Something is rotten at Yonkers

Horses last listed as being trained by Rene Allard and still owned, in part, by his mother, are showing up in the entry box at Yonkers a little more than three months after Rene was arrested and accused of horse doping.

Just a little more than three months after FBI arrests were widely hailed as the first, and much-needed, step in improving integrity in horse racing, Yonkers Raceway and racing regulators in New York are in danger of deeply tarnishing the sport over one of the accused — trainer Rene Allard.

In March, Allard and 28 other standardbred and thoroughbred people were arrested and accused of a variety of troubling crimes related to horse doping (full story here).

Recently, horses last listed as being trained by Allard that are still owned, in part, by his mother, Danielle Henri, began showing up in the entry box at Yonkers where Allard was the second leading trainer at the time of his arrest.

The United States Trotting Association (USTA) lists the D Racing Stable Inc. as being solely owned by Henri, who, as an aside, is the former mayor of Rene Allard's hometown, tiny Saint-Esprit, QC (from 1996-2009). She is also listed by the USTA as the sole owner of Allard Racing Inc. based in Quebec. Though it is believed she still lives in Quebec, D Racing Stable Inc. has its address listed as Middletown, NY, which is strange.

The gelded pacer **Blaise MM Hanover**, that is entered in the \$33,000 open handicap on July 2 at Yonkers, is an interesting case.

Before Rene Allard was arrested in mid-March — and please note that the charges against him and the others have not been proven in court — the pacer was trained by Jose Godinez.

On March 7, Rene Allard claimed the gelding for \$40,000 at Yonkers on behalf of Henri's Allard Racing Inc. and Earl Hill, Jr. of Ohsweken, ON. The next week — the same week Rene was arrested — Blaise MM Hanover was entered to race on March 14 at Yonkers with Rene listed as trainer. That card was ultimately cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but on April 8, the ownership of the horse was "changed" to Henri's D Racing Stable Inc. and Earl Hill, Jr. of Ohsweken, ON. Same owners, just a different stable name being used by Rene Allard's mother, Henri.

Now Rob Harmon is listed as the trainer on Blaise MM Hanover for his July 2 entry at the New York track.

All that would suggest that since the horse was last known to be in Rene's barn, the owners have not changed and Rene's mother is still involved, that Rene is still involved in some capacity with the gelding while facing serious horse doping charges.

In short, something stinks to high heaven.

At the very least, the Yonkers race office or the New York State Gaming Commission should have erred on the sides of caution and optics and barred Blaise MM Hanover's entry — and other horses that appear to have a similar connection — until it could definitively prove Rene Allard is not involved with the horses.

The welfare of the horses and fairness to both the betting public and the other horsepeople that have allegedly been fleeced by crooked operators, should take precedent.

On Monday, the qualifier entries for Yonkers lists **five horses** that had their last pari-mutuel starts with Rene Allard listed as trainer that are all owned, at least in part, by Rene's mother, Henri.

Sandy's Beach and **Birch Island Betty** are in the first qualifier, **Ostro Hanover** in the second and **Keystone Phoenix** and **Ourlittlegeneral A** in the third. All five are now listed as being trained by Carmen Auciello.

Why any trainer would touch horses last trained by Allard is beyond me, but you can bet the fact the six horses mentioned above have earned over \$1.6 million combined has at least something to do with it.

Birch Island Betty was solely owned by Henri's Allard Racing Inc. prior to April 3 when it was changed to her D Racing Stable Inc.

Henri was not previously listed as an owner on Ostro Hanover when Rene was listed as trainer, but, as of March 30, Henri's D Racing Stable Inc. is listed as one of the owners now. Interestingly, her three partner stables on Ostro Hanover are the exact same partners she has on Keystone Phoenix. When it comes to Keystone Phoenix, again, Henri simply changed the stable name of her involvement. On March 1, the only ownership change on Keystone Phoenix was to take him from being owned by Henri's Allard Racing Inc. to her D Racing Stable Inc.

Finally, Ourlittlegeneral A also shows Henri's partial ownership has changed from her Allard Racing Inc. to D Racing Stable Inc., this time on March 8.

Likely, there are others. I didn't do an exhaustive search of where every horse Rene was training when he was arrested has landed, but you get the point.

And, yes, those last five horses are in qualifiers without wagering or purses, so no real damage done, yet. But racetracks everywhere — especially Yonkers which already has a huge black eye because three of its top 10 trainers are caught up in the FBI allegations — should be ultra-vigilant on integrity matters now, even in qualifiers.

Yes, I hear some of you laughing.

I am not naïve enough to expect either will suddenly do better, but a guy can dream.


Most assuredly, if I can quickly connect the dots, racing regulators should have, long ago, done the same and banned entries in the best interest of the game that employs them.



Thomson explains Winbak's decision to launch new Ontario sale to sell its yearlings

Preferred Equine will also sell its Canadian yearlings at the new sale at Winbak's Ontario farm.

Winbak Farm owner Joe Thomson said no offense to the London Selected Yearling Sale (LSYS), but he would prefer to sell his Ontario yearlings live, in-person, with an auctioneer this year.

"That was my preference," Thomson said. "I think you can sell racehorses online. You can sell a lot of horses online, but I just felt like when people are buying yearlings, if there was another way other than online I think we should try that."

Last week, the LSYS announced that due to COVID-19 and problems making its indoor sale facility at the Western Fair Agriplex work in a social distancing world, that it would sell its yearlings online through ongait.com (full story here).

Winbak, which stands more stallions (12), than any other Ontario standardbred farm, announced Friday (June 26) that it would sell its 2020 yearlings at its Inglewood, ON farm beginning at noon on Saturday, Oct. 17 at a sale it is calling The Ontario Select Yearling Sale. That night, the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Finals will be held 35 miles away at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Preferred Equine Canada has also announced plans to have an Ontario consignment sell live at Winbak.

To give one an example of how that will impact this year's LSYS catalogue, last year Preferred and Winbak were the second and third leading consignors, respectively, at the sale. Preferred sold 63 yearlings for \$930,500 total and Winbak sold 44 yearlings for \$686,500 total. Between the two, they accounted for 107 or 37 per cent of the 291 yearlings sold and \$1,617,000 (26 per cent) of the total sale gross of \$6,284,992.

Seelster Farms, LSYS's leading consignor in 2019, grossed \$1,840,000 for 47 yearlings sold.

"We're not meaning to blow their sale up or do something terrible to them," Thomson said of LSYS. "I wish them all the luck in the world with what they're doing, but you just make the best decisions in life that you can for running your business. It's what you've got to do.

Winbak owner Joe Thomson announced this week his farm was launching The Ontario Select Yearling Sale.

Thomson said he thinks achieving maximum value for horses comes from putting them through the ring and auctioning them off in person, even if bidders have to bid online or via telephone.

"I think we're going to use an auctioneer," Thomson said. "Even if people can't come, there will be an auctioneer to push them along and talk about the horses and have a pedigree reader."

He said Winbak Farm of Ontario, the former location of the famed Armstrong Bros. farm, is well suited for a sale in the social-distancing era.

"They have 180 or 200 stalls there. We don't want to have (a sale) that big, but we thought that if we doubled our size or maybe a little bit more that it would probably be enough that people would come," Thomson said of the sale he hopes to cap at 100 or 120 yearlings.

"We'll have the (web-streamed) show and we'll have phone lines and we'll have the online bidding. Hopefully, by that time, they won't be on lockdown and people will be able to come as well," Thomson said. "Sure, some people with health problems, no matter what, will not want to be around a lot of people. We still could have a partial lockdown... If nobody can come and they have to do it online, then we're no worse for the wear, but we'll still have our horses there and they will have been there for 30 days and we'll have a list of where the other horses that are going to sell that day will be located. They will probably come in on the Thursday, view Friday and sell on Saturday and be done the sale by 4:00 or 4:15... We're conscious of the fact that the races are that night."

The sale entry deadline will be July 17 or at an earlier date if the available slots are full.











George Teague, Jr. was born into harness racing and excelled at it

George Teague, Jr. was born into harness racing. His father and mother were, as he said, the two best horsepeople that he ever knew.

In writing this column, I tried to avoid race, but that was impossible.

At a time when the backstretches of racetracks all over America were filled with African Americans, very few of them were given the opportunity or the incentive to rise above the status of grooms. That's the culture in which George grew up.

His childhood idol was Lew Williams, the only black man installed in the Immortals section in Goshen.

Lew Williams wasn't just a good black driver. He was one of the greatest drivers ever, he just happened to be black.

I spoke at length with Teague last week.

"Considering my age group, the fact that I'm overweight and suffer from diabetes, I guess I'm all right," Teague said. "But given the times and what the country is going through, I'm trying to be as close to invisible as I can be.

"I'm mostly a homebody. I work with the horses. I'm around my family. For the most part I'm getting along fine.

"I've never known anything but horses and I've never wanted to do anything but be involved with harness racing.

"My dad was a great horseman and an equally good farrier. Most everything I initially knew was learned by watching him and my mom."

Teague started with cheap horses and worked his way up to be able to buy some more expensive ones. Ironically, he has had more success with the less expensive ones and his non-commercial homebreds than he did with the high-priced bluebloods.

I asked him what he looks for in a yearling.

"Mostly I look at budget. I rarely could afford to buy 'the flavor of the month.' As Bill Wellwood would sometimes say, 'I like to zig when everyone else is zagging.' The difference between Bill and me was he could afford to do most anything he wanted. I couldn't. I just didn't have the money. I looked for the diamond in the rough. I looked for faults that I felt I could live with.

"For example, with Rainbow Blue, I only had five or six head at the time I got her. Artiscape wasn't all that commercially attractive. But she was — very attractive! I had trained a couple of Artiscapes the previous year. They both had a lot of go to them, but they touched their knees. I didn't think she would do that. She was a gorgeous looking filly and came from what at that time was considered a good racehorse family. The price was right at \$10,500. She was racy and had a good look and eye.

"Did I think that she would turn out to be as good as she did? I sure as heck didn't. But she showed class from the very beginning. I truly believe that if she had stayed together, she would have been the greatest race mare ever.

"My two greatest horses were Wiggle It Jiggleit and Lather Up. At first, I was tempted to say Wiggle It Jiggleit alone at number one, but Lather Up was just as good and had maybe a hair more pure speed.

"They both came along when we were downsizing the stable operation.

"They were both non commercially attractive homebreds, but if you look real deep, you will find some family in both.

"Wiggle It Jiggleit showed tremendous ability at 2, but was never quite sound. I tried to protect him because I just knew if I could come close to getting him sound, he could be extra special. We opened him up at three when he showed what he really was. His Jug was probably the greatest horse race

many people have ever seen. Actually, he probably was never one hundred per cent sound a single day of his life. He was a truly great 3- and 4-year-old. He is a beautiful horse and still has great charisma. After all sorts of experimenting we found his main problems were in his hind ankles. He's obviously not what he once was, nor will he ever be. He will tell us when he's had enough and he will have a home with us for life.

"I believe that Lather Up at the top of his game was the fastest horse to ever look through a bridle. In truth, his record shows that he is, although he shares the record with Always B Miki. He was never perfectly sound either. He had an OCD in his stifle, which is just about the worst place to have one. I think the few times he went to running was caused by that bothering him. His performance the day he took his record was beyond description. I truly believe that he might have gone faster if Montrell had really asked him."

You brought up Montrell, How about him?

"Montrell is the greatest son a father could ever have. He's always been a hard worker and a terrific young man as well as a great citizen. He's won the Jug, the North American Cup and the Meadowlands Pace. He has great hands, a great sense of speed and is an excellent horseman. Yet in my opinion, he doesn't get near the amount of drives his ability should get him. I realize that its very competitive out there and there are a lot of good drivers. Is it racially biased? I really don't want to believe that it is. But I cannot say without reservation that it isn't.

"I'll give you an example. When he was doing extra well with Wiggle It Jiggleit, Sam Beegle asked Montrell if he would come to Harrah's Philadelphia for an autograph session. Sam said he would surely get some drives and hopefully add some spark to the night.

"He did get some drives - one in the first race and another

in the 12th. Between them nothing, nada. This is Philadelphia, not The Meadowlands on Hambletonian day, although Montrell has acquitted himself very well there. The judges presumably knew he was going to be there. Never a night goes by where they don't assign a number of drives because of no shows or drivers being listed behind multiple horses. To my knowledge, they didn't put him behind a single horse."

Through your years in the business, how have you generally been treated at racetracks or in the business in general?

"I would say, generally speaking we — by we I mean our team, myself, Montrell, my sister Brenda, my trainer and dear friend Clyde Francis and Big Mike who took care of Wiggle It Jiggleit — very well, certainly as well as others. At my home turf Dover and Harrington, The Meadowlands, Canada, Ohio and just about everywhere else we have been treated well and with a welcoming attitude.

"There is one glaring omission. That is the cesspool known as Yonkers Raceway. Anytime I've been there and had business to conduct, the best I can say is that I was always treated with contempt.

"One night, Wiggle It Jiggleit won the Levy and the driver who brings people to and from the winner's circle refused to take me, Clyde and Big Mike to the circle in his vehicle. Can you imagine that? The owner, trainer and groom of the horse and he wouldn't take us to the winner's circle.

"In addition to Montrell, I have two wonderful daughters who run the office. We are truly a complete family operation."

Throughout your career you've been known as a horseman who has been able to acquire good, sometimes great horses at relative bargain prices. We've talked about some of you best ones, let's talk about some of your other good horses:

Southwind Lynx - Cost \$42,000, Earned \$1,763,389

"A real good honest horse. Not too many horses have won two million-dollar races inside of a month. He is one of



them."

Badlands Nitro - Cost \$16,000, Earned \$1,763,389

"He was an excellent horse who always raced well. It was his misfortune to come out the same year as Somebeachsomewhere, Shadow Play and Art Official. He would have done more, except that he started bleeding towards the end of his 3-year-season. He was never quite the same after that."

Total Truth — Cost \$18,000, Earned \$2,022,433

"Very fast horse. He could be a little pouty at times. When in the mood he could race with anyone."

Somwherovrarainbow - Homebred, Earned \$1,342,433

"Rainbow Blue was one of the few great mares who was able to come close to reproducing herself. Actually, this filly might have had more pure speed than her momma. She just didn't have the overwhelming grit and class that she had. Of course, in my opinion, no other mare ever did."

Danae - Cost \$15,000, Earned \$529,099

"She was one of the most difficult training lessons I ever had. Dr. Kenny Seeber helped me enormously with her. I doubt that she would have become the filly that she did without his help. Of course, she won the Hambletonian Oaks. Today she might be better known as a broodmare, being the dam of the great Propulsion and one of the million-dollar yearlings sold in Kentucky last Fall."

Delmarvalous - Cost \$25,000, Earned \$899,123

"He was a gorgeous yearling. He had high speed, but wasn't always able to sustain it. He won the Adios among other races."

Mr Wiggles - Cost \$50,000, Earned \$1,171,484

"He was an extremely tough horse who always tried hard. He had an ankle that bothered him. He was Montrell's first drive and of course he is the sire of Wiggle It Jiggleit."

Fancy Filly - Cost \$15,000, Earned \$1,089,806

"She wasn't very big or stout, but she really tried all the time. I can't recall her ever going a bad race."

Isabella Blue Chip - Cost \$40,000, Earned \$792,069

"She always had trouble with her feet. She stepped on a quarter as a yearling and took off a good piece of a foot. She wasn't the best gaited filly, but she always tried."

Feel Like a Fool - Cost \$30,000, Earned \$1,269,988

"He was well named. He was somewhat goofy. He never got over seeing things that were not there. He loved sitting behind a helmet and raced best that way. Maybe doing that prevented him from seeing non-existent things."

Western Ace - Cost \$20,000, Earned \$1,891,133

"He was just a little guy. But was ultra-tough for a little horse. He never got tired. He could go five quarters and be just as fresh the fifth one as he was the first."

Custard The Dragon - Cost \$28,000, Earned \$778,057

"Just a perfect racehorse. He gave his all in every start. A real pleasure to have in our stable."

Artcotic - Cost \$3,000, Earned \$616,548.

"She was an ultimate overachiever. She would have earned a lot more, except that she made breaks. We were never able to figure out why."

Moonbeam - Cost \$8,000, Earned \$772,486

"Finished second to Somebeachsomewhere in the Metro and was an extremely talented horse."

Jimmy Bernstein told me a terrific story about Moonbeam.

"I was at George's place and we were training a set of five 2-year-olds," Bernstein said. "We came a last quarter in 25 and a piece with me driving and George said to me, 'You like him? I gave \$8,000 for him.' I said I loved him. George then said, 'You now own 10 per cent of him. That's the kind of incredibly generous guy George Teague is."

With a resume listing horses like that, the majority coming from modest beginnings, one would think that you would be in the Living Hall of Fame, Why aren't you?

"I'll answer that the same way that Brett Pelling did a couple of weeks ago when you asked that question of him. I don't know. I don't even know how the process works. I don't think that prejudice plays a part in it. At least I hope it doesn't. I think I as well as several other worthy people have been overlooked. I do know that there aren't too many who have had two Horses of the Year and were involved with the breeding, raising and racing of the fastest(tied) standardbred ever, who are not in."

What do you see in the future for harness racing?

"Unless we start doing some positive things, I see it as being quite bleak. We have done next to nothing to help ourselves. When we had the casino windfall, we took the money and ran with it. So few of us have done anything to help the sport. Like them or not, the politicians control our future. The DSOA and I held a fund raiser at my farm which raised \$55,000 for the Governor's campaign. We need to help those who have the power to help us. That Governor is on the record as saying that the horse industry is inviolable.

"Instead of investing in the sport, much of the new found money by horsemen went to trucks, TVs, better living and that's all great, but some of it was needed to be put back in the business that puts food on our table.

"Our marketing is nil. We need to take some lessons from the casinos, but maybe it's too late. Take Harrington as an example, they bus people to the casino every Saturday night. The have a sumptuous buffet that includes chitlins. Most people probably don't know what chitlins are. But they are looking for diversity among their clientele."

Let's leave Montrell out of it for now. Who are the best drivers you've been associated with?

"1. Ronnie Pierce, 2. Tim Tetrick, 3. Brian Sears, 4. Corey Callahan, 5. Tony Morgan."

Who have been the greatest horsemen with whom you've been associated?

"1. My mom and dad. 2. My sister Brenda. She works circles around me or just about anybody I know. 3. Clyde Francis — A great friend and a wonderful horseman. 4. Dr. Kenny Seeber - As great a horseman and veterinarian as ever lived. He helped me with so many of my good horses. When he passed away, an important part of my life left me. As much as I miss his horsemanship, I miss his friendship more. 5. Tony Morgan - as wise a horseman as there ever was. Always there to help anybody.

"I would also be remiss in not giving thanks to all the wonderful owners who put their trust, confidence and money in our operation. We will be eternally grateful for their support. Without them, we wouldn't have come close to achieving the success that we've had."

What does the future hold for George Teague?

"Primarily I would like to give Montrell more of a chance than I ever had. I would like to be able to do what I want to, primarily to have peace of mind. I need to stay healthy for my family. Family means everything to me. In addition to Montrell and our two daughters, my wife Jo and I, now have an adopted 5-year-old daughter. We have six wonderful grandkids. Life is generally pretty good."

Tough battle in Finland

Björn Goop had two contenders in \$192,000 Kymi Grand Prix in Kuovola, Finland on Saturday afternoon and the outcome couldn't have been better.

His drive Vitruvio (Adrian Chip), known from two Group 1 victories for former trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro last year, was sent to the front with 1,300 meters to go in the race in Finland and that was a winning move on Goop's part.

Elitloppet runner up Cokstile attacked three wide shortly before and Goop assumed that Cokstile was the horse to beat, especially if Christoffer Eriksson would have placed his trotter in position in front of Vitruvio, so Goop's move for the lead was the important stroke that decided the result, at least regarding the first two horses to the wire.

Cokstile challenged bravely on the outside of Vitruvio, but Goop was active in the bike and showed, once again, that he is in the top position among European drivers at this moment. Last weekend, Goop went to Paris and steered Face Time Bourbon to a world record win and now he has conquered Finland and the Kymi GP.

The mile rate for Vitruvio was 1:55.1 over 1.3 miles. Cokstile came home, beaten by a head in same mile rate and Moni Viking, Goop's second horse in the race, finished third.

Båth - King of E3, again

Swedish trainer Svante Båth has just a phenomenal touch and feeling when it comes to shaping young, talented trotters into winners in big races, especially the \$202,105 E3 for 3-year-olds.

Trixton mare Barbro Kronos (out of Fama Currit, by Viking Kronos) has a great pedigree and showed talent in her first races of the season and it's not a big upset that Båth has progressed her to a E3 winner.

Barbro Kronos won her elimination in great style, but was not first choice in Saturday's final at Bergsåker racetrack in Sweden, but with all facts on hand, she should have been the big favorite in the race.

Erik Adielsson has helped Båth by winning many of the previous 13 E3 finals that were on Svante Båth's record and the victory paired with Barbro Kronos was a beautiful interaction between horse and driver. Adielsson let his trotter leave pretty quickly behind the gate, but opted second over when Bank Wise As attacked three wide in the first turn. But second over was not the right position for Adielsson and Barbro Kronos since the pace went down after the first half mile of the race, so Barbro Kronos was sent to position first

over, from where she was unstoppable.

The mile rate for winner Barbro Kronos was 1:58.4 and Svante Båth collected his 14thvictory in E3 since the stake race began in 1997. This was the first time he has won the mares edition over 1.3 miles.

"I feel fine right now, of course. Why I am so successful in E3? Well maybe I'm in a hurry and want to win something big early every year," said Båth with a big smile. "Barbro Kronos will be aimed for the bigger races later on and we don't need to hurry."

Barbro Kronos' mother Fama Currit (Viking Kronos) was a star trotter for trainer Petri Puro and she banked \$827,242 and won \$300,000 Stochampionatet and \$214,000 Drottningpokalen as a 4-year-old.

In the \$202,105 E3 for colts and geldings, the big hope from host track Bergsåker, Global Badman (Yield Boko) and 30-year-old trainer and driver Daniel Wäjersten, was better than the rest.

Three horses were scratched in the final and the race was an open story where many contenders had their chances, respectively, to win the race, but also in this edition, the strongest trotter won.

Global Badman had to do the hard job outside of leader Despot Power and disarmed him shortly ahead of the wire. Daniel Wäjersten did a tremendous job in the bike since his horse was close to losing his gait in the last turn so the driver played it safely throughout the turn before he let Global Badman use his strength in the home stretch. Shortly after the wire, the winner made a break and Wäjersten could exhale, and note that he won a stake race at his home track. The mile rate was 1:57.2 and Despot Power held to second place ahead of quick finisher Furies Rain.

"There's been a lot of tension the whole day and now it just feels empty. This is a victory that I'll remember for a long time," said 20-year-old Daniel Wäjersten after his big success.

Joe wrote prefaces and reviews for Bob Marks' books, and as most of you know, when a good writer like Bob asks you to take on that task, you have your harness racing bonafides.

Most of us "met" Joe for the first time on Twitter by following his Twitter handle, @Jaf3Joe. There, almost daily, he'd recount a harness racing fact, some from many decades ago. The way he'd vividly describe these events, you'd think he was on the tarmac for each and every one of them.

It was also on Joe's Twitter feed where we got to witness his wonderful tongue in cheek sense of humor.

I remember when Forbidden Trade beat Greenshoe in the Hambletonian, but was still was ranked behind him in the following Hambletonian poll, Canadian fans were upset. Joe played along, tweeting about how it was probably a conspiracy, and that the Hambletonian Society owes a giant apology to all of Canada.

Personally, Joe was always extremely nice to me and I enjoyed our conversations immensely. Joe would sometimes read something I wrote and very gently point out a word I'd incorrectly use, or poor grammar. I'd re-read and realize how dumb I was. But Joe never did it to make me feel dumb, because that wasn't him. He was one of those people that you feel was the smartest person in the room, but didn't want anyone to know it. I'll miss his modesty; I'll miss his good nature.

Due to COVID-19 issues, Joe will be buried in a private ceremony. But, as trainer Paul Kelley (another person who crossed Joe's path on the Internet and struck up many conversations) informs me, the services are being taken care of by a funeral home once owned by Al Thomas, the former owner of Bay State Raceway, which later become Foxboro. How fitting.

Happy Birthday to Cam Fella's trainer/driver Pat Crowe

Today (June 28) marks the 83rd birthday for horseman Pat Crowe, best known as the trainer and driver of the great Cam Fella, the Hall of Famer that was voted Horse of the year in 1982 and 1983.

In those two years, Cam Fella had 69 starts combined. No horse has made more starts and been HOY over a two-year period.

Crowe's UDRS in 1982 was a career best .437 when he had a record of 212 70-21-16 and earned Canada's Horseman of the Year award. His second best UDRS came in 1983 when he posted a .321 with a record of 284 62-32-34

In 1984, Crowe won eight race on Dec. 30 at Kingston Raceway,

Down Under influence last weekend at Big M

Last weekend, 10 races were won by trainers from the Down Under — five each night.

On Friday, wins were posted by Ross Croghan, Nifty Norman, Peter Tritton (2) and Brett Pelling.

On Saturday, Team Tritton won three races and Croghan and Kelvin Harrison won one each.

Saturday was also a new single card record for Down Under-bred horses on one card. There were 39 in to race and they posted a collective record of 4-5-6 with 23 earning checks. In one race, Down Under-breds grabbed the first four spots.

40th anniversary of the first million-dollar race

July 18, 1980 was the sport's first million-dollar race — the \$1,011,000 Meadowlands Pace won by Niatross. A new era was underway. Niatross set a new single season earnings mark of \$1.414 million and earned more than any thoroughbred too — they had not yet had their first

seven-figure event. (1981 Arlington Million)

Here are 10 oddities/unusual events concerning million-dollar races through the years:

- **1.** Buddy Gilmour won three million-dollar events all after turning 50 The 1984 Meadowlands Pace with On The Road Again, the 1986 Meadowlands Pace with Laughs and the 1986 Woodrow Wilson with Cullin Hanover.
- 2. If you made a winter book bet in 1983 on Stanley Dancer to win the Hambletonian you won. But you were probably thinking Dancers Crown and not Duenna. Dancers Crown was defending freshman champion, but unfortunately died of an intestinal issue inside a month of the race. Dancer was persuaded by owner Norman Woolworth to enter the filly-Duenna a daughter of 1977 HOY Green Speed and the rest is history. By the way, this was the first million-dollar trotting race ever held \$1,080,000 was on the line, and in the field, the first heat winner Joie De Vie would go on and became the sport's first ever single season millionaire.
- **3.** How does a racetrack lose money on a Hambletonian final? Well, when there are only two horses and there's only win wagering and they finish in a dead heat. Like in 1989, when Park Avenue Joe and Probe tied in what many consider the most memorable Hambletonian ever. Both had to pay the minimum \$2.10, and every bet made on that race was a winner.
- **4.** Davids Pass and CA Connection both finished fourth in their Meadowlands Pace elims of 1995 with the same time. Thus a coin toss was needed to decide who would go on to race in the Pace for \$1 million. Davids Pass was the winner of the coin toss and then the Meadowlands Pace as the favorite. John Campbell and Brett Pelling. Oddly, that duo finished 1-2 just two weeks earlier in the kickoff to the Triple Crown series of 1995 the Messenger.
- **5.** The 1984 Hambletonian was the fourth held in New Jersey at the Meadowlands. The winner, in a raceoff, was Historic Freight. Ben Webster drove for trainer Skip Lewis. Particularly noteworthy was the fact that on June 15, just seven weeks before the race, Historic Freight was in a claiming race. For \$52,500 you could have had him. He wound up wiring the field from post 10 and was quickly taken out of claimers for good.
- **6.** Cat Manzi drove Trutone Lobell, one of the choices for the 1983 Woodrow Wilson that went for \$1,700,000. His cousin, Jeff Lohmeyer, trained. Noses separated the top two on the wire. Carls Bird got up at over 30-1. Carl Allen was the winning driver. It would have been The Catman's first million-dollar win. Instead, he had to wait 21 years, until

2004, when Mantacular got up in the final stages to take the North America Cup (\$1,189,535). Manzi would win his second million-dollar race in 2006 taking the Meadowlands Pace with Artistic Fella. He retired with over 95,000 drives, #1 all-time. Manzi turned 70 on June 27.

7. Perfect Spirit was placed first in the 2017 Hambletonian when What The Hill was taken down, the only DQ in a million-dollar race from first to second. Ake Svanstedt was the winning driver/trainer.

8. Ray Remmen is a Hall Of Famer and one of the biggest names in the sport's history. But it was as a catch drive in 1985 when Ray won his biggest ever purse race. The \$1,344,000 Woodrow Wilson was on the line and a five-horse photo separated the top 2-year-old. Grade One, a son of Slapstick for Lee Broglio won it by a head giving Remmen the richest score of his storied career. Oddly, Grade

One apparently put all his eggs in his freshman years basket, he banked just \$1,940 as a sophomore.

9. Mike Lachance won 10 million-dollar races — half of them with horses he had not driven prior. Straight Path in the 1998 NA Cup; Safely Kept in the 1992 NA Cup; All American Theory in the 2003 Meadowlands Pace; Amigo Hall in the 2003 Hambletonian; Mach Three in the 2001 Metro.

10. In 1995, the sport of harness racing had three million-dollar events-and all three were won by John Campbell — Davids Pass in the Meadowlands Pace and the NA Cup and the Hambletonian with Tagliabue.

Elizabeth Caldwell - breeder

I don't quite know where to begin with Elizabeth Caldwell. Her pedigree and success in the sport transcends any I have had the pleasure to write about.

A third generation horsewoman, Caldwell was born in the Bluegrass State. Her grandparents, Fredrick and Frances Dodge Van Lennep, owned the legendary Castleton Farms in Kentucky, home of many storied champions. The Van Lenneps also inaugurated Pompano Park Racetrack, the initial Winter Capital of Harness Racing in the early 1960s.

"When I was little I wanted to be like my mother. I watched her practicing riding show horses, so at the age of 5 or 6, I started riding. My mother got me lessons with Jimmy Robertson, probably to keep me busy while she was riding. That's when I first got the horse bug and still have it," said Caldwell.

She began competing in the American Saddlebred discipline at age 10. Due to her busy schedule, she no longer competes, but still pleasure rides when time allows.

Her mother, Fredericka V. Caldwell is the owner of Cane Run Farm located in Georgetown, KY. Elizabeth and her brother, Danny, run the 210-acre farm named for the creek that runs through the property.

Cane Run Farm became a standardbred nursery in 1982 with a few fillies fresh off the racetrack. The first group of race fillies included Guiding Beam, Heather's Feather, plus what proved to be the foundation mare. Nan Hanover, dam of legendaryNan's Catch, she of course dam of the international star Moni Maker.

"Nan's Catch is probably my all time favorite. We owe her a lot for she helped put our farm on the map as breeders. I loved watching her race as a kid," Caldwell said.

"Currently about 70 horses reside on the farm. (Mares, foals, yearlings, layups and retirees) Some are our own and we also board for clients. I own three horses and my mother owns 20 broodmares (18 standardbreds and two thoroughbreds). Several are in partnership with Bluestone Farms.

"The numbers will fluctuate in the next couple of weeks as several of our mares and some client mares being bred in New Jersey will arrive for the Kentucky residency program. We expect about 17 to ship down and then several that have already been here will leave in the fall for Pennsylvania for their residency program.

"My job is to help plan the matings for the mares, the raising/care of their foals and prep the yearlings for public auction. The ones we own in partnership with Mitchel Skolnick, managing partner of Bluestone Farms, we will go over the matings together, then mother approves everything when we have the list ready.

"The yearlings sell in our Lexington Selected consignment. Sometimes we will retain a filly to carry on the families that have done well for us.

"I helped plan the mating for Danae to Muscle Hill, resulting in Deyrolle (Propulsion). We originally bought her dam Deanella Hanover, in the Castleton dispersal and Danae was the third foal we sold out of her as a yearling for \$15,000 to George Teague in Lexington.

"Danae, of course, sold the second "million dollar yearling" in Damien, Propulsion's full brother at Lexington Selected last year, which I think justifies our buying her back for breeding purposes.

"When Danae finished racing I heard the partners were going to sell her and I wanted to have her in our broodmare band. I hadn't been running the farm too long and really had to convince my mother on this investment.

"I told mom it isn't every day you get the chance to buy an Oaks winner that she bred (Nan's Catch, Moni Maker, and Danae).

"We ended up purchasing Danae at the Tattersalls January Mixed Sale. I couldn't be there so I asked Mitchel to take a look and please bid on her for me. She didn't sell, but we went to them afterwards and bought her for \$240,000.

"My mother wasn't too thrilled with how much I spent and Mitchel said he would love to own part of her, so that is how we got to be partners with Bluestone Farms and ended up with Danae.

"Danae's first two foals, D'orsay and Déjà vu Too, didn't sell as much as we hoped but went on to be a world champion and a stakes winner, respectively.

"Her third foal was a colt named Propulsion. (Original name was Deyrolle. His new owners changed it to Propulsion). He was sent to the Lexington Selected Sale and was purchased by agent Myron Bell for a group of owners. Top trainer Tony Alagna would break and train him. After a short, but respectable career in the United States he was sent to the Tattersalls Mixed Sale and sold as a 4-year-old to trainer Daniel Redén. Propulsion was shipped to Sweden where he too became a superstar and was named Swedish Horse of the Year for 2019. Propulsion attained Elitlopp status for five consecutive years before finally winning it this past May 31.

"Although I have been lucky enough to travel to Sweden and France several times to watch Propulsion race, because of COVID-19 I was unable to go, so watched him from home and cheered him on. It was exciting to see how well he raced in both heats after a long lay off. He has an amazing kick when he sprints home - it's like he has another gear."

Presently, Elizabeth has no broodmares of her own for she retired Catch A Train, co-owned with her mother, a couple of years ago.

"Although I don't currently have broodmares of my own, I treat all the horses here like they're mine. We've been blessed to have had many very nice horses over the years and I try to help keep the farm name going."

USTA Integrity Tipline (833/**USTATIP**) relaunched

The U.S. Trotting Association has announced the relaunch of the USTA Integrity Tipline for industry participants to alert the organization of any concerns they have regarding integrity issues in harness racing.

The toll-free number is 833/USTATIP (833-878-2847). All callers have the option to remain anonymous or leave their contact information for a follow-up call from an investigator.

"As indicated by USTA president Russell Williams in his published response to several prominent horsemen's concerns about the care of horses and integrity in harness racing (full response here), we are re-establishing our integrity tipline," said USTA executive vice-president and CEO Mike Tanner in making the announcement.

"With the plans for implementation of the Hanover Shoe Farms matching fund grant integrity initiative nearing announcement early next month, that could provide funding to assist with the costs of investigations for legitimate information obtained through the tipline."

When contacting the USTA Integrity Tipline, callers will be asked to provide as many specific details as possible regarding the situation that are important for the USTA to be aware of including names, horses, dates and locations as well as any other circumstances.

Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame 2020 induction gala cancelled

At a meeting held June 23, 2020, the Board of Directors of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame made the difficult decision to cancel the 2020 Hall of Fame Induction Gala, due to the restrictions resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. It is the intention of the CHRHF to induct the Class of 2020, along with those inducted in 2021, at ceremonies tentatively

scheduled to take place during the summer of 2021.

After the board meeting CHRHF president Darryl Kaplan provided the following statement: "While consideration was given to alternate formats for the event, it was agreed that the Class of 2020 deserves to be honored for their lifetime of achievements in Canadian horse racing with the full recognition bestowed to those inducted previously to the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, and that includes being surrounded by the family and friends who have been part of their careers. Unfortunately, that is not possible at this time. While we are unable to hold the formal induction ceremony for Gary Boulanger, Sue Leslie, Mike Keogh, Paul MacDonell, Ben Wallace, Amour Angus, McWicked, Play the King, Rambling Willie and Tepin during 2020, we are fully committed to doing so in the near future."

"Additionally, as a registered charity, the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame annual Induction Gala is a significant fundraiser for the organization. Like so many others in horse racing and beyond we are looking at creating alternate opportunities to generate the funds required to support the CHRHF's ongoing operation. Further information about these activities will be provided in the coming weeks."

Details regarding the nomination and election of the Class of 2021 will be released this fall.

Match My Kiss records first win of 2020 OSS season

Ontario's talented 3-year-old pacing fillies kicked off the 2020 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) season at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday with two veterans of the provincial program and two newcomers gracing the Grassroots winner's circle.

Mach My Kiss opened the campaign with a victory in the first \$22,800 division, cruising along on the front end to a 1:53 personal best for driver Doug McNair. Bettorthanbobbi finished two lengths behind the fan favourite in second, with Trafalgar three more lengths back in third.

"She raced great, we got a cheap half," said McNair, who engineered fractions of :28.1, :58 and 1:26.1. "She is a real handy filly and she had lots of pace."

Rob Fellows trains the Mach Three daughter for his wife Yolanda Fellows of Rockwood and Erna Corbeil of Beaumont, AB. Mach My Kiss was a three-time winner in the Grassroots last season, including a victory in the Semi-finals.

Got Power also made a return to the Grassroots winner's circle, powering up the outside to catch pacesetter Sunshine Hall and hold off the late closing Need Ur Opinion in the last division. The Royal Mattjesty daughter had a head in front at the 1:55.2 finish, with Need Ur Opinion edging out fan favourite Sunshine Hall for second.

"She had the outside in her first start back this year and drew better tonight," said driver Chris Christoforou. "The plan was to be second over but one of the inside horses made a break leaving so it turned into first over, but she overcame it and raced great. She was a nice filly last year, she finished third in a Gold at Grand River."

Tony O'Sullivan of Cambridge shares ownership of Got Power with Gary Volpe of St. Thomas and William Hill of Dundas, ON and the trainer was pleased with the filly's sophomore Grassroots debut, coming on the heels of a ninth-place effort from Post 9 in a June 12 overnight event.

"I'm happy with the result," said O'Sullivan. "It was her first real race of the year, so a good step in the right direction and hopefully she can improve off that."

Mia Culpa and **Greystone Natali O** made their debuts in the Grassroots winner's circle with impressive efforts in the second and third divisions, respectively.

Mia Culpa and driver Rick Zeron sprinted from sixth to first in the final quarter to halt the teletimer at 1:53, a personal best for the Shadow Play filly. Pacesetter Lyons Tilt Hanover finished second, leaving fan favourite Landry Seelster to settle for third.

It was the second win in three sophomore starts for Mia Culpa, who made just one appearance in the Grassroots at two. Jean Tourigny trains the filly for Roland Trudel of Becancour, Michel Damphousse of Louiseville and Guy Lavoie of Terrebonne, QC.

In the third split, driver Sylvain Filion had Greystone Natali O on the move early from Post 5 and landed on the rail behind fan favourite Mary Kat and Odds On Vero Beach. Content to sit third through a :26.1 quarter, :56 half and 1:25.2 three-quarters, Filion found himself with an open lane in the stretch as Odds On Vero Beach tipped out to attack and Mary Kat drifted off the rail. Greystone Natali O took full advantage of the opportunity and powered up the inside to a two and one-half length victory in a personal best 1:52.4. Odds On Vero Beach and Mary Kat finished in a dead heat for

second.

The win was the fifth of the season for Greystone Natali O, who did not make her 2-year-old debut until after the provincial program had wrapped up last fall. Since then, the Shadow Play daughter has been a model of consistency for trainer Brent Belore and owner-breeders Jean Caddey, Alana Belore and Dylan Belore of Embro, missing just one cheque in 14 starts.

The 3-year-old pacing fillies will return to Woodbine Mohawk Park on July 14 for their second Grassroots start.

Second round action for Ohio Sires Stakes fillies

Guinevere Hall kicked off an evening chock full of Leg 2 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) action Saturday (June 27) by winning her \$40,000 division for 3-year-old trotting fillies in a new lifetime clocking of 1:54.1. The daughter of Cash Hall had captured her first OHSS leg in 1:55 for trainer Melanie Wrenn, driver Peter Wrenn and owners M T Pockets Stable and Dave McDuffee. Guinever Hall was bred by Alan J. Leavitt of Kentucky and pushed her career earnings to \$174,181 with this latest victory, the fifth of her career in 12 starts. Robin Banks (Kurt Sugg) was a strong second at 5-1 with 1-2 Lima Gold (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) third. Guinevere Hall left the gate as the 4-5 favorite.

Kikimora made every post a winning one for driver Aaron Merriman and trainer Chris Beaver in the second OHSS division for trotting fillies. The 1-5 favorite, a daughter of Triumphant Caviar who was bred and is owned by Sandra Burnett and her trainer, tripped the final timer in 1:54.2. Kikimora had captured OHSS leg one at Scioto Downs two weeks ago in 1:54.1 and now has \$41,320 in her seasonal bankroll and \$251,516 in her career account. Tootie, with Brett Miller driving, was second at 14-1 odds after sitting in the two-hole throughout while 25-1 Delovely Hall (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) raced well to get up for third-place honors.

Uncle Peter's Love got the benefit of the rail to capture her OHSS trotting division easily in 1:54.2. It was her first win in the series, as she was second to Gunivere Hall in Leg 1 at Scioto Downs. Owned by Carl Howard and Joyce McClelland, the daughter of Uncle Peter now has \$34,681 in seasonal earnings and \$114,825 in career earnings. Randy and Michael Bennette bred the filly, who is trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr. Longshot (50-1) Team L was second for driver Hank LeVan, while 19-1 longshot Aqua Lillies was third for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.

PJ's Legacy, a daughter of Big Bad John—Walstan's Legacy, captured her \$50,000 OHSS pacing division in a new life mark of 1:51.3 for driver Ryan Stahl at 4-5 odds. The filly, who was bred by Walter Fister of Lexington, KY, had won her first OHSS contest handily in a wire-to-wire effort in 1:52 as well. Owned by Brown, Hutchison, Ridder and Kantrowitz, PJ's Legacy is conditioned by Brian Brown and has \$168,170 in career earnings. Ellagator (1-1) was second for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., while 10-1 Princess Rockette with Aaron Merriman aboard.

In the final \$50,000 OHSS contest for 3-year-old pacing fillies it was 10-1 longshot **Penpaperpaige** (Tyler Smith) who wore down the 1-5 favorite McMarkle Sparkle (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) to emerge victorious in 1:52.3. The homebred Pet Rock lass upped her earnings to \$98,476 via her eighth career win for trainer Jeff Smith and owner Shirley LeVin. Artful Dancer (7-2) was third for Chris Page.

Leg three of the Ohio Sires Stakes for 3-year-old pacing fillies is scheduled for July 4 at Scioto Downs, while 3-year-old trotting fillies will go postward in OSS leg three on July 10 at Northfield Park.

Zeron makes right call with Chrome at Big M

Southwind Chrome was sent on a mission by his driver Scott Zeron in the Friday night (June 26) feature at the Meadowlands. And he completed it in spectacular fashion.

The 5-year-old son of Chapter Seven—Counter Pointe won a second straight start in the preferred for trotters, as the razor-sharp Jeff Cullipher trainee scored in 1:50.4 after going a less-than-ideal trip.

There were horses leaving the gate from the outside, so Zeron had a decision to make early on from post eight.

"I think given the circumstances, it worked out the way it had to," said Zeron. "There were not a lot of leavers mid-pack, so it was either sneak into the four-hole or go to the front. Midway around the first turn, I decided to go to the lead. He was so good tonight. I figured I'd make the front and then rate from there."

But it would not be easy. JL Cruze, the 5-2 favorite, grabbed the lead at the quarter in a wicked :26.3 as Southwind Chrome continued his march to the top while uncovered. He did not clear until the three-eighths.

The half was reached in :55 and Southwind Chrome was moving well on the point, then Zeron asked for more in an

effort to seal the victory on the far turn. "I figured if I put space between Dex [Dunn, driving JL Cruze] and I at the five-eighths, I would be able to cruise down the lane."

He did just that.

Southwind Chrome opened up a 1¾-length edge at three-quarters after rating the third fraction in :28 and upped his lead to 2½ at the head of the stretch. Southwind Chrome's advantage diminished in deep stretch as JL Cruze was closing in, but still held on by a safe neck. Kenziesky Hanover was third.

"When you have a good horse, you just want to know the other horses' form," said Zeron. "I knew my horse was at the top of his game."

Southwind Chrome, who is heading for next week's \$200,000 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial at the Big M, paid \$9.20 to win as the second choice in the betting and now has 13 wins from 36 career starts and earnings of \$230,210 for owners Pollack Racing and Jeff Cullipher.

NJSS WRAP UP: The second leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes for 3-year-olds saw four divisions on the Friday card, and filly pacer Odds On Sarasota (Rock N Roll Heaven—Odds On Charmaine) stayed perfect in two sire stakes starts this year by finding room late along the pylons to win in 1:55 as the 4-5 favorite for driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Ross Croghan.

Rockin The Aces (Rock N Roll Heaven—Mattaroni) came from way back at odds of 17-1 to gun down 1-9 public choice Rock Me Hard in deep stretch in the colts and geldings pace in a lifetime-best 1:51.2 for Brian Sears and Robert Cleary.

Ab'sattitudexpress was sent to the top by Yannick Gingras and blew away the field at odds of 7-1 for Lucas Wallin in the filly trot. The daughter of Trixton—Abbie'sgotattidtude stopped the clock in a lifetime-best 1:52.4.

After racing wide around the first turn, 2-5 favorite Play Trix On Me was a dominant winner in the colts and geldings trot. The son of Trixton-Lima Playmate equaled his lifetime best of 1:53.2 for Zeron and Linda Toscano, the Hall of Famer who was celebrating a birthday.

A LITTLE MORE: Former Meadowlands leading drivers Sears and George Brennan, who were winless in 39 and 22 starts, respectively, both won for the first time at the meet... The Big M's "Big 4" multi-leg wagers were popular, as the 20-cent Pick-5 (\$74,907), 20-cent Pick-6 (\$32,872 with some help from a \$8,948 carryover), Early 50-cent Pick-4 (\$78,906) and Late 50-cent Pick-4 (\$78,087) all took big play. Wagering for the 13-race card totaled \$2,837,178, upping the Big M's streak of at least \$2.5 million in handle to 14.

Ohio-registered pacing sires represented include three each by Big Bad John, Dragon Again and Rockin Amadeus; while Pet Rock has two foals competing; with Bigrisk, Gunthatwonthewest, Mr Wigglies, Nob Hill High, Western Vintage and Yankee Cruiser all had one foal each racing in an OHSS contest.

In the first of the two \$50,000 OHSS divisions for trotters (Race 2), Wading Boots and driver Chris Page used come-from-behind tactics to score an easy victory in a new career clocking of 1:55 for trainer Ronnie Burke and co-owners Weaver Bruscemi Larry Karr, and Paul Collura. Facing off against five rivals, the homebred Wishing Stone gelding was content to sit tight through fractions of :27.4, :57.2 and 1:25.1 before stepping up his game in the homestretch as the 1-2 favorite. The victory, Wading Boots' second of his career and first of 2020, upped his career earnings to \$58,380 for his connections. Stonefire US (Dewayne Minor) was second at 10-1, while 17-1 Uncle Andy (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) was third. Wading Boots is the third foal out of the SJ's Caviar mare Seguin Hanover, 4, 1:53M (\$55,835) and is a full brother to U Need Stones 4, 1:53 (\$241,075) and Well I'm Fancy 2, Q1:59.3f (\$34,355).

Stanford Court (1-5) took command early in the first OHSS pacing division (Race 6) for driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., and held off a late charge by 2-1 Ocean Rock (Danny Noble) to score his second triumph of the season in 1:50.3. Doin The Most (Kurt Sugg) raced well to be third as the 5-1 choice. Trained by Brian Brown, Stanford Court, a homebred son of Nob Hill High, is owned by Robert Mondillo, Richard Lombardo, Hen-Shaut Stable and Lightning 5 Racing Stable and now has \$136,710 in career earnings from three wins in 10 starts. This large bay colt is the second foal out of the Western Ideal mare Odds On Hemera, p, 3, 1:56.4 (\$43,145) and is a half-brother to Pure Paradise (by McArdle) p, 2, 1:53 (\$102,743).

Elver Hanover kept his unblemished record intact, taking

the second OHSS pacing division (Race 10) easily in 1:51 for driver Chris Page and trainer Ronnie Burke. The 3-year-old gelding, by Yankee Cruiser, out of The Panderosa mare Edr Hanover, notched career victory number 10 as the 2-5 favorite. Bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, this youngster now sports a career bankroll of \$388,450. Can Be Perfect (6-1) was second for Tyler Smith, while 3-1 Dragon Roars Again got up for third for driver Brett Miller.

Action Uncle easily took the second OHSS for diagonally-gaited specialists with a new lifetime mark of 1:53 for driver Brett Miller. Virgil Morgan, Jr., trains the son of Uncle Peter who notched his second straight OSS triumph and third seasonal victory in as many tries for owners Carl Howard, Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills. Bred by Kenneth Sommer, Action Uncle, who left the gate as the 1-9 favorite, now has \$281,075 in career earnings. It's Academic(5-1) was second for Chris Page, with 59-1 longshot Doubleyellowline a healthy third for Danny Noble.

Priceless cruised to the three-quarters in 1:24.3 and was then joined on the outside by Grace Rocks and LeWayne Miller. Sprinting home in :27.2., Priceless was able to put away Grace Rocks and held off a late surge from a fast closing Sweet Filly and Michael Oosting to get the win by a quarter of a length. Sweet Filly was forced to settle for second while Foxy Rigger rounded out the trifecta. Priceless returned \$2.60 to her betting backers.

After winning seven of 11 seasonal starts and \$347,162 in her freshman campaign, Priceless is owned by Kevin Miller and Bert Hochsprung. The daughter of Rockin Image—Btwnyurheartnmine is expected to make her next start in the opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes action for three-year-old pacing fillies at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Saturday, July 4.

The evening also featured two \$20,000 divisions of the Star Destroyer Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings. Island Of The Sea and Michael Oosting delivered as the heavy betting favorite in the opening division to stop the timer 1:50.4. Scoring in near gate to wire fashion, Island Of The Sea utilized a :26.4 closing kick to get the win by nearly four lengths. It was the second straight Hoosier Park victory for the gelded son of Always A Virgin—Trinity Island in just three starts this season. Trained by Shane Bowermaster, Island Of The Sea has now earned \$36,000 lifetime and is owned by Eric Ell and Lisa Ell.

In the second division for the pacing colts and geldings, Roll With Jr and John DeLong also used a front-stepping effort to find the wire first in 1:51.2 for trainer Jeff Cullipher. Roll With Jr left alertly from post three to dictate fractions of :27.1,:54.3 and 1:23.3. The field was tightly packed turning for home and looked poised to pounce on the leader. Roll With Jr dug in gamely late in the lane to repel a charge from High Impression and Sam Widger to get the win by three parts of a length. In his first start of the season, Roll With Jr recorded the first win of his sophomore campaign and fourth win lifetime. The son of Roll With Joe—No One Is Alone has now bankrolled \$176,516 for owners Pollack Racing LLC and Jeff Cullipher.

It was also a big night for veteran driver Sam Widger who won seven of the 14 races on the evening's program. Widger, who finished second in the leading driver standings at Harrah's Hoosier Park in 2019, is currently third on the leading driver standings through nine nights of live racing with 17 wins.

Baillargeon trotters hunting for Gold at Georgian tonight

Since racing resumed at the beginning of June, Ben Baillargeon has been on a tear, sending out 20 winners from 54 starters, and the trainer will be looking to add to that tally when the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series season gets underway tonight (June 28) at Georgian Downs.

Baillargeon goes into the event with the early favorites in both Gold Series divisions after his 3-year-old trotting geldings Hayek and HP Royal Theo delivered a pair of impressive victories at Woodbine Mohawk Park last weekend.

"They're similar, they're both fast, I can tell you that," said Baillargeon.

"We all knew about HP Royal Theo, we knew that he's very good, he showed all kinds of ability last year," said Baillargeon of the Royalty For Life son who captured the 2019 William Wellwood Memorial Trot. "We cut him loose a little bit last week — not that we didn't cut him loose his first start, he trotted in 1:54.3, last quarter in :27.1, in against older horses — but last week he was ready and I needed to see what we had in the tank. So I said he (Louis-Philippe Roy) might want to let him trot a little. He didn't really let him trot, this is what's amazing about it, he didn't really let him trot and he went in 1:52.3, last quarter in :27.3.

"And the other horse, Hayek, a friend of my dad said, 'This horse is for sale Ben, you should look into it, this one's for you'. So I looked into it. I called Marcus Melander and he told me what I wanted to know and that was it, we made the deal," said Baillargeon, who acquired Hayek on June 8. "And the horse looked awful good his first start. He was a little bit of a handful last week, I think he will settle down with time, but he sure has lots of speed, serious speed."

Hayek and driver Sylvain Filion will be looking to replicate that June 22 effort — a seven-length gate-to-wire score in 1:53.3 — from Post 3 in the first division on Sunday, facing off against six rivals for the \$105,600 purse. Baillargeon shares ownership of the E L Titan gelding with Teresa Davidson of Milton, Santo Vena of Brampton and Nunzio Vena of Bolton, ON and the trainer said Hayek enjoyed a day off after Monday's victory and will just jog and continue to settle into his new home leading up to his Ontario Sires Stakes debut on Sunday.

"He came to the barn I think 10 days before I raced him last Monday and he was a little bit, not a handful, but he was a little aggressive, let's put it this way," said Baillargeon. "Today (Thursday) he was very nice on the track. I think he's starting to like his new surroundings."

HP Royal Theo will make his sophomore Gold Series debut from Post 5 in the second \$106,400 division, coming into the season opener off the impressive June 20 effort that saw him cruise home three lengths the best in 1:52.3. Regular reinsman Louis-Philippe Roy will be in the race bike for owner-breeder Claude Hamel of Ayer's Cliff and Michel Damphousse of Louiseville, QC. The gelding was a Gold Series winner at two, but he also made breaks in three provincial starts, so Baillargeon is hoping the trotter can kick off a more consistent provincial campaign on Sunday.

"These two horses, they're sure nice," said the trainer. "That Hayek horse, he looked very good his first start and well Theo, like I said, we always knew that he was good, but he showed that he's matured a lot since last year."

Georgian Downs will send the first race behind the starting gate at 6 pm tonight and feature the Gold Series 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings in Races 5 and 8.

In addition to Sunday's Gold Series, Georgian Downs will also host two \$7,100 divisions of the Prospect Series for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings on Saturday evening. Horses that were sustained to the 2020 Ontario Sires Stakes program are eligible for the Prospect Series, which consists of five legs contested at racetracks across Ontario leading up to a \$15,000 final. Saturday's divisions will go postward as Races 1 and 7, with a 7:15 pm post time.
