



Museum in his native Sweden.

I believe that most people would agree that Jimmy is the foremost horseman of this generation and certainly among the greatest horsemen of all time.

We had a long and sometimes meandering conversation on Monday.

The topics were varied, but almost entirely based on horses and family.

We know your father Bo William is generally acknowledged as having been one of the greatest Swedish horsemen ever. Were you always attracted to horses and harness racing?

"Yes and no. Of course, I couldn't help but being attracted to the horses, because that was what our family, especially my dad did. But my brother Johnny was far more 'addicted' to the horses. When we were growing up, that is all that he did or ever thought about. I believe he could have become a better horseman than me. He certainly was a better driver. I consider him to be among, if not the greatest, drivers that

I've ever seen."

Yet, Johnny surprised many a little over a year ago by retiring near the peak of his career. Why?

"I believe it was as a result of too much self-inflicted pressure. He is a perfectionist and always wanted things to go perfectly. We all know that is not the way life is. There were times when he suffered from depression, sometimes deep depression. As you have discussed with me, you've seen it in your family. It's a terrible affliction and you have to learn to live with it. I have my doubts as to whether his 'retirement' will be permanent. He still helps out in training a few and we might see him come back."


Let's talk about the evolution of the career of Jimmy Takter.

"For no great reason, other than I suppose to pursue a career in harness racing, I first came to America at the age of 17. I wasn't hooked yet. But I was interested in learning more. I first went to work for the team of Hakan Wallner, Jan Johnson and Berndt Lindstedt. I stayed there for 11 months and then returned to Sweden for four years. Christina and I got married there when I was 22. We got married in June and moved to America for good in December of that year. I went to work for Soren Nordin where I stayed for two years.

"I decided that it was time to go out on my own. Christina and I bought a cheap pacer, Witsend's Apollo, and managed to eke out a living racing him and winning 26 races. From there, you might say things grew."

Who are the five owners that have had the greatest influence on your career?

1. Johan Dieden - "It's easy to attract owners when you are




doing well. It's not that easy when you are an unknown. Mr. Dieden was there from the beginning, not only as a kind, generous owner, but also as a great friend."

- 2. The Antonacci Family "specifically the patriarch Sonny and his son Frankie. They've been great friends and loyal owners. The biggest bump in my career was when I got Moni Maker to train. It was Sonny who made that decision even before the group that owned her made the purchase. To this very day, I have no better friend than Frank Antonacci."
- **3. John Fielding** "No better person exists in harness racing or anywhere else for that matter. We have been extraordinarily successful from the beginning of our relationship. He was in on the cheap horses and the expensive ones. For the most part, we've done well with most of them. John has never questioned me on anything relating to horses. I just tell him what we bought and for how much he is in and we go on from there. There has never been anything resembling a cross word between us."
- **4. George Sega -** "A true gentleman. He understands the business. We have been mostly involved with his fillies. It gives me tremendous pleasure to know how well they've done both on the racetrack and in the breeding shed."
- **5. Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld -** "Two wonderful gentlemen both in and out of harness racing. They have done things the right way. They've bought wonderful mares and fillies who turned out to be great producers. In the process they've developed what is probably on a mare for mare basis, the finest trotting broodmare band in the world.

"I'm sure I've left out some others who undoubtedly belong. But you asked me about five and those were the ones which I came up with."

Speaking with you, I notice you don't often use the word "I", but rather the term "We". One of your greatest attributes has been your ability to compartmentalize and delegate authority. You speak of it as your "Team". Let's speak of its most intrinsic members.

1. My wife Christina "was far and away its most important member. Without her nothing we have done would have been accomplished. Primarily she is a great person, a wonderful wife and a great mother. But in terms of the stable, in certain areas, she was its guiding force. She handled most business aspects of the stable. She is a great communicator. She dealt with all of our owners. She was always there to answer their inquiries. If she didn't know the




answers, she would get them."

- **2. Conny Svensson** "was my farrier for 30 years. Before becoming a full-time blacksmith with us, he worked with me as a trainer. There were times when I think we must have shared the same brain. Many times when he came up with a thought, it was exactly what I was thinking and vice versa. Something people might not realize about me is that I look upon myself as being a pretty fair blacksmith myself. That's probably why we think so similarly. We trained horses together and sometimes shod horses together."
- **3.** My advance man and yearling picker Perry Soderberg. "We have been friends for 37 years. When many people think of Perry today, they look upon him as being a guy who is looking for the top, high-priced yearlings. That is entirely because when he started doing this he was able to pick out fairly cheap yearlings with which we made millions of dollars. He has a great eye."
- * Author's Note. When I mentioned to Jimmy the number of yearlings and hours spent looking at them by Perry, Jimmy jokingly replied "Why not? He sleeps for the remaining eight months of the year."

Who are the five greatest horse trainers you've known?

- **1. Jean Pierre Dubois**. "An incredibly unique individual. For him to have excelled in as many areas of horsedom as he has in all facets of them is without equal. A trainer, a breeder, a driver with trotters, runners, jumpers and even an occasional pacer and still remain a fantastic humble and generous human being. There's only one like him."
- **2. My father, Bo William Takter**. "He wasn't afraid to try different things. He was an innovator. Yet some of the things he tried that were initially laughed at turned out to be most successful."
- **3. Stig Johanssen.** "A legendary great horseman in Europe. He ran a great stable. In addition to being a great trainer, he was also a great driver."
- **4.** In his prime Chuck Sylvester was second to none. "He never had a large stable, but he had a great opinion and developed several champions including four Hambletonian winners."
- **5. Ronnie Gurfein**. "A terrific trainer. His opinions sometimes get him in trouble, but he is a really good guy. He is always willing to both learn and to help others to learn."
 - **5A.** Ake Svanstedt. "One of the greatest horsemen ever who



would has shown that he would be great anywhere. I'm sure that if you asked him, that Ake would say that he learned a lot from my father.

"As before, you have limited me to far too few. I arrived after the prime years of the Haughtons, Dancers, Simpsons, Millers and Ervins, so it would be unfair to not give them honorable mention. Their records speak for themselves.

"Another one that I would be unfair in omitting would be Ronnie Burke. What he does and has done in terms of running a stable of that size is beyond comprehension."

Being as you are from Sweden, there is one name conspicuously absent from your list, a man that many Swedes might say was the greatest horseman ever - Soren Nordin.

"Mr. Nordin was undoubtedly a great horseman. He could do more with an ordinary horse than probably any trainer ever. I worked for him for two years and I learned a lot. I also learned some things with which I disagreed. I think that he was sometimes too hard on horses. He didn't believe in breaks. I believe that many of his horses were in mortal fear of him. I view my relationship with horses to be a two way street. I respect them and I want them to respect me."


Let's talk about drivers. Who are your five best?

"I'm going to change that to the five who have had the greatest impact on my career, in alphabetical order: Yannick Gingras, Wally Hennessey, David Miller, Ron Pierce and my brother Johnny Takter."

You are building up quite a legacy, even after retiring, not only with your horses, but also with the people who have worked with you. Three stables stemming from experience with Jimmy Takter are at or near the top of the trotting world in North America.

"Of course, I'll start with my **daughter Nancy**. At her age, she has surpassed anything that I achieved at that time in my life. She is doing it with both pacers as well as trotters. She's already had a Horse of the Year, numerous divisional champions and her job with Manchego has been a uniquely great act of horsemanship. If you had asked me at the end of her 3-year-old season what to do with her, I probably would have said she's had enough. She needs to be a broodmare. She was tired. She did not seem happy. Nancy has nursed her to the stage where who knows what she might become?

The Melander brothers Marcus and Matthias worked for me for two years. They were terrific horsemen and hard workers.



Their record speaks for itself. Can you imagine having two horses like Greenshoe and Gimpanzee as well as a few other good ones in the same year?


"Per Englom - My right hand man as well as sometimes my left for several years. There are no areas in which he is deficient. He is destined for greatness."

You've had loads of great horses, let's speak about the ones that you'd rank as your five best.

"That's almost an impossible task and it certainly would be unfair to many that I leave out. One of the things I am most proud of is that we have 42 of our graduates standing as stallions throughout the world. I'll give it a try anyway, but only with my trotters.

- 1. Moni Maker "She's all alone at the top and was a game changer for all those wonderful people associated with her. She stands all alone not only because she won so many classics races in so many countries, but also because she gave so much pleasure to all of us who participated in her world tour. She's a big part of the lives of all who had anything to do with her."
- 2. Father Patrick. "He was truly great as a 2- and 3-year-old by far the best in his class. Although I won the Hambletonian that year with Trixton, his making a break in that race was one of the biggest disappointments in my career. I still have no idea why he did that and I probably will never know."
- **3. Tactical Landing.** "He and I just gelled when we got him. I did nothing radical with regard to changing anything significant. Bobby Stewart had given him a great foundation. I just don't know why it happened, but it did. Before he got injured in his last start, I firmly believe that if he had gone on to race at 4 and 5, he would have become one of the greatest trotters ever. I've sometimes wondered what would have been the case if we had him from the beginning."
- **4. Manchego "**We had her at 2 and 3 and she was a truly exceptional filly. But at the end of her 3-year-old season, I thought that she had enough. Nancy inherited her and made her even better at 4 and now at 5 than she was for me."
- **5. Kadabra "**He was a horse that maybe had as much, if not more desire than any horse we've had in our stable. A real professional who put his game face on every time he stepped on a racetrack."

What about our sport? Where are we going? What do we do wrong?



"There are so many things that we lack, but the number one is unity! Nobody works together or even wants to work together.

"The situation between Gural and Faraldo is a farce. These guys should be working together for the betterment of the sport. Instead, they are at each other's throats every opportunity they get. Who gets hurt by this outrageous and childish behavior? **Everybody, that's who - including both of them.**

"Our major organizations need leadership and restructuring. I have no doubt that the folks running USTA and the Hambletonian Society are well intentioned. They want what is good for the sport. But unfortunately in my opinion, they accomplish, very little.

"USTA and Standardbred Canada should be **ONE RECORD KEEPING ORGANIZATION** - nothing more.

"The leadership of our organizations should be based on merit and achievements. If who we presently have isn't doing a good enough job, they should be replaced by someone who can do a better job. It seems like most of the leadership jobs in our major organizations become lifetime positions or pretty darn close to them. We need achievers, not necessarily just nice guys who are caring.

"If you were to ask me what above all have I become proficient in? I would say, including horse related items, I have become a good businessman.

"There are undoubtedly some good business people on these boards. But I ask again what have they done for the good of the sport. My answer would be: not much that is apparent.

"Another area where we are lacking is with our racetracks. A couple do a decent job. The others do nothing or next to it. Where is the welcome to the customer at most racetracks? Sorry, He's gone AWOL. Look at the casinos and compare us to them. Unfortunately, there is little comparison.

"Everybody talks about the need for a commissioner, but because of state's rights people say that is impossible. I say that there has to be some way the State workers can get along with a ruling body that knows and understands the sport.

"My ideal commission would consist of three knowledgeable people who can make important rulings regarding the sport. If they need to get states' approval, then they need to try to work with the states. Something different needs to be tried."

Let's go back to Jimmy Takter. How is life for you these days?

"One word - Great!. As you may know I was facing what I thought was a life-threatening situation last year. They found

a tumor in my neck that they now feel might have been there for a long time. It was bothering me a whole lot last year. They are now treating it with something called Nucca Therapy. I don't really understand it, but I know it works.

"In my first year of retirement, Christina and I travelled the world. We went to Australia, new Zealand, California twice and spent a glorious month in Sweden. Now, the second year I became somewhat bored. I missed the horses. I've found a happy medium. I try to be of help to Nancy and Per, if needed.

In the winter, we are in Florida and I get over to Sunshine Meadows on Wednesdays and Saturdays and ride behind some of the Antonacci horses.

"All in all, life is pretty good. I've got a great wife, great kids and great grandchildren. I've got enough to keep me as busy as I want to be.

"Physically I feel fine.

"It's pretty good being Jimmy Takter."

White sulky wheel discs make pylon violations that much tougher to see

There was a bit of a buzz on Twitter last week regarding a race at Mohawk Park where it appeared the winner had gone inside several pylons in the second quarter and the discussion brought up an interesting question on whether or not the judges can even see it clearly during the running of the race.

The race in question - the 10th race on Tuesday June 30th - was won in impressive wire-to-to wire fashion by Bettor Joy A, driven by Ed Hensley (replay below).



You can easily see that Bettor Joy A runs over a couple of pylons when pacing around the opening turn. There is no violation there. The fun starts once the 7-year-old Somebeachsomewhere gelding straightens out to pace down the backstretch.

That's when it appears as though he goes inside several pylons as noted by bettor Ryan Willis with this tweet: "I'd really like to see the cameras from that race. General Joy looked to be all over the pylons through that first turn."

A tweeter that goes by the name of Mr. B concurred. "I bet him... but I agree 100% - I counted 8 consecutive."

DRF Harness editor Derick Giwner also chimed in: "He definitely hit them a few times and went way inside them a few more. I'm really not sure how that is legal. Guessing the Judges were napping. Wouldn't be the first time... won't be the last."

Reading all of this, I decided to watch the replay and it didn't take me long to conclude that Bettor Joy A had indeed drove inside a few pylons in a row as he was heading to the 1/2-mile pole. So why didn't the judges see it? Were they napping? Well, not exactly.

The definitive way to determine if there was a pylon violation that should have resulted in a disqualification was to watch the video moving it one frame at a time. When I did this exercise, I have to admit I was surprised to discover that Bettor Joy N had cleared every pylon on the backside and there was no violation.

So what's the problem then? How can several veteran race watchers come to the same conclusion watching the race video at full speed and be so wrong? The issue clearly is the white wheel discs passing the white pylons, which cause an optical illusion and/or just make it hard to tell one way or another. This happily turned out to be a case of no harm, no foul, but can we be certain the judges get it right every time when there are white wheel discs involved?

Thank you for providing me an opportunity to respond to the two articles you wrote about me, Danielle Henri.

1. Something is rotten at Yonkers

2. Kudos to Harmon, Auciello and Yonkers

You have recommended that the racing industry, "Should press pause on D Racing Stable Inc" to ensure that D Racing Stable Inc has no corporation financial connection to Rene Allard. I want to say that I am not engaging in some sort of illegal horse's ownership in the United States. I want to set the record straight as follows:

I am Danielle Henri, owner of Allard Racing Inc and D Racing Stable Inc. I am also the mother of Simon and Rene Allard. I have been involved in horse racing since 1976, with my husband, before Simon and Rene were even born. I have raced for over 40 years at many different tracks all throughout North America. I have had many different horses, with many different partners (and as sole owner), and employed several different trainers in both Canada and United States. I pay all my invoices relating to my horse racing business out of my corporate account. I am the only person on the account. I am the sole proprietor of both of my companies (Allard Racing Inc. & D Racing Inc.) That said, I have never had any issues with my license, never been denied, never been excluded, never even accused in any racing jurisdiction in any country. I have also been the elected mayor over 13 years, and then prefect of 10 city for 8 years and have been well respected, active and contributing member of society. Any suggestion of impropriety and dishonesty is an attack on my character and a blatant insult to me and my family. I appreciate the opportunity to respond in defense of my good name and character. Please excuse the grammar and punctuation errors as English is my second language.

In December of 2018, I set up "D Racing Stable, Inc.", at the time my plan was to employ some Canadian citizens to work

for me in the U.S. Nevertheless, when my son Rene was arrested as a result of complaint (not indictment), in order to continue racing my horses, on a suggestion of my attorney, I transferred the horses I decided to keep from ALLARD RACING INC. (sole owner/operator Danielle Henri) to D RACING STABLE INC. (Also solely owned/operated by Danielle Henri). Contrary to implications contained in the HRU article, I did not transfer ownership from Rene to me. I have always owned the horses in question, the only transfer was from my ALLARD RACING company to my D RACING company. The reason was simple, THE OPTICS. For the ownership on the race program to still say ALLARD RACING INC the public could easily assume that it was RENE ALLARD, so to AVOID any confusion, I transferred the horses to D RACING to remove the ALLARD name off of the program. ALL of the actions were done with full disclosure to the USTA and racetracks. I, Danielle Henri, am the sole owner of BOTH companies, they have the same FEDERAL TAX ID NUMBER, same BANK ACCOUNT, and all of it can be traced back to me, and ONLY ME. I provided all of my business documents to the racetracks and judges that asked to prove it was all above board and legitimate. They agreed.

Did your article somewhat intimidate some trainers that if they train or race horses for me, they may not be allowed to race at others racetracks? Did some horsemen put pressure on other racetracks and race offices to no longer let my horses' race since they read your articles? You should have talked to me before you wrote the first article. All my horse was tested for hair follicle at Monticello and no problem, now just need approve trainer. I have nothing to hide, it is totally my company with same ITNT number; Allard Racing Inc or D Racing Stable Inc belong to me 100%. Nothing changes.

I was elected as mayor and prefect from 1996 to 2017 and I never and will never lose my integrity. penalized and I have done nothing wrong. You can investigate on me; my book is open.

Large tracks and large fields the key to driving betting revenue

I would like to write a few guest columns for HRU as long as they will have me. What gives me the basis to write anything about harness racing? I'll get back to that question in a moment, but first let me lay out those involved that make up our business.

In no particular order, we have breeders, racetrack owners, trainers, drivers, horse owners, advanced deposit wagering sites and gamblers. Getting back to my basis, my partner and I have over 100 pacing broodmares and many of them are of very high caliber. We also have interest in several well-known stallions. As an owner of standardbreds, I presently have interest in over 250 head. On the gambling aspect, from 1996 until 2016 no one wagered more money on North American horse racing than the group I started. I feel with my diverse background and the number of years I've been involved, that I have something to offer the reader.

In blackjack, the professional player needs to measure (what I call) rules vs. conditions. Rules consist of splitting, double after splitting, re-splitting of aces, and so forth. Conditions consist of table limits, deck penetration, selective shuffling, bet spread tolerance, and so on. When considering what track to wager at, the bettor is faced with similar considerations. Rules consist of race distance, takeouts, carryovers, mandatory payouts and other items. Conditions consist of size and condition of track, field size, competitiveness of the field, and more.



In general, the larger the track the bigger the field size and the more competitive the race will be. This is the advantage large tracks have over small tracks. The larger the field the more combinations the bettor is given, and the more wagering the race should see. An 8-horse field will produce 56 exacta combinations, 366 trifecta and 1680 superfecta combinations. A 10-horse field will produce 90, 720 and 5040 exacta, trifecta and superfecta combinations, respectively. On occasion, we sometimes see a 12-horse race. This would produce 132 and 1320 exacta and trifecta combos, and a whopping 11,880 superfecta combinations.

If we ever want to be a self-funding sport we will need a much greater handle. Large tracks and large fields is the best way to accomplish this. I realize than most owners and trainers are against larger fields but these same owners and trainers are being subsidized by casinos (for the most part) that would like nothing better than to get rid of us. If we could pay more of the expense we would be more welcome.

Things tracks could do to increase field size in overnight races might be to pay every horse in the race a token to help offset some of the expense. Tracks could pay a bonus to any horse that wins from a difficult post position. Fine any horse that scratches and any horse that does not attract a minimum amount of dollars in the win pool. Trainers/owners who take up a spot in an overnight race and then scratch leave the racetrack with less betting combinations to sell.

On-track bettors need to be given a better deal. My thoughts would be an instant rebate on the ticket that they bet. Say someone goes to the window and bets \$30 to win and place, \$20 worth of exactas and \$15 worth of tri's = \$95. Right on the ticket it could read, amount wagered \$95, amount owed \$93. The more one wagers (depending on the pool) the greater the instant rebate. Tracks should encourage bettors to get a player's card where additional rebates could be accrued. Data is the new oil in business, and a player's card arms track management with all the data it needs to service and keep the players it has.

Tracks with high takeouts are just ripping off the bettor and creating a larger loss for themselves. Here is what a high takeout (Pennsylvania law allows a 35 per cent takeout on trifectas) does to the public. Say the track attracts \$100,000 in trifecta wagers in the first race, and that throughout the rest of the card no new money will be wagered. Also, the original \$100,000 will be re-bet on a 10-race card. After the first race the bettors are left with \$65,000. After two races the betting public will be left with \$42,250. After 5 races the betting public would have \$11,603 out of its original \$100,000. At the end of 10 races the betting public would have \$1346 and the track would have \$98,654.

There is so much more that could be written and I hope to have the opportunity to share my thoughts.











A trotting Horse of the Year has never sired a HOY

As strange as this may sound, never has a trotting Horse of the Year gone on to sire a Horse of the Year in the 72 years the award has been presented.

On the pacing side, it has happened seven times:

Bye Byrd (1959 HOY) sired 1976 HOY Keystone Ore

Albatross (1971-1972 HOY) sired three straight HOYs — 1979-1980 Niatross and then 1981 winner Fan Hanover.

Abercrombie (1978 HOY) sired 1992 HOY Artsplace

Cam Fella (1982-1983 winner) sired 1991 winner Precious Bunny and 1994 winner Cams Card Shark.

Niatross (1979-1980 winner) sired 1985 winner Nihilator.

Precious Bunny won it in 1991 and a decade later sired Bunny Lake the 2001 filly who took down year-end honors.

Rocknroll Hanover was the dominant winner in 2005 and then his first crop had the champion, 2010 HOY Rock N Roll Heaven.

As for trotters, not once has it happened.

Here's a look at the winners and their sire. For the first half dozen years, obviously there could not have been a sire who had already won the award and that would be significant since eight of the first 12 winners of the HOY were trotters.

1947 Victory Song sired by Volomite the 1929 Hambletonian runner-up.

1948 Rodney sired by Spencer Scott.

1950 Proximity was sired by Protector. Proximity raced from 1944-1950-which means that in her seventh and last season of competition, she was named HOY at age 8.

1951 Pronto Don was sired by Donald Truax.

1954 Stenographer was sired by Bill Gallon

1955-56 Scott Frost was the first back-to-back winner-and was sired by Hoot Mon, who was narrowly defeated 165-160 in year one of the HOY by Victory Song.

1958 Emilys Pride was sired by Stars Pride, who has the all-time record for trotting HOYs with five (1958, 1967-68-69 and 1975)

1962 Su Mac Lad was sired by Potomac Lad. Su Mac Lad raced from 1956-1965-and in his seventh year on the track in 1962, he was honored as HOY.

1963 Speedy Scot was sired by Speedster.

1967-68-69 Nevele Pride was sired by Stars Pride, who amazingly had eight Hambletonian winners as a stud, the all-time record

1970 Fresh Yankee was sired by Hickory Pride.

1974 Delmonica Hanover was a daughter of Speedy Count

1975 Savoir was the last Stars Pride to be named HOY, amazingly 17 years from the first (Emilys Pride in 1958)

1977 Green Speed a son of Speedy Rodney.

1984 Fancy Crown was a daughter of the trotting stallion that produced the most in progeny earnings: Speedy Crown. Because of his dominance as a stallion, people often mistakenly think Speedy Crown was a HOY. He was fourth in 1971, his Hambletonian-winning season, behind Albatross (141 votes), Steady Star (34 votes), Fresh Yankee with 8 and Speedy Crown with 4.

1987-88 Mack Lobell was the last male trotter to go back to back in the HOY balloting, he a son of Mystic Park, one of the pre-Hambletonian favorites in 1982 but who made a break on Hambletonian Day.

1995 C R Kay Suzie was a homebred daughter of Royal Troubador.

1996 Continentalvictory is the only son or daughter of Valley Victory to be so named. He would have been a HOY contender in 1989 but a virus stopped his season and career at 7-for-7.

1997 Malabar Man was a son of \$500,000 yearling Supergill. He did make over \$600G lifetime, but was never a HOY contender.

1998-1999 Moni Maker was the last horse on either gait to be a repeat winner. She a daughter of Speedy Crown, who passed away during her reign. Moni Maker was HOY for the first time in 1998-125-90 over Muscles Yankee, who later would sire the first unblemished HOY Muscle Hill in 2009.

2006 Glidemaster a son of the retired Yankee Glide. Glidemaster won the Triple Crown and HOY, the last time John Campbell was the regular driver on a HOY.

2007 Donato Hanover was a son of Andover Hall from his first crop.

2009 Muscle Hill dominated as the first undefeated (12-12) TROTTER ever to be so named. (Bee A Magician (17-17) to join in 2013). Sire Muscles Yankee, who became the second HOY runner-up to be a HOY sire, sired the Hambletonian winner three straight years (2008-2010).

2011 San Pail was a son of San Pellegrino. Pellegrino raced in the Self Possessed crop, and appeared in the 1998 Colonial world record 1:53.2 freshman Breeders Crown mark by C R Commando.

2012 Chapter Seven is a son of the third of four HOY runner-ups who have sired a HOY (Windsongs Legacy). In 2004, Windsongs Legacy won the Triple Crown and was edged out by Rainbow Blue for HOY 119-98. Chapter Seven's

son Gimpanzee, should he go on to be HOY in 2020, would be the first ever son of a HOY to do so

2013 Bee A Magician is a daughter of Kadabra, the fourth and final HOY runner-up (second to Real Desire 93 votes to 44) to be a sire of a HOY

2017 Hannelore Hanover is the last trotter honored as HOY. She is a daughter of Swan For All.

In summation, 24 different trotting sires for HOY, 20-of-73 HOYs were male trotters, 12 female trotters, 27 different trotters were named HOY.



Bradley and Bachrad lead long list of name-dedicated races

Harness racetrack public relations (PR) do the right thing when their biggest feature racing events are dedicated to the sport's human element, people come and gone. Those events have great value, even when the betting has little to no idea about the people for whom the races are memorializing.

Once in a while, racetracks applaud their own by naming and re-naming races after dedicated but not necessarily popular public figures within the industry, mostly as a remembrance of those who have passed. Industry people appreciate the memorials most and that is perfectly acceptable in our business as it is in any business. It is imperishable gratitude when the memories of such people are earmarked with a race and without regard to making another buck off of the act.

Those of us who have been employed in the industry were, for instance, touched and spurred by the renaming of a traditional summer stakes event after a contemporary—seasoned race-caller Sam McKee. I was personally pleased when the California harness community gave its greatest supporter, Alan Horowitz, a similar tribute. Without exception, I was delighted when Plainridge Racecourse initiated a special annual race named after Stanley Bergstein.

Many industry figures are already memorialized in the titles of state- and province-bred stakes races across North America. And believe me — because I have asked at racetracks everywhere over the decades — few to no fans and/or bettors have a clue about the namesakes.

Again, it is all right, it is not done to capture the praise of the public. It is for us. Yet, I do not understand why memorial races have not yet been awarded to certain people who were eminent contributors to the industry; especially a pair I knew and worked with and will always be grateful to for sharing their expertise.

John Bradley was the most generous of teachers. When I left broadcasting to work full time in harness racing journalism, John was my guide to the dramatics of yearling sales. I was his editor at TIMES: in harness magazine, where he wrote a bloodstock column and we spent many sleepless

nights covering major yearling sales and always making our deadlines.

John was recognized worldwide for his pedigree knowledge. Over the years he was a general manager of the Tattersalls Sale Company, a full-time consultant, market breeder and the author of "Modern Trotting Sire Lines" and "Modern Pacing Sire Lines," (Russell Meerdink Co) companion volumes still available and used as major bloodstock references.

For decades, I have asked, in print and in person, influential people in the industry, why is there not a John Bradley Memorial Trot? A score of replies about it being a great idea were noted but has never inspired such an event. Maybe I should have contacted those Russian breeding experts he knew well and visited to share his insight about the Orlov trotting line?

I won't forget my last conversation with John. He was in the final stages of cancer but he sounded bright and involved and in full command of his acumen for the details his subject ensconced. I missed him the moment we ended the call.

When TIMES: publisher David Dolezal made Marv Bachrad the senior editor of the publication, I was introduced to and worked closely with Marvin, who everyone in the business knew — except me. Most of the modern generation of harness racing journalists were at one time or another under the tutelage of Bachrad. As I worked with him, I realized he created the templates, so to speak, on how to write everything from press releases to race reviews to advertising copy. His students all became professionals and loved the guy who became one of the sport's most influential public relations forces. Regardless of our distinctively different backgrounds as writers, Marv and I got along famously when working as well as when socializing in the business.

After a few years he left the magazine, returning to his most comfortable role, as a public relations manager. He went to Dover Downs just as the Delaware track became one of the first "racinos" in the country. It was to be his final job. Last year, the inimitable Marvin Bachrad passed.

One thing I asked immediately after Marv died is something I ask again: Why is there not a Marv Bachrad Memorial? Two of the tracks he worked at for years — Brandywine and Liberty Bell — are gone, but Dover is still active and certainly owes Marv the gift of a namesake race run annually in remembrance.

Of course, there are many others deserving races named for them and it costs a track nothing to create them posthumously. It does not have to be a stakes, it could be any particular race at any track at all because no matter how large or faint a shadow an industry member did cast, a dedicated race to him or her punctuates the legacy of devotion to harness racing.

The strange case of Roger Yeahbut

We were driving 30 miles to a clinic for virus tests. We felt fine, but David's mother was 83 and recovering from heart surgery. For six weeks, I had not gotten beyond chatting with her through the screen door of her front porch.

I began the nonsense, "Some may say my previous gig as a part-time Lyft driver gave me an excellent opportunity to observe human behavior. Some may say that my riders were white rats in a lab experiment, and some may say my backseat was a cage designed by a psychologist."

I gave a small sniff and said, "We ain't gonna start rooting against horses. We love and admire them."

"And you should love them. Horses are assets, not adversaries," he said.

"What about money as motivation? After all, we are a betting game where handicappers are motivated to win money."

"That's true to a degree, and for an aging demographic share of the gambling market. However, wagering on horses is not as much fun, not as motivating, not as engaging as... people."

"You're saying we need to start disliking some drivers, trainers, and owners?"

"No, characters in those ranks are too far removed to grab and maintain animosity."

"Well, who else do we have?"

"You don't have them, but you need them."

"You lost me."

He asked, "What is between the horse race and the customer?

"The camera and microphone?"

"Yes, it is the only place to insert any semblance of conflict. I think everybody realizes presentations in your sport are a problem that ranges from bland nothingness to smooth and serious. Nowhere is there controversy and conflict. Your sport needs some faces and voices that excite people. More specifically, action with a protagonist. I know this concept sounds very strange, but if you want to climb the attention ladder, conflict is the gospel."

Turning off the exit ramp, I said, "I know a dude who would be perfect, a pal of mine from the Sore Elbow Tavern. His name is Roger Plunket. He's a fire hydrant of a guy in his 40s who wears a Yankee cap. He has squinty eyes that never look you in the face. Everyone calls him Roger Yeahbut, no matter what you say to him, he goes the opposite way, always interrupting you with, 'Yeah, but.' and then he is off and running with a hair-brained theory that he makes up as he goes along. Did you ever see a character like that?

"Every day."

"A scientist could discover a free, fast vaccine for Corona

tomorrow. Roger would go 'yeah but' and head to China, or some conspiracy downer, or anything he can think of to keep the floor for five minutes. It's weird, at first Roger annoyed the hell out of the boys at the bar, but for some reason, perhaps related to alcohol consumption, we get a big kick out of his nonsense."

"Put this contrary, argumentative guy in the announcer's booth with a foe, and it would be a start for eventually filling dead air with something useful. Does Roger know about harness racing?

"Nope, but not knowing much wouldn't handicap Roger. I once heard him interrupt a discussion of Bobby Fisher, the chess champion. Roger went on for a windy, self- assured five minutes about chess psychology without knowing a rook from a bishop."

David nodded. "We all think we are immune to the entrancing lure of conflict. Think again. The heart is never neutral."

"Who is going to fill THAT role? Actors? Do you expect the racetracks to hire people to be obnoxious?"

"Doubtful."

"Well then, who?"

"Clever, entrepreneurial, individuals could piggyback off racing and use something like Periscope, Vimeo, YouTubeLive, or Twitch."

"Twitch?"

"One of the streaming platforms for content. Anyone can have one, a gamer, an athlete, a chess player, a sports fan, a horse handicapper, or a poet. You could have one up and running next week."

I snorted, "Running to where? For who to watch?"

"Ah, that's the problem. Commanding attention and standing out. When you roll along and don't make waves, very little will happen."

"Like harness racing."

"Yes."

"How does this work for a Twitchy person."

"Perfect example. Blake Snell a baseball pitcher for the Tampa Bay Rays, he has a Twitch channel. Even though he is a famous athlete, not much happened, he was another pebble on the social media beach. In May, during the virus, he went on a Livestream rant, "Y'all gotta understand, man, for me to go, for me to take a pay cut is not happening, because the risk is through the roof, it's a shorter season, less pay. I gotta get my money. I'm not playing unless I get mine."

"Yeah, I heard about that, pretty harsh when people are reporting to soup kitchens."

"See, you're not a big-time social media person, but you

heard about this incident. You probably even watched a clip of his rant."

"I did."

"If someone had a harness racing stream of this sort and picked a huge perfecta ticket that one of his viewers wagered, or had a hilarious viral moment with a guest, or did something to stand out, they are off and running. Standing out is never easy, but intentional or accidental, it happens. If someone in the small racing sphere put up a channel and found a way to lure viewers, if they could pull some numbers with gamblers or racing fans, the product would be valuable. The audience and potential gamblers could skew younger. The great thing about a platform along these lines is that it doesn't take anything but time and effort to try."

"I said, "I might mention this to Roger Yeahbut, he lost his International Travel Agent job to the virus, he has some time to kill, and there are a lot of people he could aggravate."

David smiled, "I'd Livestream Roger to watch him pick horses and argue."

George Napolitano, Jr. wins eight at Pocono, sweeps features

After posting six winners Friday afternoon at Harrah's Philadelphia, driver George Napolitano Jr. went two better by triumphing eight times on Saturday afternoon (July 4) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, including taking both \$17,200 featured races and also guiding the two fastest winners on the card.

The features were separated in time only by a fifth of a second, but the "slower" mile was probably the more impressive – because it was posted by a trotter, the talented Explosive Matter mare **Pat Matters**, who took a new mark of 1:51.4, also the fastest trot mile of the year here. Napolitano made two speed moves with the winner of \$263,606 in setting fractions of :27, :55.3, and 1:23.3, who then showed determination to the wire in holding off 36-1 threat Stormy Kromer by a head. Nifty Norman saw his trainee notch her second straight triumph for the Patricia Stable.

In the top-level pace, Napolitano also made it two straight wins for **Turbo Hill**, whose 1:51.3 victory was his 16thin a 35-race career that has seen him amass \$215,745 for owner Tom Hill. There was an awful lot of front-end contention in a contest with such "moderate" fractions as :27,:55, and 1:22.4, but "George Nap" had the winning son of American Ideal racing in the pocket, and he used the Pocono Pike in order to go on to victory with the Jennifer Bongiorno-trained horse.

Fastest winner on the Pocono card was **Dealt A Winner**, an altered son of the recently-deceased Cam's Card Shark, who has had his share of the spotlight since all the way back to 2015, where he was the fastest sophomore of the year in 1:47.3, faster than Wiggle It Jiggleit. Five years later and now with a bankroll of \$1,326.724, Dealt A Winner can still put up fractions of :26.2, :54.2, and 1:21.3 then finish the mile out in 1:49.4, quickest of the year at Pocono while winning for Napolitano, trainer Mark Silva, and owner Jeffrey Snyder.

Also drawing attention was the Captaintreacherous

sophomore colt **Chief Mate**, who is undefeated in two seasonal starts and who now has a nice new mark of 1:50. Napolitano sent the fleet colt to the front just after the quarter and appeared to be on cruise control nearing the wire, marking him as perhaps a late-developing factor for stakes competition for trainer Tony Alagna and the partnership of Brittany Farms LLC, Marvin Katz, Brad Grant, and Captain Kirk Racing.

The Pocono players have developed the proper respect for George Napolitano Jr.'s abilities – he was favored in each of the octet of races he won. On the other hand, mid-card there were victories in successive races by **Bay Meadows** (\$51.40) and **Rock Three Times** (\$54.00).

'Tim Terrific' tallies twice in NJSS at Big M

The Meadowlands played host to four New Jersey Sire Stakes (NJSS) finals for 3-year-olds Friday night (July 3), and driver Tim Tetrick was on his game, grabbing two victories and a second on a night that saw him win four of the 13 races on the card.

Tetrick's twosome began with **Odds On Sarasota**, who won the \$160,000 filly pace in a lifetime-best 1:52.2 for trainer Ross Croghan. She returned \$3.80 to win in scoring for the fifth time in seven lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$131,200.

The daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven—Odds On Charmaine, who also won the first two NJSS legs to complete a

three-race sweep, followed live cover to get to the top at the half in :56. When even-money second choice Kelly's Champ went on a wild break scattering the field at the five-eighths, it was a walk in the park for the 4-5 public choice. At the wire, it was 4¾ lengths back to Thundra. Wynona Strided finished third.

"She's been steppy off and on at times," said Tetrick. "But tonight, she was really good and got the job done pretty impressively. [After making the lead] I was pretty sure they would be happy to follow me. I worked my way to the lead, and after that, she kind of coasted and drew away from them. Last week, she got a real easy trip [winning in 1:55] and I didn't have to use her. So I thought tonight she could wear them out."

The completion of Tetrick's NJSS double came in the \$160,000 Filly Trot, as the 38-year-old pilot guided **Ab'sattitudexpress** to a 1¾-length score over 7-5 favorite Dubai Princess in a lifetime-best 1:52.2. Common Sense S was third.

Tetrick, driving the Lucas Wallin trainee for the first time, had the 4-1 third choice in the wagering right where he wanted him: Tracking the public choice.

"Last week, my horse looked really impressive [winning in 1:52.4]," said Tetrick. "But it was going to be tough beating Dubai Princess. We got a great trip and my horse trotted well to the finish line."

Tetrick's formula for success was to sit a pocket trip and strike late.

"Lucas said I could do whatever I wanted," said Tetrick.
"That gave me a lot of options, so I got out of there and followed the favorite. That mare [Dubai Princess] came up a little off nearing the wire and run out a little bit, so I had to go up the inside. She shot right through there and we got our picture taken."

Ab'sattitudexpress, a daughter of

Trixton—Abbie's gotattitude, paid \$10.60 to win and now has four wins from six lifetime outings and earnings of \$111,000.

Tetrick's bid for a Sire Stakes triple was foiled by **Rockin The Aces**, who gunned down Tetrick and even-money public choice Rock Me Hard by a half-length in a lifetime-best 1:49.4 in the \$160,000 Colts and Geldings Pace. Rockin The Gates was third.

Rockin The Aces, driven by Brian Sears and trained by Robert Cleary, went a perfect second-over trip around the far turn, getting a perfect tow from the first-over favorite, before ducking inside late to record the score. The gelded son of Rock N Roll Heaven—Mattaroni won for the fourth time in

nine lifetime outings. His earnings stand at \$176,278.

Chalk players were no doubt nervous in the early going but Play Trix On Me lived up to his 1-9 post-time odds promise in taking the \$128,000 Colts and Geldings Trot.

"That's not what I expected," said winning trainer Toscano of her prized pupil's trip. "Last year, he was much the best in this division, so he was winning on the front end. It's important for him to go both ways. He is learning well."

Play Trix On Me, who is now a two-time NJSS champion, was pushed extremely wide into the first turn and had to take back to fifth at the quarter before driver Scott Zeron moved the son of Trixton—Lima Playmate to the outside at the three-eighths to start his march toward the leaders.

'Trix' was still 2½ lengths behind leader Toccoa Falls at three-quarters, but once straightened away in the stretch, it was no match, as Play Trix On Me stormed home to record a three-quarter-length win in 1:53.3. Jula Trix Treasure rallied for second with AP Hall Of Trix grabbing the show dough.

Play Trix On Me paid \$2.20 to win while winning for the seventh time in nine lifetime starts. His bankroll now stands at \$204.850.

A LITTLE MORE: The Meadowlands welcomed back fans into the track for the first time since the coronavirus shutdown, with the grandstand available to 25 per cent capacity. Many others watched and wagered on the races outdoors... Volatile weather, which saw lightning strikes close by, caused a lengthy delay before the third race, which made it necessary to move quickly from post parade to race for the rest of the night, causing handle numbers to suffer. The total wager of \$2,451,141 ended the Big M's streak of 15 straight racing programs with at least \$2.5 million in action... Freshmen fireworks in Ohio Sires Stakes at Northfield

Eight \$40,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) contests for freshman trotters of both genders kicked off the holiday weekend Friday (July 34) at Northfield Park. Harness racing fans got their first glimpse of Ohio's future stars with five divisions for fillies and three divisions for colts and geldings.

As expected, Randy Bendis' **Swizzle Hanover** captured the first division for fillies easily for Mike Wilder in 1:57.1.The daughter of Uncle Peter, out of the Chocolatier mare Seducedbychocolate, 3, 1:54.3M (\$174,558) left the gate as

the 5-2 choice and prevailed in the stretch over the determined 14-1 Incomeorexpenses (Tyler Smith) while 8-5 Celebrate With Me (Kurt Sugg) got up for third. The victory was the first for Swizzle Hanover who previously scored two winning qualifiers at The Meadows on June 11 and 25. She is a half-sister to North Express (by Muscle Massive) 4, 1:54.1f (\$61,573); Sweettooth Hanover (by Donato Hanover 2, 1:58.1f (\$48,367); and Sweet Tart Hanover (by Donato Hanover) 4, 1:57f (\$11,280).

In the second OHSS trotting filly division **More Spirit** (2-1) led from start to finish for driver Kurt Sugg and trainer Charlie Myrick. Bred by Dublin Valley Farm, the daughter of Southwind Spirit captured her first career start handily in 1:59.3, four lengths in front of 9-2 Magic Credit Card (Aaron Merriman), with Miss Meringue (Anthony MacDonald) third. Owned by the Second Chance Stable, More Spirit is the first foal out of the Credit Winner mare Amor Deo 5, 1:56.1f (\$86,730).

Herculisa lived up to her name as she posted an impressive 1:58.1 clocking in the third OHSS filly trotting division with Brett Miller at the controls. Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., the My MVP lass left the gate at 4-5 odds and once on top, never looked back. Owned by the Jesmeral Stable, Herculisa bested formidable rivals in 5-2 Merry Ann (Chris Page), who was second, and 2-1 Momma Knows Best (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) third. She is the second foal out of the Andover Hall mare Herculotte Hanover 3, 1:55.3 (\$16,869) and is a full sister to MVP L 2, 2:05.2 (\$19,770).

The heavily favored (3-5) **Chip It In** got up in the final strides for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., to best the hard trying 15-1 Trumpeter Swan (Brett Miller) to win the fourth OHSS trotting filly division in 1:58.2. Chris Beaver trains the daughter of Break The Bank K for Beaver, Meola, Robinson and RBH Ventures. Beaver's other trainee, 6-1 Ozma(Aaron Merriman) was a determined third. Chip It In is the seventh foal out of the Malabar Man mare Chippiesbrownsugar and is a full sister to Ms Bank Robber 2, 1:57.2f (\$72,223) and a half-sister to Justin On Broadway (by Broadway Hall) 4, 1:54 (\$89,926); and Teresa Tresa (by Andover Hall) 4, 1:59.1f (\$50,215).

A Doll Face looked every bit the part of her name as she cruised to a 1:59.4 victory in the final OHSS division for 2-year-old trotting fillies. Trainer Kayne Kauffman was in the sulky behind the 8-5 daughter of Dontyouforgetit who is owned by Doug Millard. Irish Princess, at 17-1, closed sharply for Aaron Merriman, while 35-1 My Jazz(Anthony MacDonald) trotted solidly to be third. A Doll Face is the second foal out of the unraced Muscle Massive mare Alliomi and is a

half-sister to A Fancy Face (by My MVP) 3, Q2:00f (\$15,075).

In the first of the three OHSS colt trotting divisions it was all **Spyder The Striker** (7-2) taking home first prize in 1:56.3 for driver Aaron Merriman. Trained and co-owned by Chris Beaver for C. Beaver, L. Fleming and Vip Internet, the son of Uncle Peter—Elana-San Pellegrino looked much the best after having scored two winning qualifiers—the first at Delaware and the second at Northfield prior to this test. **Admiral Allstar** (9-2) was second for Kurt Sugg, while 5-1 Replica Hanover was third for Tyler Smith. Spyder The Striker was bred by Wilbur Stoll and is the ninth foal out of his dam and is a half-brother to Kanthaka (by Triumphant Caviar) 3, 1:53.4f (\$417,242); High Blue (by Majestic Son) 9, 1:54.2 (\$304,074); Alacrity (by Pilgrims Taj) 4, 1:55 (\$232,573) and First Flower (by Angus Hall) 5, 1:58.1f (\$123,360), among others.

In the second OHSS trotting division for males, it was 3-5 **Shouldaknownbetter** (Chris Page), a Deep Chip gelding owned and trained Shane Arsenault, who made his second career victory in as many tries look effortless. Tango With Me(7-1) was second for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., while 21-1 Street Gossip put forth an impressive effort for trainer-driver Roger Hughes, Jr., to nab third-place money. Shouldaknownbetter — who qualified at Woodbine on June 12 and then trotted to 1:57 in his pari-mutuel debut — now has \$25,550 in career earnings. This fine youngster was bred by the Gbw breeding farms and is the fourth foal out of the Amigo Hall mare Lexis Electra 5, 1:59h (\$86,195), and is a half-brother to TT's D-Jay (by Dejarmbro) 6, 1:54.3 (\$98,447) and Urs Ifu Want It (by Uncle Peter) 2,Q, 2:04.3s (\$15,674).

Perron proved to be much the best as the 6-5 favorite for driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., in the final OHSS division for trotting colts and geldings, stopping the timer in 1:58.4. The son of My MVP is trained by Chris Beaver for Steve Stewart, Paul Kelly Racing, Black Creek Farm and V. Wagler and was making his pari-mutuel debut. Panzano got up to be second for Brett Miller with 5-2 Fire Cross third for Kayne Kauffman. Perron is the first foal out of the Credit Winner mare Long Island Tea 4, 1:54.3s (\$112,714).

Ohio Sires Stakes action continues Saturday night, July 4 at Scioto Downs with one division for 3-year-old pacing fillies.

Springbridge Duel offers a little redemption in Gold victory

There is an alchemy involved in teaching a yearling how to be a racehorse — the top tier of the Ontario Sires Stakes

(OSS) is, after all, the Gold Series — and last winter trainer Casie Coleman Herlihy though it might actually take supernatural power to transform **Springbridge Duel** into a racehorse.

As a result, it felt like a bit of a miracle when the 2-year-old pacing gelding captured one of the season opening Gold Series divisions at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday night (July 3) with an impressive 1:51.3 victory, six and one-quarter lengths ahead of Magnum Moon and Twin B Heart Throb.

"He was a terrible horse to break. I think it took two to three weeks before we even got a jog cart on this horse. I literally had to geld him before we hooked him in a jog cart. I had a horse whisperer work with the horse. He was nuts, he was just absolutely insane," said the trainer. "He's got to be the worst horse, or very close up to the worst horse, we've ever broke and I definitely said to myself, over and over again, 'What the hell was I thinking?'"

Coleman Herlihy's typical selection process during yearling buying season is rigorous. She studies pedigrees, she visits farms, she looks at horses repeatedly, but on the final day of the Harrisburg Yearling Sale last November she realised she had not filled her quota of Ontario Sired horses.

"I love the Ontario Sires Stakes program, but I was focussing more on Betting Line's and I simply didn't have very many Ontario Sired, so I was literally doing last minute shopping, which I never do," said Coleman Herlihy, with emphasis on the never. "I was looking at every Ontario Sired horse there was basically, and seeing him — he's a gorgeous colt, he's big, good looking, perfect conformation, he's gorgeous — I ended up buying him."

The trainer would question her last minute purchase repeatedly through the winter as her Florida-based team of second trainer Ray Domenico, caretaker Evelyn Harms and driver Steve Condren wrestled with Springbridge Duel, trying to channel his raw talent into a usable form.

"If they weren't as patient with him he could have been ruined very, very easy. Even myself, I owned him and trained him, and I was ready to just say I'm done, give up, sell him, move him or whatever," said Coleman Herlihy, who shares ownership of the colt with her partners in the West Wins Stable of Cambridge, Steve Heimbecker of Conestogo, ON and Mark Kantrowitz of Delray Beach, FL. "And saying that, he's always showed the speed. He has a great gait on him and he's wicked, wicked fast, but it took a long time to get him there and we just had to be so, so careful with him. He's a ton better than what he was, but it was a tough winter, for sure, breaking that colt."

Once the son of Big Jim and Stonebridge Damsel returned to Ontario second trainer Mark McKinnon and caretaker Kayla Chappell took up the task of keeping Springbridge Duel on an even keel and on June 20 Bob McClure piloted him in a 2-year-old qualifier. The colt finished second and returned to Woodbine Mohawk Park for a second qualifier on June 27, which he won by 16 lengths. On Friday, knowing nothing of his winter-time struggles, fans at the Milton oval sent him off as the favourite in the second \$105,600 division.

Starting from Post 6, McClure floated Springbridge Duel off the gate, but many of his peers had the same idea and a there was a crowd around pacesetter Dietrich Seelster as he reached the :28.1 opening quarter. Stuck on the outside, McClure put Springbridge Duel on the front before the :56.1 half and the gelding had opened up a two-length lead by the 1:24.4 three-quarters. Without urging, the pacer rolled home in :26.4 to claim his first victory.

"All I told Bob, in the qualifiers and that, all I ever said was, 'He likes to be first on the gate and then just take him off. Do not leave with him, do not move with him, just sit him in a hole and keep him calm, keep him relaxed, because as soon as somebody leaves with him you're never going to take him back again, he's going to get nuts," said the Cambridge resident. "The way that he was tonight, it's not like he blasted off the wings, he was floating, looking for a spot and he couldn't find a spot, and so I really don't think that's going to stir him up any more than he already is. I did not want him on the front, but he looked like he was pretty calm and relaxed and Bob had him under control.

"When I saw Bob stop, and he was still checked up and Kayla wasn't there yet, I was like, 'Oh God', and I couldn't believe how good he was. He actually was very, very good," she said of the gelding's winner's circle behaviour. "Like I said, his manners are getting so much better no doubt, but I've got his very first video on my phone still from where he ended up laying on the ground."

Springbridge Duel will now begin preparations for the second Gold Series Leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park on July 18. He will be joined by the first division winner, **Desperate Man**, who was equally impressive for driver Trevor Henry, trainer Kathy Cecchin and her co-owners John Cecchin and Nicole and Paul Davies of Arthur, ON.

Starting from Post 2 in the first \$104,800 division, Desperate Man got away fourth as Vino Louie charged out to a :26.2 opening quarter. Henry edged the fan favourite off the rail just after the :55.4 half and was putting the pressure on Vino Louie by the 1:24.4 three-quarters. The Shadow Play

son unleashed a :26.3 last quarter to claim the 1:51.4 victory, two and three-quarter lengths ahead of Twin B Fighter and Next Big Thing.

"He is probably the nicest 2-year-old I have sat behind. Very smart and professional," said Henry. "I'm so glad for John and Kathy and their kids. It's really well deserved."

Sophomore pacing colts square off in stakes action at Hoosier

The Hoosier state's top 3-year-old pacing colts were on display at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Friday (July 3) as three \$24,000 divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes were featured on the evening's 14-race card. It was a good night at the office for driver Michael Oosting who doubled up in the stakes action.

Oosting steered the fastest divisional winner of the night as **Island Of The Sea** used a front-stepping effort to score his third straight victory, tonight in 1:49.3. The 1:49.3 clocking equaled an established best as the sophomore colt remains undefeated in three starts at Hoosier Park this season.

Island of the Sea was eased off the gate through the opening panel in :26.4 and settled along the rail in fourth. As soon as the field straightened away down the backside, Oosting gave his mount the green light and he quickly ranged up to take command. Island Of The Sea cruised through fractions of :55.3 and 1:23.1.

Using a :26.2 final panel, Island Of The Sea was able to hold off a late surge from the defending divisional champion Odds On Osiris with Peter Wrenn. Odds On Osiris was forced to settle for second while The Candyman Can and Sam Widger utilized a ground saving trip to get up for third. Sent off as the 3-5 favorite, Island Of The Sea returned \$3.20 to win.

Trained by Shane Bowermaster, Island Of The Sea recorded his third win from four seasonal starts. The gelded son of Always A Virgin—Trinity Island pushed his lifetime earnings to \$48,000 for his owners Eric and Lisa Ell.

Oosting scored his second stakes win with trainer Tom Simmon's **Frontier Rollo**, who captured his first Indiana Sires Stakes victory with an impressive 1:50.2 score in the final division. Frontier Rollo utilized a pocket trip to record his fourth straight victory this season. With a :26.2 final quarter, Frontier Rollo came out on top after a very tight photo with Frankiepark and Ricky Macomber Jr.

Rollo has now won five of 13 lifetime starts. The 1:50.2 clocking also established a new lifetime best for the son of Time To Roll—Incredible Dodger.

Caribbean Escape turned in a gritty performance to deliver as the heavy favorite in the second split of the stakes action with driver John DeLong in the bike. Sent off at odds of 9-5, DeLong let Caribbean Escape settle off the gate along the rail in fifth. DeLong brushed Caribbean Escape to the front down the backside reaching command just before the three-quarter clocking in 1:23.1. As the field began to close in on the leader, Caribbean Escape dug in gamely late in the late to fend off all challenges and get the win by a length in 1:50.

Trained by K. Dean Glispie, Caribbean Escape recorded his first win of the season and second lifetime victory from eight starts. Owned in partnership by K. Dean Glispie, Barbara Schlagetter, and Gail Potter, the son of Bring On The Beach-Caribbean pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$28,892.

Trotting fillies sparkle in Gold Series opener

Ontario's most talented 3-year-old trotting fillies took a star turn on TSN's Racing Night Live at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Thursday and **Princesspartypants** opened the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series season with an impressive come-from-behind victory in the first \$73,067 division.

Starting from Post 8, trainer/driver Roger Mayotte opted to ease Princesspartypants down to the rail in eighth as Shape Shifter sprinted out to an early lead. Heading for the :27.2 opening quarter the dynamics of the race changed when fan favorite Wine Rack Hanover made a break while sitting third, spreading out the fillies in her wake. Mayotte and Princesspartypants had narrowed the gap and were six lengths back when Massive Flirt reached the :56.4 half and they soon caught cover from Susies Lady, following that filly through the 1:26.3 three-quarters. Turning for home Mayotte gave Princesspartypants a clear look at the wire and the Muscle Mass filly shifted into high gear, powering home to a two and one-half length victory in a personal best 1:54.4. Shape Shifter stayed game for second and Yen closed well for third.

"From the outside post and first (OSS) start, we just decided to play that route and it worked out. She's very versatile that way," said Mayotte. "I was following her (Susies Lady) there and she was throwing quite a bit of dirt up at my filly and my filly just wasn't real smooth, because the dirt

was hitting her and it was obviously bothering her, stinging her. As soon as I tipped off her back she just smoothed right out, just changed gears."

Mayotte trains Princesspartypants for Just In Time Stable of Mississauga, R A W Equine Inc. of Burlington and Big Als Stables Inc. of Woodbridge, ON. Thursday's victory was the filly's first in two sophomore starts and marked her first-ever visit to the Gold Series winner's circle. At two she won a division of the Grassroots season opener before making the leap up to the Gold Series, finishing just shy of the point tally required for a post season berth.

The second division saw freshman point leader **Warrawee Vicky** make her return to the Gold Series winner's circle. Lining up at Post 6, driver Doug McNair sent the fan favourite straight to the front and the duo never had to glance back, cruising through fractions of :28, :57.2 and 1:26.2 on their way to a 1:54.2 victory. Kombucha stalked Warrawee Vicky from start to finish and earned the runner-up's spoils while Mayotte and Modern Mass closed well to be third.

"She seems to be good right now, we've got to do a little fine tuning to keep her straight," said trainer Scott McEneny, referring to the filly's middle of the racetrack finish. "But you know, she's got such good gate speed that she gets spotted pretty good."

McEneny noted that a combination of mental maturity and newly configured equipment are helping keep the Royalty For Life daughter on an even keel and allowing McNair to better use her tactical speed.

"If you'd have rolled her out of there last year, you'd just be a passenger going to the half," he said. "That's her biggest thing, you've got to be able to manage her."

Brad Grant owns Warrawee Vicky, who also had one preprace under belt heading into the Gold Series season opener.

GP Dreamin wrapped up the Gold Series season opener with the quickest mile of the three divisions. Starting from Post 5 driver Jody Jamieson put the Cornaro Dasolo miss on the front and rang up a :27.4 quarter. With pressure coming from PL Notsonice Jamieson let the fan favourite roll to a :56.1 half and a 1:24 three-quarters and had opened up to a five length lead by the top of the stretch. Although Jamieson took his foot off the gas late, her peers could not catch GP Dreamin and she hit the wire five and three-quarter lengths the best in 1:53.3. PL Notsonice stayed game for second and Magic Cape rounded out the top three.

"Jared (Bothwell) has done a great job. She's real mean and cantankerous in the barn and he deals with her and keeps

her as happy as he possibly can so she can perform like she did tonight," said Moffat resident Jamieson. "She was monster kid tonight, really."

Jared Bothwell trains GP Dreamin for Carolyn Polillo. Thursday's start was the filly's third of the season and she boasts a flawless record of consecutively faster wins. As a 2-year-old GP Dreamin won a Grassroots leg and made one Gold Series start before her season was cut short by sickness.

The 3-year-old trotting fillies will make their second Gold Series start on July 26 at Rideau Carleton Raceway in Ottawa.

Sophomore trotting colts shine at Hoosier

A talented group of 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings were in the spotlight at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino in the opening round of Indiana Sires Stakes action on Thursday (July 3). Two \$31,500 divisions were featured on the evening's 14-race card and the heavy betting favorites delivered to win their respective divisions.

Emma Town Bud and Michael Oosting turned in an impressive effort to capture the opening division in 1:53.2 for trainer Byron Hooley. Employing an eye-popping :25.3 final quarter, Emma Town Bud powered home to get the win by a length over the pacesetting Swan In Motion and Ricky Macomber Jr.

Leaving from post five, Emma Town Bud left just enough to grab a pocket seat behind Swan In Motion who left alertly for early position. Swan In Motion led the field through fractions of :27.2, :58.1, and 1:27.2 before ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field. As the field turned for home, Oosting timed his attack and when Emma Town Bud tipped from the pocket, he sprinted for home. Swan In Motion trotted strong to the wire to finish second while Dude Included and John DeLong were third. Emma Town Bud returned \$4.00 to win.

With the win, Emma Town Bud is now undefeated in three starts this season. The 1:53.2 final clocking equaled his established lifetime best. The son of Big Stick Lindy—Centerfold Lady is owned by Summit Pacing Acres and has now amassed \$152,081 in lifetime purse earnings.

After an uncharacteristic break in his first start of the season, TJ's Top Pick rebounded gamely to take the second division of the stakes action with driver Trace Tetrick in the

bike. Scoring in 1:53.2, TJ's Top Pick made good on his 1-9 favoritism and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Leaving from post three in the abbreviated field of six, Tetrick wasted no time and sent his mount to the front. TJ's Top Pick strolled through fractions of :28.1, :57.3 and 1:26 before he began to distance himself from the rest of the field. Turning from home with a three length advantage, TJ's Top Pick cruised home in :27.2 to finish under a hand drive from Tetrick. Flagman and Rick Plano benefitted from a pocket trip and trotted evenly to finish second while Speed Ball Swagger with LeWayne Miller rounded out the trifecta. As the heavy betting favorite, TJ's Top Pick returned \$2.20 at the betting windows.

Trained by Jeff Cullipher, TJ's Top Pick scored the first win of his 3-year-old campaign from two starts. With the win, the son of Swan For All-A J's Ayd improved his lifetime bankroll to \$319,291 for owners Pollack Racing LLC, Jeff Cullipher, and Trace Tetrick.

The Meadows temporarily suspends onsite wagering

The Meadows Casino Racetrack Hotel ("The Meadows") announced Friday (July 3) that onsite race wagering has been temporarily suspended. Live racing at the 5/8 mile harness track will continue as scheduled, though access to the racetrack and racing operations will be prohibited to the public. Live harness racing is currently scheduled to run on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, all 12:45 p.m. start times. The casino remain open Sundays—Thursday 8 a.m. to 4 a.m. and Fridays and Saturdays 8 a.m. to 5 a.m., closing each night to disinfect and sanitize the property.

"It is with an abundance of caution that we are suspending onsite race wagering and prohibiting spectators at live races," said Tony Frabbiele, vice-president and general manager of The Meadows. "We will continue to work with the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association and the state horse racing commission to maintain the safest conditions so that we may host live races on the racetrack, as currently scheduled."

While patrons are temporarily unable to place race wagers at The Meadows, fans are encouraged to play online at **Xpressbet.com** or **Hollywoodraces.com**. Additionally, live races may be viewed at **meadowsgaming.com**.

The property continues to operate under enhanced safety protocols:

- · Capacity on the gaming floor is limited to no more than 50 per cent of maximum occupancy.

Shartin N at Philly today in one of three \$20,000 fast-class events

Harrah's Philadelphia will be playing host to one of its strongest non-stakes cards in quite some time this afternoon



(July 5), with three \$20,000 events for the fast-class older horses set to go, topped by an appearance from the 2019 Harness Horse of the Year. Shartin N.

Now seven, Shartin N is a New Zealand import by Tintin In America, and she certainly has been a ruthless force at the very top of the older pacing female ranks in North America the last two years. She has won 43 of her 58 lifetime starts, and she has bankrolled \$2,153,030, the vast majority of it for present owners Richard Poillucci, Jo Ann Looney-King, and Tim Tetrick LLC. She is the fastest pacing mare of all-time by virtue of a 1:46.4 victory at The Meadowlands last year, and she also holds her division's track record at Philly, 1:48.

Shartin N has been assigned the outside post in the field of eight – but she has shown he can handle tough starting assignments in the past. In fact, she showed that fact as recently as this past Tuesday, where she won from the eight post at Yonkers despite a grueling trip. Co-owner Tim Tetrick will again be guiding the champion for trainer Jim King Jr., the husband of another co-owner.

Shartin N's race will be race 10 on the 14-race card. The first of the three \$20,000 events, a handicap event for older male pacers in race three, will also find the favorite starting from post eight. His name is Dorsoduro Hanover, a Somebeachsomewhere 5-year-old gelding who has earned over \$1.6 million, most of that during his 3-year-old season, when he was named the top 3-year-old pacing colt in North America. Yannick Gingras is listed to drive for trainer Ron Burke, with major opposition expected from the consistent Highalator and Shake That House, making his 2020 debut after a top campaign as a sophomore last year.

The sixth race high-class trot finds a Canadian import, Run Director, accorded early favoritism. A son of Kadabra, Run Director comes to Philly from Woodbine Mohawk Park, where he has been triumphant in two of three seasonal races, including a 1:52.2 mile in his last start. To be driven by David Miller for trainer Andrew Harris, Run Director at his best would be right there with Eurobond, Muscle M Up, and other top contenders.

Today's card at Philly Sunday is so good that Western Joe and Rock The Devil, both of whom have won in sub-1:50 this year, are part of the undercard.

Post time for the first event is set for 12:40 p.m.

PA All-Stars start Monday at Pocono

The 2020 stakes season kicks into high gear starting Monday afternoon (July 6) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, with three nine-horse divisions of 2-year-old trotting colts getting their first taste of fast-class action in \$30,000 sections of the group's Pennsylvania All-Stars racing.

The barn of Marcus Melander, voted the 2019 Trainer of the Year after sending out Greenshoe, Gimpanzee, and a seemingly-endless line of quality stakes trotters, will be harnessing the favorites in two of the divisions. In race seven, Melander actually has the two favorites in the morning line, with the Father Patrick—Tanya's Dance colt Incentive given a slight edge off a 1:57.2 Meadowlands victory as he starts from post three for driver Brian Sears; In Range, the Bar Hopping—Ilia colt who finished second to Incentive in his first lifetime start, will try to turn the tables on his barnmate from post one for driver Tim Tetrick.

The race 10 favorite will be another horse for Marcus Melander and sire Father Patrick, Bidensky (dam Southern Senorita), who will start from post six with Marcus's younger brother Mattias slated for sulky duty. Bidensky was second after setting the pace in a very fast 1:55.2 Meadowlands mile in his last start, two lengths behind Southwind Tyrion; his primary competition may come from another son of Father Patrick, Glacier Hanover (dam Global Desire), a \$470,000 yearling who showed improvement between his first and second start.

In race nine, Father Patrick's sensational sire success early in his career gets reaffirmed by the appointing of another one of his sons, Ethics, as the morning line favorite. Out of the dam Speak To Me, Ethics was just outsprinted at the end of a 1:57 qualifier at The Meadowlands last time out. Tim Tetrick will be driving for trainer Per Engblom; the youngster will face the difficulty of starting from post eight in his purse bow.

Monday will give the local bettors their first chance to see these 2-year-old trotting colts; many of them will be back here Aug. 23 for a leg of their Sire Stakes event, and then the best of the group will gather on Saturday afternoon, Sept. 5 for their Sire Stakes Championship on a \$1.2 million Championship day for the various divisions of 2-year-olds at The Downs.

Rule change proposal

The purpose of my post is to ask for support in a USTA rule change. 2020 has been a very challenging year for harness racing. The COVID-19 epidemic, as well as the federal investigation into the integrity of racing, has put a significant strain on harness racing. At times like these, we should acknowledge and encourage the owners that are persevering and improve the environment for new owners to get involved. Are we doing all we can to protect the small-time owners? My proposed rule change is just one needed remedy to start a process of change.

I am a small-time owner, trainer, breeder, and (terrible) driver. Over the last 10 years, I have often felt as if the deck was stacked against me. From the obvious gas trainers that our industry has actively protected and heralded; the appearance of an inner society that is allowed special privileges, has often made me feel as if I was racing for 2nd or 3rd money at best. PT Barnum said a sucker is born every day, and like a fool, I keep returning. Not because I like to be cheated, but because I love the sport and the challenge of racing standardbreds. A rule change will not fix all the issues we face, but I think this rule will add a level of fairness and transparency that will alleviate one frustration in ownership. My rule change targets the new electronic draw system. How many of us, and how many times have you heard people complaining about drawing strings of outside post positions? When the draw was done from the pill shaker, you had the option of going to the draw to witness the process. The new system is computer driven and, in cases, executed from the laptop of the race secretary at whatever time is convenient.

A few years ago, I submitted a similar rule change that was rejected. Rules 14.06 through 14.09 are designed to ensure the integrity of the entry process. I appreciate that "Entry Box" is defined as a secure process, no longer a physical box that accommodates our exceptional online entry tools. Rule 14.09 calls for a horseman as a witness, but the industry is switching to a ship-in model with random draw times based on finding enough entries, and there are often issues getting horsemen witnesses. I would also guess that most tracks have moved to the electronic random draw system provided

by the USTA. In researching the electronic draw system, I found that there was no oversight or auditing capability available, and no mechanism to report whether the draw was manipulated, or horses handicapped to specific posts. Questions arise as to how many times was the draw executed? Was it re-executed to accomplish a preferred order of the operator? Where any of the horses handicapped in the race to pre-select which posts they would race from? These are all valid concerns, that are remedied by rule 14.09 if the draw is an old fashioned pill draw with a horseman's witness. The remedy is to create a rule that drives the USTA to modify the electronic draw system to allow transparent auditing of the draw transactions. Auditing is a simple and common mechanism built into almost all software-driven business processes. Here is rule 14.09:

14.09 Opening of Entry Box and Drawing of Horses. At all USTA member tracks the entry box shall be opened by the presiding judge at the advertised time and the presiding judge will be responsible to see that at least one horseman or an official representative of the horsemen is present. No owner or agent for a horse with an entry in the box shall be denied the privilege of being present. Under the supervision of the presiding judge all entries shall be listed, the eligibility verified, preference ascertained, starters selected and post positions drawn. If it is necessary to reopen any race public announcement shall be made at least twice and the box reopened to a definite time.

My proposal for a new 14.09 & 14.09a:

14.09 Opening of Entry Box and Drawing of Horses for manual draws. At all USTA member tracks the entry box shall be opened by the presiding judge at the advertised time and the presiding judge will be responsible to see that at least one horseman or an official representative of the horsemen is present. No owner or agent for a horse with an entry in the box shall be denied the privilege of being present. Under the supervision of the presiding judge all entries shall be listed, the eligibility verified, preference ascertained, starters selected and post positions drawn by a manual witnessed process or via a USTA approved electronic process. If it is necessary to reopen any race public announcement shall be made at least twice and the box reopened to a definite time. Draw processes executed via a USTA approved random draw USTA approved

1409a USTA Approved electronic process guidelines. To achieve approval, the system must use a random number generator. The system must record the entries and time of entry, the number of times the race was drawn, the reasons for the re-draw(s), the handicapping assignments for the race, and the number of times in total the member track drew for the race date. The system should report the audit to the USTA or member tracks entries report for publication with the entries sheet.

This change is a communication to our owners, and

potential owners, that we are striving to bring integrity back to harness racing. Wouldn't it be reassuring to see a note at the bottom of the draw that state, "Drawn 1 time, no posts handicapped"; "drawn 2 times (entry missed and added), no posts handicapped"; or "Drawn 1 time, posts 7-9 handicapped". The purpose of the member track draw count is to assure that if ten events all reported one draw, that the race office totaled ten uses of the draw system that day, and no races/draws were manipulated in a different manner. Why let the suspicion of corrupt post draws affect our ownership experience.

A friendly tuck

While I am very happy to have harness racing back after a long, long hiatus, I see some things have returned to the old norm quite quickly.

I was watching a race the other evening at Yonkers, where a prohibitive favorite drew the dreaded 8 post. I will not say what race or the horse because it's not really relevant to my point.

Into the first turn and heading to the quarter the 8 was on the outside in about fourth or fifth. Now what was the driver going to do, brush to the lead or become parked the mile? However the decision was made for him by the 2 horse, fourth along the rail very conveniently eased back and allowed the 8 a very comfortable tuck.

Coming to the half mile the 8 popped first over and ground his way along till he collared the leader on the final turn and eased away down the lane for a comfortable win. What would have been the result if the 8 had to brush to the lead going to the quarter? Would he been able to cruise to a nice comfy win? We will never know.

I see that there was over \$106,000 bet on the race. Was this friendly act for the benefit of the bettors? Were all horses in the race to win? What on God Green Earth was the driver of the 2 doing allowing the 8 to tuck? Usually less than \$600,000 is bet on the whole Yonkers card with 9 races. It made me take a second look.

I believe I had read somewhere in the past that this situation was mentioned by Mr. Gural. He was going to talk to drivers and possibly fine them for doing so.

Just my thoughts, I shall go back to my corner.
