# Hardly Kismet

Canadian trotter aims to go from green to envied in next week's Hambletonian elims.

When Highland Kismet "missed the gate by three or four lengths," according to Meadowlands track announcer Ken Warkentin, immediately questions were raised.

Highland Kismet was the 8-5 second choice in the second division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial on Saturday (July 13) at The Meadowlands, and although race favorite TCI (3-2) didn't win, he did hit the board finishing third, while Highland Kismet was sixth in the seven-horse field with only Bargain, who broke at the start, finishing behind him.

As of Tuesday (July 16) afternoon, Highland Kismet's trainer, Mark Etsell, had not yet had a long conversation with driver Bob McClure.

"The quick conversation the other night [after the race] was it was [McClure's] fault, he wasn't on the gate," Etsell said. "So, when you spot them four and get beat three, that doesn't help you, either."

McClure told HRU Tuesday — before speaking to Etsell later that night when driving two of the trainer's horses at Woodbine Mohawk Park — that 'Kismet' was not interested in putting his nose on the gate.

"He just didn't want to go in between the two horses," McClure said. "Next time, as long as he's there a little earlier, I think he will be okay."

According to McClure, he had not seen this behavior in Highland Kismet's six previous outings.

"Well, he's a green horse," McClure said. "That was only his seventh lifetime start, so we've been pretty careful at the gate with him every week. But he's never done this where he didn't want to go in between two horses before.

"I was expecting him to go up in between two horses and right behind the car, but he's afforded some immaturity. He's got a real disadvantage when it comes to experience on the other ones."

Both McClure and Etsell said the signs on the rail bothered Highland Kismet.

"There was a lot to look at, but mostly I think it was the combination of going up between the two horses," McClure said. "There have been weeks where I brought him in late, but the horses beside him were coming in late, too. So, [in the Dancer] the horse inside me and the horse outside me went right on the gate. He just seemed like he wasn't so sure about going right up in between them. But that's an easy problem to fix, just have him there earlier."

McClure said he wasn't concerned at all about what Highland Kismet did at the gate, but after that was another story.

"I mean, he's missed the gate before and beaten good horses, but it was more concerning about when I went to ask him Want to go in between the two horses. Next time, as long as he's there a little earlier, I think he will be okay. He's a green horse. That was only his seventh lifetime start, so we've been pretty careful at the gate with him every week. to leave the gate and get position after that and I had to steady him through pretty well the whole mile," McClure said. "And it's unfortunate because I thought most horses hit The Meadowlands and because the surface is so immaculate there, their gait just improves.

"I had a suspicion that maybe because of the good track, he extended more but I don't know, that's more of a Mark Etsell job than mine. And he's a specialist with trotters, so I'll leave that in his hands to figure that out. But I just hope it's something that can be rectified in two weeks because the horse I've been driving to this date was pretty well bomb proof. So, you know, when you're going down there thinking you've got a legit Hambo horse and you gotta steady him the whole way, that's pretty tough to take."


Etsell said he did diagnostics and bloodwork on Highland Kismet when he got home to Canada and everything looked okay, but he planned to talk with McClure about how the horse handled the track and whether any changes need to be made.

"You gotta remember this horse only had six starts, seven starts now, in a lifetime, total," Etsell said. "So, I mean, everything was a little overwhelming for him."



The Dancer marked Highland Kismet's first outing away from home.

"He's very comfortable at Mohawk because that's where he's been every start, from the day we schooled him to his last race [prior to the Dancer]," Etsell said. "And Mohawk compared to The Meadowlands isn't as flamboyant, flashy, with all the signs and the carnival effect that is there, especially the other night with the food trucks."



Etsell said he was telling people that, compared to The Meadowlands, Woodbine Mohawk Park is rural.

"We're basically in the country and everything is open; everything's grass, trees, there's no big fence," Etsell said. "The Meadowlands has a big fence along the backstretch which is a little overwhelming for a green horse that hasn't seen it before. So, I think he was a little taken aback by all that."

It was the anticipation of just such a situation that made Etsell want to get a race at The Meadowlands under Highland Kismet's belt before next week's Hambletonian eliminations.

"Because it is a different surface, it's a different atmosphere, I thought it would benefit us to do it and that's what we did," Etsell said. "And, hopefully, we learned enough that we'll be better prepared for the Hambo elims... We'll try and cross all our t's and dot our i's and be as prepared as we can."

It was not a night for favorites in the two Dancer divisions as both Karl (1-9) and the aforementioned T C I both failed to find the winner's circle.

"Regardless of how Karl or T C I or others had raced, after the way my horse raced in the Goodtimes, I wouldn't have traded him for anybody," McClure said. "And, given what I saw last week, I still wouldn't. My horse trotted [1:51.4], but after the wire he went around everybody. He's a powerhouse of a horse. He wants to do it.

"Even as bad as he was trotting, he still trotted [1:51.4]. So, I'm confident he can go [1]:50 over The Meadowlands; if he's right, it wouldn't shock me at all. And I think if he's at his best, he can go right with anybody."

For a little perspective, race winner Situationship went in 1:51.1 with a last quarter in :27.1, while Highland Kismet's last quarter was :26.3.

Highland Kismet is looking to become just the eighth horse that did not race at 2 to win America's Classic Trotting Race. Tagliabue is the last horse to do it in 1995 and the Dancer final (then raced as elims and a final not divisions) was also the seventh start of his career.

"The thing about this horse is no matter how the race sets up [it doesn't matter]," said McClure, who won the 2019 Hambletonian with Forbidden Trade. "I've put him on the front and he jogs in [1]:51 and I've come back halves in :53 with him. So, there's no way for them to get away from him.

"If they go slow fractions, they're going to hear from him early. If they want to speed away from him, they're going to hear from him late. There is no disadvantage to this horse when he's right."

# World record performance by Nurmos' star

Timo Nurmos stable in Sweden produces top horses basically in every crop and after last year's dominance in the \$800,000 Kriteriet for 3-year-olds, Nurmos' winner **Fame And Glory** (Tactical Landing) was ready for a world record performance on Wednesday (July 17) night.

In Eskilstuna's \$60,000 Fyraåringstestet over the Derby distance of 2,640 meters, Fame And Glory, paired with Björn Goop, proved strongest after a first-over trip, outside of stablemate Our Pride during the final lap.

Fame And Glory equaled the record for 4-year-olds over the actual distance on a five-eighths mile track and landed on a mile rate of 1:55.2.

On the same card, Goop tested his super trotter **San Moteur** (Panne de Moteur) without shoes and in an American bike for the first time, as a try-out before the Åby World Grand Prix in August and the test turned out well. San Moteur disarmed leader Mister Hercules in the stretch and looked strong in a 1:53.2 win over 1.3 miles.

And speaking of the Åby World Grand Prix, Åby's sports general Jon Walter Pedersen has invited new horses to the race and it seems like it's not hard to attract the best of the French trotters, even if the connections to Horsy Dream has accepted an invitation.

Adrian Kolgjini's Barack Face and Alessandro Gocciadoro's Banderas Bi have both accepted their invitations, respectively and on Saturday (July 20), the winner of V75's Gold division will receive a ticket to Åby's big event on Aug. 10, where the winner will get \$600,000.



#### **OPEN STORY FOR THE MARES**

Axevalla racetrack in Sweden plays host to one of the summer's biggest harness racing events in Europe and during three days (today-Sunday), the fans will get to know some good horses, not in the least in Sunday's (July 21) \$480,000 Stochampionatet for 4-year-old mares over 2,640 meters.

The longer distance and the nine days between the eliminations and final means that the Stochampionatet is a race with pretty tough conditions.

And this year's race is probably more open than any other edition of the event. Twelve mares qualified for the final via six elimination heats on Friday (July 12) and now it's time to see who is the queen among the Swedish-bred mares born in 2020.

# Taking her trainer's exam was a winning decision for Ashley Duford

For trainer Ashley Duford of the heralded Duford racing family, the decision to join the likes of her namesakes wasn't so cutand-dry at first.

"I wrote my trainer's test in January 2007 because I had owned a little trotting gelding named No Delusions," said Ashley of the bay gelding who holds the honor of being the first horse she had ever owned, trained, and jogged.

"A family friend [trainer Mike Hamlin] was training him at the time while I was in school. I never really had any intentions to write my trainer's [exam], but after being encouraged, I finally took the steps that were needed to get me set up."

Ashley's choice to not only embrace but build upon her family's legacy in Ontario standardbred racing has since proven to be a more than worthwhile endeavor.

Coming off a career year in 2023, which saw Ashley reach a single-season high earnings total of \$170,406, the fourth-generation horseperson reflected on the memorable journey that traces back to her early childhood.

It was then where she learned some of the game's basics from her grandfather Wilfred Duford, a former driver who carved out a lengthy career across the Saskatchewan, Quebec, and Ontario harness racing circuits.

"Wilf," as he was affectionately known, died in 2006.

"I remember being maybe 4 years old and I would sit in the trunk and help my grandpa roll bandages," Ashley said.

"My sister Hannah and I were always at the track on weekends. I was much younger, so I was given the little, easy jobs, where she had to clean stalls."

While stall-cleaning duty would eventually catch up with Ashley, the Dresden, ON-based conditioner still found plenty of time to hone her equine coaching skills.

Under the tutelage of her father, driver/trainer Dennis Duford, who's accumulated over 1,650 wins during his still active 40-year career, and uncles Rodney and Jerry Duford, who together boast a combined 3,456 driving/training wins and counting, Ashley effectively translated her family's teachings into her first win on May 15, 2011, at Dresden Raceway.

"It was with one of our own homebreds that I named Go Diego Go," she said. "I was working at the slots at the time, bartending, and was working the morning shift. But I made sure to take my lunch break at the time of the race.

"I walked over to the grandstand and stood out at the fence, in the rain, to cheer on my boy."

The youngest Duford's trackside presence coupled with her father Dennis behind the reins inspired the Duford homebred to hold on just long enough for a neck's decision.

The 2011 campaign was memorable for both Ashley and Go Diego Go, who scored his lone trip to the winner's circle under Ashley's schooling before retiring at the end of the season.

Across 27 career starts, the bay gelding with a big personality netted a 1-1-6 record.

Other standout performers under Ashley's coaching umbrella include a trio of trotters in Rainbow Gold 255 58-35-36 for \$306,839 in purse earnings, Savthelstdancforme (264 36-41-49, \$227,423), and Eagle Scout (254 34-33-35, \$182, 702).

As the years followed, so too did the accolades for Ashley.

The now veteran trainer is both a member of the \$1-million lifetime earnings (\$1.45 million) and 200 wins (202) clubs.

The latter achievement came in race six on Sunday (Nov. 5, 2023), at Leamington Raceway.

For Ashley, the milestone was special. With her father Dennis once again in the sulky behind another one of her most cherished talents, tally number 200 put it all in perspective.

"It was with my boy Jooner, who holds a lot of weight in my heart," Ashley said. "It really means a lot to get a win, especially when you know you're a little guy with average horses."

While she doesn't remember all the congratulatory texts or phone calls following the momentous occasion — perhaps a product savoring the moment before it passed — Ashley did remember a Facebook post from her partner Rob Doyle.

"He's my number one fan," she said.

Jooner being the horse to cross the finish line on that November day was the cherry on top for Ashley.

As she alluded to earlier, the two go way back.

"Right from a baby, he pulled some heart strings," Ashley said.

"While breaking him, my dog ran up to him and ran off with the third line, and 'Joon' just went with it. He wasn't spooked, he just kept going."

That ability to remain unfazed has worked wonders for the 9-year-old bay gelding, who also happened to deliver win number 201 for Ashley on Dec. 12, 2023.

However, this time around, it was driver Tyler Borth steering the way to victory.

Through 228 total starts on the Ontario circuit, Jooner sports a 14-30-26 line.

Ashley was able to ride the momentum from last season's late surge into her first bout on the 2024 calendar.


The team of Ashley, 7-year-old mare Playfull Elegance, and Borth delivered a clean one-length triumph in race 7 at Western Fair on Jan. 3.

Ashley, now 150 contests into the 2024 campaign (9-17-31 record), has come a long way from the kid who needed additional prompting to take out her training license.

She's grateful for the support that brought her to where she is and where she hopes to go.

"I'd like to think I'm making my father and uncles proud to be the only one to carry on in the business," she said.

### Attack of the selfacclaimed guardians of gambling gimmicks

I wanted to consider myself an expert per James Quinn's three simple ingredients. If I were near as smart as the company I kept in those days I may have been able to write an equation for it. But I could not even pass the written test to be a contestant on Wheel Of Fortune. Maybe I needed to construct a Rubik's Cube with only three matching sides; two representing my knowledge and experience and one for my intuition. My DNA refused all attempts.

Meanwhile my address found its way onto a mailing list targeting the legion of desperate and degenerate sports gamblers; or as the senders called it, The Sucker List. In a few days my personal Post Office box overflowed.

"You're going to need a bigger box or less friends," said actor/comedian Ron Carey (High Anxiety, Barney Miller) whose rented box was next to mine.

"These are ads from fellas claiming to have winning formulas at the races. Look," I said, showing him one.

He read the envelope. "Risk-Free Ricky releases his racetrack secrets. Make a thousand a day..."

"And he only wants sixty-nine bucks."

Tommy Turfmaster, Big Buck's Profitable Picks, Sid Swift's Super Solutions at The Races and on and on... It was nothing new but neither were suckers. Especially beginners.

When Off Track Betting (OTB) opened in New York in the '70s, there was an ad running in local newspapers promising winners from a phone call. A lady answered and said, "I'm going to give you a horse to bet. You can play however much you want; all I want are the winnings of a 10-dollar ticket which you'll send in the form of a money order to a post office box I'll give you when you call back after winning." I agreed and she said, "Corporal King in the fifth at Belmont."

I told a friend about it and he visited OTB and placed \$20 to win on Corporal King at long odds. We listened to the race at

an OTB parlor; Corporal King got a single call and lost. We were curious; if it were a smart scheme, why would it give out a loser?

"Because she made money on the winner," my friend said Then he explained the simple brilliance of the fraud. "She picks a single race a day. One with a big field. Like Corporate King was in a with 12. She gets a dozen phone calls. She gives each caller a different horse in the same race. One of the callers wins and sends her the winnings of a 10-dollar ticket."

"Oh, my gawd," I said, "you're a Sherlock. She's winning every race on a program if she gets 10 calls."

The phone scheme had no overhead but the mail order pieces were carefully designed printed pamphlets and follow-up pieces that cost money to mail. But at 60-some-odd bucks a clip the senders knew there were plenty of suckers on their lists willing to take shots at "crushing the races for big profits."

The guardians of gambling gimmicks mailed me ads in L.A. even while I earned a prolific profile as a writer in racing publications like American Turf Monthly and Harness Horse. I wrote back to a few of them more than once with the following offer:

"If you send me a free copy of your formula and it lives up to its expectations, I will pay you ten (10) times the asking price and write a glowing review in publications where I contribute."

I never received a single response but remained on their mailing lists.

"I guess a lot of desperate gamblers go for that stuff," Ron said. I said, "I understand the attraction. Doing a little work for big rewards."

This was my goal, too, but I did not buy into the myths of a secret formula or specific regularizer. Ultimately, I wanted to profit from pari-mutuel betting with as easy a formula as possible; one I would not construct into a so-called super system with strict rules and conditioned betting boundaries; one demanding precise race types to address; one promising a fair return-on-investment profit percentage; one I would not be able to package and sell to support its failure.


I was given time to ruminate...

My writing career forced me to take a hiatus from pari-mutuel activity. I became involved with a surreptitious plan promising adventure and international intrigue with no connection to parimutuel racing. The plan was concocted by a tycoon (let's call him Sir Delaney) who reportedly lived somewhere in Great Britain. The plan included being stationed on a tanker-ship-turned-broadcast station sailing along the borders of international waters on the North Sea. Soon I was on my way to England via France to be a member of Wolfman Jack's clandestine crew of pirate radio broadcasters.

# MacDonald looks to Adios after Pace triumph

Three drivers this century have won the Meadowlands Pace and Adios in the same year. Each time, the driver captured those races with different horses. James MacDonald can take the first step toward duplicating that feat on Saturday (July 20).

MacDonald, who won the Meadowlands Pace this past Saturday with Legendary Hanover, will drive Huntingforchrome in the

first of two \$25,000 eliminations for the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids, for 3-year-old pacers, at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows.

Huntingforchrome will enter the race off a 1:48.1 victory in a 3-year-old open at The Meadowlands on Pace night with MacDonald in the sulky. He paced his last quarter in :25.2; only one horse came home faster that night at The Big M.

"It's cool," MacDonald said about heading to the Adios with Huntingforchrome. "He felt like a nice horse, just the way he did it."

Last week, Huntingforchrome was first to the opening turn from post 5, then saw Rush In and McCrunch go by on their way to a :26.1 quarter and :54 half. He was fourth on the pylons when the field reached three-quarters in 1:22.1, then angled out in the stretch to sprint past his foes on his way to winning by 1¾ lengths over Remember The Alamo.

"He followed along great and when I needed him, he flew," MacDonald said. "Those are all good qualities to have. Going to a five-eighths-of-amile track [at The Meadows], it was good to see him have a lot of gate speed and then settle in nicely. He raced super."

The three drivers to win the Pace and Adios in the same year this century were Brian Sears in 2019 with Best In Show in the Pace and Southwind Ozzi in the Adios, Ron Pierce in 2011 with Roll With Joe in the Pace and Alsace Hanover in the Adios, and John Campbell in 2002 with Mach Three in the Pace and Million Dollar Cam in the Adios.

MacDonald and Huntingforchrome will begin their quest to reach the Adios final from post 4 in an elimination field of seven. The son of Huntsville—All On Top Hanover, one of three Adios hopefuls trained by Travis Alexander, is the third choice on the morning line at 4-1.

The first four finishers in each elim, along with the fifth-place finisher with the higher lifetime earnings, return on Adios Day (Saturday, July 27) for the \$350,000 final. Connections of the elimination winners get to pick their post positions for the final, with the other posts determined by random draw.

"He definitely looks like a player," MacDonald said about Huntingforchrome. "He drew pretty good, so hopefully we can get a good trip and get the job done."

Captain Luke, who finished fourth in the Meadowlands Pace, is the 9-5 favorite in the first elimination, leaving from post 6 for driver Scott Zeron and trainer Tony Alagna. Captain Albano, the 2023 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male pacer, is the 2-1 favorite in the second elim, starting from post 5 for driver Todd McCarthy and trainer Noel Daley.

MacDonald appeared in his first Adios last year, when he missed by a head with Redwood Hanover despite racing with a flat tire the last half-mile.

"That was a heartbreaker," MacDonald said. "It was a tough pill to swallow, but it was definitely a fun experience."

Speaking of fun experiences, Legendary Hanover's stakes-record 1:46.3 victory last week in the Meadowlands Pace might be difficult to top. Only one 3-year-old has ever won a race with a faster time, **Confederate** with a 1:46.1 score last year at Lexington's Red Mile.

"It was definitely good to see him get his shining moment on Saturday," said MacDonald, who drove Legendary Hanover for trainer Anthony Beaton and owners Eric Good, West Wins Stable, and Mark Dumain. "We've always known he's had the ability, and we were just waiting for that big moment — and he finally got it.

"I couldn't be prouder of the horse and Tony and everyone involved. It's a great group of connections. He's some kind of horse. I'm happy to be along for the ride."

MacDonald is still in the process of having the experience sink in.

"It's been a whirlwind since Saturday," he said. "I haven't really had time to sit back and reflect and appreciate how special it was as of yet, but I will. Those wins don't come along very often, so you've really got to find time to bask in it, for sure."

# Racing reflections with Bruce Saunders

Bruce Saunders is best known for training 2010 Horse of the Year Rock N Roll Heaven, but it was two award-winning horses at the beginning of his career that paved the way for his transition from the worlds of finance and government to harness racing.

Chipper Frost was the Delaware Valley Horse of the Year in 1979, not long after Saunders, who has a master's degree in finance, began in the sport following stints at a brokerage firm and as the head of the division of economic development for the state

of Delaware (even serving as acting governor for a day). Five years later, Perky Fiddler gave Saunders his second Delaware Valley Horse of the Year honoree.

"I never intended to be involved in harness racing," said Saunders, who recently recorded his 1,500th win since the inception of official trainer stats in 1991. "While I liked horses, I was never exposed to them until I was in high school. I went to Freehold (NJ.) High School and a lot of my friends, their families had horses. So, I would go with my friends to watch them race, and I kind of got a little interest, but I never thought it would be a career.

"But once you have a good horse, you're hooked."

Saunders got started in racing following the loss of his gubernatorial-appointed economic development job in the mid-1970s. He began by helping a friend with his horses in Maryland and eventually landed at Liberty Bell, where he worked with a handful of horses, one of which was Chipper Frost.

In 1979, Chipper Frost won 10 races and \$93,805, with his top moment coming in a leg of the Can-Am Series at Laurel

Raceway, which the 4-year-old pacer captured in an all-time Maryland record 1:56.3.

"He was a pretty exceptional horse," said Saunders, who trained Chipper Frost for owner Ron Hastings. "I would go with him from pillar-to-post. People liked him. That got me started."

Perky Fiddler, owned by Saunders, also was a 10-race winner in his Delaware Valley Horse of the Year campaign. The then 6-year-old pacer was a track-record setter at Brandywine, Liberty Bell, and Pocono Downs — where he established the all-age mark of 1:56.1 in winning the final of the Keystone Laurel Pacing Series. The previous Pocono record, 1:56.3, was set by Laverne Hanover in 1969 and equaled by Ludell Hanover in 1983.

In addition, Perky Fiddler set the record for most career sub-2:00 miles at Brandywine when he won there in 1:56.2 in September 1984. It was his 12th victory in less than two minutes at the track.

"He just tries harder than some horses," Saunders said in 1984. "He has met better-bred horses, and horses with more ability, but there are none gamer than him. What makes him unique is his durability and stamina. In getting older, he has gotten stronger."

Saunders added now, "Perky Fiddler raced until he was 9 in the opens at Liberty Bell and Brandywine. They would race for 10 or 12 thousand (dollars). That horse would win \$65,000 for three or four years. He kind of kept me alive.

"As time went on, I gained more experience, and I ended up developing my own barn, people I knew in the Wilmington, DE area. My routine would be to race at Brandywine in the summer, Liberty Bell in the

fall. Then when Liberty Bell would close, I would go to either Roosevelt or Yonkers, whichever was open for the winter. As it grew, maybe had eight horses, my one caretaker would stay at Yonkers with three and I would be at The Meadowlands with a half dozen or so."

Saunders posted his first million-dollar season in 1997 and enjoyed 14 consecutive million-dollar campaigns (topping \$2 million four times) beginning in 2000. From 1998 through 2011, he ranked among the Top 10 trainers in wins at The Meadowlands on seven occasions and was 11th three times.

His first star during that time was Misfit, who earned more than \$1 million lifetime. Other stakes and upper-level horses during that period included Manificent, Die Lute, Eleven A M, Master Barney, Casimir Camotion, Psilvuheartbreaker, Southwestern Dream, Lookinforadventure, Nob Hill High, and Moonlit Dragon.

And, of course, Rock N Roll Heaven.

Rock N Roll Heaven won 16 of 21 races in 2010 and earned \$2.15 million. He paced a record 11 sub-1:50 miles, with victories in 1:49.2 or faster on every size racetrack — half, five-eighths, seven-eighths, and mile. The colt was owned by Frank Bellino and bred by Steve Stewart, Charles "Cotton" Nash, Julie Nash, and Francene Nash.

In 2017, Rock N Roll Heaven was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

"He was an unbelievable horse in so many regards," Saunders said in a 2020 interview looking back at the horse's victory in the Little Brown Jug. "One of the remarkable attributes he had was that he could pace away from a field of horses any time during the mile. In the middle part, the first part, from the top of the stretch home; if he was fresh, he could just sprint away from horses. And a lot of them stood on their toes trying to keep up with him.

"To get a horse that is Horse of the Year is pretty spectacular. He was special."

Over the years, Saunders has enjoyed longstanding relationships with a number of owners, including Cary Potkin (Potkin Stables and M&M Harness Racing), Bill Matz (M&M Harness Racing and Z Tam Stables), the Paul family (M And L of Delaware), and more than a decade with the Bellino family.

"I've had owners that bought a number of really good horses for me over the years," Saunders said. "That's the important thing as a trainer, to have good owners and good caretakers who understand the game and like their horses. The training part really is the easy part.

"Good owners and good horses aside, I think your reputation precedes you in almost any profession. I think in order to survive in this game, or any other profession, it's important that people perceive you as honest, straightforward, and an individual of integrity. Those are the kinds of things I pride myself in. Integrity leads to longevity, I think. I'm kind of proud of the fact that I still do this."

As for the present, Saunders just picked up a win last week with Manolete in the opening round of the New Jersey Sire Stakes for 2-year-old male pacers. In his previous start, the colt missed by only a neck in a division of the Kindergarten Classic Series.

"I always felt in my mind, because of my education, I could do pretty much anything I wanted," Saunders said. "But I learned at a very young age that enjoying life and being happy is probably the most important thing for an individual. I know a lot of guys that make a lot of money, but are they really happy? No, they don't enjoy what they do. Horses make me happy, and I've been lucky enough to be around people that make me happy.

"It's a great game. I wouldn't be doing anything else."







# PA-sired freshman trotting fillies shine at Philly

Two-year-old trotting fillies came to Harrah's Philadelphia Wednesday afternoon (July 17) for the second preliminary rounds of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes and Pennsylvania Stallion Series, and the biggest newsmaker was the sire Greenshoe, who fathered both winners in the Sire Stakes competition and also two of the successful Stallion Series fillies.

**Princess Jackie** (dam Frisky Magic) emerged as the only double winner in either series, as on Wednesday she quarter-moved to the lead and went on to win her division, like the other worth \$79,399, in 1:56, three-quarters-of-a-length ahead of the pocket-sitter Blueberry. Tim Tetrick drove the filly, now unbeaten in three purse starts, for trainer/owner D. R. Ackerman.

The faster PASS division winner by a tick was **Goodgirl Bi IT** (dam Princess Grif), who was hustled to the lead from the outside post by driver Mattias Melander in her betting bow. When favored pocket-sitter Elaine T S broke heading for the passing lane, Goodgirl Bi IT was left well-clear and prevailed by

3¼ lengths over Ms Prada for Mattias' brother, trainer Marcus Melander, and Courant Inc.

Greenshoe's winning pair in the \$20,000 Stallion Series contests both scored in 1:58.1 in their purse bows. First to win was **Saints Preserve Us** (dam Firm To Stay), showing a good rally late to win for driver Tim Tetrick, new Hall of Fame trainer Jim Campbell, and Runthetable Stables. She was later followed in the winner's circle by **French Riviera** (dam Creamy Mimi), a \$350,000 yearling who also made her first purse race a successful one with a good rally for driver Tyler Miller, trainer/ mother Julie Miller, and owner Marvin Katz.

Quickest StS winner was the Cantab Hall—Exceed Expectation miss **Omega**, who was the alpha filly in the latter stages to stop the clock in 1:57.1 while breaking her maiden for driver Andrew McCarthy, trainer Linda Toscano, and Barbato Breeding LLC.

Completing the Stallion Series victresses were two other baby misses breaking their maiden: the Bar Hopping—Dab Hanover distaff **Demarara Hanover**, successful in 1:58.2 for driver David Miller, trainer Ron Burke, and Burke Racing Stable LLC, Knox Services Inc., FAC Racing LLC, and J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby, along with **Miss Pennsylvania**, a daughter of Father Patrick—Blue With Envy who won in 1:59.3 for driver Corey Callahan, trainer John Butenschoen, and Heritage Standardbreds.

Driving three winners on the Wednesday card were Yannick Gingras (all for trainer Dean Eckley) and David Miller.

The focus will remain on trotters today as 3-year-old trotting males go in their third prelim of the PA Sire Stakes and Stallion Series, with a few of the former group possibly earning them trips to New Jersey within the next couple of weeks with an outstanding performance. # BJM's Lil Man stands tall in NYSS at Buffalo

**BJM's Lil Man** (\$2.40) stood tall in the \$106,300 New York Sire Stakes for the 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters at Buffalo Raceway on Wednesday afternoon (July 17) with a hard-fought 1¼-length victory over Low Inside in 1:59.4 over the fast track.

After romping to a 10-length victory in the Excelsior Series at Vernon Downs on July 4, BJM's Lil Man jumped back into the New York Sire Stakes.

Banksy Monkey and Karinchak each broke stride behind the starting gate, thus leaving just five gentlemen to battle it out the rest of the way.

Low Inside (Dan Daley) got the early lead but saw that wiped away as BJM's Lil Man (Tyler Buter) quickly marched back to the top. With fractions of :29.3, 1:00 and 1:30.1, things were about to get interesting down the stretch for BJM's Lil Man.

Security Code S (Niko Karna) was first over and was on even terms with BJM's Lil Man turning for home. Low Inside was sitting in the pocket and went inside, making a move toward the lead as well. But midway down the long stretch, BJM's Lil Man found a final burst of energy and managed to give himself some daylight hitting the finish line, beating Low Inside while Security Code S had to settle for third.

Owned by Joseph Meaney and trained by John Berger, it was the second victory in three starts for BJM's Lil Man (Devious Man—Vixen). The win improved his seasonal earnings to \$63,150.

In the \$20,000 Excelsior Series for the freshmen trotters, **Logo** (John MacDonald) held back Doctor Strange (John Stark, Jr.) by 2½ lengths. He covered the mile in 2:01.2 and returned \$5.50 for the triumph.

The second division saw **Cheques In Limbo** (Kevin Cummings) score a popular \$3 victory in defeating Chapamando (MacDonald) by 1½ lengths in 2:03.3.

The final weekend of live action at Buffalo Raceway begins today with a 10-race card set for 2:30 p.m. The Pick-5 has a \$381 carryover starting in the second race. There are 10 more events scheduled for Saturday evening at 6 p.m. while the track has added this Sunday (July 21) to the calendar with a special noon post.

### Trotting fillies battle in Indiana Sire Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Indiana Sire Stakes action returned to Harrah's Hoosier Park on Wednesday (July 17) with leg 4 for the 3-year-old trotting fillies. Two divisions highlighted the 14-race Wednesday card, seeing **Hail Broadway** and **Skyway Paige** deliver victories in front-stepping fashion.

Leaving from the rail in the \$48,500 first division, Hail Broadway teamed up with regular pilot Jordan Ross to topple her five rivals and score her second-straight victory of the season. Ross protected the inside position early, sending Hail Broadway to the quarter first in a hot :27 while Black Gold (James Yoder) settled in the pocket. Hail Broadway was left alone on the lead to the half in :56.2 before Robert Taylor moved the 4-5 favorite Agent Of Fortune first-over from fourth, powering alongside the leader in the final turn. Ross kicked out the ear plugs on Hail Broadway who looked to counter as Agent Of Fortune put her head in front at three-quarters in 1:26.2.

Agent Of Fortune brought the field in to the stretch, but Hail Broadway refused to go away to her inside. The fillies continued

to trade blows in the lane before Hail Broadway retook command midway down the lane, trotting home in:27.1 to outduel a game Agent Of Fortune and win the slugfest by a quarter of a length in 1:53.3. Black Gold held for third to round out the trifecta. Hail Broadway returned \$5.40 to win as the 8-5 second-choice.

The clocking was a career best for the Luis Quevedo trained Hail Broadway who is now a winner in three of seven this season. The homebred daughter of Swan For All—Pray With Me as now earned \$98,095 lifetime for owner John Barnard, with \$86,850 of that being made this season.

In the \$48,000 second division, Skyway Paige bested four foes at 1-9 to get back in the winner's circle this season. Leaving from post 4, driver LeWayne Miller settled the heavy-favorite in the third spot early while Fly Delta (Mike Oosting) led to the quarter in :27.3. Miller tugged the right line on the backstretch, quickly marching to the lead and assuming command before reaching the half in :57.2. Skyway Paige dictated the terms on the final turn, backing down the pace to lead to three-quarters uncontested in 1:28.1.

Turning for home, Skyway Paige opened up on the field while Miller remained motionless in the bike. Trotting home in :27, Skyway Paige cruised to a two-length victory in 1:55.1 over Truly Unbelievable (John De Long) who closed to be second. Star Pilot (Trace Tetrick) rallied up the passing lane to finish third.

Trained by Susan Miller, Skyway Paige is now a three-time winner in five starts this season. Bred by Kenneth Slabach, the daughter of Swan For All—Prismatica has now banked \$334,420 in her career for owners L&S Racing, D&S Stable, Ryan Raber and Anthony Swartzentruber.

Travel Nurse was the first of McClelland's winners when she took the second division in 1:59.2 with Brett Miller driving. The duo got away seventh from the 8-hole and was parked while Dublin's Martini (Ronnie Gillespie), who was also parked, took the lead just at the :29.4 guarter from Chica Lounge (Trevor Smith). Miller was able to wrestle Travel Nurse into the 4-hole after Rose Of Sharon made a miscue heading to the three-eighths. Tom Power (Dan Noble) pulled first up by the 1:00.4 half and battled with Dublin's Martini towards the 1:30.2 third quarter. Travel Nurse made a swift three-wide move to go around the pair and by the time the field straightened out in the stretch, was in the lead. Iwillmakeuproud AS (Tyler Smith) got up for second just a length and a half behind the leader, with Tom Power holding on for third. The daughter of Enterprise out of the Andover Hall mare Poster Pin Up won her first two qualifiers before being a starter in the Next Generation.

Aunt Laura and Chris Page took the last BSS division in 1:59.2. The duo protected their inside position while Annie L (Hank LeVan) was parked from post 8 and Bye Bye Girl (Terry Hall) was three-wide through the first turn from post 9. Once the dust settled at the :30.3 quarter, Page had Aunt Laura out and moving and the 1-2 favorite reached the top by the 1:00.2 half. Annie L pulled from the 3-hole and pressured the leader at the 1:30 third-quarter, but Aunt Laura won by a length and a half under a hand drive; Annie L was second and after a photo for third between four horses, Jurassic Jewel (Miller) was victorious in getting the show dough. Aunt Laura, by Uncle Peter out of the SJ's Photo mare Tori Ann, won her second qualifier at Scioto before finishing second in a non-winners of one event on July 2.

Both Travel Nurse and Aunt Laura are trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr. and were co-bred by Richard McClelland.

Owner/breeder/trainer/driver Daren Harvey had **Countonluna** on cruise control to win the first division in 1:58.3. The pair got away third along the rail but pulled mid-way through the first turn and made the top by the :29.1 opening quarter. They hit the half in :59.1 when Jersey Janet (Ty. Smith) attacked midway down the backside heading to the 1:28.4. Countonluna, the 3-5 favorite, opened up to win by six lengths over Jersey Janet and Curious Hill (Kayne Kauffman) who was third. The winner, by Full Count out of the SJ's Caviar mare DJ's Caviar, is now a perfect two-for-two after winning a non-winners of one event on July 10 at Northfield Park in 2:01.

In The End took the third split for owner/breeder trainer Anette Lorentzon in 2:00. Juu Dee Kaa (Austin Hanners) hit every pole first, tripping the beam in :30, 1:00.2 and 1:30.4. Tyler Smith pulled In The End second over at the half, following the cover of Countdown Queen (Kauffman). Going three-wide around the last turn, In The End won by a length over Juu Dee Kay, with Say Oui (Jeff Nisonger) finishing third. In The End is by Lionhunter out of the Enjoy Lavec mare Guilt Free and had three qualifiers under her belt before Tuesday's start.

The 90-day 2024 Eldorado Scioto Downs race meet runs through Saturday (Sept. 14). Races are held Tuesday-Saturday with a first post of 5:45 p.m. each day, except for Friday (Sept. 13) which will have a 6:15 p.m. post to help accommodate horsemen attending the Ohio Selected Yearling Sale. ### Fancy Like That dominates again in Maryland Sire Stakes

Kasey Bendix and Virginia Marvel's homebred **Fancy Like That** delivered another devastating blow to her Maryland Sire Stakes competition on Wednesday (July 17) at Ocean Downs, beating Covid For Real by 11¼ lengths in 1:55.3 in a \$10,000 second-round preliminary for 3-year-old pacing fillies.

The Rusty's For Real—Scootin Woody filly coasted through a :58.2 first half on an uncontested lead in line to Johnathan Ahle before using back-to-back :28.3 second-lap splits to steadily edge clear from pocket rival Covid For Real. Yourgracefound Me finished third.

Bendix trains Fancy Like that, whose 15th career win pushed her earnings to \$151,290. She paid \$2.10 to win.

Only I Exist won the non-wagering \$10,000 Maryland Sire Stakes for 3-year-old trotting fillies, defeating Emily's Locket by 21½ lengths in 2:00.1. Russell Foster drove the Richard Hans homebred Yall Beneath Me—Get Rich Quick filly, who now has earned \$214,881, to her 11th career win.

A pair of second-round Tom Cooke Memorial divisions were conducted off the card as well, with **Casino Magic** (2:08.1, Roger Plante, Jr.) and **Chex Check** (2:05, Trae Porter) winning their respective \$8,500 splits of the event for 2-year-old trotters.

Ahle and Porter led all drivers with three wins apiece.







# Maine trotters invade Bangor

Four \$15,000-plus divisions of Maine Sire Stakes visited historic Bass Park in Bangor for a trotting extravaganza, with each division represented by the Downeast faithful.

The action began just before the regular card with a \$15,758 non-betting race for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings.

Pembroke Will (Heath Campbell-Valerie Grondin) took command as the son of Pembroke Slugger inherited pylon position due to the early miscue of Carrabassett (Mark Athearn-Gretchen Athearn). Pembroke Will cut sensible fractions of 30.1 and 1:02 with stable mate **Chipper Dale** (Drew Campbell) tracking along closely in second, with the trailer Carrabassett catching the field by the half.

As the troika approached the 1:33.1 third panel Carrabassett had jumped again while the Campbell brothers began their battle to the finish. At the head of the stretch Chipper Dale had poked a head in front and continued to gain ground through lane and prevailed over Pembroke Will by a half-length in 2:03.

Trained by Valerie Grondin for owner/breeder Lynn-Marie Plouffe, the son of Shake It Off Lindy picked up his second win of the season and eighth career victory.

Interestingly, all three of these gentlemen trotters had been tied in the points standings, having traded 1-2-3 finishes the last three weeks.

Fifteen minutes later, in the \$15,983 sophomore filly trot, trainer Valerie Grondin was back in the winner's circle with **Pembroke Breeze**. Driver Heath Campbell sent that 3-year-old daughter of Pembroke Slugger out to the front and never looked back. Setting evenly rated fractions of :30, 1:00.1 and 1:30 the trotting lass was seemingly on cruise control as she gained separation with every stanza.

At the wire Pembroke Breeze was on top by six and scored in a lifetime best of 2:00.1, taking two and a fifth seconds off of her previous mark. Owned and bred by Bill Varney, it was her third win in a row. She paid just \$2.20 as the 1-9 favorite, and has now thrust herself well atop the divisional point standings.

Twisted Venture (Mike Cushing-Charlene Cushing) finished second; My Saving Grace (Mark Athearn-Gretchen Athearn) was third.

While Team Grondin swept the 3-year-old divisions, Team Watson dominated the freshmen sets.

**Whatawonder** proved he was no fluke as he performed his second wire-to-wire romp in as many weeks, taking the \$16,378 Maine Sire Stakes for 2-year-old male trotters.

Dashing away from the car like a hoppled pacer, driver Ken Watson had Whatawonder on top by four before the first turn. From that point on the son of Whataworkout needed no additional instructions as he led the field unabated and cruised home in 2:06.4, improving his win record from the week before.

Trained by Lisa Watson for owner/breeder Barbara Lawson, he paid \$4.60 to win.

Liberty's Wildcard (Walter Case, Jr.-Marc Tardif) finished second; Katahdin Victor (Wally Watson-Lisa Watson) was third.

The final \$16,166 Maine Sire Stakes for freshman distaff trotters was another episode of the Watson power hour as they sent **Katahdin Mistress** out for her first big victory of the season.

As the gate sprung several breakers caused a reshuffling of the deck which allowed Kenny Watson to put Lady Lake Marty on the front end. Heading into a 33 second opening panel, Wally Watson shot like a rocket down the backstretch with Katahdin Mistress to wrest command from his brother. The daughter of Victor Blue Chip was sent down the road from that point and proceeded to making every call a winning one as she hit the timer in 2:08.1, a new lifetime mark.

Owned and bred by James Kelley, Jr. and Betsey Kelley, she is trained by Lisa Watson and paid \$7.80 to win.

Little Shot (Ivan Davies) finished second; Lady Lake Marty was third.

The Maine Sire Stakes ships south to Cumberland on Saturday (July 20) for the 2-year-old filly pacers.

Muchtooyoungforyou (Dowling) tracked in the 2-hole to finish second with Woodmere Flojo (Corey MacPherson) competing the triactor.

A Grassroots division of the P.E.I. Colt Stakes in race 8 had Lady Llamrei (Merner) make a break and fall to the racing surface at the start. Both horse and driver walked away from the incident without issue.

Dowling had a driving triple on the program winning with **Elm Grove Mistress** (1:58) and **Spectrum Seelster** (1:56.1) for trainer Jennifer Doyle and **Arts Beach** (1:59.1) from his own stable.

Red Shores Summerside will race Monday (July 22), post time 6 p.m. This card will host the PEI Colt Stakes for 2- and 3-year-old trotters and overnight races that were cancelled due to inclement weather on Tuesday (July 16).

# Jay Randall scores career win 5,000 at Plainridge Park

When driver Jay Randall won the fourth race with **Sweet Street Lou** (1:54.4, \$8.60) at Plainridge Park on Tuesday (July 16) afternoon, he reached the 5,000-win plateau for his career that now spans 46 years.

Randall, a resident of Ballston Spa, NY, started his driving career in 1977 at Saratoga Raceway and five years later, won the 1982 Johnny Page Award as the up-and-coming driver there. Over the years, Randall has switched his base of operations several times, moving to Monticello, then Yonkers and then The Meadowlands, before returning to Saratoga in 2005 where he has been a leading driver ever since.

Since 2019, Randall has split his summers by also competing at Plainridge Park and has been very successful at both tracks.

As a regular member of the Plainridge driver colony, Randall has racked up 286 wins that earned their connections over \$4.1 million in purses. His best single year at The Ridge was 2022 when he finished third in the standings with 100 wins and just under \$1.5 million in earnings.

The 63-year-old Randall had his single best overall season for wins in 2019 when he hung 238 victories on his competitors. Since 2018 alone, Randall has won \$10.5 million in purses, and that while being sidelined for an extended period of time in 2021 when he was injured in a racing accident at Saratoga Raceway.

This year, Randall is tied as the seventh leading driver at Plainridge with 17 wins and is tied as the fourth leading driver at Saratoga with 75 wins.

Randall notched his 4,000th driving win in August of 2018 and surpassed \$30 million in lifetime earnings in 2023. That number is now in excess of \$32 million.

# Betting tops \$5 million on Meadowlands Pace Night

Meadowlands Pace Night (July 13) brought a mixture of predictability and surprise, and was highlighted by the fastest-ever Pace — a mythical 1:46.3 mile put up by Legendary Hanover — as well as the third \$5-million night of business at the windows over the last five Pace Nights.

Wagering on the 14-race program totaled \$5,136,129.

The Pace — as well as five other major stakes events — were broadcast live to a nationwide audience on FOX Sports 2 (FS2) as The Big M and the TV team at the New York Racing Association (NYRA) continue to team up in a continuing effort to expand harness racing's exposure.

"Without question, FOX Sports has raised the bar significantly," said track chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "I want to thank NYRA and their team for their commitment to excellence in broadcasting. The three-hour show was informative, and their exciting way of showing the best in standardbred racing to an international audience has clearly raised the interest on Meadowlands Pace Night to another level."

The numbers prove that Meadowlands Pace Night clearly is bigger at the most important place: the windows.

The average Pace Night handle over the last five years (2020-24) is \$5,051,261. That number is over \$1-million more than the \$4,048,993 Pace Night averaged over the first five years of the New Meadowlands era (2011-15).

The widespread visibility isn't ending anytime soon, as there is still plenty of action to come on the networks of FOX Sports.

A GREAT NIGHT AT THE RACES: The Meadowlands Pace Night card brought non-stop excitement, and also brought just the right amount of likely and unlikely results to keep all players in the game all night long.

The on-track crowd packed the apron on the hot summer night to enjoy many different choices from the many food trucks that were on site. In addition, some patrons got to be judges in the "Best Burger" contest, which is always a popular promotion at the mile oval.

A recap of the races:

• Meadowlands Pace: **Legendary Hanover** turned in a story-book performance, setting a stakes record with his sizzling 1:46.3 clocking. Three-time defending O'Brien Award-winning Driver of the Year (for being the top pilot in Canada) James MacDonald became the first Canadian-based pilot to win the Pace in 37 years.

Nijinsky, the No. 1 horse in the sport coming into the race, was second, completing a trainer Tony Beaton exacta.

- William Haughton Memorial: This is the race two years ago that saw Bulldog Hanover record the fastest mile in harness racing history of 1:45.4. This year's edition confirmed who the top older pacer in the game is now as **Abuckabett Hanover** followed up his 1:47.3 win in the Dave Brower Memorial with a 1:47.4 Haughton score.
- E.T. Gerry Jr. Hambletonian Maturity: After an alert getaway from post 10, **Chapercraz** rallied from fifth at the head of the stretch before prevailing at the wire by a neck in a four-horse photo, scoring at odds of 32-1 to top a \$7,000 trifecta and a 10-cent superfecta that returned just under \$60,000. Evenmoney favorite and Graduate champion Winner's Bet finished 10th in the 12-horse field.
- Dorothy Haughton Memorial: All hail the Queen! After adding the Haughton trophy to a mantle that already has the 2024 Perfect Sting, Roses Are Red and Betsy Ross hardware on it, **Twin B Joe Fresh** became the top-ranked horse in the weekly Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown Top 10 poll. The superstar 4-year-old mare has won five races in a row.
- Jerry Silverman Memorial: **Caviart Belle** came from well off the pace to take the first of two divisions while **Its A Love Thing** wore down leader My Girl EJ nearing the wire in the second dash.
- Del Miller Memorial: **French Champagne** stamped herself as a big-time player in the Hambletonian Oaks as she followed up her win in the New Jersey Sire Stakes final with a victory in the first of two Miller splits. After going off-stride in each of her two outings coming into the second division, **R Melina** minded her manners to pick up her 11th win from 19 lifetime starts.
- Miss Versatility (4th leg): **Tactical Mounds** recorded her second straight Versatility victory by grabbing the lead and holding off heavy favorite M-M's Dream.
- Stanley Dancer Memorial: These two divisions provided the most shocking results of the night, and in the process, turned the Hambletonian upside down.

In the first division, the unbeaten Karl had the lead at the head of the stretch, but could not hold off the late rallies of **Sig Sauer** and Tony Adams S, who finished first and second, respectively, as Karl finished third, the first time in his 15 career starts that he failed to finish in the top two. Sig Sauer returned \$138 to win, and paid a remarkable \$335.80 to place, as bridge jumpers took it on the chin with Karl in the place pool (there was no show wagering).

The second split featured the other two of the three early Hambletonian favorites, T C I and Highland Kismet, but **Situationship** picked up his third win of the year in four tries to jump into the Hambletonian fray. T C I finished third, while Highland Kismet was well off the gate at the start before finishing sixth in the seven-horse field.

The Hambletonian picture is fuzzy to say the least, and after the Dancer, it makes for what promises to be a highly-competitive 99th edition of the \$1-million dash.

The Hambletonian eliminations take place in nine days at The Big M (on July 27), with the seven-figure final to follow seven days later (on Aug. 3) on Closing Day at the mile oval.

**CASINO AND POKER NIGHT:** If you like casino gaming, and giving to good causes, check out Hambletonian Charity Casino and Poker Night at The Meadowlands on Friday (Aug. 2).

The Standardbred Retirement Foundation and the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame are the event's sponsors.

The evening's festivities will include an open bar, dinner, poker, roulette, craps, blackjack and raffle prizes.

The poker tournament has limited seating, so it is highly recommended you purchase tickets in advance. The grand prize is a trip for two to Las Vegas (which includes hotel and airfare). Second prize is \$350, with third prize at \$175.

### Blue collar trotter Take All Comers is ready to work in Spirit of Massachusetts

To be successful in harness racing, a horse must be consistent throughout his career. One great example of that is Take All Comers, who will be competing in the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot at Plainridge Park on Sunday (July 21) afternoon.

Take All Comers is a 6-year-old gelding who, in just over four years of racing, has earned \$822,561 in very workman-like fashion. He has won 30 per cent of his races and has been in the money 62 per cent of the time and a win in the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot would push him very close to becoming the next millionaire in the sport.

Jim Campbell, who was just inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame on July 7, trains the home-bred son of Creatine—Nantab and said his horse is smart, likeable and full of heart.

"Scott [Farber] bred Take All Comers and he's just been a really nice horse for us from day one," Campbell said. "He's very consistent every year and has always given us his best effort in all the years we've raced him. He's nice to be around, he's a cool horse to jog and train. He's a little feisty at times but he's a real smart horse. When I train him, he knows where I want him to go, so I just steer him."

As a 2-year-old, Take All Comers was a solid performer in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes, won the Bluegrass Stake in Kentucky and finished fourth in the Breeders Crown, beaten only  $1\frac{1}{2}$  lengths. His sophomore campaign looked very similar with solid earnings in the PASS and a start in the Hambletonian where he finished fifth, beaten only four lengths.

As he transitioned to facing older foes at 4, he became a top open trotter in the northeast. In his stake engagements, he finished second in the \$250,000 Graduate final and followed that up with a fourth-place finish in the \$432,000 Hambletonian Maturity. Then he ended his year with three-straight upper-level condition wins at Yonkers and Harrah's Philadelphia, giving him a total of eight victories for the year.

Last year Take All Comers rattled off three quick open class wins — including a lifetime mark of 1:50.4 at Harrah's Philly — to start his summer before his stake calendar kicked in. He finished third in the \$250,000 Bob Miecuna Invitational, second in the \$222,500 Caesar's Trotting Classic and then fifth, beaten only three lengths in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown.

Take All Comers started 2024 with an invitational win at Yonkers in May. Then in the \$100,000 Maxi Lee, he got away second with a perfect trip to the half. But that soon turned into a nightmare as the outer flow locked him in behind a fading leader and basically ended his chances. Then in his last three races at Yonkers leading up to the Spirit, he was assigned the outside in each invitational, finishing a narrowly beaten second in all three.

"When you compete against these older trotters, the going gets very tough," Campbell said. "One might look like he's off his game one week, but he bounces right back the next and throws a big mile. But Take All Comers is an honest horse who gives his best effort every week and that's what you want to see. I wasn't really paying attention to that \$1 million mark creeping up, but like I said, he's very consistent.

"This Spirit race has a very competitive field and it should be a really good race. I was very happy with the post position we drew but as the old saying goes, post position is just a starting point. But he's the type of horse that can be driven anyway the driver wants him to go. Front end, from behind, first-over, it doesn't bother him. So, he's pretty versatile and that is an asset for him. He's had a really good week of preparation coming into this race and hopefully with a little racing luck, he'll be there at the finish."

This will be Campbell's second trip to Massachusetts. He raced Crystal Fashion at Plainridge in the 2021 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot, finishing third behind Manchego in 1:50.

Campbell also reflected on his Hall of Fame induction just under two weeks ago.

"Being inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame goes under one of those things I'll never forget for as long as I live," Campbell said. "It was just an unbelievable weekend and I'm honored to have been part of the class I went in with. It's something that we'll all never forget.

"And going through the Museum and all the things they have in there was just amazing. I want to go back and go through it again because I didn't see everything. I think one of the best kept secrets in harness racing is that Museum."

The Spirit of Massachusetts Trot is carded as race 9 on Sunday with an estimated post time of 4:40 p.m. Post time for the first race on Spirit Day is 2 p.m.

# Europe adopts new regulations for the use of the whip in trotting racing

On Monday (July 15, 2024), an general assembly of the European Trotting Union (UET) was held by videoconference in the presence of 19 countries out of the 22 members of the UET who voted for a new provision.

Last January, during the weekend of the Prix d'Amérique at the Vincennes racecourse (Paris, France), the UET member countries unanimously decided to adopt a new philosophy for the use of the whip in trotting races, in order to preserve the image of racing and for the animal welfare, indicating that a new wording of the provisions of the UET International Agreement would be validated during the year, for application by April 1, 2025 at the latest.

The two main principles of the new regulations can be summed up as follows:

#### **Harness Racing Update**

- the whip, which remains a safety element for the jockey or driver, is not used to kick or hit a horse.
- a jockey or a driver has only the right to solicitate his horse by a wrist movement.

On the proposal of the board and the technical commission, the extraordinary general assembly of the UET adopted today the new text of Chapter VII - Article 4 of the International Agreement, provisions already in force in several European countries (Nordic countries, Netherlands, Germany and Switzerland).

It is now up to the equestrian authorities in each member country to transpose these provisions into their national regulations.

Mrs. Marjaana Alaviuhkola, president, welcomed the decision taken by the UET member countries:

"This is a decision that will go down in the history of the UET. It marks a new era for the image of trotting and animal welfare issues. European professionals are showing that respect for the trotter is a priority in their decisions. I am delighted that European trotting is leading the way with these new rules to all the international racing authorities, whether in trotting or galloping. Equine welfare has always been the driving force behind my commitment to the presidency of the UET since my election."

### Captain Albano leads field of 15 into \$400,000 Adios

Captain Albano, the Dan Patch Award Winner for male pacers at 2 as well as Pennsylvania's champion, leads a field of 15 into Saturday's (July 20) eliminations for the \$400,000 Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows.

The \$25,000 Adios elims go as races 8 and 9 on the 15-race program. The first four finishers in each elim, along with the fifth-place finisher with the higher lifetime earnings, return on Adios Day, Saturday (July 27), for the \$350,000 final. Connections of the elimination winners get to pick their post positions for the final, with the other posts determined by random draw.

The Adios eliminations card also features PASS and PA Stallion Series events for freshman colt and gelding pacers. First post is 12:45 p.m.

A son of Captaintreacherous—Angelou trained by Noel Daley, Captain Albano earned \$445,680 at 2 and took a mark of 1:49.2 at The Red Mile. This year, he finished fourth in the North America Cup final and ninth after a horrible trip in the final of the Meadowlands Pace. So, a strong Adios performance would be his 2024 breakthrough.

Patricia Stable, L.A. Express Stable LLC, Sjoblom Racing Inc. and Michael Dolan own Captain Albano.

Trainers Ron Burke and Travis Alexander each will have three Adios contenders. Burke sends out Outer Banks (race 8, post 4, Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.), Booming Economy (race 9, post 4, David Miller) and Noblesville (race 9, post 6, Wrenn), while Alexander will be represented by Sweet Beach Life (race 8, post 1, Matt Kakaley), Huntingforchrome (race 8, post 4, James MacDonald) and Courtship (race 9, pace 8, Kakaley).

On Adios Day, the final of the Pace for the Orchids anchors a blockbuster program that features six Grand Circuit stakes. In addition, the card will offer a total of \$200,000 in pool guarantees spread over 11 wagers, thought to be the "Richest Day in PA" for bettors.

### It's Academic looks to defend his Spirit of Massachusetts title

After scoring an impressive victory in the 2023 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot that saw him grinding uncovered from the half to the wire, It's Academic returns to Plainridge Park on Sunday (July 21) to try and repeat in this year's edition of the \$250,000 trotting classic as one of nine starters who will make up the full field going postward.

It's Academic, who is trained by Hall of Famer Ron Burke, will be joined by his stablemate Chapercraz, who is coming off an impressive victory of his own just one week ago in the \$425,000 Hambletonian Maturity at The Meadowlands.

It's Academic had a career year in 2023 with eight wins and \$951,911 in earnings and as a result, was named the Older Trotter of the Year in Ohio. He had a six-month break over the winter and after qualifying three times this spring, made his first start back at The Meadowlands in the \$131,250 Crawford Farms Trot where he put in a very solid effort.

"He trained back very well, but we just haven't been able to find races for him in the early part of the year," Burke said. "He only has one start back this year in the Crawford where he finished fourth in 1:49.2 and he trotted home in :26.3. So, with that as a tightener, I expect him to be very good this week. He trained well coming into this and he should be ready.

"From here on out, the schedule picks up a little for the older trotters and he has races coming up on Hambo Day, in Canada, Lexington, Dayton, Indiana, so he will have a good share of work from here out."

If It's Academic were able to repeat, he would join only Manchego who went back-to-back in the Spirit in 2020 and 2021.

Chapercraz was purchased by the Burke Brigade just over a year ago and has been a very high percentage performer ever since. After earning just shy of a half million in 2023, Chapercraz started this year seven out of ten in the money, but with no wins. But that changed last week when he won the Hambletonian Maturity on Saturday (July 13).

"He's actually been racing just alright, but then he started to get better," Burke said. "I really thought he could have won the Graduate final on July 6, but we got locked in and we didn't get out. But then last week, we got locked in and were lucky to get out and he got the job done.

"He's really coming back around. He's a big, heavy horse and it took him a little bit longer to get ready. But I think he's our top older trotter for the next few years. He can do everything. He can leave, he can race from the back, he can race any size track. He's really become a very nice horse."

Proof of that is his winning the New York Sire Stake final at Yonkers and setting the track record at Buffalo, both half-milers, and he's three-for-three on five-eighths mile ovals.

Burke also pointed out that both trotters will have their regular drivers on Sunday which is always important.

Another starter from the Burke barn on Sunday will be Beach Cowgirl, who will compete in the \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace, which is the main undercard event to the Spirit.

Beach Cowgirl was a perfect four-for-four as a 2-year-old and a Pennsylvania Sire Stake champion. Last year she added a number of Grand Circuit stakes to her schedule and eventually finished fourth in the Breeders Crown, only 2¼ lengths behind the winner, Sylvia Hanover. This year as a 4-year-old, she has transitioned nicely to facing older mares and Burke said she will be a player here.

"Beach Cowgirl is actually better than she looks," Burke said. "She really didn't seem to like Yonkers, so we took her back to The Meadowlands for the Dorothy Haughton and she had no chance from post 9. But before that, she was really good and I expect her to be very good this week. We look to race her aggressively this week."

The high-powered Spirit of Massachusetts card will also feature the \$75,000 Bert Beckwith Invitational Pace, \$50,000 John Hogan Memorial Pace, \$25,000 Frank Dubreuil Memorial Pace and \$22,500 Elmer Smith Memorial Pace. All told, the card will offer \$607,000 in purses.

The Clara Barton will go as race 7 with a post time of 4 p.m. and the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot is carded as race 9 with a post time of 4:40 p.m. Post time for the first race on Sunday is 2 p.m.
