Fixing a hole

Jeff Gural's meeting with drivers last Friday had an instant impact on the races at The Meadowlands, but is it practical for drivers to always close holes and drive more aggressively? Some top drivers weigh in.

There was a drivers' meeting held before the Meadowlands' card on Friday (July 16), the results of which had the track's president and chief executive officer Jeff Gural feeling hopeful for the future.

"We got them to close the holes," said Gural. "Anybody who watched the races [Friday] night had to be thrilled. It was completely different, especially the 13th race. It's good that they were willing to cooperate in trying to make a better product for their customers. I was encouraged."

Gural has consistently expressed his enmity for courtesy tucks, so it's no surprise that it would be one of the topics at the meeting.

A brief review of the 13th race shows Andy McCarthy (3-1) move to the lead, Dave Miller (8-1) in the pocket and Tyler Miller (8-1) first-up. Corey Callahan (44-1) was second-over and Yannick Gingras (5-1) third-over.

Half the field was in and half was out as Tyler poked a head in front just past the :26.3 quarter, but was never able to clear as McCarthy hit the gas.



"After Gural's meeting, all the drivers really respected him and gave him the chance with his rules and with respect to that I was trying to put my horse in the best position and it just didn't happen to work out," said Tyler Miller. "Andy [McCarthy] was just trying to put his horse in the best position to do the best that he could."

When McCarthy suddenly sped ahead, it was a bit of a surprise to Dave Miller, who until then thought he'd be going from a perfect pocket to fourth at the rail.

"In just an instant, Andy changed his mind and took off and he got away from me and there was a hole where Tyler could have jumped in there but I closed it up because that's where I wanted to be," said Dave Miller. "That was my strategy [to follow Andy]. We're thinking the whole time. We're planning and it's quite interesting. It's not like we're just out there YEE-HA! I take pride in driving smart."

Right past the three-eighths pole, Gingras moved three-wide around Callahan as Tyler Miller started to back up. Gingras was first over as they passed the half in :54.1.

"I think the race would have been completely different if it had not been for Jeff," said Gingras. "Somebody should have wanted to drop me in as one of the favorites and maybe I'd give them a second-over trip. If I'm not out there then maybe Andy McCarthy lets Tyler Miller go and then retakes. But he knew with Tyler being out there and me being behind him there were [a lot] of people in the outside tier that if he let Tyler go, he would never have seen daylight again."

In the end, the strategy worked out for Dave Miller, who won, and McCarthy, who finished second. But as exciting as the race was, it's not necessarily an ideal way to race.

"Realistically, we can't be racing horses like that week in, week out," said Gingras. "I think it's just too hard on the horses. There has got to be some strategy involved and I agree with Jeff if you're dropping people in just because it's your friend and you're not going to use it as a strategy, I think those types of holes need to stop. There's no place in horse racing for stuff like that. That part I agree with."

After speaking with drivers during and after the races that night, Big M management has chosen to revisit the situation when racing returns in September after the break following The Hambletonian.

But don't think that means out of sight, out of mind.

Gural and Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemyer take all the rules discussed seriously and

expect all drivers to understand and comply with them.

What does concern several drivers is if their horses are not good enough to keep a hole closed.

"Say I win non-winners of three and it goes 1:51," said driver Tim Tetrick. "The next class is non-winners of four, five or six. So, you're telling me that this young horse that just got out of non-winners of three is supposed to compete with the next class. A lot of times it can't. They're just not good enough. So, if I draw the rail, he wants me to shut everybody out of the hole and shut the two-hole in a 1:49 mile when my horse just can't do that."

The New Jersey Administrative Code (NJAC) section 13:71-20.6 (a) states "Although a leading horse is entitled to any part of the track except after selecting his position in the home stretch, neither the driver or the first horse nor any other driver in the race shall:" and part 11 says "Laying off a normal pace and leaving a hole when it is well within the horse's capacity to keep the hole closed."

However, dating back to the time when Joe DeFrank was race secretary, the unwritten, yet widely understood part of this rule is if a driver has the capability to close a hole but chooses instead to drop someone in for strategy, then he must move out and advance.

"These are rules that are violations of the NJAC and those rules are put in place for a reason," said Settlemoir. "And you can't tell me that courtesy tucks and the friendly-style driving that occurs on the track is good for the sport."

The judges will enforce the rules and give fines and suspensions as they see fit, but Gural and Settlemoir will also be watching and may dole out penalties of their own.

For the first offense, the driver will be given a warning from track management. In addition, they will be afforded the opportunity to plead their case about what happened in the race.

"[For the] second offense, that driver will be suspended from the Gural properties, Meadowlands, Tioga and Vernon, and there are no exceptions to that," said Settlemoir. "[For the] third offense, the driver will be suspended from racing for two weeks and must reapply to race at the Gural properties.

"We're not trying to be difficult here, but rather relay the messages that our customers continue to email us and complain to us about it. We're asking that the rules and regulations are adhered to and if they're not adhered to that the fines and suspensions are going to take place whether that comes from the state or from us as the private entity. That's what's going to happen."

Retired trainer Norm Dunstan strikes Gold

Lexus Kody, the son of Dunstan's only remaining mare, Lexus Helios, was victorious in Ontario Sires Stakes action at Rideau Carleton.

Norm Dunstan did not make it to Ottawa to see Lexus Kody win his Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series division on July 11, but

the Caledon Village, ON resident does not expect to miss many more of the 3-year-old trotting gelding's starts this summer.

"Watching them on TV is not the best. I like to be there to see them go," said Dunstan. "He's turned out to be a nice colt. He's definitely not the top one that's out there, but I think he's a competitive one and gives you everything he's got. And Trevor, you couldn't ask for a better driver than Trevor, and Shannon, they're good people. They look after their horses.

"Apparently he's a love-hate horse for Trevor to train and drive. I never got into it on the hate part, I just said you handle that on your own, I don't want to know. Just let me know when he's in to go and I'll go and watch him."

Shannon and Trevor Henry train and drive Lexus Kody for Dunstan and the three share ownership of the Archangel son with David Hudson of Dallas, TX. They also share ownership of the gelding's older half-brother Lexus Markus (Amigo Hall) who recently returned to action after an injury which saw him recuperate at Dunstan's farm for several months before returning to the Henrys' Arthur, ON base.

"He came to the farm for relaxation and healing up and then I jogged him and trained him down into the 2:20's and then sent him back to Trevor," said Dunstan. "I do train some of them and I enjoy it. I'm always in the barn at six every morning still."

Now 80, Dunstan retired five years ago from full-time training and placed his horses with the Henrys and Paul MacDonell.

MacDonell currently has Lexus Markus and Lexus Kody's younger sibling Lexus Ranger (Archangel), who has a fourth-place result from the July 15 freshman trotting colt Grassroots season opener on his resume. The brothers are out of Lexus Helios, the only horse remaining on the farm Dunstan built to house his second career.

"First of all, I was in business and then when I sold the business, retired when I was 57 years of age I think it was, I bought a farm. I think it was six days later I bought a farm. I had stalls here for 24 racehorses and then another barn for the broodmares. I guess at one time we had one assistant trainer with me and four grooms, so that kept me busy," said Dunstan. "Why would I do that when I made enough money that I could go and buy a cottage on Lake Joseph and go and retire and never have to clean a stall in my life? That didn't sound good. I like fishing and a cottage sounded good, and I'd had two cottages before that, but I was wanting to be with the horses, still do, still do."

Dunstan had never trained horses before, but he was knowledgeable about their care and had owned standardbreds with his cousins Bill, Bruce and Richard Carroll. He dedicated himself to learning from his staff, catch drivers and other trainers and soon enough was making regular appearances in the Ontario Sires Stakes program with his Lexus/Lexis prefix homebreds.

"All of my horses have been named Lexus, not from the very start, but when I had eight broodmares at one time producing maybe seven babies every year I had to do something to make it easier to determine where my horses were and remember their names," said Dunstan, who picked the Lexus tag for a very pragmatic reason. "I drove Lexus cars, liked them a lot, and I thought if my horses are as good as the car, that's great."

While none of the Lexus horses have gone on to million-dollar careers, many have been useful racehorses for Dunstan and other owners. Among the horseman's favorites are Lexis Noah, named after one of his grandsons, Lexus Hall, Lexis DJ and Lexus Helios.

"When I say favorites, I mean easy to train, and they all ended up being trotters," he said. "I love trotters, I love training them."

Lexis Noah (Malabar Maple–Conway Connie) banked \$340,705 in his career and took a mark of 1:56.1. Lexus Hall (1:56.1, \$249,275, Conway Hall–Jenica Hall) gave Dunstan his only win south of the border, a victory in a 2003 Matron elimination, and finished third in the 3-year-old trotting filly Breeders Crown final the same year. Dunstan sold Lexis DJ (Amigo Hall–Lexus Lulu) after his first win as a 3-year-old, but the gelding would go on to earnings of \$526,733. Lexus Helios, a Ken Warkentin daughter of Lexus Hall, banked \$230,981 and took a mark of 1:54.1 before injury cut her racing career short in 2015.

"I tried to bring her back and she wasn't coming back good enough so I kept her for a while," said Dunstan. "I'd sold all the other broodmares that I had, hated to see them go because you get attached to them, very much so, but I kept her around and then I decided what the heck, she's eating so I bred her."

The move proved a wise one as all three of the mare's offspring have made it to the races. Dunstan keeps tabs on their progress, but said he tries to be the kind of owner he would have liked to work with himself.

"I was quite willing to try and find good trainers. And you know them all after you've been racing with them, you know the good guys, the people that you can get along with," he said, adding that when he decided to retire he physically handed over his license to avoid the temptation of loading one up and taking it the racetrack himself. "And I'm not a pain in the rear end to them. I'm not calling them every week to find out what's going on, I can get most of that off of the Internet, and then I just go up from time to time and take them a case of beer."

Dunstan's second career has been every bit as satisfying as he expected when he purchased his farm two decades ago. The only small regret he harbours is that he made the transition a little too late to try his hand at driving.

"I never took my driver's license, I would school them type thing, getting them ready to be qualified, but I left that up to the professionals. I would have loved to have drove, but once you get over 60 years of age I think it's time to let the younger guys do it," said Dunstan. "I would have loved to have done it. I was involved with sports right through high school – baseball, football – and after high school I played for the Lakeshore Bears (junior football team)."

Heading into his 81st trip around the sun, Dunstan's competitive drive is largely satisfied by watching the trotters do their work. Sophomore Lexus Kody will be returning to Gold Series action on Aug. 9 at Woodbine Mohawk Park and freshman Lexus Ranger will be back in Grassroots action on July 31 at Hiawatha Horse Park.

Woodmere Stealdeal.

Tempered steal

After his perfect record was broken, Maritime star Woodmere Stealdeal rebounded with a track record at Truro Raceway.

When his win streak ended July 10, Woodmere Stealdeal responded like any champion does — he came back stronger. He went a perfect 13-for-13 last year, which made him North America's second-winningest 2-year-old of either gait. The gelding rewrote divisional records at every Maritime track where he competed in 2020.

Then, in his 2021 comeback, he finished second to Dustylanegoliath and Gillies Barrieau in a \$16,400 Atlantic Sires Stakes (ATSS) "A" division for 3-year-old male pacers at Red Shores Summerside. "He wasn't really tight enough," said co-owner Robert Sumarah of Halifax, NS, "but I had all the confidence in the world that night. I didn't get excited. I just let it roll."

Woodmere Stealdeal and Marc Campbell started from post #6 in the seven-horse field. They instantly pursued early pacesetter

Rotten Ronnie (Redmond Doucet Jr.), grabbing the lead by the :28 opening quarter. A two-length advantage didn't last, however: Woodmere Stealdeal led to the :57.4 half, then "they all came at him because they all want to beat him, which is fine," Sumarah told HRU. Battling the first-up Dustylanegoliath (Gilles Barrieau) past the three-quarters in 1:26.2, "Stealdeal" came up less than a length short of that rival in the 1:54h mile.

"I wasn't that disappointed. He went a good race on the Island," said Sumarah. "The other horse was much tighter and had four more starts."

Their next Atlantic Sires Stakes match-up was scheduled for July 17 at Truro Raceway, Woodmere Stealdeal and trainer Danny Romo's home track. Although that card began with a divisional track record-equalling 1:54.1h win by Jadensmagicsteel (Adam Merner) in the first \$8,320 ATSS "A" colt division, "Stealdeal's" connections were confident. "I wasn't nervous, because I felt that he was right," said Sumarah, "I just knew he was going to go better than that."

In race 5, ATSS \$3,000 "B" division winner Woodmere Alvin (Corey MacPherson) raised the bar with a going-away 1:53.2h effort — a new track record for 3-year-old pacers. The blazing-fast racing surface and fresh divisional mark might have elevated stress levels for Woodmere Stealdeal's owners and trainer, if not for one fact: "The pressure was suddenly off, the week before. It was the best thing to ever happen to us," said Sumarah, referencing the broken win streak.

Last Saturday (July 17), the fastest 2-year-old pacer in Truro Raceway history (1:54.1h) made his 2021 home-turf debut.

"He was relaxed, he was himself, and he just wanted to race," said Sumarah, who shares ownership with Kevin Dorey of Middle Sackville, NS. "He seems motivated when there's people around."

For the first time in his racing career, their horse wasn't sent off as betting favorite.

Marc Campbell timed the gate perfectly, sending Woodmere Stealdeal to the front from post #2. Longshot Elliot Moose (Jason Hughes) pocketed up behind them as the field raced single-file to the :27.2 quarter. Heading to the :55.4 half, Campbell's horse controlled the pace and PEI giant-slayer Dustylanegoliath (Gilles Barrieau) made his move out of fourth, followed second-over by Rotten Ronnie (Redmond Doucet Jr.). As "Stealdeal" cruised to the three-quarters in 1:24 flat, Dustylanegoliath couldn't match strides with him; Rotten Ronnie was gapping cover. Elliot Moose who gave chase for place, as Campbell lightly urged "Stealdeal" to the wire.

"I'd be lying if I said I wasn't going for the track record," Campbell later said with a grin. He noted differences between the performances at Summerside and Truro: "I knew what we had. He

was a lot calmer in the post parade at Truro, which I was happy about. I scored him down and just kept him cool and calm. I was pretty confident once he made front and he came back to me a little bit; he just wasn't as aggressive."

The Truro timer read 1:52.2.

"The track crew obviously had that track in tip-top shape," said Campbell. After "Stealdeal's" ATSS victory, he was back in the bike behind 2020 Gold Cup and Saucer champ Time to Dance to claim the all-age Truro track record, a 1:51.3h win in the pacer's second-consecutive Lindsay Construction Cup Invitational.

Woodmere Stealdeal and his "A" division competition are back in action at Northside Downs July 24. "I told the owners Saturday night, on my way out of Truro, that I'd be there. I'll stick with him, for sure," said catch driver Campbell. "I know the owners pretty good. I've had horses for Bob Sumarah and I've driven for Danny [Romo] off and on for a couple of years. So I'll stick with 'Stealdeal.' He's definitely worth sticking with."

Even with the 2020 Maritime Horse of the Year back in the winner's circle, Campbell cautioned against underestimating rivals. "There's a great group of colts out there. It's not going to be a walk in the park — it's going to be a dogfight every week."

He said "Stealdeal" remains among the best young horses he's driven, from manners to gait.

"He has a very efficient gait. He travels the ground very light," said the PEI-based horseman. "He just covers the ground really easily."

There was a sense of recalibration after Woodmere Stealdeal's first defeat. His season had been slow to start: COVID-19 regulations affected race dates; he had to requalify after going momentarily off-stride behind a slow Truro starting gate June 13. After his latest victory, a cooled-out and cross-tied "Stealdeal" enjoyed attention and treats from children, including Campbell's.

Summerside was just a turning point for the charismatic gelding.

"Was I disappointed? Yeah," said Campbell. "But was it the end of the world? Obviously not."

Page looks for continued success in Ohio Sires Stakes action

The Mt. Vernon, OH reinsman sits eighth in North America in wins.

For driver Chris Page, Mt. Vernon, Ohio is special. He grew up in the county seat and made his first career start at the 2000 Knox County Fair – a sixth place finish in a \$900 free-for-all pace. Plenty has changed for Page over the past two decades, including more than 5,600 career wins and nearly \$50 million in earnings.

Page will miss the opening night of the 2021 Knox County Fair on Saturday night (July 24) as he will have 13 drives at Eldorado Scioto Downs, including 10 for the powerful Ron Burke Stable.

Page and Burke will team up for four \$40,000 divisions of the Ohio Sire Stake (OHSS) 2-year-old filly pace and three divisions of the OHSS freshman colt pace.

The 37-year-old reinsman will sit behind Cape Cod Hanover, the 9-5 morning line choice in the second filly split.



She is the daughter of by Downbytheseaside out of the mare Clouding Over. The 17-year-old mare has produced six \$150,000 winners.

“Cape Cod’s got the ideal body type; she’s got some size to her. She looks a lot like her sire,” said Page.

Cape Cod Hanover is undefeated this season after winning a 2-year-old event at The Meadows (June 30) in 1:54.4 and the opening leg of the OHSS on July 10 at MGM Northfield Park.

In that OHSS leg, Cape Cod Hanover left from post 7 and went gate-to-wire to score a two-length win in 1:53.3.

“Last week at Northfield, wow she was very impressive,” said Page.

Cape Cod Hanover has already earned \$23,400 for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci, Rich Lombardo Racing and RAS Racing.

In the final \$40,000 filly division, Page will drive Sea Silk (Race #11 – 6-5 morning line choice), who is two-for-two on the young season.

Sea Silk took the \$150,000 Next Generation event at Eldorado Scioto Downs Independence Day weekend in an impressive 1:51.3.

Her second start was in the first leg of the OHSS at MGM Northfield Park on July 10. Page eased the Downbytheseaside lass of the gate, taking the lead before the three-quarter pole. Sea Silk drew off to record a 5 ¼ length win in 1:53.3.

Sea Silk, a \$47,000 yearling purchase by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi, Knox Services and Hatfield Stables, has bank-rolled \$95,000 this season.

"I went down to Florida in March and trained some of babies at Ron's training center. I trained her down there. Her speed was never in question. She has matured – mentally and physically," said Page, who currently sits eighth in North America with 250 wins and 12th with \$3.0 million in seasonal earnings. "She's been beautiful to drive. She loves passing horses. Her move is very methodical."

When Page talks about the offspring of the first-year sire, Downbytheseaside, you get a little note of pride.

Page drove Downbytheseaside during the 2016 Jug Week at the Delaware County Fair when the then 2-year-old established a new world record of 1:50 over the half-mile Delaware oval.

"The Downbytheseasides are definitely going to be the X-factor in the game, not just Ohio," said Page. "These colts and fillies will step out and race on the Grand Circuit level. I truly mean that and I wouldn't say that if I didn't mean it."

"Qualifying Ron's horses over at The Meadows, we were going up against Pennsylvania and (New) Jersey bred and they have the look – the Grand Circuit look."

Ohio has another quality first-year stallion in Fear The Dragon and it's one of his offspring that Page is secretly excited about in the third \$40,000 filly division.

Dragon Lady (Race #10; 4-1 Morning Line) rallied for a second-place finish in her career debut on June 25 at Eldorado Scioto Downs. In the first OHSS leg at Northfield, she was a half-length short of her first career score.

"Dragon's Lady has been playing bridesmaid all season. She's come home in quarters of :27.3 in both starts. I am not sure if the secret is out, but she's pretty special too," said Page.

"Ron (Burke)'s got so many good pacing fillies; it is unbelievable how many good ones he has. This is the best group of Ohio breds that Ronnie has ever had."

Eldorado Scioto Down's 14-race Saturday card will kick off with a 6:15 p.m. post.

Pride of Windswept lives up to her name

Several years ago, Chris Coyle was raising a young female trotter for Sarah and John Swart Jr. at his Olive Branch Farm. Coyle told them more than once they had a nice-looking filly and he had high hopes for her.

John, who turned 96 in May, used to own Windswept Farm in Virginia, not far from where the couple resides across the Potomac River from Washington, DC, and “Windswept” is frequently included in the names of the couple’s horses.

The nice-looking filly was christened Pride Of Windswept.

It turned out to be an inspired choice.

Pride Of Windswept, now 3, has won 13 of 15 career races and never finished worse than second on her way to banking \$134,975.

Last season, the daughter of Charlie De Vie—Sprocket Hanover won both Maryland Sire Stakes finals for 2-year-old female trotters, the first at Ocean Downs and the second at Rosecroft Raceway, as well as the Virginia Breeders final at Shenandoah Downs.

On Wednesday (July 21), she dominated her \$70,000 Maryland Sire Stakes final for 3-year-old female trotters at Ocean Downs, winning by seven-and-a-half lengths in 1:59.4. She won the first \$70,000 final of the series on May 23 at Rosecroft.

“It’s turned out to be pretty good,” Sarah Swart said. “She’s done wonderfully well. For my husband, he always wanted to breed a really good trotter. It just means a lot that he’s gotten one that’s done really well after breeding to different sires.

“He’s always looked over the (pedigree) books and all the information, with the help of Chris Coyle and trainers, to pick out what he thought would be a really good horse. I think it’s worked out very well for him.”

Sarah and John have only two horses now, Pride Of Windswept and a yearling three-quarter sister to the filly by Anders Bluestone, but John has bred more than 100 over the years and owned his share of successful horses.

Pride Of Windswept certainly falls into that category. Corey Callahan has driven the filly in most of her starts, including the last 11, for his dad Nick and brother Shaun, who share the training duties.

“I love her,” Corey Callahan said. “She’s just one of those horses that’s fun to drive. She likes her job. She just wants to go out there and race. The only time she can be a little fussy is going to the gate, but she’s perfect in the race. She really likes to race.”

Pride Of Windswept won both her Maryland Sire Stakes finals last year with stakes-record performances, capturing her title at half-mile Ocean Downs in 2:01.1 with driver Montrell Teague and at five-eighths Rosecroft in 1:56.4 with Callahan.

“I don’t think she’s going to embarrass herself after she leaves the Maryland Sire Stakes,” Callahan said. “She likes to win. She’s a classy, sweet, little horse. I don’t think we’ve seen the best of her because I really haven’t had to race her much.”

Pride Of Windswept’s family includes Grand Circuit winners Salutation Hanover and Swift American. Her dam Sprocket Hanover, now 22, earned \$173,363 in her racing career.

“Her dam was a nice mare, but she was small,” Callahan said. “We’ve had several of her foals, and she’s done well as a broodmare, but they’ve all been on the smaller side just because she was little herself. But most have been good gaited and handy. And they’ve all had a lot of try to them. That’s the main thing.”

Callahan credited Frank Gannon III, who works for his dad’s training stable, with helping Pride Of Windswept’s development.

“This is basically his baby,” Callahan said. “He typically sits behind her and takes care of her. He’s been instrumental as well.”

John and Sarah don’t travel much these days, so they haven’t seen Pride Of Windswept race in person, but the couple gets regular reports from Nick Callahan and follow the horse via the Internet.

“We enjoy it,” Sarah said. “Over the years, we’ve cut way down on the horses, so this has been special.”

Trotters get final Hambletonian Day tune-ups in Tompkins at Big M

Dan Patch Award-winner Anoka Hanover and Italian-bred Colonial As will be among the 3-year-old trotters getting final tune-ups in the march toward Hambletonian Day in Saturday's (July 25) divisions of the Arthur Tompkins Memorial Stakes at The Meadowlands.

Anoka Hanover, trained by Noel Daley, was among 18 female trotters entered in the Tompkins, which was split into two \$46,450 divisions. She is the 4-1 morning-line second choice in the second division, leaving from post seven with driver Todd McCarthy. Piper Hanover, trained by Tony Alagna, is the 2-1 favorite.

Last year, Anoka Hanover won 10 of 14 races and was both the richest (\$587,758) and fastest (1:52.3) 2-year-old filly trotter in North America.

This season, she has one win and a second in five starts. She raced four consecutive weeks from May 21 to June 13 before getting some time off. She returned July 10 with a fourth-place finish from post seven in a division of the W.N. Reynolds Memorial at The Meadowlands.

"We gave her four starts in a row pretty quickly and then she had a month off," Daley said. "That was by design. She was good her first start back."

She skipped last week's Del Miller Memorial, which also was in Daley's plans to prepare his filly for the upcoming Hambletonian Oaks eliminations and, he hopes, final. Eliminations for the Oaks are July 31 and the \$500,000 final is Aug. 7 at The Meadowlands.

"I planned on missing last week because I wanted to race three weeks in a row," said Daley, who co-owns the filly with Caviart Farms, Crawford Farms Racing, and L.A. Express Stable. "I figured a few of the better ones probably wouldn't race this week."

"I still think mine is the best one out there. She's never been super gaited. Speed and power wise, she's as good or better than most of them. But she has her issues. They're all manageable, so we'll see how she progresses. Hopefully, we're (racing) three weeks in a row from here."

Piper Hanover has won four of five starts this year and heads to the Tompkins off a win over Anoka Hanover in the Reynolds.

In the first Tompkins division, Ron Burke-trained Hot As Hill is the 3-1 morning-line choice. She has hit the board in six of eight races this year, winning two, and was third in a division of the Miller last week. She is one of two Miller participants returning this week in the Tompkins, along with the third-place finisher in the other division, Lucas Wallin's May Karp.

Sixteen of the 18 fillies in the Tompkins are eligible to the Hambletonian Oaks.

Colonial As, trained by Per Engblom, is among 11 Hambletonian eligibles in the two seven-horse divisions of the Tompkins for 3-year-old male trotters. Also entered in the event were Dan Patch Award-winner Venerate and O'Brien Award-winner On A Streak.

Unraced at 2, Colonial As has won five of eight races this season. He is 8-1 on the morning line in the second Tompkins division,

where he will start from post five with Todd McCarthy. Last week, the colt finished fifth in a conditioned race won by Yonkers Trot champion Johan Palema. The field also included one of this season's top trotting fillies in terms of wins and speed, Bella Bellini, who finished second, and 2020 Breeders Crown runner-up In Range, who was third.

The Tompkins will be Colonial As' first Grand Circuit race. All five of his wins have come at Harrah's Philadelphia.

"I got him last year at the end of May, I think," said Engblom, who conditions the son of Readly Express-Piaf Dei Fiori for owner Buckstone Land Livestock. "He's a big, leggy, horse. We qualified him a couple times and then turned him out because he needed time."

Colonial As has raced twice at The Meadowlands. The first time was June 25 when he went off stride and finished sixth. Last week, he was timed in 1:52 in his fifth-place finish.

"We started him at (Philly this year) because he's got very good technique going through the turns," Engblom said. "The first time we took him to The Meadowlands, he was sick. I was happy with his last start. He needed the fast mile to get some speed in his legs. He trained very good Wednesday, so hopefully he's going to be moving forward."

Colonial As is fully staked in North America, including to the Hambletonian, but also could return to Italy later this year for the Italian Derby.

"He would really have to prove himself on Saturday," Engblom said about sending the colt to the Hambletonian, adding the Muscle Hill could be a possibility on Hambletonian weekend. "He's been doing so well that I don't want to throw him to the wolves too much before he's really ready for it. I think he's a really nice colt. His time will come. He's feeling very well about himself and he's nice and sound. Hopefully, I can keep him that way."

New Jersey Sire Stakes champion Really Fast, trained by Nancy Takter, is the 7-5 morning-line favorite in the second Tompkins division. Venerate, trained by Julie Miller, is the 8-5 favorite in the second.

KINDERGARTEN BEGINS TONIGHT

The first round of the Kindergarten Classic Series for 2-year-old pacers and trotters is tonight (July 23) at The Meadowlands. There will be four divisions for female trotters, three divisions for male trotters and female pacers, and one division for male pacers.

Daley will send out eight horses tonight in the series, including Palermo Hanover, who is a full sister to Piper Hanover.

The second round of the Kindergarten is in mid-September.

"It fits in well for them to go there," Daley said. "It's a couple of months until the next leg, so I wanted them to get some experience and get some points. A few of them have had one or two starts and have been pretty good. We always start a little bit later, there is so much racing now, that this is a good spot."



Favorites upset in PASS at Philly

The heavy favorites both took it on the chin in two divisions of the second preliminary round of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) for 2-year-old trotting colts on Thursday afternoon (July 22) Harrah's Philadelphia.

First to fall was Global Pandemic, who had won a Tompkins-Geers stake and a Pennsylvania All-Stars contest before finishing second to early divisional leader Keg Stand in a 1:55.1 division of the first PASS leg. Here the 1-5 favorite moved to the lead after a :28.4 quarter and set middle fractions of :58.1 and 1:27, but lurking in the pocket was the Explosive Matter–Blintz gelding **Kosher Mahoney**, and it was

that baby who proved to have the most in the stretch, winning by 1¾ lengths while lowering his mark to 1:56.1. Tim Tetrick drove the 4-1 second choice to the victory for trainer Symon Spicer and owner Eli Beiler.

The "early division leader" Keg Stand then met his come-uppance in the second split at the hooves of the Bar Hopping–Barbara Brooks colt **S I P**, who came within a fifth of the Philly divisional track record with a 1:55.1 win. Keg Stand was 2-5 vs. S I P's 2-1 though both had won a leg of the first round Sire Stakes, because Keg Stand went 1:55.1 vs. S I P's 1:57 (plus he finished second to Keg Stand in a Pocono stake). But as Keg Stand went for the lead past a :28.3 quarter, front-stepping S I P pushed the chalk before releasing him before a :57 half and followed him closely to the 1:25.3 three-quarters.

As soon as S I P and Yannick Gingras found stretch room between horses, it was apparent the favorite was beaten, and S I P went on to a three-quarters of a length victory over Double Deceiver, with Keg Stand fading to fifth and last (though beaten only 2¼ lengths). S I P thus becomes the only double Sires winner in this group to date for trainer Ron Burke and the ownership of Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Brusceci LLC along with Hatfield Stables and Brixton Medical Inc.

Form looked like it may be taking a stakes holiday all day as the first two divisions of the Stallion Series action also resulted in upsets. The regally-bred **Patrick Hanover** (Father Patrick–Passionate Glide) went wire-to-wire from the outside starting spot in 1:57 in his division, rewarding his backers at a 12-1 price and rewarding his brain trust – driver Andy Miller, trainer/wife Julie Miller, and owners Pinske Stables, David J. Miller, and Lawrence Means – with a maiden victory.

Another David Miller, the Hall of Fame horseman, guided the other two winners, including 9-2 shot **Khal Drogo**, who was as fierce as his Game Of Thrones character's namesake, coming home in :56.2 uncovered to win by open lengths in 1:57. Khal Drogo, a son of Andover Hall–Mariah Dancer, finally showed good manners after breaking in his first two purse races, and the colt showed plenty of talent as well for trainer Brett Ecker and Silver Bullet Stable.

Khal Drogo won the 10th race, and a storm came through southeast Pennsylvania just as the field was going to the start in race eleven, with the result that you couldn't see most of that contest. The weather went back to calm, and a favorite finally won in the last stakes action of the day, race 12's STS section, as the Donato Hanover–Hollybrook Lane gelding **Oh Boy**, coming off a second in a Stallion Series race, was the last to the top in a rapid-fire mid-race sequence of lead changes. He then came his last half in :58 to break his maiden in 1:59 over the now-sloppy surface for trainer Jason Shaw and owner Tammy Carter.

NYSS fillies stay undefeated at Batavia Downs

Batavia Downs welcomed a large crowd of live fans back to the track on Wednesday (July 21) as they opened their 2021 live racing season and the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) were in town to put on the show. Thirteen 2-year-old filly trotters went postward in two divisions for a total of \$101,700 in purses and the two best of this group remained perfect lifetime.

In the first \$51,300 seven-horse division the undefeated **Bomb Hugger** (Chapter Seven—Stylemaker) ran her streak to three consecutive wins after tripping-out the entire mile.

Iluvmyiumiu's (Andrew McCarthy) took control off the pylons while Bomb Hugger (Anthony Macdonald) left from mid-pack and tucked second at the pegs. After cutting fractions of :28.4, :59 and 1:28.3, Pioneer AS (Jim Morrill Jr.) made her way to second on the outside and then drew even with the leader. However, coming off the last turn Pioneer AS broke, giving Bomb Hugger a clear lane to the outside. Macdonald pulled the filly and she responded willingly. Bomb Hugger trotted quickly by Iluvmyiumiu's and drew clear by 1-½ lengths at the line in 1:58.2.

Bomb Hugger (\$5.40) is now two-for-two in NYSS action. The filly is owned by The Stable Bomb Hugger Group and is trained by Ryan Swift.

A group of six lined up for \$50,400 in the second round and **Gertrude** (Devious Man—Ophelia) became the second filly of the night to remain unbeaten.

Following the pattern of the first division, the rail sitter Seven On The Rocks (John Stark Jr.) left hard while the heavily favored Gertrude (Andy Miller) darted from post five and dropped in the garden spot. While the race proceeded in single file fashion through somewhat pedestrian quarters of :30.2, 1:01.1 and 1:31.1, Seven On The Rocks looked strong heading into the last turn. But Gertrude had other ideas when Miller tipped her off the pylons. Gertrude got almost even with Seven On The Rocks at the top of the stretch but couldn't quite get by the stubborn leader. The two battled heartily to the beam where Gertrude finally got a slight advantage and won by a ¼ length in 1:59.3, with a swift :28.2 final panel.

Now two-for-two lifetime, Gertrude (\$3.10) is owned by the Andy Miller Stable and is trained by Julie Miller.

It was Miller Time at Batavia Downs on Wednesday as Andy Miller led all drivers with three wins on the card while wife Julie Miller led all trainers by sending two from her stable to the Purple Haze Winner's Circle.

There were also three \$15,000 Excel A divisions also contested and they were won by **Adjure Hanover** (Chapter

Seven—Anonyme Hanover 1:59.4, \$2.70), **New Year's Eve** (Credit Winner—Sweetest Zete 2:03.2, \$10.60) and **Soundsof Silence** AS (Conway Hall—Shutupandholdon AS 2:00.3, \$16.20).

Jamieson and Henry double up in Grassroots action

Drivers Jody Jamieson and Trevor Henry each won a trio of races on the Tuesday (July 20) program at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and two of their wins came in 3-year-old pacing filly Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots action.

Jamieson opened the program with an effortless score behind **Motovation** in the first \$22,500 Grassroots division. Starting from Post 1 with the fan favorite, Jamieson allowed Motovation to settle briefly in third before taking command heading for the :58 half. Comfortably in front past the 1:27.4 three-quarters, Motovation pulled away to a two and three-quarter length victory in 1:56.4. Bikini Genie finished second and Straight Talker was third. "Motovation had a win already and she was very handy again tonight," said Jamieson.

The Sunshine Beach daughter earned her first victory in an overnight event for 2-year-old pacing fillies on July 15, touring the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval in 1:56. Phil Hudon trains Motovation for owner/breeders Hunter Sellars of Brampton and Michael Kwietniowski of Guelph, ON and has been impressed with the filly in all of her outings.

"She's a nice filly, has a big heart. I thought she raced huge her first start, so I thought she would be good, but she sure is impressive," said Hudon. "Her first start she was a little grabby off the gate, but she looked like she sat pretty good in the hole today and then when he moved her to the front she was pretty classy."

Jamieson scored his second Grassroots win, and third victory of the night, in the last division with **Warrawee Xpat**. Starting from Post 9, Jamieson hustled the filly off the gate and had her in front by the halfway marker. Once in command Warrawee Xpat was able to cruise home to a 1:55.1 win, three lengths ahead of favorite B My Sunshine. Dixie Bayama rounded out the top three. (**replay here: [Warrawee Xpat](#)**)

"Xpat is just a little peanut," said Jamieson. "To go parked past the quarter and still win the way she won really shows her

talent.”

Gabriella Sasso trains Warrawee Xpat for Jeffrey Courchesne of Cambridge and Martwest Racing Stable of Mississauga, ON. The Sportswriter daughter now has one win and one third to her credit through the first two Grassroots events and has earned more than double her \$6,000 purchase price from last fall's Ontario Select Yearling Sale.

Trevor Henry guided **Let Me Be Me** to the fastest mile of the five Grassroots divisions, touring the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval in 1:54.4. Henry floated the Thinking Out Loud daughter away from Post 1 and then sent her after the lead heading for the :57.3 half. One and one-half lengths ahead of her peers at the 1:27 three-quarters, Let Me Be Me had doubled that margin by the time she sailed under the wire. Sake Tumi finished second and favorite Big Bettor Hanover was three more lengths back in third. ([replay here: Let Me Be Me](#))

“She raced really great. She kind of surprised me tonight,” said Henry. “She raced good last week, but with everything her own way tonight she definitely found a new gear. Bob's (McIntosh) horses always get better as the year goes on.”

LaSalle resident Bob McIntosh trains Let Me Be Me for his co-owner/breeder Al McIntosh Holdings Inc. of Leamington, ON. The filly scored her first lifetime win in a July 13 overnight at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Henry scored his second Grassroots win, and third of the night, in the fourth division with **Flo**. Like Let Me Be Me, Flo was on top by the half and battled down the stretch to a 1:56.1 victory over Watch Her Fly. Favorite Velvet Stinger was able to salvage third after a pair of miscues. ([replay here: Flo](#))

“She's a big filly,” said Henry. “She raced good and should only get better.”

Dr. Ian Moore of Cambridge trains Flo for Wilma and James MacKenzie of Ennismore, ON and said the Shadow Play daughter has been something of a surprise. In addition to Tuesday's win, Flo finished seventh in the July 6 Grassroots season opener at Georgian Downs and currently sits atop the freshman pacing filly leaderboard with 75 points.

“I think her original name was something like Bunker Babe and that's just kind of the way she's built. She's just a great big, thick, round thing. She trained in the last set all winter, our worst one,” said Moore, adding that the filly was a prolific kicker through her early lessons. “But she's gotten better and better. She's just going to be a Grassroots horse, but if she can win one or two here or there that will be all right. I don't know if we're going to make it to Clinton and places like that because she's so big, but the ones that are here we will have no problem.”

The 2-year-old pacing fillies will make their third Grassroots start back at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Aug. 13. Flo will likely skip the fourth event over Hanover Raceway's half-mile on Sept. 4, but she will be ready for action when they return to Woodbine Mohawk Park for the last regular season leg on

Sept. 20.

The other Grassroots blanket went home with **Delight Bayama**, who posted a 1:55.3 win for driver Sylvain Filion of Milton, trainer Jean Tourigny and owner-breeder Bayama Farms Inc. of Saint-Andre-D'Argenteuil, QC. Shezis A Beauty finished one and one-half lengths behind the Bettors Delight daughter in second and Rhone Hanover was five lengths back in third. ([replay here: Delight Bayama](#))

Indoor simulcasting returns to Yonkers Raceway

When the COVID-19 pandemic forced the shutdown of live racing and simulcasting at Yonkers Raceway for three months in 2020, the future seemed very much uncertain. Nearly a year after the return of live racing, with the go-ahead from New York State officials, management at the Westchester County oval is pleased to announce that not only are fans permitted on the track apron but also inside the facility.

The doors reopened for simulcasting inside on Thursday, July 15 and patrons were invited back to the spacious fourth-floor with ample betting windows, seating and exceptional views of the half-mile track during live racing. Simulcasting is available seven-days-a-week starting at noon from Wednesday to Sunday and at 6 p.m. on Monday and Tuesday. Up to 24 tracks are available daily for wagering.

"We went 15 months without any racing fans on property and a full year of live racing with no spectators. It was such a relief to welcome our racing people back on-site last month and the one question everyone asked was: 'When is the 4th floor going to open?' That day came last week and it was just a great feeling to return another element of our racing product," said director of racing Alex Dadoyan.

The return of indoor simulcasting comes on the heels of the June 9 welcoming back of racing fans to the historic Yonkers Raceway oval. Via the track apron, fans have been able to enjoy world-class racing over the last few weeks including the kick-off legs of both \$500,000 Triple Crown events – the MGM Grand Messenger Pace and MGM Yonkers Trot.

Stakes action continues throughout the summer at Yonkers with five more legs of the New York Sire Stakes culminating

in the \$1.8 million Night of Champions on Friday, Sept. 10. The top point earners in each of the divisions for 2- and 3-year-olds will compete in eight \$225,000 finals.

Yonkers Raceway is open for live racing Monday to Friday with a first-race post-time of 7:15 p.m. For more information visit our [website](#).

incredible line up of racing action, including the aforementioned Battle of Waterloo and Battle of the Belles. With a post time of 12:30 p.m. guests can expect an afternoon packed with racing entertainment.

Clinton fixture Dennis Jewitt relishes six-decade career in harness racing

For the past decade, visitors and participants at Clinton Raceway have been treated to the handiwork of Dennis Jewitt, who readies the racing surface for action each Sunday.

"I take a lot of pleasure in it. I used to drive and what I try and do is have the track the way I would have wanted it. I like to see them go fast, that's what you aim for," said Jewitt. "I've been doing it for 10 or 12 years now."

The soon to be 80-year-old – he will celebrate the landmark birthday on July 24 – retired in 1992 from a driving career that saw him compete as far away as Connaught Park in Aylmer, QC and earn driving titles at a number of the Grassroots tracks in Ontario. Clinton, Elmira, Goderich, Hanover and Orangeville Raceways were all regular stops for Jewitt in his driving heyday, most of which he fit in around a full-time job in the Goderich salt mine.

"I spent 40 years working underground at the salt mine in Goderich and did the horses part time. I did a lot of driving, quite a bit of driving, for other people and trained my own horses," said Jewitt, who now calls Wingham, ON home.

There was a stretch in the late 1960s that saw Jewitt spend all of his days with the horses, but he found it tough to

balance full-time training and driving with family life at home in Goderich.

"Years ago, I think in 1967, I went to Connaught Park in Quebec and raced and I enjoyed that, but I had a young family and back then you just couldn't do it," said Jewitt, who got his start working for renowned southwestern Ontario horsemen like Wib White and Wes Litt. "So then I went back to the mine and loved every minute of it. It didn't bother me being underground and I really enjoyed it."

Once he retired from driving, Jewitt continued to train a few horses and said the best horse he ever had come along in 2004. As a 5-year-old, pacing gelding R M Karisma (Intrepid Seelster–Cherubine) won at Woodbine Racetrack in 1:51.4 and earned \$195,170 in an 11-year racing career. Also appearing on Jewitt's equine highlight reel is a mare he sold to Brett Robinson in 2005. Then four, Hope For Life (Fit For Life – Patscc) raced until 2007 when she was retired to broodmare duty. Since then, from six foals she has produced three \$450,000-plus winners who have paced sub-1:51.

"She's the dam of just a heck of a mare, she won the Blue Chip Matchmaker in The Meadowlands this year, a mare called Machnhope (Mach Three)," said Jewitt. "I've had some good horses. I've just had so much fun in the horse business."

At present Jewitt just has one broodmare and her 2-year-old Lyons somewhere filly, who he does not expect to race until this fall at the earliest.

In addition to staying busy with his horses and maintaining the Clinton oval on race days, Jewitt is a long-time supporter of the Wingham Ironmen and looks forward to getting back to co-ordinating their 50-50 draw program once the Provincial Junior Ice Hockey League resumes play in October.

In the meantime, to mark his 80th birthday Jewitt has been walking the G2G Rail Trail, which stretches 127 km between Guelph and Goderich, ON.

"I'm doing about 10 or 12 kilometres a day on it and I would like to get it done before my 80th birthday," said Jewitt, who expects to complete the trail, with two days to spare, on Thursday, July 22. "I think staying active is what keeps you going."

Family is also an essential part of Jewitt's formula for a full life. He is very proud of daughter Kathy Johnston, the former assistant race secretary at Clinton Raceway, and son David Jewitt, the deputy mayor of Central Huron, who will gather with their families on Saturday to celebrate his milestone birthday.

On Sunday, Jewitt will be back behind the wheel of the Clinton Raceway track maintenance vehicles, ensuring the surface is fast and accepting good wishes from the many friends and acquaintances he has made through more than six decades in harness racing.
