indictments, a wicked pandemic and a wide range of assorted tests and cruelties.

Battered, but not completely broken. For one cannot possibly survive for long in harness racing if one does not possess – to borrow from the name of a recent longshot winner at The Meadows trained by Tom Fanning – Enduring Hope.

So, we pray for races like last night's Meadowlands Pace, where uber-talented heavyweights act like it and highly-touted, big-money stakes deliver in the form of raised goosebumps, pulses and endorphins.

That's not always the case, of course.

But in this, of all years, ***we needed this***: an epic battle of equine fortitude and speed and strength that reminded us what we love so much about horses.

We needed it played out on an delightful card on the biggest stage featuring more than \$2.6 million in purses, betting that exceeded \$5 million and a raft of equine superstars that had collective earnings north of \$53 million heading into the night.

We needed it like a kid in Grade 7 needs to burst from school when the final bell rings on the last day before summer vacation.

That's exactly how it felt watching the whole delicious card unfold.

Here was **Manchego** dominating the Miss Versatility as you knew she would.

There was Andrew McCarthy blasting **Ramona Hill** to victory out of the 10-hole in the Delvin Miller for Tony Alagna.

Here was **Back Of The Neck** and **Ready For Moni** inching closer to Hambletonian glory with strong victories in their Stanley Dancer divisions.

There was McCarthy and Alagna teaming up again to score from an outside post – this time with **Reflect With Me** from the 8-hole in the Mistletoe Shalee.

Here was **Dancin Lou** sprinting to victory in 1:47.2 in the William Haughton.

There was **Gimpanzee** laying claim to the title of North America's best trotter with a jaw-dropper from post 13 in the Hambletonian Maturity.

Here was Dexter Dunn orchestrating a 50-1 shocker with **Major Occasion A** over Horse of the Year Shartin N in the recently-renamed Dorothy Haughton.

But the \$636,650 Meadowlands Pace was not only the toast of the night, it is destined to go down as one of the most talked about in its rich 43-year history along with Sonsam from the 10-hole, Real Desire vs. Bettors Delight and the granddaddy of them all: the night Art Official nosed out Somebeachsomewhere.

Even masks and distancing and a crowd limited by COVID-19 couldn't ruin Tall Dark Stranger (Yannick Gingras) edging Papi Rob Hanover (David Miller) by a neck in 1:47.2.

Yes, the card, given the pandemic, was far from normal, but The Meadowlands' stellar broadcasting crew, led by the two Daves – buoyant Brower and savvy Little – did their utmost to make it seem as if everything was right in world.

And for one night it certainly seemed that way in a time when professional sports are mostly on pause, concert venues are silent and even mighty Broadway is dark.

Maybe Saturday was just a momentary distraction from the misery.

Likely, the euphoria won't last long.

But, dammit, we needed this.

Tall Dark Stranger gutsy Meadowlands Pace winner

Tall Dark Stranger is a danger, especially with his back to the wall.

Pushed to the max by old rival Papi Rob Hanover, Tall Dark Stranger (Bettors Delight--Precocious Beauty) battled back in deep stretch to win the \$636,650 Meadowlands Pace by a neck on Saturday night (July 18).

In a gutsy effort, Tall Dark Stranger, the 1-2 favorite, captured the first major stakes of the season for 3-year-old pacers. Normally, the Pace follows the North America Cup, but the ongoing pandemic shuffled the calendar. This time,

the Pace was the division's lead-off event, and it was a dandy.

Tall Dark Stranger, last year's Dan Patch winner, took charge with a strong move down the backstretch. Papi Rob Hanover and driver David Miller ranged up to challenge on the turn and fought their way to a clear advantage in the stretch.

Even driver Yannick Gingras thought he and Tall Dark Stranger were finished.

"Honestly, at the top of the stretch, I thought he was beat," Gingras said. "This horse is just so gritty. He wants to fight them off. Papi was a half a length by me."

Tall Dark Stranger wasn't done in this shootout. He surged again, pushing back to secure the win and give Gingras his second Pace win.

It wrote another chapter in a rivalry that dates back to the 2019 Breeders Crown, where Tall Dark Stranger was elevated to victory when Papi Rob Hanover was disqualified for interference.

"I said after the Breeders Crown that he was coming back to win that race," Gingras said. "There are a lot of doubters

out there, but tonight is the proof that my horse loves to fight."

Tall Dark Stranger improved his season mark to 3-for-3 with the 11th win of his 12-race career.

Nancy Takter, daughter of Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter, got her first Pace victory, following Linda Toscano as consecutive female training winners of The Meadowlands Racetrack's signature event.

It was also the second straight Pace win for sire Bettor's Delight following last year's 27-1 upset by Best In Show.

Tall Dark Stranger, bred by Jim Avritt, Sr. and sold for \$330,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale out of the Hunterton consignment, became the sport's latest millionaire for the ownership team of Crawford Farms, Marvin Katz, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor.

The time for the mile was 1:47.2. Tall Dark Stranger paid \$3.00, \$2.10 and \$2.10.

Brett Pelling, all-time Pace training leader with four wins, settled for second and third, as Papi Rob Hanover returned \$3.60 and \$2.80 and Allywag Hanover paid \$2.40 to show.

Meadowlands Pace Night betting tops \$5 million

The wagering on Meadowlands Pace Night Saturday at The Meadowlands got off to a fast start and just kept on rolling all night long.

When all the money was counted, a total of \$5,051,261 was wagered on the 13-race program, by far the most in the industry this year and most on a Pace Night card since 2008, when betting was \$5,371,055. This year's total represented an increase of 25 per cent over 2019 when total action was \$4,044,303.

The play on Saturday was hot and heavy from the start, as \$419,581 was wagered in the first race, which included \$130,539 in the 20-cent Pick-5 pool, a 2020 Big M best.

The track offered a \$100,000 guaranteed pool on the Early 50-cent Pick-4 in Race 6, and wagering blew past that number, as another seasonal best – \$191,288 – was poured into the pot.

The 11th race offered a mandatory payout on the 20-cent Jackpot Super High-Five, and \$133,578 in “new money” was added to the



carryover of \$65,089 to create a total pool of \$198,667. Those who held tickets bearing the winning combination of 4-2-11-3-1 cashed in for \$3,765.32.

Not surprisingly, the Meadowlands Pace took the most action of any single race on the card, with a total of \$645,423 bet, the largest total since the 2013 Pace, when \$662,159 was pushed through the windows.

A LITTLE MORE: When it came to the driver's colony on Pace Night, all 13 races were won by some of the very best in the game. Dexter Dunn and Andy McCarthy won three races apiece, followed by Yannick Gingras and Brian Sears, who each scored twice. The remaining races were taken by Tim Tetrick, Scott Zeron and Dave Miller.

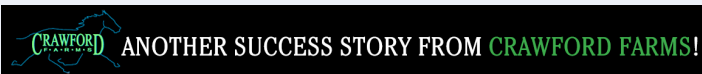

angled off the pylons to brush for the lead. Sorella, the 2-5 favorite, then moved uncovered as Love A Good Story cleared control in the backside. However Ramona Hill, sitting in the pocket, swiftly circled in front of Sorella and Love A Good Story to retake control just beyond a :54.2 half.

Rounding the far turn, Sorella marched forward to match strides with Ramona Hill, while Hypnotic AM rode second-over cover. Past three-quarters in 1:22.2, Sorella began to hang, forcing Hypnotic AM wide and the third-over Panem even wider as Ramona Hill widened her lead. Panem rolled most quickly of any down the center of the track, cutting into Ramona Hill's margin nearing the finish but still finishing 1-1/2 lengths behind. Hypnotic AM took third from Sorella.

"We had Pilot Discretion last year and we raced in the [Hambletonian]. And then, at the end of the year, Ramona [Hill] came on and she was just fantastic," co-owner Robert LeBlanc said after the race. "[Alagna] brought her along slowly — she was a late foal — and we wanted to give her time. We thought we had something special, and Tony said we were going to manage her for the end of the year. And Andy just drives her fantastic ... This is pretty special; she's a special animal."

Back Of The Neck, Ready For Moni win Dancer divisions

Judy Taylor has sometimes given her son, Howard, a tough time about the horses they have owned together. That appears to be about to change.

The Taylors and breeder Stefan Balazsi's Order By Stable own Hambletonian hopeful **Back Of The Neck**, who won Saturday's (July 18) \$142,250 first division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial for 3-year-old male trotters in 1:52 at The Meadowlands.

Howard Taylor, a Philadelphia attorney, is among the owners of 2018 Hambletonian winner Atlanta, as well as a number of other prominent horses, including this year's Meadowlands Pace winner Tall Dark Stranger.

"(My mom says,) 'You have all these good horses. I've never had one,'" Howard said. "I said, 'Every time I buy a horse for you, I own part of it too, I'm not trying to give you a bad horse. But it just never worked out that way. Now it has.'"

Driven by Scott Zeron, Back Of The Neck used a second-over trip to rally in the stretch for his second win in three races this year. Back Of The Neck, trained by Åke Svanstedt, saw stablemate Third Shift hold the lead after the first quarter before Amigo Volo took control at the half.

After Zeron moved with Back Of The Neck from fourth, Svanstedt came first-over with Third Shift heading around the final turn. Back Of The Neck, the 4-5 favorite, won by 2-1/4 lengths over Third Shift, with Big Oil finishing third.

"He was really handy today, really relaxed, which is good," Zeron said. "He's progressively getting smarter and smarter on the track. Every start is just leading up to the Hambletonian in my eyes, so today it was like leave, let him sit, see how he feels in the hole. I was able to sit in longer

A son of French trotting star Ready Cash out of Big Barb, Back Of The Neck has won five of 12 starts lifetime, good for \$207,375.

Another son of Ready Cash won the second division of the Dancer. **Ready For Moni** was fifth at the half-mile point before following Chesnut Hill's cover around the final turn and using a three-wide move in the stretch to win in 1:51.4 as the 5-2 second choice in his seasonal debut.

Hollywood Story was second and Beads finished third. The winning margin was one length.

"I couldn't have scripted it any better," winning driver Yannick Gingras said. "It's his first start of the year and I wanted to somewhat take it easy on him. It couldn't have worked out any better. He's great. I think he's ready for it. He's going to get next week off, I'm pretty sure, and he's ready for the [Hambletonian]."

Ready For Moni, trained by Nancy Takter, is owned by John Fielding, Lindy Farms of Connecticut, Herb Liverman, and Bud Hatfield. He is out of Nothing But Moni, whose dam was the two-time Horse of the Year Moni Maker. He has won five of nine career races and \$352,575. His top triumph last year came in the Kentucky Sire Stakes final, and he was second in the Valley Victory.

Ready For Moni was bred by the Moni Maker Stable of Enfield, CT and raised at Lindy Farms.

The Hambletonian Stakes, the sport's top event for 3-year-old trotters, is Aug. 8 at The Meadowlands. Eliminations will be held Aug. 1.

Reflect With Me was nowhere near the early competition, as Rocknificent rushed to the early lead followed by Priceless. But just as the :26.3 first quarter was clocked, favorite JK First Lady moved to the lead. The outer tier formed behind a first-over challenge by Marloe Hanover, with Reflect With Me getting cover through the :55.2 half and

passing Rocknificent for third on the inside.

JK First Lady pushed through three-quarters in 1:23 as Lyons Sentinel paved a path from cover to challenge for the lead going into the stretch. Those two duelled for control, but Reflect With Me rolled by them. JK First Lady gave way to Rocknificent, who found room on the inside to pick up third as Reflect With Me reached the finish line three-quarters of a length in front of Lyons Sentinel. Priceless finished fourth.

Tony Alagna trains Reflect With Me, a daughter of Captaintreacherous and Remember When. The filly won her second of two starts this season for owners Brittany Farms LLC and Bradley Grant. Reflect With Me paid \$19.40 to win. Brittany Farms bred the filly.

Gimpanzee strolls in Hambletonian Maturity

Gimpanzee and Brian Sears overcame post 13 — as well as a solid field — to capture the \$464,900 Hambletonian Maturity in rather easy fashion Saturday night (July 18) at The Meadowlands.

The 4-year-old son of Chapter Seven—Steamy Windows covered the 1-1/8 mile distance in 2:05.4 as the 3-5 betting choice.

There was much action in the early stages, as Marseille and driver Åke Svanstedt blasted out from post eight to loop many of the horses going into the first turn. Last year's Hambletonian Oaks champion, When Dovescry, was away in good position as well for David Miller through the hot :26 second opening quarter.

Southwind Avenger and Andy McCarthy were parked three-eighths of a mile before clearing to the front, and that was Dave Miller's cue to send the lone mare in the field to the top. When Dovescry got to the half in :55.2 and was soon joined when Yannick Gingras and Kings County made a power move to try to gain control.

When Dovescry and Kings County were locked in battle through much of the final turn, Forbidden Trade attempted to keep with cover second-over and Sears sat third-over in the flow waiting to make his move.

When Dovescry shook off pressure and secured the lead in upper stretch, but after passing the mile marker in 1:52.2, the mare — making her first start this year — began to tire. Sears and Gimpanzee were in full flight and easily powered on in the stretch to win convincingly by 3-1/4 lengths. Forbidden Trade, last year's Hambletonian winner, was pushed hard by driver Scott Zeron and just held down the place spot, holding off a wicked rally by Soul Strong and driver Dexter Dunn.

When Dovescry settled for fourth, and Don't Let'em finished fifth — but did so while on a break and thereby lost the position. The judges moved Kings County up to fifth and Reign Of Honor to sixth in the official order of finish.

Trained by Marcus Melander, two-time Breeders Crown champion Gimpanzee won for the 21st time in his career and is now unbeaten in four 2020 starts. Owned by Courant Inc. and S R F Stable, Gimpanzee returned \$3.40.

"I thought Scott (Zeron aboard Forbidden Trade) would be a good one to follow," said Sears. "I had to move him on the turn he such a class animal."

The victory pushed Gimpanzee's lifetime earnings over the \$2 million mark.

Sears, looking ahead to racing Gimpanzee against older foes, spoke of the attributes required to compete:

"He'll need a trip against those horses, but he's so handy."

Just seven years in, Hambletonian Maturity hitting full stride

The Hambletonian Maturity for 4-year-old trotters won by Gimpanzee in 2:05.4 over 1 1/8th miles Saturday at the Meadowlands was the seventh edition of a new classic.

Hambletonian dreams have come and been shattered by many and enjoyed by few. Until 2014, there were no second chances. If you had a top colt or filly that didn't hit peak condition in early August there was no wait-until-next year mantra.

Things changed for the better in six years ago when the Hambletonian Society stepped in and unveiled a race specifically for 4-year-olds. A new era was born and to many purists it represented a bit of a second chance, even though the competition might still include the previous year's Hambletonian or Hambletonian Oaks winner.

Owner Paul Van Camp had a pretty solid sophomore trotter in Your So Vain in 2013. The Donato Hanover-sired colt won a heat of the Kentucky Futurity and finished second in the Canadian Trotting Classic (CTC) that year but kind of fell a bit short of expectations. For Van Camp, Your So Vain's best race may have been a second-place finish in the CTC.

"Randy Waples was driving him for the first time," said Van Camp. "He told me after the race that if he had known how good he was he would have moved him earlier and we would have won by five." Such are the stories that follow you in racing and remain crystal clear even seven years later.

Van Camp was approached by the late Ole Bach after the sophomore campaign and asked if he would sell Your So Vain with buyers in Europe looking to race him there.

"I knew the Hambletonian Maturity was on the schedule

and I really didn't want to sell the entire horse so we agreed for me to hold on to 10 per cent just so I'd have something to root for," said Van Camp.

That decision led to a change in trainers, as Brad Maxwell relinquished the role and Swedish transplant trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt assumed it.

"Brad did a great job with this horse all the way. We gave him to Ake about two months before the Maturity and let him do what he does best," said Van Camp.

What sticks out while reflecting back on the 2014 Maturity's debut was that Your So Vain was making his first start as a 4-year-old in the \$484,850 contest while his 13 rivals that included 2013 Hambletonian champion Royalty For Life and Oaks winner and race-favorite Bee A Magician had plenty of preparation for the mile and one eighth contest. A record 14 trotters entered.

"I was a little concerned before the race but after watching him score down I thought he looked better physically than any time I'd watched him before," said Van Camp.

Sent off as a 7-1 third choice due in part to drawing the rail and also based on Svanstedt's worldwide reputation for having his horses ready at first asking, Your So Vain made a three-wide move on the backstretch and never looked back on his way to a then world mark of 2:05.3 for the added distance.

"I've watched a lot of races at The Meadowlands over the years," said Van Camp, "I can only recall maybe two times that a horse made a move like that at the half and went on to win the race."

To Van Camp it may not have been the actual Hambletonian but the memories today replicate the feeling he would have gotten had Your So Vain raced like that on the first Saturday in August of 2013.

"I'd say I must watch the replay (of the Hambletonian

Maturity) at least once a week,” said Van Camp while admiring the winner’s circle photo.

In 2015, JL Cruze and John Campbell were reserved off the pace as the odds-on favorite while the Jimmy Takter-trained pair of Shake It Cerry and Father Patrick did the heavy lifting in the early stages. JL Cruze catapulted from last to first and then gamely held off Resolve in a thriller that produced another world record mile and one-eighth clocking of 2:04.2. The Maturity served as a springboard to the rise of JL Cruze who is still competing at a high level in 2020 for trainer Eric Ell.

The favorite parade continued when Hannelore Hanover crushed her male rivals for trainer Ron Burke and driver Yannick Gingras in the 2016 edition. The Indiana-bred daughter of Swan For All branched out as a 4-year-old after dominating the Hoosier state as a sophomore. Hannelore Hanover would go on to earn in excess of \$3 million during her brilliant racing career.

Perhaps the original concept of the Hambletonian Maturity would be its allure to attract the previous year’s Hambletonian champion to defend his or her crown. Until 2017, no Hambletonian winner had successfully done so but that changed when trainer Paula Wellwood returned with Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder. His resume alone may have scared off some of the competition as only eight others entered the \$458,750 contest.

Scott Zeron drove Marion Marauder, a son of Muscle Hill, with the confidence one would expect from a 3-10 favorite and won by a measured half-length. Marion Marauder, despite his Triple Crown conquest, was never a horse that ran away from others but at the same time he seemed to always recognize where the finish line was and usually arrived first. Another Maturity champion alumni, Marion Marauder is still near the top of his game as a 7-year-old in 2020.

Given his overwhelming success stories in both Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks it was kind of a surprise that Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Takter had been shutout of the Hambletonian Maturity winner’s circle, but that changed in a major way in 2018 when the previous year’s Oaks champion Ariana G dominated a field of eight male rivals giving her driver Yannick Gingras his second stakes victory as a prohibitive choice. Perhaps what sticks out most is the :25.3 opening quarter Ariana G trotted. The daughter of Muscle Hill was always able to carry her speed and retired with a 1:50.2 record as well as \$2.4 million career earnings.

It’s safe to say that 2019 represented the year that everything worked out perfectly for those who had hoped the Hambletonian Maturity would become a “Classic” trotting race. First and foremost the \$450,000 event contested last

year at The Meadowlands on July 13 had a field that included the Hambletonian winner from the previous year in the mare Atlanta as well as the Hambletonian Oaks champion Manchego. Trainer Ake Svanstedt had the sub-1:50 Kentucky Futurity champion Six Pack in the field as well and those three took a majority of the betting action.

The 2019 Hambletonian Maturity turned out to be a spectacular race but not for the favorites. Instead, it was 23-1 longshot Crystal Fashion and driver Tim Tetrack working out an absolutely perfect trip despite starting from post seven. Atlanta, the 1-5 favorite racing for trainer Ron Burke after winning the 2018 Hambletonian for conditioner Rick Zeron, was able to control most of the tempo but was unable to hold sway perhaps because of the competition or the longer distance. Crystal Fashion, trained by Jim Campbell put his nose in front on the wire ahead of a charging Custom Cantab with Atlanta crossing the wire third. The judges disqualified Custom Cantab for causing interference in the stretch and set him back to seventh.

Perhaps it’s the extra distance or the healthy purse for a restricted 4-year-old race that has distinguished the Hambletonian Maturity from other races, but more likely it’s the name Hambletonian that inspires the interest of owners, trainers, drivers and breeders. It may take an extra year for some to find the Hambletonian winner’s circle but make no mistake victory is just as sweet.

Manchego coasts to victory in Miss Versatility

Nancy Takter trainee Manchego asserted her divisional dominance once more with a 1:51 stroll in the third \$40,000 preliminary of the Miss Versatility on Saturday (July 18) at The Meadowlands.

Driver Dexter Dunn eased the 1-9 favorite off the gate as a pair of Svanstedt trainees – Felicityshagwell S and Beautiful Sin – left for the front. Manchego landed in fourth and promptly angled off the pylons entering the backstretch, marching uncovered towards Felicityshagwell S and sliding past to lead the field after a :55.1 half.

Into the final turn, Beautiful Sin vacated the pylons and rushed to race alongside Manchego moving to

three-quarters in 1:23.1. Beautiful Sin continued to pressure Manchego straightening for the finish, but began to stall as Manchego extended her lead on the competition within a matter of strides. Kenziesky Hanover rallied down the center of the track quickly enough to snag second, 3-1/2 lengths behind Manchego, while Plunge Blue Chip charged from last to beat Felicityshagwell S – who gave chase to Manchego from the pylons – in a photo for third.

“She felt really good,” Dunn said after the race. “She’s got some real acceleration for a trotter.”

A 5-year-old Muscle Hill–Secret Magic mare bred by Brittany Farms LLC and owned by Black Horse Racing, Manchego collected her third victory from four starts this season and her 30th from 47 overall. The 2018 Hambletonian Oaks champion has banked \$2,217,705.

Manchego paid \$2.10 to win.

Major upset for Major Occasion in Dorothy Haughton

Major Occasion A and driver Dexter Dunn got an inside trip the entire mile to spring a 50-1 upset over Shartin N in Saturday's (July 18) \$172,850 Dorothy Haughton Memorial for older female pacers at The Meadowlands in a stakes record 1:48.1.

Shartin N, the sport's defending Horse of the Year and 3-5 favorite, was second, and Soho Burning Love A was third in the event formerly known as the Golden Girls.

Starting from post one, Dunn sat second with Major Occasion A as Kissin In The Sand led the field to an opening quarter of :26.1 and half of :54.2 before getting pressure from Shartin N, who was fourth throughout the first half of the race. Kissin In The Sand and Shartin N matched strides at three-quarters in 1:21.1 and battled into the stretch, where Major Occasion A found room along the pylons to scoot to a neck victory.

"It's a surprise, but she's actually been racing really, really good," Dunn said. "Her last quarters have been 25 (seconds); she just hasn't been handling the last turn. They changed her hobbles and she paced a lot better. We got a good trip,

obviously, but she has been racing really good. It was a lucky trip, but she's a nice mare."

Major Occasion A is trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman and owned by Enzed Racing Stable. The 6-year-old daughter of Art Major and Fake Occasion has won four of 11 races this season and \$158,110. She has won 19 races lifetime and \$331,490.

She was bred by E. Norman of New Zealand.

Dancin Lou scintillates in Haughton Memorial

Despite traveling wide for nearly all of a :52.4 opening half mile, **Dancin Lou** (\$6.00) had plenty left in the stretch to cement his place in the top ranks of the free-for-all pacing division with a scintillating 1:47.2 score in the \$391,300 William R. Haughton Memorial on Saturday night (July 18) at The Meadowlands.

The winner of last year's Breeders Crown for sophomore pacers, Dancin Lou advanced in the two-path on the first turn to track a three-way battle between Backstreet Shadow, Century Farroh and This Is The Plan through a :26 first quarter. After Backstreet Shadow cleared, Brian Sears gunned the 4-year-old son of Sweet Lou—Dancewiththebest to the fore, but the pair were strung out by Backstreet Shadow

before assuming control at race's midpoint.

After being tested through punishing early fractions, Dancin Lou found a breather on approach to the far turn, when he yielded for the pocket as Century Farroh retook and braced for outside pressure from Southwind Ozzi through three-quarters in 1:20.2. Off the home turn, Southwind Ozzi weakened in the breeze, enabling Dancin Lou to wedge out of the pocket an eighth of a mile from home. He reclaimed the lead from Century Farroh a sixteenth out under Sears urging, and widened to win by the better part of two lengths. Century Farroh held second, and Filibuster Hanover knifed through at the pegs to narrowly claim third.

My memories of Billy Haughton

*The author of **Billy Haughton – The Master** remembers the larger-than-life harness racing legend.*

In what seems like several lifetimes ago, I was just starting my journalism career when I got the pleasure of covering Grand Circuit Week at Saratoga Harness for the *Times-Union* newspaper in Albany. I was anxious and, honestly, a bit intimidated with the opportunity to interview many of the greatest drivers and trainers in North America who brought their best 2 -and-3-year-olds to compete in stakes races. We're talking about Stanley Dancer, Del Miller and, of course, Billy Haughton – legends I first learned about when I walked through the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in Goshen. They had one thing in common: they could not have been more accessible and cooperative.

When I asked Billy Haughton if I could interview him after a morning's training session, he said, "Sure," and escorted me into his trailer, where he promptly offered me a cold drink on

a hot July day. Then he gave me enough time to exhaust all my questions. When I walked out his trailer and headed for my car, I thought to myself, "Wow, I just interviewed Billy Haughton!"

Later on, I interviewed his son, Peter, an incredible young talent threatening to become as good as his dad before an automobile accident on a winter's night near The Meadowlands ended his life on June 24, 1980. He was 25 years old.

A horrible accident at Yonkers Raceway killed Billy 6½ years later and an entire horse community grieved again. He had been the leading driver in victories in six consecutive years and the leader in earnings eight straight and in 12 of 17 years. He was 62. As a driver, Billy won 4,910 races with earnings of more than \$40 million.

A few years later, while I was researching Secretariat's jockey Ron Turcotte's career for his biography, I learned that the Turcottes and the Haughtons were neighbors in Oyster Bay on Long Island and became friends. Ronnie told me of

many conversations between Billy and him, and I smiled at just the thought of how incredible it would have been to listen to those two legends discussing horses. Billy owned several thoroughbreds, and Ronnie admired Billy's horsemanship, because in harness racing a man could be both driver and trainer, an opportunity jockeys never have during their riding careers. When their riding days are over, just a handful even try to become a trainer.

Seven years after writing Ron's biography, Billy's dear wife Dottie, in conjunction with the Hall of Fame, afforded me the privilege of doing Billy's biography, which Dottie and I titled, "Billy Haughton – The Master."

I drove from Albany to New Hampshire to begin my work at the Haughton's Pioneer Farm. It was a long drive on a cold and wet evening, and when I arrived, Dottie had homemade soup and peach cobbler for me. Then she afforded me the inside look at the greatest driver and trainer in harness racing history.

Interviewing her and her children, Cammie, Tommy – an accomplished trainer, especially with trotters – Billy Jr. and Holley, was a wonderful experience as they talked about some of their greatest thrills as well as surviving the double tragedy of Billy's and Peter's accidents. They didn't shirk a single question.

Dottie gave me access to Billy's incredible horsemanship by sharing with me one of Billy's marked catalog books. Billy was famous for looking at every single horse he was considering buying in every sale he attended and taking copious notes about each one. The catalog documented that in addition to all his God-given talent, Billy also did all his homework.

That's what he did when he was growing up in Fultonville, NY, a half-hour west of Saratoga Springs. He would go to the annual Fonda Fair every summer and go to the blacksmith's shop at 6 a.m. every morning where he learned of the importance of correct shoeing, an asset he used many, many times.

Dottie filled me in on Billy's ability to take sudden naps, even one time while sharing a small plane ride with Stanley Dancer when a thunderstorm scared Stanley, who woke Billy up. Billy shrugged his shoulders and went right back to sleep.

Dottie said she saw Billy fall asleep for a minute in the post parade in a race at Roosevelt Raceway. "He was so tired that night," Dottie told me. "He'd driven in another state that afternoon. I saw his head drop down. The horse turned by himself and followed the other horses. And I saw him wake up. He knew it. He shook himself up. And he won the race,

too. We laughed."

There were also plenty of stories of Billy living life to the fullest when he wasn't at the track.

One of the more amazing things I learned about Billy was that he helped dozens and dozens of fellow drivers and trainers. Jim Harrison, the author of the classic, "The Care and Training of the Pacer and Trotter," told me the difference between

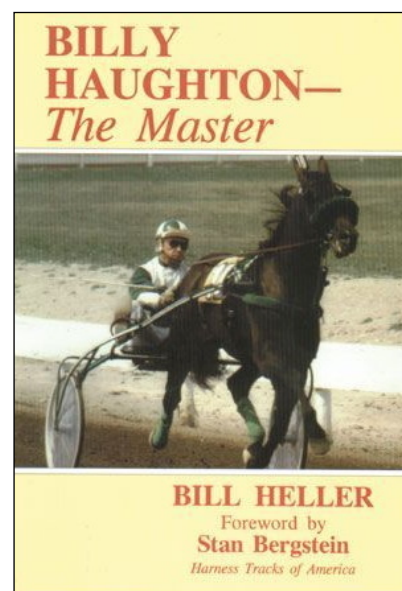
walking out of the backstretch at the end of the card with Stanley and Billy. Stanley would nod to everyone and just leave, but Billy never did as one horseman after another stopped him on his way out, asking him about the problems of one of their horses. Billy would answer every one of them, one of the reasons he was so beloved.

For the foreword of the book, I reached out to Stan Bergstein, the multi-talented executive vice-president of Harness Tracks of America, a man I was honored to call a friend. Stan did his typical brilliant work with the foreword. About Billy he wrote: "It was not statistics or numbers that spelled out Bill Haughton's greatness. It was the quality of his life and his stature as a man. For harness racing, he was star, spokesman, superb Hall of Fame trainer and driver, inspiring father and family man, symbol of the very best the sport can produce."

Before the book was published, Dottie asked me if I would like a set of Billy's colors, the famed green and white silks. I couldn't adequately describe my gratitude.

Dottie, always remembered as the First Lady of harness racing, passed away at the age of 87 in the spring of 2019, leaving a great void in the sport. Like her husband and children, she did everything she could to help support a sport which needs all the help it can find.

The Haughtons' collective impact on the sport they loved is impossible to measure. Getting to know and write about them was the thrill of a lifetime.

A conversation with the world's greatest horseman: Jean Pierre Dubois

In theory, doing a story about the greatest horseman in the world and one of its greatest people should be easy. In fact it has been one of my most difficult.

Why?

The answer is that the gentleman in question, Monsieur Jean Pierre Dubois, is a humble and self-effacing man, almost beyond description.

Although his achievements in horsedom are and have been without peer, he is a gentleman in its most literal description.

I had a telephone conversation with him last Monday. We were at somewhat of a disadvantage to begin with. Mr. Dubois' English is adequate, but not quite fluent.

My French is terrible.

Fortunately, we had Jean Pierre's grandson, Louis Baudron, a noted horseman in his own right, helping us translate my questions and his thoughts.

Before I go any further, we both agreed that we hope this will not be my last interview with Jean Pierre and it certainly is not the most inclusive.

There is so much more that can be covered on a face to face basis.

The telephone was not the best means of doing this. We hope to do a further one, face to face, between two old friends, perhaps in Lexington this fall or down the road in France. I vote for the latter, but I would be most pleased with the former.

Jean Pierre was born in 1940 in the small French town of Quivert. His father was a horseman and working with horses was the only thing that JP has ever wanted to do.

He describes his career thusly: "I've had the chance to live

my passion, so it's like my entire life has been a vacation."

He won his first race in 1954 at the ripe old age of 13.

He has excelled as an owner, breeder, trainer, driver/jockey of trotters, monte trotters, thoroughbreds and jumpers.

When asked which pursuit was his favorite, his immediate response was as a breeder.

"It's the one area where we have the chance to make and perhaps even change history," he said.

What was the horse that changed your life? I asked.

"I have had many very good horses and some great ones, but the one who has probably had the greatest affect on my career has been Cocktail Jet. I bred him, raised him, raced him and managed his brilliant stud career. Of course, all of the credit goes to the horse himself. I was only lucky enough to have been a factor in his reaching his success."

You are just as likely to see JP with a pitchfork in his hands or driving a horse van as you are to see him training and

driving in some of the world's classic races.

There is no pretension about the man. He gets up early in the morning, works with his horses all day and goes to bed early. His work is also his fun.

He also has, and has had, training stables and breeding farms in numerous venues – France, of course, but also the United States, Canada, Italy and Australia.

When asked the difference between the French trotter and the American one, he said, "they are much closer in type than they used to be. Years ago, they were vastly different. The American horse had much more speed and natural ability. The French horse was bigger, stronger and probably had more endurance."

I suggested that he – and for some time before him, Henri Levesque – might be the main reasons why they have evolved.

He didn't disagree, but his modesty prevented him from saying much more.

Mr. Levesque bred his great French mare Roquepine to Stars Pride to produce Florestan, arguably the most influential of all trotting stallions in the world.

Initially, the French trotting breed refused to even accept Florestan in its registry. Eventually, they purchased him and stood him at the French National Stud. As they say, the rest is history.

During the few years when the French approved of

allowing the breeding of French and American blood, Jean Pierre jumped in with both feet and revolutionized the world's trotting picture.

He bred the Super Bowl mare Armbr Glamour to the French stallion Quouky Williams and produced the great racehorse and sire Cocktail Jet.

He then bred Cocktail Jet to his good mare Guilty Love – who was by an Italian-sired stallion out of the Speedy Somolli mare Amour Daunou – to produce the great trotter and equally great sire Love You.

There were several French breeders who were opposed to this being allowed, fearing that this would weaken the French trotter.

The noted French breeder Albert Viel was quoted as saying that infusing the French trotter with American blood would be comparable to planting weeds in one's garden.

Jean Pierre believes that French breeding will be dominated in future generations by the mating of Cocktail Jet and his sons and daughters to those of Ready Cash and his sons and daughters.

For most horsemen to have made a mark of this magnitude would have been enough, but certainly not for Monsieur Dubois.

There are many people who consider Varenne to have been the greatest trotter ever. Jean Pierre Dubois was the co-breeder of Varenne (with a close friend in Italy). Jean

Pierre also developed Varenne before the trotter was sold.

More recently, Dubois is the breeder of Ecurie D, a trotter many consider to be the best in Europe today – and one that at the age of 4 has shown as much, if not more, talent than any of Dubois' great horses.

Jean Pierre has not only made and developed several great sires, but he is also one himself.

His two sons, Jean-Etienne and Jean-Philippe, have carried on the family tradition of being both successful trainer drivers and breeders of top horses.

Now the torch has been passed to grandson Louis Baudron, already a well-recognized and successful horseman.

I shared with him a conversation I had with Michel Lachance last week where Mike said to me, "You know how many times I've told you about how I idolized Keith Waples and how much I think of him. Let me tell you, Jean Pierre Dubois is very close to him, if not his equal as the greatest I've ever known."

Jimmy Takter said right here two weeks ago that Jean Pierre is the greatest horseman he has ever known.

I wanted to get an Jean Pierre's opinion about several people we both knew:

Daniel Wildenstein - "Mr. Wildenstein was perhaps the greatest art dealer and art historian of the 20th century. He was also among the most successful thoroughbred and jumper owners of that same century. He was a man known as being strong willed and known for switching trainers and jockeys regardless of how much success he had with them."

Mr. Wildenstein came to racing trotters fairly late in his life. He was known to have said that JP Dubois was the greatest horseman he had ever known. "If I had met Jean Pierre earlier, he would have been the only trainer I ever had," Wildenstein once said.

Moe Graif - "When I first came to North America, Moe Graif became my main man. He was fluent in both English and French and knew everybody that was worth knowing. He handled most of my bookwork. If you gave Moe an assignment, you were guaranteed that whatever it was, it

would get done. If he was your friend, you never had a better one."

Jonel Chriachos - Before he went to work with his own stable, Jean Pierre worked for "Jonny" as he was called. He was a Greek horse trainer, who once said, "I might not have been the greatest horse trainer in France, but there was no doubt I was the best trainer of owners ever." He had amassed the most well-known collection of owners ever, including the Aga Khan and many members of extreme wealth and nobility. It was to Chriachos that John Simpson had entrusted the great mare Elma throughout her very successful European racing career. Jean Pierre was working with Jonny at the time. It might just be a coincidence, but when JP entered the international trotting waters it was with Armbr Glamour, a mare that traces to the immediate maternal family of Elma, a mare who he remembered with fondness, to produce his top horse Cocktail Jet.

I met Chriachos one time when he visited us at the Hanover Fairgrounds. I will never forget one of the things he said that day. "The man looking for the perfect horse or the perfect woman will spend the rest of his life without a horse in his stable or a woman in his bed."

Is it sexist? Indeed it is, but perhaps there is some truth in what he said.

David Reid - I am including him because my friend "Doveed" told me to ask JP about him. Jean Pierre responded: "He's a very nice young man who works very hard."

I asked him what American trainers could learn from the French. His answer was, "basically nothing", but in his usual humble manner, he said he had learned a lot from some like Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton, Delvin Miller, Jimmy Takter and Johnny Simpson.

When Herve Filion sent the great mare Grades Singing to compete in the French Classics races, he sent her to Jean Pierre Dubois. She finished second in the Prix d'Amerique with Jean Pierre driving.

He still has his farm in Kentucky where about a dozen or so mares are resident. They are divided among American, French and Franco American mares. They are being bred to American stallions.

I'll leave this off by saying.

Merci a vous, Jean Pierre et Louis. C'était un grand plaisir et honneur de parler avec vous.

The James Holzhauer Challenge

“Not only do I have the plan, but I also have the man for the plan.”

“I suppose I need to ask what man, what plan.”

“James Holzhauer.”

“Who’s he?”

“A professional gambler and game show player. I never heard of him until last night, when my team, the Stable Geniuses, were playing Trivia Tuesday at the Tap City Tavern.”

“Stable geniuses?”

“Nothing political, three of us are involved with horses. Anyway, one of our questions was - Who is the **third-highest-earning American game show contestant of all time** and is best known for a 32-game **winning streak** as champion on the **quiz show Jeopardy?**”

“You knew the answer?”

“No, didn’t have a clue, I never watch *Jeopardy*. Fortunately, this is a team competition with five players. The geniuses wear matching t-shirts with a horseshoe logo. Sally Polonski, the most stable on our team, is a *Jeopardy* fanatic. She was all over the answer, James Holzhauer. We won a large pizza delivered from Mozzarella Fellas.”

He smiled, “Another exciting evening in Trey World.”

I continued, “So I go home and goggle this James Holzhauer. I’m curious what sort of guy wins \$2,464,216 on a game show. Here, read this.”

He took my phone and read.

*Despite high marks on individual tests, James Holzhauer was a C student overall, as he often skipped class and homework because he could use the time more productively, such as playing **online poker**. Holzhauer memorized obscure **baseball** and **professional wrestling** statistics, prompting his parents to reprimand him for “wasting his life” learning about sports.*

*While a student at the University of Illinois at Urbana–Champaign, Holzhauer played **hearts** and **spades** at a **card club**. The twice-a-week club quickly turned into a five-day-a-week home **poker** game with a 10-cent ante and \$2 maximum bets.*

*The poker game is where Holzhauer began gambling, but he grew his **sports betting** bankroll in the **2006 World Baseball Classic**. Believing the **round-robin** format of the tournament and variance in baseball had skewed the odds, he bet heavily on each team except the U.S. and the Dominican Republic to win the championship.*

*After graduating from college, Holzhauer moved to Las Vegas in 2008 to bet professionally on sports. Holzhauer says he has built predictive models for baseball, NFL, and college basketball, but now focuses on in-game betting. He took a year off from his occupation as a sports gambler to study for Jeopardy! Holzhauer debuted at the **World Series of Poker** in **2019**. Holzhauer is a lifelong fan of the **Chicago Cubs**. He has said his dream job is a front-office position with the team and has actively sought employment in **Major League Baseball**.*

He handed my phone back, and said, “Trey, if you were smarter, better looking, younger, followed the Chicago Cubs, and had money, you could be his twin brother.”

Ignoring the jab, I kept firing, “Here’s my plan: Hire Holzhauer, a sports guy with a brand, a math maven, a gambler, a sportsman, and put him on a game show for harness racing.”

“Is Holzhauer a harness horse handicapper?”

“The answer is probably no; at least I doubt it, but he’s a smart sports guy, he could probably pick up handicapping horses in like 20 minutes.”

“Your plan is a game show?” he asked.

I nodded, “Here’s my outline. A racetrack, or any outfit who wants to make a buck, streams a show on what appears as a *Jeopardy*-ish set. It will be a first-class presentation with a host, music, plenty of graphics, and an audience if humans

ever again intermingle.”

“What’s the format?”

“Holzhauer gets a thousand-dollar bankroll to wager over six races. Each night, two contestants challenge him to a gambling gameshow battle. They each have a bankroll of a thousand dollars, and Holzhauer takes on two challengers for drama. They could be regular folks, or they could be celebrities playing for charity. The winner is the person who has the largest bankroll after the sixth race.”

He did not scoff, a good sign his wheels were turning. After a moment, he said, “That could be a moderately entertaining show if produced correctly. And the sporting landscape is looking bleak. I read today the College football season is looking questionable, without football, there will be a void to fill.”

I ranted, “Have you watched some of the garbage they are wheeling out as entertainment? Harness racing would look like MENSA on hooves, and it would be cheap to produce a show like I’m pitching.”

He said, What you are blabbering about would piggyback off the sport.”

I pointed at him and said, “The exposure would be awesome. My quirky little plan could be a way to address the entertainment part you keep saying the sport lacks.”

Sex Appeal repeats, Rose Run Victoria upsets in Gold action

Upsets were the order of the day at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday (July 17) as both favorites in the 3-year-old pacing filly Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions went down to defeat.

In the first \$106,400 split, driver Trevor Henry sent the fans' third choice, **Sex Appeal**, straight to the front from Post 5 and reeled off fractions of :26.2, :55.2 and 1:23.1 as fan favorite Lauras Love sat fourth. In the stretch, pocket-sitter Beach Sports mounted a spirited challenge, but Sex Appeal prevailed for a three-quarter length victory in a personal best 1:50.2. Lauras Love closed to be third, but was still two lengths behind the duelling leaders.

"She gets better every week. I don't how far she'll go, but every week she seems to get better and better," said Henry of the winner. "She has turned into a nice filly that loves her work."

The win was the second straight in Gold Series action for Sex Appeal and her third straight in a five race sophomore campaign that has only seen her bested once, when she finished second. The homebred daughter of Bettors Delight and Lasting Appeal is trained by Bob McIntosh of Windsor for his co-owner Al McIntosh Holdings Inc. of Leamington, ON.

At 2, Sex Appeal competed in the Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots program without cracking the top three. She improved late in the season, winning two legs of the Harvest Series, and Henry says she grew and matured significantly over the winter.

"She just seems to have grown up, she got a lot stronger than she was as a 2-year-old and she just really got to like to race," Henry said. "She likes to leave on out of there, but I think at any point if somebody comes you'll be able to let them go, she's pretty sensible when it comes to that."

In the second \$107,200 division fans sent reigning division champion Alicorn off as their top choice, but it was fourth choice **Rose Run Victoria** who had the biggest gear in the stretch. Second choice Betalady stepped off all the fractions, leading the field to a :26.3 quarter, :55.4 half and 1:23.2 three-quarters, with Karma Seelster on her heels and Alicorn leading the charge up the outer lane. Rose Run Victoria followed Alicorn up the outer lane and when driver Robert Shepherd asked her for another gear she out-sprinted her peers to claim a one length victory in a personal best 1:51.2. Karma Seelster slipped out of the pocket to be second and Betalady hung on for third, with Alicorn settling for fourth.

Rick Phillips of Tappan, NY and Mark Harder of Freehold, NJ own Rose Run Victoria. Harder taught the daughter of Hes Watching and Victoria Gallery her early lessons, giving her two starts in the fall of her 2-year-old season and two starts at The Meadowlands in June before sending her up to Rod Boyd for the Ontario Sires Stakes season.

"I got her three weeks ago I guess. Mark was real high on her at 2 and he took his time and brought her back at 3, and he thought he had a Gold filly there, but you never know," said Boyd. "She's a big powerful horse, I like her. She's a nice filly, obviously."

Rose Run Victoria finished third in the Gold Series opener at Woodbine Mohawk Park on June 29, three-quarters of a length behind Alicorn, after recovering from a brief miscue in the first turn. In a July 10 overnight she finished second by three-quarters of a length to Beach Sports after losing focus on the front end, so Boyd was pleased to see her put everything together on Friday.

"On the racetrack she's fine, but in the barn she's a little bit high strung, especially around men. Katie McNeil is the only one that really gets along with her. I don't know if it's because I train her or sit behind her every day, but she doesn't like me a whole lot," said Boyd. "Other than that she's pretty easy though. Mark had her just perfect coming up. I've worked for him for years and he sends them when they're ready, and she was definitely ready."

Sex Appeal and Rose Run Victoria will have an opportunity to burnish their Gold Series resumes when the 3-year-old pacing fillies make their third start of the season on Aug. 3 at Grand River Raceway.

Run Director takes feature, Miller wins three at Big M

It was Hall of Famer Dave Miller's night at the Meadowlands Friday (July 17), as "The Buckeye" drove three winners on the program, including among them, **Run Director** in the featured open for trotters.

"I raced him at [Harrah's Philadelphia] in his last start and he had all kinds of road trouble but still trotted in [1:]51," said Miller. "I really like this horse."

So did those who wagered on the 5-year-old son of Kadabra—Keep The Spirit, who was sent to the gate at 11-1 in a field remarkable in how competitive it looked on paper.

While not showing gate speed in any of his recent efforts, Miller gunned his horse to the top around the first turn and hit the quarter in :27. With no one coming at him, Miller was able to rate the second fraction in :29, which left plenty of juice for the final half-mile.

Nearing three-quarters, Betting Gangster S was racing first-over trying to challenge the leader while towing 2-1 favorite Lindy The Great into the race, but Betting Gangster S stalled on the far turn, which forced Lindy The Great three-wide, sealing the deal for the eventual winner.

Lindy The Great kicked home in :26.1, but it was too little, too late, as Run Director completed his wire-to-wire win in 1:51.4.

"I did not expect to make the lead that easy," said Miller. "He was going along really easy and seemed very comfortable. I heard Andy [Miller, driving Lindy The Great] coming but we had enough left to get the job done."

Run Director, who hit the finish three-quarters-of-a-length in front of LTG, paid \$25.00 to win for his owners Thomas and Elizabeth Rankin. Swansea finished third.

The Andrew Harris trainee now has 14 wins from 38 career starts and earnings of \$470,087.

NJSS WRAPUP: The second leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes (NJSS) for 2-year-olds saw seven divisions on the Friday card.

In the first of three colt and gelding trots, the Dave Miller-driven, Marcus Melander-trained **Heartbreak Hill** (Muscle Hill—Allmar Surprise) gunned down 3-5 favorite Spy Booth nearing the wire to pull off an upset at 31-1, winning for the first time in his career in 1:54.3; **Locatelli** (Muscle Hill—Girlie Tough) went wire-to-wire in division two for Yannick Gingras and Nancy Takter, taking his first-ever victory in 1:54.4 as the 3-1 third choice; **Mon Amour** (Muscle Hill—Mind Meld) was the only favorite among the male

trotters to click, as the Per Engblom student scored in division three as the 3-5 choice in 1:56 with Dexter Dunn holding the lines.

The first of two divisions for filly trotters went to **Altar** (Muscle Hill—Swan Hot Mama) for Dave Miller and Engblom. The 7-1 chance recorded her first lifetime win in 1:54.4 coming from off the pace. In the second division, Engblom completed a sweep of the filly trot divisions – and got his third NJSS win of the night – with **Material Girl**, a Muscle Hill—Lilu Hanover offspring who was driven by Dunn. The 4-1 shot, who visited the winner's circle for the first time in her career, stopped the clock in 1:55.3.

Before the betting card, there were a pair of divisions on the pace. Recording a second victory in as many starts was the filly **Anna Jeans** (Great Vintage—Early Go Hanover), who scored in a lifetime-best 2:03.2 for trainer John Urbanski and driver Jason Thompson. Also staying perfect in two starts was **Fika Time**, a gelding from trainer Chase Vandervort who is a product of Sunfire Blue Chip—Raiders Favorite. Tim Tetrick guided the winner to a lifetime-best 1:56.3 mile.

A LITTLE MORE: Wagering was solid all night as the 20-cent Pick-5 took in \$81,252 in bets and the Late Pick-4 saw \$88,209 of action... Total wagering was \$2,883,778.

Ohio Sires Stakes action Friday at Scioto Downs

Freshmen trotting colts and fillies battled on a steamy Friday night, July 17 at Scioto Downs in seven \$40,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) Leg 2 divisions.

Swizzle Hanover continued her dominance by winning easily the first filly division in 1:57.4 for driver Mike Wilder and trainer/owner Randy Bendis. The daughter of Uncle Peter left the gate as the 1-5 favorite, and now has \$40,000 in career earnings from her two OHSS victories. Newcomer Ciao Baby Hall (Aaron Merriman) got up for a close second at 6-1 with 12-1 Mamma Knows Best (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) notching third place honors.

Street Gossip, the 1-1 choice, captured the first colt trotting divisions with Brett Miller driving for Virgil Morgan, Jr. in 1:57. The son of Cash Hall was a solid third in his OHSS Leg 1 contest and now has \$26,694 in career earnings for Carl Howard & the Jesmeral Stable. Replica Hanover (Tyler Smith) was second at 7-2 with Rose Run Wilson (Mike Wilder) third.

Spyder The Striker cruised to victory in the second OHSS Colt Trot with Aaron Merriman at the lines in 1:57.4. The son

of Uncle Peter is trained by Chris Beaver for the partnership of Beaver, Beaver, Fleming and VIP Internet. It was his second straight win in the OHSS series and upped his career earnings to \$40,000. Fire Cross(Kayne Kauffman) was second at 22-1 with 63-1 My Thunderthird for Danny Noble.

Herculisa, the 1-5 favorite, took her OHSS test in the same fashion she captured Leg 1, with a front-stepping effort for driver Brett Miller and trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr. Her winning time of 1:56.2 was just two fifths of a second off the track record. Owned by Jesmeral Stable, the daughter of My MVP now has three career triumphs in as many starts and owns a bankroll of \$41,812. Magic Credit Card(9-1) was second for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. with 9-1 Ozmagetting up for third with Aaron Merriman at the lines.

Celebrate With Me took the lead at the three-quarters and never looked back in the third OHSS contest for trotting fillies, stopping the timer in 1:56.4. Kurt Sugg steered the daughter of Full Count for trainer Marty Wollam, who co-owns the filly in partnership with Toni Dean. It was Celebrate With Me's first career victory and pushed her career earnings to \$25,472. Bank My Way, a 44-1 longshot, was second for Chris Page, while 26-1 Ti Punch was third for Cameron McCown.

Merry Ann, the 1-2 favorite, cruised to an impressive 1:57.4 triumph for driver Chris page and trainer Ronnie Burke in the fourth OHSS filly trot. The daughter of Southwind Spirit is owned by Burke Racing, Knox Services and Weaver Brussemi and picked up her first career victory with the OSS win. Her earnings now stand at \$31,700. A Doll Face(3-1) was second for Kayne Kauffman while 53-1 Cash N Chips was third for Dan Rawlings.

Winning Ticket proved to be just that as he captured the final OHSS trot for 2-year-old trotting colts in 1:57.1. The son of Triumphant Caviar was driven to his first career victory as the 6-5 favorite for trainer Chris Beaver and owners Beaver, Zeelandar Homan and Burnett. Perron was second for Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., while Pete's Passion, a 43-1 longshot, got up for third with Kurt Sugg in the bike.

Swan In Motion dominates Indiana Sires Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Swan In Motion and driver Ricky Macomber Jr. turned in a dominant performance to find the winner's circle in the featured event of the evening, the lone \$60,500 division of Indiana Sires Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts and

geldings, at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Thursday (July 16). Scoring in 1:53.4, Swan In Motion recorded his third win from four outs this season.

Leaving from post six in the field of nine, Swan In Motion was unhurried from the gate and settled along the rail in fourth. Alex Udell gave J-S Jasper his marching orders and he was the first to get a call through the opening quarter in :27.4. Flagman and Rick Plano grabbed a pocket seat while Simply Swan and Joe Putnam were next in line third.

When the field reached the half in :57.3, Macomber Jr. gave his mount the green light and he quickly ranged up to take command. Swan In Motion was on top at the third station in 1:25.4. and never looked back.

Using a :28 final panel, Swan In Motion coasted to the wire to finish nearly four lengths to the good. Flagman finished second while Brigotto and Sam Widger rallied well late for third. As the heavy 1-9 favorite, Swan In Motion returned \$2.10 to his backers at the betting windows.

Trained by Jamie Macomber, the son of Swan For All—Keystone Sadie has now won five of 15 lifetime starts while bankrolling \$237,825 lifetime for owners M&M Racing and Norbert Joseph Maza. Swan In Motion was bred by Lyle Dean Slabach. For Team Macomber, it was one of three winners on the evening's 14-race card.

Mystical Carrie, Maggie Rhee capture ISS divisions at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Three-year-old pacing fillies were the featured attraction at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Friday (July 17) as they squared off in the second round of Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) action. Two \$33,000 divisions were featured on the evening's 14-race card.

In the first division, **Mystical Carrie** was a decisive gate to wire winner scoring in 1:50.2 with Trace Tetrack in the bike. After playing the bridesmaid in her first two starts of the season, Mystical Carrie scored her first win of her sophomore campaign and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Mystical Carrie left alertly from post three to dictate first-half of fractions of :26.4 and :55.4. Reaching the three-quarters in 1:24.3, Mystical Carrie was still calling the shots as Genie Rockwell and Marlin Fry ranged up to apply pressure from first-over. Using a :25.4 closing kick, Mystical Carrie was able to turn back Genie Rockwell and finish six lengths to the good. As the 3-5 favorite, Mystical Carrie

returned \$3.20 to her backers at the betting windows.

The homebred daughter of Tellitlikeitis—Mystical Victress notched her fifth lifetime win from 14 starts and pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$74,650 for owners Mystical Marker Farms LLC. Mystical Carrie is conditioned by Erv Miller. The trip to the winner's circle with Mystical Carrie was one of five trips on the evening for Harrah's Hoosier Park's leading driver Trace Tetrack.

In the second division of ISS action, **Maggie Rhee** made her first appearance in stakes company a winning one as she was a gritty winner in 1:51. Driven by Ricky Macomber Jr. for trainer Tim Wilson, Maggie Rhee moved first-over and was able to track down her rivals late in the lane to get the win by a head. The 1:51 clocking was a new lifetime best for the filly.

Owned by Wilson Racing Stable, N.P Neff, M.J. Eichberger, Maggie Rhee recorded her sixth lifetime win from nine outings with the win. The daughter of Jereme's Jet—Bow Wow Wine has now amassed \$46,788 in lifetime purse earnings. The win with Maggie Rhee was also one of three victories on the evening's 14-race card for driver Ricky Macomber Jr.

New speed badges for trotting colts in Grassroots action Thursday

The 3-year-old trotting colts returned to Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots action Thursday (July 16) and all five winners matched or bettered their personal best efforts, in spite of competing over a rain-soaked Woodbine Mohawk Park oval.

Ripped And Ready led off in the first \$23,150 division and delivered an impressive effort from Post 9 to score his second straight Grassroots victory. In rein to Jody Jamieson, the fan favorite eased away from the starting gate into sixth heading for the :27 quarter, then circled out to close the gap on the early leaders, dropping briefly into fifth heading by the :56.4 half. Confident in his mount, Jamieson soon had Ripped And Ready on the move and the colt had a clear path to the front by the 1:26.1 three-quarters. Halfway down the stretch Jamieson took a look over both shoulders and sat back to enjoy the rest of the ride. Ripped And Ready trotted under the wire two and one-half lengths the best in a personal best 1:56.2. Pacesetter Archies Star finished second and Dart Guy was third.

"It worked out that a couple made breaks, but he really

looked on paper that he was as good as any in the program, so I wasn't surprised that he won, just the ease with which he did it," said Jamieson, who engineered the trip for trainer Thierry Vandenplas and owner/breeder Dr. Ruth Irving of Russell, ON.

The win gives Kadabra son Ripped And Ready a sophomore record of three wins and one second in four starts and a share of top spot in the three-year-old trotting colt Grassroots point standings with a perfect 100 through two legs.

Among the colts sharing top spot in the standings with Ripped And Ready is **Remember Titans**, who battled to a 1:56.1 personal best in the second \$23,500 division. After leading the field for most of the mile, Remember Titans held off a charging Aussie Lover and Kenogami Coco in the stretch to score his second Grassroots victory.

"He's a nice big horse. Flawless gaited and he is finally starting to figure it all out," said driver James MacDonald of the E L Titan colt. "When he heard the other horse coming he dug in and was able to finish it off."

Remember Titans now has a record of two wins and two seconds in four starts for trainer Shawn Steacy and owners Landmark 12 Racing Stable of Lansdowne, A K Malik Stable of Ottawa, ON and Dale Larson of Kent City, MI.

The third division saw **Freedom Express** travel up the outside lane behind the fans' second choice Angel Nation, and then sprint down the stretch to score his first lifetime victory in 1:57. Favorite Mikey Mass finished two and three-quarter lengths back in second and Massman completed the top three.

Thursday's outing was just the seventh lifetime for Freedom Express and only the third in which he has stayed on task, one of the others coming in his four race two-year-old campaign and the other in the July 1 Grassroots season opener at Grand River Raceway where he finished fourth.

"I thought he had it in him, but it took some time to get him to put it together," said driver Chris Christoforou, who drives the Wheeling N Dealin gelding for his father, owner/trainer Charalambos Christoforou. "He got a nice trip and it worked out great."

Christoforou was back in the winner's circle after the fourth \$23,150 division, guiding **Awesomedabra** to a 1:57.3 score for owner/trainer Gary Lance of Port Perry, ON. Pacesetter Crossfit Mouse finished one length behind the fan favorite and Mr Arch was well back in third.

The mile equalled the personal best set by the Kadabra

gelding winning his Grassroots Semi-Final last fall and moved him into a tie for top spot in the sophomore point race through two regular season events.

The final \$23,150 division saw Jody Jamieson back in the winner's circle with **Royaltys Odyssey**, who followed Charmbo Prince up the outer lane and then powered down the stretch to catch pacesetter Ongoing Royalty with a 1:58.1 effort. Charmbo Prince finished three-quarters of a length back in second and favorite Ongoing Royalty settled for third. All three trotters are by sire Royalty For Life.

The win was Royaltys Odyssey's first since August of his two-year-old season and came as a distinct relief to the driver and his wife Stephanie Jamieson, who trains the gelding for his father Carl Jamieson of Puslinch and breeder Joanne Morrison of Beeton, ON.

"He's been a headache his entire career," said Jamieson. "He's always had go, just hasn't put it together since early last year. We're very happy with his effort."

Royaltys Odyssey and his peers will have an opportunity to build on Thursday's success in the third Grassroots Leg on August 15 at Kawartha Downs.

Top fillies sharp in Grassroots at Grand River Raceway

CL Sportsextreme, **Cyclone Sister** and **Sportsfire** solidified their standing at the top of the 2-year-old pacing filly Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots division with convincing victories at Grand River Raceway on Friday, July 17.

CL Sportsextreme kicked off the second leg of the freshman fillies' Grassroots season with a 1:57 victory from Post 9 that impressed driver Bob McClure. The Sportswriter daughter sat third through the :28.3 opening quarter, but was aiming for the front by the :58.4 half. After cruising through a 1:27.3 three-quarters, CL Sportsextreme pulled away from her peers to hit the wire three lengths ahead of Shiatzu Seelster and Spittin Chicklets.

"I was surprised how slick gaited she was, but I was pretty happy with the way the trip worked out too," said McClure of the fan favorite. "She's a real handy little filly and she was nice, because the nine-hole is not an easy spot to get a baby away from, and she snapped out of there and then made a move to the front, and from there it was kind of an armchair ride."

McClure drove CL Sportsextreme to her second Grassroots victory for trainer Dany Fontaine and owner-breeder Ecuries C. LeBlanc Inc. of Saint-Eustache, QC.

In the second \$23,150 division McClure employed a near identical strategy with Cyclone Sister, who was fourth at the :29 quarter, moving to the lead past the :58.3 half, comfortably in front by the 1:27 three-quarters and well ahead at the 1:55.4 finish. Barefootnpregnant finished seven lengths back in second and Feisty Betty was another length and three-quarters back in third.

"Obviously, the trip, you couldn't plan that much better for a one to nine shot," said McClure. "She's a little flighty about her head, so I wanted to get her at least three-eighths of a mile on a helmet and teach her, kind of educate her a little bit, but I knew once I moved her, she's so fast, she hits high gear in a hurry. So I knew I'd make the front, it was just whether I could make it there easily and relax her once she did get settled onto the front end, and she did. She settled down and she came a big last quarter and she still had a lot left; should be a lot of fun this summer with her."

Nick Gallucci conditions the homebred daughter of Shadow Play for Millar Farms of Stouffville, ON and the trainer said, as long as she bounces back well from Friday's effort, Cyclone Sister's next start will come back at Grand River Raceway in the July 27 Battle Of The Belles eliminations.

"That was kind of like a tune-up today, so we'll see how she comes out of it and hopefully have her entered for next Monday," said Gallucci. "She's always showed a lot of speed, just a couple tendencies we've had to keep an eye on, but for the most part we never really had any complaints about her. She always showed a lot of ability."

Like CL Sportsextreme, Friday's victory was Cyclone Sister's second in the Grassroots program.

The other filly to repeat as a Grassroots winner on Friday was Sportsfire, who took a tour in the outer lane to secure her 1:57.3 victory. The fan favorite sprinted home to a three-quarter length victory over French Shaker and Halleyslittlecomet.

Anthony Haughan drove the Sportswriter daughter to the victory for trainer Dan Lagace and owner/breeder Fred

Brayford of Alliston, ON.

"I don't usually take horses late when I come back from Florida, but I have another horse with Fred so I said, 'Yeah I'll take her', and now we're kind of glad we did," said Lagace. "We picked her up on a Friday and the Saturday Fred and a friend of his came to see her, and I thought I'll just brush her out free-legged. I came off and I said, 'Fred, she seems like she's got some talent, but she was very, very hot and it's tough to beat good horses when you're this aggressive'. But my son Brady's been going with her a lot and he's got her settled down and driving really, really nice."

Sportsfire clocked the fastest mile in the July 10 Grassroots leg, circling Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:53.2, and while some of her peers made the leap up to the Gold Series for Leg 2, Lagace felt it would be better for the filly to stick with the Grassroots.

"After last week some of the horses that finished second and third, they moved up to the Gold, but I had talked to Fred and I said, 'You know, I think this filly's got some good talent, but she's growing lots'. I said, 'I think if we stick to the Grassroots and give her time to grow up and mature, I think she'll do you really, really good', and he did what was right for her and agreed to it."

The other two divisions saw **Annies Legacy** and **Amini** record their first Grassroots victories.

Annies Legacy and driver Paul Mackenzie did most of the work on the front end on the way to a one-half length victory in 1:56. Favorite Miss Shannon Beach was second and Celia Bayama was third. Robert Fellows trains the Control The Moment daughter for Leonard Rosene of London, ON, who purchased the filly for \$26,000 at last fall's London Selected Yearling Sale.

Amini went gate-to-wire from Post 6 for driver Jean Rene Plante in the last \$23,150 division. The Sportswriter daughter stopped the teletimer at 1:56.4, one and three-quarter lengths ahead of The Kings Queen. Drinks All Round was well back in third. Isaac Waxman trains the \$8,000 purchase from the London Selected Yearling Sale for Tessa Waxman of Ridgeville and David Morgan of Hamilton, ON.

The 2-year-old pacing fillies make their third Grassroots start at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Aug. 14.

Next on Grand River Raceway's Ontario Sires Stakes schedule is the second Grassroots leg for the two-year-old trotting fillies, on Wednesday, July 29.

The Greek Freak sparkles in PASS at The Meadows

The Greek Freak not only was an impressive winner in Saturday's \$193,156 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) at The Meadows, but he also stamped his ticket to next week's eliminations for the \$450,000 (est) Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids. The PASS for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers, known as the Bye Bye Byrd, was contested over three divisions, with **Sea Of Life** and **Lake Charles** also capturing splits.

A total of 44 Adios eligibles competed on Saturday's stakes program. While some trainers indicated their horses remained on the Adios bubble, that wasn't true of Ron Burke, who confirmed that The Greek Freak is Adios bound.

And why not? The Captaintreacherous—Thirty X gelding, who didn't hit the board in nine starts last year, now has won three straight, including two PASS splits. His victory for Matt Kakaley Saturday was an effortless front-end affair that saw him down Lou's A Pansy by a length in a career-best 1:50.2, with Later Dudes third.

"I didn't drive him last year, but I think they were having a little trouble with him wanting to do his own thing," Kakaley said. "He seems like he's gotten a lot smarter. He just lets me do what I want to do with him."

Burke Racing Stable, Piatt Racing, J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby, and Weaver Brussemi LLC campaign The Greek Freak.

Sea Of Life, also an Adios eligible, had pace aplenty but appeared trapped behind a wall of horses. When the Lightning Lane magically opened, he shot through for Scott Zeron to triumph in a stake-fastest 1:50. Sandbetweenmytoes was second, beaten 1-1/4 lengths, while A Positive Hanover earned show.

"We were doing some serious pacing up the backside, and then the race sort of came back to me," Zeron said. "My guy was still sharp because I didn't have to use him. I thought we would have enough room."

Tony Alagna trains Sea Of Life, a son of Captaintreacherous—Fresh Idea, for Brittany Farms, Marvin

Katz, Bradley Grant and Captain Kirk Racing.

Lake Charles followed live cover, then blew past in the lane to pull off the 10-1 upset for Mark MacDonald. Tito Rocks was second, 1-1/4 lengths back, while a hard-used Fortify completed the ticket.

"The first couple starts this year were a little tough on him," said Ray Schnittker, who conditions the son of Well Said—Bodacious Hanover and owns with Dr. John Egloff, Max Hempt and Steven Arnold. "But Mark did a good job with him today, and I was happy with him."

Lake Charles pushed his career bankroll to \$155,537.

\$100,000 PA Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

The Greek Freak wasn't the only sophomore to earn a shot at Adios orchids. Trainer Ron Coyne said **Seriously Hanover** likely will get that opportunity following his 1:50.4 win with Zeron aboard.

"That's the way the owners were leaning," Coyne said. "We'll talk about it over the weekend, but it's a very good possibility."

Michael Cimaglio, Stephen Demeter and Stephen Giagni own Seriously Hanover.

Stake honors of 1:50 — in an 8-1/4-length romp, no less — went to **No Quarter** (Dave Palone, Brian Brown).

Moneyman Hill, Lyons Skipper and Sailboat Hanover took the other splits.

\$42,610 James Manderino — 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trotters

This event, an Arden Downs stake, was over early. Although Patriarch Hanover needed more than a quarter to get the lead from post 8, the son of Father Patrick—Personal Style cruised from there, defeating Romanee Blue Chip by 2 lengths in 1:54.1. Beyond Ordinary was third.

"He's a nice little horse," said winning driver Kakaley. "He's probably not as good as the top few — he's just a little too small. But he tries his heart out. He gives it his all no matter what."

Burke trains Patriarch Hanover, who now has banked \$145,225 for Burke Racing Stable, William Switala, Joseph Martin and Weaver Brussemi.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Monday when the 15-race program offers a pair of stakes for freshman colt and gelding trotters: a \$208,721 PASS and a \$100,000 PA Stallion Series event. The card also features a trio of rich wagering opportunities: a \$10,180.47 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5; a \$5,000 total-pool guarantee for the Early Pick 4 (race 3); a \$1,058.46 carryover in the Early Pick 5 (race 2). First post is 12:45 PM.

The filly by Pet Rock out of Southern Magnolia got a pocket trip from post eight and was a winner by three parts of a length. The winner paid \$2.80 after defeating Corner Pocket and Dan Noble while Arya Again with Chris Page finishing third.

Narina Hanover, a winner in the first leg of the BSS, went wire-to-wire from post three to score by 2-3/4 lengths in a lifetime best 1:52 with Tyler Smith for Clarence Foulk. The Yankee Cruiser—Natural Paradise filly is owned by the Foulk Stables and William Hartt. Narina Hanover paid \$3.80 to win and defeated Hoochie Girl and Kayne Kauffman with McKella and Aaron Merriman finishing third.

Violets Rainbow picked up her first BSS win of the year and her second straight win taking a lifetime mark of 1:53.3 for driver Trevor Smith and trainer Mark Wagner. The Art Official—Angels N Demons filly is owned by Stephen Sexton and paid \$4.60 to win. Violets Rainbow got away fifth but tipped out past the quarter and was hung to the finish with the win by a length. Cruisingatmidnight with Tyler Smith was second and Sara Jane and Chris Page finished third.

Crowntimerockette scored her 4thwin of the season for Kayne Kauffman and Priscilla Mooney in a lifetime best 1:51.4. Sired by Pet Rock out of Crown Time Keeper, got away from post 8 and never yielded the lead going wire to wire to win by 3/4 length. The filly is owned by Ken James and paid \$27.20 defeating Odds On Greenville with Ronnie Wrenn Jr while Dan Noble finished third with Bigrisk Cruiser.

The fourth leg of the Buckeye Stallion Series 3-Year-Old Filly pacers is scheduled for Tuesday, Aug. 18 at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

Majestic Player A equals track record preceding ISS action

Three-year-old pacing colts and geldings took their turn in the spotlight in Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) action on Saturday, July 18 at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Two \$34,500 divisions brought 21 Indiana sired competitors ready to battle in their second round of stakes action. The standouts were **Odds On Osiris** with Peter Wrenn who equaled his lifetime mark and **Caribbean Escape** with John DeLong with an impressive rally in the stretch. Not to be outdone by the pacing colts, **Majestic Player A** captured the \$15,000 open trot and equaled the track record for older trotters, clocking a 1:51.1 victory with Sam Widger in the bike.

Odds On Osiris kicked off the stakes action for the evening in the opening division as he took the lead from the coveted post five. As the gate opened, he was followed by Dry Creek Sam with Robert Taylor and Island Of The Sea with Michael Oosting. Clocking fractions of :25.3 and :54.3, Odds On Osiris remained unchallenged until the third quarter in 1:24.1 when Dry Creek Sam was attacking on the outside. The two matched strides down the stretch while Clever Character with Dale Hiteman was also winding up from behind. When the clock stopped in 1:50.3, it was Odds On Osiris who reached the wire first, equaling his best time. Roll With Time with LeWayne Miller arrived late on the scene for second while Island Of The Sea finished third. Odds On Osiris paid \$3.60 to win at the betting windows.

"It's been an interesting year, but he's exactly where I was hoping he'd be at this point," Wrenn said after the victory. "That was a nice mile and I was very impressed with his class tonight."

Odds On Osiris, the son of Rockin Image—Antigua Hanover brought his lifetime bankroll to \$366,895 with his eighth lifetime win. He is owned by Odds On Racing and was bred by Merlie Schwartz.

Division two brought a full field of eleven but that didn't deter Caribbean Escape from rallying late to score his second straight stakes victory. Using similar tactics from his first round victory, Caribbean Escape was uninvolved in the early tussle as Sawyer's Desire and Ricky Macomber Jr followed the wings of the gate for the lead. Caribbean Escape showed his stamina, as he was second-over through the first quarter

in :26.1 and remained there through the half in :54. Always And Again with Ken Holliday wanted their turn on the front and lead the field into the final turn.

As the field turned for home in 1:22.2, Always And Again was still on top while Caribbean Escape joined the cavalry charging toward the wire from third over. DeLong tipped Caribbean Escape late in the lane and he dug in gamely to put a nose in front and stop the clock in 1:51. Caribbean Escape paid \$9.60 to win for his betting backers. Northern Cadillac and Joey Putnam closed from the clouds to finish second while Family Recipe and LeWayne Miller got up for third.

"With the eight hole in an 11-horse field, I figured we would have a tough trip," DeLong said. "We needed speed up front and that's exactly what happened. This horse has come a long way in a short amount of time."

Trained by K. Dean Glispie, who also co-owns with Barbara Schlagetter and Gail Potter, Caribbean Escape added a third lifetime win to his record. Bred by Stephanie Smith, the son of Bring On The Beach-Caribbean now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$46,142.

Grabbing the spotlight before the ISS races, was 6-year-old trotting gelding Majestic Player A. After sitting last for much of the mile, Majestic Player A used an incredible stretch rally to get up in the final strides to score his fifth straight victory. With the 1:51.1 clocking, Majestic Player A not only established a new lifetime best but also equaled the track record at Harrah's Hoosier Park for older trotters. Trained by Walter Haynes Jr., Majestic Player A remains undefeated in three starts at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Indiana Sires Stakes action will continue at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Tuesday, July 21 with two divisions for 2-year-old trotting fillies kicking off their stakes season.

Springbridge Duel and Desperate Man repeat in Gold action

One was a trainer's worst nightmare, the other a dream, but both **Springbridge Duel** and **Desperate Man** have done nothing but win since making their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) debut two weeks ago.

Back in Gold Series action at Woodbine Mohawk Park on

Saturday (July 18), the geldings were sent off as heavy favorites in their respective \$107,200 divisions and proved that their victories in the season opener had nothing to do with luck.

Starting from the outside Post 9, Springbridge Duel got away fourth as Twin B Heart Throb led the field to a :26.3 quarter. Next Big Thing took over on the front before the :57 half, but driver Bob McClure was content to let Springbridge Duel hover in fourth waiting for a wind break that came from Twin B Fighter heading for the 1:25.1 three-quarters. Just over five lengths behind the leader at the top of the stretch, Springbridge Duel eventually shifted into high gear and sprinted away from his peers to a two length victory in 1:53.1. Avion Seelster closed well for second and Next Big Thing stayed game for third.

"Once Bob got his attention, he was really motoring that last eighth, but he definitely scared me at the head of the lane where it looked like he was kind of hanging little bit," said trainer Casie Coleman Herlihy. "But I've got to remember he's green too, he doesn't know what he's doing."

After Springbridge Duel's 1:51.3 win on the front-end in the July 3 season opener, Coleman Herlihy opted to switch him to an open bridle in an effort to keep the fractious youngster calm, cool and collected. While she was pleased with his effort, she is not sure the new equipment will remain in place for the Big Jim son's next start in the Battle Of Waterloo eliminations at Grand River Raceway on July 27.

"I was kind of worried he was too quiet," said Coleman Herlihy. "I'm not a trainer that ever uses an open bridle much, I like a horse up on the rigging and I like keeping their attention, but saying that this horse is extremely hot, he's hard to handle, and when he gets mad he'll get chucking his head and he will make a break if you get fighting him. So you've got to keep him happy and kind of do things the way he wants so he doesn't get upset with you."

"Bob gave him a perfect trip, he couldn't have got a better trip, where we finally we got to sit for a while and then come second over, that was a really good learning experience for him," she added. "Now I've just got to figure out a happy medium with the horse."

Coleman Herlihy trains Springbridge Duel for West Wins Stable of Cambridge, Steve Heimbecker of Conestogo, ON and Mark Kantrowitz of Delray Beach, FL. The partners offered up \$40,000 for the gelding at last fall's Harrisburg

Yearling Sale and wondered all winter whether they would even see the horse race, let alone recoup any of his purchase price.

"Casie sent me two really funny videos – funny now that the colt has shown what he can do – and he was not a friendly animal at the start and we really didn't have any high aspirations for him," said Heimbecker. "He's definitely proven us wrong. I'm very excited to see what this colt can do for the rest of the year. And I know it's a little early to say, but I am excited about next year too."

Arthur, ON residents Kathy and John Cecchin and their daughter and son-in-law Nicole and Paul Davies are also excited to see what else is in store for Desperate Man after the Shadow Play son cruised to a three length victory in Saturday's second \$107,200 division.

Starting from Post 4 with regular reinsman Trevor Henry in the race bike, Desperate Man got away fifth and watched the fans' second choice Uncontrollable reach the quarter in :27.2. As the pace eased Henry sent Desperate Man after the lead, achieving that goal just after the :57.1 half. On top by two and three-quarter lengths at the 1:24.3 three-quarters, Desperate Man sailed down the stretch to the three length victory in 1:52.3. Ucanttouchthis was second and Socrates Blue Chip finished third.

"I don't think that we really ever thought, I mean John liked him and everybody liked him, but you know when you go to baby race you find out that everybody's got a super nice colt, so we really didn't have those kind of expectations at all," said trainer Kathy Cecchin. "We're happy that we have him and we really like him, but there's a lot of nice colts out there and we'll just hope for the best."

Where Springbridge Duel was a headache for Coleman Herlihy and her team all winter, Desperate Man was a model student for the Cecchin's, learning his lessons almost effortlessly.

"Super smart, John said all winter he's much more like a four-year-old than he is like a two-year-old," said Cecchin. "He just doesn't do anything wrong really. He wears two head poles, but he doesn't wear any big equipment, he's just a pretty easy-going guy."

The son of Shadow Play was a \$20,000 acquisition at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, with Henry, John MacLeod and Jim Fleming responsible for bidding on the youngster for the Cecchin's, and son after he arrived in Arthur

the couple gave half-ownership of him to the Davies' as a wedding gift.

"We were looking for a horse from the family of Outlawgrabbingears, and his mother is a sister to Outlawgrabbingears mother. Outlawgrabbingears is their good horse, maybe a horse of a lifetime, and so I said, 'Dad and I will give you money when you buy a house or we'll give you half of the colt, whatever you want', and they said that they wanted half of the colt so that's what they got," said Cecchin. "They're pretty pleased about the whole thing I think. But like I said, it could have legitimately been half of nothing, because you don't know, right."

Through just two starts Desperate Man has earned

\$106,000, and while he is not eligible anything other than the Ontario Sires Stakes, he will have ample opportunity to pad the Davies' down payment fund. His next start comes on Aug. 21 when the two-year-old pacing colts return to Woodbine Mohawk Park for their third Gold leg.

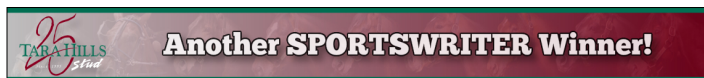
