Breaking down the Hambletonian starters

Grouping the starters from longshots to favorite.

A total of 16 male trotters are entered Saturday (July 31) across two eliminations for the Hambletonian, in which the top five finishers from their respective eliminations will return to the Meadowlands next Saturday for their shot at Hambletonian glory. Here is my grouping of horses for the 2021 edition of the stake.

\$1.1 Hambletonian Stakes

The outsiders: Zenith Stride, Spy Booth, Locatelli, Rattle My Cage, Take All Comers

Going in order of post position by elimination, ZENITH STRIDE will look to recapture the magic from his massive upset in last year's Peter Haughton Memorial from Hambletonian Day, but even that seems unlikely. Most efforts this year have been only fair, and he broke stride last out after being well situated. SPY BOOTH is one of three Taktar trainees entered across the two eliminations, though is still a maiden through eight lifetime starts; pricey yearling presumably earned a shot by closing belatedly last out to be second to Really Fast. LOCATELLI rates a better chance than the previously mentioned pair, but still falls just outside of contender status. His race three back would

make him interesting though; broke last out while in the midst of a brush from the third. RATTLE MY CAGE beat weaker twice here convincingly in June but couldn't keep up with some of the better ones last out when starting from the rail. TAKE ALL COMERS is another that maybe I'm not giving enough credit towards. He was well regarded in the Dancer following a PASS win and subsequent runner-up to Dancinginthedark M in the

Reynolds; couldn't keep up late in his most recent after being used early.

They didn't come back as strong at three: On A Streak, In Range, Venerate

The highly-accomplished and award-winning trio of ON A STREAK, IN RANGE and VENERATE earned almost \$2 million last year as freshmen between the three of them but have made less than \$170,000 so far at 3. VENERATE has lost all three times he's been favored and the Venerate of last year would have won last week's Geers stake. IN RANGE rallied nicely from an impossible spot two back in the Yonkers Trot and followed that up with a good front end try against a stakes-caliber non-winner's race last out. ON A STREAK hasn't been as strong as the latter and had every chance up the inside in his Geers division but couldn't reach. I'd rate In Range the best of these three and it's not to say that in the case of him and Venerate they are without chances, but they'll need to come back to their prior form.

The contenders: Cuatro De Julio, Delayed Hanover, Ambassador Hanover, Sonofamistery, Johan Palema, Captain Corey

CUATRO DE JULIO was one that I thought would be one of the favorites back during the winter, and his race in the Dancer was highly encouraging. Making his first start two weeks ago since the end of May when he just missed in the New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) final, he took a bold run first-over at Captain Corey in a multiple move effort and held well until very late. He was a 1:51.3 winner from last year and is one of a few that could be figuring it out at the right time. DELAYED HANOVER outraced his odds in the Dancer when he led the way and beat all except the presumptive Hambletonian fave that he couldn't stave off. He's going to attract attention to on the driver change to Dexter Dunn. AMBASSADOR HANOVER rates a contender from his Geers win in which he went wire to wire and fended off pressure to both his sides. He's still going to have to go faster than he's ever gone before but showed last week that he shouldn't be written off completely. SONOFAMISTERY kept it all together in the Dancer when he pounced late off battling leaders to get the 1:50.2 score. He has his issues, but is consistently fast; seems like he can trot with anyone at his best. It's not often you see the Yonkers Trot winner go into a non-winner's race and not be the favorite, but that's what happened last out with JOHAN PALEMA en route to a resounding lifetime best mark of 1:50.4. He doesn't always win the flashiest fashion but his ceiling remains to be seen; credit to Svanstedt for the turnaround since last year. CAPTAIN COREY is another that exits his best race yet, and for him that's saying something considering all his successes. He fended off heavy pressure last out when winning the battle but losing the war; trainer Svanstedt is well represented in this year's Hambletonian edition.

The wildcard: Really Fast

REALLY FAST has come a really long way in a really short time for Nancy Takter and bears similarities to a Jimmy Takter Hambletonian finalist from 2019, Tactical Landing. Like Tactical Landing, Really Fast was a high-priced yearling (\$700,000) and is also a colt just finally showing his potential for speed in the weeks leading up to the Hambletonian. As someone who hasn't yet been tested against high-level stakes competition it remains to be seen if he's really this good; could be a complete Hambletonian hit or miss.

The favorite: Dancinginthedark M

It looked like trainer Marcus Melander was a lock to win the Hambletonian two years ago when he had a series of monsters entered including Greenshoe. He didn't win the Hambletonian that year but he will bring the favorite into the race once again as well as other previously mentioned contenders, this time with Dancinginthedark M. The Ready Express colt showed obvious potential last year at 2 and has turned into a powerhouse this year. He stamped himself with Hambletonian favoritism off his win in the Dancer when he overcame a first-over trip to win in 1:50.1 with a last quarter of :26.4. I wouldn't say that he's miles better than anyone else but he does have an overall edge heading into this week's eliminations.

\$570,000 Hambletonian Oaks

In a talented group of 20 fillies vying across two eliminations, BELLA BELLINI is squarely the one to beat. Trainer Nifty Norman deserves a world of credit to developing Bella Bellini to where she is considering how her career started off, going winless as a 2-year-old through seven starts with just \$4,398 in earnings. Coming from the regally bred family out of Bella Dolce, her race from two weeks ago against some of the best 3-year-old colts stands out. She rallied off cover to close purposefully and was gaining late to the inside of the Yonkers Trot winner that sat the pocket to the top of the stretch. Two back she bested many of these same highly considered 3-year-old fillies including Donna Soprano and Lady Chaos, and was further flattered when Donna Soprano came back to win next out. If there was future wagering I'd think even money for her to win the Oaks final would be a fair proposition.

\$375,000 Adios Final

Switching states and venues, Saturday also features the \$375,000 Adios final at The Meadows. Consistent with how I described last week's elimination results in this column here, WATER SPORTS TEEN is suddenly the one to beat. Streaking in the right direction while others who had been previously more accomplished are now suddenly suspect, he'll deserve favoritism. Surprisingly, Yannick Gingras opts off SOUTHWIND GENDRY for LOU'S PEARLMAN. The latter paced a couple of fast miles at the Meadowlands two and three back but was no match late for

his elimination winner; I'd look for Gingras to give him a shot though. ABUCKABETT HANOVER capitalized off a perfect trip to get back on the right track last out. ROCKYROAD HANOVER took an early shot and a late shot against Water Sports Teen in his elimination but it was to no avail. Can HELLABALOU shock the world again?

Marcus Melander has had an early and impressive influence in the Hambletonian

Trainer Marcus Melander has had six checks in four Hambletonian appearances – the last four. He's 29. The last time a trainer younger than that won a Hambletonian was in 1985 when 24-year-old Per Eriksson won with Prakas. Jimmy Takter's first check was at age 33 in 1994 with runner-up Mr Lavec. Melander has sent out three in each of the last two Hambletonian finals. He is the youngest trainer to make money in four straight Hambletonians (2017-2020). His brother Mattias drove for the first time in 2020 in a Hambletonian final. Marcus has sent out the three favorites in the Hambletonian final – in 2019 with Greenshoe (second), Gimpanzee (third) and Green Manalishi (fifth). Takter had the three favorites in 2014 finishing first, second and last with Trixton, Nuncio and odd-on choice Father Patrick. Chuck Sylvester had the four favorites in 1998.

Trainers finishing 1-2

Several trainers will be trying to go 1-2 in the Hambletonian final. Jimmy Takter has turned that trick twice – 1997 and 2014. Chuck Sylvester in 1998 did it and Per Eriksson in 1992 with Alf Palema and King Conch. Billy Haughton did so in the last pre-Meadowlands Hambletonian with Burgomeister and Final Score in 1980.

New era

This year marks the fifth straight Hambletonian without John Campbell driving and the seventh in a row without Ron Pierce.

Miller holds consecutive record

Del Miller holds the record for the longest period of time from his first to his last driving Hambletonian appearance – 36 years from 1946-1982.

Billy Haughton is second on this list – 35 years from 1949-1984.

John Campbell is next up – 33 years 1983-2016.

By way of comparison, Willie Shoemaker was in the Kentucky Derby 36 straight years – 1952-1988.

Not on the board? No worries

Didn't have your very best day in the Hambletonian? No issue. There was yet another seven-figure pot awaiting a pair of colts who tried unsuccessfully for Hambletonian glory – Cruzado Del Noche was last in 2015 in his elim, but later won the Yonkers International; that same International went to Resolve after he was fifth in the 2014 Hambletonian final.

Schnittker's three records in one Hambletonian

Ray Schnittker set three records in the 2008 Hambletonian:

1. First undefeated colt to win the Hambletonian – Deweycheatumnhowe.
2. The \$930,000 total take was a record for a trainer in a single trotting event as Make It Happen was third from post 10.
3. Schnittker's first three Hambletonian drives netted him \$1,007,233 in earnings, making him the only driver to ever bank over \$1 Million his first three times behind the gate in a Hambletonian final. He was third both in 1997 and 2000 – with Armbr Plato and then Armbr Trick.

Multi-national

Billy Haughton and Stanley Dancer won 10 of the 19 Hambletonians from 1965-1983 as trainers. (8-for-10 as drivers, too) Both from the good ol' USA. Then a trend began which is quite evident today. Trainers and drivers are just as likely – or more likely – to be born somewhere else. Since Duenna crossed the wire in 1983 for Dancer, trainers were born in the USA 15 times, Sweden 10, Canada 8, Norway 2, Argentina 2 and Australia 1.

Drivers were born in the USA 16 times, Canada 16 times, Sweden 3 times, Norway 2 and Australia 1.

Sears going for #4

At the age of 53, Brian Sears is going for his fourth Hambletonian win to go with the ones in 2009, 2013 and 2015.

Here are the comparable ages of the others who got their fourth Hambletonian win:

Ben White, 70 in 1943.
Stanley Dancer, 56 in 1983.
Billy Haughton, 56 in 1980.
John Campbell, 40 in 1995.
Mike Lachance, 52 in 2003.

Every horse is on its own schedule

Just because the calendar says the first Saturday in August doesn't mean every single sophomore trotter will be at their peak. Take a look at the last decade – an amazing amount were either off the board, got no money at all or didn't even make it to the Hambletonian final, yet more than redeemed themselves afterwards

2018 – Favored Crystal Fashion was just fourth, but has gone on to a \$2 million career.

2017 – What The Hill was disqualified from first to 9th, but beat older in that year's TVG and won the division.

2016 – Bar Hopping was fifth as the public choice to win the Hambletonian, but later recovered (or matured) nicely to dominate the Breeders Crown, again as the favorite.

2015 – Cruzado Del Noche was last in his elim – no final for him. But later on he moved on to Marcus Melander's barn and upset in the \$1 million Yonkers International.

2014 – Resolve was a quiet fifth in the Trixton year. He too moved on and working from the Svanstedt barn took down an International.

2013 – Creatine was only eighth as a no factor, but wound up winning a Breeders Crown at 5 and was well past \$2 million when he retired.

2012 – Archangel (named for a famous code word used on 9/11) was fourth in the Hambletonian but later posted one of the earliest 1:50 miles and now is a stallion.

2011 – Chapter Seven was fourth on his comeback trail – a touch early for him – and then he simply dominated the next 15 months as a two-time Breeders Crown winner and the 2012 HOY and the sire of Atlanta and Gimpanzee.

Winning debuts

Eric Ledford won his Hambletonian debut in 2002 with Chip Chip Hooray.

A year prior, Stefan Melander did the same with Scarlet Knight the undefeated sophomore who trained overseas.

Trevor Ritchie got this triumvirate rolling in 2000 in his initial Hambletonian steer with Yankee Paco.

Howard Beissinger won two of his first three Hambletonian assignments – 1969 with Triple Crown winner Lindys Pride and then again in 1971 with Speedy Crown who would then sire three Hambletonian winners himself in addition to Moni Maker.

Tommy Haughton's first three Hambletonian assignments were with elim winner and eventual runner-up Final Score in 1980 and then winner Speed Bowl in 1982 at the tender age of 25 – still the record.

Yes, sire

Readly Express (sire of Dancinginthedark M) and Love You (Ready For Moni and Back Of The Neck) are not household names in North America.

Here's a look at those 41 New Jersey Hambletonian winners whose sires who did not compete in the Hambletonian themselves:

2019 – Kadabra, sire of Forbidden Trade, was ineligible in 2002

2013 – R C Royalty, sire of Royalty For Life

2012 – Revenue S, sire of Chapter Seven

2011 – Broadway Hall, sire of Broad Bahn was 9-for-9 at 2 and then never raced again.

2005 – S Js Photo, went 1-for-2 in 2005 with Vivid Photo and Classic Photo. He was not a Hambletonian eligible in 1992.

2003 – Balanced Image, sire of both Yankee Paco and Amigo Hall, two Hambletonian winners in 2000 and 2003. Balanced Image would have been the strong 1981 favorite but injured himself three weeks out from the 1981 Hambletonian won by Shiaway St Pat.

1998, 1996, 1994 – Valley Victory retired the week of the 1989 Hambletonian due to a virus and never did compete again. He won the big one with his first, third and fifth crops – Victory Dream 1994, Continental victory in 1996 and Muscles Yankee in 1998.

1984 – ABC Freight was a stalwart early on for Clint Galbraith but never made the Hambletonian. His son Historic Freight did and won it in 1984.

1981 – Tarport Devlin sired the very first New Jersey Hambletonian winner Shiaway St Pat. All the connections were debuting that year, including the winning stallion who never made it to the Hambletonian final.

Man, is she good

Manchego is now 38-for-62 lifetime and at \$3,014,152 she and her sire Muscle Hill are the first father-daughter team to each surpass \$3 million.

Manchego is going for her fifth straight Hambletonian Day win. Nobody has won on five straight Hambletonian Day cards. Five wins is the overall record set by Moni Maker. That's right, she won the Oaks in straight heats in 1996, then the Nat Ray (now the Cashman) in 1997, 1998 and 2000.

Moni Maker through 62 career starts was 39-for-62.

What a difference a year makes

Three winless freshmen made morning line favorites for Saturday's Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks eliminations.

After each going winless in 2020, colt Johan Palema and fillies Bella Bellini and Piper Hanover have totaled 14 victories this season and are three of the four morning-line favorites in Saturday's (July 31) Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks eliminations for 3-year-old trotters.

Johan Palema, who earlier this month won the Yonkers Trot, is 5-2 on the morning line in the second of Saturday's two \$50,000 Hambletonian eliminations for the boys at The Meadowlands while Bella Bellini is 5-2 and Piper Hanover is 3-1 in the two \$35,000 Hambletonian Oaks elims for the ladies.

Last year, the trio combined to go 0-for-20 with nine top-three finishes. This season, the three are 14-for-20 with no off-the-board finishes.

For trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman, who conditions Bella Bellini, the change in his filly has been remarkable. Bella Bellini has won six of nine races this year and finished second in all three defeats.

"It's the biggest shock to me," Norman said. "I've never had a horse improve so much from (age) 2 to 3. She's a good horse, but you couldn't tell that last year. Normally, you can tell something. She had speed, but that was it. She just struggled the whole time. But she matured, is sound, and is good now."

Bella Bellini is owned by David McDuffee, who also bred the filly. She is by Bar Hopping out of Bella Dolce. Last year, Bella Bellini had a second-place finish in seven starts.

"If she hadn't been a homebred, Dave probably would have sold her," Norman said. "There was no clue she was going to turn out like she has."

Bella Bellini heads to her Hambletonian Oaks elimination off a second-place finish behind Johan Palema in which she was timed in 1:50.4. Her final quarter-mile was :26.2 as she missed by a half-length despite a three-wide move around traffic on the last turn.

"She's got a fantastic attitude and high speed," Norman said. "She can catch them in three steps. When she makes her move, it's a pretty undeniable move. She can go to from fourth to first like that."

"We'll see (how good she can be). The next couple weeks are going to tell us. It's easy to be confident now, but you've still got to get there. You've got to show up two weeks in a row and be really good two weeks in a row."



The top-five finishers from each of the two Hambletonian Oaks eliminations advance to the \$500,000 final on Aug. 7 at The Meadowlands. Norman won back-to-back Oaks with Personal Style in 2012 and Bee A Magician in 2013. McDuffee was part of the ownership group of Bee A Magician.

Over the past 40 years, only two fillies have won the Hambletonian Oaks after going winless at age 2: Jalopy in 2005 and Worldly Woman in 1992.

Piper Hanover, trained by Tony Alagna, was winless in seven races last year but hit the board four times, including in a division of the International Stallion Stakes and two legs of the Kentucky Sire Stakes. This season, she has four victories in six starts.

"She was a filly that had a lot of talent last year, but she was

just immature,” Alagna said. “A lot of it was just her mental focus. She’s got that (focus) this year. We brought her back at 3 because we thought she would transition well from 2 to 3. She’s progressed even more than we anticipated. She’s been great.”

Piper Hanover, by Father Patrick out of Norman’s aforementioned Oaks winner Personal Style, won a division of the W.N. Reynolds Memorial on July 10 at The Meadowlands. Last week, she finished third in a division of the Arthur Tompkins Memorial at the Big M.

“The other day she was flat,” Alagna said. “We scoped her, and she had some mucous. We treated her, cleaned her up, and she scoped back good (Wednesday), so I hope she fires right back to where she had been up until then. She had no fight in her the other day, and that’s not her at all.”

Piper Hanover was bred by Brittany Farms and Mel Hartman. She is owned by Brittany Farms, Marvin and Lynn Katz, and Al Libfeld.

Alagna also has a starter, Beltassima, in the other Oaks elimination. She is the 3-1 second choice behind Bella Bellini. She has won three of six races this year, including the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship. The Trixton-Beltane Hanover filly raced for Jan Johnson last season but was purchased in April by Crawford Farms Racing.

“One of the reasons we bought her was because she was second in the (International Stallion) race when Piper was third in Lexington,” Alagna said. “I thought, if I like Piper enough to come back at 3, this filly is worth buying as well. She’s been very solid.”

“She never raced anywhere but the Red Mile last year, so when she first came out of Florida (this spring) it took her a little while to transition to the limestone, but after that she’s been lights out.”

As for Hambletonian contender Johan Palema, he was winless in six races last year. He is 4-for-5 this season, with the first jewel in the Trotting Triple Crown, the Yonkers Trot, among his victories. The Hambletonian is the second jewel followed by October’s Kentucky Futurity.

“Last year, he was pulling all the time,” trainer Ake Svanstedt said. “When the gate opened, you couldn’t do anything else than leave fast with him. Now, he’s nice. We have trained him behind horses and raced him from behind. We couldn’t do that before because he was pulling so hard, he was so grabby. He’s a totally different horse this year.”

Johan Palema, owned by Bender Sweden Inc., is by Bar Hopping out of Sobti Hanover, who is a half-sister to near-millionaire Spellbound Hanover, the dam of 2016 Trotting Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder.

The colt is one of four Svanstedt horses in the Hambletonian elims. Captain Corey (5-1) is in the same elimination as Johan Palema while Ambassador Hanover (9-2) and Delayed Hanover (5-1) are in the other.

Dancinginthedark M, trained by Marcus Melander, is the remaining Hambletonian elimination favorite, at 2-1. The top-five finishers from each elim advance to the \$1 million final on Aug. 7 at The Meadowlands.

The last Hambletonian winner who was winless at 2 was Tagliabue in 1995. He qualified once as a 2-year-old but never started a race.

Racing begins at 6:20 p.m. Saturday at The Meadowlands.

King Of The North looks to continue reign in Peter Haughton eliminations

This weekend at The Meadowlands, trainer Ray Schnittker aims for a spot in the Peter Haughton Memorial final with King Of The North while Jim Campbell looks to advance to the Hambletonian final with Take All Corners and Erv Miller eyes the Hambletonian Oaks final with Swift Swanda.

Schnittker hasn't had a Peter Haughton Memorial finalist since Derby finished seventh in 2013 to Father Patrick, but the veteran trainer has a stellar chance to return to the major stakes event for 2-year-old male trotters when he sends out King Of The North in the first of two \$20,000 eliminations tonight (July 30).

Fourteen first-year trotters were divided into a pair of elims, with the top five finishers in each returning for the \$350,000 (est.) final that is part of the Hambletonian Day undercard on Saturday (Aug. 7). Listed as the 9-5 morning-line favorite in his elim (race four), King Of The North will be driven by Mark MacDonald.

King Of The North has been king on the racetrack as he comes into the Haughton elims off a sweep of the three-week

New Jersey Sires Stakes series, including a career-best 1:52.4 effort in the \$200,000 final on July 16. The mile is also the fastest by a freshman male trotter thus far in 2021.

"He was good from day one," said Schnittker of the son of Walner who is out of the Schnittker-trained two-time Dan Patch Award and \$1.9 million winner Check Me Out. "He is really good and level headed, hopefully he stays sound all year and we'll have a real good year. And hopefully a good next two weeks."

Schnittker is co-breeder of King Of The North with Steve Jones, with the colt selling for \$190,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. The ownership now includes Schnittker, Arden Homestead Stable, Nolamaura Racing and Steve Arnold.

With his New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) sweep, King Of The North has \$125,000 in earnings heading into the Haughton elims.

Schnittker, who has never won the Peter Haughton Memorial, said he sees similarities in King Of The North with his mother.

"He's got that same desire," he said. "He likes to play like she did, but probably a little calmer than her."

Check Me Out's victories include the 2011 Merrie Annabelle for 2-year-old filly trotters, and Schnittker will have a starter in this year's race (now named the Jim Doherty Memorial) in Brickhouse Babe, also a daughter of Walner out of the

King Of The North (Mark MacDonald).

Schnittker-trained stakes-winning mare Royal Assets.

MacDonald will also drive Brickhouse Babe, who starts from post five in the 10-filly single-elim field. The top nine finishers will return for the \$350,000 (est.) final on Aug. 7, joined by Venerable, who earned a bye. Like King Of The North, Venerable swept the NJSS series for freshman filly trotters.

Competing in all three NJSS legs, Brickhouse Babe won her debut on July 2 at The Meadowlands in come-from-behind fashion in 1:56, and then finished sixth. In the NJSS final, Brickhouse Babe started from post 10 and rallied late for a fourth-place finish.

"That filly was really good last week," Schnittker said of the trotter he also co-bred and now owns in partnership with Jones, Mary Kinsey Arnold and Paul Bordogna. "She drew the 10 hole and got a fourth and I was ecstatic. A little longer and she'd have been third. She got shuffled to last all three times she raced, and it's not like she can't leave, it's the way the races went."

Take All Comers takes on Hambletonian challenge

Jim Campbell is not someone who worries much about post positions. So, when the trainer's Take All Comers got post eight in Saturday's (July 31) second of [two eight-horse Hambletonian Stakes eliminations](#) at The Meadowlands, Campbell took it in stride.

"There's no post that is guaranteed to always work to your advantage," Campbell said. "Sometimes an outside post can work to your advantage. Sometimes it doesn't. It all depends how the race shapes up."

"I don't get too worked up about post positions, either way."

Take All Comers is 10-1 on the morning line in his elimination, where Yonkers Trot winner Johan Palema is the 5-2 favorite. The top-five finishers from both \$50,000 Hambletonian eliminations will advance to the \$1 million final on Aug. 7 at The Meadowlands.

Saturday's second elim also includes this year's NJSS champion Really Fast (3-1), 2020 Dan Patch Award winner Venerate (4-1), 2020 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champ Captain Corey (5-1), and 2020 Breeders Crown runner-up In Range (8-1). Locatelli (10-1) and Rattle My Cage (12-1) complete the field.

The last time Take All Comers faced a field that included In Range, Venerate, and Captain Corey, was in last October's Breeders Crown final for 2-year-old male trotters at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Take All Comers finished fourth, beaten only 1-1/2 lengths, as In Range was second, Venerate third, and Captain Corey fifth behind winner On A Streak in a stakes-record 1:52.4 mile.

"It's a tough, competitive, group of colts in there," Campbell said. "It's going to come down to who gets good trips, or who doesn't get good trips, I think. I don't think there is anybody out there that's scared anybody off. There's a bunch of colts that can all go fast. It's going to come down to who is

peaking and who is sharp in the eliminations and final."

Take All Comers has won two of six races this year. His victories came in a conditioned race and a leg of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes. He was second to Dancinginthedark M, the 2-1 favorite in the first Hambletonian elimination, in a July 10 division of the W.N. Reynolds Memorial and third-placed-sixth in a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial on July 17.

For his career, Take All Comers has won three of 15 races and hit the board a total of 10 times. He has earned \$231,929 for owner Scott Farber's Runthetable Stables, which also was co-breeder of the gelding. Take All Comers is a half-brother to Breeders Crown champion Next Level Stuff.

Farber and Campbell reached the Hambletonian final in 2011 with Opening Night, who finished third.

"Overall, I'm pretty happy with the way (Take All Comers) is coming into it," said Campbell, who won the 1995 Hambletonian with Tagliabue. "He's gone some good races for us this year. He's got high speed. He's got a good attitude and likes to do his work. He can race either way, toward the front or come from behind. He's pretty versatile that way."

Miller hopes Swift Swanda is set for speedy Oaks outing

Swift Swanda will make only her second start outside of Indiana on Saturday when she faces nine foes in the second of two \$35,000 eliminations of the Hambletonian Oaks for 3-year-old female trotters at The Meadowlands.

The Erv Miller-trained filly has won four of five races this year. Her only loss came when she went off stride in a field that included male rivals. Otherwise, Swift Swanda has won each start by a minimum of a length.

Last year, she won six of 12 races and was the Indiana Sire Stakes champion. Her only previous start away from the Hoosier State came in her career debut when she won at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

"We're going to give her a try and see how it goes," Miller said. "She's been on a good roll. She's a big, strong, mare. Hopefully, the big track will pick her up a little bit. She had a start where she wasn't quite as good, and we found a couple little things that were bothering her, and she really seems in good health right now."

Swift Swanda, a daughter of Swan For All out of Cheetah Hall, is owned by Anthony Lombardi and The Kales Company.

She is the 9-2 morning-line third choice in her Hambletonian Oaks elimination, behind favorite Piper Hanover (3-1) and O'Brien Award winner Donna Soprano (7-2). Donna Soprano won her most recent start, a division of the Del Miller Memorial, in 1:51.3 on July 17. The time is the fastest of the season for a 3-year-old filly trotter.

The top-five finishers from both Oaks eliminations advance to the \$500,000 final on Aug. 7 at The Meadowlands.

"I feel good, but it's not going to be easy," Miller said. "Donna Soprano shows winning in (1):51 a couple Saturdays ago. There's nothing easy about that."

Stakes on tap at Hanover, Dresden and Grand River this holiday weekend

Ontario's Civic Holiday weekend is celebrated in racing by Hanover Raceway's Dream Of Glory on Saturday, the inaugural Black Heritage Day on Sunday at Dresden and the Battle of Waterloo on Monday at Grand River.

The Civic Holiday weekend is always a significant one on the

Ontario harness racing calendar, but with fans back in the grandstand and on the tarmac, this year's events have a heightened celebratory feel.

Hanover Raceway kicks things off on Saturday, July 31 at 1:30 p.m. with the \$56,200 Dream of Glory Final for Ontario-sired 3-year-old trotters. Elimination winners Sweet Soul David (2:02.4), Publicity Seeker (2:01.2) and Topsy In Dixie (2:01) will start from Posts 1, 3 and 4 respectively in the track's signature event, which is slated for Race 9. The card also features the \$10,000 Gail Murray Invitational Pace in Race 7.

Kadabra son Sweet Soul David heads into the event as the reigning Balanced Image champion and could become just the second horse to claim both of Hanover Raceway's marquee events, joining Traverse Seelster (Angus Hall) who accomplished the feat in 2010 and 2011. Owned by trainer Paul Lang of Ancaster, Simon Swindells of Little Britain, Garth Bechtel of Meaford and Paul Kleinpaste of Orangeville, ON, Sweet Soul David will be putting his three-race win streak up against the four-race streak Topsy In Dixie has amassed for trainer Harry Poulton and owners TheStable.ca Topsy In Dixie of Guelph, ON.

"Being a Hanover Raceway board member when this race was conceived, I am very proud of how our industry has received and supported this race over the years," said trainer Mark Etsell, who sends Top Of The Bar out from Post 7 in this year's edition. "This is a great race for Ontario-breds."

On Sunday, Aug. 1 Dresden Raceway will present its first Black Heritage Day, honouring both abolitionist Josiah Henson, who owned the land where the racetrack is situated during the mid-1800s, and the many Black families who have contributed to the racetrack's success over the years.

"There's going to be a lot of stories and a lot of camaraderie that day," said general manager Gary Patterson, adding that Dresden Raceway hopes to make the event an annual occurrence. "We're going to have a static display at the racetrack, it's going to be full-time at the racetrack, but we're hoping to have the Josiah Henson Pace every year and then we can draw attention to the static display and draw attention to these families and what they've done for the races."

In addition to the Josiah Henson Pace, there will be races honouring the List family, McCorkle family, Grineage family, Simmons family, Davis family, Prince family, Tanner family and Duwayne Guest.

Seventy-nine year old Fred List and his family will be among the people sharing stories and fellowship with fans and their fellow horsepeople.

"There's five generations of my family that used to race horses. My dad, Harry List, he could drive a horse as good as anybody," said List, who currently calls Hamilton, ON home. "He could almost talk to horses my dad, and he always drove the ones that nobody else would touch. He used to drive a mare, Alice G, and they always had to take two or three sulkies with them. She'd kick the wheels off all the sulkies. My dad used to bring a mickey of whiskey with him and he'd say, 'Now you're going to behave old girl today,' and he'd walk up and he would put the mickey of whiskey in her mouth and she'd drink half of it and he'd drink the other half and jump on the cart and away they'd go and win races."

"We had a lot of fun back years ago. Don't get me talking because I could talk for two days and I could tell you stories and never tell you the same one twice."

Standardbred Canada credits List with 1,081 wins and \$1,473,558 in earnings as a driver and 71 wins and \$251,003 in earnings as a trainer, but the vast majority of his work was complete before the current record keeping system was introduced. After leaving home at 16 he travelled all over Ontario, Quebec and the northeastern United States second training for noted horsemen such as Dr. John Findley and Donnie Hall, training his own stable and catch driving. Among the horses that stand out in his memory are Skeeter Herbert (Springfield-Tamcee Herbert, \$387,402, 1:57.3), Thamesview Blaze (Blaze Pick-Thamesview Cindy, \$223,868, 1:59.3) and New Departure (Zip Tar-Miss Blazette, \$323,699, 1:58).

He has fond memories of most of the biggest names in the game, both human and equine, and still follows the sport intently, putting Dexter Dunn at the top of the list of current drivers he admires.

List encountered racism in his travels, including in Dresden where restaurants and barbers refused to serve members of the Black community long after the 1944 Ontario Racial Discrimination Act and the 1954 Fair Accommodations Act had made racial discrimination illegal in the province (<https://www.tvos.org/article/how-activists-fought-racist-restaurants-in-southwestern-ontario>), but counts most members of the harness racing community as friends. Since retiring in 1992 he has enjoyed connecting with old friends and competitors

at events like Legends Day in Clinton and hopes to see many familiar faces at Dresden Raceway on Sunday.

In addition to Black Heritage Day, Dresden Raceway fans are also looking forward to the track's season finale on Monday, Aug. 2, which features Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots and Ontario Racing Prospect Series action for the three-year-old pacing colts. Post time for both programs is 1 pm.

Programs and a live stream are available on the racetrack's website, <http://dresdenraceway.ca/>, and those wishing to attend in person are asked to register by email at dresdenracewayreservations@gmail.com.

Also on tap for Monday, Aug. 2 is Grand River Raceway's annual Industry Day event, featuring the \$251,050 Battle Of Waterloo Final for Ontario Sired 2-year-old pacing colts and the \$145,060 Battle Of The Belles Final for Ontario Sired 2-year-old pacing fillies, along with two \$101,400 Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series and five \$21,000 Grassroots divisions for the 3-year-old pacing fillies.

While current restrictions will prevent the Elora, ON oval from offering some of the extras that typically occur on Industry Day, general manager Jamie Martin said he and the rest of the Grand River Raceway staff are ready to celebrate the return of fans to their signature event.

"The way I look at it, what's special is that we're actually open. Last year for Industry Day we were only allowed 100 people," said Martin. "We are planning for a really good crowd, so we're going to try and do the best job we can in meeting those customer's needs, from a wagering perspective, from a food and beverage perspective. We're really kind of focussing on, instead of some of those extra things, which might be kind of hard to do in this COVID environment anyway, trying to do the basic things really well so people have a good time while they're here."

The racetrack is permitted 50 per cent of normal capacity in their indoor space and 75 per cent capacity outdoors. There will be food trucks and an ice cream truck on hand to augment the track's food and beverage offerings, which are currently limited to The GrandWay Lounge, and people are welcome to bring their picnics and pop-up tents to set up on the berm in the backstretch, which will be without its usual beverage and wagering tent or grandstand shuttle.

Advance registration is not required, but Martin said if people have their heart set on a specific spot on the backstretch or table in the grandstand, arriving early might be a good idea.

"Fortunately we've got a lot of space here so we can accommodate a lot of people," said Martin. "Now if you want to get 'your' spot, you should come early, but I don't see a scenario where people cannot come in."

Post time for the Industry Day program is 12:30 pm with the Battle Finals slated as Race 10 and 11, the Gold divisions going postward in Races 3 and 8 and the Grassroots fillies battling in Races 1, 2, 5, 6, 7.

Adios hopeful Mysweetboymax showing the heart of his namesake

When Mysweetboymax races in Saturday's (July 31) \$375,000 final of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids at The Meadows, Alison and Scott Liroff and their family will be watching from their Basking Ridge, NJ home with more than the usual interest.

That's because the horse was named for their late son Max, who succumbed to cancer in 2018 at the age of 25. Mysweetboymax leaves from post 6 with David Miller aboard in the Adios, which goes as race 15.

The Adios anchors a blockbuster program that includes five other stakes: the \$106,745 Quinton Patterson Adioo Volo for 3-year-old filly pacers; a pair of Arden Downs Grand Circuit events for freshman pacers, and a \$143,132 Pennsylvania Sires Stake and a \$40,000 PA Stallion Series event, both for 3-year-old filly trotters,

In addition, the Adios Day program features five pool guarantees totaling \$90,000, including a \$40,000 Super Hi-5 guarantee — with a mandatory payout — on the Adios. A livestream of the Adios Day card, produced by the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA), will be available on the MSOA's Facebook and YouTube channels as well as Meadows Live! First post is noon.

Max Liroff was a good friend of Casey Horowitz, whose brother Brandon and father Bob bred and own Mysweetboymax and honored their late family friend by naming their horse for him. At 2, though, it wasn't clear the son of Sweet Lou—Faster Faster would live up to expectations. He earned nearly \$62,000 and took a mark of 1:52.1f but wasn't facing or beating top competition.

"He was a little immature," said his trainer, Sam DePinto. "I knew he would be a late bloomer. The more he does it, the more he gets the idea what he's supposed to do. He has no physical issues, so I think he'll be a very nice horse."

He showed how racy he's become in his Adios elimination when, dismissed at 42-1, he rallied inside to finish second to Hellabalou, beaten 2 lengths and individually timed in 1:49.3.

DePinto is no stranger to this territory. In 2010, his horse We Will See, finished fourth in the Adios final by challenging for the lead down the backside but tiring in the lane, beaten only 1/2 length by winner Delmarvalous. That's not the kind of trip DePinto wants Saturday.

"I would have to believe he needs to be up close and get good fractions and a covered-up trip. If he can get that, he has a heckuva shot, considering the way he raced last Saturday."

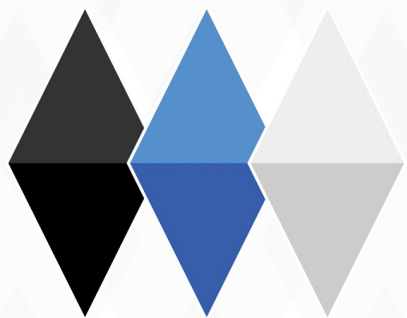


Mysweetboymax is eligible for most major late-season stakes; DePinto and the Horowitz and Liroff families have several reasons for expecting big things.

"He's maturing, and he's maturing at the right time," DePinto said. "He might turn around and start winning some of the big ones. Bob Horowitz wants everyone to know that Max Liroff fought like hell to beat that cancer. This horse races with Max's heart."

Marianne Rotella and Rachel Ryan make a winning combination

The dynamic duo of Marianne Rotella and Rachel Ryan has paid off better for The Meadowlands than any daily double ever has.

"Quite honestly, at the end of the day, without either one of them, things would be a lot tougher around here," said Meadowlands' chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "I'm very fortunate to have both of them and I don't say that about a lot of people or a lot of things, and I feel The Meadowlands is very fortunate and the industry is very fortunate as well."

Rotella, The Big M's assistant general manager, and Ryan, director of marketing and event operations, work seamlessly together to put on the best events possible and, above all else, take care of their customers.

Rotella and Ryan both started their stints at The Meadowlands at the old building, then operated by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA), and through hard work and determination over time, have risen to their current management positions.

"I started as a secretary [in 1987] and worked my way to director of admissions/guest services," said Rotella.

In 2012, following Superstorm Sandy, Rotella found her department unexpectedly understaffed, and as she was pushing a

program cart through publicity, she ran into Settlemoir and his young son, Travis, who jumped on the cart for a ride. That chance meeting had an impact, since Rotella was promoted to her current position shortly thereafter.

"That's the best professional decision that I ever made, making her the assistant general manager," said Settlemoir.

Ryan started riding horses at the age of 3 and grew up going to Monmouth Park in the summer and The Meadowlands in the winter.

"I wrote my senior paper in one of my marketing classes on racetrack advertising and marketing," said Ryan.

She worked part time at The Big M as a media assistant until she graduated college in 2004 and was hired full time.

"Then I became the marketing coordinator and slowly, slowly worked my way to here," Ryan said with a laugh.

Settlemoir sees a lot of the same work ethics and qualities in Ryan that he also sees in Rotella.

"I know that Rachel doesn't like hearing it sometimes, but Rachel is who I look to become the assistant general manager when Marianne's finally ready to retire," said Settlemoir. "Every time you ask either one of these ladies to do something, you never get any pushback. They have an understanding of where



we are and where we want to go and that's comforting. You see them actively involved not just in the administrative work but also on the front lines with the employees at the admission gate when we're doing the big events."

Rotella and Ryan will always be seen in the middle of the action, not just to support their employees, but also to be ready should something go wrong.

"I prefer to be down there manning the door, because then I know it's going correctly and if there's a problem, it's on me because I was down there," said Ryan.

"It's easier for me to fix something as it's happening," said Rotella. "And I tell people that all the time, tell me as it's happening, please don't wait until two weeks afterwards to tell me. I can't fix it two weeks later. I can make up for it, but I can't fix it."

Over the years, The Big M has played host to many events, most of which have nothing to do with harness racing, but by holding these events they get people into the building and hopefully, one day, they could become racing fans.

Putting on these events – beerfest, chili cook off, wiener dog races – and seeing and being with the people are the best parts of the job for both Rotella and Ryan.

On Saturday, July 24, they held a handicapping contest for people 18 to 30 years old. The idea for the contest came from Big M chairman and chief executive officer Jeff Gural four years ago.

"Jeff had mentioned that he wanted to do something just for the younger crowd and see if it draws anybody in," said Ryan. "He gave the idea and said run with it and make sure we get it done. So, we got it done. We had 59 contestants [the most ever] and there are a lot more that came that were intimidated about participating, but once they saw their friends doing it, they said, 'Oh we're definitely going to come back next year."

"The goal is for them to come back for something else. It's great if they come out for racing. We're just trying to get them out here for anything."

There's no question that Hambletonian Day is one of the biggest events for The Meadowlands and Rotella and Ryan expect, as in all previous years, to talk throughout the day about what is or isn't working.

"I start making notes that night or the next day [for next year's Hambletonian]," said Rotella.

Despite Settemoier's attempts to get both Rotella and Ryan to join him in winner's circle presentations, they prefer to work outside of the spotlight.

"I described it recently as Jason's the politician, [chief financial officer] Alex [Figueras] is the finance guy and I'm the fixer," said Rotella.

"And I'm the muscle," added Ryan. "One, not everybody can be in the spotlight, and two, from my perspective, the event I'm putting on or the website should be in the spotlight. To me, I'm just in the background making sure the event is the main attraction. I did my job. That's good enough. Just seeing the people here is

enough. I don't need to be in the spotlight."

"I'd rather just take care of everything and get it all done and make sure people are happy and make sure the customers are satisfied," said Rotella. "That's my gratification. Making sure that everything goes well for Jeff and Jason so that when they are out there in the spotlight, they don't have to hear complaints."

Moira Fanning, director of publicity/chief operating officer of the Hambletonian Society, started working for the Breeders Crown in 1987 and has known and worked with Rotella and Ryan for their entire careers at The Big M.

"The amount of staff and resources that have contracted since they both worked over on the other side for the NJSEA was enough to drive most of those people out of the place," said Fanning. "But they stayed and they transitioned very well into doing a whole lot more with a whole lot less. And they both really care about racing and like racing, which I feel is important."

"The two of them, Rachel and Marianne, they get no accolades, no recognition, they get a lot of s**t because when something goes wrong, which inevitably it's going to, they're the ones that have to deal with it and I'm sure they're not paid what they're worth. They're priceless. The Sam McKees, the Mariannes, the Rachels, they're irreplaceable people."

Adare Castle cruises to Canadian record at Grand River

Adare Castle earned her second Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series win with a track, OSS and Canadian record effort at Grand River Raceway on Wednesday (July 28).

Starting from Post 4 in the event for 2-year-old trotting fillies, Adare Castle settled third through the early going, content to watch Lilys Lass lead the field to a :28.1 quarter and a :58.1 half. Heading for the 1:28.2 three-quarters driver Bob McClure sent Adare Castle to the front and the fan favorite accelerated away from her peers to a six and three-quarter length victory in a record setting 1:57.1. Clockwork Orange finished second and Needa Little Magic was third.

The mile peeled two-fifths of a second off the 1:57.3 Grand River Raceway, OSS and Canadian record set by Imextraspecial last August in a Gold Series event.

"Her win at Mohawk was so well in hand, I knew there was a lot left," said driver Bob McClure. "When Pat Hunt's filly

(Lilys Lass) got down to the half a little faster than I think they would have liked I knew it set her up for a big mile, but I wasn't chasing her for any records."

Mark Etsell of Rockwood trains Adare Castle and shares ownership of the Muscle Mass filly with Robert Newton of Walkerton, Graham Hopkins of Chesley and Peter Porter of Port Dover, ON. The trainer piloted Adare Castle in a June 11 qualifier and then turned the reins over to McClure, who clocked a 2:00.3 win with the filly in her June 24 qualifier and a 1:57.4 victory in the July 6 Gold Series season opener, all at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"When he (Etsell) qualified her the first time, the filly I had I really liked and he went right along with me, so pulling up I said, 'That's a nice filly,' and he said, 'Yeah, she is,'" said McClure. "Then the next week obviously he let me drive her

and she was just as impressive, but when she really took a big step up was her first race. She improved from the baby race to the first race and then tonight.

"Mark's great at gaiting trotters so you know going to these tracks you have an advantage because you can really lean on them on the half-mile."

To reassure himself that Adare Castle would handle Grand River Raceway's half-mile surface without any difficulty, Etsell schooled her over the oval on June 21.

"She's not a huge filly and she trains on a half and she's very handy, but you know, it's always a concern," said the trainer. "You always have that knot in your stomach."

Joining Adare Castle and her stablemate Allisonann Hanover in that schooling session were Rob Fellows trainees Resolving and Rose Run Xcentric. The outing proved to be invaluable as **Resolving** used her experience, and a new pair of trotting hobbles, to turn in a flawless 1:58.4 effort to capture the second \$101,400 Gold division.

In an error-prone race that was initially delayed by a starter's recall, Resolving was the model of professionalism. Starting from Post 8, driver Trevor Henry dropped her down to the rail in fourth, avoiding all the early breakers, and then pointed her at the lead heading for the 1:00 half. Resolving took command before the 1:29.3 three-quarters and left her misbehaving peers in her wake with an 11 and one-quarter length victory. Say Something finished second and Pencils Down was promoted to third when Angelonia was placed from third to eighth for an extended break. Favourite Grace finished sixth.

"It was quite eventful," said trainer Rob Fellows. "She's pretty level headed so the recall I don't think shook her up too much, where some trotting fillies that would have really made them scatter-brained, and then she landed in and just stayed trotting, and Trevor just moved her out and let her trot good in the straightaways and she was good. It's nice when the plan works."

Fellows trains Resolving for his wife Yolanda Fellows of Rockwood, ON, Blair Corbeil of Beaumont, AB and Ted Wilson of Seagrave, ON, who bred the filly's sire Resolve in partnership with Michael Pozefsky of Saratoga Springs, NY. Resolving was also a winner in a June 24 qualifier, but made a late break in the July 6 Gold Series season opener and finished eighth.

"She's tall, good looking, doesn't carry a lot of extra weight, which will kind of lean me toward not racing her too much in the heat of the summer, but she's very well mannered," said Fellows. "She actually did nothing wrong all winter. She wasn't really flashy, like you didn't get off the track and go, 'Wow', but you said, 'Oh, she was good.'"

Resolving and Adare Castle will have their third opportunity to collect a Gold Series blanket on Aug. 20 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Lynch wins Governor's Cup, DSBF finals headline rich Harrington card

The richest card of the season welcomed fair goers Thursday night (July 29) at the annual Governor's Day program at Harrington Raceway during the Delaware State Fair.

Approximately \$600,000 in purse money was at stake on the card, most of it in four \$100,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders Finals (DSBF) for 3-year-olds.

Long standing races for older horses were also contested such as the \$50,000 Governor's Cup, \$35,000 Legislator's Cup (in Memory of Thurman Adams Jr.), \$35,000 Charles Murphy Jr. Memorial Trot and \$25,000 President's Cup.

Memorial races were also held in memory of Walter Messick, Sam Mathews, Del and Dorothy Manges and John Frazer Jr. and John Frazer III.

The Governor's Cup featured a strong showing for owner/trainer/driver Jason Lynch who had the first and third place finishers. Lynch's **Gunslinger Hill** (\$48.20, Lynch) prevailed off a pocket trip to win by a half-length over Big City Bud in 1:53. Lynch's McBoogity finished third. A 6-year-old Bettor's Delight gelding, Gunslinger Hill notched his fourth win of the season.

In DSBF final action, David Hamm and Glenn Phillips' **Tobago Time** (\$38.60, Allan Davis) was a 1:54.3 winner in the pacing filly final over Stealing Bases and Rowdy One. Tobago Time and Davis capitalized on an early miscue by 1-to-9 favorite Littlebagoftricks and scored her fifth career win. The Tobago Cays filly surpassed \$100,000 in career earnings for trainer Chuck Crissman Jr.

Davis scored another DSBF final win with Kim Caulder's **Kim's Command** (\$6) in the filly trot final in 1:59.2. The



CR Commando filly reeled in game pacesetter Whitesville Beulah, with a blazing 27.4 last quarter for a half-length win. Jazzy Judy was third. Trained by John Wilkerson, it was her first win of the season after finishing second in 5-of-6 starts.

The Wiz Kids Stable's **First State Joni** (\$11, Barton Dalious) was a 1:54.4 wire-to-wire winner over a pair of Clyde Francis trainees, Subban and Henrico. The Delmarvalous colt received a confident steer from Dalious, who was driving for his father/trainer Bart Dalious. It was the fourth lifetime win for First State Joni.

In the male trotting final, overwhelming favorite **Big Al M** (\$2.10, Eric Davis) was a decisive winner in 1:59.2 for owner Bobby Myers. Driven by his trainer Davis, the Anders Bluestone gelding improved to 4-for-4 this year and 9-of-11 lifetime and has dominated his DSBF rivals with a career bankroll in excess of \$210,000. Big Al M was a front end winner by two lengths over Vlahos and Rhett.

Scuola Hanover (\$3.40, Art Stafford Jr.) was a 1:52.3 winner in the Legislator's Cup for owners Art and trainer Andrew Stafford and Thomas Ireland. Owner/trainer Andrew Glassmeyer's Embrace The Grind (\$4.20, Corey Callahan) captured the Charles Murphy Jr. Memorial Trot in 1:57.2.

Louis Tomczak's **Proper One** (\$2.80, Tim Tetrick) won the President's Cup for the second time in his career for trainer Carlo Polisenno.

The summer circuit of racing will resume at Harrington Raceway on Aug. 16 with a 4:30 p.m. post time.

Saturday's Empire of Hope event at Hoosier Park important benefit for Standardbred Transition Alliance

Saturday evening (July 31), Harrah's Hoosier Park will play host to the second annual Empire of Hope night. The purpose of the evening is to help raise awareness, and dollars, for racehorse aftercare. All funds raised tonight (July 30) and Saturday at Hoosier Park will benefit the Standardbred Transition Alliance (STA). Still in its infancy, the STA is slowly growing in the mission of assisting with the relocation, rehabilitation and repurpose of retired standardbreds. STA president David Reid said he is satisfied with the progress, but not content.

"We are in our second year of accrediting facilities. The mission is going steadily forward," Reid said. "The placements for the first year were satisfying, but obviously we know we are a young organization. The main goal is that the heart is in the right spot for aftercare. I think the awareness level has increased. We are just continuing to grow at a slow pace, but at a steady pace."

A non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, the STA was created with a mission to accredit, inspect and award grants to organizations that work to re-home or transition standardbreds once their careers are complete. Reid said that to date three organizations have been accredited. Jennifer Daniels, STA administrator, said that over the last year and a half, 138 standardbreds have received transition services from STA accredited aftercare organizations.

"I know that may sound small, but it is somewhere to start and build from. When you gauge success, sometimes you have to be realistic about it. It is going to be a steady, slow growth. Awareness is being raised, but it needs to be raised much more," Reid said of the placements. "I think the industry has definitely embraced it, but I think we need to reach more tentacles of the industry. What people do like is the accreditation process adds validity and donor confidence. I think we need to continue to do that. I think the accreditation and oversight validates facilities,



which makes the donors' confidence even greater."

Events such as Hoosier Park's Empire of Hope are one of the vehicles that can be used to reach those tentacles of the industry. More importantly, it serves as a grassroots effort that is critically important to building STA awareness.

"This movement has to be grassroots. It's nothing that can be handed down from on high. It has to happen at the track level. That's where the community builds," said Daniels, who joined STA in November 2019. "I just returned from The Meadows, where the MSOA put on a great charity event Wednesday night. The local events are more tangible. When you see or personally know the horses that are retiring, it becomes real. When you're raising money at the local level, and you know that your contributions are helping horses that you see every day, that is tangible and real and that's how the movement grows. It's great to say that we've done this at a national level, made a secure collection point for donations, now we need to work to build the aftercare community at the track level."

Daniels said that one of the unexpected outcomes of the accreditation process is the "bird's eye" view afforded and seeing areas where the STA could be of greater service to industry organizations. She noted that in some instances, bottlenecks have been identified where the STA can partner with an organization to address ongoing challenges through grants or other means. A case in point centers around paperwork needed for a racehorse transitioning away from racing. This is an area where Daniels sees the STA playing a crucial role in the future, both in education and execution.

"The STA accredited aftercare organizations ask that a horse arrives with the USTA transfer of ownership, the pleasure horse registration, and Full Circle enrollment already completed. If that hasn't happened, it really burdens a program to have to go and chase those things down, to ask for a coggins and a health certificate," she said. "If those things are done by the owner or



trainer before a horse is sent to a program, it lifts a huge administrative burden from these charity organizations that are often running on office volunteers. The STA is stepping into a more active role with that, owner education. A lot of people would do the right thing, in terms of providing a placement ready horse, with pleasure horse conversion and health paperwork in order, if they knew the steps to take. And if they knew there was a place to turn to ask some of these questions. What are best practices for transitioning a horse when they are done racing?"

Saturday's Empire of Hope event will go a long way in creating awareness for aftercare and the STA-accredited organizations, but it will also generate needed funding. The first edition in 2019 brought in \$32,000 for STA. Reid continues to beat the drum for ways to generate a more constant stream of funding that can be utilized. He is in favor of a small fractional fee for transactions, borrowing from what takes place in thoroughbred racing while not creating a significant financial burden.

"In the thoroughbred model, every time a breeder registers a foal, there is a certain amount of money earmarked to aftercare. I've always been a believer that if you are bringing an animal into this world, you bear some responsibility at a low, fractional cost basis," Reid noted. "I think it's the responsibility of the entire industry, of all participants, to participate and contribute toward aftercare. A catch driver, whether he has a million dollar year or a \$100,000 year, it's not that much that is going to change a person's life. Everyone knows my feelings on that."

While Reid pursues that avenue, Daniels said there are other areas that need to be explored further, including in-kind donations from industry participants.

"The harness community has big hearts and they like to give, but they like to give close to home," she said. "That's why the Empire of Hope event is so powerful. You really see horsemen coming together and that sense of community. They want to take care of their own."

Since the STA launched three years ago, the mission has not changed. However, through accreditation and grant cycles, Daniels has witnessed how the organization can serve as a valuable resource, and she is excited for the opportunity.

"I'm not overwhelmed by it at all. I love it. I love that we have an organization now where you can point to the STA for transitioning best practices and advice. Before no one really had ownership of this area in its entirety, not the horseman's groups, the USTA or the adoption programs. Everyone did a little, or a lot, but there were still gaps that really weren't anyone's job to do. But the STA is perfectly situated," she said. "Again, with that bird's eye view of what's happening within the accredited programs, how the horses transition and how they are returned. We've got a great partnership with the USTA, and those gaps that we have been jointly able to identify, I think the STA is that missing link. It is the bridge to all the areas we couldn't quite get access to before. I think it's exciting."



Former racetrack executive Warren DeSantis dead at 75, funeral today

With heavy hearts, the DeSantis family is saddened to announce the sudden passing of Mr. Warren P. DeSantis, 75, of Wellington, FL, during the early morning hours of Friday, July 23.

Warren was born on Christmas eve in 1945 in Schenectady, NY, to Mr. and Mrs. Al DeSantis. He graduated from Linton High School in 1963, where he was a star basketball player and multi-recipient of the best dressed award.

Following high school, he received a basketball scholarship at the University of Miami and later graduated from Hudson Valley Community College. He was drafted into the United States Navy during the Vietnam war and was honorably discharged in 1968.

Outside of his business ventures, Warren's passions included telling his infamous stories, collecting wrist watches, being a clothes horse, watching basketball games as a diehard Miami Heat fan, and, most of all, his children. He was known for his sharp memory, allowing him to recall events, team rosters, style choices, game scores and winning horses – even if it happened over 50 years ago.

Warren had an innate ability to light up any room he walked into. His personality was infectious from the moment you met him. He had a heart of gold, he would do just about anything for anyone and he was loved by all who met him. He was also known as a “bonus Dad” to many of his children's friends and was always there to give his expert advice, solicited or not. He also liked to slip the casual brag of how he was a beauty pageant judge, therefore he “knew women.”

Warren is survived by Karen, his loving wife of 37 years, and his two children – Darren, 32, of Wellington, Florida, and Kristen, 28, who is a registered nurse in Portland, OR. In addition to his immediate family, he is also survived by his cousin Tommy Isabella, sister in law Kelli DeSantis, brother in law and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Ron Borella, niece Josephine Borella and countless friends, many of whom knew him since childhood and were inducted into the “Warren Watch Club”. He is predeceased by his parents, Gloria Volpicelli and Albert DeSantis, former *Union Star* sports editor, and brothers Patrick and Richard “RW”, former harness driver, trainer, and judge.

Funeral services will be held in Royal Palm Beach, FL, and Schenectady, NY, where he will be laid to rest.

Current track record holder and 3-year-old NYSS trotting champ, Coraggioso 1:52.4 (\$677,398) is an 11-year-old son of Conway Hall, from the Lindy Lane dam Electra Hanover and has stood the last six seasons in Ohio.

Already the sire of several multiple stakes winners and hundred thousand dollar earners from a limited book, Coraggioso returns home to establish himself among the trotting stallion ranks where he enjoyed much success on the racetrack.

"Convinced that an opportunity exists for Coraggioso to breed more mares in New York, we felt the timing was right to bring him back home to Saratoga," said co-owner Joseph Spadaro, who shares ownership of the horse with famed announcer Tom Durkin.

A multiple stakes winner at both ages 2 and 3, the strapping 16-hand trotter has taken fast records on all sized tracks and has a best beaten time of 1:51.3f.

Wally Hennessey was quick to praise the horse that he drove to his 1:54.4 half-mile track record.

"A true testament about how good he was is that he still holds the record at Saratoga and that's only half the story - great gait and excellent manners with a whole lot of talent," said the Hall of Fame reinsman.

Another Hall of Fame driver to sit behind Coraggioso was Brian Sears, who won the 2012 NYSS Championship with the colt, defeating favorite Archangel in the process.

"I've driven some tremendous trotters and Coraggioso was one of the best on a half-mile track," said Sears.

Clearly, Coraggioso has passed down his tactical speed and talent to his offspring, many of whom have excelled on the swift half-mile tracks of Ohio.

Lima Gold 4,1:55.4f (\$179,000) was from his first crop of just eight foals, and one of only two fillies foaled in 2017. Trained by Chris Beaver, she took a mark of 1:57 at Northfield at age two, winning one of several Ohio Sire Stakes, and was an Ohio Breeders Champion at age three, winning at Delaware in 1:56.2.

Panzano 3,1:55.1f-21 (\$155,468) is from the second crop of Coraggioso, one of just 10 foals. Panzano took a mark of 1:58.3 at age 2, winning a \$50,000 div. of the Ohio Sire Stakes at Northfield. Now 3, and already a multiple stakes winner, he is also trained by Chris Beaver and has trotted several miles faster than 1:55.

Coraggioso will stand the 2022 season for a service fee of \$2,500 at Mill Creek Farm, Stillwater, NY, a full service equine facility on 100 acres and located just five miles from both Saratoga Racing and Gaming and Saratoga Race Course.

Town Gossip ties track record at Batavia Downs

The New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) visited Batavia Downs on Wednesday (July 28) with both genders of 3-year-old pacers competing in four divisions for a total of \$225,000. With excellent efforts put in by the entire group, **Town Gossip** stole the show as he tied the track record for 3-year-old pacing geldings with an impressive 1:52.2 effort.

Joe Bongiorno and Town Gossip (American Ideal—Fibbertigibbet) battled with Major Bean (Matt Kakaley) to the quarter but got the lead by that pole in :27.3 and from there, he just kept going. With no one pulling right lines until the five-eighths, Southwind Petyr (Jason Bartlett) made the first move and could only advance to second on the rim at the three-quarters where the clock showed 1:24.1. Town Gossip started to pull away in the final bend and when they hit the stretch, he swelled up and paced away to a 2-1/4 length win in 1:52.2, which equaled the track record for 3-year-old pacing geldings.

"The best two horses were on the outside so I wasn't sure how it was going to shape up. Jason (Bartlett, driving Southwind Petyr) dropped in the three hole and I went to the front. My horse is usually lazy but today on the front he kept to his task on his own pretty well. I knew the horse from behind would give me a run but we didn't have to go a crazy third quarter and he was pretty wrapped up at the wire," said Bongiorno.

It was the third straight win for Town Gossip (\$3.50) and it pushed his earnings for this year to \$91,588 for owner Robert Weinstein. Jenn Bongiorno trains the winner.

The other group of colts and geldings saw the 2-year-old NYSS male pacing champion, **King James Express** (Art Major—More Diamonds), make a statement for more year-end laurels this year.

I'll Drink To That (Jim Morrill Jr.) was a strong leaver and dictated the pace for most of the mile. After a speedy :27.1 quarter, Morrill backed down the next two panels substantially and that's when King James Express (Jason Bartlett) pulled from third and started to advance. As they went around the last turn, King James Express was wearing down I'll Drink To That and when they hit the stretch, King James Express had the better foot and paced to the wire with a 1/2 length victory in 1:53.4.

"In a well-timed move with him he's pretty fast and he's great with a target. So I always have to make sure he has a target. When I moved him I thought I was a winner. He's been getting better and better every start since he qualified this spring and with his progress he should be very good for the final," said Bartlett.

King James Express (\$6.50) won his second straight and now has banked \$81,605 this year for owners Mark Harder, Deena

Frost, Wayne Carleton and Dean Lockhart. Harder also trains the winner.

The definite star of the entire filly division was **Heart Of Mine** (Roll With Joe—Aquavella) who claimed her eighth win of the year in the easiest of fashion.

Scott Zeron left and floated his way to the lead in :28.2 and cleared just past that station. With no opposition from there, he backed down the half to :58.1 and the race was basically over at that point. Heart Of Mine continued on the second circuit and maintained a 1-¾ length lead up the backstretch, around the last turn and heading into the stretch where she extended it to almost three. Down the lane Zeron had Heart Of Mine wrapped up and pacing with authority to win in 1:53.4 at the beam.

“She’s pretty nice. She’s extremely professional out there so she can position herself, good gaited so she gets around the turns well and she’s so easy to drive. She’s doing it pretty easy right now and she’s not breaking a sweat so we’ll see how she is going forward,” said Zeron.

Hall of Famer Linda Toscano trains Heart Of Mine (\$2.40) for owners The Bay’s Stable, Radio Racing Stable, Fred Wallace and the Camelot Stable. The filly now has \$176,916 made this year and went to \$308,331 lifetime in only 20 starts.

The first filly division went to **Summer Rae** (Roll With Joe—Solar Eclipse) who put in another solid effort.

Bartlett went right for the lead with Summer Rae and looked very strong on the point. The field followed single-file through fractions of :27.3, :56.3 and 1:24.4, with Party Queen (Matt Kakaley) tracking from second. Kakaley pulled off the far turn and charged the leader in the stretch. But Summer Rae hung tough and won by 1/4 of a length in 1:54.

“She got a little hot on me on the second turn and third turn, so I was a little bit concerned with that. So we were going more than we were forced to go and at the wire, she got a little tired, But in the lane she hung pretty tough once the horses got to her so I was pretty pleased with that,” said Bartlett.

It was the third win in the last five starts for Summer Rae (\$3.60) and owners Kathleen Whitaker, Charles Rowe, Paul Land and Tom Fanning, who also trains the filly.

Besides winning two of the four NYSS events, Bartlett also won two Excel A divisions to register the Grand Slam on the night.

Mohawk Jackpot Hi-5 mandatory payout announced for Saturday

The Woodbine Entertainment has announced a mandatory payout will be offered on the Standardbred Jackpot Hi-5 this Saturday (July 31) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The Jackpot Hi-5 carryover currently sits at \$137,352.52 following Tuesday evening’s card and is estimated to be more than \$150,000 on Saturday. The Jackpot Hi-5 wager will continue to be offered on each card leading up to Saturday’s mandatory payout. Horseplayers have two more opportunities to hit the entire Jackpot on Thursday and Friday. If the Jackpot isn’t hit before Saturday, it is estimated to be more than \$500,000 with the new money wagered into it.

The last Jackpot Hi-5 Mandatory Payout at Woodbine Mohawk Park (July 3) paid \$2,615.10 for 20 cents. Last year, on Feb. 15, a Jackpot Hi-5 Mandatory Payout at Woodbine Mohawk Park with a carryover of \$152,000 paid \$41,354.03 for 20 cents.

The Jackpot Hi-5 requires horseplayers to select the top-five finishers in order. A horseplayer can only win the entire jackpot if they hold the only winning ticket for that evening’s wager. If there are multiple winning tickets, half the pool is paid out, while the other half is added to the carryover.

This Saturday’s mandatory payout will see the entire carryover, plus new money wagered, paid out to all those that correctly select the top-five finishers in order. The Jackpot Hi-5 has a \$0.20 minimum and a 15 per cent takeout.

The Jackpot Hi-5 mandatory payout will take place on this Saturday’s final-race (Race 11). This race features an overflow field of 12 pacers competing in a Non-Winners of \$11,000 last 5 races or Non-Winners of \$25,000 last 10 starts and also eligible \$30,000 optional claiming and Non-Winners of six races lifetime. The purse for the mandatory payout race has been boosted to \$30,000. Post time is approximately 11:10 p.m. ET.

Live racing continues every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Post time is 7 p.m. ET.

Tie One On fastest in Arden Downs at The Meadows

In an exciting battle of promising youngsters, **Tie One On** outkicked Dreamonhigh in the slop to capture the fastest division of Thursday's (July 29) \$54,000 Arden Downs Grand Circuit Stake at The Meadows. The event for 2-year-old filly trotters, known as the Edward M. Ryan, was contested over three divisions, with **Gumdrop Hanover** and **I'm Happy Hanover** taking the other splits.

Tie One On had broken her maiden on the front end, but in the Ed Ryan, she yielded to the pocket for Hunter Myers and allowed Dreamonhigh to do the heavy lifting. The daughter of Bar Hopping-Twin B Alibi rated kindly and sailed home in 1:55.2 – a tick off the stake record – downing Dreamonhigh by a head. Miss Principle finished third.

"She's wonderful to work with, a sweet disposition," said trainer Tim Twaddle, who trains Tie One On for Thestable Tie One On. "Anthony MacDonald gets all the credit for buying her and developing her. She's the full package. This race was a measuring stick for whether she was a stallion series or a sires stake filly. This performance showed she's a sires stake-caliber horse."

Gumdrop Hanover needed the entire opening panel to reach the point for Mike Wilder, but the daughter of Bar Hopping-Grits' N Seven had little pressure thereafter, defeating Sister Swell by 4-3/4 lengths in 1:58. Sabrina Hill completed the ticket.

"Nothing phases her; she's a gutsy little filly," said winning trainer David Wiest. "She's not a big, strong filly, but she'll fill out real nice next year. Right now, she's doing a perfect job."

Edward Kimmel and David L. Wiest Stables campaign Gumdrop Hanover, a \$27,000 yearling acquisition who's likely to remain in Pennsylvania stakes for the balance of the season.

I'm Happy Hanover was making her first start in the Mike Palone stable, so Thursday was the first time winning driver Dave Palone got a look at her. He liked what he saw... and how she performed.

"I'd never seen her until I went out to pick her up for the post parade, so I really didn't know what to expect," Dave Palone said. "She did everything, ear plugs still in. It was a pretty good mile for these conditions."

The daughter of Muscle Hill—I'm On Cloud Nine quarter-poled to the top, yielded the lead, then powered through the lane to triumph in 1:59. Early leader Shayna Rosa was second, beaten 1-1/4 lengths, with Curry Hanover third.

I'm Happy Hanover races for Yves Sarrazin, Kapildeo Singh,

Dumain Haven Farm and Danielle Henri.

Palone and trainer Carl Cocciolone each enjoyed a three-bagger on the 13-race card.

Live racing at The Meadows continues today (July 30) – Adios eve – when the program features the Robert J. Key, a \$36,122 Arden Downs Grand Circuit Stake for sophomore colt and gelding trotters. Also, the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA) will stage a Family Fun Night that features face painting, a bounce house and balloon and stilts artists. The festivities kick off at the special post time of 5 p.m.

DeFrank's vision helped Big M rise to harness heights

To use race caller terminology, The Meadowlands is in "deep stretch" of its summer meeting with just two weekends of racing remaining. The final day is the granddaddy of them all, Hambletonian Day, on Saturday, Aug. 7.

This Saturday (July 31), 36 3-year-old trotters will compete for spots in not only the \$1 million Hambletonian final, but also its sister event, the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks final, as both events will have two eliminations. The Hambletonian elims will whittle 16 male trotters down to 10 while the fillies will see half of 20 entrants advance.

The finals for the Hambo and Hambo Oaks will serve as the marquee events on a spectacular 16-race program on Aug. 7 that has a special early post time of noon.

Much of The Meadowlands' rise to the top of North American harness racing can be attributed to their late, great, longtime former racing secretary Joe DeFrank. With The Meadowlands Pace – a race conceived by DeFrank in 1977 – now in the rearview mirror, looking back at some of what made DeFrank such a pivotal part of The Big M's legacy is well timed.

First of all, DeFrank had a thought of how racing would look at The Big M. His vision turned out to be the catalyst to send the big oval in East Rutherford to the head of the harness racing class.

It all started with a 10-horse starting gate and the bigger one-mile track. Then, he spoke with the drivers.

"In the first driver's meeting we ever had here," said DeFrank. "I tried to lay out the style of racing that I wanted. No backing off to the halves. No sitting in. If you are on the outside, just keep going. I want you out and going and moving. And if you get beat, you get beat."

DeFrank's plan came through TV screens across America on

Meadowlands Pace Night (July 17). In the four-race sequence shown live on Fox Sports 2, a national television audience saw no winning favorites, no winners coming from inside posts, no horses winning on the lead and 15 horses that went parked the entire mile, an average of almost four per race.

"The [Meadowlands] Pace Night national telecast was Meadowlands' Championship Meeting racing in its most contentious form," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemyer. "A style of racing that Joe DeFrank and the current Meadowlands ownership believe showcases standardbred racing at its competitive best. Forty-five years later, DeFrank's vision, adapted to today's racing style and combined with the perfect one-mile racetrack, continues to create the highest handles and the most exciting Standardbred racing in the world."

As the field turned for home, Shirley Goodness was just finding her best strides and used :28 closing kick to track down the pacesetters and then hold off a late surge from a very fast closing Country Girl Charm and LeWayne Miller. Country Girl Charm finished second while Dewtiful's Grace rounded out the trifecta. Shirley Goodness returned \$20.20 to her backers at the betting windows.

Trained by LeWayne Miller, Shirley Goodness recorded the second win from five seasonal starts. The 1:54.1 clocking also equaled a new lifetime best for the daughter of Swan For All—Stirling Debutant. Shirley Goodness is owned in partnership by Bill Beechy, Bradley R Maxwell and Kenneth Frieder and was bred by Alan Troyer and Larry Troyer of Indiana.

With no pressure on the new pacesetter to the half, Flo clipped the beam in :59.

Balance got underway out of fourth rounding the final turn and made subtle gains to three-quarters, where McClure launched his charge out of second. Past three-quarters in 1:28.2, I Love Ongait slid past Flo and opened her lead as Balance raced rough gaited to the centre of the track. McClure wrapped up his filly in the final sixteenth to win by 1-3/4 lengths in 1:55 chased home by Balance, with Flo finishing third, B My Sunshine fourth and Beyond The Sea rounding the payees.

A homebred filly by Sunshine Beach for Let It Ride Stables LLC co-owned by Bottom Line Racing LLC and Mac Nichol, I Love Ongait collected her first victory follow consecutive runner-up finishes against Gold competition. Her

maiden-breaking score pumps her earnings to \$52,583 and paid \$11.90 to win in the minor upset.

The 2-year-old pacing fillies will compete again in the second preliminary of the Whenuwishuponastar next Tuesday, Aug. 3.

Charlie May and others vie in Ohio Sires Stakes

Sophomore pacing colts are set to slug it out in a pair of \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) on Saturday night, (July 31) at Northfield Park. This is the third leg of the four-round series for 3-year-olds, and all of four previous winners of either leg one or two will face off in these events.

Don Tiger's Charlie May, a winner of \$523,127 lifetime, returns to OHSS action after plying his wares on the East Coast. The brown altered son of McArde captured the \$700,000 Meadowlands Pace on July 17, only to be disqualified when the judges determined he interfered with his rivals. Charlie May, a homebred, has nine wins and six seconds in 18 career starts lifetime and two wins this year in nine starts, with \$194,500 in seasonal earnings. One of those victories came in the June 19 OHSS contested at Scioto Downs, where he paced to a winning 1:49.3 in the second leg of this series (he had finished fourth in leg one).

Charlie May is the seventh and highest-earning foal out of his Western Hanover dam, the unraced Stipple Hanover, and is a half-brother to Velocity Stifler (by Art's Chip) p, 5, 1:50.3f (\$219,333), and to the 2-year-old pacing colt and OSS contender Shane Falco (by Racing Hill) p, 2, 1:56.1h (\$21,710), who is also owned and bred by Tiger. Charlie May will start from post eight in the second OHSS division (Race 12) for

driver Brett Miller and trainer Steve Carter.

Leg one winner Four-Star Flash vies in this same division (Race 12) as Charlie May, leaving from the six-hole for driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., and trainer Brian Brown. This venerable youngster by Western Vintage captured OSS leg one in 1:52 for owners Hutchison Harness, David Wozniak, D. Van Dusen and Acadia Farms, and finished fifth in the second OHSS leg to Rock N Republic.

Bred by Marion Beachy, Four-Star Flash has career earnings of \$102,260, with eight wins, a second and two thirds in 17 outings. He is the second and most prolific of four foals out of the Bettor's Delight mare Keladi Blue Chip p, 3, 1:56.3f (\$18,512).

Heart Of Chewbacca, who grabbed his first OHSS contest in a swift 1:51.2, finished second in Leg 2 and currently sits atop the OSS standings in the 3-year-old pacing colt division. The black son of Bring On The Beach is conditioned by Ron Burke for Dennis R. Owens and Norman Rae Racing and will have regular driver Danny Noble in the sulky, leaving from post seven in the first division (Race 9). A winner of \$288,848 lifetime, Heart Of Chewbacca was bred by Spring Haven Farm and has nine wins and four seconds in 15 career starts. He is the second and only foal to race thus far out of his dam, the Four Starzzz Shark mare JT's Chewbacca p, 3, 1:53.1f (\$32,220).

Rock N Republic sped to a 1:51.3 clocking en route to capturing his Leg 2 contest on June 19 at Scioto Downs. Trained by Robert Taylor for owner Dossie L. Minor, this brown Pet Rock gelding did not start in Leg 1 of this series. From 18 lifetime starts he has scored ten wins, a second and two thirds with \$69,147 in career earnings. Bred by L&J Racing, Rock N Republic is the third foal out of the Dragon Again mare My Juliana's Girl p, 4, 1:52.3f (\$121,560) and is a half-brother to Juliana The Baron (by Art Major) p, 3, 1:55.4f (\$25,480). He leaves from post two with Aaron Merriman at the controls in the first division (Race 9).

Crisler takes Corbin at Red Mile driving title

Randy Crisler captured the Corbin at The Red Mile meet driving title with 16 victories while Randy Jerrell tied with Anette Lorentzon for leading trainer at eight wins apiece.

Crisler finished three victories in front of Tyler Shehan, who drew into contention with a four-win day Sunday. Crisler had 85 starters, trailing only Shehan's 86 to lead all drivers at the 12-date meet that ended Tuesday (July 27). It was the Mississippi native's first title coming over The Red Mile's clay surface. He previously won driving crowns at Bluegrass Downs and Thunder Ridge, both now defunct.

"My first one here, so I'm pretty excited," Crisler said. "The top drivers are here. You have drivers who come from all over. They like racing here. So you win a title here driving against top drivers from other states, it means a lot."

Crisler, who padded his lead by taking Tuesday's fourth race with 6-1 shot Scarlett Grey, said he had no expectations that he'd win the driving title at the meet's start.

"No idea," he said. "When I secured the top, I thought, 'Okay, I might have a chance then.' That was like the second week."

Lorentzon, who has a strong stable of about 50 horses at her ACL Farm in Paris, was surprised to hear she won a piece of the training title. She sent out a meet-high 39 horses, with a meet-high nine seconds and five thirds to go with her eight victories.

"I was very surprised because I didn't think we'd been doing that good," she said. "... It's a tough meet. It's kind of lower-class horses, racing in conditions (featuring race eligibility restrictions) here. But they are literally flying in many of the miles out here. It was tough competition."

Jerrell won four of the \$25,000 Kentucky Proud Series county-fair finals as a driver and three as a trainer. He had a slim edge over Lorentzon for the most purse earnings for a trainer at the meet, \$75,865-\$75,375. He pulled into the tie for the win title when he drove Timo Kemp to victory in Tuesday's seventh race for the 3-year-old trotter's third score of the meet. The resident of Kevil, Ky., also won a trio of races as trainer-driver with Single Girl. Overall, Jerrell went 8-4-2 out of 25 starts as a trainer. He tied Elliott Deaton and James Stiltner II for third for driving victories at nine apiece while accruing a meet-best \$92,086 in driver purse earnings.

"We were very pleased with the way Single Girl raced, obviously," Jerrell said of the 3-year-old pacing filly who is 9 for 9 in 2021. "You know things are bound to change but hope they don't. Timo Kemp, just surprised – pleased – the way he raced."

Crisler and Jackie Gray of Lebanon, KY were next in the training standings with seven wins each. Crisler, with a pool of only eight horses to draw on from his stable, was delighted with his training production.

"Every horse but one won once or twice," Crisler said. "I'm probably labeled more as a driver than a trainer because I catch-drive other horses. Me winning a training title would be a big accomplishment because I don't have 30 or 40 head. Doing well with seven or eight horses is a big accomplishment."

Horsemen were appreciative of the extra 12 dates that the Corbin at Red Mile meet provided to the Kentucky harness-racing calendar.

"Everybody was glad to see more racing," Jerrell said. "We'd race at Paducah (Bluegrass Downs) the middle of June to the middle of July. But the purses were a third of what we were racing for here. Anybody who was racing in overnights (non-stakes races) around here had to be pleased with the meet."

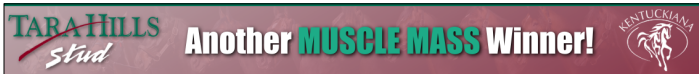
