Harrisburg sale won't be in Harrisburg this year

The COVID-19 pandemic has made the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex unavailable for the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's annual yearling and mixed sales traditionally held the first week of November, but a search for a new location has been underway for months.

The sales ring at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg will remain empty this year. Due to COVID-19, the facility is unavailable and the Standardbred Horse Sales Company will be held at a temporary location.

Standardbred Horse Sales Company (SHSC) president and CEO Pete Spears said this year's Harrisburg sale won't take place in Harrisburg due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but will go ahead as a live auction at another location.

"We're as committed as we can possibly be to offering a live auction and, in order to do that successfully, we feel that we have to maximize the number of venues to choose from and spread them out over a large geographic area and even potentially, depending on the situation, be flexible on the dates," Spears said Tuesday afternoon, a day after informing consignors by email that the sale's traditional home, the

"I think for all practical purposes we will not be anticipating using the complex this year and we're making preparations to go elsewhere," Spears said.

"It wasn't unanticipated. We've been looking into other venues as a back-up for several months. I think it's been pretty evident that [Pennsylvania] Governor [Tom] Wolf has taken a strong stand in favor of public health over economic activity and that's been his pattern, so it really doesn't surprise us that this decision has been made. So, we're prepared.

"[Sale operations manager] Dale [Welk] and I have been looking for other venues for at least three months."

Spears said the SHSC has three potential alternative venues — each one in a different state. The company has made contact with a facility in a fourth state that may work and have identified a fifth site that might work that they have yet to contact. He was reluctant to name the facilities on his short list to avoid confusion prior to a location being finalized, but said the locations vary from eastern states to

the Midwest and as far south as Kentucky.

"We're trying to maximize our options," Spears said, adding the number one priority is finding a facility that will work best given COVID-19 restrictions.

"Dale Welk, I think, is the best operations manager in the business and he'll figure out a way to make a sale work anywhere.

"Each state has its own [COVID-19] guidelines and restrictions, so we've been looking for facilities that would satisfy those things. So, there are places that we've looked in which we'd have to basically conduct the sale outside in tents. There are other places that would offer a combination of indoor and outdoor facilities and there are places where there are permanent stalls in huge barns, but because barns can be left so open, they still count as an outdoor event... so there is minimal tenting."

Spears said the SHSC is expected to make a decision on an alternate facility by mid-September at the latest.

"But if necessary, and if there's an advantage to it, we can delay that decision depending on whether the consignors would prefer to wait and have the sale later, hoping that [pandemic] conditions will improve," he said. "Any decision we make on venues can be delayed if necessary. Dale needs six-to-eight weeks in order to prepare for his set-up, regardless of where we go."

Spears said he initially thought it might be possible to keep the sale at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex because, "a decision was made to include equine auctions as economic-sustaining activities, such that they should be able to be operated under reasonable conditions," he said. "That was posted on the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture website. We took that as a favorable decision. They also posted very extensive guidelines about how to conduct public events, COVID-19 guidelines. We submitted a very extensive protocol to farm show officials, who sent it up the line for review. We felt that it complied with all of the directives. We were told, after the decision, that our protocol was excellent, but that the Farm Show would be unlikely to be available for our event and we should look elsewhere."

Spears said consignors would like there to be a live auction, not an online-only event, but the company is making plans to have online bidding and telephone bidding to complement the normal live auction.

"We're going to promote the online and telephone bidding

extensively," Spears said. "Even under the best of circumstances, many of our customers are older and many of them have significant medical conditions. They would probably benefit, from a health standpoint, by staying home and doing their purchases online or by phone. We'll do everything possible to make that happen.

"We're working with a company called ProxiBid and they run thousands of online auctions. They work with Fasiq-Tipton's [thoroughbred sales]...We think it'll be a big convenience for customers."

As for the predicted impact on the bottom line of having to change locations, Spears said he isn't overly concerned yet, especially given the quality of the horses due to be sold.

"I think as long as we can run a live auction, in a nice facility and do it in a professional manner, I think everything is going to be fine. I think that we're doing everything humanly possible to make that happen," he said.

Carson Conrad the latest in five generations of his family to work with standardbreds

Carson Conrad has had the date Sept. 18, 2020 circled in his calendar for a few years.

The teenager from Morristown, IN isn't much different than most other 15-year-olds. He enjoys sports — more specifically, basketball and baseball — likes to play video games, and hanging out with his friends.

And, like many kids on the cusp of turning 16, he's counting down the days until he can earn his driver's license.

Only in this instance, Conrad is looking forward to holding the reins, not gripping the steering wheel.

"I can't wait, to be honest. I hope the time goes by quickly," he said.

The Conrad family's tie to Indiana harness racing goes back generations. Carson, who made his debut matinee start at the Darke County Fairgrounds in Greenville, OH, at the age of 14, is the latest Conrad to sit in the sulky.

It marks the fifth generation of Conrads to pilot standardbreds.

Although harness racing is in his DNA, Carson, whohas already spent countless hours at his father Charlie's barn, at Harrah's Hoosier Park and on the Indiana county fair circuit, didn't feel a sense of familial duty to join the sport.

Instead, it was very much his own choice, one he was only too happy to make.

"I started realizing about three or four years ago that I really liked horses and horse racing," said Carson. "I think being around dad and learning really started to open my eyes. A couple of years ago, I wanted to start training – training the babies – and dad taught me how read a watch and how to have a feel for them. Before that, it was going around the barn, patting the horses – things like that. But then, the more I was there, the more I learned and understood the day-to-day process."

He also came to appreciate that harness racing is, in many ways, a team sport.

An avid basketball fan and player, Conrad, who recently took up baseball, sees notable similarities between the hardcourt, baseball diamond, and racetrack.

"In the barn, you can't think you can do it all. You need to have help, and you need to depend on others to make sure you get the best outcome. You have to lean on others. Paying attention and learning yourself, but also paying attention and learning from your teammates, that's so important, too."

Although the date of his first pari-mutuel race is to be determined, Conrad's driving education is already well under way.

Any opportunity for him to hop in the race bike is a welcome one.

"My friend commented on Facebook yesterday, he said the best thing in the world is to wake up and sit behind a horse. I commented on that. I said, 'Amen.' I just love being able to do that. People just don't know how smart these animals are. These animals are unbelievably smart, and they know what they're doing."

One horse in particular comes to mind.

"I built one of the biggest relationships in my life with my mare. She's 4 now. From being 2 and now 4, I've built a really strong connection with her, and I've also learned so much from that bond. She knows me inside and out and I know her inside and out. She taught me to believe. As a 2-year-old, she had some problems, but as a 3-year-old, she came back and was just outstanding for us. She did really well last year. She was runner-up in a fair final, and won a lot of races for us."

Ultimaroca, a 2-year-old son of Rockin Image (IN), bred by Alvin Fry, and co-owned by Conrad's mother, Sarah, has also fared well.

The bay colt, trained and driven by Charlie Conrad, has three wins from four starts.

"He's a really nice one," said Carson. "Those are the horses you love to have."

And the type of horse that make an aspiring horseman dream big.

"I want to be successful in harness racing. I want to be a catch driver, have my own stable, and make it a nice stable. Everyone wants to race in the big races, but you have the horses for that. Right now, we have a talented group of horses, and we want to build on that. We have a nice horse racing in New Jersey right now. Growing up, you never think you'll have a horse competing in another state. But this one, Skyway Quinton [trained by Charlie and owned by Sarah], he's my first sires stakes horse. He's been good to us. He's another horse that makes you happy. Every time I get that chance to sit behind a horse, it just keeps reminding me of

what I want to do for my career."

He's thrilled to have found his calling at such a young age.

"I was talking to [driver] Joey Putnam and I told him I got my first set of colors not too long ago. Joey said, 'It's good to see where you're at because I didn't know I wanted to do this until I was 18 or 19.' I can't say what my biggest skills are in the bike yet, but I do know it's where I want to be. When we train them down right now, I'll handle one week with the group and dad will handle the group the next week. They all have to get the same amount of experience. I know that when I'm behind a horse right now, I'm really focused. My mind is on them for that whole time. When I cross the wire, it's time to talk with my dad, to discuss how they did. We exchange what we learned. Like I said, it's all about learning and education. And every day I wake up, I'm excited to get to the barn."

In just over a month's time, Conrad will have another place to be.

He won't need to set an alarm to get him out of bed on that morning.

"September 18, that's when I plan to take my driver's test. I can't wait for that day. I'm thinking about it a lot. I've actually been thinking of it for a long time."











Bold Eagle says goodbye after fourth-place finish in Belgium

A champion had his last performance on the racetrack on Sunday afternoon (Aug. 2). Bold Eagle (Ready Cash) ended his career with a fourth-place finish in the \$140,000 Grand Prix de Wallonie in mons, Belgium, driven by Hugues Monthule, the horse's caretaker.

Bold Eagle had to race first over with a half mile to go in

the 1.4-mile long race, and with Prix d'Amérique winner and stablemate **Face Time Bourbon** in front, the objective was too tough. Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash), driven by Björn Goop, hit the lead at an early stage of the race and won comfortably in mile rate 1:54.1.

Bold Eagle's career is astonishing with two victories in Prix d'Amérique as the most prestigious wins and the 9-year-old champion pushed his lifetime earnings to €5,000,567 (\$5,878,020) with the fourth-place in Mons.

Sébastien Guarato trains both Bold Eagle and Face Time Bourbon.

Set for Åby Stora Pris

The \$410,500 Åby Stora Pris over heavy distance 3,140 meters (approximately 1.95 miles) is scheduled at Åby racetrack on Saturday (Aug. 8) and several tough trotters will be gathered behind the gate.

Horses such as Cokstile, Ble du Gers, Who's Who, Makethemark and Very Kronos will fight over three laps on Åby's surface and there are no doubts that the track has

My grandfather's Hambletonian garage

A journey through 94 years of Hambletonian history as time stamped by my grandfather's rental property and my sweet classic car.

In **1926**, Grauman's Chinese Theater opened on Hollywood Boulevard, my grandparents built their first home, and harness racing ran its very first edition of The Hambletonian in Syracuse, NY.

The race was won by **Guy McKinney for driver/trainer Nat Ray**. The race time of 2:04.3 took home the largest piece of the \$76,451 purse. At the time, with that kind of coin, you could have gone to Grauman's and watched Rudolph Valentino in "The Son of The Sheik" about 19,000 times – popcorn included. I don't know how they split up the monies back then, but the whole enchilada would be worth about \$1,070,000 today.

Nearly three hundred miles to the south, my paternal grandparents built their very first home in northern New Jersey. They already had a big family, so they built a big house. Things were going great for my grandfather in 1926, so, for an extra \$700, he bought the adjacent lot just in case he wanted to expand.

In the summer of 1932, with three additional children, a pair of mooching in-laws and the Great Depression tugging at his wallet, Gramps decided that the second lot needed more than just some rose bushes, a picnic table, and a cherry tree. Selling it was out of the question because the stock market crash had rendered it worthless. What could Gramps do to generate some income from that extra land?

Meanwhile, as Gramps was formulating a plan, a magnificently tall filly, The Marchioness, won the 1932 Hambletonian at Good Time Park in Goshen, NY for driver/trainer William Caton. While the crumbling economy had depressed the purse to \$49,489 – about \$940,000 in 2020 money — the race was anything but depressing. At a time when many Americans weren't working at all, The Marchioness worked enough for everyone to ensure victory in a race that required four heats to determine a winner.

On Sept. 17, 1932, exactly one month after the achievements of The Marchioness, Gramps went to the Town Hall with a set of plans. They were approved, and within days, he and my great-grandfather, a man I never knew, started the construction of a three-car garage that would hopefully generate rental income on the double lot. The cost for building it was exactly \$807.42 (\$12,000 today).

By the summer of 1933, the year that another filly named Mary Reynolds won the Hambletonian for driver/trainer Ben White, the garage was almost complete. There was a brief delay in finishing because my grandfather was toying with the idea of turning the upper part of the garage into an apartment. It was decided by my grandmother that the cost of doing this was prohibitive, and there was no way on earth my grumpy grandfather could ever get along with a tenant living on his property. So, rather than arguing about cost-effectiveness, the whole thing was topped off with a high vaulted ceiling.

Keep in mind that this was an unreasonably big stand-alone garage. My father said that it was big enough to fit three 1930 Cords. Did you ever see a 1930 Cord? Jay Leno has a few of them in his antique car collection. You don't park those things. You dock them.

In **1934**, as the garage was topped off, and the Great Depression was at its worst, the Hambletonian purse had dwindled down to a paltry \$25,845 — the lowest Hambletonian purse ever. The wounded purse notwithstanding, that year's Hambletonian was still a grand and well-attended event that saw **Lord Jim winning with Hugh M. "Doc" Parshall** driving and training.

Although the standardbred was still a relatively young breed, Lord Jim, the least expensive yearling to ever win the Hambletonian, was already an heir to some antiquated breeding. His sire, Lord Axworthy, did not sire Lord Jim until

he was 28, and his dam, Selka, a mare by Peter the Great, was 16 when she foaled him. Being genetically outdated didn't matter to Lord Jim. In a four-heat Hambletonian, Lord Jim wore down the highly-regarded Muscletone to get up and win in 2:04.1.

While Lord Jim was still basking in the glory of being a Hambletonian champ, my grandfather handed a garage key to a man named Mr. Brady, his very first garage renter. Mr. Brady was a middle-aged bachelor who lived in a nearby apartment building with his elderly mother. I don't know what kind of car it was, but my grandmother always referred to it as a big black monstrosity that was rarely used and kept immaculately clean. My grandfather was annoyed by Mr. Brady's presence simply because he was often polishing his car and tinkering under the hood. But he always paid his rent in advance at a time when money was hard to come by.

Along our journey to my next Hambletonian Garage connection, I'd like to tell you a little bit about the garage itself.

Before there was Monty Hall and the game show Let's Make a Deal, and long before I came into the world, there was my grandfather's garage. It was just like the show.

From left to right, there was Door #1, Door #2 and Door #3, and each door had the number printed on it in large numerals. This was totally unnecessary, but that was the way my grandfather did things. For example, when he kept cash in his house, the \$1 bills were kept in the tin for small Band-Aids. Five-dollar bills were kept in the tin for medium sized Band-Aids and anything larger than a five was kept in the tin for extra-large Band-Aids. The amateur psychiatrist in me suspects that my grandfather thought that money and bandages performed the same service.

The door closest to the house was Door #3. You could drive straight into that spot because the driveway led directly up to it. Gramps planned on charging the most for that spot, but until he could find a renter, he parked his own car there.

Door #2, the door assigned to Mr. Brady, was a little

tougher. You had to turn left at the top of the drive and straighten out nimbly to pull straight in. Because of that small nuisance, it was a little less expensive than Door #3.

Door #1 was the least expensive because it was exceedingly difficult to maneuver. You had to make a hard left at the top of the driveway and pull up and back a few times until you were positioned directly under the cherry tree. After that, you could level out and drive on in.

In 1939, when my father was a baby, Gramps lowered the price just enough to finally snag someone to rent Door #1. Its first occupant was a prison matron named Miss Beck. My dad remembered her because she would garage the same car there for over 20 years. Dad said that Miss Beck was a powerful woman. I guess you had to be powerful to be a prison matron back in the 1930s and 40s. With no power steering to help her, Miss Beck maneuvered her 1937 Oldsmobile in and out of Door #1 every day without ever once taking out the cherry tree.

If my grandfather hadn't been so stubborn about his rental prices, he could have rented out all the spots earlier in **1935** or **1936**. Then I would have an excuse to mention the immortal **Greyhound and the legendary Rosalind** – the greatest Cinderella story in the history of the Hambletonian. I've decided to sneak them in anyway with the idea that plenty of people probably wanted to rent the spot throughout those two years but begged off when told about the outrageous price of \$5 per month.

In the summer of 1939, Grandpa's garage was two-thirds rented, the Great Depression was fading from the headlines and Mr. Brady, a timid bachelor whose favorite color was plaid, and Miss Beck, a lady wrestler disguised as a prison matron, were parked side by side. Everyone expected love to bloom for the late-in-life couple, but it never happened. My dad said that Mr. Brady wouldn't have survived the honeymoon.

Anyway, in **1939**, with an American involvement in the European war becoming increasingly inevitable, **the Hambletonian Trophy went again to trainer/driver Doc Parshall and the horse Peter Astra** – a Peter Volo colt who sold as a yearling for the sizeable sum of \$3,250 – that's about \$60,000 today.

Initially, the owner, a physician named Dr. L.M. Guilinger, kept the colt's ownership secret. He feared that his patients wouldn't expect a bill for services rendered from a doctor with that much money to spend on a horse. The average physician earned about \$7,500 per year in 1939, while the average patient, if they were lucky enough to have a job, earned a little less than \$1,200.

It was also the year when the priceless Hambletonian Trophy that we now know was crafted. It's on display at the Meadowlands Racetrack on the Clubhouse level.

Until someone decided that the trophy was too valuable to lend out, it was presented to the winning connections to have and to hold for one year. Today, the original Hambletonian Trophy is only trotted out, so to speak, for ceremonial reasons. It's presented to the winning connections for the photo-op. When all the race day hoopla is over, the trophy is inscribed with the necessary inscriptions, and returned to its display case. The winners receive a replica in its place.

The Hambletonian stuff is easy for me to write about because most of it is programed into my brain, and whatever I don't know, I can easily look up. However, the ancient history of the garage is quite different. Almost all the old-time stuff was told to me by my dad and the last of my surviving relatives on my dad's side of the family.

Anyway, the years went by without me existing on the earth. Garage tenants and their cars came and went, everyone got old, the prison matron died of a heart attack trying to steer her car into Door #1, and the Hambletonian was still the grandest event in harness racing. Then, after four billion years of a blissful non-existence, I came along. Oh, and I'm kidding about the prison matron. I don't know what became of her, but she was in her 50s in the 1930s. So, unless she's the oldest person on earth, I suspect she's no longer with us. It's safe to say that however old she lived to be, she'd have lived at least five years longer if she either had power steering or enough money to rent garage Door #3.

Remember earlier when I told you about Mr. Brady, the old guy who rented garage Door #2 way back in 1934? Yeah, well, he lived to be nearly 100 years old and I knew him. By this time, the mid 1970s, his car, which he still used, was a well-preserved 1957 Pontiac Star Chief. The fact that Mr. Brady would ultimately end up renting the same parking spot for about 60 years seems kind of freaky.

In 1957, the year Mr. Brady's Pontiac rolled off the assembly line, Hickory Smoke won the Hambletonian for his driver/trainer John Simpson Sr. The historical importance here, apart from the fact that Hickory Smoke went on to be a high-impact stallion, is that 1957 was the year the Hambletonian moved to The Du Quoin State Fair in Du Quoin, IL.

The last quarter of the final heat was a smoking :28.4. The only thing on earth smoking more than Hickory Smoke was Mr. Brady's 1957 Pontiac. It had a leaky head gasket. At least that's how my father told the story.

In 1977, the year Green Speed won the Hambletonian with Billy Haughton training and driving, I knew all about harness

racing. In fact, the very first horse I ever jogged at a training farm in Colt's Neck, NJ was a little black horse who was sired by **Ayres, the horse who won the 1964 Hambletonian**. The year 1977 was also when Mr. Brady went to that great garage in the sky.

Sadly, Mr. Brady was gone, but sadder still was the fact that his car wasn't. As meticulous with his money as he was with his cars, Mr. Brady departed this world with his garage rent paid for a year in advance, or until his nephew in San Diego, his only surviving heir, came to either claim it or provide for its removal.

In the summer of 1977, I was assigned the chore of mowing the lawn for my home and my grandparent's home which was about 50 yards down the road. Both houses had big gardens and trees, so there were only a few medium-sized patches of actual lawn to mow. It wasn't hard work. I did neighbors' lawns for extra money, but the family lawn thing was my very first scheduled job for which I was paid. The only problem was that I had no access to gasoline for the mower.

I didn't dare ask my grandfather for gas because his grouchiness had grown incrementally over the years. The last thing he'd do was reach into his Band-Aid tins for a few bucks. The guy at the gas station wouldn't sell gas to a kid with a can, so, when I ran out of gas, instead of abandoning my job, I did what any entrepreneurial kid would do, I siphoned it out of Mr. Brady's ancient Pontiac.

Let me tell you why taking Mr. Brady's gas seemed perfectly acceptable to me.

By the time I was 12, I had seen the movie THE BAD SEED on TV about 10 times. It's an iconic film from 1956 – the year The Intruder won the Hambletonian for Ned Bower. Most people have seen the film, but for the record, it's the psychological drama about a perfectly polite little girl named Rhoda Penmark who secretly kills a schoolmate named Claude Daigle because he won the penmanship medal and she didn't. After pulling the penmanship medal off his lapel, Rhoda pushes poor little Claude off a pier at a school picnic and he drowns. No one suspects perfectly pretty Rhoda, but when Rhoda hears her mother say how brokenhearted Mrs. Daigle was about not being able to bury her boy with his treasured penmanship medal, Rhoda callously says, "Claude is dead. He won't know if the penmanship medal is pinned on him or not."

Rhoda Penmark taught me well because that's what I figured about Mr. Brady. No, I didn't murder him, but he was dead, he wouldn't know if his old car had gas in the tank or not.

Throughout the next five years, I paid little attention to the contents of the garage, although, by this time, there was a mysterious car behind Door #1 that seemed to be there for as long as I could remember. Basically, that's what this story is all about, but I took the long route to get here. This was a time when my 17th birthday was fast approaching. I was already involved in harness racing, but how that happened is a much shorter story than this.

Anyway, Gramps, no longer driving, kept his Oldsmobile Delta 88 parked behind Door #3, and believe it or not, Mr. Brady's prehistoric 1957 Pontiac, my own private Exxon station, was still there. His nephew just kept sending rent checks year after year. This annoyed my grandfather because he couldn't raise the rent for a new tenant. And then there was that mystery car behind Door #1. What was that all about?

It was obviously a car, but it was covered in a giant tarp that was secured all around by plastic rope. Atop the tarp was a car-sized swatch of burlap. On top of the burlap my grandfather had piled a bunch of paint cans and carpentry

stuff on what would be the hood and the trunk of the car. I couldn't even tell which way the car was facing.

Days before I turned 17, and dreaming about a car of my own, the unthinkable happened. Mr. Brady's nephew showed up. Despite having sat there for ages, the old Pontiac Star Chief started right up with jumper cables. It ran and smoked for a few minutes and then sputtered out. After a short while, a huddle of men determined that the car was out of gas. Of course, I'd already figured that out because I'd siphoned gas out of that car for four summers, but I wasn't about to tell anyone.

Ten minutes after Mr. Brady's car was hauled away, my Aunt Helen, a woman who never drove, pulled her car into Mr. Brady's spot. For me, it seemed like Aunt Helen was grave robbing. Mr. Brady's crypt should've been given a little more reverence. Aunt Helen's car was a gruesomely silver 1975 Chevy Impala with red interior, a red landau top and a lot of rust. Silver and red and rusty? Does it get any uglier than that? I mean, Mr. Brady's car may have been old and smokey, but it had class. This was a miserable day for Door #2.

Although Aunt Helen's car was a 1975 model, it was manufactured in 1974, the year when Bonefish won the Hambletonian for the immortal Stanley Dancer. In that race, Bonefish set a world record for four heats divided. Stanley Dancer figures largely, albeit briefly, in this story, so keep reading.

After turning 17, unlike most eager kids, I waited a few months to get my driver's license. When I acquired one, my father said he had a surprise for me. I figured that the surprise was a car, but I worried that I'd get my grandfather's old man's Oldsmobile, or worse yet, my Aunt Helen's car that looked like a lampshade in a brothel.

A few days later, my dad marched me over to the garage and handed me a key. In my head, I heard Monty Hall say,

"Will it be Door #1, Door #2 or Door #3?

It was totally demented. I had to try the key in each door to see which car I would get. I figured there was no way it could be the key to Door #1, so to add to the suspense and give my dad a thrill, I tried Door #1 first. Remember that behind Door #1 was the old car under the tarp. I put the key in the lock, turned it, and it opened. What fresh hell was this?

Using one try, I discovered that my gift car was the mysterious creature that lay beneath the dusty tarp and burlap, only now there were more paint cans, more mover's quilts, and more dust. Figures that my older brother was driving around in an Audi and I was the brother who got zonked, but at least I never had acne. Over the years, so much junk was piled up on top of that car that almost everyone, except for my father, had forgotten about it.

When the junk was cleared, the tarp was pulled back to reveal something astonishing.

Do you remember the scene in the movie AMADEUS when Salieri reads Mozart's first and only draft of his Requiem? He says, "It was miraculous!"

You're probably thinking that the car beneath the tarp was something like a 1920s Duesenberg Roadster or the 1929 Isotta Fraschini that Norma Desmond owned in the movie SUNSET BLVD, but no. It wasn't anything as elaborate as all that. It was even better.

When I was 17, we didn't have TV shows like Antique Roadshow or Jay Leno's Garage or My Strange Inheritance, so I didn't put a lot of thought into what auto-treasure might lie beneath the tarp. Cars, old or new, didn't interest me all that much anyway, but in an instant, all of that changed.

Hidden beneath that tarp for all those years was a 1965 Buick Special convertible. By this time, it was practically a relic, at least in my mind, but it was in mint condition. In 1965, while my grandfather waited on his special order (he wanted a bigger engine) Egyptian Candor won the Hambletonian for driver Del Cameron and trainer Stanley Dancer.

Made in Detroit, painted in Arctic White – an official Buick color — with a white convertible top to match, it was a mid-sized masterpiece. For the price of \$2,889, my grandfather had ordered the car from Ray Auer Buick in Red Bank, NJ, but after he drove it, he decided that he didn't like it. He said it was too sporty or something, so he put about 6,000 miles on it and stuck it in the garage to be used as a shelf. I guess the fact that it weighed three tons less than the cars he was used to made it feel "flimsy" to him.

At first glance, the car amazed me, but I worried that it

might draw in unwanted attention. Keep in mind that this car was from a different era. There was a tremendous difference between 1960s cars and 1980s cars. The styling had changed drastically. This was the MTV generation, but I'd be driving around in something straight out of the Zapruder Film.

For the price of \$390.00, and I still have the receipts, the car was tuned up, got a new battery and was fitted with new tires that I had to get on special order from Sears because they were the only place that carried them. The whitewall tires had a wider whitewall strip, and that made all the difference. I didn't have to do this, but they matched the original tires which had to be replaced anyway. I also buffed up the "Ray Auer Buick" bumper tag because it was supposedly a high-class dealership back in the day. I figured it added a little provenance to the car.

Okay, for you MY COUSIN VINNY fans out there, aside from the convertible top, this was the same car that came into question during Ralph Maccio's murder trial. Remember when Marissa Tomei gets the case dismissed because she's an expert mechanic, and Joe Pesci shows the jury some pictures of those skid marks? And then there's that whole thing about the positive-traction rear differential being a different model Buick? Yeah, well my Buick, the one that belonged to the real killers, is the car we're talking about. My Buick Special — not the Skylark — had the positive-traction rear differential. The only difference between the Skylark and the Special were the taillights and the drive train. Otherwise, it was the same car.

Of course, like with most family heirlooms, the gift car came with a stipulation. I had to give up my spot behind Door #1. I knew there had to be a catch. Seems I was evicted in favor of a paying tenant. I didn't think that was fair. My grandfather had died in 1981, so the evil voice of Rhoda Penmark in my head snarled, "Grandpa is dead. He won't know if I'm paying rent or not!"

Another thing that Gramps would never know was that **1981** was the very first year the **Hambletonian** was held at the Meadowlands Racetrack. The first Big M winner, **Shiaway St Pat, trained and driven by Ray Remmen**, was, just like every car that ever parked in my grandfather's garage, bred in Michigan.

I didn't really care about losing the parking spot. It was easier to park under the old cherry tree anyway, but parking a white convertible under a cherry tree – between the birds and the fruit – wasn't exactly a genius move, and I would have that ragtop replaced three times during the car's 10-year tenure with me.

The following week, with the top down, I introduced my

Buick to the harness racing world. As I drove down Route 9 towards Freehold Raceway, I noticed a few heads turning. Like I said, styles had changed drastically, and cars from that era didn't last exceptionally long. It's not like today where my 2002 GMC Sport-Side pickup looks almost the same as its 2020 version. At that time, seeing an older car in that kind of condition was rare.

I pulled my car into a spot near the Freehold race office. Back then, the race office was on the other side of the highway and you had to walk up an outdoor staircase to get to it. That's when I saw Stanley Dancer coming down the steps. I'd seen him in races, and he'd won the Hambletonian four times, but I had never seen him in person. He was a real-life human... and he was walking towards me with a wide-eyed smile.

He said, "Where did you get this car?" I stammered that it was given to me by my father and that it had been my grandfather's car. Almost amazed, he walked around my car and gave it a buyer's going over. He asked to peek under the hood and was doubly impressed when he saw the Wildcat 310 engine. Then he noticed the Ray Auer Buick logo on the rear bumper. He said, "Ray Auer sold nice cars. I knew him. This car is a real beauty. Good luck with it." Then he walked away.

That was surreal, but not as unusual as the time, years later, when I sat on the ground with the immortal Herve Filion and helped him change his flat tire. As we struggled with a seized lug nut, Herve said, "Whatever happened to your white convertible?"

Right around the time Stanley Dancer took a shine to my car, the great Howard Beissinger – he won the Hambletonian in 1978 with Speedy Somolli – said that my car was, "a terrific piece of work," when he saw it parked behind his barn at the Meadowlands.

When I was stabled at Meadow Run Farm in southern New Jersey, Harry Harvey - Helicopter 1953 – admired my car, but he warned me that it would eventually start to smell like horses. He was right about that. He was also right when he told me that my tiny horse, Texas Bound, needed to be trained as though he was a big horse. When I followed his advice, Texas Bound went from being a cheap horse who never won, to being a cheap horse who won a lot.

The compliment I remember most fondly was when one of my favorite harness racing drivers, Mickey McNichol, someone I think of as a good friend and mentor, said to me, "Where the hell did you get this car!" The thing that makes it so memorable for me is that Mickey McNichol's Hambletonian victory with Alf Palema in 1992, still reigns today as my all-time favorite Hambletonian. I was happy to see Mickey win it, and I thought at the time, that Alf Palema was one of the most magnificent trotters I had ever seen.

Naturally, as with all things of beauty, there was a dark side

to the life of my beautiful car. In **1985 – Prakas with Bill O'Donnell in the bike for Per Eriksson** – my car was stolen from the Meadowlands parking lot and showed up two weeks later in the parking lot of Roosevelt Raceway. A sharp detective would have deduced that the thief probably liked harness racing.

After it was towed by the Westbury police, the careless guy who oversaw the impound lot out on Long Island had tossed it onto a pile of abandoned cars. It took every cent I had to get it repaired. Using body parts from a junked Skylark, my car had to be fitted with Skylark trim and repainted.

The car would again be stolen in **1986 – Nuclear Kosmos** with Ulf Thoreson driving for Per Henriksen. It was found a few days later lying in a ditch near the Passaic River. I had it fixed again but it was losing its luster.

In 1987— Mack Lobell with John Campbell driving for Chuck Sylvester — my poor car was yet again snatched from a city street. This time I found it myself. By 1992, my beautiful Buick that had caught the eye of some of the greatest Hambletonian horsemen in history, and several car thieves with a penchant for vintage cars, would end up being snagged five times.

When we were sitting in the dirt and Herve Filion asked me, "Whatever happened to your white convertible?" I told him that I didn't know. To this day I still don't really know because after its fifth abduction, it wasn't located until 15 years later – which is a great story for another time.

So here we are in 2020, a year that's been nothing but fun, and my nearly spotless 2002 GMC Sport Side Sierra sits in my garage, although I use it from time to time. The car seems so young to me because I remember buying it off the showroom floor in 2001 – the year Scarlet Knight won with Stefan Melander. The sad truth is that it's actually older than my 1965 Buick was when I first laid eyes on it. And then there's this neighbor kid, a 7-year-old boy, who is fascinated by my "old truck." So, the cycle begins again. I've decided to either sell it to the kid when he's old enough to drive, or to lay down and die and leave it with a full tank of gas just in case the kid goes into the lawn mower business. I'll be dead. I won't know if my car has gas in it or not.

McNairs click for fourth Battle Of Waterloo win during Industry Day at Grand River Raceway

Scarlett Hanover and Ed Hensley scored in the Battle of the Belles.

Grand River Raceway's 30th annual Industry Day event on Monday (Aug. 3) sustained bouts of heavy rain during the 10-race anniversary card which boasted purses of \$669,663 with nine stake races, featuring the track's two marquee dashes.

But it was a sunny finish for the Guelph, ON father-son duo of Gregg and Doug McNair who clinched their fourth Battle Of Waterloo victory.

23rd annual Battle Of Waterloo

At 8-5, **Bettor Sun** was the co-favorite heading into post time for the \$200,964 contest for rookie Ontario-sired pacing colts.



Trained by Gregg for breeder/owner Willow Oak Ranch, the Sunshine Beach colt was piloted by Doug, who left from post two and took control of the field by the half-mile marker. The pair finished a length ahead of Avion Seelster (Jody Jamieson) and Cantstoplying (Jonathan Drury).

A 35-1 champ in last week's maiden-breaking effort in his elimination division, Bettor Sun's 1:54.1 finish in that dash set a Canadian season record for 2-year-old pacing colts over a half-mile oval.

He bested his own record with Monday's clocking of 1:53.4.

"Last week he surprised a lot of people, including myself," Doug

said following the final. "He's the colt I liked the most of dad's 2-year-olds this year.

"He's good gaited; he gets around like a hoop around a barrel."

The McNairs previously won the Battle Of Waterloo with Magnum J in 2017, Three Of Clubs in 2013, and Trail Boss in 2008.

Bettor Sun's triumph boosted his bankroll to \$116,558 in three career starts.

12th annual Battle Of The Belles

Scarlett Hanover and Ed Hensley left from the second tier and carved out a solid pocket trip to take the \$128,149 Battle Of The Belles final in a new stakes record of 1:54.3. The mile also set a Canadian season record for rookie pacing fillies over a half-mile track and just missed the divisional track record by one-fifth of a second.

"I followed a good horse and got a great trip," said Hensley of eventual runner-up, Ring Of Kerry, who led the field to the three-quarter marker. "My mare was getting a little rammy; she wanted out of there and I was able to get out at the right time."

In last week's elimination division, Scarlett Hanover wired the field to capture her maiden in 1:55.3. Ashleigh Hensley trains the Bettors Delight daughter, a \$45,000 yearling purchase and winner of \$101,855 in four career starts for owners Burke Racing Stable, Frank Baldachino, Jandt Silva Purnel & Libb, and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

Ring Of Kerry was the runner-up with Sylvain Filion and Cyclone Seelster was close behind in third with Bob McClure.

OSS undercard

Three-year-old pacing fillies in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) underpinned the card with two Gold Series divisions and five fields of Grassroots contenders.

Last year's Battle Of The Belles champ, **Karma Seelster** was an impressive winner in the first Gold Series division which kicked off the matinee program. Piloted by Doug McNair, the Sportswriter filly was 7-1 as she took to the front of the field early in the mile en route to clocking her 1:53 victory (just one-fifth of a second off the track record). Owned by Eileen and Keith Waples and Karen Hauver, the Gregg McNair trainee is a career winner of five races and \$354,005.

Sound Idea with Bob McClure and Betalady with Jody Jamieson rounded out the top three.

Lauras Love took the second Gold Series division in 1:54.2 with a half-length advantage over Rose Run Vantage (Sylvain Filion) who cut out the mile. All Day Sunshine (Louis Philippe Roy) was third.

It was the second consecutive win for Lauras Love, and seventh of the season from 11 starts. John Pentland trains and co-owns the Betterthancheddar filly with Gracie Mae Barr. Her lion's share of the \$105,600 purse brings her career tally to \$141,584.

Race favorite **Kat** captured her first season win in the first of five OSS Grassroots divisions (Race 2) for trainer James Dean. With Jody Jamieson in the bike, the pair took control of the field at the first quarter and staved off outside attackers at the final quarter, with a half-length score in 1:56. The daughter of Hes Watching is owned by Wilma and James MacKenzie. Count To Three with Trevor Henry and Docs Harmony (Travis Cullen) were close behind at the wire.

Free Flyin Ticket scored her second consecutive OSS Grassroots victory in Race 3. Paul MacDonell steered the Betterthancheddar filly to a three-length win in 1:54.1, elevating her to the top of the OSS division standings. Trainer Anthony Beaton co-owns with David Mercer, Gary Volpe and George Quarterone. The runner-up was High Roller Duke (Colin Kelly), while Tuggingoncredit finished third (Louis Philippe Roy).

Bettorthanbobbie added another win to her burgeoning collection, with a half-length score in Race 5. Sylvain Filion steered the bettors' top choice to her sixth season win in 1:54.4 for trainer Marcel Barrieau and owner Ian Smith. Bettorthanbobbie is a career winner of 11 races and \$53,828.

Doug McNair managed a wire-to-wire trip with **Landry Seelster** in Race 6. The race favorite posted her second consecutive OSS victory in 1:55 for trainer Michael Ellis and owner Kim Lezanchuk. Jonathan Drury and Mary Kat finished second, followed by Coqui Coqui with Travis Cullen.

The final Grassroots division was the quickest, claimed by **Preeminence** winning by open lengths with Bob McClure in the bike in a new career best of 1:54. Sent off at 9-5, the Sportswriter filly is trained by Marcel Barrieau for Claude Baril, Gilles Caouette and Michael Daneault. Keystone Kalimba (Jody Jamieson) was second and race favorite Trafalgar (Sylvain Filion) rounded out the top three.

Total handle for this year's 10-race Industry Day was \$392,062 which was down slightly from the 11-race card handle of \$488,696 in 2019.



Oaks favorite, three in Hambletonian for Melander

Marcus Melander will send morning-line favorite **Hypnotic AM** to Saturday's \$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks at The Meadowlands and, for the second year in a row, three horses to the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes final.

Melander's Hambletonian trio last year — Greenshoe, Gimpanzee, and Green Manalishi S — were the bettor's top-three choices in the race won by Forbidden Trade. His group Saturday will lack the same backing, each of his horses is 15-1 on the morning line, but the 28-year-old Melander still relishes the opportunity to compete in harness racing's premier event for 3-year-old trotters.

"We all hope for that win, even though it's going to be tough," said Melander, who will send out **Capricornus**, **Hollywood Story**, and **Rome Pays Off** in the Hambletonian. "I don't feel defeated with any of my horses because they're all good. They just need the right trip to get up there."

Melander is looking for his first win in the Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks. He was second in last year's Hambletonian with Greenshoe while Gimpanzee was third and Green Manalishi S fifth. He was fourth in last year's Oaks with Miss Trixton.

The Hambletonian is the first jewel in the Trotting Triple Crown. CBS Sports Network will air a delayed one-hour broadcast of the Hambletonian from 6-7 p.m. (EDT) Saturday. The stakes-filled card at The Meadowlands starts at noon.

While Melander is sending out perceived longshots in the

Hambletonian, Hypnotic AM gets the early nod in the Oaks, which is for 3-year-old female trotters. The winner of 10 of 13 career races and \$624,725, she is 5-2 on the morning line.

Hypnotic AM, a homebred daughter of Chapter Seven—Daydream AM S owned by Courant Inc., enters the Oaks off a 1:52.3 win in a prep race this past weekend at The Meadowlands. Eliminations were unnecessary for the Oaks, which attracted a field of 12 fillies.

"I was very happy with her," Melander said. "She has a lot of speed and this year she has been handy as well. She got a little grabby and hot at the end of last year and you couldn't really control her. This year she has been much better.

"She just has a great attitude and she wants to do it out there. I'm very confident with her, but there are nice horses in there. They will be tough to beat but I'm very confident in my horse."

Hypnotic AM and driver Brian Sears will start the Oaks from post 12, which is in the second tier behind the starting gate.

"It is what it is," Melander said. "It's up to Brian, that's why we have him. He worked it out perfectly with Gimpanzee from post 13 (in the Hambletonian Maturity on July 18) so hopefully he can work something out here as well."

Hypnotic AM was last year's New York Sire Stakes champion and she opened this season with two wins on the New York circuit, including the Empire Breeders Classic. She then finished third in the Del Miller Memorial, won by

Ramona Hill in 1:50.3, on July 18 at The Meadowlands in her start prior to the Oaks prep.

"She got a tough trip and was interfered with, but she needed that race," Melander said. "It's been a little bit too easy on her in New York. She gets to the lead and has had some pretty soft halves and sprinted to the win. It was good that she got tired in that Del Miller race. That really helped her to get in form. We were very happy with her performance."

Sorella from the stable of trainer Nancy Takter is the 7-2 second choice in the Oaks and Jim Campbell's Next Level Stuff is 9-2.

As for the Hambletonian, Melander is happy with his horses heading into the final. The last trainer to have at least three Hambletonian finalists in successive years was Jimmy Takter, who accomplished it in 2013 through 2015.

Rome Pays Off, driven by Melander's 24-year-old brother Mattias, was fifth in his Hambletonian elimination after racing on the outside the entire mile. He won his first two races of 2020, including the Tompkins-Geers Stakes in 1:52.3.

Last season, the son of Muscle Hill—Order By Wish won three times on the Pennsylvania circuit and was second in both the Peter Haughton Memorial and Breeders Crown. He has won five of 15 career races and \$392,934 for owner S R F Stable.

Rome Pays Off starts the Hambletonian from post eight. Tony Alagna-trained Ramona Hill, who bypassed the Oaks to challenge the boys in the Hambletonian, is the 5-2 morning-line favorite.

"It's going to be hard to beat Ramona Hill," said Melander, who was the 2019 Trainer of the Year in the U.S. "She's going to be the favorite and should be the favorite. Behind her I think it's pretty wide open. Rome Pays Off could be second as could anyone else in the race. It's an open race in my opinion.

"(Rome Pays Off) drew a little bad but he's a nice horse and always shows up. I have nothing bad to say about that horse. He always does his best."

He will start the final from post three with driver David Miller. The Courant Inc.-owned son of Muscle Hill—Counter

Pointe has won four of seven lifetime races.

"He's still a little bit green but he develops more and more with every race," Melander said. "He started with some easier races and then we had to go to Grand Circuit competition to see if he was good enough to aim for the Hambo or not. He got a good draw. We'll see."

Capricornus, who finished second in last year's William Wellwood Memorial and has won three of 15 career starts, finished third in his Hambletonian elim. He will start from post seven with driver Tim Tetrick. The son of Cantab Hall-Oh My Darlin is owned by JJ Racing Stable.

"Maybe he's not the type that wins every week, but he always does good races," Melander said. "The elimination was a race like that as well. He got shuffled back and still had a lot of trot to the end."

Captainofrocknroll is now two for two at Mohawk Park and two for three overall. His only loss was runner-up finish in a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes division on July 22 at The Meadows.

Robert Hamather is the owner-breeder of Captainofrocknroll, who is the first foal from former mares preferred competitor Rock N Roll Xample (\$370,055). The rookie pacing colt has now earned \$31,116. He paid \$3.40 to win.

Coleman-Herlihy appears loaded with talent for next week's \$88,500 final. Her trainee **Dean B Hanover** skipped Monday's second leg after scoring a 1:52.1 victory in last week's opening round.

The Dream Maker Series final takes place next Monday (Aug. 10).

Somebodyslilly, Mystical Carrie score ISS wins at Hoosier

Sophomore pacing fillies closed the curtain on a week's worth of Indiana Sires Stakes action at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino as two \$32,000 divisions highlighted the evening's 14-race card on Saturday (Aug. 1). Rain did not deter divisional winners **Somebodyslilly** and **Mystical Carrie** who both turned in convincing efforts to find the winner's circle for the second straight week.

Somebodyslilly converted a pocket trip into a 1:51 score in the opening division over a track rated good. Driven by Michael Oosting, Somebodyslilly capitalized on a break by the heavy post-time favorite, Priceless and Brandon Bates, and went on to win by five lengths.

Priceless left alertly from post five to dictate fractions of :27.1, :56.4 and 1:24.3 while Somebodyslilly sat patiently in the pocket. As the field turned for home, Priceless made an uncharacteristic break and took herself out of the race. Somebodyslilly inherited the lead and held off a late surge from Kickin Up My Heels and Trace Tetrick to get the win. Classic Country and Sam Widger rallied well late for third. As

the 3-1 second choice, Somebodyslilly returned \$8.60 to win.

Trained and owned by Eli Schwartz, the daughter of Time To Roll—Somebody's Artist recorded her second consecutive victory and first stakes win of the season. Somebodyslilly pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$88,350 with the win.

In the second division, Trace Tetrick guided Mystical Carrie to another decisive score. Sent off as the heavy 1-5 favorite, Mystical Carrie moved first over and paced strong to the wire to finish four lengths in front of her competition and score in a new lifetime best of 1:50.1 over a track rated good. It was the second consecutive stakes victory for Mystical Carrie and the second consecutive week she lowered her lifetime best.

Genie Rockwell and Marlin Fry established first half fractions of :26.2 and :56.2 while Mystical Carrie sat along the rail in third. Genie Rockwell led the field to the third station in 1:24.3 and was then joined on the outside by Tetrick and Mystical Carrie.

When the field turned for home, Tetrick asked Mystical Carrie for more and she responded with a :26.1 closing kick to get the win by four lengths. Seventimesacharm and John DeLong rallied well late to get up for second while Genie Rockwell held on for third. As the 1-5 favorite, Mystical Carrie returned \$2.40 at the betting windows.

Trained by Erv Miller the homebred daughter of Tellitlikeitis—Mystical Victress recorded her second seasonal score from four starts. Mystical Carrie has now amassed \$90,650 in lifetime purse earnings and is owned by Mystical Marker Farms LLC.

Trotting colts lock up top spots in Grassroots action

One week after making their debut in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) winner's circle, 2-year-old trotting colts **Stonebridge Armour, Tymal Chrome** and **Arch Hall** collected their second provincial victories on Monday (Aug. 3) as Dresden Raceway played host to a trio of \$22,000 Grassroots divisions.

Fan favorite Stonebridge Armour opened the Grassroots action with a gate-to-wire effort from Post 5, cruising home a three and one-half length winner in 2:04.1. Lovin Life Hanover finished second and Showme Some Muscle was third in the \$22,800 test.

"The gate was a little bit tricky with him in Sarnia, but I kind of knew him a little more today and he seemed to be a little more mature about it today too. He handled the gate

really well and after that it was pretty much just a cake walk from there. I never pulled the plugs or nothing, I just sat on him the whole way," said driver Tyler Moore, who piloted the colt to his first Grassroots victory at Hiawatha Horse Park on July 25. "It was my 500thwin too, so that was nice."

Moore drives the Muscle Mass colt for trainer Jacques Dupont's Les Ecuries D'Orleans Inc. of Repentigny, Gestion C. Levesque 2005 Inc. of St-Hyacinthe, Mario Bourgea of Stanbridge East and Marc Camirand of Montreal, QC. A half-brother to \$1.2 million winner Manofmanymissions, Stonebridge Armour was a \$45,000 acquisition from last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

With wins in both of his Grassroots starts Stonebridge Armour currently sits third in the freshman trotting colt standings with 100 points.

Tymal Chrome earned his second Grassroots win with a gritty first-over trip, reeling in pacesetter Daylon Midnight and advancing down the stretch to a one length victory in 2:04.4. Doro Sogno tracked fan favorite Tymal Chrome from start to finish to secure the runner-up's share of the \$22,450 purse and Diehard Seelster rounded out the top three.

"He's been a nice horse all along. He just goes out, he just trots, it's like he refuses to make a mistake. He just wants to be a nice horse," said trainer Anthony Beaton. "He did the same thing in Sarnia, he went a big mile there first-up. He just seems like he wants to make you happy and not make mistakes, and that's great."

Beaton trains Tymal Chrome for Larry Menary of Branchton, Michael Guerriero of Brampton, ON and George Harrison of Wanes Walton, England. The partners purchased the Muscle Mass son for \$22,000 from last fall's Harrisburg Yearling Sale. With two wins and one third in Grassroots action, Tymal Chrome currently sits second in the division standings with 112 points.

Division leader Arch Hall delivered his second Grassroots win off a pocket trip behind early pacesetter Insanity, who rang up fractions of :30 and 1:01.2 before being collared by Arch Hall heading by the 1:33 three-quarters. Once he was in command, fan favorite Arch Hall sailed home to a two and three-quarter length win in 2:03.1. Insanity settled for second with Willywin well back in third.

"He just left out and that horse (Insanity) wanted to be on front so he just sat there. Down the backstretch he pulled him and just made sure he got through the turn fine, and then he asked him the top of the lane and he just took off again," said trainer Blake MacIntosh. "He's a nice colt and anybody can drive him, he's pretty childproof right now. For a

two-year-old trotting colt he's really smart."

MacIntosh shares ownership of Arch Hall with Hutt Racing Stable of Malvern, PA. The Archangel colt has been no worse than fourth in four lifetime starts, with his two wins and one second putting him at the top of the Grassroots standings with 125 points.

All three of Monday's winners are eligible to the Aug. 15 Balanced Image Eliminations at Hanover Raceway. The colts that make the Balanced Image Final on Aug. 22 will miss the fourth Grassroots event, which is slated for Aug. 25 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Love A Good Story breaks track record at Batavia

It was a big stake day at Batavia Downs on Sunday (Aug. 2) as an all-New York Sire Stake card of racing featured 2 and 3-year-old trotting fillies vying in four divisions for a total of \$213,400 in purses.

The highlight of the day was **Love A Good Story** (Chapter Seven—Celebrity Lovin) who took the second \$55,000 division for 3-year-olds in memorable style.

Driver Andy Miller floated Love A Good Story off the gate and dropped in third while Without A Warning (Scott Zeron) got to the quarter in a quick :27.4. Positions remained unchanged in the throttled-down :30.2 second panel until Love A Good Story pulled first up as she made her way into the turn.

Past the five eighths, Love A Good Story drew alongside Without A Warning and the two trotted side-by-side up the backstretch and to the three-quarters in 1:26.2. The match race continued around the last turn and down the lane when Love A Good Story got the edge with Miller urging her on and hit the wire in 1:55.1.

The time was a new track record for 3-year-old trotting fillies, besting the standard of 1:55.4 set by Quincy Blue Chip just last year.

It was the 10th win in 15 lifetime starts for Love A Good Story (\$2.50) who has now earned \$400,484 for owners the Pinske Stables, the Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Daniel Plouffe. Julie Miller trains the winner.

Love A Good Story was bred by Celebrity Farms and was a \$90,000 Lexington Selected yearling purchase.

The first \$54,000 split had an abbreviated four-horse field that saw **Island Lily** (Chapter Seven—-Up Front Hotsey) dominate.

Tom Jackson put Island Lily on the front and then led at every station with Destiny Blue Chip (Ake Svanstedt) on her back. After fractions of :29, :58.4 and 1:28.2, Destiny Blue Chip pulled the pocket and took a run at the leader in the turn. But Island Lily headed for home and trotted away clear to an easy 4-1/2 length victory in 1:57.2

It was the first lifetime win for Island Lily (\$4.90) who was unraced at two. Fred Grant both owns and trains the filly.

Island Lily was bred by Noel Daley and Up Front Racing and sold for \$70,000 at the Harrisburg yearling sale.

The freshman class saw the best performance come in the second \$52,200 division from **Destined To Dance** (Chapter Seven-Go Go Dancer) who dropped in fourth from post seven as Eliza B (Scott Zeron) scooted to the quarter in :29 flat. With four horses breaking early, the field was now in two groups with the top quad playing follow the leader to the half.

Past the five-eighths Just Joshing (Andy Miller) came from third and made a move for the lead while Destined To Dance was still a gapped fourth. But after they entered the final bend, Tyler Buter hit the gas and Destined To Dance responded in dynamic fashion. Still three lengths off the lead, Destined To Dance dug in hard and with a full head of steam, flew down the stretch with ease while reeling off a :28.1 quarter to win by 1-1/2 lengths in 1:59.1.

It was the third straight win, all in NYSS action, for Destined To Dance (\$3.80) who is owned by Heritage Standardbreds, Crawford Farms Racing and Rich Prezzioti. John Butenshoen trains the winner.

Destined To Dance was bred by Crawford Farms and sold for \$100,000 at the Lexington Selected yearling sale.

The complexion of the final \$52,200 division changed quickly as post time favorite No Pay No Way (Scott Zeron) broke going for the lead. But Ake Svanstedt was happy to take her place when he guided **Broad Strokes** (Chapter Seven—Lady Marian) to the front and then never looked back. Broad Strokes slowed the half down to 1:01.1 as no one challenged and Svanstedt continued to grab leather into the second circuit.

Credit Income (John Stark Jr.) finally advanced on the outside and got within a length of Broad Strokes in the final turn and the two were on a breakaway. Broad Strokes and Credit Income traded leads all the way down to the wire where Broad Strokes got a slight advantage and won by 1/4 length in 2:01.2.

It was the first lifetime win and a lifetime mark for Broad Strokes (\$6.80) who is owned by Little E, Joe Sbrocco, L. Berg Inc. and Triple Play Trotters. Ake Svanstedt also trains the winner.

Broad Strokes was bred by Fair Winds Farm and was a \$50,000 Harrisburg yearling sale acquisition.
