Tall Dark Stranger won the lone \$50,000 Meadowlands Pace elimination Saturday and then drew the five hole for next Saturday's \$631,650 final. His nemesis Papi Rob Hanover wasn't as fortunate.

Yannick Gingras orchestrated the winning trip for trainer Nancy Takter, taking the front after the quarter pole, rolling through remaining fractions of :54.4 and 1:22.1 and coming home in :26 to record the 1:48.1 victory.

Captain Kirk (Joe Bongiorno), one of three finalists for trainer Tony Alagna (along with Captain Barbosa and Chief Mate) finished a half-length back in second and drew the 10 spot for the final.

Papi Rob Hanover (David Miller) started in the 10-hole — the second time in three 2020 starts he's had the outside post — but managed a strong trip and finished three lengths back in third. However, his poor luck with post draws continued. He drew the nine-hole for the final.

Captain Barbossa (Brian Sears) was fourth, Manticore (Jordan Stratton) was fifth, Major Betts (Dexter Dunn), who led the field to the :26.1 opening quarter and then dogged Tall Dark Stranger most of the mile from the pocket, faded to sixth. Catch The Fire (Mike Wilder) was seventh and Roll With Jr. (Tim Tetrick) grabbed the final spot in the final. Capt Midnight and Mocha On The Rocks finished ninth and 10th, respectively, and failed to advance to the final.

A second Pelling trainee Allywag Hanover — the winner of his \$39,432 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes test in 1:50.4 on Friday (July 10) at Harrah's Philadelphia — and Chief Mate skipped the Meadowlands Pace elimination and accepted byes into the final.

Tall Dark Stranger, a son of Bettors Delight out of Precocious Beauty, was bred by Jim Avritt, Sr. and is owned by Crawford Farms Racing of Syracuse, NY, Marvin Katz of Toronto, Caviart Farms of Vienna, VA and Howard Taylor of Philadelphia. The pacer remains perfect in two 2020 starts, improved his career earnings to \$751,889 and is now 10-1-0 in 11 lifetime starts.

Tall Dark Stranger was purchased for \$330,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

43 years, 43 quick facts on The Meadowlands Pace

- 1. The first two years the eliminations and the final were the same night. Escort and Falcon Almahurst won in 1977 and 1978, respectively.
- 2. Each of the first four editions of the Meadowlands Pace were the richest race ever held to that point:

\$425,000 in 1977 won by Escort

\$560,000 in 1978 won by Falcon Almahurst

\$750,000 in 1979 wonby Sonsam

- \$1,011,000 in 1980 won by Niatross (it was the first million-dollar harness or thoroughbred race).
- 3. Thirty times the Meadowlands Pace has gone for \$1 million or more, only the Hambletonian (37) has done it more often.
- 4. Cam Fella finished seventh in his 1982 Meadowlands Pace elimination. He would never again miss the board in 57 more tries, His sons won an incredible four straight Meadowlands Pace finals from 1991-1994-and all four set their lifetime mark in the process:

1991 - Precious Bunny in 1:49.4

1992 - Carlsbad Cam in 1:51

1993 - Presidential Ball in 1:50

1994 - Cams Card Shark in 1:50

- 5. C R Kay Suzie at 28 is now the oldest living Horse of the Year (1995), The 1994 Meadowlands Pace winner Cams Card Shark held that honor until his passing last week.
- 6. Tim Tetrick is the only driver to win the Meadowlands Pace five times prior to his 40th birthday:

2007 — Southwind Lynx – Tetrick was 25

2010 - One More Laugh - 28

2013 — Captaintreacherous — 31

2014 - Hes Watching - 32

2017 - Huntsville - 35



7. Brett Pelling might have to change his name to Brett Hanover if he goes 1-2 in the 2020 Meadowlands Pace. He sends out Papi Rob Hanover and Allywag Hanover. Remember, Pelling went 1-2 in the Meadowlands Pace in 2005 with Rocknroll Hanover (HOY) and Village Jolt.

- 8. Ninety-five per cent of the \$1 million Meadowlands Pace purse in 2004 went to trainers from Down Under:
- 1. Mark Harder Holborn Hanover
- 2. Brett Pelling Timesareachanging
- 3. Chris Ryder Metropolitan
- 4. Mark Harder Camelot Hall

9. Both He's Watching (2014) and Gallo Blue Chip (2000) won the Meadowlands Pace after going 8-for-8 at 2. Niatross in 1979 was 13-for-13 as a freshman and HOY. Conversely, Escort and Art Official won the Pace in 1977 and 2008, respectively, yet both were 0-for-15 at 2.

10. Brothers George and Buddy Gilmour each won the Meadowlands Pace in the 1980s — Buddy twice as a driver (1984 with On The Road Again and 1986 with Laughs) and George was trainer of the favorite and winner in 1989 Dexter Nukes.

- 11. "7 & 7 & 7 & 7 That is four 7s. Four divisional winners (3 YOCP) Jate Lobell 1987, Goalie Jeff 1989, Western Hanover 1992 and Blissful Hall in 1999 all finished seventh in the Meadowlands Pace.
- 12. Courageous Lady and Hazel Hanover were both sixth in the Pace final in 1978 and 1979, respectively, the last time a filly has tried her luck in the Pace final. Miss Easy won the consolation in 1991 over Cambest after making a break in her elim and failing to advance.
- 13. What a week. In 2019, Linda Toscano went into the Hall Of Fame on a Sunday Night and then six nights later won her first Meadowlands Pace with 27-1 Best In Show. The first female trainer in the Hall, she became the first female trainer to win the Pace.
- 14. Bettors Delight took a while, but got it done in 2019 with son Best In Show 18 years after he was second best to Real Desire in a thrilling 2001 Pace final. He joins an incredible list of Meadowlands Pace runner-ups who have had a more than distinguished siring and/or racing career: No Nukes 1982, Abercrombie 1978, Artsplace 1991, Somebeachsomewhere 2008, Always B Miki in 2014 and last year with Bettors Delight, the world's leading horse racing sire.
- 15. The first sub-1:50 Meadowlands Pace elimination was in 1993 (Riyadh, 1:49.4). It came two years after the first sub-1:50 final (Precious Bunny, 1:49.4).



16. Pelling is trying to do two things in the 2020 Pace never done before — go 15 years between wins and 25 years between his first and most recent Pace victory:

1995 — Davids Pass

1997 - Dream Away

1999 - The Panderosa

2005 - Rockn Roll Hanover

2020 — Allywag Hanover or Papi Rob Hanover

17. 2020 marks the first time ever that the Meadowlands Pace comes before the North America Cup.

18. The 2020 Pace lands the very same weekend of the first ever million-dollar Meadowlands Pace (1980 Niatross, \$1,011,000).

19. Chris Ryder sent out the Meadowlands Pace runner-up last year with division winner Bettors Wish 21 years after he sent out the 1998 Meadowlands Paced favorite Sealed N Delivered (10th).

20. The 1990s Meadowlands Pace winning sires had their own travails in their own Meadowlands Pace attempts:

1990 — Beach Towel was the winner and his sire French Chef could not advance from the 1981 Pace elims.

1991 thru 1994 the four winners were all sired by Cam Fella, who was an uncharacteristic seventh in his 1982 Pace elim (Precious Bunny 1991, Carlsbad Cam 1992 Presidential Ball 1993 and Cams Card Shark 1994).

1995 - Davids Pass won it. He was sired by Jate Lobell, who was seventh in the 1987 Pace, the only time he ever missed the board.

1996 — Hot Lead as sired by Jaguar Spur who failed to make any noise come Pace time.

1997 — Dream Away was sired by Artsplace who was the big favorite in 1991 but could not stay with Precious Bunny in the first ever sub-1:50 Pace.

1998 — Day In A Life was from the first crop of Life Sign, who looked like he might be going by for the 1993 Pace win but veered in late and was second best to Presidential Ball.

1999 — The Panderosa won it from post 10 and his sire Western Hanover wasn't as lucky. He was impeded in the 1992 final on the first turn and wound up seventh.

21. Two of every five favorites win the Meadowlands Pace final and two of every three Meadowlands Pace eliminations favorites win their prep.

22. Odd fact: Pelling has yet to win the Pace in an "EVEN" Year. He has won it in 1995, 1997, 1999 and 2005.

23. Dexter Dunn and Andy McCarthy were both named on a



pair in the elims. Dexter was second a year ago with Bettors Wish. Never has a Down Under driver won the Pace final.


- 24. Tall Dark Stranger looks to give the Takter family their Pace breakthrough. Nancy was favored last year but finished fourth with Captain Crunch.
- 25. Four Captaintreacherous sons participated in this year's elims. He was the 2013 winner from the first crop of Somebeachsomewhere whose only loss came in the 2008 Meadowlands Pace.
- 26. Majors Betts is a son of Art Major, who in 2002 became the richest ever single season sophomore pacer not to race in either the North America Cup or the Meadowlands Pace. \$1,562,779.
- 27. Manticore has some making up to do at least from the perspective of 2010 Trainer of the Year Bruce Saunders. His colt that year HOY Rock N Roll Heaven was torched through a :25.4 opener in the 2010 Meadowlands Pace and missed a head on the wire in 1:47.4 to One More Laugh.
- 28. None of this year's elimination horses had double digit wins going into the prep.
- 29. 2020 marks the 25th anniversary of Dave Miller's first ever Meadowlands Pace drive in 1995. He was fifth from post 10 with Cinder Lane Sam closing in :26. Miller won his first Pacer in 2018 with Courtly Choice.
- 30. The record purse for the Meadowlands Pace is \$1,293,000 in 1984 when On The Road Again won it from post 12. On The Road Again was the second choice behind Guts, the runner-up, and to prove he was drinking from the fountain of youth, winning driver —52-year-old Buddy Gilmour came back two years later at age 54 to win both the Meadowlands Pace with Laughs (\$1,025,500) and the Woodrow Wilson with Cullin Hanover (\$1,561,500).
- 31. The first win for a catch-drive in a million-dollar race came in the 1982 Meadowlands Pace when John Campbell and Hilarion won it from post 10. He did not drive that colt in the elim Bill O'Donnell did and won with him, but opted for Rompin Home in the final (fifth).
- 32. The first million-dollar trot came three years after the first million-dollar pace:
- 1980 Niatross won the \$1,011,000 Meadowlands Pace 1983 — Duenna won the \$1,080,000 Hambletonian
- 33. Bill O'Donnell became the first driver to ever win both a million-dollar pace and trot. And he did it in the same year three weeks apart Meadowlands Pace with Nihilator and the Hambletonian with Prakas.



- 34. Tim Tetrick at 25 years 8 months became the youngest driver to win a million-dollar Meadowlands Pace when he won with Southwind Lynx in 2007.
- 35. Trevor Ritchie is the only driver to win the Meadowlands Pace and the Hambletonian in his debut in each 1987 Pace with Frugal Gourmet and 2000 Hambletonian with Yankee Paco.
- 36. Pelling's debut in the Meadowlands Pace came in 1993. He missed a check with Dave Palone-driven Mystical Prince.
- 37. Triple Crown winners have not gotten it done in the Meadowlands Pace since 1983 when Ralph Hanover won both:
- 1997 Western Dreamer was third
- 1999 Blissful Hall was seventh
- 2003 No Pan Intended was fourth
- 38. Rocknroll Hanover was the sport's first sub-1:50 2-year-old (2004 Metro in 1:49.4). He then won the 2005 Meadowlands Pace en route to HOY honors.
- 39. Thirty years went by from Meadowlands Pace runner-ups being voted Horse Of The Year 1978 Abercrombie and 2008 Somebeachsomewhere.
- 40. In 2003, Mike Lachance pulled off an unprecedented daily double-taking both the Meadowlands Pace and the Hambletonian without ever having driven either horse before in race. He won with All American Theory in the Pace for Des Tackoor and Amigo Hall in the Hambletonian for Blair Burgess.
- 41. Yannick Gingras' debut in the Meadowlands Pace came as the favorite for Brett Pelling. In 2004, he was second with Timesareachanging at 9-5.
- 42. Always A Virgin was the favorite in 2007 in the Meadowlands Pace but made an untimely late break. His son Always B Miki was the runner-up in 2014 to He's Watching at 10-1.
- 43. Shelly Goudreau passed away from a racing accident in California the first week of September in 1982. At that point in harness history there had been six million-dollar races, and Shelly was the only driver who appeared in all six: three Woodrow Wilsons, three Pace finals.



If you wanted to go to a ball game, a movie or just hang out in the neighborhood, why not? Safety issues were rarely thought about, let alone encountered.

She was the oldest of three children to Bill and Gloria Vreeland.

Her father loved sports of all kinds but especially horse racing. Unfortunately, his preference was the thoroughbreds. He and Linda visited all the New York area tracks fairly often, but almost never went to Roosevelt or Yonkers.

The family grew and eventually outgrew their neighborhood.

Bill decided to move the family to larger quarters on Long Island.

Linda hated it.

She had lost all her freedom. She wasn't old enough to drive. There was no public transportation. She felt trapped.

Her mom suggested that she might be interested in taking riding lessons. That was to be her first physical introduction to horses.

She loved them.

She also became a rabid New York Mets fan. Linda and her dad went to numerous Mets games, including a couple of historic ones.

But, she was bit by the horse bug.

She was a good student and wanted to become a veterinarian.

She started working at a local riding school.

Linda had a friend who worked for Buddy Regan, then the leading trainer on the New York scene. She was urged to give the standardbreds a try.

She thought to herself, why not? In those days, a groom took care of two horses, sometimes only one, if it was a very special one. But they worked and they worked hard.

Buddy and his stable were meticulous. After all, he had worked for Stanley Dancer before he went out on his own. How could he and it be otherwise?

She describes herself as being a very good groom, but tells a story on herself where she messed up and paid for it.

A friend of hers wanted to go to the beach one afternoon. Linda hadn't yet cleaned and put away her harness. Against her better judgment, she was urged to just put it in the harness bag and clean it the next day. Who would know the difference?

The next day when she came to work, she found a pile of disassembled harness lying in front of the stall door.

Buddy said "If you had done what you are getting paid to do, you wouldn't have this mess to take care of now. That would have likely taken you a half hour to do. Now it's going

to take you at least triple that time."

She learned a very important lesson. There are very few successful shortcuts in this business. If you take care of all the little things, you will be much better prepared to handle the big ones.

She learned a lot working with Buddy Regan. He wasn't the easiest person to work for, but was imminently fair.

Buddy was the first trainer that she knew who utilized farm turnouts to a great degree. He trained them, but he didn't think stall living was the best environment to keep a horse happy. When his horses weren't working, they were likely in a pasture eating grass. He incorporated being turned out into their regular training regime. He found that it kept them happy and fresh.

He had a 30-horse stable and that was all he ever wanted, although occasionally he'd get a few more. For a short period of time Linda even got the opportunity to look after the great mare Tarport Hap after Alan Leavitt had purchased her. She was a truly great mare.

Buddy, had two important edges going for him:

1. One of his principal owners was Ernie Dahlman, perhaps the sharpest handicapper to ever inhabit the New York tracks. Ernie was not only an excellent and successful bettor, but he also had a great eye for watching horses on the track and gauging their ability. He was extremely sharp on advising Buddy on which horses he believed were good claims, which he thought Regan could improve upon. Invariably, these horses were claimed by Buddy for Ernie or some of his other owners. They almost always did well.

2. Back then, there were several trainers who were known for "sitting" on a horse. That is not extending them to their utmost, expecting that the horse wouldn't get over classified or in hopes of making a score with them. These guys were raw meat to Regan, who would claim from their ranks regularly.

Eventually Regan got tired of the New York grind and went to Florida with a group of younger horses, leaving Linda with the New York contingent.

Linda worked with Buddy for nine years, before he, in essence, shut down the operation.

The next person she went to work with was a young up and coming horseman named John Campbell. John had a smallish stable at Roosevelt. Linda and John's brother Jim looked after the "family horse," To Ri Johnny, which to this day remains one of Linda's all-time favorite horses. Ultimately, John disbanded the New York operation and moved everything to New Jersey.

Then the second Buddy came into her life. His name was Gilmour.

"If there is a person who has a bad word to say about



Buddy Gilmour, as a person or as a horseman, I haven't met him," Linda said. "Buddy was a pleasure in every way. If he couldn't help a horse, then that horse couldn't be helped. Working for Buddy and Don Sider was an absolute pleasure. At the end of the day Buddy would walk the stable. With each horse, he'd start his inspection at the bottom of their feet and work his way up until he had covered the entire horse."

After a while with Gilmour, she decided that the time had arrived when she needed to go out on her own.

Regan called from Florida and asked me to handle the New York operation, he'd be staying there for some time. That led to me opening my own stable starting with some of his owners.

Two fortuitous things happened to her at or about that time.

1. She met and began to use Michel Lachance as her principal driver. Mike was one of the greatest drivers ever, but what many people fail to realize is that as great a driver as he was, he is an even better all-around horseman. What Lachance doesn't know about a horse isn't worth knowing. For many years before coming to New York, Lachance ran and owned the biggest part of a stable of 30 head or so. Not only did he drive Linda's horses successfully, but he also gave her tips in training them.

The first really good horse she had was Storm Dust. He won 16 races and was voted Claimer of the Year in New York.

2. She got two great owners who stayed with her for a very long time — the deLucias and the Katz Brothers. The Katz Brothers stayed with her for 28 years. She still regrets the acrimonious situation that caused them to leave. She perfectly understands their reason for doing so. However, she feels if tempers had been allowed to cool for a few days their relationship wouldn't have ended the way it did. They have since repaired their relationship and I am very pleased with the success they have had since leaving. No family deserves it more.


Let's talk about one of my favorites: Clarence.

"Clarence was one of those once-in-a-lifetime dogs. We were fortuitous to get him when we did. He was named after the town where he came from Clarence, New York. We were privileged to have him for 13 years and that wasn't even half enough time. The first road trip we made with him was to visit you guys in Hanover. He must have been about eight or nine weeks old. You baby sat him then and did for many years when we left him with you in your office at Harrisburg."

His successor, Bailey, is a wonderful dog. But there will never be another Clarence.

You tried training in Pinehurst for two quite successful years, but then decided to stay up north. Why the change?

"The primary reason was the help. I have great help that



have been with me for years. Good help is irreplaceable. They are the backbone of any stable. They have homes and families in New Jersey. It was just too hard for them to pick up and go. Pinehurst is pleasant, but except for a few weeks the weather there isn't much warmer than it is in New Jersey. Brad and I also found it difficult going back and forth.

If I ever do it again, I'll go the whole way and go to Florida. When and if that day comes, we will go to Florida with half as many horses as we have now and they will all be young ones."

Speaking of Brad, how long have you two guys been a twosome?

"We've been together for 29 years. He is a Godsend. He excels at just about everything that I either don't do well at or hate to do. Our stable would not have had near the success it has had without him. He is a great person and a terrific horseman."

Who are the five best horsemen you've been associated with?

It's impossible to leave it at five, but I'll give it a try.

- **1. Mike Lachance.** "Two words 'The Best.' No horseman that I've ever known has more attributes than him. He is brilliant, beyond brilliant, with horses. He is every bit as good with a trotter or pacer, male or female, cheap horse or top one. He is a great communicator and a great mentor."
- **2. Buddy Regan** "A great horseman. Without him, I wouldn't be where I am now. He could be stubborn and strong willed. But his instincts were usually correct when it came to horses."
- **3.Herve Filion** "Simply amazing. I think Bill O'Donnell said he was part horse. I think I'd change that to say all horse, in a human body. The things he could do with horses were astounding. We had an extremely fast horse named Pantry Man. He was also a stone cold runaway. Nobody could control him. He probably set up more lifetime records for other horses than any other horse ever. One day Buddy had Herve in to drive him. Herve said 'I'm going to race him from behind.' 'Sure', Buddy said thinking to himself, Pantry Man will show you. Others have tried, but none have succeeded. As soon as the gate closed, Herve tucked him into the five hole no fighting, no grabbing on. Those hands were magical. He pulled at the half, just rode the third quarter and jogged. None of us could believe it.

"Another time I bought a terrible horse for a lot of money. I was in deep trouble with him. Herve said, 'Let me race him at Freehold, a few times, give him some confidence, teach him to be a racehorse. Damned if he didn't. I think he finished second with him six times. We sold him at Harrisburg and he brought \$60,000. If not for Herve he wouldn't have brought \$10,000. Like you say, he didn't call you by your name. You were 'kid.' I was 'da girl."

4. Bill Wellwood – "Incredible horseman. I was so fortunate to get to know Bill and train some of his stock. It always surprised me that they came in all colors, shapes and sizes. There was no Wellwood type. You could learn more in a 15 minute conversation with 'Woody' than if you spent days

speaking with someone else."

5. Stanley Dancer - "In terms of the complete package, he might have been the very best. He might not have been the very best driver ever, but he was darn good and he revolutionized the way horses were driven. In terms of training, he was pretty darn good. In terms of running a stable nobody did it better. I doubt that anybody ever will. The same applies to record keeping.

"Let me tell you a story. One of the turning points in my career was when I got all of Richard Heffering's good horses to train. The best one of them was the outstanding trotting filly Lifelong Victory. At about the same time, Paul Reid, who was Stanley's assistant came to me saying 'Stanley would like to speak with you. The first thought that came to me was what did I do wrong? I walk into his office and he has what looks like a shoebox on his desk. He said, 'I just heard that you got Lifelong Victory to train. I thought this could be of help to you.' Stanley had her as a 2- and 3-year-old. Inside the box he had every single record of the filly while he had her. He had pictures of her being broken and the entire time he had her. In the event that she became great, he would have a complete chronology of her career. He had a record of every training mile she had ever gone, every medicine she had ever received, her temperature every day, any notes regarding how he felt about her at any particular time. Talk about details, he was the best."

5A Tim Tetrick – "Of all the young great drivers out there now, I think he overshadows all of them in terms of horsemanship. From my experience, he is on the ball more often than not when he suggests a change with a horse."

Who were the five best horses you've ever had?

"I hope one of them is in the stable right now, but you never know."

1. Chapter Seven. "Just a perfect horse. He got better each year that he raced. I probably should have had two Hambletonian winners. But at 3 he wasn't perfectly healthy and didn't shake off some kind of bug he was carrying until late in the year. He wasn't very big, nor did he have much length to him, but his gait was amazing. I've often been asked two questions about him. The first was did he need trotting hobbles? My answer would be no, whereas Market Share most definitely did. I trained Chapter Seven in 1:56 without the hobbles before one of the major races and asked Mike if we should try him without them. His usual wise answer was we're doing all right now, why change?

"The second question I often get is did I expect him to be as great a stallion as he has become. The answer of course has to be no. Who could possibly have forecasted such success for any horse. Successful stallions like him only come along very seldom. You are lucky if you hit the right one.

2. Walner – "The most natural ability I've ever seen in any horse. He was perfect from day one. He was never really a kid. He was always a man among boys. If things had gone right with him, I believe he would have gone in 1:48 or maybe a touch faster. If his foals have his gait and ability they will be a force on the racetrack."

- **3. Market Share –** "A wonderful horse who sometimes gets forgotten. He earned \$3.8 million, with \$2 million earned as a 3-year-old. He was a terrific racehorse who almost never failed to come and play. Very few almost four million dollar winning horses have received less recognition than this truly game warrior has gotten. He might not have been as perfect as Chapter Seven and Walner, but he was pretty darn good and then some."
- **4. Heston Blue Chip "**He's another really good horse who didn't receive the attention that I believe he deserved. It's probably mostly because the bulk of his racing was done on the New York Circuit and not in the Grand Circuit races against the glamor boys. But he beat them all in the Breeders Crown and then went on to win the Matron in 1.48. Those two wins earned him his Dan Patch Award."
- **5. Kenneth J "**He was a beautiful horse, beautifully gaited and a pleasure to train."
- **5A** Jet Laag "This is probably more of a sentimental choice. But I just loved this guy. Don't get me wrong, he would have been an asset to anybody's stable. He was as consistent as they come. I cannot recall him ever going a bad race. His world record performance at Delaware Ohio was one of the greatest thrills in my career."

You are known as one of, if not the best, if I might use the expression "Owner trainers" in the business. You get along with your owners and they seem to get along with and stay with you.

- 1. Ken Jacobs "Ken gave me the chance with some high-end New York-breds and we just clicked. That resulted in Heston Blue Chip and Kenneth J and a bunch of others. He has been my major owner for the last decade or longer. He is game and isn't afraid to try to hit the ball out of the park. He does his homework pretty well by himself, but usually comes to me for confirmation of his opinions. We hit a little bit of a bump in the road last year, but, thankfully, it got resolved and all is good. I'm hoping that he gives me some of his good Walners to train next year."
- **2. The Katz Brothers "**They are terrific people who came to me when I most needed owners. We were together for 28 years, which is virtually unheard of in this business. Although

we broke up a few years ago, I still miss having them in the stable. I trained for their parents, Jack and Pearl, as well as for them. They love the business and are really passionate about it. Their recent success could not have happened to more well deserving people."

- **3. Richard Gutnick "**I've often said that the stress of training good horses is harder than training ordinary ones. When it came to Chapter Seven and Market Share, Richard gave me the privilege of training these two incredible horses and left me alone to do my job. He always trusted me to do the right thing and helped to make my job easier. I will always be grateful for that."
- **4. My Present group "**They are a terrific mix of young and old, experts (self-proclaimed), and neophytes. Without exception, they are enthusiastic people who love the business and with who I am generally at ease.

"The Enviro Stable has been loyal and steadfast and partnered with the Katz Brothers to give me my first Breeders Crown winner Mollycandoit.

"Richard Young has given me the opportunity to train a Meadowlands Pace winner.

"Andy Cohen, Jeff Gural, George Segal, Dan Baer, Harvey Nagler and the groups they are part of, keep us in the game every year."

5. Richard Heffering. "The loss of Richard and his dad Peter to the business was incalculable. They really put their faith in me by giving me a bunch of high quality trotters at a time when my ability with trotters was definitely an unknown quantity."

What does the future hold for Linda Toscano and Brad McNinch?

"Right now we are most concerned with this year's group. At this time I think our depth and strength is concentrated in fillies although we have a few nice colts that we like.

"I just turned 65, I have no immediate plans to cut down significantly. Although, I'm sure that as times goes on we will do so.

"Ideally I'd like to have a stable of 15-20 2- and 3-year-olds, winter train in Florida and continue to race up north as long as we can remain productive.

"I'd also like to one day load up our RV with Brad and Bailey travel and see all of our country."

Hurrikane Emperor, Gimpanzee win Graduate finals

Hurrikane Emperor provided an upset in the \$250,000 Graduate Series final for 4-year-old pacers while 1-5 favorite Gimpanzee took care of business in the \$250,000 Graduate Series final for 4-year-old trotters Saturday night at The Meadowlands.

Hurrikane Emperor, sent off as the fifth choice at odds of 7-1, was second over in fourth at three-quarters before coming three wide off the last turn and storming through the stretch to reign by 1-1/2 lengths over Workin Ona Mystery in 1:47, the fastest mile of the season. Dancin Lou finished third. Favorite Bettor's Wish was eighth.

Mark MacDonald drove Hurrikane Emperor to victory for trainer John McDermott and owners Jonathan Klee Racing,

Kuhen Racing, and William Garofalo.

"I really thought he was going to be awesome tonight and Mark gave him the most beautiful drive in the world," McDermott said. "It worked out beautifully."

Hurrikane Emperor is a homebred son of former McDermott standout Hurrikane Kingcole, who died last October at the age of 10. Hurrikane Emperor won seven of nine races as a 2-year-old and opened his 3-year-old campaign with three consecutive wins, including the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship, before seeing his season derailed by sickness.

"We don't know what it was, but everything just kept falling apart," McDermott said. "I shut him down. My boys were so great about it, they told me to give him all the time he needed. We did and it's paid off."

Hurrikane Emperor won a conditioned race in March before the sport was shut down because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

When racing resumed, he returned in the Graduate Series, where he won an opening-round division at Tioga Downs. He finished third in his second-round division last week at The Meadowlands.

"This is beyond words," McDermott said. "Through this pandemic it's been such torture, all I did was go deeper in the hole. Thank God for my great partners that have supported me through it because it has not been easy. To come out here, I knew he was awesome this year. Last week we were all slightly disappointed, but the way he got sick last year, I'm trying to not overuse him.

"This is just really a blessing. He is so special to us. Owning his daddy, losing his daddy last year, he's family. He's the greatest creature in the world to me. It's funny, as a 2- and 3-year-old he didn't remind me of his father because he was really nondescript and didn't have much of a personality. In the last year, he's grown into such a clown that he's so much like his dad off the track. On the track, he's nice and manageable."

Hurrikane Emperor, out of the mare Hurrikane Schmumma, has won 13 of 22 career races and \$534,476.

In the Graduate Series final for 4-year-old trotters, Gimpanzee saw Reign Of Honor lead the field around the first turn but moved to the front at the quarter on his way to a 1:50.4 triumph for driver Brian Sears and trainer Marcus Melander. Reign Of Honor, also trained by Melander, was second and Chin Chin Hall finished third. The winning margin was one length.

Gimpanzee, a son of Chapter Seven out of Steamy Windows, is 3-for-3 this year and has won 20 of 26 career races. A Dan Patch Award winner at age 2, the stallion has banked \$1.89 million for owners Courant Inc. and S R F Stable.

"Reign Of Honor finishing second from a bad post (10) was a little bit shocking that he was so fast behind the gate," Melander said. "Gimpanzee was supposed to win, but finishing first and second, I'm very pleased.

"(Gimpanzee) is doing what he's supposed to do. He's going to go back next week for the Hambletonian Maturity, so it was nice to get a nice race on the lead. I was very happy with what I saw. The horse is getting more in form. Even though he's been racing great, I can feel him getting sharper and sharper. It will be very exciting to continue racing with him."

The W.N. Reynolds Memorial divisions for 3-year-old male trotters were won by **Jula Trix Treasure** and **Back Of The Neck**, both from the stable of trainer Ake Svanstedt. Jula Trix Treasure, driven by Gingras, won in 1:51.2, with Beads second and EL Ideal third. Back Of The Neck, with Scott Zeron in the sulky, won in 1:52 with Play Trix On Me second and Maesteraemon third.

The only Reynolds event for 3-year-old female trotters was won by Takter-trained and Gingras-driven **Sorella** in 1:50.2, the fastest mile of the season by a 3-year-old trotter. Panem was second followed by returning Dan Patch Award winner Ramona Hill in her 2020 debut.

Fresh air and sunlight

Sunny Billion outpaces alleged abuse known as "Occurrence #19-608".

(Editor's note: The author became one of the fractional owners of Sunny Billion while researching this article).

In Bedouin legend, the first horse was formed from the air itself. In COVID-19 pandemic times, the return of live horse racing before other sports provided a breath of fresh air. The symbolism is too timely: The racehorse, of any breed, breathing deep and giving flight to dreams.

It can be a steep ascent for a horse already in flight from a disturbing past.

On Dec. 2, 2019, in race 3 at The Raceway at The Western Fair District in London, ON, seven 3-year-old male pacers found a place on the pylons in the first turn. Maching Time led the way to the opening quarter; behind him, moving second-over from fifth, was Sunny Billion. As the field approached the three-quarters, Maching Time deflected first-over challenger Sportslover's bid for command; Sunny Billion appeared ready to tip three-wide, but instead began to gap cover, finishing fifth.

What happened after the race was seen, reported, and documented as "Occurrence #19-608" by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) Investigation and Enforcement Bureau. On Jan. 26, 2020, racing officials Dave Stewart, Emma Pote, and Doug Hopkins questioned trainer Frederick Bourgault about his treatment of Sunny Billion the night of Dec. 2. While the details were not made public, other trainers allegedly witnessed Bourgault "committing an act of cruelty or neglect to a horse" (rule 6.22), which was deemed "misconduct prejudicial to the best interests of racing" (rule 6.20 (b)).

February 1, ruling #SB 49647 stated that the trainer would be fined \$2,500 and suspended 45 days (Feb. 17-April 1, inclusive; ruling #SB 49647), with conditions placed on his license for a full year, to begin April 2, 2020 (ruling #SB 49648). On Feb. 11, Bourgault and representative Dave Boughton requested a review of this decision before the Horse Racing Appeal Panel (HRAP), filing a Notice of Appeal and a Notice of Motion requesting stays of the rulings against him. The HRAP defines a "stay" as the temporary suspension of whatever decision has been made by a judge, steward or the registrar, allowing the racing participant to continue working until their appeal hearing takes place, or until another date specified by the HRAP.

At first, the registrar objected to allowing Bourgault the

stays; however, they were allowed Feb. 18 following written submissions provided to the Appeal Panel. On March 11, dates were announced for the trainer's appeal hearing: May 26-28 and June 2-4, inclusive. Then came COVID-19, which led to the cancellation of Ontario race dates after March 19, as well as indefinite postponement of all hearings. When racing resumed at the provincial "B" tracks, Bourgault resumed working as a trainer. At press time, he was ranked #6 in Canada by wins this year (40).

Sunny Billion's return to competition has not been as easy as that of his former trainer. When still racing for owners Michel Letarte of Boucherville, QC and Jean Allaire of Montreal in late January, the gelding was moved into the stable of conditioner Francis Guillemette. Sunny Billion's final Ontario start was a lacklustre race 10, Feb. 23 at Rideau Carleton Raceway. He finished sixth of seven \$7,000 claimers, at odds of 40-1. Before Rideau Carleton had even announced it was cancelling upcoming dates due to the pandemic, the 4-year-old pacer was posted for sale online. He was purchased and on his way to Nova Scotia before anything was clear about his future, or the racing season ahead.

Brad McCallum runs the Won't Back Down Stable, a small fractional ownership group based at Truro Raceway. He had been following Sunny Billion online through early 2020, negotiating a price for the pacer who hadn't hit the board in any of six Ontario starts this year. On Feb. 24, the deal was finalized.

The gelding's condition was poor on arrival. From a physical perspective, he was 200 pounds underweight, partially the result of untreated dental problems. Mentally, the horse now nicknamed "Billy" was worse: trembling in the wash stall, barely interested in food; amazingly, not head-shy, although his face still bore the marks of a beating with a headpole. Perhaps unsurprisingly, he showed a preference for being handled by women. With Truro Raceway's original early May season opener pushed ahead to June, there was no need for new trainer Gardner "Wink" McCallum to rush Sunny Billion back to the track; the horse was instead turned out at the farm of trainer/driver Darren Crowe.

In April, Sunny Billion was jogging five days a week at Truro Raceway, with light training on Wednesdays and a more intense training day on the weekend, followed by a day off on Mondays. He qualified May 31, finishing sixth, individually timed in 2:03.1h — an adequate effort, just ahead of Truro's first seasonal pari-mutuel card on June 5. Brad McCallum admitted he was disappointed by the pacer's opening-night debut for the Won't Back Down Stable, in which he also finished sixth, timed in 2:02.4h, for driver Kenny Parker Jr. Sunny Billion showed no improvement for catch driver Ernie Laffin June 12, struggling home eighth. Laffin told McCallum that he thought the gelding might have had breathing difficulties during the race; a June 19 class

drop seemed to confirm the notion when "Billy" could finish no better than another non-factor sixth.

On June 26, Sunny Billion landed post #7 for his latest class drop, this time into Truro's non-winners of \$401 in previous five starts. Switched from closed bridle to a hood with cups, joining forces with new driver Darren Crowe, he went off as 3-5 favourite instead of the usual double-digit odds. His latest driver would try different tactics this time, to see if the mild-mannered son of Sunshine Beach would match confident handling with equivalent confidence.

Instantly backed up to last off the gate, could the round-gaited pacer take air in the overland journey to the top? Crowe would find out, as he sent Sunny Billion first over from seventh when leader Putnams New Year reached the quarter pole. With fresh assertiveness in every stride, Sunny Billion just kept advancing, despite never seeing the inside path for the remainder of the race. Whatever had happened in Ontario seemed suddenly distant, as "Billy" stayed brave in the three-wide path for his first win of the year. The teletimer displayed a modest 2:02.1, a number irrelevant to anyone in the winner's circle.

Summer will provide Sunny Billion with more confidence-building races, as he comes up for air at a track with no Lasix program. His former trainer's appeal hearing will proceed on a date which should soon be announced; it will be an electronic hearing, in accordance with ongoing COVID-19 protocols as the HRAP reschedules the existing backlog.

Nice wire-to-wire win for Melander's star

Stefan Melander-trained **Milligan's School** (Yankee Glide) came to the lead during a hailstorm in the \$108,000 Årjängs Stora Sprinterlopp in Sweden and when horses disappeared by making early breaks, no one could reach the American-bred trotter over 1,640 meters.

Ulf Eriksson drove Melander's top trotter and aimed for the lead when quick starter and stablemate Disco Volante went off stride as soon as the car left the field of 10 horses.

Sorbet found position first over and Milliondollarrhyme third over, but Milligan's School kept the pace high throughout the whole race and the opponents had no chance to challenge as he landed on a mile rate of 1:52.2.

Norwegian trotter Gigant Invelley followed as runner up after a pocket trip and Sorbet held for third place.

Milligan's School claimed his 25th victory in his career, which includes 93 starts and \$1,290,083 in earnings. This victory gave the 7-year-old colt a ticket to the \$347,000 Hugo Åbergs Memorial at Jägersro racetrack on July 28.

Ble du Gers strongest in Norway

For the second time this summer, French-bred **Ble du Gers** (Quinoa du Gers) won a big race in Norway. In June, 9-year-old Ble du Gers won the Oslo Grand Prix and when the \$53,000 Ulf Thoresen Grand International was on the schedule at Jarlsberg racetrack on Sunday afternoon, he once again proved that he likes northern European racing conditions, where 5/8 mile tracks are most common.

The Ulf Thoresen Grand International became a messy story where several horses disappeared by making breaks early into the race and Ble du Gers was served a trip second over by driver Vidar Hop. The French trotter left Jean-Michel Bazire's barn earlier this spring and Norwegian trainer Frode Hamre has done a great job keeping the gelding in perfect shape.

Vidar Hop left his position at the backstretch and Ble du Gers took over the lead from Evil Enok M.E. when 500 meters remained of the race and three wide follower Zarenne Fas seemed to be a serious threat in the last turn. But Ble du Gers is stronger than many other trotters in the elite and the victory was never in doubt. The mile rate was 1:55.3 over 1.3 miles and Zarenne Fas finished second, well ahead of Floris Baldwin, who was one of the horses that went off stride in the race's opening.

Cleangame returns to winning form

Bazire's star trotter **Cleangame** (Ouragan de Celland) won for the first time since Jan. 18 when he won Saturday (July 4) in \$101,000 Grand Prix du Conseil Municipal in French Vichy on Saturday night.

Cleangame started 25 meters behind front trotters in the 2.975-meter event and the race went off after three recalls.



Cleangame made his move midway through the race and during the last lap Bazire followed leader Etonnant, an opponent Cleangame easily disarmed at the beginning of the stretch. Bugsy Malone finished strongly from behind and Cleangame had to give his all to win in sharp mile rate 1:54.1 over 1.8 miles.

Bold Eagle just shy of being richest French trotter

In La Capelle last Sunday (July 5), Bold Eagle chased victory in the \$101,000 Prix de la Thierache and the entourage around the charismatic top trotter was aiming for records. Bold Eagle is just behind Timoko in becoming the richest French trotter in history. Bold Eagle needed a win in the La Capelle to set the record.

But a second over trip resulted in third place, behind Billie de Montfort, who followed leader and winner **Drole de Jet** (Coktail Jet) the whole way. Drole de Jet has really found high level this summer. In his previous start ahead of the race in La Capelle, Pierre Vercuysse's horse made a strong effort as second to Face Time Bourbon in Prix Réné Balliere at Vincennes. On Sunday afternoon, he took a safe wire to wire victory over the mile in 1:52.

As a 4-year-old, in 2017, Drole de Jet won \$450,000 Grand Prix de l'U.E.T. at Solvalla and now it seems like he's ready to fight among the toughest contenders in Europe again.

Elian Web claimed big trophy in Finland

Papalympiatravet winner and Elitloppet contender **Elian Web** (Like A Prayer) had a great weekend in Finland last
week. On Saturday's race card in Lahti, the first heats in
\$300,000 Suur-Hollola went on and paired with Janne
Soronen, Elian Web won in great style in a mile rate of 1:55.4
over 1.3 miles, which meant that he would get a pleasant
post position the day after. Yes, the Suur-Hollola is special in
that way, that the story is determined after racing two days
in a row. In Sunday's final, Jorma Kontio was back alongside
Katja Melkko's gelding and from post 1, Elian Web had no
problems in keeping the lead, a position from where he is
tough to beat and Suur-Hollola 2020 was his race from the
moment when the car left the field of 12 trotters. Elian Web

won in a mile rate of 1:57.1 and claimed his second biggest victory in his career.

Hotshot Luca, who won the second elimination on Saturday's race card, finished second and Big Headache took the bronze medal.



Tiny-but-speedy Emma Town Bud competitive with the big boys

Byron Hooley knew his trotter Emma Town Bud had a quick turn of foot, but even the conditioner was surprised when the pint-sized powerhouse tripped the timer in 1:53.2 Thursday (July 2). Steered by veteran reinsman Mike Oosting, the son of Big Stick Lindy—Centerfold Lady blazed home with a :25.3 last quarter to capture a \$31,500 Indiana Sires stakes division at Harrah's Hoosier Park in a lifetime best mile. The victory also raised the gelding's record to three wins in three starts in 2020.

"You wouldn't think he could go with those big colts, but he doesn't know he's little, and right now he thinks he can beat everyone on the track," said Hooley, who races under the moniker Summit Pacing Acres. "I'm hoping I can keep him that way with the attitude."

Emma Town Bud has never lacked for attitude and enthusiasm. A friend called Hooley's attention to the trotter leading up to the 2018 Michiana Classic Sale. In the midst of a four-year campaign with Satin Dancer, an Indiana Sires Stakes champion with just shy of \$740,000 on her card, the trainer was told the yearling possessed the same breeding as his top mare, sired by Big Stick Lindy out of a Credit Winner mare. Cataloged as Silver Star Corona, Hooley viewed his video and traveled to see the colt in Emma, a small northern Indiana town located between Topeka and Shipshewana. He purchased the trotter privately days before the sale and paid Hoosier Classic Sale Company commission on the negotiated price.

"It took about five Amish guys to load him in the trailer. He was tough to handle," Hooley explained. "I thought I would just take my time with him. He made me look bad a couple times. I've had about three runaways with him, but ended up being safe and I was safe."

Two days after the purchase, Norman "Bud" Hostetler, a

former Trottingbred racer and associate judge at the Elkhart County Fair, passed away. Hooley asked Hostetler's son, Rick, also a comrade from his Trottingbred days, if it would be okay to name the new acquisition after his father. With approval, Silver Star Corona became Emma Town Bud. While he has proven himself a professional on the track, the trotter keeps his 70-year-old trainer on alert when going through the daily routine.

"He's not hard holding. He is really professional once you're on the track. He drives with an open bridle, no overcheck. He's not a bad apple," Hooley said. "Hooking him, he can get excited. I don't really trust hooking him by myself. I always have someone there to take his head when you put the bike on. If something scares him a little bit, I don't know how to explain it, he'll explode. He is getting better and starting to behave more often, but he's the one where I'm on my toes from the time I take him out of the stall until the time I'm finished with him. You just have to make sure everything is done the right way or you're going to have a problem."

Once on the racetrack, Emma Town Bud has shown his professionalism. Last season, Indiana divisional champion TJ's Top Pick garnered much of the attention in sires stakes competition while Hooley's charge quietly compiled a 3-4-2 record in 12 freshman starts. The gelding captured two Indiana Sires Stakes legs, and was second in another. Unfortunately, he scoped sick in the \$270,000 Super Final, finishing fifth while sent off as second choice in the contest.

"He was sitting second, right where we needed to be. I thought he would pop out and make it happen," said Hooley. "Well, he popped out and just went backwards."

After accumulating \$127,081 in his rookie season and taking a 1:54.4 mark, Emma Town Bud wintered in Florida, training with a group of pacers. The owner believes this tactic may have helped make his trotter stronger heading into the 2020 campaign. He has returned sharp, evidenced by the sophomore's first three starts. In his debut June 17, Emma Town Bud moved right to the lead from post eight and wired the field, kicking home in :26.2 to win by over three lengths in 1:55.1. The next time out he squared off against TJ's Top Pick setting the fractions while his adversary sat in the pocket second. A stretch duel never materialized as TJ's Top Pick broke stride turning for home and Oosting steered Emma Town Bud to a seven-length score, circling the oval in 1:54.2.

In the opening round of sires stakes action, the gelding did not command the field, instead taking a seat behind narrow second choice Swan In Motion. Waiting patiently until the stretch, Oosting moved the three year old out and brushed past the leader to win by a length. His 1:53.2 time matched the mile registered by TJ's Top Pick in the other sires stakes division that night.

"He goes out of the gate and there aren't too many that can beat him out of the gate. This year he is more relaxed sitting in a hole. He has always shown some quickness, but this year it just seems he's bloomed a little bit and developed some lungs, and appears stronger than he was as a two year old," said Hooley. "When he's loaded and he's got some cover and you tip him out, he pins his ears back and it's time to go. He just explodes."

He has banked \$25,000 in his first three seasonal starts, but a long sires stakes season awaits Emma Town Bud. With the Breeders Crown returning to Indiana this year, Hooley kept his pupil eligible should the sophomore continue to thrive in each test.

"One thing that probably isn't going to help him is his size. Right now, I've got confidence in him," the owner explained. "I just hope I can keep him sound and keep him eating. Other than that, it's up to him and up to the driver to get him where he needs to go. He is for sure an athlete and he's got the will to do it. We'll just see what happens and try to have a little fun with him."

Courtney Pink – farm veterinarian at Diamond Creek

Born and raised in Hartford, CT, it was a bit of a culture shock when Courtney Pink attended veterinarian school at Texas A & M. Unlike most youngsters that change their mind dozens of times on a career choice, Pink knew exactly what she wanted to do with her life.

"When I was eight years old I was taking horseback riding lessons when a vet came to the farm to treat a horse with colic," she said. "At the time I didn't know what colic was or what the vet was doing, only that he was making the sick horse feel better. From that day on all I wanted to do was to make sick horses well."

Specializing in reproduction and neonatology, a job opened up at Hanover Shoe Farms shortly after Pink graduated. She jumped on it.

"I took the job at the breeding farm and fell in love with harness racing. It was exhilarating to become part of the team at Hanover — the #1 standardbred horse-breeding farm that raises and breeds the next generation of champion racehorses.

"It's wonderful to help with the foals, watch them grow, and hit the track. And it is especially exciting when some of the horses I foaled return to the farm to become broodmares. It is a 'full circle' moment.

"After graduating from veterinary school I did my internship at Hill-N-Dale, a thoroughbred-breeding farm in Lexington, Kentucky. From there I went on to work at Hanover from 2008-2016. After I left there I worked at Mid Atlantic Equine Center in Ringoes, New Jersey, for one year, which brought me to where I am today and have been for the past four seasons – Diamond Creek Farms.

"Currently 75 horses call Diamond Creek home, including stallions, broodmares, foals, tease mares and several HHYF trottingbreds."

This makes for a very long day for Dr. Pink.

"I start the day early in the morning checking the broodmares and young foals to ensure they have done well overnight. Then it's off to the breeding shed, collecting all stallions that have semen orders for that day and ovulation checks. After the broodmares have been checked I attend to any new cases or very sick horse."

Diamond Creek is proud to stand several top stallions such as Father Patrick, Always B Miki and Creatine.

"We do have many great sires so it's hard to pick a favorite, as they are all so different. I really enjoy working with Father Patrick as we have a really great working relationship.

"Patrick is a very 'alpha male' stallion so trying to learn his personality and working relationship was hard at first. But now that we know one another we have a great relationship.

"On the pacing side, Always B Miki is my favorite for he is very quirky and has a huge personality. Miki has developed into a great stallion over the past four years and we are excited for his future.

"Creatine, another one of our trotting stallions, was born at Diamond Creek. He is a 2010 stallion out of Berry Nice Muscles that was retired from racing due to an injury in the midst of his 6-year-old campaign, after earning slightly over \$2.1 million. Creatine's first crop of foals are 2-year-olds and we are very optimistic he will produce some great racehorses."

Another superstar born at Diamond Creek is the Somebeachsomewhere mare out of Western Montana named Pure Country. Born in 2013, Pure Country went on to earn over \$2.4 million and was named Pacing Filly/Mare Of The Year for her 2, 3, and 4-year-old years. Pure Country was retired and is currently enjoying her new career as a mama — raising her first foal, a Sweet Lou filly.

The breeding end of the business is not easy. It can be tiring and heartbreaking, but also exciting, and the reason why many of us die-hards remain in the sport.

It's 'the dream' of every horseman to breed and raise a world champion — or at least, a very good stakes winner.

"I think getting a good foal has a lot to do with genetics. If you have a smart, athletic, strong mare bred to a great, proven stallion the odds are in your favor of getting an athlete.

"In addition to genetics, everything needs to go right. I like to say my goal is to have good healthy broodmares bred to good healthy stallions, which will lead to great pregnancies, followed by an easy foaling, and a healthy foal that will grow up to be a healthy yearling, that will turn into a successful racehorse.

"Also, to get that perfect cross, again, it has to do with genetics. But for me personally, it is the untrained or unraced sister to the good race mare bred to a great stallion."

Pink said Lilting Laughter is one of the most special horses she has ever encountered.

"When I first met her she was an active broodmare, although at the time she wasn't carrying her foals anymore. We were breeding her and flushing an embryo out of her so a recipient mare could carry the foal for her as Lilting (as we call her) no longer could carry herself.

"Although she was officially retired as a broodmare, she

took on a second career as a nanny mare. I always loved using her as a nanny mare because as soon as we would bring her into the foaling barn, she would nicker for the foal.

"Lilting loved each and every foal as if they were her own. Today, she is 30 years-old and officially retired living her life with a herd of horses."

Pink said she thinks invitro fertilization is an excellent development.

"Assisted reproductive techniques have come so far in the last 20 years that I think we should utilize it more than we probably do. It is a great way for a proven broodmare to continue producing foals when they are no longer able to get pregnant. We have the knowledge and technology to provide these services and I think they should be readily available for those who wish to pursue these options.

"As far as too old to breed, I think that is a mare dependent answer. Some mares are great producers and very fertile into their late teenage years producing nice foals, so I would let them continue to breed. For others who might start missing a year or producing small foals, I would say you should probably think of retiring them."

Rocknificent upends frosh champ Lyons Sentinel in PASS at The Meadows

Exploiting a pocket trip, **Rocknificent** spoiled the sophomore debut of Dan Patch Award winner Lyons Sentinel by outkicking her and scoring in Saturday's (July 11) \$210,932 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows. The event for 3-year-old filly pacers, known as the Adios Betty, was contested over three divisions, with **Drama Act** and **Party Girl Hill** taking the other splits.

The action-packed card featured 16 races — all stakes splits for 2- and 3-year-old filly pacers — featured a number of budding stars. But the most intriguing story line was Lyons Sentinel's season kickoff, which was delayed by COVID-19 disruptions. She looked sharp in three qualifiers, but on Saturday's sloppy-but-drying surface, she couldn't hold off Rocknificent, who prevailed by a length in 1:50.4. Shouldabeenatd completed the ticket.

The win by Rocknificent, a Captaintreacherous daughter of Dan Patch awardee Rocklamation who banked \$285.006 at 2, wasn't much of an upset. In fact, players expected it, sending her off at 3-5 versus 3-2 odds for Lyon's Sentinel.

"It was always going to come down to a sprint," said winning driver Scott Zeron. "I was happy my horse was able to win and not have to do any work. She's an extremely intelligent horse who puts herself in great positions all the time. She has a really quick turn of speed. So even chasing a great horse like that, it becomes a foot race at the end. I'm always confident that she has the quicker foot."

Linda Toscano trains Rocknificent for Enviro Stables, South Mountain Stables and Little E LLC.

Jim, King, Jr., who conditions Lyons Sentinel, was far from disappointed with her performance.

"It was her first time out, and trip beat her," King said. "You can't be upset with that. I don't think there's any shame in her game."

Drama Act took to the track when it was at its sloppiest, and she relished the off going, powering to a front-end victory in 1:50.4 with a back half in :54.3. Alexis's Beach finished second, beaten 2-1/2 lengths, with Blazin Grace third.

"She paced the back half in :52.3 last week at Hoosier, so we know she's got it in her," said Krista Harmon, who conditions the daughter of Well Said—Lounge Act for The Ok Corral. "As long we stay healthy and sound, I think we'll be there at the end of the year. You look at

her and you don't see a 1:50 mile coming out of this little butterball, but it's in there."

\$190,283 PASS — 2-Year-Old Filly Pacers

Saturday's program also featured the Sand Tart, a PASS for freshman filly pacers, with the splits going to **Grace Hill**, **Continualou** and **Let 'Er Buck**.

Grace Hill got to perform after the track's upgrade to fast, and the daughter of Always B Miki—Western Silk took full advantage, roaring to the point with a quarter-pole move for Dexter Dunn and winning her second straight PASS split, this one in 1:52.4. Dancethenightaway was second, 2-3/4 lengths back, while Marsala Hanover earned show.

"She has a long stride and does her work pretty easy," Dunn said. "She went in 1:52 today and felt like she was doing it pretty easy. She has a good future."

Nifty Norman conditions Grace Hill for Tom Hill.

Continualou was sitting second near the three-quarters when Chris Page confidently pulled the pocket with her. The daughter of Sweet Lou—Continual Velocity cruised by, breaking her maiden in 1:54.2. When Uptown Hanover and Ocean's Apart rounded out the ticket, it gave trainer Ron Burke a 1-2-3 sweep of this split.

"I realize how old I'm getting when I'm starting to drive the moms of these things," Page said. "I drove her mom — had like three lungs — and I think she passed that on to her baby. She felt pretty good and I thought, well, we'll give her a shot. The sky's the limit for her."

\$100,000 PA Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Filly Pacers

The Bethinator notched the fastest victory, winning in 1:51.3 for Dave Palone and trainer Brett Pelling, while Enduring Hope provided the tote board fireworks, upsetting at 26-1 for Tim Tetrick and conditioner Tom Fanning. Also victorious were Ashtini, Girl On The Beach and Alexa Skye.

\$100,000 PA Stallion Series — 2-Year-Old Filly Pacers

Lady Newton and **Fighting Evil** each scored in 1:54 to share stake honors. **Blonde Onthe Beach**, **Darby Hanover** and **Podium Girl** took the other divisions.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Monday, when the 15-race card features a \$5,000 total-pool guarantee for the Early Pick 4 (race 3) and a \$2,713.47 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5. First post is 12:45 PM.



Allywag Hanover wins; Captain Groovy, Chief Mate upset

Allywag Hanover, the 1:48 3-year-old colt pacer who took a bye from the Meadowlands Pace elimination and came down to Harrah's Philly for Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) competition, showed his sharpness while coming his personal back half in :54 for a 1:50.4 win over a "sloppy track" on Friday afternoon (July 10).

But neither Chief Mate, his fellow Meadowlands Pace elimination "bye"-taker, nor Captain Groovy, who also paced his 1:48 earlier this year, could avoid falling victim to an upset despite racing gallantly in their respective \$39,432 divisions of the first prelim for their PASS group.

Many speedy horses at Philly have recently employed the tactic of securing a decent early position, then rocketing to the lead with a backstretch brush. This is the path Tim Tetrick chose as the way to win with Allywag Hanover, and the Captaintreacherous colt looked in prime form with his twin :27 quarters home, winning by 5¾ lengths to remain undefeated in three starts this year for trainer Brett Pelling and the Allywag Stable.

The first of the "banner colts" to suffer defeat was Chief Mate, undefeated in two 2020 starts, who got to the half in :55.2 and then had his main rival, **Sandbetweenmytoes**, coming at him first-over. But the Somebeachsomewhere gelding Sandbetweenmytoes paced his own last half in :54.3 raw to pass Chief Mate by three-quarters of a length in 1:50.4, a time which equaled his mark. Dexter Dunn drove the winner, two for three this season, for trainer Jim Campbell and Fashion Farms LLC.

Captain Groovy was the one to take the uncovered path in his section, and he grinded to the lead approaching the stretch. But the Sweet Lou gelding **No Lou Zing**, sitting third-in for driver Josert Fonseca, built early momentum up the inside when the pocket-sitter followed the favorite outside near the stretch, then showed good late foot into the :55.2 second half to win by a half-length in 1:53, his third victory in four outings in 2020. Nancy Takter trains the winner for 3 Brothers Stables, the Rojan Stables, and Caviart Farms.

Sire Sweet Lou had a Sire Stake double when the gelding **Tito Rocks**, despite entering the race as a maiden, was accorded favoritism by the crowd, and he backed the crowd's faith despite having to come first-up into a :54.3 back half, just overhauling Sea Of Life by a neck in 1:52.1, a lifetime best. Dexter Dunn, the only driver to win two Sire Stakes, got Tito Rocks home for trainer Robert Cleary and Royal Wire Products Inc.

Captaintreacherous also got a Sires double with the win of the gelding **The Greek Freak**, who surprised at 12-1 for driver

Matt Kakaley, trainer Ron Burke, and Burke Racing Stable LLC, Piatt Racing, J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby, and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. The Greek Freak was hard-used early to get a pocket trip, but the early energy paid dividends late, as 59-1 shot Diamond Head wore down favored pacesetter Enough Sun, only to see the "Freak" scoot up the inside to win by three lengths in 1:52, giving him two wins and a second in three yearly races.

There were also six \$20,000 Stallion Series sections on the soggy Friday program, with Somebeachsomewhere siring three winners and Western Ideal two, including one each for trainer Chris Ryder, the only trainer with a double in the StS action. The Western Ideal gelding **Barrage Hanover** was successful in 1:54 for driver Victor Kirby and trainer/owner Ryder, while Somebeachsomewhere produced the gelding **Moneyman Hill**, who was a pocket rocket in 1:52.4 for Ryder, driver David Miller, and owner Tom Hill.

The other two winners by Somebeachsomewhere were also geldings: **Sunuma Beach**, who shook off a big backstretch challenge and went on to win in 1:53.3 for driver Tim Tetrick, trainer Linda Toscano, and owner Arnie Chusid, and **Revolt**, who took the backstretch-brush-to-victory route for driver George Brennan, trainer Nik Drennan, and owners Joseph Davino, Brad Shackman, and the Drennan Stable LLC.

The other Western Ideal winner was the colt **Seriously Hanover**, who crossed the wire first in his last start at Pocono only to be taken down for going inside stretch pylons en route to victory; this time he made an early move to the lead and came home in 27.4 to reduce his mark to 1:52.4 for driver Scott Zeron, trainer Ron Coyne Jr., and owners Michael Cimaglio, Stephen Demeter, and Stephen Giagni.

Finally, the Sweet Lou gelding **Sweet Truth** used the successful backstretch-brush tactic en route to a 1:53.4 triumph, coming home in :27.4 for driver Yannick Gingras, trainer Ron Burke, and Burke Racing Stable LLC, J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby, William Switala, and James Martin.

It was Munster (Tyler Buter) with the early lead. Reba Blue Chip (Verlin Yoder) took over and led to a first quarter of :26.3. No Mas Drama (Joe Bongiorno) then took control as they headed for the backstretch. Destiny Blue Chip (John MacDonald) came first over and put the pressure on. No Mas Drama maintained a short lead hitting the half in :56. The two kept side by side going around the final turn. No Mas Drama hit three-quarters first in 1:25.1.

Love A Good Story (\$3.30) moved second over third as they went around the final turn. As they made the turn for home, she went three-wide and looked like she was shot out of a cannon as she rushed to the front. Reba Blue Chip was blocked in as they headed to the final turn. Once she got an opening it was too late and she had to settle for second as Love A Good Story won in a lifetime best of 1:52.1 Munster finished third.

Love A Good Story is a 3-year-old filly by Chapter Seven out of Celebrity Lovin. It was her second win this season and ninth career victory. She is trained by Julie Miller for owners Pinske Stables, Kentuckiana Racing Stable, and Daniel Plouffe.

Howard Parker drove five winners on the card. He combined with trainer George Ducharme to get wins with Ltmeatcake Hanove r(\$3.10), Greyscale (\$8.30), and Charlotte Chaplin (\$3.80). His other wins came with Golden Brit (\$4.10), and The Dough Man \$11.60).

Driver Leon Bailey and trainer Misty Carey combined for three wins as well. They were in the winner's circle for **Mister Livan N** (\$8.70), **Tempster Hanover** (\$6.90), and **Hit The Road Joe** (\$5.30).

Live racing returns to Vernon Downs with a 12-race card on Thursday (July 16) with a post time of 4:00 p.m.

Hambletonian prospects in All-Stars races at Pocono

Many owners and trainers contemplating entering their top 3-year-old trotters for the sport's greatest prize, the Hambletonian, got a good evaluation of their horse's prowess three weeks before Hambletonian elim day as The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono held three \$30,000 divisions Saturday (July 11) of the Pennsylvania All-Stars event for this division.

The fastest winner was the Father Patrick colt**Big Oil**, undefeated in two starts this year and the setter of a world record for a dead-heat on the trot when he tied with Real Cool Sam in 1:52.1 at Lexington last year. Andrew McCarthy, deputizing in the sulky for trainer Julie Miller and the ownership of Melvin Hartman, David McDuffee and Little E

LLC, sent the favored colt to the early lead in a :27.2 opener – but then got a bit of surprise as second choice Chestnut Hill rocketed from eighth to first in the second quarter, looping a parked horse, and putting Big Oil in the pocket in middle fractions of :57.2 and 1:24.4 (third split with the wind).

Chestnut Hill got away by a couple of lengths into the stretch, but then his hard exertions started to get to him, and as Big Oil charged up in the Pocono Pike, the pacesetter lapsed from stride, with Big Oil winding up 2¼ lengths to the good at the end of the 1:53.2 mile. Despite the late miscue, Chestnut Hill impressed with his speed and held second after a brief inquiry found he violated no rules.

The Father Patrick gelding **Amigo Volo**, who set four world records during his freshman campaign and earned over \$600,000, earned his first victory in his second 2020 start, winning another division by two lengths in 1:54. George Napolitano Jr. sent the winner to the front early and looked to be in control throughout, keeping pocket-sitter Swiss House Onfire at bay for trainer Nifty Norman and the ownership of Pinske Stables and David J. Miller.

The Andover Hall colt **DD's Redemption** may be given a shot at the upcoming big money, as in only his fifth lifetime start he took a new mark of 1:54.4 in his All-Stars cut. Åke Svanstedt raced "DD" in the pocket after Shinkansen insisted on the lead, moved out head-stretch, and then just did hold off the 55-1 Overserved, who shot up the vacated inside to miss by the slimmest of margins. Svanstedt is also the trainer of the chancy colt for Meri Equicare LLC.

George Napolitano Jr. wound up the day with six visits to the winners circle. The final one gave Pocono its fastest mile of the year so far as Branquinho, a son of Somebeachsomewhere who had missed only two lengths behind Workin Ona Mystery in a Graduate division at Tioga, closed off a cutthroat pace to take a new mark of 1:49.3 for owner/trainer Ray Schnittker.

During a twilight card starting 5 p.m. today (July 12), Pocono will feature five divisions of an All-Stars event for 2-year-old pacing colts, which will include three winners from the first leg of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes: Always A Miki, Bayfield Beach, and Lou's Pearlman.

Tokyo Seelster cruises in freshman trotting colt Gold opener

It was debut night for the 2-year-old trotting colts on Thursday (July 9) and the 25 youngsters put on an impressive show for Woodbine Mohawk Park fans in a trio of \$73,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions.

Tokyo Seelster went off as the heavy favorite in the first division and the Kadabra son delivered a commanding front end performance that saw him trot under the wire two and one-half lengths ahead of his peers in 1:58.1. Rookie Season shadowed the fan favorite to claim runner-up honours and C My Kicks Hanover closed hard to be third.

"We broke him and then he went on to Robbie Robinson and we just got him back last week," said trainer Richard Moreau, tipping his hat to Robinson for teaching the colt his early lessons. "He's a beautiful colt, mature for his age."

Moreau selected Tokyo Seelster from the London Yearling Sale last fall, offering up \$52,000 for the colt on behalf of owners Michael and Sam Sergi of Canton, NY. Ottawa-based Robinson gave the young trotter two qualifiers at Rideau Carleton Raceway in June and then brought him to Woodbine Mohawk Park for a June 30 race, which he won by a neck in 1:58.

"He's big and strong and mature for his age and his size. Usually those big kind of trotters are kind of clumsy and stuff, but he's all business and he knows what to do. I give credit to Robbie Robinson, he did a great job with the horse to have him the way he is now, he just did a great job with him," said driver Sylvain Filion, echoing Moreau's praise. "I could have raced him any way I wanted, but once I cleared the front, I knew I was in control of the race and that was it, he was an easy winner."

The second division saw Woodbine Mohawk Park fans put their money behind Walkonthemoon, but **Macho Martini** caught the pacesetting favorite in the stretch to claim the 1:57.2 victory by three-quarters of a length. Walkonthemoon settled for second and Greg finished seven lengths back in third.

The win may have come as a surprise to fans, but driver Bob McClure has been convinced of Macho Martini's star potential for several weeks.

"The first time he came to Mohawk was probably a month ago. I had heard about him from Luc (Blais) and the first time I went with him I said, 'Either this one is really, really good or the rest are really, really bad', because he was just waves ahead of the other ones and such a natural," said McClure. "And then the first time I ever stretched him out was his last qualifier (July 3), and I had no idea I was coming :27 flat, all I knew was that he just kept getting faster and faster and

faster. Even tonight, down by the wire is where he was trotting his fastest, so he's had me excited for about a month now."

McClure, trainer Luc Blais and owner Determination of Montreal, QC are no strangers to success in the trotting colt ranks. Macho Martini's stablemate Forbidden Trade was an Ontario Sires Stakes star at 2 and 3 and captured the Hambletonian Final last summer. McClure points out that young horses can change a great deal over the season, sometimes for the better and sometimes not, but for now he is allowing himself to imagine unlimited potential for Macho Martini.

"At this point you don't know what they're going to be, the sky's the limit," he said. "Especially when they go out and the open their career that way, you know. You start thinking down the road and it's pretty exciting."

The Muscle Mass son was a \$37,000 purchase from the Harrisburg Yearling Sale and provided a quick return on investment Thursday, banking \$36,933 with the win.

Not to be outdone by his peers, in the final division favorite Royal Tyrone halted the teletimer at 1:57.1, overcoming a couple of awkward moments in the stretch to keep a head in front of Mystic and Logan Park.

"When I tried to get him into gear in the lane he was trying to trot fast, but he was getting a little mixed up. He can go a lot faster if I can iron him out," said driver Robert Shepherd with a rueful chuckle. "He's a really manageable colt, but when one comes he wants to race, he wants to go fast, he wants to win, right, and then he just gets a little mixed up late."

Shepherd and his partner Isabelle Darveau condition Royal Tyrone for 1187422 Ontario Inc. of Ottawa, ON and they will spend the next three weeks trying to help the Royalty For Life gelding maximize his speed in preparation for the second Gold Leg on July 30 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"I'm going to maybe change some things, see if I can maybe just mess around with some gear and stuff I think," said Flamborough resident Shepherd of the gelding, who was a \$13,000 acquisition from the London Selected Yearling Sale. "I can't fault the colt, he always tries, he always wants to go forward."

Wally Hennessey wins six including feature at Tioga

Defending driving dash champion Wally Hennessy, once again put on a show at Tioga Downs on Friday (July 10) with

six wins including a victory with Prairie Cougar in the \$8,000 fillies and mares open handicap.

PersistantBetto r(Bruce Aldrich) was the first to lead in the feature. Prairie Cougar (\$6.60) forged to the front before hitting the first quarter in :27.2. She would use us a :29.3 second quarter to hit the half first in :57. Charging Moa N (Mike Merton) came first-over down the back stretch and actually took a slight lead to three-quarters in 1:23.4.

Prairie Cougar battled back and reclaimed the lead to win in a lifetime best of 1:51.4. Charging Moa N had to settle for second. Gold Star Mysti (Corey Braden) finished third.

Prairie Cougar is a 4-year-old mare by Royal Millennium. Owned by Laurie Poulin, Barbara Jensen, and trainer Mike Deters, she won for the third time this season. She now has 10 career victories.

Hennessey's other wins came with **Odds On Cheddar**(\$3.60), **Ey Cowboy**(\$21.80), **Big Bill Breez e**(\$3.00), **Money Earned** (\$4.70), and **Mister Marvalous** (\$5.10).

Rain unable to dampen fillies' Grassroots debut

Rain caused a brief delay in Friday night's (July 10) program at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but it did nothing to dampen the efforts put forward by the two-year-old pacing fillies in their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots debut.

Five \$22,000 divisions went postward Friday and **Sportsfire** delivered the quickest result in the first split. The daughter of Sportswriter and driver Bob McClure left smartly from Post 2 and reached the quarter in :27.2 and the half in :56. Fan favorite Ourlittlemiracle revved up at the half, looking to take command, but Sportsfire battled back and the fillies matched strides through the 1:24.1 three-quarters. Down the stretch Sportsfire had a little more in the tank than her rival, hanging on for a three-quarter length victory in 1:53.2. Ourlittlemiracle was second and pocket-sitter Turning The Table was third.

"She got stretched in the quarter and pushed in the third-quarter," said McClure. "But she's a quick little filly, very honest. She'll give you a solid effort."

Fred Brayford of Alliston, ON bred and owns Sportsfire and Daniel Lagace trains the filly, who now has a win and a fourth on her resume through two lifetime starts.

McClure also piloted the winner of the fourth division, **Cyclone Sister**. Starting from Post 4 the pair sat mid-pack through much of the race, tipping out past the half behind

Siri Blue Chip and advancing to third by the top of the stretch. A big :26.4 final quarter saw the Shadow Play daughter sprint by the leaders and on to a one length victory in 1:55.4. Fan favorite Celia Bayama snuck up the inside to be second and Siri Blue Chip was third.

"She's very fast, but very flighty," said McClure, who drives Cyclone Sister for trainer Nick Gallucci and owner/breeder Millar Farms of Stouffville, ON. "She's scared of her own shadow, and drivers' colours and loud noises, but she has a lot of ability and should only improve."

The rain started to fall as the second division got underway and fan favorite Drinks All Round led the field to a :28.1 quarter. Drinks All Round and A La Mode Seelster traded places twice on the way to the :56.1 half, leaving many of their peers well behind, including CL Sportsextreme who was 11 lengths back in sixth. The gap closed heading for the 1:26.2 three-quarters and as the fillies turned for home the leaders were tiring and **CL Sportsextreme** was rolling out three-wide and taking aim on the wire. The lightly regarded CL Sportsextreme powered home to a three and three-quarter length victory in 1:56.2. A La Mode Hanover stayed game for second and Watching Cassie was third.

"She's a very willing filly that qualified nicely," said driver Chris Christoforou of CL Sportsextreme. "She got towed into a slowing pace after an unusually quick second quarter. She took full advantage of that and finished strong."

Christoforou crafted the Sportswriter daughter's come-from-behind victory for trainer Dany Fontaine and owner/breeder Ecuries C. LeBlanc Inc. of Saint-Eustache, QC.

Christoforou also scored a second Grassroots victory, piloting **Chiefs Dream Girl** to a front-end score in 1:55.4. Annies Legacy finished two and one-quarter lengths behind the favorite and just a nose ahead of Wasaga to wrap up the Grassroots program.

"She's a big, strong filly. She raced great her last start (July 3), Jack has been patient with her and it's paid off," said Christoforou. "She made a nice move in the second quarter and was very strong the rest of the mile."

Jack Moiseyev trains the homebred daughter of Sunshine Beach for High Stakes Inc. of Moffat, ON and LSC Stables of North Brunswick, NJ.

The third division saw **Jackieofalltrades** sprint away from Post 5 to a :28.2 quarter, then yield to Twin B Sunkissed heading for the :58.3 half. Twin B Sunkissed went unchallenged to the 1:27.1 three-quarters, but Jackieofalltrades and driver Sylvain Filion stepped out of the

pocket in the stretch and out-duelled the fan favorite for a one-half length win in 1:55.

"All winter she's been a nice little filly. She was not really one of the stars or anything, but she just seemed to do everything right and every time we trained her, she'd show us a little more," said trainer Tony Beaton. "She just seemed to keep going forward and improving every training, and she showed it tonight."

Beaton shares ownership of Jackieofalltrades with David Lumsden of Ancaster, ON and David Mercer of Sydney, NS. The partners offered up \$20,000 for the Betterthancheddar daughter at last fall's London Selected Yearling Sale.

Jackieofalltrades earned back half of her purchase price on Friday and will have an opportunity to add to her lifetime total when the fillies head to Grand River Raceway next Friday, July 17 for their second Grassroots leg.

Hambletonian Maturity supplements due by 8 a.m., Tuesday, July 14

The \$400,000E Hambletonian Maturity trotting race is scheduled for Saturday, July 18 at The Meadowlands. It is the seventh edition of the race created by the Hambletonian Society and The Meadowlands to provide more racing opportunity for four-year-old trotters.

The Hambletonian Maturity allows for supplemental entries under the following conditions:

Supplemental entries are due and payable by 8 a.m. on Tuesday, July 14, 2020.

Payment of \$50,000 (\$42,000 plus the \$8,000 entrance fee) must be in certified U.S. Funds and RECEIVED in the Meadowlands Race Office prior to 8 a.m. (local time) on that day along with the supplemental entry. The supplemental check or wire may also be delivered to the Hambletonian Society office before the end of the business day on Monday, July 13.

All supplemental entrance fees shall be made payable to the Hambletonian Society Inc. All supplemental fees shall be added to the amount of the purse of the specific race.

Entries for eligible Maturity horses are due at the standard

entry time of 9 a.m. Tuesday, July 14.

If any supplemental entries are received for the Hambletonian Maturity, notice will be disseminated via the Meadowlands text message service.

Like the Hambletonian and Oaks, the Maturity racing conditions prohibit the use of Lasix, the only race day medication permitted in New Jersey, and entrants are subject to out of competition testing.

The Maturity is raced at a distance of a mile and an eighth and allows for up to 16 starters. If more than 16 enter, the top money-earners in their three and four-year-old seasons are given preference.

There are 34 eligible trotters: 26 horses and geldings and eight trotting mares.

All starters sixth through last will receive money.

Ten Ohio Sires Stakes contested Saturday

Ten divisions of Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) were contested Saturday night, July 11 at Scioto Downs.

Charlie May captured the first of four \$40,000 OHSS contests for 2-year-old pacing colts for driver Danny Noble as the 1-9 favorite in 1:54.2. It was the second career victory for the brown son of McArdle in as many lifetime starts. Trained by Steve Carter, Charlie May now has \$95,000 in career earnings for breeder-owner Don Tiger. Barnard Hanover, a 16-1 longshot, was second for Chris Page, while Brett Miller steered I'm Sorry Man to a third place finish at 5-1 odds.

Lady Arthur took the first of four \$40,000 OHSS races for freshman pacing fillies in 1:53.2 in a wire-to-wire performance for driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., besting rival Summer Touch (Chris Page) by a neck. Disaronno Hill (Brett Miller) was third. Lady Arthur is a daughter by Arthur Blue chip and the victory was the first of her career in two starts. She now has \$22,738 in career earnings for trainer and co-owner Dr. Ian Moore, who owns the filly in partnership with the RG McGroup and Serge Savard.

Yanks Dugout captured the first of two \$50,000 OHSS events for 3-year-old trotting colts, besting four rivals in 1:54.2 and holding off a late charge by It's Academic (Chris Page) by a head. It was the second victory in the series for the son of Triumphant Caviar who is trained by Edward Miller and was driven by Kurt Sugg for owners Ivan and Duke Sugg, who also bred the youngster. Yanks Dugout now has \$75,150 in his career coffers. Stonefire US (Dewayne Minor) nabbing third-place honors.

Laughagain Hanover got a perfect steer by Peter Wrenn to capture the second OHSS division for freshmen pacing colts, stopping the timer in 1:54.3. The son of McArdle, who is trained by Laura Searway, left the gate as the 9-5 favorite and notched his second lifetime win in as many tries. Hill Yeah was second at 3-1 for Chris Page, while 3-1 Jackie Moon was third for Josh Sutton. Owned by Michael Cimaglio, W. Richardson and R Cimaglio, Laughagain Hanover has \$2,248 in career earnings.

Winella Hanover took a new lifetime mark of 1:54.4 en route to her victory in the second OHSS for 2-year-old pacing fillies. Driven by Chris Page for trainer Ronnie Burke, the daughter of Racing Hill notched her third straight triumph in as many tries. Owned by Burke Racing, Weaver Bruscemi, J. Mellilo and J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby, Winella Hanover now has \$99,800 in her career bankroll.

The 1-9 favorite upped his seasonal earnings to \$80,500 with four wins in as many tries. Wading Boots was second for Chris page, while Doubleyellowline got up for third for Dan Noble.

Hardt At Work prevailed in the third OHSS division for 2-year-old pacing colts, tripping the timer in 1:55.1. The son of Manhardt is conditioned and was driven by Mike Micallef

for Brett Boyd Racing and Anthony Formosa. Rockin Airway was second for Kayne Kauffman, while Caviart Sargent was third for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. Hardt At Work is now two for two in his brief career and sports a bankroll of \$23,750.

Driven by Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., for trainer/owner Danielle Snyder, the daughter by Domethatagain picked up her second straight victory in as many tries, upping her career earnings to \$23,400. We supported this position by giving a \$200 stipend (now \$250) for horses not receiving a purse check and adding 10 per cent to the purse for 10 horse fields. These added funds were appropriated from the horsemen's purse account with no contribution from track management. We are considering allowing more 10 horse fields because, without question, it helps the handle. Dana's statistics should help others to understand the importance of larger fields. I appreciate him taking time to explain this vitally important matter.

The world now has a terrible situation to deal with, coronavirus, I can understand that it was almost impossible at first to find racing when very few tracks were open, they were showing tracks no one's ever heard of unless they live near said track. Now that things have come back around they have brought back the Meadowlands and Mohawk. Unfortunately, one of my favorite tracks is back and they have not shown any races from there. Yonkers!

I don't know what harness racing has done to TVG for them to cover harness racing with such disrespect. Perfect

example of this was (Friday) night. The Meadowlands was at post time and Del Mar was 7 mins out, they never left the coverage of Del Mar, and then after the race they went to Penn National then finally decided to show the Meadowlands race. Why is it when TVG does show a harness race they can't wait to get it off the screen and move on to some other race? Usually, there is no post-race analysis, they just take the race off the screen in a flash and tell you the prices with be shown at the bottom of the screen. The disparity in coverage is very sad and should be embarrassing to TVG, as it is all horse racing in the end and we the harness players are human too and deserve the same respect afforded the other racing.


