumsized, some might say he's on the small side, but he's a medium-sized Bettors Delight colt. Big, thick ass, big shoulder, very long barrel. He wears a long hobble. That's exactly the kind of horse I like. I want a horse that's not too big, with a long stride on him, long barrel and just a thick ass, thick shoulder, smart head.





On Wednesday (June 19), over 100 people gathered at Classy Lane Stables for a Pepsi North America Cup victory barbecue.

"I don't know what it is, but I've had good luck with horses with white on them. He's got a white strip down his nose. That's just a superstitious thing, nothing to do with him, but it seems like all my good ones have white on them and he's got white on him.

"Also, I loved his video. The farm that raised him, All American, I've had some very good horses that I've bought off the way they raise them, such as Stag Party, Alexis Faith. They do a fantastic job raising them."



WHAT'S NEXT ON THE DANCE CARD?

As for what's next, Beaton and Coleman said both Nijinsky and Legendary Hanover are likely headed to the Meadowlands Pace.


"That's our intention now," Beaton said. "We're gearing them up. They had a light week this week. I know they haven't raced much, but they've been going tough because there's no easy trips at that level. We gave them a lighter week and then we'll ramp it

up this week and get them prepped for the Meadowlands Pace. Hopefully everything stays good with both of them and we'll do the eliminations and hopefully the final."

Asked what race he'd most like to win next, Beaton laughed.

"I'll be honest with you, I want to keep winning them all if I can," he said. "I don't want to get too greedy, but it would be nice to get a little greedy."

After the experience he had last fall, can you blame him? Pushed to pick one race he'd love to win now that he has won the NA Cup, Beaton said The Adios.

"It's a very good race with tradition and everything and The Adios is one cool trophy," Beaton said. "It's a great day. We were second last year with Redwood [Hanover] and we had a flat tire from the half on and he still just got beat at the wire. It would have been very nice to win that one last year with my own horse."

In the meantime, Beaton is still recovering from a wild victory barbecue Coleman threw on Wednesday (June 19) for Nijinsky's connections at Classy Lane Stables.

"I will say, Thursday wasn't the greatest day," Beaton said, laughing.

Coleman said the celebration was "awesome... I think there were over 100 people there. We started at 1 p.m. and I left around 9:30. Tony and [his wife] Lisa said it all shut down around 11 p.m.

"I'm a big believer in it's a team on these horses. It's not just the trainer, it's not just the driver, not just the groom, there's a huge team behind these horses. You've got your blacksmith, your feed people, your vet, your dentist, your chiropractor, and just friends and family and everybody that's behind you.

"To me, doing parties like that and taking care of them, it shows them how appreciated they are. I think they work harder. They want you and your horses to win just as badly as you do and I just think they appreciate it, so I think it keeps the barn morale good and keeps everybody really wanting to win that little extra."

Beaton said he appreciated Coleman throwing the party for all involved.

"She never goes short when it's time for a party," Tony said. "She's very generous to everybody when it comes to that. If she has success, she wants to share it with a lot of people. Like I said to somebody, 'She does it right when she does it.' I really appreciate what she did there. She stayed up in Canada for a few extra days just so we could have a party."


In the end, Coleman's pride was on display on social media like much of her life usually is.

"To win it as an owner, picking [Nijinsky] as a baby, training him down and watching Tony do the actual hands-on getting the job done... I think I posted on my Facebook a picture of Tony and the Cup and said, 'Two of my students,'" Coleman said.

As for that party, Coleman said it was about more than winning the Pepsi North America Cup. It was also a release after the stress the Beaton barn had at the end of 2023.

"We had a lot of celebration drinks and great barbecue with everyone that's been part of the team and on Tony's side the entire time and everything... Besides winning the North America Cup, it was kind of a release, a double party."





To win the Hambletonian, Highland Kismet would have to buck history

Vaulted into the top tier of Hambletonian contenders in the blink of an eye and documented in Harness Racing Update by Melissa Keith on

Friday, Highland Kismet has sights set on the first Saturday in August at The Meadowlands.

The divisional leader and potential generational talent Karl will still represent the largest roadblock to Highland Kismet winning that race, but there is a notable amount of history to be overcome as well: No horse has won the Hambletonian as an unraced 2-year-old since 1995.

No one since Tagliabue 29 years ago has won a Hambletonian having not raced prior to his 3-year-old season, and the feat has been attempted only seldom since that time. Interestingly, in the years immediately before Tagliabue's win which included a same-day elimination win, Park Avenue Joe dead-heated for the Hambletonian win in 1989 having not raced at 2, and five years before that Historic Freight accomplished the same in 1984. It's possible that the last time it occurred before that year was back in 1956 with a horse named The Intruder.

While no horse this century has managed to overcome not racing as a freshman to win the Hambletonian, there have been others that have at least made it to the final. Based on what I could find and there obviously could be others, that unofficial list would include Holy Guacamole (2003), Too Salty (2007), Knows Nothing, who was also an elimination winner in 2012, Pilot Discretion (2019), and most recently with Really Fast in 2021.

If Highland Kismet were to win the Hambletonian six weeks from now, one thing he would almost certainly accomplish would be the latest starting horse to ever win the race. His first racetrack appearance in a qualifier didn't come until April 26 and his first pari-mutuel race didn't happen until May 2. It doesn't seem possible any horse has won the Hambletonian that didn't debut until May of their 3-year-old season.

Tagliabue may have been the closest to Highland Kismet in terms of getting started. He first qualified on March 31 of his 3-year-old season and then debuted on April 18. In another similarity, he was scratched sick out of his next race and wasn't seen again in a pari-mutuel race until June 21. Highland Kismet too, following his first race, was scratched sick and then came back two weeks later to be runner-up in his next out race, just as Tagliabue.



In the most recent comparison, Really Fast began racing earlier. Having first attempted to qualify in February of 2021, he made his first official start on April 2, one full month before Highland Kismet made his debut. Really Fast would go on to be second in his Hambletonian elimination to eventual Hambletonian winner that year, Captain Corey.

So, what to make of all this? I guess I'm surprised that there aren't more talented sophomore trotters with late starts. Generally, it seems that the best 3-year-olds are the ones that raced at 2. Even if they weren't stars at 2, having that early foundation is a benefit that those who didn't race won't have.

In thoroughbred racing, there was a similar phenomenon with regards to the Kentucky Derby. Prior to 2018, no unraced 2-year-old horse had won the race since the year 1882. But there are key differences between the breeds and the races.

The first Saturday in May, the Kentucky Derby, is three full months before the Hambletonian. With that, it would be far more difficult for a horse who never raced at 2 to be fully primed to beat the highest level of competition in May, whereas with the Hambletonian there are a few more critical months of time to work with. One would think that extra time would produce more unraced contenders.

The other part has to do with the durability of the breed. While the thoroughbreds have become ever more fragile of a breed and the careers of many of the top horses amount to total career races in the single digits, standardbreds remain as durable as ever. The top horses still race week in and week out, racing at least a couple dozen times a year.

With the breed similar to where it was decades ago, why were there three different unraced 2-year-olds to win the Hambletonian in an 11-year span in the 1980-90's, but no one since? Who knows. Maybe that period of time was just an aberration.

If Highland Kismet were to win the Hambletonian, it wouldn't hurt for luck to be on his side as well. When Tagliabue won in 1995, a footnote to that year's race was the breaking stride of the 1-9 favorite in their elimination, the freakishly-talented filly CR Kay Suzie. If she didn't break stride and fail to advance, who knows how that race's final would have turned out.

That's not to say I'm wishing the same fate on Karl and driver Gingras, who has never been better positioned to win this race; I'm not. I don't want misfortune to happen, and please don't come back to this column if it does. It is to say though, that talent as well as an element of fate play roles for horses to win the Hambletonian starting this late.

Unchallenged Checking Out gearing up for Indiana Sires Stakes test

Indiana fair circuit racing moved to Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino last week, with divisions contested over three nights. As he has done in the first two rounds of fair action, freshman **Checking Out** turned in another dominant performance Thursday (June 20). Steered by Mike Peterson, the Check Six—This Flight Rocks gelding set all the fractions on the way to a 1:56.4 effort as the heavy favorite.

A \$6,500 yearling purchase, Checking Out is owned by trainer Scott Linville, racing under the banner of Linville Racing Stable. The conditioner admitted that buying yearlings in the range of \$6,000-\$7,000 is the limit for his low-budget stable, but he has previously succeeded with the progeny of Check Six. He plucked the gelding from last September's Northern Indiana Yearling Speed Sale in Topeka. Consigned by Paul Webb of Ivy Lane Farm, the pacer is out of a Rockin Image mare that won the Indiana Sires Stakes consolation as a 2-year-old.

"We thought he was a pretty nice colt," Linville said. 'He had everything we were looking for. Doc Webb raised him as a weanling and yearling. He told us after we bought him, 'You

bought the buy of the sale I'm pretty sure.' He's just done everything right growing up. Anything you ask him to do, he does."

While the owner and trainer said Checking Out trained down like any young horse over the winter, as the months passed, the green pacer began showing promise.

"Growing up through the winter, you have no idea what you have," he said. "The more I trained him, the more I liked him. I never have reached the bottom of the tank training him. I train pretty hard in March and April and never once have I run out of gas."

The Goshen, IN, resident got a sense of his charge's capabilities when schooling him at the Elkhart County 4-H Fairgrounds this spring. That day the freshman slotted in alongside 3-year-olds, and while Linville didn't plan to finish first, Checking Out left the field behind.

"He just happened to get to the front and nobody could catch him," Linville said. "I knew we had something then."

Thus far in 2024, Checking Out hasn't just passed each test, he has excelled at every turn. In the first round of fair action at Converse, held June 5, Peterson guided the freshman to the lead from post 2. The duo received every call on the way to a near-five-length advantage, pacing the mile in 2:02.4. Linville's trainee added his name to the Converse record books one week later. Challenged at three quarters by Clint Coy and Vel Mr Bruiser, Checking Out kicked home in :27.3, stopping the clock in a time of 1:58 to grab a share of the speed record for freshman pacing colts. The mark is also shared by Luck Be Withyou offspring Luckychris (2021) and Chocluck Chip (2023).

"Mike had to chirp to him a little bit," Linville said. "When he did, he pulled away by five really quick. Mike just couldn't believe how much speed he's got. Last week at Converse, Mike came off and said going down the front stretch this dude's looking in the grandstand and looking at the judges stand and he's not paying attention to what he's doing, he's just having fun. I don't know how good he's going to be."

Moving to Hoosier Park for round 3 in the fair circuit's Quest for the Governor's Cup, the gelding was bet down to 1-9 by his backers. While he collected his third straight win, he was relatively untested in the second of three divisions, winning handily by more than four lengths in another gate-to-wire effort. The winning time of 1:56.4 was considerably slower than the marks turned in by Derek's Rocket (1:54.4) and Special Pete (1:55.1).

"Mike does a good job with the babies," the trainer said. "If we get beat, we get beat. He's not going to abuse him just to make a few extra bucks at this time."




This spring, Linville went against tradition and staked his pupil to everything offered in Indiana. He made the move after comparing Checking Out to Attaboy Lloyd, another Check Six son he successfully campaigned for two seasons on the fair circuit.

"He's eligible to everything in Indiana; sires stakes, Elite, the Horseman," Linville said. "We normally don't do that, but they are due April 15, and by that time we kind of had an idea we had something. We had Attaboy Lloyd, and he was pretty tough on the fair circuit. I told my son that he's going to be better than Lloyd was. This colt is much bigger, more developed, and more athletic built."

The fair circuit moves to the southern end of the state in Corydon, but Checking Out will skip a leg and instead compete again at Hoosier Park. The owner has his sights set on preparing his pupil for the first leg of Indiana Sires Stakes slated for July 12. He will take a shot with the gelding knowing that he can return to the fair circuit if the competition proves too tough.

Travis Alexander is garnering success while flying under the radar

It should not have been, but it was a slight surprise to this observer that the third leading stable in North America in both earnings and wins with \$2,376,940 and 144 respectively is that of Michigan native Travis Alexander. This past week Alexander also notched win number 1,000 as a trainer. He is a fifth-generation horseman and the first in his family to leave Michigan. The Alexander Stable is presently domiciled at Mark Ford's Training Center in Middletown, NY, a 90-minute ship from Yonkers Raceway and two hours from Pocono Downs, the two tracks where its horses are most likely to be racing. It was on a jaunt to Pocono where he was racing two 3-year-olds that this reporter caught up with Alexander.


You represent the third leading stable in North America, both in money earnings and wins. That is quite an accomplishment. Some might say you have perhaps been flying a little below the radar. Do you believe that to be the case and how is your stable made up?

"To some degree that might be so. If indeed that is the case, it may be because a good part of the group is made up of overnight horses. Right now, we have horses that fit just about every class, both trotters and pacers at Yonkers, Pocono Downs and The Meadowlands. The stable is presently composed of 90 head, half of which are 2- and 3-year-olds; 25 of those are 2-year-olds, some of which will be making their first starts [Wednesday (June 19)]. I suppose the flying under the radar mostly relates to the way publicity is attained in the business. Most of it goes to the glamour horses, those that excel on the Grand Circuit.

"Thus far, I would describe our stable as being mostly a meat and potatoes operation. That's not to say that I am not looking for the great Grand Circuit horse. That is in the background of

my mind with every yearling that comes into the stable. But with every youngster we acquire, we primarily want the opportunity to race for decent money. That means, if the horse is not destined to be a Grand Circuit performer, which realistically applies to the vast majority of them, we want one that will acquit itself well in the sire stakes, most specifically those in New York and Pennsylvania, the states to which most of our youngsters are eligible to race. They are close by and they still race for very good money. That is one way in which the great Kentucky money has perhaps indirectly helped New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

"To some extent the competition in those areas has been lessened because so many more of the better horses have found their way to Kentucky. That's not to say that we will not race in Kentucky if we have a horse which we feel will be competitive there. We have two racing at Oak Grove next week. Those \$50,000 races just about every week for 4-year-olds, has been a great boon for horses who are not quite true free-for-allers yet, or those who might never become that. I'm a great believer in racing horses where I believe they can earn money and help the owners.


"I like to think of myself and my operation as being very client oriented. In most, I guess in just about all areas, the owners call the shots if they are so inclined. We do all we can to follow their wishes. If they prefer racing overnight horses, that is what we do. If they want to follow their dreams and race in stakes races we also provide a vehicle for that."

Let's talk about your 2-year-old class.

"As I said, some of them will just be beginning to race [Wednesday]. We have five in to start at Pocono Downs. Of those, I am particularly excited about a Cattlewash filly named Eightsevensix. She has probably been our best one all winter and spring. That is not to say that the rest of the class is behind. That is definitely not so. There is just something about this particular filly which I've loved from the very get go. In addition to the Cattlewash, we have two Huntsvilles, a Captaintreacherous and a Sweet Lou starting tomorrow. We have several others waiting in the wings who I believe will become really good 2-year-olds, maybe even that rarity, a great star. We are barely into summer, that time of year when we are still dreaming. They are just beginning to sort themselves out."

Speaking of the Cattlewash filly, it's still early, but from only a very small crop those 2-year-olds by Cattlewash seem to be making a great impression.

"Yes indeed. From only a small crop of 38, he already has six sub-1:58 winners. Forty per cent of the entire crop has already raced. I thought that two them, Power Code, the colt that Carl Jamieson has and my filly were two of, if not the two most impressive, 2-year-olds in training at Sunshine Meadows this past winter. But as we all know, training well is one thing, racing well can



be quite another. There are two things perhaps among others that Cattlewash has in his favor. Firstly, he was a great racehorse, virtually all great sires were. There is the odd exception, but it is exceedingly rare and if it took place, it usually happened a long time ago. Secondly, and maybe just as important, is that he is a great son of Somebeachsomewhere.

"Just look at SBSW's accomplishments as a sire of sires. He already has Captaintreacherous, Downbytheseaside, Huntsville and Stay Hungry. So Surreal has also done really well from limited opportunity. This year we have Cattlewash and Papi Rob Hanover both looking good from their first crop. Then there is Beach Glass in Ontario waiting in the wings. If there is another horse who has produced as many good sires, I cannot think of who it might be."

We spoke of your 2-year-olds, how about your sophomore class?

"We have a 3-year-old homebred of Dr John Cummins named Dame Good Time, that I believe will be a pretty good colt, I should say gelding. He has earned almost \$200,000 and seems to be continually getting better. I doubt that he is as good or probably will ever be as good as Karl, but he is our best 3-year-old. We are aiming him towards Aug. 3, Hambletonian Day at The Meadowlands. It's far too much to think that he will or can be a match for Karl and maybe some of the other 3-year-old trotters out there. But it's horse racing. If nothing else, we are allowed to continue to dream until as sometimes happens our dreams are shattered."

Let's speak about Michigan and your roots in Michigan racing.

"As I told you, I am a fifth-generation horseman. None of my ancestors ever left the state to race elsewhere. I was the first to do so. Growing up, there were seven thriving racetracks in Michigan. Now, sadly, none remain. It's a tale that can be found to varying degrees throughout North America. Montreal was once the leading racing center in all of Canada. Now, sadly, a metropolis of several million people many of which were once great fans of the sport doesn't even have a single racetrack. Florida racing is dead, likely never to be revived.

"Despite the casinos efforts to make us a dead issue, we still race for decent money in New York and Pennsylvania. But both states have the same problem, nobody goes to the races. Sadly, the same to a lesser degree holds true for our greatest racetrack The Meadowlands.

"There are still reasons for some optimism though. Kentucky, at least the breeding industry in Kentucky, is thriving. The same to a lesser degree holds true for Ohio and Indiana. How do we get new fans to come to the races and watch our great equine athletes compete? I wish I had the answer to that. Unfortunately, I do not. However, unless we come up with a way to generate more interest in the sport, I don't know how we can continue over the long haul."



It's now summer, the time of year when the stable functions mostly as one big, well-oiled machine, but there is a time of year when you have a northern division based in New York and one in Florida at Sunshine Meadows.

"From November through early May we train our young horses in Florida and keep those racing or preparing to race in New York. I think that this is best for the horses, the owners and maybe for the people who look after them, especially the ones who train in Florida. I think it works very well. We have a great staff and have great lines of communication among us. We do have some people who specialize with the younger horses and those who work mostly with the racehorses.

For example, Doug Miller is one of the most important members of the team. He trains with us, specializing with the young horses year-round. Beginning in late summer, he hits the road visiting the various breeding farms evaluating their yearlings. He acts as our scout much as Perry Soderberg and Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky do for their various clients. Doug is an excellent horseman with a wealth of experience. By the time the sales come along we have narrowed our list down to those that we feel we can best concentrate on for our various clients."

Speaking of your clientele, a stable of 90 head must involve a good many owners. How many owners have horses in the Alexander Stable?

"Presently there are 25. They range from a single owner who might have a percentage of one horse to Mark Wasserman, who's Fiddlers Creek Stable owns all or parts of quite a few horses in training with us. Mr. Wasserman is more than just an owner of racehorses with the stable though. He has been with us since 2008, pretty much from the time I first went out on my own. We help him not only with the horses he has racing, but also in having put together what I feel is a pretty elite broodmare band. Fiddlers Creek now owns 20 broodmares from which we breed and raise yearlings to eventually join our racing stable. There was a time when Fiddlers Creek had no partners. Mr. Wasserman preferred it that way.

"As I've said more than once, we try to be as owner oriented as possible. Whatever an owner desires, we try to accommodate. Today, in addition to its homebreds, Fiddlers Creek often comes aboard in the yearlings we purchase for our other clients. I like to think of our operation as one happy family that continues to both grow and thrive."

"When I was in college, a friend of a friend got in touch with [standardbred trainer] Arty Foster, Sr. and she had told me that he needed help on the farm," Megan said. "I told my mom, 'I need that number.' I always wanted to be around horses, so it seemed like a great fit. My mom reminded me that I had never been around horses, but I didn't care."

Foster, who rode show horses for a time growing up in East New Market, then got to dialing the number, a lot.

"I called Eric — I am embarrassed to say this — every couple of hours for an entire day," Megan said. "I was assuming that he was out working, and he finally called me back. He told me to stop by any time, so I did right away."


At the farm, she met Foster's grandson, Russell, an accomplished horseman in his own right.

"He is my all-time favorite horse," said Megan. "When we lost him in a claimer, I was sad. He kind of put Russell's driving career on the map, which was amazing. When they were paired together — Hi Sir is a war horse — it just clicked. He was so good for us.

"I see that horse as playing a big part in our relationship; he grew with us. I was sad to see him go, but he's retired now and living the life he deserves."

As is Megan, who is thriving as a trainer, a role she has held since 2019.

She won 16 races and posted 55 top-three finishes from 87 starts in her rookie campaign.

Her milestone first triumph came at Rosecroft with none other than Hi Sir. Russell, who has over 2,200 career driving wins, was in the race bike.

Five years later, Megan is still winning races and finds herself closing in on 100 career victories.

Her most successful campaign to date came in 2023 when she recorded 23 wins and purse earnings just shy of \$284,000.

Working alongside her husband throughout the years has made for, literally and figuratively, a racing match made in heaven.

"Our friends who are outside of racing — if we are out with them — will tell me that they don't know how I work with my husband," said Megan with a laugh. "Don't get me wrong, we do have our little spats, especially at the busy times of the year, but it works. We are on the same page with how we want to get things done the right way."

It has been a winning formula, both individually and combined.

"We make it work very well," Megan said. "I'm proud of the fact that I have been able to maintain consistency in our barn and hold down the fort when Russell is driving elsewhere." Horse racing has expanded to become a bona fide family affair for Megan and Russell, who call Cordova, MD, home.

"It's been nice to have the kids [son Blake and daughter Mia] along with us too, taking them to the barn and having them tag along," Megan said. "Having horses on the farm with us, I couldn't wait for the kids to get out of school so that they could be with us and be around the horses.

"My son can be a little shy around the horses. My daughter loves them. We had a filly born on the farm a little while ago so that one is the favorite for both. I would say that Smooth Rocket, one of our horses, is her favorite."

When she isn't tending to work on the homestead or a busy life in the barn, Megan does find time to enjoy some personal pursuits.

One of those interests is literally taking time to smell the roses.

"I do enjoy crafts very much," she said. "Every once in a while, people will ask me to paint something for them. I love to paint. I also enjoy working in my flower beds in the summer, just being outside."

Spending too much time indoors has never been a good fit, nor has been working in an office environment.

She was reminded of that not long after she and Russell tied the knot in October 2014.

Back then, Megan had decided to pull back from the horse world for a full-time role.

"I tried working in a totally different environment not long after Russell and I got married," she said. "I took a step back from the horses and I went to work at a doctor's office.

"I lasted six months there and I was miserable. I said, 'No, this isn't for me."

Racing, however, is for her.

And she expects it will be for a long time.

"I feel very lucky and very blessed to be in racing and to do this with Russell and our kids," Megan said.





An ode to longshots

An alert reader of this publication suggested a correction to the **Breaking Stride column of June 2**. The column under discussion contains a list of harness racing movies released to the public. The reader asked, "Hey Trey, What about Johnny Longshot, the Emilio Estevez harness racing movie? I saw a few minutes of it."

The reader saw a few minutes of something, but not a movie. Most likely, the reference was to a pre-production trailer for a proposed film or a promotional interview from about 10 years ago. Johnny Longshot was a movie that reached the pre-production stage of development, but the film was not completed or released. This failure for a movie to launch is not unusual, and most of the time, the reason is funding, or we should say, lack of funding.

Buying a yearling and winning a big race with your horse is extraordinarily difficult and expensive. The journey from a script to the screen or video is equally challenging. I have dabbled in the arenas of yearling harness horses and Hollywood. On the longshot scale, they are about a dead heat.

Want some data? In the glory days before COVID-19, in 2019, more than 67,000 screenplays were registered with the Writers Guild, but only 777 movies made it to the viewing public. The odds are over 90 scripts for each produced film, and just creating a film is no guarantee that the backers will make money.

Participants in harness horse racing whine that getting a champion trotter or pacer is complex and expensive, and the odds against purchasing and raising a Hambletonian winner are long shots. That is correct. We are trying to do something challenging. We may suffer from selective amnesia, the inability to do risk/reward probabilities, and delude ourselves into having a secret sauce. In filmmaking and yearling racehorse purchasing, we are much like the hapless Lloyd (Jim Carey) seeking romance with a pretty girl in a scene from Dumb and Dumber.

Lloyd: "What are my chances?"

Mary: "Not good."

Lloyd: "You mean "not good" like... one out of a hundred?"

Mary: "I'd say more like one out of a million."

Lloyd: (slowly reacts) "So you're telling me there's a chance? (joyfully) Yeah!!"

Making movies, raising horses, running marathons, becoming a movie star; why do people even try endeavors where success is such a longshot? Why do we dare to do difficult things? When presented with empirical statistics about your chance of owning a Hambletonian champion, why do you buy a yearling at the next sale?

Who knows?

Here are a few guesses from a fool.

When you attempt something unbelievably challenging, your peers do not expect you to be successful. They think you are bonkers. For me, this takes the pressure off. It's house money. Failure to hit a home run stings, but it is not embarrassing. At least you were at the plate swinging. This philosophy is much like my wagering on horses. I always play ridiculous long shots on the toteboard. I'm never disappointed, and should I ever win a race, it will be a real hoot.

When you try something outside your comfort zone, you learn new stuff. For example, when arranging a camera shot with a greenscreen background, you must use a blue screen in filming shrubbery, or it will disappear. I just learned that last week. Learning is cool. Striving for complex, challenging goals like a completed movie or a champion racehorse takes you to places you do not usually travel.

The fun is in the trying, in putting yourself out there. Maybe you wanted to try amateur harness horse driving but could never pull the trigger and make the call. When you do, if you do, you get an endorphin rush; one step feeds the next, and you wonder why you waited so long. Easy things are boring. Watching and wagering on races from your computer is okay, but climbing into a jog cart is better. We all think we are superheroes in the winner's circle. Mentally, we are all staring in our movie, why not make it real?

You want to have fun. Find several million dollars of disposable income and contact Emilio. He probably still has options for the Johnny Longshot script (tons of scripts bounce around Hollywood for decades). If Emilio doesn't work out, find someone else to make the movie or look for another harness horse racing cinematic property to spin into movie gold. Heck, call me. I know a guy with a half-dozen excellent sports-related movie scripts in development waiting for a player with funding.

Shoot for the stars. If you fall, you land on a cloud.

French Riviera, a daughter of Greenshoe—Creamy Mimi who was purchased for \$350,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, won in 2:00.1 with Andy Miller in the sulky. The filly led throughout the mile and came home in :28.1 to defeat Demarara Hanover by 2½ lengths. She is owned by Marvin Katz.

Miller trains French Riviera's half-brother French Wine, a multiple stakes winner who has earned more than \$1.1 million in his career. Miller also campaigned another of the filly's siblings, stakes-winner French Cafe, and Andy Miller drove dam Creamy Mimi to victory in the 2008 Hambletonian Oaks, deepening the connection to French Riviera's family.

The family also includes past stars Bella Bellini, Pizza Dolce, and French Laundry.

"I was tickled pink when Marvin Katz purchased her for us to train," Julie said about French Riviera, who was bred by Katz and Al Libfeld. "I love that family. It's such a great pedigree family."

Julie was equally pleased Thursday after French Riviera's qualifier.

"Andy said she handled herself well behind the gate, she drove with two fingers, and trotted through the wire," Julie said. "That's what I want to hear when Andy gets off the bike, that they had a good experience and they had trot on the way home. Andy said she was a professional. That was great."

Julie took her time getting French Riviera ready, much like the trainer did with the filly's siblings.

"She trained down quite a bit like French Wine did," Julie said. "He always had a lot of talent and ability, but you had to be the kind of trainer that waits on them. We took our time with her, gave her a lot of TLC, and showed patience. I think it all paid off today."

Julie will mull her options with French Riviera, who is Pennsylvania and Kentucky eligible.

"Being in that dual eligible program, we plan on taking advantage of that," she said.

Ron Burke sent out seven winners Thursday, with three winning for the second time. Getting the job done again for the trainer were female pacer **She's A Streaker**, male pacer **Railroad Station**, and female trotter **Ms Prada**. First-time winners were female pacers **Sweet Ballad** and **It's Crunch Time** and male trotters **Safe Talk** and **Hidalgo**, who was purchased under the name De Kooning for \$600,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale.

She's A Streaker won in 1:54.3 on Thursday with Yannick Gingras in the sulky. She won in 1:57.1 on June 10 at Gaitway. Purchased for \$80,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale, She's A Streaker is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services Inc., Frank Baldachino, and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby. The daughter of Huntsville—Mikayla Rose was bred by Walnridge Farm and Bonnie Benson.

Railroad Station stopped the timer in 1:56.4 on Thursday after winning in 1:59.1 last week. David Miller drove the colt, who was purchased for \$110,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and is owned by Burke Racing, Hatfield Stables, Weaver Bruscemi, and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby. His family includes Grand Circuit winners Indulge Me, Reign On Me, Summer Child, and The Firepan; his extended family includes millionaires Jimmy Freight and Abuckabett Hanover. The son of Sweet Lou-Rodeo Rosie was bred by Eric Good.

Ms Prada and Gingras won in 1:59.3 after winning in 1:59.2 last week, when she had the fastest trotting mile of the day. Ms Prada sold for \$100,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and is owned by Burke Racing, Beasty, Joseph DiScala, Jr., and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby. The daughter of Greenshoe—Asiago was bred by Marvin Katz, Sam Goldband, Al Libfeld, and Black Horse Racing.

Hidalgo recorded Thursday's fastest trotting mile, winning in 1:57 with Gingras after finishing third, timed in 1:59.4, last week. A son of Muscle Hill—Brooklyn, the colt's full brothers Kings County and Brooklyn Hill were winners on the Grand Circuit, and the family also includes 2008 Hambletonian Oaks champion Creamy Mimi. Hidalgo is owned by Brixton Medical Inc. and Hatfield Stables and was bred by Order By Stable AB.

Safe Talk, driven by Joe Bongiorno, won in 1:59 after going offstride last week. The son of Tactical Landing—Safe Word was purchased for \$97,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale and is owned by Ben Mondello and FAC Racing. Safe Talk, from the family of 2016 Trotter of the Year Marion Marauder, was bred by Heritage Standardbreds.

Sweet Ballad, driven by Gingras, won in 1:55. She finished second on June 10 at Gaitway, timed in 1:57.1. The daughter of Sweet Lou—Write Me A Song was bred by owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, and Phil Collura. She is the first foal out of Write Me A Song, who was a multiple winner on the Ontario stakes circuit.

It's Crunch Time won in 1:56.3, also with Gingras. She was fifth last week, timed in 1:58.3. The Crawford Farms-bred daughter of Captain Crunch—Meghan Lynn is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon, who purchased the filly's mother in foal to Captain Crunch in November 2021. Her family includes millionaire In The Arsenal.

Jennifer Bongiorno sent out two winners Thursday morning, winning with male pacers **Snack Attack** and **Go Go Grasshopper**, both driven by Joe Bongiorno.

Four divisions of sophomore pacing fillies at Scioto

Four divisions of the Buckeye Stallion Series for 3-year-old filly pacers were held Friday (June 21) at Eldorado Scioto Downs. **Fearless Ginger** was the only repeat winner in this second leg while three other winners found the winner's circle for the first time in BSS action.

Austin Hanners guided Fearless Ginger to an easy 3½-length victory in the second division of the \$20,000 Buckeye Stallion Series in 1:51.2. Leaving straight for the front from post 2,the pair led at every call of :26.2,:55.2 and 1:23.1 before coasting home in :28.1. Hot Shave (Aaron Merriman) finished second with Frontier Dragon (Kayne Kauffman) getting up for third.

Fearless Ginger won the first leg of the BSS on May 1 and then posted consecutive victories in the Falcon Almahurst Series for BSS eligible horses. She now has four wins in eight starts and \$42,120 earned on the year. Friday's win was a new lifetime mark for the 3-year-old Fear The Dragon filly owned and trained by Tim Lane.


Heartofthesea also took her division in 1:51.2. Sitting third through splits of :26.1 and :54.3 while Calypso Pearl (Dan Noble) led the way, Page pulled Heartofthesea second over heading to the 1:22.1 three-quarters. Following the 6-5 favorite, Illegal (Tyler Smith), Page flipped Heartofthesea three-wide in the last turn and drew off to win by four lengths over Calypso Pearl who finished second and Illegal who was third.

Heartofthesea, by Downbytheseaside, is owned by Country Club Acres, Wingfield Brothers and David Van Dusen. Brian Brown trains the filly who now has \$73,460 earned lifetime and crushed her previous lifetime mark by two seconds Friday.

The other two divisions were won by **Miss Betty** (Hanners) and **Gone Coastal** (Noble), both in 1:52.1. Miss Betty, by Dancin Yankee, is owned by Harold Ward, trained by his son David Ward and was bred by Dustin Arledge. She is now two for 12 lifetime after breaking her maiden on June 12 in 1:54, with \$33,800 in lifetime earnings. Miss Betty was a \$8,000 purchase from the Buckeye Classic Yearling Sale. Sarah Said (Eric Goodell) was second and Gulf Moon (Merriman) third.

Gone Coastal, another Downbytheseaside filly, is owned by breeder Tim Betts and trained by his brother Scott Betts. She has hit the board in all eight of her lifetime starts, winning five of them and earning \$35,731 seasonally, and lifetime, as Gone Coastal did not race at 2. I'm A Beach Lady (Luke Hanners) was second and I'm Fancy Like (Merriman) got up for third.

The 90-day 2024 Eldorado Scioto Downs race meet runs through Saturday (Sept. 14). Athearn sweeps Maine sired trots at Cumberland

Driver Mark Athearn and trainer Gretchen Athearn swept a pair of Maine Sire Stakes trotting events on Friday (June 21) at Cumberland Raceway, recreating a similar instance last season where the same two youngsters won their stakes debuts on the same day.

It was like Déjà vu all over again when in the \$15,758 early non-wagering event Athearn's **Carrabassett** went right to the top and never looked back, scoring by nine open lengths in 2:03.2. The sophomore son of Boy Band did the same thing in his first pari-mutuel race in 2023, winning in a pedestrian 2:11.3. Reducing his mark by nearly eight seconds, it was his first trip back to the winner's circle since last July. Owned by Patrick Leavitt, he was bred by the late Mike Andrew.

Pembroke Will (Heath Campbell) last season's freshman champion finished second; Chipper Dale (Drew Campbell) was third. They were both trained by Valerie Grondin.

In the \$16,208 opener for Maine-sired 3-year-old trotting fillies, Athearn took matters into his own hands once again and repeated his wire-to-wire journey with **My Saving Grace** in 2:05.1. The Shake It Off Lindy filly won her first three starts last year, and went on to capture a total of five Maine Sire Stakes on the season. Taking a new mark for Team Athearn, she is owned by Margaret Thyng and paid \$7.60 to win by a length. She was bred by Leighton Property.

Last year's distaff champ and 1-2 favorite Pembroke Breeze (Heath Campbell) finished second; Twisted Venture (Mike Cushing) was third.

Next, a pair of \$16,000-plus Maine Sire Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings went postward as races 3 and 4 on the 13-race pari-mutuel card.

Justcallmebuck just keeps on winning as the son of Deuce Seelster grabbed his third in a row for driver Heath Campbell and trainer Gary Hall. Slicing through the beam in 1:59.1, the duo provided a meager \$2.20 payoff as the 1-9 heavy favorite. Owned and bred by Kristina Hall, it was the gray colt's second consecutive stakes victory, and another wire-to-wire romp.

What's For Suppah (Aaron Hall-Michelle Hardin) finished a fast-closing second; Chance Worth Tryin (Drew Campbell-Kevin Chase) was third.

The Tardif Taskforce nearly swept the final \$16,416 event, with their charges taking first, second and fourth places. Aaron Hall left swiftly with Ron Cushing's Hesjustadelight, setting an opening panel of :29.1. They paced in single file fashion to the :59.2 half, where 1-2 favorite Ella V Fella (Kevin Switzer, Jr.) moved first over from fifth position. While he embarked on that mission to improve his position, that attempt proved unsuccessful as stable mate **Wes's Challenge** (Walter Case, Jr.) popped the deuce and took command past the 1:28.1 third stanza.

Storming home in 1:58, the son of Deuce Seelster paid \$7.20 to win, who was bred by Gary and Kristina Hall. Art's Flight (Andy Harrington-Mark Tardif) picked up the pieces and finished second; Hesjustadelight hung on to be third; Ella V Fella was fourth.

Driver Drew Campbell had four wins on the card, and Mark Athearn won three which included the early non-betting race.

The First Tracks Cumberland meet continues throughout the summer months with regular racing on Friday and Saturday each weekend during the extended pari-mutuel meeting, which runs through Aug. 3.



Steve Stewart and Timot Stables bred the winner, a son of Muscle Hill.

The "R's" had it in race 5 as **R Dutchess** (Tetrick) ground by leader R Charm (Scott Zeron / Linda Toscano) in the shadow of the wire to win in 1:55.1 with the last quarter on the board :27.3. Making History (Brett Beckwith) is one of a very few sons of the iron tough Breeders Crown winner American History, who is still racing at a high level by the way, and the colt demonstrated some of his father's grit in a game 1:53 win, home in :27.1 after being out to the quarter and setting the pace from there. Making History is a Riverview Racing homebred, trained by Tony Alagna for the Riverview principals, Myron and Stephanie Bell.

Young Mr. Beckwith came right back with a pick-up drive on **Papi's Pistol** for Sam DePinto and came home a winner from the pocket in 1:53.3 home in :26.4 to just barely snap Delray Beach (Gingras / Takter) at the light in a game effort from both colts. Anthony Perretti gets a breeder's credit as well as an owner's share on the winner, owned with Shannon DePinto and Chris Arvanitis, bred with Davino and Shackman.

The last of the 18 2YO winners on the day was a Tall Dark Stranger colt, a likely result with four of the five colts being by that first crop sire. It was **White Lotus** who led all the way to be Gingras' fifth of the day, this one in 1:53.4 / :26.4 for trainer Per Engblom. The Real Thing (Dunn / A. Harris) followed the winner and stayed for second. A \$110,000 (LEX) buy for Morrison Racing, the colt is a Lindy Farms bred.
