Stable success helping Millar heal from double lung transplant horror story

Millar Farms homebreds have been on a roll since racing resumed in Ontario in June. Three-year-old gelded pacer **Powertrain** clocked a 1:49.3 mile at Woodbine Mohawk Park in his second lifetime start on June 28, 2-year-old pacing filly **Prohibition Legal** won an Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series division on July 2, freshman pacing colt **Betterhavemymoney** followed suit one day later, and 2-year-old pacing filly Silver Label captured a Grassroots division on June 6, drawing driver James MacDonald to Georgian Downs for a single drive.

"It's a little surreal so I'm kind of pinching myself a little bit and just enjoying it," said owner/breeder George Millar. "I said to (my trainer) Nick (Gallucci), 'It's kind of strange this week because we were all pretty excited.' The whole farm was pumped about Powertrain last week. To have a colt go sub-1:50 his second lifetime start, you kind of think this is what we'd be all focussing on this week, but it was like hardly anybody is talking about him because the 2-year-olds are racing so well."

The early season success has had extra meaning for the entire Millar Farms team because 2021 started out on an appalling note for its owner. The Stouffville, ON resident, who is in his 71st year, had a double lung transplant in February that resulted in a 13-week stay in hospital and a rehab program that is ongoing.

"It was like a horror show, I had a double lung transplant and found out a day later the lungs they gave me had COVID. So instead of being in the hospital for two weeks I wound up being in the hospital for 13 weeks and lost 35 pounds. I had to learn how to walk all over again," said Millar. 'George needs a break this year so let's race good for him.' So that's what's happening."

Millar and Gallucci selected two trotting fillies out of the London Virtual Yearling Sale last fall, but they have been delayed due to some fractious behaviour in the paddock, so all of the youngsters currently tearing up Ontario racetracks are homebreds, some of them third generation products of Millar's breeding program.

"I pick the breedings out and then you're there when they all get broke, so it's kind of like you're there from start to finish.

It's a nice feeling. And a lot of these babies I have I raced their dams, I raced their great dams, I raced their great-great dams," said Millar. "Prohibition Legal is out of a daughter of Little Black Book, who was kind of my foundation broodmare, and we had a good time with Catch A Wish racing, too. She's produced me two or three in 1:50, so she's just a good mare. Serious Matter is still around, she's walking the field. They call her grandma. She's not having foals anymore but when Steven weans the babies she goes out and looks after them."

The Little Black Book line is being carried on in 2021 by freshman pacing filly Prohibition Legal (Big Jim–Catch A Wish) and 2-year-old pacing gelding Silk Road Smash (Bettors Delight–Chocolate Truffle). Two-year-old pacing gelding My Blueberry Buck (Thinking Out Loud–Mind Over Matter) is a great-grandson of Serious Matter. Three-year-old pacing fillies Cyclone Sister (Shadow Play–Riveting) and Cantstoplying (Sunshine Beach–Musical Voyage) are great-granddaughters of J Bs Elizabeth and Betterhavemymoney (Betterthancheddar–Whosluckierthanme) is a great-grandson of Natchitoches.

"You know the funny thing is, that Betterhavemymoney colt, I was going to cull his dam," said Millar. "She was marked in the book to cull after she foaled out this year and I liked him so much in January I told Steve Samis, my broodmare farm manager, I said, 'Stevie, I changed my mind. I like this colt, I think we'll breed her back to Betterthancheddar,' and I'm so glad I did now."

Newer members of the broodmare band are also starting to have an impact. Shadow Play son Powertrain is the first foal from Mmillion Blue Chip, a daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven and Molly Can Do It that Millar acquired for \$100,000 at the 2013 Lexington Selected Sale. The mare did not find success on the racetrack, but her owner hopes she has found her groove as a broodmare. Powertrain is two-for-two and makes his OSS debut in the second 3-year-old pacing colt Grassroots division at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday (July 10).

"I bought a lot of mares, like really well-bred mares, over the last three or four years and a lot of them didn't turn out too well on the racetrack, expect for Bestseller Hanover, so a lot of them are already in the broodmare band," said Millar. "Their first babies are being dropped on the ground this summer, they've already had them on the ground, and more will drop next year, so I'm looking forward to seeing what they're going to produce."

Gallucci and his team will break seven yearlings this fall and there are 11 foals on the ground. Millar enjoys getting in the jog cart behind the young horses and is working hard on his rehab program to make sure he does not miss a mile behind the 2020 and 2021 foal crops.

"Last week I went up and jogged one, but when they did the surgery, they kind of split you right open you know, they did some nerve damage to my left arm. My right arm is great, but

I don't have the strength in my left arm and the horse kind of bolted sideways like it was going to go in the infield and when I went to pull on the left line I would have liked to have a little bit more strength there, so I think I've got to do a little bit more exercise before I go back," said Millar. "But guaranteed I'll be sitting behind my yearlings in September and jogging them on the farm. That's what I like to do."

In the meantime, Millar is enjoying watching his racehorses compete and the babies frolic in the fields with their mothers.

"After spending that much time staring at hospital walls, it's so nice to be back at the farm, and be around the horses," said Millar. "It's getting busy around here now which is nice. And I have all my grandchildren here swimming in the pool right now, so actually life couldn't get better."

Communication must be paramount in Yonkers tote malfunction

An oddity occurred this past Tuesday (July 6) at Yonkers Raceway where the night's fourth race resulted in a no contest. Though an out of character event, it's still one where its implications must be taken with extreme seriousness.

Having not seen the events live and not having replay availability (more on that below), going solely by the race chart it appears that Hitman Hill left from post 4 and then yielded to an oncoming Branquinho who left from post 7 and cleared past the quarter pole. In a seemingly innocent enough race, Branquinho led the rest of the way easily for the two-length win while Keystone Komodo chased to be second. Hitman Hill backed away from the pocket to finish a well beaten third.

What ensued from there was a series of communication breakdowns.

Following the completion of the race, graphics showed simply the order of finish for the top four horses for at least 10 minutes, but without the hint as to an inquiry or what may have been causing the delay in the race to go official. After that, it was announced that the race was a no contest. Showing a race off-time at 8:24 p.m., the track issued a tweet over an hour later at 9:43 p.m. stating "Tonight's fourth race was declared a no contest due to a tote malfunction in the stop betting that caused wagering to be open during the race."

There's a lot to unpack in that statement. For starters, it shows irrefutably the potential for wagering to continue even as a live race has begun. Though it seems that there's been ample anecdotal evidence through the years to support it, any suggestions of "open windows" (continuing to be able to bet after a race has started) have been typically treated as conspiracy theories.

So, what actually happened in the case of Yonkers tote malfunction? No one knows. Was it simply a matter of human error? Was it some form of a technical malfunction? Was it something more nefarious? The public, and particularly those who had wagered on the race and even more-so those who would have cashed otherwise, deserve a more detailed explanation than the tweet.

It's critical in being able to know with certainty what happened at Yonkers because surely this is not the first time in the history of racing that such an event has occurred. And the track owes it to the public and to their customers to let them know not only what happened but how that is going to be prevented again in the future.

Adding to the confusion is not being able to piece together the scope of impact by the tote malfunction. Almost every race replay begins from a few seconds before the start of the race through the end of it. For this race, the replay made available only shows the closing stages of the race. Because of this, you can see the "final" closing odds, but you can't see the odds of what the horses were at the start of the race, presumably before any in-race changes occurred.

I was able to take screenshots that night of the Pick-3 and Pick-4 will-pays leading up to that race and based on those, the #4 Hitman Hill was slightly favored in both pools over #7 Branquinho. But who knows unless you saw it live and remembered it if Hitman Hill was still favored as the race started. All we know is that according to the graphics in the homestretch Branquinho was 3-5 and Hitman Hill was 3-2. In the post-race graphics, the winner Branquinho was priced even shorter at 1-2 while third-place finisher Hitman Hill drifted slightly to 8-5.

When trying to obtain additional information for this column, the track was not able to comment on the matter at this time and the judges forwarded me to the New York State Gaming Commission.

Meadowlands Pace eliminations

This weekend is highlighted on the racing front with two eliminations for the Meadowlands Pace. With 14 entrants, there are two eliminations Saturday (July 10) where the top five of seven horses in each \$50,000 elimination will come back for next weekend's final.

FIRST ELIMINATION RACE 6

ONE EIGHT HUNDRED has proven himself to be the real deal and credit to Takter for managing the maturation of this one since last year. After impressively sprinting up the inside two back to beat South Beach Star, his race last week against older conditioned foes was even faster when he established a new life mark of 1:48 flat including a :25.3 kicker at the end. He's not unbeatable by any means, but he is a deserving elimination favorite. ROCKYROAD HANOVER hasn't been able to get the best of One Eight Hundred yet this year, but he does come off a race where if not for a ticky-tack disqualification he would have been given due credit for beating Perfect Sting. HEART OF CHEWBACCA gets a big-time driver change to Brennan. Noble was first listed down to drive when entries were first taken and I'm not sure if Brennan replaces him due to that drive in the Messenger elimination, but at any rate a return to early speed may be coming. CHARLIE MAY gave an excellent account of himself when running second to American Courage in his Messenger elimination and final. CHASE H HANOVER loomed for a moment first-over into American Courage; playable longshot. EXPLOIT posted a 1:48.1 mile four back.

Picks: One Eight Hundred, Chase H Hanover, Rockyroad Hanover

SECOND ELIMINATION RACE 8

AMERICAN COURAGE passed his Messenger test with flying colors and now gets a shot on the big track. When I spoke to trainer Alexander a couple weeks ago in advance of the Messenger eliminations, not only was he adamant about how good his colt was, but that he was going to open even more eyes once on the mile track. This is his shot! Two-year-old champion PERFECT STING went a 1:48.1 mile two back but then for all intents and purposes was defeated last out at The Meadows off a :55.1 half mile. He'll be tested here for sure. SOUTHWIND GENRY was charted with interference last out attributed to Rockyroad Hanover, though it's tough to say if it materially impacted him. He was a dominant winner three back at Philly in a race that included One Eight Hundred; would have to think Yannick will be pushing forward early. ABUCKABETT HANOVER was beaten last out at Yonkers before the break but that was a nightmare trip from post 8 anyway; gets a rematch with #1 on more level footing.

Be My Baby Now and Sea Silk impress in \$150,000 Next Generation events

Ownership group takes pair of 2-year-old events.

Owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli, Knox Services and Hatfield Stables had a great couple of nights last weekend in the Next Generation events at Eldorado Scioto Downs. The veteran ownership group won a pair of \$150,000 events for Ohio bred 2-year-old fillies with trotter **Be My Baby Now** and pacer **Sea Silk**.

In Friday's (July 2) inaugural filly trotting test, the What The Hill–Baby Bella filly made her first career start a winning won with a length-and-a-half score in 1:57.4.

Driver Chris Page sat patiently in fourth through much of the race, sending the winner three-wide in the final turn to outsprint Reichers Caviar (Aaron Merriman) and Moments Created (Kurt Sugg) to the wire.



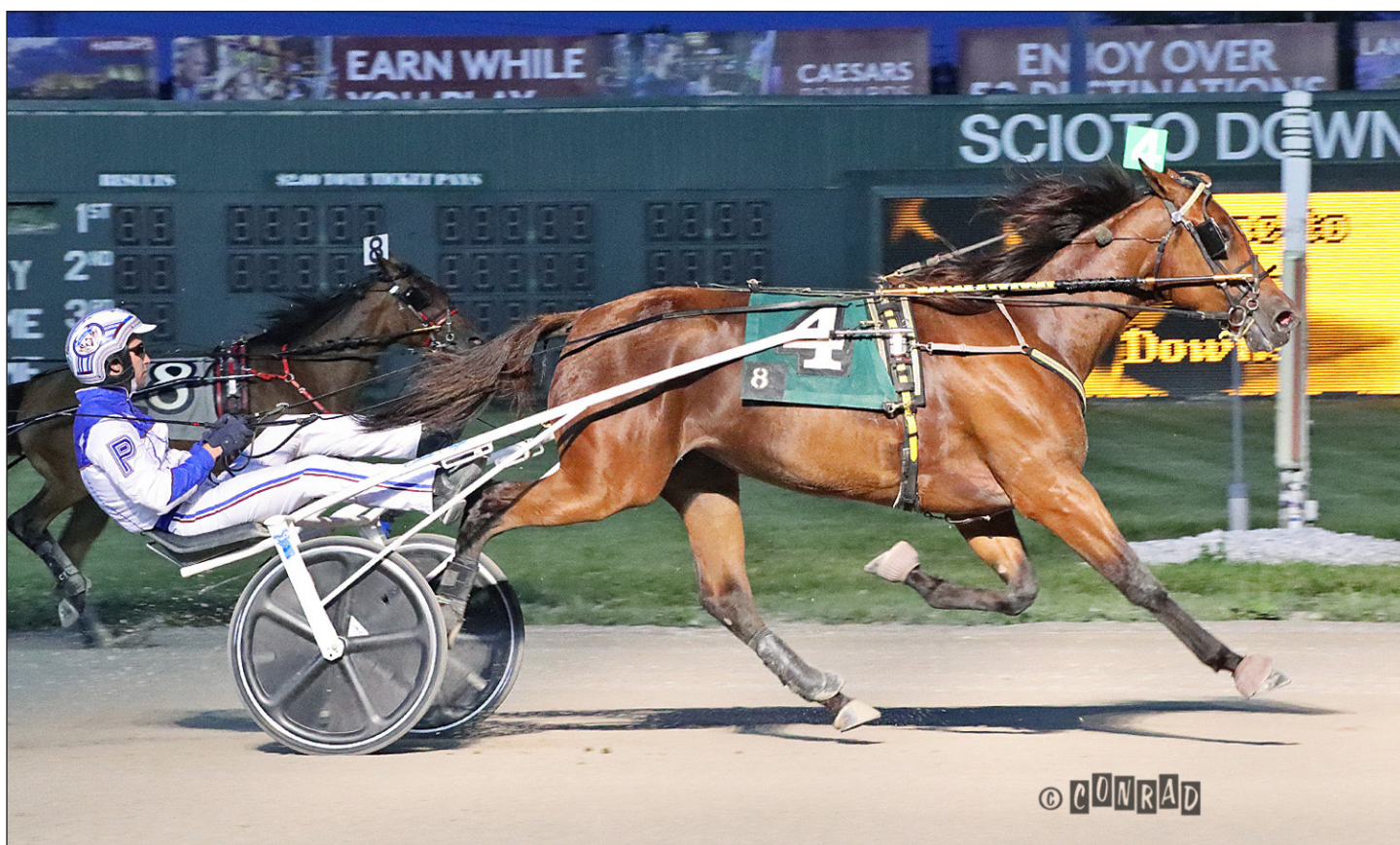
“Be My Baby Now didn’t seem as impressive as Sea Silk but I think that’s her style,” said co-owner Mark Weaver. “She’s all business and will do whatever Chris asks of her, nothing less and nothing more.”

On Saturday night (July 3), the pacers took center stage and Sea Silk had the Eldorado Scioto Downs fans buzzing with her 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ length romp and 1:51.3 track record effort in the filly pace.

Page once again eased his mount off the gates wings, taking the lead before the three-quarter mile station and drew off from Secret Side Place (Trevor Smith) and the pace-setting Dragon’s Revenge (Dan Noble). She paced her final quarter in :27.3 to secure her first win.

The Downbytheseaside–Silk Purse lass was made the bettor’s top choice after a pair of qualifying wins at The Meadows – both miles were timed in 1:58.3.

“Sea Silk really impressed me,” said Weaver. “I can’t remember a more impressive debut.”

Be My Baby Now (Chris Page) won last Friday's (July 2) \$150,000 Next Generation event for Ohio-bred 2-year-old trotting fillies in her first career start.

"We have another filly, Seaside Park, that was better than her all along but she got hurt. So, knowing we were going in with our 'B' team I was a little worried. We may have to reevaluate our rankings."

Nine of the 10 money-earners in the pace events were by Downbytheseaside or Fear The Dragon, both first year Ohio stallions.

The Next Generation required a \$10,000 nomination fee paid on March 15 to claim a spot in the nine-horse fields.

"The Next Generation was just the cherry on top. It is such a unique race with the purse so big for being so early in their careers," said Weaver.

Ironically, both Burke Brigade Next Generation champions were \$47,000 yearling purchases at the 2020 Ohio Select Sale – Be My Baby Now from the Stephanie Smith-Rothtaug consignment and Sea Silk from the Steiner Stock Farm offerings.

"Maybe next year we'll just start opening the bids at \$47,000," joked Weaver.

Be My Baby Now and Sea Silk will not have much time to rest as the first leg of the Ohio Sire Stakes (OHSS) will be held this weekend.

The trotters will return to Eldorado Scioto Downs tonight (July 9), while the pacers will head to MGM Northfield Park's "Flying Turns" on Saturday (July 10).

Trainer Ron Burke will send out 25 freshmen into OHSS action over the two nights – nine on Friday and 16 Saturday evening.

"As for the other ones in the sire stakes, at this point they're hard to separate. For the most part we went with our best in the Next Gen but there are some that were very close," said Weaver. "We have a very deep group this year. Almost all of them we felt were worthy of going in the sire stakes in the initial leg rather than the Buckeye (Stallion Series)."

Weaver is not only high on his chances this weekend; he is also very high on the future of Ohio racing.

"The Ohio program doesn't take a backseat to anyone. We have quite a few Ohio bred that we're very excited about and most will be in action this weekend. With the new stallions in the state, it wouldn't surprise me to see Ohio bred as players in the Grand Circuit races."

You make the call

The Meadowlands-sponsored race announcers workshop started in the 1990s and even though it's gone through some changes over time, two things remain the same: its popularity and Ken Warkentin.

Saturday morning (July 10), Warkentin, the voice of The Big M, will once again share his trade secrets with a bunch of eager wannabes.

"My first thought was, I don't expect there to be much interest, I always think that, and then [Matt Zuccarello] gets 15 people," said Warkentin.

Zuccarello attended the workshop in 2017 and when it wasn't planned the following year, he took it upon himself to help organize it in 2019.

"I decided as a fan and amateur driver that I wanted to continue this and, hopefully, we'll be able to do it for many more years," said Zuccarello. "This is the second one that I've been in charge of coordinating in the past three years."

The organizers are fortunate enough to have 15 qualifiers on Saturday, but if they end up with more participants than races, all of the names will go into a hat and the lucky ones will get to call over the public address system.

Ken Warkentin, the voice of the Meadowlands, will again play host to an announcer's workshop on Saturday morning (July 10) at The Big M.

The prospect of calling a race at the top track in the sport is exciting to all attendees, many of whom have practiced doing it.

"I've been around the game since the early '70s," said Robert Jolly. "I used to call the races on my way to Roosevelt and Yonkers."

Casey Moore, who'll be driving down from central New York, heard about the workshop on The Meadowlands simulcast show.

"I've always had a passion for sports broadcasting," said Moore. "Often finding myself muting the races and calling them on the fly, so any opportunity to hone my skills with a living legend, is one I simply cannot pass up."

Robert Pugliese, who lives a few miles from The Meadowlands, decided to attend after reading about it in the Paulick Report.

"I have been a horse racing fan since I was a teenager," said Pugliese. "As a kid, I remember watching the Kentucky Derby on TV and mimicking Dave Johnson's 'and down the stretch they come' call every year. I thought it would be fun to learn what goes into calling a race and maybe trying it myself."

New Jersey resident Bob Fidanza owns horses with Zuccarello, who told him about the workshop.

"I enjoy all aspects of the racing game and meeting others who share that interest," said Fidanza.

For horseman Michael Hinkley, calling a race is on his bucket list.

"I owned and trained in the 80s and always enjoyed all the race callers, so I thought it would be fun to see and learn from one of the best," said Hinkley.

Chris Daggett became a harness fan in the early '90s when his parents were part owners of a few horses.

"So, growing up, I remember announcers like John Bothe, of course Ken Warkentin, Roger Huston and even the Meadowlands racing secretary Scotty Warren, when he used to announce at Rosecroft," said Daggett. "I've always loved to pretend to call races whether I was at the track or recalling old races with friends. Never thought I'd have a chance to actually give it a shot, so I jumped at the opportunity and I'm blessed to be bringing my dad [Dave] with me as well."

Teacher Andrew Blasenak will be up early driving in from Havertown, PA, west of Philadelphia.

"I'm interested in doing the workshop because I really love the sport of harness racing and I have a strong theatrical background," said

Blasenak. "I got a taste of calling a race three years ago on a hot, hot Fourth of July at the Saratoga Harness track. I had to [recreate] the race to my parents (who ducked indoors to obstructed-view seats in the air-conditioned bar area), and it helped me key into the race and every moment of the action as I told them what was going on, so I thought it might be fun to try it at The Big M."

Thomas Kearney, from Silver Spring, MD might win for longest drive at just under 3½ hours.

"I heard about this workshop through social media after I was hired as the track announcer at Shenandoah Downs in Virginia," said Kearney. "I had filled in for Pete Medhurst at Rosecroft Raceway in 2017, so I figured this workshop could serve as a refresher for calling harness races, which I last did in 2017."

Even though Zuccarello has done the workshop before and has called a few qualifiers, he still looks forward to his next chance to call.

"It's one of my dream jobs," he said. "I've been announcing since I was a little kid [maybe seven or eight years old]. I found a couple of the cassettes recently."

Since the workshop starts at 8 a.m., it'll be a long day for Warkentin, but that's fine with him because he enjoys giving the class a look behind the curtain.

"It introduces people to the other side of how we process racing," said Warkentin. "That's what we do, we process racing. We're telling people what happened. The bottom line about this is, it's just a fun time and the money goes to charity."

All workshop attendees pay a \$25 participation fee, which is donated to the Harness Horse Youth Foundation and even though no one actually believes that attending one workshop or possibly calling one race would lead to a job offer, it's certainly a start and you never know what the future holds.

"I told them to bring their enthusiasm and a check and we'll go from there," said Zuccarello.

What's that expression? \$25 and a dream.

All you need to know for the Meadowlands Pace

The 45th edition of the signature event at harness racing's top venue is upon us as the \$700,000 (est.) Meadowlands Pace, an open event for 3-year-olds, gets underway this Saturday (July 10) with a pair of \$50,000 eliminations (see fields below).

The Pace final, which is slated for July 17, serves as the centerpiece for "The Greatest Night in Harness Racing." With COVID-19 protocols now in the rearview mirror (although unvaccinated patrons must wear a mask), fans will undoubtedly pack the house, but for those who cannot make it out to the track, there will be a live two-hour telecast on Fox Sports 2, that not only will feature The Pace, but three other major stakes as well.

Perfect Sting ready for Meadowlands Pace eliminations

After a perfect 10-for-10 campaign in 2020 that led to Dan Patch Award honors as the 2-year-old Pacing Colt of the Year, expectations were high that Perfect Sting would return this year and keep a firm hold atop the 3-year-old division.

After a bit of a bumpy start in his first three starts in 2021, the road to repeat glory for Perfect Sting likely will have to begin on Saturday night (July 10) when the colt lines up in post five in the second of two, seven-horse \$50,000 eliminations (race eight) of the Meadowlands Pace at The Meadowlands.

"It's time to start asserting his dominance, that's for sure," said trainer Joe Holloway. "I think it's time for him to step up his game and move to the head of the class."

The task won't be easy for Perfect Sting as his heat includes recent Messenger Stake winner American Courage (four-for-four this year), 2020 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champion Southwind Gendry (two wins and two seconds this year), and Abuckabett Hanover, who saw his perfect four-race win streak this year snapped when he made a break in the Messenger final.

"We're in a good spot in a short field," said driver David Miller about Perfect Sting, who is listed as the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the Pace elim. "I don't see any problems and I think things will work out."

"I have confidence in him. I have confidence in his ability and his talent and I'm confident everything is going to go just fine."

Any perceived pressure of the continuance of Perfect Sting's perfect record evaporated quickly this year when the colt suffered his first-ever defeat in his season's debut in a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) division on May 16 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. In that race, Perfect Sting came up a head short of the winning Abuckabett Hanover in 1:50.

"I don't worry about (a win streak)," said Miller. "I try to put him in position to win every race. Going undefeated, that's added

pressure and added anxiety on yourself, and you end up racing the horse too hard trying to keep the winning streak alive. I don't want that. I don't even like that being brought up. I already know he's a good horse and I know he gives 110 per cent."

When 3-year-old opens didn't fill at The Meadowlands, it forced the hand of trainer Joe Holloway to enter Perfect Sting in a June 19 overnight against older horses. Challenged several times throughout the mile, Perfect Sting was able to post a game career-best 1:48.1 victory.

Seven days later in a PASS division at The Meadows, Perfect Sting led at every call before crossing the wire second, but the colt was elevated to first via disqualification of the winner.

"I believe (the race against older horses) took a toll on him," said Miller. "He went to The Meadows the next week and he still finished second. It wasn't like he stopped and finished fifth. He got beat a length. The horse had every right. I'm not disappointed in him at all, I think he's a great horse."

Holloway said he plans on making a shoeing change for the Pace elim, switching to an aluminum shoe.

"I had a shoe with a pad on and I thought the shoe was kind of moving around on his foot," said Holloway, who trains the \$629,977-winning 3-year-old son of Always B Miki out of the world champion mare Shebestingin for breeders-owners Brittany Farms and Val D'Or Farms. "I thought going lighter with aluminum would give the horse stability. It had nothing to do with speed, I just thought it was better for him."

The top-five finishers in each elim will return for the \$700,000 (est.) Meadowlands Pace final on Saturday (July 17).

The 9-5 favorite in the first elim (race six) is the Nancy Takter-trained, Tim Tetrick-driven One Eight Hundred, who has six wins in eight starts this year. The \$800,000 yearling purchase of Takter and Brixton Medical Inc. is coming into the elim off a career-best 1:48 win in a June 26 overnight at The Meadowlands. Closing out that victory with a final quarter of :25.3, the effort edged South Beach Star and Perfect Sting's 1:48.1 clocking as the fastest mile by a 3-year-old pacer thus far in 2021.

Önas Prince wins “Swedish Hambletonian”

The \$232,000 Sprintermästaren for 4-year-olds was held in Halmstad, Sweden on Thursday night. The mile race, which sometimes is referred to as “The Swedish Hambletonian”, was preceded by three elimination heats in which all saw wire-to-wire winners in **Önas Prince**, **Rome Pays Off** and **Hell Bent For Am**.

The latter horse had best luck in the draw and trainer Sabine Kagebrandt picked post 1 for her Muscle Hill son. Önas Prince started from post 2 and Rome Pays Off from number 3. Two horses previously trained by Marcus Melander (Hell Bent For Am and Rome Pays Off) were in great position ahead of the race but it was the third elimination winner, Önas Prince, who had the best form when the final was on.

Trainer and driver Per Nordström has never experienced a better period in his professional life than this season. Week after week he collects big trophies in races in Sweden and his Chocolatier

son Önas Prince is, according to Nordström himself, the best horse he has trained.

Hell Bent For Am kept the lead from post 1 and Önas Prince got a pretty relaxed first over trip while Rome Pays Of followed in second over.

Nordström drove a perfect race with his Önas Prince. He saved some power outside the leader and put in the extra gear when Hell Bent For Am was beaten in the last turn. At that point, Rome Pays Of attacked from second over, but Robert Bergh's horse couldn't get seriously close to Önas Prince who sprinted to safe win in 1:52.2.

Big part of the field of chasers behind the top duo went off stride in the last turn, which resulted in bronze medal for strong finisher Maestreaemon.

Önas Prince has 15 wins out of 20 starts so far in his career and the Chocolatier son can look back at a 2021 where he is undefeated in seven attempts.

Fifty Cent Piece wins \$162,000 Stosprintern

The 4-year-old mares fought in elimination heats of the Stosprintern in Halmstad on June 28 and 10 trotters were gathered behind the car on Thursday night (July 8) when the \$162,000 final was on the race card.

American-bred **Fifty Cent Piece** (Muscle Hill—Thatsnotmyname) topped the entire Harrisburg yearling sale in 2018 with a bid of \$500,000 and owner SRF Stable opted to ship the mare overseas after the 3-year-old season. Trainer Robert Bergh was most pleased to land both Fifty Cent Piece and Rome Pays Of in his barn.

In the Stosprintern final, Bergh had to be satisfied with his position first over because Fifty Cent Piece has proven to be one of the toughest 4-year-old mares racing in Europe this year.

The mare can't race in the biggest stakes races in Sweden during the season, but both the \$232,000 Drottningpokalen and \$162,000 Stosprintern are open for horses born outside of Sweden, as long as the owners have staked the horses.

Fifty Cent Piece has been outstanding in her two big races for the year. She claimed the Drottningpokalen at Åby in May and a position outside the leader didn't stop her from grabbing another trophy in Halmstad on Thursday night.

Bergh noted that his horses was in total control mid-stretch and Fifty Cent Piece came home in a 1:55 mile.

Betting Pacer finished strongly as the runner up after a pocket trip and leader Hilarious Am finished third.

New owner remembers dad with 'Chuck'

When he was growing up, Justin Bolasci spent a lot of time going to the races with his father. Starting at the age of somewhere around 3, he would accompany him regularly on trips to The Meadowlands, and whenever his dad cashed a ticket, young Justin got to keep any \$1 bills returned with the winnings.

"I rooted for him to win every race," Bolasci said with a laugh. "He loved the ponies. He loved to bet on the horses, he loved the sport. As a little kid growing up, I loved it too."

Bolasci's father always wanted to own a horse, but never did. After his dad passed away two years ago, Bolasci decided he would get involved in harness racing as an owner as a tribute to him and fulfill that dream. In 2020, he partnered with trainer John McDermott to become co-owner of four horses, and he has added five more this year.

Among that group is a 2-year-old male pacer competing tonight (July 9) in one of three eliminations of the MGM Springfield Stakes at Yonkers Raceway. The horse is Hurrikane Chuck, named in memory of Bolasci's dad.

"I'm excited," Bolasci said. "I'm sure he's watching."

Hurrikane Chuck, by Huntsville out of All The Buzz, has raced twice this season. He finished fourth in a division of the Tompkins-Geers Stakes in his debut at The Meadowlands on

New York



June 19 and won a division of the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) at Buffalo Raceway on June 30.

The colt is the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the third of the three \$25,000 Springfield eliminations. The first two finishers in each elimination, plus the two third-place finishers with the fastest individual times in each elimination, return for the final on July 16.

"He's a great boy," said Bolasci, who shares ownership of Hurrikane Chuck with Jonathan Klee Racing, William Garofalo, and Peter Kleinhans. "He had a great race the other day and we're excited to watch him develop."

Hurrikane Chuck was purchased under the name Bandera Buzz for \$21,000 at the Goshen Yearling Sale. In addition to the NYSS and Springfield, the colt is eligible to the Kindergarten Classic Series.

"Next year, I have him staked a little heavier," McDermott said. "We're very happy with him so far, he's a very nice horse. He loves his job. He's good gaited and everything, but he just never has a bad day. He goes out and does it every day and is as pleasant as can be."

Bolasci, a 36-year-old New Jersey resident who still lives near The Meadowlands, didn't get to see his horses in person as often as he would have liked last year because of the COVID-19 pandemic but is thoroughly enjoying his experience as an owner.

"When one of the horses wins, there is no feeling like it," he said.

Hurrikane Chuck will start the Springfield elimination from post four with driver Tyler Buter. His elim features two other horses coming off pari-mutuel wins, Paula Wellwood-trained Wolfrax and Ron Burke's River Ness. Wolfrax, the 5-2 second choice from post one, captured a conditioned race while River Ness, 7-2 from post eight, won the Tompkins-Geers division that included Hurrikane Chuck.

The 5-2 morning-line favorite in the first elimination is Travis Alexander's Pleaseletmeknow, who debuted with a second-place finish in a NYSS division. The 5-2 choice in the second elim is Stretch The Line, who is coming off a Landmark Stakes triumph for Erv Miller.

DeLong records 3,000th driving victory

Driver John DeLong recorded the 3,000th win of his driving career after he piloted Parklane Terror to victory in a conditioned pace at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Wednesday (July 7). The 1:52.1 victory marked the third win of the season for the 3-year-old gelded son of Western Terror and a career milestone for the 32-year-old Wisconsin native.

DeLong came into the 13-race card at Hoosier Park on Wednesday just two wins away from his milestone. He also found the winner's circle with Cindy The Great for trainer Roger Welch on the card before reaching 3,000. DeLong's family and friends were in the winner's circle to congratulate and acknowledge his accomplishment.

DeLong started his driving career on the Illinois fair circuit in 2005 and won his first driving title at Running Aces in 2008. Now at the age of 32, DeLong has over \$27 million in career purse earnings. DeLong posted his first million dollar season in 2013 and has gone over the million dollar mark in purse earnings every season since. He has finished amongst top five of the leading driver standings at Harrah's Hoosier Park for the last six seasons. DeLong is currently second on the 2021 leading driver standings at Hoosier Park with 98 trips to the winner's circle and over \$1 million in purse earnings. Trace Tetrack leads all drivers with 153 victories.

Also featured on the evening's 13-race card were two divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes for the 3-year-old trotting fillies. After an uncharacteristic break in an overnight last week, **Swift Swanda** returned to her winning ways to take the first \$47,000 division in 1:54.2. With regular pilot Trace Tetrack at the controls, Swift Swanda

went to the front and held off a late charge from the pocket sitting Dewtiful's Grace and Verlin Yoder to get the victory.

Trained by Erv Miller, the daughter of Swan For All—Cheetah Hall recorded her fourth win from five seasonal starts. Owned in partnership by Anthony Lombardi and The Kales Company LLC, Swift Swanda pushed her lifetime purse earnings to \$317,637.

In the second division of the stakes action, **Guccio's Lady** and Michael Oosting pulled the 8-1 upset to get up in the final strides of the mile to score in 1:55.2 over a track rated sloppy. Trained and owned by Melvin Schmucker, Guccio's Lady scored her second win of the season and established a new lifetime best. The daughter of Guccio—After Midnight recorded her third lifetime victory from 20 starts and pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$66,326 with the win.

A Girl That Twirls, April Angel 'share' Buffalo track record

The 2-year-old filly pacers in the second \$50,400 division of the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) learned a couple of valuable lessons at Buffalo Raceway on Wednesday night (July 7) that sharing is a good thing.

A Girl That Twirls (Chris Lems) and **April Angel** (Jim Morrill Jr.) finished in a dead heat for the victory and the tandem also had to share a new track record in doing so as they toured the half mile oval in 1:55.2 over the fast track. It eclipsed the old mark of 1:55.3 established on July 3, 2019 by Fashion Hall (Tyler Buter).

In the other division, **Twenty Grand** (\$2.80) showed she was worth more than that in beating Symphony Hall by three quarter lengths in 1:56.4.

But the talk of the night was the deadlock between A Girl That Twirls (American Ideal—Heels On The Beach) and April Angel (American Ideal—Royal Distraction).

"(A Girl That Twirls) raced phenomenal, especially being on the outside going around the final turn," driver Chris Lems said. "She just kept digging in."

Jim Morrill Jr., who was on the bike behind April Angel (\$3.60) said, "I didn't realize it was a track record or a dead heat. I thought maybe (A Girl That Twirls) would bobble a little bit in the stretch to give us an edge but she kept coming and my horse came back a bit in the end."

A Girl That Twirls (\$5.60), who entered undefeated in two qualifiers, is owned by D Racing Stable and is trained by Deborah Daguet.

April Angel is co-owned by Nanticoke Racing Inc., Jeremy Pentoney and Keesha Givens. and is conditioned by Les Givens. It was her first triumph after a second place finish in her career debut.

In the other bracket, **Twenty Grand** (Mark MacDonald), after setting the tempo, had to rally and was able to turn back Symphony Girl (Morrill Jr.) and Lorrie Sue (Kevin Cummings).

"(Twenty Grand is) green so I was glad to see that five (Lorrie Sue) come up alongside and grab her attention," said MacDonald.

Bargain trotting filly strikes Gold in OSS debut

Two-year-old trotting fillies got their star turn at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Tuesday (July 6) and Adare Castle and Elegant Mermaid emerged victorious in their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series debut.

In the first \$101,400 division, fans liked the look of **Adare Castle's** qualifying results — one win and one second — and sent her off as their top choice. The Muscle Mass daughter and driver Bob McClure of Rockwood, ON left well from Post 4 and had established command before the :29 opening quarter. They cruised along on the front end through a 1:00.1 half and 1:30 three-quarters and then kicked home to a four and three-quarter length win in 1:57.4. HP Felicity finished second and Needa Little Magic was third ([replay here: Adare Castle](#)).

"The first day we hooked her she laid down in the mud, so I wasn't overly impressed that day, but after that things were pretty good. She was a little spooky all winter, but she settled down and once we started coming to Mohawk training she got better and better and better," said trainer Mark Etsell. "The first time I qualified her, I mean she had showed speed before, but at home, you know, and then I turned her loose a bit that day and she come home in :27.3 and I said, 'Hmm maybe we've got something here.' So then Bobby qualified her the next time and she come home in :28 and change. She's got such a fluid gait. It just helps her a lot, she can carry her speed for quite a ways, and she's sensible too, so far anyways."

Etsell purchased the filly at last fall's Standardbred Horse Sales

Company yearling sale in Timonium, MD for a modest \$10,000, a price that had him double checking his catalogue and going over Adare Castle with a fine tooth comb looking for a flaw he had missed in his initial inspections.

"I almost missed her, it's kind of a scary story. It was really hot there and of course you didn't want to stay inside because of the COVID restrictions and stuff, so I was outside having a drink with Aaron Byron and all of a sudden I heard her name," Etsell recalled. "I ran in and they were stuck at \$8,000. I stuck my hand up and they dropped the hammer. I'm going, 'Hmmm did I buy the right horse? Was I bidding on something else?' I'm like, 'No, that's the number.' So I went back and looked at her again and said, 'What did I miss?' and there was nothing."

"She's not a big, big filly, maybe that was the thing, she was a little, I wouldn't say on the small side, small medium maybe. It was funny, I could have sold her like five times after I bought her down there, so I guess obviously somebody else missed her too. I don't know, our fortune, other people's misfortune, it worked out good for us."

On her arrival in Ontario, Etsell's long-time partners Robert Newton of Walkerton, Graham Hopkins of Chesley and Peter Porter of Port Dover, ON bought shares of Adare Castle, who returned that investment and put a little money in their pockets with the \$50,700 she earned Tuesday evening.

In the second \$102,200 Gold division driver Sylvain Filion of Milton, ON used a similar strategy with **Elegant Mermaid** from Post 8. Sent to the front soon after the :28.1 opening quarter, Elegant Mermaid sailed through a :59 half and 1:29.1 three-quarters before pulling away to a two and one-quarter length win in 1:57.3. Fan favourite Grace finished second and Lovin Julie was third. ([replay here: Elegant Mermaid](#)).

Elegant Mermaid, another daughter of Muscle Mass, is a recent arrival in the Ben Baillargeon barn and he said he was impressed with her Ontario Sires Stakes debut.

"I didn't have her this winter. She wintered in (New) Jersey at Andy and Julie Miller's. They've taught her everything," said Baillargeon. "She's such a natural gaited trotting filly that she'll make money because she will trot on every track. I wish she was a little bigger maybe, but sometimes the best things come in little packages, right. So right now I am very pleased with her. She's well behaved, she trots nice and there's not much else I can say about her, I only had her one week. I might look like a genius but I didn't do the work on her really."

Daniel Plouffe of Bromont, QC and Alexandra Verret of Magog, QC share ownership of Elegant Mermaid, who qualified twice at Gaitway Farm in New Jersey before shipping north for her Ontario stakes engagements.

Adare Castle, Elegant Mermaid and their 2-year-old trotting filly peers will make their second Gold Series start at Grand River Raceway on July 28.

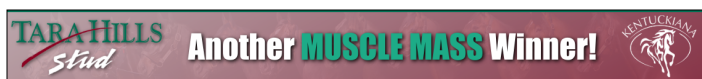
