Tom Durand lucky to survive plane crash on his farm

The pilot and trainer, who finished second in the 2011 Hambletonian with Whiskey Tax, crashed Monday on the infield of his farm track in Ontario after his plane's engine failed shortly after takeoff.

Tom and June Durand and trotter Whiskey Tax finished second in the 2011 Hambletonian won by Broad Bahn. This week, Tom survived a plane crash on his farm.

If not for his harness track and a split-second decision, trainer Tom Durand is certain he would have died when his engine failed and his plane crashed Monday morning (June 22) at his farm in Puslinch, ON shortly after takeoff.

"I guarantee I wouldn't be talking to you today," Durand said Wednesday.

Instead, Durand, 63, only suffered one broken vertebrae and spinal compression in the crash that destroyed his plane.

"The doctor came in after all the tests were back, and said, 'Sir, this is your lucky day. I can't find any major damage. There's a spinal compression in all your joints, you're going to be very sore tomorrow and, if we measured you, you'd be

about an inch shorter than you were this morning,” Durand said laughing.

ENGINE FAILURE

Durand, who finished second with Whiskey Tax in the 2011 Hambletonian won by Broad Bahn, said the engine on his yellow Aerotrek A-220 failed shortly after takeout from his farm landing strip.

“I got up to maybe 150 feet or 200 feet, somewhere in that range, I don’t know the exact height, and the engine started to die on me,” Durand said. “I lost power and I was thinking ‘Oh crap, what’s going on here?’ Then it picked up and it came back, so I thought, ‘Okay, maybe it was just a surge or something and I’m going to be all right.’ And then it started to go again. So, here I am and my brain is going 1,000 – ‘What’s my training say that I’ve got to do?’ Number one is ‘Fly the airplane.’ Number two is ‘At low altitude, with low energy, low airspeed, everything, you have to land straight ahead’ you don’t have enough energy to make a turn. You’ve got to find your best option, which is within 30 degrees of where you’re heading right now.

“So I’m looking at trees, I’m looking at rocks, I’m looking at a house and a forest. I’ve got no good options straight ahead. I’m going to kill myself flying into terrain.

“Somehow, magically in my brain, I say, ‘The engine is not completely dead, it is still producing a little bit of power.’ So I’m going to do what the book says that you’re not supposed to do and that is to make a turn.

“So, I did it. I made this gentle turn around to the left, which is the infield of my racetrack and I started bringing it around and bringing it around and I’m about a third of the way around – and I’ve already picked out where I’m going to try to set this airplane down in a level corner of this field – and I said, ‘Just give me a little more power and I’m going to make it.’

“About a third of the way around this turn, (the engine) quit.”

Durand said he was still about 100 feet off the ground and descending quickly.

“I was still trying to get oriented so I didn’t crash into the

other trees that I’m looking at on the road. I still have to turn another 60 degrees or so to not hit something. I’ve got an airspeed of probably around 42 miles an hour, which is stall speed or just above stall speed. This is a tough place to be, but it’s manageable if you’ve done it before. You can fly an airplane at stall speed if you’re really, really careful.”

The wind had other ideas. When he turned back, the wind became a tail wind that cancelled out some of his airspeed, forcing the plane into what he called a “semi-stall” that resulted in an extremely hard landing.

“I guess you could call it a crash landing when you total the airplane,” he said.

JUNE WATCHED IN HORROR

Watching all this in horror was Durand’s wife, June, and some friends.

“At the instant I impacted, I felt this extreme pain right up my spine and I thought, ‘Oh man, I really messed something up.’ I thought, I don’t know how many bones in my back I just broke, but I know something is messed up. I didn’t have any other problems, no scrapes... I managed to get the door open and I crawled out. I’m lying on the ground waiting for (help) from some of these spectators...”

“June was terrified, she was yelling and screaming at people to come and help. She got in her truck and drove it out to the infield. By this time, I’m lying out there just trying to shake off this pain and, miraculously, it was subsiding. I’m down to half the pain that I was having 10 minutes earlier. I said, ‘I think I’m going to be all right,’” Tom said.

“Next thing you know, we’ve got ambulances, fire trucks, police cars and everything all out there on my track.”

VETERAN PILOT

Tom, who has trained the winners of more than \$8.2 million (Cdn), said he earned his pilot’s license in the 1980s.

“We were winter training at the South Florida Trotting Centre and the apartment that I had rented was on a direct path to the airport there (Lantana Airport in Palm Beach),” Tom said. “I was driving by there every day on my way to work and I’ve always wanted to fly and I told my wife, ‘I’m going to stop in there and check it out.’ So I had lessons and I signed up and had my license in 60 days. I went every afternoon. I trained horses in the morning and went flying every afternoon and I did it in a month.

“Over the years, I think I’ve owned nine different airplanes.”

While raising kids, Tom backed off flying – “I needed to invest in other things, like kids,” he said, laughing – but the passion to fly was still there.

“Seven or eight years ago I bought an airplane and I’ve been flying it around for all this time. It’s just a four-seater, single engine. I take it to Florida every winter and June and I take trips on it.

“I’ve always had this dream of being able to fly off my own property, so I didn’t have to go to the airport. Last year, I built this strip out behind my barn, but it’s short. The Cessna, the bigger airplane, was kind of marginal for flying out of this kind of strip, so I found this beautiful little two-seater airplane and it was just the ticket for flying out of a farm like this, so I bought it last summer. It’s a totally different kind of airplane to learn to fly. Even though it’s smaller and lighter, it was very difficult to transition into from what I’m used to flying, so I put in 10 hours with an instructor to really get familiar with it. Half of them were last fall and then the other half were this spring,” Tom said, adding the Aerotrek A-220 is a factory-made light sport aircraft constructed in Czechoslovakia and imported into North America through Indiana.

“There’s been 600 of them built, worldwide. They are very rare. There’s only about 120 of them in North America and there might only be about half a dozen in Canada – well, probably only five now.

“It’s been a very reliable aircraft, extremely well-made... This particular airplane was made in 2012 and it looked brand new.”

Tom normally keeps the plane at the Kitchener-Waterloo Airport, which is just a 12-minute flight from his farm. Last weekend, he flew it to Brantford to practice landings there and then flew it to his farm.

“A couple of family friends came over and I gave them rides,” Tom said. “We had a family get-together for Father’s Day.”

He decided to leave the plane at his farm for the night and take it back to the Waterloo airport on Monday morning. That’s when the accident happened.

Until that day, he said he hasn’t had a single problem with the plane.

“It ran perfect and then it just crapped out on me,” Tom said.

“When you do all your training as a pilot you’re trained for worst-case scenarios, and that is *the* worst thing that can happen to a pilot – loss of engine power on take-off, because you don’t have any options. You’ve got no altitude to work with, you’ve got no airspeed energy to work with, you’ve got nothing to work with and you’ve got to milk out what little you have and get something out of it.

“I had a plan. It was a plan that I put together in a matter of two seconds, but I really believed that it was going to work. It failed in the last few seconds because I landed too hard because of what I told you about the downwind turn, but... they say that any aircraft landing that you can walk away from is a good landing.”

In the meantime, personally training his small stable of five horses – including 12-year-old millionaire Whiskey Tax who finished third in a race at Grand River Raceway on Wednesday – will have to wait.

“I can’t get on a cart. I can’t lift anything over 10 pounds because my back can’t take the weight. It’s a little hard getting up and down,” Tom said.

GET BACK ON THAT HORSE

As for the plane, Tom said he needs to know why the engine failed.

“I don’t want to go on with my whole life and always wonder what was going on with that airplane,” he said. “We’re almost positive that it was in the fuel system somewhere. We know it’s not water. We know it’s not bad gas and we know it’s not contamination or anything like that, but it’s probably in the fuel pumps, the carburetors, something in the fuel system because it didn’t blow any cylinders or anything like that. It was starving for fuel, for some reason.”

He admits he was both composed and terrified in those frightening seconds and his initial instinct after surviving the crash was to never fly again. A friend helped him sort through his emotions.

“He was on the phone with me today and we talked it through and I’m already feeling confident about getting back in an airplane again because this is such a rare event. The chances of it happening to me again are really, really in my favor,” Tom said.

Just like horses, Tom Durand said flying is, “a disease. If you get bit by the bug, you cannot get rid of it.”

Schnittker's 1:48 duo will not supplement to Meadowlands Pace

The timing of it seems odd with racing just getting back underway and all, but the Meadowlands Pace is rapidly approaching. With the Meadowlands not even resuming racing until just three weeks ago, focus is now shifting from simply making it back to the track to competing in an accelerated stakes schedule.

Racing at the Meadowlands over the past couple of weeks has featured promising and some of the more well-known horses from last year at 2, but over the 36-race marathon last weekend, two of the most impressive 3-year-olds came from

the barn of Ray Schnittker.

Interestingly, neither of the them are currently eligible to the Meadowlands Pace.

First up from the barn was **Captain Groovy** (Captaintreacherous—Let's Groove Tonite). Following up on his June 6 triumph from opening weekend when he blew the doors off his rivals in 1:49.3 in his first start of the season, Captain Groovy came right back to win last weekend, stopping the timer in a real sparkler, 1:48 flat. He did so with a bold first over rush around the final turn, going from fourth to first in a matter of strides. For comparison of times, the very next race that night, a race with similar conditions, went in 1:50.3. The second finisher in that race was Captain Barbossa, a Tony Alagna-trained horse with Meadowlands

Pace aspirations of his own.

A few races later that night, another Schnittker 3-year-old **Splash Brother** (So Surreal—Sugarcoated) was parked past the quarter from post 10, but it didn't matter as he went all the way in 1:48.2, with a :25.3 kicker at the end of it. It was his second consecutive Meadowlands win following up from a 1:51 win on June 6, and in the process, he bested another well regarded Alagna trainee, the 4-5 race favorite Captain Kirk.

The respective times of 1:48 and 1:48.2 from Captain Groovy and Splash Brother are the fastest miles posted by any 3-year-old this year. Despite the big early season performances, Schnittker does not plan to pay the \$62,500 supplement for either horse. Schnittker, who won the 2017 Meadowlands Pace with Huntsville, said "No, I'm not going to come up with that kind of money. They were both nice colts last year, but they weren't over the top. A lot of my owners are sour with making stakes payments, so I try to keep it to a minimum."

Indeed, neither horse appeared extraordinary last year. Captain Groovy earned a modest \$68,744 through 9 starts last year while taking a 1:52 mark at Pocono. Splash Brother – a gelding – went winless last year in 7 starts and didn't win his first career race until earlier this month.

The two horses combined are 4-for-4 as 3-year-olds, and the improvement in Splash Brother in particular has been profound. Regarding his performance last Saturday, Schnittker said, "I thought he'd go in 1:50 no problem; but once you get down to 1:48 territory, that's kind rare air. He was probably 17 hands last year; he's huge. He was that big last year, and I think he needed another year. Mark MacDonald fell off of him at Saratoga last year and he did something there and we couldn't ever quite figure out what it was, but he was never really right the rest of the year. But he's been training like a beast since he's come back."

Both Captain Groovy and Splash Brother are staked comparably. Both are staked to the Adios, and, of course, both are expected to race throughout sire stakes – Splash Brother in the New York Sires Stakes, including Empire Breeders, and Captain Groovy throughout Pennsylvania.

"Hopefully, if they're good enough, they still have a shot of making a half-million," said Schnittker.

On the surface it may seem like the horses are in an advantageous position if they were to supplement, having already both paced in 1:48 while some of the other contenders are still just coming back to the races – especially since this year the Meadowlands Pace plays more

like a North America Cup, seeing as how early it is in the season relative to when the horses have started back in training. But, Schnittker doesn't necessarily see there being a conditioning edge.

"I think what it is, is that our horses are getting more like the thoroughbreds. They don't need all of the work (that they used to). It's just, you keep them happy and they come into their conditioning a lot quicker. I didn't train those horses any harder than I did 10 years ago, they just came out and did it. I think that the breed is changing," the trainer said.

In looking at races from as recent as the past two weeks, it's hard to argue that Schnittker doesn't have a point. These days everyone races faster than they used to, and horses don't necessarily "need" a start or two. Schnittker's two horses qualified in the 1:55 range at Goshen and had no trouble coming out sub 1:50 at the Meadowlands. Last Saturday, the current Meadowlands Pace favorite Tall Dark Stranger paced a qualifying mile in 1:49. Atlanta made her first start of the season and went toe-to-toe with Manchego in a 1:50.2 trot. Kissinintheland paced first out in 1:47.4. The examples are endless.

In addition to Captain Groovy and Splash Brother, Schnittker also feels good about fellow 3-year-old barn mates Lake Charles and Cigars And Port.

"Lake Charles was a good colt last year, and he was third in his first start at the Meadowlands (1:50.2). He went a big trip in the same class Groovy was, he's real nice. And I've got Cigars and Port. I thought he raced okay at the Meadowlands in his first start. He won the sire stake final last year at Batavia and he's racing this weekend at Tioga. Hopefully they all stay sound and have a good year."

It gets better. I texted Joe Faraldo to inform him of the bloop. Joe in turn contacted the powers that be that had erred in an attempt to be ultra-cautious. Sure enough, for the next three days I get the same text every morning.

For the few of you that have read this far and don't understand what I am ranting about, in order to be tested positive for antibodies one must have been exposed to the virus.

Hopefully my 10 per cent was a logical figure. In the end, Faraldo published a statement that all was well and the problem was solved.

It's way too early to tell, but as of now there is little that



surprises me in the 2-year-old ranks. Muscle Hill has had more than his share of winners as has Chapter Seven. So far, I am a little disappointed in Southwind Frank, but as I said, it's very early and he only had 49 foals. Captaintreacherous and the new kid on the block Always B Miki are the big leaders on the pacing side. Betting Line is a major question mark to me, simply because he has nearly 50 per cent of his foals racing and not that many winners. That would tend to tell me the foals are quite sound and not that fast. Stay tuned.

Sara Connelly asks: I remember a time that you, Chuck Sylvester and Per Eriksson ruled the roost. Jimmy Takter was usually an also ran with few exceptions. How did he become the end all to the sport? Do you think his private veterinarian had a part in it. He was the first trainer that had his own vet since I have been in the game.

STOP right there. I am not big on conspiracy theories. Don't you think a man that won every major race under the sun would be caught if he was doing something illegal at that level. Jimmy is without question one of the finest conditioners that ever lived. When it's all said and done, in this writer's opinion he was the best. But the best on the totality of his performance. His performance winning almost half the Breeders Crowns a few years back with the assistance of David Miller was worth watching over and over.

However, think back to that night, which to me was symbolic of his dominance.

There was no Per Eriksson, no Chuck Sylvester and no Ron Gurfein.

That evening was so great and such a time of change in the sport that I must pause and explain something not previously discussed. Ron, Chuck, and Per were not in the business of training pacers.

Think for a moment if you can train a top trotter you surely can do the same with a pacer. Jimmy was smart enough to figure this out and it immediately catapulted him to the top of the class.

Jimmy's secret to success is something he shared with both me and Per. However, Charlie was just super good. He didn't need to learn from the Scandinavian.

Takter secret was teach the 2-year-old to go with pain.

"If they can't learn to overcome it they will never be great," he would always say.

I was blessed to have both Jimmy and Per as owners on my first Hambletonian winner, Victory Dream and I will tell you they were by far the most supportive owners I have ever had. Every night on the paddock bus one or both would be patting me on the back and saying don't change a thing you

are doing a great job.

The trotting game in those days was so different than anything I had ever experienced. All of us, including Chuck, fed off one another. There were many times when questions would be raised by all of us. It was like a wonderful club. We could be racing for \$650,000 in the World Trotting Derby and one of the above came to me and asked, "Do you think I should switch from steel to aluminum in the final."

We were close. Imagine Chad Brown asking that question of Bob Baffert. I don't believe it would happen.

As I have said many times before, the draft is the secret to success in harness racing. Unlike the major class sports, it is better to end the year on top than on the bottom when it comes to the selection process. The better you perform the more money you have to spend. Does it always work? No, but it does help. Having George Segal, Jerry Silva, Deana Frost and too many others to mention give you a huge edge. Chuck had Perretti, Goldman and Liverman enough to draft a championship team and Per had a very powerful duo of Margareta Wallinus-Kleberg and Ted Gewertz. At the beginning, Jimmy had little power, but at the end he had it all.

Then came "baby trainer" Marcus Melander who not only has a great team of yearling selectors but mucho dinero. I truly hope my answer has not in any way demeaned the Takter legacy, as to my mind he is by far the greatest trainer in the history of the sport and a wonderful man to boot.

Add to his legacy that the Apple fell more than close to the tree with the stable of his very talented daughter Nancy. I have a hunch that the name Takter will be around when my grandkids go to the races in 2075.

Paul Arondes asks: Please watch the replay of the Roll With Joe Sunday at Tioga Downs and explain to me what Richard Still was doing aside from getting in everybody's way?

I don't need to watch the replay, as I am a big fan of Bettors Wish who is owned in part by my best friend.

I am also very close to the Bier family that races his mount Highalator. I will start with I know that Still would not be driving if the family didn't believe he was good. And anyone can make a poor drive. That said, he was well aware he was done going to the half and it would have been a correct move to grab hold of the horse and retreat then and there.

Instead, he kept his horse in the mix long enough to destroy the chances of most of the trailing horses and seriously affected the outcome of the race. I refuse to speculate as to what the result would have been if Richard was more judicious in his drive. I will say that if he retreated

at the half the order of finish in my opinion would have been radically different. That's why they call it horse racing.

After all is said and done, if you like to gamble you may get 2-1 on Bettors Wish in his next start. You can bet the house.

Joel Kravet asks: Belmont Stakes winner Tis The Law is being promoted as a New York bred, I don't believe that the horse ever stood in NY. What is the gimmick? Can a Muscle Hill race in the New York Sires Stakes? What's the scoop?

Unfortunately, the answer is not so simple and as you implied there is a little gimmickry going on.

When the farms in a state start losing their stallions, something must be done to attract mares to the farms. Thus, New York came up with a new rule. If a mare, as in Tis The Law's case, is bred in a state outside of New York (i.e. Kentucky) and after she is pronounced in foal is shipped to New York to foal, the resulting colt or filly is considered to be New York-bred.

No, a Muscle Hill cannot race in the New York Sires Stakes. However, our sport has its own share of gimmicks. Muscle Hill is a New Jersey stallion, but his offspring can race in the Kentucky Sires Stakes and also the New Jersey Sires Stakes.

It's called dual eligibility, a new term of the times like social distancing.

It's basically the same type situation the mare is bred in New Jersey and sent to Kentucky, but it is just a six-month residency requirement and unlike the case with the New York thoroughbreds it is not necessary for the mare to foal in Kentucky.

Thanks again for all the kind words. I am on route to Pennsylvania and just in the nick of time. I just heard an announcement that New York, New Jersey and Connecticut have ruled 14-day quarantines for any travelers from high-profile pandemic states. Governor Wolf in PA will not be far behind.

To this writer, it should have been proposed as a voluntary request as in my wildest dreams I cannot fathom how they could ever enforce it. As I write this, Governor Cuomo has stated the fines will range from \$2,000 to \$10,000 if you are caught cheating. Maybe they will be handing out GPS ankle bracelets at the airports and EZ Pass toll booths.

World record performance by Face Time Bourbon

The best trotter in the world? The answer is clearer after Sunday's \$165,000 Prix René Balliere at Vincennes racetrack in Paris, France.

Sébastien Guarato's top trotter and Prix d'Amérique winner Face Time Bourbon hadn't started since late February this year, but was still in shape enough to perform at his very best over 1.3 miles.

Björn Goop sent the 5-year-old star to the front three wide after the first quarter and spent another quarter-mile outside the leading duo, meaning the first half of Face Time Bourbon's return race was ultra-tough. That didn't stop Face

Time Bourbon from leaving his opponents in the stretch and the Ready Cash son came home in a mile rate of 1:51.3 over 1.3 miles, which is a new world record performance.

Pierre Vercruysse's Drole de Jet made a strong effort as runner up, while Feliciano finished strongly for third place.

Face Time Bourbon has banked \$1,918,815 so far in his career and has won 21 of his 25 starts. His next big objective is the \$192,000 Criterium des 5 ans at Vincennes on Aug. 29 where the distance is solid 3,000 meters.

Driver Goop had his own horses racing in Sweden during the Sunday, but it's hard to say no to a drive on Face Time Bourbon.

"It's magic. The horse is truly impressive. It's a great job done by all of Sébastien Guarato's team. Face Time Bourbon's acceleration is exceptional and he was very calm during the race and I found him superb today," Goop said on TV channel Equidia after the race.

This was Face Time Bourbon's fifth victory in a Group 1 race, and the champion trotter is still only five years old.

There were several stakes races on the card at Vincennes and 3-year-old **Helgafell** (Charly du Noyer) continues to consolidate his position as number one in the "H-crop" in France. Philippe Allaire's star dominated the \$164,000 Prix Albert Viel in a safe win from the lead in mile rate 1:58.3 over 1.6 miles.

Allaire also hoped to collect the trophy in the monté race \$164,000 Prix d'Essai for 3-year-olds, but his weapon Hudson Vedaquais (Thorens Vedaquais) finished several lengths behind Hope On Victory, who made a break shortly before the wire which resulted in disqualification.

Face Time Bourbon replay.

Set for E3 finals

E3, the circuit for European-bred 3-year-olds, is on the schedule at Saturday's race card at Bergsåker racetrack in Sweden. As usual, the first of the two finals is held over 1.3 miles.

The \$202,105 E3 for colts and geldings is an open edition where fresh trainer Daniel Wäjersten's Global Badman (Yield Boko) was the most impressive winner in the eliminations.

In the division for 3-year-old mares, Trixton daughter Loaded Maria, undefeated after five starts so far, looks to be the first choice, but the race is, like the other division, a very open story and new stars will be born on Saturday afternoon.

Alberta's Gordon Empey on the joys of Cenalta Farms

When it comes to their stake in horse racing, the couple from Bowden, AB doesn't mind a little California dreaming.

Gordon and Helen Empey feel right at home on their Cenalta — a combination of 'Central' and 'Alberta' — Farms, an ideal spot for the standardbred owners to travel to either Century Downs in Calgary or The Track on 2 in Lacombe, the latter a 40-minute drive northeast of Bowden.

"I like the atmosphere up there," said Gordon, of The Track

on 2. "It's very laid-back. It's a pretty setting. Hopefully, everything goes well this season. I'm going to support them as much as I can. Once we get into the stakes races with our young horses, we probably won't get to race there as much, but it's a very nice place to race."

He can say the same of Cal-Expo.

For the past four winters, the Empeys have taken their show on the road, so to speak, heading south to Sacramento to enjoy the warmer temperatures and the California racing scene.

"The first winter we went to California, we had great success down there," said Gordon. "I guess you could say we enjoyed it so much, including the warm weather, that we've made the choice to go back every winter since then. It's a great place to train the babies, which is something we really enjoy doing... training and working with the babies."

As he noted, the Golden State proved to be a happy hunting ground from day one.

In Empey's first training start at Cal-Expo, on Nov. 12, 2016, he sent out Cenalta Eclipse, a homebred son of Allamerican Merlin.

Dismissed at 27-1, the bay got away eighth, then moved up to fifth at the half-mile mark.

With Andrew Arsenault in the bike, Cenalta Eclipse, who had improved to third at the stretch call, rallied stoutly to notch a half-length score, cutting the final quarter in :28.3.

Cenalta Diamond and Cenalta Cougar, also Empey homebreds, each won three races that winter at Cal-Expo.

“We might not get to California this year because of the pandemic. We didn’t race too heavily last year, around 35 starts there. With the young horses, we were trying to save them for when we got back here for the stakes this summer. In hindsight, I wish I would have raced them a little more. But we have had some good success there.”

Not bad for a couple who started out with a modest purchase and modest expectations some 20-plus years ago.

Their harness racing story began with the purchase of a bay daughter of the great Jate Lobell, bred by Armstrong Bros. in Inglewood, ON.

“We bought our first horse from a friend I was working with, a horse that they brought back from the racetrack,” said Gordon. “Her name was Smitty’s Girl. We bred her and sold the first foal as a yearling. From there, we just started adding

a few mares here and there. Early on, we bought mares from people who were either getting out of the business or cutting back on their numbers. The sales weren’t going that well, so we started racing a few ourselves.

“Only one horse that we’ve raced didn’t have the Cenalta name in it. Her name was Gravel Gertie. I bought in on her to use as a broodmare. Everything else has been a homebred. Now, we’re into the homebreds being out of homebred mares, too.”

Just over four years ago, Empey, then closing in on retirement age, earned his trainer’s license.

The decision was based on two particular considerations: economics and enjoyment.

“I was doing most of the training here on the farm any way,” he said, in reference to the dirt track at Cenalta Farms. “I figured that I could learn from my own mistakes. Money obviously plays a huge part in my decision to train. If I had to send my horses out to others trainers, we’d be out of the business, for sure. There just isn’t enough in it to make a living.

“The horses might be better if I handed them over to a seasoned trainer, but then my expenses would be that much

more. That said, we do enjoy watching our horses – like Cenalta Power, Cenalta Call Girl, and Cenalta Diamond – go on and do well for other trainers.”

Training hasn’t always been a smooth ride for Empey.

He’s endured a fair share of injuries, thankfully, none of them too serious, since 2016.

Empey, who has 51 career training triumphs, takes all of it – bumps, breaks and bruises – in stride.

“I’ve had a couple of good ones,” he said, with a chuckle. “I broke my shoulder. I guess that would be four years ago. It was a young horse and he got spooked. Some broken ribs, on another horse – I can’t quite remember them all. I know there’s been three or four. Luckily, I’ve had some good friends take over when I’ve been down and out.”

Despite various times spent on the sidelines, Empey is proof that you can’t keep a good horseman down.

Still training his current stable of four, he continues to derive great joy from being around young horses.

“I love working with them. It’s very gratifying to see them develop. Sometimes, it can be a little frustrating, but it’s about taking time to guide them along and educate them the best you can. I don’t push them too early. I’d rather see them around as an older horse, then just give everything they’ve got as a two-year-old, and not having anything left in the tank later on.”

Empey sees his time in horse racing through a somewhat similar lens.

“Both my wife and I are getting a little long in the tooth, and you feel those aches and pains more now when you get down to do legs and things like that. It can be tough, but one of the good things with young horses is that you don’t have to deal with as many leg problems. And these young ones, they keep us going.”

Plainridge opening delayed until July 13

When the Massachusetts Gaming Commission gave their support to a tentative date for live racing to begin at Plainridge Park, it was contingent on Phase-3 of the governor's reopening plan beginning on schedule. That has not happened and the track's starting date has changed.

On Friday (June 19) Governor Baker announced that he was extending Phase-2 by one week so he could get a look at two weeks of indoor dining data before making a decision on starting Phase-3.

As a result, if Phase-3 does begin after that one week extension, qualifiers at Plainridge would be held on Monday (July 6) and Thursday (July 9) and then the opening day of live racing for the 2020 season would take place on Monday (July 13).

Any further delay of implementing Phase-3 will also result in another delay in the racing dates listed.

The condition sheets for qualifiers are now on the United States Trotting Association's website (www.ustrotting.com) with a double draw to be held for those qualifiers. You must declare by 9 a.m. Thursday morning (July 2) for the draw for Monday (July 6) and Thursday (July 9).

Horse men and women are also reminded to renew their Massachusetts racing licenses in advance of the start of live racing. With limited access to the judges office due to social distancing, it is suggested you print an [application from the MGC website](#), fill it out and return it with a check. MGC personnel will be working prior to the track's opening to process all applications received in order to avoid any kind of last minute rush.

Pacing fillies launch 2020 Ontario Sires Stakes season tonight

Ontario harness racing fans and participants will be celebrating tonight (June 26) as the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program makes its 2020 debut at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Delayed by five weeks due to the COVID-19 shutdown, the OSS program will kick off with four \$23,000 Grassroots divisions for the 3-year-old pacing fillies and last season's leading trainer Gregg McNair will look to pick up where he left off, sending out early favorite Landry Seelster in the second split.

The Mach Three daughter will start from Post 2 and heads into the Grassroots season opener off a sharp runner-up finish in a June 19 test at Woodbine Mohawk Park and a fourth-place result in her June 9 sophomore debut.

"She raced good both starts really. She seems to be getting a little stronger," said Guelph resident McNair, who shares ownership of the filly with Ilderton Boys Stable of London and Dany Fontaine of Ormston, QC. "She still has a bit of a mind of her own on the track and stuff, she's a little hyper, but she's got a good gait to her and everything. We hope that she's all right; she drew good."

McNair's son Doug, currently the leading driver at the Campbellville oval, will steer Landry Seelster in the third start of her sophomore campaign. As a 2-year-old the filly captured the Grassroots season opener at Woodbine Mohawk Park and went on to qualify for the season ending Grassroots Championship, where she finished seventh.

Trainer Rob Fellows started two fillies in the Grassroots Championship last fall and both Mach My Kiss and Coqui Coqui will look to launch another successful provincial campaign on Friday. Mach My Kiss is the early favorite from Post 6 in the first division and Coqui Coqui gets Post 2 in the final split.

"The two of them train bridles apart every time they train together," said Fellows. "To me like they act like they have the same amount of ability, but a lot of time when they start racing they separate real quick, because we try to train and keep them together just for attitude as much as anything you know, but once you start racing of course no one's waiting on you, you've got to be able to keep up and go."

"Obviously we're hoping for good things for both of them. Both of them actually are owned by the breeders. My wife Yolanda and I own part of Mach My Kiss, with Blair and Erna Corbeil who bred her, and of course Jack Turigliatto, he bred

Coqui Coqui. They believe in us to keep their horse and you hope you can do them proud.”

Doug McNair will steer Mach Three filly Mach My Kiss for the Fellows and Corbeil families, while Bob McClure gets the call on Sportswriter daughter Coqui Coqui.

With fans not permitted at the racetrack, the owner/breeders will be cheering on their Grassroots hopefuls from afar Friday, but Fellows hopes to see them trackside before the season comes to an end.

“Hopefully it will be behind us partway through this season and we’ll get people out,” said the trainer. “The racetracks will do all they can do to bring it back as quickly and safely as they can, because we don’t want to be doing something that’s not 100 per cent safe for the people. We want to do whatever is right.”

Post time for tonight’s 3 card at Woodbine Mohawk Park is 7 pm and the Grassroots divisions will be featured in Races 2, 4, 7 and 9. [Downloadable programs](#) and a [live stream](#) of all the races are available on the Woodbine [Mohawk Park website](#).

Both McNair and Fellows will be back at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday when the 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings kick off their Grassroots season. McNair will start Mack from Post 3 in the third division and Doubleagentman from Post 7 in the fifth, while Fellows sends out Lous Delight from Post 2 in the second split.

Big M firing on all cylinders

It was neither Hambletonian Day nor Meadowlands Pace Night, but you couldn’t tell that from the betting at the Big M Saturday night (June 20).

Wagering surpassed the \$4 million mark for the first time on a “non-event” card since March 1 of 2014, as a total of \$4,100,386 was pushed through the windows. The track did program 18 races – five more than usual – to get some horses raced who had been on the sidelines during the COVID-19 shutdown, but the average action per race was still a rock-solid \$227,789.

“Last weekend was a good one for us,” said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. “It

was gratifying to be able to afford our horsemen more opportunities to race and make some much-needed money for their connections as we waited for some of the neighboring states to open up. We were also happy to see the response of our fans, who bet vigorously throughout the weekend.”

The total wager for last Friday (June 19) and Saturday was \$7,582,203 for 36 races, good for an average per race of \$210,616.

This weekend, when racing will be conducted on the usual schedule – tonight (June 26) and Saturday (June 27) – at the usual post time of 7:15 p.m. with the usual 13 races, bettors will be shooting for a pool that figures to be far bigger than usual in the 20-cent Pick-6.

Pick-6 players will be adding to a pot that will start out with a carryover of \$8,948 tonight. The Pick-6 is one of the track’s betting “Big 4”.

The wagers, which all offer a low 15 per cent takeout and will also have \$160,000 in guaranteed pools, are the 20-cent Pick-5 (race one, \$40,000 guaranteed pool), the aforementioned Pick-6 (race four, \$30,000), the Early 50-cent Pick-4 (race six, \$50,000) and Late 50-cent Pick-4 (race 10, \$40,000).

Twenty-cent Jackpot Super High-Five players will no doubt continue to chase their pot of gold, given some serious carryovers. Friday’s fifth race will begin with \$54,154 in the hat, while the 13th and final has a carryover of \$65,202.

Last Saturday, despite nine winning favorites on the card, Pick-5 players hit big, cashing in for \$32,943 when two double-digit-odds winning horses scored during the sequence, including a 38-1 chance in the opening leg (race one).

TIM ON TOP: Tim Tetrick led the way last week in the driver’s colony, scoring nine times. Dexter Dunn, Yannick Gingras and Jordan Stratton were next with four winners apiece.

Nancy Takter and Shane Tritton were the leading trainers, as each sent three to victory lane.

FAST, FASTER, FASTEST: Saturday night saw eight of the 17 pacing events go in sub-1:50. On Friday, when Manchego nosed Atlanta in 1:50 in the first leg of the Miss Versatility Series, she established the fastest mile on the trot in the sport this year. She bested her own mark – set on June 5 – by three-fifths of a second.

COMING UP: This weekend, there will be plenty of good racing to go around, as the New Jersey Sire Stakes for 3-year-olds rolls on. In addition, 4-year-old trotters will go at

it in “harness racing’s traveling road show”, the Graduate Series. There will also be a 3-year-old open trot, where some Hambletonian contenders will get in behind the gate.

HOW TO WATCH, HOW TO BET: Since fans are still not allowed to attend the races, for those anxious to be a part of the Big M action, they can watch the races on the Roberts Television Network (rtn.tv) or on the Television Games Network (TVG). To bet the races in New Jersey, go to 4njbets.com, and if out of state, go to tv.com or your favorite ADW (advance-deposit wagering) platform.

FREE STUFF: For free past performances of some key wagers, go to playmeadowlands.com. On Friday, the 20-cent Pick-6 (race four) and Late 50-cent Pick-4 (race 10) will be available. The Late Pick-4 will be available for Saturday’s races.

CHECK OUT THE TEAM: For those who need to get a leg up on the action, go to playmeadowlands.com to see track oddsmaker and analyst Dave Brower’s selections and commentary. Go to the “handicapping” drop down and then go to “race reviews”.

Additionally, track announcer Ken Warkentin’s blog is available on the site and offers his picks and analysis.

Last week, Big M handicappers did well, as Brower led the way with 15 winners. Dave Little and Warkentin tabbed 13 and 12, respectively.

This weekend’s pre-game shows get underway at 6:45 p.m., and the team – which includes Jessica Otten – will give out best bets and value plays. Little and Brower will do some news and notes and will also look at each evening’s feature races. They will give out Pick-4 selections during the evening before saying good night after the 11th-race replay with the segment “Little’s Late Double”, where the former Daily News handicapper tries to send everybody home a winner.

During the evening, look for Otten’s interviews with

horsepeople from the back paddock after race replays.

Leaving from post five in an abbreviated field of five, Tetrack sent Rock Swan to the front and she quickly grabbed command through the opening panel in :27.2. May Baby was content to grab the pocket seat while Shape Shifter and Peter Wrenn were next in line third. Rock Swan clicked off fractions of :56.2 and 1:25.0 before ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field.

As the field turned for home, Yoder tipped May Baby out from the pocket and the stage was set for a battle to the wire. The two fillies matched strides down the long Hoosier Park stretch and neither appeared willing to accept defeat.

Ultimately, May Baby prevailed in a tight photo and established a new lifetime best in the process. May Baby returned \$3.40 to her backers for the victory.

With the win, May Baby pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$241,990 and has now won seven of 11 of her lifetime outings. The daughter of Guccio—Free Wheeling is owned by Cheyenne Yoder and was bred by Oakwood Farms. May Baby is expected to make her next start in the opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes action for 3-year-old trotting fillies at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Wednesday, July 1.

The Star Destroyer Stakes will return to Harrah's Hoosier Park tonight (June 26) with two \$20,000 divisions for 3-year-old pacing colts and one \$30,000 division for 3-year-old pacing fillies on the evening's 14-race card.

Erv Miller also sent out the fastest trotting male in the Chapter Seven – Chandler T gelding **Cschapeterone**, whom Atlee Bender steered to success in 2:01.1 for the Ervin Miller Stable, Tangie Massie, Louis Willinger, and Harvey Eisman. Stablemate Mystical King was just a tick behind Cschapeterone in completing the Erv Miller quadruple for driver Marcus Miller and the partnership of the Ervin Miller Stable, Mystical Marker Farms, and Harmony Oaks Racing Stable.

Trainer Jenny Melander sent out two successful trotting filly freshman winners, with the Cantab Hall – All That Sparkles miss **Myreanna** taking speed honors with a wire-to-wire 1:59.2 win for driver Matt Kakaley and the JPS Racing Stables LLC. Jenny herself handled the Cantab Hall – Tymal Elvira distaff Two Piece Tanlines and probably didn't like being 13 lengths behind at the three-quarters, but the front-end speed gave way and Melander guided her baby home first in 2:03.2 for Melander Racing Inc., John Devito and Michael and Gary Card.

Laura and Paul Baker's McMarkle Sparkle captured her OHSS division in a blistering 1:50.1 for driver Brett Miller and trainer Jim Arledge, Jr. The homebred brown filly by McArdle—It's Ladies Nite used come-from-behind tactics to score her first triumph of the season by nearly five lengths. McMarkle Sparkle owns a bankroll of \$138,826 lifetime.

From the 12 pacing fillies entered in these OHSS divisions, four were sired by Ohio-based stallion Pet Rock, with two each sired by Big Bad John and Yankee Cruiser. The following stallions were represented by one foal each in these events: Dragon Again, Major Stone, McArdle and Western Vintage.

In the three trotting divisions, which feature fields of seven diagonally-gaited specialists each, OSS leg one winners—Globetrotting, Guinevere Hall and Kikimora—have all returned.

Globetrotting took her round one division in 1:55.1 for trainer Jason McGinnis and Thestable Globetrotting of Guelph, ON. Bred by Steiner Stock Farms, the daughter by Manofmanymissions—Celebrity Deville has procured career earnings of \$171,582 thus far. She'll leave from post six in race three.

Kikimora, a daughter by Triumphant Caviar—Nessa Rose, battles in this same division from post three. Trained by co-owner Chris Beaver for breeder and co-owner Sandra Burnett of Wilmington, OH, Kikimora captured her first OHSS leg in a career best 1:54.1 with Aaron Merriman at the lines. The winner of \$231,516 lifetime has four wins, three seconds and a third from 11 career starts.

Guinevere Hall, a winner of \$154,181 lifetime, heads up the first OHSS division (Race 1) from post three for driver Peter Wrenn and trainer Melanie Wrenn. The daughter of Cash Hall—Garbo Hall won her first OHSS leg with a front-stepping 1:55 performance. Bred by Alan J. Leavitt of Kentucky, Guinevere Hall will be trying for her second consecutive triumph in as many starts this season.

Leg three of the Ohio Sires Stakes for 3-year-old pacing fillies is scheduled for July 4 at Scioto Downs, while 3-year-old trotting fillies will go postward in OHSS leg three on July 10 at Northfield Park.
