Catch The Fire (3, Mike Wilder) barely held off a late charge from Chief Mate to win in 1:49.3.

Chief Mate rallied for second at 50-1 while the hard-used No Lou Zing was third. The winning time over a sloppy surface was 1:49.3.

This 54th edition of the Pace for the Orchids likely was the most unusual thanks to COVID-19 restrictions. Usually jam-packed stands seated only a handful of invitees. The apron, usually rocking with fans and live bands, was eerily silent. The presumptive heavy favorite, Papi Rob Hanover, was out of the final with a season-ending injury. As usual, though, the horses provided more than enough drama to make up for any missing elements.

After Elver Hanover seized the early lead from post 9, Wilder and Catch The Fire quarter-poled to the point where they faced a backside challenge from No Lou Zing.

"I was really worried about that horse," Wilder said. "He

went a humongous trip in the elimination. He showed he can take a lot of air. I couldn't shake him, and then a whole heard of them came at me. But my horse dug in. He's true grit."

Five horses remained live in deep stretch, but none could reach Catch The Fire, the 9-5 wagering favorite off his elimination win last week. Last year's Kentucky Sires Stake champion, Catch The Fire soared over \$400,000 in career earnings.

Charlie Taylor of CT Stables purchased Catch The Fire at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale for the bargain-basement price of \$15,000. Ackley was so sure that Catch The Fire would go too dearly that he left the auction ring for a sandwich, only to return and find himself the trainer of a son of Captaintreacherous—Dream Outloud bred by Dr. Fred Kruszelnicki of Alberta.

It was the biggest career win for driver Mike Wilder and it came at his home track with his entire family present.

Ackley, who trains a small stable at Ohio's Fayette County Fairgrounds and operated a forklift for 20 years before switching to racing, called the Adios victory the highlight of his career.

"It's a big win, to have a horse that can compete at this level and win," Ackley said. "No way I could have imagined this; it's fantastic."

For Wilder, the triumph was even more emotional. An Ohio native who has been a fixture at The Meadows for many years, Wilder and his family are exceptionally active in many aspects of racing and the community. His wife, Heather, who has done broadcasting work for HRU, is a popular interviewer on harness shows while serving as president of the United States Harness Writers Association Keystone Chapter. Their teenage daughters, Scarlett and Lauren, also are active in USHWA. Yet, even though Mike has amassed more than 8,300 career wins, he had never finished better than fourth in an Adios final. He choked up as he tried to describe his emotions.

"This means the world to me," Wilder said. "The Good Lord is in control of everything in this world, and I was the lucky man today. It means everything for my kids to see it and for my wife to be here. It's something I'll never forget. It's something that may never happen again, although you wish it would."

"I didn't even think about the empty stands. My family's here. My mother's here from Florida. It means the world to me."

Ackley said Catch The Fire will enjoy a week off while his connections determine his next engagement.

ADIOS NOTES: Trainer Ron Burke had his usual busy Adios Day, starting 26 horses on the 16-race card. They produced five victories for him... When Jeff Zidek called Saturday's Adios, he became only the fourth announcer to call the event over its 54 years. The others: Ken Kadar (1967-1973), Charlie Hinkle (1974-1975), Roger Huston (1976-2019).

Southwind Gendry sets mark, Lou's Pearlman stays unbeaten in Adios Day stakes

Saturday's Adios Day card at The Meadows was rich with supporting stakes that included a pair of Grand Circuit events for freshmen and two Pennsylvania Sires Stakes for 3-year-old filly trotters. Here are the highlights:

\$59,088 Arden Downs

2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

Last week, **Southwind Gendry** scored with a covered trip. In the Gov. David L. Lawrence, as this stake is known, he needed no help, powering to the point at the quarter for Yannick Gingras and winning in a stake record 1:51.2. That knocked a tick from the mark set by Yankee Bounty in 2014.

"He's a little bit behind the rest of our colts, but as he figures it out, he'll be a good colt," said Ron Burke, who trains the Always B Miki—Gambler's Passion gelding for Burke Racing Stable, Phillip Collura, Knox Services and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby. "We knew watching his first qualifier that he's something special."

Chase H Hanover was second, 1-1/2 lengths back, with Capt Jack Hanover third.

Meanwhile, another Burke youngster, **Lou's Pearlman**, continued to look like the real deal, extending his career unbeaten streak to four for Matt Kakaley and owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusceci, Elizabeth Novak and Howard Taylor. Captain Sleaze was second, beaten 2-1/4 lengths, while Great Somewhere earned show.

The son of Sweet Lou was so full of himself that Kakaley had him under a snug hold even while sending him on a quarter-pole move to the top.

"He has a lot of high speed; he's impressive," Kakaley said. "In my mind he's one of the best 2-year-olds out there. He's absolutely perfect to drive."

Hellabalou stopped badly last week, and his trainer Eddie Dennis, thinks he knows why.

"He struggled getting off the track last week, and the vet

thought it was the heat,” Dennis said. “Once we got him cooled down, he was much better. He rebounded really good today.”

The son of Sweet Lou—Magestic Blue Chip looked quite comfortable on the point, defeating Sweet Angel Boy by a neck in 1:53 for Andrew McCarthy. Mikibytheseaside completed the ticket. Eric Good campaigns Hellabalou.

\$35,690 Arden Downs 2-Year-Old Filly Pacers

Uptown Hanover recovered quickly from a brief break in the final turn and went on to cross the wire first. But she was disqualified and placed back to eighth for interfering while on that break, giving the win in the Mary Lib Miller to Fighting Evil and driver Mike Wilder in 1:53.2. Wicked Ways was third-placed second while Southwind Olenna was promoted to third.

“Every once in a while, you get lucky,” said winning trainer Dane Snyder. “She raced very good, but she was lost on the front end. She’d never been there before. She’s not very big, and she has a lot to learn, but she has a big heart.”

\$187,182 PA Sires Stake 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters

In the faster \$93,591 division of this stake known as the Meadow Bright, the Muscle Hill miss **Fifty Cent Piece** got to ride a pocket trip, then found clearance up the inside and went on to a 1-3/4-length victory over favored and first-over Shishito in a career best 1:52.2 despite the sloppy surface.

Wilder, an hour away from his finest moment in the sport, picked up the catch drive behind the Marcus Melander-trained filly, who had had some rough racing luck in a few recent starts. But the trip worked out fine here for Fifty Cent Piece, a \$500,000 yearling who is starting to live up to her pedigree for the S R F Stable.

In the PASS division raced over a fast track, Sans Default brought sire Muscle Hill another credit when she also utilized the Lightning Lane for driver Matt Kakaley to stop the clock in 1:54.1. Sans Defaut, whose name translates to “flawless” from the French, lived up to her moniker for the second race in a row, now showing earnings of \$180,185 for trainer Burke and the ownership of Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brusce, Crawford Farms Racing, and J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby.

Burke started 25 horses in 12 of the races on the card; in the four \$20,000 Stallion Series races, he sent out only one. But there's little question that she was the most impressive one – the Muscle Hill miss **Dune Hill**, 9-1/2 lengths clear of her field at the end of a mile (while the track was still fast) in 1:52.4, a new stake mark. Dune Hill made a big uncovered move to the lead for driver Yannick Gingras and drew away at will for her third straight win for owner Joseph Di Scala, Jr.

Two other stallion series winners clicked as the favorite along with Dune Hill. A popular local winner was the Explosive Matter filly Perth Angel De Vie, who took a new mark of 1:55.3 in off going for driver Bryce Brocklehurst, trainer Harold Brocklehurst and the ownership of Double R Farms LLC, David Obley and Richard Williams, who will see PA Fairs racing start a 2-day stand in their hometown of Clearfield tomorrow. The other stallion series chalk was the Donato Hanover filly **Alittlebitofsugar**, a 1:55.2 winner in the slop for driver Tim Tetrick, trainer Sam Schillaci and owner Peter Barbato.

The only non-favorite to visit the winners circle was in the opening race of the day, with the track still fast, when the Father Patrick filly **Queso Fresco** charged outside on the far turn and finished out taking a new mark of 1:54.3 as the second betting choice. Team Orange Crush – trainer Julie Miller and driver/husband Andy – saw the filly finish second upon acquiring her care in her last start, and she improved on that position by one here for owner Dr. John McKinley.

Party Girl Hill stays perfect, outduels Lyons Sentinel in Adioo Volo

Unraced at 2, sophomore filly pacer **Party Girl Hill** launched her career this year with four straight victories, including two wins in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS). The question: How would she fare when she faced the likes of Lyons Sentinel, last year's divisional champion?

The answer: Very well, thanks. The two squared off in Saturday's (Aug. 1) \$107,320 Quinton Patterson Adioo Volo at The Meadows, and the brash contender defeated the champ by 1-1/4 lengths in 1:49.4 over a sloppy surface. The event was the sub-feature on the Adios Day card highlighted by the \$375,000 final of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids.

To be sure, when she left from post 3, Tom Hill's homebred daughter of Captaintreacherous--Look Cheap had a distinct edge over Lyons Sentinel, who was stuck with post 8. Yet the champ all but erased that advantage by cutting leisurely fractions of :26.2/:56.2. Even winning driver Dexter Dunn wasn't sure Party Girl Hill could overcome that.

"I thought after that cheap quarter that it might be a hard task for my filly," Dunn said. "The way she traveled up the back, though, she seemed to have the other one's measure. She kicked away in the straight, doing it pretty easy."

Dunn moved Party Girl Hill without cover from fourth, and she wore down Lyons Sentinel after a protracted duel. Pettycoat Business completed the ticket.

Winning trainer Chris Ryder said he isn't terribly surprised by the strong start this year of Party Girl Hill, who lifted her bankroll to \$143,610.

"I expect her to be improving, and she raced like she is," Ryder said. "You can only train them so much at home, but she always felt as good as a horse can feel."

He indicated Party Girl Hill would appear next in another PASS leg.

Ramona Hill, Ready For Moni win Hambletonian eliminations

Ramona Hill rallied from the back of the pack to defeat **Back Of The Neck** in the first of Saturday's (Aug. 1) two \$50,000 Hambletonian Stakes eliminations at the Meadowlands and **Ready For Moni** rolled to victory in the second as the stage was set for next week's \$1 million final.

The Hambletonian is harness racing's premier event for 3-year-old trotters. The top-five finishers from each elimination advanced to the Aug. 8 final at the Big M.

Joining Ramona Hill and Back Of The Neck in the final from the first elim were, in order of finish: Amigo Volo, Big Oil, and Hollywood Story. Joining Ready For Moni from the second elim were: Threefiftytwo, Capricornus, Sister Sledge, and Rome Pays Off.

Ramona Hill and Sister Sledge are fillies. This was the first time multiple fillies took on the boys in the Hambletonian since Act Of Grace and Continental victory in 1996, and only the second time since 1983.

Marcus Melander, the 2019 Trainer of the Year in the U.S., has three of the finalists: Capricornus, Hollywood Story, and Rome Pays Off. Threefiftytwo is trained by Luc Blais, who won last year's Hambletonian with Forbidden Trade.

As elimination winners, Ramona Hill and Ready For Moni got to draw for posts in positions one through five. Ready For

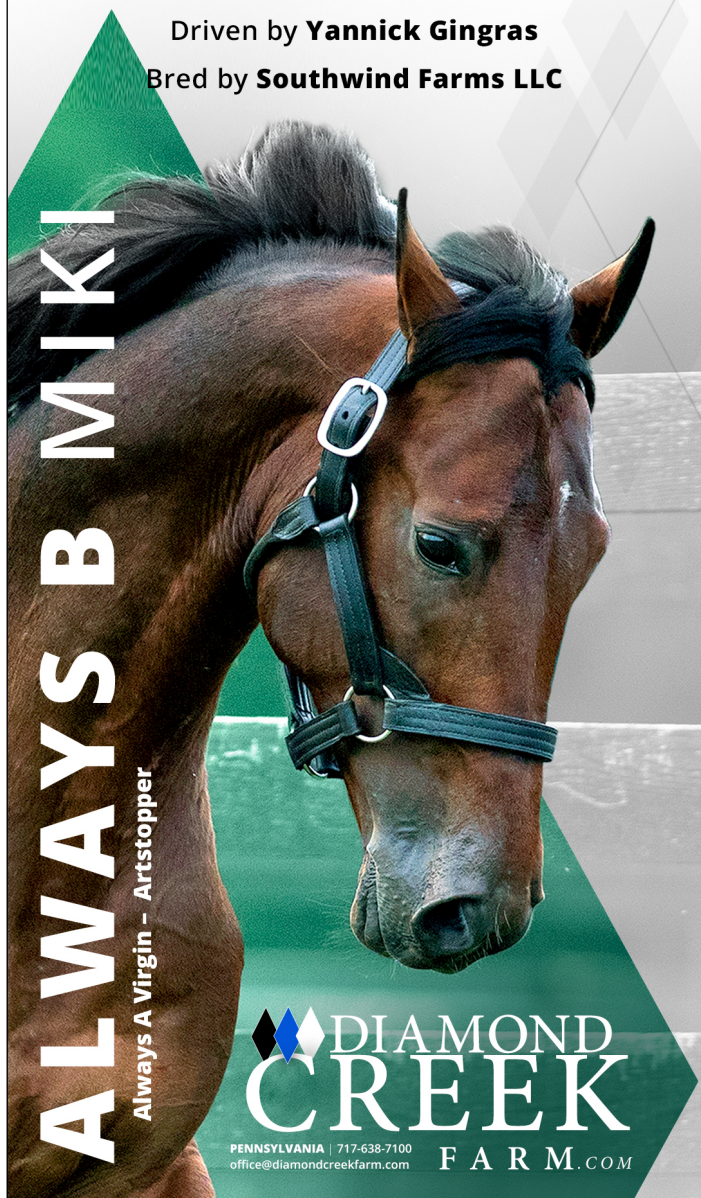

Moni, who was randomly selected first to draw, got post one and Ramona Hill got post five. Posts two through four went to Back Of The Neck, Hollywood Story, and Big Oil, respectively. Starting outside Ramona Hill in posts six through 10 will be Threefiftytwo, Capricornus, Rome Pays Off, Sister Sledge, and Amigo Volo.

In the first elimination, Ramona Hill, the 2019 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old filly trotter, was last in the eight-horse field and forced three wide around the final turn before flying home and besting Back Of The Neck by a half-length in 1:51.2. Her last quarter was timed in :25.4.

Andy McCarthy drove Ramona Hill, the 6-5 favorite, for trainer Tony Alagna. Ramona Hill, who captured the Del Miller Memorial on July 18 in 1:50.3 at the Meadowlands, has won two of three starts this season.

"She's been great," Alagna said. "She was a very immature 2-year-old and she was still able to get the job done. We were so happy with how she came back (in the winter) in Florida. Her first start, she raced super off the pace and two weeks ago she was sparkling and tonight she's even better."

Alagna was patient with Ramona Hill last year, giving the filly a mid-season break in a campaign that culminated with a win in the Breeders Crown from post 10 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"I knew what we had, we just had to do the right thing," Alagna said. "We waited on her when she needed it and she paid us back."

Ramona Hill is a daughter of Muscle Hill out of Lock Down Lindy. She is owned by Brad Grant, Crawford Farms Racing, Robert LeBlanc, and In The Gym Partners. She was bred by Crawford Farms. For her career, she has won eight of 10 races and \$556,865.

Alagna said the decision to enter Ramona Hill in the Hambletonian rather than the all-fillies Hambletonian Oaks was made last Sunday.

"I think as a group we all kind of knew what we were all thinking in the back of our minds, but we all waited to pull the trigger at the same time," Alagna said. "We were all willing to give it a shot. The big decision was the fact they don't go two heats on one day."

In the second elimination, Ready For Moni took the lead at the half-mile mark and never looked back on his way to victory by three-quarters of a length over Threefiftytwo in 1:51.3.

Yannick Gingras drove Ready For Moni, the 6-5 favorite, for trainer Nancy Takter. Ready For Moni is 2-for-2 this year, winning a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial in 1:51.4 on July 18 at the Meadowlands in his seasonal debut.

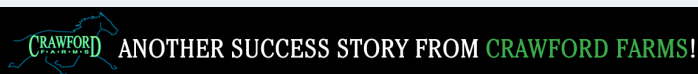
"The way the schedule has been this year, it's been a little difficult to find races," Takter said. "We didn't want to have him over-raced going into the Hambletonian, so he had a

couple nice qualifiers to kind of let him get into his own and hopefully he'll take this race in the right way and be even sharper for next week.

"There are a lot of small parts to the puzzle that need to be put together in the right spot for everything to go perfectly on Hambletonian Day. But with the win here we get post-position relief, so that will be a big help. But there are a lot of things that need to go right."

Ready For Moni is a son of French star Ready Cash out of the mare Nothing But Moni. He is owned by John Fielding, Lindy Farms of Connecticut, Herb Liverman, and Bud Hatfield. The colt was bred by Moni Maker Stable.

For his career, Ready For Moni has won six of 10 races and \$374,020. He joined Takter's stable this year.

"Ready For Moni was trained down in Florida with Lindy Farms through his winter training and came to me a few weeks ago, right before he was getting ready to qualify," Takter said. "So, they did all the heavy lifting with him, we've just kind of done the fine-tuning to get him a little bit sharper for the races. They did a great job with him and they get a lot of credit for how the horse is right now."

Hypnotic AM mesmerizes in Hambletonian Oaks prep

Hypnotic AM and driver Brian Sears grabbed the lead on the backstretch prior to the half-mile point and cruised to victory in Saturday's \$15,000 prep for 3-year-old filly trotters entered in next week's Hambletonian Oaks, defeating May Baby by 1-1/4 lengths in 1:52.3 at the Meadowlands. Solsbury Hill finished third.

Hypnotic AM, the even-money favorite, started from post eight in the eight-horse field and raced on the outside until clearing early leader Solsbury Hill for the top spot following an opening quarter of :27.1. From there, the Marcus Melander-trained filly reached the half in :56.3 and three-quarters in 1:24.4 on the way to her third win in four tries this season.

"I was just going to try to go forward if it looked like it was possible and take it from there," Sears said.

Eliminations were unnecessary for the Hambletonian Oaks, the sport's top race for 3-year-old filly trotters. Twelve horses entered the Oaks, with eight opting to race in Saturday's prep at the Meadowlands. The \$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks is Aug. 8 at the Big M, part of a card that includes the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes.

Hypnotic AM is a daughter of Chapter Seven out of Daydream AM S. She is owned by breeder Courant Inc. and her triumphs this year include the Empire Breeders Classic. For her career, Hypnotic AM has won 10 of 13 races and \$624,725.

"We've come back this year and tried to get her to relax a little bit," Sears said. "At the end of last year she was getting a little warm with us, but Marcus has done a great job keeping her calm and she's been doing everything we've asked so far."

Who named it The Hambletonian?

The origin story about how the sport's most famous trotting race got its name.

The titans of trotting were plotting in privacy in Chicago in early 1924. They had something up their sleeve, something that would shock the world of harness racing, but they took a vow of silence until all the details were worked out.

They were planning to launch a race like harness racing had never seen. It would have a jackpot purse impossible to imagine in the sulky sport, and it would not be a mere one-time extravaganza but instead a continuing classic.

It would be for trotters, of course, because pacers were still second-class citizens in the Roaring Twenties. And it would be for 3-year-olds, not older horses, to reward owners who supported early speed with their purchases at yearling sales.

They were huddled in the office of *The Horse Review* at 221 E. 20th Street in Chicago. *The Review* covered the trotting landscape across the continent and around the world. John C. Bauer, publisher of *The Horse Review*, was holding court in his personal office.

Meeting with Bauer were Harry O. Reno, a Chicago businessman and racing promoter, and Joseph I. Markey, the affable Iowan who was a long-time staffer at *The Horse Review* and beloved by horsemen for his bonhomie. Taking in the scene was John L. Hervey, another invaluable veteran at *The Horse Review*.

The men dissected the many intricacies and challenges of starting a new event. What payments would be necessary by



breeders and owners to fund a record purse that would grab headlines? How much money could be raised by having host tracks bid for the honor of hosting the great event?

Where would the new race fall on the American trotting calendar?

How much money would be needed upfront to advertise the new event before they got the first dollar in payments?

They put their collective heads and collective wisdom together to address these challenges. They argued the pros and cons of each point.

Finally, it seems that everything had been decided to everyone's satisfaction. The process – much like a mother giving birth to a child – had been hard labor in hopes of future rewards.

Then suddenly Bauer said in a calm and mild manner, "Well, boys, there seems nothing left to be done. But before you go ahead, I would call your attention to the fact that as yet your stake hasn't any name. And it can't very well be introduced to the public without one.

"What," Bauer asked his cronies, "do you propose to call it?"

According to Hervey writing 16 years later, consternation swept the room as Markey and Reno stared at Bauer with bulging eyes and open mouths. They looked to Hervey for assistance.

Almost in unison, Market and Reno said, "Great Scott! We never thought of that!"

Brainstorming began immediately. But it went nowhere. Hervey later recalled the Markey and Reno were two of the most innovative minds in the trotting sport, but they were at a loss for ideas. (Reno was also the brother-in-law of William Monroe Wright, owner of the prominent trotting nursery Calumet Farm in Kentucky).

They knew, however, that if they hoped to create an event that would revolutionize the trotting sport, the name would have to be fitting.

Markey admitted, "A name must be thought up that will go a long way toward putting it over. A good name will be worth everything. A poor one will be like a ball and chain."

The first suggestions were feeble grasps and summarily dismissed by all. They called in another staff member, Henry Allen, for help and moral support.

Finally, John Bauer glanced at a portrait of a horse hanging above his desk. A lightbulb went on.

"I propose that we call it the Hambletonian Stake," he announced. "The trotting breed today is a Hambletonian breed. There is no other name in the trotting world that means so much."

Bauer's inspiration was the portrait of Hambletonian 10 done by artist Robert L. Dickey. It was painted from the only unretouched photograph of the horse known. It shows the great father in 1864 at age 16.

The others in Bauer's office of *The Horse Review* quickly agreed that no other name would do. No other name would be more fitting. The new race would be the Hambletonian.

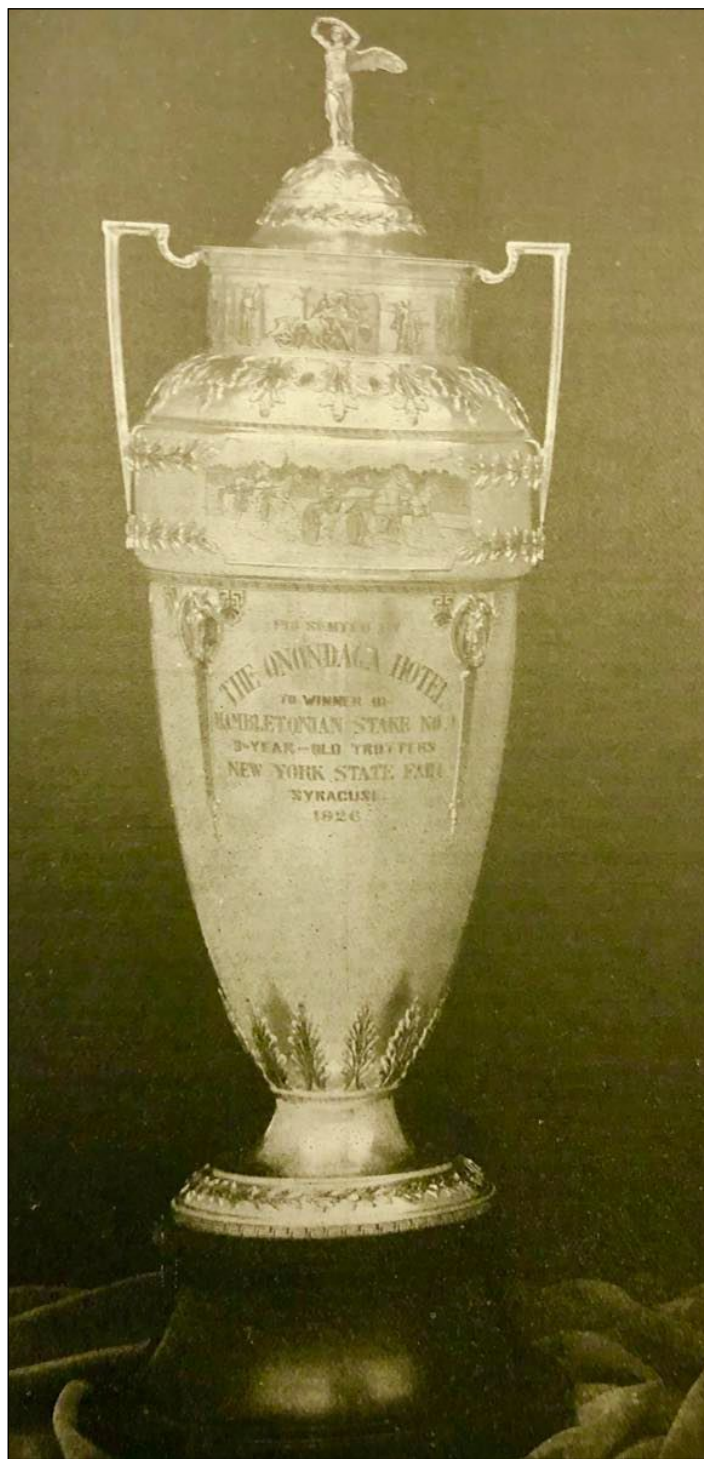
Races named after great horses are commonplace today. The Little Brown Jug, named after a famous pacer from the late 1800s, was started 20 years after the Hambletonian. The Messenger for sophomore pacers, was started 30 years after the Hambletonian. The Dexter Cup, named after the famed trotter of the 1870s once driven by Ulysses S. Grant, was started in 1960.

When the Hambletonian was announced, it was estimated that it might reach a purse as high at \$70,000.

Many people scoffed at that notion. "Preposterous!" some declared. The richest race ever had been the \$50,000 American Trotting Derby for older trotters in 1908.

Harry Reno, however, was a wheeler-dealer who had created the American Pacing Derby out of thin air and watched it offer a \$25,000 purse to owners. Now Reno was dreaming even bigger.

Breeders paid \$10 to nominate foals of 1923 to the first Hambletonian on May 1, 1924. Payments of \$200 and \$250,

respectively, were due on New Year's Day in 1925 and 1926. The starting fee was set at \$500.

The founders of The Hambletonian Society asked tracks to submit bid for the honor of hosting the new event. The Grand Circuit track in Atlanta offered a bid of \$3,000. That was topped by a bid of \$5,026 by interests in Kalamazoo, MI.

Neither bid, however, could match the \$8,000 bid by the New York State Fair in Syracuse.

That allowed sponsors to dream of offering a purse of \$50,000 for the first Hambletonian and they projected that the race might go for as much as \$75,000 once established.

Fourteen horses — half of them fillies — were declared into the first Hambletonian, and Belwin was the leading sire with five starters.

After two heats, the trophy went to Guy McKinney, who triumphed over Guy Dean. Both were sons of the trotting patriarch Guy Axworthy.

Finishing third in the summary was the Peter Volo filly

Ellie Trabue (the fifth dam, incidentally, of Speedy Crown).

Winning owner Henry B. Rea of Pittsburgh collected a check of \$45,816 or about \$658,000 in today's dollars.

The Hambletonian was an instant classic and an instant success. It has been the most coveted prize in harness racing for almost a century.

Yoder father and son set to battle in Hambletonian Oaks

Verlin Yoder will send out Reba Blue Chip and his son, James Yoder, will send out May Baby in next Saturday's \$600,000 final.

A dozen sophomore trotting fillies will go to the post in next Saturday's \$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks at The Meadowlands vying for one of harness racing's most prestigious titles. It will be a unique and special experience for Verlin and James Yoder. The father and son will each send out their first Oaks starters, one a dominant Indiana-sired 3-year-old, and the other a successful New York-bred trotter. Individually, and as a family, the Yoders will savor the moment, but when the gate folds, they will become the fiercest of rivals.

"It's a pretty neat situation. You don't see that a lot," said Verlin. "To have one filly in is cool. But, to have two is awesome."

Verlin Yoder has delivered winning moments on the sport's biggest stages. In 2014, he shipped Natural Herbie to the Meadowlands and steered the gelding to a lifetime best 1:51.4 effort in the \$75,000 Vincennes Invitational, part of the Hambletonian Day card. That same season, Natural Herbie also captured the \$250,000 International Trot at Yonkers. Two years ago, Verlin triumphed with Woodside Charm in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown final for freshman trotting fillies, held at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. The victory also secured a Dan Patch Award for his charge.

Saturday (Aug. 8), he brings **Reba Blue Chip** to the dance in his first attempt at the Oaks. Verlin and his wife, Rachel, own the Chapter Seven—Natasha's Kiss sophomore.

"We own everything ourselves, so we can't go nominating to everything. So we try to pick our spots," he explained. "I've never had anything good enough to go in the Oaks or the Hambo. We still don't know if we do, but it will be fun to try."

Prior to a fourth-place finish at the Meadowlands last night (Aug. 1), Reba Blue Chip finished first or second in nine of 10 career starts while earning more than \$75,000 (May Baby was second in that same Oaks prep won by Hypnotic AM). As a freshman, Reba Blue Chip won three times in five attempts, each victory coming at Harrah's Hoosier Park. This

season, Verlin has kept the filly in New York, twice testing her in New York Sires Stakes (NYSS) competition. A filly that has been on the aggressive side, Reba Blue Chip has become more manageable as of late.

"She's come a long way in the last six weeks. I've been able to get the dog chain out of her as far as driving. All spring I had to have a dog chain in her to drive her in a race or a training mile," the trainer said of his charge, an \$80,000 Lexington Selected yearling purchase in 2018. "Now, she's down to a regular bit, which is a very good thing. She's starting to grow up a little bit as far as manners. She's always been fast; it was always her brain that would get in her way."

The filly dropped in the box after a runner-up showing in NYSS action July 11 at Vernon Downs. There, Reba Blue Chip trotted in 1:52.3. The owner said that while it was good to see a solid effort leading into the Oaks, the decision to enter her did not hinge on that start. Instead, it was a commitment made long ago.

"It's something you decide in February or March and you have to set up things for that day. You try to be ready for that day," said Verlin, who turns 47 next month. "The best guy that I've seen, and that's because it's in my era, is Jimmy Takter. This guy absolutely romps on Hambo Day and romps Breeders Crown night. But he doesn't make the decision six weeks prior to that; he makes the decision four months prior to that, where he had things timed for that day."

James Yoder arrives in New Jersey with **May Baby**, a filly that has been virtually flawless competing in the Hoosier State this season. As a 2-year-old, the Guccio—Free Wheeling

lass captured six of 10 starts, finishing half a length behind Rock Swan in the \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final as the slight favorite. An \$8,500 yearling purchase for Yoder and his wife, Cheyenne, May Baby banked \$225,490 in her first season of competition while not always at her best.

"Last year she had a quarter crack and abscess. She had three starts last year where the issues were not bugging her," James said. "This year, the quarter crack is grown out and her feet are good."

The younger Yoder gleaned valuable practices when part of his father's stable and he has applied much of that knowledge as he now manages his own barn. He, too, is selective when picking his spots outside Indiana.

"A lot of my inspiration comes from watching him and knowing how he prepped horses for certain times of the year," James said of his dad's strategy. "Just try to make sure the horses were sharp when it was time. Backing off horses at times and picking your spots."

Last season, he closed out May Baby's campaign in the Breeders Crown. After trotting fourth in her elimination at Woodbine, the filly and her trainer found themselves first over racing in second at three quarters in the \$600,000 final. She faded to eighth that night.

"It was a good experience for me and for her," James said. "It's different when you step up to that next level. I've learned from it and I just want to try to apply that knowledge."

After the 2019 campaign, James and Cheyenne Yoder returned to Bell, FL and the Gilcrest Training Center, where his parents also winter each year, and where Reba Blue Chip and May Baby trained down heading into the 2020 season. He made his filly eligible to the Hambletonian Oaks so that the option was on the table should she return in good form. With three starts under her belt, May Baby has recorded three victories. The first of the season was a hard-earned score versus Rock Swan where she kept a nose in front at the wire in 1:52.3. In successive Indiana Sires Stakes starts she won by four lengths and nearly 10 lengths, respectively.

"We've kind of been talking about going all year, but she needed to win all her races leading up to it to make us want to go out. She had to show good miles, and she's been doing that. So we decided to take a shot at it," James noted. "I wanted to make sure that she rated good and was doing it her way and it wasn't me urging her to go more. She has been willing to do it, and she's been coming out of the races good. It's an honor to be in it."

Neither father nor son discussed the decision to enter the

Hambletonian Oaks ahead of time. Verlin is proud of the work his son has put in managing May Baby to a start in one of the sport's top races. Previously, James, who celebrates his 26th birthday today, first visited East Rutherford in 2015, sitting in the stands on Hambletonian Day as a spectator. That season, he sent out his first starters as a trainer, and since then has accumulated 61 victories from 290 purse starts.

"James has done a good job with the filly. I think she deserves a chance. She has shown she's worthy. I think she has. We'll find out," the elder Yoder stated. "That's what a dad dreams of, that means he's doing his job. As a parent, all you can ask for is that your kids grow up and make a living for themselves."

These Indiana natives will have the backing of their home state Saturday, but should each trot out of the final turn in contention, family ties will have no influence on the outcome. James offered an anecdote demonstrating the depths of their competitive nature.

"He actually tried to get me to qualify May Baby against Reba Blue Chip earlier this year at Gilcrest. I quickly backed out of it because I knew neither one of us was going to give an inch," he said. "There will be no favors. However, if both of us turn for home and it looks like we'll both hit the board, that would be awesome. I'd be ecstatic."

"We've always said we're probably the only two idiots that would get a whipping fine in a qualifier," Verlin said, laughing. "Do you think I would wait on him? Oh, I'd try to beat him, but if he beats me, I'm happy for it."

Hawthorne racino approved

If all goes according to plan, the casino will open late in 2021.

Hawthorne Race Course is officially on the road to becoming a racino.

The Illinois Gaming Board on Thursday voted unanimously that the ownership and key personnel of the fourth generation family-owned track receive a “finding of preliminary suitability” to be licensed to conduct casino gambling that will augment the harness and thoroughbred meetings.

“The staff of the Gaming Board has been wonderful,” said Tim Carey, Hawthorne’s president and chief operating officer. “We presented them a very difficult and complex ownership structure (because of the number of Carey family members in the ownership estate). They had to work through that.

“Now, it allows us to go out and get the financing and start construction. We plan to start in mid-to-late September and we will have a 14-month construction schedule.”

If all goes according to plan, the casino will open late in 2021.

Hawthorne is the longest running gambling business in Illinois and the state’s oldest sporting venue, dating back to 1891. It opened as a thoroughbred track and added harness racing in 1970, becoming the Chicago metropolitan area’s sixth standardbred track. Now, it has the distinction of being the only surviving harness track.

Casinos began operating at Illinois in 1991 and the state now has 10, but it wasn’t until last year that the legislature voted to allow racetracks to add slot machines and table games with a portion of the adjusted gross revenue allocated to their purse accounts.

Carey’s original plans called for a one-year hiatus in the spring thoroughbred meeting to enable Hawthorne to conduct a Feb. 15-Sept 20 nighttime harness meeting while casino construction was going on during the day. He was hoping the racino would be ready to begin taking bets sometime during the Oct. 1-Dec. 31 thoroughbred meeting during which all of the racing will be in the afternoon.

But the COVID-19 pandemic coupled with the length of time it took the Gaming Board to vet the family owners and confirm their long-standing reputation of integrity played havoc with those plans.

Racing was halted after 12 programs on March 15 and 33 nights were lost before it resumed on June 5 with spectators conspicuous by their absence. Since then studio racing has been taking place on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.

Although no work was done on the casino per se, the interior of the track has been gutted to make for an easy transition to constructing the casino and the sportsbook that also is a by-product of last year’s racing legislation. Hawthorne is developing the sportsbook in partnership with PointBet.

“I think a lot of people may have expected us to simply put some slot machines and tables into our existing facility, but we’re going to break the mold on what a regional integrated casino, racing and entertainment destination can be,” said Kevin Kline, Hawthorne’s CEO of gaming.

Kline has been in the gaming industry for 25 years and has significant experience in the development of multi-faceted casino projects.

Harness and thoroughbred horsemen look upon the racino as a godsend.

“Our share (of the revenue) starts at 12.75 per cent and then escalates to 20 per cent, depending on how well they do,” said Tony Somone, executive director of the Illinois Harness Horsemen’s Association. “We figure it’ll probably average out to from 15 per cent to 18 per cent.”

Another important aspect to the racino is that will bring to an end the much-reviled purse “recapture” that is unique to Illinois. It is a 1995 provision of the law that brought full-card simulcasting to Illinois and allows tracks to recoup revenue from live handle losses because of wagering on races from other states. The recapture amount is 2 per cent of the decrease in Illinois handle on in-state races from the total bet in 1994.

That year the amount bet was \$1,181,911,128; in the intervening years it has declined substantially to an all-time low of \$44,467,712 in 2019.

The impact on purses has been devastating.

“If they open (the racino at Hawthorne) next year it’s done,” Somone explained. “We still would have to pay what we owe this year but if they open next year we wouldn’t have to pay anything in 2022.”

Friday was the deadline for 2021 race dates applications. Hawthorne asked for a 63-night harness meeting from May 7-Sept. 26 to be sandwiched between thoroughbred meetings from March through April and September through December. The thoroughbred application calls for live racing on Labor Day, which would put it in conflict with the requested harness meeting.

It will be up to the Illinois Racing Board to decide which option it wants Hawthorne to pursue in 2021 when the annual dates hearings are held on Sept. 16.

Arlington International Racecourse's owner, Churchill Downs, Inc., is creating the uncertainty. Much to the consternation of both the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Racing Board, CDI has declined to convert Arlington into a racino. Bill Carstanjen, the CEO of CDI, has said that the reason is because the taxes are too high but the logical explanation is that CDI doesn't want an Arlington racino to compete with Rivers Casino in Des Plaines in which it holds a 62 per cent interest. The casino is located less than a half-hour from Arlington and CDI also is bidding for a new casino in Waukegan, another community in Arlington's market area.

When Hawthorne and Arlington received the green light from Gov. J.B. Pritzger to resume racing the first weekend in June, Arlington was engaged in a bitter contract squabble with the ITHA. A two-year contract finally was approved on June 22 but the meeting that had been scheduled to start on May 1 didn't get underway on July 23.

During the past two years, Carstanjen has expressed uncertainty about racing at Arlington beyond 2021. If that happens Hawthorne not only would be the only harness track in the Chicagoland metropolitan area it also would be the only thoroughbred track.

In a conference call with CDI shareholders last week when asked about the status of Arlington he replied: "The long-term solution is not Arlington Park. The land will have a higher and better purpose for something else. We've been patient and thoughtful and constructive with the parties up in that jurisdiction but long term that land gets sold and that license will have to move if it's going to continue."

He added that Arlington "may race" in 2021, a remark that casts the cloud of uncertainty over the upcoming dates hearings.

Meanwhile, Hawthorne is giving harness horsemen plenty of opportunities to make up some of the money they lost because of the 2 ½-month COVID pandemic shutdown by putting on 13 races on most programs. Full fields have been the norm.

According to Jim Miller, director of publicity and horsemen's relations: "Since our return handle per night (solely from simulcasts) has averaged just over \$1 million."

The best night so far was Sunday, July 5 when \$1,445,066 was bet.

Non-wagering racing without spectators has been flourishing every Tuesday at the State Fairgrounds in Springfield where all 27 county fair cards have been moved. Racing began there on June 3 and is scheduled to continue through Sept. 1.

"We typically have between 18 and 23 races," said Tim Norman, the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Bureau

Chief for horse racing and county fairs. "The big thing is we're distributing the purse money (from the county fair program)."

Both the Springfield and DuQuoin State Fairs have been cancelled but Hawthorne is picking up the races that would have been held there and will use them as a preface to the regular Friday and Saturday night programs. The Aug. 14-15 Springfield races will be held on those nights at Hawthorne and the races that were to be held on Aug. 19 and 20 have been rescheduled for Aug. 21 and 22; DuQuoin's Aug. 28-29 races will be contested at Hawthorne instead.

For Hawthorne's long-time track announcer, Peter Galassi, this has been a year unlike any other.

"At the beginning of the meeting we had shut out the grandstand and they started gutting the place so the only fans I could see were those on the apron," he said. "With no one there I've had to change my terminology a little."

"At the end of the night I always remind everyone to turn off their computers and go walk the dog."

The passion of Steve Jones

A passion for horses was born into the man behind Cameo Hills.

Although Steve Jones says his interest in horses came at a later time, I'm inclined to believe that his memory may be playing tricks on him.

I think that for all intents and purposes, he was in effect born in a feed bucket.

My earliest memories of him were as a pre-teenager following his Hall of Fame dad, Hal, everywhere he went in exercising his duties as farm superintendent at Hanover Shoe Farms.

Before that, Hal was the farm manager at Ohio's behemoth Pickwick Farms – where he introduced the concept and utilization of artificial insemination to the breed – and then at New York's Blue Chip Farms.

After Hal was done with his myriad of duties at the Pennsylvania nursery, my mind's eye sees Steve coming into the office perusing the farm's library of periodicals and Sires and Dams books, sometimes for hours on end.

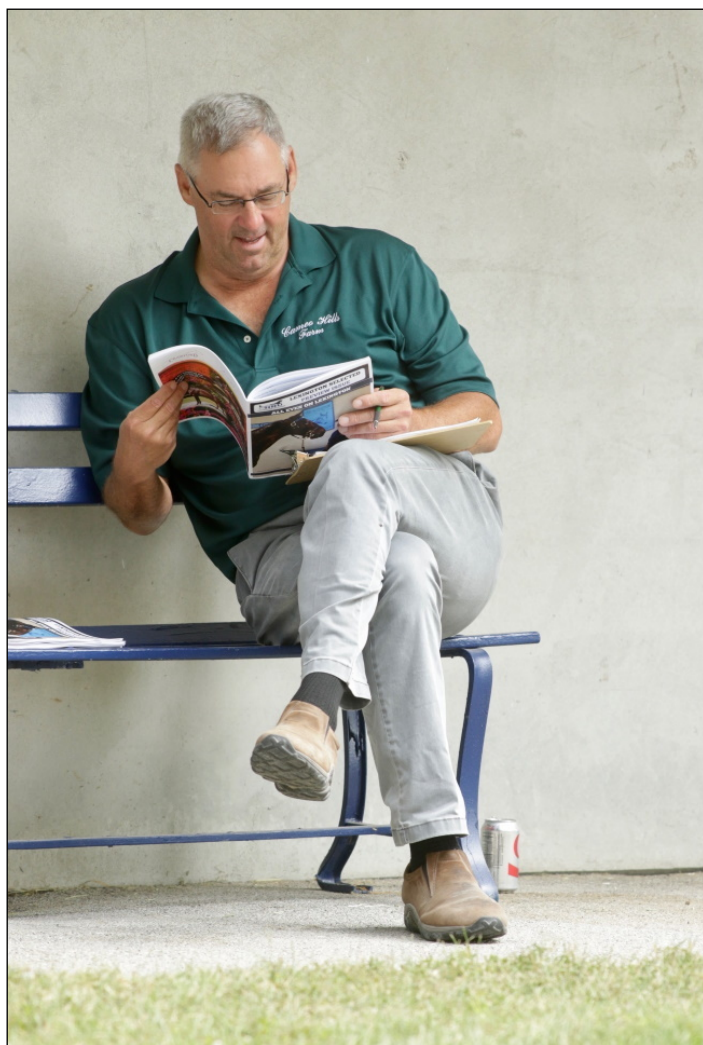
Steve says that it wasn't until he actually worked with Hal at their newly acquired Cameo Hills Farm in New York that he became consumed with harness racing.

It may have grown by then, as it still is growing, but trust me on this, his passion was and will always be there.

His first "job" he remembers was at Hanover on Saturday mornings when he went around with his dad keeping the teasing records of the mares that they were checking. When the yearling catalogs came out, he recalls many an evening spent stuffing catalogs to be sent out to the farm's large mailing list.

From Hanover, the Jones family moved to the newly-established New Jersey division of Lana Lobell Farms where his dad became the farm manager.

It was there that Steve first learned how to handle and

show a yearling.

It was also there that his love for racing grew.

Those were the halcyon days of both harness racing and The Meadowlands.

Back then The Meadowlands raced six nights a week. Steve Jones would be in attendance all six nights.

Life was good.



He and his family lived in a beautiful mansion, set on a beautiful farm and surrounded by some of the greatest horses the world has seen.

All the top names, the Dancers, Haughtons, Sholtys and Beissingers were frequent visitors.

He was seeing all of North America's greatest horses race on an almost nightly basis.

He was living the dream.

After some time, Hal and mom Marie came to the decision that they had perhaps spent too much time working for others. It was time for them to establish something of their own. They were going to buy and build their own farm in the then thriving Goshen, NY area. There were numerous breeding farms there and the sky was the limit.

There were both plusses and minuses to the venture.

They purchased 118 acres of undeveloped, but fertile land in the area. There was a lot of work and money put into it to make it a workable horse farm. That was the minus.

The plus was that Hal could build it to his exact specifications.

His goal was to make it as efficient and practical as a horse farm could possibly be.

Here was a man who had managed Hanover, Lana Lobell, Blue Chip and Pickwick Farms. There was probably nobody who had as much hands on experience and insight as to how a horse farm should be laid out and run.

When his mom and dad decided to take that step, Alan Leavitt, who owned Lana Lobell asked young Steve to stay on.

Hal left the choice to Steve, although his preference was that his son accompany him.

Steve recalls having a meeting with Lana Lobell's manager and asking him what his duties would entail. The response was "Whatever needs to be done. If a ditch needs to be dug in winter, then that's what you will be expected to do."

Steve chewed on it for awhile and came to the wise conclusion that if that was what he was going to do, then he would be better served doing it for his father.

Steve you and your family have, perhaps a deserved reputation, for being thrifty and watching where the dollars go.

"I give my mom all the credit for that. My folks never had a lot of money to begin with. They worked hard for every dollar they earned and mom was not prepared to waste any of it. We were never poor and never suffered from any of the needs of life, but we also weren't disposed to waste what we

had earned.

"There was one rigid exception to that - the horses. When a horse of value came along, we didn't think too long before acting upon the opportunity.

"The most glaring example of that was in the purchase of a share of Albatross. When Albatross was re-syndicated by Hanover, my dad had the opportunity to buy a share for \$50,000. That was about all the money that my folks had in the world. It was the result of decades of hard work and money management. But that was all they had.

"My dad absolutely felt that Albatross was the greatest racehorse that he had ever seen. He was willing to take the plunge. I'm not quite as sure about mom. Add to that the risk inherent of betting the store on a horse that came with no guarantees. There was no payout. It was strictly a cash on the table buy.

"Hell, there were no guarantees that he could even breed a mare, let alone that he could get them in foal. Then, of course most stallions, regardless of how great they were on the racetrack, don't make it on a high level in the breeding shed.

"They went for it anyway. That one move was by far the biggest factor in any success that I've had in the breeding business.

"I'm probably not as frugal as mom could be, but nobody would call me a spendthrift either - **except when it comes to buying quality mares or buying into stallions.**

"Not only will I spend whatever the price, within reason, for quality horses, but it also extends to what is best for the horses. We never skimp on the best hay and feed. Whatever needs to be done to produce a healthy, well-maintained horse, gets done.

"I know that there are a few gorgeous showplace farms out there. I won't mention their names. But I can guarantee you

that not a single one of them raises a better or healthier horse than we do. I believe that the fancier aspects of an operation, are more for the ego satisfaction of the owner or the perceived impression that it might make on potential buyers."

***Author's Interruption:** This brings to mind a true story that I've told more than once.

Lawrence B. Sheppard, the owner of Hanover Shoe Farms, was looking to hire Jim Harrison, then considered the foremost authority on standardbreds, as his farm manager.

Harrison had never before been to Hanover.

He visited and Mr. Sheppard spent the day showing him around and advising him as to how the operation functioned.

At the end of the day, Mr. Sheppard asked him what he thought.

"Well, frankly Mr. Sheppard, I'm kind of disappointed," Harrison said. "I've been to Kentucky and seen all those beautiful farms with their beautiful buildings and fences. This is pretty much a bare bones operation."

Mr. Sheppard looked at him, kicked up a pile of dirt and responded, "Boy, in Kentucky they raise fences. Here, we raise horses."

So, your dad set up the farm to his specifications. Isn't it hard to get a farm established, especially when you aren't standing a stallion?

"At first it was just dad, my brother Mike and me. We had put together a group of a few average broodmares, by our present standards. But they served us well.

"Dad also had made many friends along the way and we got some boarders as well, including Charles Michael for whom we raised Goalie Jeff and Marty Granoff's Val d'Or Farms. Our overhead wasn't as high as some of the showplaces bordering us, so we could present the opportunity to board mares at a more affordable rate than those of Blue Chip, Castleton and Lana Lobell whose stallions the mares were booked to. We tried hard and history shows we have succeeded in raising the quality of our broodmare band.

"That's where my dad's trust in my knowledge kicked in. He was never afraid to invest in a good horse and neither am I.

"We just kept raising our standards as far as pedigrees and quality individuals were concerned. We were never satisfied with the status quo and I hope that I never become so."

Where is Cameo Hills Farm positioned today?

"Well, we are more than triple the size than we were when mom and dad first bought the original 118 acres. We are now at 425. We are the home of about 100 broodmares. Roughly half of them belong to us and the others are boarders. Of course, that doesn't include yearlings, weanlings and sucklings.

"In fairly recent years, we have also gone into the stallion game. We stand two very promising horses So Surreal and Huntsville.

"Despite very limited opportunity So Surreal has already proven himself to be one of the top pacing stallions ever to stand in New York. Last year, he swept three of the four New York Sires Stakes finals. I'm not sure, but I think that may have been unprecedented.

"Huntsville has booked the maximum number of 140 mares each year that he has stood at stud. His first crop are yearlings and will go to the sales this fall.

"I think they look terrific, but every stallion owner says that. We've done the best we could. It's now up to him."

You brought up sales. What do you think the future holds for sales this year?

"As you know, these are scary times. I don't know. One thing I do know for sure is that all of our yearlings will be sold regardless of what they bring. We are in the breeding business, not the racing business.

"If we've been successful, I believe that is one of the major keys to our success. What you see is what you get. We don't play games. We don't compete with our customers on the racetrack. This is what we do for a living. We have no other business to fall back on.

"Besides my wonderful family, I've got three assets in life – horses, land and a stock portfolio that I've been able to acquire because of the horses and the land.

"You asked me the question 'What sort of percentage loss would you be willing to take now in terms of your yearling consignment relative to last year's?' My answer would be 30 per cent. It could be more. I hope it's less. Regardless, they will all have new homes."

You have another business. You probably broker the sale of more bookings to stallions than anybody else in the business.

"That actually came about mostly by accident. Most of the credit for that also goes to Albatross. His success in the stud was well beyond our expectations. We thought he'd be great, but not to that degree. There was a period of time for a few years when if you didn't have an Albatross for the big events, you might as well not show up.

"His stud fee kept rising to the point where it got as high as \$75,000. We probably didn't own a mare at that time that was worth \$75,000. Dad and I spoke about it and we decided that we'd be well ahead of the game if we sold our three bookings at a discount - maybe \$50,000 or \$60,000. We got a lot of flack on that from Hanover and a lot of the shareholders. But we felt they were our bookings. We took

the risk in buying the share. We felt that the rights were ours to do with as we pleased. It's now become fairly accepted, but not completely. It also works both ways. I've sometimes been in the position where I've been able to sell bookings at a premium above the advertised stud fee, sometimes well above it. It's called America and it's the free market at work.

"To be able to do this has also required a large capital outlay on my part. I've bought into most every quality stallion or stallion prospect that has been syndicated in recent years.

"Just off the top of my head these are the stallions in which I own equity or breeding rights:

Just as Hal and Marie had two sons that got involved in their parents' way of life, so do you and Kathy

"Kathy is a big part of the team. She helps with the foals and in every other way that she is able to. She has a big presence on social media, which I lack. She keeps the farm's name and those of our horses in front of the public.

"Tyler is 27 and Jake is 24. They are both learning in the same manner that I did. They are interested. They are becoming good horsemen. They have a good work ethic.

Perhaps most importantly, they are a positive factor on the farm's payroll."

Basking in the energy of the place: celebrating the 30th anniversary of Industry Day

Despite an imperfect way to celebrate an event best experienced in person, Monday's socially-isolated card at Grand River Raceway will mark three decades of the track's premier event, which started at its predecessor, Elmira Raceway

1990. The world was 30 years removed from its next global pandemic. Brian Mulroney was Prime Minister of Canada and George Bush Sr. was the U.S. President. The Simpsons aired for the first time on FOX. (Sorry in advance for the forthcoming earworm...) Ice Ice Baby was all over the airwaves.

The first web page was published on the World Wide Web.

In harness racing, John Campbell, then 35, won his third Hambletonian and became the youngest driver ever elected into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame. Beach Towel took the Meadowlands Pace, Little Brown Jug and Horse Of The Year.

And on the afternoon of Aug. 6 in Elmira, ON, a grassroots track which had recently overcome near financial ruin, carved out the first edition of an annual event called Industry Day.

The event's name was a nod to its objective: to celebrate the harness racing industry – its hardworking people and horses, and the bonds between the two.

Since its inception 30 years ago, the event has evolved to include the creation of the Battle Of Waterloo in 1998 (with an introductory purse of \$200,000) the addition of the Battle Of the Belles in 2009, and of course the change of venue from Elmira Raceway to its successor, Grand River Raceway, in 2004.

The name Industry Day was also an homage to Elmira Raceway's fair circuit roots and the kind of homespun magic that ensues when large crowds of people with a shared passion spend several hours together under the blistering sun (or warm rain) with sugar-fueled kids in tow, a race program jammed into the back pocket and a desire to *bask in the energy of the place*.

As I Google "weather on August 6, 1990 in Waterloo Region, Ontario, Canada" to retrieve instantaneous

scene-setting for this story (that first Industry Day felt like 22°C and was mostly cloudy) it's difficult to appreciate what has been lost in the all-or-nothing world we've left behind.

In 1990, if you sought to experience Industry Day, you packed up and went, period. If you didn't, you missed it. You didn't watch it elsewhere and you didn't read about it until the next trade magazine arrived in your mailbox later that month.

Had you been there, you would have seen five-year-old Silver Reign capture her 41st career win in a 1:57.2 – a Canadian season record over a half-mile track, overall track record for Elmira Raceway and just one-fifth of a second shy of the all-time Canadian record for aged pacing mares. Four starts later, she'd retire to the breeding shed where she would produce champs such as Northern Dynasty (\$697,593) and Northern Knight, which would sell for \$250,000 as a yearling in 1999 for her then owner John McKnight. Silver Reign was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall Of Fame in 2011 joining her driver/trainer Bud Fritz (who was inducted a decade earlier). She won 42 of 95 starts, banked \$766,871, took her career mark of 1:55.4 in the Fan Hanover and was Canada's top pacing filly at both two and three.

The fans on-track for that inaugural Industry Day wagered a record \$151,294.

The first opportunity to watch Industry Day away from the racetrack was in 1998 – a year of huge innovation as Elmira Raceway simultaneously introduced the Battle Of Waterloo and became the first Ontario B-track to simulcast its races to a network of tracks and teletheatres throughout Canada and the U.S.

Many of the architects of the event have left us, and it's unnerving to think the 30th iteration of their efforts will

have such a muted and awkward COVID-19 execution (a fact which I'm sure is doubly distressing for the current staff of Grand River Raceway and every racetrack dealing with the same set of circumstances for their marquee events).

Those departed include Ken Middleton Sr., the race secretary, GM and publicist of Elmira Raceway in 1990 and the brainchild of the event. Race secretary Diane Twasnick wrote most of the cards for the event prior to her passing in 2017 and took great pride in the celebration each year.

Dr. Ted Clarke was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall Of Fame in 2014 and retired from Grand River Raceway in 2017 after nearly two decades of managing both tracks – a labor of love of which the development of Industry Day was a point of personal pride. Not one to beam visibly, he beamed visibly when people referred to Industry Day as a miniature version of the Little Brown Jug in the sense of community and camaraderie it inspired.

Clarke passed away in 2019.

Gone too is Somebeachsomewhere, the most notable Battle Of Waterloo champ. A mural at Grand River Raceway

commemorates his 2007 victory in what was, by then, a \$300,000 race.

The family spirit of Industry Day has for several years played out on the racetrack, too.

A recurring father-son-duo theme dominates many of the Battle Of Waterloo results, starting in 2002 with Village Blitz. That's when trainer Carl Jamieson recorded his third Battle Of Waterloo win, but this time with son Jody in the bike. (Carl had driven his two previous winners, C T Rocket in 2000 and Distinctiv Skeeter in the inaugural running.) The pair were winners again in 2004 (Banner Yankee), 2006 (Warrawee Ideal) and last year with Sports Obsession.

Same storyline with Doug and Gregg McNair. They shared the Battle Of Waterloo winner's circle with Magnum J in 2017 and Trail Boss in 2008. They also won the race with Three Of Clubs in 2013 – having won the Battle Of The Belles one race earlier with Lady Shadow. They have a shot to do it again this year with last week's Battle Of Waterloo elimination winner Bettor Sun.

Aside from its racing content, Industry Day has offered plenty of additional programming throughout the years.

Several guest champions have attended to meet and greet (and occasionally nibble on) fans, including Cam Fella, Apaches Fame, Gallo Blue Chip, Sportswriter, Goodtimes and Run The Table who celebrated his 25 thbirthday at Industry Day 2007.

For more than a decade starting in the late-'90s, the Ontario Harness Horse Association (OHHA) played host to the OHHA Backstretch Olympics featuring epic, timed showdowns in water pail racing, bandage rolling and horseshoe tossing, to name a few. Later, OHHA would continue its outreach with cash prizes for caretakers of the horses competing on Industry Day based on a number of show categories.

The event has involved most provincial harness racing groups and associations. The Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society has hosted fundraising efforts at the event over several years which included garage sales for racing equipment and memorabilia and an art sale which featured framed paintings created by the hooves and noses of some of the biggest equine champs of the day.

When the Battle Of Waterloo launched in 1998, Queen Elizabeth (sensational impersonator Carolyn Sadowska), Napoleon, the Duke Of Wellington and an army of tin soldiers was recruited to kick it off in style.

Another impersonation that sealed itself into the lore of Industry Day is the Herve Filion nod made by Randy Waples after winning the second edition of the Battle Of Waterloo in 1999 with Your Nemesis.

After returning to the winner's circle in a standing position on the bike, Waples announced he would donate his \$5,000 earnings to the local chapter of the Boy Scouts. The kids gathered in uniform at the track a few months later to deliver their thanks and to present Waples with a framed caricature painting of his antics. Waples has since won three more editions of the race.

Reflecting on the colorful 30-year history of Industry Day highlights a few key points. One, these events are, for most of us, more potent when experienced in person. Two, many of

these memorable moments came at a time when you could *only* experience them in person. Three, this weird event-purgatory created by COVID-19 is a bizarre time to be celebrating the longevity of anything at all, let alone one of Canadian harness racing's favorite outings.

All but 100 people donning masks will follow the Industry Day 30 th anniversary card from their TV sets, laptops, tablets and mobile devices. Many will pine in scarcity for parking lot jams, shade-hunting, mild heat stroke, kiddie tantrums on the tarmac, and lineups for beer, hotdogs and toilets.

Perhaps this pandemic will reinvigorate our willingness to endure these inevitable inconveniences to experience a celebration like Industry Day and once again prioritize the act of *basking in the energy of the place*.

I'll Drink To That (Jim Morrill Jr.) won the \$53,100 first division.

Major Bean (Jason Bartlett) went straight to the front. Sexy Blue Chip (Wally Hennessey) took over the lead just before hitting the first quarter in :28. Major Bean went back to the front as they headed for the stands for the first time. He led to the half in :57.3. I'll Drink To That (\$14.60) made his move going first-over down the backstretch. He led to three-quarters in 1:24.4.

I'll Drink To That continued to lead as they made the turn for home. Carrythetorchman (Marcus Miller) came flying as they hit the stretch but I'll Drink To That was too strong to win in a lifetime best of 1:53.2. Carrythetorchman had to settle for second. Sexy Blue Chip finished third.

I'll Drink the torch is a 2-year-old colt by American Ideal—Margarita Monday. Trained by Chris Ryder for owners Craig Henderson, Lawrence Minowitz, Robert Mondillo, and Oompa's Farm.

American Courage (Matt Kakaley) remained unbeaten with easy with in the \$52,200 second division.

Major Makover (Wally Hennessey) held a slight lead hitting the first quarter first in :27.0. Sauvignon Bluechip (Tyler Buter) took over the lead right after the first quarter but that was short lived when American Courage (\$2.70) came flying by and took the lead with a lap to go. He hit the half in :56. Garrett's Drama (Jimmy Whittemore) came first-over to challenge as they reached the backstretch. American Courage cruised to three-quarters in 1:24.1.

As they headed down the stretch it was all American Courage winning easily in a lifetime best of 1:51.3 Sauvignon Bluechip was second best. Major Makover finished third.

American Courage is a 2-year-old colt by American Ideal—Nota Fool Bluechip. He is owned by Fiddler's Creek Stables LLC and trained by Travis Alexander. He is now five for five in his young career.

Big carryovers mean big payoffs at Big M

It was a night for the players who love The Meadowlands' multi-leg wagers Friday night (July 31), as a pair of big carryovers led to windfalls for shrewd bettors.

Right off the bat, the first race saw the 20-cent Pick-5 attract \$330,061 in "new money" on top of the \$52,665 carryover. The pool total was \$382,726, and those who had winning tickets where the winner's odds were 7-2, 3-2, 17-1, 12-1 and 2-1 cashed in for \$3,974.94.

Twenty-cent Pick-6 winners also cashed in for big green. After \$61,325 was pumped into the pool on top of the \$13,524 carryover, a total of \$74,489 was in the hat. Winner's odds for that sequence were 12-1, 2-1, 7-1, 6-5, 5-1 and 7-2, and those who held live tickets walked away with \$4,689.20.

With the boost provided by the big Pick-5 betting, the total pool on the first race was \$483,599, which set the tone for the rest of the evening, as total wagering exceeded the \$3-million mark for the eighth time this year with \$3,065,942 pushed through the windows on the 13-race card. That number represented a 34 percent increase over the corresponding program from a year ago.

ON THE TRACK: Plumville Prince scooted up the rail after three horses vacated the pylons on the far turn, then split rivals in deep stretch to record a 1¾-length score in the lone

Peter Haughton Memorial elimination for 2-year-old colts and geldings on the trot.

Sent to the gate as the 5-1 third choice in the wagering, Plumville Prince stopped the clock in 1:54.2 in winning for the first time in three lifetime starts. Scott Zeron drove the product of Father Patrick—Lady Athens for his father, trainer Rick.

Finishing second through seventh, respectively, were Moonstone S, Venerate, Media Mogul, Caruso, Zenith Stride and Incentive. They will join three horses who accepted byes – Locatelli, Type A and Spy Booth – in the \$324,000 Final on August 8.

Chalk players took it on the chin in both eliminations of the Jim Doherty Memorial for 2-year-old filly trotters.

In the first elim, 2-5 choice **Insta Glam** broke on the far turn, setting up a win from well off the pace from 12-1 chance Darlene Hanover (Chapter Seven—Danielle Hanover), who scored in 1:54.4 in registering her first lifetime score for trainer Brett Bittle and driver Andy McCarthy.

Material Girl, Hot As Hill, Ineffable and May Karp finished second through fifth, respectively, earning berths in the August 8 final, which will go for \$310,000.

Altar, also 2-5 in the betting, was sailing along on the lead in mid-stretch before going off stride in the second elim, allowing **Mazzarati** (Cantab Hall-Falls For You) a trip to the winner's circle. Driven by Tim Tetrick for Lucas Wallin, Mazzarati hit the wire in a lifetime-best 1:56.

Avenir, Ixia Maculata S, Altar (finished 3rd, disqualified and placed fourth) and Sel's Choice were second through fifth in the official order of finish to advance to the final.

In a pair of \$40,000 divisions of the Home Grown, **Caviart Audrey** (Somebeachsomewhere—Darlin's Delight) used a wicked late kick (:25.4 final quarter) to catch 3-5 favorite Grace Hill in taking her lifetime debut in 1:51.4 at odds of 2-1 for Yannick Gingras and Nancy Takter in the split for 2-year-old pacing fillies.

The division for 2-year-old colts and geldings on the pace saw Summa Cum Laude (the 6-5 slight second choice) blast directly down the road for Dexter Dunn and Ron Burke. The son of Somebeachsomewhere-Western Graduate hit the wire in 1:51.4, a lifetime best. Monterrey Jack, also 6-5, finished third.

BEFORE THE BETTING CARD: Shake That House, a son of American Ideal—Shake That Junk, went wire to wire in 1:49.1, taking the New Jersey Breeders Maturity Final for pacing 4-year-old horses and geldings for trainer Tony Alagna and driver Joe Bongiorno. It was 1¼ lengths back to Hurricane Emperor in second.

A Beach Cowgirl (Somebeachsomewhere—Limestone Cowgirl) sat a perfect pocket trip and got up as they hit the wire to gun down JK American Beauty by a nose in a

lifetime-best 1:49.4 for Annie Stoebe and Andy McCarthy in the New Jersey Breeders Maturity Final for 4-year-old mares on the pace.

Freshman fillies impressive in first Gold Series victories

A trio of fresh faces graced the winner's circle at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday (July 31) as the 2-year-old trotting fillies competed in leg two of their Gold Series campaign.

Dicentra kicked off the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) action with a mature effort from Post 3 in the first \$73,867 split. The fan favorite left well and led the field toward a :28.3 quarter before yielding to Hadiknownbetter. Driver Bob McClure sent the filly back to the front before the :59 half, but a quick challenge from Midnight Miracle saw Dicentra back in second by the 1:28.1 three-quarters. Once the fillies squared up in the stretch McClure gave Dicentra an open lane and she powered home to a one and three-quarter length victory in a personal best 1:56. Midnight Muscle finished second and Blackout Riley was seven lengths back in third.

"She's a very nice filly that seems to be improving in dramatic fashion. In Georgian she was very green and I don't think the surface there helped her. Since being back she has become a very top notch filly," said McClure. "Reminiscent of her big sis On A Sunny Day."

Dicentra finished sixth in the July 12 Gold Series season opener at Georgian Downs and then captured her Pure Ivory Series division at Woodbine Mohawk Park on July 23, giving the Muscle Mass daughter a record of two wins in three lifetime starts.

Luc Blais bred Dicentra and trains the full-sister to \$700,000 winner On A Sunny Day for owner Determination of Montreal, QC.

In the second division Dashing Muscle and driver James MacDonald settled in third from Post 1 and waited through fractions of :29.2 and :59.2 before tipping to the outside and seizing control from Ban Ban Deo soon after the 1:29.4. A :27.1 last quarter sealed the deal, giving Dashing Muscle her first Gold Series victory in a personal best 1:57.1. Fan favorite Meadowview Lilly was two lengths back in second and Hawaii completed the top three.

"Her owner, James Armitage, he trained her down at his farm in Dunrobin and then when she was in 2:07 he gave me a call and asked me to take her and finish her off," said trainer Chantal Mitchell. "She's just a very, very smart filly. The first time I jogged her she felt like an older horse and he said she was always like that. So that's, I think, what her biggest attribute is, is she's just very mature. For two-year-old trotting fillies, having some brains on your side

is always a plus."

Like Dicentra, **Dashing Muscle** now has two wins to her credit through three starts. The Muscle Mass daughter, who was a \$30,000 purchase out of the London Selected Yearling Sale, finished fourth in the Gold Series opener and then captured an overnight event at Grand River Raceway on July 24.

"Up until today, every time I'd taken her to the racetrack it was different one, and every time she went somewhere it was like she'd been there before," said Mitchell, adding that the filly had also been to Rideau Carleton Raceway under Armitage's tutelage. "She's very nice, you couldn't fault her. She doesn't do anything wrong. It's just like having an aged horse."

In the final \$73,866 division, driver Doug McNair let **Up And Ready** float away from the starting gate and settle into a gap in fifth as Pixies Lady led the field to a :28.3 quarter. Great Dane took control before the :57.4 half and while she was fending off a challenge from fan favorite Fox Valley Liza, Up And Ready was revving up from fifth. Circling out three wide heading by the 1:26.3 three-quarters, Up And Ready drew away from her peers in the stretch on her way to a personal best 1:56.3 victory. Exclusive Rosette was three and one-half lengths back in second, with another length back to third-place finisher Anna Bolena.

John Bax trains the Kadabra daughter, who was a \$300,000 purchase out of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale by Al Libfeld of Pickering, Marvin and Lynn Katz and Sam Goldband of Toronto, ON. While she was training down in Florida Up And Ready kicked Bax and fractured his elbow, so he is pleased to see that his perseverance with the fractious youngster is starting to pay off.

"I still remember the kick," said Campbellville, ON resident Bax. "She hasn't changed that way. She's best after the harness gets on her and she's out on the track, then she's good, but the rest of the time it's very careful. You let her come to you, you don't go to her."

Up And Ready finished sixth in an overnight event at Woodbine Mohawk Park on July 3 and was third in the Gold Series season opener at Georgian Downs on July 12, just ahead of Dashing Muscle.

The fillies will make their third Gold Series start at Grand River Raceway on Aug. 19 and then both Dicentra and Up And Ready are eligible to the Champlain and Peaceful Way Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"I think we're Sires Stakes now and then you know, I'm hoping that she'll progress enough to be aiming for the Peaceful Way and that kind of thing," said Bax. "But we don't want to get ahead of ourselves, it's one step at a time."

Trace Tetrick sweeps sophomore pacing colt ISS at Hoosier Park

Three-year-old pacing colts performed in their third leg of Indiana Sires Stakes action on Friday (July 31) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Both winners were guided to victory by Harrah's Hoosier Park's leading driver Trace Tetrick. In the first division, Tetrick was victorious with **Roll With Time** who prevailed in a tight photo. He then guided Island Of The Sea to a gutsy 1:48.4 victory, just a fifth of a second off of the track record for the division.

Tetrick's first trip to the winner's circle was with Tyler George's Roll With Time in the first \$35,000 division. When the gate opened, Roll With Time found a spot in fourth, waiting patiently to attack through fractions of :26.2 and :56. Just after the half, Tetrick urged Roll With Time to make his move for the lead.

When the field reached the three-quarters in 1:23.4, Roll With Time surged ahead of the pace-setting Clever Character and Dale Hiteman. The stretch saw a cavalry charge to the wire that looked to be anyone's race. Dojea Gizmo with Dan Shelter and Family Recipe with LeWayne Miller fanned out across the track and rallied toward the leader. Digging in gamely, Roll With Time reached the wire first, stopping the clock in 1:50.4. He paid \$4.80 to win while Dojea Gizmo finished second and Family Recipe finished third, all within a length of each other.

"The trip worked out the way I planned, but he is a versatile colt, too," Tetrick said after the win. "Tyler has him in really good shape and he's racing sharp right now."

Roll With Time, the son of Time To Roll—Roknrol Bluegrass, now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$35,000 for owners Jeff Fought, Brian Carsey and Casey Myers. Bred by Hickory Hollow Stables, he earned his first stakes victory and fifth lifetime victory with the win.

Tetrick steered another winner to victory with Dylan Davis trainee **Island Of The Sea**. While the betting public was backing Super Final champion Odds On Osiris with Peter Wrenn at the lines, Island Of The Sea waited mid-pack through the early stages of the race. Sitting through fractions of :26.1 and :54.2, Island Of The Sea moved first-over as the field approached the final turn with Dry Creek Sam and Robert Taylor in tow. Odds On Osiris looked strong on the front and continued to call the shots through the three-quarters in 1:22 but Island Of The Sea was gaining on the leader with every stride.

Turning for home the stage was set for a battle to the wire

as Island Of The Sea and Odds On Osiris matched strides down the stretch. Neither wanted to give an inch but it was Island Of The Sea who burst forward by a neck, crossing the wire in a sizzling 1:48.4. Odds On Osiris was forced to settle for second while Crook Boyzz and Brandon Bates finished third. Island Of The Sea paid \$14.00 to win in the minor upset.

"He's a nice horse — I've been watching him since he's been here," said Tetrick who was driving the horse for the first time. "He's very handy and dug in late to get the win."

Lightly raced as a 2-year-old, Island Of The Sea has won six races from 9 lifetime starts and boasts a lifetime bankroll of \$67,720 for owners Eric and Lisa Ell. The son of Always A Virgin—Trinity Islands was bred by Steve Schmucker.

Macho Martini and Tokyo Seelster repeat in Gold Series

Woodbine Mohawk Park hosted a pair of \$108,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions for the 2-year-old trotting colts on Wednesday (July 30) and **Macho Martin** and **Tokyo Seelster** both made their third straight appearance in the Milton oval's winner's circle.

First off the gate was Macho Martini, starting from Post 8 with regular reinsman Bob McClure in the race bike. The pair had to dodge a breaking Royal Tyrone heading into the first turn and were six lengths off the pace when Rookie Season reached the :28.2 quarter, but Macho Martini had caught the leaders by the :58.3 half and established a comfortable lead before the 1:28.2 three-quarters. Heading for home the fan favorite opened up a four and one-half length margin on his peers and hit the wire in 1:56.4. Master Grand overcame a bobble at the start and interference at the half to finish second and Rookie Season was four more lengths back in third.

"What a fun horse to be a part of. Every week he just goes out and does his job," said McClure. "His personality off the track too, he's just a big, cocky kid, just a lot of fun."

Luc Blais conditions Macho Martini for Determination of Montreal, QC, who offered up \$37,000 for the Muscle Mass son at the 2019 Harrisburg Yearling Sale. Blais said the colt demonstrated talent all winter and has already developed into a professional racehorse.

"He was always the best colt in the winter, training. He's a mature horse, he looks like a 3-year-old, strong and mature," said Blais. "He's very professional. He's got a nice presence. He's a proud horse, you know. What you see on the track, he's like that in the barn."

With a full slate of stakes events on his calendar, including the Champlain and William Wellwood Memorial, Blais said

Macho Martini will enjoy a mini-vacation next week after winning the first two Gold legs and the first leg of the Millard Farms Series.

“He had three big weeks now and we’re going to give him a week off,” said Blais. “The season is going to be long now, the big race coming in a couple weeks. We’re going to try to make him fresh as we can.”

In the second division Tokyo Seelster left smartly from Post 7 and was sitting third when Highland Mowgli reached the quarter in :29. Regular reinsman Sylvain Filion soon had Tokyo Seelster on the move and the fan favorite hit the half in :58.2. Harry mounted a challenge heading for the 1:29.1 three-quarters and got a head in front of Tokyo Seelster, but the colt kicked it into another gear and powered away to a three and one-half length victory in 1:57. Highland Mowgli finished second and Harry was third.

“Leaving the gate I was just being careful to avoid breakers and stuff like that and once we turned on the backside, I pulled to go to the front, decided to control the pace,” said Filion. “Once he got there he relaxed really good, he relaxed almost too much, he kind of fell asleep on me, until Paul Walker came alongside with his trotter (Harry) and then he took off again. He was really, really strong at the wire.

“That’s what I like about him, he’s going to probably last longer that way,” said Filion of the colt’s laidback approach to racing. “I’d rather have him like this than the opposite, too rammy and stuff like that, no, that’s a good quality in a two-year-old trotter.”

Richard Moreau trains Tokyo Seelster for Michael and Sam Sergi of Canton, NY, who purchased the Kadabra son for \$52,000 at last fall’s London Selected Yearling Sale. The Sergis watched the race from home and were impressed with the youngster’s third effort.

“At the top of the stretch they were all coming pretty good at him and I thought, ‘Geez’, but when he found that extra gear then we were all like, ‘Wow’. He could be the real deal,” said Michael Sergi. “It’s sort of bittersweet that we can’t come there to watch, because we can’t cross the border, but we’ll cheer from home I guess.”

Sam Sergi bought his first standardbred four decades ago and has shared his love of harness racing with son Michael over the years, from driving and training to breeding mares and standing stallions. They typically start their young horses at their Canton farm before handing them over to trainers, but Tokyo Seelster remained in Ontario after the sale last fall.

“My dad usually breaks them but he was having some health issues so we just decided to leave him there to be broke. We were actually going to bring him home and train him but we live in New York, our track was really bad, it was pure ice for most of the winter, so that’s when we decided to

send him to Robbie,” said Sergi, noting that Tokyo Seelster learned his first lessons from Moreau and his staff, moved to the barn of Ottawa horseman Robbie Robinson for his winter conditioning, and then returned to Moreau in time for the Gold Series season opener on July 9. “Every time we would call and talk he (Robinson) was like, ‘Yeah, he’s doing great, feeling good’. And a couple of times he was even like, ‘You know, I really don’t want to jinx him, I just don’t want to say, but he is special’”

Sergi said Tokyo Seelster looks to be the best 2-year-old trotting colt the family has owned, and they look forward to watching him battle in the remaining Gold events, as well as the Champlain and William Wellwood Memorial.

The freshman trotting colts will make their third Gold Series start at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Aug. 20.

Ontario Sires Stakes action continues at the Milton oval on Friday, July 31 with three Gold Series divisions for the two-year-old trotting fillies. The fillies will compete in Races 1, 4 and 8, with the first race getting underway at 7 pm.

Swan In Motion remains undefeated in stakes action at Hoosier Park

Swan In Motion continued his winning ways at Harrah’s Hoosier Park Racing & Casino after he captured the featured event of the evening, the second division of the \$31,500 Indiana Sires Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings, on Thursday (July 30). Stopping the timer in 1:54.3 over a track rated sloppy, Swan In Motion claimed his third straight stakes win and remains undefeated in five starts this season for trainer Jamie Macomber and driver Ricky Macomber Jr.

Swan In Motion was unhurried from the gate and settled along the rail in third while Emma Town Bud and Michael Oosting did all the heavy lifting on the front. Emma Town Bud carved out fractions of :28.4, :58.4, and 1:27.3 before ever feeling threat. When the field turned for home, Macomber Jr. guided Swan In Motion out to the middle of the track and the colt found his best stride. Using a final panel of :26.1, Swan In Motion was able to track down Emma Town Bud and went on to win by a length and a quarter.

The son of Swan For All—Keystone Sadie has won five of five outs for his sophomore season and seven of 15 lifetime. Owned in partnership by M&M Racing and Norbert Joseph Maza, Swan In Motion has now bankrolled \$261,450 lifetime.

In the second split of the stakes action, **Dude Included** utilized a similar late stepping strategy to score in a new lifetime best of 1:53. With driver John DeLong in the sulky, Dude Included turned a pocket trip into a two length score to record his second win of the season.

TJ's Top Pick and Trace Tetrack played the role of post time favorite and dictated fractions of :27.1, :56.4, and 1:25.2 while Dude Included waited patiently in the pocket. Tipping out from behind the tiring leader turning for home, Dude Included employed a :27.1 final quarter to win going away.

Trained by Trent Stohler, Dude Included now sports a 5-2-3-0 seasonal record and 14-3-7-1 lifetime. Owned by Benjamin Graber, Dude Included pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$129,735 with the win.

There are 16 freshman fillies divided into two divisions, each going for \$52,200.

The first group features No Pay No Way (Credit Winner-Not A Diva) who has one NYSS win in only one lifetime start. After qualifying handily at the Meadowlands in 1:56.4, No Pay No Way took a come from behind win at Yonkers on July 21 in a state-bred race, banking the bulk of the \$48,866 purse after the win in 2:00.

Scott Zeron will be in the bike for trainer Rick Zeron.

Titans Hope (E L Titan—Fiery Manes) made an impressive first start at Yonkers, finishing third after a mid-mile move. A change in barn and driver seemed to step her up from her qualifier and she looks to continue improving in here.

Jason Bartlett drives for trainer Andrew Harris.

Also in the race is Credit Income (Credit Winner—Income De Vle) who won an Excel A outing in 2:01 at Saratoga Raceway on July 8 before stepping up to a top level, second place finish at Yonkers where she trotted in 1:59.2.

John Stark Jr. drives for trainer Maureen Salino.

The second division has Destined To Dance (Chapter Seven—Go Go Dancer) starting from post seven and looking for her third consecutive win on the year. This filly has won gate to wire at Saratoga on July 8 in 1:59.4 and from off the pace at Yonkers on July 21 in her lifetime best 1:58.3.

Tyler Buter will steer again for trainer John Butenschoen.

Just Joshing (Chapter Seven—Jodi's Jayme) has two consecutive wins in Excel A company and both were very

impressive. She takes the next step here and looks to be a formidable force against the top group this week for driver Andy Miller and trainer Julie Miller.

Elize B (Chapter Seven—Legal Lady) made a stellar debut after cutting the mile and just getting beat in 1:59.2 at Saratoga. She made a break in her next outing at Yonkers from post seven and looks to make amends for that misstep. Scott and Rick Zeron are also the driver/trainer team on this filly.

There are only nine entrants in the sophomore soiree that will also go in two groups for \$54,000 and \$55,000, respectively.

The first division has four starters who are winless this year but who also show a lot of potential.

Destiny Blue Chip (Chapter Seven—Chasin Clouds Away) was caught up in a torrid 1:53 mile at Tioga Downs on June 21, chasing Love A Good Story who is in the other division. In her last start at Vernon Downs, she was parked out for over three-quarters of the mile before tiring in the last turn in a race that went in 1:52.1. She is now in a short field that looks like she should be able to make use of those tighteners.

Ake Svanstedt both trains and drives.

Starrystarrynight (Conway Hall—Makes Me Crazy) has won three times last year but has still not found the winner's circle in 2020. After winning her qualifier on June 15 at Yonkers, Starrystarrynight has been racing overnight condition races at Harrah's Philly where she was recently race timed in 1:55.2. Now back facing her own age and gender, she should be well prepped for a top effort in her first stake start this year.

Billy Davis Jr. drives for trainer Gilbert Garcia-Herrera.

Island Lily (Chapter Seven—Up Front Hotsey) showed good early work this year before finishing fourth in an Excel A event. After a month layoff, she qualified in a lifetime best time of 1:56.4 by 3-1/2 lengths at Pocono. She steps up to the top level here but comes in looking the part.

Tom Jackson drives for trainer Fred Grant.

The second \$55,000 leg is stacked with three of the top five point-getters in this division.

Love A Good Story (Chapter Seven—Celebrity Lovin) has won both of her NYSS outings this year taking a lifetime mark of 1:52.1 at Vernon Downs on July 11. She also finished second to Hypnotic Am in the \$207,250 Empire Breeders Classic and most recently competed in the \$253,500 Del Miller at the Meadowlands against Hambletonian hopeful Ramona Hill who won it in 1:50.3.

Team Orange Crush handles Love A Good Story with Andy Miller in the bike for trainer Julie Miller.

No Mas Drama (Muscles Yankee—Massive Drama) hasn't

missed a check all year until an impossible trip in the Del Miller where she found herself 10th at the quarter chasing a 1:50.3 mile and Munster (Chapter Seven-Riches Oblige S) has also cashed in four starts behind the gate. However both are still looking for win number one of the year.

Jim Morrill Jr. Drives No Mas Drama for trainer Jenn Bongiorno and Tyler Buter will team Munster for Per Engblom.

Post time for the first race is 1:15 p.m.

Dresden Raceway plays host to Grassroots and Prospect Series Monday

Dresden Raceway wraps up its 2020 season on Monday (Aug. 3) with a trio of \$22,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots divisions for the 2-year-old trotting colts and a pair of \$7,000 Prospect Series divisions for the 3-year-old trotting colts.

Local colt Magnitude Ten will make his Prospect Series debut in the first division, starting from the advantageous Post 1. Owner-trainer John Sullivan of Dresden will be in the race bike for the Kadabra colt's stakes debut, looking to add a win to the trotter's resume of two seconds and one third in three lifetime starts.

"He was so big as a two-year-old that I thought maybe I might hinder him by trying to race him, and I'm pretty patient, so what I did was I trained him down pretty good and then I stopped with him and gave him a rest and let him develop," said Sullivan, who sent the colt behind the gate for the first time on June 20 at Hiawatha Horse Park. "I am pretty happy with everything he has done. He's a nice horse."

Magnitude Ten faces a field of four, including former Grassroots competitor The Reins Of Titan from Post 2 and July 11 Prospect Series winner Los Ballykeelamigo from Post 5. Sullivan hopes the colt can hold his own, but win or lose there will be a bag of carrots waiting for Magnitude Ten in the barn when he comes off the track.

"He just loves his carrots. He costs me a lot by the amount of carrots that he eats. He doesn't like apples, but he loves carrots," said Sullivan with a chuckle. "He has to have something in his mouth all the time, whether it's a sleeve, a hat, part of the bridle or anything. He just has to have something in his mouth. He's quite a character."

Magnitude Ten and his peers will kick off the Civic Holiday Monday program at 1 pm in the first race, with the second Prospect Series division going postward in Race 5.

The Grassroots colts square off in Races 3, 7 and 8 and 2-year-old trotting colt point leader Arch Hall will be looking

for a second Grassroots win from Post 5 in the last division. Trainer Blake MacIntosh is expecting another strong performance from the son of Archangel and driver Paul Mackenzie.

"He's just done everything we've asked him to do so far," said St. George, ON resident MacIntosh, who shares ownership of Arch Hall with Hutt Racing Stable of Malvern, PA. "He's a very handy horse. He's very easy to drive, he doesn't do nothing wrong, and there's no real tricks to him. He's a pretty nice horse, for a two-year-old trotting colt he's pretty smart."

Arch Hall will face off against six Grassroots foes in the eighth race, most of them veterans of the first two legs. In the July 11 season opener at Georgian Downs Arch Hall just got nipped at the wire and had to settle for second and in the July 25 contest at Hiawatha Horse Park he was a one and one-quarter length winner on the front end from Post 9, stopping the teletimer at 2:00.4. With a win and a second under his belt, Arch Hall sits atop the division standings with 75 points, 13 points ahead of Tymal Chrome who will start from Post 6 in the second Grassroots division.

Thoughts on the changing sports landscape

After seeing the news from Miami this week regarding Major League Baseball and COVID-19 positives, I think it's fair to be concerned about the overall state of mainstream sports moving forward in 2020. Yes, the NBA has a bubble, but with so much in-game contact and even more in the NFL, I think it's safe to say sports isn't getting back to "normal" anytime soon.

For the first time in my life, horse racing isn't just an afterthought in society and the sports world in general. The job done by many major race tracks, and Woodbine, in particular with its newly minted TSN partnership and the timely unveiling of their DARKHORSE app, has moved horse racing further ahead than anyone could have projected. Yes, for many jurisdictions with casino partners 2020 has had some new and problematic challenges. Diminished capacity on gaming floors, COVID fears, and overall financial hardship have definitely reduced revenue at these venues. As our partners continue to navigate these uncharted waters, we need to do some navigating of our own.

Horse racing is very fortunate to be operating at all. I personally applaud the efforts of our industry stakeholders in getting us back on the job when so many of our neighbors are still unemployed. That isn't to say things are great and we don't have major hurdles approaching, because we do. COVID-19 has put most everyone in a much different financial situation than they are used to, and the fallout from

that is undoubtedly going to be felt first and foremost by our smaller breeders this coming sales season.

We have to face the realistic notion that there is simply less money available in 2020 to buy yearlings. I believe this an opportunity for trainers to show some entrepreneurship and partner with breeders that may be actively looking for a "Plan B" leading up to, and after the conclusion of the fall sales. TheStable.ca has done this since we opened our doors and some of our best horses have come from these partnership programs. We have been approached by many breeders already this season, and I'm sure there will be no shortage of interested parties soon enough to work with you. This is incredibly important because if we start to lose breeders, we risk shrinking a viable entry point for new people coming into the horse racing industry. If smaller breeding operations shutter, we will have fewer horses bred, eventually leading to yearlings shortages in the future that will inevitably drive up prices making it impossible to find value in the yearling market at all. Further to that, fewer horses will ultimately result in smaller fields and the inevitable downward spiral that we must fight to avoid. By not working together this fall we will actually be hurting ourselves and our industry in the long run. The obvious question is: Where will the extra funds come from to form and foster these partnerships? Is there any way to create more cash flow to help our industry moving forward?

I've spoken in multiple venues on two continents about the power of affordable ownership, and the draw it has on everyday people. This year because of COVID-19 shuttering society as a whole, we have more eyeballs on our sport than we had since the start of the internet. Do you think any of these people watching have ever seen a sport they can become interested in, and afford to be an active participant? The potential for that added value is immense for horse racing, and TheStable.ca has proven that this transition from fan to owner is very real and possible. This article isn't about what we have done at our barn, as much as what other trainers can do in theirs. It isn't the name, slogan, or the person selling the idea. It's the message of affordable ownership and the entertainment that goes with that. I always claimed that the affordability of the entertainment dollar for dollar found in horse racing is unmatched in society, now it's simply unrivaled!

I believe the time is upon us to properly educate our horsemen on how they can connect with everyday people to grow their own barns and brands. More now than ever, we need to introduce ourselves to society in new and direct ways to show them what we actually offer. We have a competitive and exciting sport full of athleticism, speed, great stories, and hard work. There is nothing like seeing and hearing the horses thundering down the stretch to cross the finish line — all in a time when there isn't much of anything available for people to get excited about.

For the negative people ready to only talk about the struggles we have faced in the past with marketing, gaming, or bad apples in our sport, I would say to them that every sport has its own unique issues, and we are no different. Bringing new people into the sport of horse racing makes it stronger and helps us shine a light on all the poorly lit corners of our industry. This is more than just new paint on an old piece of wood. This is rebuilding and rebranding a great product that more people than ever would be interested to participate in. Saying the interest isn't there is simply incorrect. I think if anything I've proven that to be untrue.

With the sports entertainment field significantly thinned out right now, we are doing a great job seizing the day, but I do think it's time we strive for more.

People can say horse racing is dead, but I believe from this generational disaster we could find the fresh air we have so desperately been in search of for decades. Our future is literally right in front of us, we need to continue to push forward, be aware and stay ahead of the hurtles to come. Strengthen our core, protect our breeders, and we will see growth that most of us never thought possible.

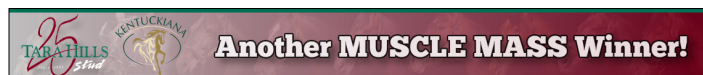
