Richard Moreau suspended for alleged EPO positive

The 10-time O'Brien Trainer of the Year in Canada has been suspended indefinitely, but maintains his innocence in a case involving Pepsi North America Cup starter Funtime Bayama. He vows to appeal.

On Monday (July 22) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Richard Moreautrained horses won four of 10 races on the card. The next night all of the trainer's horses were scratched by the judges for an alleged EPO positive on his former trainer Funtime Bayama.

The matter is still being investigated by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO). Moreau told HRU he plans to appeal the decision to the province's independent Horse Racing Appeal Panel (HRAP).

Moreau told HRU on Thursday that he did not want to discuss the case in detail, yet.

"I'm low profile," he said. "I'm working to get out of the problem, but I'm not the kind of guy to post anything too much. I'm sorry, I'll go step by step. I'm dealing with the racing commission and lawyers right now."

On Monday, Fashion Frenzie wired the field in 1:52.2 in the race 2 preferred handicap trot for Louis-Philippe Roy. Mister Magic and driver James MacDonald won race 3, for trotters that had raced for a purse of \$15,000 or less in one of their last three starts, in a seasonal-best 1:53. In race 4, for non-winners of \$14,500 in their last five starts, trotter Stonebridge Bravo and MacDonald beat Moreau stablemate Nasey (driven by Doug McNair) as they finished 1-2 in the 1:53.1 mile. Bella Cavalla won race 8, for trotters who were non-winners of \$8,000

in their last five starts, winning in a new lifetime mark of 1:53 flat for Moreau and MacDonald. Two Moreau horses finished off the board: breaker Gaines Hanover in race 2, and Grateful in race 10.

Although four Moreau trainees were entered to race the following night (Tuesday, July 23) at Mohawk, all four horses were judges' scratches before the start of race 1. Aquinas Hanover (race 1), Bad Eye Bill (race 5), Betterholdontight and Thrilling Times (both race 8) were declared ineligible to start.

The July 23, 2024 AGCO judges' report for Mohawk cited AGCO ruling #2756963, which found that Funtime Bayama, formerly trained by Moreau, had tested positive for the banned substance darbepoetin alfa (DPO) in a June 10, 2024 out-of-competition test. AGCO deputy registrar Katherine Cunningham issued the official ruling.

Described by the AGCO as "a prohibited performance-enhancing non-therapeutic substance which adversely affects the integrity of racing," DPO is sold under the name "Aranesp" for the treatment of anemia in human patients with kidney disease or undergoing chemotherapy. It is also used in veterinary settings, for cats and dogs with anemia due to kidney disease. In the context of harness racing, it is classified as an illegal erythropoietin (EPO) stimulating agent, a long-lasting blood booster with proteins foreign to those naturally occurring in horses. The result can be anemia and death.

The gravity of the matter was evident in the AGCO's immediate full suspension of Moreau, the 10-time O'Brien Trainer of the Year in Canada (2013-2022). The ruling states that "all horses owned wholly or in part, or trained by Moreau, are ineligible to be entered or race, but may be transferred to the care of another trainer approved by the AGCO race officials."

Prior to speaking briefly to HRU on Thursday, Moreau maintained his innocence in a post on Wednesday on his Facebook account.

It read: "Good evening everyone. Simply to say thanks to all who texted me today. Stories change, time pass[es]. For all of you who know me, obviously, I didn't do it but... Life goes on. Thanks for your support."

Funtime Bayama set the 1:50.1 Canadian and Mohawk track record for 2-year-old pacing geldings on Sept. 2, 2023 in Ontario Sires Stakes Gold leg 4 for driver Sylvian Filion, son of the horse's

original breeder, owner, and trainer Yves Filion. Moreau trained Funtime Bayama from his July 7, 2023 Mohawk debut until the gelding was sold to American interests after finishing third in the June 15, 2024 North America Cup final.

Currently owned by William Pollock and Bruce Areman of Freehold, NJ and trainer Andrew Harris of Allentown, NJ, Funtime Bayama finished second to Nijinsky in their July 6 Meadowlands Pace elimination.

The gelding left aggressively for driver Dexter Dunn in the July 13 final, advancing uncovered from fourth to make front by the :26.2 opening quarter. He put up little resistance when eventual winner Legendary Hanover challenged him first-over at the :53.2 half, allowing the colt to clear to the lead. Funtime Bayama pulled the pocket approaching three quarters and even though Dunn pulled the plugs, Funtime Bayama was not advancing. He backed through the field after Yannick Gingras moved Gem Quality off the rail and appeared to hit Funtime Bayama with his wheel.

He finished a distanced last, individually timed in 1:52.4.

On July 13, before the Meadowlands Pace, owner Pollock told interviewer Dave Little about buying Funtime Bayama.

"Andrew Harris tried to talk me out of it, because he's only going to be a fun horse to win races, stand in the winner's circle. After that, he's no use to you. I said, 'That's okay.' My son was in the car with me at the time when I was negotiating. The guy wanted more; we offered less; we met somewhere in the middle, and the guy took it. He's a great horse," said Pollock, adding that he wanted to build "a championship barn."

Moreau had an HRAP hearing on Feb. 6, 2023 concerning a Lasix (furosemide) overage for the disqualified horse Nine Ways. The trainer was fined \$2,000; ordered to return purse money and trainer-driver fees; suspended from Feb. 7-21, 2023, inclusive; and required to complete the AGCO Equine Medication and Awareness Program.

On March 1,2024, Moreau had another HRAP hearing, concerning a Lasix overage in the horse Real Willey, who won on June 19, 2023 at Mohawk. The trainer was fined a total of \$2,500 for positive tests on June 19, 2023 and July 22, 2023. Real Willey was subsequently disqualified from both races, with purse redistribution ordered. Moreau filed an appeal.

The Puslinch, ON-based trainer has only raced one horse in the United States in the last 20 years, finishing seventh at Buffalo Raceway with Emmas Lilly on July 11, 2009 in a New York Sires Stake race. He is the current seasonal leader in the Mohawk trainer standings, with 115 wins from 661 starts this year at the Campbellville, ON track. His trainees have won a combined \$2,275,958 at Mohawk this year.



## Hambletonian horticulture

Superior seeds produce fairer fields.

Thanks to the seeding formula developed and implemented by the Hambletonian

Society, the soonest the highly-anticipated rubber match between 2023's top 2-year-old colts, Karl and T C I, could take place is Saturday (Aug. 3) at The Meadowlands, should both qualify for the Hambletonian final.

As with all sports, no one wants to see what is believed to be the marquee matchup play out before the finals.

It was with just that in mind that in 1997 the Hambletonian Society — more specifically, their then executive vice president Tom Charters — came up with seeding for America's Trotting Classic.

"I have to give Tom Charters credit, he came up with the formula," said Hambletonian Society president/chief executive officer John Campbell. "I take no credit for that whatsoever, but I do feel very strongly that it's better than trying to seed them just by somebody's opinion. It's based on data and sometimes data works out perfectly and sometimes it doesn't."


Campbell was still driving the year the seeding formula was adopted — he won a record fifth Hambletonian the following year with Muscles Yankee and a record-extending sixth with Glidemaster in 2006 — but he still played a part as a voting member of the Society's board.

"It was a board decision at the time," Campbell said. "Tom proposed it and came up with the formula, then presented it to the board and it passed.

"I think he kept it simple enough, but at the same time, made it fair and relevant because everything's weighted in the year of the race."

In simplest terms, the formula assigns points to each contender in the eliminations based on earnings both as a 2-year-old,





tougher, but I can't help that. I'm happy with the [seeding] formula. It's just the way it worked out this year based on the data that was presented to us... data driven is not perfect, but it's better than a random selection where [all the best horses] could have gotten together.

3-year-old, and in their last five starts. Both the last five starts and 3-year-old earnings are weighted twice as much as what was made during a competitor's 2-year-old season.


The conditions for the Hambletonian explain it this way, "For example, if a horse earned \$100,000 as a 2-year-old and \$200,000 as a 3-year-old and \$150,000 in his last five starts, his assigned value would be \$800,000 (\$100,000 + (2 x \$200,000) + (2 x \$150,000) = \$800,000). These earnings would be based on USTA official money earnings at the time of declaration."

Once each of the 20 horses entered this year were assigned a point value by Hambletonian Society staking manager Nadia Tarnawa, she and Campbell went through the field and separated out the contenders. It's no surprise that Karl and T C I both received an "A" ranking and were therefore split up.

"There are two divisions, so there are two As, two Bs, two Cs, two Ds and two Es," Campbell said. "If there's an entry, by trainer or owner, we switch a B for a B or a C for a C. And that's the way we do it.

"And this was just a year when you have a horse like Highland Kismet, who didn't win any money at 2; he still got ranked, but he wouldn't be ranked as highly as what you maybe would have thought the way it works. And Sig Sauer, same thing. He comes back, he wins in 1:50, but he won all his money at 2."

Although viewed by many as the third best in the division behind Karl and T C I, Highland Kismet's point value did not reflect his perceived talent.



"He fell lower than his reputation is right now, put it that way," Campbell said.

Once the top 10 horses are separated into their A through E pairs, a blind draw is used to separate them into their respective races. The remaining 10 horses are then drawn into the fields also employing a blind draw.

"Well, I know that one [field] looks tougher, but I can't help that," Campbell said. "I'm happy with the formula. It's just the way it worked out this year based on the data that was presented to us.

"So again, data driven is not perfect, but it's better than a random selection where they all could have gotten together."

The first Hambletonian elimination (race 9) includes 4-5 morning-line favorite Karl (post 6), Highland Kismet (post 3, 3-1), and Dancer Memorial divisional champs Situationship (post 10, 9-2) and Sig Sauer (post 8, 8-1).

T C I's trainer Ron Burke said he expected fewer horses to drop in, but is happy with where his colt landed.

"I think the three horses that everybody thought were the best [T C I, Highland Kismet and Karl] all didn't race up to their expectations [in the Dancer on July 13]," Burke said. "I think it gave everybody, and rightfully so, hope.

"I think I got the better division and I'm fine with the rail. I don't have any problems."

T C I is the 2-1 favorite on the morning line from post 1 in the second Hambletonian elim (race 11). Also in that race are Zweig champ Dame Good Time (post 7, 3-1) and Secret Agent Man (post 3, 4-1), who won the Tompkins-Geers last weekend.

After the Dancer, Burke had said TCI did not feel like himself.

"That was the first time I've ever warmed him up where I wasn't happy," Burke said. "He wasn't lame. He wasn't anything. He was just eh. And usually when you warm him up, you're like, 'Wow, what a nice horse.' [That night] I was like, eh.

"It was funny, I warmed Chapercraz up the next race; he was vicious and he went out and won and I wasn't surprised because he warmed up like a horse that was ready to win."

Burke trained TCI on Wednesday (July 24) and said he was better.

"The other day when he warmed up, he warmed up flat," Burke said. "I wasn't happy with him. I actually brought him home to my vet here and we did a complete physical and we found some things we didn't know were going on with him.

"He came back [Wednesday] and trained very sharp, definitely better by far than he warmed up that night. So, I expect that he'll be much better."

Burke said the night of the Dancer, T C I wasn't bad, he just wasn't brisk.

"He was just like, one speed and that's not him," Burke said. "So, everybody [Wednesday] that saw him train, they were like, 'Damn, he was good.' And I'm like, 'Yeah, much better.'

"And, I think honestly, if I can get him through this week I'll have him totally ready for the final. Everything will be taken care of."

Even though a horse only has to finish in the top five in each race to qualify for the Hambletonian final, don't expect T C I just to be trying to qualify.

"So, being fifth isn't in my DNA," Burke said. "That ain't my deal. We go to win. I don't go to be fifth.

"And we're going for \$100,000, too. People forget, it's not like we're going for \$3."







#### Karl, T C I lead the way for **Hambletonian** elims

A total of 20 sophomore male trotters were entered in the 99th edition of the Hambletonian, requiring two \$100,000 eliminations. The top-five finishers from each group will advance to the \$1.05 million Hambletonian final Aug. 3. Elim winners draw for post positions 1 through 5 followed by the remaining finalists receiving their posts in an open draw on July 30 at Hogan Equine Clinic in Cream Ridge, NJ.

Karl, rated No. 1 in the Road to the Hambletonian, is the 4-5 morning-line favorite in the first of the two elims and will start from post 6 with driver Yannick Gingras. Joining Karl in the field are Goodtimes Stakes champion Highland Kismet and Stanley Dancer Memorial division winners Sig Sauer and Situationship.

Sig Sauer, Situationship, and Highland Kismet occupy spots 3 through 5, respectively, in the Road to the Hambletonian rankings, which are compiled by Meadowlands announcer/ analyst Ken Warkentin. Highland Kismet is the 3-1 second choice, leaving from post 3 with Bob McClure driving for trainer Mark Etsell. Situationship (9-2) drew post 10 for trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt and Sig Sauer (8-1) will start from post 8 with Andy McCarthy in the sulky for Noel Daley.

T C I, the 2-1 favorite in the second elim, will leave from post 1 with driver David Miller. The field also includes Dr. Harry M. Zweig Memorial champ Dame Good Time, 3-1 from post 7 with Scott Zeron driving for Travis Alexander, and last week's Tompkins-Geers Stakes winner Secret Agent Man, 4-1 with Andy Miller driving for Julie Miller.

Karl and T C I both head to the Hambletonian eliminations off third-place finishes in divisions of the Stanley Dancer Memorial on July 13 at The Big M.


For Karl, the setback snapped an eight-race win streak dating back to October. Karl, the 2023 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter, has won 13 of 15 career races and \$1.22 million for trainer Nancy Takter, who won last year's Hambletonian with Tactical Approach. The colt's victories last year included the Breeders Crown and this season the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship.

T C I, the 2023 O'Brien Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter to compete in Canada, has won 13 of 17 career starts and \$1.36 million for trainer Ron Burke. Last year, the colt's victories included the Mohawk Million, William Wellwood Memorial and Peter Haughton Memorial.

Situationship is one of three Hambletonian hopefuls from the stable of trainer Ake Svanstedt, who is a two-time winner of the sport's top prize for 3-year-old trotters. His other horses in this year's Hambletonian are Amazing Catch and Daiquiri Hanover, both in the second elim.

The Hambletonian is the second jewel in the Trotting Triple Crown, following the MGM Yonkers Trot and ahead of October's Kentucky Futurity. Sir Pinocchio, who won the Yonkers Trot, was not staked to the Hambletonian.

Twenty-three 3-year-old filly trotters were entered in the \$675,000 Hambletonian Oaks, requiring three \$50,000 eliminations. The top-three finishers from each elim plus the fourth-place finisher with the highest lifetime earnings will advance to the \$525,000 final, also Aug. 3 at The Meadowlands.

French Champagne, who won a division of the Delvin Miller Memorial on July 13, is the 2-1 favorite in the first elimination. She will leave from post 1 with Dunn driving for Svanstedt. Soiree Hanover, last year's Dan Patch Award-winning filly, is 3-1. She will start from post 5 with Tim Tetrick driving for Lucas Wallin.

Elista Hanover, who has won nine-consecutive races since opening her season with a third-place finish, is the 6-5 favorite in the second elim. She will start from post 4 with David Miller driving for Annie Stoebe. She counts divisions of the W.N. Reynolds Memorial and Tompkins-Geers Stakes among her victories this year.

Date Night Hanover, who won this year's Zweig Memorial for fillies, is the 5-2 favorite in the third elimination. She will start from post 5 with Dexter Dunn in the sulky for Marcus Melander, who won last year's Hambletonian Oaks with Heaven Hanover. Delvin Miller Memorial division winner R Melina, leaving from post 8 with Todd McCarthy driving for John Butenschoen, is the 3-1 second choice.

#### Antonacci says lessons need to be learned from Massachusetts politicians' attempt to raid racing's funding

Frank M. Antonacci said there is an important lesson people in all horse racing jurisdictions can learn from the recent failed attempt by Massachusetts politicians to severely decrease money that goes into the state's Race Horse Development Fund.

"I hear people talk about marketing of the sport," said Antonacci, a member of the esteemed family behind Lindy Farms and the board member of the Harness Horseman's Association of New England that also acts as the group's government affairs liaison. "And I think what gets lost is, 'Who are we marketing to?' I think part of that has to be a really concerted effort to make sure that we are really speaking to some of the politicians and that they understand... what these tax dollars or incentives are going to support, because we do have a very, very compelling case.

"I've seen government dollars spent on much less effective programs than what I see in the racing and breeding industry in Massachusetts. I think we need to think about, 'How do we really speak to those people?' And, really, just always be in the back of their mind that this is a good use of funding."

Antonacci said recently the horse racing industry in the state nearly had between 50 and 90 per cent of its funding cut.

"The governor's office came out with a budget that slashed the Race Horse Development Fund portion of the funding for racing by like 50 per cent," Antonacci said. "The Senate version came next and it cut it by almost 90 per cent. Then it went into a conference committee and, really, the House of Representatives — mainly, the speaker in the house, the majority leader — did a heck of a job to make sure that they preserve racing.

"The house in Massachusetts really was the biggest proponent of the gaming legislation originally. It really understood the vital nature of the industry and racing in a state at the onset of expanded gaming, and really have been the stewards of the whole industry since then. They did a great job again this year of kind of beating all that back and put that nonsense out of the budget and it stayed in full force. So, it definitely was a win."

The Race Horse Development Fund — which comes from a cut of the tax revenue coming from class one and class two casinos in Massachusetts — is critical to both purses and breed development programs in the state.

"When I went to Boston College and used to race [in Massachusetts], the open would go for \$3,500 or \$3,000 or \$4,000," Antonacci said. "The purse structure was between \$1,500 and \$4,000. It was really, really challenging times for anybody that was racing there. Everybody was just kind of hanging on by a string.

"To see it go from that to a really robust overnight racing program for 100 plus days a year with a very viable purse structure — which hopefully will continue to grow and I believe is competitive — now you really are able to make a living and make investment in the state.

"Then, the breeding industry has really flourished. And I think this last year there was more growth in mares — I think 155 or so broodmares in the state. So, that's grown every year. The breeding program and the Massachusetts Sire Stakes are now very competitive."

Massachusetts offers a dual-eligibility program based on mare residency, not where stallions stand. The program has proven popular in the industry with dual-eligibility yearlings commanding a premium.

"Massachusetts fancies itself as a biotech, academic hub, which are all wonderful things," Antonacci said. "But, the blue collar agrarian jobs that come with our industry are equally, if not more, important, if you want to preserve open space and what I call the New England charm of rural Massachusetts.

"That's kind of the story that I like to tell is that this is a way for those farms and those folks to make a good living and be able to do so and stay in the Commonwealth. So I think that's played well.

"It's actually been pretty neat to see the vet school at UMass is now involved with the breeding program. So that's great. That kind of state involvement for their vet school at UMass is kind of a unique wrinkle. And Tufts vet school, as well. They're involved in the program and, obviously, get customers through the breeding program."

As for the latest attempt to raid funding for horse racing, Antonacci said it's a story others need to heed and learn from — including in Massachusetts.

"I think it was a little bit of a surprise that [the attempt to raid the Fund came] through the budget process," he said. "There wasn't a piece of legislation.

"I think, historically, the Senate has been a little bit challenging to deal with. I want to give them the benefit of doubt that they don't really understand the industry as well as the House members. And I think it's kind of incumbent on us to really try to change that over the next year and coming years to really reach out more proactively to Senate members to let them understand really what a success story racing and breeding in Massachusetts has been."

# Hiawatha Horse Park is a destination for fans of all backgrounds

When Jim Henderson took the reins as owner and operator of Hiawatha Horse Park in 1990, his vision for the Sarnia, ON oval was clear: build a destination for fans of all racing backgrounds.

As the five-eighths-mile track approaches the midway point of its 35th season under Henderson's leadership, the plan remains the same.

"We have a really good crowd," Henderson said. "A bad day is 1,200 people. It's a good mix of young and older people, and it's more of a social crowd.

"Our betting is up quite a bit. Last weekend, we did \$67,000 on our live product, which is really good. I forget what they did on the simulcast, but it's way up too. Overall, it's pretty well double what we used to do on the simulcast."

Hiawatha's 2024 campaign left the gate on May 4 with a 10-race program and will continue to run each Saturday through Sept. 21.

This season has been particularly interesting for Henderson, who has noticed a few new trends as it relates to Hiawatha's weekly crowds.

"There's a lot of young people," Henderson said. "More than I've seen in the last year or two."

The reason? Henderson said harness racing simply offers the perfect balance of affordability and entertainment.

"It's not that expensive for them, either," he said. "We do jumbo hot dogs for two bucks and dollar pop on the first Saturday of every month. If there's five of them in the family, they can go over there for 20 bucks and get 10 hot dogs, taxes included, and away they go to the picnic table.

"Three weeks ago, we had about 4,000 people here for hot dog night."

In addition to the influx of young families, Hiawatha's shot-caller also noted more 20-somethings choosing to spend their Saturday nights at 1730 London Line.

"I find a lot of the 20-to-25-year-olds that are coming out now are saying 'Okay, beers and mixed drinks are five-six bucks," Henderson said. "They come out, have a couple of drinks, something to eat, and watch the races.

"If they walk in with 20, 30 bucks, they don't feel like they don't have any money on them. Yet, when they go to the casino, they take 20 bucks and they're not in there for 10 minutes. It's a different atmosphere at the track."

While the younger demographic isn't generally as interested in betting on the races, Henderson added that one segment of fans is committed to playing the ponies.

After Northville Downs ran its final race on Feb. 3, horseplayers in Michigan needed a place to watch and bet on races.

Cue Hiawatha.

"We noticed a big change this year because Michigan doesn't have horse racing," Henderson said. "All of a sudden, we're getting a lot of people from Michigan coming. They're unique; Thursday, Friday, Saturday, the simulcast is growing like crazy.

"The Americans coming over are a little different because they're here to gamble. Most of them will spend between \$500 and \$1,000, and they don't mind. While others are older people who have been going to the races all their life, and now they can't go, so they're coming over the border to watch here."

On paper, the infusion of Michigan horseplayers provides a legitimate boost to Hiawatha's live handle. In practice, however, Henderson says there's still plenty of meat being left on the proverbial bone.

More and more people are interested in coming. Even on simulcast days, there's more and more people coming out, and more couples. "Now, the only problem with that is the people from the States, they're looking at pool size, among other things," he said. "They're betting our races too, but not the same as The Meadowlands or Mohawk or Gulfstream. They're just a different crowd. They're more educated players.

"If they're going to bet \$100 across on a horse, they want to be in a decent-sized pool, and that's where it hurts us in a way because I'm showing 20 tracks on a Saturday afternoon and Saturday night — I show everything that Woodbine has, I show it all — so you can bet on all of it. In some ways, it hurts us because it takes away from the live handle."

Despite the counter-effect on live handle, simulcast days have been a boon for Hiawatha's attendance, and in turn, the development of horse racing fans into more sophisticated horseplayers.

"More and more people are interested in coming," Henderson said. "Even on simulcast days, there's more and more people coming out, and more couples. The two of them are coming out, and they've already got a program in their hands. They print it at home, bring it with them, and have the names of their horses ready to go."

The turnout was especially strong on July 6, which also happened to be the first Saturday of the month, for an Ontario Sires Stakes Prospect Series tilt for 3-year-old pacing colts.

Henderson estimated some 4,000 people packed into the grandstand to take in the night's festivities.

Although 'Loonie/Toonie' night and an OSS series contest landing on the same day may seem like the perfect storm, Hiawatha has been able to routinely drive strong attendance numbers by simply maximizing the 165-acre venue's abundant space.

Community events such as Rib Fest, food truck rallies, concerts, shows, and even retirement parties have been the perfect complement to the facility's live racing product.

These theme nights, along with the beach volleyball club and driving range also present on site, are crucial to

Hiawatha Horse Park's development into a premium all-inone entertainment centre.

"We've done a lot of little upgrades through the capital improvement program," Henderson said. "We built a really unique, really dressy tote board... It's like a giant TV out there. It's got everything with the replays and odds on each side.

"We changed all the lighting over to LED this year. The picture is way brighter, really crystal clear now with the high-definition cameras. We remodeled the kitchen and the paddock and did a bunch of stuff on all sides."

With help from Henderson's sister Barb, he remains committed to growing the Southwestern Ontario venue into a community beacon for both present and future generations to embrace.

As Hiawatha's 2024 meet heads into the home stretch (nine race dates remaining), Jim is ready to put the finishing touches on another successful season.

"It comes back to the customer base and keeping the one we have going right now," Jim said. "If it stays as strong as it's been all summer, it'd be awesome.

"Everything's gone according to plan so far, but there's always room for improvement."







#### Daley eyes Adios, Hambletonian successes Saturday

After watching Captain Albano be something of a victim of circumstances in prior races, trainer Noel Daley liked the way things looked last week in the colt's Delvin Miller Adios elimination. He wouldn't mind a repeat viewing in Saturday's (July 27) \$350,000 final.

Captain Albano captured his Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids elim by 3¼ lengths over Timeisonmyside in 1:49.2 on July 20 at The Meadows. He is the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the final, starting from post 4 with driver Todd McCarthy in the 58th edition of the event for 3-year-old pacers.

Wish You Well, who won the other Adios elim by  $1\frac{3}{4}$  lengths in 1:49.1, is the 3-1 second choice. He will leave from post 2 with David Miller driving for Nifty Norman. His 1:49.1 mile, which included a blistering :25.2 last quarter, is the season's second fastest by a 3-year-old pacer on a five-eighths-mile track. Captain Albano's 1:49.2 score is tied for third.

In his Adios elim, Captain Albano got away third, but moved to the front after leader Noblesville reached the opening quarter in :26.3. Captain Albano and McCarthy controlled the action from there, reaching the half in :55 and three-quarters in 1:22.4 on their way to the win.

It was Captain Albano's third victory in seven races this season. Last year, Captain Albano was no worse than second in nine starts, winning seven and being named the Dan Patch Award recipient for best 2-year-old male pacer.

"We've been trying to get to the front for a month, and if we got there, we haven't been able to keep it," Daley said. "The horse has been fine every start. He really has. He just hasn't had any luck. I'm still happy with him. He seems good, he still seems bright."

Captain Albano encountered traffic or trip trouble in his prior three races — the North America Cup final, Meadowlands Pace elimination, and Meadowlands Pace final on July 13, when he got parked three-wide near the rear of the field from post 7 in the opening quarter-mile.

"That race was over at the quarter pole for us; he got three deep and that was the end of it," Daley said, adding about Pace champ Legendary Hanover and his stakes-record 1:46.3 victory, "I don't know if anyone was beating him anyway, he was awesome.

"In the North America Cup, he got shut off halfway down the lane. You can't stop and get started up again. In the elimination of the Meadowlands Pace, he was doubled up with too much pace. That's when he threw in all those bad steps. It wasn't for any other reason than he had too much horse. He had to grab him and settle him just to get into the final."


For his career, Captain Albano has won 10 of 16 races and earned \$577,915. The son of Captaintreacherous—Angelou is owned by Patricia Stable, L.A. Express Stable, Sjoblom Racing, and Michael Dolan.

Daley and McCarthy are both seeking their first Adios trophy. They finished third together with Pebble Beach in 2022.

"Hopefully, [Captain Albano] can make it to the top again once things settle down," Daley said. "We'll just see."

Captain Albano will be among eight stakes starters for Daley on Saturday. Four of the others will be among a group competing at The Meadowlands and include Sig Sauer in the first of the night's two \$100,000 Hambletonian eliminations for 3-year-old trotters as well as Buy A Round, Miss I La, and Paulina Hanover in the Hambletonian Oaks eliminations for 3-year-old female trotters.



Sig Sauer and driver Andy McCarthy will leave from post 8 in their Hambletonian elim and are 8-1 on the morning line. Sig Sauer, a son of Muscle Hill—Sigilwig who will be making only his third start of the year, is coming off a 1:50 win in a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial on July 13 at The Meadowlands. It is the fastest mile of the season by a 3-year-old trotter.

"He seems real good," Daley said. "He was even a little more forward than I thought he would be [in the Dancer] but Andy gave him a great trip, and everything worked out. But you have to remember, that was his second start for the year and his seventh start lifetime, so you'd like to think he's still on the upward trend. I think that's our biggest advantage."

The first elimination field includes 4-5 favorite Karl, trained by Nancy Takter and No. 1 in the Road to the Hambletonian rankings, as well as Goodtimes Stakes champion Highland Kismet and the other Stanley Dancer Memorial division winner Situationship.

"We got a bad post and the tougher of the two divisions, it's just up to [Sig Sauer] to have a good day," Daley said. "As long as he has a good day, he's going to make it in there.

"He's a handful to deal with on a daily basis, but he's been very professional every time we've taken him to the races. I told people early in the piece that if he's half as good as he thinks he is, I'm in good shape. It just turned out that he is."

The top-five finishers from each elim will advance to the \$1.05 million Hambletonian final, the sport's premier race for 3-year-old trotters, Aug. 3 at The Big M. Elimination winners draw for post positions 1 through 5 followed by the remaining finalists receiving their posts in an open draw. The draw will be conducted July 30 at Hogan Equine Clinic in Cream Ridge, NJ.

In the Hambletonian Oaks, Paulina Hanover is 6-1 in the first of three \$50,000 eliminations. Buy A Round is 5-2 in the second elim and Miss I La is 10-1 in the third. The top-three finishers from each elim plus the fourth-place finisher with the highest lifetime earnings will advance to the \$525,000 Oaks final, also Aug. 3 at The Meadowlands.

"My best chance is Buy A Round," Daley said about the daughter of Walner—On Your Tab, who has hit the board in all 13 career races, winning eight. "She came up with a little bit of a high white count again [last start when she finished second in a division of the Del Miller Memorial]. I know she was second, but she was disappointing there. Everything seems good again. Hopefully, she will be back to herself. As long as she's up close, she can sprint."

#### **Dalgety riding the wave**

Carter Dalgety has needed little time to make a big impression.

The 21-year-old Dalgety, who earlier this year became the quickest junior driver to reach 100 wins in New Zealand history, recently arrived in the U.S. to spend a couple months observing harness racing firsthand on this side of the world. Not even two weeks into his stay, he made an impact here as well.

On July 19, Dalgety made his Stateside debut and picked up his first North American win when he guided Chris Ryder-trained Handlelikeaporsche to victory at Harrah's Philadelphia. The next night, Dalgety got his first Meadowlands triumph with Stonebridge Reef, another horse from the Ryder Stable.

"I didn't expect it to be this good this quickly, but I'll take it," said Dalgety, who is staying with longtime family friend and

four-time Dan Patch Driver of the Year Dexter Dunn. "Initially, I wasn't too worried about driving. I was just going to come over and help out in a few barns and sort of travel around and see how everybody does it here compared to Down Under. Dex kind of encouraged me to give the driving a go.

"He's made everything so much easier for me. I don't think it would be going as good without him."

Dunn, who led New Zealand's premiership in wins 10 times before moving to the U.S. in 2018, worked and drove for Dalgety's parents, Cran and Chrissie, and the family's Kentuckiana Lodge.

"Growing up with him, it's been pretty cool to see his whole journey right from the start to where he is now," Dalgety said. "It's quite incredible."

Dalgety is on his own incredible journey. In March, he got his 100th win in only his 550th start, which according to Harness Racing New Zealand stats set the record for fewest drives by a junior driver to reach the milestone. Making it more memorable, Dalgety got the triumph in a Group 1 race with All You Need Is Me, a horse trained by his parents.

It was Dalgety's second Group 1 victory in his career, which has seen him post 117 lifetime wins so far in New Zealand. He ranks No. 1 in wins this year in the junior driver's premiership, with 38, and seventh in premiership.



Off the track, Dalgety in March received the Valachi Downs Young Scholarship Award, which provides funding to help individuals under 35 advance their careers in the equine industry. Dalgety was the first harness racing driver to get the scholarship.

"That was really cool," Dalgety said. "It's not something I expected, of course, because it was such a big pool of people. When I got the nod, I was just over the moon."

Dalgety, who has a Bachelor of Commerce degree with a double major in supply chain management and global business, also runs his own clothing line, Fuego Collection, in addition to working with horses.

"The university stuff definitely helps with that, managing supply chains and logistics, importing and exporting," Dalgety said. "Hoodies have been my biggest seller. I made up a couple designs and still have a lot more to release. It's so interesting, with marketing and working out what people like. It's ever changed."

Dalgety used some of his scholarship award for his trip to the States.

"I've always wanted to come over here," Dalgety said. "My family came over this time last year, but I waited at home; I wanted a little bit more experience driving. I thought another 12 months might have been perfect. I turned 21 in May and it's a little bit quieter in winter in New Zealand, the racing. I thought why not. I talked to Dexter and here I am."

In getting his first U.S. win, Dalgety and Handlelikeaporsche settled in second from post 7 before prevailing in a stretch duel over favorite Declan Seelster. Sent off at 11-1 odds, Handlelikeaporsche won by a half-length.

"It probably wasn't really expected, which made it a little better, I think," Dalgety said. "It was a thrill, and maybe a bit of relief as well just to get off the mark. It was one of the greatest feelings ever."

And it was followed by another great feeling the next day when Dalgety guided Stonebridge Reef to a career-best 1:48.4 triumph at The Meadowlands. Dalgety and Stonebridge Reef were fourth at the quarter, came first-over heading to the half, were on top by 4½ lengths in the stretch and won by 1½ lengths.

"He just felt so good I thought I'd get him out on the front," Dalgety said. "As soon as he got the lead he just swelled up and found another gear. He was flicking his ears around the last turn and just exploded up the straight. There wasn't a real point where I thought I had it [won], but I thought the way he felt that he would have been hard to chase down. As soon as they got close, he just kept kicking. It was amazing, really.


"For any harness boy in the world, you watch The Meadowlands, and to get a drive there was absolutely amazing in the first place. But then to win like that, it was a dream come true."

Dalgety has 10 drives over the next several days — eight at Harrah's Philadelphia and two at The Meadowlands. He also has been busy at qualifiers, driving horses for trainers such as Ron Burke, Andrew Harris, Nifty Norman, Brett Pelling, and Linda Toscano.

"Nobody really knows me at all, and for them to put me on their horses is pretty cool," Dalgety said. "I just hope that I can repay them."

Dalgety expects to stay in the U.S. for about another six weeks, then return to New Zealand as some of his horses there return from layoffs. In the meantime, he will soak up the experience here.

"It's been a dream start," Dalgety said. "I just got to keep riding the wave."







## Hungry For Love, El Rey adore The Red Mile

The Red Mile completed the first week of its 150th season featuring the first of three \$35,000 legs in the debut of the Kentucky Sire Stakes Series for 4-year-old male and female pacers. **Hungry For Love** and **El Rey** demonstrated their affinity for the Lexington oval as each horse turned the tables on the rival who defeated them at Oak Grove in \$150,000 series finals last month.

Defending Kentucky Commonwealth Series champion, Hungry For Love (David Miller), gunned down favored Strong Poison (Yannick Gingras) by a half-length in the third race on a card where races nine through 12 were canceled due to the unpredictable weather in the Bluegrass.

The daughter of Stay Hungry was content to track in third position while Strong Poison went straight to the top with Keep My Secret (Marvin Luna) in second. The mares remained in that position as Strong Poison clicked off fractions of :28.2,:56 and 1:24.3 through three-quarters. Hungry For Love, however, decided it was time to go at the top of the lane as she overhauled Keep My Secret to pursue the leader.

From there the race was on as Hungry For Love paced a sizzling :25.1 final quarter-mile to hit the wire in 1:50.2. Take nothing away from Strong Poison as she came home in :25.4. Keep My Secret held third.

Conditioned by Ron Burke, Hungry For Love increased her bankroll to \$542,866. The mare was bred by Brittany Farms and is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon.

The victory avenged three consecutive defeats when lining up against Strong Poison. The public's second choice paid \$6.72 to win and improved her overall record to 44 15-8-7. She is 12 3-5-2 in 2024.

El Rey (Marcus Miller) demonstrated a return to the red clay was exactly what the doctor ordered after a disappointing effort in the \$428,000 William Haughton Memorial on July 13 behind Abuckabett Hanover. He also took a measure of revenge on 2023 Kentucky Commonwealth Series final winner, Admiral Hill (Gingras), who bested him in the \$150,000 series final at Oak Grove.

The son of Captaintreacherous zipped right to the front after the wings on the gate folded with favorite Admiral Hill biding his time in second. El Rey led the field with splits of :27.3,:53.4 and 1:21. As the field of seven turned for home, Admiral Hill laid down the gauntlet with Blue Lou (D. Miller) in hot pursuit.

El Rey would not be denied in a thrilling stretch drive, turning back the bids of his foes to stop the clock in 1:49.1. to hold Admiral Hill at bay by a nose. Blue Lou was another nose back in third.

Trained by Andrew Harris, El Rey increased his bank account to \$656,130 from 41 career miles. The stallion is owned by William Pollock, Bruce Areman and his trainer.

El Rey has compiled a record of 9 2-3-1 this season and paid his supporters \$6.06 for his effort. He was bred by Riverview Breeding LLC.

Racing returns to The Red Mile on Sunday (June 28) with another evening under the lights. Racing will be conducted on Sundays, Mondays and Tuesdays through Sept. 17 prior to the Grand Circuit coming to town. First post for Sundays is 5:05 p.m. with Mondays and Tuesday kicking off at 1 p.m.

Odds-on favorites **Geralds A Keeper, Fancy Like That** and **Tony Babe** swept Wednesday's (July 24) trio of \$87,500 Maryland Sire Stakes championships for 3-year-olds on the pari-mutuel card at Ocean Downs while a would-be odds-on favorite in **Only I Exist** likewise coasted to victory in the non-betting \$87,500 Maryland Sire Stakes final for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

Geralds A Keeper completed a sweep of the series and extended his winning streak to five with a 1:58 score in the 3-year-old male trot. Trae Porter launched the Lockkeeper—Brilliance Hanover gelding to the fore from the outside post 6, and the pair traveled unopposed through splits of :28.4, :58.1 and 1:28 before evading a mild late rally from stablemate K J Dash by two lengths. War Pony was a one-paced third from the pocket.

John Wagner trains Geralds A Keeper, now a six-time winner with \$122,920 in earnings, for owner Kelsey Wagner.

Fancy Like That likewise swept the 3-year-old pacing filly series, building on 15½- and 11¼-length wins in her preliminaries with a dominating 12-length, 1:56 score over Yourgracefound Me. Marissa For Real was a distant third.

Johnathan Ahle drove Kasey Bendix and Virginia Marvel's homebred daughter of Rusty's For Real—Scootin Woody to her 16th career win and her ninth of the season. She paid \$2.10 to win.

The sophomore male pace saw Tony Babe and driver Jonathan Roberts rate splits of :28.3,:58.2 and 1:27.1 before accelerating in the stretch to repel a late challenge from pocket rival Petes For Real by a half-length in 1:55.4. The Editor finished third.

Tony Babe, a Rusty's For Real—Aunt Babe gelding, has now won four races— all this season— for owner, breeder and trainer Ronald Short. He paid \$3.40 to win.

The non-wagering 3-year-old filly trot was a virtual walkover for Richard Hans' homebred Only I Exist, who was never challenged by runner-up Emily's Locket and the galloping New Concept at any point in her 1:56.3 lifetime-best mile, which she won by 21¾ lengths. Russell Foster drove the Yall Beneath Me—Get Rich Quick filly to her 12th win in 13 career starts.

Racing returns to Ocean Downs on Sunday (July 28) with a 12-race card; first post is 7:05 p.m.

#### A look back at the 2024 Buffalo Raceway season

"It was a nice meet overall," Buffalo Raceway general manager Jon Cramer said as he reflected back on the recently completed 2024 season.

"Our handle was down slightly for the season, both on and off track. Our promotions were well received, especially on opening and closing nights as well as our Dine N Derby Party."

There were plenty of highlights during the campaign with six track records being rewritten.

"The horses are just getting faster and I think our track resurfacing last off season helped also," Cramer said.

Double Class and driver Jim Morrill, Jr. broke the 4-year-old trotting gelding mark with a 1:56.2 on July 13 then a week later on July 20, topped his own freshly set standard with a 1:56.1 tour around the Buffalo Raceway half-mile oval.

Biscoe established a new all-age trotting mark for a stallion as well as the 4-year-old record with a 1:55.3 for driver James McNeight, Jr.

In the New York Sire Stakes, pacer Boston Rocks put down a 1:52.2 which broke the old barrier for the all-aged and 3-year-old colts.

The year end awards saw Power And Grace being named the Trotter of the Meet. The 8-year-old mare (Holiday Road—Mark Of Honour) is owned by Hartel Maintenance Inc., Lormer McClure, Brett MacDonald and Reg Higgs. Trained by Ronald MacDonald, she won six out of 15 races at Buffalo, earning \$58,820.

Egomania took home Pacer of the Meet honors. After sweeping all three legs of the Spring Up Series, the David Russo trainee then captured the finals. Owned by Anthony Barone, Egomania won six of 14 attempts and had over \$47,000 in winnings.

Samuel Smith took home his second consecutive Trainer of the Meet award after registering 60 wins through Friday and nearly \$500,000 in purses.

Kevin Cummings won the Buffalo Raceway driving championship with 97 victories and \$772,186 in purse earnings. Since 2019, Cummings has either finished second or third but finally clinched that elusive title.

In other statistics, the inside post captured 182 victories in 641 starts while the post time favorite winning percentage at the track for the year was 45.87 per cent.

Cramer stated that the 2025 live racing season is expected to return in early March.
