Hellabalou shoots to victory in 55th Adios

The former longshot delivers the first Adios victory for driver Tim Tetrick, trainer Eddie Dennis and owner Eric Good.

Hellabalou used a pocket trip to pull off an 81-1 upset in a Meadowlands Pace elimination. He worked out a two-hole-journey-with Lightning-Lane-brush to take his Adios elimination. He couldn't possibly fashion another garden trip in the Adios final, could he?

He could and he did, pouring through the Lightning Lane once more to capture the \$375,000 final of the 55th edition of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids Saturday (July 31) at The Meadows. It was the first Adios title for both Hall of Fame driver Tim Tetrick and winning trainer Eddie Dennis. The son of Sweet Lou—Magestic Blue Chip now has banked \$327,136 for owner Eric Good.


Rockyroad Hanover split horses for second, 1-1/4 lengths back, with Water Sports Teen, who did most of the heavy lifting, third. The winning time was 1:48.4.



Hellabalou zipped to the front from post 5 in a snappy :26 but yielded to the pocket when Water Sports Teen and Joe Bongiorno pressed him for the lead. Water Sports Teen was able to resist the first-over challenge of elimination winner Abuckabett Hanover, but the effort left him vulnerable to the inside thrust of Hellabalou. Tetrick said he thought Water Sports Teen would get him to the Lightning Lane.

"I was pretty sure the pocket would hold up," Tetrick said.
"Getting to the quarter in :26 wasn't too bad, and Joe's horse

looked really strong when I let him go. I thought if he could take me there for a little bit, it would be great."

The long, varied and important career of Tom Charters

Teased that he had used up his allotment of pocket trips for the rest of his career, Dennis replied: "I hope I got a couple more coming.

"When I saw him get to the front and Joe was still wide, I thought we were in a good spot because I know he'll shoot up the inside real fast. I told Tim he's as sure-footed as anything you'll ever sit behind. Don't ever worry about him putting in a step."

He said Hellabalou would be pointed to the Hempt Memorial. Hellabalou, bred by Andray Farm and Sergent Stables LLC, was sold for \$42,000 at the 2019 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

In mid-season form at last, Blue Diamond Eyes cruises in Adioo Volo

After beginning the season with six straight losses, **Blue Diamond Eyes** rolled to her second consecutive impressive victory in Saturday's \$106,745 Quinton Patterson Adioo Volo for 3-year-old filly pacers at The Meadows.

Blue Diamond Eyes got away second for Yannick Gingras, who sent her to the point at the quarter. The daughter of Captaintreacherous—Aria Hanover jogged from there, defeating Beach Crazy by 3-3/4 lengths, in 1:49.4, with Darby Hanover third.

Blue Diamond Eyes banked more than \$546,000 last year but was getting checks rather than wins until her 1:49 triumph a week ago in a Pennsylvania Sires Stake leg that matched the fastest-ever distaff mile at The Meadows. Both Gingras and winning training Ron Burke have theories for her slowish start at 3.

"She's been super-sharp all year, but she's been in with a tough group of fillies," Gingras said."

For his part, Burke indicated that it took her until mid-season last year to reach, well, mid-season form.

"She started slow last year," Burke said, "but by the end of the year, she was the best filly racing. She's big, and it takes her a while to get rolling. From here on out, she'll be pretty tough no matter who she races."



Fiftyfour K springs 17-1 upset Friday in Arden Downs

In only his second career start, **Fiftyfour K** showed the poise of a veteran as he toughed out a 17-1 upset victory in Friday's (July 30) \$36,122 Arden Downs Grand Circuit Stake for freshman colt and gelding trotters at The Meadows. **Hustlenomics** captured the other division in the event known as the Robert J. Key.

Winning driver Jim Pantaleano had no idea what to expect from the son of Sebastian K—Westfiftyfirst and so was appreciative of the first-over cover provided by Ginger Tree Brad.

"I looked at the program before the race, and the race wasn't laying the way I thought it would," Pantaleano said. "I quickly grabbed cover when I could. He had a lot of trot the whole way."


Still looming in the Lightning Lane was early leader Guido Di. Fiftyfour K edged him by a head in the good time of 1:56.4, while Ginger Tree Brad saved show. Ron Burke trains Fiftyfour K for Here's To Us Stable.

Hustlenomics showed some poise of his own when his firstover cover blew up in his face. Winning driver Mike Wilder said the Full Count—Glisten Hanover gelding "did everything right."

"He's one of those horses who wants to get into gear real quick," Wilder said. "When his cover broke, he did get into gear quick, but I just stayed with him. I've driven quite a few Full Counts for Marty Wollam, and they're iron horses."

Hustlenomics persevered and downed Rose Run Extra by 1-1/2 lengths, with Armani third. Todd Luther conditions the winner for Black Magic Racing LLC.

Brady Brown piloted four winners on the 13-race card.

Delayed Hanover, Captain Corey win Hambletonian eliminations

Ake Svanstedt trainees won both of Saturday's (July 31) \$50,000 Hambletonian Stakes eliminations for 3-year-old trotters at The Meadowlands Racetrack, with **Delayed Hanover** capturing the first division and **Captain Corey** taking the second.

Svanstedt saw three of his four elimination starters advance to the \$1 million Hambletonian final on Aug. 7 at the Big M, as Ambassador Hanover joined his winning duo.

The top-five finishers from each elimination moved on to the final.

Nancy Takter also had a trio of finalists. Really Fast was second

to Captain Corey while Locatelli and Spy Booth were fifth-place finishers in their respective elims.

Completing the group of 10 horses advancing to the final were Cuatro De Julio, who was runner-up to Delayed Hanover, plus Sonofamistery, Venerate, and Take All Comers.

Elimination winners will draw for post positions one through five. The remaining finalists will go in an open draw after the elimination winners receive their post.

Post positions for the Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks finals will be drawn at 1 p.m. Tuesday (Aug. 3) on Meadowlands Facebook live. Both finals will air live from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Hambletonian Day (Aug. 7) on CBS Sports Network. First-race post time on Hambletonian Day is noon.

In the first elimination, Delayed Hanover won by two lengths over Cuatro De Julio in 1:51.1. Ambassador Hanover, Sonofamistery, and Spy Booth completed the top-five finishers advancing to the Hambletonian final.


Dancinginthedark M, the 4-5 favorite, went off stride on the final turn. Zenith Stride, last year's Peter Haughton Memorial winner, also made a break. On A Streak, the 2020 O'Brien Award winner from Canada, was scratched sick.

Ambassador Hanover led to the first quarter in :27.2 before Cuatro De Julio was put in motion and grabbed the lead in a

:55.1 half. Cuatro De Julio stayed on top through three-quarters, reached in 1:22.4, but was unable to hold off Delayed Hanover in the stretch.

Dexter Dunn drove Delayed Hanover, who was third for most of the mile, for trainer Ake Svanstedt. Ambassador Hanover also is trained by Svanstedt, who handled the driving behind that colt.

"The pace was strong enough; I was happy where I was, we had a good spot there," Dunn said. "(Dancinginthedark M) was outside of us on the last turn and made a break, so we had clear air. We followed (Ambassador Hanover) out in the straight and it felt like he was full of trot. When I moved him over, he certainly was. He showed a lot of speed."

Delayed Hanover has won three of five races this year and four of 12 lifetime, earning nearly \$260,000. He is owned by Mellby Gard Inc. and Ake Svanstedt Inc. He was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and sold for \$230,000 at the 2019 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale.

Sent off at 6-1, Delayed Hanover paid \$14.80 to win.

In the second elimination, Svanstedt-driven Captain Corey got the lead from stablemate Johan Palema in a :27.3 opening quarter and never looked back. He set fractions of :55.3 and 1:23.4 on his way to victory in 1:51.2. Really Fast, the 7-5 favorite, was second followed by Venerate, Take All Comers, and Locatelli.

"I didn't pull up and everybody knows I have a good horse," Svanstedt said about setting the tone with Captain Corey. "He raced (1):50.3 his last start, so he's a good horse. He was the same today. I hope he can be even better with week-to-week races."

Captain Corey is owned by S R F Stable, Knutsson Trotting Inc., Midnight Sun Partners Inc., and Ake Svanstedt Inc. The son of Googoo Gaagaa—Luv U All was bred by Carter Duer and sold for \$150,000 at the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. He has won two of four races this year and seven of 11 lifetime, with career earnings of more than \$400,000.

Sent off at 6-1, Captain Corey paid \$15.40 to win.

Longshots rule in Hambletonian Oaks elims

The 2020 Breeders Crown champion **Lady Chaos** had started the year slowly, winning just once in seven tries. The Cantab Hall—Strong Legacy filly found her "A" game on Saturday night (July 31) at The Meadowlands for driver David Miller, going wire-to-wire in a 1:52.4 clocking to capture the first of two \$35,000 eliminations for the Hambletonian Oaks for

3-year-old trotting fillies.

Miller had Lady Chaos on her toes and drove to the lead alertly at the outset, seating You Ato Dream in the pocket prior to the :27.4 opening quarter. From there, Lady Chaos was able to rate the second quarter kindly in just :29.1 as 2-5 favorite Bella Bellini and driver Dexter Dunn played possum not wanting to advance prematurely and towed rivals into the fray.

Dunn pushed the 'go' button with Bella Bellini and the Bar Hopping filly hit high gear quickly and looked to be trotting right past Lady Chaos as the two accelerated into the final turn. Miller didn't allow that to happen, and Lady Chaos drove on keeping her rival at bay through a :27.4 third quarter.

In the homestretch, it was a match race between the 8-1 Lady Chaos and the heavily backed Bella Bellini with Lady Chaos gamely holding her position to the wire by a head and earning post preference for the \$500,000 final on Aug. 7. Bella Bellini settled for second with You Ato Dream third across the wire. Contested Hanover and Scott Zeron weaved through traffic for fourth and Brian Sears had last year's Jim Doherty winner, Darlene Hanover, airborne in the closing yards to earn the final spot.

Lady Chaos is trained by Linda Toscano for owners Richard Gutnick, Tom Pontone, Joseph Lozito Jr. and Enviro Stables. She was bred by Lindy Farms of Connecticut and AV & Son Bloodstock Inc. and sold for \$125,000 at the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

She returned \$18.60 to win.

"She fought tonight," said Toscano. "So I was tickled with her. She's an absolute pleasure to train."

The second Oaks elimination saw fillies coming from everywhere in the homestretch, but it was Scott Zeron behind 24-1 shot **Awesome Trix** that found the shortest route, skimming the pylons late to score the upset in a 1:52.4 mile.

There was action from the outset as Dutiful left sharply along with Flawless Country and Iteration. Dutiful put Flawless Country in the pocket early but parked Iteration to the :28 first quarter before releasing her. Big City Pearl left from the outside post 10 and found herself parked for Verlin Yoder,

who sent the filly up to challenge through the second quarter. Iteration and Big City Pearl were on even terms through the :56 half with Flawless Country moving up with cover second-over followed by Hot As Hill and 4-5 favorite Donna Soprano in the outer flow.

Brian Sears had Iteration in control at three-quarters in 1:24.1 but horses fanned across the track and sought room between rivals. Iteration was brave fighting off challengers for much of the stretch, but Zeron had been fortunate as the two horses he had been following while fourth on the pylons at the three-quarters fanned out for room that opened up the inside lane for Awesome Trix to utilize. Under Zeron's urging, Awesome Trix hit high gear late for the 1-length victory.

Iteration finished second with Hot As Hill, Flawless Country and Piper Hanover following her across the wire to earn spots in the rich final.

Awesome Trix, a daughter of Trixton—Awesome Chrissy bred by William Jones and Steve Stewart cost \$13,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, the least of the 10 in the field. The filly is owned by trainer Chris Beaver along with Aaron Merriman and Robert McNerney. In winning for the third time this year, Awesome Trix returned \$50.80 to win.

"She interfered a lot as a 2-year-old but had high speed," said Beaver following the win. "She's getting stronger this year and learning to go."

When Dovescry won Saturday's (July 31) \$40,000 fifth round of the Miss Versatility Series for older female trotters, beating Atlanta by a neck in 1:50.4 at The Meadowlands Racetrack. Weslynn Quest finished third.

The 12-horse field was reduced by one when Ab'sattitudexpress was scratched.

Weslynn Quest got the early lead and led to an opening quarter of :27.2. When Dovescry, who was battling for the lead, got to the front just past the quarter but soon saw Next Level Stuff brush to the top spot and take the field to the half in :55.2.

On the final turn, Morairtime, who started from the second tier in post 11, challenged Next Level Stuff for the lead and they reached three-quarters together in 1:23.1. Atlanta, who started from post 12, was second-over behind Morairtime and charged into the stretch looking for the lead. When Dovescry needed room and found it in mid-stretch to power to the front and rebuff even-money favorite Atlanta.

"I was happy to follow (Next Level Stuff); I figured she would take me into the stretch," winning driver David Miller said. "(Morairtime) was on the outside and was still right there at the head of the lane. Right there, I thought, oh, boy. But (Next Level Stuff) drifted and I was able to get up the inside.

"I was impressed, whenever you beat Atlanta. She is probably one of the greatest trotting mares I've been around. She's pretty special. I'm very proud of my mare, she's a really good horse. She's pretty special herself. She had a lot of trot. I've been racing her on the front, and she's good that way, but they always appreciate a trip. She was really good that way."

Miller drove When Dovescry for trainer Brett Pelling and owner John Lengacher. When Dovescry, by Muscle Hill out of Cedar Dove, was bred by William Weaver III. The 5-year-old mare has won 15 of 36 career races and earned \$1.23 million. She was the 2019 Hambletonian Oaks champion.

In no rush to lead leaving from post 8, favorite **Perfect Sting** and driver David Miller relaxed until the stretch of the \$78,700 Tompkins-Geers for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings at The Meadowlands to win in 1:49 on Saturday (July 31).

There was not a lot of action to the half as 43-1 Gamblin Mo rode the pegs to take the lead and cut a :26.4 first quarter, followed by Toronto and Highlandsbeachsbest, who chased in line to a :54.4 half.

Coming to three-quarters in 1:22.2, Whichwaytothebeach came first over to challenge the leading longshot while Perfect Sting followed second over. When the field hit the straightaway, Whichwaytothebeach was pacing a direct path to the finish line, but Perfect Sting was full of pace in the middle of the track and passed under minimal urging to glide home first by two lengths. the public's second choice, finished second in a photo with Highlandbeachsbest while Toronto took fourth.

"Tonight we wanted him to finish up really good, so the opportunity was to get in the hole," Miller said after the race. "And I had a good horse to follow, so that's what we did. I was real happy with him. He paced really good; he fired really good through the stretch. That's something we were looking for."

Joe Holloway trains Perfect Sting, a son of Always B Miki—Shebestingin and the beaten favorite in the clamorous Meadowlands Pace, for owners and breeders Brittany Farms LLC and Val D'Or Farms. His earnings rose to \$841,577 with the win, his third in five starts this season. He paid \$2.40 to win.

Fire Start Hanover successfully downed 2-5 favorite Test Of Faith in a neck-and-neck stretch drive to hand the champion filly her first defeat of the season when winning the \$62,800 Tompkins-Geers for 3-year-old pacing fillies in 1:49.


Dexter Dunn landed Fire Start Hanover in fourth when leaving from post 9 while Test Of Faith, starting from the second tier, tracked her stablemate Staycation Hanover into the first turn to settle into fifth. Passing a :26.4 first quarter, Dunn sent Fire Start Hanover for the lead, with Test Of Faith in tow, and cleared before a :55.2 half.

Into the far turn, Fire Start Hanover begrudgingly yielded the lead to Test Of Faith, but Dunn began to light a fire under the champion filly as he gradually floated his charge from the pocket past three-quarters in 1:22. Once straightening for the finish, Test Of Faith fought gamely to keep Fire Start Hanover at bay, but the Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee nonetheless powered past in the final strides to win by a neck at the beam. Off The Record finished third while Classicist closed for fourth.

"We had to push her out pretty hard to clear a few outside of us, [but] she got out of the gate good though," Dunn said after the race. "I could feel David [Miller] starting to edge [out] there past the quarter, so we made our move and he came with us. She's pretty versatile. She really swelled up when I let David go and she was ready to rock, so I kept her on the helmet round the turn and she did the rest on the straight."

Last year's Dan Patch 2-Year-Old of the Year, Fire Start Hanover has now won 10 races from 17 starts and banked \$678,432 for owners Pinske Stables, David Hoese and Lawrence Means. The Sombeachsomewhere—Fit To Frame filly bred by Hanover Shoe Farms paid \$7.20 to win.

Fire Start Hanover was sold for \$105,000 at the 2019 Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling auction in Harrisburg, PA.

'King' reigns in Peter Haughton eliminations

Robertsin wins the other Haughton elimination; Joviality S wins lone Jim Doherty elim.

The horses are now set for the two marquee 2-year-old trotting events at The Meadowlands on Hambletonian Day (Saturday, Aug. 7) as eliminations got field sizes down to 10 for the \$275,000 (est.) Peter Haughton Memorial for colts and geldings and \$300,000 (est.) Jim Doherty Memorial for fillies Friday night at The Big M.

King Of The North stamped himself as the favorite in the Haughton with an easy score in his elim in 1:56.1 for driver Mark MacDonald and trainer Ray Schnittker. The colt, a son of Walner—Check Me Out, used a quick burst of speed to get by early leader Temporal Hanover heading to the half and tripped that beam in a sleepy :57.3.

The 4-5 favorite maintained the lead from there, recording a 1¼-length win over the pocket-sitting 6-5 second choice Temporal Hanover. The final time was three-and-two-fifth-seconds slower than his lifetime best, much to the delight of his trainer.

"He's like a professional soldier," said Schnittker. "He got cheap fractions, which is good for next week. He didn't have to do much. He just had to brush for an eighth of a mile. I was a little concerned with the horse in the two-hole because I wanted to win so we can get a better post draw for the final."

Elimination winners get to draw for post positions one through six in both the Haughton and Doherty.

"He's a really nice horse," said Schnittker. "He's like a 5-yearold. Hopefully, he gets the job done next week."

Global Pandemic, B A Superhero and Looks Like Moni finished third through fifth, respectively, in the six-horse field (with one scratch) to earn spots in the final.

King Of The North paid \$3.60 to win after upping his stats to four wins from four lifetime starts.

Robertsin (a gelding by Muscle Hill—Sina) won the other Haughton elim in wire-to-wire fashion for driver George Brennan and trainer Nik Drennan. In winning for the first time in four career starts, Robertsin trotted the mile in 1:54.4 after hitting the wire three-quarters-of-a-length to the good and returned \$4.60 to win as the 6-5 public choice.

"I liked him right along," said Brennan. "He's been drawing bad posts [post nine in all three career starts heading into Friday] but he got to see the left side of the starter car tonight [post five] and didn't surprise me at all. He trotted home well into the wind. He's awful good. Winning this race so we could draw a good post for the final was definitely on my mind. You're not just looking to qualify for the final and hope you draw well. I think it's a great way to do it."

Finishing second through ninth, respectively, were Jiggy Jog S, Valentina Blu, Brickhouse Babe, Raised By Lindy, 9-5 favorite Mon Cheval (who went a brutal trip from post 10), Peyton Hanover, Delilah Hanover and Pink Gypsy.

2022 Illinois dates dilemma: Hawthorne is the only applicant for both harness and thoroughbred dates in Chicago

As expected, thoroughbred racing at Arlington International will cease after this year.

As expected, corporate owner Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI) hasn't applied for 2022 racing dates at Arlington International Racecourse, leaving Hawthorne Racecourse as the only applicant for both harness and thoroughbred dates in the Chicago metropolitan area.

Friday (July 30) was the deadline for applications for the dates that will be awarded by the Illinois Racing Board after hearings on Sept. 23.

Hawthorne applied for 365 programs for both the standardbreds and thoroughbreds, an unworkable arrangement because the respective racing surfaces are incompatible and the stable area can't accommodate both breeds simultaneously.

But there was a very good reason for doing it that way. According Jim Miller, the track's director of horsemen's relations, applying for the entire calendar year for both gives Hawthorne the flexibility it needs to come up with a compromise schedule that meets the approval of both the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association (IHHA) and the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (ITHA).

"We've had a great relationship with both groups over the years and I don't expect there's going to be any issues," Miller said. "I expect we'll be meeting over the course of the next few weeks, working in unison to put together a schedule that's going to make the most sense for everybody involved. We want to make sure there are enough opportunities for both thoroughbred and standardbred horsemen in the state of Illinois. We want to have everything in place before the dates hearings."

Tony Somone, executive director of the IHHA, sees the situation in the same light.

"This is something we anticipated — it's what we feared," Somone said. "We're certainly not happy with it but we have to

deal with it. We're going to have to share Hawthorne with the thoroughbred horsemen. We have a terrific relationship and I'm confident that we'll find something that works for everybody.

"We'll have an eye on securing some summer days. Making sure 2-year-olds have a complete racing season is so important to our breeding industry. With that in mind we will meet with the thoroughbred leaders and Hawthorne and come up with an amicable situation for everybody."

It helps that Somone's counterpart at the ITHA, Dave McCaffrey, is a former harness driver and trainer and served as president of the IHHA before becoming the ITHA's executive director.

Currently, Hawthorne is conducting a 63-night harness meeting that began May 7 and will continue through Sept. 26. Racing is held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.

The harness meeting is sandwiched between two thoroughbred meetings at Hawthorne for a total of 53 live days — from March 6-April 25 and from Oct. 1-Dec. 31.

Pari-mutuel harness racing also is scheduled at the two State Fairs — at Springfield on Aug. 13, 14, 18 and 19 and at DuQuoin on Aug. 27 and 28.

What appears to be the last thoroughbred meeting in Arlington's rich history that dates back to 1927 left the starting gate on April 27 and will hit the finish-line on Sept. 30.

While Arlington is synonymous with thoroughbred racing its history book does have a harness racing footnote. In 1976, its dual-breed sister track, Washington Park, perished in a fire and in 1977 and 1978 its harness meeting was moved to Arlington by then-owner Gulf and Western, Corp. Although the two years of racing at the 1 1/8 mile track were neither a financial nor an artistic success, there were a couple of highlights. Future Hall of Fame driver Dave Magee deadlocked Stan Banks for the driver title in 1978 and Hall of Fame pacing mare Silk Stocking set a world record with a time of 1:57.4.

In the 1970s at one time or another 10 tracks in Illinois conducted extended meetings, but there are only two survivors — Hawthorne and downstate Fairmount Park, across the Mississippi River from St. Louis. After running an April 27-Sept. 6 thoroughbred meeting consisting of 63 live days this year, Fairmount wants to expand to 150 programs in 2022 and race from March 12 through Nov. 20.

In the past Fairmount also offered harness racing but ended its involvement after its 1999 meeting and has no plans to offer the sport in the future.

Starting in the mid-1990s Illinois tracks began imploring the legislature to permit casino gambling, remaking them into racinos that would funnel a portion of their revenue into the purse accounts, thereby enhancing the quality of racing.

Arlington's then sole owner Dick Duchossois, who rebuilt the track into what Architectural Digest called the most beautiful racetrack in the world following the 1985 fire that destroyed the clubhouse and grandstand, closed his thoroughbred palace in 1998 and 1999 in what proved to be a successful attempt to

(717) 637-8931 fax: (717) 637-6766 theblackbook.com get significant breaks in taxation. Earlier he had clamored for a "racing industry casino" at Arlington that he said, "would have made Illinois racing the best in the country."

In 2000, Duchossois reopened Arlington and that same year he merged with CDI, making him CDI's biggest stockholder by far. In addition, the CDI board of directors was expanded from 12 to 15 members with Duchossois, his son, Craig, and employee Robert Fealy becoming the new members.

"This day is historical for racing," Duchossois said at the time. "This merger will benefit both Churchill Downs and Arlington and more important, it will strengthen our industry... in both Illinois and North America as well as benefit the horsemen and fans who participate in the sport."

It didn't quite turn out that way.

However, as recently as 2019 it seemed hope was on the horizon after a massive gambling expansion bill was approved and signed by Gov. J.B. Pritzger.

Hawthorne and Fairmount immediately began embarking on racino projects, and Hawthorne's \$4 million venture is targeted for completion late next summer.

But Arlington sent shock waves through Illinois racing by passing up the opportunity to add the casino it had long been pleading for. Parent company CDI said the reason was because the horsemen's cut was too big but the obvious intent was to shield another of its holdings, the nearby Rivers Casino, from competition.

After Neil Bluhm's Rush Street Gaming opened Rivers in 2011 it quickly became the most profitable casino in the state and in 2019 CDI bought a 62 per cent interest.

The offshoot: early this year CDI announced it was selling the 326-acre Arlington property for redevelopment.


CDI chief executive officer Bill Carstanjen prefaced the announcement last summer when he said: "The long-term solution is not Arlington Park. The land will have higher and better purposes for something at some point."

Bidding closed June 15 and, according to CDI, "numerous parties have made offers." On June 17, the National Football League's Chicago Bears confirmed reports that they were among the bidders.

Perhaps not by coincidence five days later the team announced a deal with Rivers Casino to make its digital arm, BetRivers, the team's exclusive sportsbook and casino partner. The Daily Herald conjectured that "Revelations of the sports gambling partnership lends more fuel to long-held speculation that the team might relocate to Arlington Park. And it shows that executives from the Bears and Churchill/Rush Street (Gaming) are already talking."

Reportedly, CDI turned down a \$200 million offer for the racetrack and its casino license, according to an anti-trust complaint filed with the Illinois attorney general's office by the ITHA.

One other group that is led by former Arlington president Roy



Arnold and includes some prominent thoroughbred owners and trainers has bid on the track with the intention of preserving thoroughbred racing there, but it appears to be doomed because of CDIs attempt to make a twin-killing and by destroying Arlington as a racetrack gambling option and, at the same time, wiping out a potential casino rival to Rivers.

Following the 2000 CDI merger, Duchossois, who will turn 100 in October, continued to micro-manage Arlington but in recent years he has assumed a passive role as chairman emeritus at the track. Coinciding with him stepping back in involvement with daily operations, he and his family sold a substantial amount of their CDI stock in 2015 and 2017, going from a 25 per cent interest to a 7.1 per cent holding and relinquished their seats on the board of directors.

While Duchossois has been hailed for his contributions to thoroughbred racing he can't be called a friend of harness racing. In 1988, he acquired the downstate harness track Quad City Downs but discontinued racing following its 1993 meeting.

In retrospect, it appears that the acquisition was made to take advantage of the off-track betting parlor opportunities for Quad City Downs that a newly-enacted law made possible. Following the cessation of racing the track continued to operate as a simulcast outlet until January, 2015.

The closure of Quad City Downs as a racetrack deprived the Chicago tracks of a minor league feeder that produced drivers, trainers and horses. The list includes Magee and McCaffrey.

Chicago harness racing's ongoing dates shortage dilemma began when the sister tracks, Maywood Park and Balmoral Park, were forced out of business because of bankruptcy following their 2015 meetings.

The situation arose after federal investigators wire-tapped a phone conversation between Balmoral president John Johnston and lobbyist Lon Monk, a confidant of former Gov. Rod Blagojevich, during which Johnston emphasized the importance of Blagojevich signing an extension of a casino impact fee bill that had been passed by the state legislature. The bill called for the state's four most prosperous casinos at the time — Harrah's in Joliet, the Empress in Joliet, Hollywood in Aurora and Grand Victoria in Elgin — to allocate a portion of their gross revenue to Balmoral, Maywood, Hawthorne and Arlington to be used primarily for purses.

Monk, in turn, urged Johnston to make a \$100,000 campaign contribution to Blagojevich. Although the contribution never was made, Blagojevich signed the bill shortly thereafter.

Blagojevich was sent to prison for trying to sell U.S. Senate seat vacated when Barack Obama was elected president. The phone conversation between Monk and Johnston was used as evidence of the former governor's corruption, prompting the four casinos to sue Balmoral and Maywood for alleged complicity. They were awarded \$77.8 million in damages, bankrupting the tracks.

At the hearings for 2016 racing dates Hawthorne and Arlington formed an alliance in making a joint schedule proposal. Hawthorne allotted Arlington a portion of its host track revenue from out-of-state simulcasts for purses and, in return, Arlington supported Hawthorne's thoroughbred application

In view of Balmoral and Maywood's bankruptcy, the board denied their dates requests — in effect, shutting them down permanently — and approved the schedule jointly proposed by Arlington and Hawthorne.

The 2019 gambling expansion legislation calls for a replacement in the form of a new harness track/casino to be located in one of six townships in south suburban Chicago, and at the dates hearings in September of that year it seemed as though a racino in the village of Tinley Park was a done deal.

Real estate developer and video gaming magnate Rick Heidner was planning to buy the former Tinley Park Mental Health Center and build a state-of-the-art facility and the Racing Board approved his application for a Dec. 6-29. 2020 harness meeting.


But a month later it was revealed that Heidner had business ties to a banking family with alleged organized crime connections and Gov. Pritzger called off the sale of the property.

Since then the possibility of a new harness racino has been in limbo, leaving Hawthorne as the only game in town for standardbred horsemen and in 2022 thoroughbred horsemen will find themselves in the same unenviable situation.

"It's certainly not going to be perfect for everybody," Somone said, "but we'll come up with an amicable situation for everybody."

Go On Boy defeats Vivid Wise As in Paris

Enghien, not Vincennes, was the Paris track that raced on Saturday (July 31) afternoon and Elitloppet runner up Vivid Wise As made his first start since the trip to Solvalla in May.

Mathieu Abrivard sat behind Alessandro Gocciadoro's Yankee Glide son in \$181,000 Prix de Washington and the duo had to face a first over trip when Jean-Michel Bazire's duo Davidson du Pont and Dorgos de Guez controlled the field in front.

Vivid Wise As got advantage of the race in the last turn and into the stretch, but from behind, Romain Derieux-trained **Go On Boy** (Password) got close and just before the wire the 5-year-old Go On Boy disarmed the new leader and first choice Vivid Wise As.

The Prix de Washington is a mile race and Go On Boy won in 1:52.

Jean-Michel Bazire won the \$95,000 Prix de Milan for 4-yearolds. **Hooker Berry** (Booster Winner) sprinted to safe victory ahead of first choice Helgafell and noted a mile rate of 1:57.1 over 1.3 miles.

Face Time Bourbon races today

Face Time Bourbon, who is back in his home country after an impressive win in Finland two weeks ago, will be aimed northward today (Aug. 1). Mons in Belgium awaits and it's time for the \$140,000 Grand Prix de Wallonie, where Face Time Bourbon will start from post one behind the gate over 1.4 miles.

Big win for Lionel

Biri racetrack in Norway offered a great race card on Saturday (July 31) afternoon and among several nice races, \$45,500 Norwegian Championship was held. An old fighter, 11-year-old **Lionel** (Look de Star) claimed the prestigious win and this was Lionel's third victory in the race.

Owner Göran Antonsen drove the chestnut himself and via a very speedy first half mile, Lionel came to the lead from where he held the opponents behind him in mile rate 1:59.3 over 1.6 miles on a sloppy track.

The \$45,500 Norwegian Championship for mares was held over 1.3 miles and Trond Andersen's **Miracle Tile** (Cantab Hall) took a safe wire to wire victory in 1:59.3.

Bigger purses were at stake in two divisions of the \$69,000 Prinsess Märtha Louses Pokallopp for 3-year-olds. **I.D.Exeptional** (El Diablo B.R.), paired with Ole Johan Östre, came to the lead at an early stage and the duo was outstanding over the stretch. I.D.Exeptional won in mile rate 1:59.4 over 1.3 miles.

Readyforwine (Ready Cash) claimed the win in the fillies' division for Magnus Teien Gundersen. A first over trip didn't stop Geir Vegard Gundersens trotter and the family affair couldn't end better since Geir Vegard (Magnus' father) finished second with Kim B.R. Readyforwine won in a mile rate 2:00.3







The long, varied and important career of Tom Charters

From caretaker to the Hall of Fame.


There cannot be too many individuals who can speak of occupying as many important and especially diversified positions in our sport as newly installed Hall of Famer Tom Charters. What better time than Hambletonian week could it be to speak of the face of the Hambletonian as its president for 20 years.


He is still employed there as its executive vice-president after his "so called retirement." As he said, "Can you imagine being replaced by no one less than the legendary John Campbell? That's the gold standard in harness racing. If that isn't a great honor, I don't know what is."

This scribe has known Charters for over 40 years. But I learned more about him and his experience in our sport in a recent two-hour phone discussion than I knew in all the previous time. This interview will be interspersed with vignettes learned in that discussion and may sometime stray from the person and the story.

Tom Charters began his harness racing career as a teenager working for Dick Hackett, brother of the legendary Jim Hackett, the developer of numerous champions including Best Of All.

While working for Dick, he became friends with John Eades who began his career working for Delvin Miller in Pennsylvania under assistant trainer Foster Walker whose greatest claim to fame might have been as the man who Miller dispatched to California with Meadow Skipper at the end of his 2-year-old season. Mr. Walker's job was to race the colt a few times out there and then have him gelded and prepped for his 3-year-old season. Joe Lighthill became his driver. Foster told him, "he can't leave and hates having dirt hit him in the face, other than that you are on your own." Lighthill hit him and he quickly developed the ability to leave. He equalled Overtrick's season record of 1.59.4, which

was extremely rare for a 2-year-old. The decision to geld him was put on hold. Can you imagine what the breed would be like if they had gone forward with the plan?

But I digress, as I likely often will. Eades was somewhat of a conduit for Charters to Delvin Miller.

Charters wanted to get deeper into the sport and wrote to Miller, who answered with a handwritten note within a few days. Thus began a lifetime association with the best friend a person could have. As Charters said, "For the rest of my life, he was my patron; I never had to look for a job again."

He went to work for Miller as a groom for one summer, but

(717) 637-8931 fax: (717) 637-6766 theblackbook.com was drafted into the army the following winter. He served for 22 months including 10 months in Vietnam before he went back to school. As he describes his experience in Southeast Asia, "I served in the Signal Corps, where I got shot at on occasion, but I wasn't very combative myself."

On returning, he worked three more summers for Miller while attending school in the off season. The best horse he took care of in those days was a Hickory Smoke colt by the name of Spitfire Hanover. The colt was owned by Whitey Ford and Arnold Palmer. He wasn't great, but he was solid and very good. Among his wins were the Yonkers Trot. He was one of Miller's well-known bargain buys. Memory fails me. I know for sure he brought less than \$10,000. He might have even brought less than \$5,000. He was then sold to Italian interests for significant money. To those of you who may have read Ford's autobiography, in it he gives Miller great credit for rescuing him from near financial ruin through his purchase of Spitfire Hanover. He was in bad shape financially and Spitfire came along at the right time.

Of course we got to discussing Delmonica Hanover. Delmonica was given to Charters to take care of. She was a lot of work, but Charters said Aime Choquette thought she was that good and would justify the time spent on her.

"However, she was far from the best 2-year-old filly in the country when I got her," Charters said. "She wasn't even the best filly in the Delvin Miller stable. Yankee Mama and Keystone Bride were significantly better early in the season. Delmonica Hanover had her problems mostly relating to maturity and growth issues. Moving to the big tracks on the western circuit was to bring out the best in her. All along, Aime said, 'Give her time, she will be the best before it's over. She's got the gait."

Charters in his understated way said, "I took care of her for two years, as a 2-year-old and then as a 5-year-old — the only years she didn't win any big races. Bernie DuFour took care of her at 3 and 4."

Although Charters went to Europe with Delmonica in 1975, Choquette went with her to France the previous year, the year that she won the Prix D'Amerique, the first American-owned or trained to win Europe's greatest trot. Charters says that Choquette went because he was a far better horseman and had the experience having been to Paris-Vincennes before with Great Lullwater in 1959. That is probably very much the case. However, the likelihood was partially that Choquette was perfectly fluent in French, his native language.

"The next year I took her to Europe, where she didn't do nearly as well. She did the European Grand Circuit winning a couple of minor prep races in Germany for Hans Fromming. We then went to Berlin, Naples, Milan, Munich and Stockholm. She was getting checks, but she was getting tired. I thought it was because of too many 'first over' trips and too little sitting in holes or allowing her to go on to the top. Can you imagine my effrontery. I told Hans Fromming that. Me telling a man who had won 5,000 plus races before Herve Filion was

probably born how to drive a horse. He took it well, though. He was very nice about my 'advice.' Timothy T was by far the best trotter in the world then. We knew she couldn't beat him. Delvin decided to skip France and we came home. For two years she was great, but I didn't have her. She won the Roosevelt International two years consecutively. I got her back the following year. She won a division of the Maple Leaf Trot and her final start at Hollywood Park in taking her lifetime record of 1.59.2. Can you imagine that? The greatest trotting mare in the world with a lifetime record on 1.59.2. My how things have changed."

One more vignette about Delmonica. It was a few years later. Charters was the assistant racing secretary at The Meadows. Ed Ryan sent him, Tom Rooney and a few others in a mini bus for a picnic in Hanover. We had a cookout at my house and of course visited the Farms. The first item on Charter's agenda was to visit his old friend Delmonica, who was in residence. We dared him to see if he could recognize her. He was sure that he would. There was a field of maiden mares. Charters went in the field and didn't see her. He thought to himself, 'That Murray Brown is trying to pull a fast one on me. She isn't even here.' He approached a mare with a star similar to his old girl's, but stopped when he realized it wasn't her. Then he felt a nuzzle on his hand from behind. Charters hadn't found Delmonica Hanover, but she had found him.

"She always took care of me at least as well as I took care of her," he said.

The plan had been for Miller to give Charters three horses to train and race for himself. However, Charters realized he was a few credits short of getting his degree from the University of Kentucky. So when the mare was retired, Charters flew her back to Meadow Lands Farm in Pennsylvania by way of Lexington, where he jogged her in the morning and went to the library in the afternoon to write the outstanding paper to finish his course work.

He then returned the mare to the farm and went back to Ohio where a surgery interrupted his plan to start that training career of his own.

"I called Delvin and told him I'd be laid up for a while and he'd better give the horses to someone else."

Within days, he got another call from Miller. Kenny Marshall was the racing secretary at The Meadows. Miller thought that he would make a good assistant and that it might open the door to future opportunities. He took it and was Marshall's assistant from 1976 to 1979. That year, Marshall took the now vacant job at Pompano and Detroit when his mentor Bill Connors retired. Charters succeeded Marshall at The Meadows and stayed until 1982.

Gary Buxton called him about perhaps taking the racing director's job at the newly opened racetrack in Macau.

"It will be a great adventure," Buxton told Charters.

Charters decided to do it. He wasn't married. he wanted to

see the world. When he told his bosses at The Meadows, Ed Ryan and Joe Hardy about his decision, they agreed that he should grab it, it was a great opportunity.

"I wasn't sure how to take that," Charters said.

He stayed there for 18 months, extending his initial one-year contract. It certainly was a great adventure. "They built a beautiful track with a great modern grandstand. Unfortunately, that was the first time that I realized that when it came to wagering, most people preferred the nearby casino than they did betting on harness horses. The handle was miniscule.

"The highlight of my tenure was when I received a call from Stan Bergstein asking if we would be interested in hosting the World Driving Championships that year. I presented the proposal to my superiors and they approved it. We got great drivers from all over the world. Robert Cameron from New Zealand eventually won it after he got lost and disappeared in Singapore and Hong Kong en route. Great European drivers who came and are familiar names to North Americans were: Olle Goop, Steel Juul, Pekka Korpi and arguably the best driver ever Ulf Thoreson. Bill O'Donnell was supposed to represent the United States but he ran into passport problems in making it. I received a phone call from Stan Bergstein. 'I've got bad news and good news,' Stan said. O'Donnell won't be able to come, but we got Joe O'Brien to take his place. The news was unbelievable. All the other drivers were excited. They barely knew or knew of O'Donnell at the time, but Joe O'Brien was a legend. In reality, Joe was dying of the cancer that ultimately took his life. As sick as he was, he still performed in the incredibly competitive manner that Joe O'Brien was known for. Little did anybody know it was the very last time that Joe O'Brien would race a horse in competition, or for that matter, according to his step-son Stan Bayless, it was the last place O'Brien ever sat up behind a horse.

"I soon came home. Delvin had sent me a card that said don't do anything about a job until after you speak to me. Because of the slowness of the trans-Pacific mail I hadn't received it by the time I left. He finally caught up with me and told me that a series of races called the Breeders Crowns was in the works. 'I think that you should apply to administer it.' I said 'Sure.' Andy Grant called and advised the same. I was to be interviewed for the position in Florida. There was a special meeting of the Hambletonian Society at Pompano about starting the Breeders Crown and afterwards I was met by John Cashman; there was no interview. The decision had been made. I was going to administer the Breeders Crowns.

"Cashman managed to put together as disparate a group of people imaginable to get together to set up the rules for the new series. Andy Grant, Alan Leavitt, John Simpson and Fred Van Lennep. Some might think that it might be difficult to get these four to agree whether it was night or day. It was quite interesting.

"Early on, I was lucky enough because of a series of incredible circumstances to have the opportunity to hire Moira Fanning as my colleague.

Harness Racing Update

"Andy Grant had been president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society succeeding Max C Hempt. In June 1998 he called me and said that he was ready to step down as president and was going to recommend me to succeed him.

"I was elected by the board. It has been quite a ride for the 20 plus years since.

"I'm proud of the many accomplishments during my three-and-a-half decades with the Society. We established the Breeders Crown and maintained and enhanced the Hambletonian as the premier event in our industry. We also resurrected the Hambletonian Maturity for 4-year-olds — now renamed, the E.T, Gerry Jr. Hambletonian Maturity. There were others, many critical issues for the industry, including expanding the Society's portfolio of serviced races throughout the industry.

"We also took on the lesser 'fun' tasks such as identifying the colors of the winning drivers of the Hambletonian, not easily accomplished when the first four decades of the race were recorded in black and white.

"Lastly, as a former groom, I also attempted to identify the caretakers of the Hambletonian winners. We already had the grooms of the Breeders Crown champions, but the Hambletonian, the Oaks and the Maturity were more of a challenge, especially from the early years. We completed the Oaks, got most of the Maturity and to date identified 90 of the 96 Hambletonian champions. Still working on those last six."

It all culminated with your installation in the Hall of Fame three weeks ago. How did you feel about that?

"I was and am overwhelmed. I have to give all the credit for it to harness racing and Delvin G Miller, the greatest man I've ever known."

Tom, you've been fortunate to have known most of the harness greats of the last couple of generations. How about a few words in no particular order on some of them?

Aime Choquette — "A great horsemen and a wonderful person. He was one of the five people I mentioned my Hall of Fame induction speech for any of the success I've enjoyed."

Norman Woolworth — "We all wish we had Norman's life. Few people enjoyed life and harness racing more."

Ebby Gerry — "A great leader. When Ebby Gerry speaks people listen. If they didn't, they missed the boat.

Andy Grant — "Someone who understood and respected precedent and duty. A mentor that I spoke with several times a day for two decades."

John Cashman – "Loved and understood more facets of the sport than anyone I've known."

Margareta Wallenius Kleberg – "Makes going to Sweden

a joy. She has contributed more to Swedish and to a lesser degree American breeding and racing than anyone I know. It was Margareta's idea to add the two 2-year-old trots to the Hambletonian Day card which enhances our International simulcast."

Moira Fanning — "Someone who I have been fortunate to have known, helped by and worked with for the largest part of my career. She is a great asset not only to the Society but also our entire sport."

Jim Simpson – "A hard worker. Very hands on. I've known Jim since we were both in the shedrow."

Frank Antonacci — "Very practical. He and his family have been committed to the sport for more than half a century."

Mike Kimelman — "Persistent. Pragmatic. As you told me quoting his father Oscar, 'My son will come up with 20 ideas, 19 of them will be crazy, but the remaining one will hit it out of the park."

Ted Gewertz — "A great mind. You don't realize how brilliant he is until you've worked with him."

Fred Hertrich III – "His perspective from being head of the Breeders' Cup brings great knowledge to the society."

More Love You and a story

I'm still preoccupied with Love You, the French trotting supersire. Mr. Stefan Fredriksson, of Sweden was kind enough to send me the racing histories of Love You's first three dams. They're in French and I haven't quite mastered all the details yet, but it's clear they were all successful race mares. Not surprisingly, they were all bred, trained, and driven by Jean Pierre DuBois, one of the greatest horsemen in every aspect of training, driving, and

breeding standardbreds the world has ever seen.

As this kid pointed out last time around, Love You has a lot of American blood. Mr. Fredriksson was good enough to quantify it. Love You actually has 56.61 per cent American blood in his pedigree, as opposed to 43.39 per cent French blood.

But, more importantly, Love You is a rare example of a stallion who is blessed with about as stacked a genetic deck as we'll ever see. If you imagine a horse's genetic makeup as a deck of playing cards, which determines his ability to sire speed, it runs from a low card of "two" to a high card of "ace." Love You's genetic card range probably starts with a "10" and goes straight up from there.

Every foal's genetic inheritance comes in equal parts from his sire and his dam. With Love You as the sire, every foal he sires starts life with a genetic high card, or speed gene. All the dam has to do is provide a middle range genetic card, say an "eight", and the average of those two cards, or speed genes, is going to be a fast horse. Which is what a preponderance of Love You's progeny are, fast horses.

Where this gets interesting to us, the standardbred breeders of America, is when you add Moni Maker to the mix.

Moni Maker, at one time, was the greatest money-winning race mare of all time, of all racing breeds. But as a broodmare, with one striking exception, she was the living proof that the phenotype, or visible horse, has no connection to the genotype, or invisible, genetic makeup. In plainer words, Moni Maker's greatness on the racetrack didn't have anything to do with her level of ability to reproduce fast offspring.

That fact was proven again and again, as Moni Maker's first eight foals, all sired by a variety of top American trotting sires, were nothing special on the racetrack. Only two of them won more than \$50,000, and they eked out \$146,059 and \$80,375, respectively. But then, in 2013, she was bred, for the only time, to Love You, and the result was a colt appropriately named International Moni.

He took a record of 1:51.3 at three, and earned \$775,463. However, both his earnings and his rep would be so much higher if he had not suffered fatal interference in the final of the Hambo. He had won his elimination decisively, and if memory serves me right, he was the betting favorite in the big dance, but bad racing luck struck him down.

An in-depth look at International Moni's pedigree provides an interesting insight. He is technically line-bred to Speedy Crown, but it's a 2 by 5 link. You'll remember, when the same name appears twice and the sum of the generations in which it appears is five or six, then the horse with such a cross is defined as inbred. When the sum of the generations is seven or eight, a horse so bred is defined as line bred. Any sum of the generations where the same name appears twice is higher than eight is defined as an outcross pedigree.

This kid must confess that a 2 by 5 cross is something he has not seen frequently in more than 60 years in the biz, but, as they say, live and learn. In any case, International Moni went into the stud in 2019, at Hanover Shoe Farms, and he was bred to full books of 140 mares in both his first two years. His first crop sells as yearlings this fall.

It is not my job to write ads for any horse, and I'm not going to write one now for International Moni. What I can say is if International Moni makes it as a sire, he will open up a whole new breeding line for the American trotter.

On a different note, last Saturday I golf-carted over to the Junior League Horse Show at the Kentucky Horse Park for stakes night. I was lucky to run into Randy Cates, a top saddle horse trainer who used to help us out with yearling prep. Randy is a second generation saddle horse trainer, and his dad, Royce Cates, was someone I knew during my show horse days.

Royce Cates was a crackerjack horseman, but he was also a terrific promoter. He started out in California, and he was the one who got Bill Shatner into the show horse game. He actually sold Bill Shatner his first horse, which resulted in Bill's lifelong attachment to saddle horses, which is still alive and well today.

But I still remember quite well a Royce Cates story from the

time both of us were young and showing horses. Royce, at the time, was operating out of a barn in South Carolina, where there were horse shows every weekend for at least six months of the year. Royce's specialty was road horses, which are registered standardbreds trained for the show ring.

The usual thing at most of those horse shows was to use one of the local trainers as the judge.

In the particular year I'm talking about, Royce had a nice roadster who was his pride and joy, and had gone through most of the summer undefeated.

Then came a show at Thomasville, where the judge was a fellow trainer named Billy Grubbs, and he tied Royce's roadster second in the roadster stake.

Two weeks later, their positions were reversed, with Royce the judge at East Martin and Billy Grubbs was there with his string of horses. Billy was a little nervous about showing in front of Royce, so he sought him out before the show started.

"Royce, old buddy," he said, "I sure hope you ain't mad about where I tied your road horse at that other show."

"No, Billy, I ain't mad," Royce said with a smile. "But I haven't forgotten, either."

Sabine Spring – trainer, owner, race official

Born in Munich, Germany, this edition's Superstar moved to the United States in 1999 and got a job working for Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter as a caretaker.

The fact that her family was not involved in harness racing didn't deter the young girl from trying something completely

out of her element, and it didn't take long before Sabine Spring would excel in every sector of the industry that she went into.

"Horses have always been my love and passion, and whether it's owning, training, riding, placing retirees in forever homes, or working on the backside as a racing official, I am living out my dream and doing exactly what I always wanted to do."

So how did this German girl get involved in harness racing?

"A horse named GERMER is the one responsible that sparked my interest in being involved in harness racing. He was a trotter who came right off the track and my sister and I bought him as our riding horse. He was a goofy guy who I will never forget.

"I had many other horses in Germany, such as millionaire KANO COMFORT and Derby winner SPEEDY HARRY.

"I was fortunate to work with some really nice horses in Germany and travel across Europe to race them. Millionaire Kano Comfort and Derby Winner Speedy Harry have been two of the most outstanding trotters I've had the honor and blessing to work with.

"After working for Takter, I got a job at Joie De Vie Farm in New Jersey. It was there that I met my husband and the plan of my staying a few months in the United States turned into

permanently living here.

"It was great working at the farm for I got a chance to work with some really, really good ones, such as AVA, DREAM ANGEL, EXCUSEZ MOI and TONY CHIN. We developed other nice youngsters as well.

"I've always enjoyed working with the young ones, but today I have mostly teenagers who have a lot of wisdom.

"The most prominent amongst my retirees are: champion trotter SEVRUGA, THEHEARTOFCONFUSION A (who was recently adopted out a few days ago) and multiple winners who earned several hundred thousand dollars during their racing careers; now enjoying their retirement eating green grass and exploring the trails.

"I currently have 10 retired standardbreds; the majority of which are available for adoption after transitioning into riding horses. They reside at a farm I'm leasing in Pennsylvania.

"Horses are wonderful, intelligent animals and standardbreds are exceptionally versatile. I love seeing them show the world what they are capable of doing besides racing.

"The breed is incredibly smart, willing to learn and please, level headed, and hardy.

"The mandatory retirement age for standardbreds is 15, but many retire way before that due to not being competitive enough to pay the bills, or sustaining injuries that require more time to heal then their owners can afford.

"Most trainers and owners are caring and want to be sure their horses will go to loving homes in their second careers after retired from racing. I'm often contacted by the horsemen/ horsewomen to take their horse to rehab to transition them to racing so they can be adopted out.

"Over the years I've had many standardbreds who ended up at auctions and kill pens across the United States after they no longer could work on Amish farms as buggy horses. I always try my best to keep one or two and save them from that horrific trip across the borders.

"I wish I could save them all, for they all deserve another chance, but it's impossible.

"It's amazing how the horses saved from the kill pen blossom with TLC and proper nutrition. The vast majority of kill pen horses are useful for riding and driving and make exceptional family horses after they've had time to bounce back from nutrition and neglect.

"All the horses go on an adoption contract and will come back to me should their owner no longer care for the horse. Through this life-fulfilling endeavor, I have met many wonderful people and made good friends with many adopters. Seeing the horses being well cared for and happy is one of the most rewarding things in life and why I do this."

Spring makes time in her busy life to place retired racehorses into loving, forever homes. She is one of several 'angels' who place horses who can no longer race; and steers them into a new career.


Besides owning and training horses, Spring has worked as the assistant paddock judge at Harrah's Philadelphia from 2006 through 2020 and began working as assistant race secretary at Pocono Downs in February 2021.

"My job as assistant race secretary includes taking entries each day; assisting in putting together the races; taking and directing phone calls, and processing claims placed on horses in claiming races," she said.

Today, she resides in Ashley, PA with her husband and horses.



Things don't always work out

Not every plan works out. A year ago, I had an idea. The format was straightforward. Find an online chat group, an online newsletter, or a Facebook group devoted to a specific illness. At the time, I had a yearling to donate to this group of people who probably knew nothing about the sport. My thinking was to rename the yearling related to the illness, introduce myself in a posting, and give the audience a reason to pay attention by posting the horse's progress each week on the site. Any winnings would be donated to research on the disease. (*See a snippet of the concept below).

The plan required a trainer willing to work at a reduced rate and an entity ready to pick up the training costs and additional expenses. I threw a few lines into the water but did not get a bite in the somewhat tricky spring/summer of 2020 when racing was in quarantine. Time ran out, and the idea got shelved. I failed. So what? Failure is just another chance to try again.

Just as Parkinson's is a journey, so is each young horse like Stirred Not Shaken. Consider this note an invitation to take every step of his journey updated monthly in this newsletter. The trip will be fun. The explanations will be easy to follow. Satire, videos, and bad jokes will be part of the presentation. Any money earned will go towards research.

Should you have questions as the adventure trots along, I will clearly answer them. There will be video clips, and we might even try to arrange opportunities for you to meet Stirred Not Shaken. If all goes well, you can attend his races or watch them on your computer.

Next month, you will receive a second email where you will meet Stirred Not Shaken...

That initiative did not fly. Who cares? The concept could take flight at another time or in another form. I do not regret trying. Here is what I do regret: For a decade, my brother-in-law, Ryan, battled a different disease, multiple myeloma. Each month I drove him to receive treatments. Our conversations did not always flow like water, so we returned to common ground. He leaned into his illness, treatment and family. I headed towards sports, especially harness racing.

I regret not trying harder to steer him into our game. Ryan was a bright, curious guy. When he got his teeth into something, he was fascinated, but he was painfully introverted and risk averse. He would have enjoyed our game if the first few dances were

risk-free. I should have made a detour to the breeding farm after one of his treatment trips and said:

"Ryan, I raised this trotter and have decided to race him. He is heading to a trainer at a training track in two weeks. On January 1, he will turn 2 because all horses born in a calendar year turn 2 on the first day of the year. In June or July, if we are lucky, he will race for money, probably not a lot of money, but who knows. There are plenty of hurdles and lessons that this horse needs to learn between now and his first race. I'm going to take you out to see the lessons once each month after your treatment and then to see him race if he makes it to the racetrack.

"Ten per cent of any purse money he earns is going to your one-year-old grandson. You don't pay a damn thing except for your attention. Your job will be to listen to me babble about the sport, ask questions, and read some stuff I will forward to you."

Why this did not cross my mind during his years of treatment is a mystery to me. Racing for others makes participants feel good. Technology can open doors for people to find the joys of our sport. If you find a person or a group of people willing to pay attention, give them a nudge. If you can physically get to racetracks and farms, that's great. If not, in this era, people can experience us in pixels. Seeing what we see in this sport can be good medicine for people. Why not give them a nudge? Maybe they become fans and owners; perhaps they do not.

You will never know unless you try.







Twin B Archie makes winning debut in Gold Series

Twin B Archie made an impressive debut in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Thursday (July 29), clocking a 1:55.3 victory in the first of three \$70,533 divisions for the 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings.

From Post 1, driver James MacDonald settled the fan favorite in fourth as Drinks At Home clocked a :28.1 opening quarter. Following Red Overbach past Renegade Gypsy and Drinks At Home, MacDonald allowed that colt a brief moment on the lead before Twin B Archie took command heading for the :57.1 half. Untroubled on the lead through the 1:26.3 three-quarters, Twin B Archie opened up a seven and one-half length margin on his peers down the stretch to secure his first lifetime win after runner-up efforts in the Grassroots and Millard Farms Series. Drinks At Home finished second and Red Overbach was third. (replay here: Twin B Archie)

"I was a little worried when he moved him to the front because he's never been any good training on the front, so I was kind of impressed with him today," said trainer Scott McEneny. "He looks like he could be hopefully a contender here for the year if we can keep him sound and keep him sane."

The Puslinch, ON resident shares ownership of Twin B Archie with Domenic Chiaravalle of Hamilton, Floyd Marshall of Jarvis and Martwest Racing Stable of Mississauga, ON. The partners offered up \$52,000 for the Archangel gelding at last fall's Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale and he has been a bit of a project since Day 1.

"He's a big dummy. They had problems when they brought him in before they sold him, that's why he was gelded before he even went through the sale. He just gets scared and does stupid things," said McEneny. "Walking to the paddock one day in the snow he heard somebody kicking the walker and he darted sideways and dragged me for like 20 feet on the ground.

"He's come a long way. I always thought he had the ability, he just never kind of showed it, he was always lazy, but I figured as soon as he got behind the gate he'd wake up. He's just

done everything that I thought he would do."

The second division saw **Esplosione** earn his second straight Gold Series win with an off-the-pace effort for driver Trevor Henry. Also starting from Post 1, the Kadabra gelding watched from fourth as fan favorite Luca Hanover reeled off a :27.4 quarter, :58.1 half and 1:28.1 three-quarters. When Henry opened the throttle in the stretch Esplosione powered away to a three and one-quarter length victory in 1:57.4. Mr Fritter finished second and Luca Hanover settled for third. (**replay here: Esplosione**)

"He does it really easy, like Trevor the last two weeks he hasn't had to pull the plugs or anything. He's just very professional, when he comes off cover he just wants to go forward," said trainer Meg Crone. "And he's really smart, which helps a lot with a 2-year-old trotter."

Crone trains Esplosione for owner/breeder Melvin Hartman of Ottawa, ON and trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman's Enzed Racing Stable Inc. of Allentown, NJ. A 1:58.2 winner in the July 8 Gold Series season opener, the gelding prepped for Thursday's leg in a well-attended schooler at Woodbine Mohawk Park last week.

"There was no race for him so we had to end up schooling him last week and it was funny, almost every horse in his race was in his schooler because they were in the same boat," said Crone, who may resort to the same strategy before the third Gold Series event on Aug. 19 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. "This was his fourth start and we'll try to get one more, but we don't want to have too many because we'll probably try the Grand Circuit races with him."

The last \$70,534 division saw favorites **Duly Resolved** and driver Paul MacDonell pick up their second Gold win with a front end effort from Post 7 that saw them log fractions of :28.2, :58.1 and 1:27.4 on the way to a four and one-half length victory in 1:56. HP Maestro finished second and Century Isaiah completed the top three. (**replay here: Duly Resolved**)

"I still get nervous, but I was impressed tonight. I mean truthfully it's hard to get a read on him because he's fairly laid back and so you're saying, 'Geez, has he got any more or not?'" said trainer John Bax. "I mean last time was 1:57 and you're thinking, 'Was he all out in 1:57?' And then he goes out there in 1:56 tonight and he looks like he's just loafing. We're tickled."

Bax Stable of Campbellville, Don Allensen of Wyoming, Gaelic Stable of Sharon, ON and David Hudson of Dallas, TX share ownership on the gelding, who is three for three with earnings of \$93,067 in his young career.

OSS action returns to the Campbellville oval next Friday, Aug. 6 with the third Gold Series Leg for the three-year-old trotting fillies.

Three freshman colt pacers stay perfect in Buckeye Stallion Series

Three 2-year-old colt pacers made it two-for-two through the first two legs of the Buckeye Stallion Series at Eldorado Scioto Downs Thursday (July 29). Five divisions were contested, each with purse of \$17,500.

After the dust cleared **Dirge**, **Moved Bythe Spirit** and **Western Ready** found the winner's circle.

Moved Bythe Spirit (Western Vintage) battled to remain perfect in the series. Moved Bythe Spirit was fifth and went first

up to win by two lengths. The gelding is trained by Timothy Lane and was driven by Jeremy Smith.

Trainer Virgil Morgan Jr scored with **Fear No More** (Fear The Dragon) in 1:54.4 with Mitchell Cushing. The colt trailed the field of eight and moved with cover to score by a neck.

The final winner of the night was **Robin's Art** (Art Official) who is owned and trained by Kent Saunders. The gelding with Roy Wilson driving was hung a good part of the mile but got up to win by a head.

Archery Seelster equals Hiawatha track record in Grassroots win

Hiawatha Horse Park played host to the 2-year-old trotting colts for Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots action on Saturday (July 31) and, for the second straight year, the colts were flying around the Sarnia oval.

The speed show started early as Archery Seelster tied the 2-year-old trotting colt track record in the first \$21,800 division. Starting from Post 7 with Bob McClure in the race bike, Archery Seelster eased away from the starting gate and was sitting sixth when Mass Attack reached the :28.4 quarter. As Mass Attack continued through a sharp :59.2 half and 1:28.1 three-quarters, McClure kept Archery Seelster out of trouble in the outer lane before turning the colt loose in the stretch. Archery Seelster powered home to a 1:59.4 victory, three-quarters of a length in front of Mass Attack. Usurp Hanover was three lengths back in third and favorite Lexus Ranger was fourth.

The mile equalled the track record set by Fashion Frenzie in Grassroots action at the Sarnia oval last July.

"He's a good-gaited colt, suited well for the smaller tracks," said McClure. "He's still green so he should improve."

Trainer Marcel Barrieau of Cambridge, ON and Gestion Mastel Inc. of Longueil, QC share ownership of Archery Seelster, who was an \$85,150 purchase out of last fall's London Virtual Yearling Sale. The Wheeling N Dealin colt missed the July 15 Grassroots season opener due to sickness, but Barrieau said the youngster was a solid performer all winter. Saturday's outing was Archery Seelster's third and he now boasts a record of one win, one third and one fourth.

"He's a very mild-mannered colt and never ever done nothing wrong. I just hope he can go fast enough, that's all," said Barrieau. "I didn't want to throw him in the 'A's' right away because I like giving them a couple of starts before I do that, it proves to me that they are good enough. I'll try him in another Grassroots and maybe a Gold after."

The 2-year-old trotting colts will make their third Grassroots start at Kawartha Downs on Aug. 7.

McClure also captured the third \$22,150 division with favorite **Mask Of Zoro**, who sat third through the :29 quarter and 1:00.1 half put up by Rolling In Clover and then took command. On top by a comfortable margin at the 1:29.4 three-quarters, Mask Of Zoro pulled away from his peers in the stretch, reaching the wire four and three-quarter lengths ahead of Rolling In Clover in 2:00.1. Unresolved Debt finished third

"He's a very nice colt," said McClure. "He's not built like a

two-year-old, physically or mentally. He's all racehorse and a very powerful colt."

McClure piloted Mask Of Zoro to his first lifetime win for trainer Benoit Hebert of Papineauville and Eric Lafleur of Gatineau, QC, who purchased the Muscle Mass son for \$12,000 out of the 2020 Ontario Select Yearling Sale. With Saturday's win and a third-place finish in the Grassroots season opener, Mask Of Zoro currently sits atop the two-year-old trotting colt standings with 62 points.

Driver Trevor Henry won the other two Grassroots divisions, quiding **Stonebridge Zeus** and **P C Double Down** to victory.

Starting from Post 5 in the second division, Stonebridge Zeus watched from fifth as Northern Ironman rolled through fractions of :29.1, 1:00.2 and 1:31.1. Turning for home Henry found the colt an open lane and Stonebridge Zeus powered by the leaders to a 2:02 victory. Sir Ballykeel was one-half length back in second and Arch Ruler was another length back in third. Favorite Livingontherail finished seventh.

"He got a really good trip," said Henry. "He squeezed out at the head of the stretch and when he got room he raced good."

Henry engineered the win for trainer Blake MacIntosh of St. George, Van Camp Trotting Corp. of Port Perry, ON and Mortgage Boys Stable of Fayetteville, NY, who offered up \$20,000 for the Resolve son at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. The win was the first lifetime for Stonebridge Zeus, who finished eighth in the Grassroots season opener.

"We were high on him all winter and now he's just starting to show what we thought he could be," said MacIntosh, noting that the colt was a little behind his peers after missing about three weeks of training due to sickness. "We're hoping he just keeps improving, and keeps going forward and shows us the speed we think he has."

Henry wrapped up the Grassroots action with P C Double Down, going gate-to-wire from Post 1 for a 2:00.2 score. The fan favorite battled to the wire, keeping a neck in front of Down The Fence and Guinness.

"I drove him last week (July 15) and he raced good. Today he dug in at the wire to win," said Henry. "I thought he would have win a little easier, but they rushed him the whole way, three-quarters in 1:28.4."

Amy and Curtis Clements of Dobbinton, ON bred and own P C Double Down and Curtis handles training duties on the son of Il Sogno Dream, who earned his first victory with the effort. The gelding was sixth in the season opener.

Red Mile ready for today's state-bred showdowns

Freshmen trotting colts and fillies will be the first to spar in the month-long Kentucky Champion Series, which annually attracts Kentucky-bred horses from across the country. Today's (Aug. 1) first round features four total divisions, going each for \$40,000.

Conditioner Tony Alagna sends the morning-line choice in the opening division for colts and geldings, carded as Race 1, with Gigondas, a Brad Grant-owned colt by Trixton. He leads a seven-horse contingent off a 1:55.3 off-the-pace score in a \$15,000 prep for the Kentucky Championship Series held on July 19. He'll start from post 3 with Andrew McCarthy in the sulky.

Just outside of Gigondas starts a pair of New Jersey-sired underdogs. The first, Bully Boy Hill from post 5, enters off a pair of runner-up finishes – one coming to Peter Haughton favorite King Of The North – as well as a ninth-place finish in the New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) final. The second, Ken's Walner from post 6, will try to break his maiden off a third-place finish in his NJSS debut and a fourth-place effort in the opening preliminary of the Kindergarten.

Division two, going as Race 9, for the males gathers eight trotting competitors led by Keg Stand, a Nancy Takter trainee listed as the 2-1 favorite on the morning line. Dexter Dunn retains the drive on the Bar Hopping colt with four starts to his credit this season, a pair of those being victories against Pennsylvania-sired competition. He races for owners Black Horse Racing, Christina Takter and John Fielding, and will try to rebound following a fifth-place finish where he faltered on the lead in a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes division.

Inside Keg Stand scores a strong pair. From post 2, Tony Alagna sends Majestic J following a third-place effort in the NJSS final after sweeping the first two preliminaries. David Miller steers that Walner colt for owner Kenneth Jacobs and starts just inside of Iwon't Backdown As, the Anette Lorentzon-trained gelding by Lionhunter who won on debut at 12-1 in an Indiana Sires Stake in 1:56.3. Tim Tetrick drives that gelding from post 3 for owner ACL Stuteri Ab.

The first division for fillies will complete the early Daily Double with a full-field of 10 spanning across the red clay. Trainers Tony Alagna and Nancy Takter again have the likely public choices, with Alagna sending 5-2 shot More Than Ever and Takter sending 2-1 favorite Selfie Queen. More Than Ever enters off a runner-up finish in the Kindergarten Series to Selfie Queen, who – in her first start with hopples – uncorked a :26.4 final quarter going first over to win in 1:54.2. Dexter Dunn pilots the Muscle Hill filly for Takter while Tim Tetrick gets the call behind Alagna's Father Patrick debutante.

Batch two of the Kentucky Championship fillies start in Race 8 with another full field going to gate. In a tighter betting contest on the morning line, Nancy Takter trainee American Beauty has the slight nod with a 7-2 listing. The Walner filly, a homebred out of Hambletonian Oaks winner All The Time for Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, enters off a 1:55.4 victory in the Kindergarten following a sharp rally in the second NJSS prelim, firing home in :27.2 to finish fifth. Dexter Dunn will drive the filly from post 5.

Trainer Chris Beaver sends the second choice on the morning line, Disclosure, from post 8. The Trixton filly has flaunted late sped through the NJSS, ripping sub-:28 final quarters in each prelim along with a :27.1 kicker to take the \$25,000 consolation on July 16. Dan Noble grabs the drive on the Trixton filly owned by The Delaware Group, Equinex Racing Corp and Joe Sbrocco.

Today's 14-race card in Lexington also features six divisions of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series – three for the boys and three for the fillies. First-race post is 1 p.m. (EDT).

On Monday (Aug. 2), pacing colts, geldings and fillies are set to compete in their opening round of the Kentucky Championship Series, which will go in a total of three \$40.000 divisions.

Monday's card opens with the lone dash for pacing fillies – an event that aligns six behind the gate. Tony Alagna pupil Dont Fence Me In starts as the slight morning-line choice from the pylon post over Ron Burke's Downbytheseaside filly Sloopy, who goes as the second choice and starts widest of the sextet. Dont Fence Me In enters off a gate-to-wire score in 1:52.3 in the opening round of the Kindergarten while Sloopy starts following a pair of off-the-pace check grabs in the Ohio Sires Stakes. Dexter Dunn pilots Alagna's Captaintreacherous filly while Yannick Gingras will sit behind Sloopy.

Colts and geldings cap the early Daily Double with their first division of the Championship Series, led by Caviart Farms' homebred Caviart Camden. The Huntsville colt has two victories to his credit from three starts, the most recent an off-cover win in 1:52.2 with a :26.1 final quarter. Yannick Gingras retains the drive on the Tony Alagna trainee and will start from post 5 in the seven-horse field.

Inside of the morning-line choice starts Pebble Beach, who went a hard-luck trip on debut in an Ohio Sires Stakes event at Northfield but followed that effort with a powerful stretch kick to win in 1:51.1 at The Meadowlands. Todd McCarthy sits behind the Downbytheseaside colt for trainer Noel Daley and will score from post 1.

Todd McCarthy returns in the afternoon's seventh race to pilot the second-division favorite I Did It Myway, who also starts from the pylon post. The Tony Alagna-trained colt by Captaintreacherous is undefeated from three starts – his first victory coming in a division of the Geers at The Meadowlands and his other two in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes competition. He competes against five others including a pair listed at 3-1

in Indiana invader Western Era, who enters off a 1:52.2 victory in a state-sired event, and Chris Ryder trainee Vicious.

Monday's 11-race card also features five \$20,000 divisions for the Kentucky Commonwealth Series, three for colts and geldings and two for fillies. First-race post time is at 1 p.m. (EDT).

Freshman pacing colts to visit Monticello Raceway

Four divisions of New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) featuring 2-year-old pacing colts are on tap at Monticello Raceway for Monday, Aug. 2. Each division is worth \$25,000. The 11-race card also includes three Excelsior A class, each racing for a purse of \$15,000, and two Excelsior B events, vying for \$6,600 in each dash. This marks the third NYSS event of the year for the two-year-old colts, and a few have already distinguished themselves as the real deal.

The first Sire Stake is carded as Race 3. Pleaseletmeknow comes into the race with an excellent resume: in four lifetime starts, he has won three. The son of American Ideal was a Sire Stake winner his last start at Saratoga in 1:55.4, a second in NYSS action at Buffalo, and was a heat and final winner of the Springfield Series. He's banked \$109,000 thus far this season. He will start from the rail with regular driver Matt Kakaley for trainer Travis Alexander. Forrest Blu (PP2 – Tyler Buter) and Top Genius (PP4 – Jordan Stratton) both won their respective Sire Stakes at Buffalo in their last start.


