My opinion piece published Sunday about horses owned by Rene Allard's mother, Danielle Henri (full story here) touched off a bit of a firestorm.

The overwhelming majority of those that took the time to contact me were supportive about the need to err on the side of caution, for now, about Henri-owned horses last trained by her son.

That's exactly what happened this week when trainers Rob Harmon, Carmen Auciello and Yonkers Raceway decided it's not in their best interests to be involved in training or allowing those horses owned, in part, by Henri to race at this time.


All six horses mentioned in the column were scratched either by the track or trainers.

Kudos to Harmon, Auciello and Yonkers and others for taking that position. I wanted to acknowledge them with the same prominence in HRU in which I first mentioned all of their names. I owe them all at least that.

Some of those that made contact were critical of my naming Harmon and Auciello. Fair point.

Let me be clear, I have never believed Harmon or Auciello to be dishonest operators. Neither has any concerning violations on their record according to a search of the United

States Trotting Association (USTA).

In both cases, they were simply trying to help out a few of their long-time owners who happened to be partners with Henri on a few horses.

Auciello had only entered horses in qualifiers before scratching. No harm, no foul.

Harmon told me he specifically asked Yonkers if it was okay to race Blaise MM Hanover and he was given the green light. That's on Yonkers, which was another major theme of the column; the need for regulators and racetracks to do better.

When it came to Harmon and Auciello, what I questioned was, "why any trainer would touch horses last trained by Allard is beyond me, but you can bet the fact the six horses mentioned above have earned over \$1.6 million combined has at least something to do with it."

Harmon and Auciello are talented and widely respected. My point was they don't need to take these horses at this time and risk their reputations being tarnished. Their decision to walk away would suggest they agree.

Let me be clear on a few other points.

I did not and do not think Harmon and Auciello were or are beards for Rene Allard and did not write that they were. However, I can see how some readers may believe I *implied* it by what I wrote at the end of the column. That was not my intent. Eleven paragraphs after either of the trainers was last mentioned, I wrote, "As most of us know, beard trainers are not new. Simply transferring horses to a different name, thumbing one's nose at authorities and carrying on as usual, is not new. But how the people in charge address integrity matters urgently needs a new approach, now more than ever."

Here's why I think those that defended Harmon and Auciello have a valid point: both association and perception often equal reality in the reader's mind.


Similarly, perception is often reality in terms of harness racing integrity. Clearly, we have a perception problem in harness racing. It doesn't matter much if that's fiction if our customers believe it to be true.

Again, that was a major theme of the entire column. In a sport in which integrity challenges are threatening the industry's entire existence and dishonest trainers are blatantly stealing from the honest ones, the perception of malfeasance is particularly powerful and we need to be cautious until matters are fully resolved.

Remember, the care and welfare of horses has to be tantamount. The people that wager their hard-earned money need to know the game is as fair as possible.

Also, I did not write that Allard is a hidden owner on horses owned by his mother.

I clearly stated Henri is the sole listed owner of both Allard



Racing Inc., which has an address in Quebec, and D Racing Stable Inc., which has an address in Middletown, NY.

I also did not say Henri is doing anything wrong by owning horses. She is legally entitled to do so until racing regulators say otherwise. (Editor's note: For the record, Henri was offered a chance to respond and said an email response is forthcoming. The email did not arrive before press time on Thursday evening, but we will publish it on Sunday if we receive it before that issue goes to press).

But, please remember, racing horses, like having a license to drive a car, is a privilege not a right. Just because you are a licensed owner does not mean a trainer has to take your horses, nor does it mean a racetrack has to take your entries. It's up to the race office to decide how to build a race card.

Yes, D Racing Stable Inc. horses have also shown up at other racetracks and continue to do so. Should I have named every single case in which it was occurring and all the trainers involved? Perhaps, but that would have made for a long column belaboring the same point. As stated in the original column, the point wasn't to do an exhaustive list of where all the horses landed and name all those that were training them, but, rather, point out Henri's horse are showing up in entry boxes, show a few high-profile examples and suggest that, perhaps, racetracks and regulators might want to be cautious.

Clearly, I was picking on Yonkers, but I did so because three of its top 10 leading trainers at the time of the arrests, including Allard, are accused in the alleged horse doping scandal.


For those that ask why I didn't single out other horses such as star trotting mare When Dovescry in the column, it's important to point out that while she was previously trained by Rene Allard, she doesn't list ever being owned by Henri or anyone else in the Allard family. The owners are entitled to have Brett Pelling, or anyone else for that matter, train her and I wish all the connections luck.

The key point here is the need to be cautious about an Allard family ownership connection to those horses formerly trained by Allard until either a thorough investigation following the money can be done to ensure there's no hidden ownership — which is illegal — or Allard's case is resolved.

Again, I did not and am not saying Henri did anything illegal. I just want the regulators to be thorough and make sure everything is in order. After all, that is their job.

Racetracks and regulators can ignore that advice if they want. Some clearly have. D Racing and Allard Racing horses continue to race and win other places. It's not just a Yonkers issue. I just pointed out this was happening so there is full disclosure and regulators took a long look.

Please remember, Henri is not faced with only two options



here: race these horses or not. She also has every right to sell her shares in those horses for what they are worth. Word from Auciello posted online appears to indicate that is exactly what is in the works. Of course, Henri is free and clear to do what she wants with the proceeds. She also has the right to buy other horses and place them with whatever licensed trainer chooses to take them and racetracks and regulators can decide if they will be allowed to enter.

Again, the poor optics comes from horses previously trained by Allard and still owned by his mother. It's a bad look.

Also, for the record, I did not say Allard had been indicted. I wrote, "Allard and 28 other standardbred and thoroughbred people were arrested and accused of a variety of troubling crimes related to horse doping."

I also wrote, "the charges against him and the others have not been proven in court."

Of course he and the others deserve their day in court.

You have my word that whether he is cleared or convicted, we will prominently report the result either way.

But coming back to perception again here, what the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York has released about the case is extremely troubling, especially for anyone that purports to love horses.

For anyone thinking I'm unfairly picking on Allard here, please take a minute to process what was alleged in this Bill Finley story published in HRU on March 15. Feel free to also read the full sealed complaint (full document available here):

The sealed complaint against Allard lays out instances where he allegedly used and "misbranded" illegal drugs to improve the performance of his horses. He has been charged with "misbranding," which carries a maximum sentence of five years in prison.

Perhaps the most disturbing part of the sealed complaint does not directly involve Allard but is the text of an intercepted phone conversation between Louis Grasso and Ross Cohen, both of whom were among the original 27 people indicted, where they joke about horses of Allard's that died, allegedly, because of the use of illegal drugs. Grasso is a veterinarian and Cohen, according to the original indictments, is someone who was distributing PEDs.

The conversation reads (and note this appears exactly as it did in the sealed complaint in terms of grammar and spelling):

Cohen: What's going on with the Allard death camp?

Grasso: (Laughter) well I didn't get any more emergency calls yesterday so I am assuming

Cohen: Assuming the number stopped at 7?

Grasso: Well yeah

Cohen: How many died?

Grasso: Three

Cohen: Jeez. What were you thinking?

Grasso: Three or two maybe.

Grasso and Cohen continue to discuss the effects of the drugs on the horses.

Cohen: Ok, maybe it was just the batch that Allard got I guess I don't know.

Grasso: They got high fever kidneys shut down.

Grasso: ...One of them just died on the table they just cut him open and poof it died.

Cohen: Holy f-k did they do an autopsy?

Grasso: Their heart rate was like triple they were breathing real heavy their membranes were going f-ing purple.

The sealed complaint includes the deposition of FBI agent Bruce Turpin, who states that Allard's barn was raided on or about March 9. He was stabled at the training center in Middletown, NY run by (Richard) Banca. Turpin testified that the raid yielded multiple empty syringes, the drug Glycopyrrolate, epinephrine and vials labeled "Thymosine Beta" and "for research purposes only."

The court filings also include the text of an intercepted text message from Allard to Grasso, which read: "I need 3 bottles of red acid to go to Canada Thursday." According to the FBI, red acid is administered to mask physical injuries in racehorses, thereby increasing the risk of injury while racing. Red acid was one of the PEDS that (Nick) Surick allegedly was using on his horses and distributing to others.

Those are serious allegations.

Yes, of course, the feds need to prove Allard did something illegal. Yes, I have heard some legal analysts suggest the case is weak. I don't know. We'll see.

But should the industry chance it?

Is that smart business?

You be the judge.

After reading what is alleged, I want you to ask yourself if the most prudent course of action is to press pause on D Racing Inc. until thorough investigations can be done to ensure the stable has no connection to a trainer accused of something so heinous.

Being cautious on this one places the integrity of an entire integrity-challenged industry ahead of an individual's rights.

Sounds like Harmon, Auciello and Yonkers agree. Good for them.

Ontario breeders win major court case against province

A group of 36 Ontario breeders seeking damages for the abrupt cancellation of the former Slots At Racetracks Program (SARP) have won a landmark court judgment over the Province of Ontario (full decision here).

In a decision dated Monday (June 29),Ontario Superior Court Justice Michael Emery ruled in favor of the plaintiffs' motion for a summary judgement against the province for breach of contract.

The breeders have been seeking \$65 million in a case that has taken six years to resolve. Damages for breach of contract will be calculated in a future court proceeding.

There is a 30-day period to appeal the decision.

Jonathan Lisus of Lax O'Sullivan Lisus Gottlieb LLP of Toronto, successfully argued on behalf of the breeders tied to the Standardbred Breeders of Ontario Association (SBOA).

Emery's ruling said he accepted the breeders' argument that there was a breach of the valid contract between the breeders and the province that came from a 1998 Letter of Intent (LOI) that was "the crucible that contained the overall terms for SARP, how it would work and the essential benefits it would yield to interested parties."

All other claims against the province — including those launched against the Ontario Lottery and Gaming corporation (OLG) specifically — were dismissed.

Lisus told *The Toronto Star's* Mary Ormsby (**full story here**), "It's not easy to win against the government in a civil case.


"The breeders were really very brave to take this on."

The breeders did not contest the right of the province or OLG to terminate SARP, Emery wrote, but, instead, successfully argued they were given "insufficient notice of that cancellation because of their rolling investment to breed horses."

SBOA president Walter Parkinson told Ormsby, "It was a very long, drawn out process, but we remained optimistic. I think we have a renewed sense of optimism now, with this judgment, that the long wait was worthwhile."









The Next Generation introduced at Scioto Downs

A pair of \$150,000 2-year old events to be contested on Independence Day.

It has been a great early summer for Eldorado Scioto Downs — handles have skyrocketed, entries are strong and interest nationwide is at a decade-long high.

More eyes of the harness world will be on the south Columbus, OH oval on Independence Day thanks to a pair of \$150,000 Next Generation Stakes for Ohio-bred freshman pacers.

The Next Generation Stakes required a one-time nomination fee of \$10,000 and was due March 15 – many weeks prior to any charted lines were recorded. Although the payment was due in March, the actual starters did not have to be declared until Tuesday (June 30) afternoon.

While the idea of a subscription event has been done in thoroughbred racing with the Pegasus World Cup at Gulfstream Park, the Next Generation will be a first-of-its-kind event in harness racing and, to top it off, it was based on a suggestion by a trio of Ohio horseman – Chad Foulk, Bruce Soulsby and Chuck Grubbs.

"I was with Bruce Soulsby and Chucky Grubbs and we were watching the Pegasus (World Cup) and we said we should try something similar on a lower scale," said Foulk. "We went to Stacey (Cahill) and Jason (Roth) and they ran with it. They have done everything since. We did try to get some people to buy spots, but that was it."

"They approached us and we were like, 'Yeah, let's try this," said Roth, race secretary at Scioto Downs. "We'll try anything once. People were calling weeks in advance of the deadline asking about the race, so we were confident that they were going to fill."

Both events were oversubscribed – 11 for the colt pace and 10 for the filly event – requiring a lottery draw for the final nine spots from the Scioto Downs winner's circle on May 23.



In an almost cruel twist of fate, the Foulk entry was the final form pulled in the random draw in each of the divisions.

"We weren't sure we would get in either of the fields," joked Foulk.

Two of the spots in the filly pace were scheduled to be auctioned off through the Hoofbid app by their original owners – Foulk Stable and William Hartt. However, no bids were submitted forcing the owners to look for a suitable entrant.

"We ended up buying a filly (Notwhatshesaid)," said Foulk. "My friend and I both had a spot, we sold a spot and we kept a spot."

Nortwhatshesaid, who will be piloted by Tyler Smith (post #6; 15-1), is a perfect two-for-two on the Ohio fair circuit and owns a mark of 2:01.2 at the Ottawa County Fair.

In the colt pace, Speak Well will race for Foulk's father, Clarence, under the L & L Stables banner and Hartt.

The unraced Well Said colt comes into the season with a 1:56.2 qualifying victory on June 22. He was made a 10-1 choice again with Tyler Smith in the bike.

"The Speak Well colt has been our best one all along," said the son. "He's talented, but he makes mistakes. He hasn't figured it all out yet. He just has to stay pacing."

Eleven of the 18 entries in the Next Generation events will be making their career debut on Saturday.

"Nobody knows who the best horse is at this time (of year). If the race would be in August, you would know who would be the top three or four horses," said Roth. "The early date adds another dynamic to the event."

After a quick check of the revised North American stakes calendar, it also appears that the Next Generation events are the richest events to be held so far in 2020.

"Especially for 2-year-olds starting out," noted Roth.

With the interest of the Next Generation events coupled with an upcoming Canadian version, maybe the "entry by owner" events will gain steam and popularity.

The inaugural Mohawk Million for 2-year-old open trotters is scheduled for Sept. 26. That \$1 million event had nine \$110,000 spots available with the 10th final spot reserved for the William Wellwood Memorial winner.

A similar 2-year-old trotting event at the Red Mile was attempted by the Hambletonian Society but was cancelled due to conflicts on the stakes schedule.

"I think we can expand Next Generation to the trotters next year," said Roth. "There could be additional marketing opportunities with the fall yearling sales if a farm wants to be a sponsor of the race."

Also on Scioto's July 4 afternoon card (2 p.m. post time) will be the third leg of the Ohio Sire Stakes for 3-year-old filly pacers. The field of 10 will be headlined by PJ's Legacy (Ryan Stahl), Mcmarkle Sparkle (Brett Miller) and Penpaperpaige (Tyler Smith). The trio has won all of the preliminary divisions.

Exploit, a Somebeachsomewhere colt from the same barn was impressive in another 1:55 effort. Congratulations to Tony, his team and his owners on a great morning. A special shout out to my friend Jerry Glantz who we all remember as the "golden voice" of Pompano Park and points north for being one for one in 2020. His Artspeak colt looked great in 1:56.

How about the sister and brother team of Jen and Joe Bongiorno impressively winning in 1:58 with Tart Tongue, a \$12,000 Southwind Frank colt?

Every honoree deserves his day in the sun. The presence of this horrid virus should not deprive the 2020 Hall Of Fame class from the dinner and presentation that we all have been afforded. Postponing the event to 2021 was a great move however to prevent a circus.

I would suggest that the selection committee take a year off so that the group chosen for 2020 may have a night of their own.

Alan Leavitt's most recent attack on me see HRU last Sunday (2020-06-28 Feedback) was without merit.

My statement referred to maneuvers in the horse industry to populate farms. New York has had residency requirements for mares since the early '70s. In 1994, they instituted a rule that allowed resident mares to be bred out of state as long as they returned within 90 days of their cover and remained till their foaling.

* * *

I received a very interesting email from Ulf Lindstrom of the European Research Network Trotting.

Believe it or not, we are getting very close to yearling auctions and anything I can come up with to help you in the selection process I will pass along.

Below you will find a chart of what they call the 58 "elite" mares determined by offspring earnings listed by the Swedish Association of Breeders. The list represents the earnings by foal order.

1st foal - 11 per cent

2nd - 10

3rd - 12

1st thru 3rd = 33 or 57 per cent

4th - 6

5th - 7

6th - 1

7th - 11 = 19 per cent

Of the 42 mares that had 10 or more foals equaling 183 total foals only three representing two per cent had a foal that late that was the pride of the mare's production.

You can use this chart in any way you chose. It certainly would tend to persuade me to buy foals of younger mares, but as far as a determination of what foal to buy, stick to your own opinion.

Anonymous asks: Is it fair that some of the horses moved from the indicted trainers to smaller stables are kept under the 60-day waiting rule and two big stables (Julie Miller and Brett Pelling are given a pass with Lindy the Great and When Dovescry?

If what you refer to was true it would certainly be a big mistake. However, I have discussed the matter with The Chairman Of The Board (Jeff Gural) and there is a simple explanation. Lindy The Great never raced for the Rene Allard Stable so it is unlikely he was ever pre-raced.

In the case of When Dovescry, she was allowed to qualify only, and remains on the 60-day schedule.

Personally, I find it beyond the pale that any owner should suffer. This is not 1960 where owners were lined up out the door. Today, they are quite difficult to find. For this reason alone I was not a fan of the 60-day rule. It's too late to cry over that. We should allow all legitimate owners to race. The accusations on social media of some totally legitimate trainers for acting as beards is ridiculous. Does anyone think that a man with a 50 horse stable is going to risk his livelihood and reputation to beard for three horses of an accused horseman? Remember if you care that much there is always a paper trail. Let these horses race and if you think

there are improprieties investigate after the fact.

Richard Johnson asks: What was the reasoning behind the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes committee scheduling four 3-year-old pacing stakes in conflict with major stakes they could have started last week and avoided the entire mess?

I see that there is a conflict with the Meadowlands Pace elimination and final, the Cane Pace and The Pepsi North America Cup and I am only guessing but I would say the answer is simple. Pennsylvania is for Pennsylvania. In the years I raced in the state it was next to impossible to race a young horse if he was not bred in the state and if not owned and bred you still had to wait in line.

In all fairness, we have to give them somewhat of a pass because of the fact that under the circumstances no one was sure of when racing would begin and how ready the horse colony was to enter stake races.

I cannot imagine it was thought out and purposely done that way. However, after the fact, I can believe it was left that way because it does in essence eliminate the top horses from partaking in any state money and that in turn will benefit the local horseman.

Please don't send me letters that it was their plan all along as I truly don't buy it.

Emil Fonseca, Craig Henderson, PJ Fraley and many more asked Saturday Night: Why are the races going so fast this year, especially at the Meadowlands?

We have discussed this topic often. There are many reasons, breeding, tracks banking turns, fancy race bikes, etc.

I think what we are dealing with this year adds something new, fresh horses.

Every horse racing has had at least three months off. That has never happened before. At the Meadowlands there are 10 fresh animals in every race. That in and of itself will reduce the time at every quarter. Add to that trainers are very hungry and tend to train harder in today's world than ever before. Lots of sound and fit equine athletes appear nightly.

Another point of interest is that the weather has been extraordinarily warm and humid which helps to create the perfect storm.

Tltdvm@aol.com asks: Please tell me the difference in the training methods of the Swedish and American trainers.

I think as time goes on the top American barns have succumbed to the methods of the euro-barns. I will add if you are a trainer in North American and you are reading this column it would serve you well to look into it.

If it wasn't for Per Eriksson, you may never have heard the name Ron Gurfein.

The major difference between the two countries are basically two-fold. One, the straight track or euro track as it is often referred to, and "Bending" the process of determining lameness in Sweden almost as a daily process.

Per's knowledge of the proper use of the straight track and its huge success as a tool to develop wind and strength became instilled in my mind immediately.

As for Bending, it's not for me and there are times I have watched Scandinavian trainers perform this method to the point where I thought it entirely counter-productive. It is a process of bending a joint in question and holding it tight for about 30 seconds and trotting the horse off to see if the lameness is evident. I tried, believe me, and think I got as many false positives as real ones. I will say it works for King James.

The length of the straight track is usually limited to one quarter mile with maybe and eighth of a mile and a circle at both ends to walk and turn around. The reason for this is space availability is limited on most farms. However I have seen half-mile and longer strips in my travels but mostly in Italy.

The straight track in essence provides a format for what is called interval training and you really don't need to look much further than Sunshine Meadows to realize what a powerful tool it is in conditioning the racehorse.

Using the Hambletonian as a guideline look at this list of interval trainees: Prakas, Probe, Harmonious, Giant Victory, Alf Palema, Victory Dream, Continentalvictory and Self Possessed.

I am unaware of the percent of American trainers that interval train I will say that there are a whole lot more than there were 50 years ago.

Interval training is not the only way to create a stronger equine athlete. Ron Burke has led the way with faster training tactics that seem to work very well also. I have never watched his operation but some of his drivers have commented to me how well the method works. His accomplishments speak for themselves.

Thanks to you all for the kind words especially Trish Coyle and Giacomo Francisci I really appreciate you emails. Please keep the questions coming in. The Meadowlands restaurants and grandstand will be open to all starting this weekend as well as the sports book. Knowing management they will do an excellent job keeping a safe environment for all. Enjoy the return to semi-normal and have a wonderful week.

Observations from the busy week that was

It's now been one month since racing has resumed at the Meadowlands and even less time than that elsewhere, but it's taken no time for some of the racing plotlines for this season to already take shape.

Beginning with last Saturday, last year's 2-year-old pacing divisional winner **Tall Dark Stranger** made it known that the road to the Meadowlands Pace with eliminations next weekend will go through him. Underscoring what Ray Schnittker was quoted as saying in this column last week, horse's these days no longer need a start or two before being able to put up fast miles.

While making his first pari-mutuel start since last year's Breeders Crown, Tall Dark Stranger came wide off dull cover to win going away under wraps in 1:47.4. Granted, a 1:47 mile isn't quite what it used to be and fellow 3-year-old **Allywag Hanover** went in 1:48.2 just two races prior, but that really was a visually impressive mile. Tall Dark Stranger's chief rival from last year, **Papi Rob Hanover** qualified last week in 1:50.3 and will get a single prep this weekend in advance of the Meadowlands Pace eliminations when he starts from post 10 in a mid-level conditioned race. Also, in that same race, making his sophomore debut as well, is Capt Midnight.

Tall Dark Stranger is trained by Nancy Takter, who has been blazing the way at the Meadowlands since June. Winning 11 times from 27 starters, top trotting stars such as **Manchego** and **Sorella** (4 for 4 combined) and pacing mare **Kissin In The Sand** (1:47.4) have led the way.

One new name to the trainer standings in North America is Shane Tritton, son of Peter Tritton. The younger Tritton has gotten off to a fast 5 for 9 start at the Meadowlands winning solely with his stock of horses imported from Down Under, including a perfect 2 for 2 with **My Ruebe Star N**. Conversely, perennial top trainer Ron Burke is off to an uncharacteristically slow start at the Meadowlands, winning just four times from 60 starters at that track. He's bound to heat up at some point, but for the past few weeks, horses from the barn have underachieved at low prices.

Last year's Driver of the Year award came down to Tim Tetrick and Dexter Dunn, and currently those drivers sit 1-2 at the Meadowlands with Tetrick currently three wins ahead of Dunn, who has picked right up from where he left off from last year's dream season. Yannick Gingras is just a couple of wins back in third, and I'd expect those three to battle it out all season long for the top drivers spot.

With the rivalry of Tall Dark Stranger and Papi Rob Hanover to potentially be renewed next week, another rivalry already resumed this past week at Yonkers. In the fillies and mares open handicap at Yonkers, defending Horse of the Year Shartin N overcame post 8 with relative ease and wore down pacesetter Caviart Ally who had to settle for third in 1:52. Shartin N was actually above even money that race and I can't recall the last time her odds were that high; I guess post 8 will do that sometimes. Caviart Ally got the better of Shartin N a couple of times towards the end of last year, but everyone in that aged mares division is going to have to step up big to have any chance of dethroning Shartin N.

Despite being slow out of the gate at the Meadowlands, trainer Burke is outpacing the rest of the trainer colony at Pocono Downs. In fact, one might have thought that the trainer standings since the return of racing would look much different due to the absence of the indicted formerly leading trainers, but the standings look like about what you'd expect. Burke is followed by Garcia-Herrera and then by Erv Miller, along with Jen Bongiorno sporting a perfect 4-4 record. At Pocono, the reliable trainers remain the ones most playable. On the driver's side, George Napolitano still leads the way as expected, but just narrowly for the time being over Matt Kakaley.

Elsewhere in PA, it's too early to assess how the trainers and drivers are shaking out at Harrah's Philadelphia, but a new season's mark for 2-year-old pacers was set yesterday (Thursday) when a Captaintreacherous colt named **Red Right Hand** won his PASS division in 1:52. In the preceding race, the fastest horse to date by freshman sire Always B Miki was set when closely named **Always A Miki** cruised first over in another PASS division in 1:52.2. Both 2-year-olds are trained by Takter.

Overall, if it seems like a lot of tracks are seeing record handle in some form or another over the past month, it's because they are. In looking at the economic indicators put forth by the USTA, the one bright spot in the lost days of racing due to the coronavirus has been the increase in wagering. While race days and purses are down over 50 per cent due to the shutdowns, the amount of money wagered on a per-race basis is up nearly 20 per cent from last year. It's the result of a pent-up demand for wagering due in part to the fact that other sports people would normally wager on still hasn't returned. The numbers may also give credence to the "less is more" notion, that less race days but larger and higher quality race fields will produce higher handle.

Pacer-bred trotter Don Fanucci Zet wins big in Sweden

Green Manalishi was the bettors' first choice in the first out of three elimination heats for the \$255,000 Sprintermästaren, but Stefan Melander's trotter had to fight from post 8 over the mile, on a 5/8 mile track, which is tough for every horse.

A first turn three wide ended in a first over race and leader **Bythebook** (Googoo Gaagaa) looked unbeatable the whole way. So Svante Båth's Bythebook finished the last half mile in :55.2 and driver Erik Adielsson had everything under control over the home stretch. Bythebook came home to win in 1:53.4. Green Manalishi held strongly as runner up and Usain Töll claimed a spot in the final as third after a pocket trip.

Guzz Mearas (Muscle Mass) and Johan Untersteiner was the answer in the second elimination and Untersteiner served his horse a perfect trip in second over, while Osterc was eager in front for Erik Adielsson. Osterc held to third place and Guzz Mearas disarmed first over trotter Upset Face in great style over the stretch. Winner time: 1:54.

Hard Livin son **Don Fanucci Zet** was the fastest elimination winner and Daniel Redén's trotter didn't get a free ride to victory. Don Fanucci Zet was three wide in first turn and when in front, a spicy Gerry set the pace high on the outside. Still, Redén's horse was superior and second over trotter Click Bait couldn't challenge the winner, who noted a 1:53.2 mile.

In the final, Bythebook drew post 1 behind the gate, Don Fanucci Zet 2 and Guzz Mearas 3, approached and drivers and trainers did their best to get horses ready for the second heat of the night. Green Manalishi raced without shoes and with closed bridle, a first time combination for him and from post 9, behind Bythebook and Don Fanucci Zet. But the Stefan Melander trained Green Manalishi disappeared from the race at an early stage since went off stride behind horses and in front, Bythebook easily kept the lead the first 100 meters. Then, in the first turn, Usain Töll and Wim Paal gave their all to try to reach front position which costed power

and Paal had to accept position first over.

Don Fanucci Zet was served a trip in second over and driver Örjan Kihlström opted to leave that position at mid backstretch. That move forced Don Fanucci Zet to race three wide in the last turn, but when Usain Töll's power was out, the Hard Livin son got close contact with leader Bythebook.

And Don Fanucci Zet disarmed Bythebook with 200 meters to go, but at that point, two chasers from inside positions got their space to speed, Click Bait on the outside of Don Fanucci Zet and Guzz Mearas on the inside. But nothing could stop Don Fanucci Zet in Sprintermästaren final on Thursday night. Örjan Kihlström spoke about the great mentality of the horse after the big victory and he also mentioned the unlikely progress that Don Fanucci Zet has experienced since April this year.

"He is just such a nice horse to be around. He is calm, he almost stops and wants to take a look at the environments around the track just seconds before we have to go behind the car and when the race is on, he really focuses on what he shall do. I was very confident after the elimination, but you never know what happens in a new race. I'm very happy that this horse won the race," said Kihlström after the big win.

Don Fanucci Zet (Hard Livin—Kissed By The West) was, as HRU published before (**full story here**) bred with a pacing mare and purchased in Lexington by Redén in 2012.

"And that's why I'm so very proud right now. This is a horse that we've built with a stud of ours (Hard Livin) and a mare that I couldn't get to trot. I don't know where this will end, maybe this is a new breed in our sport," said Redén.

Don Fanucci Zet won in 1:52 and Guzz Mearas took silver medal ahead of Click Bait.

Grande victory in \$171,000 Stosprintern

Ten 4-year-old mares had qualified for the final of \$171,000 Stosprintern at Halmstad racetrack, Sweden and the Thursday night show became sparkling with an upset winner in Grande Diva Sisu (Ready Cash).

Per Nordström is trainer and driver behind the Stosprintern winner and he did everything perfectly in the race at Halmstad. In the eliminations, Grande Diva Sisu was first choice in her heat, but a front trip ended with second place, a fact that most certainly made her a winner in the final. Nordström opted post nine, behind horses, in the final and he found a perfect cover trip in third over, with favorite Golden Tricks in front of him.

When Golden Tricks attacked three wide 650 meters to go, Grande Diva Sisu followed easily and in the race's last meters she disarmed a brave Golden Tricks.

The 4-year-old Ready Cash mare won in 1:54.3 and collected the biggest triumph in her career. In May, Grande Diva Sisu showed great capacity as runner up in \$215,000

Drottningpokalen, from post 12 and there's no doubt that Per Nordström's mare is one of the hottest horses ahead of the big races Stochampionatet and Derbystoet later this season.

Vivid Wise As back as a winner

Elitloppet favorite (ahead of the eliminations at Solvalla in May) Vivid Wise As (Yankee Glide) has returned to his Italian trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro and showed that he was back in business for real when he won \$202,000 Gran Premio Turilli in Rome on Monday night.

World record trotter Zacon Gio lead the race and Vivid Wise As followed behind before Gocciadoro gave his horse the signal to attack at the home stretch.

The mile rate of 1:58.4 was enough to claim the victory over 1.3 miles.

Alessandro Gocciadoro had a great night in Rome. In \$202,000 Gran Premio Tino Triossi for 4-year-olds, Andrea

Guzzinati steered Gocciadoro's Always Ek (Filipp Roc) to safe victory after a trip in third over. Always Ek swept the field during the race's last 700 meters and impressed in 1:56.3 over 1.3 miles.

Gu d'Heripre wins in Paris

Vincennes in Paris had a nice race card on Tuesday night and Gu d'Heripre (Coktail Jet) impressed a lot from position first over in \$95,500 Prix Phaeton.

Franck Nivard drove the talented 4-year-old and had control of his opponents all the way in mile rate 1:58 over 1.6 miles.

Gu d'Heripre belongs in the top of the French crop born 2016 and Philippe Billard is the trainer.

Sébastien Guarato trained Green Grass (Bold Eagle) hit the lead a half mile into the \$95,500 Prix Paul Leguerney for 4-year-old mares and was never challenged seriously. Mathieu Mottier sat in the bike and the duo came home in 1:57.3 over 1.6 miles.

Troy Beyer has worked for a number of greats and learned from them all

There's no doubt that Troy Beyer's racing IQ is off the charts.

When you have worked – and do work – with some of standardbred racing's most accomplished names, you're bound to learn some invaluable lessons along the way.

Beyer, 25, who has worked for high-profile trainers Nancy Takter and Brett Pelling, as well as Andy and Julie Miller, is currently second trainer for Noel Daley.

The native of Crete, IL, who also drives, continues to be a willing student of the sport.

"Everybody has their own way of doing things, so being with so many different people, I can't really say everyone does everything the same. The best thing that you can do is to just try and take in everything, and listen. Everyone has their own style and approach, which allows you to pick up valuable things here and there. I would say that it's not just trainers that you learn from. Other drivers, grooms – you can learn a lot of different things from different people. The more you can take in, obviously, the better off you're going to be."

It's a philosophy that has served Beyer well.

"You really can learn something new every day. That should actually be the motto of horse racing because it's certainly true."

It was Beyer's father, a former standardbred trainer himself, who helped lay the groundwork for his son to join the harness racing ranks.

When Troy was 13, his father asked if he'd be interested in training a horse, Casino Comp - a pacing daughter of Final Cheers, bred in Illinois by Thundermint Farms - at the small farm they were at in Illinois.

The youngster needed little encouragement to sit in the race bike. And when he did, he knew exactly what he wanted his full-time job to be.

"For me, driving is the thing I like to do the most," said Beyer, who drove Casino Comp to victory on June 25, 2014, at Balmoral. "It's always a big adrenaline rush. It's always a lot of fun. Even if you don't win, the feeling that you get from being out there is amazing. But, of course, it's always better when you cross the line first."

Beyer readily recalls his milestone first win.

The victory, on May 25, 2013, at Balmoral, came with Come N Bet It, a son of Intrepid Seelster bred in Lucan, ON, by Seelster Farms.

"That was actually a lot of fun for me. My dad and I claimed him off a friend of ours. We claimed him at Balmoral and that horse really taught me a lot, including patience. He was a stone-cold closer and he was great at Balmoral because they have a quarter-mile long stretch. You basically could sit in with him until the three-quarter pole, and then pull him out into the middle of the racetrack and he'd just fly home. He was a lot of fun. He's a horse that you could always count on. He had a lot of soreness issues, but he was just a horse with a big heart."

After a sophomore season in which Beyer won 11 races from 209 starts, he posted seven wins in limited action in the sulky from 2015-2017.

Two years ago, he had his breakout campaign, winning 16 races in the sulky. In 2019, the number rose to 24.

Despite the temporary pause to live racing this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Beyer, who is back working with

Daley since the Hambletonian-winning [Broad Bahn, 2011] conditioner returned to the United States from Australia last year, is hopeful he can set career-best numbers across the board in 2020.

"Things are going very well. Knock on wood, all our babies that we got out of Lexington and Harrisburg – even some other ones people have sent us – they're all doing very well at this stage. It looks like we could have a nice year in Sires Stakes, and races like that. We have 23 [horses], but our whole side of the barn is full. I also have one horse of my own that I train and drive. My wife [Katie Gangell-Beyer] actually has a horse in the barn, so it's a family affair."

Although he's plied his trade at numerous horse racing hot spots, Beyer, who now calls Bordentown, NJ home, is still learning more about the craft, both as a trainer and a driver.

Upping his game remains a top priority.

"I think having gone through some very influential and successful barns, you appreciate the effort and the dedication you need to succeed, and the need to keep pushing yourself. In this business, there are plenty of ups and downs. You enjoy the happy moments, and you learn from the tough ones. The most important thing is to always strive to be better, keep your eyes and ears open, and be open to learning."

Beyer hopes his continuing education pays off with more driving opportunities.

Getting those chances, however, can be, at times, a difficult task.

"The biggest challenge for me, as a driver, is just trying to get drives and maintain drives. It kind of hurts me a bit when we have breaks. I drive at Yonkers quite a bit and every time they close down for a break, it usually takes me two or three months before I start getting drives again. Going to qualifiers each week is very important any young guy starting out. You have to make sure you go to those qualifiers and be ambitious. You're not going to pick up horses sitting on a couch at home."

Not a problem for Beyer, who continues to strive to be at the head of the class.

"You have to show up and put in your time. The ultimate goal would be to drive full-time, primarily. I'd like to have a barn of my own some time in the next few years, to have both racehorses and babies. Racehorses are great to have around, but I really enjoy working with the babies. That's the biggest thrill in the business. You guide them along, help them learn, and watch them go on to do well."

It's a cherished role for Beyer, and one where the standardbred student is happy to be the teacher.

Ralph Gauwitz: A lifelong love of harness racing

He struggled down the aisle of the stable at the Illinois State Fair, balancing himself with crutches and dragging his legs behind him.

He stopped in front of the stall where I was tending to a trotter and appraised the blood bay colt.

"What's his status?" he asked me.

That was my introduction to Ralph J. Gauwitz, Jr. of Illinois and a half-century later we are close friends.

Ralph was born in Illinois, the heart of America, and shares a birthday with America: he was born on the Fourth of July.

He wasn't, however, born during the revolutionary war but instead in 1940, making him 80 years old on Saturday. He likes to remind me that he was born the same year as Adios, Volo Song, Worthy Boy, King's Counsel and the thoroughbred Triple Crown winner Count Fleet.

Alas, Ralph was born with spastic cerebral palsy, and has

been confined to a wheelchair most of his adult life. But that hasn't prevented him from being one of the most ardent fans of harness racing in history.

He always lived in the Land of Lincoln and there are not many tracks, fairs, or breeding farms in Illinois that Ralph has not visited. He was also a regular fixture at the Lexington and Indianapolis Grand Circuit meets for decades and a ringside observer at the yearling sales in Kentucky and in Harrisburg, PA.

In 1970 at the Tattersalls sale, Ralph was more than an observer as he had the final bid on a filly named On To Victory, a sister-in-blood to Triple Crown winner Speedy Scot. Her price was modest and Ralph didn't have the funds to train her, so he bred her to Illinois stallions.

On To Victory didn't produce any champions but Ralph sold her foals and followed their progress on the track.

He knew standardbred pedigrees inside and out and could cite the accomplishments of countless stallions and mares throughout the 20th Century.

His interest in pedigrees is what led to our initial

conversation. I was spending my summer break from college in 1968 rubbing horses and the day we met I was caring for a colt named Speed Classic. He'd been the highest-priced colt in the Castleton Farm yearling consignment the previous fall and he was an elegant andrefined colt. Ralph knew the colt's pedigree and sale price and was interested in him. Alas, Speed Classic stabbed a hind leg, never raced, and went to stud in Argentina.

But from that initial meeting in1968, our friendship blossomed. In 1972, when I was fresh out of college and living in Columbus, OH in a small apartment (rent of \$112.50/month), Ralph made his first and only trip to the Little Brown Jug.

I picked him up at the bus stallion and got him settled in my apartment. I told him that Jug Day was a madhouse at Delaware and we'd have to get up and get there early to beat the crowds.

I was up and ready to go on Jug morning but the simple tasks that I performed routinely took Ralph so much longer. It was a valuable lesson for me in the challenges that a disabled person faces each day.

But Strike Out set a world record winning that Jug and we had a fabulous time. Our friendship got stronger and we exchanged letters discussing arcane topics of interest only to a couple of harness racing junkies. I have a treasure trove of Ralph's letters in my files.

Whenever harness racing was conducted at tracks in Illinois, chances are you'd find Ralph with a ringside seat. He was particularly fond of the Grand Circuit stakes at Springfield.

In 2009, the State of Illinois honored Ralph for his steadfast loyalty to harness racing and he was brought to the winner's circle and saluted with warm applause from the spectators. Surely many of them recognized and knew Ralph as a fervent harness racing fan.

That same year, Hanover Shoe Farms named two colts — a

trotter and a pacer — in honor of Ralph.

Gauwitz Hanover by Yankee Glide was later renamed Celebrity Gauwitz and got a 1:57.3f trotting mark.

R Gauwitz Hanover by Modern Art was an Ontario Sires Stakes winner at age two and now has won 46 races and more than \$450,000. His took mark of 1:49f when he was a 6-year-old and he's still racing at age 11.

R Gauwitz Hanover was won faster than 1:55 for 10 consecutive seasons — and I wonder if any horse has ever done that. Ralph follows R. Gauwitz Hanover each time he races.

For most of his life, Ralph lived with his parents in Peoria but in recent years he has resided in nursing home facilities in that area. He still has many friends, including Fred Elmore who speaks with Ralph regularly. When Elmore owned part of a pacing colt by Somebeachsomewhere, Ralph was the colt's biggest cheerleader, although he never saw him race in person.

Racing veterans Kendra and Al Casselman are other longtime friends.

Bill Wright, a prominent standardbred owner in Illinois, has been a staunch supporter for Ralph over many years.

Ralph made a lot of friends in the sport over his decades of love for harness racing. It was always easy to find him at The Red Mile each fall as his spot in the railbird seats gave him a great view of the passing parade.

His 80th birthday celebration will be subdued because life in nursing homes is lonely and strained during this time of the COVID-19 crisis. Ralph, however, has already received many calls and cards from his friends in the sport.

When I think of true-blue fans of harness racing, I will always think of my friend Ralph Gauwitz.

"If I've got something running at Grand River or Hanover or Clinton I'm there for sure," said the owner. "We like racing on the small track. We live in the country, and we're just kind of country people, so we like to support those small tracks. There are a lot of nice people at those places and I like the half-mile racing. I mean you can go there and actually watch the races, like you can watch the whole race live. You go to Mohawk Woodbine you've kind of got to watch on TV if you want to really see it properly."

High Roller Duke goes into Sunday's Final on a three-race win streak that started June 16 with a 1:55.3 win in non-winners of \$15,000 lifetime at Georgian Downs. The Bettors Delight daughter followed that up with a 1:56.3 win in the Prospect Series for Ontario Sired pacing fillies at Hanover Raceway on June 20 and then took her Kin Pace elimination last Sunday with a 1:58.2 effort. She has been on the front or up close in all three of her wins, so Schlegel says

Post 8 may not be ideal, but hopes driver Doug McNair can work out a trip.

"We probably would have liked her to have her nose on the gate, even if it was farther out, but we'll take what we're given," said the owner. "Just the last couple starts she's been on the inside, but she can also come from the back."

If High Roller Duke and McNair can find their way to the winner's circle it will be the second straight year a Glenview Livestock Ltd. horse has claimed the Kin Pace Final. Mach Three daughter Significance captured the title last fall, upsetting heavy favorite So Much More.

Schlegel and partner Cheryl Cherry of Guelph acquired Significance from Hanover Shoe Farms at the 2017 Harrisburg Yearling Sale, while High Roller Duke is a second generation product of the Glenview Livestock breeding program.

After enjoying watching harness racing as a youngster Schlegel jumped into ownership four decades ago with pacing mare Wise N Fast. For 20 years he stuck with owning racehorses, but when Top Time Patrol's racing career came to an end in 2004 be bred the Shore Patrol mare to Astreos and the Glenview breeding program was born.

"One person that gave us a lot of good advice that really helped us when we first started years ago was Robert Hamather," said Schlegel, who named the first foal out of Top Time Patrol Robcinbobbi, for Rob, his wife Cindy and daughter Bobbi. "My friend, Paul Taylor, introduced me to Robert Hamather and he gave us a lot of great advice."

Over the last two decades Schlegel has pursued a range of strategies with the breeding side of the Glenview operation, but at present he is focused on breeding a handful of his own pacers and trotters and purchasing a few well-bred yearling fillies in hopes that they will become future broodmares.

Schlegel recently relocated the broodmare operation to a Rockwood, ON farm formerly owned by Stewart and Heidi Cockshutt and said Stewart's friendship and guidance over the past year has been invaluable.

"We were looking for a broodmare farm and we bought that place and we were fortunate enough that after the deal, when we went to look at the place that night, they had just come back before we had left and we started talking and we really got to be friends. And Stuart's a guy that's 91 or 92 years old, and they bought a house in Rockwood so they're five minutes away, and he really likes to come back," said Schlegel. "And he comes back two, three, four times a week. Whether it's to tell us how to work the water bowls or how to

have the paddocks, his contribution's been very good for us."

While Cockshutt remains a hands-on participant in his ninth decade, Schlegel says he only gets out to the farm a handful of times each year, leaving things in the hands of Lacey and Andrew McCabe, who live on site and handle everything from training the racehorses to care of the breeding stock to selecting the stallion matches for each mare.

"I'm hands on with the cattle, I don't go out there too often," said the owner, whose primary business is purchasing cattle. In fact, between the Rockwood farm and First Line Training Centre, where the racehorses are stabled, Schlegel admitted he has lost count of the number of horses in residence.

"You know I'd be lying if I told because I'm not even sure. Maybe 20," he said. "There's probably about a dozen racehorses and I think that maybe there's four 2-year-olds, so then there's probably four broodmares and then there's a couple yearlings and a couple weanlings. So maybe we've got 24, 25."

A regular participant in the Ontario Sires Stakes program, Glenview Livestock's most successful provincial competitor in recent years is Pretty Handsome, who captured the pacing colt Grassroots Championship in 2017 and 2018 and has earned \$216,555 lifetime. Palm Patrol, a Mach Three daughter from the operation's foundation broodmare Top Time Patrol, banked \$462,912 in a seven-year career.

Watching the horses compete, especially on his favorite half-mile tracks, is what Schlegel enjoys the most about the business so he will be counting the days until he can be back in his usual spot at Hanover and Clinton Raceways on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. And Ian, if you need a personal assistant to help out with the Kin Pace Final, you can reach Rob at the cottage.



Hall of Famer Cams Card Shark dead at 29

Cam's Card Shark passed away peacefully at Hanover Shoe Farms on July 2 at the age of 29. He was with the people that loved him, including Hanover Shoe Farms farm manager Patti Murphy who has been with him since he retired to stallion duty, first in New Jersey and then Pennsylvania. Cam's Card Shark was retired from stallion duty in 2014 and lived his remaining years in the stallion barn at Hanover.

Cam's Card Shark took his record of 1:50 at age 3 in and made \$2,498,204. He was the Dan Patch Horse of the Year in 1994 and was inducted to the Hall of Fame in 2007. Cam's Card Shark's major wins include the North America Cup, Meadowlands Pace, New Jersey Classic, Messenger Stakes, The Adios, Berry's Creek, James Dancer Memorial, Art Rooney Pace and The Miller Memorial. He was scratched as the overwhelming favorite to win the Little Brown Jug and never raced again.

The story just starts there. Cam's Card Shark started his stallion career at Hanover Shoe Farms of New Jersey in 1995 and moved to Pennsylvania in 2012 where he stood his last two seasons at Hanover's main farm in Pennsylvania. Cam's Card Shark sired 1829 foals that earned \$150,458,259 collectively. His most notable performers include the double millionaires Bettor's Delight p,3,1:49.4 (\$2,581,461), Shark Gesture p, 1:48.1 (\$2,818,021), Four Starzzz Shark p 1:47.4 (\$2,537,267), Royalflush Hanover p,3 1:49.3 (\$2,153,483), and the one time co-fastest pacer of all time, Holborn Hanover p,1:46.4 (\$2,070,640). Cam's Card Shark's daughters have produced the winner of \$117,543,368 including the performers A Rocknroll Dance p.1:47.2 (\$2,429,411) and Heston Blue Chip p,3,1:48f (\$1,7881,881).

"If he had only sired Bettor's Delight, who is inarguably one of the greatest stallions the business has ever seen, he would have left his mark, however he did so much more. Shark was a great racehorse and an even greater stallion. He was as tough and gritty a horse as you could know. It was, of course,

a sad day here but he had a great life and we were blessed to have had him for as long as we did", said Hanover's Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky.

Owners Jeff and Paula Snyder was understandably sad when they received the news. "He changed our lives, he was really the start of my career in harness racing and the horse that got Paula interested in racing. We really appreciate everything he did for us and take comfort in the fact that he had such a long and happy retirement at the only home he knew after racing," Jeff said.

In the second division seventh race, the 4-5 favorite **Hen Party** held off the pocket sitting Alleyesonme As by a
half-length in 1:53.3. Hen Party, a daughter of Roll With Joe is
trained by Tony Alagna with Andrew McCarthy in the bike for
Crawford Farms.

In the third division eighth race, **Eye Popping** sprung a 7-1 upset in 1:53.4. Precious Alexis was a length and a half back in second with Moaning Lisa third. A daughter of So Surreal, Eye Popping is trained by Scott Di Domenico and driven to victory by Tim Tetrick for owner William Hartt.

Also on the card was the fourth race \$33,000 Open Handicap Pace where Tookadiveoffdipper with Yannick Gingras driving held off Jesse Duke N in 1:52.4. That race saw \$152,012 in wagering, the highest of the year so far at Yonkers. In total, the eight race card handled just over \$700,000, the highest figure since returning from a three month stoppage.

Racing resumes at Yonkers next week with a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday schedule with first post at 7:12pm.

Alicorn triumphant in return to Gold Series action

Just over eight months since her last appearance at Woodbine Mohawk Park, 3-year-old pacing filly Alicorn returned to the Milton oval on Monday evening (June 29) and marched straight back into the winner's circle.

Making her sophomore debut in the first of three \$73,067 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions, Canada's 2-year-old Pacing Filly of the Year eased away from Post 5 as Betalady led the field to a :26.2 opening quarter. After sitting briefly on the rail in third, driver Louis-Philippe Roy sent the fan favorite to the front and Alicorn rolled on to a :55 half and 1:23.3 three-quarters. Lauras Love and Rose Run Victoria mounted an attack in the lane, but Alicorn held them off for a three-quarter length victory in 1:50.4.

"To come off of an eight month layoff and have to pace 1:50 and change her first start, that's not easy for any horse," said Chantal Mitchell, who trains Alicorn for Windermere Stable LLC of New York, NY and Robert Muscara of Ivyland, PA. "She did the vast majority of the work in there tonight. I don't know if she could have gone faster if she was pushed, but she did what she had to do and I'm quite happy with her."

The Bettors Delight daughter came into Monday's Gold Series season opener off a trio of qualifiers on June 4, 11 and 18, with the most recent clocked in 1:52.2. Mitchell was confident that Alicorn was ready, but the Waterdown resident was still happy to get the win in the books.

"There's always a lot of expectations. When the stakes schedule came out and she didn't have any races for a month then I scratched her from the (May 29) qualifier, and it was, you know people were losing their minds," Mitchell said. "They said, 'What's wrong with her?' It's fine, it's just I don't have anywhere to race her so I'm not going to qualify her this week, we'll qualify next week. I mapped out a plan for her after I had a stakes schedule so then it was — because everybody was questioning what I was doing — it was, hopefully I made the right decision."

The winner of \$536,907 wintered in North Carolina and Mitchell said, while she did not grow taller, Alicorn did fill out and looks stronger than she did as a two-year-old.

"She's a lot thicker. She filled out a lot, and I think she filled out quite a bit just in the last two months. With all this extra time it did her some good. A lot of people were calling her fat tonight. I said it's a good thing she doesn't care what other people think because she would develop a complex," said Mitchell with a laugh. "It's like I said to one of her owners, it'll take a couple more of those 1:50 miles to get

her back to her fighting weight, but she's starting in a good spot."

Sex Appeal also started her sophomore campaign in a good spot, finding the OSS winner's circle for the first time. The Bettors Delight daughter and driver Trevor Henry caught the pacesetting Rose Run Vantage in the stretch to record the victory in a personal best 1:51. Fan favourite Rose Run Vantage settled for second and Saulsbrook Raven was third.

"She's a nice filly, she's just starting to learn how to race. She grew up a lot from last year," said Henry, who drives Sex Appeal for trainer Bob McIntosh of Windsor and Al McIntosh Holdings Inc. of Learnington. "Hopefully she keeps it up."

A Grassroots competitor at two, Sex Appeal now has three wins to her credit in four sophomore starts.

The final Gold Series division went to **All Day Sunshine** and driver James MacDonald, who tracked Probert through the mile and then circled the stalled favourite in the stretch. All Day Sunshine sprinted all the way to the wire, getting a nose in front of So Delightful in a 1:52 personal best. Keystone Kalimba completed the top three.

"I was hoping to find a nice trip with her and get as much as we could, but Dan (Lagace) has the horse great and the trip worked out," said MacDonald. "When I gave her some racetrack, she did the rest."

A Gold winner at two, Sunshine Beach daughter All Day Sunshine is owned by trainer Daniel Lagace of Cambridge, Christopher Nicol of Caledonia, ON and Billy Joe Timmins of Birmingham, GB.

The 3-year-old pacing fillies will return to Woodbine Mohawk Park on July 17 for their second Gold Series Leg.

Pennsylvania baby pacing colts impressive at Philly

Trainer Nancy Takter and driver Dexter Dunn combined to win the fastest two of the four divisions of the \$218,260 first preliminary round of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes for 2-year-old pacing colts Thursday afternoon at Harrah's Philadelphia, with **Red Right Hand**, whose 1:52 was the fastest clocking among the babies, salvaging some honor for tote-board favorites, who had taken a PASS drubbing up until then.

Red Right Hand, a Captaintreacherous colt out of the mare Preppy Party Girl, gradually made his way to the front past a :27.2 quarter, went to the half in :56.2, then received a stern challenge from Summa Cum Laude before, through, and after the 1:24 three-quarters. Red Right Hand dug in to keep his game opponent at bay by a neck for the partnership of Christina Takter, Nancy Takter and JAF Racing, Joe Sbrocco, and R A W Equine Inc.

The other successful Takter-Dunn teaming was with the Always B Miki-Beach Gal colt **Always A Miki**, who followed up on a 1:56 morning victory with a well-deserved 1:52.2 mark here. Always A Miki was fifth, some 6½ lengths behind at the half, but the colt just kept eating into the leader Literl Lad Hanover's margin, then left him behind by 1½ lengths with personal back fractions raw of :54.3 - :27.1 for his owners, Christina Takter, Goran Anderberg, Herb Liverman, and the Rojan Stables.

The Sweet Lou-Lucy's Pearl colt **Lou's Pearlman** was let go at 7-1 despite having the best qualifying win time of all the PASS horses (1:54), and he responded by lowering his tab further to 1:53.3. Another colt having to overcome a difficult first-up journey, Lou's Pearlman showed determination en route to a neck victory over inside rallier Crunch Hanover for driver Matt Kakaley, trainer Ron Burke, and Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscemi LLC along with Elizabeth Novak.

Bayfield Beach dropped five seconds from his first qualifier to his second, and for his pari-mutuel debut he dropped over three more seconds en route to a 1:52.4 in-hand victory. David Miller got the call to guide the Somebeachsomewhere—DB Blue Chip colt for trainer Brian Brown and the ownership of Crossover Racing, Country Club Acres Inc., Rich Lombardo Racing LLC, and Joe Sbrocco (who joined Christina Takter with an ownership double in the Sire Stakes).

In the six \$20,000 Stallion Series races, driver David Miller and trainer Blake MacIntosh teamed twice with winning shippers from Woodbine Mohawk Park: first with the Somebeachsomewhere–Lady Be Great colt **Great Somewhere**, an easy 1:55.1 winner for the partnership of the trainer, Reginald Pettipas, Ruth Irving, and Gilles Landry, and then with the Captaintreacherous–Bittorsweet Terror colt **Bazooka Hanover**, who looked ripe for passing in midstretch but grittily went on to defeat Caviart Skipper by a neck, with Fernet About It just photoed out for the deuce, in 1:56.4 for owner Steve Heimbacker.

The card-opening Stallion Series winner, the Sweet Lou-Edra Hanover colt **Emblaze Hanover**, had several distinctions for driver Matt Kakaley, trainer Ron Burke, and Burke Racing Stable LLC, Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky, Jason Melillo, and J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby – he was the fastest winner in this sector in 1:53.3; he gave Kakaley-Burke the

distinction of being the only teaming to win both a Sire Stake and a Stallion Series race; and he was the only StS winner not to be on the lead at the half, using "pocket rocket" tactics en route to the win.

In a stretch duel of sons of Betting Line, **Andres Hanover** (out of Anadarko Hanover) held off the late shot of Rifleman by a neck in 1:54 for driver Andrew McCarthy, trainer Andrew Harris, and the partnership of Michael Goldberg Racing Inc. and A Harris Racing LLC. The other StS credit for Betting Line was also a battle between two of his colts – Batterup Hanover (out of Beachbunny Hanover) withstood favored Caviart Richmond by a half-length in 1:55.4 for driver Dexter Dunn and trainer Chris Ryder, the latter co-owner with William Ezzo and Barry Spak.

Finally, **Rollbin**, a son of A Rocknroll Dance–Binions, sustained late on the front end for a half-length decision over Get Along in 1:55.2. The meet's leading driver, Tim Tetrick, was in the sulky for trainer Jim King Jr. and his wife/owner Jo Ann Looney-King.

Baillargeon trotters sweep Gold Series opener in Innisfil

They arrived at Georgian Downs off impressive wins, fans made them the heavy favorites, and 3-year-old trotting geldings **Hayek** and **HP Royal Theo** delivered the goods, cruising to victory in their respective Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions on Sunday evening (June 28).

Hayek led off for the Ben Baillargeon stable, starting from Post 3 in the first \$105,600 Gold division, and the E L Titan son made it look easy from the moment the wings closed on the starting gate. Driver Sylvain Filion sent the gelding to the lead and Hayek rolled unchallenged through fractions of :28.1, :57.4 and 1:27.1 before opening up a five and three-quarter length margin on his peers heading for the 1:55.2 finish. Your Still Up was promoted from third to second and Northern Sultan moved up from fourth to third after Port Perry made a late break in the stretch, crossing the wire second but being placed back to fourth.

"He was a lot smarter tonight than he was Monday when I won with him," said Baillargeon. "I was a little bit anxious to see how he was going to behave himself, you know. He looks like he's fast enough, but he's still racing against better horses like Port Perry and company, but he was well behaved and Sylvain said, 'Geez, he was well-behaved and he was very good, very nice'. He asked him to go a little bit and he just went."

The trainer shares ownership of Hayek with Teresa Davidson of Milton, Santo Vena of Brampton and Nunzio Vena of Bolton, ON. The partners acquired the trotter on June 8 and Hayek has now delivered two wins and \$60,300 in earnings to his delighted new owners.

In the second \$106,400 Gold Series division, HP Royal Theo and driver Louis-Philippe Roy lined up behind Post 5. Roy eased the fan favourite away from the starting gate, allowing Horse Trader and Hot Wheelz to battle to the :28 opening quarter, and then sent HP Royal Theo to the front. Like his stablemate, HP Royal Theo was unchallenged through a :57 half and 1:26.1 three-quarters, and sailed home to a three and one-quarter length win in 1:54.1.

"He's a fast horse and he's a lot more mature this year and everything," said Baillargeon. "He's pretty smart, like he could have ducked in in the four-hole, but I told Louis, 'Take your time, but don't duck. You're the best, drive him like you're the best, but take your time at the gate.' And he's getting to be very smart and very good.

"I couldn't ask for anything better right now. If I can keep them both like that, with their head on their shoulders, we're going to have a good summer."

Breeder Claude Hamel of Ayer's Cliff and Michel Damphousse of Louiseville, QC share ownership of HP Royal Theo. The Royalty For Life son won a Gold Leg at two and also captured the William Wellwood Memorial Final, earning \$286,040. Sunday's victory boosted the gelding's lifetime earnings to \$350,240.

"You need some of them to pay for the ones we don't see. I have some in the field, so it's nice to get some to pay for them. It's a wheel you know, it's a big wheel. These two will keep the wheel turning for a while anyway, let's put it this way," said Baillargeon with a chuckle. "I have broodmares and I have all kinds of stuff too. Monsieur Hamel is the same thing, and Santo (Vena), he's the same thing. We dabble in about everything there is about the sport, so you need to get a few like that sometimes."

The next Gold Series event for the 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings takes place July 21 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, so Baillargeon said Hayek and HP Royal Theo will make one overnight start before continuing their Ontario Sires Stakes campaign.

Georgian Downs will play host to its second Ontario Sires Stakes event on Saturday, July 11 when the 2-year-old trotting colts will make their Grassroots debut.

Trotting fillies impress in ISS at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino played host to the opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) action for the 2020 season on Wednesday (July 1) as the evening's 14-race card featured two \$33,000 divisions for the 3-year-old trotting fillies. Using similar gate-to-wire tactics, divisional winners **Hotel Whiskey** and **May Baby** kept their individual winning streaks alive to deliver in impressive fashion in their respective divisions.

Hotel Whiskey with driver John DeLong in the bike wasted no time and went right to work as soon as the wings of the gate folded from post five. Reaching the front through the opening panel in :27.4, Hotel Whiskey was able to slow the tempo just a touch through middle fractions of :57.3 and 1:26.4 before outsprinting her rivals turning for home.

Stopping the timer in 1:54.3, Hotel Whiskey used a :27.3 closing kick to turn away the pocket-sitting Rjz First Lady and LeWayne Miller. Bluebird Ladyluck and Dan Shetler found late racing room to round out the trifecta. Sent off as the publics' third betting choice, Hotel Whiskey returned \$7.80 to her backers at the betting windows.

Trained and bred by Cassidy Whitton, Hotel Whiskey established a new lifetime best with the win. After sweeping a late closing series at Harrah's Hoosier Park last week, the sophomore filly remains unbeaten at three in three seasonal starts. The daughter of Bluto—LW Jaynie Flyer pushed her lifetime earnings to \$37,049 with the win.

In the second division, May Baby looked every bit the part of a 1-5 favorite as she captured her split of the stakes action to retain her perfect two-for-two sophomore record. With trainer James Yoder in the bike, May Baby utilized a gate to wire effort to finish four lengths in front of her competition and stop the timer in 1:52.4.

Leaving from post four in the field of nine, May Baby left alertly to grab command through the opening panel in :27.4. J-S Miss Carly and Alex Udell benefitted from a pocket trip while the rest of the field followed in straight alignment down the backside. May Baby clicked off fractions of :57 and 1:25.1 before she began to distance herself from the rest of the field.

Turning for home, May Baby was on top with a five length lead. Rock Swan and Trace Tetrick made a valiant stretch run but were forced to settle for second place honors. Deswanslittlelorie and Michael Oosting rallied late for third. As the heavy betting favorite, May Baby returned \$2.60 at the betting windows.

With the win, May Baby pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$258,240 and has now won eight of 12 of her lifetime outings. The daughter of Guccio-Free Wheeling is owned by Cheyenne Yoder and was bred by Oakwood Farms.

Indiana Sires Stakes action continues at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Thursday (July 2, results not available before press time) with two divisions for the 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings.

Nominations, purses up at Red Mile

The Red Mile announced Thursday that the outlook is bright for its 2020 race meet, which begins on Sunday, Aug. 2 and runs through Sunday, Oct. 11.

As of this writing, the Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series and Commonwealth Series hosted by the Lexington, KY track will have purses as advertised. Also of note, nominations for the track's major open stakes races are up from last year.

The KYSS Championship Series is scheduled to have three \$40,000 legs and \$250,000 finals for 2 and 3-year-olds, while the new Commonwealth Series will have two \$20,000 legs and a final worth \$50,000.

The sire stakes program kicks off Aug. 16 and concludes with the rich finals on Sept. 20 (Championship Series) and Sept. 21 (Commonwealth Series).

The Red Mile's major stakes portion of the meet starts Friday, Oct. 2 and closes with the traditional Kentucky Futurity Day card on Sunday, Oct. 11. Races will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday during those two weeks with an afternoon post time of 1 p.m.

With nominations for the open stakes races up from last year, purses for the majority of those 20 marquee events are expected to be on par—or likely higher—than those offered in 2019.

One change for this year that should be noted by horsemen is rather than hosting late closers during the final two weeks of the meet, the track will instead have overnights with conditions—and anticipated purses—similar to the late closers of the past.

"We want to encourage owners and trainers participating in stakes to bring their young horses along, as always," said Red Mile shareholder George Segal. He said the race office will review the horse population and tailor conditions specific to the horses that will be on the grounds or planning to ship-in race day.

With the industry just now coming back from its COVID-19 shutdown, Segal said that the payments and starting fees associated with the late closing program is one less thing horsemen will have to deal with.

"We'll basically provide them with unique opportunities to showcase their young horses, and of course there's no better racing surface to do that on than at the Red Mile," he said.

The two weeks of major stakes events — coupled with the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale — creates what's come to be known in the industry as "The Lexington Experience." The sale will be held at the crosstown Fasig-Tipton Pavilion the evenings of Tuesday, Oct. 6 through Saturday, Oct. 10.

The Blue Chip Farms Matchmaker Series will also be held on Saturday, Nov. 21 with an estimated \$200,000 Final and a \$75,000 consolation. There will be two preliminary legs in the series on Nov. 6 and Nov. 13, each carrying a \$40,000 purse with no declaration fee. The first leg of the series had been drawn for March 13 before the temporary closure of the track.

A total of 27 mares are eligible for the Blue Chip Matchmaker and 46 horses are eligible for the MGM Borgata Pacing Series.

Another Yonkers Raceway series that was interrupted in March was the M life Rewards for Ladies and Gents. The M life races have been rescheduled for Monday, July 20. The M life Rewards Ladies and Gents will both have a \$60,000 Final and \$30,000 Consolation.

Final standings for the series are available online.

Due to travel restrictions and pandemic concerns around the world, the \$1 million MGM Yonkers International Trot, originally scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 12, will not be held this year. The \$250,000 trotting and pacing invitationals planned for that day are also canceled.

The Sept. 12 card will still feature more than \$1.8 million in purses as part of the New York Sire Stakes Night of Champions which will be comprised of eight \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes Finals.

Swizzle Hanover in the first OHSS filly division (Race 1) deems watching. The daughter of Uncle Peter, out of the Chocolatier mare Seducedbychocolate, 3, 1:54.3M (\$174,558) has the pedigree credentials to be a good filly. Co-owned and trained by Randy Bendis for Reed Broadway, Swizzle Hanover scored a pair of winning qualifiers at The Meadows on June 11 and 25 with Mike Wilder at the lines, clocked in 2:03 and 2:00.1 respectively. She is a half-sister to North Express (by Muscle Massive) 4, 1:54.1f (\$61,573); Sweettooth Hanover (by Donato Hanover) 4, 1:57f (\$48,367); and Sweet Tart Hanover (by Donato Hanover) 4, 1:57f (\$11,280).

The second OHSS filly division (Race 5) is a bit more wide open, however the Cash Hall filly **She Loves To Jiggle** bares a look after having scored an impressive, front-end winning qualifier in 2:02 at Hawthorne on June 21 under the watchful eye of trainer Jim Eaton. She Loves To Jiggle is out of the Conway Hall mare Jiggles (\$4,657) and is owned by her trainer, Robert Silberberg, J. Schwartz, and the estate of Phil Langley.

Mama Knows Best hails from the powerful Canadian-based stable of trainer Jason McGinnis and heads up the third filly division (Race 7) for owner Thestable Mamaknowsbest. This daughter of Uncle Peter finished third in a Woodbine qualifier on June 11 before winning her debut on June 23 at

Northfield in 1:58.2 as the favorite with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. at the controls. She draws the rail in this OSS contest with Wrenn, Jr. in the bike again and will be the one to beat. Mama Knows Best is the eighth foal out of the Andover Hall mare Europass 3, Q1:58.2F (\$6,050) and is a full sister to Uncle Amos 3, 1:59.1 (\$26,127) and a half-sister to Passing Jetta (by Lear Jetta) 3, 1:55.4f (\$144,199); Money Crazed (by Crazed) 3, 1:57.3f (\$30,738).

Owner/breeder Sandra Burnett's **Ozma** looks serious in the fourth OHSS filly division (Race 9). Trained by Chris Beaver, this Triumphant Caviar Lass is the second foal out of the former OSS winner Evanora 3, 1:56.3h (\$115,348), herself a daughter of Pilgrim's Taj. Ozma scored a winning qualifier at Delaware on June 11 in 2:02 before posting a 2:02.4 clocking in a third-place finish in a Northfield qualifier on June 25. She benefits from the rail in this eight-horse field and will have Aaron Merriman in the sulky.

Rose Run Whitney is the most experienced freshman filly that will line up behind the Northfield gate on Friday in the final OHSS filly contest (Race 11), having scored two impressive qualifiers at The Meadows for trainer Ronnie Burke before winning a conditioned event at Northfield on June 28 in 2:01.2. The daughter of Uncle Peter will be steered by Kayne Kauffman from post three. Rose Run Whitney is the ninth foal out of the Angus Hall mare Stonebridge Dancer 3, 1:57.3F (\$34,902) and is a half-sister to: Rose Run Sydney (by Triumphant Caviar) 4, 1:54.1 (\$597,703); Magic Dancing (by Kadabra) 3, 1:59.3f (\$52,664); Rose Run Ida (by Triumphant Caviar) 3, 2:00.1h (\$53,736); Rose Run Urban (by Triumphant Caviar) 3, 1:57f (\$43,709); Magic Hat (by Kadabra) 4,Q1:57.3s (\$38,951); and Whitegloves (by Kadabra) 4,1:57s (\$33,145).

In the first of the three OHSS colt trotting divisions (Race 3), Admiral Allstar starts from post three for trainer Edward Miller. This son of My MVP is the only youngster in this contest with pari-mutuel raceway experience, having finished in a dead-heat for third on June 17 in a Northfield overnight for driver Kurt Sugg after having won his Northfield qualifier on May 28 in 2:03.2. Bred by the Lmn Bred Stables, Admiral Allstar was clocked in 1:59.2 in that start for owners Beccy Sugg, Watson Harness Racing and Mary Stucky. This gelding is the seventh foal out of the unraced Conway Hall mare Minor Skirmish and has

Dancer bill to allow out-of-state NJ residents to place wagers

Horse racing has been a crucial part of New Jersey's economy and its history since the late 1800s. A lot has changed within the horse racing industry, and Assemblyman Ron Dancer wants the current law on betting to reflect those updates.

Dancer's bill (A-2355) would give New Jersey residents the ability to place wagers on horse racing even when they are out of state. Currently, a New Jersey resident must be physically present in the state to place a wager.

"All New Jersey residents should be allowed to place wagers on horse racing no matter where they are, whether it's online or through an agency," said Dancer (R-Ocean). "With the changes in technology, our access to place wagers has changed and the law should reflect those changes. It's also critical we do everything we can do to keep our staple industries afloat during and after the coronavirus pandemic."

Dancer's bill unanimously passed the Assembly with a 73 to 0 vote.
