Tom Grossman: No questions off limits

The owner of Blue Chip Farms on how what he learned at the racetrack at a young age has guided his whole life.

Tom Grossman grew up in New York city. He was a racehorse junkie for as long as he can remember, but it was of the thoroughbred variety, not standardbred.

His father loved going to the track. So did Tom, who usually went along with him. Tom recalls his father being a significant bettor — one who rarely let emotions get in the way of choosing his picks. He worked with the numbers and tried valiantly to get them to work out in his favor.

As with all successful gamblers, he looked for value.

Tom distinctly remembers he and his dad going into a very crowded paddock at Saratoga. He remembers his father saying to him at the age of 10, "Look around you son. All you have to be able to do is be smarter than 15 per cent of this crowd to be able to make money here."

Of course, both realized that it was not quite as simplistic as that. But it wasn't all that difficult either if you paid attention to all things, both big and small.

Tom says that he learned many of his life's lessons — and attributes much of his success in the "real world" — to what he learned from going to the racetrack at a very young age.

The bottom line was to determine what the risk/reward

ratio was and to abide by the results obtained from doing so.

His first job "on the street" was working for Goldman Sachs before it became the huge behemoth it is now. He rose through the ranks and eventually headed his own department where he groomed several young people to success in their chosen profession.


It was in doing so that he came to realize that not all of us are capable in all areas. The genius on Wall Street might be so because he or she is proficient in a small area where he ranks ahead of those who might have more socially desirable traits. However, that one area might surpass all others in terms of success measured by monetary gain.

He was a schoolmate and good friend of Scott Kimelman, whose father Michael (AKA The Chief) and grandfather Oscar (The Big O) together with Bill Brown built Blue Chip Farms into one of the top breeding farms in not only New York

state, but also the world.

Scottie did his best to switch Tom's allegiance from the thoroughbreds to trotters and pacers. Although Tom still loves the thoroughbreds and has some involvement there, he has gone over to "The Dark Side".

Tom credits The Chief as being one of the wisest and most assiduous people he has ever known in just about every venue of life.

He says that one should never underrate The Chief's ability in just about every field that he enters.

One thing that he told me about The Chief was that when Warren Buffett was on his way to stardom, it was not unusual for him to park a considerable amount of his large portfolio under Mike Kimelman's management.

I remember Mike's dad Oscar telling me one day after he had a scotch or two, "My son Michael is likely to come up with 20 new ideas. Nineteen of them might be crazy or pure nonsense, but the remaining one will be the one that knocks the ball out of the park. If you played all 20, you will usually come out ahead."

Back to the horse business and Blue Chip Farms.

Tom was in a tax situation where he was maybe doing a



little too well. The Chief told him "I've got the perfect vehicle for you to stop giving all that money in taxes to the government and instead have some fun with it. I'm going to sell you Blue Chip Farms."

Thus began Tom Grossman's career as a serious investor in harness racing.

Within a very short period of time, Tom realized that horse breeding is a very capital intensive business. You have to spend money, sometimes a whole lot of money, in order to make some.

Thankfully, at that time, Grossman was in a position to do

SO.

He quickly realized that his broodmares were getting older. He needed to and did invest a lot of money in young fillies who would eventually become the nucleus of the broodmare band.

He bought major positions in the stallions Bettors Delight and Art Major and ended up making a whole lot of money for himself and anybody associated with them.

He bought Art Major at three. Most people told him to retire him at that age. The horse had done enough. He would undoubtedly get a full book and over a relatively short period of time would pay for himself and more.

Tommy instead decided to roll the dice and bring him back for his 4-year-old season as had also been done with Art Major's sire Artsplace.

Although he did not sweep the year as Artsplace had done, he came darn close. Tom looks back on that season with the fondest of memories. His dad was in declining health, but managed to be strong enough to share the winner's circle experience with great joy with his son at each of his innumerable victories.

Bettors Delight has turned out to be an epic stallion. At the latest count he has sired an astounding 41 millionaires.

He is definitely in any conversation concerning the greatest pacing stallions ever.

Grossman said the person shopping for standardbred yearlings has a good chance of making money, if he does things right and fortune falls his way. In the thoroughbred business, such a person has zero chance unless that person is incredibly lucky and finds that needle in a haystack like a California Chrome.

It all comes down to numbers and risk/reward.

I asked him about Chapter Seven and the extraordinary horses that he has thus far produced.

Are you surprised? I asked.

"Of course" he said. "That kind of horse comes along very rarely. They are a once in a generational product. They influence and sometimes change the breed.

Blue Chip Farms has had three of those stallions in Most Happy Fella, Bettors Delight and now Chapter Seven.

Perhaps I am being slightly premature with Chapter Seven. But I don't believe so. If anything, things will almost certainly change for the better. In his first few crops, he got very few "A" quality mares of the type that Muscle Hill and Father Patrick, got from the get go. Now he is getting them. His next three crops should move him up even higher than the

previous ones did.

What few people might realize is that Grossman is also deeply involved in another equine pursuit. He breeds and sells show horses.

Show horses demand more patience than standardbreds. He raises both breeds together with an occasional thoroughbred until they are separated as yearlings. The show horses then go into a multi-year preparation program until they are sold to various buyers all over the world. Some of them might be as old as 6 or 7 before they leave the farm. Tom assured me that in some instances it is well worth the wait.

He says that he got very lucky when he was advised by a very astute horseman to purchase a mare by the name of Sapphire.

Sapphire became a multi-Olympic champion. Many of Tom's successful show horses trace to Sapphire. He purchased Sapphire on the advice on the advice of Barney Ward, a man he still considers the greatest horseman he has ever known.

Before entering this conversation Tom said that no questions were off limits, so here we go.

You are often accused of associating with — for lack of a better term — people considered unsavory types — people such as Josh Marks and Rene Allard who many consider to be detrimental to our sport. What do you say to that?

"When Andy Grant placed me on the board of the Hambletonian Society, part of his mission was to change the feeling that the Society was a group of elitist old men who didn't know or care of most things relating to the business other than protecting the status quo. I felt that part of my mission was to recruit some young overnight racehorse trainers and get them to realize how much opportunity there is in the yearling game. I tried my best to do that. Some worked out. Others didn't. Some are still in the learning process.

"I might have been somewhat predisposed to getting involved with some of these guys because I have an older brother with issues similar to those of Josh Marks. On the street and throughout life, if I've learned one thing above all others it's that nobody is perfect. Some of the so called 'bad guys' can be redeemed, others cannot. Some of them were never bad guys to begin with. The ones who could not be redeemed, have hurt me and my businesses. One never knows until one tries. The one thing that Josh Marks and Rene Allard possess above all others is that they are both great horseman. Lots of accusations have been made against

both of them, very few, if any have been proven thus far.

"When I worked with Josh, I was with him every day. I jogged alongside him. I watched him working with the horses. I thought he was well on his way to becoming a good citizen. Then when he got up north, his demons took over. I believe that at heart he is a good person.

"Josh Marks has numerous personal problems. There are times when he has been able to overcome them. There have also been times when he's jumped the fence. There is nobody he has hurt more than himself. I have never seen him mistreat a horse. The one thing I have often seen is him working hour upon hour with a 'problem' horse trying to find the key to making him good. His patience has been remarkable in that area. I've often thought to myself, if only he was as patient and took care of himself that well.

"Rene is somewhat the same. He is a remarkable horseman. He works extremely hard. He has an incredible memory. He knows every horse he has ever been around — how they were equipped, their likes and dislikes. I have asked him face to face with his wife and children present, 'Rene can you swear to me that you haven't used any blood builders on your horses?' He put his hand on his son Leo's head and said, 'No one in this entire world means more to me than Leo. I swear on his life that I have never raced a horse using blood builders.'

"I realize my allegiance to these guys has cost me lots, maybe millions of dollars. I also realize that being loyal to some may have come back and bite me in the ass, but that is who I am.

"When I first started training horses I was told by several not to give my horses to Ray Schnittker. I was told among many other things — he is a horse destroyer, he will ruin your horse, etc. I gave them to him anyway and we did pretty well.

"Today, that same Ray Schnittker is revered by many and cited as a positive example of what a horseman should be. There aren't too many out there who are a greater credit to harness racing than Ray Schnittker."

Blue Chip Farms is far and away the biggest and best known breeding farm in New York. You are often criticized for your stance on insisting that mares be inseminated in the Empire State. The argument is by doing so, you are making things far more difficult and expensive for your out of state clients. You are also preventing the growth in both quality and quantity of the New York-bred horse. You are in effect preventing some great stallions and certainly hampering the quality of good mares being sent to be bred in New York. The fact is in many cases the mares are just in the state for a cup of coffee anyway.

They are trucked there, inseminated on the van and shipped back to their resident state on that same day, or with some, they are decamped for a few days during their heat period and then sent home. Many breeders will just not subject their best mares to the possibility of injury, especially when they have a foal at their side. What are your thoughts?

"I know that there are some who are in favor of changing the rule. It might happen. My fear is that it might result in short term help and in the long run could hurt us immensely. The reason the New York program and those of other states are there is to sustain and help agriculture. Without the agricultural aspect we would not have sires stakes, regardless of the venue. I fear that some of the politicians might get hold of the issue and ask how is shipping semen helping sustain agriculture and employment in the state? You hardly need any green grass and acreage to do that. All you need are a few stallions, a few acres, a person to collect the horses and someone to package the semen and ship it. How is that helping agriculture and employment? I hope it never happens, but it could. We have to be constantly vigilant."

Let's talk about Tom Grossman, the guy. Other than your business pursuits what keeps you occupied?

"My son has pretty much taken control of the show horse aspect at Blue Chip. I spend a lot of my time following him compete in shows all around the country. Mostly due to COVID-19 and the restraints it has placed upon 'ordinary life,' I've become somewhat of a golfing junkie. I've always golfed, however recently I have been much more involved. I actually shot a hole in one at Augusta in 1999.

"I'm a huge pizza lover and have checked out most of the best known places in the city. I've also invested in a few. Among my favorites are Di Fara, Beebe's, Paulie Gees and Rubirosa."

"When I had my Hedge fund, I had my staff run *quants doing studies of pedigrees and breeding. I still occasionally do so."

*Author's Note: I had no idea what a quant was. I looked it up and found that it is a means of using computers to determine outcomes.



Papi Rob Hanover rolls to 1:47.1 world record in his Adios elimination

The Greek Freak and Catch The Fire were also elimination wins Saturday at The Meadows.

Papi Rob Hanover blazed his way to the \$375,000 final of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids in a world record 1:47.1, a world record for a 3-year-old colt on a five-eighths mile track. Also winning eliminations Saturday at The Meadows were **The Greek Freak** and **Catch The Fire**.

Joining the three winners in the Aug. 1 final are Later Dudes, Chief Mate, No Lou Zing, Sweet Truth, Capt Midnight and Elver Hanover. Connections of the elimination winners will choose their post positions Tuesday, with their order of selection determined by random draw. All other post

positions will be randomly drawn.

The Adios Day card is a blockbuster, featuring two Grand Circuit stakes in addition to the Adios as well as Pennsylvania Sires Stake and PA Stallion Series action.

The Meadowlands Pace runner-up, Papi Rob Hanover was comfortably in front after quarter-poling to the point for David Miller following Captain Barbossa's unrealistic :25.3 opening panel. Papi Rob Hanover

(Somebeachsomewhere—Panera Hanover) reached three-quarters in 1:20.3, but he wasn't done yet, clicking off the final panel in :26.3. Sweet Truth was second-placed third,10-1/2 lengths back, while No Lou Zing was elevated to second.

Brett Pelling, who trains Papi Rob Hanover for David McDuffee, said he wasn't concerned that the swift mile might leave him short next week.

"He came out of the Meadowlands Pace great, and he proves he needs to race. He just needs more racing," Pelling said. "Every race has been better than the one before, so he's on the right track.

"Could he bounce off that? He's a big, strong horse. Nothing's ever knocked him around yet, so he'll be fine."

The time knocked a tick from Betting Line's previous world record. In addition, the mile is the fastest ever paced at The Meadows, lowering Bolt The Duer's former standard of 1:47.4.

Catch The Fire endured a demanding opening panel — :26.2 while wide — and held on gamely to score in a career best 1:49.3 for Mike Wilder, trainer John Ackley and owner CT Stables. Capt Midnight was a head back in second, with Elver Hanover third.

"He could have been fourth or fifth in the Meadowlands Pace final, but we got hung up at the top of the lane," Wilder said. "When you're going miles in 1:47, you can't get stopped. Today I wanted to make my own luck. He showed up like he always does."

After a brief skirmish for the lead, The Greek Freak controlled the mile and earned his berth in the final with a 1:49.4 win, fastest of his career and his fourth straight victory. His job was made a touch easier by the break of the pocket-sitting Sandbetweenmytoes as the field straightened for home. Later Dudes was second, beaten 1/2 length, while Chief Mate completed the ticket.

"He's getting better every start," said winning driver Matt Kakaley. "He was really, really good again today. We got an easy second quarter. That's what we wanted to do, save some for next week. I'm really happy with him and looking forward to next week."

PASS and Stallion Series results

The Adios eliminations card at The Meadows also featured a pair of stakes for 3-year-old filly pacers — two \$94,341 Pennsylvania Sires Stake divisions and a \$100,000 PA Stallion Series event contested in five \$20,000 divisions. There was action aplenty, as a stake record was matched and a Dan Patch Award winner got off the 2020 schneid. The highlights:

After suffering two tough defeats to start the year, last year's divisional champ **Lyons Sentinel** scored impressively in a career-best 1.49:2 in her PASS for 3-year-old pacing fillies. Sitting behind swift fractions, she moved first up for Tim Tetrick and downed Alexis's Beach by 2-1/4 lengths, with Rocknificent third.

"She could definitely have three wins already, but today she got the better trip," Tetrick said. "She's ready to go beat somebody for sure."

Jim King conditions the daughter of Captaintreacherous—Tutu Hanover, who now boasts a lifetime bankroll of \$910,553, for Threelyonsracing.

Party Girl Hill didn't race at 2, but she's started her sophomore campaign with a flourish — four victories without a loss, including Saturday's triumph in 1:49.1 for Dexter Dunn in the other PASS test. That equaled the mark Big McDeal established in 2012.

"She's always had good speed, nice manners — an easy keeper. She always struck us as having class even before we raced her," said Chris Ryder, who trains Tom Hill's homebred daughter of Captaintreacherous—Look Cheap. "At 2, she had a broken P1, a bone between the ankle and the foot in the

hind leg. It's not unusual for horses, and they heal up, no problem."

JK First Lady finished second, beaten 1-1/2 lengths, with Baby Your the Best third.

In the PA Stallion Series, **Going Gone Hanover** earned stake honors with her 1:51.4 win while Dream Dancing provided the tote board pyrotechnics, upsetting at 49-1 for Chris Shaw and trainer Mitchell York, who owns the Rocknroll Dance—Clearly Foxy filly with David Brickell.

Going Gone Hanover retook the lead for Mike Wilder and wasn't threatened from there, defeating a rallying Anthem by 3-1/2 lengths. Wingding Hanover completed the ticket.

"I got to drive her last week and kind of got away in a bad spot with her," Wilder said. "I either wanted to get a two-hole trip or try her on the lead today because she raced so good last week first over. Boy, did she ever show up."

History-making Marion Marauder at it again

The 2016 trotting Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder set yet another record on Friday (July 24) at the Meadowlands. He lowered his lifetime mark a full second to 1:50.2, just 2/5ths off the track standard co-held by Sebastian K and Archangel for trainer Paula Wellwood. Scott Zeron drove for Jean Wellwood and Devin Keeling of Ontario.

FIRSTS are nothing new to this 7-year-old son of Muscle Hill out of Spellbound Hanover. Consider this list:

- 1. At \$3,375,016 he is the richest Triple Crown winner ever trotter or pacer. There are 19 overall winners, 10 pacing and 9 trotting.
- **2.** Niatross is the other Triple Crown winner past \$2 million, doing so in 1979-1980.
- **3.** No Triple Crown winner prior has ever raced past their 6-year-old season and that includes the gelding Western Dreamer. Rum Customer won the 1968 pacing Triple Crown and competed until age 6 into 1971. He tipped past \$1 million lifetime. Western Dreamer won the pacing Triple Crown in 1997 and competed until 2000, age 6. He banked \$1,812,176 lifetime.
- **4.** The 1:50.2 is actually 1/5th faster than the lifetime mark of the last pacer to win a Triple Crown, 17 years back, No Pan Intended at 1:50.3.
- **5.** Paula Wellwood is the first and only female trainer to have a Triple Crown winner, thoroughbred included.
- **6.** 66 21-17-8 is now Marion Marauder's slate lifetime, meaning he has broken a tie with Muscle Hill at 20 victories even though dad did so in just 21 tries.
- **7.** \$3,375,016 is his new total and Muscle Hill himself made \$3,273,342. He is the only son or daughter to out-earn dad.
 - 8. He took his lifetime mark in his 66th career try.

- **9.** Try and find a career \$3 million winner who has a winless season on his bio! That's right, Marion Marauder was blanked last year in 10 tries. 10 0-2-2 \$220,521.
- **10.** Nobody else won all three Triple Crown races by either a nose or a head.

Trainer Mike Keeling, Paula's husband, has also been with the triple millionaire every step of the way.

"It's hard to believe a horse of this caliber hasn't seen the winner's circle this long," Mike said. "He really hasn't changed much, but the way they race has. It has made it harder for him to get into striking distance."

How about the NEW JERSEY connection that both father and son have and had?

Muscle Hill, the 2008 freshman Breeders Crown winner at the Meadowlands, made his first five starts as a sophomore and his first four qualifiers at the Meadowlands in 2009. He took his mark of 1:50.1 winning the Hambletonian. He stands at Southwind Farms in New Jersey.

Marion Marauder took his mark 1/5th off of dad's right in East Rutherford, in addition to winning the Hambletonian there.

His dam is Spellbound Hanover by Donerail. Spellbound Hanover won over \$950,000 lifetime and was a New Jersey Sires Stakes star in 2000-2001. She captured the 2000 Merrie Annabelle (Now the Doherty Memorial) for \$346,000 for Bill Popfinger. Her sire, Donerail, has the unique distinction of never having left the Garden State at all. The 1994 Peter Haughton winner and 2-year-old trotting colt of the year, he was the final hope for Stanley Dancer for his 6th Hambletonian back in 1995 but retired that summer.

Mike added some more New Jersey flavor to Marion Marauder's story: "When he races at the Meadowlands, he stays at Magical Acres. Last year he was turned out at Dr. Mazzarisi's Farm in Jersey, too."

He's 7 now, which is old for a trotting stallion with this kind of bio right?

"Racing beyond this year is difficult to forecast," Mike said. "Europe would have been a logical step but COVID may have a lot to say about that."

P.S.: If Marion Marauder races into 2021, he'll tie the five-years-after mark for Hambletonian-winning stallions. Timothy T did it in 1970, going another five seasons and taking two Elitlopps. He finished up after the 1975 season

with \$894,237 — ranking in the top five all time among trotting males upon retirement. (Shiaway St Pat raced through much of the 1980s after winning the 1981 Hambletonian, but was a gelding competing at the lower levels).

Reflect With Me sets 1:48.2 track record winning Nadia Lobell at Hoosier

The mile was also a new lifetime mark, the fastest time this year by a 3-year-old pacing filly and marked the second consecutive night a national season's record was set at the Indiana track.

Reflect With Me ventured to Harrah's Hoosier Park for the

first time in her illustrious career and made her Harrah's Hoosier Park debut a winning on Friday (July 24) as she captured the featured event of the evening, the \$100,000 Nadia Lobell Stakes for 3-year-old pacing fillies. Stopping the timer in an eye-catching 1:48.2, Reflect With Me destroyed the previous track record for sophomore pacing fillies, established a new lifetime mark and also recorded the season's fastest time in her division with the win. The mile also marked the second consecutive night a national season's record was established at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

With regular pilot Andrew McCarthy in the sulky, Reflect With Me left just enough from post four to grab a pocket seat behind Priceless and Brandon Bates who left alertly from post five. Priceless appeared relaxed on the front as she dictated first half fractions of :26.2 and :55.

As the field approached the final turn, Trace Tetrick had Lady Lou out and attacking from first-over and the pace began to quicken with a three-quarter clocking in 1:21.4. Priceless was able to put away Lady Lou but Reflect With Me was winding up in the pocket. McCarthy found late racing room and the top two fillies were matching strides down the lane. Using a: 26.1 final quarter, Reflect With Me was able to stick a head in front of a very game Priceless to get the win.

Genie Rockwell and Marlin Fry utilized a ground-saving trip to get up for third. Sent off at odds of 1-5, Reflect With Me returned \$2.60 to her backers at the betting windows.

"I respect Priceless a lot and knew we wanted to stay close to her," McCarthy said after the victory. "I was hoping for room in the stretch. This filly is so speedy; she'll sit you back in your seat when you ask her to go.

"She's got extreme speed. She just wants to win."

With the win, the 2019 Breeders Crown winnerremains undefeated in three starts to kick-off her sophomore campaign. For her career, Reflect With Me has won eight of 14 races, missed the board only once, and amassed \$625,122. Trained by Tony Alagna, the daughter of Captaintreacherous—Remember When is owned in partnership by Brittany Farms LLC and Bradley Grant. Brittany Farms also bred the filly. Reflect With Me was sold for \$120,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale as hip #1.

Plainridge Park plays host to the sport's top mares today on Spirit Sunday

Atlanta and Manchego square off in the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot; Shartin N looking to defend her crown in the \$100,000 Clara Barton.

When the Grand Circuit makes its midsummer stop in Massachusetts this afternoon (July 26), the top three older mares currently competing in the sport — all multi-millionaires — will be on hand to compete in the \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts Trot and \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace at Plainridge Park. Post time is 2 p.m.

The much-anticipated third round of the year between **Atlanta** and **Manchego** will take place in the Spirit and little separates the two coming into the race with each claiming one win in head-to-head competition.

In their first meeting in the \$40,000 Ms. Versatility at the Meadowlands on June 19, Atlanta and Manchego got away third and fifth respectively before Yannick Gingras pulled Atlanta and Dexter Dunn followed with Manchego. Atlanta cleared past the quarter and Manchego took control from her by the half.

The pair remained one-two until they hit the stretch when Gingras tipped Atlanta and methodically gained ground on Manchego as both drivers heavily urged their mounts. When they hit the wire they were side by side and it took a photo to separate them by a nose, with Manchego getting the nod in 1:50. The win time is the fastest trotting mile of the year to this point.

The second meeting came two weeks later on July 4 in the \$170,900 Cutler Memorial, also at M1. Atlanta and Manchego both gunned the gate and sprinted away in tandem from the field of 11 to a very hot first quarter of :25.4. Manchego was finally able to clear at that point but Atalanta was right on her back.

Chin Chin Hall (Brian Sears) engaged Manchego past the half and pushed her through a 1:23.1 third quarter and around the far turn. Atlanta, who was sitting in the pocket, was able to get out at the top of the lane and tip three-deep turning for home. Atlanta drew even with Manchego in deep stretch and eventually was able to run her down at the wire to win by only 1/2 length in 1:50.1. That time is the second fastest trotting mile of the year (tied with Guardian Angel As).

Despite this marquee match-up, the 2020 Spirit Trot field has other very strong competitors who can definitely have an effect on the outcome of the race, making this a very bettable event.

Lindy The Great (Andy Miller) has yet to win this year but has suffered bad luck in the draws with two consecutive eight holes, forcing him into two hellacious overland trips. However, he has still performed outstandingly despite those disadvantages, finishing second and third in those races. In the Cutler he was beaten only 1-1/4 lengths by Atalanta and

Manchego after being parked out the entire mile.

Manchego's stablemate **Eurobond** (Tim Tetrick) is coming off a powerful 1:51.2 win at Harrah's Philadelphia on July 5 and seems to be peaking at the right time for this race. He has a lifetime best outing of 1:50.1 last year at the Meadowlands and clearly has the ability to contend with these

Joey Bats (Andrew McCarthy) could be a big sleeper here after finishing only 2-3/4 lengths behind the favorites in the Cutler. He had a favorable draw (post one) and McCarthy has already pulled an upset in this stake when he followed fast fractions and snuck up the inside to win 2017 Spirit with JL Cruze at 60-1.

Shartin N will make her second trip to the Commonwealth to defend her crown after she won the inaugural Barton in 2019. In that race, Tim Tetrick put Shartin N on the point and went gate to wire, uncontested and under a strong hold to win in 1:49.1, smashing the all-time Plainridge track record.

This year, Shartin N started out winning two straight and taking an early season's mark of 1:50 at Dover Downs before being sidelined with a foot injury. After 18 days off she returned to the Meadowlands on July 18 in the \$172,850 Dorothy Haughton Memorial and put in a huge effort, falling short by only a neck.

In a first-over trip engaging the front-running **Kissin In The Sand** (Yannick Gingras), Shartin N took the lead in mid-stretch but tired in the final strides to finish second behind Major Occasion (Dexter Dunn) who rallied gamely up the pylons. With that start under her belt, she remains the horse to beat on Sunday and Tetrick will have her on her toes.

Kissin In The Sand was pushed extremely hard every step of the mile in that Haughton start and still tired only late. In her first outing of 2020 she scorched the Meadowlands, going gate to wire in a lifetime best 1:47.4, which is also the fastest pacing mile of the year to date.

Shartin N's stablemate **Soho Burning Love A** (Jordan Stratton) won back-to-back races in 1:48.4 and 1:48.1 before finishing third in the Haughton, right between the two morning line favorites. This mare has paced home in :25.4 three times this year and will be in a position to upset.

Another mare to watch is **Trillions Hanover** (George Brennan) who has also exhibited great closing speed. With four solid races in her last four starts, there is not much separating her from the favorites at the end of the day with a favorable trip.

Kissin In The Sand, Soho Burning Love A and Trillions Hanover will give Shartin N all she can handle in this six-horse field.

The all-time track record on the trot at Plainridge Park is 1:51.3 set by JL Cruze and 1:49.1 on the pace by Shartin N. Both marks look to be under assault on Sunday.

Post time for the Clara Barton Pace is 3:20 p.m. and the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot is 3:40 p.m.

Thankful and Ferrari B.R. best in Norway

Öystein Tjomsland is well known for being one of the best trainers in northern Europe in terms of training cold blood trotters, but on Saturday afternoon (July 25), he also showed that he can produce stakes winners among standardbred horses.

His trainee **Thankful** (Muscle Hill—Peaceful Way) won the \$32,400 Norwegian Championship for mares, paired with Tom Erik Solberg, after a third over trip. The duo disarmed front-runners Madelen L.T.C. and Miracle Tile over the home stretch and came home in mile rate 1:55.3 over 1.3 miles.

Per Oleg Midtfjeld's **Ferrari B.R.** (Muscles Yankee) took a safe and slow start in \$32,400 Norwegian Championship and found third over, a spot that Midtfjeld left for position first over with two laps to go in the 1.6 miles long race.

With 5/8ths of a mile left, Midtfjeld defended his position outside of leader Gretzky B.R. when Evil Enok M.E. was sent three wide and at the back stretch, Ferrari B.R. started to put heavy pressure on the leader. Gretzky B.R. capitulated and Ferrari B.R. held his neck ahead of strong finisher Kick Off Classic at the wire. The title defender in the race won in mile rate 1:57.4.

Drole de Jet second best in France?

Pierre Vercruysse has really put his 7-year-old Coktail Jet son Drole de Jet in perfect shape during the summer. In the \$97,000 Prix de Washington mile race at Enghien racetrack in Paris on Saturday afternoon, Vercruysse managed to send his colt to the front from post 1 when quick starter Billie de Montfort was on the outside when the car accelerated from the field.



CHICK HERE Drole de Jet got himself a couple of lengths advantage over the long home stretch of Enghien and managed to claim the victory in 1:52.2.

Drole de Jet was early invited to \$450,000 Åby Stora Pris in Sweden in mid-August, but now it seems like Vercruysse has other plans for his star trotter.

"First we go to Grand Prix du Departement des Alpes-Maritimes and then the Lotteria in Naples, Italy," Vercruysse toldf French media after the race at Enghien.

Drole de Jet finished second to Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) in Prix Réné Balliere at Vincennes on June 21 and noted a mile rate of 1:51.4 over 1.3 miles that day. A 1:52 victory in a mile race in La Capelle followed and few other French horses have shown better form than Drole de Jet this summer.

Jenny Melander – Trainer

The fact that her parents were both allergic to animals didn't deter 7-year-old Jenny Melander from pursuing her love of horses.

"After a couple of pony rides at my cousin's farm, I was hooked," she said. "They also owned racehorses and that's when my interest in the sport took off."

Growing up in the northern part of Sweden, Melander worked for an old-time trainer named Gunnar Melander.

"Gunnar was no relation to me, for the name Melander is a

common one in Sweden. In fact, one of the sport's top trainers, Marcus Melander, is also not related.

"Working for Gunnar, I learned a lot for he was a great horseman."

When she was 23, Melander ventured to the land of opportunity — America — and got a job working for trainer Per Eriksson and remained there for several years before he returned to Sweden.

"I married trainer Jonas Czernyson and for a few years we ran a stable together. After our divorce I returned to school to get my education as an educational teacher.

"After graduation I worked for trainers Erv Miller and Mark Harder as a second trainer, which ignited my interest in taking the lines and starting my own stable.

"Today, I run a stable of 23 horses with my husband, Marty Noonan. We are stabled at Wingate Farm located in Wind Gap, Pennsylvania.

"I train both trotters and pacers; however, there are a lot more trotters than pacers in my barn. Our stable consists of condition racehorses and 2- and 3-year-olds: one pacer and 22 trotters.

"Several are: **Captain Krupnick**, a 4-year-old son of Conway Hall who has won three of his last four starts, including a 10-length win at The Meadows in a personal best of 1:54; **Bella Ava**, a 4-year-old Conway Hall daughter who has won her last two starts at Pocono Downs; **Bully Boy**, an Ohio-bred 4-year-old who has won his first three starts after acquiring him last winter, and **Beyond Ordinary**, a Canadian-bred 3-year-old who posted a recent lifetime best at Pocono in 1:55.4.

"My all-time best horse was a Swan For All colt named **All On Black,** who won six out of eight races as a 2-year-old. He was Indiana's 2-year-old champion for trotters and victorious in the final.

"We recently retired him on our farm where unfortunately he had a tragic paddock accident and succumbed to his injuries.

"My favorite horse is **Wisenheimer**. The old boy is now 11 years old, still racing and loves his job. He has had my back through the years and helped me develop my stable.

"Twice he broke down with two fractured coffin bones and this past winter he coliced and had to have surgery and is extremely lucky to have survived.

"My husband, Marty, came from Australia where he bred and raised racehorses. Although his passion lies there, in America the breeding costs are steep and so much can happen before the horse even makes it to the races. "Thus, every year we go to the sale and buy a few yearlings hoping, like all horsemen, of one day winning a Breeders Crown or Hambletonian. But we rarely even stake to those races for stake payments are high and don't usually buy that caliber of horses. But we keep hoping and dreaming like all horsemen.

"Our horses race mostly at Pocono and Harrah's Philadelphia, but we also travel to the Meadowlands, Yonkers, Tioga and the Meadows. If we have any stake horses we go to all the New York tracks.

"Last year we raced a few times in Canada and for a couple of years we traveled to Indiana to the Sire Stakes.

"As far as which driver we use, it is hard to find one that will stick with our horses as we operate a fairly small operation, but generally we use Marcus Miller, Jim Morrill or George Napolitano, who do a super job.

"At one time we owned a broodmare and raised our own babies, but unfortunately, we didn't have much success in that area. But training a baby and developing it into a nice horse is very rewarding and if it's one you bred, of course it's even a greater feeling. Maybe one day we'll have a few mares again."

The daughter of Royalty For Life— Dewdle All Day made a second-quarter move to the lead from third and got sensible fractions of 1:00.3 and 1:30.1 before trotting home in :27.4 to win by 3 ¼ lengths.

Serenity Joy finished second, while Spruce Creek was third.

You Will Be Queen is a homebred for Dustin Jones Stables Inc. and Hebert Horses Inc. She is now is undefeated in two starts. Her career-debut was strong 1:59 victory in an OSS Grassroots on July 13 at Mohawk Park.

A \$2 win ticket on You Will Be Queen returned \$6.50.

The Millard Farms and Pure Ivory Series will take next week off before resuming on Aug. 6.

Going, going, gone?

"Online auctions could well be the wave of the future," said my pal as we drove down a country road on the way to a farm to inspect a yearling that may, or may not, go through a sales ring this fall.

I sighed, "Online won't be the same."

"The future never is. Who knows how the virus will play out? Everyone, in every business, is going along trying to do business as usual. It's not."

"In the old world, I had tickets for a ballgame tonight. Instead, I have a mask fitting."

"This is all so surreal. You may never attend another live yearling auction."

"That would hurt. Auctions are like going to the corner bar, or a ballgame, or a reunion with your friends. A couple of days with nice folks, punching shoulders, throwing barbs, slinging bull, gossip, dreams, horses, and free snacks. Everything that makes life worth living."

"A good part of Trey's world?"

"Yeah, I enjoyed sitting in the audience with my catalog, writing down my guess on the final number, and listening to the auctioneers chant. I'd take a break to wander around and look at the horses, and then go outside for a joint, careful not

to get too stoned and find myself the highest bidder."

"You've been in the sport for what, 15 years. How many yearlings did you buy at in-person auctions?"

"Me, none. I can't take the heat. My partner did the physical bidding. When a horse on our 'possible' list headed into the ring, I headed for a corner where I could hear the auctioneer. I'll never forget those days curled up in a fetal ball, listening for the hammer to fall and praying the number is lower than our absolute upper number, which my pal has occasionally found flexible. Then, waiting for him to emerge, my heart fluttering faster than a hummingbird's, and give me a thumbs up or down. Ahh, that was living, my friend."

"Trey? Fainthearted? Hiding in a corner?"

"Bidding on a yearling is intense when you're not sure you can scrape up the turnpike toll fees home. In my opinion, having your kind of money would take all the fun out of the experience."

David chuckled, 'You think bidding on a yearling is pressure? In 500 BC,in Babylonia, wives were sold at auctions. The auctions began with the woman the auctioneer considered to be the most beautiful and progressed to the least. It was illegal to allow a daughter sold outside of the auction method."

I gave a small whistle, "And people bitch about Tinder."

He said, "The Latin word auction derives from the phrase augeō, which means 'I increase' or 'I augment'.

I blew him a raspberry and said, "The English phrase for a sentence like that is: Who cares?"

"Do you know that there are several types of auctions?"

I sighed, "I know that you know, and I know that you are going to tell me."

He did. "An **English auction** is the one you know from the horse sales where a seller sets the price, there is a time limit, and bidders are encouraged to bid on the item. The highest bidder wins. A **Dutch auction** is the reverse of an English auction. The price begins high and is lowered until a buyer



finally bids.

I nodded, "The Dutch thing is kind of cool. Like Russian roulette, you pull the trigger once and boom."

He droned on, "Then you have the **Japanese auction**. An initial price is displayed. It either starts from zero or whatever the sellers' reserve price is. Buyers are all invited into the bidding area where the displayed price steadily continues to climb. Bidders leave the stage when they feel bids are too high. The auction ends when a single buyer is remaining."

"That sounds a tad like musical chairs, you know, the last man standing. Is every type of auction named after a country?" I asked.

"Nope. The Vickrey Auction got its name from William Vickrey, winner of the 1996 Nobel Prize in Economics. This one is complicated, and it's also known as a second-price auction. Sealed bids are submitted. When opened, the item is awarded to the highest bidder BUT at a price equal to the second-highest bidder's price. For example, five bids are opened on a yearling: one for \$100,000, one for \$90,000, one for \$70,000, one for \$57,000 and one for \$45,000. The winner will be the \$100,000 bidder. However, and this is cool, the winner will only have to pay \$90,000, the second-highest bidder's price. Now in a Chinese auction..."

"Whoa, whoa, that's enough auction education for one day. Those all sound like more fun than an online auction."

"The social thing again?"

I sighed, "Yeah, it's not easy to explain to civilians, but leaving a live auction after signing the ticket for a yearling, to me, that is as close as you can get to buying a dream. The next few days are a buzz. Every single one of us signing a ticket KNOWS, this is the ONE."

He said, "It could be interesting seeing what new methods breeders design to sell yearlings."

"It is going to be hard to replace being in the arena. If I could bottle that feeling of walking out of the sale with the yearling you want at a lower price than you thought you would pay, the market share for yearlings could grow. That happy feeling at a live sale makes getting new folks involved a much simpler task. Filling the void with online auctions, virtual inspections, third parties, or other types of sales will change things."

He said softly, "The world turns," I nodded, "I'll miss the buzz."

Indiana-sired two-year-old pacing colts and geldings were the featured attraction at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Thursday (July 23) as the evening's 14-race card was highlighted by four divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes for the freshman pacers. **Rogers Image** and John DeLong stole the show after they recorded a national season's record for 2-year-old pacing colts with a 1:51.2 clocking in the first division. It was also a good night for trainer Brian Brown who teamed up with leading driver Trace Tetrick to score two wins in stakes action.

Rogers Image opened up the stakes action in a big way when he paced to a 1:51.2 winning mile in the opening division and scored his maiden breaking win in fashion. Delong allowed Roger's Image to settle off the gate and found a spot along the rail in seventh. When the field straightened away down the backside, DeLong decided it was time to move and Rogers Image quickly ranged up to grab command. Employing a :27.1 final quarter, Rogers Image got the win by nearly a length over JK Going West and LeWayne Miller.

Trained by Ron Burke, the son of Rockin Image—Remi's Rocket recorded his first win of the season from two outs. Rogers Image increased his lifetime bankroll to \$13,750 for his ownership partnership of Burke Racing, J&T Silva, Purnel & Libby, Ras Racing, and Weaver Bruscemi.

Trainer Brian Brown sent out his first winner of the evening in the second division of the ISS action as **What's Your Beef** utilized a sharp gate to wire effort to score in 1:51.4. With Trace Tetrick in the bike, What's Your Beef scored his third straight win and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Leaving from post four, What's Your Beef grabbed the lead through the opening panel in :27.4 and went on to dictate middle fractions of :56.4 and 1:24.4. Using a :27.0 final panel, What's Your Beef was able to hold off a late surge from Virgo

and LeWayne Miller to get the win.

The son of JK Endofanera—Kats Treasure is now three-for-three in his young career. What's Your Beef pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$22,500 for owners W. Donovan, J. Sbrocco, K. Nichols, and Jaf Racing.

PBR Street Gang tallied the second win for Team Brown after he scored his maiden breaking win in the third division of the stakes action with Tetrick in the bike. PBR Street Gang left just enough to grab a pocket seat and waited patiently to make his move late in the lane. Tetrick tipped PBR Street Gang from behind the leader and he used the long Hoosier Park homestretch to his advantage to get the win in 1:52.2.

The son of JK Endofanera—Love You Always scored the first win of his career from two lifetime outs. With the win, PBR Street Gang increased his lifetime purse earnings to \$11,850 for owners Country Club Acres, J Sbrocco, M. Leeman, and L&H Mgmt Services.

Madeline's Blk Jack played the role of favorite and looked every bit the part of a 1-5 shot scoring in his split of the stakes action. With Ricky Macomber Jr. in the bike, Madeline's Blk Jack made his game winning move down the backside and never looked back. Using a :26.3 closing kick, Madeline's Blk Jack coasted to the wire under a hand drive from Macomber and finished five lengths in front of his competition.

With the win, the son of JK Endofanera—Honey's Luck remains undefeated in two starts. The 1:52.2 clocking established a new lifetime best for the colt. Madelines Blk Jack is owned by Madeline Farms and trained by Jamie Macomber.

Two-year-old pacing fillies battle in Ohio Sires Stakes

Summer Touch left no doubt she was much the best in the first of three \$40,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) for 2-year-old pacing fillies on a steamy Friday night (July 24) at Scioto Downs.

Trained by Ronnie Burke, the daughter of Well Said—Real Touch paced through fractions of :27.3, :57.2 and 1:26.2 before stopping the timer in 1:54.2 for driver Chris Page, who notched his 81stvictory of the summer meet at Scioto Downs. Summer Touch, the 7-5 choice, had finished second to Leave Her Wild in Leg One of the four-round series. Leave Her Wild (Mike Wilder) finished second to Summer Touch at 8-5, with She Knows It All (Brett Miller) third at 18-1. The

homebred Summer Touch, who is owned by Burke Racing, Knox Services, Slaughter Racing and Weaver Bruscemi, now has \$30,000 in career earnings.

Sentimental stole the second OHSS filly division for driver Tyler Smith and trainer John Ackley in a new lifetime mark of 1:53.2. The daughter of The Panderosa—Downwyn Kate was bred by Marvin Raber and is owned by the CT Stables of Washington Court House, Ohio. It was her second victory in this series, as she captured her Leg One in 1:56.1. and now has \$43,750 in career earnings. The gutsy 25-1 longshot Don't Trip was second with owner/trainer/driver Ronnie Gillespie in the sulky, with even money favorite Lady Arthur (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) third.

Rainy Day Chic made her Ohio Sires Stakes debut a winning one for owner Marjorie Polhamus, stopping the timer in 1:54.1 with driver Brett Miller at the lines. Trained by Dan O'Mara, the daughter of Rockin Amadeus—Fritzie Chic made every post a winning one and pushed her career earnings to \$31,781 with her third career triumph as the 5-1 choice. Free Thinker, the 1-1 favorite, was second for Chris Page, while 10-1 longshot Lady Sconset was third for Mike Wilder.

Altar, Southwind Tyrion score in NJSS at Big M

They might have taken different paths to get there, but **Altar** and **Southwind Tyrion** both found their way to the winner's circle in a pair of \$160,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes finals on Friday (July 24) at The Meadowlands.

Altar, a daughter of Muscle Hill—Swan Hot Mama, led at every call in taking the 2-year-old filly trot for driver Dave Miller and trainer Per Engblom. After heading to the gate as the 4-5 public choice, Miller urged Altar to the top and never surrendered the lead in a thoroughly dominant performance, hitting the wire 2¾ lengths in front of Material Girl in a lifetime-best equaling 1:54.4. Presto finished third.

"I actually wanted to get out of there and get on Yannick's [Gingras, driving Presto] back," said Miller. "I thought that would be better. She finished real strong."

After hitting the half in a rated :58, Altar accelerated and opened up 2½ on the field at three-quarters and had no anxious moments from there. "Not particularly," said Miller when asked if he intentionally sped clear of the field. "She was so relaxed, I did chirp to her on the far turn, and she did everything on her own from there."

Altar returned \$3.60 to her backers, and now has two wins in three lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$92,500 for owners Diamond Creek Racing.

In the 2-year-old colt and gelding trot, the Ake Svanstedt trained and driven Southwind Tyrion stayed perfect in two lifetime outings after scoring in a lifetime-best 1:54 coming from off the pace.

The son of Muscle Hill—Taylor Jean was pushed wide into the first turn and took back to mid-pack before emerging from the five-hole approaching the half, flushing cover from Mon Amour, who was looking for a three-race Sire Stakes sweep.

Miller and Heartbreak Hill were sailing along on the lead at three-quarters but brought little from there. After tipping off his cover, Southwind Tyrion exploded home in :27 to record a 3-length win over Locatelli, who did well from post 10 as the 2-1 favorite. Spy Booth grabbed the show dough.

Southwind Tyrion, who returned \$16.40 as the fifth choice in the wagering, now has earnings of \$92,500 for owners S R F Stable and Ake Svanstedt Inc.

STAYING PERFECT: A pair of \$96,000 NJSS Finals for 2-year-old pacers were contested before the betting card, with both winners completing three-race sweeps after taking both of their respective preliminary legs.

First up was **Anna Jeans** (Great Vintage—Early Go Hanover), who won the filly event in 2:05.2 for driver Jason Thompson and trainer John Urbanski. **Fika Time** (a Sunfire Blue Chip—Raiders Favorite gelding) stopped the clock in a lifetime-best 1:55.4 in the division for colts and geldings for Tim Tetrick and Chase Vandervort.

There were also a pair of New Jersey Breeders Maturity events for 4-year-old pacers, the first of which – for horses and geldings – went to **Hurrikane Emperor** in 1:50. The son of Hurrikane Kingcole—Hurrikane Schmumma, the fastest horse in the sport this year by virtue of his 1:47 clocking in the Graduate on July 11, was piloted by Mark MacDonald for John McDermott.

A Beach Cowgirl (Somebeachsomewhere—Limestone Cowgirl) established her lifetime best of 1:50 in holding off JK American Beauty by a half-length for Dexter Dunn and Annie Stoebe in the division for mares.

A LITTLE MORE: 2016 Hambletonian champion Marion Marauder won the overnight feature – a high-end conditioned trot – in a lifetime-best 1:50.2... Miller led all drivers with four wins on the card... Betting surpassed the \$2.5-million mark for the 29thtime in 35 Big M programs this year, as a total of \$2,759,620 was pushed through the

windows, including \$100,394 of action in the 50-cent Late Pick-4... Racing resumes Saturday at 7:15 p.m.

Sister Said won by a neck in 1:55.3, beating Bearcreekhoney and Kurt Sugg and Finesse with Ryan Stahl.

Well N Down (Well Said—DJ Cameo) with Anthony MacDonald for Jason McGinnis roared down the stretch rallying from sixth place to win by a head in 1:56.1. Clara Lou with Tyler Smith was second and the favorite Odds On Buckeyes with Chris Page was third.

Merriman had a hat trick on the night in the Stallion Series as he guided the Brian Brown trained **Lovely Munro** to victory in 1:55.1. The daughter of McArdle—Modern Connection sat second and got up at the wire for the victory, edging out the favorite Apple Soozy and Tyler Smith. Diamond Official and Josh Sutton finished third.

Pompatuse Of Love (Mr Wiggles—Big Time Blaire) gave Dan Noble his second win of the night in the BSS. Trained by Kim Dailey, Pompatuse of Love took the lead at the half and never looked back, winning in 1:55.1. Reachthruthesky AS and Tyler Smith was second. Merriman guided Sand Fantasy to a third-place finish.

Roy delivers Grassroots hat trick as pacing colts sizzle at Mohawk

Delightful Terror kicked off the second leg of the 3-year-old pacing colt Grassroots Series in impressive fashion on Friday (July 24), circling Woodbine Mohawk Park in a personal best 1:49.3.

In rein to Louis-Philippe Roy, Delightful Terror got away sixth from Post 7, tucking in behind fan favorite
Bettorbuckleup as Messier Seelster led the field of nine to a sharp :25.2 opening quarter. Taking over the lead, Sunshine
List maintained the brisk tempo through the :53.1 half while
Delightful Terror started to advance up the outer lane behind
Bettorbuckleup. Bettorbuckleup had a head in front of
Sunshine List at the 1:22 three-quarters, but when Roy asked
Delightful Terror for another gear the colt unleashed his
trademark finishing kick and sprinted home to a two and
one-quarter length victory. Bettorbuckleup settled for third
and Bettor In Cash also closed well to be third.

"He was great tonight. I knew he was sitting on a big effort, because he has been racing well against tougher competition," said trainer Shawn Steacy. "A hot pace to chase helped, but he put in a very good effort."

The win was the first of the sophomore campaign for Delightful Terror, who finished third to Bettorbuckleup in the June 27 Grassroots season opener at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The Bettors Delight son, who was also a Grassroots winner at 2, is owned by Shelly and Robert MacMillan of Waterloo, breeder Doug Millard Farms of Woodstock and Vivian Bell of St. Thomas, ON.

The win was the first of three for Roy on the Grassroots program. The Guelph resident was back in the winner's circle after the second and sixth divisions.

In the second, split the reinsman put heavy favorite **Twin B Frenchtoast** on the front from Post 2 and never looked back, rolling through fractions of :27.2, :56.1 and 1:24 on the way to a 1:51.2 victory. Delightful Terror's stablemate Truffle Dog was three and one-half lengths back second and My Bettors Del completed the top three.

Richard Moreau conditions Twin B Frenchtoast for William Wood of Denton, MD, William Dittmar, Jr. of Langhorne, PA, Stephen Iaquinta of Havertown, PA and Toby Rekoon of Westfield, NJ. Friday's victory was the Sunshine Beach colt's fourth of 2020 and his first in Ontario Sires Stakes action.

Roy completed the Grassroots hat trick with a front end effort aboard **YS Mathis** in the last \$23,150 division. The pair took control heading by the :27.1 quarter, rang up a :56 half and a 1:23.2 three-quarters, and then held off Sundown Kid and fan favorite Mayhem Hanover in the stretch for a neck victory in 1:51.

Moreau also trains Sportswriter son YS Mathis for owner/breeder Yves Sarrazin of La Presentation, QC. YS Mathis, a two-time winner at the Gold Series level as a 2-year-old, earned his first win of the sophomore season in the June 27 Grassroots event.

"All three are good Grassroots horses. They're really nice colts. It shows how deep the three-year-old pacing colt division is this year. I couldn't tell you which one of the three is the best right now," said Roy of his Grassroots winners. "This division will probably bring us a nice competitive race when it comes time for the Finals."

Driver Jody Jamieson recorded a Grassroots driving double, guiding **Sports Obsession** and **Cold Creek Cabo** to wins in the fourth and fifth divisions.

Sports Obsession, also a Gold Series competitor at 2, went gate-to-wire from Post 6, hitting the wire in a personal best 1:51.3. Bettor At Hightide finished four and one-quarter lengths behind the fan favorite and Illbewatchingu was third.

"He's sort of a hard luck three-year-old," said Jamieson,

whose wife Stephanie Jamieson trains the Sportswriter son for Carl Jamieson of Puslinch, ON and George Harrison of Wanes Walton, England. "He's big and strong, but he just couldn't go with the Gold colts this year. The Grassroots helped tonight as he got it his own way and jogged, really."

In the fifth division Jamieson left smartly with Cold Creek Cabo from Post 4 and led the field to a :26.4 quarter, then yielded to fan favorite Mack, content to sit in the pocket through a :55.2 half and a 1:23.3 three-quarters. In the stretch Jamieson gave the Dali gelding a clear look at the finish and Cold Creek Cabo kicked home to a one-half length win in 1:51.4. Mack settled for second and Day Delight was third.

"He just got a great trip and turned it into a win," said Moffat resident Jamieson. "He's a real green colt, but he knows where the wire is."

The win was Cold Creek Cabo's first, in just his fifth lifetime start. William Slack trains the youngster for breeder Daniel Walker and Debora Stokes of Grafton, ON.

The other division went to **The Wild Card** and driver Doug McNair who went gate-to-wire in 1:52.2 for trainer Dr. Ian Moore of Cambridge, ON and his co-owners R G McGroup Ltd. of Bathurst, NB and Serge Savard of St-Bruno, QC. Gonnahaveonemore and Lous Delight finished three and one-half lengths back in second and third.

The win was The Wild Card's second in Grassroots action, putting him in a tie for top spot in the division point standings with YS Mathis. The next opportunity for the three-year-old pacing colts to pad their Grassroots point tally comes August 16 at Rideau Carleton Raceway.

Rideau Carleton Raceway fans will be treated to a full slate of 3-year-old trotting fillies this Sunday, July 26 as the Ottawa oval kicks off its 2020 Ontario Sires Stakes season.

The fillies will compete in three \$71,000-plus Gold Series divisions, five \$22,000-plus Grassroots divisions and a single \$7,500 Prospect Series division. Top Gold Series filly Warrawee Vicky, who was developed at Rideau Carleton Raceway by Metcalfe, ON resident Robbie Robinson, makes her return to the Ottawa oval in the second Gold Series division.

"She seems to be coming into the race in good form. She qualified last week (July 17) just to tighten her up," said Scott McEneny, who trains the Royalty For Life daughter for owner Brad Grant of Milton, ON. "It looks like a tough division, but she should be one of the tough ones. We'll be hoping for a good trip."

Warrawee Vicky and driver Doug McNair will line up at Post 2 in the \$71,467 test, looking for their second Gold Series win of the season. They face a field of five, including GP Dreamin, who was also a winner in the July 2 Gold Series opener at Woodbine Mohawk Park and is undefeated in four starts this season.

Lansdowne native Shawn Steacy will start two fillies in Grassroots action, including division co-leader Moana, who gets Post 4 in the last \$22,800 Grassroots split.

"I think Moana should be very good and competitive, especially with the four-hole there, the way she raced in Clinton," said Steacy. "We had a little sickness go through the barn last week, but I think it's basically all over. Moana had a little bit of a temperature coming out of the race last time, but she seems to be 100 per cent healthy now, so I think she should be good."

Moana and driver James MacDonald scored a 1:59.2 victory from the outside Post 7 at Clinton Raceway on July 5. A three-time winner in the Grassroots program last season, the Muscle Mass daughter is owned by Landmark 12 Racing Stable of Lansdowne, 1187422 Ontario Inc. of Ottawa, ON and Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. of Hudson, QC.

Stablemate Cute Accountant also gets Post 4 in the third \$23,150 Grassroots division and Steacy is hoping the Archangel daughter can finally put together a successful start for owners Landmark 12 Racing Stable, 1187422 Ontario Inc. and Stephen Klunowski of North York, ON.

"She has just as much speed as Moana, and any normal horse in the Grassroots, but she just can't keep herself together," said the trainer. "She's probably left more wins on the table this year than just about any other horse."

MacDonald will also steer Cute Accountant, who made a break and finished fifth in the Grassroots season opener. Both fillies will arrive in the Ottawa area on Friday, shipping back to the Steacy's Lansdowne farm, where they learned their early lessons.

"We trained them at the farm here, at the First Line farm, yesterday (Wednesday), trained them around 2:02, and we're sending them back to our home farm tomorrow (Friday) where they're just going to jog and rest before the race on Sunday," said Steacy. "We have a full good facility there that

we're able to use where other people have to truck in the day before or day of, whatever they do, and ours will get home and relax a little bit."

Although Ottawa harness racing fans will not be able to watch the fillies compete in person, a downloadable **program** and **live stream** are available on Rideau Carleton Raceway's website.

In addition to Sunday's slate of Ontario Sires Stakes events, Rideau Carleton Raceway will also host Gold, Grassroots and Prospect Series divisions for the three-year-old pacing colts on Sunday, Aug. 16.

(The other 2:00 mile of the meet was posted by Todd's sometimes-partner and longtime friendly rival Roger Hammer, the owner/trainer/driver of the Delmarvalous sophomore gelding Life's Marvalous, who was home in 1:58.3).

Todd also rang up a PA fair seasonal divisional record with the Donato Hanover 3-year-old filly Chinchilla Hanover, who won in 2:03.2 for owner/son Cody Schadel – in a "B" division of the Fair Sire Stakes.

Todd's brother Tony won three races at Bedford, and all of them had a note of distinction to them. The first was with the baby Father Patrick – Princess Pearl colt Capo Dei Capi (Italian for "boss of bosses"), who lived up to his name by being the first (and still only) horse to win three times at the fairs this year. Owned by Tony and wife/trainer Linda, Capo Dei Capi overcame a trailing post to win in 2:07.1, that time equaling his own and that of Swing Batter Swing as the seasonal divisional mark.

Tony and Linda also combined to send out another local season's leader in the Betting Line—A And Gs Princess 2-year-old pacing filly Southwind Aussi, a winner in 2:02.4.

The third winner for Tony was the fastest trotter of the year so far in this young fair season. The Cantab Hall sophomore colt Libero Hanover went over the Bedford twice-around in 2:01.2, with Tony's (and Todd's) father Bruce the owner and trainer of this quick youngster.

A gorgeous summer afternoon greeted the 2-year-old trotting colts as they arrived at Hiawatha Horse Park on Saturday, July 25 for their second Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots leg and the youngsters celebrated with a track record performance in the first \$23,150 division.

In spite of starting from Post 9, **Fashion Frenzie** was the fans' top choice and the colt rewarded their faith by taking command just after the half and romping home to a 13-length victory in a track record 1:59.4. Test Your Magic finished second and Arch We Lucky was third.

"Yesterday (Friday) I schooled him behind the gate at the farm, just to make sure he was good on the gate, because I wanted to be one of the first guys on the gate with the nine-hole so I wouldn't have to chase it, and it worked out pretty good," said trainer/driver Dustin Jones. "He behaved himself behind the gate, so that was a big thing. He got away good and then I was lucky to get behind the second favourite in the first turn and that helped too."

Fashion Frenzie arrived in the Jones barn just after a July 4 qualifier at Trois-Rivieres, where he learned his early lessons from Francis Richard. The Archangel son made a break in a July 17 qualifier at Woodbine Mohawk Park so Jones made a few shoeing changes and sent the youngster back for a third qualifier on July 21. Fashion Frenzie delivered a flawless 2:00 effort that made the horseman wonder if he should have opted for the Gold Series rather than the Grassroots.

"The last couple weeks he's really changed a lot, getting out in the paddock every day. He was out in the paddock for an hour this morning, he likes his paddock time and he's turning into a pretty nice horse," said Jones. "The young guy that had him in Three Rivers did a heck of a job getting him ready; all I had to do was change his front shoes and put him in to go. They did all the ground work on him, so it made my job a lot easier."

Ferme Auclair of St. Antoine De Tilly, Ecurie Francis Richard Inc. and Georgette Guillemette Inc. of Becancour and Mario Bourgea of Stanbridge East, QC share ownership of Fashion Frenzie, who was a \$7,000 purchase from last fall's London

Selected Yearling Sale.

The second Grassroots split saw **Stonebridge Armour** leave smartly from Post 7 and take control before the half, then cruise home a one-half length winner in 2:01.1. Insanity finished second and Crazy Goodbye was three more lengths back in third.

"He got out of there really good, like I could have blasted him right to the front easily, but I just kind of took my time with him and let things settle," said driver Tyler Moore. "Brett MacDonald was on the front and his (Insanity) looked pretty green so when I come out of the first turn I just tipped him to the outside and away he went. He actually won pretty easy. I didn't have to ask a lot out of him."

Moore engineered the win for trainer Jacques Dupont's Les Ecuries D'Orleans Inc. of Repentigny, Mario Bourgea, Gestion C. Levesque 2005 Inc. of St-Hyacinthe and Marc Camirand of Montreal, QC. The Muscle Mass son, a half-brother to \$1.2 million winner Manofmanymissions, was a \$45,000 acquisition from the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Driver James MacDonald swept the other two divisions, guiding both **Arch Hall** and **Tymal Chrome** to 2:00.4 victories.

Fan favourite Arch Hall left smartly from Post 9 and controlled the pace from start to finish, cruising home a one and one-quarter length winner over Diehard Seelster and All The Trimmings.

"Post 9 would terrify some people, but I wasn't that worried about it for him, he's so good gaited and he's got quick speed. I mean, if it was three-year-old pacing colts, yeah Post 9 is pretty bad, but for a two-year-old trotting colt, everyone has got to be kind of careful, and I don't, you know because he's great gaited and he's very professional," said MacDonald. "So I was able to just get him out of there good and as soon as he settled in on the front he kind of relaxed, and as soon as I need him he had lots more to offer. He's going to be a nice horse all year I think."

MacDonald and Arch Hall were second in the Grassroots season opener at Georgian Downs on July 11, just caught at the wire, and the Guelph, ON resident said the Archangel son had clearly absorbed the lessons he learned in his first outing. St. George, ON resident Blake MacIntosh conditions Arch Hall for his co-owner Hutt Racing Stable of Malvern, PA.

In the final \$23,150 division MacDonald and Tymal Chrome watched Petro Dealin and Daylon Midnight ring up sharp a :28.2 quarter, :59.3 half and 1:29.3 three-quarters and then circled around the tiring leaders and drew away to a one and one-half length. The Wheel and Incredible Hall also circled the pacesetters to be second and third.

"He punched out of there good and there were some big fractions up front, they were moving along pretty good, so when they started to tire I just flipped him out three wide and he was very good," said MacDonald. "He got in a little bit on the last turn, I kind of just had to watch him, and then when he straightened up he took off again.

"I was very fortunate. I had three bomb proof trotters to drive in the Sires Stakes today," said MacDonald, who also piloted Test Your Magic to his runner-up result in the first division. "It makes your job as a driver a lot easier when you only have to focus on your job, and not hanging onto them or holding them together and your job."

Anthony Beaton trains Tymal Chrome for Larry Menary of Branchton, Michael Guerriero of Brampton, ON and George Harrison of Wanes Walton, England, who offered up \$22,000 for the youngster at the Harrisburg Yearling Sale. The Muscle Mass son was third in the Grassroots season opener, finishing one length behind Arch Hall.

The 2-year-old trotting colts will resume their Grassroots rivalry on Monday, Aug. 3 at Dresden Raceway.

Hiawatha Horse Park's record book will face its second threat of the season on Saturday, Aug. 22 when the 2-year-old pacing colts arrive in Sarnia for their third Grassroots leg.

Three of the four favorites in their \$30,000 divisions of the Pennsylvania All-Stars series for 2-year-old pacing fillies were not victorious – but it was the one winning favorite who posted the fastest time.

Among the sophomores, it was the Muscle Massive filly **Miss McKee** who was the speediest with a lifetime best of 1:53, with George Napolitano Jr. keeping her on her toes to let no challenger get by early, in the middle, or late in the race. The sophomore is now 4-for-5 since trainer Jack Baggitt Jr. reintroduced her to trotting hopples, and the equipment switch looks to have worked wonders, to the pleasure of owner J L Sadowsky LLC.

Two of the three favored winners in the trotting stakes are trained by Ron Burke, and both are daughters of Muscle Hill. They are **Sans Defaut**, whose name means "flawless" in French, living up to her moniker while posting a 1:54.1 time

for driver Joe Bongiorno and the ownership of Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Crawford Farms Racing, and J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby; and **Dune Hill**, who snapped home in :28 to complete a 1:55 triumph for driver George Brennan and owner Joseph Di Scala Jr.

The other All-Stars trotting winner was the Explosive Matter miss **Queen Of The Hill**, who made an early move to the lead and went on to lower her mark to 1:54.4 while raising her earnings over \$200,000 for driver Tyler Buter, trainer Per Engblom, and owner Al Libfeld.

Among the baby pacing misses, the Captaintreacherous—Marinade Hanover distaff **Marsala Hanover** lived up to her backing, winning in 1:52.1 as one of three maiden winners. Jason Bartlett set sail with the Linda Toscano trainee, stepping home in :27 to be uncatchable for the Enviro Stables LTD, South Mountain Stables, Little E LLC, and Westminster Road LLC.

The A Rocknroll Dance-Mikayla Rose filly **Dancethenightaway** insisted on the early lead in her division for driver Jim Morrill Jr. and then maintained her advantage to the wire, coming home in :55.2 to complete a 1:52.2 triumph. Trainer Andrew Stafford is also a co-owner of the promising miss with Bonnie Benson, John Johannsen, and Holly Case.

Driver Victor Kirby had bad racing luck behind **Lyons Softassilk** in their event, but the

Somebeachsomewhere – Bettor Than Silk filly showed her mettle in posting a 1:53.3 victory. Forced to tuck in early, Kirby was able to get back outside as the outer tier was the lively one on the turn, then swung wide and coaxed a solid rally from "Softassilk," whose connections, trainer Jim King Jr. and owner Threelyonsracing, also are the force behind last year's two-year-old champion Lyon's Sentinel (who won at The Meadows later in the afternoon).

The only previous winning freshman to triumph before this event was the Sweet Lou-Continual Velocity filly **Continualou**, who followed a Sire Stakes triumph in her last start with a victory here in 1:53, the best of her young career. Joe Bongiorno and Ron Burke again teamed up for a stakes victory with Continualou for Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

Bongiorno and Burke had three overall winners on the card, as did perennial local driving leader George Napolitano Jr., who ends this report as the driver of Another Daily Copy, a Somebeachsomewhere gelding who streaked a mile in 1:48.4, fastest time of the local season. The veteran now has won \$583,658 for trainer Richard Johnson and the ownership of D'Elegance Stable IX, Carmen Iannacone, T L P Stable, and The Gandolfo Stables.

"Fairness" in post draws?

How many of you might like to see the quality of "fairness" applied to each of your post draws?

Seeing a horse draw poorly what seems like week after week has been a pet peeve of mine for a long time. I've had my rants on the subject. But here I'm going to share some thoughts to help us hopefully understand the subject better.

My bottom line premise for this letter is: if we get a "bad" post draw one race; we get a "good" post draw the next race. Period.

Most recently I've "gone bananas" as a result of my

horses most recent three draws since returning to racing at Scioto Downs. My post draws have been 10, 10, and 8. Basically, three "bad" draws in a row. This should never be allowed to happen. It's simply not fair.

But I hear many of you saying right now, "But, sir, things will even out over time." Will they? I'm sorry, but you have no scientific basis for making this statement. There is no guarantee at all that "balance" will be achieved. Your viewpoint falls under what is referred to as the "gamblers fallacy."

Hang in there with me as I take you through just one example using the game of roulette (this comes from a textbook I use in the Investments class I teach at a local community college... Fundamentals of Investments, Eighth Edition, Jordan, Miller and Dolvin):

One way to look at the gambler's fallacy is that because an event has not happened recently, it has become "overdue" and is more likely to occur. People sometimes refer (wrongly) to the "law of averages" in such cases.

Roulette, as some of you know, is a random gambling game where gamblers can make various bets on the spin of the wheel. There are 38 numbers on an American roulette table, 2 green ones, 18 red ones and 18 black ones. One possible bet is to bet whether the spin will result in a red number or in a black number. Suppose a red number has appeared five times in a row. Gamblers will often become confident that the next spin will be black, when the true chance remains at about 50 per cent (of course, it is exactly 18 in 38).

Moving on... Keep hangin' in there with me...

The misconception arises from the human intuition that the overall odds of the wheel must be reflected in a small number of spins. That is, gamblers often become convinced that the wheel is "due" to hit a black number after a series of red numbers. Gamblers do know that the odds of a black number appearing are always unchanged: 18 in 38. But gamblers cannot help but feel that after a long series of red numbers, a black one must appear to restore the "balance" between red and black numbers over time.

Now, if we go back to my three most recent post draws, some might say I'm due to get a better draw. But as the example above shows, there's no scientific evidence that will take place. My next race could very well put me in another bad post position. And it's simply unfair to rely upon luck week after week in determining the post from which my horse will start. But that's our current system.

What can we do to add fairness to our post draws? First, it has to be decided by people far more important than me that fairness must be brought into our post

draws.

I know the USTA is asking for rule changes right now. What I'm describing here is far more than a rule change but rather a change in philosophy on how post draws will be determined.

After it's decided this is important enough to do, we need a computer. Honestly, if I was a computer programmer I'd do this myself for no charge. But I'm not that smart.

And, I'm not so naïve to know there would need to be dozens of variables plugged into the computer program to make this work. But when all is said and done, I would know that one week my post position will be "good," while the next week it will be "bad." Of course, there are varying degrees of good and bad, but you get the idea. We wouldn't be stuck with consecutive races of "bad" posts.

Would this system be perfect? Of course not. Nothing ever is. But it would be far better than the current system.

Raise your hand now if fairness sounds like a good idea?

If you read this far, thanks for your time. And I hope your next post draw is a good one. I'm sure hoping mine is.
